

YL HARMONICS is published bi-monthly by and for the members of YIRL. YIRL is a non-profit, fraternal organization comprised of women amateur radio operators. It is incorporated as such under the laws of the State of California.

Dues are \$2.50 per year, pro-rated quarterly from March 1st. Anyone joining in March, April or May pays \$2.50; anyone joining in June, July or August pays \$2.00; anyone joining in September, October, or November pays \$1.50; and anyone joining in December, January or February pays \$1.00....except for adopted members, whose dues will not be pro-rated for portions of years. Dues for adopted members are \$3.00. Dues for a family member are \$1.25. All others pay \$2.50. Subscriptions to YL HARMONICS may be had by non-members at this rate.

Dear YLs:

YIRL is celebrating its Twenty-fifth anniversary, and we are very proud of the fact that we have 7 members who have held continuous membership for the 25 years. They are Ethel Smith, K4LMB - Enid Aldwell, W6UXF - Anita Bien, W4JCR - Lenore Conn, W6NAZ - Loretta Ensor, WØUA - Lida King, W1GQT and Ethel Pick. VE2HI.

Twenty-five years ago Ethel Smith (then W7FWB) wrote a letter that was published in QST. Twelve YLs answered that letter, and these thirteen YLs were the founders of YLRL. In 1955 Ethel was made a

Life Member of YIRL and this year YIRL voted Life Membership to the other twelve.

Our name, "Young Ladies' Radio League" was suggested by Ethel in her original letter and it has stuck. Enid Carter, W9NBX, (now Enid Aldwell, W6UXF) published a monthly bulletin and Volume 1. Nr. 1 asked for suggestions for a name. From the suggestions submitted Enid chose YL Harmonics, and how our magazine has grown!

Somewhere around the 1st Anniversary of YLRL our signature "33" was originated by Clara, W8KYR,

(now W2RUF), its meaning being "Love, sealed with friendship, between one YL and another".

Our YIRL Emblem, the diamond with scroll, was designed by Ethel Smith. The YIRL Girl on the Globe was designed by Vi Grossman, W2JZX. The YLRL Motto, "QRV" (I am ready) was suggested by Anita Bien, W8TAY. (now W4JCR)

In the past twenty-five years we have grown from the original 13 members to a membership of nearly 1,000 and YL Harmonics has grown into a bi-monthly publication we can all be proud of. It is

sent to our many members all over the world.

This past June 19th, 20th and 21st, we had our 4th International Convention in Columbus, Ohio. and what a wonderful anniversary celebration this was with 167 YLs registered. All of the YIRL Officers, and 6 District Chairmen were present as well as 11 Past Presidents. YIRL CONSTITUTION, BYLAWS,

and

PROCEDURE POLICY

July 1, 1964

We, the undersigned, being desirous of furthering cooperation among women radio amateurs, developing proficiency in radio operation and furthering the interests of amateur radio, do hereby constitute ourselves the YOUNG LADIES! RADIO LEAGUE and enact this constitution as our governing law.

ARTICLE I - MEMBERSHIP

Sect. 1 Only licensed women amateur radio operators shall be eligible for membership.

Sect. 2 Membership of the League shall consist of the following:

FULL MEMBERS who shall be entitled to all the rights and privileges of the League, except
for - -
FAMILY MEMBERS who shall be entitled to all the rights and privileges of the League except
for receiving the official publications.

ASSOCIATE MEMBERS who shall be entitled to the rights and privileges of the League except

the right to hold office.

LIFE MEMBERS who shall be entitled to all the rights and privileges of the League.

HONORARY MEMBERS who shall be entitled to all the rights and privileges of the League
except the right to vote or hold office.

ARTICLE II - ORGANIZATION

Sect. 1 For the purposes of organization and League activities, there shall be a division of the organization according to the United States amateur call sign areas and such additional districts as are deemed desirable by the Board of Directors.

Sect. 2 The club year shall begin at midnight EST, December 31.

Sect. 3 The fiscal year shall begin on March 1.

ARTICLE III - OFFICERS

Sect. 1 Officers of the League shall consist of the following: President, Vice President, Secretary, Receiving Treasurer and Disbursing Treasurer.

Sect. 2 At the time of election of officers, there shall also be elected one District Chairman from each of the YIRL Districts.

Sect. 3 Only full, family, or life members who have been members in good standing for at least two consecutive years immediately prior to taking office shall be eligible to hold any office.

ARTICLE IV - ELECTION OF OFFICERS

Sect. 1 All officers and District Chairmen shall be elected by the membership for a term of one year. They shall take office at the beginning of the club year and each shall hold office until her successor has assumed the duties of the office.

Sect. 2 Election of all officers and chairmen shall be in accordance with the regulations prescribed in ARTICLE X of the Bylaws.

Sect. 3 Simply plurality vote shall govern in all elections of officers.

ARTICLE V - MEETINGS

Sect. 1 All "meetings" will normally be conducted by mail.

Sect. 2 No regular membership meetings are specified.

Sect. 3 Action of the Board of Directors shall be called by the President at least twice a year, one "meeting" being near the end of the club (calendar) year.

