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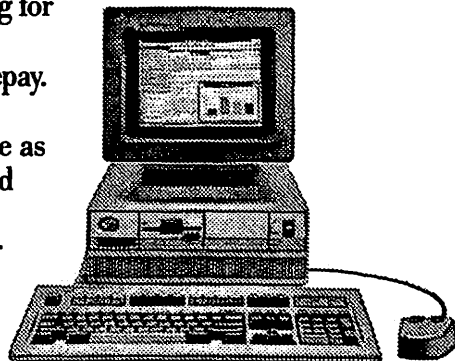
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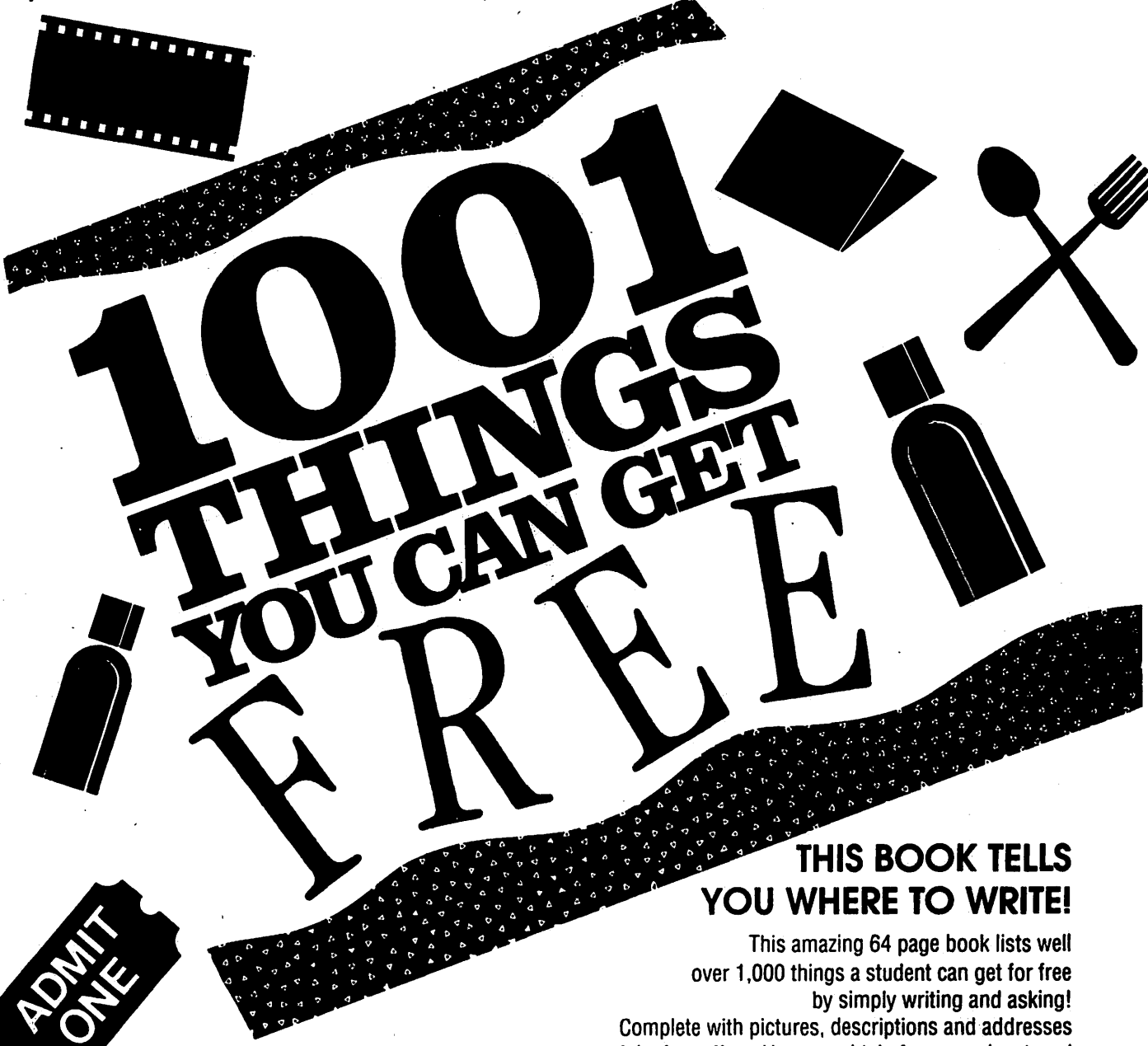
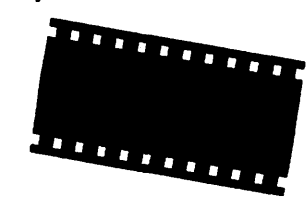

ADDING/DROPPING COURSES OR UNIVERSITY WITHDRAWAL

- March 30.....Last day for Spring Quarter complete withdrawal from the University without owing tuition or fee.
- March 30.....Last day to add a course without instructor's permission.
- March 30.....Last day to add or drop a course without being assessed a \$20 change fee.
- March 30.....Last day for graduate students to apply for on-leave status.
- March 30.....Last day to make change to or from S/NS grade option.
- April 2-24.....One-half tuition due if officially withdrawing completely from the University for Spring Quarter.
- April 6.....Last day to drop a course without entry on transcript. (W is assigned beginning April 9).

TUITION/FEE ASSESSMENTS AND DEADLINES

REGISTRATION PERIODS

STAR REGISTRATION

The University of Washington's touchtone telephone registration system is referred to as STAR-Student Telephone Assisted Registration. STAR registers students in course sections immediately and accommodates subsequent course adds and course drops, immediate alternative section availability if the requesting sections are closed or cancelled, spoken listing of confirmed registration schedule, and open/closed status of course sections. The touchtone telephone registration system is available through the fifth class day of the quarter.

REGISTRATION PERIOD I

Via STAR

February 12-March 1, 6 a.m. to 12 midnight

March 2, 6 a.m. to 6 p.m.

STAR is closed February 19 for Presidents' Day.

ELIGIBILITY. This period is open only for continuing students currently enrolled Winter Quarter 1990. Priority registration dates are based on your completed credits plus Winter Quarter 1990 credits registered in as of February 9. You may call STAR on, or after, your registration date to register and make changes to your schedule. The priority registration schedule follows:

REGISTRATION CONFIRMATION AND ID CARDS WILL BE MAILED ON MARCH 6. You may also confirm your registration schedule by calling STAR and using the List Schedule Transaction (L #). This listing includes building and classroom locations.

REGISTRATION PERIOD II

via STAR

March 5-21, 6 a.m. to 12 midnight

March 22, 6 a.m. to 6 p.m.

March 23, STAR closes to produce Class Lists.

ELIGIBILITY. This period is primarily for newly admitted students and returning former students. Advising/registration notice of dates are mailed to newly admitted or readmitted students. You may register on, or after, your date. Continuing students may access STAR any day during this period.

REGISTRATION CONFIRMATION AND ID CARDS. If registered March 5 through 9, Registration Confirmation and ID cards will be mailed on March 12.

If registered March 12 through 22, Registration Confirmations and ID Cards available to be picked up in person in the Registration Office, second floor, Schmitz Hall after 10 a.m. on the weekday morning following a call to STAR before 5:30 p.m. the prior day. If STAR is called after 5:30 p.m., the Registration Confirmation and ID Card will be available two working days after 10 a.m. in the Registration Office.

You may also confirm your registration schedule by calling STAR and using the List Schedule Transaction (L #). This listing includes building and classroom locations.

CHANGE OF REGISTRATION CONFIRMATIONS. Registration Change Confirmations will be mailed periodically. You may also confirm your registration schedule by calling STAR and using the List Schedule Transaction (L #). This listing includes building and classroom locations.

ELIGIBILITY. This period is open to all students for late registration and for changes to registration schedules. A \$25 late registration fee is assessed and billed to students registering March 24 - April 1, except for faculty/staff tuition exempt and ACCESS students. No fee is assessed for changes of registration.

You are encouraged to register and complete changes to registration earlier in this period to avoid being blocked from reaching STAR on March 30 due to heavy phone usage. (Additional fees for changes of registration go into effect Monday, April 2)

ADD GUIDELINES. You may add a section without permission through the fifth class day unless the class is full or requires permission in which case an entry code is required. The Registrar's Office will accept course overload authorization up to 115% of classroom capacity when you present an entry code from either the instructor or other authorized person in the department.

NEW REGISTRATION CONFIRMATIONS AND ID CARDS. Registration Confirmations and ID Cards will not be mailed but may be picked up in person in the Registration Office, second floor, Schmitz Hall after 10 a.m. on the weekday morning following a call to STAR before 5:30 p.m. the prior day. If STAR is called after 5:30 p.m., the Registration Confirmation and ID Card will be available two working days after 10 a.m. in the Registration Office.

CHANGE OF REGISTRATION CONFIRMATIONS. Change confirmations will be mailed on April 2. You may also confirm your registration schedule by calling STAR and using the List Schedule Transaction (L #). This listing includes building and classroom locations.

EXCEPTION PERIOD

April 2-June 1

Sections Office, 264 Schmitz

8 a.m.-5 p.m. Monday-Friday

This period is open for late registration, and late adds and drops. A \$20 fee is assessed for changes of registration. New registrants are assessed \$25 through April 6, and \$75 beginning April 9. STAR is not in operation and entry codes are not valid.

ADDING COURSES. From April 2 through the remainder of the quarter, an add will be approved only under unusual circumstances. You must obtain departmental authorization signatures using Add/Drop cards. All Add/Drop cards must be submitted in person at the Sections Office.

From April 2-27, course adds will be accepted with departmental authorization signatures, usually the instructor, but only up to 105% of the classroom capacity of the course section.

From April 30-June 1, course adds require the signatures of both the instructor and the department chairperson of the department offering the course. Registration will not be permitted if enrollment has reached 100% of classroom capacity.

DROPPING COURSES. Refer to Grading Information Related to Registration section.

NONMATRICULATED STUDENTS

March 21, 6 a.m. to midnight, via STAR

March 22, 6 a.m. to 6 p.m., via STAR

Because nonmatriculated students register after all other students, enrollment may be closed especially in the following areas: mathematics, English composition, beginning foreign languages (particularly French and Spanish), business, and art.

Nonmatriculated students who register after March 22 will be charged a \$25 late registration fee if registering by the tenth day of the quarter, and \$75 after the tenth day of the quarter.

FACULTY/STAFF TUITION EXEMPTION

March 16-UW Faculty/Staff Tuition Exemption Request Card due in Sections

March 21, 6 a.m. to midnight, via STAR

March 22, 6 a.m. to 6 p.m., via STAR

APPROVAL REQUIRED. With the approval of their department administrator, regularly admitted UW faculty and staff members who have been employed full-time for six months or more prior to first day of the quarter may take up to 6 credits per quarter under the tuition exemption program. According to legislative action, all registrations must be on a space-available basis after other matriculated students have registered.

