Sikes will appear before the Senate Communications Subcommittee at a hearing scheduled just days after the Commission's Mass Media Bureau formally recommended the elimination of the current 12 AM-12 FM radio station ownership limit and significant relaxation of the duopoly rule.

The date and time of the hearing had not been set at R&R's presstime.

Congressional Concerns

Although three key Senators Daniel Inouye (D-HI), Ernest Hollings (D-SC) and John Danforth (R-MO) – have expressed opposition to elimination of the 12-12 limit, a committee staffer

FCC Chairman Al Sikes has said the hearing is not an atbeen summoned to Capitol Hill tempt to kill the FCC's ownership initiative. "We're not going to come out

with guns blazing," said the aide. "But we do have some concerns [about elimination of the ownership cap.]"

The staffer added that the lawmakers understand radio is in trouble and are willing to listen to any remedial measures that do not undermine such public interest goals as maintaining program diversity.

No hearings are currently planned in the House of Representatives. However, Larry Irving, a senior aide to House Telecommunications Subcommittee Chairman Ed Markey (D-MA) said his boss is also concerned about the possible elimination of the ownership rules.

Tiptoeing The Ad Minefield

With the election season heating up and broadcasters still poring over the FCC's recently revised political advertising rules, top Commission officials recently held a question and answer session aimed at clarifying the campaign do's and don'ts

Among the reminders offered by General Counsel Bob Pettit and Political Programming Chief Milton Gross:

. The lowest unit rate may seem like a complicated concept, but it's not. Treat political advertisers exactly as you treat your most favored commercial customer and you'll have no problems with the FCC. Remember: Every single discount opportunity available to commercial accounts must be disclosed and made available to political customers.

 Require campaign media buyers to sign a statement acknowledging that they were fully briefed on all your advertising rates and policies. If they decline, place a memo in the file detailing your meeting with the buyer and his/her refusal sign.



WGMS (AM)/DC **Makes Move To All-Sports** WMAL fumbles Redskins

WGMS (AM)/Washington will drop its WGMS-FM Classical simulcast in mid-April to become all-Sports WTEM (The Team). In addition, the outlet will be the new radio home of the Super Bowl champion Washington Redskins, who had been with Cap Cities/ABC's WMAL for the better part of 50 years.

"Extensive research in the market showed Washington wanted and needed an all-Sports station,' said WGMS-AM & FM GM Cather-ine Meloy. "There are bits and pieces of sports on several stations, but no single sports source. This [format] gives us an exclusive."

According to Meloy, the Classical Acquisition Partnership station is currently negotiating with sever-al "recognizable names" to host drivetimes and middays. Former WFAN/New York GM Scott Meier, who is consulting the station, said those air talents will host "personality-based sports entertainment, not just call-in and sports talk."

In addition to the Redskins, WTEM will carry a variety of network sports, including the CBS baseball and football packages. The station is currently searching for a GM and PD. Former WMAL NSM and Sports Director Bob Synder has been named GSM of WTEM. WGMS (AM)/See Page 21

REVENUE REPORT December is Flat, **Jan Figures Down**

The radio industry showed mixed results in the months of December and January, according to a number of industry sources.

Combined revenues in December 1991 were up 0.1%, compared to December 1990. The increase, though slight, was the first since July. Average local business was down 0.5% but national revenues increased 1.9% after a 7.7% decline in November. Figures are based on the index of revenue pool results compiled by the RAB, Miller, Kap-lan, Arase & Co., Hungerford Aldrin, Nichols & Carter, and the Radio Network Association.

A 5.6% decrease in national station revenues pushed total revenues down 1.6% in January 1992, compared to January of last year. Local revenues fell just 0.5%, based on preliminary results from stations in 79 markets that report their revenues to Miller, Kaplan, Arase & Co.

National Ratio Off

For the fourth consecutive year, the ratio of national revenue as a percentage of total revenues for the month of January declined. Throughout the latter half of the 1980s, national revenues accounted for an average of 23% of total January revenues. January 1992 national revenues comprised 20.66 % of the month's totals - down from the 21.53% share for the same period in 1991

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Appeals Court Nixes Female Preference

In a long-anticipated decision written by Supreme Court Justice Clarence Thomas, a U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals panel last week struck down the FCC's policy of awarding a preference to female applicants for broadcast licenses. stantially related to achieving di-

Thomas, writing for the 2-1 majority in the case of Lamprecht v. FCC while still on the appeals bench, said the female preference policy violated the equal protection clause of the Fifth Amendment. "When the government treats people differently because of their sex. equal protection principles at the very least require that there be a meaningful factual predicate supporting a link between the government's means and its ends," Thomas said. "In this case, the government has failed to show that its sex preference policy is substantially related to achieving versity on the airwaves."

The difference between female and minority preferences, Thomas argued. is that there is significant statistical evidence that minorityowned stations are likely to offer programming not available on white-owned outlets but little evidence that female-owned stations offer significantly different programs from male-owned operations. The FCC's minority preference program was upheld by the Supreme Court in the 1990 case of **Metro Broadcasting v.** FCC.

In his dissenting opinion, Chief

Judge Abner Mikva chided his colleagues for "thwarting the intentions" of all three branches of government. "The Supreme Court held that Congress may require the FCC to make certain broadcasting licenses available only to minorities; yet this court reaches the surprising conclusion that Congress may not require the FCC to adopt a far milder and far less discriminatory preference program for women," said Mikva. "It strikes me as impossible to reconcile the Supreme Court's decision in Metro Broadcasting with my colleagues' decision today."

The Lamprecht case, which involves a battle over an FM channel in Middletown, MD, now goes back to the FCC for reconsideration.

Senior Lending Still Lacking For Radio

Leading radio industry dealmakers say financing for station acquisitions remains difficult to find, despite the federal government's moves to lower interest rates and slash red tape involving HLT loans and small stock offerings.

"There are virtually no new sources of lending available," said Star Media investment banker John Frankhouser. With little or no senior financing available to acquire stations with positive cash flow – and "none whatsoever" for

stick deals – Frankhouser sees no end in sight for plunging prices.

Frankhouser told R&R the lending climate will improve only gradually as lenders see broadcasters meeting their financial projections. In the meantime, Frankhouser said public stock sales appear to be an attractive option for larger broadcasters "and, in some cases, the only way out" of the credit crunch.

Blackburn Capital Markets Managing Director Steven Pruett sees a continuing exodus of lenders from radio. "Until something happens to improve the profitability of the radio industry, either through regulatory changes or improvement in the economy, you're not going to see any improvement."


Restoring Stability

Pruett believes the FCC must allow radio industry consolidation in order for financial stability to be restored. He said it was the stability of a limited number of licenses that attracted banks to radio lending in the first place. But that stability was eliminated by the 1980s wave of move-ins, drop-ins, and Docket 80-90 stations.

Hartstone & Dickstein Inc. Chairman Joel Hartstone is more optimistic, noting that lenders who were in the broadcasting arena prior to the mid-1980s rush and have stayed with the business "are beginning to talk about a limited amount of new business." He predicted that lower interest rates coupled with elimination of the HLT stigma will increase loan availability. "The money will flow first to other areas much more freely, making the scarcity of money less of a problem for radio," Hartstone said.

Crisler Capital Managing Director Dean Meiszer said lower interest rates are helping broadcasters with loans tied to fluctuating key rates. He added, "I don't know if it's enough to offset the loss of revenues in markets that aren't growing."

A few broadcasters have financed deals with foreign capital, such as Nogales Reed Corporation's pending acquisition of KGW & KINK/Portland, OR. But Meiszer said foreign investors are reluctant to look at U.S. broadcast deals because foreign ownership restrictions force them to take non-voting positions that leave them no opportunity to take control if the deal goes sour.



FCC Ignores LMA Impact On One-To-A-Market Waivers

Parton Broadcasting has won a waiver of **FCC** oneto-a-market rules to permit its acquisition of **WINZ & WZTA/Miami** from **Guy Gannett Publishing**, after the Commission refused to consider the impact of local marketing agreements (LMAs) on its Top 25 markets/30 voices rule.

Under FCC rules, new TV-radio combinations are permitted in Top 25 markets if more than 30 independently owned, operated, and controlled stations exist following any merger.

A local resident opposed the sale on grounds that Lowell Paxson has an attributable interest in WYHS-TV/Hollywood, FL. She argued that numerous LMAs in the Miami market undermined the 30-independently-owned test. Gannett and Paxson argued that LMAs don't create attributable ownership under Commission rules and can't be recognized when considering one-to-a-market waivers. The Commission, noting only two LMAs in Miami, concluded it didn't need to inquire further.

"We decline to reach any conclusion in this proceeding that particular types of LMAs, or LMAs in general, either serve or disserve the public interest . . . We also decline to undertake any general reassessment of our Top 25 markets/30 voices standard, since the facts in this case do not warrant any departure from that standard," the Commission ruled.

FCC Prices 'Shit' At \$3750

he FCC has fined WYBB/Folly Beach (Charleston), SC \$3750 for indecency violations after morning talents Robb Duran and Ed Salen repeatedly uttered the word "crap" during a skit and followed with a comment that they "just can't say shit."

According to Mass Media Bureau chief **Roy Stewart**, "The scatological material as broadcast involved a deliberate and repetitive use of the word 'crap' to heighten the audience's awareness of and attention to the subsequent use of the term 'shit' by the announcer. Such willfully focused use is patently offensive and inconsistent with any contention that the passage at issue represented an incidental remark."

