### **EDITOR'S COMMENTS**

Antique radio collectors love a challenge. Whether it has to do with history, restoration techniques, technical issues, whatever — we pursue answers. Sometimes a single line in an article tweaks a memory, and the reader rises to the challenge of finding more information.

So it was with Mike Masar when he read the article in the March 2008 A.R.C. in which Phil MacArthur says that the eleven colors offered by Flavoradio were "probably a record for the largest color variety of any radio ever made." Mike was off to rummage in his archives, and he came up with an advertising poster, a section of which is on our cover, offering no fewer than 55 color combinations for the Philco PT-10C Transitone.

So Mike offers the next challenge: Who out there can tell us more about this set? Our research came up with only one known set, so the PT-10 appears to be rare. An article or "Photo Review" contribution would be welcome. We're hoping someone rises to Mike's challenge.

Inherent in a challenge, of course, is competition. Philco entered the radio market competition of the mid-20th century with supercharged advertising campaigns that put it at the top of the industry. Phil Turney describes one highly successful Philco advertising tool used from the late 1930s to the 1960s — the celebration of key production milestones.

The 5th, 7th, 10th, 15th, and 20th millionth sets were all given major advertising blitzes, but, as Paul points out, the 10 millionth set celebration was the most attention-getting. The Model 38-116XX was presented to the veterans at the Walter Reed Hospital in Washington, D.C., on Armistice Day (now Veterans Day) on November 11, 1937. Needless to say, this was an advertising triumph. A limited number of replicas with engraved plaques were sold to the public and are coveted by collectors today.

Far more available is the Zenith Royal 1000 Trans-Oceanic, the subject of an article by Phil MacArthur, who is obviously a fan of transistorized portables. This too was an advertising success story. Zenith managed to convince the public that replacing the vacuum-tube Trans-Oceanic with a transistorized version was worth twice the price. Phil is also a great salesman in that he writes convincingly about the rewards of keeping this set operative in his everyday family life.

Ever the historian, Bob Murray tells us about the rare crystal set made by the Edwards Signaling Company and now on display in its restored state at the AWA Museum in Bloomfield, New York. Though largely a manufacturer of signaling, communications, and protection equipment, Edwards saw fit to celebrate its 50th anniversary in 1922 with a crystal set.

New examples of crystal sets show up fairly regularly; however, this one is especially unusual because it has a buzzer to help adjust the crystal detector, an asset generally included only in commercial sets.

For the second month in a row, we are able to report on auctions of high-profile collections. Both Bonhams with its Catalin auction in the October issue and this month's RM Auctions of the Art Astor collection demonstrate that a prestigious collection, a catalog identifying specific sets, and an orgnization promoting absentee bids yield exceptional results.

Though classic cars were a major focus of Art Astor's collection, hundreds of radios and related items, especially microphones, from early broadcasting days to the 1940s brought impressive prices. A Zenith 9S232 "Walton" selling at \$11,500 and a Wurlitzer Victory jukebox at \$17,250 are good examples.

We're happy to report on an interesting private collection auction that we might not have known about if Ray Chase and RM Auctions had not alerted us and contributed the information. We hope that all you readers will keep us in mind when such events occur in your area.

# WITH THE COLLECTORS

### Philco Dealer Poster and the PT-10C

Radios in colorful cabinets have been the subject of several articles in A.R.C. But, Philco may be the king of color in terms of variety, as Mike Masar explains in this article. (Editor)

I enjoyed reading Phil Mac-Arthur's story "Flavoradios Become More Flavorful" in the March 2008 issue about the many colors of Flavoradios. However, his statement that the eleven colors he has discovered "Probably setting a record for the largest color variety of any radio ever made" got me thinking about an old Philco poster I thought I remembered having somewhere.

Sure enough, a little digging turned up a Philco dealer poster announcing the radio lineup for the 1940 model year. A section of the poster described the 5-

Loktal tube, Transitone Model PT-10C priced at \$14.95. Figure 1 shows a Model 10C image extracted from the poster photo on this month's cover. What astounded me was the number of color combinations offered — fifty-five! Sure makes eleven seem puny.