ADMISSION STATUS. Faculty/staff members who wish to enroll as matriculated students must be officially admitted by the Office of Admissions by the regular admission closing date; February 1 is the closing date for Spring Quarter. Faculty/staff members who are former students returning in either the same classification or as nonmatriculated students should apply at the Registration Office, window 7, second floor, Schmitz Hall. Applications will be accepted up to the beginning of the quarter.

HOW TO REGISTER. Mail, or present in person, an appropriately signed UW Faculty/Staff Tuition Exemption Request Card to Sections Office, 264 Schmitz, Mailstop PD-10. This card must be received no later than March 16 to ensure the tuition exemption status will be recognized when STAR is called. Complete the STAR Work Sheet before calling in. **FACULTY AND STAFF WILL NOT BE PERMITTED TO CONVERT TO THE TUITION EXEMPTION PROGRAM IF THEY HAVE ALREADY REGISTERED FOR SPRING QUARTER PRIOR TO MARCH 21, AND THEY WILL BE REQUIRED TO PAY REGULAR TUITION FOR THOSE CREDITS.**

If using a Merlin phone on the UW campus to call STAR, press the # sign key twice to send transactions.

Tuition-exempt faculty/staff are not entitled to other student services such as those available at the Hall Health Center and the Intramural Activities Building. Therefore, UW student cards will not be issued to faculty and staff. Faculty/staff identification cards may be used for library services.

FEE PAYMENT. The \$5 registration fee will be billed, but only if registration has successfully occurred.

LATE REGISTRATION. If registration or drop/add is necessary the first week of the quarter, use STAR or one of the Sections Satellites. The late registration fee will not be assessed during this period for faculty and staff in the tuition exemption program.

MARCH 22, 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. open to any ACCESS student who missed the previous registration time.

The University of Washington waives tuition for Washington residents sixty years or older who wish to attend classes as auditing students, on a space-available basis. The fee is \$5, whether one or two courses are attended. As auditors, they do not receive credit and are not expected to do laboratory work or to take examinations. A transcript is not maintained. Students who attend the University under the Access program are limited to two courses per quarter.

Registration may be made in person. For additional information on mail-in registration or about the program in general, telephone UW Extension, 543-2300, between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., weekdays.

REGISTRATION ELIGIBILITY

CONTINUING STUDENTS GUARANTEED ELIGIBILITY.

University of Washington students who remain in good scholastic standing are guaranteed the opportunity to register each quarter as long as they maintain continuous enrollment (Summer Quarter excepted). Continuation must be in the same classification, e.g., undergraduate, postbaccalaureate (fifth-year), graduate, etc. Once a student earns a baccalaureate degree, he or she must apply for readmission as a postbaccalaureate (fifth-year), nonmatriculated, or graduate student. Exceptions to the guarantee are: (1) students under disciplinary action, (2) students with a financial hold, (3) students not meeting their departmental continuation policies, or (4) students not meeting the University's satisfactory progress policy (See *General Catalog*).

Continuing students who withdraw during the first week of two consecutive quarters (Summer Quarter not included) will not be eligible to register as continuing students for the third quarter, and must reapply as former students returning to the University.

If an undergraduate does not enroll for one or more quarters, or if a graduate goes on-leave, s/he must file an application for readmission with the Registrar's Office, second floor, Schmitz Hall, window 3. Undergraduates must include payment of the \$25 application fee. Information on admission closing dates is available at Window 3, second floor, Schmitz Hall, or by calling 543-5920.

NEW STUDENTS. Students new to the University or applying for a new classification should contact the Office of Undergraduate Admissions for undergraduate and/or postbaccalaureate (fifth-year) standing, or the Office of Graduate Admissions for graduate standing. Application closing date is February 1 for new students entering from high school, and for all other new and former students.

RETURNING FORMER STUDENTS. Returning former students not enrolled in winter quarter and on-leave graduates must apply for readmission. A \$50 enrollment service fee will be required of each eligible applicant. Former graduate students who did not request an on-leave status must contact the Office of Graduate Admissions. Space is limited, and enrollment quotas will be filled on a first-paid, first served basis. Application closing date is February 1.

ACADEMIC ADVISING

Students are strongly encouraged to see an academic adviser to discuss their educational objectives, to assess progress toward completion of requirements, and to learn procedures involved in registering at the University. It is wise for students to make appointments with advisers and to have ideas of courses they would like to take by reviewing the *General Catalog* and the quarterly *Time Schedule* before the advising session. If students fail to maintain contact with their advisers and problems develop with degree programs, these problems are the students' responsibilities. The consequence may be additional time to complete degree programs.

HOW TO USE TALIS:

1. Using a touchtone telephone, call TALIS at 543-9000.
2. After the greeting, press the 3 digit code followed by # associated with the information you desire.
3. You may go directly to another message at any time by pressing the associated 3 digit code followed by #.
4. When you are finished, just hang up.

1. TOUCHTONE TELEPHONE. Use only a touchtone telephone to make entries on STAR. Touchtone phones make a different tone after each key is pressed. Telephones that make no tone or only a monotone will not work on the registration system. Your touchtone phone acts as a computer keyboard, enabling you to enter your course requests just as if you were sitting at a computer terminal. Within minutes, you will know your confirmed schedule.

2. CALLING STAR. STAR is available, during published registration dates and times. STAR is closed on holidays and may close earlier than 12 midnight on a few days to produce registration confirmations, ID cards, and instructors' class list. If STAR does not answer your call, it is not in operation. If the phone line is busy, all lines are being used. Call back later. You may call STAR during, or after, your initial registration date to add, drop, check section status, etc.

3. VOICE RESPONSE. A voice response will guide you after each transaction. If you do not understand a response or instruction and would like it repeated, press the star key (*) first, and then the number sign key (#).

4. IF YOU MAKE A MISTAKE. If you make a mistake before finishing an entry, press the star key and the number sign key (*#), and your entry will be discarded.

5. TO SPEED UP YOUR REGISTRATION. To expedite your registration, you may enter data during the voice response. Be cautious about doing this, since you may miss some important information such as when and where to obtain your Registration Confirmation and ID Card.

6. DISCONNECT ACTION. Time limits are built into the system, so if you are holding on the STAR line for an extended period of time, you will be disconnected. Error limits are also a part of the STAR system, so if you do not enter the correct information after the second try, STAR will disconnect. You may immediately call back to STAR.

7. TRANSACTIONS. The transactions you enter on your touchtone telephone communicate to the computer what action to take (such as add a course, drop a course, check a section status, etc.) and what data you want considered. The transaction code legend follows:

- A = Add a course
- D = Drop a course
- L = Hear a spoken listing of your assigned courses
- S = Check the open or closed status of a course
- T = Terminate your call and get information on how to obtain your Registration Confirmation and ID card
- * = Star key; used to separate data
- # = Number sign key; used to send transactions that you enter

8. ENTRY CODES. Entry codes are five digit random numbers issued to you by academic departments as authorization to enroll in restricted course sections. Academic departments have the ability to establish varying levels of enrollment control for course sections in each registration period, or they can maintain the same level of control throughout.

Courses requiring entry codes are designated with the symbol > to the left of the schedule line number (SLN) in the Time Schedule. Please note that departments reserve the right to require entry codes whether the course is so designated in the Time Schedule or not. Usually information on where to obtain entry codes is found in the body of the Time Schedule, either as a comment before the course listing or just after the title of the course. Contact the department offering the course if STAR advises you an entry code is required and the location for obtaining one is not identified in the Time Schedule.

Once you have used an entry code, the computer removes it from the list of viable codes and will not accept it again. If you drop a section that required an entry code to add, then you must obtain another entry code from the department if you wish to re-add the section.

When you use an entry code to register, it becomes a part of your registration record, and is visible with your name on computer terminal screens. Entry codes are valid only through the fifth day of the quarter.

Beginning the sixth day, you must obtain departmental authorization signatures to add courses using standard Add/Drop cards. These cards must be submitted in person at the Sections Office, 264 Schmitz Hall, and a \$20 change fee will be assessed.

9. LECTURE/LAB/QUIZ/CONFERENCE. These are combined under one SLN for each possible combination of time and day. On STAR, when you register for a course SLN associated with a lecture, lab and/or quiz or conference, you will be registered for all the lecture, lab, quiz or conference combination as listed under one SLN in the Time Schedule.

10. ALTERNATE SELECTIONS. If the section requested is closed you will be informed by STAR of open section alternates (including new sections added after the publication of the quarterly Time Schedule). You can then immediately select an alternate section to be added to your schedule. Have a pencil ready and be prepared to write down schedule line numbers (SLN) and meeting times of alternate sections.

11. TIME CONFLICT. You may not register on STAR for two courses that meet at the same time or for courses with overlapping meeting times. If you want the second course instead of the one you are registered for, you must drop the first one before adding the second course on STAR. If you want two time-conflicting courses, you must add the second course, in person, at Sections in 264 Schmitz during any registration period, or at one of the satellites during Registration Period III. Time conflicts of more than one hour require instructors' signatures for both courses involved.

12. REGISTRATION HOLDS. If you have a hold on your registration, you will not be permitted to complete your registration until the hold has been released by the initiating office. If you attempt to register on STAR before your hold has been released, the voice response will indicate which office has placed the hold, and where to go to get it released.

13. ELECTING S/NS GRADING OPTION. You may register for a course on STAR, but you must go in person to Sections, 264 Schmitz, or to one of the satellites during Registration Period III, to elect the Satisfactory/Not Satisfactory grading option.

14. AUDIT. Audit registrations will not be processed by STAR, but must be completed in person at Sections, 264 Schmitz Hall.

15. CREDIT LIMITATIONS. Undergraduates will be limited to 19 credits during Registration Periods I and II to allow all students a chance to develop a basic schedule. Additional credits may be added during Registration Period III. Thirty credits is the limit per quarter.

16. VARIABLE CREDITS. Some courses are offered for a variable number of credits. See the department to obtain the appropriate number of credits for a variable credit course and be prepared to enter the number of credits when requested to do so by the voice response on STAR. To change variable credits, go to Sections, 264 Schmitz.

17. SECTION II ON STAR WORKSHEET. Since Section II requires selection decisions only during your first telephone call this quarter, you may proceed directly from Section I to Section III through Section IX in a random manner when making subsequent calls.

STAR will not accommodate changes of your initial decisions in SECTION II. You must go in person to the Sections Office, 264 Schmitz Hall to modify selections. Faculty/staff using tuition exemption program will not be asked to make decisions for Section II.

