CONSTITUTION

OF THE NATIONAL BAPTIST CONVENTION OF AMERICA

(Adopted September, 1893 and Amended September, 1916.)

Whereas, It is the sense of the colored Baptists of the United States of America, convened in the city of Atlanta, Ga., September 28th, 1893, in the several organizations known as "the Baptist Foreign Mission Conventions of the United States of America," hitherto engaged in mission work on the West Coast of Africa; the "National Baptist Convention," which has been engaged in mission work in the United States of America; and the "National Baptist Educational Convention," which has sought to look after the educational interests, that the interest of the Kingdom of God requires that the several bodies above named should unite in one body; wherefore we do now agree to adopt the following constitution:

Article I.

This body shall be known and styled "The National Baptist Convention of America."

Article II.

The object of this Convention shall be to correlate and co-operate with the many Baptist state and district organizations in doing missionary, Sunday School and educational work, and to promote, foster and stimulate the publication and circulation of religious literature through our several boards and auxiliaries as may be hereafter named.

Article III.

The messengers of this Convention shall be representative and annual.

Section 1.—Representative: Any orthodox Missionary Baptist church, Sunday school, Missionary or Baptist young people's society, district and general association, Sunday school convention, and state convention may become an annual representative by the payment of Five (\$5.00) Dollars for the general expenses of each annual session, and may be entitled to one or more additional messengers by the following payments: \$2.50 each, to be paid in at the session or twenty-five or the maximum part of twenty-five dollars contributed through the several boards for any of the objects named in Article II. The maxi-

imum number of messengers from any one organization shall be specified by resolutions or by-laws.

Section 2.—Annual Membership: Any person who is a member of any regular Missionary Baptist church in union with this organization may become an annual member by the payment of \$2.50 for the general expenses at each session, or twenty-five dollars or the maximum part of twenty-five dollars contributed through either of the boards for any of the objects named in Article 2.

Article IV.

Officers: The officers of this Convention shall be a President, two or more Vice Presidents, a Recording Secretary, four Assistant Secretaries, a Statistical Secretary, a Lawyer, a Treasurer and a General Auditor, all of whom shall be elected annually and hold their offices until their successors are chosen. The President or Vice President of each state convention, moderator of each general association co-operating with this body shall be associate honorary or advisory Vice President.

Article V.—Duties of Officers.

Section 1. The President or any of the Vice Presidents shall preside at any of the meetings of the Convention. The Vice Presidents shall represent and assist the President of the Convention in their order named. In case of death, absence or inability to attend of the President, one of the Vice Presidents named in their order shall represent him. He shall sign all orders drawn by the Secretary on the Treasurer, sign the call for the regular meetings or special meetings of the Convention, appoint all committees not elected by the general body and may make annual visits to the state or territorial conventions and general associations in the interest of this body by special invitation or by consent of the state convention or association. He shall perform such other duties as may be designated by resolution or by-laws.

Section 2. The Recording Secretary shall keep a faithful record of all the proceedings of the annual meeting, compile and distribute the minutes of the annual proceedings and shall see that the minutes are sent to all members whether they be representative or annual. He shall prepare and distribute the necessary enrollment blanks, cards, etc., to enroll the members, shall draw all drafts on the Treasurer to be countersigned by the President; he shall keep all such proceedings, together with the proceedings of the Executive meetings, in a well-bound book and report the same at each annual session.

Section 3. The Treasurer shall receive all money brought up to or collected at the annual meeting of the Convention, and shall, by order of the Convention, turn over the same to the Treasurers of the different boards in accordance with the object for which the money was brought

up to the Convention, at the Convention. The Convention shall say how all undesignated funds shall be used. The Treasurer of the Convention shall make an annual report to the Convention of all moneys paid out by him, to whom, for what, and the amounts turned over to the Treasurers of the boards and shall receipt the Finance Committee and any messenger for all money turned over to him, and shall accept or take receipts, vouchers, cancelled checks, or other evidences to show money paid out and keep his account in a well-bound book.

Section 4. The Statistical Secretary of the Convention shall, together with the Recording Secretary and Corresponding Secretary of each of the boards of the Convention, gather the statistics of the denomination from year to year and is expected to make them as full as possible, and the same may be printed in pamphlet form for distribution as information.

Section 5. The General Auditor of the Convention shall audit the accounts of the Convention and shall pass upon the accounts of each of the auditors of the various boards: shall make a report of his findings at each annual session of the Convention. Each auditor of the several boards shall make such reports to the general auditor as may be designated by the by-laws of the Convention and the by-laws of the several boards.

Article VI.—Management.

The Convention shall elect at each annual meeting a Foreign Mission, a Home Mission, an Educational, a B. Y. P. U., a General Publishing, a Benefit and Woman's Auxiliary Board, Evangelical Board and other boards as may be deemed necessary from time to time, and these boards shall continue in office until a new election.

Section 1. The Boards shall consist of one member from each state or territorial convention represented in or co-operating with this Convention.

Section 2. The members of these boards shall be nominated by the members from the several states and territorial conventions and confirmed by this body. This general board may be divided into two separate boards to be known as the General Advisory Board and the Board of Management.

Section 3. Each board of management shall have a chairman, recording secretary, corresponding secretary and treasurer. The corresponding secretary and treasurer may be one and the same person. The duties of each board may be regulated by by-laws adopted by the boards and by-laws made by and accepted by the Convention. The recording secretary of each board shall keep a faithful record of all the meetings of the board and of the executive committee of the board. The treasurer of each board shall receive and disburse all money of

the board. He shall keep a record of all money received and disbursed. He shall hold all deeds bequests or other property of the board. He is treasurer and his books shall be opened to inspection to any member of the board. No money shall be paid out except by order of the board from whose treasurer it is to be drawn.

The Corresponding Secretary of each Board shall conduct the correspondence of the board of which he is Secretary. He shall have general management of the work of the Board but shall be subject to such by-laws as the Board may think best for the management of the work.

The officers of each board, together with such members as may be designated by the by-laws, shall constitute the board of management to transact the business for the constitutional provisions and by-laws made by the boards at such time and place as may be called by the President of management shall consist of not less than five members and shall hold quarterly meetings and shall have power to make such rules and regulations for the management of its business and its officers as they may think best. To each board shall be committed during the recess of the Convention the entire management of all of the affairs relating to the objects with whose interest it shall be charged, all of which management shall be in strict accordance with the constitutional provisions and by-laws made by the boards and adopted by the Convention.

Each board shall have power to make such compensations to its officers and employees as its by-laws and regulations may specify, or as the board of managers may in its judgment think best. Each board shall make an annual report to the Convention of all missionary, educational, publication and other work done by them during the year, together with the receipts and disbursements of all money.

Article VII.—Qualifications.

All agents, missionaries, district, field and corresponding secretaries employed by the boards of the Convention must be members of some regular Baptist church in union with the churches composing this Convention. They must, previous to their appointment, furnish satisfactory evidence of genuine piety, fervent zeal in the Master's cause and talents which fit them for the service for which they are to be employed.

Article VIII.—Annual Meetings.

The Convention shall hold meetings at such time and place as it may determine, but should anything occur to prevent the meeting at the time and place appointed, the board may arrange the time and place and publish the same to the denomination.

Article IX.—Executive Board of the Convention.

The general Executive Board of the National Baptist Convention shall consist of all the elected officers of the Convention, the correspond-

ing secretaries and chairman of each of the Boards elected by the Convention, together with the associate honorary, or advisory Vice President, elected according to Article IV of the Constitution.

Section 2. This General Executive Board shall have an Executive Board of Management which shall consist of the President, Recording Secretary and Treasurer, elected at the annual meeting and the secretary and chairman of each of the boards. This Executive Board of Managers shall meet at such time and place as may be called by the president of the Convention or as may be designated by the by-laws.

Amendments.

This Constitution may be altered or amended at any regular meeting of the Convention by a two-thirds vote of the members present, provided the proposed alteration or amendments are presented on the first day of the session and voted upon on the last day of the session.

Amendments.

Any rule or by-law not in harmony with the foregoing constitution is hereby annulled.

PROCEEDINGS

Indianapolis, Ind., Sept. 8, 1926

The Forty-sixth Annual Session of the National Baptist Convention opened its session in Tomlinson Hall. 10:00—President J. E. Wood asks Chorister Johnson to announce song service would begin.

Chorus sang, "I shall not be moved" and "Ride on King." Dr. G. C. Coleman, Vice President, California, called for brethren appointed to conduct devotionals. Not being present, Dr. L. Johnson, Miss., and Dr. J. C. Lott of Texas were asked to conduct the devotionals. Dr. J. C. Lott of Texas read Eph. 4:1-16. The chorus sang, "I heard the voice of Jesus say," etc. Dr. L. Johnson led in prayer, chorus sang, "Wait til I put on my crown." Dr. Lott took a few moments commenting on the lesson read and asked brethren to spend the next few minutes in an expression meeting. Drs. Toles, Charles Clark and many others of the brethren spoke. Chorus, "My soul be on thy guard," and "Am I a soldier of the cross," after which Vice President Coleman of California presented the President, Dr. J. E. Wood, who made some very helpful remarks concerning the work before the convention.

Vice President Coleman presented to the convention Dr. J. W. Hulse, Kansas City, Mo., to preach the Introductory Sermon. Dr. Hulse selected text from Second Corinthians 4:4. Subject, "The Glorious Gospel of Christ." The sermon was full of information and inspiration. After the sermon Mrs. J. W. Hulse, wife of the speaker sang, "My Mother's Song" which greatly moved the audience.

Prayer by Dr. J. H. Eason, Ala. Dr. S. R. Prince was asked to take a thanks offering which amounted to seventy-one (\$71.11) dollars and eleven cents.

Sister Barnejee, Missionary of India was present and said she represented three hundred natives with three million gods.

Financial Committee was appointed. (See committee.) Rev. F. W. Williams of Pennsylvania was introduced and

brought greetings from Lott Carey Convention. Announcements. Benediction by Dr. J. W. Hurse, Missouri.

WEDNESDAY—Afternoon Session

Vice President Dr. G. C. Coleman called session to order. Dr. J. W. Anderson, Portland, Ore., and Dr. A. Pyburn of Austin, Texas, conducted devotional services. Dr. J. W. Anderson led in singing, "Am I a soldier of the cross" and prayed a very fervent prayer. The 23rd Psalm was repeated by the Convention, Dr. Anderson leading. Song, "I want to be a Christian." Program read by Secretary of the Convention.

By motion of the Convention Dr. Fuller was to take the subject, "Our Devotional Object," Thursday afternoon.

By motion of Convention Rev. E. W. Dallas was selected in place of Rev. T. M. Smith on devotionals Friday evening.

By motion of Convention the President's Annual Message was postponed on account of illness of the president to another time when he would be better.

Committees on Finance and Enrollment were appointed. Moved and adopted that the program with changes ordered be adopted.

The following ushers were appointed:

Report of Executive Board was given by Dr. S. S. Jones, Secretary. The report of Dr. Jones shows the great work done by our Convention through the board and secretary in giving status to our Convention in historical society and properly placing officers and boards of our Convention, thus making a record of lasting remembrance. Dr. Jones urged the Convention to put on a program that would insure our president a trip around the world.

Dr. S. R. Prince of Fort Worth, spoke on report of the Secretary, S. S. Jones and stated that Dr. Jones had done a wonderful work this year and called attention to the fact that we had too many Boards and that the work of the Convention could be bettered by blending together several boards.

Dr. W. Johnson and Dr. E. W. White also spoke on Secretary Jones' report, commending it and asked that we at the earliest convenience take up recommendations of corresponding secretary. Dr. Prince spoke on report.

Dr. W. Johnson of Louisiana gave notice that he would offer resolution on correlation. Corresponding Secretary's report adopted. Song, "Blest be the tie that binds." Announcements by Dr. S. S. Jones. Dr. H. A. Boyd made announcements of Sunday School to be held at Convention on Sunday 9 o'clock a. m.

THURSDAY—Morning Session.

9:30—Vice President Coleman called the Convention to order, asking Dr. H. M. Williams of Texas and Dr. E. W. White, Louisiana, to take charge of the Bible Lesson, but on account of time was postponed.

In the absence of C. E. Askew and Rev. C. T. Dorrah, Rev. W. M. Davis, Florida and S. A. Pleasant of Texas were called to conduct devotions. Rev. S. A. Pleasant read Psalm 7:5. Rev. W. M. Davis offered prayer. President J. E. Wood called for reading of minutes of Wednesday. The Journal was read and adopted.

Motion that President's Annual Address be given at 4 o'clock Thursday.

Motion prevailed that this action be rescinded. Dr. H. M. Williams of Texas moved that all conflicting items of program be suspended and that President's Address be given at this morning session. Said motion seconded and adopted. As the president stated he was ready now or at any time to give it as he felt better. Dr. Coleman, vice president, asked Dr. J. W. Hulse to take the chair. Dr. Hulse presented the president, paying a high tribute of respect to our president for his great service. Song chorus "By and By."

Dr. Wood delivered his Annual Message with power, although he was sick, touching all of the vital needs of this Convention.

PRESIDENT'S ANNUAL ADDRESS

Indianapolis, Ind., September 8, 1926.
My Brethren in Christ:

"A beautiful statue stood in the market place of an Italian city. It represented a Grecian maiden of graceful form, beautiful face, and noble expression. One day an unkempt, sloven girl came face to face with the statue. She gazed at it in wonder and admiration. It stirred long-dormant instincts within her. 'I can be like that,' she said to herself, 'something within me tells me so.' She went home, washed her face and combed her tangled locks. The next day she went to the market-place and gazed long at the statue, and then went home and washed and mended her tattered garments. Thereafter, day by day she went to look upon the figure of the Grecian maiden, and day by day she changed. She straightened her shoulders, her form became graceful, her face became radiant and refined, till by and by she was transformed into the likeness of the statue. So may each of us coming to this Convention see Jesus only during our stay in this city—behold His loving face, His generous spirit, His supremely holy character, till we shall go from here filled with light, and love, and life, that men may see: 'They have been with Jesus.'"

Before us lie duty, opportunity and blessings. Shall we be keen enough of comprehension to discern our duty, wise enough to seize our opportunity, and humble enough before His throne to receive the blessing? That one among us who will understand that he will

recognizes this occasion to serve the denomination, humanity, and his God, is the greatest among us; will answer the oft repeated question: 'What good is a National Baptist Convention?' He will pour out his selfish ambition, empty himself of all spirit, of vain glory and lay his ability, his influence and his money on the altar to be used of God. He will be found wanting never where duty calls; he will never stand idle when great tasks are to be done.

The ties of love, which bind the hearts of men and women in this Convention into a glorious unity and fellowship, demonstrate the teachings of that beautiful Psalm which says, "Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity." Those lowly and self-sacrificing servants of Jesus Christ, who have followed the cause of this Convention, who have followed its fortunes in sunshine and shadow, who have sought not their own glory and personal advancement, but have labored to advance the glory of His Cross, stand out today as great heroes in Christian endeavor and brilliant achievements. Some of them have fallen fighting in the ranks, but their lives and labors form a blazing Milky Way from earth's toils to heaven's joys. They labored in their sector on the great and eternal temple on which we are building and their memory should awaken in our bosom the spirit to dare, to do and to die; that the banner of the Cross shall wave in every land and among all nations.

The world has a right to expect of us great things today, big things spiritually, big things Godly, big things financially. We shame and outrage the persons who have trusted us and have chosen us to represent them in matters pertaining to the Kingdom if we fail to do a work in this Convention commensurate with our resources, our ability and our numbers. Shall we fail the cause which we represent? Shall we fail the thousands of Baptists throughout this country looking this way today? Shall we disappoint our supporters and admirers? Had I the erudition of a Paul, the language of a Beecher, the oratory of a Webster and the fiery eloquence of a Patrick Henry, I would plead the cause of man's redemption and the call to Christian service before you, till all who sit before me this day would stand upon their feet and swear eternal allegiance to the Kingdom of Christ and bring their possessions—their ability, their talent, their influence, their all—and lay them on the altar to be used of Him in reclaiming and sanctifying a lost world.