ARTICLE VI - AMENDMENTS

Sect. 1 The Constitution or Bylaws may be amended by membership vote, a two thirds majority of the total votes cast being required.

BYLAWS

ARTICLE I - MEMBERSHIP

- Sect. 1. Pursuant to Article I of the Constitution, the following membership requirements are established. FULL MEMBERSHIP shall be open to all women who possess a valid renewable amateur radio license. FAMILY MEMBERSHIP shall be open to the second or additional Full Member of any one family residing at the same address. ASSOCIATE MEMBERSHIP shall be open to all women who meet the general membership qualifications but are unable to comply with all the requirements specified for Full Membership. ADOPTED MEMBERSHIP shall be granted to those Associate Members residing outside the United States or Canada who are unable to send money for their dues and are therefore "adopted" by YIRL groups or individuals. Women holding Novice Class licenses are eligible for Associate Membership during the term of their Novice License and shall be transferred to Full Membership upon obtaining a renewable license. LIFE MEMBERSHIP shall be granted to licensed women amateur radio operators who may be elected thereto by formal action of the League. HONORARY MEMBERSHIP shall be granted to those individuals who may be elected thereto by formal action of the League.
- Sect. 2 Application for membership shall be submitted in writing to the Receiving Treasurer and must be endorsed by a member in good standing. Each applicant must express her willingness to abide by the Constitution and Bylaws and such rules as may from time to time be promulgated.
- Sect. 3 Election procedure shall be as follows: Application for membership shall be submitted to the Board of Directors. A majority vote by the Board shall elect to membership. The Board may delegate ministerial functions of granting membership where no question of eligibility or desirability is raised.
- Sect. 4 Expiration of amateur license shall automatically disqualify a person from membership. However, the YL shall be entitled to receive Harmonics for the remainder of the fiscal year for which her dues were paid.
- Sect. 5 Expulsion from membership shall be in accordance with the provisions of Roberts' Rules of Order.

ARTICLE II - DUES

Sect. 1 The dues shall be as follows:

FULL MEMBER	\$ 2.50
Except Family Member	1.25
ASSOCIATE MEMBER	2.50
Novice Member	2.50
Adopted Member	3.00
SUBSCRIBER	2.50
LIFE MEMBER SHALL PAY NO	DUES.

HONORARY MEMBER SHALL PAY NO DUES.

Sect. 2 Members and Subscribers who reside outside the continental United States or Canada shall be charged an additional amount to cover the cost of foreign postage or air mail required for mailing the League publications.

Sect. 3 Dues shall be paid in advance and shall be due and payable on March 1st of each year.

Sect. 4 For members joining at other than the beginning of the fiscal year the dues shall be prorated on a quarterly basis.

Sect. 5 Dues may not be paid for more than one year in advance except for the partial payment of new membership. In the event the fiscal year is changed, dues may be paid to cover through the next full fiscal year.

- Sect. 6 Special assessments may be levied upon the membership by a vote of the Board of Directors.
- Sect. 7 Notice of expiration of dues shall be published in the YL Harmonics magazine. Delinquent members shall then be notified by first class mail after March 31st.
- Sect. 8 Members who fail to pay their dues within a period of one month subsequent to the date on which they become due and payable shall be automatically dropped from membership provided that notification of such action has been given in the expiration notice or by a letter sent first class mail to the last address of record.

ARTICLE III - OFFICERS

- Sect. 1 The officers of the League shall be elected for a term of one year. They shall assume office on January 1st of the year following their election.
- Sect. 2 The President and Vice President shall not be eligible for more than one term of office consecutively. (This does not mean that they cannot run for ANOTHER office - only that they cannot succeed themselves in the SAME office)
- Sect. 3 No member shall hold more than one office at any one time.
- Sect. 4 A vacancy in the President's office before the expiration of term shall be filled by the Vice President. Other vacancies occurring between elections shall be filled by appointment of the President under whom that officer shall serve.
- Sect. 5 All officers shall serve without compensation in any form. This shall not preclude the reimbursement of necessary expenses incurred in the conduct of their respective offices and approved by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE IV - DISTRICT CHAIRMEN

Sect. 1 Election of District Chairmen shall be made at the same time and on the same ballot as the election of primary officers. All regulations regarding eligibility and election of officers shall apply except that members shall vote for only the one District Chairman to represent the District in which the member resides.

ARTICLE V - BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Sect. 1 The Board of Directors shall consist of the following: the President, Vice President, Secretary, Receiving Treasurer, Disbursing Treasurer, the District Chairmen, the Chairmen of each of the Standing Committees and the immediate Past President of YIRL.

ARTICLE VI - EXECUTIVE BOARD

Sect. 1 The Board of Directors shall elect from its membership an Executive Board of three members who shall have all the powers of the Board of Directors between the "meetings" of that Board. The Board of Directors shall define in bread terms the duties and authority of the Executive Board.

