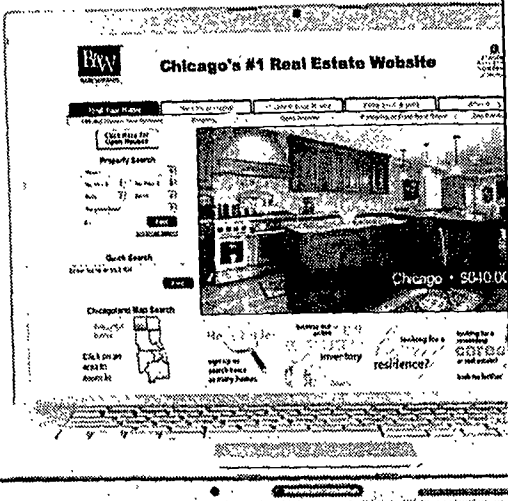

Blase admits guilt

Ex-Niles mayor pleads guilty to corruption charges

Feds alleged insurance scam paid him \$420K in kickbacks

There were no Halloween treats Friday for former longtime Niles mayor Nicholas Blase.

Blase, 80, changed his plea Friday from innocent to guilty on federal corruption charges of mail fraud and tax evasion, and admitted to steering local businesses to buy insurance from an agency that paid him \$420,000 in kickbacks over the past 20 years.

The veteran mayor and former Maine Township Democratic committee-man pleaded guilty to one count of mail fraud in the kickback scheme, which carries a sentence of up to 20 years in prison and a fine of up to \$250,000. He

also pleaded guilty to one count of tax evasion, which carries a prison sentence of three years and a fine of up to \$100,000.

In exchange for Blase's plea, the federal government agreed to drop nine additional corruption charges.

Upon changing his plea, a visibly emotional Blase asked to read a prepared statement before U.S. District Judge Wayne

Andersen.

"I am here today because I made a mistake," Blase said. "I have tried to do what I thought was right. I want to take this opportunity to apologize to those I let down — my family, my friends, and most of all, the people of Niles. We've been through a lot together. I was wrong and for that I am very sorry."

The judge was gentle with Blase and offered

him consolation regarding his political legacy.

"What is wrong is deeply wrong," Andersen said. "The good things that happened, fortunately, will not be undone."

Blase and his attorney, Chris Stetler, both declined to comment after the hearing. Federal prosecutor Dan Collins would not further elaborate on the deal struck with Blase and said the sentence for his crimes would be up to the discretion of the judge.

In changing his plea to guilty, Blase ends a two-year legal battle and months of speculation over whether he would continue to fight the charges or cut a deal with the government.

Blase initial trial was scheduled for Sept. 8, but his attorneys asked for more time to negotiate with prosecutors. The case was set for another status hearing on Sept. 25, but that was rescheduled

to today. Attorneys at the time would not say whether a deal was in the works.

Blase, who served as mayor of Niles for 47 years before retiring in August, was arrested at his home in 2006 and indicted on several counts of mail fraud and accused of inappropriately using his elected office to pressure local businesses into buying high-priced insurance from Ralph Weiner & Associates, of Wheeling. He initially pleaded not guilty.

The government had alleged that the scheme netted Blase about \$420,000 in bribes kicked back by Weiner's company.

"I'll be absolved of all this and I'll stay in office," Blase told reporters at the time.

Blase is scheduled to appear in court Jan. 29 to be sentenced.

Students return early to Gemini

East Maine School District 63 announced Friday that the asbestos-abatement process at Gemini Junior High School had been completed ahead of schedule, and said students would be returning to the building Wednesday.

It was previously thought that students would not be able to return to Gemini until Monday.

"We are happy to let you know that final testing indicates no trace of asbestos, mold, or any other contaminants any-

where in the building," Superintendent Kathleen Williams wrote in a letter to parents.

Asbestos was discovered in the adhesive beneath Gemini's first-floor carpeting Sept. 13 when work crews were cleaning up after a flood.

"New carpet has been installed," Williams wrote, "and the areas impacted have been completely disinfected."

While no trace of airborne asbestos was detected at Gemini, school board members voted to keep the school closed until the substance was completely removed to avoid problems in the future.

"The abatement process was conducted in three phases with affected areas completely sealed off/contained from the rest of the building," Williams wrote. "After each phase, additional air quality testing was conducted, and each time this testing indicated that there were no airborne contaminants at Gemini."

All of Gemini's students took up residence in other District 63 schools and worked out of mostly makeshift classrooms set up in gymnasiums.

Students returning to Gemini will be given copies of their class schedules and lock combi-

nations to jog their memories.

"In addition a letter will be placed in the files of eighth grade students when transitioning to high school referencing the situation and its subsequent impact on instructional areas not addressed during this time period," Williams wrote. "The Board of Education and we are excited about our return to Gemini and would like to thank our 'host' elementary schools for their gracious hospitality, as well as our parents and staff for their support and patience."

Holiday dance to replace aborted Homecoming

Maine South High School in Park Ridge will host a free dance in December to make up for the cancellation of the Homecoming dance on Oct. 4.

The dance, described as informal, will be from

6:30-9:30 p.m. on Dec. 6 in the school's Spectator Gym. The radio station KISS-FM has offered to provide a disc jockey and music for the dance free of charge.

Dance was canceled midway through the evening following a bomb threat called into 911 that night. Students were evacuated from the building and sent home while school officials waited for the Cook

County Bomb Squad to arrive and search the building. No explosives were found, and the source of the 911 calls remains under investigation by the Park Ridge Police Department.

Residents to pay 25 cents a month for public TV

In a move that will give Niles its very own government access cable-TV channel, village trustees at their Oct. 23 meeting voted 5-1 to approve a 10-year franchise agreement with Comcast.

The new channel will have a range of programming, including news and information, emergency warnings, educational specials, sports, entertainment and arts and culture.

But the new agreement with Comcast states that the channel will be established by a 25-cent "pass-through" fee for every sub-

scriber every month (\$3 a year) for a period of time deemed necessary to pay for the equipment used to provide the channel.

Assistant village manager Steve Vinezeano estimated the cost of the equipment to be between \$65,000 and \$80,000.

"We've got 24 hours to cover," he said. "There's an awful lot of information we can get on there."

Niles now receives an educational channel from Triton College, but the school does not serve Niles and does not provide local information.

Acting Mayor Robert Callero said he was in favor of the new channel be-

cause the opportunity is presented to provide residents with emergency warnings and additional information about the village.

"All our sister cities could even put a little presentation on there," he said. "It's \$3 a year."

But while Trustee Kim Biederman agreed with Callero and the rest of the board regarding the value of the channel, she voted against the Comcast agreement because she was reluctant to pass the 25-cent cost on to residents.

Instead, Biederman said, she would like to see the village pay for the

channel using funds from the franchise fee it will receive from Comcast. The new agreement states that the village will continue to receive a franchise fee from Comcast that is 5 percent of the company's annual gross revenues.

"I'm opposed to passing the tax on to residents," Biederman said. "I believe this public channel should be funded with the revenues from the franchise agreement."

But other trustees said the village would need the franchise fee funds to help balance this year's budget. The measure passed 5-1.

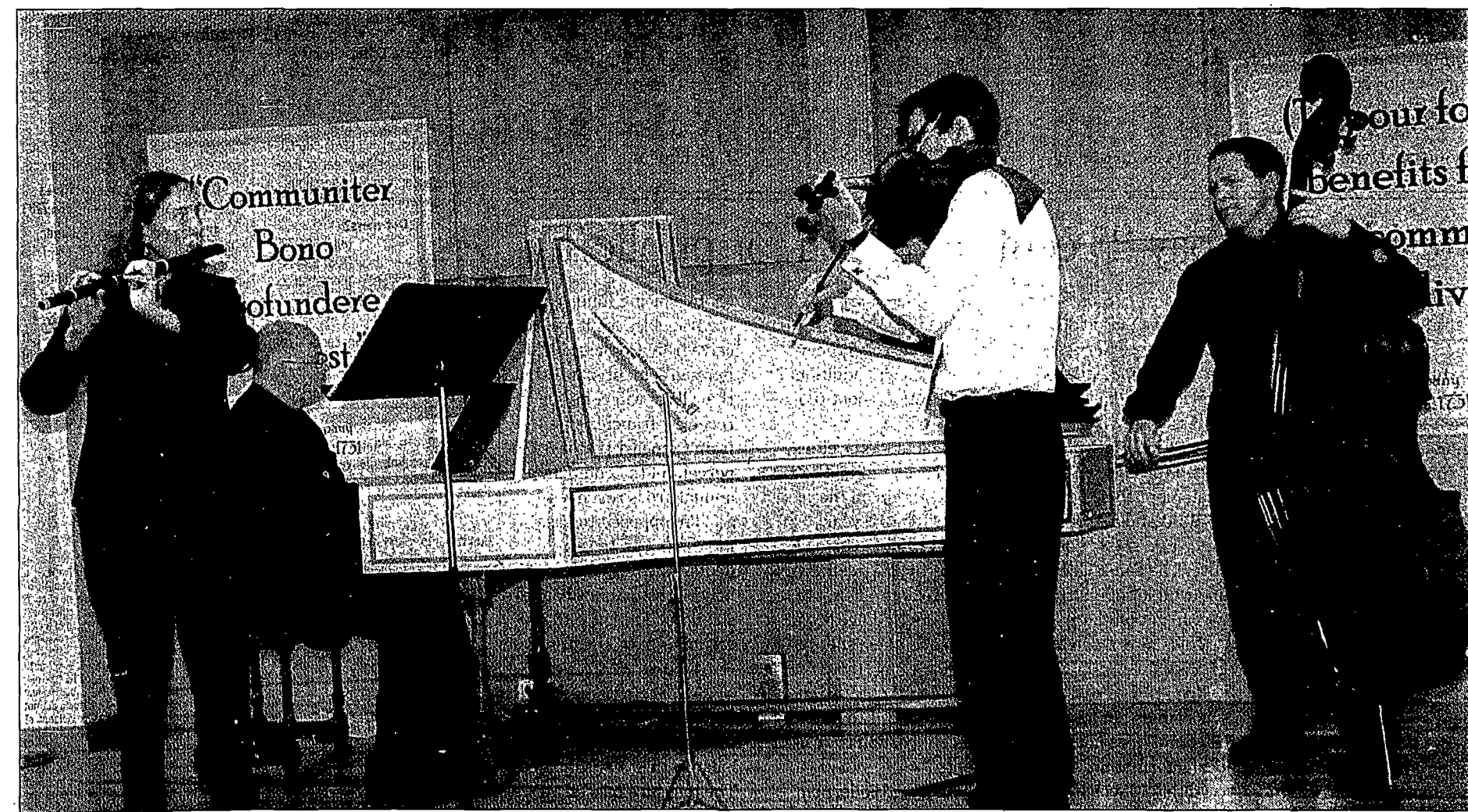

Democrats 'win' big in Maine South 'election'

Like those who took advantage of early voting, Maine South High School seniors had an opportunity to cast ballots prior to the Nov. 4 general election — even though theirs was more of the “mock” variety.