The poster advises you to contact your distributor for a list of colors, but no mention is made of the actual number of basic colors available, or

how fifty-five color combinations could be achieved. Why so many colors? The poster touted that the variety was "Philco's answer to the growing demand for radios that will harmonize with the colorful decorative schemes of today." This statement would seem to coincide with the movement toward color in other products, such as cars.

The poster tries to entice you with other reasons for multiple colors, such as "To suit the decorative scheme of any home or office" and




Figure 4. The Philco PT-35 had great eye-appeal with its bright ebony cabinet and dial, knobs, and speaker grille in contrasting cream.

"To fill the student demand for a radio finished in school, college, club, fraternity and sorority colors."

Although my wife would have you believe that I already own too many Philco radios, I do not own a PT-10C. In fact, I'm not sure I have ever seen one, which leads me to believe they are very rare, especially for a major national brand. The body and louver area appear to be made out of the same plastic type material. Were the same color choices available for both areas, and how many different base colors were there? I wonder how many different color combinations were actually sold.

I'd be interested to know if anyone has any more information on this radio or if anyone actually owns one. If so, is it in your fraternity colors?

### SIMILAR PHILCO TRANSITONES

Philco produced several other sets in the same style as the PT-10C, as indicated in another part of the Philco poster for the 1940 model lineup. However, none could match the PT-10C in variety of color.

Most were in darker tones of brown and ebony. For example, the PT-43, shown in Figure 2, was advertised as "Refreshingly different!" It had a rich walnut cabinet with handle, dial, knobs, and speaker grille of cream plastic. The PT-55, shown in Figure 3, had a rich brown and amber plastic cabinet and carrying han-

dle. It was touted as "Bound to be a favorite!" The PT-35, shown in Figure 4, might have had even more eye-appeal with its gleaming ebony cabinet and dial, knobs, and speaker grille in contrasting cream.




Figure 5. A "distinctive modern design," the Model PT-59 came in a two-tone brown and amber plastic cabinet.

Models with electric pushbutton tuning like the PT-59, shown in Figure 5, and the PT-67 are described as having a more "distinctive modern design." The PT-59 has a two-tone brown and amber plastic cabinet, while the PT-67 is "a beauty" in amber and brown plastic with a molded handle.

In all, Philco advertised 21 Transitone models. All are described in the poster as "Powerful AC-DC superheterodynes, with 5 super-efficient Loktal tubes...all working — no ballast tubes. And they have Automatic Volume Control, High-Output Speaker, Full-Vision Dial. All approved by Underwriters' Laboratories — Safe from fire and

shock."

Obviously, Philco could easily fill its promise of providing a radio to suit the needs and decor of any home or office.

# The Zenith Royal 1000 Trans-Oceanic

Having explored the development of the Zenith Royal 500 series in the July 2008 issue of A.R.C., Phil MacArthur takes us to the next level of transistorized portables, the Trans-Oceanics. (Editor)

It's mid-1955 and several manufacturers are shipping the early transistor radios to showrooms across the country. The ground breaking Regency TR-1 and the initial entries from Raytheon, RCA, Philco and others are headed for the dealers' display cases. At Zenith the prototypes for the Royal 500 are being evaluated and assembly lines are in the planning stage at the Chicago plant, looking for a November debut.

Engineering discussions have been held for several months on the next update for Zenith's flagship portable, the Trans-Oceanic. The latest model, the 5-tube L-600 is only a year old and is selling briskly, but the transistor won't wait. Designing the next edition for this all-wave portable presents unique challenges.

First, the design team is charged with transforming a very popular product. The Trans-Oceanic is the top-of-the-market choice for a diverse public. The earlier H-500 has sold about one quarter million units at \$125 each in its three-year run, and the recent redesign is maintaining that sales pace, even at \$140 each. (These prices are just shy of \$1000 in 2008 dollars.) Second, the eminently recognizable

suitcase appearance will be downsized, modernized, and built more like an expensive camera than any radio currently on the market. All this has to be accomplished using revolutionary transistor technology and at a price of \$250, almost double that of its predecessor.