ARTICLE VII - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

- Sect. 1 The President shall preside at all official meetings and/or conventions of the League and shall act as Chairman of the Board of Directors. She shall be an ex-officio member of all Standing Committees. She shall call meetings of the Board by air or in writing at least twice a year. Prior to taking office on January 1st, she shall appoint one of the newly elected District Chairmen to serve as Chairman of the Nominating Committee. She shall make all appointments whenever vacancies occur in office.
- Sect. 2 The Vice President shall assume all duties of the President in the absence or disability of the latter. She shall have charge of all League station activities, contests, rules of same nets, etc. In this work she will be assisted by a committee of at least three membersof her choice, each from a different district. She shall appoint a custodian for awards such as WAS/YL; YLCC; WAC/YL; DX and Continuous Membership Certificate. She may appoint committees or assistants to aid her in specific branches of activities under her jurisdiction. She shall serve as a member of the Board of Directors.
- Sect. 3 The Secretary shall keep a record of all proceedings of the League. She shall keep a complete and accurate record of amendments to the Constitution and Bylaws. She shall maintain a permanent file of all applications for membership and shall handle all matters

- pertaining to membership and voting in accordance with the provisions of the Bylaws and Procedure Policy. She shall mail to each new member a letter of welcome. She shall serve as a member of the Board of Directors.
- Sect. 4A The Receiving Treasurer shall receive all money for dues and forward this money to the Disbursing Treasurer. She shall send dues receipt cards to each member. She shall forward all applications for membership to the Secretary for her files and shall keep the Secretary and Editor advised of dues payments and of all changes in the membership records. She shall serve as a member of the Board of Directors.
- Sect. 4B The Disbursing Treasurer shall receive and receipt all money sent to her by the Receiving Treasurer and all other money paid to the League, and shall make payment of all obligations known to her to be proper and authorized. She shall submit an itemized financial statement semi-annually to the Budget and Finance Committee for auditing. She shall file all reports required by the Federal, State and local governments. She shall serve as a member of the Board of Directors and shall be an ex-officio member of the Budget and Finance Committee.
- Sect. 5 Each District Chairman shall be responsible for gathering news for YL Harmonics and for forwarding same to the Editor at appropriate intervals. She shall assist the Vice President in organizing contests, traffic schedules, nets and all League activities. She shall serve as a member of the Board of Directors.
- Sect. 6 The Board of Directors shall be responsible for all matters of League policy. The Board shall be called to meet at least twice a year, one meeting being near the close of the club (calendar) year. Additional meetings may be called by the President at her discretion or by a written request of three or more members of the Board. All business of the Board will normally be handled by mail.
- Sect. 7 The Executive Board shall act for the Board of Directors when necessary between meetings of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VIII - STANDING COMMITTEES

- Sect. 1 The Standing Committees of the League shall consist of the following: PUBLICATIONS COMMITTEE PUBLICITY COMMITTEE, BUDGET & FINANCE COMMITTEE and MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE.
- Sect. 2 The Publications Committee shall edit a publication to be known as YL HARMONICS. The policy of the publication shall be determined by the Board of Directors and the Editor. The general management of this publication shall be in the hands of the Editor who shall be Chairman of the Committee.
- Sect. 3 The Publicity Committee shall be responsible for publicizing the League in every way possible. It shall provide news items concerning the League and/or its members to newspapers and magazines. It shall cooperate with the District Chairmen in all publicity work and aid them whenever requested. The Publicity Committee shall maintain a League Scrap Book and a Photo Album which shall be sent upon request to affiliated clubs or conventions.
- Sect. 4 The Budget and Finance Committee shall act as advisor to the Board of Directors to prescribe the amount of money to be expended for specific purposes such as publications of YL Harmonics; operating expenses of individual officers and committees. It shall advise the Board in regard to investing League funds. It shall act as advisor to the Disbursing Treasurer and shall audit the Disbursing Treasurer's reports semi-annually.
- Sect. 5 The Membership Committee shall be responsible for recruiting members for YIRL.

ARTICLE IX - VOTING

- Sect. 1 On questions involving the entire membership, the Secretary shall provide each member with a ballot and information concerning the question or candidate to be voted on. This may be done through publication in YL HARMONICS, provided each Family Member shall also receive a copy of the ballot. A closing date for voting shall be stated in the notice and shall not be less than six weeks from the date of publication.
- Sect. 2 Votes shall be returned to the Secretary in an envelope signed by the voting member. The Secretary shall verify the eligibility of each voter, shall count and tabulate the votes, and submit them to an auditor designated by the Board of Directors. After auditing, if there are no discrepancies, the votes shall be returned to the Secretary for retention. If there is a discrepancy between the count of the Secretary and that of the auditor, the ballots shall be forwarded to the President for final decision. The Board of Directors shall direct the Secretary to send written notice of election results to all candidates and shall cause the results of the balloting to be published in the next regular issue of YL HARMONICS.

- On ballots involving the entire membership, a simple plurality vote shall govern in all matters except amendment of the Constitution and Bylaws, which shall require a 2/3 vote.
- On ballots of the Board of Directors, a majority vote shall govern in all matters except Sect. 4 suspension of the Bylaws, which shall require a 2/3 vote.