18. MERLIN TELEPHONE. If using an AT&T Merlin telephone to call STAR, press the # sign key twice to send transactions.

19. QUESTIONS. If you have questions regarding registration, please call Sections, (206) 543-5875, Monday through Friday, from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

FOLLOW THESE STEPS BEFORE CALLING STAR

- STEP 1.** Read the Registration Periods, How To Use STAR, and the STAR Work Sheet very carefully.
- STEP 2.** Academic advising is highly recommended, and it is suggested that you make an appointment with your adviser before selecting your courses. Use the Trial Schedule Form provided below to draft your schedule.
- STEP 3.** Obtain entry codes from departments for courses requiring entry codes.
- STEP 4.** Organize your registration materials (*Time Schedule, STAR Work Sheet*). Use the *Spring 1990 TIME SCHEDULE* to obtain the schedule line number (SLN) for each course section. SLN's change every quarter. Develop your program on the Trial Schedule Form. Prepare an alternate course section list because some sections may be full. Complete the STAR Work Sheet. ADDITIONAL REGISTRATION INFORMATION AND NOTICES

1. ADDRESS CHANGE TELEPHONE SERVICE - CALL 543-3868. Students are responsible for notifying the Registrar's Office when their address changes. An Address Change Telephone Answering Service is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week for changes of local and permanent addresses and telephone numbers, restricting release of directory information, and where to mail registration confirmations, ID cards, tuition billing statements, and final grades. Students should always leave a forwarding address with the U. S. Postal Service whenever they move. Addresses may also be changed at the Registration Office, window 5, second floor, Schmitz Hall.

If you have applied for financial aid, you must also report your address change to the Office of Financial Aid.

2. CLASS ATTENDANCE GUIDELINES. To provide enrollment space for others, students who do not attend regularly scheduled class meetings during the first week of the quarter are subject to being dropped at the discretion of the teaching departments. Affected courses will be identified in the *TIME SCHEDULE* and posted in departmental offices.

Students must not assume that departments will automatically initiate a drop for nonclass attendance. Students who register for courses they do not attend are themselves responsible for officially dropping the courses through the Registrar's Office. The consequence of not officially dropping courses is a 0.0 grade.

Students should contact the instructor or teaching department if they plan to be absent any day during the first week of the quarter.

No person, other than a faculty member attending informally with the approval of the instructor, may attend a University course in which that person has not been officially registered through the Registrar's Office. An instructor may allow a student to attend his or her class only if the student's name appears on the official class list from the Registrar's Office.

3. REGISTRATION TAMPERING. A student who tampers or attempts to tamper with the registration records of another student, including but not limited to dropping courses and adding courses, may be subject to disciplinary sanctions as defined in the Student Conduct Code (WAC 47B-120).

4. SECURING YOUR REGISTRATION DATA. If, for any reason, you believe that another person might tamper with your registration on STAR and you want to avoid this possibility, you may go to the Registration Office, second floor, Schmitz Hall and request a security code. Ask for the Security Code Request Form and identify the 6 digits you wish to use instead of your date of birth when accessing STAR each quarter.

5. FULL-TIME STUDENT REQUIREMENT. To be considered full-time, a undergraduate or professional student must register for 12 credits and a graduate student must register for 9 credits. However, it is important to note that differing criteria and standards for full-time enrollment exist for participatory eligibility, e.g., Veterans Administration, athletic eligibility, Bureau of Indian Affairs, Vocational Rehabilitation, and various forms of financial aid. Information on full-time requirements of the Veterans Administration and the Immigration and Naturalization Service may be obtained at 460 Schmitz. Consult the Financial Aid Office for its requirement on satisfactory student progress.

6. OVERLOAD GUIDELINES. For reasons of public safety and instructional quality, course enrollment in each section will be limited to the approved classroom capacity. The Registrar's Office monitors course enrollments throughout the quarter according to the following guidelines:

a. Through the fifth class day, students may add a section without permission unless the class is full or requires permission; then an entry code is required. The Registrar's Office will accept course overloads up to 115% of classroom capacity when the student presents an entry code from either the instructor or authorized person in the department.

b. From the second through the fifth week, overload authorization signatures will be accepted up to 105% of classroom capacity.

c. Beginning the sixth week, no course registration will be accepted without co-signatures by both the instructor and the department chairperson. Registration will not be permitted if enrollment has reached 100% of classroom capacity.

7. \$20 CHANGE-OF-REGISTRATION FEE. The \$20 change-of-registration fee is assessed uniformly for all registration schedule changes made after the fifth class day of each quarter. The \$20 fee is a service charge, not a penalty.

There is no charge for changes made in Registration Periods I, II and III. This "free" period gives students an incentive to complete their schedule before the quarter is too far advanced.

Fee waivers are rarely approved. If you think your change is necessitated by a University error or is at the University's request, you must pay the fee and complete a petition for a refund. The petition will be sent to the Dean of your college for a decision. You will be notified of the decision by the Registrar's Office. The fee will be waived only if the change is necessitated by a University error or is at the University's request.

8. COMPLETE WITHDRAWAL FROM THE UNIVERSITY. (Dropping all courses for the quarter). It is the student's responsibility to withdraw completely if he or she is unable to attend for the quarter. Students must write the Withdrawal Office, 264 Schmitz Hall, Mailstop PD-10, University of Washington, Seattle, Washington, 98195, or withdraw in-person at 264 Schmitz Hall. Complete withdrawal for the quarter is not available via STAR.

Tuition owed will be based upon the date the complete withdrawal is received in the Withdrawal Office. No withdrawals are accepted after the last day of instruction for the quarter.

Courses dropped as part of a complete withdrawal from the University during the first two weeks of a quarter are not recorded on the student's UW transcript; however, the date of the complete withdrawal is recorded.

Students are required to turn in their student ID cards when they withdraw from the University and are not eligible to continue using University services or facilities after their withdrawal.

Continuing students who withdraw during the first week of two consecutive quarters (Summer Quarter excepted) will not be eligible to register as continuing students for the third quarter. Such students must reapply as former students returning to the University. For example, a student who withdraws during the first week of Spring Quarter and Autumn Quarter must reapply as a returning former student for Winter Quarter.

The forfeiture schedule for completely withdrawing from the University is as follows:

- Students withdrawing before the sixth day of the quarter do not pay tuition. New and returning students forfeit their \$50 enrollment service fee.
- Students withdrawing on the sixth day through the thirtieth calendar day continue to owe one-half of their tuition.
- Students withdrawing after the thirtieth calendar day continue to owe full tuition.
- Students whose registrations are cancelled for nonpayment of fees will continue to owe the University one-half their tuition and fees.
- International students who are registered for an English as a Second Language course must make a separate request for a refund for that course by contacting the ESL Office in 102 Lewis Hall at the same time they withdraw from the University.

9. UNDERGRADUATE SATISFACTORY PROGRESS. Students admitted to the University to pursue baccalaureate degrees are expected to make satisfactory progress toward the attainment of that degree, and are expected to enter a major and graduate after completion of a reasonable number of credits. Refer to the *GENERAL CATALOG* for additional information.

10. STUDENT DIRECTORY INFORMATION. The University will routinely release student directory information, unless requested otherwise by the student. Directory information is defined as student's name, address, telephone number, place of birth, major field of studies, weight and height of members of athletic teams, dates of attendance, degrees and awards received, and the most recent previous educational institution attended by the student.

11. DISCLOSURE OF STUDENT RECORDS. As a general rule the University will not release a student's education records to a third party without written consent of the student. The complete University policy on student education records and the location of such records may be found in the Washington Administrative Code under WAC 478-140. Manuals containing the Code are available at Reference Stations on campus, and at the Visitor's Information Center, 4014 University Way NE. The policy covers such items as accessibility, review and expunging of inaccurate records, and costs to be charged for copies of student records.

12. FOLLOWING RULES AND REGULATIONS. It is the University's expectation that a student will follow University rules and regulations as they are stated in the *GENERAL CATALOG*. In instances where no appeal procedure is spelled out and the student believes that a special set of circumstances makes appeal reasonable, he or she may appeal the application of specific rules or regulations to the office of the dean of the school or college in which he or she is enrolled in the case of an academic matter, or to the Office of Student Affairs in the case of a nonacademic matter. These offices will either render a decision on the appeal or refer the student to the proper office for a decision.

13. EQUAL OPPORTUNITY. The University of Washington provides equal opportunity in education without regard to race, color, creed, religion, national origin, sex, sexual orientation, age, marital status, disability, or status as a disabled veteran or Vietnam era veteran in accordance with University of Washington policy and applicable federal and state statutes and regulations.

14. SEXUAL HARASSMENT GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE. Students, as well as members of the faculty and staff, who wish to file a complaint regarding sexual harassment may contact either of the two offices listed below:

Personnel in these offices will be available to discuss and provide assistance in resolving the complaint.

15. INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS must subscribe to the student insurance plan unless they are covered by another plan. Refer to the **STUDENT INSURANCE** section for more details.

16. DISABLED STUDENTS. Various support services, including priority registration, are available to students with disabilities. Contact the Coordinator for Disabled Student Services (DSS), 482 Schmitz, 543-8924, 543-8925 TDD, for information on equipment services, accessibility, and accommodations to meet individual needs.

Students with disabilities who require special accommodations for science labs, internships, etc., should contact the DSS Coordinator and the academic adviser of that department immediately to work out appropriate services.

The STAR Work Sheet and Instructions are available from DSS in alternate media, including tape recording, large print and braille. Students with disabilities which would limit their ability to use STAR may register through DSS or at the Sections Office, 264 Schmitz Hall.

17. ASSOCIATED STUDENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF WASHINGTON (ASUW). The Associated Students of the University of Washington is a voluntary association of students designated by the University Regents to carry out a variety of student activities. In order to vote in ASUW elections or hold ASUW office students must be members. Student's membership choice will not affect tuition payment in any way. Information about the ASUW can be obtained from the ASUW Office in Room 204L Student Union Building.

18. PLACEMENT CENTER. The Placement Center provides comprehensive career and job search information and services for students and alumni to facilitate their transition from academic programs of the UW to the broader society. Services are available to UW students and alumni who are registered with our office. Registration is free for students; alumni must pay applicable fees for the period of time during which services are desired.

Types of services offered include individual career counseling, job search seminars, a career information library, a Minority Job Placement Program, on-campus interviews, job opportunity bulletins, a placement/credential file service, and career-and degree-related summer jobs/internships. To participate in the on-campus interview program, students must attend an orientation session. For more information, please come by the Placement Center at 301 Loew Hall, FH-30, or call (206)543-0535.

19. UW ID CARD. Carry your UW ID Card with you at all times since it is required for a variety of transactions and services on campus. In some situations, you may be asked to provide additional pieces of identification, one containing your photo.

GRADING INFORMATION RELATED TO REGISTRATION

DROP COURSE GRADES AND RESTRICTIONS

Instructor's signature is not required for dropping courses.

UNDERGRADUATES. Undergraduate students who drop courses receive no entry on their academic record if the drop is made during the first two weeks of the quarter, except if all courses are dropped, then a university withdrawal date is entered on the student's record.

Drops made during the third and fourth weeks of the quarter will be recorded with a "W." Refer to deadlines shown in the Student Action Guide.

After the fourth week, only a limited number of drops are permitted as determined by the number of credits earned at the University. While completing the first 44 credits at the University, a student has three drops permitted after the fourth week. Any of these three drops not used at the time 45 credits are earned are forfeited. After 45 credits have been completed at the University, the student earns one late drop for each 45 credits earned. These may be accumulated and used as necessary.

