

Niles over budget on salt buy

The price Niles will pay for road salt has increased significantly this year due to shortages created by increased demand, record costs, and last winter's ex-

treme conditions. The Village Board Tuesday approved \$332,000 for the public services department to ourchase 4,000 tons of salt from Central Salt LLC of Louisville, Ky. — nearly \$135.000 over the previously budgeted amount.

Public Services Director Scott Jochim said the increase was due to low to

zero inventory left at supplier's depots and mines, record high fuel prices, increased demand from users to avoid shortages this winter, and barge traffic that was halted for one month this summer due to the flooding of the Mississippi River.

Jochim said even obtaining price quotes this year posed a challenge because there was so little inventory among Niles' usual suppliers. Aside from Central's

Printer to bring 120 jobs to village

Incentive gives owner 20-percent, 8-vear tax break

A Chicago printing company will move to Niles, bringing 120 new jobs to the village.

IPP Litho Plate Corporation will occupy space at 7300 Natchez Ave., a 64,000-square-foot property that has been vacant for seven months.

The Village Board voted Aug. 26 to support a resolution granting the printing business a special "6(b) reduced property

tax rate" used by Cook County as an incentive to occupy a vacant property.

The tax incentive lowers property-tax rates from 36 percent to 16 percent for eight years if owners take significant steps to rehabilitate the property.

Village officials said IPP Litho Plate plans to spend \$1.5 million renovating its new space.



Oscar Mayer selected her from more than 1,000 applicants from across the nation as one of the 14 who would be part of their 21st class of drivers of seven Wienermobile.

Once accepted, Fergus spent two weeks of 14hour days at Hot Dog High in Madison, Wis., where she learned how to drive the Wienermobile, the history of it and the company (Carl Mayer drove the first around Chicago in 1936 as a promotional gimmick) and how to garnish her conversations with all types of hot-dog puns. She and partner Selena Armendarez were then dispatched to the South, home to a culture quite different from her Chicagoland upbringing - these people put chili on their hot dogs.

"I forgive the people down here," Fergus said from Brownsville, Texas. "They say 'Give me chili,' and then we do."







Thanks to state, **Bischof family** for stalker law

proximity of their perpetrators was signed earlier this month, thanks in large part to the efforts of the family of

The Cindy Bischof Law, named after the Arlington Heights woman who was fatally shot in Elmhurst by her ex-boyfriend even though she had restraining orders against him, will allow a judge to require someone charged with a violation of an order of protection to wear or carry a global positioning device.

The GPS device would notify law enforcement or another supervisory agency immediately and notify the victim "in near real-time" of any breach of the court-ordered

The equipment should include a loud alarm to warn the potential victim if the offender is near and there should be a cell phone implanted in the ankle device by which the monitoring agency can advise an offender that he or she has violated the boundaries.

Illinois already requires all sexual predators convicted after Jan. 1, 2007, to wear a GPS device on a bracelet when they are released from prison for the duration of their parole. Illinois gets its electronic monitors from Behavioral Interventions which charges \$1.95 per day per bracelet for electronic detention; \$6.30 per day for each passive GPS device; \$8.55 per day for each hybrid device; and \$9.30 per day for each active GPS unit.

Cindy Bischof had argued that people who violate restraining orders should have to wear electronic bracelets or similar detection devices so their victims could know if the stalker is in their vicinity

The new law, which goes into effect Jan. 1, was written, voted on and signed quickly -- perhaps one of the few things the state legislature has done right this year.

And it leads us on the right path to ensuring protection orders are taken seriously by offenders and to dissuade stalking.

The hard work is partly due to Cindy Bischof's family who lobbied for this law and now are on a crusade to make it a national law

Approximately three woman a day are killed in the United States by their intimate partners, according to Diane Rosenfeld, a Harvard University law professor, who helped draft a similar law in Massachusetts.