ARTICLE X - ELECTIONS

- Prior to taking office on Jamuary 1st, the President shall appoint one of the newly elected Seat. 1 District Chairmen to serve as Chairman of the Nominating Committee. The Chairman shall then appoint two more District Chairmen to assist her in selecting qualified candidates for each of the offices stipulated in ARTICLE III of the Constitution.
- In addition to the candidates selected by the Mominating Committee, any qualified member Sect. 2 may be nominated for office by written petition on five members in good standing.
- No member may be nominated to office without her written consent.
- Sect. 3 The Nominating Committee shall check on the eligibility of each candidate and shall cause to be published in the MAY/JUNE issue of YL HARMONICS, or in a special bulletin, a slate of candidates for office together with a brief review of each candidate's qualifications.
- Prior to July 1, ballots for the general election shall be provided to each member. Ballots Sect. 5 may be included in the MAY/JUNE issue of YL HARMONICS if desired, provided each Family Member shall also receive a copy of the ballot.
- Sect. 6 Voting shall be conducted in accordance with ARTICLE IX of the Bylaws.

ARTICLE XI - QUORUM

Sect. 1 The members participating in any meetings or voting shall be considered a quorum, providing all members have been notified of the activity by mail sent to the last address of record. Such notice shall be mailed at least six weeks prior to the closing date of the ballot.

ARTICLE XII - LEAGUE PAPER

- Sect. 1 There shall be an official publication of the YIRL to be known as YL HARMONICS which shall be published by the Publications Committee in accordance with the provisions of ARTICLE VIII, Sect. 2. A copy of YL HARMONICS shall be supplied to every member of the League in good standing with the exception of Family Members.
- Sect. 2 The expenses of YL HARMONICS shall be governed by the Board of Directors.
- Sect. 3 Subscription to YL HARMONICS may be obtained by any interested persons upon payment of a subscription fee of \$2.50 per year, plus any foreign postage or air mail postage required. Subscriptions shall run from March 1st to March 1st.

ARTICLE XIII - AFFILIATED CLUBS

- Sect. 1 Local clubs of women radio amateurs shall be eligible for YIRL affiliated Club Membership when 50% of the members of such club are YIRL members in good standing. Written application for affiliation shall be made to the Secretary, accompanied by a roll of the membership of the club and designation of the geographical area covered. Election shall be by vote of the Executive Board. A Certificate of Affiliation shall be issued by the YIRL Secretary.
- Sect. 2 Affiliation of the YIRL Affiliated Clubs shall be renewable annually at the beginning of the club year and shall require submission of an up-to-date membership list and affirmation of eligibility.
- Sout. 3 MIRL Affiliated Clubs shall be independent organizations and shall pursue no course of action in the name of YIRL without first obtaining written permission of the Board of Directors. If the name "YOUNG LADIES' RADIO LEAGUE" or "YIRL" is incorporated in the name of the local club, it shall be qualified as to location or territory served by the local club.
- Any action or policy pursued by an Affiliated Club which is in opposition to the Constitu-Sect. 4 tion or policy of YIRL shall be cause for cancellation of affiliation within the discretion of the Board of Directors.
- For contest purposes, the membership of Affiliated Clubs shall be limited to those members Sect. 5 actually residing within the geographical area specified in the application for affiliation.

ARTICLE XIV - AMENDMENTS

- Sect. 1 An amendment to the Consitution or Bylaws may be propsed at any time by written request of five or more members. Such proposal shall be submitted to the Board of Directors who shall give it consideration, and, if approved, shall cause the proposed amendment together with appropriate ballot and explanation for the reasons for the proposal to be published in the next regular issue of YL HARMONICS, or a special bulletin. Voting shall be conducted in accordance with the provisions of ARTICLE IX of the Bylaws. Approved amendments shall be recorded by the Secretary.
- Sect. 2 On questions of order and procedure not otherwise determined by these Bylaws, the provision of the current edition of Roberts' Rules of Order shall prevail.
- Sect. 3 These Bylaws may be suspended in case of emergency by a 2/3 vote of the Board of Directors, provided subsequent notice is sent by mail to each member.
- Sect. 4 The present Bylaws shall become effective January 1, 1959.