The mock election, consisting of races and referendum questions that appeared on actual Park Ridge ballots, took place in all senior social science classes on Thursday, Oct. 30. Students used real voting booths and selected their candidates and referendum positions using Scantron sheets commonly used for multiple choice tests.

The Democrats swept the election, something

that did not come as a complete surprise to social science teacher Warren Scott who said he has found high school students to be, in general, more democratically-minded.

Barack Obama was the winner of the presidential race, receiving 64 percent of the vote, Scott reported.

“We actually have quite a few students who have campaigned for Mr. Obama,” he said, adding that several had plans to campaign in Hammond, Ind. prior to the election, and some were looking to attend the Chicago rally for Obama on election night.

In other races, students overwhelmingly re-elected Dick Durbin to the U.S. Senate and Jan Schakowsky to the 9th

Congressional district. More locally, incumbent State Senator Dan Kotowski of the 33rd District received 75 percent of the vote to opponent Mike Sweeney's 20 percent. In the highly contested 66th Representative District race, students overwhelmingly elected newcomer Aurora Abella-Austriaco over 16-year incumbent Rosemary Mulligan.

Kotowski, Sweeney, Austriaco and Mulligan all spoke to the seniors prior to the election, Scott said.

On the referendum issues, 54 percent of seniors voted against the state conducting a Constitutional Convention. Sixty-two percent voted in support of a state provision that would allow state officials to be recalled from office. When asked if Park

Ridge should adopt a system of staggered terms for its aldermen, 50 percent of students said “yes,” 38 percent said “no” and the remainder did not vote on this question.

Scott said 95 percent of Maine South seniors participated in the mock election and were educated about many of the issues inside their classrooms.

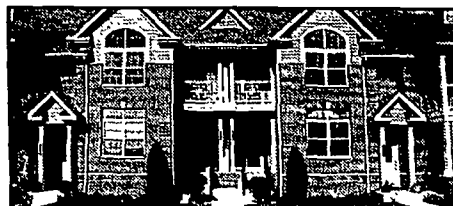
In actual elections, Maine South students have been particularly active, Warren added, with 48 students signed up as election judges on Nov. 4. During the primary election, Maine South had the most students serving as election judges than any other high school in Cook County, Scott said.

“We’re really trying to push that involvement,” he said.

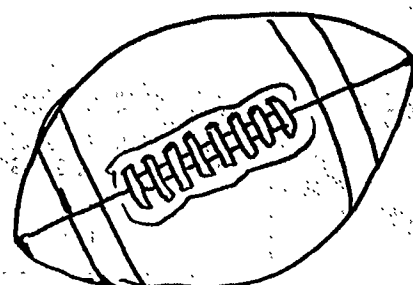

Too young to vote, not to have a voice

Maine West students favor Obama in largest-ever online mock election

By now, America knows who the next president will be (hopefully).

But it is still interesting to note that many youths at Maine West High School participated in the largest online student mock election in American history last week and wanted their voices heard — even though most were too young to vote.

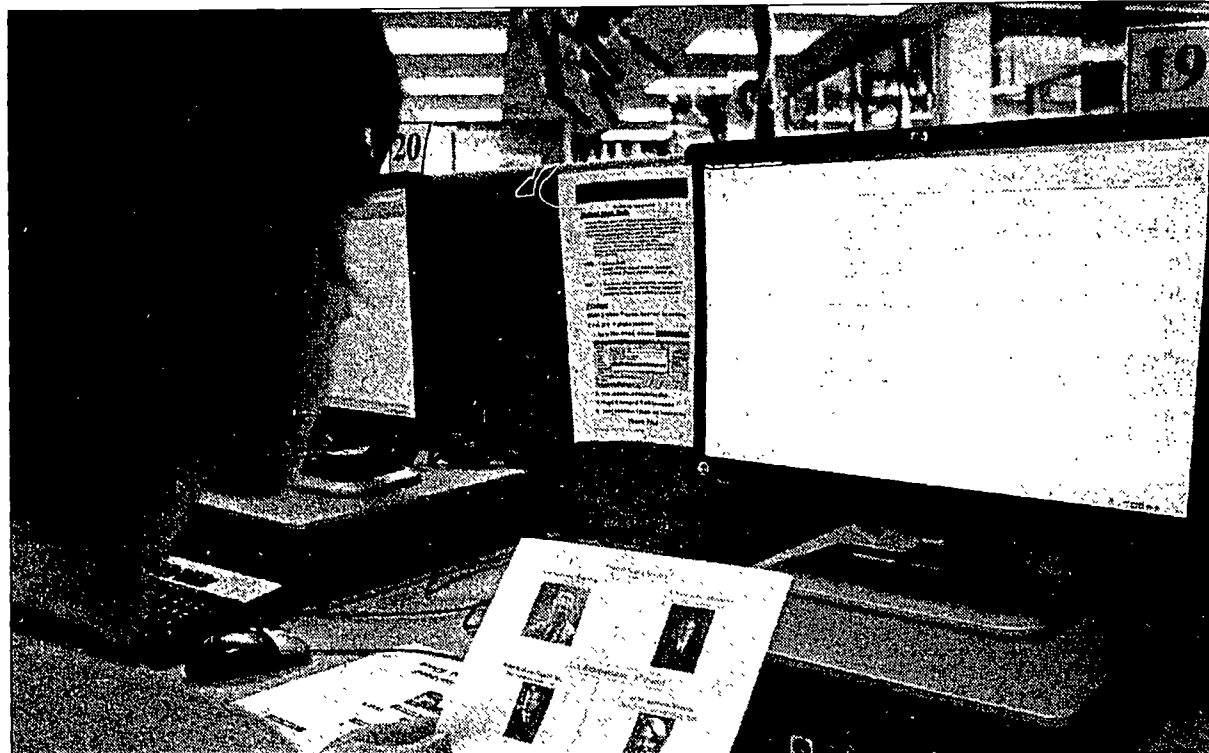
Of the 1,771 students who voted at Maine West, Barack Obama came out far ahead by receiving 80 percent, while John McCain received only 18 percent. Independent Party candidate Ralph Nader picked up 1.8 percent and

various write-in candidates accounted for rest.

"We've done mock elections in the past in almost every presidential election but I'd say this is the largest-scale mock election we've ever done, and the first electronic voting we've ever done," said Maine West Social Science Department Chair Susan Gahagan Mueller.

Maine West began the mock-election process by signing up to be part of the Youth Leadership Initiative, the nation's largest student mock election. The group mock election was organized by of the University of Virginia Center for Politics.

Maine high schools' mock elections support Democrats

Maine Township High School District 207 students made Barack Obama a landslide winner in mock elections conducted at Maine East, South and West high schools.

At Maine East, Social Science Department teachers and editors of the student newspaper, *The Pioneer*, worked together to give all students a chance to vote. Ballots were handed out on Oct. 23 and 24 and collected Oct. 27 to 29. Obama re-

ceived 743 votes, or 73 percent, for president. John McCain received 11 percent, or 115 votes, with other choices drawing 16 percent.

At Maine South, only seniors cast ballots in their social science classes. They supported Obama and his running mate, Joe Biden, to McCain and his running mate, Sarah Palin, by 306 to 128, or 64 percent to 27 percent of all votes cast.

Among Maine South seniors, U.S. Sen. Dick

Durbin outpolled his opponent, Steve Sauerberg, with 66 percent of the vote, compared to Sauerberg's 17 percent. In other races, South gave 9th District U.S. Rep. Jan Schakowsky, the incumbent Democrat, 63 percent of their votes; her opponents, Republican Michael Younan and Green Party candidate Morris Shanfield, received a combined 33 percent. State Sen. Dan Kotowski, D-33rd, outpolled his Republican opponent

Mike Sweeney, 76 percent to 20 percent. State Rep. Rosemary Mulligan, R-65th, earned 39 percent of the votes, behind Democratic challenger Aurora Austriaco, who received 57 percent.

South seniors also voted on three ballot questions. They opposed a state constitutional convention by 54 percent to 44 percent; favored establishing a recall process for elected officials by 62 to 34 percent — a Cook County advi-

sory question — and favored staggered terms for Park Ridge aldermen by 50 percent to 38 percent.

Maine West students gave Obama and Biden 80 percent of their votes. They cast 74 percent of their ballots for Durbin in the U.S. Senate race; 67 percent for Jill Morganthaler in the 6th District U.S. House race against incumbent Republican Peter Roskam; 75 percent for Kotowski in the 33rd District state Senate

race; and 65 percent for Austriaco in the 65th District state House contest.

Asked to identify the issue most important to them, a plurality of 49 percent chose the economy.

Nearly all of Maine West's 2,364 students cast online ballots during 91 sections of social science classes. West's social science faculty and the school's student chapter of Mikva Challenge Youth in Action organized the election.

Mock voting took place electronically at schools across the nation and the tallies were fed into the

YLI Web site. Obama also won on the national level with 60 percent of the YLI's 3 million votes, compared with McCain's 36 percent.

"We brought 91 classes down to vote in three different computer labs,"

said Maine West social-studies teacher Gwynne Ryan. "We did it because we wanted to get kids excited about voting."

Ryan said the school's social-science faculty and student chapter of the Mikva Challenge Youth in

Action group spent many hours preparing for the vote and organizing the event.

