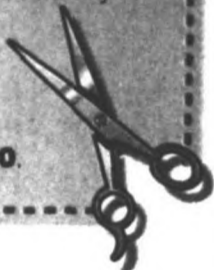

Backers boost historic district



The designation of a historic district will help property values, but it won't preclude business owners from making improvements to their property.

Backers of a plan to have much of downtown Plymouth named a historic district say the move will preserve property values and the local economy.

The city's seven-member historic district review committee plans a presentation of a draft report on the plan and a public hearing at 7 p.m. Wednesday, Feb. 2, at the city commission chambers at city hall.

In the report, the committee tries to address the potential concerns of some downtown building owners over restrictions on improvements.

"The purpose of the historic district commission won't be to dictate the design specifications," said Mayor Doug Miller.

"The intent is to work with property owners to ensure that work that's done fits in with the historic character of the district, to benefit all property owners," Miller said.

A final report is scheduled to go before city commissioners March 7, when they are also scheduled to consider establishing a historic district ordinance.

Miller, also a member of the historic district study committee, said answering the concerns of property owners is a typical early step, when these districts have been proposed throughout the state.

He acknowledges that some property owners, on first hearing of such an ordinance, are worried about red tape

Students hear King's message of justice

Every year, East Middle School principal Tom Workman commemo-

rates Martin Luther King Day with a special address for his students. This year was no exception.

Martin Luther King was true to his

convictions, even though his house was bombed, and ultimately, his life was taken, Workman said. "He still stuck to what he believed in. We are

celebrating a very important person and a very important day in recognizing Martin Luther King."

Knowing how much the slain civil rights leader means to him, East Middle School secretaries Denise Gerisch and Karen Massey presented Workman with a painting of King, which Workman hung in a place for all to see last Monday.

The following is what Workman read to his students: "Each January we set a day aside to recognize the life and contributions of Martin Luther King Jr., who was born January 15, 1929. He is the first Afro-American to be recognized by having a national holiday named in his recognition and the youngest to receive the Nobel Peace Prize.

"In the Declaration of Independence, it was written 'all men are created equal' with rights to 'life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness.' This idea has come to be known as the American Dream, the dream that all citizens of the United States have an equal chance to realize their potential. That means being able to be the best we can be.

"History has clearly demonstrated that in the United States, we have not

Teacher remembered for caring

It's a scene that readily comes to mind: students bolting out the door into the June sunshine on the last day of school.

That didn't happen in David Thomann's classroom at Pioneer Middle School. "I watched last year on the last day of school. Kids lined up to say goodbye to him. You didn't see that with everyone else," said Chuck Portelli, president of the Plymouth-Canton teachers union.

Plymouth resident Thomann, 48, who was diabetic, died Jan. 18 of a heart attack in a fellow teacher's classroom at Pioneer. He was born March 2, 1945, in Highland Park.

"I talked to him at 2:30, and by 3:30 he was dead," said Portelli. The two spoke about a memo from an administrator, "nothing of significance. We laughed and joked about a couple things."

Efforts to revive Thomann, who taught physical education and math, weren't successful. EMS workers arrived within minutes but couldn't establish a pulse and had difficulty creating an airway. He was taken to St. Mary Hospital where he was pronounced dead.

Thomann, who was with the district for 17 years, was a tutor for the University of Michigan athletic study table and a member of the Livonia Masonic Lodge. He was an assistant

football coach for Plymouth Canton High School, and for Ann Arbor Pioneer and Ypsilanti high schools. He worked as a defensive line coach and a defensive coordinator.

Plymouth-Canton Superintendent John Hoben said he knew Thomann as a high school ballplayer when Thomann and his brother, longtime Sablem basketball coach Fred Thomann, played for Taylor Center High School. "They are a fine family. The dad and mom were staunch followers of athletics," Hoben said.

Pat Fitzpatrick and Jerry Ostoin, colleagues of Thomann's, said their friendship with Thomann dates to

Family gets help from good neighbors

It's not unfamiliar territory for Debbie Dell'Orco. That's why she and other Sunflower subdivision neighbors are accepting help for the family whose home burned last Monday.

"I feel for the people. So if there is something we can do, I would like to help them," said Dell'Orco, who lost her husband, Marty, and six of nine children when their house on Proctor burned in December 1990.

Sunflower residents are accepting donations — cash donations are preferred — for the Robert Johnson family whose house on Polo burned, sending two grandparents and their 5-year-old

granddaughter out into subzero temperatures.

