SUMMARY OF DIRECT CHARITABLE ACTIVITIES-PART IX-A

MUSEUM

1,340,118 people visited the Museum free of charge during FY02. In addition to presenting the permanent collection and temporary exhibitions (a total of 18 during the fiscal year), we provided a wide variety of free interpretive materials, programs, and services on a daily basis. These included printed materials in the galleries, gallery and architecture tours, Art Information Rooms, a Family Room, the Art Access system, an orientation film, and a variety of printed materials including maps and visitor guides. The Museum published 30 new titles during FY02.

Education

In addition to the activities listed above, which are available to all visitors on a daily basis, the Museum Education department provided a variety of other free activities and services including:

4 large-scale Family Festivals, which featured art-making activities, gallery activities, storytelling, and a lively variety of community-based performers. Approximately 32,149 people attended during the fiscal year.

The School Programs served approximately 68,738 students during FY02 We also subsidized bus transportation for 54 out of the 58 schools in our Multi-visit Program, providing 109 bus rentals this year

Weekend Family Workshops, Weekend Storytelling, Getty Getaway Days, Artful Sundays and Art Adventures, programs were offered in English and Spanish, serving families with children.

Professional Development Workshops, Community Collaboration Workshops, Teacher Collaboration Workshops, Community Group Tours, Community Partnership Programs, and our Teacher Resource Center served local educators and community organizations to help them integrate art education into their activities

The Museum provided 23 lectures (3,707 attendees), and 13 seminars (740 attendees) free of charge There were 6 Adult Gallery/Studio Courses (286 attendees) offered that were free except for a fee for materials

There were 36 free performing arts programs (28,259 attendees) in FY 02 including the series Friday Nights at the Getty, Unsigned Indies, and Sounds of LA. In addition to free performances, there were 12 ticketed performances (3,479 attendees) in FY02 including the Gordon Getty Concerts and Selected Shorts.

worked closely with the Museum and with scientists at the Getty Conservation Institute on a technical study of the picture, and subsequently has carried out a very successful treatment.

The Paintings Conservation department participated in a symposium held at Yale University in New Haven. Entitled Early Italian Paintings Approaches to Conservation, the symposium presented the current collaboration between the Yale University Art Gallery and the J Paul Getty Museum, including a history of Yale's collections, past conservation treatments, the state of the paintings and recent treatments. An international group of conservators, scientists and scholars discussed the 20th-century conservation of early Italian paintings. Special attention was given to discussing the benefits of multi-disciplinary collaborations between conservators, scientists and art historians.

Personal Viewpoints A Seminar on Paintings Conservation examined current practices of painting conservators and highlighted the values, concepts, and theoretical commitments that animate the best conservation work. The manuscript for the <u>Personal Viewpoints</u> publication (based upon the papers and discussions from the symposium held at the Getty Research Institute in June) was also completed.

The Paintings Conservation department completed the cleaning and restoration of a new acquisition, Delacroix's <u>Arab Horseman</u>. Work continued on a number of other recent acquisitions, including the Rubens/Brueghel <u>Mars and Venus</u> and the Ribera <u>Philosopher</u> Several other important treatments were brought to a successful conclusion, including the Getty's new acquisition, <u>A Mathematician</u> by Jusepe de Ribera, Mattia Preti's <u>The Martyrdom of St Bartholomew</u> from Bardstown, Kentucky, Lorenzo di Credi's <u>Madonna and Child with St John the Baptist</u> (one of Mr Getty's personal acquisitions), and a small <u>Landscape</u> by Bidault (which was also a recent donation to the Getty collection) Most notably, work was completed on the Rubens/Brueghel <u>Mars and Venus</u>, and the painting went on view in mid-December in its new frame

Work continued on a number of other projects, including a large panel by Giovanni del Biondo from the Yale University Art Gallery, a Rafaellino del Garbo altarpiece from the Ringling Museum in Sarasota, FL and a tondo by Piero di Cosimo from the Philbrook Museum of Art in Tulsa, OK

Anne Ruggles, Conservator of Paintings from the National Gallery of Canada in Ottawa, returned to the Getty to continue her work on Bartolomeo Montagna's <u>St Jerome</u> The painting will be on view at the Getty Museum before returning to Ottawa in the early fall as the centerpiece of a small focus exhibition.

A new collaborative conservation venture was initiated with the Taft Museum in Cincinnati, Ohio and a beautiful Still Life by Balthasar van der Ast was restored in early 2002 and is now on display.