Stewart said the new "base forefeiture" for indecency is \$12,500, but he reduced it because of the "relatively minor nature" of the incident. Station owner Lynn Martin told R&R he hasn't decided whether to appeal. He added that both jocks were suspended without pay for three days and placed on probation after the incident in August 1990. "I think our jocks used poor judgment. I don't necessarily agree that what they said is indecent by the FCC's standards, but it doesn't meet my standards," Martin said.

Meanwhile, the FCC keeps slapping stations with fines for EEO violations. Group Six Communications, licensee of WWOC/Avalon, NJ, was fined \$20,000. Dakos Broadcasting, the former owner of WOKD & WXKT/Arcadia, FL, was fined \$18,000, and current owner Gulf Dunes Broadcasting was denied reconsideration of a short-term renewal and reporting conditions. MEG Associates, the former owner of WDAR-AM & FM/Darlington, SC, has been fined \$12,000.

Maddox Working On Metroplex IPO

hesley Maddox has been named CFO of Metroplex Communications, but clients of her Cleveland-based radio finance boutique need not worry that they'll be left high and dry.

"I'm keeping my company, and I'll be servicing four other clients. But I'll be in-house with Metroplex, helping them prepare for their upcoming initial public offering as chief financial officer," Maddox said.

Meetings were scheduled Wednesday (2/26) in New York with underwriter **Brenner Securities** to plan to the roll-out of the IPO. In other market action:

• WGN/Chicago is the nation's top billing radio station at \$42.5 million, according to the new *Duncan's Radio Market Guide*. Others in the Top 5: KABC/Los Angeles, \$35 million; KOST/Los Angeles, \$33 million; WINS/New York, \$30 million; and KLOS/Los Angeles, \$29.5 million. The top billing groups are CBS at \$205.1 million; Group W, \$200 million; Cap-Cities/ABC, \$199 million; Infinity, \$125.4 million; and Cox, \$109.9 million.

Barry Manilow Testifies In Favor Of Digital Tape Royalties

egislation to give the record industry copyright royalties on sales of digital tape recorders and blank tapes is racing through Capitol Hill hearings with virtually no opposition.

Singer/songwriter Barry Manilow was the star witness at a hearing held by the House Intellectual Property Subcommittee last week (2/19). "Home copying threatens our livelihood," Manilow told lawmakers. "Without this bill, the music industry will be on a downhill spiral." He said the proposed legislation would mean fewer dollars to invest in talent and the potential loss of "a whole generation of new artists and songwriters."

Royalty Payments

Both the House (H.R. 3204) and Senate (S. 1623) are seeking to have the government collect small royalty payments from manufacturers and importers of all digital tapes recorders and blank digital tapes, regardless of format — DAT, DCC, **Sony** Mini-Disc, or some future technology. The money would be distributed to music copyright holders. Two-thirds of said funds would go to record companies and their artists; the remainder would be earmarked for composers and music publishers.

The royalties are intended to compensate copyright holders for lost sales due to home taping. The record industry claims losses already amount to over a billion dollars a year — a figure electronics manufacturers dispute — losses that will undoubtedly mushroom when the high-quality digital material hits the mass market.


Capitol EMI Music President Joe Smith testified that the record industry hopes the introduction of digital recordings will produce the same surge in sales that CDs did when introduced a decade ago. He said compensation for home taping, however, was needed before record companies could embrace the new technology.

Ulterior Motives?

Independent label owner Wayne Green of Greener Pastures Records was the lone House witness to oppose the royalty bill. He accused the major record companies of "ulterior motives of controlling new technologies." Green said there was no proof of losses from home taping, only speculation.

The House bill is expected to win easy committee approval after minor revisions are inserted to ensure its applications to music recordings only and not computer data storage devices. No floor vote has been scheduled for the Senate version, which received committee approval late last year.

PC Tips For The Traveling Executive

ds for personal computers often depict a young exec sitting in a hotel room, PC plugged in and running, "talking" to the computer at the home office. What you *don't* see is the frustrated young exec working frantically to hook up the @!#@!# thing.

Writing in the Wall Street Journal, Walter Mossberg says the hotel-visiting PC user's biggest obstacles are scarce and hard-tofind phone jacks, hard-wired phones, and complicated dialing systems (dial "9" + your personal ID number, your mother's maiden name, etc.).

However, he also offers the following tips for making smoother portable PC/home office connections:

• Look for hotel rooms with extra phone jacks. These are rare, but it never hurts to ask.

• Carry phone accessories. Three inexpensive and extremely useful ones are: a long spare




phone wire, a coupler that connects two phone wires, and a "Y adaptor" (the last of which allows two phone lines to plug into a single jack).

On the more upscale end, you can add an acoustic coupler. This device – extremely useful with hard-wired phones – allows you to connect your PC modem to the phone's handset by using rubber cups that fit over the ear and mouth pieces. A special connector that fits between the handset and the phone and provides a spare jack for your PC modem is also available. • Use software that can handle large phone numbers. This will help you overcome the limitations of having to dial extra digits when calling outside lines. What's more, some software can be programmed to pause and wait for outside dial tones.

• Use software that permits human interaction. You never know when you may have to dial a phone manually or give an operator a calling card number orally.

• Use electronic mailboxes. If you can't directly dial your company's home computer, try depositing your missive in an electronic mailbox. Your associates then can use the same service to retrieve the message.

• Travel light. Don't lug around a printer if you really don't need one. Instead, equip your PC with a fax modem. This will enable you to print hardcopies of your work by faxing it to the hotel's fax machine.





How Family-Friendly Is Your Firm?

elping employees cope with work/family conflicts is becoming one of corporate America's biggest challenges. The Families & Work Institute recently surveyed 188 major U.S. companies to determine the extent to which companywide formal work/family policies had been adopted.

Following — listed in declining importance — is the NY-based institute's vision of what the ultimate family-friendly company would provide its employees:

• Dependent-care services: Child- and elder-care referral, on-site centers, and sick-child programs.

• Flexible work arrangements: Parttime work and variable starting and quitting times.

• Management change: Work/family coordinators and work/family training for managers.

 Financial assistance: Child-care discounts, long-term-care insurance, and flexible benefits.

• Work/family stress management: Relocation services, wellness programs, and work/family seminars.

 Corporate giving & community service: Funding for national or community work/family initiatives.

• Parental leaves: Job guarantees, length, and eligibility.

From this list the institute created a 610-point index. Applying this index to the policies in place at the companies surveyed, it found that **Johnson & Johnson** and **IBM** were far and away the most family-friendly firms. (Aetna, Corning, AT&T, John Hancock, Warner-Lambert, U.S. West, Du Pont, and Travelers rounded out the top 10.)

Nevertheless, only the top two firms totalled more than one-third of the points possible on the Families & Work Institute's index.

Your LMA Questions Answered

The recent "Ins & Outs Of Joint Station Agreements" column (R&R 2/14) generated so much feedback on the subject of these multi-station arrangements, I've decided to devote this week's column to answering readers' questions.

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For simplicity's sake, we'll refer to all such agreements as LMAs, whether referring to Local Marketing Agreements, Local Sales Agreements, or Joint Operating Agreements.

Q: Do you think LMAs are a fad?

A: Granted, ours is a trendy business prone to fads, whether they be co-op departments, new formats, positioning lines, etc. And for many stations, LMAs will be a fad - especially those that enter any kind of LMA without planning and a consistent approach.

Many LMAs will fall apart. However, those that are prudent, wellplanned, and well-executed will survive. I recently heard a story about two GMs who decided to form an LMA over lunch, went back to their stations simultane-

ously to tell the staffs what was going to occur, and then went about instituting the LMA. This kind of

action is obviously doomed from

the beginning. The business is justifiably searching for ways to expand profit centers and adjust operating overhead to a level commensurate with actual net profits. If forced to predict, I'd say that one LMA per metro (or per region) will survive I'd say that one LMA per metro will survive until ad growth returns to double digits.

Q: What ramifications exist that haven't been discussed?

A: The top issue which I - and some bankers - feel has not been addressed is: What does an LMA do to the value of the station's assets? Radio is not and has never been a business of property, plant, and equipment.

Radio has always been a business in which everyone but the FCC views the license as a tremendously valuable asset — an asset for a limited resource (frequencies). And given the current shortage of truly aggressive, forwardthinking, skilled professionals, investors are learning that this is a business in which people are tangible assets as well.

The traditional first-generation LMA – where one station provides the sales, programming, and marketing, and the other retains a shell of a staff – will seriously affect the stations' value over the long term. An LMA also offers a potential liability for the operating party, as a sizable amount of revenue may be lost.

Q: Should combo sales be forced on clients? A: Most of the people involved in

LMAs believe combo sales should be "highly encouraged." "Forced" is a rather harsh term, but letting the buying community feel combo buys are highly optional undermines much of the fiscal argument for entering an LMA in the first place.

The staff should be well-trained in dealing with such situations; financial incentives to sell both stations are a good idea. Management should also provide research and training to promote the combo buy.

Achieving additional revenue impact with fringe demos is one of the prime reasons for forming any LMA, especially when that impact allows you to leverage one station into fringe business it might not normally get in a shallow buy.

Out-of-demo business is another matter entirely, and should probably remain out of the question — especially on a low-inventory station.

Q: How would you suggest competing with an LMA?

A: If you review my last column's list of possible difficulties with LMAs, you can translate them

into weaknesses to exploit when competing with an LMA – specifically, audience duplication, weighting by cells, demos, ethnic skew, etc.

Q: How do you feel about LMAs that span two or more markets?

A: Linking sales and/or programming regionally makes great sense in many cases. An LMA may be prudent for overhead and revenue in state-wide networks of similarly formatted stations, or where the geographic area is often purchased simultaneously.