PROCEDURE POLICY

- Sect. 1 The organizational divisions of the YIRL shall include one District from each of the United States amateur call sign areas; KH6; KL7; VE; and KZ5.
- Sect. 2 It shall be the duty of the President to see that all monies, files and YIRL property are accounted for at the end of her term of office and she shall see that the duties of each officer are carefully carried out. She may appoint an assistant to any officer. She shall see that a minimum treasury of \$100.00 is always maintained.
- Sect. 3 The Vice President shall be in charge of all League contests and shall purchase from League funds all prizes, awards and certificates as authorized by the Board. She shall receive and judge the logs for contests; submit a report of the results for publication. She shall be responsible for delivering the prizes and awards to the respective winners. With the aid of the District Chairmen, she shall keep informed of the normal operating hours and frequencies. She may appoint committees or assistants to aid her in specific branches of activities.
- Sect. 4 The Secretary shall keep a permanent file of all applications for membership. All officers and Committee Chairmen shall keep the Secretary informed of the proceedings of any meeting, convention, special emergency nets, contest matters, etc. The Secretary shall keep a record of all TLRL Constitution, Bylaws and Procedure Policy Amendments and the date of their adoption. Copies of the Constitution and Bylaws shall be made available to members. The Secretary shall maintain proof of votes of all elections or ballots for a period of 60 days after which time she may destroy same if there has been no question in the audit. It shall be the general policy of the retiring secretary to make sure each new officer has an adequate supply of information sheets and application eards.
- Sect. 5A The Receiving Treasurer shall prepare an up-to-date membership list at least twice a year, one being at the end of the Club year. These lists shall be made available to all officers, District Chairmen and Committee Chairmen. She shall issue membership cards upon receipt of dues. She will forward lists of new members to the Secretary so that she may send them a letter of welcome. The Receiving Treasurer shall also cause the publication of dues reminders in YL HARMONICS two months prior to the end of the fiscal year. She shall notify subscribers of the expiration of their subscriptions.
- Sect. 5B The Disbursing Treasurer shall pay all bills authorized in writing by the President or by the Board of Directors. However, the President may grant blanket authorization of payment of routine bills.
- Sect. 6 The Editor, as Chairman of the Publications Committee, shall receive, edit and assemble all material for publication of YL HARMONICS. The Editor shall have the right to edit and condense any materials sent to her. She may call upon the President or the Board of Directors for decisions where there is doubt concerning the desirability of publishing certain material. The Editor shall have authority to appoint assistants for Special Features. One such assistant shall be a Novice News Editor. An assistant may be appointed to provide special handling of HARMONICS. This assistant shall receive all surplus copies of HARMONICS and shall be responsible for mailing to new members not included in the regular mailing list. She shall investigate reports or HARMONICS not received and shall send replacements when warranted. Copies of HARMONICS which are returned because of change of address will be

- forwarded to this assistant. She shall have extra copies of HARMONICS available for sale and shall provide publicity copies to Officers and Committee Chairmen upon authorization of the President.
- Sect. 7 HARMONICS shall be mailed to each member in good standing except Family Members. A reasonable number of copies of HARMONICS will be supplied free of charge upon request of Officers and Chairmen for use in publicity and recruiting. Free copies of HARMONICS will be exchanged with other publications which may be of interest. Advertising space in HARMONICS shall be limited to no more than 10% of the total printing space. Acceptance of expenditures for publishing and mailing HARMONICS shall not be allowed to exceed 2/3 of the amount of the total annual dues.
- Sect. 8 The Budget and Finance Committee shall audit the Disbursing Treasurer's books three months prior to the close of the fiscal year and again three months after the beginning of the fiscal year.
- Sect. 9 It shall be the duty of all officers to keep proper records of all League equipment and supplies assigned to their custody and to keep records of expenses incident to the conduct of their office, regardless of whether or not they intend to donate such expenditures. These records shall be made available to the President or Board of Directors upon request and shall be forwarded to the Disbursing Treasurer at the time of request for reimbursement or at the end of the Club year. The Disbursing Treasurer shall maintain these records in a permanent file and pertinent information shall be passed on to the successing officers. Retiring officers and chairmen shall pass to their successors all possible information that may be of assistance.
- Sect. 10 On questions within the purview of the Board of Directors, the Secretary shall provide each member of the Board with a ballot and information concerning the question to be voted; this material to be provided by first class mail. Votes shall be in accordance with the provisions of ARTICLE IX of the Bylaws.
- Sect. 11 The President shall appoint a Librarian who shall be prepared to furnish historical and current information about YIRL. She shall maintain a complete file of YL HARMONICS from its inception. The Librarian shall attempt to compile a complete list of all licensed YLs in the world. The Librarian shall serve as an assistant to the Editor.
- Sect. 12 The Membership Committee shall have Membership Correspondents for each of the following areas: Eastern Membership Correspondent; Western Membership Correspondent and International Membership Correspondent. The Membership Chairman may serve as Membership Correspondent for the appropriate area.
- Sect. 13 In filling vacancies for unexpired terms, an officer who has served more than half a term shall be considered to have filled a full term of office. This provision applies to those officers appointed to fill unexpired terms as well as to elected officers.
- Sect. 14 Should both the President and Vice President be unable to act, the Secretary shall notify the Board of Directors, who shall then designate an acting president.
- Sect. 15 It shall be the general policy of the League to rotate officers so that no President or Vice President shall be from the same district as her predecessor.
- Sect. 16 Adoption of International Members shall be made through the International Membership Correspondent. Dues for adopted members will not be accepted without prior approval of the International Membership Correspondent.
- Sect. 17 The President shall appoint a Property Custodian or Supplies Chairman who will serve for an indefinite term. The Property Custodian will work closely with the Disbursing Treasurer since she will handle funds from the sale of pins, charms, etc. She will maintain other supplies for distribution to the officers in the conduct of their respective offices.
- supplies for distribution to the officers in the conduct of their respective offices.

 Sect. 18 Definitions of votes shall be in accordance with Roberts! Rules of Order and the following interpretations shall apply:

 PLURALITY: A candidate has a plurality vote when she has a larger vote than any other
 - candidate.