Development of a Council group for the Paintings Conservation department was initiated. Several potential members were contacted and invited to become founding members of the group

Plans to undertake a long-term collaborative conservation project that will include the study and restoration of two large paintings by Jean-Baptiste Oudry from the Schwerin State Museum were finalized during a visit to Schwerin.

The department of Paper Conservation hosted a workshop on the Identification of Digital Print Processes taught by Martin Juergens Twenty conservators from across the country attended. The workshop was sponsered in partnership with the Western Association for Art Conservation.

The department of Paper Conservation undertook the examination and condition reporting of over 100 works on paper in connection with the *Devices of Wonder* exhibition.

Conservation treatments were completed on 51 prints for the exhibition Manuel Alvarez Bravo Optical Parables Conservation treatments and matting and framing were also completed for several outgoing loans, including 15 prints by Thomas Eakins to the Philadelphia Museum of Art. Consultant Conservator Valerie Baas from the Detroit Institute of Arts assisted the photograph conservators on these exhibitions for one week.

The department of Paper Conservation gave a public lecture entitled In the Company of Spice

Traders Medieval Manuscript Illuminators and their Painting Materials The lecture was given in
conjunction with the summer manuscripts exhibition Illuminating Color

Two manuscripts, the <u>Book of Hours, use of Strasbourg</u> and the <u>Hedwig Codex</u>, were restored prior to going out on loan, the treatments included parchment repair and consolidation of flaking pigment. <u>T'oros Roslin</u>, canon tables from a <u>Gospel book</u> was also conserved.

The article Technical examination of a fifteenth-century German illuminated manuscript on paper a case study in the identification of materials was published in Studies in Conservation, vol. 46 (2001), pp 93-108

Paper Conservation performed the conservation mounting and framing of 41 bifolia from the manuscript <u>The Gladzor Gospels</u> for the exhibition <u>The Armenian Gospels of Gladzor</u>, which opened in September <u>The Gladzor Gospels</u> is on loan from the Special Collections department of the University Research Library at UCLA for conservation and exhibition.

The department of Paper Conservation hosted and coordinated the three-day Annual Meeting of the Western Association for Art Conservation (WAAC) at the museum. The conference consisted of papers presented by 30 speakers on a broad range of conservation topics and tours of the conservation facilities of the museum and the GCI

Conservation treatments were completed on fifty-one prints for the exhibition Railroad Vision that opened in March 2002 Conservation treatments and matting and framing were also completed for

several other projects including: 45 prints for the In Focus Dorothea Lange publication, 25 prints for the exhibition The Public Record Photographs of the Great Depression from the J Paul Getty Museum on loan to Pomona College, and 15 prints by Gustave Le Gray for loan to the Biblioteque Nationale in Paris

Conservation treatment of the recently acquired <u>Christ in Majesty</u> (2001 84) by Antoine de Lohny was completed by the department of Paper Conservation. The treatment included the removal of the parchment support from an acidic backing board adhered with drymount adhesive. The leaf was inlaid and rematted in preparation for its inclusion in the *Treasury of Fifteenth Century Manuscript Illumination* exhibition that opened in March.

Conservation treatment on a manuscript belonging to the El Escorial Flemish Book of Hours illuminated by Gerard David and the Master of James IV of Scotland (El Escorial, Vit 12) was done in Madrid The conservation treatment included rebacking repair to the binding in preparation for its loan to the exhibition Illuminating the Renaissance Triumph of Femish Manuscript Painting in Europe 1467-1561 at the JPGM in June 2003.

The department of Paper Conservation also hosted conservators Janice Schopfer and Michele Fasim from the Fine Arts Museums of San Francisco at the Legion of Honor to review techniques for consolidating flaking pigments and compensation of losses in manuscript illuminations as well as repair techniques for parchment.

The watercolor Rome from the Tiber by Giovanni Battista Lusieri was conserved. It is owned by the Huntington Art Gallery and was on loan for display at the Getty in the exhibition Rome on the Grand Tour. For the same exhibition two pastel drawings recently acquired by the JPGM. Anton Raphael Mengs' Portrait of William Burton Conyngham and Liotard's Portrait of Lord Mountstuart was also conserved. Mounting, matting, and framing of several drawings for that exhibition as well as for the forty drawings on loan from the Utrecht Archives and the Royal Collection for the exhibition Sacred Spaces of Pieter Saenredam was also undertaken by the department. Conservation treatments and preparations were also completed for the exhibitions Posing for Posterity and Viewing Italy in the 18th Century

The Decorative Arts and Sculpture Conservation department worked extensively on the preparation, the receipt of nearly 100 objects, filing condition reports on each object, making mounts and installing them all, as well as installation and eventual de-installation of the Devices of Wonder exhibit. This work involved receiving, condition reporting, making mounts and installing nearly 100 objects from dozens of national and international lenders, as well as performing conservation treatments on numerous objects prior to their display. The department also worked to prepare mounts and install objects for the Grand Tour exhibit.