There are several examples of one or more metros being included in the same TSA, and of several adacent markets being included in the same megalopolis or metro area. (I've always thought it strange that none of the powerful Los Angeles or San Francisco morning shows are simulcast to both markets, or as part of a statewide network.) Similarly, New York, Philadelphia, Boston, and Washington, DC are geo-psychographically linked, as evidenced in part by Howard Stern's multimarket success. You could also say the same

Franchise Opportunities

onsider taking advantage of your in-house assets in the following areas. Each offers the possibility of a separate revenue-generating franchise.

• Programming — You can sell your product directly to other stations, whether lock, stock, and barrel, or divided into specific shows and features. If you have a platinum programmer, you can offer consultant services to other outlets.

• Technical & Engineering Support — This area has been hit by budget cuts as well as the tremendous lack of available qualified talent, whether they be studio designers, technical visionaries, tower experts, or parttime support. Your qualified staffers may be sitting idle while your equipment runs smoothly. Somebody else may be willing to pay for their expertise.

 Sales — Many stations' sales franchises can easily be replicated and marketed to other stations. For instance, experience in mounting expos, concerts, or other major revenue-generating events is always at a premium.

thing about smaller markets such as Belton, Killeen-Temple, and Waco, TX.

Searching For Other Income

Strip away all of the discussion surrounding LMAs, and the bottom line remains: How do you create additional revenues while maintaining maximum operating profits?

Not all options for increased income have to be directly tied to units on the particular station. After the LMA trend settles down (and several go under), the focus will probably turn to finding and developing additional profit centers that can drive revenue and profits and become self-sufficient assets.

Several potential profit centers are easily overlooked. The most underutilized is franchise revenue

Financial incentives to sell both stations are a good idea.

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- income deriving from talent, a concept, an event, or proprietary expertise that can be replicated elsewhere. Essentially, this entails going into the franchise business, today's fastest-growing business area. For example: you create a profit center when you construct a tower and lease space to other telecommunications concerns.


But the income doesn't have to be strictly confined to the broadcast business. Revenue can be created in many areas (see box at upper right). The first steps are vi• Creative — Creative services can be profitable, whether you exploit your multimedia capabilities, on-air jingles, or unique creative merchandising.

• Research — This is a growing area for many, even outside of the broadcast business. Consumer research companies are being hired at high rates by many corporations, manufacturers, and retailers who desire local usage and perceptual information.

• Proprietary software — This is one of the highest growth segments today. While many stations have developed software in a myriad of areas, others complain about the traffic systems currently available, the lack of broadcast networking software, the poor interactive database collection/management information systems, and so on. Those few that have refined their software and are committed to marketing it will reap the rewards of their investment.

sion, talent, a realistic commitment, staff to execute and sell, and a business plan. So far, these elements have been missing when broadcasters have tried to create franchise income.

In general, the business plans have been weak or nonexistent, or the would-be entrepreneurs have given the additional marketing responsibilities to individuals who already had full plates. And they've tried marketing their companies under their own names. That may not sound like a big problem, but considering the egos in this business, it becomes more of an issue than you might think.

BLACKS, WHITES & GREENS Attitudes On Environmentalism Surveyed

While 66% of all Americans say the environment "should take precedence over economic growth," recent surveys conducted by Cambridge, MA-based Cambridge Reports Research International found that black Americans are even more likely to agree with that statement than their white counterparts (69% vs. 63%).

Although similar majorities of black and white consumers say they would support a 5% income

tax increase *if* the money was "specifically used to clean up the environment," blacks are far more likely than whites to say that air pollution is a serious threat to human health and safety (54% vs. 35%, respectively).

While the two races are generally in agreement on the subject of the environment, there are nevertheless some significant differences between blacks and whites as to how environmental concerns are perceived and what actions industry and government should take to help Mother Earth.

Money Matters

• Blacks are more likely to say it's "very important" to buy household and garden products labeled environment-friendly (52% vs. 45%). More whites say it's "somewhat important" (32% vs. 23%).

• 37% of whites and 20% of blacks "would risk unemployment" so that industry could better protect the environment.

• More whites than blacks would be willing to pay higher prices "so that industry could better preserve and protect the environment" (72% vs. 62%).

• More whites than blacks would be willing to pay added costs to purchase environmentally friendly products (83% vs. 63%).

Truth In Advertising

• Both groups show a great degree of skepticism about products that claim to be environmentally sound. Only 47% of blacks – and 56% of whites – "generally believe" such claims. An almost equal number of blacks and whites (14% and 13%, respectively) are "unsure" about such claims. Furthermore, 40% of blacks and 30% of whites say they don't believe these product claims at all.

• Majorities of both groups say environmental concerns have caused them to change their dayto-day behavior (78% of whites and 67% of blacks).

Music Is Sixth Most-Popular Purchase

hen asked to name the things they most enjoyed buying, more than two in five Americans (42%) chose recorded music. Overall, recorded music was the sixth most-popular pleasurable purchase.

And . . . if you count all those people who, when giving, are giving the gift of music, then the amount of pleasure generated in buying recorded music may be even greater than the following figures detail:

K-based Garage Wizard Ltd. recently patented the "Terminator," an anti-theft system for cars as well as their radio/cassette players.

The device consists of an extendable, steel arm. One end locks to the car's gearbox, the other holds a dummy cassette. When the false cassette is secured in the player (and a locking button is pressed), the stereo can't be removed and since the gearshift is immobilized the car can't be moved either.

The company also makes a model that attaches to the handbrake rather than the gearbox. Incidentally, the dummy cassette is reversible, so it can be used with either left- or right-loading cassette players. For more info, call (212) 745-0495.

Americans Getting More Mileage Out Of Their Autos

A mericans are purchasing fewer new cars and hanging onto their old autos longer. While 1990 sales of domestic and imported cars dipped for the second consecutive year, the number of automobiles on U.S. streets increased to more than 123 million, up nearly 518,000 vehicles from 1989.

What's more, the average age of road-ready autos climbed to 7.8 years in 1990, surpassing the previous year's average car age (7.6), which had held for five straight years.

Following are some other auto statistics every radio salesperson should know, courtesy of the Detroit-based Motor Vehicle Manufacturers Association:

Drive Time

· Boomers, defined as those age

35-44, continue to make the lion's share (24%) of new car purchases. The 35-44 demo also accounts for more than a third (34%) of all U.S. purchases of European cars.

• More than half (53%) of all new Asian cars are purchased by 35-44s and 25-34s.

• A third of American households have at least one vehicle; another third have two; 6 million households have three; and 2.7 million have four or more.

• More than a quarter (27%) of new car buyers plan on keeping their vehicle for five years; 15% plan on keeping theirs for four years; and 15% plan on keeping their new cars for 10 or more years.

• The number of licensed drivers

increased to 67,555,000 in 1990, up 2.1 million.

• Female drivers outnumber their male counterparts in five states (Delaware, Iowa, Kansas, Maine, and Tennessee). **Truckin'**

• Nearly a quarter (24%) of new pickup truck buyers plan on keeping their vehicle for 10 or more years.

• Nearly two-thirds of pickups are used primarily for personal transportation.

• Nearly half (45%) of pickups are purchased by blue-collar workers.

• Professionals purchase the plurality (25%) of sport/utility vehicles.

Coffee Drinking Drops, Gourmet Sales Perk Up

n average, Americans are drinking far less coffee these days. U.S. coffee consumption fell from a daily average of 3.1 cups per adult in 1962 to an estimated 1.75 cups in 1991, according to the National Coffee Assn.

Only half of U.S. adults currently have the coffee habit, down from three out of four in the 1960s. Furthermore, total coffee sales have been stagnant, climbing from \$6.3 billion in 1987 to \$6.8 billion in 1992.

Despite these figures, the *gour-met* coffee business – offering specialty roasts and blends – isn't suffering. The NYC-based Find/SVP research firm says sales of varieties such as Kenyan or Hawaiian Kona by companies not affiliated with major brands have increased an average of 13% annually, from less than \$500 million in 1987 to an estimated \$780 million in 1991.

Several purveyors of specialty coffee are going national. Seattle's **Starbucks Coffee Co.** has expanded to 110 stores and an estimated \$80 million in revenues. Buffalo Grove, IL-based Gloria Jean's Coffee Bean now sports 124 stores in more than 100 cities and plans to open another 58 (mostly franchise operations) by 1993. The company claims revenues jumped from \$18 million in 1989 to \$50 million in 1991.

Fewer Taxpayers Giving \$1 To FEC

I n 1989, less than one out of every five American taxpayers checked the box on their 1040 Form that sets aside \$1 of their tax money to pay for the U.S. presidential campaign, according to the North Hollywood, CA-based Miller, Kaplan, Arase & Co. accounting firm.

As recently as the late '70s, nearly 30% of U.S. taxpayers were willing to donate their dollar to the Federal Election Commission. However, this figure has been declining ever since.

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DAB

which supports L-band, circulated a document Monday (2/24) urging immediate availability of frequencies so that its government could proceed with its plans for its proposed terrestrial DAB system, years before the first DAB satellite is launched. Satellite CD Radio Chairman Martin Rothblatt and World-Space/AfriSpace President Noah Samara were active outside the WARC meeting rooms pitching their satellite DAB proposals to any delegate who would listen. They claimed to be having success in convincing delegates that satellite DAB could be just a few years down the road.

With less than a week remaining, the conference must wrap up its business by next Tuesday (3/3). So far, only one minor document has received final approval and a handful of other small issues are awaiting final votes. None of the major issues, including DAB consensus, appeared close to resolution.

