(d) General Provision. The Certification by the City Clerk
of the sufficiency of a referendary petition shall automatically
suspend the ordinance in question pending repeal by the Council
or final determination by the electors as the case may be. An
ordinance adopted by the electorate may not be amended or re-
pealed by the Council for a period of one (1) year, and then only
by the affirmative vote of five (5) Councilmen. Should two (2) or
