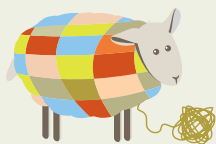

The Yarndale Hub is located in The Gather at the Littondale Entrance. It is the place to go for general information or assistance.

The Yarndale shops are located in The Gather and at the Wharfedale Entrance (D1). They will be open all weekend so you can buy your Yarndale goodies while you're here.

Worldwide Creative Project

To mark our tenth birthday and to help raise awareness and funds for the vital work of Yorkshire Air Ambulance, we asked you to make ten links for chain bunting this year. At the time of going to print we had received **3770** beautifully made chain links. The display can be seen

close to the Wharfedale entrance next to the Yorkshire Air Ambulance stand. Do stop and take a moment to have a look and we hope you agree it looks fabulous.

Celebrating our birthday and the textiles heritage of Skipton, we partnered with Skipton Town Hall and Watch This Space to bring woolly workshops to people of all ages in Skipton this summer. Skipton Town Hall is the hub for Culture & Heritage in Craven with an exciting programme of Events and Performances throughout the year.

Watch this Space is a Heritage Action Zone project funded by Historic England. It is about looking at spaces differently and asking how they might be used to support, encourage, and build the creative and cultural sector in Skipton.

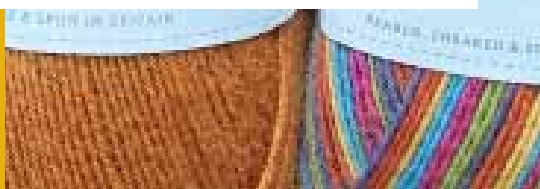

Yarndale

Barbara Socks

~ Will fit most as the foot length is adjustable.
by Joanne Whitehead, adapted by Emma.

Materials

- 25cm 3mm circular knitting needle
- 100g ball of 4ply sock wool
- 3mm dpn needles
- Stitch markers



Part One: Cast On

Using one of your dpns cast on 60 stitches (sts).

Part Two: Cuff

Using your circular needle work the first row of the rib. K2, P2

Join the round being careful not to twist the sts and continue K2, P2 rib for 16 rounds.

Part Three: Knit

The first row after the Cuff is a decrease row: (K5, K2tog) 8 times, K to end of round. (52sts)

Work 50 rounds knitting every round. I like to do two stripes of each colour which is usually a bit less than 50.

Part Four: Heel Flap

Using one of your dpns K13, turn work and using another of your dpns P26.

Leave the remaining 26 sts on your circular needle tucking the ends of the needle inside the sock.

Turn your work so that you're on a knit side.

Row 1: *with yarn at back of work sl1P, K1 repeat from * to end. Turn work.

Row 2: With yarn in front sl1P, P to end.

Turn.

Repeat 2nd & 3rd rows 12 times more. (24 more rows in total).

Part Five: Heel Turn Using dpns.

Row 1: (right side): K15, sl1, K1, pssso, K1, turn. (pssso stands for pass slip stitch over)

Row 2: sl1P, P5, P2tog, P1 turn.

Row 3: sl1P, K to 1 st before gap made on 2nd row, sl1, K1, pssso (1st from each side of gap), K1 turn.

Row 4: sl1P, P to 1 st before gap made on 3rd row, P2tog, P1, turn.

Rep rows 3 & 4 until all heel sts have been worked, ending with a wrong side row. 16 sts.

Part Six: Pick Up Stitches

Using dpns K across 16 heel sts, pick up 14 sts evenly down side edge of heel making sure to pick up last st into corner to avoid a hole.

Using a second dpn K26 sts from circular needle.

Using a third dpn pick up and K14 sts evenly up side edge of heel,

Part Seven: Gusset (decrease)

Start knitting back onto your circular

needle as follows.

K to 3 sts before the end of the second dpn. K2tog, K1 and place stitch marker. K to end of third dpn and place marker. K1, sl1, K1, pss0, K until all stitches are back on your circular needle. K to first stitch marker.

Round 1: Slip marker, K to next marker, slip marker and knit to 3 sts before next marker.

Round 2: K2tog, K1, slip marker. Knit to next marker, slip marker, K1, sl1, K1, pss0 and K to marker.

Repeat rounds 1 & 2 until 52 sts remain.

Part Eight: Knit that Foot

Work every round knit until foot measures 16.5 cm (or length to fit foot up to point where your toes start).

Part Nine: Toe (decrease)

Round 1: K to 3 sts before marker, K2tog, K1. Slip marker.