Maine West student Juan Salgado, 17, is a member of the Mikva Challenge Group, named after Abner Mikva, a re-

tired federal judge.

"Based on what my peers have been saying, I believe Obama will win," Salgado said before the election.

Salgado said he wished he could cast an actual vote in the presidential

election, but did not feel being too young to do so robbed him of his right to be politically active.

"I still have voice," he said. "And I can encourage other people to vote."

Village to use \$120K grant for energy-efficient lighting

The Niles Village Board met Oct. 23 and approved a request for proposals to provide sustainable-lighting services that will redesign the existing lighting at two fire houses to use less electricity.

The village recently received a \$120,000 grant from the Clean Energy Community Foundation, an independent foundation affiliated with ComEd, under the 2008 Public Safety Buildings Lighting Upgrade Grant Program, that will pay for the project.

The grant will fund new lighting at Fire Station 2, which located near the intersection Dempster Street and Cumberland Avenue, and Fire Station 3, located at 6611 Jarvis Ave.

A new LED-based lighting system, not yet widely adopted in Illinois,

will reduce overall electricity demand at both stations by 283.14 kilowatts.

The village will also use the grant to inform and educate the public about the benefits of energy-efficient lighting upgrades.

In other board business, the village adopted federal "red flag rules," which requires municipalities with utility services to prevent the misappropriation of consumer information by implementing written identity-theft policies by Nov. 1.

The board also allotted \$207,124 to buy a new ambulance for the Public Services Department to replace a 1996 model, and waived a \$2,500 demolition fee for St. Haralambos Greek Orthodox Church, which wants to demolish a house on its property so that it can build a new community center and expand its parking lot.

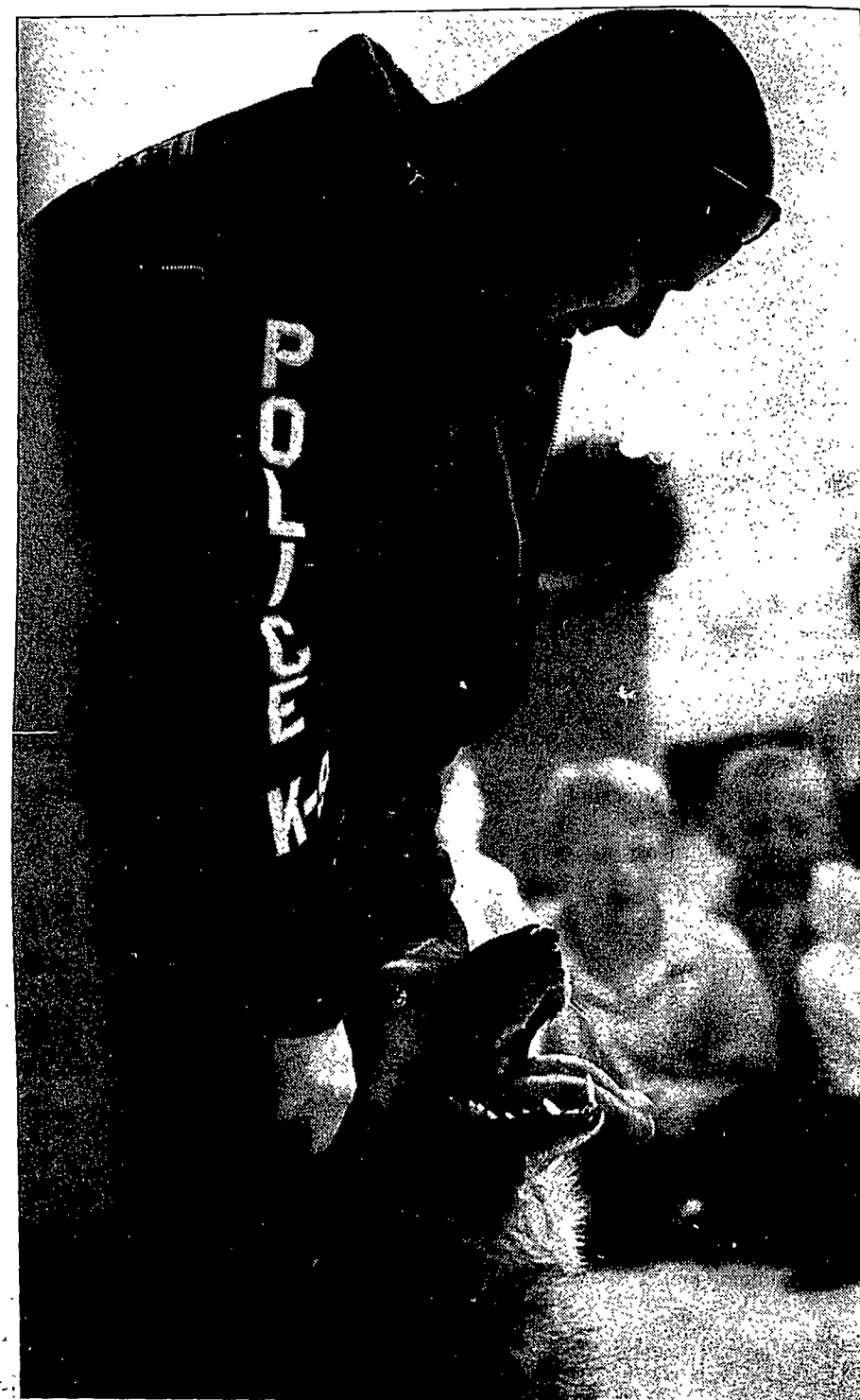

Dist. 64 scores well on ISAT

Park Ridge-Niles School District 64 officials say their students continue to perform well on the Illinois Standards Achievement Test, which determines student progress in relation to the federal No Child Left Behind Act.

Results of the 2008 ISAT, taken by third-through eighth-graders in March, were shared with members of the Board of Education on Oct. 27. Results show that District 64 as a whole made annual yearly progress, as 92 percent of students met or exceeded state standards in reading and 94 percent met or exceeded standards in math, the two subjects NCLB looks at most closely. This year's NCLB benchmark required at

least 62.5 percent of students to make AYP in these subjects.

Collectively, students with disabilities met AYP with 66.4 percent meeting or exceeding standards in reading and 72.3 percent meeting or exceeding standards in math. However, the sub-group of students with disabilities at Field School scored below the AYP benchmark in reading, which resulted in that school as a whole not achieving AYP.

Field ISAT results show that 40.4 percent of students with disabilities met or exceeded standards in reading. Just over 55 percent met or exceeded standards in math, but a 14 percent flexibility provision allowed the school to meet AYP in math.

Diane Betts, assistant superintendent for District 64, said extra sup-

port is provided for students who are struggling, and a review of the district's reading curriculum is currently taking place.

School district officials across have long expressed concerns about NCLB requiring students with learning difficulties to meet the same standards as other students.

Board member John Heyde said the district needs to come up with a "strategy" for how to proceed if schools or sub-groups do not make AYP. He also said he would like to know "sooner than later" if there are grade levels or sub-groups in danger of falling below the ever-increasing AYP benchmarks.

"I think it would be helpful to have a school by school look as to where we might fall off the AYP wagon," Heyde said.

Open house to cover free transit service for disabled riders

Individuals currently living with disabilities soon will be eligible to ride trains and fixed route buses on Pace, Metra, and CTA for free. For Pace riders that means free rides on more than 220 fixed routes throughout the suburbs and Chicago.

Pace, ARC of Illinois and the Illinois Department on Aging is encouraging riders of ADA Paratransit to take advantage of a new law by hosting a series of open houses throughout the service area to promote the benefits and help riders become familiar with fixed route service.

The local information open house will be held from 4 to 7 p.m. Nov. 6 by Community Alternatives Unlimited at 8765 W. Higgins, Chicago, not far from the CTA Cumberland station.

"We are committed to helping our customers make a smooth transition to fixed route services so they can fully benefit from the reliability and flexibility of this service," says Richard Kwaseski, chairman of the board for Pace.

Pace staff will guide riders through the application process. All Pace buses are wheelchair accessible and are equipped with securement devices and priority seating for people with mobility disabilities. To improve access for persons with visual disabilities, stops are announced, and for persons with hearing disabilities, route instructions have large print and Braille signs are posted.

Ray Campbell is visually impaired and says Pace fixed route service is convenient and straightforward. "I like using fixed route service because it allows for

spontaneity. It's easy to use and it gives me more options," says Ray Campbell.

Fixed route service allows customers to live a more spontaneous life because, unlike ADA Paratransit service, there is no need to schedule rides a day in advance.

"While fixed route services may not meet the needs of some individuals with disabilities it is certainly a viable option for many," says Tony Paulauski, Executive Director, of The Arc of Illinois. "This is a major victory for our community and we look forward to assisting all of the people who can comfortably use the service into an improved lifestyle."

To qualify for the free rides, individuals must become certified in the Circuit Breaker with Disabilities Program which is administered by the Illinois Department of Aging (IDA). Eligibility requirements include earning an annual income not to exceed: \$22,218 for a household of one; \$29,480 for a household of two; \$36,740 for a household of three.

Once applicants have received the appropriate certification from IDA and have filled out a short application form from the Regional Transportation Authority, riders will receive a Circuit Permit in three to four weeks allowing them to ride Pace fixed route buses, Metra trains and CTA trains and fixed route buses for free. The free rides program is the result of legislation that was signed into law by Governor Blagojevich on Aug. 26.

Thank veterans for their contributions

If you're old enough, you may remember the day an announcement came that war was over.

A few still living remember the announcement of the Armistice on Nov. 11, 1918, when Germany signed an agreement to stop the war it was waging with Britain, France, the United States and their other allied forces. It took effect at 11 a.m. — the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month — and was considered at the time to have ended the War to End All Wars. That hope was fleeting.

Armistice Day would be converted later into the more lasting Veterans Day. World War I's veterans — now only a handful left — were followed by those from World War II, Korea, Vietnam, Grenada, Desert Storm, Iraq and Afghanistan. And as each new generation adds their military service to their country, there continues to be a need to recognize not only the service but the patriotic spirit and dedication which backed up the time in uniform.

Recognition does not always come swiftly. The long Vietnam conflict took years to be classified as a war. It split the country politically, spawned protests at home, and left many returning veterans questioning the mixed reactions they received.

