## DUBAWI ON TOP AGAIN AS ARQANA LIGHTS UP

DEAUVILLE, France—The second and final session of the select part of the Arqana August Sale lit up in ebullient fashion with two seven-figure yearlings, including the €2.4-million sale topper by Dubawi, a half-sister to Group 2 winner Babylone (Fr) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}).

Charlie Gordon-Watson made a significant impact on the day's action when acting for an unnamed client and signed for the filly (lot 108) out of Typique (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) shortly after bidding €525,000 for lot 99, a filly by Frankel (GB).

The sale leader was consigned by Haras d'Etreham for relatively new breeder Thierry Gillier of Haras Voltaire, who bought Typique, a daughter of G1 Prix Marcel Boussac winner Denebola (Storm Cat), at the Goffs November Sale of 2016 for €450,000 through Laurent Benoit's Broadhurst Agency.

"It's just such a fantastic Niarchos family with Group 1-winning 2-year-olds as the second and third dams, and she's beautiful. She's the best-looking Dubawi filly I've ever seen and the mare's first two foals both look pretty good," said Gordon-Watson. "André Fabre loved her and he will train her."

The filly's page boasts plenty of depth, with Group 1 winners Senga (Blame), Coup De Genie (Mr. Prospector), Machiavellian (Mr. Prospector), Bago (Fr) (Nashwan) and Maxios (GB) (Monsun {Ger}) all prominent. Cont. p2

#### PALACE PIER JOINS THE ELITE AT DEAUVILLE

Coming into Sunday's G1 Prix du Haras de Fresnay-le-Buffard Jacques le Marois short of his peak having suffered a blood disorder last month, **Palace Pier (GB)** (Kingman {GB}) nevertheless had sufficient ammunition to deny **Poetic Flare** (Ire) (Dawn Approach {Ire}) and gain membership to an elite club on the honor roll of the feature of Deauville's month-long festival.

Meeting the younger generation for the first time, the four-times Group 1 winner was the subject of the most interest among the Normandy crowd and started at 7-10 drawn away from the stand's rail which often grants an advantage here. Held back by Frankie Dettori trapped out on the wing as Poetic Flare raced against the fence out of sight tracking the keen-going Alpine Star (Ire) (Sea the Moon {Ger}) and Order of Australia (Ire) (Australia {GB}), Sheikh Hamdan bin Mohammed Al Maktoum's TDN Rising Star received the go-ahead 300 metres from the finish. Furthermore, Typique, who achieved little on the racecourse in her two starts, has made a promising start to her broodmare career. Her first foal Babylone (Fr) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), who is

also trained by Fabre, has won three of her five starts in her breeder's colours, most recently landing the G2 Prix de Malleret at Longchamp in July. Her year-younger full-sister Assyrian Queen (Fr) made a promising debut when second at Deauville on Aug. 5.

Nicolas de Chambure, who consigned the filly on Gillier's behalf through his Haras d'Etreham, said, "All the credit is for Haras Voltaire. They did the mating: it's a new owner with a new team

on a new farm and it is great to see a result like this. They bought an expensive mare and they have been rewarded for their investment in French breeding. We just feel very grateful that they trusted us with this lovely filly. She is going to a great owner and it is nice to see fillies like this going to people with a long-term plan."

The same owner/breeder will also take charge of Ecurie des

Monceaux's Frankel half-sister to Group 3 winners Fas (Ire) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) and Silva (Ire) (Kodiac {GB}), who had been signed for by Gordon-Watson just 20 minutes earlier.

He said, "We love Frankel and this is a wonderful family. She's a late foal and she will only improve. She will be trained by John Gosden."

Born on Apr. 29, the bay is a daughter of Sotka (GB) (Dutch Art {GB}), a listed-placed sister to the crack sprinter Sole Power (GB) (Kyllachy

(GB)), and she was bred at Monceaux by Zalim Bifov.

## The Daily Bulletin Argana August Yearling Sale - Day 2

- The €2.4-million sale-topping filly becomes the third yearling since 2015 to pass €2-million at Arqana's flagship yearling sale.
- The pace picked up on the second day of the sale; the average for the day was €311,250, and the median €215,000. The cumulative average for Part I was €258,479 (-11.4% from 2019) and the median €185,000 (-16%). The clearance rate was 74.5%.
- Dubawi (Ire) was the leading sire of Part I with five sold for an average of €1,012,000.
- Saxon Warrior (Jpn) was responsible for the highest price for a first-season sire during Part I of the sale; lot 135 sold to Oliver St Lawrence for €370,000.
- Half of the Roaring Lions offered during Part I (3) were bought by David Redvers, who bought the late Horse of the Year himself as a yearling. He had a high price of €300,000.
- Monceaux was leading vendor of Part I for the ninth straight year, with 28 sold for €8,507,000.
- Oliver St Lawrence edged Godolphin as leading buyer with five purchased for €3,335,000. Godolphin bought six for €3,220,000.

#### **Argana August Yearling Sale Cont.**

A notably livelier second session saw figures largely in line with the last time Arqana's premier yearling sale was held in August in 2019. The day's aggregate of €18,775,000 was up by 2% and

the average rose by 4% to €307,787. The median dipped only slightly to €210,000 and the clearance rate was 78% for 61 of the 78 horses in the session being marked as sold.

Over the two evenings of trade that make up Part I of the sale, 118 yearlings were sold (75.2%) for €30,342,000, 7% off the 2019 aggregate of €32,655,000 for 112 sold. The cumulative average was €257,136, down 11.8%, while the median dipped 16% at €185,000. The Arqana August Yearling Sale was last

year staged in September as the Deauville Select Sale owing to a pandemic-induced delay, and over the first two days there 164 yearlings were sold for an average of  $\in$ 181,049 and a median of  $\in$ 105,000.

#### Siyouni Colt Leaves Them Reeling

It didn't take long for the seven-figure barrier to be breached again and that came a few moments after lot 152 entered the ring. Ecurie des Monceaux already has one Siyouni (Fr) colt from

a Galileo (Ire) mare as a poster boy in last season's Arc winner Sottsass (Fr), and hopes will be high that the colt by the same sire out of Highland Reel's full-sister Cercle De La Vie (Ire) can rise to a similar level after being purchased for €1.5 million by Oliver St Lawrence.