The Decorative Arts and Sculpture Conservation department completed an authenticity study on the

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bronze statue of Juno by Anguier, which is currently at the Museum for possible acquisition. In a related development, the department has initiated a broad technical study of bronze casting cores with mineralogist Giacomo Chiari of the University of Turino, Italy The department also conducted an authenticity study and cleaning treatment on a recently acquired Chinese Porcelain Teapot with 18th century silver mounts. Another porcelain object, the recently acquired Sévres bust of the Duc d'Orléans, was cleaned, mounted, and installed in the galleries.

In addition, two French bronze figures with silver mounts were selectively polished and coated prior to their loan to Versailles for an exhibit on the arts of Madame de Pompadour. These two bronze figures, along with a Sèvres Pot Pourri and a mounted Chinese porcelain were delivered to and installed at Versailles. While in Paris, research and practical study were carried out on 18th century. French furniture finishing techniques and their relevance to modern conservation treatment. This work will pertain to the future treatment of furniture in the collection.

Treatment was conducted on three works in marble: the Museum of the City of New York's bust of Ann Buchan Robinson (cleaning), the Chinard Allegorical Portrait of the van Risamburgh Family (replacement of a missing finger) and the Bellona by Pajou (retreatment of an old, poor quality restoration)

A considerable amount of effort was dedicated to the study and monitoring of conditions in the gallery vitrines. This work was stimulated by the abnormal yellowing of some buffering materials in the cases. Preparations were also made to upgrade the Getty's environmental monitoring capabilities through the acquisition of the latest generation data-loggers.

The Decorative Arts and Sculpture Conservation department conducted thorough technical studies on French furniture in the collections for the forthcoming catalogue of baroque furniture and gilt bronzes. A Boulle Bureau Plat and a gilt bronze Chandelier, also by Boulle, were studied for the forthcoming catalogue of baroque furniture and gilt bronzes. In addition, an extensive authentication study has begun for the Sculpture department of the Burgundian Cabinet which has recently been attributed by Alain Prévet to the 16th century master, Hugues Sambin. A technical study and acquisition report were also prepared for the recently acquired sculpture, Self Portrait by Gaugin. This piece was also treated for possible insect infestation.

In the realm of wooden artifacts, the Decorative Arts and Sculpture Conservation department has offered its technical support in the study of the Ezcaray Retablo, a monumental 17th century Spanish altar currently undergoing conservation in preparation for its installation in the new Los Angeles Cathedral Numerous cross sections of gilding, gesso and paint have, and continue to be analyzed in order to determine the nature of the original materials and the degree of prior restoration.

The Decorative Arts and Sculpture Conservation department graduate intern is conducting research on reversible adhesives for wooden artifacts conservation. This project will be presented in Miami

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at the American Institute for conservation Annual Meeting in June. She is also currently enrolled in a one-week specialized course on glass deterioration and conservation with one of the foremost experts in the country. The department is also hosting an additional short-term graduate intern from the conservation training program in Munich, Germany.

An international symposium jointly organized and sponsored by the Antiquities and Antiquities Conservation departments on the history of sculpture restoration titled, "History of Restoration of Ancient Stone Sculptures" was held October 25 - 27, 2001. There were 18 speakers and 110 attendees, which we thought a goodly number considering the after effects on travel of the events of Sept. 11 The papers will appear in a volume to be published by Trust Publications.

RESEACH AND LIBRARY

The Getty Research Institute anchors the Getty's research mission and its goal of advancing scholarship in the fields of art and art history. It exists to bring together all the resources and activities required to advance understanding of the visual arts taken in their widest possible significance. The Research Library at the Getty Research Institute provides valuable support for scholars through its extensive research collections, which include manuscripts, archives, photographs, artists' books, architectural models, and 830,000 volumes of books, periodicals, two million study photographs, and auction catalogues, and by inviting scholars from across disciplines to Los Angeles to pursue their research in residence. Access to the collections and to scholarship conducted at the Research Institute is made available at the local, national, and international levels through active publications and exhibitions programs, a wide range of public programming that includes lectures, performances, and symposia, and online databases.