As an indication of reluctance over terminating an established design, Zenith continued to produce the tube-type Model 600 in parallel with the new solid-

state model from 1957 through 1962. It was possible to see three different models of the Trans-Oceanic in some showrooms during 1962—the B-600, the Royal 1000, and the Royal 3000.

### THE ROYAL 1000 TRANS-OCEANIC VARIATIONS

Introduced in December 1957, the nine-transistor Royal 1000, shown in Figure 1, had eight bands: the standard broadcast band, 2-4 Mc, 4-9 Mc, and the 31, 25, 19, 16, and 13 meter bands (identical to the L-600). In July 1958, the \$275 1000-D, which added the longwave band, appeared.

Both models used nine D cells in the battery pack. In 1964, the \$199.95 1000-1 model added an AC power adapter. (The price was reduced in 1962 due to the introduction of the \$275 Royal 3000, which had FM.) The Royal 1000 stayed in the Zenith product line-up through 1968, an 11-year run.

Today, collectors are documenting the variations in the early production runs of the Royal 1000. First, Zenith made no formal designation of the model name until after production had started. Hence, there is no "Royal 1000" identification found on the earliest receivers. Second, the wavemagnet cable originally exited from the right-hand side (viewed from the back) and was clamped to the battery box. This was soon changed to the left side and coiled beneath the speaker magnet for a neater appearance. This rare wavemagnet appears only for the first couple of months.

Third, the earliest 1000s had a full set of black RCA transistors. Later, the transistors would be made for Zenith in Holland. Fourth, the original telescoping antenna had a "press to release" mechanism. Fifth, for at least a year, the 1000 had real leather covering and the words "genuine leather" appeared on the fold down cover. All of these early indicators appeared with the original chassis number 9AT40.

The earliest date codes are 731 (Aug. 1957) on the tuning cap and 738 (Sept. 1957) on the speaker. The hard plastic, bott-on battery box appeared for about two years before being replaced by the newer box; hence, both are quite common.




Figure 2. The top of the panel contains a dial plate etched in silver and naming the company as "Specialists in Signaling Apparatus for half a century."

Figure 2 shows several early features: the clear plastic battery box, the red wavemagnet cable dressed down the far right rear and bolted to the battery box; the 9AT40 chassis number; the black RCA transistors; the 343738 (738 is the 38th week of 1957) date code on the speaker; the 731 date code on the tuning cap; the 732 date code on the little output transformer; and the (upside down) serial number 6250523.

### **PRODUCTION TOTALS**

The production totals for the first 15 years of the solid-state Trans-Oceanic were only about half of the totals for the last 15 years of the tube-type Trans-Oceanics. This might be attributed to changes in the market and increasing competition, first domestic, then from Japan and Germany. Perhaps this also shows that Trans-Oceanic buyers were more conservative and wouldn't trade their tube radios for transistors.

Solid production totals for each of the transistor-

ized Trans-Oceanics don't exist, so the big question remains, how many of each model were sold? We can estimate the totals by analyzing the frequency that they appear in A.R.C. ads and on eBay. For every 10 of the tube 600s there are about three 1000s, six 3000s. five 7000s, and only one R7000. Based on the known total of about 270,000 for the 600, the totals for the solid-state versions would be as follows: 90,000 Royal 1000s, 150,000 Royal 3000s, 130,000 Royal 7000s and only 30,000 of the R7000s. These numbers are just rough estimates, but for the moment, they're all we have.

We are fortunate to have so many of these fine all-wave receivers available 50 years after they were built, ready to serve new generations of listeners. Many of us

have them at our chair sides or on the night stand. They can be found daily on eBay for \$35 to \$250 depending on condition. They have turned out to be easy to repair, usually requiring the replacement of about a dozen capacitors and perhaps a plug-in transistor or two.

### **REWARDS OF OWNERSHIP**

It's rewarding work to give another 50 years of life to a good receiver. Generic PNP germanium transistors are plentiful and inexpensive, around a buck each. I keep a stock of Hitachi 2SA70 or RCA SK-3007 transistors handy since they look just like the original 4-pin shielded RF and IF transistors from Zenith. Replacing the D cell pack with a rechargeable 12-volt sealed, lead-acid battery (about \$20) eliminates battery box problems and adds months between chargings.