Police and social agencies, like WINGS, work nonstop to keep victims of abuse safe. But ultimately, it is the government's duty to protect its citizens, especially those who cannot protect themselves, and now technology enables it do so.

Costs and logistics still must be worked out. The state has not yet chosen which company will provide the monitoring system, but to pay for it, the law imposes a fine of at least \$200 on someone convicted of violating an order of protection.

But the Bischof family strongly believes - and we concur — these GPS devices will allow victims to live without constant fear of their abuser, and they ultimately could save lives.

Now that school is back in session in District 64, one of the questions that teachers may ask students is: What did you do on your summer vacation?







Party People") hits an impressive benchmark for desperation as the spectacularly untalented (and unpronounceable) Mr. Marschz. a high school drama teacher who decides to stage a musical sequel to Shakespeare's greatest drama. Marschz has failed as an actor failed as a teacher, failed as a husband, pretty much failed at everything, and has one chance to redeem himself with one great show. Which might seem like a long shot, considering that his big production number is called "Rock Me Sexy Jesus." "Hamlet 2" is raunchy. foul-mouthed, tasteless and borderline-blasphemous, but it's also frequently hilarious and dead-on-target with its observations on acting. theater. school, ambition, talent. therapy. alcoholism, love, marriage. career. self-delusion, civil liberties, racial and sexual prejudice, funding for the arts and oh-so-much more. Directed and co-written (with an assist from "South Park" writer/producer Pam Brady) by Andrew Fleming, who also made the sharpwitted Watergate satire "Dick." (BI) (92 min.) What you might not get, though, unless you've already formed an idea of what to expect from the Judd Anatow comedy factory is that "Pineapple" is smarter and funnier than you'd have a right to hope from anyone else making a similar movie. sat on the rock in the hot sun and took a deep breath. The smell of pine and musty dirt wafted to my nose. There was a slight breeze, but the water in front of me didn't ripple. Tall pine trees circled one edge of the small lake; large boulders ringed the other.

Surrounded by concrete and skyscrapers in Chicago, I sometimes forget that places like this exist. And one of the only ways I could have driven there is in a Hummer.

It was probably less than 10 miles off the main road, but it took us more than hour to get to this spot enclosed by rocks and boulders.

Martin Walsh, Hummer general manager, mentioned that the new H3T is a "lifestyle enabler." And after our trek to that secluded lake, I see what he meant. Strap a kayak on the top, stick some fishing poles, a tent, some duffel bags with gear and clothing and a couple of coolers with food in the 5-foot bed and you can go virtually anywhere - with five people. Need a little more room for stuff and less for people? Rear seats have a 60/40 split, creating additional flexibility for carrying cargo.

For 2009 the new H3T breaks into a segment previously untouched by Hummer: that of the midsize pickup.

The truck bed is capable of carrying two dirt bikes, a snowmobile or ATV and full sheets of plywood. Towing capability with the up-level 5.3-liter V-8 engine is 5,900 pounds. The standard 3.7-liter I-5 engine tows up to 4,400 pounds.

Plus, it has all the standard Hummer off-road capability. Minimum ground clearance with the base 32-inch tires is 9.5 inches and steps up to 10.2 inches with the up-level 33-inch tires. Approach angles for the new H3T are 37.1 degrees and 38.7 degrees respectively. All these numbers are incredibly close to those of the regular H3. However, because of the truck bed, the departure angle on the H3T is a little less capable, but still very good, at 30.9 degrees and 30.6 degrees Yet when you climb inside, it's like stepping

into a premium midsize SUV. The gauges and controls are clean and simple and the seats are lushly comfortable. If I didn't check my rearview mirror, I never would have guessed I was driving a rugged pickup truck.

Looking at the H3T from any angle, you can't mistake the vehicle's lineage. This pickup truck is a Hummer through and through. From the seven-slot grille to the high windshield, recognition is immediate. From the front, you'd be hard

pressed to tell the difference between the H3T and the H3 because the B-pillar forward is shared hetween the two vehicles

What's different is the 5-foot pickup bed and an extra 22.3 inches added to the wheelbase.