Black-type updates are the stuff of dreams for consignors and Henri Bozo and his team gained a high-class boost when Cercle De La Vie's first foal Angel Bleu (Fr) (Dark Angel {Ire}) won the G2 Vintage S. at Glorious

Goodwood, beating the G2 Coventry S. winner Berkshire Shadow (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire}).

"He was a standout colt with a great update," said St Lawrence of the yearling. Cont. p5



He added, "The 2-year-old looks a proper horse and if he could be as good as him then we've done our jobs. I suspect he will be trained in England. He's been bought for Fawzi Nass."

St Lawrence made his presence felt at last year's Select Sale and he has done the same again with the sale now reverted to its August slot. At the end of the first two days he was the leading buyer, with five yearlings bought for €3,335,000.

He also signed for the most expensive yearling by Coolmore freshman Saxon Warrior (Jpn) at €370,000. Lot 135 was consigned by Haras de Bourgeauville and is a son of the dual listed winner Artistic Jewel (Ire) (Excellent Art {GB}).

in at Arqana for another daughter of Dubawi (lot 117) offered by Haras de l'Hotellerie on behalf of breeders Manfred Wurtenberger and Reinhard Stockli.

It took a bid of €900,000 from Simon Mockridge to secure the

half-sister to G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud winner Wonderment (Ire) (Camelot {GB}). Her dam Wiwilia (GB) (Konigstiger {Ger}) was a dual winner in Switzerland and is a half-sister to the GI Man O'War S. winner Wake Forest (Ger) (Sir Percy {GB}).

"She's a beautiful filly, very easy moving," said Mockridge, "There are Group 1 winners under the first three dams and she has a lovely outcross pedigree for our broodmare band in time."

The filly's sale represented the highest price achieved by the

Garcon family of Haras de l'Hotellerie in nine years of consigning at Arqana. Cont. p6

"We are very happy that she has been bought by such a good breeder," said Guillaume Garcon. "It is the first time Juddmonte has bought from us and it is very exciting to know that she is

going to such a good place. The last time we sold a yearling by Dubawi he was a Group 1 winner [Mubtaahij (Ire)] and we hope for the same for this filly."

The Hotellerie team has also sold the two most expensive yearlings in Europe by Coolmore's first-crop sires U S Navy Flag and Mendelssohn over the last two days. The latter, lot 90, was bought for €235,000 by Daithi Harvey and Lindsay Laroche's Highland Yard and will be trained for Laroche by Nicolas Clement.

when in pursuit of Haras de Saint Pair's Kingman (GB) colt (lot 113) out of the listed winner Via Pisa (Fr) (Pivotal {GB}).

Having bought Saturday's session-topper, a Kingman half-sister to Native Trail (GB), for €950,000, the agent went to €850,000

for the colt, bred by Andreas Putsch in Normandy from a half-sister to the treble Japanese Grade 1 winner Admire Mars (Jpn) (Daiwa Major {Jpn}).

"He's an athletic colt from a very organic farm in Haras de Saint Pair," said Stroud, who has bought six yearlings for Godolphin over the last two days for €3,220,000.

They included lot 163, a Dubawi half-brother to G3 Prix Miesque winner Devant (Fr) (Showcasing {GB}) from Ecurie des Monceaux for €650,000.

The consignor is in its usual

slot at the head of the vendors' leaderboard with 28 yearlings sold for  $\leq$ 8,507,000.

#### **Classy Signings For Coolmore**

A yearling by France's champion sire Siyouni was also on the shopping list of the Coolmore team, which stands the stallion's Arc-winning son Sottsass (Fr) and went to €650,000 for another colt by him from the Ecurie Des Monceaux draft.

Lot 160 is the first foal of Correze (GB) (Shamardal), whose lone win may have come in the provinces but she has plenty to recommend her on paper as a daughter of the G3 Nell Gwyn S. winner Cloud Castle (GB) (In The Wings {GB}). She is also a half-sister to three stakes winners from a family which includes the high-class siblings Luso (GB) and Warrsan (Ire).

It was perhaps not a surprise to see MV Magnier come out on top of a bidding duel for Haras de Montaigu's Galileo half-sister to the Derby winner Wings Of Eagles (Fr) (Pour Moi {Ire}).

Having gone to €500,000 to buy the grey filly (lot 120) from the Forien family, he said, "She comes from a great breeder with a great history and she was a lovely filly. Let's hope she can run."

The family has received further updates this season through the exploits of G2 Prix Greffulhe winner Baby Rider (Fr)



(Gleneagles {Ire}), who is out of the filly's half-sister Gyrella (Fr) (Oasis Dream {GB}).

#### Father And Son Backed By Skiffington

Among three purchases at Arqana August, agent Amanda Skiffington signed for two of the more expensive yearlings of the day by Wootton Bassett (GB) and his son Almanzor (Fr) at €500,000 and €450,000, respectively. Cont. p8

Both were bought for Fiona Carmichael, with the colt by Wootton Bassett (lot 146) being the first foal of listed runner-up Bhageerathi (Ire) (Motivator {GB}). He was offered by Anna Sundstrom of Coulonces on behalf of Haras de Saint Laurent.

"He's just a really lovely colt by a horse I think is a seriously good stallion," said Skiffington. "That's the sort of price you have to go to to buy a horse like that."

Lot 121, the Almanzor filly from Haras des Capucines, received a dream update just hours before she went through the ring when her half-sister Who Knows (Fr) (Siyouni (Fr)) won the G3 Circus Maximus Prix Francois Boutin just across the road for a partnership consisting of Ecurie de Parc Monceau, co-breeder Gerard Larrieu, Eric Puerari and Hubert Guy.

Another half-sister, Poetic Dream (GB) (Poet's Voice {GB}), won the G2 Mehl Mulhens-Rennen and their dam Zain Al Boldan (GB) (Poliglote {GB}) was useful in her day as the winner of the Lingfield Oaks Trial.

Royal Story descends from the eight-time American Grade I winner Heavenly Prize, and this is her third foal. She was bred to Cracksman (GB) this spring.

This colt, the second foal out of the unraced Swedish Challenge (Hat Trick {Jpn}), was picked up by Avenir Bloodstock for €33,000 in this ring at the Argana December Sale last year. His page has seen some significant updates this season; his dam's half-sister Sweepstake (GB) (Acclamation {GB}) is now the dam of Group 1 winner Broome (GB) and Listed Chesham S. winner Point Lonsdale (GB), both also by Australia. Even with those two aside, the sire has had a productive season, and that was reflected in this colt's price on his second trip through the ring.