We've carried a Royal 1000 in our camper and on our boat for years, and it never fails to draw attention and start conversations. Get one for yourself, and listen in on the world through a radio with real class.

## The Edwards Signaling Company Crystal Set

In the following article, Bob Murray tells us about a piece of crystal radio history. His Edwards crystal set is now a museum piece, but there may be other Edwards sets out there that we can add to this bit of history. (Editor)

Edwards and Company, now a subsidiary of General Electric Security, was founded in 1872 by Robert Edwards and David Rousseau to explore the new phenomenon of electricity and to manufacture battery-operated gas fixture igniters. Among the company's first customers was a New York City church where sextons had climbed a 100-foot ladder to light gas fixtures located high above the pews. In 1873, Rousseau withdrew from the company and was replaced by Adam Lungen. Edwards and Lungen invented an electric doorbell and a burglar alarm.

In 1881, Robert Edwards obtained his first patent for an electric bell. In 1882, he patented a drop-type annunciator. In 1883, he patented an electric gas bumer lighter for push-button operation, and in 1884, an electric door opener.

In 1884, Edwards displayed its wares at the first electrical show in the United States. Held in Philadelphia, it was called the "Electricial Exhibit, National Conference of Electricians."

In 1886, the Edwards catalog listed for the first time electrically wound clocks, program systems, and coils. In 1896, Edwards stopped installing electrical devices and limited its activities to the design and manufacture of signaling, comunications and protection equipment. In 1903, Edwards installed the New York Stock Exchange bell to signal the start and end of trading each day.

### **EDWARDS CRYSTAL SETS**

The year 1922 marked the 50th anniversary of the Edwards Company. In recognition of the anniversary, the Company built a number of crystal sets. These sets seem to have been used as corporate gifts in areas where the company was

seeking to install industrial signals and alarms.

An example of an Edwards crystal set, found in Winnepeg, Manitoba, Canada, is shown in Figure 1. A dial plate etched in silver, shown in Figure 2, identifies "Edwards and Company Inc., New York City," as "Specialists in Signaling Apparatus for HALF A CENTURY."

The company apparently did not make a large number of these sets, since they escaped the attention of crystal set expert Maurice Sievers in his *Crystal Clear* books and the early receiver historian Morgan McMahon in *Vintage Radio*.

### THE RESTORATION PROCESS

The panel of the set as found was in good condition. Missing were the detector arm, the crystal, and the cabinet. These have been fabricated.

The detector arm was made from %" brass rod and plated with nickel. Its knob was turned from a scrap of mahogany and finished with black enamel.

The panel appeared to be made from mahogany and stained with mahogany. The case was made from 7/46" mahogany and finished with Minwax mahogany stain followed by Minwax Jacobean stain. The case was then lacquered with three coats of Deft brush-on, semi-gloss lacquer. The cabinet catches are from discarded 35mm slide storage cases. The handle is from a Canadian military surplus instrument case.




Figure 3. The back of the panel showing crystal set components, the coil at top, and the buzzer lower right. Lower left, the metal label is marked with the company triangular logo stating "1872 Edwards" and the catalog number 0117.

Figure 3 shows the back of the panel with the company triangular logo on a metal label also containing the catalog number 0117 and "1872 Edwards."




Figure 4. A schematic of the rudimentary circuit. The tuning coil with slider is on the left; the phones are on the right; the crystal is at the upper middle; and the buzzer circuit is on the lower right. A capacitor, center, couples the buzzer to the crystal detector.

The circuit, shown in Figure 4, is rudimentary. It would have been a poor performer in an area like New York City where discrimination of adjacent stations would have been an issue. It may have performed somewhat better in Winnipeg.

The set consists of a tuning coil with a single slider, operated by a knob on the panel. The tuning dial is calibrated from 0 to 9, and there is an area to the right of the tuning knob where the operator could write in pencil the names and settings for stations received. See Figure 2 again.

There is also a buzzer to help with setting the cat's whisker. This feature does not generally appear in books for home builders in 1922, but it was more common in earlier years. Bucher describes it in 1917 in his Wireless Telegraphy.