The Research Library

The Research Library was open to serve outside patrons more than 54 hours per week. 2,092 readers were registered to use the Library during those hours Research Library staff answered 43,206 reference requests, 72% (30,906) of which circulated to outside patrons. The Research Library circulated 64,642 items, 43% (27,904) of which were made by outside patrons. The Interlibrary Loan unit received 2,715 requests from other libraries and academic institutions and filled 66% (1,787) of those requests

The Research Library recorded 14,906 visits by outside patrons to the collections. Outside browsers worldwide performed approximately 173,000 searches remotely on the Research Library's online catalog that is available via the Web. The Research Library loaned 115 items for public exhibition to outside institutions.

The Chief Librarian's Office hosted the following activities the annual meeting of the Independent Research Libraries Association (IRLA), the Bertelsmann Group, an international group of public libraries, sponsored by the Bertelsmann Foundation, and

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a tour and reception for the Association of Research Libraries (ARL) directors during its annual membership meeting held in Los Angeles.

The Research Databases department of the Research Library manages three projects: The Bibliography of the History of Art (BHA), is jointly published by the Getty and by the Institut de l'Information Scientifique et Technique (INIST) in France, and collaborators in ten European countries contribute material to the Research Institute for inclusion in it. The BHA increased by over 22,000 records this year, bringing the total to about 245,000 records That database is available electronically through DIALOG, Research Libraries Information Network (RLG), and Ovid Technologies, Inc

The Provenance Index department provided training, photocopies, books and software to local, national, and international collaborative partners. The Provenance Index also provided training and updates on the software system used by the Provenance Documentation Collaborative (an international project overseen by the Provenance Index focused on the documentation of works of art). The Provenance Index Databases, totaling over 825,000 records, are available to the public free-of-charge at the website http://www.getty.edu/research/institute/provenance/. Technical support and assistance in using the website is also included. In addition, the staff continues to perform provenance research, at no charge, on paintings at the request of museums, curators, private individuals, scholars, and dealers.

The Avery Index to Architectural Periodicals produced at Columbia University, issued the 2002 annual CD-ROM through Getty Trust Publications. This new update contained over 400,000 record. All records were also distributed online through the Research Libraries Information Network (RLG). The Avery Index will be distributed by EBSCOhost beginning in the fall of 2002.

Digital Resource Management and Vocabulary Program

The Digital Resource Management and Vocabulary Programs provided mentoring and training, including workshops, to staff from numerous non-profit cultural organizations during Fiscal Year 2002

In August 2001, two Digital Resource Management staff members donated their services as faculty for the UCLA "Summer Institute for Knowledge Sharing" the head of the department was one of the facilitators for the 4-day program, and also presented 2 workshop modules, the digital projects manager presented a workshop module focusing on the production, management, and preservation of digital library resources.

In September 2001, the managing editor of the Vocabulary Program conducted two presentations and a discussion session regarding building and using controlled vocabularies for staff from the University of London Library and approximately 40 representatives of other libraries, archives, and miseums in Great Britain.

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In March 2002, the managing editor and one of the vocabulary editors presented a workshop at the University of London Library that included a session to begin to familiarize the target audience with the actual and potential online tools at the ULL, including the Getty vocabularies and other resources to provide access to paleographical and other archival materials in their collections. The model developed at the University of London Library would hopefully be used by similar collections in the UK and other sites in Europe

In March 2002, the managing editor of the Vocabulary Program met with representatives from the Royal Collection (the National Trust) and the UK Public Records Office, advising them about issues regarding the use of the Getty vocabularies and discussing how these institutions could become contributors to the vocabularies in the future

Staff in the two departments typically spend between 2% and 10% of their time providing mentoring and advice via e-mail or telephone on standards, vocabulary implementation, and digital resource management and preservation to staff from cultural heritage and educational organizations

Organizations that received mentoring in Fiscal Year 2002 include the Barnes Foundation in Philadelphia (including 3 on-site visits to the Barnes from the department head, a 3-day visit from Barnes staff to the Getty, and numerous e-mail and telephone consultations), the School of Information Studies, UCLA (participation in curriculum development, master's program portfolio reviews, and other activities), the Josef and Anni Albers Foundation, the Fowler Museum, UCLA, the Walker Art Center, Minneapolis, ArtSTOR, University of California, San Diego; American Society for Information Science, Los Angeles chapter, Katholieke Universiteit Leuven, Belgium.