Healing came later, with the construction of the Vietnam Memorial in Washington, D.C., and its touring replicas which brought images to cities and small towns around the country. At every stop, friends and family leave remembrances — notes or flowers or memorabilia they wish they could show their loved ones. A museum is now being constructed to house all those treasures to the men and women whose lives were cut short, who never had a chance to become veterans.

The men and women serving in World War II had to wait even longer for their own national memorial. It is only five years since the National World War II memorial was dedicated — honoring 16 million who served and more than 400,000 who died in the war, along with those supporting the war effort at home. These days, veterans of World War II, once the bulwark of local veterans' associations, are dying too.

On Nov. 11, in many communities, veterans will be gathering — at local monuments or memorial walls or community flagpoles — usually at 10:30 a.m. so they will all be gathered for that 11th hour on the 11th day ... in solemn remembrance. They remember their comrades — the ones who came home and the ones who could not — and the long, hard hours and days and weeks of battle and the things they gave up or set aside to fight for freedom.

If you can, join the local vets at their ceremonies, ask about their service and recognize their efforts to keep our country free.

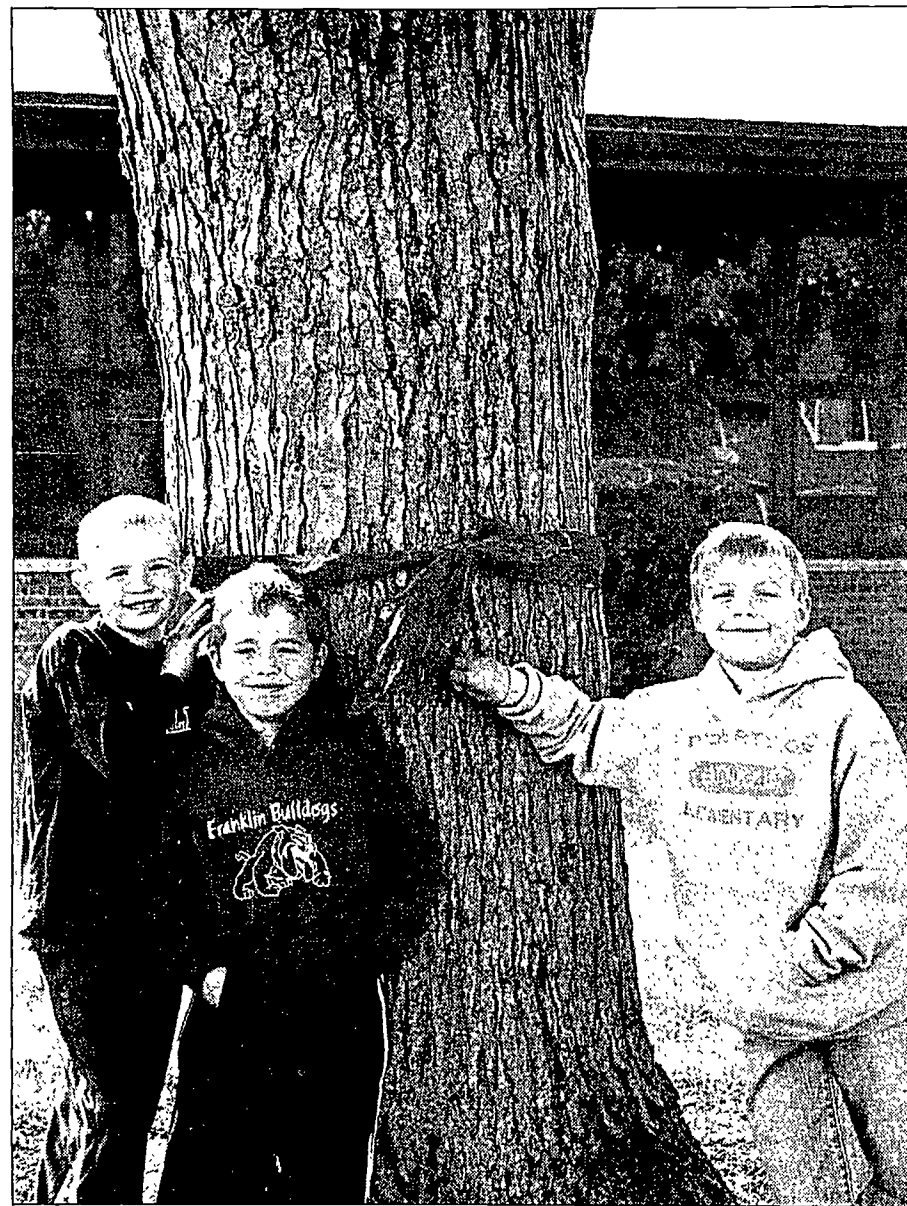
As they do every year, students at each school in the district tied red ribbons around trees on their campuses to promote drug-free lifestyles.

BOY IN THE STRIPED PAJAMAS
The son of a Nazi officer forges a forbidden friendship with a Jewish boy in a concentration camp. (93 min.) Rated PG-13 for some mature thematic material involving the Holocaust.

A couple of slackers (Paul Rudd, Seann William Scott) agree to participate in a youth-mentoring program to avoid going to jail. David Wain ("Wet, Hot American Summer") directed the comedy. (99 min.) Rated R.

SYNECDOCHE, NY
A theater director whose life is crumbling (Philip Seymour Hoffman) builds a replica of New York inside a warehouse to dramatize his personal struggles. Screenwriter Charlie Kaufman ("Eternal Sunshine of the Spotless Mind") makes his directorial debut. (124 min.) Rated R for language and some sexual content/nudity.

STILL PLAYING

APPALOOSA
★★★ 1/2
We're back to good guys vs. bad guys in this very traditional Western and it works quite nicely. Appaloosa is the name of the town that has sent out a distress call to marshal-for-hire Virgil Cole (Ed Harris) and his long-time deputy Everett Hitch (Viggo Mortensen), because evil rancher Randall Bragg (Jeremy Irons) and his thugs have been making life intolerable. At first it seems that "Appaloosa" might be gearing up to deliver the standard revisionist-Western line that there's not much difference between the mercenary Cole and Bragg, but it soon becomes apparent that he and Hitch are old-school heroes at heart. They smile at children, treat women with respect and always give fair warning before the slaughtering begins. As director and star, Harris (who also made the excellent "Pollock" 8 years ago) demonstrates a deep understanding of what makes an old-school horse-opera satisfying. When a character rides off into the sunset in "Appaloosa" it feels just right. (B) (114 min.) Rated R for some

violence and language.
BEVERLY HILLS CHIHUAHUA
A pampered pooch (voice of Drew Barrymore) gets lost in Mexico. Raja Gosnell ("Scooby-Doo") directed the comedy featuring the voices of Andy Garcia, Placido Domingo, George Lopez, Cheech Marin and Paul Rodriguez. (91 min.) Rated PG for some mild thematic elements.

BODY OF LIES
A CIA field agent (Leonardo DiCaprio) in the Middle East clashes with his armchair-warrior boss (Russell Crowe). Ridley Scott ("Kingdom of Heaven") directed the espionage thriller. Rated R for strong violence including some torture and for language throughout.

CHANGELING
★★ 1/2
As you might expect, this somber drama about a mother's quest for her missing child has been handsomely mounted by Clint Eastwood, Ron Howard and company and it features an impressive emotional workout from Angelina Jolie. It's a bit too coolly detached to be completely involving, though, with supporting characters that border dangerously on caricature (Righteously Indignant Crusading Preacher, Evil Psycho Ward Doctor, Twitchy Serial Killer) and it doesn't have the luxury of providing a satisfying resolution to its central mystery. The tailor-made-for-the-movies true story revolves around the disappearance in 1928 of nine-year-old Walter Collins and the media circus that develops when the corrupt Los Angeles police department return the wrong boy to his mother (Jolie) and then attempt to force her to accept him to save themselves embarrassment - even resorting to throwing her into a nightmarish psycho ward when she protests to reporters. Eastwood balances this with a parallel story about an ax murderer who has been kidnapping little boys and hacking them up on his isolated ranch and he manages to achieve some particularly disturbing moments that are guaranteed to have parents staring sleepless at the ceiling for many nights to come. Unfortunately, the elements of horror in "Changeling" are symptomatic of a general willingness to resort to melodrama (a few of the more lurid touches in the mental ward could have been taken from the 1948 shocker "The Snake Pit") that calls the entire film into question. (B) (140 min.) Rated R for some violent and disturbing content, and language.

PRIDE AND GLORY
★★ 1/2
You've seen it all before, but you've probably never seen all the elements of the good cop/bad cop,

loyal-to-the-force or loyal-to-the-law morality tale mixed together to more agonizing effect than they are in "Pride and Glory." Edward Norton is effectively tormented Ray as an ace NYPD detective whose investigation into the slaughter of four cops in a drug-bust gone wrong turns up evidence that dirty cops might be involved - possibly including his brother (Noah Emmerich) and brother-in-law (Colin Farrell). And Ray knows from bitter experience that his career-cop dad (Jon Voight) puts the force and family above the letter of the law. (B) (125 min.) Rated R for strong violence, pervasive language and brief drug content.

RACHEL GETTING MARRIED
★★★★
Hardcore bad-news girl Kym (Anne Hathaway, achieving the antithesis of her role in "The Princess Diaries") is released from rehab just long enough to throw her sister's wedding into an uproar in this involving (and sometimes exceedingly painful) drama about a family coping with a terrible trauma from its past. Working from a debut screenplay by actress Jenny Lumet (daughter of director Sidney Lumet), which emphasizes naturalism over button-pushing plot manipulation, director Jonathan Demme ("Silence of the Lambs," "Philadelphia") does his best to make us feel that we're not so much watching this story as we are participating in it. And that's not always a comfortable feeling. Demme emphasized spontaneity from his large ensemble cast, shooting without rehearsals with roving hand-held cameras and the results are fresh, surprising and unfailingly intimate. It will be quite a surprise if Hathaway doesn't receive an Oscar nomination for her complex, multi-layered performance. (B) (114 min.) Rated R for language and brief sexuality.