"We had all decided to do something and with what Debbie has been through she wanted to help them anyway we can," said Lynne Eckardt, editor of the monthly subdivision newsletter, in which the effort will be publicized.

Lee and Noel Bittinger of RE/MAX Crossroads real estate also are offering a rental house to the family if they need a place to stay. "We have the possibility of one coming up within a week," Lee Bittinger said. He asks the family to call him or Noel at 453-8700.

Sunflower neighbors who are

collecting donations for the family are asking that clothing and food not be sent. "It's nice when people donate food and clothing, but it's easier when they (the family) can just go to the store and buy what they need," Dell'Orco said.

Eckhardt said she has been unable to locate the family but is putting a notice about the effort in their mailbox, hoping they are still picking up mail.

Anyone who is interested in helping should make checks out to the Robert Johnson family in care of the Hanford Clubhouse, 45800 Hanford Road, Canton. Drop-offs are also possible. The clubhouse is open noon to 3 p.m. Mondays, 2-6 p.m. Wednesdays,

or by appointment by calling 453-2022.

Firefighters from stations 1 and 2, as well as Canton police officers, responded to the late morning fire. It's believed the girl was playing with matches and a couch caught fire. When the smoke alarm activated, the grandparents could not find the girl. When she appeared at the front door and the grandparents got her safely out, emergency personnel were called.

"Thank God it was only material items that were lost," Dell'Orco said.

Initial estimates of damage to the two-story house topped \$150,000. Insurance agents will later determine if the house is a total loss.

Stolen bowl holds many memories

An antique bowl was stolen from a Plymouth antique shop Jan. 9, and its owner would like it returned.

The green heart-shaped bowl belonged to Jeanne McLoughlin, owner of In My Attic, 865 Wing. Once she discovered it was gone,

"I didn't realize I had become so attached to it," she said.

"The bowl belonged to my grandmother, who's been gone for 15 years. She meant a lot to me. Now someone has stolen her green heart-shaped bowl," McLoughlin said.

"It's not the value. The bowl was one of the most important items in my shop. My goal in business was to share Plymouth memories with people, not have them stolen. Whoever stole the bowl does not have a heart. They hurt me deeply," she said.

The bowl, about 12 inches around and 14-16 inches tall, has several chips on the back, reducing its value as an antique.

McLoughlin said anyone with information on who took the bowl may call her at the store at 455-8970.

that could hamper plans to develop their property.

"It's the same fear that's come up in every town that's done this, early on," Miller said. "As time goes on it's not an issue," he said, as property owners see the good side of establishing the districts.

Historic district design guidelines encourage a building owner to preserve the historic style of a building. "It's not really different from the current zoning ordi-

nance," he said.

One downtown property owner who's expressing concern is Joe Van Esley, who owns a real estate office on Ann Arbor Trail off of Kellogg Park.

"For so many years they've been trying to get a new ordinance to dissolve parking credits, and that is supposed to be right around the corner," Van Esley said. "They've been working on it.

I've been waiting so I can expand my building."

"If this passes, and when I go to expand, they can say now wait a minute, this doesn't fit into our ordinance," he said. "I would hope it doesn't turn into another roadblock for development, I would hope it doesn't turn into a taking of property rights from people.

"We have a beautiful downtown

and it should be preserved, but people shouldn't be overburdened," Van Esley said. "I don't want to see the price of adding on getting beyond the means of what somebody can afford."

The proposed Plymouth Kellogg Park Historic District includes 55 properties, 75 percent of which are classified as contributing properties as they are 50 years old or more.

EXERCISE & AGING

If you are age 70 and beyond, what exercise is best for you? Fatigue in the afternoon, or after 2-3 hours shopping, is part of the aging process. You should not expect stamina sufficient to allow you to keep up with children in their 40-50's and grandchildren in their teens to thirties.

Examine traditions you have set up for family and friends. You may need to change responsibility for large meals at Thanksgiving and Christmas, or for housing, feeding and entertaining the extended family to ensure reunions and renewal of kinship. 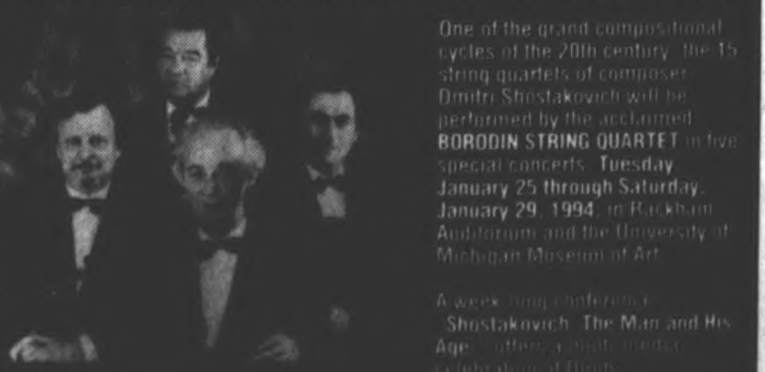

Drive for third judgeship gaining momentum

To deal more effectively with a growing caseload at the 35th District Court in Plymouth, the court's advisory board is renewing efforts to win state funding for a third full-time judge.