While it is not really essential on this crystal set, the Edwards Company made buzzers! They also made the phone condenser on the underside of the panel. According to the Edwards historian in a response to a website query, there is no record of Edwards having made a radio receiver.

The restored Edwards crystal set featured in this article is now in the AWA Museum in Bloomfield, New York. I would be interested to hear from anyone who has found another one.

# Philco Milestone Celebrations Armistice Day 1937

The Philco brand loomed large in the first half of the 20th century when every household realized it had to have a radio. Paul Turney traces Philco's amazing production record through its radio milestone celebrations from 1934 to 1947 when it began to shift into TV milestone celebrations. (Editor)

The Philco Radio and Television Corporation commenced the manufacture of radio sets in 1928 and quickly became one of the tube radio era's most prodigious manufacturers. Within a span of just three years, Philco grew to occupy the number one spot in the industry in terms of units sold. By 1935, so impressive were its sales that it would claim, "The American public bought three times as many Philcos as any other make... almost half as many Philcos as all other makes combined." The company continued to ride this tide of success for many years.

From the very outset, Philco realized that in order to sell lots of radios, a flamboyant bigbudget marketing policy was necessary, backed by modern, attractive, and reliable products that were readily available for sale at the right price. Whatever steps necessary were taken to ensure that these basic business tenets were maintained. One does not have to delve too deeply into the era's advertising before realizing that Philco succeeded admirably in positioning both its name and products to be omnipresent before the radio buying public.

Whether it was through the production of jumbo-sized "demonstrator" radios, or through extravagant media advertising campaigns, sponsoring of radio shows and celebrities, and seemingly endless announcements for new technological innovations, the company always kept the public abreast of its latest accomplishments and offerings.

A recurrent theme in Philco media advertising was its celebration of key production milestones. This trend was perhaps borrowed from the automobile trade and appears to have started with the announcement of the five millionth set towards the end of 1934. It continued with commemorations for the seventh, tenth, fifteenth, and twentieth million sets over the course of the next 15 years or so. Perhaps the most interesting of these was the celebration of the 10 millionth set, the Model 38-116XX, which happened to coincide with Armistice Day in late 1937.

# THE MODEL 38-116XX AND ARMISTICE DAY 1937

Philco's ten millionth set celebration, held during late 1937, followed in the tradition of the earlier ceremonies for which the Philco Models 16X and 116X had taken center stage. The ten millionth set, by design or otherwise, was the Model 38-116XX, shown in Figure 1. This was Philco's next to top-of-the-line set for 1938, a \$200 (initially), 15-tube, hi-fi behemoth.

For the occasion, over and above the usual advertising and in-store promotions, Philco gained publicity by presenting the set to the Walter Reed Hospital in Washington, D.C., at a ceremony that was part of the 1937 Armistice Day celebrations in the nation's capital. The 38-116XX was presented to veterans in the hospital by Boake Cart-

er, the famous, if not controversial, Philco Radio news commentator, representing the Philco Radio and Television Corporation.

Secretary of War Harry H. Woodring accepted the radio on behalf of the veterans and servicemen. The interest in this event was such that every seat in the Red Cross House auditorium in the Great Army Medical Center was occupied by soldiers and patients, with yet more space occupied by patients in wheelchairs.

On a silver plate attached to the base of the inclined control panel of the radio was the follow-

ing inscription:

"This, the ten millionth Philco, is presented to the World War veterans in the Walter Reed Hospital in the hope that it will bring them in closer contact with 'the good things in the air.' November Eleventh, 1937."

During the ceremony, Boake Carter spoke of some of his own wartime exploits twenty years earlier, for which he himself had been hospitalized. He likened listening to the radio while in the hospital to having "a ringside seat as the world rolls by," and added, "Not only in the hospital here, but to other Veterans' hospitals all over the country, replicas of this ten millionth Philco are being presented by the Philco Company at the same [sic] time."

Secretary Woodring concluded the proceedings: "I know of no greater pleasure than to come here and accept this generous gift on behalf of the Walter Reed hospital. To my mind there is no greater invention than the radio, especially for those who are hospitalized. Philco has given its 10,000,000th radio to the Walter Reed hospital. I recall that when Philco produced its 7,000,000th radio, it gave that instrument to the Warm Springs Foundation, in which our president is so interested. I say now that we express our admiration to Philco for this gift."