At the beginning of the year a group of young ministers sat down for a conference to consider the worth-while things to claim their attention for 1926. Growing out of that conference these ministers agreed upon four objectives for which they would ask their congregations to work during the year. These objectives are Unity of Purpose, Universal Peace, the Proper Adjustment of Inter-Racial Relations and Personal Evangelism. These objectives possibly rearranged in their importance will challenge the thought and sympathy of all thoughtful disciples of Jesus Christ. In order of importance we might consider Unity of Purpose, Personal Evangelism, Proper Adjustment of Inter-Racial Relations and Universal Peace. In our way of thinking unity of purpose is highly important as the essential in all Christian activities and it is secured only by the surrender of our will into the will of Jesus Christ. It can be said of us that we are of one mind only when we have the mind of Christ.

If we are here today to do His will, if there be in our hearts a desire that the things shall be accomplished which He wants accomplished, if we are willing to do anything, to be anything, to suffer anything for His glory, each and every one of us possessing this spirit, then we are a unit of purpose. Personal evangelism is second in importance. Not only the future of the church, but the future of the world's civilization depends upon personal evangelism. Christianity got her big start in the first century through the activities of saved men who made the saving of others a personal duty. My only hope of the world's redemption socially, commercially, politically, is through the teachings of Jesus Christ. As valuable as may be the work of secular education as useful as may be the service which the community workers and the social reformer render society, if the gospel of Jesus Christ is left out these efforts will be ineffectual in rendering any lasting good to the human race. The gospel of Christ alone is God's saving power and if mankind is to be saved—the African, the Indian, the Chinaman, the Caucasian—it must be saved through this gospel. The recognition of this eternal truth lays upon every disciple of Jesus Christ the stupendous task of subsidizing every resource to spread the gospel among all peoples.

May whatever we attempt here have for its ultimate aim the making of Jesus known, to all the world.

Much is being said and done nowadays about adjusting inter-racial relations. Pulpit and press, church and state, are giving much attention to this important subject, but I see no solution to this problem outside of the gospel. To attempt to adjust relations between man to man, race to race, class to class, upon any other basis than the teachings of Jesus Christ, is the sheerest folly. Until the disciples of Jesus Christ accept all saved men and women on equal terms in the scale of brotherhood, the preachments of the adjustment of inter-racial relations is a delusion. A minister told us recently of an experience in his life. He had been raised in the North and was called to pastor and influential church in the South. He knew a cultured, consecrated Negro preacher and had heard him address large audiences of white and black, even the Southern Baptist Convention. So he said to him, if in his travel he ever passed his way he should be glad to have him preach to his congregation. Some months afterward he was advised that this Negro minister would be passing through his city, and so he said to his officers that he would be glad to make an appointment for him. These officers advised him that they did not think their people would understand his inviting this Negro to speak from his pulpit and suggested that the city auditorium would be the more logical place in which to have him speak.

Court houses and city auditoriums, meet on equal terms and listen to speakers of different races with much jubilation in political campaigns and prohibition campaigns, and these same folks would call a halt if it were undertaken to hold a soul-saving campaign under similar conditions. Can the race question and the adjustment of inter-racial relations ever be solved satisfactory to the teachings of Jesus Christ as long as the church and the gospel ministry and the missionaries of all races and people can not meet on a common level in all Christian work manifesting the same fellowship and spirit of cooperation as men of the world show in secular affairs? Doctor

Booker T. Washington in his lifetime, used to tell a story of a southern planter who said to his Negro servant that the white people of that section were putting on an advertising campaign to induce the moneyed men of the country to buy lands and come into the south. The Negro servant said, "Boss, I am opposed to that proposition." The land owner wanted to know his objection. "Well," said the Negro, "We Negroes have as many white folks down here as we can take care of." Until there is a change of heart and purpose and practice in many of the professed followers of Jesus Christ, the church is suffering today from an over-abundance of church members. The church has lost much of its prestige, not because of the attacks of atheists and infidels, but because of the inconsistency of its own members in dealing with inter-racial matters; and the inconsistency is not all on one side of the house. Until the Negro Christian shall practice love and kindness toward all races, regardless of the attitude of those races toward him, he is not prepared to criticize others for their attitude. In truth, it is far better to manifest the proper Christian spirit toward others than it is to receive this manifestation from others, when in our heart there is hate and malice. The one who hates degrades himself much more than he degrades the one whom he hates. Love and kindness and good-will are the weapons by which we shall conquer in this country. Our blessed Lord though often reviled, reviled not again, and His followers will win by following in the path He trod. In a recent speech, Mr. Darrow, of Chicago, asked the question, why did not Daniel's God and the God that saved the Hebrew children out of the fiery furnace, save the colored people of this country from the fires of segregation, of Jim-Crowism and lynching? I answer, if my people, north and south, or any other people, will be as loyal and true to Daniel's God as Daniel and the Hebrew children were, Jehovah will do all that He did for Daniel and the Hebrew children, and even more. If they will obey the Word of God, if they will be loyal to Jehovah's laws, if they live up to their Bibles and respect the Sabbath and God church and constituted authorities; and live clean, moral lives, God will lift the burdens that oppress them, smite their foes before them and make their enemies to be at peace with them. God has wrought miracles in our behalf as wondrous as dividing the Red Sea and furnishing water out of the rock in the wilderness. The lifting of four million slaves out of the cess-pool and mire of human slavery and clothing them upon the solid rock of American citizenship and clothing them with the rights and privileges of free-men, is as great a miracle as the opening of Blind Bartemeus' eyes and the strengthening of the limbs of the impotent man at the Pool of Bethesda. From a race of slaves He gave the world a Frederick Douglass, the gifted Statesman; a Paul Laurence Dunbar, the poet; a Booker T. Washington, the Wizard of Tuskegee; and a Richard H. Boyd, whose fruit and the rose of Christian literature for Negro people, whose fruit and sweet perfume have inspired Christian geniuses and Negro authors throughout the country. What God has made of my people in this country is a modern miracle equal to anything He did for Israel in Egypt or the early church in the Roman Empire. Today He is locking the jaws of the lions, quenching the fiery furnace, and lifting Josephs, Daniels and Esthers to rule on thrones; and I warn you today if you will make the Ten Commandments and the Sermon on the Mount

your code of morals, there shall come to you, peace and prosperity and happiness which can never be won by the sword.

The fourth objective is Universal Peace, and as much as peace may be desired, it will never come until corruption and crime and injustice are destroyed and truth and righteousness and purity are enthroned in the hearts of men. The League of Nations failed in its attempt to bring about Universal Peace because God was not considered in the compact and it trusted in warships, in airplanes and in poisonous gases instead of the promises of Jehovah. I call upon you this day to seek world peace by teaching the principles of Him who is declared the Prince of Peace.

I believe you are here for the purpose of making more effective the work of missions, Christian education, and to uplift mankind by putting into operation the Great Commission and uniting our Baptist forces in a program that will make concrete the orders received on Olivet's brow.

HOME MISSIONS

Home Missions, the basis of our Convention activities, have been woefully neglected. Till we shall become willing to invest money and men enough in a Home Board to lay a foundation deep and wide, upon which all our other conventional activities may rest, we can never have a very large and lasting convention. The spirit of missions is the incentive to all denominational achievements. When this spirit grows and glows in our hearts it will burst forth in new churches established, new buildings erected, increased salaries for deserving pastors, and the waste places shall be builded up and the desert become a watered garden.

We call upon the members of this Convention and upon Baptists everywhere to so labor to establish a strong mission organization in this country as will make true Ezekiel's prophesy of the holy river where the waters became ankle deep and waist deep and deep enough to swim a horse. It shall be easy to maintain all the worthy objects of this Convention, when the fires which sent Philip to Gaza and Paul to Macedonia, and Carey to India and Livingstone to Africa, begin to burn in our hearts. God grant that the thousands of loyal Baptists will pray, and pray, and pray, till they are moved to give of their substances in such a measure as will build a strong Home Mission Board, and a Home Mission Program in this Convention.

We should not be satisfied till we shall have a half million dollar Home Mission Fund used for the purpose of preaching the gospel in all parts of our common country. The report of the Home Missions Board, which will be read at this Convention, will show that the fires of missions are burning and that this Board has made wonderful strides in mission work this year. I refer you to this report for careful study and consideration.

EDUCATION

While our Convention has declared its purpose to establish and maintain a National Theological and Training Seminary for the preparation of ministers, missionaries and religious workers, yet our activities in the field of education should be extended to every state in which there is a Baptist institution of learning. Our first duty should be to liquidate the mortgage debt on our property at Nashville. This should be done at this meeting, and every Baptist here gathered should give his pro-rata to the accomplishment of the task.

We should also give our fullest endorsement to well established and well conducted schools and colleges operated by Baptists throughout the country. We should render support to these institutions by holding country-wide educational rallies to secure funds to sustain a strong faculty and to secure the necessary buildings and equipments. We should assist in giving the widest publicity to the work of Baptist schools and labor to fill their dormitories with students. We should support some outstanding college in the east, and the southeast, the west and the north. This Convention could furnish students and monies for these colleges and in turn these colleges would send promising candidates for the ministry and missionary fields to the National Seminary for training for their work. Education is valuable and conducive to good citizenship only when it is maintained under proper influences. Our country suffers much today and the vilest attacks upon our Christianity come from some of the most brilliant minds of the age because of an education given under improper influence. Thousands of bright intellects are being trained away from the faith of the fathers and away from the Bible and the church, in institutions of learning controlled by Liberalists and Modernists. Deplore this as we may, we can never overcome these conditions until we are willing to put consecrated men and consecrated money enough into our denominational program to enable our schools and colleges to compete with these non-Christian institutions. I call upon you this day, who are charged with the task of keeping the teachings of our Lord and Master pure and unadulterated, to lay upon the altar \$25,000.00 in this meeting for the defense of the truths we love and for the cause for which we stand.

CHURCH EXTENSION

While our Church Extension Board has done marvelously well with what it had to do, it is obvious to every thoughtful person who has given the church extension work any consideration, that there is need of closer organization, and a stronger business management of this Board. This does not mean that those in control of this phase of our work have not done well; but it is apparent to all that they, nor any other set of men, can do a lasting service in their sphere until church extension is founded on the solid rock of Christian business. We must have a board composed of men imbued with the one thought of building more church edifices and lifting those already built and debt-ridden, up from under the load under which they groan. This Board should elect a secretary-treasurer, and pay him a salary which will allow him to give his whole time to this work. He should be capable of interesting business men, bankers and philanthropists in church extension and establish a church extension fund which would be on the board in a position to finance a building proposition of \$5,000.00 or \$10,000.00 on short notice.

Under the notice of this board should come church architecture and the board should offer suggestions and advice to building committees in order that church buildings erected be adapted to worship and church administration. Much money and embarrassment would be saved if proper advice were given churches contemplating new buildings.

FOREIGN MISSIONS

As disciples of Jesus Christ advance in the school of missions, it will become more and more apparent that there is no more home missions nor foreign missions but just missions. In the Great Commission, Jesus saw the Hottentot, and the Zulu, the Chinaman and Norseman, the Indian and all the nations of the earth as one world. The incentive to do foreign mission work must spring up on this side and not in the heathen land, if the work is to be permanent and effectual. That person who is moved by the distressing pagan, will never render the larger service to the cause. Missionary activities on foreign fields should be inspired by love and loyalty to Jesus Christ, and a born desire to acquaint mankind with the Saviour so dear and loving to your own heart. The constituents in this Convention should adopt the New Testament mission plan and beginning at Jerusalem witness for Jesus unto the uttermost parts of the earth. The wisdom of this program is apparent when we remember the Proverb: "Physician, heal thyself;" and until Christians in America can make America a Christian nation, the heathen will laugh and scorn when we attempt to Christianize them. Hence, it is as necessary that we conduct and train our forces at home in the principles of missions as it is that we send missionaries to the foreign field. For in fact, if we send men and women to foreign lands with untrained and prepared supporters behind to sustain them, we send them out to suffer and die. If we attempt to do mission work in Africa, and Japan while we bite and devour one another at home, and while prejudice and hate wrangle in our breasts the one against the other, and while lawlessness and crime flourish here at a greater degree even than in the darkest heathen land, conditions at home will nullify all we attempt to do abroad. Let us keep before us the true spirit and purpose of sending out the gospel and then we will lay sane plans and render unselfish service.

The plan of cooperation formed between this convention and the Lott Carey Foreign Mission Society is a step in the right direction, and if carried out in the spirit of Jesus Christ, without any attempt to honor any body or any organization, but Jesus Christ, will hasten the day when the gospel shall be preached in every land. The loyal disciple of Jesus Christ does not consider whether he shall be known as a missionary hero or whether there shall come to him distinguished honors for service rendered on the foreign field, but he would be happy in service were heathen lands brought to a knowledge of Jesus Christ even though he himself was never known among the missionary workers. We believe that wise, sane and unselfish counselors in this Convention and in our sister organization will work out this plan of cooperation to the redemption of the world and the glory of God. Let us all be patient and unselfish and willing to put our best service into the plan. I counsel the churches making up this Convention to increase their contributions to the foreign mission work, remembering that bread cast upon the waters will return again, and if we build up a foreign mission fund that will sustain and increase the work undertaken in heathen lands, there will be no necessity for scrambling for glory, for in saving a lost world there will be glory enough for all.

PUBLISHING BOARD

Our National Baptist Publishing Board blossoms and sends forth its sweet perfume as the bright and consummate flower of our highest aspirations and richest achievements. It is through this Board that we must disseminate among all peoples, Baptist thought and New Testament teachings. This Board has made known to the world the authors and writers among Negro Baptists and among all peoples, as no other organization has been able to do. It has given to Negro Baptists standing and prestige that challenge the literary world. It has produced authors and writers. It has created a place for thousands of our young people. It has borne upon its back the burdens of the denomination. It has put thousands of dollars into our missionary funds. It has kept the denominational fires burning in every section of our country and in every foreign field. The corpse of faithless and discouraged Baptists have seen its light and stood upon their feet. It is no longer an object of controversy; its purpose and character are clearly defined in the charter under which it operates, and the records of Davidson County, Tennessee, show its relations to Negro Baptists of this country. Hence, we have no cause for engaging in bitter controversy, but honest and intelligent persons will examine these records and be willing to stand by them, and the person who in the face of them insists in making false representations or seeks to misinform the public, or to create false impression among the people, is unworthy of consideration. I need not call upon you to stand by and support this beautiful maiden, fair and pleasant, whose statue is like the palm tree; whose head is like carmel and hair like purple; whose eyes are like the fish pools in Heshbon and fruit like cluster of grapes that shaketh in Lebanon. The National Baptist Convention will never die as long as Henry Allen Boyd races the country from the Lakes to the Gulf, and from the Atlantic to the Pacific; and sings the song of progress and efficiency as exemplified in the masterful institution at 523 2nd Avenue, North, Nashville, Tennessee. A small token of our appreciation can best be manifested in every member of this convention making at least one yearly purchase of the products of this Publishing Board and speaking a word of cheer and good-will to those who are giving their lives that it may not fail. If you have confidence in J. P. Robinson, in E. R. Carter, in L. E. Campbell, in J. L. Harding, in G. B. Taylor; if you have confidence in H. Allen Boyd, you are willing to commend the future of this Publishing Board to the loyal support and love of succeeding generations. A young man stood before an old minister bowed with the weight of years and labor, and pointed out to him the defects in the church edifice he had builded. When this young man had finished, the old man looked straight into the eyes of the young man and said: "I can not point out any defects in the building you have built." The world's record will show that those who would criticize and find fault with our National Baptist Publishing Board, not one of them, have built a worthy institution of any kind.

OTHER BOARDS

Our Evangelical Board, our Benefit Board and our Laymen's League deserve our consideration. The work of soul-saving and caring for the aged and infirm ministers and the work of centraliz-

ing, controlling and utilizing the man power in our churches, as represented by our Laymen's League, is by no means to be despised; and we hope our churches everywhere will give the wide door of opportunity to our evangelistic staff, and that ways and means may be utilized to make the Benefit Board a real asset, and that we may encourage the laymen in our churches by giving them such prominence on the program in this Convention as shall bring a thousand churchmen, other than preachers, to the sessions of the Convention. I congratulate the churchmen, lawyers and doctors, mechanics and merchants, who find time to turn aside from their secular occupations to work with us in extending the Kingdom. Their counsel, their cooperation and the money they give to support the ministry and all church activities should receive our highest appreciation.