The three Getty vocabulary databases (Art & Architecture Thesaurus, Union List of Artist Names, Getty Thesaurus of Geographic Names) continued to be available on the World Wide Web free of charge Average usage for all three vocabularies for Fiscal Year 2002 was between 150,000 and 200,000 queries per month, with users from all fifty United States and many foreign countries

Digital Resource Management and Vocabulary Program online publications, including Introduction to Imaging and Introduction to Metadata, are also available free of charge on the Web and are typically among the top 20 Research Institute online resources accessed by users. The digital library resources or image collections produced by Digital Resource Management in collaboration with GRI collections curators and other staff members are also frequently accessed by Web users, with Monuments of the Future Designs by El Lissitzky and Mexico from Empire to Revolution consistently in the top 25 Research Institute online resources

Public Events

Poetry Readings During the course of the year the Research Institute co-sponsored three poetry readings with the Poetry Society of America in Los Angeles Each reading was held at the Getty Center The Research and Education department also commissioned three poets to write original

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works relating to the scholar year theme, Frames of Viewing Perception, Experience, Judgment The poets presented their work at a public reading in April, 2002.

Film Series A series of eight film screenings and discussions was offered in conjunction with the Frames of Viewing theme. In conjunction with the screening of Hotel, the Getty Research Institute presented a panel discussion with filmmaker Mike Figgis and special guests that examined how new technologies have changed the context and definition of art, and how filmmakers have confronted the challenge of adapting to these changes

Exhibition Lectures The Research Institute sponsored presentations by Jeff Wall and Benjamin Woolley about the exhibition Devices of Wonder From the World in a Box to Images on a Screen Getty Scholar Chloe Chard gave a public lecture in connection with the Getty 's exhibitions Italy on the Grand Tour

Exhibition. Framing LA A View from the Acropolis was a one-day exhibition of work created by artist Deanna Petherbridge during her term at the Research Institute as a Getty Scholar

Performance Self-Portrait of an Other Dutch writer and former Getty Scholar Cees Nooteboom and pianist Sarah Rothenberg appeared together in a mixed media performance. Nooteboom read sections from his new novel All Souls Day. The readings were interwoven with Rothenberg's performance of pieces by Shostakovich, Toru Takemitsu, Morton Feldman, and Arnold Schoenberg Panel. Building Walt Disney Concert Hall. The Research Institute, in collaboration with the Los Angeles Philharmonic, presented an afternoon of panel discussions that focused on the design and building processes of the Walt Disney Concert Hall, as well as the meaning of this significant structure within the fabric of downtown Los Angeles.

Panel Artists' Last Thoughts This public discussion brought together three noted art historians (Thomas Crow, Nancy Troy, Richard Shiff) to talk about the reflections of four visual artists at the end of their careers Mark Rothko, Piet Mondrian, Paul Cézanne, and Willem de Kooning Panel Sounds of Architecture – Perception and Experience examined the performance In the Shallows within the context of the Frames of Viewing theme Participants explored questions such as. How do works of art reinforce or resist the intricate mental habits that govern viewing in a given turne or place?

The following exhibition was developed by the GRI and presented in the Museum Special Exhibition gallery Devices of Wonder From the World in a Box to Images on a Screen November 13, 2001—February 3, 2002 (Exhibitions Pavilion) Curators Barbara Stafford, University of Chicago, and Frances Terpak, The Getty Research Institute

CONSERVATION

Research, field work and dissemination of information related to international, multidisciplinary projects were initiated or continued in North, Central and South America, the Mediterranean region, Europe and China These include, continued planning for Mayan sites in Central America, scientific analysis of the world's first-known photograph and creation of a free, online database of conservation abstracts

The GCI contracted two engineering experts to participate in a field campaign at the Mayan site of Copan in Honduras. The results included recommendations for addressing the structural stabilization of the Hieroglyphic Stairway and tunnels on the site and addressed issues such as drainage, subsurface hydraulics, and effects of vegetation around the staircase

The GCI worked in collaboration with the Instituto Hondureno de Antropologia e Historia (National Agency for Anthropology and History in Honduras), the local community, tourism authorities, and the ministry of urban housing to develop a comprehensive management plan for the Mayan site of Copan, Honduras

A Site Management Plan for Joya de Ceren, El Salvador was completed and CD's and hard-copy bound prints of the Plan were prepared for final distribution. The Plan was established to manage this archeological site, the people, and the value of the site for future generations

The GCI continued to work with the Dunhuang Academy (The Heritage Conservation Agency for Northern China) on the conservation and treatment of wall paintings in Cave 85 at the Buddhist grottoes in Mogao, China. GCI scientists evaluated field and laboratory tests performed on wall

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painting samples and performed testing of salt distributions, which can affect deterioration. GCI conservators developed grouting procedures and a methodology for producing condition surveys. This ongoing collaboration introduces new approaches and methods for conservation of Cave 85, which can be used as a model case study. This model case study will give China the ability to continue the preservation of many other caves along the Silk Road.