Moroccan Proposal

Frustrated by the lack of progress, Moroccan delegation head **Mohammed Manessouri** proposed that a special committee be appointed to work on a universal agreement that would include all of the major issues. Oman representative Salim Al-Abdissalaam said, "This is the fourth week of the conference and we haven't settled any of the important issues." He and most leaders from the smaller attending countries voiced support for Manessouri's proposal.

WARC Chairman Jose Barrionuevo Pena of Spain put off any decision on the Moroccan suggestion, leaving the established committees to continue their work for a few more days.

Continued from Page 3 January and February are the months in which national business traditionally lags far behind local revenue. During a typical January, only 5.7% of annual national business runs, compared to 6.5% of annual local business. This occurs again during February, when 6% of national and 7.1% of local annual revenues run.

RAB President Gary Fries noted that radio finished 1991 in far better condition than the magazine, newspaper, and broadcast TV industries.

Regions Rebound

When broken out by region, national revenues in the Southeast and Midwest were up 8% and 11.3% respectively in December, following November declines of nearly 4% in each. The Southwest rebounded from a 12.5% decline in November 1991 with a 3.7% rise in December. The East experienced the most depressed revenues in 1991, with local down 4.4% and national off 5.2% for the year.

Continued from Page 1 "The sentiment likely to be expressed at the Senate hearing will reflect those of [Markey]," said Irving.

According to Irving, Markey is committed to "keeping the Commission from eviscerating structural regulation."

'Audience-Based' Rule?

Next week's hearing will undoubtedly focus on a February 18 FCC memo in which Mass Media Bureau Chief Roy Stewart recommended elimination of the national ownership limit in favor of an "audience-based" local ownership rule for major markets.

According to Stewart, the national limit "no longer serves the Commission's traditional concerns about economic concentration and diversity" and should be abandoned. If the commissioners aren't comfortable with a total abolition, Stewart said, they should permit licensees to own between 100 and 200 stations in any combination of AMs and FMs.

The memo included a third option of eliminating the AM limit and boosting the FM cap to 54 - anumber the bureau says "would restore the same ratio of ownership to all FMs as existed when the 7-7-7 rule was created in 1953." Stewart opposes this option because it provides special treatment for the AM band.

On the local level, Stewart urged the commissioners to permit broadcasters in the top 260 markets to own as many stations as they wish in a single market so long as their combined share of the local audience does not exceed more than 20-25%, as measured by Arbitron.

In smaller markets – those with eight stations or less – a licensee could own up to four stations, regardless of band, so long as those properties did not account for more than half the radio outlets in the market.

The Senate hearing will also address Sen. Larry Pressler's (R-SD) long-pending AM stereo bill, which would – among other things – require the FCC to set a standard for the technology.

'MAL 'Skinless

WMAL's loss of the Redskins' rights, which the N/T station had held since 1942 (with one sevenyear interruption from 1957-1963), shocked the Washington radio community.

According to WMAL OM Jim Gallant, 'Skins owner Jack Kent Cooke was asking a minimum of \$3.5 million per year for the rights, far more than the \$2.7 million for the last three-year contract and significantly more than WMAL was willing to pay this time around.

Gallant said WMAL will continue to cover the Redskins aggressively, including pre-game, post-game and locker room shows featuring former Redskins quarterback and WMAL color commentator Sonny Jurgensen.

"We're leaving the door open to the Redskins," said Gallant. "We lost them once before and they came back. In the meantime, we're going to cover them better than any radio station in town."

"Under the new rules, candidates are not only entitled to the lowest unit rate, but they're also allowed to cherry-pick the slots in which their ads run," Greene said. "In the past, such spots were sold in packages and spread out across all dayparts. Now they can come in and say, 'I only want morning drive or the Michael Jackson show." "

Greene, whose station reportedly bills \$35 million annually, said, "Thankfully, our lowest rate is not that low. But the Dodgers are coming on next month, and we've got to be watchful of our inventory."

Limited Acceptance

George Nicholaw, VP/GM at all-News KNX/Los Angeles, said his station hasn't decided upon a political advertising policy but is leaning toward limited acceptance of local and statewide spots.

"We'll probably accept advertising for the races that will have the greatest impact on the largest number of our listeners, such as district attorney or board of supervisors. We'll also look at the statewide races — such as the one for governor — and see what impact they have. But I don't think we'll take advertising for state house or senate campaigns."

Continued from Page 1 have to sell to them if you don't want to.

 Broadcasters can require political candidates to pay in advance. But the decision to do so must be based on the same criteria applied to commercial accounts. If, for example, all new commercial advertisers are required to make up-front payments, the rule can also be applied to new political customers.

 The most common violation discovered in the FCC's infamous 1990 political advertising audit was the failure to maintain proper political files. Such files must note all requests for time and the disposition of those requests, including copies of the schedules that ran and the amounts candidates were charged.

• The FCC will be aggressive in its enforcement efforts. Fines run from \$12,500 to \$250,000. Rep. John Dingell (D-MI) has asked the agency to do another political audit during this primary season. That may or may not happen.

• Being sold out is not an excuse to deny a candidate reasonable access.





Topics will reportedly center on local politics and the economy in the daytime and sex talk — spiced with some Gold — at night. CHR As A Niche Format

Dance or alternative approaches provide best chance for survival

The CHR debate rages on.

Obviously, emotions run high anytime a major format is under fire; this was particularly evidenced at recent industry conventions. However, hoping something isn't true won't make it go away.

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Mainstream CHR essentially ceased to be viable in competitive markets two years ago, when managers – making it clear that having a substantial 12-24 audience wasn't good enough – forced programmers to aim older. This effectively pulled the plug on mainstream CHR.

Let's not be confused. As a format, CHR isn't dead. But what's been known as mainstream CHR isn't viable except in format-exclusive markets. In markets with more heated competition, the days of effectively playing everything from rock to rap to dance to pop ballads are over.

It's obvious no station can play all of the Top 10 selling albums when that list includes Nirvana, Bonnie Raitt, Metallica, Hammer, Garth Brooks, and Michael Bolton. A station with a set of music like that is headed for disaster. You can be successful playing rock or alternative or dance. But if you try to do all of these genres in a fragmented market - where several CHR niches are taken your station will inevitably lose.

The only exception that would prevent a major ratings slide is when the mainstream CHR's niche is defined by a great morning show, not by its music. This is also true for mainstream AOR and AC, where stations are literally identified in diaries by a personality's name.

Dance Card

Other than the morning show niche position, I believe there will only be two CHR formats that will survive the next few years:

• Dance. Like it or not, dance-leaning CHRs are the mainstream Top 40s of the '90s. Dance-leaning formats, which rely on rhythm and rap, have clobbered most broad-based CHR Like it or not, dance-leaning CHRs are the mainstream Top 40s of the '90s.

competitors. The only difficulty for rhythm is that it isn't attractive to advertisers. Unfortunately, unsophisticated media buyers, agencies, and station reps don't understand that 12-24year-old listeners make more purchasing decisions than ever before thought. Many studies reveal this group has considerable disposable income and also influences parental buying decisions.

CHR has done a poor job of educating advertisers about the value of having a large 12-24 audience. Now, no one wants a young adult audience because it won't generate enough advertising dollars. The rejection of young listeners is the single biggest reason CHR is in such terrible shape and is being programmed in such a schizophrenic way today.

Are CHRs programming for the available audience or for advertisers? How else can you explain topselling singles with tremendous phone response being played after 7pm while inoffensive, passive ballads are being played throughout the day? Some major market stations are even going so far as to block-program CHR during the day and alternative at night.

As I stated in my first article about the state of CHR (R&R 9/13/91): "Trying to appeal to adults in a young music environment by playing AC artists is like casting Dustin Hoffman in 'Bill And Ted's Bogus Journey' in a bid to get adults to see the film." It's absurd and doesn't work. I don't

believe there's such a thing as Adult Top 40. That's a misnomer. You're either CHR or AC. You can't be both and win. If you're doing Hot AC, you're not doing CHR anymore.

Speaking Of Alternatives

Another format offshoot CHRs should consider is:

• Alternative. The contemporary format of the '90s will be based on alternative music and will essentially replace the old Top 40s that attempted to play rock, pop, dance, etc.

While a majority of mainstream acts in all formats haven't done well in record and concert sales, alternative music has generated some of the most profitable concerts (e.g., the Lollapalooza tour) of the past year. Nirvana, Siouxsie & The Banshees, et al. are the acts listeners want to hear and are paying to see. In recent years, the Cure and Depeche Mode have been selling out stadiums. Yet in most markets, there are no alternative-based contemporary stations. Even today, most CHRs are barely playing Nirvana – which shows how out of touch the format is with music that's actually happening.

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CHR has done a poor job of educating advertisers about the value of having a large 12-24 audience.

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By the end of 1993, alternative music formats will explode onto the scene in most markets. This is the first significant underground movement since the trend that brought album music to FM radio in the late '60s. These new alternative stations will take the best ingredients from CHR and AOR: an uptempo delivery and an in-your-face attitude.

While some alternative stations initially will be

either album- or singlesbased, I predict the format will have the most potential by playing "top tracks," concentrating on singles as well as a few highly identifiable hit album tracks. Why? Because most album stations must rely heavily on library product to add familiarity and, as you know, there isn't a lot of familiar alternative-based library material. It'll be

much easier for alternative stations to focus on top tracks and play from a small library.

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Although this kind of format would be primarily 12-24, it could generate a slightly older and more male audience than traditional CHR has in the past. Obviously, this format will hurt both mainstream CHR and AOR.