K1, sl1, K1 pss0, K to 3sts before next marker K2tog, K1. Slip marker. K1, sl1, K1, pss0, K to marker.

Round 2: Slip marker, K to next marker. Slip marker.

Rep rounds 1 & 2 until 24 sts remain.

At some point you will need to knit onto dpns as there won't be enough stitches to stretch around the circular needle.

Part Ten: Kitchener Stitch To start:

Front P on

Back K on

Then: 1. Front K off 2. Front P on 3.

Back P off 4. Back K on

Yarndale Festival Hat

by @17em_ma

Materials

Using a 4mm hook and any DK yarn. Emma uses a Yarndale Learn to Crochet kit which has 100g of Scheepjes Softfun yarn. Change colour at the end of each round until you reach the brim of the hat.



Using UK crochet terms.

sl st = slip stitch

ch = chain

tr = treble

To start:

Make a slip knot and ch4. Join to make a circle.

Round 1:

In this round you will be working into the middle of the chain circle.

ch3 then 11tr into the chain circle. Join with a sl st to top of ch3 and fasten off.

Round 2:

Join new yarn with sl st in any space between 2tr of Round 1 and ch3. Then 3tr in next space and repeat 10 times until you have 11 3tr clusters. Then 2tr in the space where ch3 started the round. Join with a sl st into ch3 and fasten off.

Round 3:

Join new yarn with sl st in any space between 3tr clusters of Round 2 and ch4 then *3tr, 1ch* in next space. Repeat ** 10 times (11 3tr clusters). Then 2tr in space where ch4 started the round. Join with a sl st into ch4 and fasten off.

Round 4:

As Round 3 but 4tr, 1ch in ch spaces round

until last space. Then 3tr in ch space where ch4 started the round. Join with a sl st into ch4 and fasten off.

Round 5:

As Round 3, but working in spaces between 4tr clusters.

3tr, 1ch, 3tr in spaces round until last space. Then 3tr in space where ch4 started the round. Join with a sl st into ch4 and fasten off.

Rounds 6-16:

As Round 3

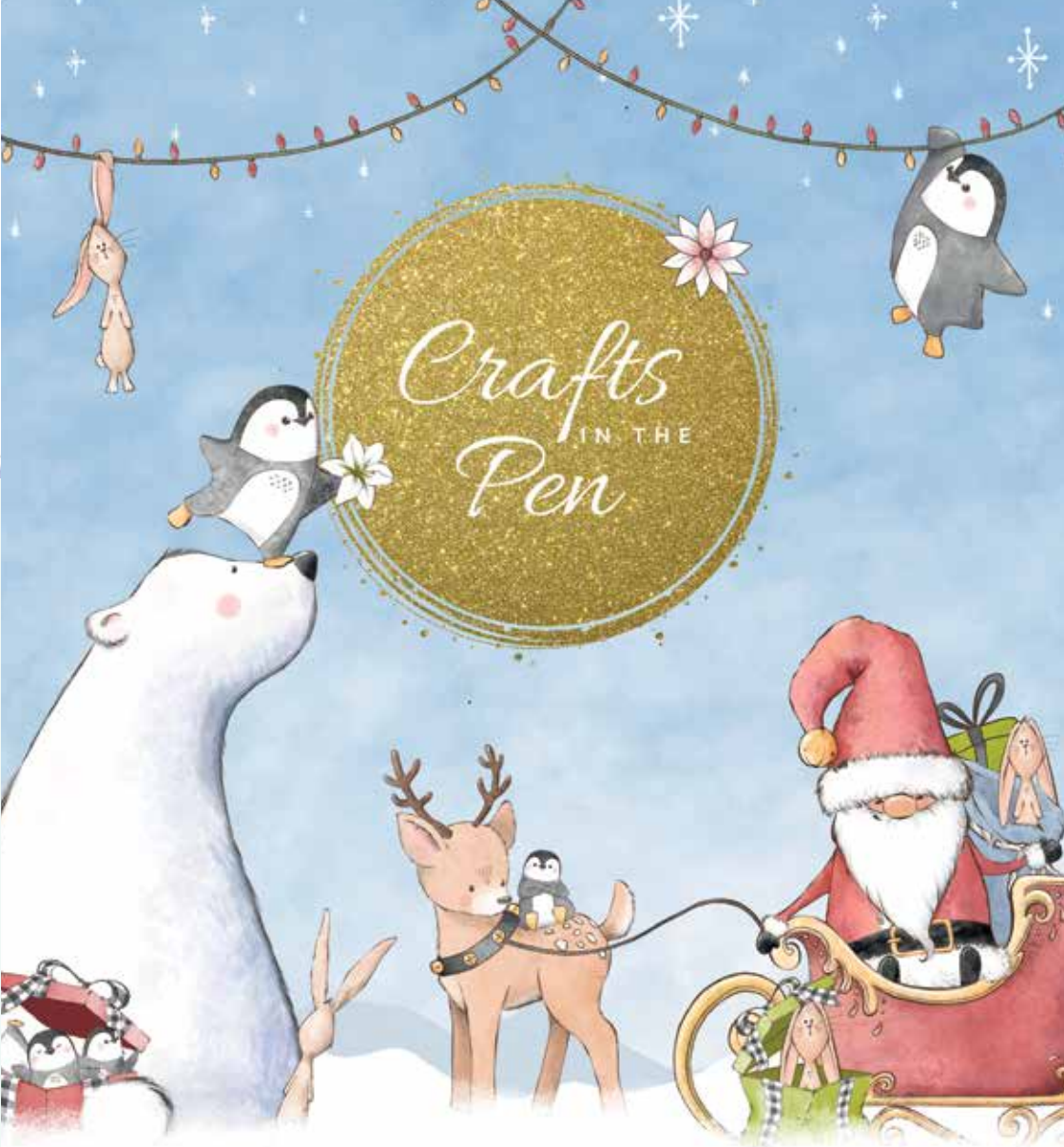
Round 17:

Join new yarn with sl st in any space between 3tr clusters of Round 16 and ch3 then 2tr in same space. The next 3tr are worked into the top of the tr stitches from Round 16 (1 in each).

In next space *3tr then 1tr in top of the next 3 trebles from Round 16*. Repeat ** round so 3tr clusters in spaces then 3tr in the top of previous round's stitches. Join with a sl st and don't fasten off.

Round 18:

ch3 and 1tr in the top of each treble from previous round. Continue round the brim of your hat and join with a sl st to beginning ch3. Fasten off and darn in all ends. To finish sew in ends with a darning needle.

- 75g TOFT DK yarn Cream

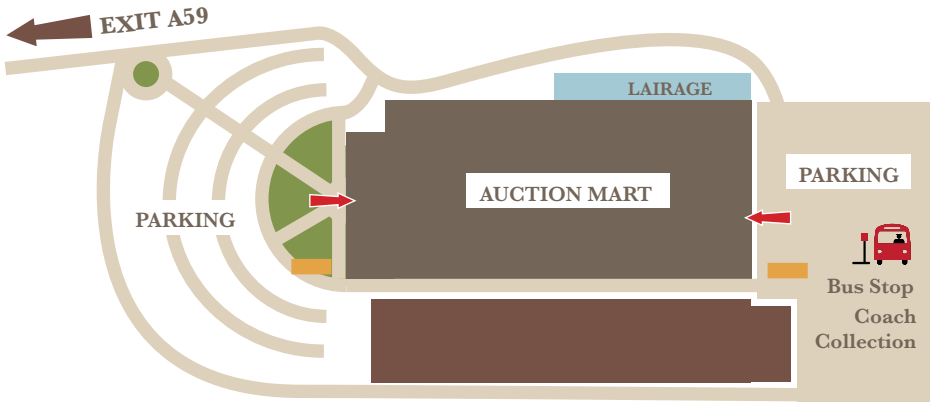

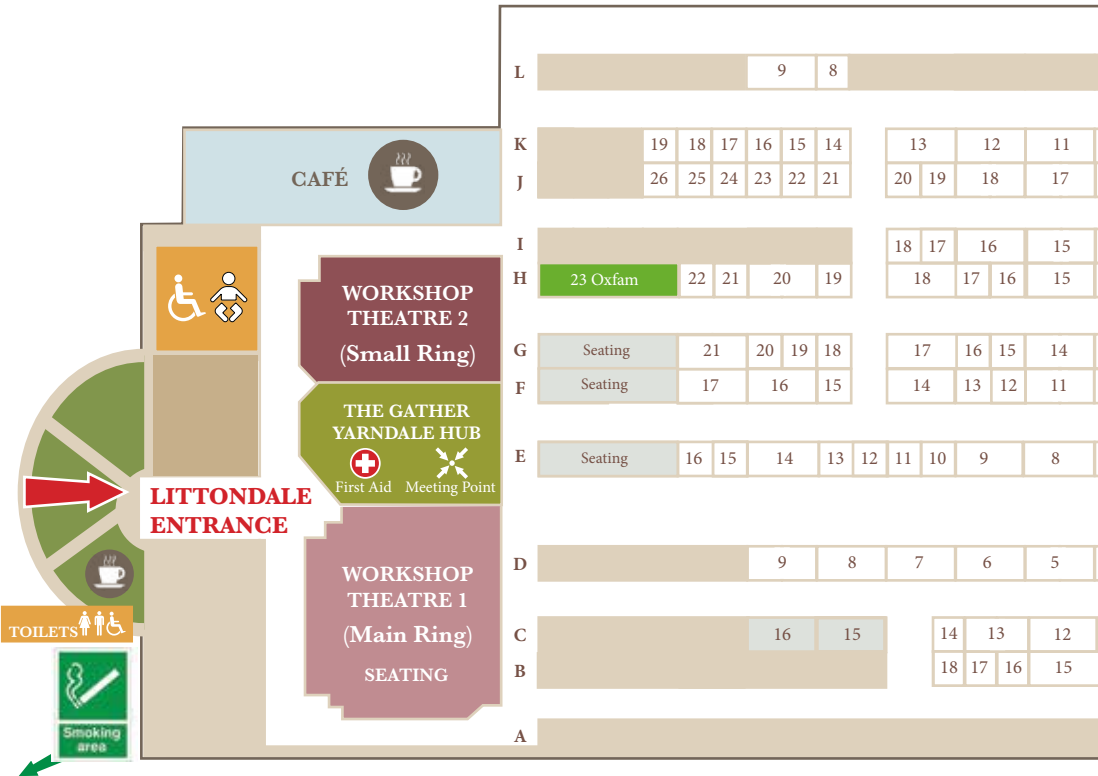

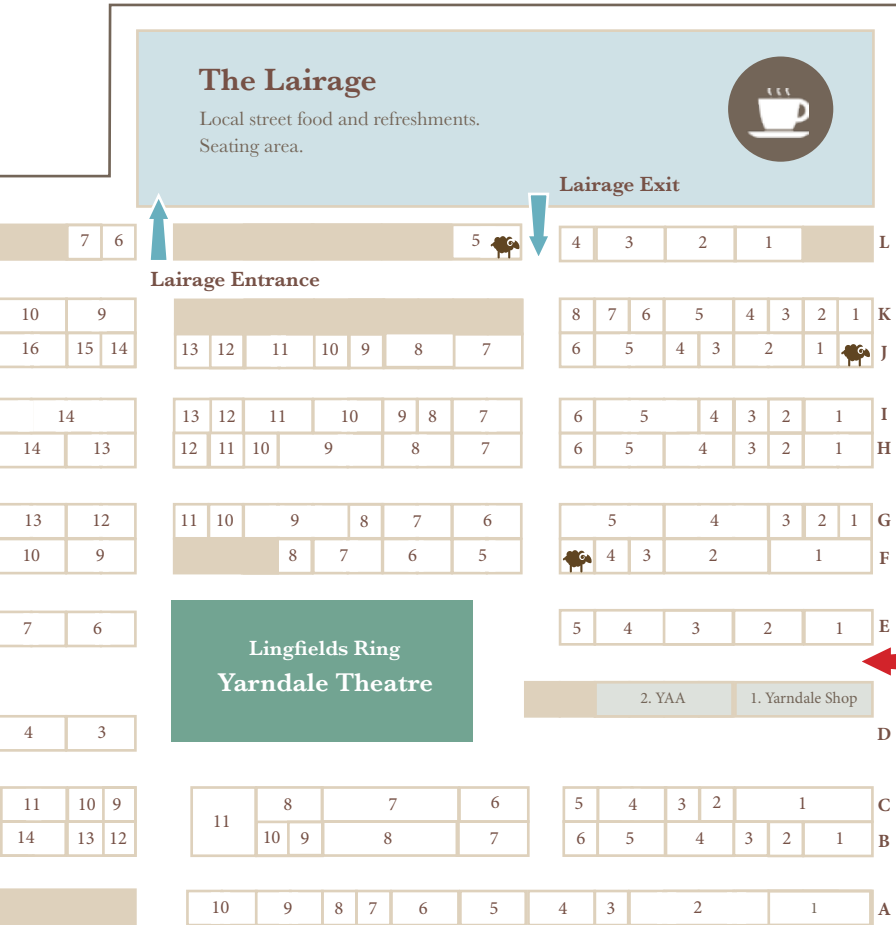