No drops may be made after the last day of instruction (June 1).

GRADUATE STUDENTS. Graduate students who drop courses after the first two weeks of the quarter receive a grade of "W."

No drops are permitted after the seventh week of instruction.

HARDSHIP WITHDRAWAL. Hardship withdrawals are for dropping individual courses only. The \$20 change of registration fee will be assessed. (See section on Complete Withdrawal from the University for procedure to follow for dropping all courses for the quarter).

Students may petition the Registrar for a hardship withdrawal if: (1) the student is unable to complete the course in question because of a severe mental or physical disability, or (2) unusual or extenuating circumstances beyond the student's control prevented the student from dropping the course by the drop deadline. See the *General Catalog* for complete information.

SATISFACTORY/NOT SATISFACTORY

Students may elect to take certain courses on a Satisfactory/Not Satisfactory (S/NS) basis. Advisers should be consulted, and in no case are undergraduate students allowed to register for more than six credits (or for one course, if that course is offered for more than six credits) on a Satisfactory/Not Satisfactory basis in a given quarter.

Students may register for the course on STAR, but they must go in person to Sections in 264 Schmitz Hall to elect the S/NS grade option. STAR will not accommodate the S/NS grade option.

S/NS must be elected during initial registration or added or dropped during the first five days of the quarter.

For undergraduates, a course in which an "S" is earned may not be used to satisfy any department, college, or University requirement, except that the credits may be applied to the minimum of 180 credits required for graduation. Each instructor will report conventional-grades to the Registrar, who will convert satisfactory grades (2.0 or greater) to "S," and unsatisfactory grades (less than 2.0) to "NS" for the student's transcript. No more than 25 S/NS credits will apply to an undergraduate degree.

Graduate students earning grades of 2.7 or above receive a grade of S (Satisfactory), while 2.6 or below are recorded as NS (Not Satisfactory). With the approval of his or her graduate program adviser or Supervisory Committee Chairperson, a graduate student may elect to take any course for which he or she is eligible outside of his or her major academic unit on an S/NS basis.

In cases of withdrawal, the W is recorded. Neither S nor NS is included in the grade-point average. N, I, and X are recorded until the instructor reports the final grade, or in cases of incompletes received by undergraduates, until the I is converted by the Registrar.

CREDIT/NO CREDIT COURSES

Some courses are offered on a credit/no credit (CR/NC) basis. It is not possible to register S/NS to take these courses, because the only grades assigned by the instructor are CR (Credit) or NC (No Credit). Neither CR nor NC is included in the grade-point average. In cases of withdrawal a W is recorded. N, I, and X are recorded until the instructor reports the final grade, or in cases of Incompletes received by undergraduates, until the I is converted by the Registrar.

AUDITORS

STAR is not available for audit registration, which must be completed in person at Sections, 264 Schmitz Hall. Registration is available during any of the registration periods. Attendance in courses as an auditor is by consent of the instructor involved and is conditioned on the space available. Permission to audit is ordinarily granted for lecture classes only. An auditor may not participate in class discussion or laboratory work, and his or her registration may be canceled at the discretion of the instructor. No entry is made on the permanent record for courses audited. To receive credit for an audited course, the student must register for the class for credit in a subsequent quarter.

Auditors, except ACCESS program students, pay standard tuition and fees and must be regularly admitted and registered in the course. Although credits for audited courses will not be listed on the schedule of classes, they will be included in the billing on the fee statement. Such credits count in the calculation of fees.

Courses audited may not be changed to credit registrations after the second week of the quarter.

INCOMPLETE GRADE

Incomplete grades may only be awarded if the student is doing satisfactory work up until the last two weeks of the quarter. Undergraduate students must not reregister for courses in which they have received an Incomplete, since a grade earned in a repeat course will not be recorded as an Incomplete conversion grade.

To obtain credit for the course, an undergraduate student must convert an Incomplete into a passing grade no later than the last day of the next quarter. An Incomplete not made up by the end of the next quarter will be converted to the grade of 0.0 by the Registrar unless the instructor has indicated, when assigning the Incomplete grade, that a grade other than 0.0 should be recorded if the incomplete work is not completed. The original Incomplete grade is not removed from the transcript.

Special Course and Laboratory Fees

The amounts charged for tuition and fees normally cover University charges for course registration. Some courses, however, have extraordinary expenses associated with them and in such cases the University may charge additional fees in amounts approximating the added instructional or laboratory costs.

TUITION FORFEITURES OR REFUNDS

Students will be billed for the number of credits, including audit hours, on their programs at the beginning of the quarter. Only partial tuition reductions will result for courses dropped after the first week of the quarter.

Students dropping courses after the first seven calendar days of the quarter and through the thirtieth calendar day of the quarter will be expected to pay one-half of the tuition associated with that course.

Courses dropped after the thirtieth calendar day receive no refund.

The effect of tuition forfeitures on the over-18-credit surcharge is as follows: forfeitures for courses dropped that exceeded 18 credits are charged the same as above. Also, if a student drops a course after the thirtieth calendar day and adds another, total credit charges will include credits that are added with no reduction for credits dropped.

Course drops become effective the date received and processed on STAR, in the Sections Office-264 Schmitz, or through the Department Registration Screen used in academic departments.

TUITION PAYMENT GUIDELINES

1. It is the student's responsibility to see that tuition is paid in full by the tuition due date (third Friday of each quarter). Bills are sent at the beginning of each quarter to facilitate payment. However, failure to receive a tuition bill does not nullify the student's responsibility for payment by the due date.

2. You should indicate selection of your permanent or local address on STAR for fee statement mailing. If you have not received a fee statement by the end of the second week of the quarter, contact the Student Accounts and Scholarships Office for the amount of tuition due.

3. You may pay your fees in person in the Student Accounts and Scholarships Office or mail them to UW, Student Accounts and Scholarships Office, 129 Schmitz, PE-10, Seattle, WA 98195, before the tuition due date. Fees must be paid by Friday of the third week of the quarter. Payments postmarked on or before the due date are accepted without a late fee. Metered mail received after the due date is subject to penalties as described in #4 below.

4. If you fail to pay by the deadline you may continue to pay your tuition the week following the due date, plus a late fee as follows:

If payment has not been received in the Student Accounts and Scholarships Office by end of the late payment period, your registration for the current quarter as well as any future quarters will be cancelled. Students permitted to reregister after cancellation for nonpayment will be charged a \$75 fee, in addition to their tuition.

5. If you reregister, you must reregister for all classes on your schedule at the time of registration cancellation. (Fees will include appropriate charges for classes dropped during the forfeiture period.) No reregistration will be possible after the last day of instruction. *Please note: Even if your registration is cancelled you will continue to owe one-half of your tuition.*

6. Credit cards and credit card checks are not accepted.

7. Tuition and fees not paid by the end of the academic quarter will be subject to an interest charge of 1% per month, or fraction of a month, (12% A.P.R.), beginning with the month following the end of the quarter.

APPLICATION OF PAYMENTS TO A STUDENT'S ACCOUNT

As a rule, payments received for a student's account are applied to charges in order of their due dates. For charges with the same due date, payments are applied first to tuition and related University fees

and then to other charges on the account. A payment may be applied to a specific charge by contacting the Student Accounts Office at 129 Schmitz Hall. Financial aid from Federal Title IV programs is applied only to required tuition and fees and to loan and aid repayment obligations. The University may not apply such aid to pay insurance and some other optional charges.

STUDENT INSURANCE

The University offers a voluntary accident and sickness insurance plan to supplement the services available at the Hall Health Center. UW students (except those enrolled in programs administered by UW Extension and UW employees attending classes under the employee tuition exemption program) who remain registered through at least the first six days of instruction in the quarter are eligible to enroll in the plan.

Students may sign up for the plan when they register for classes. If students are registered for classes by their academic departments, and no plan is indicated, they will be enrolled in the student only quarterly plan. The insurance premium will be included on the quarterly tuition statements and must be paid by the quarterly tuition-due date. In most cases Financial Aid will not pay insurance directly so students must make sure the premium is paid on time. There is no late payment period for the insurance premium.

If students are billed for student insurance and wish to add, cancel, or change coverage, complete the appropriate section on the remittance advice copy of the billing statement and pay the revised amount, or make payment in person at the Student Accounts and Scholarships Office by the tuition-due date.

International students must subscribe to the student insurance plan unless they are covered by another plan. Proof of other cover-

age must be submitted to the International Services Office and a waiver obtained each Autumn Quarter (or upon initial admission if other than Autumn Quarter) because waivers are valid only through Summer Quarter each year. Students holding insurance policies that expire during the academic year are responsible for obtaining new waivers, as necessary.

Brochures describing the plan in more detail are available at the Hall Health Center, the HUB, and the 2nd floor Information Window in Schmitz Hall. Plan benefits may change each academic year, so students are encouraged to review the brochure carefully.

WASHINGTON STUDENT LOBBY (WSL)

The Washington Student Lobby (WSL) is a voluntary, independent organization of university students whose purpose is to influence the Washington State Legislature and others on higher education matters of special interest to students. Students may choose to support the WSL by contributing \$1.00 each quarter. Support for the WSL may be indicated during registration and the voluntary contribution will be included on the tuition billing statement for payment with tuition.

WASHINGTON PUBLIC INTEREST RESEARCH GROUP (WASHPIRG)

The Washington Public Interest Research Group (WashPIRG) is a student-directed, non-profit and non-partisan research organization. Students may choose to support WashPIRG by contributing \$2.00 each quarter. Support for WashPIRG may be indicated during registration and the voluntary contribution will be included on the tuition billing statement for payment with tuition.

Final examinations should be administered in accordance with the above examination schedule.