WOMAN'S AUXILIARY

Our woman's auxiliary has proven a source of encouragement, inspiration and financial assistance to the work of this Convention. Without its aid what we have accomplished could not have been accomplished. Woman is the sensitive flower which responds to the faintest solicitation and which beautifies and sweetens everything she touches. She is true to every trust, loyal in any cause and walks the path of service with unflinching devotion. Jockabed, Hannah, Ruth and Esther won unfading glory in their day and gave to the world the highest example of unselfish service, loyalty and queenly virtues. They have their prototypes in Madames Georgia DeBaptist Faulkner, M. A. B. Fuller, Anna Washington, Wm. Grimble, J. L. Harding, J. H. Winn, G. W. Alexander, Lula Mae Hurse, S. R. Prince, I. H. Kelly, and a score of others, whose character is as fair as the sun and service as Gibraltic as the Andes Mountain. They deserve our counsel and encouragement. We extend to them a hand of full cooperation in building a national organization and extending the work of the Kingdom.

STAND-BYS

The loyal, unswerving, rooted-and-grounded in the truth disciples of Christ are the class upon whom the civilization of the world depends. Our churches and schools and Christian homes, our civilization and the foundation upon which the government rests, look to this class of men of faith and hope and love for their sustenance and perpetuation. Mean jealousies, false representations, slanders and hypocrites, have never won and will never win a victory for Jehovah and wickedness, they must come clean with God and clean with their brethren. The humble, the faithful, the pure in heart, have nothing to fear, but a guilty conscience makes cowards of us all. Men skulk in the dark and form unholy alliances over night and resort to strategy and schemes to accomplish selfish designs, but their Haman will become entangled in their own net they have set, and as a lion, he shall flourish as the palm tree, his strength is renewed like that of the eagle.

Whatever program may be laid at this Convention must be dealt with as God's plans and purposes and not as mere exigencies and man-made policies for the emergency. God's purposes are eternal. He may be ten thousand years producing a diamond from

or a load of coal soot, but He will be neither hurried in His process nor frightened from His task; and when it is finished it will be perfect. And so man who would construct a program under God must make his program after God's conception and attributes. The program we would construct must first, by the grace of God, be formed in our hearts. Let God's kingdom be planted in you and let it grow out as the flowers blossom from the tiny seed planted in the garden walk. A man infected with measles will infect others, and when we become infected with missions, world evangelization and Christian training, others about us will catch the disease. Leaders must use wisdom judgment and precision. They must not permit their feelings to carry them away from the straight and narrow path of duty. At times a leader must do the unpopular thing, which will bring down upon his head the wrath of the populace, but he must be true to his God, true to his conscience and true to the interest of the people. Lincoln's war policy not only made him unpopular in the South, but many of the northern politicians and statesmen condemned him. However, he whom they assassinated in 1865 is loved and adored throughout the civilized world in 1926.

OVERCOME BY FAITH

The achievements of the leaders and reformers and builders have made real history in the world by faith. "By faith Abraham when he was called obeyed." "By faith Moses when he was come to years refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter." "By faith the walls of Jericho fell down." "By faith the harlot Rachab perished not." And the pathfinders of latter days discovered that they could win in life's battles by faith and not by genius, and culture, and wealth. By faith Columbus discovered a new world; by faith the Pilgrim Fathers, the Quakers and the Huguenots planted villages along the coast of the Atlantic and laid the foundation of our Republic. By faith Jefferson, Adams, Franklin and Hamilton gave us the Constitution and the Declaration of Independence. By faith Luther led the Reformation and William Carey planted the rose of modern missions in India; by faith Phillips and Lovejoy and Garrison struck human slavery in this country its death blow. By faith the leaders in our race just emerged from the degrading system of human slavery, organized churches, established schools, and laid the foundation for good homes and business enterprises, which make this race of mine the marvel of the civilized world. As much as we may prize and respect intellect and ability, and human instrumentality, our success and attainment will depend upon our faith. "All things are possible to him that believeth." We shall never win in this country by trickery, strategy and advantage; but if we shall ever build a permanent citizenship, it must be accomplished by faith in the promises and principles of Jesus Christ. Our banks fail, our great commercial enterprises go to pieces, our educational programs flounder upon the rocks, our churches and associations and national conventions lag behind, not because we have not the money to support them, not because we have not the men with brain and talent to operate them, not because as Baptists we have not the numbers in our churches to sustain them, but because we fail to comply with the

teachings of God, who declared, "Upon this rock I will build my church and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it." The faith which led Moses across the Red Sea, Joshua around the walls of Jericho, Nehemiah to rebuild the walls of Jerusalem, led Lincoln and Frederick Douglass and Sojourner Truth to plead the cause of liberty and human rights until freedom reached forth her hand and lifted four million slaves up out of the mire of serfdom and set their feet upon the solid rock of freedom and American citizenship. And that same faith will lead my people out of the present bondage of ignorance and superstition into the Promised Land of usefulness and happiness.

CONCLUSION

And now, my brethren, if we should review the history and achievements of Baptists there looms before us a shining monument of glorious deeds and benefactions. From the days of John the Baptist until now has the Kingdom of Heaven been preached by Baptists Paul and Peter and John and Bunyan and Spurgeon and William J. Simmons and Gattie and Lee and Morris and Boyd and Loti Carey and Luke, and an unlimited number of heroes who have fought the good fight, won the victory and now rest under the shades of the Tree on the banks of the River of Life, bequeath to us their faith, their character, their ability, and labors, as a rich heritage. Their memory inspires and cheers our spirits in this sacred presence. Their we not pledge to the cause for which they gave their undying sacrifice on high, let us perform so well the task committed unto us that their spirits and all the holy angels in heaven will rejoice at our accomplishments. When for the last time the King of Day mounts up with fire, and Milky Way shall fade, and stars shall tremble and planets burn up, and kingdoms and throne shall crumble, and all the works of man pass away, then I want you and me and the faithful soldiers in Christ everywhere who come to appear before our great Commander, laden with trophies won on many a battlefield, to bear our Redeemer say, "Well done, good and faithful servant." Let us labor together here and rejoice together before His deathly throne in heaven.

The same was favorably received by the entire Convention.

Dr. G. L. Prince moved that the President's Message and Recommendations be adopted now without even going to committee; seconded by Dr. S. S. Jones. Motion adopted. By motion Dr. W. Johnson, Louisiana, seconded by Rev. M. Robinson, Texas, that the president now be elected to succeed himself was unanimously adopted. Dr. Dixon moved that rules be suspended. Dr. J. W. Hulse succeeded himself as First Vice President. Dr. S. S. Jones

seconded the motion which was unanimously adopted. Dr. Charles H. Clark of Chicago, announced meeting of Railroad Commission at 10 o'clock. Miss Alice Kelly of Walker Manufacturing Co., spoke to the Convention urging the sending of Dr. J. E. Wood around the world and paid high tribute of respect to Dr. Hulse, saying his sermon was the best that she had ever heard. President J. E. Wood asked Convention to make provision for changes that occurred by Convention changing program. Moved, seconded and adopted that the president make those changes, which president did.

Benediction, Dr. J. P. Robinson, Arkansas.

THURSDAY—Afternoon Session.

Dr. G. C. Coleman presiding. Mrs. S. E. A. Hicks sang "Pray, pray" also "Sunshine." Dr. J. H. Randolph, Washington, D. C., read from Matthew 26th chapter beginning with the 40th verse. Prayer by Dr. W. H. Stokes. Rev. F. W. Williams preached the Educational Sermon, using the subject, "Christian Education." Text, Luke 2:52. "And Jesus increased in wisdom and stature and in favor with God and man." The sermon was full of power, spirit and instruction. Dr. Charles H. Clark of Chicago led in a fervent prayer, that seemed to move the entire audience. Mrs. S. E. A. Hicks sang "Just a little while." President J. E. Wood requested Dr. J. A. Sharpe to lead in the Educational Rally. Dr. Sharpe made a great plea for us to do our full duty for the school. An offering of Seven Hundred and Eighty-five (\$785.00) Dollars was received at this time.

THURSDAY—Evening Session.

Dr. S. S. Jones gave a stereopticon lecture on the Holy Land showing many scenes of the Holy Land and also scenes of many notable gatherings of churches and also of meeting of the Sunday School Congress. All were very instructive and pleased the audience. After this the chorus sang "Wade in the water." "Victory Through Faith" was discussed by Rev. J. H. E. Nelson, New Jersey. FRIDAY—Morning Session.

Dr. H. M. Williams, Galveston, conducted the Bible period, giving a great lesson on "The Essentials in Mis-

sions." He seemed filled with the lesson and gave a great lesson. After this the minutes of the previous session were read by the Secretary and adopted. Dr. Gaines spoke concerning the report of this Convention. Dr. William Johnson presented a resolution on the matter of correlation. (See resolution.)

Dr. J. P. Robinson, Arkansas announced receiving a telegram that Dr. Booker, President of Arkansas College was dead at Fort Worth, Texas.

Song, Mrs. Harrietta Solomon, Texas, "I didn't feel no ways tired." Prayer by Dr. E. C. Cole, St. Louis. Scripture lesson, Matthew 28:19, 20; Mark 16:16-17 was read by the secretary, Charles W. Lewis, Indianapolis by request of Dr. B. J. Prince. President J. E. Wood presented Dr. B. J. Prince to the Convention to preach. Dr. Prince used as a text, Matthew 28:19-20, subject, "God's Program to the Church." His sermon deeply moved his audience. Solo by Mrs. B. J. Prince, "Saved, saved."

Report of the Trustees of the school was called for and Dr. A. A. Lucas of Texas made the report of the Board, giving total of money received, but at this time did not have account of expenses nor money paid out. Moved and adopted to receive the report and said report be given to certified accountant. Notice of banquet for messengers to Convention was given by President Wood for Saturday evening 6:30 to 8:30.

An offering of \$1005.30 was taken for Education. By consent of the Convention the Foreign Mission and Benefit Board will report Friday night.

A resolution was presented by Dr. L. L. Campbell to have committee appointed to draft resolutions of sympathy and respect on account of the death of Dr. Booker. A Committee of Condolence was appointed: Dr. L. L. Campbell, Dr. C. P. Madison and Dr. J. P. Robinson. (See committee report.)

Benediction by Dr. M. Robinson, Texas.

FRIDAY—Afternoon Session.

Devotions conducted by Rev. W. Short, Oklahoma and Rev. E. W. Dixon, North Carolina. Rev. Dixon read 6th chapter of Second Corinthians. Prayer was offered by Rev. Short. Sister Keller, Chicago, rendered a solo. Dr. W. T. Johnson, Virginia of the Lott Carey Convention having to return to Richmond, was immediately introduced to the

Convention and made a strong plea for cooperation in the Mission work. The Convention was highly pleased with Dr. Johnson's talk. Dr. J. P. Robinson, Arkansas, chairman of the Home Mission Board was presented and spoke on Home Missions, afterward presenting Dr. I. M. Hendon, Corresponding Secretary of the Board to make report for the Home Mission Board. Dr. Hendon gave a fine report of the Board's activities during the past year.

By proper motion the report was adopted. Offering for Home Mission Board taken was \$177.70.

The Foreign Mission Board was allowed thirty minutes to make report Saturday a. m., at 9 o'clock.

Dr. J. R. Plummer made report for the Evangelical Board as Secretary Rev. A. A. Banks was sick. Said report was adopted. Offering for the Board of \$12.00 was taken.

Dr. E. W. White offered resolutions concerning the death of Dr. Joshua Henderson. (See resolutions.)
Benediction by Rev. R. G. Garner, Oklahoma.

FRIDAY—Evening Session.

7 p. m. Dr. Coleman called the meeting to order. Selection by Prof. H. B. P. Johnson, National Chorister. Dr. W. Johnson Corresponding Secretary of Extension Board made report of the Board. Said report was turned over to the Accounting Committee. An offering of \$29.51 was taken. Selection by the chorus. Dr. D. J. Hull spoke of Rev. Henry Allen Boyd and his worth to our race and denomination. Dr. J. P. Robinson paid a high tribute to Secretary H. A. Boyd also and presented him. He made a fine report of the work of the Board.

TO THE CHAIRMAN AND MEMBERS OF THE NATIONAL BAPTIST PUBLISHING BOARD OF THE NATIONAL BAPTIST CONVENTION OF AMERICA.

Divine Providence has led us safely through another year's work. We thank God for His loving kindness and tender mercy. We wish to thank the Board members individually and collectively, and the denomination as a whole, for the part they have played in bringing a measure of success to the institution that we have the honor to serve as secretary. We wish therefore, to submit the following:

The Late E. H. Boyd.

Words are not at my command to pay the deserved and proper tribute to the founder of the National Baptist Publishing Board, the late Dr. R. H. Boyd, who builded more wisely than he knew when he laid the foundation for this printing, publishing and manufacturing establishment. Far-sighted leaders, Christian-hearted ministers, experienced business men have all joined in one acclaim as it were, to give him honor and praise. He has gone down as one of the wise, safe builders. It is sufficient therefore, for us to pass him this compliment; although he has been gathered to his Father, we feel that if he were here he would receive it modestly and continue on his constructive program.

Personnel of the Board.

No change whatever has been made in the personnel of the National Baptist Publishing Board. Dr. J. P. Robinson of Little Rock, Ark., the venerable pastor, State Convention President and editor, is still the Chairman. Rev. G. B. Taylor of Nashville, Tenn., pastor and churchman, is the Vice-Chairman. The other members are Rev. J. A. Brown, Chicago, Illinois; Rev. H. A. Alfred, Nashville, Tenn., Moderator of the Stone River Association and pastor of Mt. Nebo Baptist Church; Rev. H. M. Burns, Nashville, Tenn.; Rev. E. R. Carter, Atlanta, Ga., pastor of the Friendship Baptist Church; Rev. L. L. Campbell, Austin, Texas, pastor of the Ebenezer Baptist Church, and President of the General Baptist Convention of Texas; Rev. J. L. Harding, Nashville, Tenn., President of the Baptist State Convention of Tennessee and pastor of the Third Avenue Baptist Church, and Henry Allen Boyd, Nashville, Tenn.

The Scope of Work.

No limitations have been put on the scope of denominational work along the lines of religious publications and literature of your Board in the past year. The same amount of activity that has characterized the Plant's efforts since its organization has been put into force and practice. The developments have gone rapidly forward and the limitations to the territory into which the National Baptist Publishing Board's products have been pushed are apparently boundless.

In the far off Philippine Islands as well as the various coasts of South and West Africa, we have endeavored to render the same service in filling orders promptly.

Our Various Departments.

The National Baptist Publishing Board has its Plant thoroughly organized so that it may function through its various departments. This has enabled us to systematize the work, parcelling it out and holding the heads of each of these departments responsible for the prosecution of the work as well as expediting the business.

The various heads of the departments make up a Council, or in other words, they form a cabinet for the secretary. He has relied much upon these heads of departments, has depended upon this council and these Chief Clerks, Foremen and Superintendent to furnish detailed statements each day for the work to be done. The following are the departments and their heads:

The Editorial Department is under the supervision of Rev. D. J. Hall, A. M., D. D., the Editorial Secretary, with the Correspondence Course Department, Rev. T. B. Livingston, D. D., Dean and Rev. J. A. Sharpe, D. D., as Superintendent of the Teacher Training Department.

The Secretarial Department is under the direction of Miss S. B. Wilson, Office Secretary.

The Stenographic Department is conducted and operated by Mrs. A. E. Tittle, Chief of that Department.

The Manufacturing Department is under the direction of Mr. L. S. Gray, the General Foreman.

The Sunday School Mission Work is under the supervision of Rev. S. J. Dixon.

The Department of the Union-Review has as Managing Editress, Miss N. E. King. The Editor of the Union-Review is Dr. John H. Frank, but he resides in Louisville, Ky.

The Department of Bookkeeping and Accounts is under the supervision of Mr. A. E. Weeks.