ROCKNROLLA
★★ 1/2
If you've seen writer/director Guy Ritchie's "Lock, Stock and Two Smoking Barrels" and "Snatch," there's really no reason to check out "Rocknrolla," unless you're in the mood for more of the same - only less so. After unsuccessfully taking his ultra-stylized, ultra-violent, incongruously humorous gangster movie formula more seriously with last year's "Revolver," Ritchie returns his emphasis to entertainment this time around. And he delivers, intermittently, though the freshness and excitement are long gone. The setting, as usual, is London's underworld, where an assortment of blasé tough guys (for Ritchie, coolness is all) are trying to make an honest living by stealing from each other. You've got an old-school London mob boss named Lenny (Tom Wilkinson, almost unrecognizable), an imperturbable Russian crime czar (Karel Roden), a couple of

genial armed robbers named One Two and Mumbles (Gerard Butler of "300" and Idris Elba), the Russian billionaire's sexy accountant (Thandie Newton), a junkie rock star named Johnny Quid who's faking, his death to boost record sales (Toby Kebbell) and a handful of quirky supporting characters (including Jeremy Piven and Ludicris as hustling music promoters and a couple of unkillable and Russian hitmen) to keep things lively as needed. The general idea is to keep all these characters chasing after each other, all the while commenting wryly on life in general, with enough flashy camera work and tricky editing to keep things visually interesting and just enough outrageous violence (such as Lenny's proclivity for crawfish torture) to remind us we're watching a gangster movie. Ritchie makes it work reasonably well one more time, but it seems even he might be getting a little weary of the formula. (B) (114 min.) Rated R for pervasive language, violence, drug use and brief sexuality.

ZACK AND MIRI MAKE A PORN
★★★
The raunch is wall-to-wall in "Zack and Miri Make a Porno," but it's really a sweet romantic comedy at heart. As sweet as you can get with former porn star Traci Lords playing a character called Bubbles - and graphically demonstrating how she got the nickname with a bottle of bubble liquid and... You don't want to know. Well, maybe you do, but I can't tell you about it here. Gen-X hero Kevin Smith, who has demonstrated a flair for transgression since his 1994 indie debut "Clerks" was slapped with an NC-17 rating for language alone, wrote and directed this surprisingly upbeat and good-hearted story of a couple of lifelong friends (Seth Rogen and Elizabeth Banks) who decide to produce and star in their own porn movies to restore their squandered finances. What they won't know, until their first sex scene, is that they're in love with each other - a revelation that complicates the scenario in not-especially interesting ways. The stuff that really resonates for Smith and his excellent cast is the outrageously tawdry comedy that arises from the premise of a crew of gung-ho amateurs going the full monty and much, much more. More evidence that the end of civilization is near, perhaps, but at least there's laughter involved. (B) (101 min.) Rated R for strong crude sexual content including dialogue, graphic nudity and pervasive language.

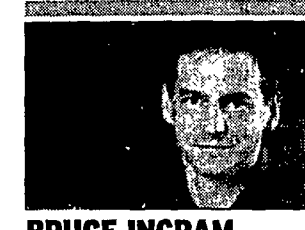

Predictable: That's how we 'Role'

Role Models ★★ 1/2

Considering the somewhat-edgy comic talent involved in "Role Models," it's surprising and a little disappointing that the plot about a couple of man-children who finally grow up when they have to care for a couple of actual kids turns out to be so thoroughly formulaic. Fortunately, the writers and performers put just enough mildly transgressive spin on the material to make it intermittently amusing and the formula itself provides a modest feel-good payoff. That's an uneasy combination,

though, and it doesn't provide complete satisfaction on either count.

The simplest way to explain what's going on with "Role Models" may be that it's an attempt to make something more-or-less mainstream by co-writer/director David Wain. Wain has a solid reputation among cult-comedy aficionados as one of the founding members of the early-'90s MTV sketch comedy series "The State" and he's previously co-written and directed the parody of summer-camp comedies "Wet, Hot American Summer" and "The Ten," riffing in a very uneven way on the 10 commandments. Neither found the sort of breakthrough audience Wain needs and this one's not likely to either. Though it might have, if someone like Adam Sandler or Bill Murray or anyone else with a track record for this sort of out-

wardly snarky, inwardly sentimental comedy (and a pre-sold fan base) had taken the assignment.

Not that there's anything wrong with either Seann William Scott or Paul Rudd, though their fans will probably be surprised to see them going a bit gooey. They play good-natured babe-crazy party-animal Wheeler (Mr. Scott of "American Pie") and repressed-grouch Danny (Mr. Rudd, a member of the Judd Apatow stock company, also featured in Wain's previous films). Wheeler and Danny spend their days driving around in a monster truck customized to look like a demented bull, delivering just-say-no lectures to kids in school auditoriums and selling a legal-high energy drink called Minotaur ("It's not poison; it's got juice in it"). By the end of a long day of swilling Minotaur, they're typically wound up pretty tight.

And by the end of one particularly bad day, during which Danny gets dumped by his longtime girlfriend Beth (Elizabeth Banks in a thankless role), they get involved in a fracas that means 30 days jail time. Unless they agree to do 150 hours community service at a Big Brothers-type mentorship agency called Sturdy Wings.

Most of the laughs arise from them being assigned weird kids nobody else can cope with: Foul-mouthed Ronnie (Bobb'e J.

Thompson), who immediately accuses Wheeler of trying to molest him, and painfully shy Augie (Christopher Mintz-Plassé of "Superbad"), a cape-wearing super-nerd obsessed with a medieval fantasy role-playing game. Though there's also some freaky stuff being dished out by the reformed junkie Sturdy Wings founder (Jane Lynch), who loves to do disturbing things with bagel dogs.

It doesn't take long, though, for the big boys to bond with the little boys

(Wheeler and Ronnie share a reverential appreciation for women's breasts) and for the story to slip into paint-by-numbers mode. But there are a few inspired little touches that could make it worth a look if you're in a forgiving mood — like Augie's lament that he looks like a young Marvin Hamlish.

of Franklin Park, who plays Anna. When Anna first meets the king, "She doesn't like him very much because he's not following through on promises made to her," Hays said. But later, "They really form a strong friendship. He is impressed by her. She doesn't back down from him and he's never had that before. She sees all the good he is trying to do. He just doesn't know how to go about it."

Kelley indicated that a challenge of the role is letting the king's softer side emerge so he won't come across as an ogre.

The relationship between the King and Anna is always fascinating to watch, but it is the memorable Rodgers and Hammerstein score which makes "The King and I" a perennial favorite. It's includes such numbers as "Getting to Know You" and "Shall We Dance."

Both actors are enjoying working with the many young people in the cast.

"They're interested in learning how to act and how to create a character," said Kelley, a technical trainer by day who enjoys helping the children.

"The kids are so great!" exclaimed Hays, a corporate trainer who has worked with Rising Stars for a decade. She admitted, "I broke my golden rule" about not acting with children.

Honda's 2009 Pilot delivers decent mileage

There are few occasions when I actually look forward to a large SUV landing in my parking space for the week. Luckily, the week I had the 2009 Honda Pilot was one of those rare occasions: Chicago Marathon week.

My family was visiting — with all of their large luggage — and it was nice to be able to cart everything and their stuff in a single vehicle.

The Pilot is another all-new vehicle from Honda for 2009, and it is 2.9 inches longer, 1 inch wider and 1 inch taller than the previous model. Total cargo volume behind the first row is 87 cubic-feet, which is down 0.6 cubic-feet from 2008, but there are cargo volume gains behind the second and third rows with measurements ringing in at 47.7 and 20.8 cubic-feet respectively.

The 2009 Pilot is a large vehicle: It felt large, and it drove large too. I'm not a fan of giant SUVs, and even though it was nice to have some

extra passenger space during the test period, I would have preferred something of the crossover variety that provides similar space and cargo volume but doesn't create such a huge foot print.

It took me a couple days to get used to the sheer size of the Pilot, and initially I was timid about changing lanes in highway traffic. I was constantly watching the large side mirrors to see if I had enough space, and more often than not I felt like it was more of a guess than a certainty. I found it difficult to maneuver through parking garages and my small condo parking lot.

The test vehicle really could have used the optional running boards (\$619 to \$784) or side steps (\$445 to \$663) because getting into the Pilot was a bit of a challenge for those who are petite, older or had just run a marathon.

In addition to the big step-in height, there are other reasons this car isn't quite right for someone who's petite in stature. I was able to adjust the seat and steering wheel to get good visibility out of the front and side windows, but comfort went completely out the door. Because of my far-forward, height-adjusted position, I sat too close to the underbelly of the dash. I found that my legs were virtually pinned between the seat and the dash, with little room to move my right leg from gas pedal to brake. Coincidentally, this is

also a problem I noticed in the smaller Honda CR-V.

Another size-related issue I had was with the steering wheel. It was incredibly meaty, which made it hard for me to keep a comfortable grip on the wheel during turns and tight maneuvers.

The test vehicle, with a base price of \$40,630, was a top-of-the-line four-wheel-drive Touring model with a DVD rear entertainment system. Because it came equipped with navigation, leather seats, heated front seats, XM satellite radio, a 115-volt power outlet, Bluetooth connectivity, an auxiliary input jack and most of the other luxury items you could want in a nonluxury SUV, there weren't any options added to the test vehicle. Surprisingly, there are a plethora of small accessories that can be added — like running boards, kayak attachments or a towing kit — to customize the vehicle to your tastes and lifestyle.

The Pilot starts as a LX two-wheel-drive model with a base price of \$28,230 and travels upward in both 2WD and 4WD variations of the LX, EX, EX-L and Touring models.

The Pilot was introduced in 2003 and got a styling refresh in 2006, but 2009 introduces the second generation of the eight-passenger SUV. Along with a complete redesign, the Pilot adds several completely new features. Some are necessary evolutions like the standard tilt/telescoping steering wheel, auxiliary input jack and center stack mounted shifter. Others, like the hill start assist, tailgate with lift-up glass hatch and humidity control as a part of the standard air conditioning, are items you wouldn't necessarily expect on a Honda.

One my favorite all-new features, however, is Honda's variable cylinder management. This enables the 3.5-liter V-6 engine to use all cylinders when power is needed, but it operates on three or four cylinders when decelerating or traveling at a constant speed — like when you engage cruise control while traveling at 65 mph on the highway.