As part of the final phase of a training project in El Salvador, which was devastated by earthquakes in 2001, structural stabilization was completed for the Casa Barrientos in Izalco. Additionally, rain protection was completed for the two remaining training sites. Casa Barrientos, the Church of El Pilar in San Vincente and the Church of El Carmen in Santa Tecla. The Salvadoran staff that was trained can put these techniques to work at other sites that require emergency stabilization and protection. The GCI also produced a 3-minute video to sensitize the general population on the necessacity to stabilize structures damaged by earthquakes.

The third and final training campaign was carried out at the site of Utica in Tunisia GCI staff taught local conservation staff how to protect mosaics in situ so that this aspect of Tunisia's cultural heritage will remain in tact in its original context. Didactic materials were prepared by the GCI project team and presented to trainees to be used with future mosaic maintenance efforts within the Mediterranean region.

The fourth and final campaign was carried out at the site of Thuburbo Majus (Tunisia) between May 20 and June 21, 2002. A conference and site visit was organized on June 7, 2002. This conference focused on the training of technicians on various techniques to clean, repair, and maintains mosaics. Demonstrations of these techniques were also made to the senior managers of the Institut National du Patrimoine (National Tunisian Heritage Agency—INP). This initiative led to the creation of a dedicated unit within the INP for the study and conservation of mosaics in situ.

The Getty continues its long-term commitment to Los Angeles through its support of projects to preserve the rich, diverse heritage of the city. The GCI's Los Angeles Historic Resource Assessment Project lays the groundwork for how a comprehensive survey could play an important role in building appreciation of the city's architectural heritage and could contribute significantly to neighborhood conservation and community development. In February, the Los Angeles City Council voted unanimously to pass a resolution acknowledging the Getty's historic resource assessment efforts to date and made a commitment to cooperate in this effort

The bilingual version of the Mogao Master Plan was completed. Not only was the GCI able to contribute methodology and know how in preparation of this plan, but also organized the training of Chinese specialists at the GCI as well as in China This collaborate effort will preserve the site for future generations

In June, the GCI converted the publication, Art and Archaeology Technical Abstracts (AATA), to

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AATA online (aata getty edu), a free, web-based resource The launch of AATA Online increases the reach and usefulness of this resource for conservation professionals around the globe. The site offers the previously published 36 volumes of AATA and ultimately will include more than 100,000 abstracts related to the preservation and conservation of material cultural heritage.

In June, the oldest extant photograph, Joseph Nicéphore Niépce's View from the Window at Le Gras (1826) was brought to the GCI for two weeks by the University of Texas, Austin for examination The photograph itself had never before been scientifically analyzed and the GCI was asked to identify the photographic materials, study the material makeup and determine its state of conservation. GCI scientists used noninvasive analytical techniques (e.g., X-ray fluorescence and Fourier transform infrared spectrometry) available in our laboratories to conduct the study. The First Photograph project successfully determined, through thorough material and environmental examination, (1) the processes and materials utilized to create the world's earliest photograph in 1826, and (2) prescriptions to preserve the photograph in its new display at the Ransom Center at the University of Texas.

The GCI hosted the fifth Infrared and Raman Users Group conference, which brought together manufacturers, scientists and conservators to explore the many uses of this technology.

The GCI convened a roundtable meeting of recording, documentation and information management experts. This brought together 20 documentation and conservation experts from all over the world to discuss bridging the gap between conservators and documentation professionals.

On June 11-14 a meeting of professionals was held in Nicosia, Cyprus to discuss needs in the field of mosaic conservation. A total of 23 experts participated in discussing the conservation of Mosaics in situ. The discussion was based on assessing current needs and gaps in the field and to initiate an International collaboration for future action in this field. The GCI prepared an International Glossary of terms in the field of Mosaics in situ, which will contribute to the future scientific research in this field.

The GCI presented the Emergency Preparedness worktable in Santiago, Chile This was a follow up to the June 2002 workshop, which emphasized the need to increase awareness, expertise, and preparedness for natural and human caused disasters. The importance of this workshop was to communicate the fundamentals of emergency preparedness and train other institutions on emergency awareness and prevention.

A workshop entitled, "Metodologia y Aplicaciones para Intervenciones en Retablos de Madera Policromada" was co-organized in Seville, Spain by the GCI and the Instituto Andaluz del Patrimonio Historico. The workshop provided conservators with an opportunity to discuss the varied approaches to conserving retablos, which are comprised of complex elements including paintings, sculpture and architectural structures.