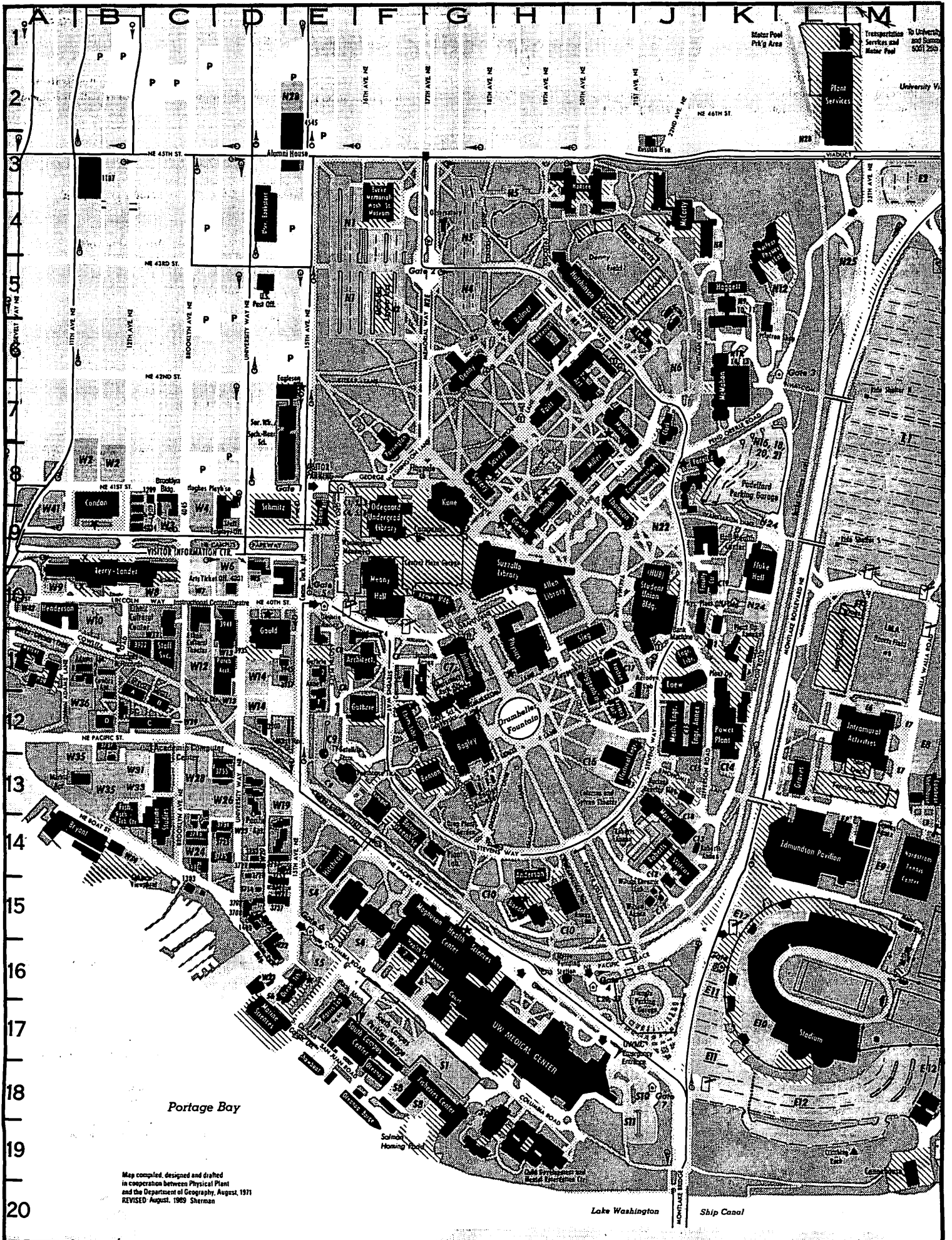
The dean may permit an instructor to change the time of a final examination upon prior application demonstrating good cause for such change. In such cases, the following guidelines shall be observed:

1. With the dean's permission, the final examination may be postponed or moved to an earlier time within the examination period if agreed to by all students and the instructor. Before approving the rescheduling of a final examination, the dean shall obtain assurances that the change will not have an undue adverse impact on the students. The dean shall notify the Registrar of the approval granted for the date of a final examination.
2. An instructor shall not, except in very unusual circumstances, grant permission to individual students for an early examination. If the student is unable to take an examination on the scheduled date, the procedure outlined in the following paragraph should be followed.
3. A student absent from any examination through sickness or other cause, judged by the instructor to be unavoidable, shall be given an opportunity to take a rescheduled examination or perform work judged by the instructor to be the equivalent.

If the instructor determines that neither alternative is feasible during the current quarter, the instructor may exempt the student from the requirement. Examples of unavoidable cause include death or serious illness in the immediate family, illness of the student, and, provided previous notification is given, observance of regularly scheduled religious obligations.

4. Classes that meet on the hour use the first full hour of instruction to determine the time of examination. For example, a class that meets at 10 a.m. uses the 10:30 a.m. examination time.
5. Classes that begin on the half hour and last longer than one hour use the actual starting time to determine the examination time. For example, a class that meets at 7:30 a.m. and continues until 9:00 a.m. would use the 7:30 a.m. time.
6. Classes in which the entire class meets at the same hour every day, in the same room, may use that room at 8:30 a.m. or 2:30 p.m. for a three-hour examination. All other examinations are limited to one hour and fifty minutes unless other arrangements are made with Room Assignments.
7. If an examination is held at a time other than the above schedule indicates, instructors must check with Room Assignments to make sure the room is available.

CAUP 496 PRACTICAL EXPERIENCE (3-6, MAX. 6)
Unpaid work-study course in cooperation with local professional offices. On location study of various aspects of professional practice under the supervision of a firm or agency involved in any aspect of environmental design, planning management. Prerequisite: upper division standing.

CAUP 498 SPECIAL PROJECTS (1-12, MAX. 12)
Instructor-initiated and college-approved systematic study and offering of specialized subject matter. Topics vary and are announced in preceding quarter. Entry code required.

ARCHITECTURE

ARCH 409 COLOR AT THE CONCEPT LEVEL IN DESIGN (3)
Simple processes of color presentation researched and developed for use as communication. Designed to make color available early in design development and make it integral with all other aspects of design.

ARCH 418 WATERCOLOR DRAWING (3)
Principles and practice of using transparent watercolor for the naturalistic representation of objects, people, and interior and exterior space.

ARCH 558 SEMINAR IN TWENTIETH CENTURY ARCHITECTURE (3 OR 5)
Joint with ART H 591. See Art History for description.

BUILDING CONSTRUCTION

B CON 456 REAL ESTATE INVESTMENT SEMINAR (3)
Analysis of private and public real estate investment decisions using case studies of individual development projects. Focuses on application of principles introduced in 453, 454, and 455. Joint with URBDP 456. Prerequisites: 454 and 455. Entry code required.

URBAN DESIGN AND PLANNING

URBDP 456 REAL ESTATE INVESTMENT SEMINAR (3)
Joint with B CON 456. See Building Construction for description.

COLLEGE OF ARTS AND SCIENCES

AMERICAN ETHNIC STUDIES

AES 150 INTRODUCTORY HISTORY OF AMERICAN ETHNIC GROUPS (5)
Survey of the history of African Americans, Asian Americans, Chicanos, and Native Americans in the United States.

AES 151 INTRODUCTION TO THE CULTURES OF AMERICAN ETHNIC GROUPS (5)
Survey of the cultures of Chicano, African American, Asian American, and American Indian communities of the United States. Each group's culture is examined in its isolation and in its interaction with mainstream culture.

AES 322 RACE AND GENDER: HISTORICAL PERSPECTIVES (5)
Joint with WOMEN 322. See Women Studies for description.

Afro-American Studies

AFRAM 358 LITERATURE OF BLACK AMERICANS (5)
Joint with ENGL 358. See English for description.

Asian American Studies

AAS 392 ASIAN AMERICAN WOMEN (5)
History of and contemporary issues related to Asian American women in the United States. Joint with WOMEN 392. Prerequisite: 205 or 206.

Chicano Studies

CHSTU 330 CHICANOS THEMSELVES (5)
Explores the issue of Chicano, or Mexican-American, identity. Examines statements of selfhood by Chicanos, studied in order to understand the relationship between individual and society in creating identity.

AMERICAN INDIAN STUDIES

AIS 203 INTRODUCTION: PHILOSOPHICAL AND AESTHETIC UNIVERSES (5)
Social construction of reality, aesthetic as well as imaginative, as conceptualized by approximately five traditional American Indian cultures from different regions of North America.

ANTHROPOLOGY

ANTH 358 CULTURE AND COGNITION (5)
Surveys anthropological theories and research on the relationship between language, thought, and behavior. Examines the influence of cultural inheritance on perception, classification, inference, and choice. Describes relevant cross-cultural research methods and evaluates theoretical models used by cognitive anthropologists. Prerequisite: 202 or 203 or PSYCH 355 or permission of instructor.

Physical Anthropology

PHY A 476 SOCIOCULTURAL ECOLOGY AND HEALTH (3)
Sociocultural ecology of health/disease, focusing on humans as bioculturally integrated beings, and on populations as biocultural units of adaptation. Examples of research on disease (infectious, chronic) and patterns of morbidity and mortality (infant, maternal, old age) with particular attention to situations of sociocultural change.

ART

ART 520 SEMINAR IN PAINTING AND PRINTMAKING (1)
Designed as a forum for the presentation and criticism of student work as well as for discussion of contemporary directions in visual art.

Art History

ART H 306 INDIAN ART OF SOUTH ASIA (5)
Development of Indian art from its origins to the medieval period. Spread of Indian religions and related art forms in Tibet and Southeast Asia also briefly introduced.

ART H 485 ITALIAN FUTURISM, DADA, SURREALISM (3)
Survey of three European early modern art movements whose ultimate objective was the collapse of bourgeois culture. Central issues: the role of art and artists in catalyzing social change, strategies for destroying public faith in logic, integration of verbal and visual signs and non-aesthetic conceptions of art.

ART H 496 ART AND SEXUAL IMAGERY (3)
Themes and symbols of sexuality in art in a range of world cultures and time periods investigated through readings that illumine the contextual meaning of the works. Religious, political, psychological, and economic interpretations employed to understand the widespread existence and importance of these topics.

ART H 591 SEMINAR IN TWENTIETH CENTURY ARCHITECTURE (3 OR 5)
Specific focus changes from quarter to quarter. Joint with ARCH 558. Prerequisite: graduate standing with background in architecture, architectural history, or permission of instructor.

ASIAN LANGUAGES AND LITERATURE

Chinese

CHIN 544 CHINESE DIALECTOLOGY (3, MAX. 9)
Methodology and theory of studying Chinese dialects. Among areas covered are fieldwork methods, dialect classification, and dialectal grammar. Prerequisites: 542, ASIAN 401, and permission of instructor.

Hindi

HINDI 423 SURVEY OF MODERN HINDI LITERATURE (3)
Survey of Hindi literature from the late nineteenth century to the present. Readings from representative novels. Prerequisite: 422 or equivalent.

Turkic

TKIC 483 UZBEK MORPHOLOGY AND SYNTAX (3)
Joint with TKISH 483. See Near Eastern Languages and Civilization for description.

BIOLOGY

BIOL 152 BIOLOGY: ECOLOGY AND EVOLUTION OF ORGANISMS (5)
Fundamentals of living systems, with emphasis on the ecology and evolution of organisms. Considers diversity of organisms and the ways they are adapted to live in specific habitats. Studies forces which direct the evolution of organisms.

CHEMISTRY

CHEM 141 GENERAL CHEMISTRY LABORATORY (2)
Introduction to laboratory work, including experiments to illustrate analytic techniques, stoichiometry, and synthesis. Designed to complement 140. Prerequisite: 140 or 145 (may be taken concurrently).

CHEM 352 PHYSICAL CHEMISTRY FOR BIOLOGISTS (4)
General equilibrium thermodynamics and aspects of the theory transport properties, reaction kinetics, and electrochemical phenomena of particular relevance in the biological sciences. Prerequisites: introductory courses in chemistry and differential calculus.

COMMUNICATIONS

CMU 340 INTRODUCTION TO ADVERTISING (5)
Overview of the advertising industry, its history, structure, operations, and institutional role. Prerequisites: 201, 202, 203; MKTG 301.