In 1990, the state court administrator recommended adding a third judge at the court, and the state Legislature also approved it. The court handles cases from the Canton, Plymouth and Northville communities.

But the local governments who administer the court decided to postpone the creation of the position until a third courtroom was built.

The local units agreed to the new judgeship in 1992, but the Legislature balked due to a budget crisis.

In recent months, legislators have grappled with plans to change the property tax system. They have yet to set aside the money necessary to pay for new

judgeships in the state.

"We haven't heard from the Legislature. They have to appropriate the money for a third judge," said 35th District Judge John MacDonald.

"It's certainly been recommended by the (state) supreme court, and the need is certainly there," he said.

In 1992, the caseload per judge at the 35th District Court was 20,140 compared with the statewide average of 11,138.

Now, "The caseload is basically the same, it dropped a little bit in the past year by 5 or 10 percent. That still more than justifies the position," MacDonald said.

State Rep. Jerry Vorva, R-Plymouth, said the Legislature will look at paying for the judgeships "in the whole context of the governor's budget."

"With the growth in Plymouth and Northville, there's clearly need for a third judge. It's a matter of whether it will be a budget-

buster," he said.

Last year, the court completed a renovation creating a third courtroom, where part-time third judge Charles Kaufman presides. "He's here two, two and a half days a week," MacDonald said.

Word on whether the appropriation will be approved should come "I think within the next month," MacDonald said.

Should the money be appropriated, candidates for the position with a \$98,500 annual salary

would be required to file petitions to run by May 10.

An August primary would be held, followed by a general election in November. The new judge would take his or her place on the bench in January 1995.

MacDonald said a four-year term would be created initially for the position, and would change to six years in succeeding terms so judicial elections would be staggered every two years in the district.

Students earn kudos

proud of themselves," he said.

Carrie Dzialo designed a carving using her dog Mocha and cat Dash as models. "I was happy and really excited," she said. Carolyn Dzialo, her mother, said, "We're very appreciative of the tremendous support students received from their teachers. It's nice to have that kind of support."

"I think it went really well," said Kelle Morse, another festival organizer. "The kids were really excited. They came out and really enjoyed themselves."

"The ice fest is a family event, and the more involvement we can get, the better. We tied this in with the high school and community colleges, which is a good thing, because that's the future of this thing. The O & E supported us, and that makes it a really good thing for everybody," Watts said.

Ordinance outlines details on maintaining property

An ordinance that spells out minimum upkeep of city homes and yards has won the approval of city commissioners, to be ready in plenty of time for the spring cleanup program.

The first reading of the ordinance passed the commission Jan. 17. The final reading is expected early next month.

While the ordinance sets some new provisions for yard upkeep, the intention is to combine provisions previously set forth in other city codes. It provides a guideline for residents who complain about the relative upkeep of a neighbor's yard or property.

After the ordinance was first proposed in December, city commissioners made some changes. A draft provision to allow grass height no higher than six inches was revised to allow higher grass height in cases of natural landscaping.

A two-level process by which property owners can appeal ticketed violations is also part of the property maintenance ordinance.

It calls for:
■ A home to be maintained "in a clean, safe and sanitary condition free from any accumulation of rubbish or garbage, except on a

temporary basis in accordance with city regulations."

■ Trees and shrubs "shall be kept trimmed so as not to adversely affect structures or impede pedestrian or vehicular traffic."

■ Machinery, equipment, vehicles, lumber piles, crates, boxes, building blocks, furniture, recreation equipment or other materials "either discarded, unsightly or showing evidence of a need for repairs" in a yard will be considered a nuisance.

■ Firewood should be stored behind the front building line and not cause rodent or other pest infestations.

■ Dog pens should be placed at least 10 feet from adjacent property lines unless an obscuring fence is provided. "All dog pens and runs shall be kept free of feces, garbage and other odor-causing

conditions," the ordinance states.