Crispin de Moubray went to 35,000gns to secure the multiple listed-winning and Group 3-placed Artistic Jewel (Ire) (Excellent Art (GB) at Tattersalls December in 2019 carrying this colt. At the time her first two foals were unraced and she had lost consecutive pregnancies, but connections were rewarded for their gamble when her Saxon Warrior colt became one of the star turns for a first-season sire at this sale. Her current 4-yearold Machine Gun (Ire) (Dark Angel (Ire)) had also become a winner in the interim. Artistic Jewel was bred to Wootton Bassett (GB) this spring.

#### 165 f Australia (GB) **Diamond Tango**

Justin Casse signed the ticket on this daughter of G2 Prix Pomone scorer Diamond Tango (Acatenago (Ger)) at 140,000gns at last year's Tattersalls December Foal Sale. The half-sister to G2 Doncaster Cup victor Desert Skyline (Tamayuz {GB}) proved a profitable pinhook.

Delivering his customary surge to shut down the gap in a moment, he was able to subdue the Bolger runner inside the final 150 metres and score a shade cosily by a neck, with Order of Australia 1 3/4 lengths away in third. In doing so, the 4-year-old who is unbeaten this year and has suffered one excusable reversal in his three seasons of racing equalled the feat of Miesque and Spinning World in completing back-to-back successes in this French monument, a "Win And You're In" for the GI FanDuel Breeders' Cup Mile Presented by PDJF at Del Mar in November.

"I love the horse--he's the best miler I've ridden," declared Frankie, who was equalling the record of Freddy Head with a sixth renewal. "He's beautiful. He's got everything, pace, a turn of foot and goes on any ground. We were rushing to get him here today--he lost a bunch of work, but he's so good we got away with it."

Dettori's winning haul in this began in 1999 with Dubai Millennium (GB), so to hear the rider of greats at the trip such as Dubawi (Ire) and Mark of Esteem (Ire) herald Palace Pier as the top in that category underlines the quality of the pride of Clarehaven. Unbeaten in two low-profile starts at Sandown at two, the bay failed to make it to the G1 2000 Guineas as a result of a setback but showed what Newmarket had missed a month later when denying Pinatubo (Ire) (Shamardal) in the G1 St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot. Prevailing with a degree of comfort from a different Alpine Star (Ire) (Sea the Moon {Ger}) to the one he encountered this time in last year's Jacques le Marois on testing ground, he carried an air of invulnerability into the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. on Champions Day but lost a shoe and any prospect of winning exiting the stalls before earning third through sheer ability alone. Giving the impression he was merely going through the motions in the Apr. 23 G2 Sandown Mile and the G1 Lockinge S. at Newbury May 15, Palace Pier was less demonstrative in the G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot June 15, an hour before Poetic Flare was exactly that in the St James's Palace. While the showdown between the generation leaders among their sex was postponed from the Sussex to here, the gap between them was clear to see as the year-older colt employed his superior acceleration to settle the question.

Caught wide throughout and following a rival in **Victor Ludorum (GB)** (Shamardal) who could not take him far enough,
Palace Pier had the distinct disadvantage of the two with Kevin
Manning enjoying as charmed a trip as is possible in this race.
Track, trip and ground were all on Poetic Flare's side and yet the
one who according to John Gosden was "80%" was able to win
snugly.

"I got on the tail of Mickael [Barzalona on Victor Ludorum] and kept an eye on Kevin--when he kicked, I went after him," Dettori explained. "I raced on my own for the last 200 metres and passed him good, but he came and fought me back. Apart from losing a shoe and having a bad start in the QEII last year, he's done nothing wrong and is a credit to the team."

While Alcohol Free (Ire) (No Nay Never) goes up in trip on

Wednesday, it may be that the true division champion at a mile is decided by the international handicappers at the end of the year. With Jeff Smith's electrifying filly probably headed for the QEII on Champions Day Oct. 16, Gosden, Sr. gave his clearest indication yet that Palace Pier could go up in distance for the G1 QIPCO Champion S.

"I wouldn't be frightened of stepping him up to a mile and a quarter, but I think we'll wait for Champions Day," he said. "With a horse like this, you don't want to come back too quickly and possibly run him a bit short so we'll wait and either go for the mile or the mile-and-a-quarter race then. The Breeders' Cup is a long way off, but I'm very fond of Del Mar as I had a lot of success there and have a lot of good friends there."

"I thought it was a very clean race and Ryan went a sensible pace on Order of Australia, controlling it and keeping it in hand. It was not a race to be sitting out the back and was a bit of a test of speed," Gosden added. "I made it clear he was coming here 80%, on the absolute minimum of work, but his class got him through. He was having a pretty strong blow after and was 10 days short for this, but they weren't going to move the Jaques le Marois and without it his season would be meaningless. He made a great move, but lack of fitness told at the end. He's a gorgeous horse, is a dual winner of the race and is top-class--he has an amazing cruising speed and acceleration." Cont. p13

Kevin Manning said of the gallant runner-up, "Poetic Flare ran a very good race. The horse again gave his best today and we are really over the moon with his effort."

Aidan O'Brien said of Order of Australia, "I think that the mile is a perfect trip for him, even on a straight course. He might even be able to go longer, but he has a high cruising speed. His end-of-year objective is the Breeders' Cup Mile and we'll see how he recovers from the race before deciding where he goes next, but the [G1] Prix du Moulin [de Longchamp on Sept. 5] isn't excluded. I'm very happy with his performance."

She was successful in the G3 Nell Gwyn S., GIII Noble Damsel Breeders' Cup H. and GIII Eatontown


S. and was also runner-up in the GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup and the G1 Coronation S. before producing the G2 UAE 2000 Guuineas scorer Kinglet (Kingmambo) and the G2 Derby Italiano runner-up King's Caper (GB) (New Approach {Ire}).

Miss Caerleona was also responsible for the GII Davona Dale H. winner Miss Coronado (Coronado's Quest), who in turn threw the stakes scorer and GI Las Virgenes S. third Arethusa (A.P. Indy) while the family also features the G1 1000 Guineas and G1 Irish Oaks heroine Blue Bunting (Dynaformer) and the top-level performers Girl Daddy (Uncle Mo) and Comicas (Distorted Humor). Beach Frolic's 2-year-old colt Highland Frolic (Fr) (Highland Reel {Ire}) was a 320,000gns purchase by McCalmont Bloodstock at the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale Book 1, which is where her yearling colt by Almanzor (Fr) is headed in two months' time.