What this means is that Honda can add 6

horsepower and 13 pound-feet of torque to the new Pilot, yet the fuel economy ratings increase at least 1 mpg in both city and highway driving. The 2WD model has city/highway fuel estimates of 17/23 mpg, and the 4WD model rings in at 16/22 mpg. Considering that the Pilot is a 4,590-pounder that seats eight, those fuel estimates are actually encouraging. During the test week, I averaged around 18 mpg in the 4WD model during combined driving.

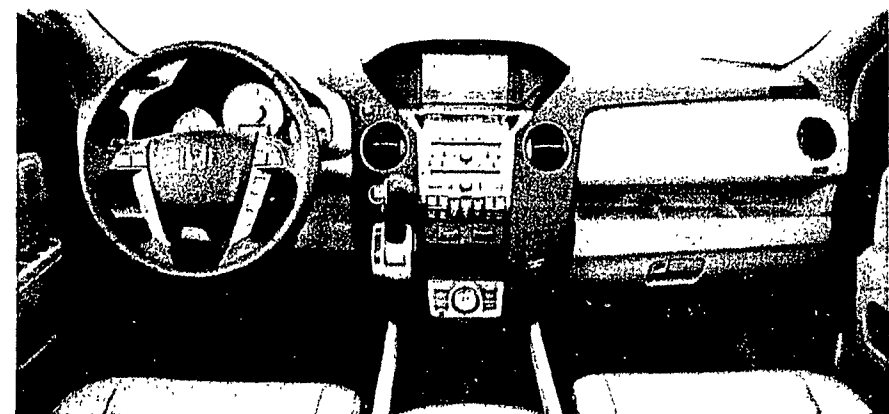
I thought the 250 horsepower and 244 pound-feet of torque being delivered by the V-6 engine was fine for a vehicle of this size. It didn't feel sluggish, but there wasn't the smooth, seamless power that I've experienced in other large SUVs equipped with a V-8.

Overall, the Pilot is not my kind of vehicle. But if you're in the market for a large SUV, the variable cylinder system alone is a reason to consider this as an option. Another reason is the base price less than \$30,000.

Sales near 85 percent mark at park-like senior haven at Belle Plaine Commons

Seniors searching for an affordable condominium in a park-like setting are invited to tour Belle Plaine Commons at 2335 W. Belle Plaine Avenue near Irving Park and Western avenues in the North Center neighborhood.

A groundbreaking ceremony was held recently for a park on the campus that houses several senior living facilities, including Belle Plaine Commons, a five-story, 92-unit new-construction condominium development.

Sales are nearing the 85-percent mark at Belle Plaine Commons, which anchors the north side of the five-acre North Center Senior Campus, bounded by Irving Park Road, Western Avenue, Belle Plaine Avenue and Oakley Avenue.

"There is still a wide selection of one-bedroom, one-bedroom-plus-den and two-bedroom residences available at Belle Plaine Commons," said Judy Westerberg, sales manager for Garrison Partners Consulting, the exclusive sales and marketing agent for North Center Associates, the developer. "But at these prices, this is a rare opportunity that won't last."

Prices at Belle Plaine Commons range from \$194,990 to \$212,990 for one-bedroom condominiums with 848 to 900 square feet of living space; \$204,990 to \$249,990 for one-bedroom plus den condominiums with 944 to 1,011 square feet of living space; and \$245,990 to \$298,990 for two-bedroom condominiums with 1,134 to 1,288 square feet of living space.

All prices include one outdoor parking space. Heated garage parking is available for an additional \$15,900.

Current average prices for one-bedroom condominiums elsewhere in the North Center neighborhood are about \$237,000, and two-bedroom condominiums go for about \$392,000, making Belle Plaine Commons a rare and attractive choice for discerning adults.

City officials, members of the North Center neighborhood (including senior renters and condo owners from the senior campus and surrounding neighborhoods), recently attended a groundbreaking ceremony for a new half-acre park, which is planned for completion this fall, Westerberg said.

The parcel of land is the second and largest of two parks on the block-long senior housing campus that encompasses Belle Plaine Commons, the 104-unit Martha Washington rental apartments, and the 86-unit St. Vincent DePaul Residence. The new park is at the hub of the three senior housing buildings, while the first and smaller park is nearing completion at Oakley and Belle Plaine, Westerberg said.

Workers have now begun efforts to transform the larger park from soft mounds of dirt into a floral den of sorts replete with flowers and foliage, benches, Romanesque colonnades and a fountain.

"Each park will have a fountain that is being imported from England, no less," Westerberg said.

"We wanted to create a model that really did not exist anywhere in America," Ald. Schuller said, addressing the small crowd that gathered for the park's ground breaking, which included a delegation of city officials and others who wielded golden shovels to "break" ground for the park's construction start.

Others on hand for the event Father Robert Beaven, St. Benedict Parish; Ralph Brown, president, Technical Assistance for Corporate Housing (TACH) Development; Nelson Cheung and Dinal Wayne, Department of Planning & Development; Bill Povalla, assistant commissioner for senior housing, Department of Housing; Tom O'Donnell, president, Ravenswood Community Council; Kevin Clark, landscape engineer and project manager, Lakota Group.

Belle Plaine Commons is especially appealing to empty-nester singles and couples who have owned homes, two-flat or three-flat buildings in the neighborhood and have seen a strong rise in property values and real estate taxes.

"With the mayor's support, we were able to open on July 1 our senior satellite facility here that provides the opportunity of living computer usage and a luncheon program Monday through Friday," Ald. Schuller said.

Ralph Brown, president of TACH Development, one of the developers of the senior housing campus, chronicled the effort to bring both the senior housing and the green spaces to fruition. He said developing the parks has been an eight-year process so far, cross-pollinating the efforts of several developers and the city and several funding sources.

The developers of the three senior buildings formed Central Green Corporation, a nonprofit, to develop the parks.

Though privately developed, the parks ultimately will be open to the public upon completion, Brown said.

"When the construction is finished, we're going to turn them over to the city," Brown said. "So these will be city parks."

The Lakota Group designed the parks. "I think it's going to be tranquil," said Kevin Clark, a landscape engineer with The La-

Kota Group. "That's the one word. Hopefully, it'll be a nice respite from the busy street."

The fountain will be the focal point of the central park, Clark said. He described the design as being like "an open lawn with a nice path."

Architectural remnants from the razed building where the larger park will stand will be part of the design, Clark said.

"They salvaged some columns and the pediments that go along the top of them," Clark said. "The four columns are going to be at the corner of Belle Plaine and Oakley as the entrance to the park, from the corner. It's going to be a pretty cool thing. That are going to be the entrance to the parks."

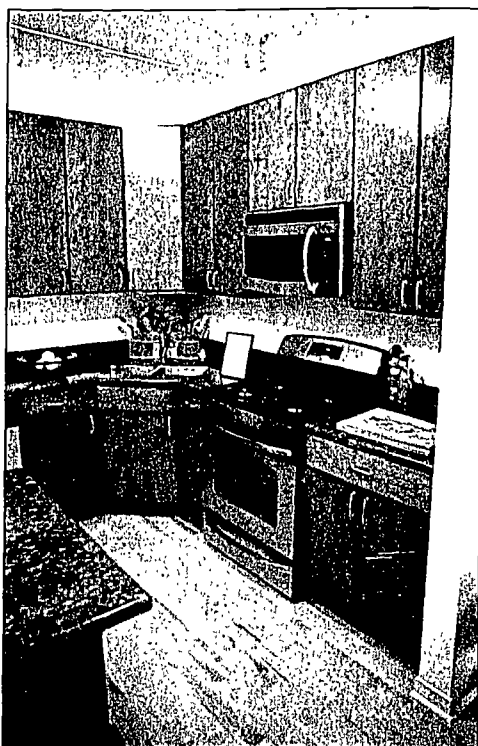
A decorated model is available for viewing at Belle Plaine Commons, said Rena Appel of North Center Associates.

"The majority of the buyers at Belle Plaine Commons are people who have resided in or near the North Center neighborhood for decades and who are looking forward to maintenance-free condominium living," Appel said.

"We also are attracting buyers from the suburbs, other city neighborhoods and people from out of state who are moving back to North Center to be near their grown children who own homes or condominiums in the neighborhood," Appel said.

"It's a condo that is comfortable to live in, yet designed for a buyer who is downsizing from a larger home, townhome or condominium," Westerberg said.

"Many of these long-time neighborhood residents are tired of the financial and physical burdens of maintaining their aging

properties," Appel noted. One member of the household has to be 55 years of age or better, but the other member may be as young as 48 years, he said.

Upscale building amenities include a furnished lobby, community room, fitness center and a library.

The lower level of the building contains the 58, leased parking spaces and individual resident storage lockers. The 43 outdoor parking spaces and 11 guest parking spaces are located in a parking lot contiguous to the building.

Most residences have balconies, Juliet balconies or patios. Kitchens are equipped with G.E. appliances, including refrigerator with icemaker, gas oven and range, dishwasher, disposal, and built-in microwave oven and designer cabinetry.

Most baths include ceramic tile, oversized mirrors, linen closets and designer cabinetry. Residents of Belle Plaine Commons will have access to the Advocate Health Center, also part of the Senior Campus.

Ald. Schuller has long said it was his long-range goal to build a senior campus to enable longtime residents to remain in the community.

"Many seniors who have to move out of their homes for a variety of reasons including financial, health and mobility issues now have the opportunity to remain in their neighborhood," Ald. Schuller said.

"In partnership with Ald. Schuller and the City of Chicago, Advocate Health Care was pleased to be able to donate five acres of land to make affordable housing a reality for senior citi-

zens in the 47th Ward," said Jim Skogsborg, Advocate's president and chief executive officer.

Belle Plaine Commons is located in the heart of the North Center neighborhood, on the northern edge of Lake View and near the upscale housing enclaves of St. Ben's, Ravenswood and Lincoln Square.

New restaurants and shops have made this area one of the fastest growing and most popular in Chicago.

Now may be best home-buying market since World War II

Amid what some experts believe may be the best home-buying market since the end of World War II, Chicago-area house hunters who are bold enough to sign a residential sales contract are beginning to reap hefty financial rewards, often saving tens of thousands of dollars, analysts say.

