Golden opportunity marks mall's 50th

At Golf Mill Shopping Center's 50th Anniversary Celebration this weekend attendees will be treated to a free Neverly Brothers concert on Friday and a free Kids' Fun Fest on Satur-

The Neverly Brothers will play a mixture of '50s American Rockabilly and '60s British Invasion beginning at 7 p.m. Friday in the parking area outside the main entrance to the food court. Lawn chairs and blankets are welcome, and the first 150 concertgoers to visit the courtesy table will receive a free 50th anniversary camp chair.

From noon to 4 p.m. Saturday families can attend Kids' Fun Fest in Center Court that will feature a magician, a stilt walker, a juggler, face painters and a Radio Disney AM1300 Road Crew party with music, games and prizes.

Golf Mill will also give away passes to an 11th-century feast and show at Medieval Times Dinner & Tournament in Schaumburg. Shoppers with same-day Golf Mill Shopping Center store receipts totaling \$150 or more will receive one free pass valued at \$60 per person that is valid through September, and shoppers who spend \$200 or more will receive two of the passes.

Golf Mill opened in 1960 as an outdoor retail mall with businesses including Mill Run Playhouse, F.W. Woolworth and Sears. J.C. Penney arrived in 1966. In 1985 a \$44-million redevelopment enclosed the mall and increased the number of shops from 69 to 120. A food court was added and Kohl's

opened. In 1998, Target opened, and in 2005 Value City Furniture moved in. Lucky Magee's opened an off-track betting facility in 2006. The mall completed another renovation in 2007 that added new flooring, restrooms, painting, amenities and a mall entrance.

Golf Mill Barber Shop owner John Ciaccio has been in business in Golf Mill since it opened 50 years ago.

"There were beautiful stores a long time ago," he said, "real beautiful stores."

His son, Joe, who is also a barber at the same business, said he has grown up around the

"Outside the mall, as a kid, there was a working mill with a water wheel and a pond of fish," the younger Ciaccio said. "Dad took us there on Sunday to feed the fish and see all the birds."

He added that the Mill Run Playhouse was an important entertainment venue in its heyday. Stars like Frank Sinatra, Dean Martin and Michael Jackson would play there and stop by the barber shop to get their hair done.

According to Regina Verdico, director of marketing and business development, Golf Mill is doing well despite the recession. Its occupancy rate is in the mid-90s. Target recently added a grocery section to its store, JCPenney did a recent \$4-million renovation and Sears has plans for a full exterior remodeling.

Kohl's, JCPenney and Sears are offering extended hours this week to give shoppers more opportunities to take advantage of the Illinois sales-tax holiday, which will end Sunday.

Sales-tax holiday celebrated

Through Sunday, Niles shoppers are saving 5 percent on back-to-school items during Illinois' 10-day sales-tax holiday.

Customers at Niles businesses ordinarily pay a 9.5-percent sales tax. Village Manager George Van Geem explained that amount includes 5 percent for the state, 2 percent for Niles, 1.25 percent for the county, 1 percent for regional mass-transit and .25 percent for state mass transit. Without the state portion shoppers have been paying only 4.5 percent on eligible school supplies, clothing and footwear since Friday, when the tax holiday began. Large retail stores across Niles have been opening early and closing late.

Virtually all items required by classroom teachers, including paper, binders, pens, pencils, crayons, rulers, erasers, chalk, tape, paste and glue, are eligible for the reduced sales-tax rate.

Other eligible items for reduced taxes include clothing that costs less than \$100 per item, including shoes, outerwear, uniforms, gloves, hats and mittens. A complete list of eligible items can be found at the Illinois Department Revenue website, tax.illinois.gov.

"We have a 10-day window to really take advantage of this state government tax break," said Niles Chamber of Commerce Executive Director Katie Schneider. "It's a rare opportunity to save money and help out local businesses and the economy at the same time."

The tax holiday is having a positive impact at Golf Mill Shopping Center, according to Regina Verdico, director of marketing and business development.

There has been an increase in traffic in the mall and we would attribute that to the sales-tax holiday," she said.