# FASIG-TIPTON NY-BRED SALE RETURNS WITH STRONG OPENER



**Session-topping Hip 341 in the ring** | Fasig-Tipton

by Jessica Martini

SARATOGA SPRINGS, NY--The Fasig-Tipton New York-Bred Yearlings Sale, which had a string of record-setting renewals interrupted only by its cancellation due to the COVID-19 pandemic last summer, got back on track with a strong opening session at the Humphrey S. Finney Pavilion Sunday evening.

A total of 62 yearlings sold Sunday night for a gross of \$6,497,500. The average was \$104,798 and the median was \$80,000.

"It was an outstanding opening night to the 2021 New Yorkbred sale," said Fasig-Tipton President Boyd Browning. "I was thrilled to have the average over \$100,000 tonight. It's one of those milestones that we are trying to achieve. Hopefully the strength will continue tomorrow."

During the first session of the 2019 New York-bred sale, 66 horses sold for \$5,972,500. The average was \$90,492 and the median was \$75,000.

With 20 horses reported not sold Sunday, the buy-back rate was 24.4%. The corresponding figure in 2019 was 32%.

"As encouraging, or more encouraging, it was a very reasonable RNA rate tonight for the New York-bred sale," Browning said.





"In the past we've talked many times about the higher-thanaverage RNA rate because there are so many opportunities for the owners and breeders of these horses to race given the purse structure in the state," Browning continued. "The RNA rate tonight was certainly at an acceptable level. The momentum and enthusiasm from the selected sale continued tonight with a really strong marketplace with a diverse group of buyers."

Sunday's session was topped by a filly by Uncle Mo who was consigned by Tom Gallo on behalf of her co-breeders and was purchased by Gallo for his Dream Maker Racing partnership. The yearling was one of nine to bring over \$200,000.

"The market is fabulous," Gallo said. "I think this market is strong with people coming out of the pandemic with all of this pent-up enthusiasm and people who didn't get to spend their money last year. And this is a neat market because it's a middle market. It's a meat-and-potatoes market. People can come here and buy a decent horse for \$50,000, \$70,000 or \$100,000 or \$150,000 and, with the purses the way they are, if you get just a consistent horse that places a couple of times, wins, places again, you're already up to \$120,000 or \$150,000 in earnings. You may not break even for everything, but at least you have cash flow coming back."

The New York-bred Yearlings Sale continues Monday with a final session beginning at noon.


#### **Uncle Mo Filly a Dream for Gallo**

Tom Gallo was so impressed by a filly by Uncle Mo (hip 341) he was consigning for her co-breeders that he purchased her for his Dream Maker Racing partnership for a session-topping \$495,000 Sunday at Fasig-Tipton.

"Dream Maker Racing is a racing partnership that I manage," Gallo explained. "It's a group of people who bred her. All of the offspring are bred by Mia Gallo, Mary Kopley, Michael Newton and Elizabeth Weese--they are the ones who own the mare. We just set a price and if she didn't bring the price, we were just going to race her ourselves. But we have to sell it from the breeding partnership to the racing partnership."

Of the yearling, Gallo said, "We loved the filly. We absolutely loved her. I've loved her since the day she was born. She is a monster. From when she was young, she just had a mind of her own. We raise them as weanlings and then we ship them down to raise them in Kentucky. After she was weaned, if you went up to her and she didn't want to be nice, she would come at you with ears pinned as a baby. And that's rare. So I always liked that because you have to be like that. Sometimes you have to be like that to be competitive and win races."

Dream Maker Racing also campaigned the yearling's half-sister Satisfy (Candy Ride {Arg}), who was second in the 2018 Iroquois S. Like that filly, hip 341 will be trained by Bill Mott.



"Bill Mott has trained the whole family and he will be training her--he just doesn't know it yet," Gallo said. "But he's done well with the family. We had the granddam, and we bred and raced the mother and now we are racing her babies. And we even have one of her daughters who just had a foal. So now we are on the fourth generation. And Bill is a breeder's trainer. He trains for people that race daughters of daughters. He is such an intelligent guy and he remembers the traits of the family. So it gives you a little bit of a jump start on the horse."

#### **Ingordo Stays Bullish on Accelerate**

Lane's End's David Ingordo has made no secret of how much he has been impressed by offspring of the farm's first-crop sire Accelerate, and the bloodstock agent acquired another yearling by the GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner when going to \$335,000 late in Sunday's first session of the Fasig-Tipton New York-Bred Yearlings Sale.

"I was staying true to my *TDN* article where I said we would be trying to buy Accelerates," Ingordo said with a smile after signing the ticket on hip 385. "We bought a beautiful colt in July and I saw this filly and she has got everything you'd want to have. I love her female family. She has the New York-bred to fall back on if we need it, but she looks like an open company horse. She is an excellent representation of what Accelerate is producing." *Cont. p4* 

The filly, who will be trained in California with John Sadler, is out of Delay of Game (Bernardini). The mare's half-sister is the dam of graded stakes winner Stanford (Malibu Moon) and multiple grade-placed Hedge Fund (Super Saver).

"They are like himself, really balanced individuals with a ton of class," Ingordo said of what he is seeing in Accelerate's first crop of yearlings. "This filly oozed class. She's been by the ring all night and didn't turn a hair and came up here really well.

Accelerate himself is a beautifully-balanced horse and this filly is just like him. She is out of a Bernardini mare. I couldn't get much more."


Of the yearling's final price, Ingordo said, "She is a good horse and she costs what a good horse costs. She was expensive, but we loved her."

The bay filly, consigned by St George Sales, was another success out of Delay of Game for Dan Hayden's EKQ Stables. Hayden purchased Delay of Game in foal to Street Sense for \$90,000 at the 2017 Keeneland November sale. Her Street Sense filly sold for \$260,000 at the 2019 Keeneland September sale and her Classic Empire colt sold for \$310,000 at last year's Fasig-Tipton October sale.