In addition to the ten-millionth set and the replicas thereof presented to hospitals, Philco offered a limited number of replicas for sale to the public. Each was sold with a personalized plaque affixed to its inclined control panel bearing an engraving of the purchaser's name preceded by the words, "Exact Replica of the Ten Millionth Philco. Built for ....."

Today the 15-tube Philco 38-116XX is much coveted by collectors, with a few appearing for sale yearly at radio shows and on-line venues. Some of the actual ten-millionth replicas complete with engraved plaques, also do occasionally turn up — for sure, there are known surviving examples. However, one cannot help but wonder what happened to the "exact ten-millionth" set, as presented to the Walter Reed Hospital over seventy years ago. Where was this radio used? Did the resident veterans of a former "World Crisis" use it to keep up with the unfolding events of the next?

We may never know, but what we can say is that this story serves to remind us of the important role that radio once played, and to some extent still does, in various of the nation's institutions that care for the injured and infirm, especially those who fought and paid a heavy price for the freedoms we enjoy today.

# EARLIER PRODUCTION CELEBRATIONS — THE FIVE MILLIONTH PHILCO RADIO

In celebration of the production of the five millionth Philco, a 1935 Model 16X, shown in Figure 2, the company and its dealers ran a widespread advertising campaign, offering "greater values, easier terms and more liberal trade-in allowances than ever before." Contests, such as one that ran in stores in westem Oklahoma, eastern New Mexico and the Texas Panhandle, gave away Philco prizes to the top 50 entrants of a 100-word letter entitled, "Why I would like to own the five millionth Philco."

The first prize was the five millionth Philco, a \$175 Model 16X. It was won by a Mrs. J.M Hurst, whose letter was read aloud at the opening ceremony of a newly-retrofitted furniture store in Wellington, Texas, where Philco radios were sold.

Another advertising theme was comprised of special offers made on "furniture ensembles," a Philco radio being the centerpiece. One such ensemble, advertised by a furniture store in Valparaiso, Indiana, included a 6-tube Model 45L console, a world globe, a walnut end table, a modernistic bridge lamp complete with parchment shades, a luxurious armchair, and a beautiful wall mirror, all for the price of \$59.95. This was the normal price of the radio alone! A rider was added to this deal to the effect that "any Philco model may be had in combination with this ensemble."

This ensemble was rather more generous than most I've seen advertised, but the general intent was no doubt to entice the public into stores. Once there, the hope was that they would buy Philoc radios of equal or greater value than the one offered, even if the ensembles had all been sold. Imagine the rush once these deals were announced!

A newspaper report from the Texas Wellington Leader, December 1934, summarizes the Philco advertising planned for this grand occasion: "Philco will celebrate the production of its five millionth radio with a stupendous 11-week continuous advertising campaign in every important medium, including newspapers, magazines and broadcasting. It is estimated that 1,100,089,883 separate Philco advertisements will appear during this campaign. This is approximately ten advertisements for every person in the United States between now and Christmas"

### THE SEVEN MILLIONTH RADIO

Just over a year after the five millionth event, in early 1936, Philco staged a promotion for its seven millionth set, which was a 1936 Model 116X, a \$175 11-tube hi-fi console, shown in Figure 3. Once again, Philco mounted a media advertising blitz, with special promotions, contests and drawings used to attract people into the stores where Philcos were sold.

As the seven millionth set completed its trip down the production line in Philco's Philadelphia factory, S. Davis Wilson, the city's mayor, was present at the plant to place his official blessing on the radio. He and several of his staff, accompanied by members of the press, had traveled to the plant to congratulate Philco on its "unprecedented record" and "to offer the city's gratitude for having given steady employment to thousands of Philadelphians and having added more than \$37,000,000 to the city's payroll."

On behalf of Philco, the ceremony was attended by James M. Skinner, president, Philadelphia Storage Battery, and Larry E. Gubb, president, Philco Radio & Television Corp. Shortly thereafter, perhaps at yet another ceremony, this exact seven millionth set was presented to the Warm Springs Foundation, renowned for its association with polio survivor President Franklin D. Roosevelt.