The average American family will spend \$606 on back-toschool supplies this year, according to a National Retail Federation survey. With the tax holiday in place that same family in Illinois would save \$30.30 in sales taxes. According to the Illinois Department of Revenue, families in Illinois spend between \$800 million and \$1.2 billion overall on back-to-school gear for their children. The 5-percent sales-tax holiday will likely save them between \$40 and \$60 million in tax payments.

Across the nation, 18 other states have held sales-tax holidays. According to a study of the Florida sales-tax holiday by the Washington Economics Group, the tax holiday there had a positive economic impact, increasing gross sales by about 8 percent for that month.

The WEG analysis found that Florida would have seen an increase in economic activity of about \$1.7 billion if it held a tax holiday in 2009. It would have given the state a net increase of \$118 million in state and local taxes, according to the report.

"The idea is to encourage public awareness," Strzelecki said. "It's not just law enforcement that combats crime, it's the community together."


Strzelecki said children were involved in the learning experience, too

Cuts create wait

The ongoing recession has hurt Niles in many ways, from its sales-tax ledgers to the unprecedented waiting list at its Family Services Center.

Still, the village's budget and economy show signs of ongoing strength, though the center has been overwhelmed.

Finance Director Scot Neukirch said that salestax revenues for the past year returned to the same level as in 2006. In addition transfer-stamp revenues, \$3 per \$1,000 of the sale price when homes are bought or sold, have declined by \$200,000.

"We're pretty much in the same boat as everybody else regarding the economy," said Neukirch, "Fortunately in Niles we have a strong fund balance to bridge the gap until hopefully the economy returns."

Neukirch said the biggest budgetary issues are pensions and personnel costs.

"The village is going to have to continue to look at the expense side, at streamlining services and reducing staff," he said. "Since service is our largest expense, we need to look at ways of reducing those

"That's our first way to address the issue if the economy doesn't come back in the near future."

But Niles' businesses seem relatively healthy. In the first half of 2010, 85 businesses have moved out and 111 have moved in, said Business Coordinator Denise McCreery. She said small mom-and-pop stores like Rossini's Restaurant are moving out, while discount stores like Costco, Kohl's, Target and Walmart are doing well.


Efficiency, fundraising

The center plans to focus on becoming more efficient and raising more funds. The upper limit of its sliding pay scale for counseling, which can slide down to nothing in the cases of greatest need, has recently increased from \$40 to \$125 an hour.

"We've reduced contractual hours with some therapists, and we are really switching the mode of financial services," said Knobel. "We have cut down on some hours of services. On Wednesdays we close earlier, on Fridays a little bit





"We are recognized as experts in the field of special education," Kendrick said. "A lot of families move to Niles Township because of NTDSE."

She noted that the district is able to offer a range of services that an individual district cannot. NTSDE is able to provide specialized

services, even if it is something needed by only one







feathered Yankton Sioux headdress, with flowing eagle feathers and colorful beadwork, in the middle of the room might suggest the exhibit it's part of is about an extinct culture.

But, by the time you get to the end, you realize Plains Indians are still a vibrant culture making art with modern materials.

"Dazzling Colors: The Evolution of Plains Reservation Art," at the Mitchell Museum of the American Indian in Evanston, shows how tribes west of the Mississippi River and east of the Rocky Mountains adapted when they were forced onto reservations and the U.S. government imposed restrictions on cultural expression.

Laura McDowell. curator of the exhibit, said the Reservation Period is defined as being between 1880 and the 1930s, but the museum included art before and after the period, to show how native peoples flourished and adjusted outside the Reservation Period.

"(The exhibit) was designed to provide visitors with a broader chronology, beginning in

present," she said. "This allowed us to include information about how reservations developed and about contemporary Plains art, which is still being produced by people living on reservations.

At one end, visitors will see a computer showing and explaining winter counts, the way the Lakota people measured a year, from first snowfall to first snowfall. Maps showing the reservations that would be established by the U.S. government, and how those lands shrunk or disappeared through the Reservation Period, provide foreshadowing for the rest of the exhibit.

In between are clothing items made from animal hides, beads and hair, and animal amulets covered in beads. McDowell said the

the 1830s and ending in the snake, lizard and turtle were the most popular amulets given to children.

"They were given to children to teach them about the animals' defense mechanisms, to protect themselves," she said.