 MAJORITY: A majority vote means more than half the votes cast, ignoring blanks.
- Sect. 19 The Procedure Policy may be amended by a 2/3 vote of the Board of Directors.
- Sect. 20 In the event the Organisation shall be dissolved, any monies remaining shall be distributed to the existing membership.

It's nice now, with the Convention over, to go through the box full of swaps and gain, not only the memory of happy hours shared with its donor, but a bit of knowledge of the section of the country where she lives.

Some of the swap items included K7MRX's paper weights - cut-outs of the State of Idaho made from zinc as well as pretty paper napkins from the Idaho paper industry and Idaho beans or split peas with a pattern for making a cute clown bean bag. The South Dakota gals sure used a pile of ingenuity - they made replicas of a sunburst, about 2" in diameter, in bright yellow with 'South Dakota' written on them. They then completely and evenly edged each of these with beautiful pheasant feathers. They were handsome! (Betcha those gals had glue and feathers on their fingers many a night last winter - and lived in fear of an unexpected sneeze as well!!) K5YIB, Barbie, had - thanks to her OM's dexterity a real cutie. She had 3"X 3" thin plywood squares with the outline of the State of Texas and " 33 from K5YIB" woodburnt on them. Attached to each was a replica of a branding iron, one of which had actually been used to imprint a B on each square. Derned clever!!!

There were cute artificial corsages, too - violets from Illinois and oranges from California. Baby Doll, W6BDE, had some adorable pins, replicas of the San Francisco cable cars - so cute. Binnie, K8ZNC, had tiny little spark plugs on a key chain - from Toledo, naturally! (Looks real cute on my charm bracelet, too!) W6DXI, Gladys, had key chains with little artificial oranges on them. Claire, W4TVT, had nice little booklets entitled "Washington in Miniature" which we've enjoyed. K9IIK, Fran, had gold coins commemorating Princeton, Indiana's sesquicentennial. K9GR, Hazel, made and embroidered some lovely aprons for her swaps. The Portland Roses brought coat hangers covered with thick red fuzzy pipe cleaners with two white taffeta roses at the top. TG9BC, Corinne, had some real handsome Guatemalan towels. WiZEN had white linen handkerchiefs with a liquid embroidered Miss Wrone in one corner and the traditional Boston Bean Pot in the opposite corner. K1IZT has banners with her call on them. Many a quizzical eye went in the direction of the 12 Wrone members present who were seen carrying what was obviously a plain egg box. Inside, however, were their swaps - a Wrone doll, with acorn head and cap, a pine cone body with pipe cleaner arms and a pretty green skirt with "Miss Wrone" in liquid embroidery. These were attached, by green ribbon, to a pin which had '1964' on it. (Our fingers got glued up a bit last winter, too!!) All the Buckeye Belles very aptly had buckeyes on a ribbon with a bell attached. There were no doubt others that I didn't see, but from those listed here it's easy to see that there are some real clever YIRLers! Already many of us are planning our swaps for the next Convention - plenty of 'em, too!!!

Table decorations were beautiful. The front of the head table in the Ohio Ballroom was covered with a huge green net on which were umpteen of those cute YIRL and Buckeye Belle cutouts. (These show quite clearly in one of the forum pictures. Some of the table decorations are also visible in some of the photos. I intentionally shot some of the snaps with the subject just off center so as to include the decorations.)

Some of the tables were centered with representations of each district, others had towers and beams. At forum there were loot bags at every place just crammed with goodies, as well as little YLRL banners made of pellon.

At our places at the YL Luncheon, on Saturday noon, we found diamond shaped nylon net pot cleaners in various colors as well as egg-shell colored wallets with the YLRL diamond embossed in gold. These

are real cute - just too pretty to use!!

At the Banquet tables on Saturday evening were individual Kleenex holders in various colors of taffeta, as well as a recipe holder made from a snap type clothes pin on a stand with 'YLRL' on the clothes pin and '1964' on the base. All of the wood was YLRL blue and the letters were silver. A lot of work went into these handy little gadgets. We understand that wonderful Decorations Committee went through 16 packages of noodle letters in order to come up with enough "YLRL"s and "1964"s !!!! Wow!!!

The OM's were well considered and planned for at the Convention, too. They had a most interesting tour on Saturday morning while we were at the Forum. They saw the Center of Science and Industry, with its many educational and scientific exhibits, as well as W8TO, the station of the Columbus Amateur Radio Association. From the slides my OM took, I can see that this is a place well worth spending some time in. They also took in "Gibby's" on their tour and there's proof of this stop also at our QTH, hi! Chuck and Woody, K8MZS and W1RCJ, didn't get to go on the tour. They were too busy at Natiowide! They manned the tape recorders throughout the whole affair and how I have appreciated them as I replayed the tapes this week to help in writing this. My CM, K1GUU, spelled me behind one camera or the other and took several of the shots that appear in this issue as well as 2 trays full of slides that have brought back happy memories.