COMPARATIVE LITERATURE

C LIT 599 SPECIAL SEMINAR OR CONFERENCE (1-9, MAX. 30)
Group seminars, or individual conferences scheduled to meet special needs. Prerequisite: permission of graduate program adviser.

DANCE

DANCE 380 DANCE MAJOR SEMINAR (1, MAX. 6)
Discussion of topics pertinent to educating a dance artist including training techniques, current trends in choreography and performance, and issues relating to health, nutrition, and body image.

DRAMA

DRAMA 373 WOMEN IN THEATRE (5)
Examines both the inclusion and exclusion of women by the cultural practice of theatre. Has two primary aims: to provide an historical overview of women to playwrighting, acting, directing and criticism, and to apply contemporary social issues to the practice texts, and criticism of the stage. Recommended: 302

ECONOMICS

ECON 444 TOPICS IN LABOR MARKET ANALYSIS (5)
In-depth analysis of special topics in the operation of labor markets and public policies affecting incomes and employment. Course content varies by instructor. Prerequisite: 443.

ECON 475 ECONOMICS OF THE EUROPEAN ECONOMIC COMMUNITY (5)
Analysis of economic issues relating to the European Economic Community. Explores the institutional aspects, the attempt to coordinate social and economic policies - welfare, employment, commercial, fiscal, and monetary - and the economic linkages between the EEC and the rest of the world. Prerequisites: 300, 301.

ECON 491 ISSUES IN ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT (5)
Examines major theories of economic development and the practical experience of developing countries. Prerequisites: 300, 301.

ECON 508 MICROECONOMIC ANALYSIS III (4)
The role of time and uncertainty in microeconomic analysis. Prerequisites: 500, 501.

ENGLISH

ENGL 282 AMERICAN LITERATURE AND POLITICAL CULTURE, ORIGINS TO 1865 (5)
American literature in its political and cultural context from the Puritan origins to the Civil War. Emphasizes an interdisciplinary approach to American literature, including history, politics, anthropology, and mass media. Prerequisite: 281.

ENGL 358 LITERATURE OF BLACK AMERICANS (5)
Selected writings - novels, short stories, plays, poems - by Afro-American writers. The historical and cultural context within which they evolved. Differences between Afro-American writers and writers of the European-American tradition. Emphasis varies. Joint with AFRAM 358.

GEOGRAPHY

GEOG 360 PRINCIPLES OF CARTOGRAPHY (5)
Origins, development, and methods of cartography. Principles of data representation and map design for thematic and topographic mapping. Introduction to the use of computers for mapping.

GEOG 520 GEOGRAPHIC INFORMATION REPRESENTATION (3)
Current issues in geographic information representation for cart-

ography and geographic information systems. Includes representations for visualization and databases. Prerequisites: 460 or 465 or equivalent and concurrent registration in 529 or 565 or permission of instructor.

GEOG 565 GEOGRAPHIC INFORMATION SYSTEMS AND EXPERT SYSTEMS (5)

Design considerations for expert systems related to geographic information systems. Geographic/ cartographic knowledge structuring and reasoning in expert systems examined with the use of an expert system development environment. Prerequisites: 460 and 465 or equivalents, and permission of instructor; recommended: concurrent registration in 520.

GEOPHYSICS

GPYS 533 INTRODUCTION TO SOLAR-TERRESTRIAL PHYSICS (3)

Introduces the student to several areas of space physics, the physical principles that apply therein, and the methods by which significant observations are made. Covers electromagnetic and plasma processes from the center of the sun to the surface of the earth. Prerequisites: PHYS 321, PHYS 322, PHYS 323, or permission of instructor.

GERMANICS

GERM 323 CULTURE AND ITS ARTIFACTS: THE SHAPING OF GERMAN CONSCIOUSNESS (3-5, MAX.5)

Introduction to the major artistic and intellectual achievements of the German speaking countries. Prerequisite: reading knowledge of German.

HISTORY

HST 123 THE MODERN WORLD: SPECIAL PROBLEMS (5)

Historians today exploit the techniques and insights of other disciplines (sociology, economics, psychology) to enrich their own understanding of the past. Using the history of the modern world as a data base, the contributions to the study of history made by other disciplines are examined.

HST -497 PUBLIC AND LOCAL HISTORY (-5)

Reviews nonacademic applications of history (museums, parks, business, archives, planning, policy-making, popular media.) Includes directed research and writing on local topics in one applied setting. Students ordinarily undertake a lengthy research project in an internship-like role. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

History of the Americas

HSTAA 365 THE HISTORY OF AMERICAN FILM (5)

American films and film-making technology; the film industry and its financing and marketing strategies. Cultural, social, political, and economic impact of films upon American society. (Last quarter offered: Sp 89.)

Ancient and Medieval History

HSTAM 460 MEDIEVAL ENGLAND, 1042-1485 (5)

Upper level survey of English history from the Norman Conquest until 1485. Emphasis on political, social, and economic history, with special attention to the peculiarities of English development as these had emerged by 1485.

History of Asia

HSTAS 465 THE VIETNAM WARS (5)

Analyzes Vietnamese, Cambodian, and Laotian wars fought in Southeast Asia from 1946 to present. Examines how the Vietnamese managed to defeat both the French and Americans. Questions whether these wars were wars of independence, civil wars,

or "proxy wars" in which local forces served the interests of great powers.

HONARS ARTS & SCIENCES

H A&S 253 WESTERN CIVILIZATION III (5)

Introduction to ideas and society in Western civilization.

H A&S 263 WORLD CIVILIZATION III (5)

Introduction to ideas and society of civilization other than the Western. Specific civilization (Chinese, Japanese, Middle Eastern, South Asian) differs from year to year and section to section.

INTERNATIONAL STUDIES

SIS 480 THE CATHOLIC CHURCH IN WORLD POLITICS (5)

Acquaints students with the self-identity, theology, ecclesiology, and political role of the Catholic Church in the contemporary era, with emphasis on its role in the United States, the U.S.S.R., China, Eastern Europe, and Latin America. Prerequisites: two courses in either world politics or comparative religion.

SIS 522 SPECIAL TOPICS IN ETHNICITY AND NATIONALISM (3, MAX. 6)

Topics vary, but always focus on ethnic group relations and nationalism viewed from a broad, comparative, interdisciplinary perspective. Emphasis is heavily cross-cultural, and the geographical coverage world-wide.

Canadian Studies

SISCA 490 SPECIAL TOPICS (1-5, MAX. 15)

Content varies.

SISCA 499 UNDERGRADUATE RESEARCH (3-5, MAX. 15)

Comparative Religion

RELIG 212 QUR'AN IN ENGLISH (3)

Joint with N.E. 212. See Near Eastern Languages and Civilization for description.

RELIG 410 LAW IN JUDAIC EXPERIENCE (5)

Place and function of law in Jewish social and personal experience. Discusses the various ideological justifications of the law in biblical and rabbinic literature, examines representative texts, and explores theological reflection on law by medieval and modern thinkers. Prerequisite: 210; recommended: 310 or 313.

East Asian Studies

SISEA 476 DEVELOPMENT OF MODERN JAPANESE CULTURE (5)

Interdisciplinary study of Japanese culture from 1600 to the present. Focuses on development of thought, law, religion, education, literature, and art with emphases on the cultural synthesis that emerged through interaction of Westernization and tradition. Prerequisite: one Arts and Sciences course on Japan.

Southeast Asian Studies

SISSE 499 UNDERGRADUATE RESEARCH (1-5, MAX. 15)

Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

Vietnamese

VIET 113 FIRST-YEAR VIETNAMESE (5)

Introduction to modern Vietnamese conversation and grammar. Emphasis on correct pronunciation and basic structure.

VIET 213 SECOND-YEAR VIETNAMESE (5)
Continuation of 112. Review of Vietnamese grammar, development of conversational skills (listening and speaking), reading literary and cultural materials, writing compositions. Prerequisite: 113 or permission of instructor.

MATHEMATICS

MATH 307,308,309 LINEAR ANALYSIS I,II,III (3,3,3)
Ordinary differential equations, Laplace transform, series solutions, systems of linear equations, vector space R^n , systems of linear differential equations, stability, partial differential equations, Fourier series, orthogonal bases, projections, inner products. Prerequisites: 126 for 307, 307 for 308, 308 for 309.

MATH 409 DISCRETE OPTIMIZATION (3)
Maximization and minimization problems in graphs and networks (shortest paths, minimum spanning trees, maximum flows, minimum cost flows); transportation and transshipment problems, NP-completeness. Prerequisite: 407.

MUSIC

Music

MUSIC 270 WORLD POPULAR MUSIC (3)
A global survey of popular music, including Latin America, Africa, Eastern Europe, the Middle East, Asia, and the Pacific. Emphasis on students' ability to recognize styles and to analyze the social and historical processes that have shaped them.

MUSIC 401 EARLY BRITISH MUSIC, 1300-1700
Examines the history of British music from its earliest polyphony through the music of Purcell. Stylistic features of English music studied, including medieval polyphony, Tudor music, Elizabethan music, and seventeenth-century music through Purcell. Prerequisites: 313, 314, or permission of instructor.

MUSIC 464 JAZZ LABORATORY (1, MAX. 9)
Forum for testing new technical skills, improvisational techniques, and jazz compositions and/or arrangements in a formal laboratory setting. Prerequisite: concurrent registration in MUSAP 400 or higher, or permission of instructor.

MUSIC 599 READINGS IN MUSIC (3, MAX. 9)
Selected readings on current issues and problems in music. Prerequisite: permission of a supervising music faculty member.

Music Applied

MUSAP 220...MIDI SYSTEMS TECHNIQUES (2)
Overview of MIDI (Musical Instrument Digital Interface) technology and practical applications of other music technologies in the school environment. Primarily for music education majors.

MUSAP 319 PRIVATE INSTRUCTION: VIOLA DA GAMBA (2-3, MAX. 9)

NEAR EASTERN LANGUAGES AND CIVILIZATION

NE 212
Survey of the contents of the sacred scripture of Islam, regarded by Muslims throughout the world as the literal word of God. Treats Qur'anic narrative, law, theology, and ethics. Some attention also given to the Qur'an as an historical document and to Qur'anic scholarship by non-Muslims. Joint with RELIG 212.

NE 250 IRANIAN CULTURE AND CIVILIZATION (3)
Explores the culture and civilization of this Middle Eastern society through a multi-disciplinary approach that includes such manifestations as architecture, carpet weaving, story telling, and composition of poetry.

NE 596 SPECIAL STUDIES IN NEAR EASTERN LANGUAGES AND CIVILIZATION (3-5, MAX. 15)
Course offered occasionally by visitors or resident faculty. Content varies. Prerequisite: graduate standing.

Arabic

ARAB 407 ARABIC GRAMMATICAL TEXTS (3)
Introduction to the concepts and terminology of traditional Arabic grammar. Readings in the grammatical literature supplemented by instructor's lectures and written exercises. Prerequisites: good command of Arabic and permission of instructor.