■ Building surfaces "shall be maintained free of broken, loose, rotting, crumbling, missing or inadequately finished materials and shall also be maintained free of any materials which are not intended to be on such surfaces, regardless of whether such conditions have been caused by normal wear and tear, neglect, vandalism or accidental causes."

City manager Steve Walters said once a resident is deemed to be in violation, a letter would be sent detailing the violation, suggesting possible sources to seek for help and specifying a time by which improvements should be made.

Further contact could lead to a ticket being written and court action if there is no compliance.

The compiled ordinance is based on ordinances other cities use, Walters said.

Plymouth police arrest man following fight at his home

Columnist has praise for Archer

Detroit News columnist Jon Pepper has some thoughts: Detroit Mayor Dennis Archer must restructure city government; the Tigers have to stay in Detroit; and it's near impossible to figure out what's going on with school financing.

"He I think has a perspective to put things in writing that I have bouncing in the back of my head," said Wayne County Commissioner Bryan Amann who introduced Pepper to the Canton Economic Club Wednesday.

Pepper praised Archer's urging of Detroiters to be self-reliant by taking care of their families and their city. "Here it is three weeks later (after inauguration) and I still support him."

Faced with an \$88 million deficit, Archer must restructure the

government — something former Mayor Coleman Young didn't do — to reduce the costly bureaucracy and get some type of concession from unions. For that, Pepper said, Archer made a smart move in hiring retired UAW leader Doug Fraser to work with unions.

"That's a pretty smart move," Pepper said, adding that Archer is wisely distancing himself from the effort.

Pepper also predicted that Archer will eventually privatize certain city services even though there may be some opposition. "But he has to figure out a euphemism for privatization."

A new Tiger Stadium has captured Pepper's interest. "If I were king of the world, I would remove all subsidies from professional sports." Nonetheless, Pepper sup-

ports helping the Tiger organization remain in Detroit. If not Detroit, then the western Wayne suburbs would be a possibility and there's word of St. Petersburg or Tampa. "I don't think they are going to go that way," Pepper said.

The columnist, a Dearborn resident, said maintaining the Tigers in a stadium in Detroit would be a symbol of confidence in the city. "The trend of letting Detroit decline will catch up with us in the suburbs," Pepper said.

Heads nodded in agreement as Pepper discussed the impossibility of understanding school finance tax proposals. "It seems pretty clear the Legislature didn't know what they were voting for," he said.

Pepper asked what happened to Gov. John Engler's plan to reform education. He assured the audi-

ence that no action would have been taken if the governor were not facing re-election.

He encouraged the business community to become as strong a lobbyist as the Michigan Education Association. "They (business) have to take the gloves off," Pepper said. "I think we have to have something to improve the business climate and education in the state."

When asked which proposal he would choose, Pepper picked the ballot proposal, which reduces the state income tax from 4.6 to 4.4 percent and increases the sales tax. The statutory plan proposes an income tax increase and no change in sales tax. "All you export out is taxpayers," Pepper said, referring to an income tax increase.

allowed all citizens to reach their potential. Racial minorities, women and the poor have been among some of the people restrained from realizing their dream.

"In 1954, Martin Luther King emerged as a national leader of peace and justice in the effort to win equality for minority Americans. Dr. King helped to focus the nation's attention, and his courage and non-violent philosophy gave people faith and hope to work peacefully for a change in our country's laws.

"He was arrested for every trumped-up charge imaginable. He was denied his right to a seat on a public bus in Montgomery, Ala. His house was bombed, he was jailed for sitting at a department store lunch counter, he was sprayed by water hoses and attacked by dogs, all because he believed black children and adults

should have equal access to schools, libraries, playgrounds and eating places throughout the country.

"He was beaten, threatened, and stabbed in his pursuit of racial justice. In August 1963, he led a march to the national capital of Washington, D.C. There, he gave his 'I Have A Dream' speech, one of the most important speeches in American history.

"He dreamed that one day people would be judged by their character and not their color, that all children would be able to walk together hand-in-hand as brothers and sisters, that freedom and justice would prevail in all the states of our country, and that this nation would live out the true meaning of the Declaration of Independence creed, that all men are created equal and that every citizen has the opportunity to realize the American Dream."

the late 1960s at Willow Run schools, where Fred won the state basketball championships. The Thomanns, Ostoin and Fitzpatrick taught together at Willow Run. "Dave was a good guy," said Ostoin, Salem High School principal. "He had built-in respect, kind of like Fred."

"He cared a lot about kids," said Fitzpatrick, an area coordinator at Salem.

Fred Thomann said of his brother, "He was well-respected and well-liked. He did a nice job, with his teaching and his outside interests. He was probably closer to his students than the staff members he worked with. He loved to make sure kids got what they needed."