The Book-binding Department is in charge of Mr. Lee S. Gray.

The Press Room Department, with all of its presses, is under the supervision of Mr. George S. Davis.

The Composing Room, where all of the typesetting is done, forms are laid out, etc., is under the management of Mr. Daniel R. Penton. This department embraces the linotypes and proofreading; we merged these three into one, thereby cutting down some of the overhead cost of supervision.

The Cabinet Department is under the supervision of Mr. Charles Watkins.

The First-class Mailing Room, where all the orders are read, calculated and labels written, is under the supervision of Miss Annie Polk.

The Second-class Mailing Department, where all the orders are counted out, wrapped and dispatched to the post office, is managed by Mr. G. P. Baker.

These heads of various departments not only hold their councils, but they have a safety committee whose duty it is to look after and keep themselves informed on the physical condition of the Plant.

Editorial Secretary's Office and Contributors.

In our report last year we paid our respects to the editorial secretary's Office and the work he was doing in giving the denomination, as well as the race, a class of publications from a literary point of view that did not necessarily have to take second place with any. His office has been strengthened and an addition has been made to the editorial force by putting on better writers, experienced thinkers and outstanding denominational leaders. Their work has already meant much to the editorial secretary's force. Then too, he has strengthened the literature by giving his résearches and improved exposition on the Bible.

Periodicals, Publications, Requisites—Their Circulation.

Meeting the demands of an exact, yet growing clientele such as is found in the various Sunday schools scattered throughout the confines of the National Baptist Convention of America, is a task that has confronted the National Baptist Publishing Board this past year; but it has been equal to the occasion. Periodicals have been published regularly, denominational books issued consecutively, requisites prepared constantly, and the circulation has been increased by a large per cent. Improvements have been made in the Sunday School Literature and in the National Baptist Sunday School Lesson Commentary. Maps of the Holy Land in colors have been inserted in the Commentary for 1927. Two songs are to be found in each of the Sunday School and B. Y. P. U. Magazines. The improvement has been gradual but steady.

Standard Books and Denominational Helps.

In order to meet the growing demand for denominational and standard books for ministers, teachers, as well as laymen, your Board has had to go to an unusually heavy expense, because it had to finance the effort by buying the paper, ink, labor and other materials, for manufacturing these books and placing them on the shelf.

More than 100,000 books have been placed upon the shelf during the past fiscal year, which only means if they do not move and are not circulated, paid for and put in the hands of our denominational leaders, the money will still be lying there. We are confident however, that the denomination will appreciate this far-sightedness on the part of the Board and continue to accept the service.

Machinery and Mechanical Department.

Because the Board has decided on a plan of economy and conservatism, the authority given to the secretary to install new machinery in the press room, in the bookbinding department as well as in the composing room, was not taken advantage of. He felt, and still feels that it would be far better to use some of the old machinery a little longer than to incur an unusual debt upon the Plant, which debt would have to be met by the payment of the principal and interest, so that

aside from the installation of a few new typewriters to take the place of those that had seen long service, no additional machinery has been put in any of the departments of the National Baptist Publishing Board's Plant for the past year.

The Physical Plant and Real Estate.

Property values in Nashville have increased rapidly. Those who will look at the real estate deals and will take time to post themselves will see that the real estate owned by your Board located at Second Avenue, North and Locust Street, almost completely surrounded by streets and alleys, lies between the Public Square and the L. and N. Railroad track, so that in the expansion of the city it is bound to come in as the most desirable manufacturing property.

The buildings are still very desirable and are used more as a manufacturing plant than as office buildings. Their physical condition, while needing certain repairs, is by no means weak. They put up a real appearance and occupy a conspicuous place in the eyes of Nashville's public.

Correspondence Course Department.

Following up its record of thirty years of service, and desirous of helping the masses of ministers, Sunday school teachers, B. Y. P. U. workers, religious helpers, a Correspondence Course Department has been added to the National Baptist Publishing Board's service. The lessons are edited by experienced writers so that the individuals may remain at home and pursue a prescribed course that will be helpful to them. Already the registration shows a large number of persons taking advantage of this department to improve themselves. The price has been placed so low that it is proving a real inducement.

The B. Y. P. U. Department.

Ever since the National Baptist Convention at its Chicago session gave the National Baptist Publishing Board exclusive permission to sell, circulate and disseminate as well as to print, bind and edit all the B. Y. P. U. literature, tracts and paraphernalia for the B. Y. P. U.'s, in other words, allowing it to have a real B. Y. P. U. Department, new life has been noticeable, continues, there will be ten thousand Societies on the roll every section of the confines of our Convention.

The B. Y. P. U. Department of the National Baptist Publishing Board's Plant has functioned in a very large way, and we predict that if the present growth which is now noticeable and new Societies have sprung up in many churches in within the next two or three years.

Teacher Training.

One of the hardest tasks that we have endeavored to put over in connection with the National Baptist Publishing Board's work is the Teacher Training Department. While we have secured the service of a superintendent of this department and have endeavored to keep him moving about from one section of the country to the other, it has not been a rapid going department, and yet we predict that ere long in every church there will be seen the need of a thoroughly trained, competent corps of teachers for the Sunday school as well as the Church School.

This Teacher Training Department is not only stationed at the Publishing Board's Plant under the supervision of this superintendent, but there is a correspondence feature enabling those churches and localities who are not able to get the superintendent for fifteen or twenty days, to do his practical work in institutes, to study by mail. We commend the Teacher Training Department to the denomination.

The National Baptist Union-Review.

Without missing a single issue, and without inserting as much as one page of patent plate matter, the National Baptist Union-Review has been issued every week during the past fiscal year. The editorial tone has been kept up to a high standard; the news columns have been brimful and fairly bristling with denominational news; the circulation has increased so that we come back this year rejoicing in the fact that it is still the leading Baptist Journal published in the United States by the Negro Baptists.

Its splendid features like the Homiletic Department, the Woman's Page, the editorials and the general news have proved very attractive.

What We Need.

We need the prayers of the denomination individually and collectively, that we may carry on unto God.

Our needs at the National Baptist Publishing Board's Plant along the lines of improvements as a manufacturing plant are, machinery, modern and high-speed, to keep up with the increased orders that come in, and sufficient capital so that we can place upon the shelf requisites and books in large enough quantities to expedite the filling of every order, making delays impossible to exist.

We need cooperation; we need prayerful consideration; we need our denominational leaders to accept the service that has

been so carefully outlined for them and bounteously extended through the Board's Plant.

Looking Forward.

Were we permitted to peep into the morrow; could we but see over yonder in the distant future; if we only knew in advance what the denomination expects of us, many of our problems would be solved.

Looking forward in a financial way; looking forward in a denominational way; looking forward in a manufacturing way; looking forward in every conceivable manner is what must be done if we are to continue to maintain, if we are to keep up our progressive movement, and if we are to remain at the head of our class as religious publishers, printers, manufacturers and suppliers of church helps.

We are looking forward as best we can for 1927 to be our banner year, and to bring within the fold customers who need what we manufacture and supply. We are looking forward to the time when every member out of every family will be in some church, Sunday school or B. Y. P. U. and when religious literature and tracts will be in every home.

The Sunday School Congress.

Without doubt the Lord's benediction rested upon the entire denomination in the Sunday School Congress this year that was held at Columbia, S. C. The consensus of opinion is that it was the best Congress held in the history of the Congress work. It was a constructive meeting, and the state of South Carolina and the city of Columbia made history. The Baptists of the state as well as the city vied with each other in giving hospitable entertainment.

We offer with and as a part of this report the story of the Congress as was stenographically reported, with the enrollment at Columbia, S. C.

TWENTY-FIRST ANNUAL SESSION OF THE SUNDAY SCHOOL CONGRESS HELD AT COLUMBIA, SOUTH CAROLINA, JUNE 8-14, 1926.

The Official Congress Special Train arrived Wednesday, June 8th, at 8:00 a. m., standard time at the Union Station. It was met by the local committee, and immediately a Congress parade was formed which traversed the principal streets of the city to Benedict College, where the sessions were held. The Congress Officials were ushered to the platform and seated, after which Rev. Thomas W. J. Tobias, the chorister, led the chorus in singing "Great Day" out of the National Jubilee Melody; then Dr. J. C. White, the chairman of the local committee, introduced Rev. C. N. Fields of Toledo, Ohio, who offered invocation. He next introduced the chairman of the Sunday School Congress, Rev. J. P. Robinson, D. D., of Little Rock, Arkansas, who declared the Twenty-first Session of the

Sunday School Congress open. After a few preliminary remarks, Rev. Robinson presented the Secretary of the Sunday School Congress, Rev. Henry A. Boyd, at which point Lieut. Gen. Carl Wright, Spartanburg, S. C., led the Cadet and Sunday School Children in yells in honor of Revs. Henry A. Boyd, J. P. Robinson and J. C. White. Another selection was rendered by the chorus during which the President of the National Baptist Convention, Rev. J. Edmund Wood, D. D., of Danville, Ky., entered the auditorium and was ushered to the platform by the chairman of the local committee. He addressed the great throng of delegates and messengers.

The Secretary of the Congress read the themes for the 1926 session, the list of subjects, made announcement of the different departmental sections and introduced the departmental conductors.

Rev. J. C. White introduced Mr. Willie Lee of Bogalusa, La., who presented the Congress forces with three hundred souvenir walking canes and three thousand post cards. Mr. Lee represents the B. Y. P. U. State Convention of Louisiana. After further announcements by the Congress Secretary and Rev. J. C. White, the session recessed for one hour.

At one o'clock a meeting of the departmental conductors was held at which a full outline of the work to be accomplished during this session was given by the Congress Secretary, and a definite constructive program outlined, which concluded the first day's session.

Finance Committee made partial report of grand total of \$337,221.11. Mrs. Faulkner of the Women's Convention spoke of the work done by them and presented Mrs. M. A. B. Fuller, corresponding secretary who made her report. Report adopted with words of praise for the great work they have done.

By motion the convention proceeded to elect place for next session and not wait for Committee on Time and Place to report.

Moved and adopted that ten minutes be given those putting place of meeting in nomination and five minutes given to those seconding nomination. Dr. E. J. Prince placed Denver, Colo., in nomination; Dr. W. Johnson placed Shreveport, La.; Dr. D. B. Gaines, placed Little Rock, Ark.; Dr. Cole placed St. Louis, Mo.

Later Dr. D. B. Gaines moved withdrawal of nomination of Little Rock, Arkansas. Dr. W. Johnson withdrew Shreveport in favor of Denver, Colorado. Dr. E. Cole withdrew St. Louis. It was moved and adopted to go to Denver, Colorado for the next session of this Convention.

The President declared the convention adjourned to meet at 3:30 o'clock.

The Executive Board was called to meet at 2:30. The Executive Board meeting was held at Metropolitan Baptist Church, Dr. J. E. Wood preaching.

Moved and adopted that all ushers and committees would serve free hereafter. Dr. W. Johnson had his vote recorded in the negative.

Motion adopted to apply to all committees and ushers, but not to treasurer who should be paid.

The Field Secretary, Dr. Kelly, asked for information about his work, as to when he should begin, what remuneration should be paid said office and general information concerning his work. Moved and adopted that this board approve action of the former board in allowing a salary of \$1800.00 per year to the president for past year, minus traveling expenses, etc. President Wood submitted \$734.00, leaving a balance owing this year to the President \$1066.00.

By motion the bill of \$1066.00 was allowed the president. With reference to Dr. Kelly and his work it was the opinion of the Executive Board that that would be worked out.

Moved and adopted that a committee of three be appointed to meet Mrs. E. P. Jones and arrange terms of settlement with her for the amount claimed as due her husband. The following committee was appointed by President Wood:

Dr. D. Over, Dr. S. S. Jones and Dr. I. M. Hendon. Moved and adopted that each one as for amounts due them be prorated according to finance raised on hand (agreed to pay each one 30 per cent.)

Moved and adopted to pay Educational money raised to cashier of the Bank in Nashville, Tennessee where notes on school were owed.

FIRST DAY—Morning Session

Chicago, Ill., December 1, 1926.

The Executive Board and Conference of the National Baptist Convention of America, was called to order, on the above date, at 10:00 a. m., in the Antioch Baptist Church, Dr. E. H. Branch, pastor, by President Dr. J. Edmund Wood.

Devotion was conducted by Rev. H. A. Alfred of Nashville, Tenn., and Rev. E. C. Cole of St. Louis, Mo. A season of prayers followed. After brief remarks by President Wood, Pastor E. H. Branch was presented, who extended greetings to the Brotherhood in a hospitable way, and Dr. J. W. Anderson of Portland, Ore., responded in his usual happy manner.

The President conducted an echo meeting, in which all present took part, which was interesting and profitable.

A motion prevailed that we resolve ourselves into an Executive Board Meeting.

By motion M. L. Porter was elected Secretary of the meeting.

President Wood asked that the Board consider the following: (a) Budgeting our work. (b) Financial Program. (c) Perfecting the Records of the Convention. (d) The Condition of Our Boards.

A motion by Dr. G. L. Prince prevailed, that Drs. D. E. Over and M. L. Porter compose a Committee on Printing Convention Minutes.

Dr. H. A. Boyd announced a telegram from Dr. J. H. Frank of Louisville, Ky., expressing his regrets in not being able to be present at Board meeting, which was read and acknowledged.

Dr. G. L. Prince offered a motion that the Executive Board, indicate to the Constitution Committee of the Convention, that we favor a revision of the Constitution that centralizes the work of the Convention in the four (4) fol-

lowing Boards: Publishing Board; Foreign and Home Mission Boards; Educational Board.

A motion to adjourn for one hour prevailed.

Benediction by Rev. L. A. McIntyre.

FIRST DAY—Afternoon Session.

At 2:45 p. m. Pres. Wood called the Conference to order. Rev. J. B. Ridley of Nashville, Tenn. and Rev. P. W. Fields, Springfield, Ill., conducted devotion.

The morning journal was read and approved. After some comment on the program by Pres. Wood, Dr. G. L. Prince, Denver, Colo., opened the subject, "Budgetting the Causes of the Convention," followed by others.

A motion adopting \$400,000 as the Convention's Budget.

A motion prevailed that the Executive Board request that each church of the Convention ask 25 cents per member to raise the Budget. Benediction by Rev. A. D. Williams.

FIRST DAY—Evening Session.

At 8:00 p. m. Rev. A. D. Williams and Rev. A. D. Florence conducted devotion. The local program, with Dr. E. H. Branch as Master of Ceremonies, was rendered to the delight of all present.

Dr. E. W. Dixon of Asheville, N. C., was introduced, who selected as his subject, "The Need of Going Further." Matt. 26:38 and preached a splendid sermon. Dr. L. A. McIntyre of Evansville, Ind., offered prayer. Offering \$7.00. Rev. D. P. Jones announced the illness of Dr. L. Drane.

Benediction by Dr. E. W. Dixon.

SECOND DAY—Morning Session.

Dr. I. M. Hendon read the Scripture and offered prayer. "Saviour more than life to me," was sung. The afternoon and evening journals were read and approved. The Conference adjourned for thirty minutes.

After re-convening Mrs. Georgia D. Faulkner, President of the women's work, spoke on the subject, "The Women's Auxillary and Our Baptist Women" which was inspiring and instructive. She was followed by Mrs. M. A. E. Fuller with some practical and helpful advice. Dr. I. M. Hendon, J. S. Morton, G. L. Prince, J. P. Robinson, J. W. Hulse, H. E. McWilliams, C. H. Clark, H. C. Lewis, followed in the discussion.

A motion prevailed that Dr. A. A. Graham speak at 2 p. m.

A communication from Rev. Jas. Kelly was read, and by motion referred to the following committee: Dr. C. H. Clark and Dr. I. M. Hendon.

Communications from the following were read: Dr. S. S. Jones, Muskogee, Okla., Dr. R. B. Porter, Little Rock, Ark., Dr. L. Hawthorne, Georgiana, Ala., Dr. C. J. Smith, Barton, Fla., Dr. J. H. Hendricks, Okolona, Miss., Dr. G. C. Wells, Sumrall, Miss., Dr. C. C. Phillips, Golconda, Ill., Dr. B. F. Ferrell, Indianapolis, Ind., Dr. J. H. Eason, Birmingham, Ala., Bro. Joe McClury, Nashville, Tenn., Dr. W. P. Washington, Decatur, Ill. Announcements.