#### Army Mule Filly an Emotional Score for O'Neill

After watching his filly by Army Mule (hip 314) sell for \$300,000 to Maverick Racing/Siena Farm Sunday night at Fasig-Tipton, Windylea Farm's Kip O'Neill dedicated the result to his late father and Windylea founder Philip O'Neill, who passed earlier this year. The yearling is out of Whispering Angel (Hard Spun), a mare the father-son team purchased for just \$3,000 at the 2019 Keeneland January sale.

"This is for my dad," O'Neill said. "He died in March. He and I bought that mare together. And when we bought her for \$3,000, we looked at each other and said, 'What are we missing?' Obviously, we got lucky." *Cont. p5*

The yearling was consigned by Francis and Barbara Vanlangendonck's Summerfield and while the team celebrated the successful sale in the back of the pavilion, Barbara Vanlangendonck explained with a broad smile, "He told me he had three horses and asked which one we wanted and we picked this one."

Just four months after the O'Neills purchased Whispering Angel, her son Wells Bayou (Lookin At Lucky) won the GII Louisiana Derby.

"The mare is kind of our franchise mare," O'Neill said of Whispering Angel. "She is a big, strapping Hard Spun mare and she was successful on the track. She only raced three times and she had some bone spurring, nothing major. So they decided to retire her and sell her. She had slipped a Kitten's Joy filly and that's probably how she slipped to us."

Of the yearling, O'Neill said, "She's been very forward since she was born. She's been a beautiful filly. It took her a while for it to come together. It's a testament to our staff, they did a fabulous job getting her ready. We are thrilled with the connections that bought her. We wish them the best and we'll see where we go from there."

Whispering Angel is currently in foal to Speightstown and has a full-brother to Wells Bayou by her side.


Windylea Farm has a broodmare band of 23 head.

"Our plan is to sell," O'Neill said. "You've got to sell from the top and the middle. It's hard to sell from the bottom. So those we end up racing or finding a different career for."

Hip 314 was the first Windylea horse to go through the ring at the New York-bred sale.

"Two more tonight and two tomorrow," O'Neill said of the rest of the yearlings scheduled to sell in Saratoga. "If we better this, I'd be some shocked. She was the queen."

"He was a really nice colt," Winter Quarter's Don Robinson said. "I actually thought he would do better. But I am perfectly happy with what he brought. The mare has been really good. The family has been fantastic for us. I am perfectly happy and a really smart guy bought him, Tom McGreevey. He never wavered."



#### A Chicagoan's Premature Goodbye to Arlington cont. from p1

Trained by Jerry D. McGrath, she made her first few Chicago appearances in allowance company at Hawthorne (purse \$9,700), but she eventually found her level at Arlington the next summer, finishing second with Pat Day for \$11,500 claiming before winning two starts later on the grass under John Lively for \$13,000. She got her picture taken twice in 32 starts, she earned a shade more than \$27,000.

Roughly diagonal from my home, at 707 Clearwater Court, resided Paul Levy, a dark-skinned, shortish man who looked the part of a horseplayer (maybe even a bigger gambler than I ever realized). My parents were friendlier with the Levys than they were with the Loebmanns. Paul was a gambler, but did not own any horses. In my early teens, Paul would take me and his stepson, my classmate Michael, to the track, where we'd try to turn two bucks into an undefined larger sum by betting show parlays. I remember vividly that Paul wanted no part of Sunny's Halo when the 1983 GI Kentucky Derby winner shipped in for the GI Arlington Classic. He insisted Play Fellow was the right horse. He was not wrong and got paid nearly 5-1 for that opinion.

Between my two neighbors, a lifelong fan was created. I attended my first Arlington Million a few months later, its third running. John Henry was looking to add to his victory in the inaugural renewal of America's original seven-figure race, but when it was announced that the turf condition was to be listed as 'good,' I turned my attention to an easy-ground loving horse trained by someone called Luca Cumani. I knew nothing of him, nor was I remotely aware that placings in races like the 2000 Guineas, St James's Palace, Eclipse S. and Sussex S. were a highly positive thing. In any event, the task seemed extremely tall for Tolomeo and Pat Eddery, the tote read 38-1 (well, probably read 30-1, to be fair). I proudly bet \$2 to show and watched Tolomeo

knife through late to take down 'Big John.' He paid \$17.80 to show. What did I know from exactas, er, perfectas? I was only 16 and probably wasn't supposed to be betting at all. Tolomeo remains the only 3-year-old winner of the Million to this day. And John got his second in emphatic style the next summer, defeating Robert Sangster's future GI Breeders' Cup Mile winner Royal Heroine (whose sire Lypheor was also responsible for Tolomeo) and Gato del Sol.

Having graduated WHS in 1985, I took a trip to Germany (I'd been named student of the year in the language, hold your applause), but I got desperately homesick, flew home a few days early. Not long after my return, on July 31, and just a couple of weeks before I was set to enter freshman year at the University of Illinois, I learned that the track was on fire. It felt like I could reach out and grab the tower of black smoke all the way from 1518 Clearwater. I got in my Chevy Impala, drove that direction and somehow managed to watch the conflagration from the adjacent train station parking lot. One of the saddest sights I have ever seen. You all know of the never-say-die attitude of Richard L. Ducchossois, the tent city, Teleprompter defeating Greinton to win the 'Miracle Million.'

I became a bit disconnected from racing while in college, though I did make the occasional visit to the OTB in Champaign. I moved back to Wheeling in the early 1990s and met up with Walt, Bill and Jerry, older gentlemen from nearby suburbs, and my friend to this day Rob, roughly my age and who--more than any other person--is responsible for stoking my interest in racing. Every Saturday, without fail, we'd meet on the Arlington apron, watch the horses gallop around, listen to backstretch banter, handicap and plan for that afternoon's rendezvous.

In 1995, I had a close-up with Mariah's Storm. That was cool, given how she has impacted the Thoroughbred breed over the last two-plus decades. Mariah and the locally based Golden Gear were the first two horses I got to know 'up close and personal' that went on to the Breeders' Cup.

I also made the acquaintance of a trainer named Neil Pessin, made my first trip to Keeneland that fall, an overnight car ride with Rob, had breakfast at the Keeneland track kitchen, fell asleep waiting to see A.P. Indy at Lane's End. True story. By the way, did you know Neil ran one in the Million? Coaxing Matt was sixth to Star of Cozzene (minus Lure) in terrible ground in '93.