During the press preview for the H3T, we mixed up the off-road driving with some highway time, giving us a good opportunity to see how the truck handles in everyday situations.

The vehicle I was driving during the preview was an Alpha model, which comes with the 5.3-liter V-8 engine. Acceleration was decent if occasionally sluggish. Then again, we were driving a 5,069-pound vehicle at an altitude around 7,000 feet, so I can't complain.

You do get some obvious road noise from the gargantuan tites slapping the pavement on the highway, but all things considered, Hummer did a great job of keeping the cabin relatively quiet.

Even though the test vehicle had manually adjusting front seats, I got a pretty decent driving position. The one thing I would have liked: height idjustment. You get that on the optional power seats, but not on the standard manual ones.

My biggest fear as we shimmed through narrow passes and skirted tree trunks was that I'd somehow put a huge dent or gash in the back of the truck. Twenty-two inches is a lot of extra metal to maneuver. And as you'd expect, the turning radius wasn't that good. I'd often have to do a two-point turn to get the right angle for a turn on

But that being said, the H3T could make the

Debuting in the H3T, Hummer introduces some new features into the H3 lineup for 2009. In terms of off-roading, a couple important additions are the front locking differential included with the off-road adventure package and the standard hill start assist. There is also a new rearview camera system display on the inside of the rearview mirror, which replaces the previous mirror slide-out display.

During my brief time in the H3T, I found the vehicle to be capable, comfortable and kitschy cool. It did everything I wanted and more.

The downside is fuel economy. It stinks. The I-5 engine manages city/highway fuel economy of 14/18 miles per gallon and the V-8 in the Alpha models gets 13/16 miles per gallon. If you figure in a lot of off-roading with low gears and four-wheel drive, it will be significantly less.

Base price for the H3T will be \$31,495 with the standard I-5 engine and five-speed automatic transmission, almost \$2,000 less than the regular H3 model. Upgrading to the H3T Alpha model, will cost \$36,760.

This vehicle definitely isn't for everyone. But . if it's for you, mark your calendar. The H3T goes into production early this month and should start hitting dealers a few weeks later.







Automakers face conflicting safety rules worldwide

DEARBORN, Mich. - It seems like an easy solution: Americans are looking for more fuel-efficient vehicles, so Ford Motor Co. is bringing over some of the small, gas-sipping cars it's been selling to Europeans for years.

But introducing the cars to the U.S. market isn't as simple as changing the speedometer from kilometers to miles. Ford has to reconcile American and European safety regulations - everything from the color of rear turn signals to the positioning of crash test dummies - that will keep the cars from hitting U.S. highways anytime soon.

Competing interests among automakers, governments and the insurance industry are hampering efforts to standardize safety requirements worldwide. That means extra engineering to make different versions of vehicles for different markets

"Each party negotiating this has their own views about their own standards being better," said Ronald Medford, senior associate administrator of vehicle safety at the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, which sets U.S. standards. "But as long as we can show we're not lowering safety and we're lowering cost, we're all interested in that."

Some differences are significant, like the U.S. rule that requires protection for passengers not wearing seat belts, which has no European equivalent. Others are small, like the U.S. requirement that vehicles have side lights, which are optional in Europe. Ford isn't the only automaker facing this issue. The ultra-

compact Smart car was sold overseas for nine years, but before Daimler AG could bring it to the United States, it had to make the car longer to meet U.S. crash standards, spokesman Ken Kettenbeil said.

But Ford's promise to bring six small, fuel-efficient vehicles from Europe and start building them in North America in 2010 puts a new focus on the challenge of satisfying governments' varying requirements.

These global models are the cornerstone of Ford's plan to return to profitability after losing \$8.7 billion last quarter. The Dearborn-based automaker says its small European vehicles sell well and are superior to those in the United States. Ford also plans to save billions from designing products for global sales, boosting profits on small cars, which don't generate the revenue of trucks and SUVs.