Nearby, a representation of a tipi, which would have been made with bison skin, is juxtaposed with a chair made of buffalo horns and hide. Chairs like this, McDowell said, were mass manufactured by furniture companies in the East. While Plains people used every part of the buffalo for practical purposes, Euro-Americans were decimating the buffalo population for novelty items, such as chairs, and discarding most of the animal.

Traditional native chil dren's clothing is placed near a sewing machine

and a gray woolen dress to show attempts by Euro-Americans to assimilate young Native Americans in boarding schools.

During the Reservation Period, children were removed from families and stripped of their traditional clothes, often made of hides, and forced to wear the drab, wool garments at the schools. They were also forbidden to practice their cultural traditions and required to learn Anglo-American skills, such as sewing with sewing machines.

But, at the end of the exhibit are bright, colorful pieces produced toward the end of assimilation attempts and post-Reservation Period.

Beaded neckties are an example of native Plains people poking fun at the Euro-American clothes

forced upon them. But other items, such as a beaded baseball cap, indicate that while some of the materials may now be different, the Plains people continue to practice cultural traditions.

"Our hope is that people will leave the exhibit with both a deeper understanding of the uplifting story of the Plains native people who faced rapid and unusual forced changes to their ways, yet created innovative art and retained their cultural traditions," McDowell said. Comment: pioneerlocal.com

This spectacularly complex, cerebral summer blockbuster from writer/director Christopher Nolan ("The Dark Knight"), may not tie up apparent loose ends with the mathematical precision of his brilliant "Memento" (though it will probably take multiple viewings to he sure). It's also emotionally tenid and it disappoints, just a bit, in the final moments. But this is still a must-see – a welcome challenge compared to the spoon-fed plots of standard-issue formulaic products. Nolan begins with a formula: One Last Big Job for a weary, homesick corporate espionage super-thief (Leonardo DiCaprio) with a quilty secret, who steals secrets from dreaming mega-executives; but he plays mind-bogglingly original variations on that theme. Cobb (Di-Caprio) and his team of shared dreamers (Joseph Gordon-Levitt, Ellen Page and Tom Hardy) play fast and loose with reality as a matter of course, but the climactic Big Caper, which involves planting a new idea in someone's mind instead of merely uncovering a secret, requires navigation of a dream within a dream within a dream and subconscious suggestion amounting to deep Freudian psychotherapy in a hostile subconscious with their lives at stake. Never fear: "Inception" pulls its weight as purely entertaining popcorn, with no shortage of shootouts, car chases, explosions. etc. (in addition to a wealth of fantastic imagery), but it gives you something else to chew on as well (BI) (148 min.) 



Anyone who has ever heard Beckie Menzie sing or play the piano knows that she sets high standards in everything she does. Audiences also quickly recognize her great warmth and wit. Faithful 'Macbeth' takes the outdoor stage

Muse of Fire Theatre Company, a dynamic group of actors keen on making classic plays accessible to as wide an audience as possible, has brought to life William Shakespeare's tragedy "Macbeth" on the grounds of Evanston's verdant Ingraham Park. Last year, the troupe put on a Shakespearean history play, "Henry V."

All performances, directed by Jemma Alix Levy, the company's founder, run for two hours without intermission. Admission is free, and playgoers are advised to bring chairs or blankets, sunglasses and mosquito repellent.

Levy's enthusiastic cast — led by Ryan Swikle as Macbeth and Laura Shatkus as Lady Macbeth — remains faithful to the text as it dramatizes the underlying themes of ambition, fate, betrayal and corruption. The no-frills production

makes the most of the natural setting with its mature trees and grassy knoll. While that's visually striking, acoustics can be problematic, especially since the performers are unamplified and must compete to be heard over noisy cicadas, the occasional roar of airline traffic and intermittent wail of emergency vehicle sirens.

In addition, performers at times find themselves positioned with their backs to the audience, which only exacerbates how much audience members can The play unfolds on the

Three stars will shine at the Rosemont Theatre on Aug. 14 because they believe in Caring for Kids. Grammy-winning saxophonist Kenny G, singer Stephanie Mills and singersongwriter Jeffrey Osborne will perform at the event benefitting Shriners Hospitals for Children.