Benediction by Dr. O. J. Allen.

SECOND DAY—Afternoon Session.

After devotion by Rev. J. B. Ridley, Pres. Wood appointed the following on the Finding Committee: Revs. G. L. Prince, L. A. McIntyre, H. C. Lewis, J. S. Earl, D. E. Over, J. A. Royal, L. H. Walker.

Dr. A. A. Graham was introduced, who in a lucid and forceful manner discussed, "The Relation Between the National Baptist Convention and the Lott Carey Foreign Missionary Convention." Dr. Graham said in part: "In our co-operation, we must find out what God wants us to do. In this co-operation, the relation between the two organizations are one, we are one together, standing side by side fighting one big battle. This co-operation means fellowship and it means love. Our possessions are your possessions, and your possessions are ours. We want to build up a work in Liberia that will not die when the missionaries die. To do this we must build churches, schools, hospitals, etc." The address was a timely and helpful one. Dr. J. W. Hulse followed with some helpful suggestions.

The following pledged to give out of their salary \$5.00 each month for Foreign Mission: Drs. D. E. Over, J. W. Hulse, J. P. Robinson, C. H. Clark, I. M. Hendon, G. W. Alexander, J. W. Anderson, N. A. Seymour, J. A. Sharpe, \$2.50.

By motion Dr. H. A. Boyd was elected Official Reporter. Benediction.

SECOND DAY—Evening Session.

Following a 30 minutes' praise service, Pres. Wood introduced visitors from Michigan. Dr. J. S. Morton was

presented and read Acts 1:10. Rev. L. H. Walker sang "He will hold me fast." Dr. D. E. Over was presented, who read from Acts 1:8, "But ye shall receive power, after the Holy Ghost is come upon you," and he reasoned with us of "The Beauty of Power," "Need of Power," "Promise of Power," and the "Personality of Power." The message was logical and inspiring. Dr. L. A. McIntyre sang "It pays to serve Jesus." Dr. J. P. Robinson offered prayer. Offering \$13.00. Bro. E. R. Robinson sang, "I walk with the King."

Benediction by Dr. D. E. Over.

THIRD DAY—Morning Session.

At 10:00 a. m., Rev. O. E. Kelly and Rev. P. W. Fields conducted devotions. The morning, afternoon and evening journals were read and approved.

By motion Rev. L. H. Walker was selected to preach at 8 p. m.

Dr. I. M. Hendon was presented, and discussed, "The Activities and Needs of the Home Mission Board," in a masterly way. Dr. J. A. Sharpe followed in a forceful address on "Christian Stewardship." An offering of \$24.07 was taken for his work. Miss Julia Mae Kennedy sang "His eye is on the sparrow."

A resolution by Dr. G. L. Prince, that the names presented to the Convention for the Trustee Board be confirmed, viz: J. L. Harding, J. W. Pitt, J. W. Hurse, C. H. Clark, was by motion adopted.

Benediction Rev. H. C. Lewis.

THIRD DAY—Afternoon Session.

Dr. W. R. Payne read the Scriptures and offered prayer. The morning journal was read and approved. The report of the Finding Committee was submitted and by motion approved. (See report.)

A recapitulation of the last three years' administration, shows: monies collected by the Convention (not including the Publishing Board) \$83,000; To Foreign Mission Board \$42,000; To the Late Dr. E. P. Jones (back debts) \$1,160; To Seminary \$8,280; To Repairs on Seminary \$1,200; To Publishing Board for Printing \$1,350; Total on back debts, \$11,990. This was encouraging to the brotherhood to learn of the progress made in the past three years.

A round table talk was led by Mrs. Belle E. Hendon, Cor. Secretary of the Women's Auxiliary, which was very helpful. One hundred thousand children enlisted! Can it be done? How? Was ably presented by Mrs. Fannie Morton.

Benediction by Dr. I. M. Hendon.

THIRD DAY—Evening Session.

From 8:00 to 8:15 p. m. praise service was conducted. The journal was read and approved. Rev. O. E. Kelley read Romans 6, and Rev. E. North offered prayer. Rev. L. H. Walker was introduced, who preached a splendid sermon; Subject, "Christian Race." Heb. 12:1. "Saviour more than life to me," was sung, and Rev. L. C. Clark offered prayer. An offering of \$12.08 was taken for Home Mission, by Dr. I. M. Hendon, and \$3.34 for Bro. E. R. Robinson.

Benediction, Rev. L. H. Walker.
The Executive Board by motion ordered the following to be paid: To Home Mission (Dr. I. M. Hendon) \$100; To Rev. D. P. Jones (back account) \$6.00; To acting Secretary (M. L. FOURTH DAY—Morning Session.

Dr. E. H. Branch read the Scripture and led in singing. "My soul be on thy guard." Dr. H. A. Boyd offered prayer. The journal was read and approved. The Committee on the Adjustment of the Agreement with Rev. Jas. Kelley, Field Representative of the Convention, reported the following: We, your Committee, recommend: (a) That the representative form an agreement with the Publishing Board for printing his literature. (b) That the compensation be \$2,000 and \$600 for expenses per year. (c) That the Representative make monthly reports to the President's Office and send copy to the Recording Secretary. This report shall include: work done, miles traveled; and monies collected, etc.

A motion prevailed that the above report be adopted, and the Secretary ordered to file a copy with Rev. Jas. Kelly.

President Wood suggested that Conferences be held in each State, as may be arranged with Vice Presidents of the States, which was by motion adopted.

Dr. H. A. Boyd submitted the following: "That each pastor be requested to send in at least fifty per cent of his reading membership as subscribers to The National Baptist Union-Review and become responsible to the National Baptist Publishing Board, for the collection of the amount subscribed.

By motion the proposition was approved.

An interesting program was arranged, for Sunday-afternoon Mass Meeting with Dr. G. L. Prince, Master of Ceremonies. The following were introduced: Mrs. E. A. Hubbard, Miss Julia Mae Kennedy, each spoke briefly.

A letter from Rev. W. P. Washington, Decatur, Ill., who is ill, was read. An offering of \$3.85 was taken, and motion prevailed that the Secretary send a letter of acknowledgement and the offering to Rev. Washington.

A motion prevailed that an expression of appreciation be extended President J. Edmund Wood. Also that a vote of thanks be extended Dr. E. H. Branch, pastor, officers and members of the Antioch Baptist Church.

Y. P. U., and Missionary Circle. Educational Board, \$30,000; Foreign Mission Board, \$100,000; Home Mission Board \$20,000; Women's Auxiliary \$20,000; Administration expenses, \$5,000. This Budget is to be raised by apportioning the amount among the several churches of the Convention at a sum equal to twenty-five (25c) cents per member.

The greatest emphasis was laid upon the propagation of all our work in unity with the Lott Carey Foreign Missionary Convention. All the Foreign Missionary activities of both organizations have been now placed in and under the executive direction of Dr. A. A. Graham.

Arrangements were definitely made, by which the entire outstanding indebtedness upon the Seminary property at Nashville, Tenn., is to be raised at the coming meeting in Denver, Colo.

The Executive Board had the most enthusiastic meeting in the history of the Convention. President Wood and Mrs. Georgia D. Faulkner, President of the Women's Auxiliary Convention, are looking forward with great anticipation that the accomplishments of this Conventional year will be the greatest in the history of the Convention.

The survey made by the Boards of the work being done in the various States is most encouraging.

The addresses made at this meeting were helpful in the information given regarding the various phases of the Conventional work.

REPORT OF CORRESPONDING SECRETARY OF NATIONAL BAPTIST CONVENTION OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, FOR THE YEAR ENDING AUGUST 31, 1926

Muskogee, Oklahoma
September 8, 1926

To the Officers and Members of the National Baptist Convention of the U. S. A.

Christian Greetings:

I beg herewith submit to you my seventh annual report as your corresponding secretary. It would be inhuman in me if I did not in some way express my very high appreciation, and thanks to you for entrusting to my care this high office, I see much about me to give thanks for and it I know my heart I am glad to be here.

While my success with this office this year has not been all I hoped for, not what I desired, still I can say along with others I have been able to keep the "trail" on the King's Highway leading up to the Metropolis of the universe, "the City of the Living God."

God has given us a broad field reaching from the Atlantic on the East to the Pacific on the West and from the ice peaks on the North to the hot sands on the South, not only so but over yonder in the lands of the Seas, through the Lott Carey Convention, yea all the world just a glance will convince the skeptical mind, "there remaineth much work to be possessed" much work to be done: Our Convention is but little over half organized, and we seem to be partly playing with the work of some of the boards.

It should be ours at this very meeting to strengthen the weak places in our fortifications, and order this mighty army forward, yea our Sunset and the work left undone. But in all, and through all I am glad to see I can still see the rain-bow of hope beaming from the brow of our constituents, and the insign of prosperity prominent on their forehead.

So we are here to relate our experience and express our sentiments to preach, sing, and pray, to inspire each other and arouse one another to greater educational and missionary activeness, that our school

at Nashville, may be once for always put on high grounds, and all of our boards be placed in position to successfully operate the work intrusted into their hands, or abolish every non-essential board.

Now, Brethren, in justice to myself and you, I must again say the proper relation between this convention and all of its boards should be clearly brought out, and time enough given in the discussion of this very thing until the constituents of the convention see and understand not only how the boards are related to the convention but how they are related to each other.

This convention is the parent-body of all Baptist organizations in the U. S. who do business under her banner, and in her name, the boards all of them are but creatures, (or should be) therefore, the convention is, or should be indirectly responsible for the debts of all of its boards, and should propose to be no stronger than the weakest board. The convention itself should be the clearing house for the boards in the operation of their work during the year, not only this, but the convention should be the incubator for education, publication, and missionary endeavors.

The people as a whole will never rally to the support of our boards until they are enlightened as to the working of the board we wish them to help. Real information is what the people are telling your Secretary they want and the board who has that part of our work in hands which is essential to this convention's existence, should be given time to educate the people to their workings as well as their needs.

The records of this convention should be able to show the numerical strength of the denomination, show the property it owned, and where located both real and personal, and what board holds it in trust; the value of the same, the liabilities thereon, when due, the policies in Insurance Companies, and to whom these policies are made payable in case of loss by fire or otherwise, also the Baptist position on all denominational questions of National or world-wide importance, all this and other things that will bring us to the attention of the business philanthropist of this country, should be kept in a well bound book of this convention, and opened to the inspection of its members, and those who would donate to our boards' work.

The Corresponding Secretary of this convention should be able to communicate from one of our boards to another and this body to other great religious bodies and assist each of the boards, Cor-Sec. in setting up their claims on the world of mankind.

If some of the above things are not resorted to speedily, this body will slowly but surely lose its identity or dwindle away into insignificance. Because of the need of many of the above mentioned things your Secretary has been so handicapped until we are not satisfied with our year's effort. I have done what I could.

Board Meetings.

I have attended all the Board Meetings and Conferences except the one at Louisville, Kentucky.

As neither the Board nor the Convention made any changes in the amount of money to be raised during this year, the budget stands as follows:

At the Louisville meeting the Board or Conference with the leaders of this and other National bodies approved of a National Denominational Literature Sale contest to be conducted by the women of this convention. (The terms of which was to send the minister selling the highest amount of Christian Literature to the Holy Land.) Your Secretary was called upon to put the power of his office and his personal influence behind this move. This I was glad to do, knowing that the boards meant to help put our literature into as many homes in this country as possible.

Second Board Meeting in Columbia, S. C.

The program for this session was made at this meeting (See program, Exhibit "B.") The Board also agreed at this session to strike for business-like and systematic program for 1926 and 1927, and that every encouragement be given the Trustees at our Seminary at Nashville, to the end that they be able to raise a sufficient amount of money that the school may be opened for the next scholastic term.

High Points in Conventional Activities During the Year.

a. The convention approved of and placed our President, (Dr. J. E. Wood) in the a-round-the-world-contest, launched by the Madam C. J. Walker Manufacturing Company of Indianapolis, Indiana.

b. The extensive traveling of President Wood during the year, he has put a belt around the United States as well as traveled locally and in Indiana, Pennsylvania, North and South Carolina, Illinois, Tennessee, Kentucky, Ohio and Missouri.

c. The special efforts of Dr. Ira M. Hendon, cor-sec. of the H. M. Board in his travelings and writings in the interest of home mission work has helped the convention in a general way.

d. Dr. Henry A. Boyd of Nashville, (The business wizard of the U. S.) has stirred the country from side to side with the Union-Review and the National S. S. Con. during the year. These agencies have done more to augment the forces of this convention than any other things we have at our command. The ministers of this convention are giving the S. S. Con. the proper support, they could make the Congress twice as large as it is, which would mean immediate strength for our National Publishing Board, and this board is one of the essential assets to this convention.

e. Another high point is: The favorable way in which the leaders of this convention have touched the East England brothers, and they in turn have mingled with us in a most helpful way; chief among these are the leaders of the Lott Carey Missionary Society.

The U. S. Government and this Convention.

As you may know the Department of Commerce, Bureau of Census was ordered by the U. S. Congress to take the census of the religious bodies in the U. S. A., for the year 1926. So that in February, 1926, they officially called upon your Secretary for assistance and the statistics of this Convention. It took a great deal of hard work, correspondence and

money to place before the Department the necessary information. (I hope to complete this important work in this session.)

(See Correspondence Marked, Exhibit "B" and made a part of this report.)

Before I could get this work done the National Historical Society seemed to have been misinformed as to this convention.

This convention had no particular credits nor did they have the officers and the personnel of the boards of this convention recorded, and as I knew that the U. S. Government rests very largely upon their records and the World Alliance copied the records of this Society, I thought it important that all of our boards and the personnel thereof, be sent them; hence I wrote to every board of this convention to send me the names and addresses of their members, as a result the following officers, boards, and board members have gone into the National and World's record. (See Exhibit "D" made a part of this report.)

There are many churches in the various parts of the United States, who promised self-support in the very near future, writing your secretary for assistance, while in every case I have referred them to the proper board who should give this relief. Visit the churches. I feel that this convention should know about them, otherwise this body might be misunderstood by the neglect of some board and drive promising fields from us before the convention knows. Some of these application (Pittsburgh, Pa., and Clarkesburg, W. Va.) are still in this office. (See correspondence, marked Exhibit "E" and made a part of this report.)

This convention agreed in the Kansas City meeting to support its President (Dr. Wood) in sending him around the world in the Madam Walker voting contest. I called special attention! This contest closes September 15, 1926, (which is next week.) What shall we do about this promise? (See resolutions adopted in last session) marked Exhibit "F" and not made a part of this report.

I ask and recommend that a committee of fifty leaders be appointed today to consummate this matter that the said committee be given plenary powers. Let us in this matter fail not. The expenses of this office for the year for stationery, postage, office-help, and money spent and rotary machine \$161.50, which I hope you will pay.

BENEFIT BOARD REPORT—BY W. O. BELL

Brother President and Messengers composing the 46th session of the National Baptist Convention (unincorporated) assembled with the Baptist Churches of Indianapolis, Indiana,

Greetings:

A few days ago, to be more specific, on the 16th day of August, 1926, your humble servant was tendered the position of Corresponding Secretary of the Benefit Board of this great Convention. With much reluctance but after prayerful consideration, we accepted the task, not unmindful of the many ordeals and perplexing problems accompanying the propagation of this great work. In our younger days and while President of a district convention, it was our good pleasure to voluntarily raise funds for aged ministers and widows with whom we came in personal contact. This we have always regarded as our very best Christian endeavor; certainly it was the joy of our life to have the privileges of gladdening the heart and comforting the soul of the care-worn, down-trodden and forgotten hero of the cross of Calvary, who became for

the mighty intense love that filled their soul and permeated their entire being waded through blood and tears that the banner of our King might be planted in every nook and corner of this country.

We come not to make a report, nor to give an account of our stewardship for as you know, we are just beginning. We hope, however, to magnify the object of this phase of the work of our great convention and ask that you answer substantially the question: "Shall this work go on or shall it cease?" We regard no work meager that has for its object the furtherance of our Master's Kingdom.