This is out of chronological order inasmuch as the remark was made at the Banquet, but somehow it seems more apropos here, while I'm mentioning these OMs of ours. Shirley, K8MZT, praised all of our OMs, and thanked them sincerely for their help, by paralleling an old axiom, saying, "Beside every YL there is a good man". This was so evident as we watched Val, Frank, Wes, Ralph, the above mentioned, and several others whose names I don't know, being "Johnnies-on-the-spot", somehow showing up where and when they were needed, moving tables, playing chauffeur, (Golly, that airport is sure 'down the road a piece' !!!), and doing various and sundry favors and errands so willingly. YIRL certainly

appreciates these men.

The invocation prior to the noon luncheon was given by Onie, W1ZEN, after which a fine luncheon

was served and enjoyed by all. After the meal we got into the afternoon session full swing.

In this session recognition was given to the founders of YLRL. A real highlight of this was a tape from Lenore, W6NAZ, one of the founders. This was much more than just a plain old tape - it was a gift. Lenore and her CM did a truly fabulous job, with proper background music and historical bits of information in the news in 1939 which "refreshed" more than one memory! There were messages from Enid, W6UXF, who got caught in front of a mike twice for this Convention - one for the tape and twice as our guest speaker - not bad for a CW gal; from WØUA, Loretta Ensor, the 1st YL voice to span the ocean, and who submitted the name "Harmonics" which was subsequently chosen for our publication; from W4JCR, Anita Bien, ex W8TAY, the illness of whose OM prevented her from attending; from VE2HI, Ethel, who stuck to her guns and sent her message in CW, which was read by Lenore's CM, with the CW as a background - what a fine fist. W1GQT, Lida, also a CW gal although she taped via the mike, sent her thanks to YIRL for her Life Membership as did W6WSV, Carol, ex W9WWP, 1st V.P. and Activities Mgr. Lenore then spoke, expressing thanks to all who had kept YIRL alive, and thanking all concerned for her Life Membership. I think she more than did her share in sending this tape, with all the time and work it represented, on to us. (W9NIW, W6RGX, W5HYF and W8SBB were unavailable for this tape. W8SBB was finally located immediately prior to the Convention and is K4UBT, Mary Bamberg of Clearwater, Fla.

Two of the founders were able to attend, K4IMB, and W6UXF, and their plaques for 25 years continuous membership, a gift of the Belles, as well as Enid's Life Membership Certificate, were presented at the session. These plaques were originally dreamed up by Marge, K8ITF, and from there the idea just "growed", like Topsy, until finally the plans were finalized and the plaques were actually made

by Ivette, WABAWS. They are handsome. (See photo section.)

The "long-time licensed" YL attending was Liz, W3CDQ, licensed since 1922. Among the other long-timers were Carmella, licensed since 1934; W7HHH, 1939; W6QGX, 1940; W2CWL, 1942; W5RZJ, 1943, and

W6UXF + K4LMB, both licensed in 1936.

There were many telegrams and letters from clubs and individuals, both Stateside and DX, from California to Scotland, which were on a bulletin board for all to read. These kind words on paper prove that even though they're unable to be present, they're still YIRL all the way. Many thanks to these gals for their thoughtfulness. And, speaking of thoughtfulness, let's not overlook the positively gorgeous lei sent to K1IZT from the KH6YLs - it looked lovely on Blanche, and was so thoughtful of thos girls. Many thanks to you.

A group photo was taken during the afternoon session by Evans Photo Service, and what a fine job this photographer did. It's a 10"X 20", crystal clear, with smiles from side to side. I don't know how he got so many women to photograph so well simultaneously, hi! Represented in that photo are 25

states, every stateside district plus Canada and Guatemala - a total of 167 licensed YLs, the largest YIRL Convention to date.

Now for the formalities: The Forum on Saturday morning was opened with an invocation by Fran, K9IIK. Ruth, W8LGY, led a song of welcome as well as the Buckeye Belle song - both of which she had written, and a very catchy tune to each. This gal, too, is a clever one.

Blanche, K1IZT, as President, conducted the business session after having commended the Belles on a fine job done on the Convention. She introduced the YIRL Officers, all of whom were present; the Belle Officers; the 3 YL Editors present; the YIRL Continuous Membership Chairman - W2OWL; K4LMB and W6UXF, and the 6 District Chairmen present.

Martha, W6QYL, as Vice President, spoke briefly on YIRL activities, giving Howdy Days and YIAP dates and info as well as announcing the Sterling Silver Gift to be given to the YIRL member bringing in the greatest number of new members this year - our 25th Anniversary Year. (This last, and Howdy Days are covered in the May/June issue, and the YIAP in this issue.)

With Blanche back at the podium, we stood, with a flower placed as a symbolic token, for a moment of silence for the known departed members of this year: DJ4XLC, W6PCA, K6OWQ and G3OHB; For these four, as well as any others whose deaths have not been reported to us, were not forgotten at Convention.

Blanche displayed the new WAS/TL Certificate which has been redesigned to more adequately represent the 50 States, rather than continuing use of the old "48 State" certificate. This new certificate has a 50 star flag as a subdued, but oh so pretty, background. It was met with much enthusiasm by these present.