Turkish

TKISH 483 UZBEK MORPHOLOGY AND SYNTAX (3)
Introduces the student to a Turkic language, Uzbek. Designed for graduate students and intended to enable them to achieve competence at an accelerated pace. Joint with TKIC 483. Prerequisite: graduate standing.

PHYSICS

PHYS 343 ENVIRONMENTAL RADIOACTIVITY (3)
Sources of radioactivity in the environment, including both natural sources, especially radon, and manmade sources, especially nuclear power and nuclear explosions. Emphasis given to methods for determining radiation doses from the significant sources. Joint with NUC E 343 and RAD S 343. Prerequisites: 121,122,123, or equivalent.

ROMANCE LANGUAGES AND LITERATURE

Spanish

SPAN 303 INTRODUCTION TO STYLISTICS THROUGH COMPOSITION (4)
Prerequisite: 302.

SPAN 321 INTRODUCTION TO SPANISH LINGUISTICS (3)
Synchronic and diachronic linguistic analysis of Spanish, including Spanish phonetics and phonology, morphology, syntax, and evolution of the language. Prerequisite: 303.

SPAN 468 LATIN AMERICAN WOMEN (5)
Issues in women's culture from various Latin American countries, social classes, ethnic groups. Includes female creativity, relationship between female artists and the male tradition, women's exploitation of women, relationship of middleclass to popular feminism, connections between feminism and social change. Prerequisites: 303,321, and one additional 300 level course beyond 303.

SPAN 577 CONTEMPORARY LITERARY THEORY (5)
Introduction to various structuralist and poststructuralist theories of literary analysis, including those developed by Hispanic theorists, and their application to the study of texts from the Spanish and Latin American traditions.

SOCIOLOGY

SOC 584 SPECIAL TOPICS IN SOCIAL PSYCHOLOGY (3)
Examination of current substantive topics in social psychology. Content varies according to recent developments in the field and the interests of the instructor.

SOC 587 SPECIAL TOPICS IN DEVIANCE AND SOCIAL CONTROL (3)
Examination of current substantive topics in deviance and social control. Content varies according to recent developments in the field and the interests of the instructor.

SOC 590 SPECIAL TOPICS IN SOCIOLOGY (3)
Examination of current substantive topics in sociology. Content

varies according to recent developments in the field and the interests of the instructor. Topics covered in courses with this number lie outside those covered by other special topics courses numbered 581 through 589.

STATISTICS

STAT 533 CLASSICAL THEORY OF LINEAR MODELS (3)
Joint with BIOST 533. See Biostatistics for description.

WOMEN STUDIES

WOMEN 322 RACE AND GENDER: HISTORICAL PERSPECTIVES (5)

The intersection of race and gender in the lives of women of color in the United States from historical and contemporary perspectives. Topics include racism, sexism, activism, sexuality, and interracial dynamics between women of color groups. Joint with AES 322.

WOMEN 392 ASIAN AMERICAN WOMEN (5)
Joint with AAS 392. See American Ethnic Studies for description.

WOMEN 468 LATIN AMERICAN WOMEN (5)
Joint with SPAN 468. See Romance Languages and Literature for description.

WOMEN 495 TUTORING WOMEN STUDIES (5)
Trains students to serve as tutors in designated courses. Tutors facilitate weekly group discussions, assist with writing assignments, explain course materials. Prerequisites: 200 or 206; junior or senior standing; one or more upper-division course relevant to Women Studies; prior completion of the course (or equivalent) to be tutored; permission of instructor.

SCHOOL AND GRADUATE SCHOOL OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

INFORMATION SYSTEMS

IS 300 MANAGEMENT INFORMATION SYSTEMS (4)
Fundamentals of information systems, what they are, how they affect organizations. Technical and organizational foundations of information systems, building information systems, managing information system resources. Laboratory emphasizes using computer to analyze, coordinate, solve organizational decision-making problems. Prerequisite: admission to School of Business Administration or permission of undergraduate office.

MARKETING

MKTG 530 MANAGEMENT OF SALES OPERATIONS (3)
Management of personal selling activities within a marketing program. Setting objectives, determining sales strategies; recruiting, selection, and training of sales representatives; allocation of effort, supervision, compensation, and control. Emphasis on case studies. Prerequisite: 502.

SCHOOL OF DENTISTRY

ORAL MEDICINE

ORALM 584 DENTAL CARE OF THE DISABLED (DECOD) III (*, MAX. 10)
Field practice in community outreach to facilities and agencies serving disabled populations. Includes observation, dental screenings, patient education and in-service training of direct care staff. Prerequisite: 404 or 664.

ORALM 664 DENTAL CARE OF THE DISABLED (DECOD) II (*, MAX. 10)
Practicum in chair/bedside delivery of dental care to different dis-

abled populations. Includes rotations to institutions, long-term care facilities, and homebound service, using mobile equipment. Prerequisites: 564 and permission of instructor.

COLLEGE OF EDUCATION

INDEPENDENT STUDY, RESEARCH, AND FIELD EXPERIENCE

EDUC 553 SEMINAR IN STUDENT INQUIRY (2)
Presenting and discussing inquiry projects in which doctoral students are involved. Students, working alone or in collaboration with faculty and other students, present proposals and/or descriptions of their own inquiries and the results thereof. Student participants take leadership in determining the agenda of the seminar. Prerequisites: 552 and doctoral student status.

COLLEGE OF ENGINEERING

AERONAUTICS AND ASTRONAUTICS

A A 421 SPACE SYSTEM DESIGN (3)
Design of spacecraft and/or space power systems for advanced near-Earth and interplanetary missions. Nuclear and solar power systems, thermal management, space structures, reentry physics, advanced propulsion systems, orbital mechanics, and other aspects of space engineering needed for general capability in space systems. Prerequisite: 420.

A A 432 COMPOSITE MATERIALS FOR AEROSPACE STRUCTURES (3)
Introduction to analysis and design of aerospace structures utilizing filamentary composite materials. Basic elastic properties and constitutive relations of composite laminates. Failure criteria, buckling analysis, durability, and damage tolerance of composite structures. Aerospace structure design philosophy and practices. Prerequisite: 332 or permission of instructor. (Last quarter offered Sp 1990.)

A A 462 ROCKET PROPULSION (3)
Physical and performance characteristics of rocket propulsion devices. Mission requirements, chemical rockets, arcjets, electrostatic and electromagnetic thrusters. Prerequisite: A A program seniors or permission of instructor.

CIVIL ENGINEERING

Transportation, Surveying, and Construction Engineering

CETS 418 CONSTRUCTION SURVEY CONTROL (3)
Surveying specifications, instrumentation and calibration, infrastructure design and layout considerations; curves, sewer, building and slope taking. Project control and monitoring. As built surveys. Prerequisites: CIVE 306, 316 or equivalent or permission of instructor.

CETS 518 PHOTO GEODESY AND DIGITAL MAPPING (4)
Coordinate systems. Mathematical principle of aero-triangulation. Establishing mathematical models for combined photo-grammetric and global positioning systems. Design of combined system. Analysis and practical applications for digital mapping. Prerequisite: 514. (Offered alternate years.)

COMPUTER SCIENCE AND ENGINEERING

CSE 524 PARALLEL ALGORITHMS (3)
Design and analysis of parallel algorithms: fundamental parallel algorithms for sorting, arithmetic, matrix and graph problems, and additional selected topics. Emphasis on general techniques and approaches used for developing fast and efficient parallel algorithms and on limitations to their efficacy. Prerequisite: 521.

ELECTRICAL ENGINEERING**EE 443 DESIGN AND APPLICATION OF DIGITAL SIGNAL (5) SP**

Design of signal processing systems in digital computer circuitry and their use in various commercial, industrial, and research applications. Digital signal microprocessors, digitization and analog reconstruction, design of digital filters and fast Fourier transform systems, case studies of applications in communications and audio. Weekly lab, group design project. Prerequisites: 372, 442.

MATERIALS SCIENCE ENGINEERING**MSE 515 ADVANCED TRANSMISSION ELECTRON MICROSCOPY (3)**

Principles of image formation in crystalline and amorphous materials at the atomic resolution level; high spatial resolution electron diffraction with emphasis on convergent beam electron diffraction; quantitative elemental compositional and chemical analyses with energy dispersive x-ray spectroscopy and electron energy loss spectroscopy; high voltage electron microscopy. Prerequisites: 512 and 513.

MSE 700 MASTER'S THESIS (*)**NUCLEAR ENGINEERING****NUC E 343**

Joint with PHYS and RAD S 343. See Physics for description.

SCIENTIFIC AND TECHNICAL COMMUNICATION**STC 516 RESEARCH METHODS IN TECHNICAL COMMUNICATION (3)**

Introduction to research methods in technical communication. Students examine the relationship between theory and research, hypothesis testing, experimental designs, modes of observation,

COLLEGE OF FOREST RESOURCES**FOREST PRODUCTS AND ENGINEERING****FPE 412 FOREST PRODUCTS MARKETING (3)**

Examination of forest products markets, industry structure and strategic management issues. Includes product management, distribution channels, promotion, pricing, marketing research, export markets, and case studies to understand decision making in the forest products industry.

FPE 527 ADVANCED HILLSLOPE STABILITY (3)

Advanced exposure to the effects of land management, especially forest land management, on slope stability. Forest harvesting, road construction, and species conversion. Graduate focus on modeling slope stability in space and time.

FPE 528 ADVANCED HILLSLOPE HYDROLOGY (3)

Advanced treatment of runoff processes from hillslopes and small drainage basins. Processes of infiltration, overland flow, and subsurface flow described mathematically. Focus on linking soil water and runoff processes in a computer model. (Offered even-numbered years.)

FPE 529 CURRENT TOPICS IN WILDLAND HYDROLOGY (1)

Students present detailed analysis of research papers on selected topics in wildland hydrology. Topics cover measurement techniques, experimental data and theoretical models of hydrologic processes. Prerequisites: seniors or graduate standing and permission of instructor.

FPE 535 ADVANCED SOIL PHYSICS (4)

Advanced exposure to physical properties of soil and water. Thermodynamic properties of soil-water mixtures and osmotic effects. Darcy's law and application to the movement of the water table. Focuses on an area of soil physics of interest to the student.

FOREST RESOURCE MANAGEMENT**FRM 515 ADVANCED SOIL AND PLANT ANALYSIS (3)**

Plants and animals must acquire nutrient elements from their environment. Quantifying the composition of samples is the first step in understanding the processes in natural and manmade systems. Sampling, handling, preparation, storage, and analysis stressed. Prerequisites: one botany or plant science course, instrumental analysis, soils.

FRM 547 STREAM AND RIVER ECOLOGY (4)

Characterizations of stream and river ecosystems from a watershed perspective. Emphasis on fundamental processes affecting the structure and dynamics of aquatic communities and the riparian zone. Resource conflicts, new technologies, field trips and class projects. Joint with FISH 547. Recommended: general ecology, Forestry-Fisheries interactions.