The reasons for the existence of this organized and intrepid host of Baptists would be wholly incomplete were not provisions made for the care and relief of the indigent and aged ministers and their widows. This is as it should be, for true religion carries with it the doing of something for the relief of the needy. James 1:27. Our Savior went everywhere doing good, relieving poor suffering humanity.

To care for our aged fathers in the gospel is not only a great Christian duty, but direct results of a grateful remembrance. How very sad it is to forget those who paved the way for us whose hoary hair shows now ripeness for eternity and whose physical frames tattered and torn shows signs of returning to Mother Earth! Shall we not remember them? A few are yet among us. Those who followed Grant and Lee, and who are yet alive are the recipients of everything possible that will make their declining years full of joy and sunshine. Shall the church of our Christ be less grateful? Shall we turn a deaf ear to the cries for bread and shelter of that poor old brother out yonder, who with his Bible and hymn book-walked with bleeding feet, faced hostile travelers and put their lives in jeopardy? God forbid! God forbid! King David was surrounded with all of the luxuries of life. Everything that heart could wish was his and yet in the midst of it all, his grateful mind turned back a few mile-posts down the road over which he had come, and he saw himself a lonely fugitive in the dark, weeping upon the shoulders of his friend, Jonathan, who risked his life to give aid and comfort to him in the sad hour of life. Now it is all over, Jonathan is dead, and David enthroned with thousands of warriors to protect him and thousands of servants to do his bidding. He asked the simple, but sublime question: "Is there any one of the house of Jonathan yet living?" When told that within the borders of his kingdom in an obscure place, there was a poor old cripple yet living, he gave orders that he be brought to the mansion and be fed from the King's table for Jonathan's sake. While we enjoy the blessings of serving God unmolested under our own vine and fig tree, we should ask if there is anyone yet living among us who bore untold suffering in the heat of the day and in the cold, hungry and thirsty that the Kingdom should come and righteousness prevail. Let us search now the country over from the Canadian border to the Gulf, us search now the country over from the turbid Atlantic to the placid Pacific and find him the blessed old time, simple, gospel preacher whose voice once made the welkin ring, but now feeble and low, whose eyes are dim and whose wrinkled face is turned toward the setting sun of his life. Find him and give him meat, drink, shelter, and some day our Master will say to us, "When I was hungry you gave me meat, thirsty ye gave me drink, stranger and ye took me in, naked and ye clothed me, sick and ye visited me, in prison and ye came to me." Then we shall ask: "Lord when saw we thee, hungry, thirsty, naked, in prison and came unto thee?" The Lord will answer, "Inasmuch as ye have done it unto one of the least of these my brethren, ye have done it unto me."

Why then should not this board receive the unstinted and unanimous support of all the Baptist composing this convention? I see no reason why it should not. There are many widows among us whose husbands were ministers. Many of them are in sad need of help. It is ours to ask that you come to their rescue.

Our Plans.

If allowed, we have decided to put this work over in a large way. We have nothing to do with past failures, nor do we share but very little in whatever success that may have attained; but it is our purpose to conduct a campaign to raise funds and to distribute this fund quarterly among those we may have on our list. This, we shall do without a dollar salary. The office expense shall not exceed ten per cent of the income. Thus at least 90c out of every dollar of your money must come. Thus at least ninety cents out of every dollar of your money must be used directly for the purpose for which it was solicited. We shall, for the present at least, discard the insurance idea. For there can be no real insurance without legal status or financial backings. We shall make reports to all through the papers and through the mail to those who give us their names and addresses. We shall ask those who register with us to be constantly on the look out for ministers and widows who are in need of help and notify our office at Texarkana. May God bless this, our first endeavor in a large way to be a blessing to the

REPORT OF THE HOME MISSION BOARD TO THE FORTY-SIXTH ANNUAL SESSION OF THE NATIONAL BAPTIST CONVENTION U. S. A.

Dear President, Co-workers, Friends, Brethren:

We come to submit to you herewith our stewardship as has been committed to us as servants. We assure you all that this year has been one of experience and joy notwithstanding the negligences and delinquencies among our leaders, organizations and communicants. As you may know, that since the days of the Rev. William Beckham, and the resignation of our Home Field by the lamented Dr. R. H. Boyd, the home mission has been neglected, not only neglected, but in a way rejected by those who are blind to the common interests of the Kingdom of God. Dr. J. P. Robinson, our Chairman, has stood by this work all along and most of the time by himself, he still holds the helm with that tenacity that is common among those who believe that the Bible is true.

Last year at Kansas City, our report for two months was only about which evidenced inexperience, and is now but a stone throw in advance. We are still in our experimental age, however we are glad to submit to you the programme of our Home Board during this Convention Year.

You remember that President Wood, recommended that the U. S. be divided in regional districts, with three regional secretaries, covering the entire territory of the National Baptist Convention, whose duties to travel in the interest of the Home Mission Board, doing the work of an evangelist, organizing churches, looking after every phase of our denominational work as it touches our Convention, this matter was given the Board in its entirety to operate, this we set out to do. Each Board member of the States was elected secretary of his or her State, where the division of ideas was of such nature that the other wing of our Convention control the Superintendent of Missions to aid in pushing the ideals of our Convention, this was attempted and carried out in a large way.

Dr. J. W. Anderson, D. D., 429 Tillamook Street, Portland, Oregon, was elected as regional secretary for the Western States, beginning with Illinois; Dr. J. G. Gathings, D. D., Goliad, Texas was elected for the Southwestern Section, taking the State of Texas, Oklahoma, Arkansas, Louisiana, Mississippi, New Mexico; Dr. W. J. M. Price, D. D., Paris, Kentucky, was selected for the Southeastern section, beginning with Kentucky, Tennessee, Mississippi, Alabama, Georgia, Florida, the Carolinas and Virginias. The Rev. John Jackson of Midland, Pa. taking the East, covering the territory of the Lott Carey Convention. The General Secretary to cover the Middle West and aid in the operation of the entire section.

In each state we appointed the board members as secretaries to work their own States in cooperation with their State Superintendent of Missions and Regional secretaries as the occasion may require. We also

appointed the Rev. D. Webster Bowen, of Chicago, Illinois as Missionary Evangelist as an experiment, pointing to better days. These efforts have brought to us fine results. Dr. Jas. Kelly, D. D., Colorado Springs, Colo., contributed to our Home Mission Board. Three editions, viz. "Lessons on Home Missions," "Catechism of Missions," and the "Relations of Pastors, etc. on Missions," will mean much in educating our denomination up to their standard of living and giving. These books are on sale at this meeting.

Among the Regional Secretaries, Dr. J. W. Anderson, is the only one who worked or reported his work during the year and his work has been a marvel which you will hear later on. Drs. C. T. Dorroh, Fla.; C. C. Phillip, Ill.; R. W. Woullard, Miss.; G. P. Barksdale, Kentucky; W. M. Foster, Ky.; the two latter working under their State Superintendent of Missions, have done the best work of the year aside from the cooperative work of Dr. William Z. Thomas of Indiana. This state with Illinois, holds splendid cooperation with the White Baptists. Dr. H. E. McWilliams of Illinois promised to give us his report, but failed thus far.

Mrs. Fields of Arkansas, Mrs. Toomer, of Missouri, and Mrs. Jones of Indiana, were added to stimulate the work among women. Mrs. Jones a singer of unusual ability to evangelize the work with pastors in their local church programs. We will get report no doubt at this meeting.

Dr. Bowen held revivals in various sections of the country especially in Indiana, Ohio, Tennessee and Kentucky with great results. Dr. Kelly's contribution will add in many ways to our work in both education and finance. The Secretary in person visited Kentucky, Tennessee, Pennsylvania, Ohio, Illinois and Indiana. Conducted financial campaigns, revivals, lecture meetings, institutes, associations and conventions, personal conferences with pastors and ministerial alliances, delivering addresses, helping mission churches and mission pastors. He followed the Dr. L. K. Williams, D. D., President of the Incorporated Convention in several places with fine results which are visible in this session.

The Bethlehem Baptist Church, Pittsburgh, Pa., Rev. Moses S. Hunter, Pastor, was helped to the amount of \$500.96 and 33 additions to the membership. We gave aid several times last winter to Dr. Thoburne; Nazarene Baptist Church, Rev. Miller, Pastor, Evansville, Indiana, \$20.00; Fall Creek Baptist Church, Indianapolis, \$5.65; \$50.00 to the Missionaries in Kentucky aside from help forwarded during the year. Dr. J. W. Anderson of Portland, Ore., and Dr. G. C. Coleman of Northern California will tell you of the many churches aided during the year in the West. All of which we rejoice.

When we began work one year ago, the Board did not have a penny, no place of meeting, such as an Office, nor any office fixtures. But now we have a place of meeting, furnished us by the Corinthian Baptist Church officers, Typewriter and Neostyle writer, with which we can do our correspondence with much less expense attached. The secretary in order to save expense and use offering for the needed sections did apparently the office work this year himself, with a little exception. While sacrifice has been great we enjoyed all because you believe in the teachings of the Bible where it says "Make disciples of all nations, teaching them to observe all things." We also believe that mission is a Baptist debt to the world, and that it should and must be paid, the only way to settle it is to give the Gospel to the whole world, and the

best way of doing that is to keep the Home base regulated and in operation.

We hold that the Commission of Christ includes the home fields as well as foreign fields: "Ye shall be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in Judea, and Samaria, and unto the uttermost parts of the earth."

There are certain considerations which emphasize the importance of Home Mission Work: **STRENGTHENING THE HOME BASE IN ORDER TO EVANGELIZE THE WORLD.** If we would reach other nations with the gospel of Christ, America must be made Christian. Just during the World War we maintained bases of supplies in the home-land, to sustain our soldiers across the Seas, so much we keep the home base intact to reinforce and sustain our workers in other lands.

The missionary idea is to give the gospel to each individual soul that is without Christ regardless of where he lives, whether at home or abroad. The various designations usually employed, as Home, State or Foreign are merely for convenience in the missionary propaganda, and one is no more important than the other for the appeal is world-wide and the gospel is to be preached from our own doors to the ends of the earth. Christian missions are to be found at the very taproot of Christianity itself. The plan of God has ever been the salvation of the world; "to make all men see what is the dispensation of the mystery which for ages hath been hid in God, who created all things." Eph. 3:9. There is no nation or tribe on all the face of the whole earth that is to be left out of the design of God for the salvation of the human race. In Prophecy the thought of universality of salvation runs like a golden thread through all of the Old Testament, and bursts into a glorious light, bright as the noonday sun in the New Testament. It first becomes an actual offer of salvation to all nations by the sending forth of messengers upon the command of Jesus Christ. Matthew 28:18-20; Mark 16:15; Luke 24:46-48; John 20:21.

For one to disclaim the missionary intent of Christianity is to disbelieve the plain words and commands of our Lord, or else to remain in total ignorance of His teaching. It will be noted also, that because of the fundamental character of Christianity as a missionary religion, missions are of necessity the very law of life for the churches of Christ. His churches are missionary churches, and are to remain so to the end of time. It must never be forgotten that the Christian nations of today were originally heathen, and would have remained so, had it not been for missions. It necessarily follows that the nations that are yet heathen will remain so, until enlightened by the missionaries of the Cross. No church, and no individual is true to self, nor to Jesus Christ that fails in the missionary obligations.

Every leader of the New Testament becomes cognizant of the most intense missionary zeal shown in Apostolic times. The whole body of believers were practically missionary, evincing a zeal for universal salvation. Our Lord Himself toured the regions around about proclaim-

ing the gospel of salvation, first to the lost sheep of the house of Israel, then to all classes, kindreds, tribes and tongues. He trained His early followers to be messengers of salvation, and sent them forth to declare the healing message. Step by step were they led from the narrow confines of Judaism to a holy passion for the souls of men everywhere to be brought into saving relationship with God. His death on the cross was the one atonement for sinning and suffering humanity the world around. Thus the necessity of His messengers to carry the news of this provision to the ends of the earth in each succeeding generation. Then in His ascension to the Father, His parting admonition to his followers was in the form of a command to "go into all the world and preach the Gospel to every creature." This command has never been annulled, and is today the clarion call to His churches everywhere, to evangelize the world.

In Apostolic times by means of individual conversions, and the founding of churches, the missionary idea progressed from beneath, upward, until it became the mightiest moral and religious force the world has ever known. As New Testament Christians, Baptists are ever to heed the call of their Divine Lord. Every true Baptist is a missionary Baptist, and every true Baptist church is a missionary church.

Baptists have always believed that the world is to be won to Christ after the Apostolic order. The greatest blight that Christianity has ever had was caused by political alliance with the state under Constantine, then onward until the present time in some parts of the world. From then onward measures were taken for the violent suppression of heathenism, and the official favoring of Christianity in its place. Thus the pure Gospel of Apostolic days passed into an eclipse that was almost total as it culminated in the Dark Ages. Happily God always preserves His chosen few, as in the days of Elijah, to be called into action at the right time. Baptists are the pioneers of modern missions. In October, 1792, the first missionary society, other than Romanist, in the Anglo-Saxon world was born. This was in response to God's call to William Carey, a Baptist minister at Kittering. The story of his call, struggles at home and abroad cannot be inserted here in lengthy detail. Suffice it to say that the Baptists, through William Carey, were the father of modern missions, and that his triumphs were so great that after thirty years of labor he had translated the Bible, or parts of it, into thirty-four different languages, and with his colleagues had rendered the Word of God accessible to one-third of the human race.

In America, Baptists participated in forming the first missionary society in 1796, known as New York Miss. Society. "This appears to have been a sort of co-operative effort by members of the Baptist, Presbyterian and Dutch Reformed Churches." A few months following, these same denominations formed what was termed the "Northern Missionary Society." The object of these societies was to support preachers among the North American Indian, but did not extend their operations to the great heathen world beyond. The second distinctively missionary society for foreign missions was formed by the Baptists in 1814, known as the "Baptist Missionary Union," which became famous for large and aggressive evangelical work. The conversion of Judson and Rice to Baptist principles after their appointment by the Congregational Board brought the Baptist Mission Union into existence. Judson and wife remained upon the foreign fields, while Rice came home to arouse the churches to their obligations and his familiar figure became known a-

mong Baptists almost from one end of the land to the other. The work of Judson through nearly forty years laid a foundation both large and durable in a stronghold of Buddhism. "Numerous converts, a corps of trained native assistants, the translation of the Bible and other valuable books into Burmese and his almost completed Burman-English dictionary were some of the direct fruits of his thirty-seven years of missionary service."

Another notable achievement in the Baptist missionary work was that of Dr. and Mrs. John E. Clough among the Telegus. The work was first founded in 1836, and after seventeen fruitless years and when the work was about to be abandoned, the Cloughs were sent to the field. Their work, after strenuous effort, was rewarded in one of the most marvelous mass movements in the history of evangelical missions. On a single day a thousand converts brought their idols to be destroyed, while at another time 222 were immersed in one day. Within a space of ten days nearly nine thousand had professed their faith in Christ. In China, Baptists were among the early evangelical missionaries, and have done and are doing a notable work in the celestial empire. No effort can here be made to give a detailed history of Baptist missions. Suffice it to say, some of their missionaries, as Carey, Judson and Clough, were epoch-makers in the world's history, and that now Baptists are more awake to the divine call of missions than they have ever been, and have workers in almost every part of the earth, with ever-enlarging plans for world evangelization.

By Home Mission work, we generally understand the mission work undertaken in our own country by the states cooperating in the National Baptist Convention, as distinguished from state missions on the one hand, in which the work is done in each state by the Baptists living in that state; and from foreign missions on the other hand, the work done in foreign countries by cooperating National Baptists. This is our task, and it's not too big, if we, will only face our challenge and opportunities like God's big men. We need only to preserve the spirit of the New Testament cooperation, and this finds its highest expression in world-wide missionary effort both at home and abroad. The believers in Macedonia and Boyd cooperated in relieving the needs of believers hundreds of miles away in famine-stricken Judea.