There were quite a few items of business to be brought up at the Forum, therefore discussion on each item was limited to 15 minutes. It is to be remembered that at a Forum we can only discuss - we cannot vote.

The first item discussed was the division of the Treasurer's office, as described in the May/June issue of Harmonics. The need for this seemed obvious to the group, as indeed it is, and the job split, as proposed, was accepted as most reasonable. It was quite obvious to all that unless the job was lightened in some manner, it was going to be nearly impossible to find someone to fill that position.

Another item of business brought up was how to raise the means to up-date "CQ-YL". Pages are needed to cover both the 1960 and 1964 Conventions as well as YIRL Officers etc., of the past few years. One method of raising funds, discussed among the officers and past presidents, is the one used by many church groups - that where the group donates \$1.00 and makes it grow. It was also pointed out that some clubs might prefer to make an outright donation in proportion to the membership. A suggestion was made that the clubs take on a project of their choice to make up to \$20.00. K4IMB, Ethel, knowing the spontaneous air hams can give, suggested that if everyone present donated \$1.00 it would help out tremendously. This idea was readily accepted. One girl at each table collected that table's donation, all purely voluntary, and at the end of the Forum \$58ZJ\$ was happily holding approximately \$100.00. This, although it will go a long way, is not enough to complete the up dating, and it is still requested that the clubs take up where those at the Convention left off. CQ-YL is interesting reading and is, to most of us, a tremendous wealth of background information often referred to. It has been used avidly by both the 1960 and 1964 Convention Committees. If you do not already have one, you're surely missing out on a lot of personal enjoyment - also, how about sending your DX adoptee or your secret pal a copy???

Also brought up at this business session was the forming of a President's Advisory Committee, which had been approved at a special-meeting of the Officers and Past Presidents of YIRL on Friday. This was readily received by the group, who could see, as those at the Friday meeting had, the advisability of a President being able to get first hand background knowledge to aid her in making decisions. It is a committee of six, plus the current President, consisting of past presidents, with 3 appointed this year and three more to be appointed next year by the 1965 President, all terms to be 2 years. In this way, no one President appoints more than three to the committee. Named to assist Blanche in the remaining months of 1964 were Beth, W7NJS, Onie, W1ZEN, and Vada, W6CEE.

Blanche had written the clubs early in the year to see if they had anything they particularly wanted brought up at the Forum. One was for an explanation of YIRL expenses, particularly wanting to know where our money is spent and why we can't delve into our savings. A sheet of average Feerly figures was distributed, showing just where our money goes and how very close to the margin we operate. It was pointed out that our expenses would be even greater if bills were submitted by all officers, including D.C.s, for full expenses incurred in their jobs. As to the savings account, it was explained that this money came from bonds accumulated by YIRL during the 2nd World War and later cashed. It is not excess cash left over from any yearly dues.

An invocation by Joy, KBGWF, preceded the Banquet on Saturday evening. After the most enjoyable meal there were various formalities including the presentation of the cup for top phone score in the TL-CM Contest to KØEPE. The cup was presented by W6QYL, who quipped that this made it a "Martha to Martha" award!

It then came time for the guest speaker, WoUXF. Enid was a spark plug in the start of YLRL, and it was most fitting, therefore, that she be asked to speak at this, our 25th Anniversary.

Sheintroduced her friend "Elmer" - a hand puppet, who asked, among other things, what a ham was. Enid aptly described a ham as a "friendly person who likes to talk".....very apropos! Elmer also introduced Ruth, W8IGY, who, with the backing of all the Belles, pulled a real fine "sneaky" on Shirley, K8MZT. On behalf of the Belles and those present, she presented Shirley with a beautiful pillow, created from the square made by the Portugal YLs - so very pretty. And a very flabbergasted, but sincere thank you came from Shirley, who, we understand, had given the club the word not to try anything like this!! Guess you know, she's glad they did put one over on her now, though!!

Enid's speech was most interesting, and although it was too lengthy to reiterate in its entirety, its basic morals were that we can find happiness if we only look within ourselves; and, most important, that today, this moment, is the most important time of our lives inasmuch as yesterday is gone,

and no one can tell what tomorrow will bring.

It then became prize drawing time - and prizes, prizes, prizes - - it's a wonder Joy, K8GWF, didn't lose her voice calling out all those numbers! On the drawing on the "Donation Ticket" the First Prize Drake TR3 Transceiver was won by W8MSA; the Clegg Thor by WA8DJS; the P + H Linear by K8VRO; the T.O. Keyer by K8DSH; and the Waters Hybrid Coupler by W8DUW - all OMs!!

The hand embroidered prizes, over which we all drooled, were drawn for while we listened, hoping, and wondering, were we going to be the lucky one. Frankye, WA9ENB, was a lucky one - she won the luncheon cloth. The greatest of the great, in the line of prizes, went to Irma, K6KCI, who won the much coveted bed cover and what a beautiful thing that thing is. The gals did a fabulous job of putting it together, with its soft pastel backing and loads of lace work.

And so, all too soon, it was over. A grand time, and a very well planned and well executed affair.

Many good words have been said to the Belles and many they deserve.