The 1995 Million holds a very special place all these years later. My late father wasn't much of a racing fan, but he quickly pored over the PPs and asked me to bet on Awad for him. With the late Kevin Goemmer on the mic that year and with dad listening on the radio (WBBM, I think, maybe WIND), David Donk's long-winded galloper took advantage of a lively pace to beat Sandpit (Brz) at nearly 6-1, adding to his 22-1 upset of the GI Secretariat S. two years prior. Marlin completed that same double in 1996/1997 (Stevens masterfully walked the dog) before the track closed for two years.

In the summer of '96, I got to feel what it might have been like when Secretariat paid a visit to Arlington some 23 years earlier. Cigar put better than 34,000 into the stands July 13, looking to equal Citation's modern-day record of 16 victories in a row. With 130 pounds and the weight of the Thoroughbred world on his

back, the Horse of the Year turned for home to a deafening roar from the crowd and rolled to a comfortable success. He received a hero's welcome when he came back in front of the stands. Sure glad I decided to leave the company picnic that day to see my equine hero. It ranks as easily my most memorable and thrilling moment as a horse racing fan.

Right there in my backyard.

To herald the return of the Million in 2000, the purse was doubled and Juddmonte's Chester House--maybe the best-feeling horse I've ever seen in the build-up to a big race--gave Bobby Frankel his first of two Millions. Beat Hollow took the 2002 renewal for a mere \$1-million pot. Speaking of 2002, the gang and I sat out on the apron freezing our butts off for the only Breeders' Cup hosted by the track. Couldn't have had Volponi, but did cash a nice bet on Vindication.

Other names to grace the Million trophy include the venerable The Tin Man, the versatile Gio Ponti, the popular Little Mike. In 2015, I made a non-working trek to visit my brother out in the far Northwest suburbs and dragged my three kids with (their first plane flight, too). They each were given four \$2 win tickets (I guess I kept one of the longshots). My middle stepdaughter was recipient of the \$13.80 returned by Illinois-bred The Pizza Man. On a dad/daughter visit to the *TDN*'s Red Bank offices, Maddie 'drew' The Pizza Man on a dry erase board. It still hangs proudly on the fridge a half-dozen years later.

As it was for fans to say goodbye to places like Garden State Park and Bay Meadows, and Suffolk Downs and Atlantic City and Hollywood Park, it was not easy walking out of the paddock for the last time after Saturday's Million (as much respect as I have for Mr. Duchossois, I can't, just can't).

I will not forget the countless winter Saturdays and Sundays spent upstairs at the Trackside OTB, a place I left a successful Derby future wager on a horse named Monarchos. The place where a vocal contingent of Jamaicans loved to cheer on horses like Jack's Big Mac (pronounced Jacques-a-big-mock).

There was that time standing in front of a bank of TVs (I think this pre-dated full-card simulcasting) getting ready to watch the 1996 GII Suburban H. Next thing I know, a bespectacled older gentleman steps over in my direction and encourages me to 'bet Wekiva (Springs), big.' The push came from long-time Chicago *Sun-Times* turf writer Dave Feldman.

I will always remember scooting over to the track from home or zipping up Route 53 after cutting out of work early when you could get in for free after the seventh to see the likes of Jeremy Jet and Fritz Barthold and Harham's Sizzler and Gee Can He Dance and The Vid. Little Bro Lantis, Mr. Springfield, Downtown Clown, Katie Be Fast, Hunk of Class, Crown's Way. Horses like Kuma, Major Dandy, You Dancing Devil and Soccory.

Asiel Stable runners like Bonita Meadow, trained by the legendary Richard Hazelton, the familiar green-and-yellow colors of top Illinois breeders Team Block. And all those Noel Hickey-trained Irish Acres runners, like Classic Fit and Buck's Nephew and Classic Fit and Thesunshinesbright. Maybe even a Buck's Boy sighting.

Those were good times. Shame there won't be more. All good things must come to an end, or so they say. Farewell, Arlington. I sure am going to miss you.

## THINK YOU'RE A NAVARRO VICTIM? GET IN LINE

Now that the barred Thoroughbred trainer Jorge Navarro has admitted in open court that he doped racehorses and procured performance-enhancing drugs [PEDs] for others between 2016 and 2020, the industry has a \$25,860,514 question to kick around between now and when "The Juice Man" gets sentenced Dec. 17.

Beyond Navarro's potential five-year prison term and possible deportation back to his native Panama, the 46-year-old conditioner also must pay restitution to victims in that astronomical amount as per the stipulations of his plea bargain.

Although it is unclear exactly how federal prosecutors arrived at that precise figure, a press release from the United States Attorney's Office (Southern District of New York) states that it reflects "winnings obtained through his fraudulent doping scheme."

Most likely, the calculation is based on the purse earnings of Navarro's trainees in races that prosecutors deemed he ran doped horses.

As part of the deal he cut with the feds (Navarro pled guilty to one felony count of conspiring to administer misbranded and adulterated drugs in exchange for having a similar second count dropped), Navarro had to affirm to Judge Mary Kay Vyskocil that the government was citing a proper amount of restitution.

For perspective, that massive dollar figure equates to nearly 75% of all the purse winnings Navarro's horses amassed during his 15-year training career.

Whether or not Navarro will ever be able to pay such a daunting amount of restitution based on gross purse winnings (and not the actual net profits from his crimes) is the obvious question.

Equally important--but perhaps more of an exercise in theoretical justice--is who exactly qualifies as a victim of Navarro's crimes to be eligible for restitution?

Let's tackle the "ability to pay" aspect first.

According to a U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ) explanation of the restitution process, "In federal cases, restitution in the hundreds of thousands or millions of dollars is not unusual. While defendants may make partial payments toward the full restitution owed, it is rare that defendants are able to fully pay the entire restitution amount owed. If and when the defendant pays, you most likely will receive a number of small payments over a long period of time..."

"Realistically...the chance of full recovery is very low. Many defendants will not have sufficient assets to repay their victims. Many defendants owe very large amounts of restitution to a large number of victims."

A separate 2019 explanation from the Congressional Research Service (CRS) states that "Federal prosecutors collect roughly \$1 billion a year for the victims of federal crimes. Yet prosecutors will likely never secure more than \$1 out of every \$10 owed." *Cont. p12* 

As for who qualifies for restitution, that CRS publication offers only broad clues: "As a general rule, a victim is a person [or a business or some other entity] who is physically injured, or who suffers a property loss, as the proximate result of a qualifying offense. A victim may also be someone named as a beneficiary in a plea bargain."