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Publications

The following publications were completed Assessing the Values of Cultural Heritage, El Pueblo The Historical Heart of Los Angeles, Copper and Bronze in Art Corrosion, Colorants, and Conservation, Color Science in Examination of Museum Objects, and Effects of Light on Materials in Collections

Scholarship

The GCI hosted five conservation guest scholars who researched topics such as textile conservation and preparatory ground layers used in European canvas paintings in the 16th to 20th centuries

The GCI welcomed three graduate interns for year-long internships. Their areas of focus ranged from lime mortars and plasters research to technical analysis of bronze art objects.

The GCI held three public lectures as part of the continuing series "Issues in Conservation". The topics ranged from restoration of the Athenian Acropolis to preserving Los Angeles's postwar suburbs to preservation. In addition, GCI project team members gave lectures at the conservation training courses in Dazu, Sichuan Province, China They shared the information about protecting China's historic sites and general site management that they have been developing for years as part of the China Principles project.

Conservation, the GCI Newsletter, was published and distributed free of charge to approximately 8000 individuals and institutions located in approximately 130 countries.

EDUCATION

The unifying theme for this scholar year was Frames of Viewing Perception, Experience, Judgment The theme was centered on the fundamental problem of how body, mind, and culture combine to produce perception and aesthetic experience. Participants pursued their individual projects, conversed in the weekly seminar, attended lectures and other events, took part in workshops, and informally shared their ideas with staff and with one another. In September eleven Getty scholars and two Getty Fellows arrived at the Getty Research Institute, joining five Getty Fellows already in residence. Fifteen Visiting Scholars also took part in the scholar year, working at the Research Institute for periods of one to three months.

During Fiscal Year 2002 the Research Institute awarded a total of 66 grants to participants in the scholar year (33), the Intern and Graduate Intern Program (1), and Library Research Grants (32).

Lecture Series

Research Lectures Two of the Research Institute's curators presented lectures on the Special Collections holdings of the Research Library Six additional presentations in this series were given

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by guest lecturers

Art Matters The Research Institute continued a series entitled Art Matters, in which Barbara Isenberg conducted conversations with artists, dealers, and others about their work and the changing California arts scene. During the fiscal year ending June 30, 2002, there were five such programs, featuring Alexis Smith, Michael Light, Peter Plagens, Richard Thompson, and film critics Richard Corliss, Ella Taylor, and Kenneth Turan.

Works in Progress Every year the Research Institute hosts a series of presentations—usually by local scholars—on work in progress in art history and the humanities. The purpose of the series is to promote discussion of current issues, topics, and themes among interested scholars and students. There were ten of these events during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2002

Workshops

In collaboration with the Clark Art Institute, the Research Institute conducted two workshops on Art History and Criticism, one at the Getty Center and the other in Williamstown, Massachusetts Participants included scholars in residence at the Research Institution and the Clark, scholars in residence the previous year at the Research Institute, and invited experts on this question.

(Un)Stable Strategies III Writing the History of Art Now was the topic of the third in an ongoing series of dissertation workshops for doctoral candidates working in the history of art and related fields. Candidates were invited to apply to participate in a discussion linking their specific research projects to current methodological and theoretical issues in visual studies. This two-day event gave twelve doctoral candidates the opportunity to participate in stimulating, intensive discussions with each other, with Getty staff, and with two outside faculty members. The workshop was designed to encourage the sharing of ideas on the candidates' specific projects and on the state of the discipline

Viewing Sculpture Organized in collaboration with the J Paul Getty Museum and moderated by former Getty Scholar Malcolm Baker, this workshop addressed the viewing practices and conditions (past and present) specific to viewing sculpture

Perspective Manuals and Treatises In Search of an Audience was a four-day international workshop held in conjunction with the exhibition The Geometry of Seeing Perspective and the Dawn of Virtual Space. This event was the first of two workshops organized collaboratively by the Getty Research Institute and the Centre de'Études Supérieures de la Renaissance in Tours, France, with the Bureau de la Recherche Architectural et Urbaine, Ministère de la Culture et de la Communication, France. Participants addressed the issue of the audience for perspective texts. Given their complexity for the average artist and their presence in contemporary collections of physical and natural sciences, it is still unclear who used perspective manuals and for what purpose

As part of the Research Institute's continued effort to collaborate with local academic institutions, a

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graduate seminar on Writing the History of Art Problems of Description and Narrative was offered in collaboration with the Art History department of the University of Southern California. USC graduate students received credit for their participation.

USC Graduate Seminar Professor Todd Olson taught an art history seminar for local graduate students.