Automakers know how to retrofit their vehicles but quesnion the time and expense involved when the changes may not make those vehicles safer, said Jim Vondale, director of Ford's safety office.

Ford recently studied 43 regulations in Europe and the United States and found that just 11 were equivalent, Von-

dale said. Fourteen had major differences that would require significant changes. Asian countries' regulations, which are closer to European requirements than their U.S. counterparts, add even more complexities.

It doesn't stop with government standards. Automakers also have to contend with the Arltington, Va.-based Insurance Institute for Highway Safety, which is funded by the insurance industry and runs its own closely watched set of crash

Tests may look similar at the outset but contain crucial differences. The European frontal crash test uses a deformable barrier - made to mimic another car - that slams into 40 percent of the front of the vehicle. That challenges engineers to spread the energy from the crash across the rest of the car. The fixed barrier in the U.S. test absorbs no energy, causing a severe crash that evaluates the vehicle's overall strength.

Adding to the complexity of the frontal test is that the United States and Europe put their crash test dummies in different seating positions, which can affect how the air bags should deploy, said III-IS President Adrian Lund.

Medford said NHTSA's test to make sure cars are safe for unbelted occupants is important in the U.S. market, where people who weren't wearing seat belts make up 45 percent of all traffic fatalities

But car makers grumble that NHTSA's requirement makes cars less safe for belted occupants, since protecting people without seat belts requires more powerful air bags and other changes.

"We would much prefer to design a vehicle that provides good protection for unbelted occupants but is tuned specifically to protect occupants that are doing what they're supposed to be doing," Vondale said.

He said 40 countries, including the United States, have signed on to a 10-year-old effort to harmonize regulations. The group has agreed to frameworks for global regulations governing door locks, rear head restraints and electronic stability control. Next, the group will consider pedestrian pro-

But efforts to match lighting standards, for example, were shelved after Japan nixed a regulation requiring daytime running lights and Europe refused to allow rear turn signals to blink red instead of amber, Vondale said.


"It's very difficult for governments that have had a specific regulation on their books for many years to suddenly decide to change," Vondale said. But he said the short-term cost of redesigning vehicles for the global market would be more than made up by the long-term savings of harmoniza-

"We think it's very important to have a single set of requirements that can be enacted globally," he said.

What's in a roofline?



Named as such because it appears as though a notch has been taken out the 'C' pillar The notch allows the roof to be taller at the rear than in an equivalent fastback

Slantback

The 'C' pillar was often at an angle similar to, or steeper than, the windshield. Not a popular roof style, the design allowed the rear glass to stay dry in the rain. A power up/down feature for the rear glass was an option in the '63-'64 Mercurys. Mid-1990 Mercury Cougars mimicked the styling, but the rear glass was perpendicular to the body not stanted.




Coupe

Regardless of roof type, if the car had two doors and a body-mounted 'post' separating the front window from the rear, the car was considered a coupe, Like modern-day coupes, the rear-passenger windows were often fixed or hinge mounted allowing them to pop out. In the 1950s, the style

Hardtop cars do not have a post dividing the front and rear passenger windows. The roof is mounted to the body only at the base of the windshield and the base of the

At the same time, however, many parents may miss some of the small clues that can help them make an even bigger decision than a weekly family trip to the museum. What should parents be looking for when choosing quality child care for their youngsters?

One might expect any child care facility to be in excellent condition, but "look for clues that show children are being active," says Turner. "There should be a good balance between cleanliness and messiness. Are there wellloved, well-used tovs around? Are children's art projects prominently Children don't thrive in sterile unstimulating environments."