FRM 548 SPECIAL TOPICS IN STREAMSIDE STUDIES (2, MAX. 6)

Contemporary problems and issues in forestry, fisheries, and wildlife management in watersheds. Topics vary, yet focus on interactions of land and water resources in the forests of the Pacific Northwest. Joint with FISH 548. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

FRM 578 FOREST RESOURCE ECONOMICS: DEMAND AND MARKETS (3)

Origin and characteristics of demand for forest products and services including amenities, analysis of markets for products, log and stumpage. Intensive review of current literature. Prerequisites: ECON 400,401, and permission of instructor. (Offered even-numbered years.)

FRM 583 ADVANCED INTERPRETATION (5)

Interpretive inventory and site analysis. Interpretation for special populations. Interpretive programming and research techniques. Individual project required. Prerequisite: 383 or equivalent. (Offered even-numbered years.)

URBAN HORTICULTURE**UHF 590 GRADUATE STUDIES (*, MAX. 15)**

Study in fields for which there is not sufficient demand to warrant the organization of regular courses.

UHF 600 INDEPENDENT STUDY OR RESEARCH (*)**UHF 601 INTERNSHIP (3-9, MAX. 9)**

Internship required of students in Master of Forest Resources program in Urban Horticulture. Independent work in collaboration with faculty, arboretum staff, and/or sponsoring institutions. Prerequisite: permission of graduate program adviser.

UHF 700 MASTER'S THESIS (*)**UHF 800 DOCTORAL DISSERTATION (*)****INTERDISCIPLINARY GRADUATE DEGREE PROGRAMS****NUTRITIONAL SCIENCES****NUTR 536 EVALUATION NUTRITION RESEARCH AND NUTRITION EDUCATION (3)**

Evaluation of research articles, critique of grant applications and

proposal development. Use of media, including television and the news in nutrition education. Preparation of visuals for technical and consumer presentations.

NUTR 550 NUTRITION, METABOLISM AND DISEASE: UP-DATE (3)

Update of recent developments in the field of nutrition, especially as related to human health maintenance and disease prevention. Focus placed on topics receiving active research attention or substantial public attention. Intended for graduate students in fields related to health/disease. Prerequisites: basic chemistry and biology

RADIOLOGICAL SCIENCES

RAD S 343 ENVIRONMENTAL RADIOACTIVITY (3)

Joint with NUC E 343 and RAD S 343. See Physics for description.

INTERSCHOOL/INTERCOLLEGE PROGRAMS

QUANTITATIVE SCIENCE

Q SCI 341 APPLIED COMPUTER PROGRAMMING (3)

Emphasizes solving complex resource management problems using modular programming techniques. Interfaces to data bases, spreadsheets, and graphical packages are stressed. The design of algorithms to solve specific problems is implemented using a higher-level language.

Q SCI 477 QUANTITATIVE WILDLIFE ASSESSMENT (5)

Focuses on wildlife sampling techniques for estimating animal abundance, home range, and survival rates in terrestrial populations. The design of wildlife investigations for the purposes of impact assessment, research, and resource management is integrated with estimation schemes and demographic models in a quantitative framework. Prerequisites: 291-292, 482.

Q SCI 514 ANALYSIS OF ECOLOGICAL AND ENVIRONMENTAL DATA I (3)

Factors affecting optimal growth of individuals in their habitat. Estimation of growth and mortality parameters. Response of organisms to changes in environment (bioassay, environmental monitoring). Stochastic viewpoint emphasized. Research design issues for ecological or environmental studies. Analysis of unwieldy data sets. Prerequisites: concurrent registration in STAT 512 and knowledge of calculus.

UNIVERSITY CONJOINT COURSES

UCONJ 511 ISSUES IN HOME HEALTH CARE DELIVERY (3)

Service delivery issues relevant to provision of health care services across the life span in the home setting. Home health care as an important component in health care system. Individual and multidisciplinary practice of health care disciplines. Emphasis on research literature. Prerequisite: graduate student standing, upper division with permission of instructor.

UCONJ 526 INTRODUCTION TO LABORATORY RESEARCH IN NEUROBIOLOGY (4)

Students become familiar with, and assist in, the performance of research on ongoing projects in designated laboratories. Emphasis on employed methodology and techniques. Prerequisite: first year graduate students in neurobiology.

GRADUATE SCHOOL OF LIBRARY AND INFORMATION SCIENCE

LIBR 527 CONSTRUCTION OF INDEX LANGUAGES (3)

Explanations of design options, features of index languages or thesauri, and criteria to use in their selection. After completing the

thesaurus construction project, students are prepared to design index languages, plan and implement a design project, and evaluate index languages. Prerequisite: 502 or permission of instructor.

SCHOOL OF MEDICINE

BIOLOGICAL STRUCTURE

B STR 556 TOPICS IN DEVELOPMENTAL AND SYSTEMIC CELL BIOLOGY (3)

Recent advances in molecular and developmental aspects of cell biology; emphasis on specific organ systems. Differentiation of lymphocytes, germ cells, muscle, epidermis; cell biology of lens, vessel wall, visual cortex; computer modeling; cell-cell and cell-matrix interactions. Prerequisites: undergraduate biochemistry and/or molecular biology, general cell biology; or permission of instructor.

B STR 559 DEVELOPING RESEARCH PROPOSALS (2)

Developing research proposals in cellular, molecular, and developmental biology; neurobiology; morphometrics and computer modeling; experimental immunology and hemopoiesis; reproductive biology; molecular structure. Weekly seminars by faculty and written proposals by students to include background and significance of projects specific hypotheses and aims, methodology, analyses of possible outcomes. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

MEDICAL HISTORY AND ETHICS

MHE 545 SEMINAR IN CLINICAL ETHICS (3)

Review of various approaches to analyzing ethical aspects of clinical decisions. Relationship between ethical theories and practical problems. Analysis of important current cases in medical ethics to demonstrate a systematic method of clinical-ethical analysis. Open only to graduate and professional students.

ORTHOPAEDICS

ORTHP 505P PRECEPTORSHIP IN ORTHOPAEDIC SURVEY (1)

Opportunity for first- and second-year medical students to gain experience with clinical faculty members in the community. Students observe general aspects of private practice from a longitudinal perspective. Prerequisite: permission of department.

RADIOLOGY

RADGY 550 *IN VIVO* NMR IN BIOMEDICINE (2)

Theory and practice of *in vivo* nuclear magnetic resonance spectroscopy examined, with focus on basic research in physiology, bioenergetics, and metabolic imaging. Grade based on a series of short written critiques of current primary literature. Open to all medical and graduate students. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

FISHERIES

FISH 312 FISHERIES ECOLOGY (4)

Ecological characteristics of fishes and shellfishes in the important freshwater and marine habitats of North America. Relationship between physical aspects of the habitats and community structure. Impacts of human activities on diversity and abundance. Prerequisites: 310, 311, OCEAN 200, BIOL 472.

FISH 498 INTERNSHIP/EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING (1-9, MAX. 9)

Structured, practical training in the fishing industry, government

agencies and other areas utilizing fisheries, food science, or quantitative science expertise. Experiences are supervised and evaluated. Written reports required. Prerequisite: permission of faculty advisor.

FISH 547 STREAM AND RIVER ECOLOGY (4)
Joint with FRM 547. See Forest Resources for description.

FISH 548 SPECIAL TOPICS IN STREAMSIDE STUDIES (2, MAX. 6)
Joint with FRM 548. See Forest Resources for description.

FISH 580 INTRODUCTION TO THE MANAGEMENT OF FISHERIES (3)
Introduction to fisheries and the multidisciplinary aspects of their management. Emphasis is on integration of biological, socio-economic, and institutional aspects of fisheries management. Joint with IMS 580.

INSTITUTE FOR MARINE STUDIES

IMS 580 INTRODUCTION TO THE MANAGEMENT OF FISHERIES (3)
Joint with FISH 580. See Fisheries for description.

SCHOOL OF PHARMACY

PHARMACY PRACTICE

PHARM 469 DRUG INFORMATION SOURCES (2)
Introduction/evaluation of printed/computerized information sources, important to pharmacists. Emphasis on systematic methods of information retrieval, evaluation, and dissemination. Written and verbal communication skills for pharmacists stressed; current topics concerning ethical and liability issues and adverse drug reaction attribution covered. Prerequisite: pharmacy major.

SCHOOL OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND COMMUNITY MEDICINE

BIOSTATISTICS

BIOST 533 CLASSICAL THEORY OF LINEAR MODELS (3)
Introduction to one-, two-way analysis of variance; randomized blocks; fixed, random effects, multiple comparisons. Statistical distribution theory for quadratic forms of normal variables. Fitting of the general linear model by least squares. Joint with STAT 533. Prerequisites: 421 or 423; and 513, BIOST 513, and a course in matrix algebra.

HEALTH SERVICES

HSERV 455 ADULT MEDICINE II (10)
Continuation of 454. Introduction to relevant laboratory and radiological procedures. Organ system approach covers endocrine, renal, reproductive, dermatologic, musculoskeletal, and neurological systems. Prerequisite: admission to MEDEX program.

HSERV 510 THEORY AND METHOD IN SOCIAL AND BEHAVIORAL SCIENCES: POVERTY AND HEALTH (3/4)
Major concepts and methods of social sciences applied to research and practice of public health. Substantive focus on effects of poverty on health status. Methodologic focus on survey research methods and analysis. Prerequisites: 511 or 512-513; BIOST 511 or equivalent; EPI 511 or equivalent or permission of instructor.

HSERV 574 RISK AND INSURANCE IN HEALTH CARE (3)
Examines the design of health insurance contracts and the workings of health insurance markets. Five areas are emphasized: actuarial pricing, underwriting, benefit design, the marketing of health insurance benefits, and integrated delivery and financing mechanisms.

HSERV 598 EXTENDED DEGREE PROGRAM PROJECT OPTION (*, MAX. 9)
Supervised project work on a selected topic related to student's concentration in graduate study. Includes survey of literature, development of approach, and written paper on conclusions. Prerequisites: registration in extended MPH degree program and satisfactory completion of the first summer's course work.

PATHOBIOLOGY

PABIO 531 APPLICATIONS OF MOLECULAR BIOLOGY TO PUBLIC HEALTH (2)
Addresses the impact of molecular biology on public health. Lectures focus on the application of biotechnology to diagnostics, pharmaceuticals, vaccines, and environmental concerns. Considerations for developing and using biotechnology products also discussed. Prerequisite: course in genetics, biochemistry, or microbiology, or permission of instructor.

W COURSES OFFERED SPRING QUARTER 1990

Students who plan to take majors in the College of Arts and Sciences and who started college Autumn Quarter 1983, or later, must complete 10 credits of courses designated "W". Some other undergraduate majors also require W courses. W courses are not English composition courses but, rather, are courses in which a substantial amount of writing is required. Almost any department can offer W courses. The following courses being taught Spring Quarter 1990 have been designated as W courses.
