





SPC related was bleeding from the head and there was blood present on Mr. related Mr. bed was about 4 feet off of the floor. SPC was confused, dizzy, and could not remember the ground and Mr. falling from his bed.

About 1935, 31 Jan 04, SA interviewed SSG 79<sup>th</sup> MP Company, Camp Cropper, BIAP, Baghdad, Iraq, who provided a verbal statement. SSG related between 15 Jan 04 and 29 Jan 04, he was the NCOIC for the 28<sup>th</sup> CSH hospital security detail, as augmented by the 79<sup>th</sup> MP Company. SSG related he recalled the incident where Mr. fell from his hospital bed; however, he (SSG did not physically observe this fall. He stated SPC was working in the ICW at the time and possibly had better information about the incident. SSG did not suspect any wrong doing associated with Mr. fall other than his (SSG speculation that Mr. probably attempted to get up from his bed and subsequently fell. SSG did not recall noticing Mr. in the Camp Cropper facility prior to his medical evacuation to the 28<sup>th</sup> CSH on 26 Jan 04.

About 1000, 6 SEP 05, the undersigned interviewed Dr Forensic Pathologists, Director, Medico Legal Institute, Ministry of Health, Baghdad, Iraq (IZ) and Dr. Forensic Pathologists. Medico Legal Institute, Ministry of Health, Baghdad, IZ who performed the autopsy on the body of Mr. spoke little English so Dr. acted as translator for him. Dr was brought to the Medico Legal Institute on 18 Feb 04. A request for autopsy the body of Mr. was submitted by the Iraqi Police, Al Juaifir Police Office. The autopsy was performed on 19 Feb 04. Dr. related his office did not receive any documentation pertaining to the circumstances of Mr. death except for the Death Certificate completed by U.S. Coalition Forces. Dr. there were no injuries on Mr. body that were consistent with being beaten or abused. The only noted injuries were those annotated on the autopsy report and those "injuries" were primarily the surgical incisions to the head as a result of the surgical procedures performed in an attempt to save his life. The only unexplained injuries were the bruises noted on the right cheek, nose and left temple. Neither Dr. was familiar with Mr. previous medical history or any of the circumstances related they had no previous medical documents or treatment history surrounding his death. Dr. concerning Mr. nor were they provided with any report describing the circumstances of his death. The undersigned briefed the doctors on the fact that Mr. was being treated for hypertension, diabetes, and was taking blood thinners and aspirin prior to being medical evacuated to the Combat Support Hospital (CSH) because he complained of chest pains and was believed to be having a heart attack. The undersigned also explained while he was at the CSH, Mr. had fallen out of his agreed if Mr. hospital bed and hit his head. Dr. and Dr. had the pre-existing medical conditions as described, his injuries could easily have been caused by such a fall and the internal bleeding in the brain as noted in the autopsy report. Dr. and Dr. reiterated the intracranial bleeding was caused by some kind of impact trauma and the injuries noted on the autopsy report were consistent with a fall.

During the interview, Dr. and Dr. and Previewed the translated autopsy report and made some minor corrections. Those corrections were submitted to Mr. Translator, Titan Corporation, (assigned to the 48<sup>th</sup> MP DET (CID), Camp Slayer, IZ) who made the corrections.

Around 1215, 12 Sep 05, this case was coordinated with CPT Computer CPT Office of Staff Judge Advocate (OSJA), Multi National Corps-Iraq (MNC-I), Camp Victory, IZ, who opined there was no evidence to believe a criminal offense was committed.





- 1. About 1640, 31 Jan 04, the 10th MP BN (CID) reported, via Serious Incident Report (SIR), detainee died while in the custody of U.S. Forces at the 28th CSH. Baghdad, IZ. Preliminary investigation disclosed that about 0700, 25 Apr 03, detainee vas detained by Coalition Forces for reasons unknown and detained at Camp Cropper, Baghdad International Airport (BIAP), IZ. On 26 Jan 04, detained was treated by the 744th MP BN for a minor injury when detained complained of dizziness, headaches and chest pains. Detained was subsequently air evacuated to the Intensive Care Unit (ICU), 28th CSH for observation and treatment. On 26 Jan 04, while in the ICU, detained allegedly fell out of his bed and sustained a severe head injury. Between 26-31 Jan 04, detained conditioned worsened and a CT scan disclosed hemorrhaging to the brain. Subsequent surgery of disclosed hemorrhaging to the brain from the fall; however, a second brain hemorrhage, approximately 3-4 weeks old was found. About 0156, 31 Jan 04, Dr Neurosurgeon, 28th CSH pronounced detainee deceased. An autopsy of detainee was not conducted as the cause of his death was opined to be result of the fall, thus detainee remains were released for disposition. On 30 May 04, this investigation was re-opened to further investigate the undetermined death of detainee
- 2. This office requests copies of any and all medical records, the Camp Cropper detainee file, any and all interrogation reports and a list of all dates detained was subjected to interview and interrogation.
- 3. The medicals are to be reviewed for consult with the Armed Forces Medical Examiner in attempts to establish the cause and manner of detained death. The detained file and interrogation reports are needed for review to identify all personnel having contact with detained to the dates of interview and interrogation will assist in determining the last date detained was in contact with U.S. Forces before his death.