The logical leap for many racing industry participants is that the people who suffered purse losses by getting beaten by Navarro's hopped-up horses should be at the top of the list for qualifying as victims.

But just think of what a formidable task it would be for federal officials to try and account for each and every racing entity (owners, trainers, jockeys) who is owed some sort of payback for their losses. The effort would span years of races across multiple jurisdictions, and would take on an additional layer of difficulty because some horse ownerships are comprised of multiple individual partners.

And what about bettors who otherwise would have hit winning tickets if Navarro's doped runners didn't taint the outcomes of potentially thousands of races? (This also presumes that they could properly document any pari-mutuel losses to Navarro's juiced horses.)

The good news is that according to the DOJ, there is actually a provision for large numbers of unknown victims to come forward and ask to be included in restitution when authorities don't know the names of each and every individual.

Instead of listing specific victims, the restitution order could say something broad like, "Anyone who owned, trained or rode a horse that finished behind a Navarro trainee in the following list of races." It would then be the victims' responsibility to come forward and make themselves known.

But the bad news for potential claimants is that federal prosecutors--and the judge--could decide that trying to process such a humongous volume of claims is just too cumbersome a task at a time when the legal system is already overburdened.

In that instance, the DOJ states that, "A court may decline to order restitution if it finds that determining restitution in a case is too complex."

TDN attempted to contact the U.S. Attorney's office in New York several times last week to try and get a general idea of who might be identified as victims in Navarro's case and what the restitution process might look like.

We're still waiting for a call back from the feds.

It's important to note that Navarro's nearly \$26 million in restitution is different and separate from the \$70,000 forfeiture that he must pay the government before his sentencing date. That amount represents the value of adulterated drugs that prosecutors deemed Navarro transacted via interstate commerce.

Since the actual drugs themselves cannot be located to be forfeited--presumably, those PEDs long ago coursed through the systems of X Y Jet, War Story, Shancelot, Sharp Azteca, and numerous other Thoroughbreds that Navarro has admitted to drugging--he must forfeit the monetary value of those drugs to the government instead.

Back on Aug. 3, Kristian Rhein, a now-suspended veterinarian formerly based at Belmont Park, changed his plea to guilty on one felony count of drug adulteration and misbranding for use in the covert doping of racehorses. At that hearing it was revealed that the working number the feds are alleging co-defendant Jason Servis won illegally with his purportedly doped trainees is also roughly \$26 million.

That's half the \$52 million in purses that Servis's trainees bankrolled during his entire two-decade training career between 2001 and 2020.

If Servis ends up getting convicted at a trial (or changes his "not guilty" plea like six other defendants have already done), it's expected that he will be on the hook for that amount in restitution.

Let's assume that Servis, like Navarro, will be unlikely to meet that obligation.

What then, is the purpose of mandating such a large financial penalty if the DOJ is well aware most victims only end up collecting 10 cents on the dollar?

Part of the answer has to do with federal sentencing guidelines.

All sorts of aspects of a crime affect sentencing levels. For example, if a defendant is deemed to have abused a position of public trust, or used a special skill in a manner that facilitated the commission or concealment of the offense (which both Navarro and Rhein admitted to as part of their plea bargains), the penalties increase by two sentencing levels. *Cont. p13* 

But another part of the guidelines states that if a conspiracy causes a financial loss to victims in the range of \$25 million to \$65 million, the severity of the crime gets bumped up by a much more serious factor of 22 levels.

So even if victims never see any of the money that is due to them via restitution, the fact that both Navarro and Rhein affirmed in their plea bargains that roughly \$26 million was the amount of the losses they caused others to incur, it can have significant bearing on how long they'll be sentenced to prison. Hitting that lofty \$25-million-loss mark is a key component to stricter sentencing.

If it's any solace to potential victims, remember that federal restitution orders are enforceable for 20 years. So even if Navarro serves his maximum sentence of five years and walks out of jail a free man, victims can still hound him for money 15 years beyond that by securing liens against any property he might have or by suing him in civil court based on his criminal conduct that led to the conviction and issuance of the restitution order.

And here's one last thought: Although it's unlikely to happen, wouldn't it be amazing if Judge Vyskocil declared in the restitution order that the true victims in this case are not people, but all of the Thoroughbreds known to be doped by Navarro?

And in lieu of awarding payments to those individual equine victims, how about if the court instead assigned the restitution benefits to accredited Thoroughbred aftercare and welfare organizations?

Those organizations would probably never get all \$25,860,514. But even if Navarro was made to pay as much as he possibly could over the next two decades to help horses, it would seem like fitting retribution as well as worthwhile restitution.

## TIMELINE FOR HISA IMPLEMENTATION COMES INTO CLEARER FOCUS

With the July 1, 2022, implementation date looming for the nationwide regulatory Authority mandated by the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act (HISA) to go into effect, Charles Scheeler, the chairman of the Authority's board of directors, on Sunday outlined the timetable for the sport's new ruling body to be fully operational.

Speaking via pre-recorded video during Sunday's 69th Annual Round Table Conference on Matters Pertaining to Racing that was hosted virtually by The Jockey Club (TJC), Scheeler said the Authority is currently developing its anti-doping and safety programs side by side, and that by the fall those initiatives will

be shared publicly in an effort to generate feedback.

"All of this will be before we submit these proposed rules to the Federal Trade Commission (FTC), which is what is required by the Act," Scheeler said. "And then [the FTC] will make them public; publish them in the Federal Register for a 60-day period of notice and comment. So the industry will get a second bite at the apple--another chance to comment on these rules.

"After the 60 days, the FTC will decide whether to approve all or some of these rules. We hope that they approve all of the rules that we submit to them. And then they have to be posted and finalized for a four-month period of time. So no later than Mar. 1, 2022, for these rules to become operative on [July 1, 2022]," Scheeler said.

"We will also, in the late fall and winter, be sharing with state racing commissions our estimates of the costs for the coming year. That is required by the Act to occur no later than Apr. 1. But it is our goal to get those numbers to the states months and months in advance of the event," Scheeler said.

"And then, July 1, we will go live together with a new system to enforce the anti-doping and medication laws, and to make the tracks safer, and to make the sport fair for everyone," Scheeler said.