Observe caregivers

Parents should discern between simple employees and true child care providers who love their jobs and care about nurturing the children. Is the staff on the floor, on children's level playing with them? Are they happy, engaged, and energetic, attuned and aware of their

Another key is listening for providers who talk with the children, not to them. Says Weiner, "Teachers should encourage social emotional development by helping children express their feelings verbally. We help children develop language and communication skills through listening, engaging children in conversations and providing opportunities to interact with other children."

Consider also the ratio of children to caregivers. "Young children learn in a secure environment when they have a strong relationship with a primary caregiver or teacher," Weiner comments, "Programs should not transition children frequently from class to class or teacher to teacher."

Parental involvement

Finally, child care does not replace the role of the parents, who after all are a child's first teachers. "Parents should be made to feel valued as partners in their child's growth and development," says Weiner. "They are always welcome in our center. We want our teachers to consult with them about their child's needs and progress." Many programs will provide a daily summary of your child's

With the assistance and input of parents, child care providers can more aptly develop appropriate programming for children, "They should be given opportunities to learn through exploration and play," agrees Weiner, "We want to provide a variety of learning materials and add new challenges and experiences as children are ready

"Ask for a copy of the curriculum or daily summary, including snacks, activities and quiet time," adds Turner. "If this information is not available, that's a clear sign you may want to look elsewhere

Another stamp of approval would be to listen to what other experts say. Accreditation by the National Association of Early Childhood Education (www.naevc.org) is the mark of excellence in early learning programs. In addition, Illinois Action for Children (www.actforchildren.org) provides wellregarded assistance for choosing child care.

Carla Kissel's Pork Chops with Apricot **Rosemary Sauce**

2 bone-in pork chops 1 shallot, finely minced 1/4 C sweet Marsala wine 2-3 heaping T Kissel's Apricot Rosemary Spiced Jam 11/2 T butter:

1T olive oil Salt and pepper to taste

Heat olive oil in a 12-inch skillet over medium high heat until just smoking. Add pork chops and brown on each side, being careful not to overcook. Salt and pepper each side after browning. Remove chops, tent with aluminum foil and keep warm.

For the sauce: Add 1 T olive oil to the skillet and return to medium high heat until shimmering. Add the shallot and cook until softened, about 2 minutes. Stir in the sweet Marsala wine, scraping up any browned bits and simmer until reduced and slightly syrupy, about 7 minutes.

Stir in any accumulated juices from the pork chops. Turn the heat to low and whisk in the Apricot Rosemary Spiced Jam. Allow the sauce to caramelize a bit. Stir in the butter. Return chops to pan and coat with the sauce.

Serve with lightly mashed Yukon Gold potatoes. This recipe also works well with boneless, skinless chicken breasts.



Versatile sweet

These new, gourmet jams aren't just for the morning toast, Kissel provides pointers for using jam to make pan sauces for meats and toppings for desserts in occasional cooking classes at the Deerfield Whole Foods location, where her jams have been sold since June. Gourmet jams and jellies are also finding their way into fashionable dinner menus paired with fine cheeses and even as cocktail enhancements.

Alcohol and fruit also mix well as jelly combinations. Rosemary Divock, the late herbiere who lived in Lake Geneva, Wis., and sold her popular, homemade herb jellies in Chicago area shops, encouraged jelly makers to consider substituting wine for fruit juice. Instead of

juice, she'd pair white wines with lemon grass, pink rose petals, or tarragon. Red wines she matched with garlic, rosemary, or thyme.

Summer in winter

In her book, Growing and Using Herbs in the Midwest, (Amherst Press, 1996), Divock pointed out how herb-laced jellies bring the joy of a "bountiful summer of herbs" to a mid-winter dinner table.

Divock used herbs like licorice mint, rose geranium, and pineapple sage to make fruit juice-based jellies for accenting thumbprint cookies, glazing fruit tarts, or basting meats. She mixed orange juice with lavender. pineapple juice with cilantro, and grapefruit juice with anise hyssop.

"Late summer is the best time of the season to make jellies," Divock wrote. "This is when the essential oils, which give herbs their distinct taste. are at their peak."