Limited numbers of replicas of the seven millionth set were offered for sale to the public, bearing a commemorative medallion stating the set to be an "exact replica of the seven millionth Philco." Has anyone seen or heard of the existence of one of these commemorative sets in recent times? I haven't.

### LATER MILESTONES

Philco celebrated the production of its fifteen millionth set in late 1940, three years after the tenth. The big feature at this time was Philco's "Beam-Of-Light" phonograph. "Reproduces Records On A Beam-Of-Light" was the catch phrase.

The twenty millionth Philco radio was produced in late 1947, seven years after the fifteenth, in-

cluding a lull of three or four years caused by World War II. Philco commissioned Bing Crosby to make a phonograph recording especially for this occasion, containing Blue of the Night, his famous theme song from "Philco Radio Time," and the popular lullaby Home on the Range. Autographed copies were given away with Philco radio and phonograph purchases made during the celebrations.

The instance of the twenty millionth set appears to have been Philco's last publicized celebration of radio production. However, perhaps that was because the company had switched to commemorating television milestones, starting with the one millionth set in 1954! But that s quite another story.

# RM Auctions — The Astor Collection Anaheim, California — June 27-29, 2008

CONTRIBUTIONS BY RAY CHASE AND RM AUCTIONS

Southern California broadcasting veteran Art Astor gave collectors a "day in the sun" when his impressive collection of vintage automobiles and memorabilia crossed the RM Auctions block on June 27-29 in Anaheim, California, Included were 200 classic cars and 786 lots of pre- and postwar memorabilia. The three-day event attracted over 200 onsight bidders and others from across the continent and Europe. The Astor Collection represented over 30 years of careful and dedicated selection of early automobiles and technology, including radio.

### THE COMMUNICATIONS COLLECTION

The widely diverse range of memorabilia included one of the world's largest assemblages of early radios and telephones, as well as an assortment of Art Deco items and turnishings. One striking top seller, for example, was a Ford

Neon sign once used by a Ford Dealership and selling at \$21,850.

Not to be outdone by the many dazzling automobile offerings were the vintage radios and related items. Art Astor is well known for his passion for radio throughout Southern California. As the owner of several prominent California stations, his interest in the medium is professional.

But, it is also deeply personal, as his collection of hundreds of sets from early broadcasting days to the Catalin and Bakelite sets of the 1940s attested.

The collection included an interesting mix of styles from table sets to consoles and chairsides. Among the outstanding items was a 1940 Scott Phantom radio, which sold for \$12,937. In the radio-related category, a vintage Victory Jukebox from the 1940s brought \$17,250.

Given that Art Astor has long been in the broadcasting business, it was no surprise that he had an impressive collection of microphones. One example was a Western Electric 387W microphone selling at \$12,650. A number of other manufacturers, such as Shure, Electro-Voice, RCA, and Amperite were represented.

No expense had been spared to restore many of the sets to look and sound as they did when new,

and at auction, many of them exceeded their preauction estimates. In fact, radio prices seemed high. Examples are an RCA Model 18 selling at \$1,610, and a big, heavy Majestic Model 70 selling at \$1,035.

### **VINTAGE AUTOMOBILES**

Art Astor's collection of classic automobiles was outstanding. The top seller of the sale was a 1938 Cadillac V16 convertible coupe, one of 10 examples for 1938 and believed to have been once owned by movie star Gary Cooper. It sold for \$616,000. Another Hollywood connection was a 1941 Lincoln Continental Coupe thought to have been the classy conveyer of the glamourous Rita Hayworth. It sold for \$209,000. As you might expect, auto radios were also part of the sale.

Onsight bidders had competition from a large number of telephone and internet bidders. Total sales, including the buyer's premium, surpassed \$15.4 million. Radios and related items totaled \$546,822 on which the buyer's premium was 15 percent. Multiple item lots and passed items are not included in the listing. All prices include buyer's premium.

A warning: Auction prices are not current values. Our selection of auction items is not necessarily complete.