The numbers are there for alternative-based formats. Phone and retail response as well as concert sales are making dramatic success stories out of acts like Nirvana, Live, and Pearl Jam, who receive very little airplay. Where's the format for these acts? I predict wise broadcasters searching for format solutions in markets all over the country will start resonating "the street" by opting for a contemporary-based alternative niche in 1992.

No Middle Ground

While the audience is clearly present to support

these two forms of CHR, the caveat is that dance and alternative CHR are 12-24 formats. These aren't music genres that generally appeal to 25+ listeners. But as I've always said and will continue to preach, if you want 25+ on a young adult radio station, whether it be dance or alternative, you must have a great morning show.

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Managers, if you're in the CHR business and would like 25+ demos, let your PD play the hits and hire a great morning show. CHR broadcasters, quit dayparting hot acts who generate great retail and request activity. Don't avoid playing these acts during the day. Instead, learn to sell the format better to advertisers and agencies.

If you're in the CHR business in a competitive market (two or more CHR stations), you'd better play dance or alternative music, or make sure your station's niche is having the best morning show in town. Because if you're on the musical middle ground without a quality morning show, you're "no one's favorite radio station" and have taken the first step toward oblivion.

The Zoo features Australian singer/guitarist (and former Capricorn solo artist) Billy Thorpe, who co-produced the as-yet-untitled disc with Fleetwood. Also in the band: singer Bekka Bramlett who's joined by her mother, Bonnie Sheridan (Bramlett) - on the cut "In Your Hands."

And ... yet another Mac mate, Rick Vito, sees his "King Of Hearts" Modern/Atlantic solo debut enter stores this week (R&R 1/17).

Soul II Soul III

"This [third album] is much more geared to the Caribbean, which makes it at first listening more Americanized," Soul II Soul honcho Jazzie B tells Rock Over London. Due in mid-April, the new album also features more male vocalists than previous group efforts.

Among those males are London soul singer Rick Clarke and Jamaican Richie Stephens - the latter of whom sings on the first single ("Joy") - due March 16. Also featured are UK female reggae artist Kofi and a "mystery vocalist" whose identity will be revealed only when the LP is released. ROL theorizes that this last track may surface under a pseudonym or on a "white label" first.

Kiss Plots 'Revenge'

KISS is recording "Revenge" with producer Bob Ezrin (who produced their "Destroyer" LP). Due May 19 from Mercury, the disc contains such titles as "Take It Off," "Spit," "Unholy," and the band's cover of Argent's "God Gave Rock & Roll To You Part II,' as heard on the "Bill & Ted's Bogus Journey" soundtrack

BOOK BEAT Tell-Tale Grammy Chronicle he story of the Grammy

Awards is that of a struggle between the mountain of the music establishment and the winds of change, claims author Henry Schipper, whose "Broken Record: The Inside Story Of The Grammy Awards" (\$17.95/Birch Lane Press) is due in mid-April.

In his lively, anecdotal history of popular music's first awards show, the ex-Daily Variety Music Editor argues that the Grammys have historically shunned important new music, whether snubbing the Beatles to reward the Anita Kerr Singers in 1965 or lauding Milli Vanilli as Best New Artist in 1989.

The 224-page hardcover starts at the 1957 formation of NARAS ---which Schipper says was a reaction to the growing threat of rock 'n' roll - and ends with longtime shutout



The Rockford Files

WXRX becomes first to topple perennial market leader WZOK

January 2, 1992 is an historic date in the brief history of WXRX/Rockford, IL. For it was on that day the Fall '91 Arbitron advances proclaimed the Airplay Broadcasting AOR the market's No. 1 station, marking the first time that anyone had *ever* beaten CHR WZOK.

WZOK's 17.1-12.5 tumble certainly helped, of course, but 'XRX didn't back into this victory, jumping 10.5-14.9. Pretty lofty numbers for any station, particularly one with a less-than-stellar background.

Cleaning The 'Dump'

'XRX began as WYBR back in 1986. It posted some decent ratings, but PD Tim Crull, who joined during summer 1988, says working conditions were far from ideal.

"I was actually hired over the phone without an interview," he recalls. "My theory is they didn't want me to see the place, because it was a real dump at the time. The equipment was archaic, and the station went off the air regularly. I don't even know if we had an engineer."

Crull stuck it out at WYBR before the station was sold to Airplay a year later. In the course of those 12 months, he advanced from morning drive to Production Director to acting PD. "I guess they thought I might have some leadership ability. But my role as interim PD was basically to baby-sit the station and keep it on the air until the sale went through."

Although Crull wasn't thrilled with the outgoing ownership, he was also leery of the new regime. "I was pretty scared at first because we had no idea what they were going to do with the station," he recalls. "There was a big rumor they'd take it AC. But after a while, they sat me and Promotion Direc-

tor Sky Drysdale down and said, 'We've had a chance to check out everybody here and we think you guys are high caliber. So, we're going to keep it AOR.' "

Airplay recognized the only way it could hope to compete was to improve both working conditions and staff. "We were going off the air once a day by that time, and the personnel was pretty shaky," Crull says. "It was really a pit. So we decided we had to put WYBR to bed and start from scratch.

"We gutted the studios, brought in all new equipment, and hired a really good consulting engineer. The work atmosphere improved immediately. At the same time, we hired a bunch of new people."

Once the technical and cosmetic improvements were completed, it was time for some serious programming changes, starting with a call letter switch.

X-Cellent Adventure

WXRX was born January 1, 1990, after a typical weeklong publicity stunt. "It was one of those wacky radio things," Crull explains. "We promised to run 30 hours of continuous **Beatles** music beginning Christmas Eve, but we kept playing them the next day. The day after, we played one Beatles song followed by one Stones song. Each day after that we added a new artist: the Eagles, Seger, the Who, and Led Zeppelin."

Although the station remained AOR, Crull says 'XRX's mix differed significantly from its predecessor's. "When we looked through the WYBR computer, there were only two categories that really made any sense – currents and Christmas music. The rest was a real [mishmash] of junk. There really wasn't a lot of structure.



"Because of that, we started off very tight, rotating about 600 classic titles with a handful of currents. We gradually evolved the mix from there, adding more '80s material and increasing the number of currents.

"We also added [voice talent] Charlie Kendall to the mix, which made a big difference. Nobody in the market had really used a versatile voice like his. The overall audio quality was 100% better, as

Levine: The Difference Between Owner And Program Director

y February 21 column about WOUR/Utica, NY's tremendous success prompted this reply from Ed Levine, President/co-owner of crosstown Classic Rock WKLL:

Since I was not given the opportunity to participate in your Utica article, I thought I would clarify a few points:

• I am the President and co-owner of WKLL — not the program director. WKLL has an extremely competent PD and full programming staff. To insinuate I'm in Utica, on-site, calling all the programming shots is not only incorrect, it's insulting to the great staff that is there.

If you want to evaluate my recent programming efforts, you've got to look at WPYX/Albany. That's where I am four-five days every week as the "on-site consultant." The 4.9-6.4-8.0 three-book trend speaks for itself.

• While WKLL did not have a good fall Arbitron, it should be noted that this is the first down book the station has had in its two-year history.

 Since you seem intent on judging my Utica performance, let's judge it by the numbers that really matter: My partners and I purchased the construction permit for WKLL for \$165,000 in 1990. Using one-anda-half times gross as a guideline, you'll find WKLL has appreciated in asset value approximately \$500,000 in two years. WKLL will be profitable in 1992, just its second full year on the air. Simply put, my partners and I made a great deal with WKLL!

l left a good job with the best company in radio [PD at Infinity's

was the jock presentation. It was just a much better radio station." Regardless of how spectacular the improvements, only an extreme optimist could have predicted 'XRX would even come close to challenging WZOK, let alone beating the CHR powerhouse. Crull readily admits he had no such illusions.

"As a matter of fact, we had a down book in Spring '91, so we fig-

WJFK/Washington] to pursue my dream of owning a group of radio stations. It's what everybody talks about doing, but few ever actually do. I don't need a "ham-and-egger" like you busting my balls.

Frankly, Levine makes some very valid points. Given his extensive AOR programming background and continuing involvement at WPYX, it's easy to overlook the fact that he's WKLL's owner. While he certainly has more than a passing interest in the station's ratings, holding him responsible for them doesn't make sense. After all, when an Infinity station has a down book, we don't blame Mel Karmazin.

On the other hand, it's certainly no coincidence that WPYX's ratings have nearly *doubled* since Levine's return. Anyone analyzing Ed's day-to-day programming skills should be looking at Albany — not Utica.

ured our best hope was to grab the No. 2 spot. So it was a pleasant surprise when the advances came in.

"It definitely showed our competition we were for real. So many operators had taken over this station, come on with a bang, and then drifted off into radio hell."

Demos = **Profits**

In the final analysis, Crull says winning the 12+ beauty crown is "mainly an ego thing" and feels the station's demographic profile is the real key.

"We're very solid across the board, which is crucial in a market this size. A 12-24 station couldn't pay the light bill in Rockford. With the available ad dollars, anybody who tried to do something like that here would learn a lesson real fast."

'XRX's historic book certainly came at the right time; like most stations, it's coming off a tough fourth quarter. "It was our worst in two years," Crull says. "Even the bigger corporations that do business with us cut their ad budgets. Luckily, we're so hot all of a sudden that we're sold out. We've shifted the ad dollars quite a bit."

When you talk about a market Rockford's size (No. 143, if you're scoring), you naturally figure regular research is a luxury, which it is at 'XRX. Airplay did a cluster analysis prior to closing on the station, but has done little more on the research front.

Crull does get helpful national input from DeMers Programming/ Marketing, which has consulted the outlet since September 1989. In addition, the station conducts what Crull describes as "quasi-focus groups."