If you are thinking about purchasing a home or condominium this fall, have down payment cash, job security, a good credit score, and can qualify for a mortgage, "now may be the perfect time to buy," advises Nicholas S. Gouletas, chairman and CEO of American Invivo.

"The current downturn is not a real estate crisis in the United States. It is a financial crisis," noted Gouletas, a condo-conversion specialist who has developed, marketed and managed over 45,000 units in more than 100 buildings in 40 markets nationwide since 1969.

"It's still very much a buyer's market," Gouletas said.

Although it may take "up to three years" for the Chicago-area housing market to fully rebound, Gouletas expects it to come roaring back.

Resale home sales numbers improved in September as people took advantage of the buyers-market conditions with low interest rates, ample supply, and negotiating room on price, according to Illinois Association of Realtors.

The Chicago-area existing home market is down, but far from dead, reported the latest IAR home sales survey for the Chicago area. Single-family

home and condominium sales totaled 6,371 units. While the sales number is 6.2 percent less than the 6,794 home sales in September of 2007, the total is impressive, considering the shape of the economy.

The median home sale price for the Chicago area was \$224,000 in September 2008, down 13 percent from \$257,500 in September 2007, so there are bargains to be had in the Chicago area. The IAR survey includes Cook, DeKalb, DuPage, Grundy, Kane, Kendall, Lake, McHenry and Will counties.

"Some downward pressure on prices is expected as we move through the inventory of homes and some would-be buyers and sellers simply wait out uncertainty in the financial markets and economy," observed Pat Callan, president of the IAR.

Another positive exists for first-time purchasers, who between now and June 30, 2009,

are eligible for a new \$7,500 tax credit and increased loan limits on FHA-insured mortgages.

"The economy has reached proportions that have many analysts suggesting that it is by far the worst since the Second World War," noted Dr. Geoffrey J.D. Hewings, director of the Regional Economics Applications Laboratory (REAL) of the University of Illinois.

"With the passage of the bailout plan and the international collaborative efforts to address the systemic problems of ailing economies, there is some basis for optimism that a turnaround may be possible in 2009," said Hewings.

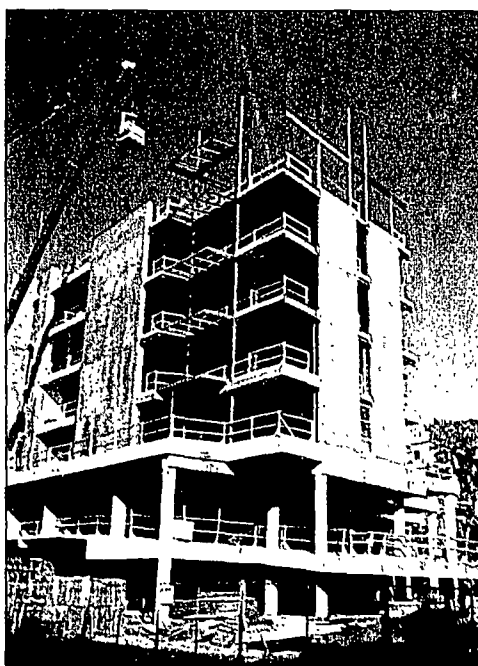

I contacted them, and Mariah from their quality control called me and asked if I could send her the shirts. I never heard back from her, so I contacted them again and she said they were going to send me another shirt and a free shirt for the troubles. I received another T-shirt. I tried contacting Mariah again and she said she would look into it and make sure I get my shirt, but I never heard back.

So I'm out two shirts, and they have the one I sent them and won't even send that back, even if I wanted it.

FOR GOOD HEALTH, PUT HEART IN YOUR COOKING

Too often, people think that developing heart disease dooms them to a life of boring, tasteless food. North Shore cardiologists Dr. Micah Elmer and Dr. Irwin Silverman challenge that notion by teaming up again with Chef Dawn Dlugosz of "A New Dawn Cooking School" which meets in Whole Foods Market, North-

brook, for a heart healthy cooking class in the grocery store's classroom. "Cardiologists are real good at dispensing medications, but when we tell someone to eat better, to eat healthier, no one knows what that means," said Elmer, of Cardiovascular Associates of Glenbrook and Evanston (CAGE). "We thought this would be a really good way to show what we mean." The "Cooking with CAGE: A Healthy Thanks-

Getting fresh

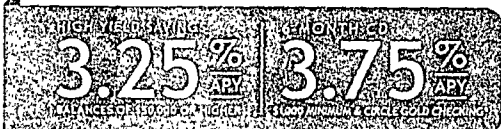

"It's a better idea to use fresh ingredients and whole products instead of food being prepared with a lot of preservatives." Suggestions include using heart-friendly olive oil instead of butter in the potatoes. "Garlic adds the flavor," she said. Sweet potatoes can get healthier, too, enhanced with a light salad vinaigrette instead

4 large sweet potatoes
2 T olive oil
1/8 tsp. kosher salt
Pepper to taste

Honey-Balsamic Vinaigrette
1/4 C balsamic vinegar
1 T Giovanni (soft Cream of Balsamic) (a flavored, thick balsamic reduction.)
1 T honey
1/2 C olive oil
2 tsp. Dijon mustard
1/8 tsp. kosher salt
Pepper to taste



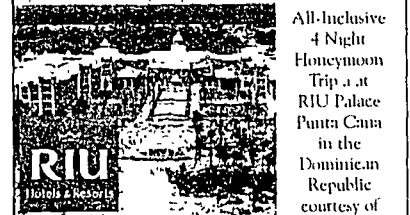

MORTGAGE UPDATE

Mortgage matches highest rate of the year By Holden Lewis • Bankrate.com

The roller-coaster ride continues with mortgage rates. This week, they climbed to the highest level in three months, matching the highest level of the year.

The benchmark 30-year fixed-rate mortgage rose 45 basis points, to 6.77 percent, according to the Bankrate.com national survey of large lenders. A basis point is one-hundredth of 1 percentage point. The mortgages in this week's survey had an average total of 0.39 discount and origination points. One year ago, the mortgage index was 6.29 percent; four weeks ago, it was 6.41 percent.

The benchmark 15-year fixed-rate mortgage rose 53 basis points, to 6.46 percent. The benchmark 5/1 adjustable-rate mortgage rose 18 basis points, to 6.67 percent.

The 30-year fixed reached 6.77 percent in Bankrate's July 23 survey. That's the highest it has been all year. The last time the 30-year rate was higher was in Bankrate's survey of July 18, 2007, when it fell 21 basis points, then rose 54 basis points the next week, then fell 42 basis points the week after that, followed by this week's rise of 45 basis points. Mortgage rates seldom move in such wide swings. It's frustrating to borrowers who want to snag the best rate.

"It makes it difficult, particularly when you have clients who are preapproved, out looking for homes," says Dan Dowling, president of United Mortgage Capital in Altamonte Springs, Fla. "There's so much (housing) inventory, it's tough for them to decide which one. Then combine that with extreme volatility of interest rates."

He counsels home buyers to get a good deal on a house -- that's not difficult with Florida real estate -- and to grab a good interest rate when an acceptable one passes by.

Lately, a mortgage rate is "like the weather in Seattle," he says. "If you are disappointed with it, wait a while and it will change."

With mortgage rates this volatile, it's difficult to pin down the cause for the twists and turns. Dick Lepre, senior loan consultant for Residential Pacific Mortgage, in San Francisco, traces it to a surge in the issuance of commercial paper -- short-term debt that companies issue.

The Federal Reserve has started to buy commercial paper, breaking the ice in an important part of the frozen credit markets. Now that corporations are more able to borrow, their prospects look brighter -- and that development led to Tuesday's 889-point rise in the Dow Jones Industrial Average.

Lepre believes that investors sold mortgage-backed securities (among other investments) to buy stocks -- and that sell-off led to the rise in mortgage rates.

Notre Dame nearly upsets Bartlett

Dons give impressive effort in 10-7 loss

For the third year in a row, Notre Dame's football team had to face a top-seeded team in the first round of the state playoffs. And for the second time in those three games, the Dons threw a huge scare into an undefeated opponent. This time, it was Bartlett Friday night at Streamwood High School.

The Hawks (9-0) were one of only four unbeaten

teams in the Class 8A bracket.

The Notre Dame defensive unit didn't let Bartlett's record bother it, however, as the Dons turned in a stellar effort. And while Bartlett did manage to carve out a 10-7 triumph, it had to earn it every inch of the way.

"We came to play tonight," longtime head coach Mike Hennessey said moments after the 2008 season came to a halt. "Our defense was outstanding. We caused, and recovered, some turnovers and stopped their offense for the most part.

"Our problem was that we couldn't establish our own offense. We were

never able to get any favorable field position."

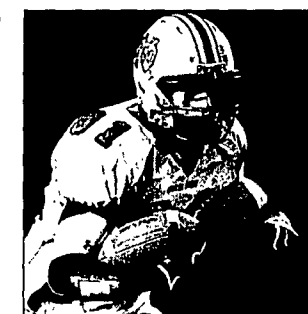
The ND defensive squad did indeed play an inspired game. **Jack Thompson, Kyle English, Billy Hughes, Sean O'Hara and Pat Lazzara** all displayed a high level of intensity. Bartlett quarterback Josh Hasenberg was under pressure from the opening series.

The Hawks did break the scoreless deadlock with 3 minutes, 33 seconds left in the first quarter when they capped a 65-yard drive with a 27-yard field goal by Dnn Knrys. Bartlett's defense, which sacked ND quarterback **Eric Hennessey** picked up a crucial fourth-and-one at midfield and

Bartlett failed to add to its narrow lead until midway through the final quarter. The Hawks finished off a 58-yard drive with a 1-yard TD plunge by Fabian Liberi. Karys' PAT kick made it 10-0.

Amazingly, at that point, ND's offense came to life. Hennessey (14 completions for 137 yards), who had left the game with a bruised ankle, returned to the field and orchestrated a 70-yard drive that culminated with a 24-yard touchdown pass to Lazzara. **John Jennings** kick made it 10-7 with 4:48 left.

With time running down, however, Bartlett picked up a crucial fourth-and-one at midfield and

ran out the clock.