Dr. James Kelly's description of missionary essentials are two, Man and Money, the Minister is God's Man. The preacher of the gospel is the human pivot in the kingdom of God and the primal earthly factor in the reign of righteousness. In him centers the imperial forces, and upon him rest the immeasurable responsibility of renovating this world, routing the Satanic powers and regenerating humanity.

The spiritual leadership called the ministry is second only to the divine agency called God in World's redemption. He is God's royal ambassador, representing heaven's plenary power in God's dealing with men. He is God's under-shepherd, feeding, protecting, sheltering, guiding, healing, leading out God's flock. He is the Watchman on God's watch towers, spying the enemy of souls and warning of His destructive approach.

The preacher is charged with a sacred debtorship to all men; intrusted with a holy trusteeship—the mysteries of Christ's redeeming gospel and has committed to him the most transcendent guardianship—the spiritual immortality of unregarded mankind, and has given to him

by the divine hands the most boundless task of earth's leadership, in winning and building souls and fitly preparing them for an eternal residence with God. He lives unto God, speaks of him, leads to him, and receives his orders from him. His office is second to none among men. All his allegiance, covenants, and allegiance to men are subject to his vows to God. His appointment and commission are from God and his first accountability is to God. Hence he is the responsible and the dependable source in getting his message across to man. Will we do it? I answer we will.

Taking into consideration the condition of our Field, the dearth in Missions for years, the evil propaganda of the oppositionist, the undeveloped leadership and unorganized mass in our churches, we count our program a success the first year. White Baptists in Indiana and Illinois cooperate with our State Boards and will cooperate with our National Home Board when terms are made. We feel that the time is not ripe yet for such request on broad terms. Our own brethren are not ready for such a basis Nationally.

REPORT OF AUDITOR

Bro. Pres. and Brethren of the National Baptist Convention, Unincorporated: We come to you at the close of another convention year to make our report as Auditor and to thank you for suffrage. My report for August 1925 to August 1926 is as follows:

I have audited the books of the Home Mission Board and found evidences of a faithful and honest effort to keep the books in a clear-cut business way, and they were found to be correct. We found the Treasurer's book of the National Baptist Theological Seminary and Training School for the fiscal year ending July 31, 1926, to be correct; and, although the books were correct, we also found a number of checks turned over to him which he had not been able to cash.

In auditing the books of the Woman's Convention, Auxiliary to the National Baptist Convention, Sister Fuller in her usual way furnished us with every facility to make a thorough and careful investigation of the receipts and the accounts of their Board. I feel we are fortunate in having such a woman for our Corresponding Secretary.

In keeping with the request of your Board and our President we requested the following persons or Boards to have their vouchers and books at Nashville, Tenn., by the first of August, 1926: Home Mission Board, Foreign Mission Board, Educational Board, Benefit Board, Woman's Auxiliary to the National Baptist Convention, Church Extension Board, Laymen's League, and Evangelical Board. Some of these gave reasons why they could not send their books to said place and at that time, and others have not responded at all.

I audited the books of the National Baptist Publishing Board, and in doing so, Dr. Henry Allen Boyd turned over to us, or rather gave us every facility to make a thorough and careful investigation of the receipts and expenditures of the Publishing Board. ANNUAL REPORT OF THE CORRESPONDING SECRETARY

This year has been to me the hardest in all my experience as an executive officer of the Lott Carey Society. I have been sorely afflicted all year in both body and mind. I fought for months an up-fight trying to regain my health. The blue days in bed and long confinement in a darkened room brought me almost to the verge of despair. I could hear the call of duty, distinct and loud, but I had not the strength to even start to meet it. My feet and legs and the vital organs of my body which had carried me so successfully since childhood refused to move at my command. My mind kept busy at a thousand different tasks which in imagination I had carried to joyful consummation, while in reality nothing had I done, and nothing could I do. I very heartily reveal the true state of my health to the public, lest I take the very heart out of the cause which I represent; and more than once I had decided to unfurl the white flag and announce my surrender.

The grave seemed far nearer to my tottering feet than the future of summons and let my soul be at rest; to aggravate my tormented condition, we ran short of money early in the year and I faced the awful necessity of bearing a burden for which I had no strength. Had our honorable president, Dr. C. S. Brown, and the queenly president of our Auxiliary, Mrs. J. H. Randolph, denied a single request of our Auxiliary, I am sure that the work would have had to pass into other hands; but His name be praised, I am here today and am able to report to you the status of our Society regarding its work in every field.

For the past six years the work on the foreign field has been as three fingers on the hand—Liberia, Haiti and Russia. We are adding the thumb and the other finger this year,—India and South Africa. Our policy for the past few years has been not to expand, but rather to contract and to concentrate in order that the impact of our full force and strength might be effectively felt on the few fields we occupy. Missions is like a bewildering castle with many corridors and numberless chambers. The small corridor occupied by the Lott Carey Society, which is the least of all, in comparison with other foreign agencies which have millions to spend while we have only hundreds, has led to many open doors whose chambers we have been compelled to enter and with our feeble strength to occupy. Mrs. Bannerjee, who is a high caste Indian, and has labored in her native country for more than a score of years under the direction of the British Baptists, has herself to us for service in India, with her entire staff of assistants. We are compelled to believe that she was sent to us by the God whom we seek to glorify. We could not falter in our faith or refuse to obey His behest who gave the great commission. We have therefore accepted her and are preparing for her sailing November or December, 1926.

Many years ago Rev. B. F. Mdotona was sent by our Society to

South Africa and laboured under our auspices for a number of years, but due to a compact which we had made with the British Baptist Union of South Africa, we were compelled to release him. His work has now been approved by the British Baptist Union of South Africa, and we are free to reinstate him as a missionary under our Society. Rev. Mdotona has organized The Lott Carey Baptist Home Mission Society of South Africa, which has 40 affiliating Lott Carey Branches. The name Lott Carey in South Africa has been greatly exalted through the work of Rev. Mdotona. We are therefore incorporating his entire equipment into the work of the Lott Carey Baptist Foreign Mission Society, U. S. A. Rev. Mdotona will become our Superintendent in South Africa and all of his native workers will be listed among our staff of missionaries. Hence the five fingers of the hand are complete, and attached to the arteries of the arm, must be equally nourished by our faithful endeavors.

HAITI

Our plan of co-operation with the American Baptist Home Mission Society of New York in the education and evangelization of Haiti has worked very smoothly this year and with gratifying results. All of our Haitian workers are under the supervision of Dr. A. Groves Wood who is the representative of the Home Mission Society on that field. Dr. Wood makes requisition for the quarterly salary stipend through the home office at New York, and we in turn make our payments to Mr. Wood through the home office at New York. All reports from Mr. Wood regarding our work and all correspondence between us is conducted in the same way. Dr. Wood has been careful to make his statements clear and simple and has assumed a very sympathetic attitude toward our missionaries under his charge.

Rev. Boaz A. Harris, we have left by our compact independent entirely of the supervision of Dr. Wood. Reports on all sides assure us that Rev. Harris has gone beyond all others in Haiti in promoting the cause of our denomination. His support has been entirely too meager. His salary and that of his wife has been generously furnished by the Afro-American Baptist State Convention of New Jersey, and \$200 per year is given him by the Young Peoples Baptist Union of Newark, N. J., for the education of girls. I pledged to add last year one thousand dollars additional to his work, but was unable to redeem this pledge. I was able to give him only one-fourth of the amount promised—\$250. This year I shall exert myself to the limit to make good the amount which he so justly deserves. Up to the present date every missionary's salary in Haiti has been paid in full.

RUSSIA

More and more does our interest increase in our Russian Baptist Brotherhood, and more and more does our joy abound that God had led us to overreach the line of racial prejudice in their behalf. No field in which we labour has expressed more sincere gratitude for the aid given them than has Russia. To the Russian, Christ is everything, and religion is the most vital aspect of his life. He looks to the Christ who saves to lift the load of his oppression and to give healing to his crushed and bleeding heart. He gives up all for Christ; we are therefore extremely happy, however feeble our arm may be, to be an instrument in God's hand to offer to the Russians of our communion a crust of bread and bottle of water in His name. We have paid our Russian

workers up unto the fourth quarter of the year, and because of difficulties in transmitting funds, we are yet due our obligation of the 4th quarter. It is awfully hard to keep the channel of communication free of obstructions, because of the political and social conditions of the country. Rev. I. V. Neprash of East Orange, N. J., is our Russian agent in this country. May God give faith and courage to our fellow Christians in a land where they are so sorely afflicted.

LIBERIA

Our purpose has been to focus the greatest part of our strength upon Liberia, the only Negro Republic in Africa, and here we have encountered our greatest difficulties. We have collected our staff of workers there from different schools and States in our own country and for other reasons which we cannot fathom, there has been a lack of harmony and union of spirit among our workers in Liberia, which has greatly retarded the progress of the work for which we have prayed and labored. So many of the workers in Africa seem void of loyalty to our cause and to each other. Complaints and grievances from within and without keep our work apparently on the verge of danger all the time. Communications from our Liberian workers to the various centers on the home field disturb the peaceful anity of our work-brewing. Delt and subtle reflections upon our administration and the policies of the Secretary are continually afloat among the peoples of Liberia and our own workers here at home, thru clandestine correspondence and open expressions in the Watchman, a paper published in our own plant in Liberia and at our expense.

We have had in hand for more than two years money with which to erect several buildings and for which we have plans already provided, but we have not yet found a suitable man to supervise their construction. Then too, if we begin at one place to build in Liberia there will be jealous interest at the other places where buildings are to be erected, so have in Liberia and the best of our denomination is the Alexander Mission under the leadership of Rev. W. H. Thomas and the work under Dr. E. D. Hubbard near Careysburg. These are different in character, Dr. Hubbard's work being industrial and the work of the Alexander Mission mainly academic and evangelistic. The work of Mrs. F. B. Watson is a very fine prospect and ought soon to be materially improved. The Allegheny Baptist General Association of Western Pennsylvania will provide general support for Mrs. Watson's station, and her salary has been provided for through the Clarke Memorial Baptist Church of Homestead, Pennsylvania. The cash is in hand to send an automobile truck to Mrs. Watson and the Government has completed a public highway from Monrovia to this station. The salaries of all of our workers in Liberia have been provided for as follows:

Bank Street Baptist Church, Norfolk, Va., Dr. G. W. Watkins, pastor, Rev. E. D. Hubbard; Women's Convention of North Carolina, Mrs. P. B. Shepard, President, Mrs. Cora Pair Thomas and Miss Minnie B. Lyon; Clark Memorial Baptist Church, Homestead, Pa., Dr. M. A. Talley, Mrs. F. B. Watson; First Baptist Church, Roanoke, Va., Dr. A. L. James, Miss Clarice Gooding; First Calvary Baptist Church of Norfolk, Va., Dr. O. J. Allen, pastor, Rev. W. H. Thomas, and one missionary in Russia; The Ebenezer Baptist Church of Richmond, Va., Dr. Wm. H. Stokes, pastor, one missionary in Liberia (un-named);

The Allegheny Baptist General Association of Western, Pennsylvania, and the Youghiogheny Baptist Association, Doctors G. E. Sallie and A. J. Payne, moderators, respectively, supports the station under Mrs. Watson. The Afro-American Baptist State Convention of New Jersey, Dr. J. C. Love, President, pays the salary of Rev. and Mrs. Boaz A. Harris in Haiti; The White Rock Baptist Church of Durham, N. C., pays the salary of Rev. Osiris Lamour in Haiti and we shall only be required to find the means for the support of their stations.

The saw mill sent out at such great expense is now in operation situated on a reservation secured by Mr. A. C. Faulkner. The saw mill has been involved by him and we cannot tell how long it will take to unravel the difficulty. It may be necessary for us to appeal to our State Department at Washington, D. C., to bring about the proper adjustments.

THE GENERAL CONDITIONS

The one supreme need covering all of our fields is MONEY—money, money, money. I wish I could emphasize that word until it would burin deep into the hearts of our churches and the souls of our pastors. Money is everything; it is the master key that will unlock the door of every chamber in the massive mansion of missions. It will cure all diseases and heal every wound. For instance, if I could have only \$2,000 per year for maintenance at the Alexander Mission, in addition to the salaries paid, I believe all bitterness and personal resentment would pass away. If I could give only fifteen hundred or a thousand dollars purely for the purpose of operation, I think the mystery of our misunderstanding would be solved. The same might be said of the Hubbard Mission and all the other work which we have in Liberia. Money, money, money, oh that we might have money! Yes, the areas in Africa and elsewhere which we are trying to cultivate need money. Do not chide, however, if, as your representative, I fail to send money to these fields. The body itself must have life before it can supply nourishment for the arm, and the arm must be nourished before it can supply nourishment to the fingers. You represent the body, I as your Executive, represent the arm, and the fingers represent our mission fields. Again do not charge the administration with the sin of waste and extravagance, if money must be spent to keep the work alive on the home field. A growing child needs more bodily nourishment than a full grown man or a mature adult, likewise a growing organization. It must educate, advertise, and fight for place and standing. I say fight, for the task is nothing less.

Those who have millions and millions to spend on missions have far less to spend on advertisements. Silence then our lips of complaint and open our pocketbooks. Our cause then will prosper. Money, money, money; oh that we might have money!

THE LOTT CAREY HERALD

We should not stand back and criticize the Herald. Neither thoughtlessly compare it to its own disadvantage with journals gotten out by other foreign mission agencies. A pig that has to root for its living can never be so fat as the pig that is kept in a comfortable pen, and supplied daily with swill and corn, more even than it can eat. If our help for the Herald could be as generous in quantity as our fault finding sometimes has been, the paper would show a wonderful improvement. We are compelled to commend the Herald as a clean, conser-

vative instrument. We can also testify that the Herald is sound, reliable, scrupulously circumspect with regard to our own cause and the work of others. The Herald is indispensable, and we must not only give it life, but life more abundantly.

OUR AUXILIARY

It has been amazing in the past few years to note the growth of the President of our Woman's Auxiliary in wisdom and vision, to see how her soul has rounded out, how she has increased in the quality and wealth of her sympathy and understanding, and how adequately she has learned the lesson of co-operation. I am sincerely grateful to her and to her staff of officers and workers for the help they have given me, especially during the past year. In fact, I think it would have been impossible to have carried the burden of the year to the end had it not been for the timely assistance rendered by the Auxiliary. We are in every sense an indivisible unity. So that we are not two but one. This oneness also includes our Junior Department and completes the family circle known as the Lott Carey Baptist Foreign Mission Society, U. S. A. We should like to call our Junior workers Busy Bees—but they are far too happy in their work to be thus denominated. I shall have to call them Fairies—Fairies of a peculiar sort, engaged in a high and holy mission.

CO-OPERATION

More and more are we assured that we are traveling in the right direction when we follow the path of co-operation. Our faith in the wisdom of our course, as set from the beginning, is more deeply confirmed with every step that we take. Co-operation with black and white, bond and free, and so on. In our co-operation with the National Baptist Brethren, we have had no very large increase in the way of money so far, however, we feel confident that the harvest in the end will bear much fruit. We have already found in our National Brethren a larger fellowship, a union of spirit and a virgin but inviting field with untold future possibilities. Our own strength for the task before us has been greatly augmented by that of such men as Dr. J. H. Winn of Fort Worth, Texas, Dr. David E. Over, Baltimore, Md., Dr. S. S. Jones of Muskogee, Okla., Dr. Henry Allen Boyd of Nashville, Tenn., Dr. Ernest Hall of Cleveland, Ohio, Dr. J. Edmund Wood, President of the National Convention, and others. We have found them to be men on whom we can count and who stand ready to count on us. Nothing we have ever done has given us more genuine satisfaction than this single act of co-operation with our National Brethren—a belated, but I believe a true birth of their atonement when Negro Baptists in America must surely make for their awful sin of division.

REPORT OF THE CONFERENCE

We arrived at LeZoute just in time to miss the first session of the Conference. We began with the second session Wednesday afternoon.

It had been my purpose, owing to my condition of health, to attend the sessions of the conference only at intervals; but from the very moment I was enshrouded in its atmosphere, I was gripped by a compulsion that held me in the Conference for the full three sessions a day from the beginning to the end.

Dr. O. J. Allen was also enrolled as a delegate and was given a badge and program.