Kenny G has been enchanting audiences with his amazing sounds and original compositions since the mid-'80s. "I got pretty lucky in that I was playing the right music at the right time," he modestly said.

The saxophonist will perform several selections from his new album, "Heart and Soul." The album of all-original music includes 10 instrumentals and two numbers with singers: Robin Thicke performs "Fall Again" and Kenny "Babyface" Edmonds sings "No Place Like Home."

Kenny G became acquainted with the Shriners when he performed in California about a year ago. "I really connected with the people that were running the organization and the cause is great - helping kids that need medical care and having the care done at no charge to the family. I'm proud of my association with them."

The audience can expect an exciting performance from Kenny G. "My concerts are a little different from what you'd expect because of the music that you hear on the radio," he said. "They're not all romantic ballad music with beautiful melodies. We have a lot of energy in the



show. We have a great video guy. There's a lot to see. It's not going to put you to sleep."

Stephanie Mills first earned fame at the age of 17, when she starred on Broadway as Dorothy in "The Wiz." The Grammywinning recording artist, whose hits include "Home," "I Feel Good All Over," "Something in the Way (You Make Me Feel)" and "Never Knew Love Like this Before," took time off from her career to focus on her son Farad, now 9. She's back touring, promoting her new album, "Breath-

less," her first since 2004. "I wanted to be a mom." Mills explained. "My son was getting ready to go into kindergarten and I wanted to be home when he got home and really be

attentive to him." Mills wrote most of the songs on her new album, which she produced on her own CJ Entertainment record label. "I wanted to say things that my audience could relate to so I decided to write more," she said. "This is the first time

I've written the bulk of the album, and I'm really, really happy that I did."

The covers that Mills included are "I'll Be There," for her late friend and one-time boyfriend Michael Jackson; "Willing to Forgive," an Aretha Franklin song; and the Beatles' "Yesterday."

Mills' original songs chart the good and bad of relationships with men. "Me being 53 years old and having been married and been in-and-out of relationships, I still have a love for men, what they do and how they do it. So I wanted to write an album about that," she said.

Despite her excitement about "Breathless," Mills plans to primarily sing her hit songs at the concert.

"One of the biggest highlights of my career is being associated with the Shriners Hospitals because I love children," Mills said. "My son is a special-needs child. He is now seeing a doctor at the Shriners because they have the best doctors." Comment: pioneerlocal.com







Hyperbolic hipster love

SCOTT PILGRIM VS. THE WORLD

There's a very simple way to figure out whether or not you should check out this hard-rocking, ultra-hyperbolic, videogame-saturated, often very funny, hipster romance. Sorry to be ageist about it, but if you're over 30, think twice (Though anyone with an appreciation for unfettered energy and imagination should find something to admire before exhaustion sets in.) But if you're twenty-something or under, this one, literally,

was made for you. Of course, if you're twenty-something or under, you didn't need to be told that.

Faithfully adapted from a six-volume series of cult-hit graphic novels by Bryan Lee O'Malley, "Scott Pilgrim vs. the World" comes with a bulletproof set of hipster/slacker A-list credentials including ironic-vulnerability poster boy Michael Cera in the title role and "Shaun of the Dead" helmer Edgar Wright as director/co-Cera, fresh from his mul-

tiple-personality outing in the very strange, very funny "Youth in Revolt," is a good fit, despite the fact that he doesn't have much opportunity for his usual deadpan wit (to tell the truth, there's some question about this Pilgrim guy's intelligence, if not his hipness). Cera duly registers the character's selfsatisfied, borderline obnoxiousness, but is much more at home with his raging insecurities.

The essential facts about young Mr. Pilgrim are as follows: He's 23, he lives in Toronto, he's permanently "between jobs," he plays bass in a struggling rock

Infiniti G37x makes good impressions

t was 2009 when I first got a chance to see the then-new Infiniti G37x Coupe. First impressions have a lot to do with successfully marketing and selling cars, especially higher-end luxury models like Infiniti, and the G37x gave me a lot of reasons to want to drive one.

Fast-forward to late spring 2010, which is when the newest edition became my tester for the week. Again, first impressions being what they are - mostly an emotional response (even for someone who drives close to 100 cars a year) - this 2010 version is a sexy coupe that elicits second looks and sometimes third glances.