"We call them 'listener advisory boards.' We ask listeners to write in and tell us in 50 words or less why they'd like to be an expert. Then we rent a conference room at a local motel and talk about the station and the market. We find it's a good reality check. It's also good public relations."

Affordable TV

Although it may lack a huge research budget, 'XRX more than holds its own in the marketing arena, concentrating on television. Crull cites the station's ongoing relationship with Film House as a significant element in 'XRX's overall success.

"TV's very affordable in Rockford, and there are good trade relationships in town, which is very important. The stations need to use us for their sweeps and they don't have a lot of money to throw around for radio spots." Crull also attributes a good deal of the station's ratings gains to its evolving "stationality. We began just concentrating on the music for about a year. Then we started to develop the personas of the people on the air."

It's noteworthy that 'XRX has soared to No. 1 without the benefit of a high-profile morning show. "We decided to worry about that only after all the other dayparts were taken care of," Crull explains. "We have three games during the morning show, plus news, weather, and sports, and that's about it. We run 30-minute music sweeps every hour.





New CHR Guidelines Focus On Reporting Reality

R&R's newly introduced CHR Reporting Guidelines have some significant differences from last year's update.

Specifically, the most important changes include:

· Testing records limited to one week; then records must be reported if still being played • Reporting to R&R first before

any other publication · Lowering of current music

minimums from 60% to 55%

 New ratings percentages to attain and maintain reporting status.

Following is an overview of the new guidelines, which are now in effect

Short History Lesson

Because R&R's music information has always been generated from a carefully qualified panel of the nation's radio format ratings leaders, it has become the industry standard for timely, accurate, comprehensive airplay data. In order to make sure it stays that way, our reporting stations must meet standards for ratings success, format qualification, and accuracy.

Nearly 20 years ago, R&R revolutionized the industry by focusing attention on airplay charts, publishing for the first time raw data that went into the chart and demystifying decades of unsubstantiated numbers, bullets, and charts.

Our fast turnaround of the data we received from our reporters provided the industry the most current music information it had ever enjoyed, and reporting stations' informed, honest playlists of the music they'd be featuring in the coming week gave the radio and record business something completely new - a reliable, timely chart that allowed radio stations to plan their future playlists, using information from specific stations - gleaned from our Parallels and published playlists - that matched their local audience targets.

R&R has evolved its methodology to meet the needs of the industry, and will continue to do so, including adding monitor technology in the near future. But our principles remain the same:

· Only the top winning radio stations report

· Reporters are asked to report, poroughly and honestly, the play list they'll be using during the coming week.

We don't ask for the music they played last week, or a monitored airplay report that's even older by the time it's published. Even a completely accurate monitored report is, at best, nothing but history. R&R music information, the freshest, most current available, provides a factual, honest guide to what will be happening.

Reporters Are Winning Radio Stations

Stations are chosen primarily on the basis of their Arbitron ratings. CHR reporters are either 12+ format-dominant in their markets or are judged by R&R's Editorial Board to be sufficiently competitive with the market's CHR leader that their musical input is valuable.

Music Guidelines

All reporting stations are expected to provide local programming input to R&R's national music overview. Reporters cannot employ satellite or other national programming services for more than 15% of the broadcast week (or up to 30% if the bulk of the national programming is in overnights).

Based on the national consensus of our reporters, we have determined standard playlist guidelines for our music formats. These guidelines may shift as the musical climates in the various formats change.

While no editorial comments are ever offered on individual records that stations report, a station whose playlist consistently diverges from the national consensus by an appreciable amount, as determined by the R&R Editorial Board, may lose its reporting status.

Mainstream Music Percentages A mainstream R&R CHR reporter's playlist should be made up

of at least 80% of the music from within the weekly R&R CHR universe: the National Airplay/40, New & Active, and Significant Action

CHR Reporter Add/Drop Ratings Guidelines

A CHR reporter's Parallel status is based on Arbitron's 12+ metro population. Stations must sustain acceptable 12+ ratings results (see below for specifics) in an Arbitrondefined metro market. Reporters' rating status is reviewed each time a book is issued in their individual markets. County Reports and Custom Survey Area Reports do not qualify.

• PARALLEL 1: 12+ METRO OF ONE MILLION OR MORE. These markets may have multiple reporters provided they can attain and maintain at least 40% of the market format leader's 12+ AQH share. Any P1 reporter falling below 40% for two consecutive books will be subject to evaluation based on its musical diversity and value to our database. Continued under-performance may, at the discretion of the R&R Editorial Board, result in a station losing reporting status or being reassigned to P2 until ratings minimums can be attained again. Potential third reporters in a market will be selected at the discretion of the R&R editorial board, based on ratings, market size, and musical diversity

• PARALLEL 2: 12 + METRO OF 200,000-1 MILLION. Markets of 500,000 and above may have multiple reporters provided that they attain and maintain 50% of the 12+ AQH share of the market's format leader. In these markets, any P2 reporter that falls below 50% for two consecutive books is subject to the same evaluation process detailed above in the Parallel 1 section

P2 reporters in markets below 500,000 must attain and maintain 60% of the 12+ AQH share of the market's format leader, without exception.

• PARALLEL 3: 12+ METRO BELOW 200,000. Markets with more than 150,000 population may have multiple reporters provided that the second-rated reporter attains and maintains 75% of the 12+ AQH share of the market's format leader

In markets below 150,000 population, only the top-rated qualified CHR station will be chosen as a reporter, with the following exceptions. In cases of a tie or a difference of one half-share or less between two stations, R&R will at its discretion allow oversampling by retaining both reporters, in the interest of fair play. However, at any time, no more than five markets in this population category may have two reporters. In all other cases, the 12+ AQH format leader will be the market's sole reporter, subiect to review each time a new book comes out.

Special consideration, on a case-by-case basis, will be allowed stations in any Parallel with severe technical/signal problems during a ratings book, provided the problems are noted in the Arbitron report.

Stations losing reporter status for repeated violations of accuracy will be reevaluated on a case-by-case basis by the R&R Editorial Board after assurances by station ownership/management that safeguards are in place to prevent such occurrences from happening again.

> Dance/Rock/New Rock **Leaning Music** Percentages

An R&R CHR reporter with a decided Dance, Rock, or New Rock lean should have a playlist made up of at least 50% of the music from within the weekly R&R CHR universe, and music within the CHR universe must be the primary component of the station's playlist.


It should be noted that these percentages apply to the reported playlist and corresponding on-air content of the station between 6am-12midnight on a daily basis.

R&R also reserves the right to decide from airchecks if a station is in the CHR format based on its overall formatic lean, tempo, or presentation.

Rotation Guidelines

Minimum airplay requirements: A fulltime record must receive at least three plays between 6am and 12midnight every day. A dayparted record must receive one to two plays between 6am and midnight. Dayparted records in the "adds" and "ons" sections should be reported as such.



Test Rotation Guidelines

R&R requires that stations report everything in a current rotation.

A current playlist should solely constitute all records - including album cuts - in current rotation. Records being played five to seven times during a week, following a test period of one week, must be reported.

Stations that don't report everything played in a current rotation — including album cuts — are reporting an incomplete playlist and could face a loss of reporting status. Reporting a record not being played could also jeopardize a station's reporting status.

Current Music Percentage Guidelines

The programming emphasis of a CHR reporter should be current-intensive. On average, at least 55% of the music played should be current. It is not necessary that a station be 55% current in all dayparts, but it must be at least 55% current on average when all of the records played between 6am-12midnight are evaluated.

A station that plays less than this amount of current music will no longer be considered an active CHR outlet by R&R, and could lose reporting status.

CHR reporters that have moved in an adult direction in all dayparts and more closely resemble an AC station in sound, tempo, or presentation may also lose reporting status.

R&R considers current music to be any title that is currently listed on the CHR National Airplay/40, New & Active, or Significant Action sections, and any title that was active during the past four weeks from the date of the playlist and/or monitor being analyzed in any of these areas.

CHR

Playlist Length

Stations may report up to 40 numbered records. We will ask them to designate their five hottest records. These should be charted records with significant upward movement; records with downward moves will not be accepted for hot reports.

Stations may report as many "adds" with a number on the chart as they have; our present reporting system also accepts up to 15 "adds without numbers." The system will now also accept up to 20 "ons" (records added in previous weeks which did not convert to the chart).

"Adds" are not permitted on frozen playlists. Two consecutive frozen lists result in a station's data not being used in the second week's national information.

Phone Reports Increase Accuracy

All playlists must be phoned in by 5pm PST each Tuesday. We do not accept "faxed" playlists. With faxed playlists, the potential for error increases. We prefer a phone call, so that we can verify the information with an accredited station representative.

Report To R&R First

Over the past 20 years, a number of publications have continued to "promote" R&R reporters under the guise of obtaining chart information for their limited-circulation publication vehicles. R&R has maintained complete objectivity in report-taking so that the radio and music industries can trust our information. In return, we ask for accurate reports, given to us before they're given to any other publication.

On A Personal Note

Since the letter containing the new guidelines for **R&R** CHR Reporters you see summarized in this week's column hit stations' desks, much talk has been generated.

With the competitive monitoring services now available, there are few secrets about who's playing what any more. Later this year **R&R**'s monitoring technology will bring you an unsurpassed level of airplay reality.

The bottom line on these guidelines is that **R&R** is simply refining what we've been delivering for nearly 20 years to our reporters and readership at large: the most accurate, current music information available. The Gospel According To Brother Esmond Patterson

Thirty-five years into his broadcasting career – and just in time for Black History Month – Brother Esmond Patterson's story has been included in the archives of Washington, DC's Smithsonian Institute. The Gospel radio pioneer has influenced the religious growth of Atlanta's black community for over three decades.