Can you ask one of the docs about this case. Detainee was diagnosed with a thrombosis of unk etiology, cellulitis and a fever on 27 Jul 03. In Jan 04 he's in the hospital complaining of chest pains. While in the hospital, he falls out of bed, bangs his head hard enough to suffer an SDH and coma. While treating the SDH they find a previous SDH of unk etiology that is about 3 or 4 +/- weeks old. The first SDH would've ocurred while he was in custody. The second is pretty well documented in the med records so there doesn't appear to be any foul play involved. Eventually the guy dies, body is returned to family without a post.

Given the med hx as I've given it, is there a medical condition that would account for it, ie some type of blood disorder that would account for the "spontaneous" first SDH maybe as a result of a thrombosis lodged in one of the vessels in the brain. It sounds a little hairbrained and I'm no doc, so I maybe talking out of the side of my head, and there is a lot we don't know, ie location of the SDH for starters, but the question was asked.

Many details are missing. Thee is no documentation as to how this guy all of a sudden ended up with a head injury (no mention of fall or previous injury). He was admitted for heart problems and has a terrible baseline health status (ASCVD, diabetes, the usual). He apparently ruled out for a myocardial infarction and they even wrote an order to discharge him back to the detainee camp when the next set of orders has him post-op from a craniotomy and evacuation of a hematoma. Did he fall or did they just notice he might be impaired?

The death certificate (no name or any other data, not even a date/time of death) attributes death to low platelets causing a bleed. Not all of the platelet counts were legible but the ones I saw demonstrated a trend downward over 27-28 JAN and then back upward with a low of 49,000 (the lowest counts were actually reported after the surgery occurred). I would argue with the neurosurgeon that 49,000 is not low enough to typically cause spontaneous bleeds. Other factors, such as his clotting status, might be involved. Also, he may have been transfused and his platelet counts could have dipped even lower but we don't have those reports. The dip in platelets may have been a drug reaction but I find it hard to imagine he could go from 49K back up to 304K in 24 hours without a whole bunch of help. If this was all from transfusion, they gave the guy way too many platelets. No one needs to get above 150K by artificial means.

C.I.D. needs all of the hospital records, including progress notes, transfusion records, and operative notes (what was done, what did they find, why did they decide to operate). The imaging studies (at least the reports) and all labs should be made available. It doesn't sound like this guy presented with any injuries (other than a lac on his great toe). If he fell out of bed or whatever hard enough to require surgery there must have been an incident report.

By the way, an autopsy should have been done and this death certificate is invalid (this is a recording).

- 1. The review of ROI # 0020-04-CID259-80138 determined the investigation was operationally insufficient and was administratively insufficient.
- 2. The review disclosed the following deficiencies. Review of the original case file noted that of ten exhibits listed as attached exhibits to the Final ROI only a CD-ROM containing the crime scene photographs was present. All other exhibits, like medical records, AIR's, etc., were missing from the case file and were not present on any CID-ROM's in the case file. Two CD-ROMs present in the file were reviewed and were identified as not containing any documents from this investigation. The CD-ROM's appear to have electronic defects. The Agents Activity Summary (AAS) cites that when a U. S. Army doctor treated the victim for a head injury the doctor detected that the victim had suffered two brain injuries. The victim had suffered a first brain hemorrhage three to four weeks prior to his death, and the second brain hemorrhage injury shortly before his death when he apparently fell to the floor from his hospital bed. The medical evaluation was that the older injury was fatal if left untreated. There was no investigative effort made to ascertain the victim's location and circumstances during the time period in which the older brain hemorrhage was inflicted. The 28th Combat Support Hospital released the victim's body before CID was notified of the death. The case agents expended considerable effort to locate the victim's body after release, however once they learned of the body's likely location they did not go to the body, expose photographs. examine the body for evidence of trauma or arrange for an autopsy. The evidence developed shows the victim suffered a brain hemorrhage while he was a detainee in U. S. Army control, however there was no information developed to address the circumstances surrounding the cause of this injury. The Final ROI cites that the 28th Combat Support Hospital released the body to the International Red Cross (IRC), although AAS entries cite that the body was not released to the IRC, but was taken to the Foreign Sick Medicine Office, Baghdad.

#### MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD

SUBJECT: Request For Correction (RFC) 0136-05-CID001 concerning Report of Investigation (ROI) 0020-04-CID259-80138

- 1. The above mentioned ROI was reviewed by the Detainee Assessment Task Force (DATF), HQUSACIDC, Fort Belvoir, VA, on 2 Mar 05. There were a total of nine findings discovered during the review (See enclosure).
- a. In reference to Finding one: The previous investigating unit attempted many times to acquire any and all medical documentation pertaining to the deceased. The medical documentation in question pertains to the deceased's stay at the 28<sup>th</sup> Combat Support Hospital (CSH). At the time of the reinvestigation (Final Supplemental) the 28<sup>th</sup> CSH had redeployed to the United States, the 31<sup>st</sup> CSH replaced them. Since the time of the reinvestigation the 31<sup>st</sup> CSH has been replaced by the 86<sup>th</sup> CSH. The 31st CSH provided what they had on hand; however, they did not have the surgeon's operative notes or the findings and the incident report regarding the trauma at the hospital. Coordination with the Operating doctor revealed he did not have any of the documentation. Dr. Office of the Armed Forces Medical Examiner (OAFME), Armed Forces Institute of Pathology (AFIP), did clarify that the hospital should have prepared a written report if the detainee fell out of bed; however, it is very possible they did not. This is surmised because one could not be found, no one remembers one being done and this is a combat zone where standard procedure is sometimes not followed. It is the undersigned's opinion that these records never existed or no longer exist.

b. In reference to Finding two: The undersigned finds no reason to believe that the deceased was abused by US or Foreign Coalition personnel. The deceased detainee never mentioned being abused while under US control. He never mentioned being abused during capture, transport or interrogations. None of the personnel interviewed stated the detainee ever mentioned being abused in any manner; on the contrary, he made comments that he was treated fairly while in US control. This is a mute point but noted.

c. In reference to Finding three: The undersigned reviewed this closed case file on 31 Jan 04, along with CW4 and CW2 During that review the undersigned determined that the detainee was strapped to the bed probably because he was "antsy", inadvertently moving, and basically not saying still. He had many, many

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medical problems that also could have lead to him inadvertently moving around. During the course of the investigation it was determined on several different occasions that the detainee had many pre-existing risk factors for blood clots leading to subdural hematoma. The factors were listed as follows: he was taking aspirin, a blood thinner, and had an old hematoma. Prior to the detainee's death he had been seen on a daily basis for care of a diabetic ulcer on one of his feet. His blood pressure and blood sugar were also being followed, and his medications for hypertension and diabetes were being optimized. LTC had the detainee evacuated to the 28<sup>th</sup> CSH because he thought he might be having heart attacks. But the DATF point is noted.

FINDINGS OF DATF REVIEW:

1. The initial investigation was severely lacking; however, there was a lot of great investigative effort after the case was re-opened in May 04. Although the Final Supplemental added a significant amount of medical records, Dr. AFIP, indicated he required additional records to complete his review. Dr. specifically mentioned the surgeon's operative notes and findings and the incident report regarding the trauma at the hospital. Dr. clarified that the hospital should have prepared a written incident report if the detainee fell out of bed. No documented follow-up to determine if these records existed.

2. Exhibit 28 was a matrix that listed the dates that the detainee was interrogated. No documented follow-up to locate or review these interrogation records for possible references to recommended interrogation techniques, exceptions to policy to employ harsh interrogation techniques and complaints of mistreatment or injuries. This would include identifying and interviewing the interrogators who interviewed the detainee. Regarding the issue of interrogation records, SA searched the Magistrate's Cell at Baghdad Central Confinement Facility for a file on the detainee. It is not clear why SA searched for a file at BCCF since the detainee had been held and interrogated at Camp Cropper since his capture. The detainee was apparently being held or at least interrogated by the Iraq Survey Group (ISG); therefore we need to coordinate with Camp Cropper and the former ISG for records on this detainee.

- 3. Drawing who was interviewed on 16 Jun 04, mentioned there had been problems controlling the detainee so the detainee was strapped to his bed. He said the detainee was strapped down by the arm and leg on one side of his body. This was the only reference in the file to problems controlling the detainee and there was no follow-up regarding the problems controlling the detainee. Were the problems related to the detainee's medical condition or was he simply being uncooperative? Everything else in the case indicates the detainee was cooperative, in good spirits and very polite.
- 4. Exhibit 26 contains a two page Detainee Personnel Report for a detainee named US9IZ- This record is completely unrelated to this case and should be formally removed from Exhibit 26 via a Memorandum for Record to USACRC.

- 5. Exhibit 26 contained a classified memorandum from the ISG, dated 4 Jan 04, which listed two points of contact. Nothing documented to indicate that we attempted to interview these individuals concerning the detainee.
- 6. Exhibit 25s and 26 contained various other tracking numbers for the detainee, including Black ISN HVD and and Capture Tagram. The reference to ISN was listed on the original capture tag. Probable that the references to were derived from either that the reference to Unknown when or why the detainee's number was changed from the contained tracking numbers.

- 7. Exhibit 26 contained references to the capturing unit; however, no documented effort to identify and interview the capturing personnel or locate and review their capture records to determine if the detainee sustained any injuries during capture. Noted that the capture unit was a "Task Force" which is being investigated in several ROIs for allegedly using excessive force when handling detainees.
- 8. Exhibit 26 also contained a "21 Day Review" form, which listed six aliases that were not documented elsewhere in the file.
- 9. A thoroughness issue that should be noted, but cannot be resolved at this point is the fact that was no scene examination of the location in the hospital where the detainee fell off the bed. Unknown why we did a scene exam on the detainee's cell back at Camp Cropper or why this was documented as a crime scene sketch?

RECOMMENDATION: Reopen this investigation and address the aforementioned issues.