Conferences

A Getty-sponsored panel discussion took place at the College Art Association's annual meeting in Philadelphia Thomas Crow and several Getty Scholars in residence discussed their Frames of Viewing projects

Heroes Leave their Shores Exile, Loss, and the Dynamics of Artistic Creation was a collaborative conference that included paper sessions, performances, and several related public events, and examined various aspects of exile as a creative, social, and psychological phenomenon.

Frames of Viewing Seeing Rothko investigated the effect that Mark Rothko had on contemporary art as a whole, focusing on specific artists and their work. As part of the conference, Thomas Crow spoke with artists Larry Bell, Mary Corse and Philip Taaffe

Frames of Viewing The Brain, Cognition, and Art This conference linked the Research Institute's scholar-year theme, Frames of Viewing Perception, Experience, Judgment, and a related theme (Cognition, Brain and Art) of Stanford University's Center for Advanced Study in the Behavioral Sciences (CASBS) The conference brought together approximately fifty distinguished visiting/residential scholars from the two institutions with invited guests from local universities to explore the intersecting themes from multi-disciplinary perspectives—particularly art history and the sciences. The event included a public lecture by award-winning theatrical director, actor, and writer Jonathan Miller on The Gaze Looking as It Appears in Pictures.

Italy's Eighteenth Century Gender and Politics in the Age of the Grand Tour ex plored the local characteristics of the peninsula that has usually been judged and understood in light of the French Enlightenment. The conference was organized by the Research Institute in conjunction with the UCLA Center for Seventeenth and Eighteenth-Century Studies and the Clark Library

Frames of Viewing took place at the Haus der Kulturen der Welt in Berlin. Eight Research Institute scholars were matched with eight scholars from Germany, including Horst Bredekamp and Hans Belting, to discuss issues related to Frames of Viewing.

Investigating Harry Smith's Mahagonny Filmmaker, anthropologist, painter, and musicologist Harry Smith worked on Mahagonny, his final film, for over ten years and considered it his magnum opus. The conference focused on Smith's cinematic transformation of Kurt Weil and Bertolt

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Brecht's caustically saturical opera into an allegory that explores human needs and desires amid the rituals of daily life in New York City A performance by Patti Smith was the closing event of the conference

The Grant Program provides critical support to institutions and individuals throughout the world in fields that are aligned most closely with the Trust's strategic priorities. It therefore funds a diverse range of projects that promote learning and scholarship about the history of the visual arts and the conservation of cultural heritage, and it consistently searches for collaborative efforts that set high standards and make significant contributions. Current funding priorities include grants for research, conservation, and leadership training and professional development.

Application forms and submission deadlines vary depending on grant category. For most grants, a brief preliminary letter describing the project and its financial requirements should be submitted to the Grant Program before a formal grant proposal is developed. Individual research grants are judged through an annual competition.

- 1 (b) The Getty put on numerous public performances including "Selected Shorts" a series of readings of classic and contemporary short stories as well as theater and dance performances designed to attract an audience that might not otherwise visit the museum. The J. Paul Getty Museum's Summer Concert Series and Friday Night Concerts introduce audiences to music that might not otherwise be performed in the Los Angeles area. Each concert is accompanied by a lecture and extensive program notes to place the music in historical perspective against works of art in the Museum's collections
- 1 (c) The Getty Research Institute hosted conferences to expand the knowledge of the history of art and the humanities These conferences included Heroes Leave their Shores Exile, Loss, and the Dynamics of Artistic Creation, a series of conferences entitled Frames of Viewing including Seeing Rothko, The Brain, Cognition and Art, Perception, Italy's Eighteenth Century Gender and Politics in the Age of the Grand Tour and Investigating Harry Smith's Mahagonny
- 1 (d) Royalties are received from two sources. The Bibliography of the History of Art provides the most comprehensive English language indexing and abstracting service for articles, books and exhibition catalogues on Western art from late antiquity to the present. Art and Architectural Technical Abstracts is a major source reference in conservation, publishing 2,500 abstracts per year covering technical examination, investigation, analysis, restoration preservation and documentation of works of historic and artistic value
- 1 (e) The Museum makes audioguides available to its visitors for a small charge These random access units allow visitors to take a personalized tour of the collections by offering commentary and perspectives on works of art in the collections by curators, scholars, educators, artists and local leaders in both English and Spanish.
- 1 (f) Upon request, the Museum and the Research Institute make available photographs and slides of works of art in its collections. These photographs are provided free of charge to scholars and arts institutions. A nominal charge is made for other requests to offset production costs.
- The Museum bookstore makes available to the public a wide variety of general art books as well as publications, prints and postcards specific to the Museum's collections. Additionally, scholarly publications produced by J. Paul Getty Trust Publications, the Research Institute and the Conservation Institute are available from the bookstore.