A video interview with Patterson will be housed in the Institute's Anacostia Museum of African-American history. Atlanta Interfaith Broadcasters, a local religious cable network, annually presents the Anacostia Museum with videotaped records of various forms of religious observance.

This year, because his story was part of that record, Patterson accompanied the delegation to Washington. He was so impressed by the museum that he mounted a remote broadcast to tell his WAOK/Atlanta audience about the work being done there to document the African-American experience.

can-American experience. Patterson reflected, "When the lady called me from Atlanta Interfaith Broadcasters and asked if I'd come over to be interviewed, I thought this was just some little thing they were going to do and then leave the tape in the corner somewhere.

"So, after we did the tape and I read in the local newspapers that they had put together a committee of people to go to Washington to deliver it to the Smithsonian, I was knocked off my feet. I just could hardly believe it!"

Morning Person

He should have believed it. Patterson's a legend in Atlanta and Gospel radio. He's been with Summit's WAOK for 28 years, and that wasn't even his first radio job. "The first station I ever broadcast on was the first black-owned and operated radio station in the country – [Atlanta's] WERD. They had been on the air a while when I started with them in 1955."

Sunday mornings are Patterson's real stronghold. For over 30 years, first on WERD and now on WAOK, his Sunday shift has been 6am-noon. (He goes to church right afterward.) Arbitron shows

what kind of devotion he pulls in: WAOK's share among persons 12+ on Sunday 6am-10am is 12.6, second overall in a field of 24 outlets. He's in double digits in most every demo in that time period, and ranked No. 1 in many of them.

He said, "I've been No. 1 in Atlanta for over 15 years on Sunday mornings. The only station to beat me is an FM station that plays nothing but music – no commercials. I play commercials on my program, and we've really been blessed with that kind of success.

He explained how his early bird shift works on weekdays: "I start every morning at 4am, and I'm on by myself for three hours. At 7am our PD [Michael Gamble] comes in, and we do two hours together; we chit-chat back and forth, and we play some music." MD Connie Flint chooses the music.

"You have to understand this market and the fact that I made Gospel music popular at 4am a long time ago," he chuckled. "It was 4 o'clock because the boss said, 'Well, I can't let you do but an hour and that's from five o'clock until six o'clock.' I told him I wouldn't come in and do just an hour.

"Then he said, 'Would you want to come in at 4am? Nobody's going to get up and listen to you at that time of the morning except a rat and an owl!' I told him, 'You're right, but when I'm through telling everybody, they'll get up and listen!' And that's just what happened. People have been listening starting at 4am since 1980."

Self-Promotion

That's no accident. Patterson explained, "I'm a community man. My success in this market has been with the people. I was born and raised right here in this city, and that's how so many people know me here. I stay out there in the street with them.


"I've been a paper boy, an insurance agent, and a furniture salesman; all my life has been public work. That's meant meeting people, and I've told people about my program on the radio. I've been my own public relations person through the years, and that's made me popular and kept me on the radio."

Air talent and self-promoter – sounds like two jobs. Patterson exclaimed, "That's right, that's right ... and sometimes three! In my first job at WERD I was the janitor, and I did a show on the air. As a matter of fact, I used to have to put the bucket over in the corner sometimes in the morning and then hurry up and put my theme song on."

Helping Hand

"I'm involved with a lot of things in the community," said Patterson. "I'm an active member of the NAACP, the SCLC [Southern Christian Leadership Conference], the UNCF, and the Butler Street YMCA, where I've been a member for 25 years and on the board for two years."

Patterson's been devoted to the Paradise Baptist Church for 40 years, which he says has kept him strong spiritually. He's also active in charities like the March Of Dimes and the Sunset Avenue Blind Center. "That's my way of contributing to a better way of life for those less fortunate," he said.

"I've helped a lot of people because I love people. I've asked for no hurrahs for what I do, but if you plant good seeds, good things will grow from them. And if you plant bad seeds, that's what you'll get back. Over the years I've helped people by buying food for them to feed their children.

"I've helped churches in need of financial assistance by talking about them on my program and having Gospel singing benefits.

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l've truly been blessed during my career. People have helped me do a lot of wonderful things, and being on the radio with God's help has made it all possible.

I've also helped churches pay their gas bills so they'd be able to cook to feed the needy. When you do these things, the word gets around to those in the community. I guess you can say I'm a concerned person "

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Gospel Caravan

Once a month, Patterson puts on the Gospel Caravan, his 30-year tradition. "This is a community Gospel program. People like it because we travel around the city to different churches, there's no admission charge, and we just get together and have a good time singing and praying and preaching. Over 1500 people meet us there each month.

"We keep moving the event each month, and that's a real plus for us. I don't let no grass grow under my feet. I keep moving!

"I'm 64 years of age, and the way I'm getting around, nobody could look at me and tell I was 64. I plan to do 10 more years on the radio before I retire. I can keep up or outdo most other people who have active lives."

Knowledge Parade

Patterson concluded with an anecdote about one of his more celebrated community actions. "In 1974 I wanted to make the people of Atlanta aware. People need to know God and to know God is not dead. I came up with the idea to have a parade through downtown Atlanta to let people know we need religion in this nation. Some stations had begun taking gospel music off the air, and I wanted to let people know gospel wasn't dead either.

"I had a hard time getting a permit for that parade, but I finally got one of the councilmen to get it for me. On a Saturday morning in 1974, some 74,000 people paraded down Peachtree St. in downtown, ending up at City Hall. It was one of the largest black gatherings ever in Atlanta, except for the funeral of the late Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

"We didn't even have any bands, because they were already scheduled to perform out of town in competitions. So, this parade took place the day before my anniversary, and all the gospel groups and singers came to town a day early to ride in the parade and wave at the people. The event was about religious awareness, and the people turned out for us.

"I've truly been blessed during my career. People have helped me do a lot of wonderful things, and being on the radio with God's help has made it all possible."

NEW ROCK

CIMX Revs Up Motor City

Last May, CHUM Ltd.'s CIMX (89X) was Detroit's "fourth or fifth" AC station. Today, it's the city's premier alternative rock outlet. PD Greg St. James explains how the station's commitment to the format evolved from a block of nighttime programming to a fulltime affair.

Separated from the continental U.S. by "500 yards of water," CIMX is a Canadian-licensed 100,000-watt FM that blankets the Motor City. As an AC, it pulled negligible ratings. But during its first Arbitron book as a New Rocker, the station jumped from .5 (Spring '91) to 1.6 (Summer '91) 12+. Its Fall '91 12+ showing was off a hair (1.5).

CIMX's 18-34 finish was also encouraging: from just over a 1.5 (spring) to more than 3.5 (summer), then leveling off to slightly less than 3.5 in the fall. The station's showing in the Fall '91 Ann Arbor book is even more impressive: 4.3 12+ and nearly a nine in 18-34.

Making The Switch

CIMX began flirting with New Rock shortly after St. James joined from crosstown AOR WRIF in September 1990. "We were AC during the day. But at 7pm we would play this whacked-out sounder with the GM [Al Pervin] coming on and basically apologizing for what was going to happen during the next eight hours. Then I'd take over and go nuts."

Encouraged by listener response to the New Rock block programming, St. James enlisted the aid of his longtime friend – **XETRA-FM** (91X)/San Diego Asst. PD/MD Mike Halloran – to help persuade Pervin to go with the format fulltime. "We put together a business plan and a pitch. We took [Pervin] to dinner a couple times and persuaded him that [New Rock] is *the* viable format of the '90s. He went to bat with his corporate people, and the rest is history."

The format flip was greenlighted in February 1991, but St. James didn't make the switch for another three months. "I didn't want to put something on the air that was going to sound like shit,"

he explains. "It took two or three months of very intensive work to get it right. Sometimes you only get one chance with folks, so the product needs to be there. It's important."

After instituting a new music system, building the library, and designing the station's logo, formatics, and sales kits, St. James focused on fine-tuning CIMX's new image, beginning with the handle 89X. "We chose an 'X' because of [struggling CHR rival] WDFX's history in this market. We felt the similarity would be nice for our upper demo. There's a certain echo effect, and we fit the whole X generation thing."

Music Mix

St. James says the station is approximately 55%-60% current. "If



we lean in any direction, we're a little guitar-oriented because, well, this is Detroit. Research has shown you've got to be smart. If you play something new and inherently unfamiliar, you have to give [listeners] a reward. For instance, if we play This Picture, I guarantee you the next song is going to be by the Pretenders, the Clash, Elvis Costello, or someone you know. Every quarter-hour should reflect the radio station; that's our goal.

"We're not going to back off an artist because AOR is playing it. U2 is this format's artist, so is Nirvana. When [singles by those groups] cross over, we bring on additional tracks. If you listen to us, there's no reason to go somewhere else to hear U2 or Nirvana. I operate under the assumption, 'let's find reasons why we can play records,' rather than look for reasons not to play records."

Because 89X is licensed to Windsor, Canada, it's required to broadcast a fixed percentage of music by Canadian artists. For most Canadian stations the figure is 30%, but thanks to its proximity to Detroit, CIMX is required to air only 15% Canadian content.

St. James says the requirement gives him an advantage in the market. "The [rule's] intent is to break, develop, and support Canadian artists. Fortunately in this format, there's quite a number of good, solid Canadian artists. So we aren't forced to play Canadian artists just to get the [CanCon] percentage. We actually make the regulation work for us."

