

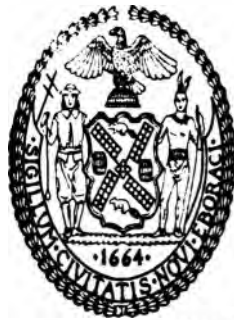

MUNICIPAL CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION

ALL PERSONS DISCHARGED FROM MILITARY DUTY ARE ADVISED TO forthwith consult and carefully read those provisions of the State Civil Service Law and State Military Law pertaining to their rights, duties and responsibilities in connection with civil service examinations, and civil service employment. In order to safeguard such rights, they are further advised to forthwith appear at the offices of the Municipal Civil Service Commission at 299 Broadway, Manhattan, N. Y. 7, with their discharge papers. 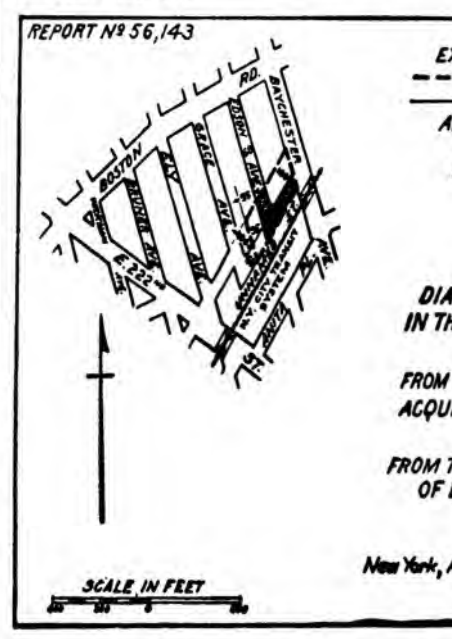

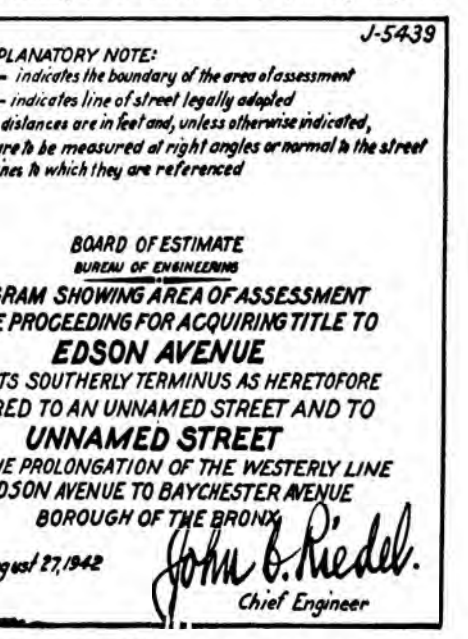

3. A brief description of the supplies, materials and equipment to be furnished and of the work or labor to be done.

(c) Proposals for bids shall be in such form as may be prescribed by the agency issuing the same and shall state:

1. That the person making the bid shall deliver it in a sealed envelope, addressed to the head of the appropriate agency, on or before the time and at the place designated in the advertisement;
2. That the sealed envelope shall be endorsed with the name or names of the person or persons presenting the same, the date of its presentation and the title of the proposal;
3. The place where and the day and hour when the bids will be publicly opened;
4. The quantity and quality of the supplies, materials or equipment to be furnished and the nature and extent of the work or labor to be done;
5. That every bid shall be accompanied by a deposit in approximately the sum of two percentum of the amount of such bid; except that in the case of a proposal for a single item or class of items, the deposit shall be approximately two percentum of the contracting agency's estimated cost of the supplies, materials or equipment to be furnished and the work or labor to be done. (g) Medical, surgical, dental, laboratory supplies and implements and food supplies involving an expenditure of more than one thousand dollars may be procured on purchase orders based on bids which permit of competition received after advertisement in at least three successive issues of THE CITY RECORD.