But that timetable for implementation could face legal pushback in the form of lawsuits initiated by the National Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association (National HBPA) and several state racing commissions.

Speaking in a separate section of the Round Table video presentation, TJC's chairman, Stuart Janney III, said such obstructionist tactics won't prevail in the long run.

"They defend the status quo with lawsuits that are effectively protecting a few bad trainers, veterinarians, and horsemen at the expense of those who are honest," Janney said. *Cont. p14* 

"They offer nothing in the alternative other than worn-out notions of state-by-state compacts in defense of the same broken system."

Janney also reiterated a prediction he made during last August's Round Table video presentation that more federal arrests of alleged horse dopers are in the pipeline.

Six of 28 defendants arrested in March 2020 have already pleaded guilty to felony charges in the federal government's prosecution of an alleged "corrupt scheme" to manufacture, mislabel, rebrand, distribute, and administer performance-enhancing drugs to racehorses all across America and in international races.

Elsewhere in the two-hour Round Table presentation, two Columbia University researchers--Dr. Yuval Neria, a professor of medical psychology, and Dr. Prudence Fisher, an associate professor of clinical psychiatric social work--gave an update on the Man O' War Project, which uses Thoroughbreds in equine-assisted therapy (EAT) to treat veterans with post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD).

"We plan on capitalizing on our work so far by creating the Man O' War Center at Columbia University," Fisher said. "And its mission will be to advance the promising field of EAT. The center will coordinate and carry out many initiatives that further our work."

Neria said another goal is to provide EAT training to others in the field.

"Over the last two to three years, we have been approached by many programs who are eager to learn from us and implement our protocols," Neria said. "[And] we plan to adapt our protocols for use with other groups beyond veterans with PTSD. For example, children and adolescents, and also others. With support from Ambassador [Earle] Mack, this fall we will be carrying out a pilot study with anxious youths."

Fisher added that research work on the original protocols will be expanded by undertaking a randomized, controlled trial later this year.

"This would be a larger study, and we plan on partnering with other sites that we will train to make it work," Fisher said.

Neria added that "a critically important part of our mission is to expand the number of retired Thoroughbred racehorses that are used in the EAT programs."

#### PLETCHER TESTS POSITIVE FOR COVID-19

Trainer Todd Pletcher has tested positive for COVID-19, and will continue to isolate until Thursday, he confirmed via text Sunday morning.

Pletcher, who was inducted into the Hall of Fame Friday, Aug. 6, said that he sought out the test after experiencing allergy-like symptoms and after a co-worker tested positive.

"I got the results back this morning," he said via text. "Starting Monday, I thought I was experiencing some allergies. Since I've been vaccinated, I wasn't concerned as I didn't have any traditional COVID symptoms. Late Friday, a co-worker tested positive so I decided to get a PCR test yesterday and started isolation. This morning, the results returned positive. I feel fine but will follow recommendations and stay put until Thursday."

A PCR, or polymerase chain reaction test, is considered the most accurate test for diagnosing COVID-19.

Pletcher said that he did not attend the Monday and Tuesday evening sessions of the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Yearling sale, but did look at horses earlier in the day on the sales grounds.

Pletcher is currently third in the Saratoga trainer standings with 14 wins.

Olympic Runner closed out a strong weekend for Gary Barber and Mark Casse when rallying to his first graded stakes win in Sunday's GII King Edward S. at Woodbine while setting a new course record.

Winner of the King Corrie S. over the local main track two summers ago, the gelding went winless while racking up five seconds in his next nine starts before getting off the schneid with a last-to-first rally in a Gulfstream allowance/optional claimer Jan. 23. A close runner-up in the GIII Canadian Turf S. there Feb. 27, he was last in the GII Muniz Memorial Classic S. Mar. 20 at Fair Grounds and off the board in the Elusive Quality S. and Seek Again S. at Belmont before just missing by a neck when second in the GII Connaught Cup S. here July 18.

Off as the fifth choice in this spot behind heavily-favored stablemate March to the Arch, Olympic Runner traveled in fifth at the rail behind a :23.33 quarter. Inching closer after a sharp :45.75 half, the dark bay set his sights on frontrunning Town Cruise as he passed six furlongs in a blazing 1:08.12. Well-bet Background shipped in to get the money in Sunday's GIII Longacres Mile H. at Emerald Downs, the Seattle-area track's annual meet centerpiece.

A winner just once in his first eight career outings, the chestnut found his groove with a 34-1 upset in a sloppy Oaklawn allowance Feb. 27 and captured another allowance there two starts later Apr. 23. Runner-up in an Arlington all-weather allowance/optional claimer June 5, he was a hard-luck loser in the Hanshin Cup S. there three weeks later, dueling the evenmoney favorite into a last-place finish through sharp fractions before just getting tagged by a head on the wire.

Backed down to favoritism here off a 5-1 morning-line quote, the gelding was caught five wide going into the clubhouse turn before gradually angling over to the three path to sit in sixth behind dueling leaders through scorching splits of :22.94 and :45.34. Advancing after three-quarters in 1:09.73, he appeared to have too much to do to catch longshot Windribbon, who inhaled the tiring pace players three-sixteenths out, but kept to his task as that rival began to flatten in deep stretch, and just surged past in the shadow of the wire to score.

"Unbelievable, I have no voice left at all," said winning coowner Bob Rondeau, the longtime voice of University of Washington football and basketball. "[In mid-stretch I thought] there's no way in the world he wins that race, but [Background] had the wherewithal to pull it off. This is an unimaginable thrill."

Winning rider Rocco Bowen, a three-time leading rider at Emerald who had since moved his tack to the Midwest, was emotional after capturing his first Longacres Mile.

"I can't believe it ... finally," Bowen said. "I knew Background wasn't done; we fought together out there."

#### **Pedigree Notes:**

With the victory, Background becomes the ninth stakes winner, second graded stakes winner and first North American graded victor for Journeyman Stud's Khozan--his other graded scorer is Airbus (Per), who took Peru's G1 Monterrico Clasico Polla de Potrillos last summer. His dam is a half to SW/MGSP Leonides (Richter Scale), while his second dam is a half to four-time GSW North East Bound (D'Accord). He has an unraced 3-year-old Fury Kapcori half-sister named Make History, a juvenile full-brother named Aztec, a yearling full-sister named Esoteric and a weanling full-brother. Ephyra visited Khozan once more this spring.