The Competition

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89X shares listeners with Detroit's two CHRs (WHYT and WDFX), two AORs (WRIF and WLLZ), and lone Classic Rocker (WCSX). But St. James isn't threatened by the competition. "We're superserving the niche. Our core may sample other stations, but they don't have any particular loyalty. Our major advantage is that we're the only kid on the block in New Rock. We're not the fifth AC choice in a market with something like 48 signals.

Interestingly, St. James says many 89X listeners *weren't* lured away from radio competitors. "A lot of people weren't listening to radio. Although we've certainly picked up listeners from the AORs, we're also getting guys who've

spent a lot of time with their tape decks."

With his core established, St. James wants to take the station to the next level. "Now it's a question of convincing more casual radio users to make us their No. 1, 2, or 3 button. Our next goal is to bring in listeners who realize that we're playing hit records — some of their favorite songs — during any given quarter-hour. First you get the core, then you solidify: superserve the target and expand a little bit to bring new people to the party."

St. James, who targets 18-34s, says the format is tailor-made for cities with large populations, like Detroit. "This format serves X-percent [pun fully intended] of a population base. It's a lifestyle group. You need a large population base, enough bodies to get you that intangible proof of listening: ratings and the ability to get the job done for a client.

"Detroit has an incredible music heritage. It takes music seriously as part of its day-to-day life whether Motown, blues, or rock 'n' roll. If you lean toward the rock

It's the format that takes rock [most] seriously in the '90s. So there's a place for New Rock in Motown. This is the town the MC5 came from! In a convoluted way, they're one of the godfathers of this format."


Value-Added Promotions

Like most New Rockers, CIMX is promotion-intensive. "There's always something going on," says St. James, citing the station's recent 12 Trips Of X-mas as a prime example "Using the back of bumper stickers, we did a point-ofpurchase campaign at several retailers in Windsor and Detroit. Listeners filled out their Top 5 cutting edge songs of all time, then 12 days before Christmas we pulled a name, read it on the air, and played the five songs named. If that person called the station during the five-song block, he or she won the trip of the day.'

Prize packages included trips to New York City to see U2, to L.A. for the **Red Hot Chili Peppers**, to Tijuana for PIL, to San Antonio to see **Poi Dog Pondering**, and to San Francisco to see **Robyn Hitchcock**. "We ended up doing 14 trips because we can't count," jokes St. James. "The response was incredible. We ran out of bumper stickers. We also did an AIDS fundraiser a couple months ago. We expected to raise maybe \$10,000 but did \$35,000 in 12 hours."

The station also buys two billboards (rotated monthly) and runs TV spots. "You have to have fun. You have to make the radio station cinematic. We try to do value-added promotions when we can to give listeners a sense that there's always something going on."

The Climb Continues

54 stations rank No. 1 25-54, 43 12+

Country radio's upward ratings spiral is proceeding steadily, as reflected by the fall '91 Country Ratings Index's 4% increase over summer '91 and its 6% jump over fall '90.

Most amazing, however, is the format's ever-growing marketplace dominance. The fact that 54 Country outlets rank No. 1 25-54 and 45 stations rank No. 1 12+ is remarkable enough. But incredibly, Country stations rank either first or second 25-54 in 73 of Arbitron's 99 continuously measured markets! That's a new record, handily topping summer 1991's record-setting 67 markets.

What's more, in six cities - Dallas, Kansas City, Nashville, Phoenix, Salt Lake City, and Wichita -Country outlets ranked first and second among 25-54 adults. Rather heady stuff for a format that hit its six-year low only two years ago.

To compensate for the addition of new continuously measured markets into the CRI database, the actual share totals for all the Country stations in continuously measured markets have been multiplied by a factor of .737 to keep the CRI relative to past indices. This practice will continue with a fluctuating factor - as more markets are continuously measured. Thus, the CRI is a relative -- not an absolute -number, representing actual shares.

The conversion factor is determined by additional markets, not stations. We are determining market, not station. listening levels.



Rush Is On To WBT (AM)

In the Fall '91 Arbitron, WBT (AM)/Charlotte inched closer to the top among 35-64s. A controversial talk show host may have provided the spark for the Full-Service AC's improvement.

"This was our first book with **Rush Limbaugh**," explained PD **Mary June Rose**. "The noon-1pm hour was our second-highest-rated hour. This is a great market for him – the good old, conservative, Bible Belt South."

During the sweep, Limbaugh aired from noon-3pm. Last week (2/17), he was shifted to 1-4pm. A news block now fills the noon hour. Following CBS's five minutes of network coverage at the top of each hour, WBT (AM) slots three minutes of local news. "We're thrilled with CBS and wish they had overnight programming," Rose commented. A three-minute local cast also runs at :30.

Comparing Limbaugh to another FSA staple, ABC's Paul Harvey (who's not heard in Charlotte), Rose noted, "Rush's audience is remarkably different. It's younger, hipper, tends to be male, and is the loudest, most vocal group of listeners I've ever encountered.

"Some women like him, but he predominantly appeals to males in their 30s and 40s. Harvey tends to appeal more to people in their 50s and 60s."

King Henry

WBT (AM) also airs locally originated talk programming. Since 1980, "Hello Henry" (Henry Boggan) has taken center stage from 8-11pm.

"He's the king of the East Coast at night," beamed Rose. "We get calls from New York, Miami, and Philadelphia. He has upper-demo appeal, but he also has a cult following with younger people. He

balances Limbaugh, because he isn't controversial. Everybody loves Henry because he's a real gentleman on the air."

Former AOR personality John Hancock hosts a 9am-noon talk block. "He's the most enthusiastic person we have, and he'd rather do this than anything else," said Rose. "He's 39 – and thrilled that he no longer has to play AOR music."

AM's 'Hip Factor'

According to Rose, several other factors led to her station's fall gains. "Summer's always our worst book because people are on vacation, or they're listening to music stations. Our fall book was better because summer was over," she reasoned.

"Slowly but surely, talk programs are becoming an alternative format. There's a hip factor on AM that hasn't been evident in years."

One of the NBA's newer entries, the Charlotte Hornets, have become a WBT mainstay. "We carry the Hornets and University of North Carolina football and basketball," Rose pointed out. "North Carolina basketball is a big deal; football isn't because – traditionally – North Carolina doesn't win."

Like most other markets, Charlotte is in the midst of an advertising dry spell. "None of the radio stations are doing much promotion," said Rose. "The economy's not very good, and we've taken some bad hits. However, our sales have been surprisingly okay. We did very little fall marketing; we ran a limited Rush TV schedule."

Programming WBT (AM)'s 50,000-watt facility in Charlotte's seven-county metro can be frustrating. "Our signal is directional [north/south] at night," Rose explained. "The second-largest city in our metro [Gastonia, population 60,000] can't pick us up at night or early in the morning before the signal change. We can reach Cuba and Maine, but after sundown and before sunup, we can only reach about half of our metro."

Day The Music Dies

Unlike fellow FSA KOMO/Seattle (see below), which continues to play music throughout the day, WBT (AM) has evolved to a more News/Talk approach. The Gulf War hastened this evolution. "Once we started all the heavy news coverage, we never changed back, which is true of many other FSAs," Rose remarked.

"In a way, we're still full-service because we convey a warm and fuzzy feeling; most News/Talk stations don't. But we probably play no more than three records in all of morning drive. With the exception of some weekend programming, music will probably be gone on this station within the next six months."

KOMO Registers Husky Gains In Seattle Triumph

KOMO/Seattle was one of 10 Top 100 Market Full-Service ACs notching fall-fall improvement among 25-54s *and* 35-64s. OM **Rob Dunlop** attributed some of KOMO's success to the University of Washington football Huskies, whose games air on KOMO.

"There was lots of momentum built around the team, because people felt they were going to be strong again," remarked Dunlop. On New Year's Day, the Huskies earned their second successive Rose Bowl victory.

"We did a good job of capturing that momentum. We love carrying the Huskies because there's so much image and tradition with the team; it works well for us." KOMO also carries the school's basketball contests.

In addition to teaming up with the red hot Huskies, KOMO instituted some programming adjustments this fall. "We're trying to be

a more 'contemporary' station," commented Dunlop. "Our goal is to

do a better job of providing news and information services. The Huskies were important to us, but we also did some tightening and provided more targeted programming."

KOMO fills its evening/overnight schedule with network and syndicated talk programming (including ABC's Tom Snyder).

With its 11 fulltime news staffers, KOMO has a high-profile news commitment. "We run four and a half minutes of [ABC] news at the top of every hour [6am-6pm], followed by another five minutes of local news," Dunlop reported. "At the bottom of the hour, we do five to six minutes of news in AM drive and three to four minutes an hour the rest of the day." **Consistency's Key**

Morning man Larry Nelson has been on board since 1967, midday announcer Keith Johnson joined in 1981, and PM driver Norm Gregory has been with the station since 1984. In fact, the station rookie is Dunlop, who celebrates his first year at the station next month.

KOMO has difficulty creating an outdoor presence, because Ackerley, which owns crosstown Sports/ AC combo KJR & KLTX, also owns the local billboard company. "It's very difficult getting good deals on billboards," Dunlop pointed out. "We do TV and direct mail. We try hard to stay in touch with as many listeners as possible. This format – more than any other – needs listener input."

Music Plays On

Unlike many other major market FSAs, KOMO continues slotting a fairly good chunk of music each day (5:30am-7:00pm). "We're playing about four songs an hour in morning drive; nine per hour middays; and about seven an hour in afternoon drive, Dunlop said. "We play plenty of music throughout the day.

"Every other AM station in this market does news, talk, or sports. We're the only one playing music, and there are people in town who listen to us for that. FSAs in other parts of the country may not be in such a position and are more likely to abandon music earlier than we will."