This all-wheel-drive G37x Coupe features sleek styling, fun performance and absolutely luxurious appointments as the building blocks of its existence. My Infiniti G37x AWD Coupe tester had a base price of \$38,700. The final sticker totaled \$47,245 after adding the following

The initial addition of the seven-speed automatic transmission, featuring a performance-oriented drive sport mode and downshift rev matching, makes all the difference when trying to have a bit of fun pushing the G37 Coupe around town.

The G37 Coupe's engine is integrated into the second-generation FM (front midship) platform, which features a four-wheel-independent suspension with lightweight aluminum components that yield rapid acceleration response and sporty handling. The always-impressive ATESSA E-TS, also found in the Infiniti G37x sedan AWD model, makes this great-looking G Coupe a real performer. The ATESSA E-TS system is capable of delivering up to 50 percent of available power to the front wheels automatically. Midwest weather alone is reason to consider this exceptional system and the G37x Coupe.

The cabin of the G37x Coupe is luxurious. It features leather-appointed seating as standard and a high-quality Infiniti sound system by Bose. I found the cabin to be quite relaxing and road noise is nothing but a whisper (especially with the Bose system upgrade engaged).

For the owner of a G37x Coupe, smaller is probably better. Head and legroom is more than adequate in front but much tighter in back. My rear passengers were a bit cramped but luckily those were short trips. The refined interior appointments make any trip in the G Coupe pleasant, and the driver will enjoy the sporty dash treatment with traditional gauge placement and great visibility day or night.

Visually the G37x Coupe is a winner, but it also delivers an exhilarating performance package as well. The acceleration is brisk, with a smooth linear response as it progresses through the seven gears either automatically or manually shifted. The rev-matching feature of the transmission will be appealing to many drivers. The ride quality is

comfortable without being too firm. The handling characteristics are without a doubt sporty and fun

Interior fit and finish and surface textures give the G Coupe an advantage over some others in the class and if you enjoy high-tech gadgetry, well, Infiniti has you in mind for the G.

E-readers may replace lexibooks

The e-reader market exploded when Amazon introduced its Kindle and Kindle 2. Sony, Barnes & Noble and other companies have also introduced their own devices. Ebook reader companies are realizing the benefits of offering digital versions of textbooks. Amazon has contracted with three textbook companies to offer digital editions.

The first advantage is the weight issue. The average college student takes five classes per semester. That can equal five or more textbooks to purchase, and each weighs several pounds. A student has the potential to be carrying 50 pounds at any given time. In comparison, most e-readers weigh just a few ounces and can hold a thousand books or more, depending on file size.

\$300, some textbooks can cost as much. Although the cost of textbook material delivered to an e-reader is still unknown, it may be more affordable than on-campus bookstore prices. Also, should a traditional textbook be lost a student has to repurchase it. Many e-readers feature back-up ability, where a previously purchased book can be retrieved free from a database or storage device.

Convenience is another factor for ebooks. Students simply browse wirelessly for their desired reading and download it in minutes. This is certainly more time-efficient than waiting on long lines at the campus bookstore or waiting for books to be delivered through the mail from online sources.

E-readers have the potential to be successful for school use, but they need to have the support of professors behind them. For a device to garner broad acceptance, institutions may need to make the devices part of the school's requirements. This is similar to many schools requiring all students own a laptop. Students who are unable to afford an e-reader may be subsidized for the device or be able to use student loans to pay for


30-year mortgage trend



Although most - even Maine East coach Gabe Corey — assumed Andrew Lee this fall would once again quarterback the Demons, that's not going to be the case.


Instead, Corey gave the keys to the offense to George Zakharia. The coach decided early enough in the summer that Zakharia got enough snaps to prepare for the season.

Football teams all over the state were scheduled to start preseason practice Wednesday. All of them have questions that need answering before the first game is played.

This is what's going through the mind of Maine East as the Demons get ready for Schurz at Lane Stadium Aug. 28.

1. Can the Demons build on last season's two-win success after going into the 2009 season on a 39-game losing streak? Losing is contagious. But so is winning. Coach Gabe Corey knows if the Demons can win a game or two more than last season, then they are on the right path. He's been busy beating that point over and over

2. Who will be taking the snaps under center this fall?