I have never attended a meeting of any kind which was so completely absorbing as this wonderful Conference on African Missions.

There were about 300 hundred delegates. Every part of Africa was represented by able and experienced missionaries. North America, England, France, Germany, Switzerland, Holland, Sweden—and so on; South America and India were also represented by prominent corresponding messengers.

Many of the choice minds of the Baptists of Great Britain, except Dr. Shakespeare, and all of the other European countries previously mentioned were here.

The colored delegates consisted of Bishops Gregg and Clair, Drs. East, Atkins, Olden, McCoy, Mr. Yergan and Clark, Mrs. Williams, Dr. John Hope, Dr. Allen, Doctors Atkins, East, Mesdames Williams and Bouy and myself were the colored delegates from America.

The Conference covered a period of seven days. I experienced an emotion of pride and exultation far beyond what I could ever have conceived, as address after address was delivered; even in the devotional periods, each founded upon the simple word co-operation.

My heart welled with pride, with ineffable satisfaction that our Lott Carey Baptist Foreign Mission Society, U. S. A., had adopted as its shibboleth this magic word. Like a silver thread running through and interwoven into a fairy Arabian fabric, co-operation was the dominant factor which gave color to the proceedings of the Conference in its main sessions, groups and committee meetings and outside conversations.

Like the rays of the sun converging to a common focus in a prism, from all parts of the world the sentiments, hopes, aspirations and purposes of the missionaries and missionary agencies represented, centered in this one word co-operation. I was amazed at the largeness of vision and spirit and the overflowing sincerity of the men of light and leading in solving problems of the world.

The conviction formed that justice and fair play among all the nations of the earth, including even Africa, will eventually come to pass, will abide in my heart forever.

There was not a moment lost during the full seven days, no debate, no parliamentary controversy; a continual and constant stream, like a limpid current from a perennial spring, kept flowing from beginning to end. Such a variety of viewpoint and diction, resembling fruit and flower gathered from the many lands of the earth, and yet such unity of spirit.

In addition to the missionary personnel of the conference and leaders of Christian thought among religionists all over the world, there were present some eight colonial Governors in Africa and a number of notable administrators of African affairs from among the powers of Europe holding possessions in Africa.

There were many distinguished journalists especially from Great Britain and a very kindly and touching message from the King of Belgium.

I gained a wonderful insight into the purposes and policies of the various Governments who are controlling what is called Colonial Africa, which includes Central Africa, and the South African Union.

Those who represented this territory both as officials and as missionaries explained their points of view with the utmost freedom and frankness.

All phases of the problem in the various African communities were:

fully discussed: economics, education, agriculture, intermarriage, the color bar, amalgamation, forced labor, cruelty and abuse of natives, slavery, illicit sex relations of whites with natives and many other questions to which my attention had never before been called.

Belgians, Britains, French, Swiss and Swedes, Portuguese, Americans, black and white, and native Africans and representatives from all nations of the earth joined heartily and with great candour in the consideration of these African problems.

The most amazing thing to me in this joint discussion was not the intelligence and breadth of view of the native Africans, exceptional as it was, nor yet the persistent appeal of the American Negro group for an open door in Africa, but it was the whole hearted determination of a majority of the ablest whites to conserve Africa for the Africans, and to protect the Africans in their inherent rights.

The outstanding address of the whole meeting was delivered by the Governor of the Belgian Colony in Africa, the Honorable Mr. Lugard. With undoubted sincerity, so far as I can trust my own opinion, he proclaimed upon the housetop that the African under God must never be deprived of his own land.

A French woman recorded the free French point of view as to the absolute equality of the races.

The Boers were positive in their support of the color line and segregation, and the British were often twitted for their economic interest in the country.

The consensus of opinion, including the representatives of all the nations assembled, was that the African should have, and in the end would have, the heritage in land and in human rights which God had given him.

I do not believe from my observations of the conference that the sentiment of the world will long permit the continuance of abuse and travail thru which Africa is now passing.

My heart was never more hopeful of the future of the black man on that continent than it is today.

The white American Christians were ably represented by Dr. Jas. H. Dillard, Dr. Anson Stokes and a number of other white religionists from both Northern and Southern sections of the country. Not a false note was sounded from the flute which set forth their sentiments of truth and justice.

The American Negro group with the utmost vigilance and discernment waged a friendly warfare for an open door in Africa to Negro Missionary endeavor. They fought and won. One section of the elaborate conference code of resolutions says on this point:

COMMITTEE ON AMERICAN NEGROES AND AFRICA

The Conference with the information at its disposal, believes the following to be a true statement of the facts relative to this subject.

I. Findings As To Facts

1. Although there are no legislative restrictions specifically directed against the American Negro, most African Governments are either opposed to or place difficulties in the way of the sending of American Negroes to Africa.

2. Opposition to the sending of American Negroes to Africa is due mainly to three factors:

(a) The unrest caused by the so-called Pan-African and Garvey Movements.

(b) The antagonism to Government of certain American Negroes in Africa in past years with resulting serious disturbances in some cases.

(c) The failure of certain American Negroes in Africa in past years.

3. Most American Negroes consulted, owing to the effect of one or more of the reasons above named, do not think the present time auspicious for pressing upon Government such a general change in policy as would mean the sending of a large number of American Negroes to Africa in the immediate future, although strongly believing that efforts should be made so that the number of such missionaries may be gradually and steadily increased.

4. There are at present working in various parts of Africa American Negroes of the highest character and great usefulness, whose fine spirit and devoted work will in the course of a few years greatly increase the respect in which American Negro missionaries are held and make the securing of permission for the entrance of additional colleagues easier.

5. There is a natural and laudable desire on the part of American Missionary Societies, both white and Negro, to send additional American Negroes as missionaries to Africa—thereby giving the educated Negro an outlet for his zeal to render unselfish service, and aiding in what would seem a natural and important way the cause of African evangelization and education.

II. Recommendations As To Policy

In view of the above findings the Conference adopts the following resolutions:

1. That the Negroes of America should be permitted by Governments and encouraged by Missionary Societies, to play an increasingly important part in the evangelization and education of Africa, and that the number of their missionaries should be increased as rapidly as qualified candidates are available for needed work, and as their representatives already in the field still further succeed in gaining for their people and their societies that public confidence which is so essential.

2. That every practicable form of assistance and support should be given in the spirit of Christian friendship and fellowship as to colleagues of the same missionary status by White missionaries to qualified American Negroes working in Africa, who show themselves worthy of confidence, and that the same spirit of co-operation should be expected by White missionaries from American Negro Missionaries.

3. That Governments should be supported in requiring that American Negroes, wishing to enter Africa for missionary purposes, should go out under the auspices of recognized and well-established standing, and that owing to the difficult and delicate inter-racial situation in Africa, exceptional care should be used in the selection of men and women of strength of character and a fine spirit of co-operation, who can meet the same tests as White missionaries.

4. There are at present working in various parts of Africa American Missionary societies not now represented in Africa should work as far as possible through well-established societies already in Africa, and that they should consider particularly the needs of unevangelized districts.

5. That when Missionary Societies of established reputation are unable to secure the admission to Africa of American Negroes needed for important work, and qualified to perform it, the matter may properly

be taken up with the International Missionary Council for use of its friendly offices.

6. In adopting these resolutions the Conference recognizes that the above recommendations are not an ideal or complete solution of these questions, but believes that they represent the "next steps" which may be wisely taken, and that they should, in the providence of God, gradually bring about a highly significant and increasingly important contribution by the Negroes of America to their distant kindred in Africa.

Our personal contacts with each other were informal and of the most friendly kind. The Conference badge was simply a label bearing the name and profession of the one who wore it.

Everybody was acquainted with everybody else, and felt free to approach his fellow delegate as a friend, without regard to sect or color.

One was not confined to any special table in the dining room nor table mate; no special seat in the assembly hall. He knew everybody and everybody knew him. He was at home everywhere.

In our hotel, which was Headquarters of the Conference, Bishop Clair, Mr. Max Yergan, Dr. Allen and myself seemed veritable magnets attracting groups of every kind around our seats at the table like flies about a honey comb. We were literally talked to death. Newspaper men, ladies from England, Bishops from Germany and an untold array of brilliant minds from all lands were ever and always casting their sinners into the depths of our very hearts as if to hook out our very souls. Eyes that seemed to look straight through you, were boring in all the time and your soul was impaled on the tantalizing end of a question mark. We enjoyed the experience. It was something new, something refreshing, something really human, to which our souls responded with warm ardor and good feelings.

SOME BARRIERS TO AMERICAN NEGRO MISSIONS

We found that the two most stubborn barriers to American Negro Missions in Colonial Africa were the Garvey Movement and the Pan-African Conference. While the mention of these two movements were carefully excluded from the Code of Resolutions which was adopted by the Conference, we found nevertheless that they constitute a real fear among the powers of Europe. The FAILURES of early missionary efforts in Africa are also factors against the Negro program of missions in Africa.

I discovered, I think, a very important fact in connection with the whole situation in Africa, namely that every act or utterance on the part of the Negro in America effects tremendously the politics of the whole world. On one occasion I was confronted before the British Consul in New York with the literal text of every speech that I had made in the past ten years on subjects relating to inter-racial affairs.

The Negro in America must in the future measure the significance of his every word and the meaning of his every act, lest he weave a rope which will stretch his own neck. Extravagant eloquence and oratory will serve only to make a rebound and will surely react to his detriment.

I wish to utter a word of warning, that the Negro in America be circumspect and exercise the utmost restraint regarding his activities from the platform and press.

The Negro delegates at the LeZoute Conference have won a signal

victory which should not be lost by careless and irresponsible conduct or speech in the future.

CLOSING SESSIONS

As the Conference was drawing to a close Sunday, Sept. 19th, the Negro delegates to the Conference sang, by request, at the morning service, several Negro spirituals in which Dr. Allen and I took part.

Dr. Brown of New York was the preacher on this occasion. The response to the singing of the spirituals by the congregation assembled from all the ends of the earth was something ecstatic, if not indeed pathetic. The vibrations from the hearts of those who heard the singing were so effulgent and tender that our own hearts were moved. Dr. Sale of the American Baptist Home Mission Society of New York, with tears flowing from his eyes, stated that he had heard the spirituals sung by Negroes in schools and colleges and throughout the American continent for a lifetime, but that he had never before been so impressed with their spiritual value. The effect was simply overwhelming. From that moment onward a unanimous request followed us to sing at all the other sessions of the Conference.

Monday, September 20th, the Conference closed, the entire day being devoted to business sessions, in which resolutions setting forth the views obtained on the various aspects of African need were fully discussed and adopted.

The entire code would make a volume in itself and cannot be quoted in a brief survey of this kind.

Tuesday morning with friendly hand clasps and fond farewells we separated. Group after group was leaving for their distant homes, and by Tuesday night the Conference had turned itself into history and Dr. Allen and I were left alone to tarry in the queenly village of LeZoute for another two days.

OUR HONORED DEAD YEARS 1925-1926

DR. WM. J. HOWARD

Rev. Wm. J. Howard, D. D., the late pastor of the Zion Baptist Church of Washington, D. C., was one of the founders and charter members of the Lott Carey Baptist Foreign Mission Society, and was also one of its most enthusiastic advocates and workers. Dr. Howard stood far above his colleagues in regard to Christian work, in general, and foreign mission work, in particular. His ardor and enthusiasm was unbounded. He was tireless as a worker and picturesque as a Christian. He was one of God's exceptional men, whose personality stood out unique in itself. He was a distinct model, unlike other men in almost all that appertains to Christian activities. He had faith and patience with those who could win his confidence, but was intolerant toward those in whose Christian integrity he did not believe. So far, God has not given us another man who could exactly fill his place. His taking away was a distinct loss to the cause of the Lott Carey Baptist Foreign Mission Society, the denomination and the Christian church. Dr. Howard was educated at the Old Wayland Seminary in Washington, D. C., which is now Union University at Richmond, Va. He had been pastor of the Zion Baptist Church of Washington, D. C., for over 40 years, and was the most beloved pastor in the city. He was known by everybody in that large city, white and colored, and was regarded by the colored people of the city, as a whole, as their pastor regardless of denomination. His influence for good was felt everywhere. He died a member of the Executive Board of the Lott Carey Society.

DR. EVANS PAYNE

Rev. Evans Payne, D. D., the late pastor of the Fourth Street Baptist Church of Richmond, Va., was like John Jasper, James H. Holmes and Richard Wells, one of God's true prophets, in the days when the Negro Church needed guidance. Dr. Payne was orthodox in every doctrine of the church. He was fierce and rugged in opposition to all creeds and religious programs in which he did not believe.

He was a master in debate, fearless, resourceful and unconquerable. Dr. Payne was not only a true prophet of God but was a strong minister of the Word and a good pastor. He was educated at what was then known as the Richmond Seminary, now Union University. He obtained his education after he reached maturity. He was large of stature and full of vitality. A man who was to be loved as a friend and feared as an enemy. He died the president of the Ministers Conference of the city of Richmond, Virginia.

PROF. WALLACE EPPS

Prof. Wallace Epps, for many years teacher in the public schools and superintendent of the Sunday School of the Ebenezer Baptist Church of Richmond, Va., was one of the outstanding laymen among the Negro Baptists the country over. Prof. Epps was very unassuming and yet a man of firm convictions, great force of character and na-

excelled initiative. He was loyal to all departments of the Kingdom of Christ—education, home missions, foreign missions and charity. He was a patient toiler and believed in amity and Christian co-operation. He was the president of the State Baptist Sunday School Convention at the time of his death, a position he had held for many years. Professor Epps was highly respected and greatly admired for his fine qualities everywhere.

MRS. C. S. BROWN

Mrs. C. S. Brown, late wife of our honored president, Dr. C. S. Brown, of Winton, N. C., was a woman of exceptional personal beauty and had a charm of manner which made her conspicuous everywhere. She was quiet and modest to a fault, unaffected, of great simplicity, yet she stood out like a diamond surrounded by pearls and other precious stones. Even women loved her, in spite of her beauty. Although she lived in the country, she could mingle in any society with the grace of a queen. She was of a happy disposition. Her home was full of sunshine and her children were sparkling fountains of exuberance and joy. She was an ideal wife and companion and also mother. Mrs. Brown was perhaps the foremost worker among the women of our Lott Carey Auxiliary. At the last session of our Convention in Brooklyn, although she lived in the country, her circle brought in, in cash, to the treasurer of our Society over \$700. The Lott Carey Society will be poor indeed for many years because of the loss of this Godly woman.

MRS. BLACKWELL

Mrs. Annie E. Blackwell, of Richmond, Virginia, wife of Professor J. H. Blackwell, eminent educator of our State, was buried in Petersburg Wednesday afternoon, December 8th. Mrs. Blackwell was one of the founders of the Auxiliary to the Lott Carey Baptist Foreign Mission Society, and had been its treasurer for the whole life of this organization.

Mrs. Blackwell was wonderfully endowed with gifts for service. She was honest to a fault, a true friend to all mankind, impatient with wrong doing but easy to forgive. She was deeply emotional in the manifestation of her zeal and consecration for a holy cause. She was constantly working at her task, overflowing with ardor and enthusiasm. She was wholly consecrated to any cause which she espoused, and was consecrated to the core.

She was one to inspire the faith and confidence of others and to win reluctant and recalcitrant unbelievers to conviction and acknowledgement of truth.

Mrs. Blackwell was not only respected for her fine and heroic character but she was greatly beloved. The most humble could approach her with the utmost freedom and she was a friend to all, regardless of social standing. She was a busy worker in her church and a true believer in her pastors. No woman in Virginia for the past twenty-five years has excelled Mrs. Blackwell in all of the virtues which the Lord recommended to men. She was a great woman (a wonderful wife and mother) and her memory will live as long as time goes on.

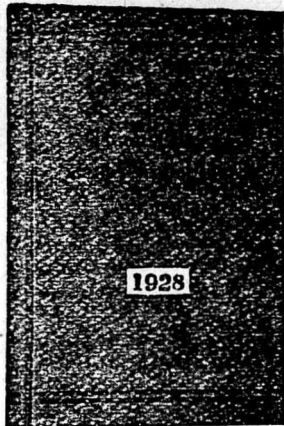