"I thought we gave it a valiant effort," Hennessey said. "Even though we were 5-4, we know the quality of our schedule (in the East Suburban Catholic Conference) makes us better.

From tag: "This is about a gift card scam. Last Christmas, I received an American Express gift card from my dad. I had checked the balance a couple of months before I tried to use it. I had about \$17 left. When I gave it to the cashier, I told her to apply this card to my balance and let me know the new total. I also told her I didn't remember how much was left on it.

"She supposedly swiped it and told me there was a zero balance on it. I was confused and thought maybe I made a purchase of \$17 and just forgot about it. I said 'OK, then I'll just write you a

check for the total amount.' She then said, 'Do you want me to just throw away the card?' Something told me to get the card back and call again about my balance.

"I did that when I came home and found I really did have \$17 left on the card. I wonder how many others tell them to just throw it away there at the store, and the cashier just keeps the cards."

And from Marianrose, who wrote about her granddaughter using a gift card in a store and being told (by a dishonest cashier) that it was all out of money: "The store manager sided with the cashier. I think teenagers are more likely to be the victims, since they might not ask for the card back.

Too often, people think that developing heart disease dooms them to a life of boring, tasteless food.

North Shore cardiologists Dr. Micah Eimer and Dr. Irwin Silverman challenge that notion by teaming up again with Chef Dawn Dlugosz of "A New Dawn Cooking School" which meets in Whole Foods Market, North-

Healthy differences

"For example, we'll stop by the olive oil and talk about the benefits of extra virgin versus regular olive oil," said Eimer.

Getting fresh

"We'll be using a lot of olive oil instead of butter, and introducing a lot more whole grains and fiber," said Dlugosz. "It's a better idea to use fresh ingredients and whole products instead of food being prepared with a lot of preservatives."

Suggestions include using heart-friendly olive oil instead of butter in the potatoes. "Garlic adds the flavor," she said. Sweet potatoes can get healthier, too, enhanced with a light salad vinaigrette instead

of being buried in marshmallows or brown sugar. A lighter, tastier way to roast a turkey breast is to tuck a sautéed apple-sage mixture under the skin for extra flavor. "You get the flavor to go all the way through the breast," Dlugosz said. "If you add a lot of fresh, flavorful ingredients you don't need all that fat and can take the skin off."

Grilled Sweet Potato Salad with Honey-Balsamic Vinaigrette

4 large sweet potatoes
2 T olive oil
1/8 tsp. kosher salt
Pepper to taste.

Honey-Balsamic Vinaigrette

1/4 C balsamic vinegar
1 T Giovanni Isola Cream of Balsamic (a flavored, thick balsamic reduction.)
1 T honey
1/2 C olive oil
2 tsp. Dijon mustard
1/8 tsp. kosher salt
Pepper to taste.

Place potatoes in a large pot and cover with cold water. Bring to a boil and cook until tender but still firm, about 15 minutes. Let cool and cut into 1/2-inch slices.

Heat a cast iron grill pan or outdoor grill over high heat until very hot.

Drizzle sliced potatoes with olive oil and sprinkle with salt and pepper. Grill the potatoes until browned, about 2-3 minutes per side.

Whisk together all vinaigrette ingredients except olive oil. While continuously whisking, slowly stream in the olive oil until combined.

Toss grilled sweet potatoes with vinaigrette while still warm. Serve salad warm or at room temperature. Makes 8 servings.



Mortgage Update: Mortgage matches highest rate of the year By Holden Lewis • Bankrate.com. The roller-coaster ride continues with mortgage rates. This week, they climbed to the highest level in three months, matching the highest level of the year.

The benchmark 30-year fixed-rate mortgage rose 45 basis points, to 6.77 percent, according to the Bankrate.com national survey of large lenders. A basis point is one-hundredth of 1 percentage point. The mortgages in this week's survey had an average total of 0.39 discount and origination points. One year ago, the mortgage index was 6.29 percent; four weeks ago, it was 6.41 percent. The benchmark 15-year fixed-rate mortgage rose 53 basis points, to 6.46 percent. The benchmark 5/1 adjustable-rate mortgage rose 18 basis points, to 6.67 percent. The 30-year fixed reached 6.77 percent in Bankrate's July 23 survey. That's the highest it has been all year. The last time the 30-year rate was higher was in Bankrate's survey of July 18, 2007, when it fell 21 basis points, then rose 54 basis points the next week, then fell 42 basis points the week after that, followed by this week's rise of 45 basis points. Mortgage rates seldom move in such wide swings. It's frustrating to borrowers who want to snag the best rate. "It makes it difficult, particularly when you have clients who are preapproved, out looking for homes," says Dan Dowling, president of United Mortgage Capital in Altamonte Springs, Fla. "There's so much (housing) inventory, it's tough for them to decide which one. Then combine that with extreme volatility of interest rates." He counsels home buyers to get a good deal on a house -- that's not difficult with Florida real estate -- and to grab a good interest rate when an acceptable one passes by. Lately, a mortgage rate is "like the weather in Seattle," he says. "If you are disappointed with it, wait a while and it will change."

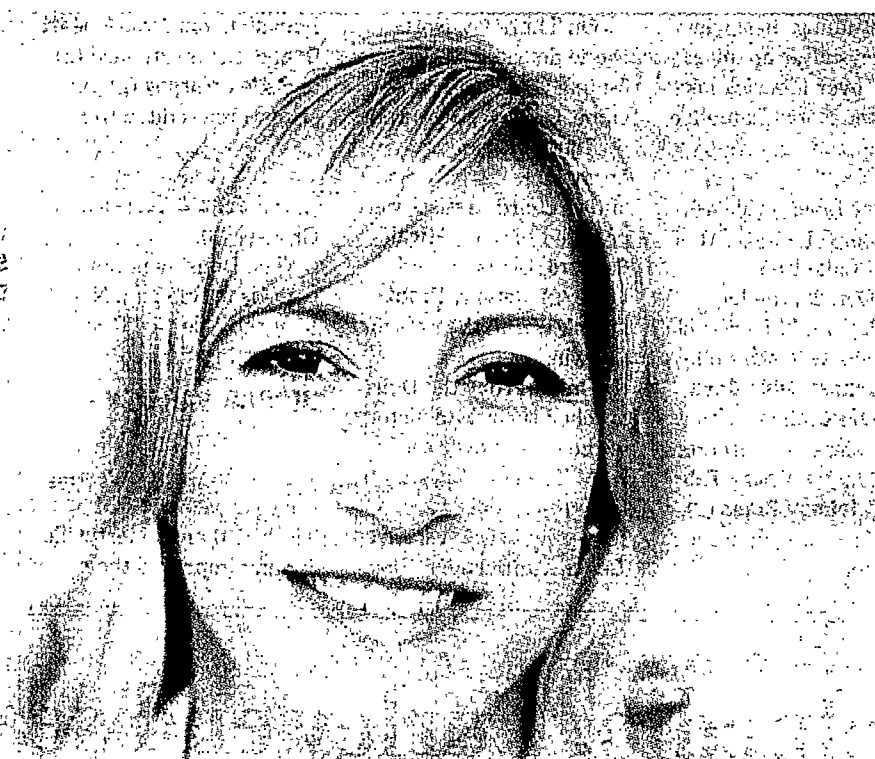

Notre Dame nearly upsets Bartlett

Dons give impressive effort in 10-7 loss

For the third year in a row, Notre Dame's football team had to face a top-seeded team in the first round of the state playoffs. And for the second time in those three games, the Dons threw a huge scare into an undefeated opponent. This time, it was Bartlett Friday night at Streamwood High School.

The Hawks (9-0) were one of only four unbeaten

teams in the Class 8A bracket.

The Notre Dame defensive unit didn't let Bartlett's record bother it, however, as the Dons turned in a stellar effort. And while Bartlett did manage to carve out a 10-7 triumph, it had to earn it every inch of the way.

"We came to play tonight," longtime head coach Mike Hennessey said moments after the 2008 season came to a halt. "Our defense was outstanding. We caused, and recovered, some turnovers and stopped their offense for the most part."

"Our problem was that we couldn't establish our own offense. We were

never able to get any favorable field position."

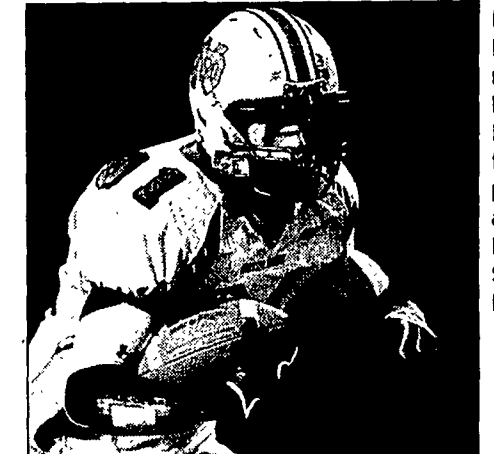
The ND defensive squad did indeed play an inspired game. **Jack Thompson, Kyle English, Billy Hughes, Sean O'Hara** and **Pat Lazzara** all displayed a high level of intensity. Bartlett quarterback Josh Hasenberg was under pressure from the opening series.

The Hawks did break the scoreless deadlock with 3 minutes, 33 seconds left in the first quarter when they capped a 65-yard drive with a 27-yard field goal by Dan Karys. Bartlett's defense, which sacked ND quarterback **Eric Hennessey** seven times, also did a tremendous job.

Bartlett failed to add to its narrow lead until midway through the final quarter. The Hawks finished off a 58-yard drive with a 1-yard TD plunge by Fabian Liberi. Karys' PAT kick made it 10-0.

Amazingly, at that point, ND's offense came to life. Hennessey (14 completions for 137 yards), who had left the game with a bruised ankle, returned to the field and orchestrated a 70-yard drive that culminated with a 24-yard touchdown pass to Lazzara. **John Jennings** kick made it 10-7 with 4:48 left.

With time running down, however, Bartlett picked up a crucial fourth-and-one at midfield and

ran out the clock.

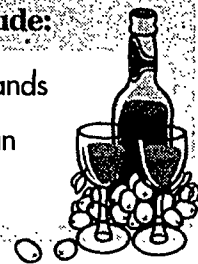

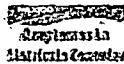