Thomann was an outstanding football coach, and a skilled golfer and woodworker. "Those became his passion. He loved the game (golf)," his brother said.

Thomann graduated from Taylor Center High School and Eastern Michigan University. He attended Adrian College and Northern Michigan University. He also

worked for Hostess Catering.

Thomann was direct and open. "Once he made a decision, that was the way it was," said Fred Thomann. "It was a very firm set of standards he adhered to. He didn't deviate much from the direction he was going in. He viewed his friendships very strongly, and often times there were disagreements and often times different directions were taken.

"Still, the friendships were there. He had a tremendous amount of respect for people," he said.

Thomann is survived by his wife, Kathryn of Plymouth, daughter, Tanya, sister, Gloria Shelton of Farmington Hills, and mother, Beatrice of Taylor. Thomann, who was cremated, was buried Friday from Vermeulen Funeral Home in Plymouth, less than half a mile from Pioneer Middle School.

Officiating was the Rev. Harvey Heneveld. Memorials may be made in Thomann's memory to the American Diabetes Association.

200,000 saw park light show

Wayne County officials report that the first annual "Festival of Lights" in Hines Park was an outstanding success.

The four-mile-long holiday light show attracted more than 63,000 cars between Nov. 22 and Jan. 9, generating more than \$300,000 in revenue, said parks director Hurley Coleman.

Light show patrons were asked to voluntarily donate \$5 per car, and Coleman said 94 percent of them did. Some gave more.

The show featured gigantic displays of animated snowmen, a north pole village, larger-than-life skiers and ice skaters, a Loch Ness monster and many other lighted displays purchased from Bronner's in Frankenmuth for \$250,000. A five-year, no-interest loan was taken out to purchase the lights.

Any profit from the light show will go into the parks budget, but Coleman isn't sure yet how much profit there is.

After expenses like electricity, promotion, parts and supplies are paid, he said, "We should come out with a little bit of a profit." A detailed report is being prepared for Wayne County Executive Edward McNamara and the county commission.

Next year's show will have additional displays, Coleman said, but the plan is to get private sponsorships to pay for them.

Area businesses contributing to the event included Ameritech, AAA of Michigan and Detroit Edison. Others included Awrey Bakery of Livonia, Bruce and Chato Advertising, CPI Photo Finishing, Eastman Kodak, Little Caesars Pizza, Roostail Catering, Soil & Materials Engineers, Tucker Anthony, Walbridge-Aldinger and WNIC.

McNamara praised the light show as "a great event for Wayne County."

"We created a fun-filled, family-oriented show and helped raise funds for the park system at the same time."

Besides the lights, other activities included performance by various school and church choirs sponsored by the Blue Care Network of Southeast Michigan. Community and civic groups including, Wayne-Westland YMCA and Wayne Memorial Marching Band staffed a small gift shop to raise funds for their organizations.

But there was some grumbling from some park area residents and others.

Westland residents living near Hines Park were angry about the light show traffic around their houses. Beatrice Scalise of Westland characterized the light show as McNamara's "pipe dream that has turned into a traffic nightmare." Coleman reports that traffic complaints ceased after the first week of operation.

Although the county commission approved the light show, a two local commissioners voted against it, including Thaddeus McCotter, R-Livonia, and Bryan Amann, D-Wayne.

Coffee Bean Cafe new to Plymouth

If you have yet to indulge in the burgeoning new coffeehouse culture, now's the time to ease into contemporary cafe society. You really don't have to be a coffee-lover to experience the ambience of the java cafes. Just consider them a great place to meet friends, linger over a newspaper or game of backgammon, study and people-watch. The latest addition to the coffeehouse scene is the Plymouth Coffee Bean Company, recently opened downtown at 884 Penniman. Tim and Pam Haase transformed a 120-year-old landmark home into a cozy, West Coast-style establishment.

Coffeehouses tend to exhibit distinct personalities. They are not gulp-and-run types of joints. Most feature artful decor, low lights and intimate seating. The atmosphere invites you to stay awhile and relax with that cuppa joe.

The Plymouth Coffee Bean Company is modeled after the early 20th century European coffeehouses found in France and Italy.

Living room-like spaces are filled with comfortable oversized vintage-look furniture, arranged to induce conversation. Antique accessories, original wood floors and contemporary art add to the decor. The walls and ceilings are bathed in fantasy-like faux finishes, the result of Pam's expertise with a paintbrush. It's hip enough to appeal to young adults, yet sophisticated enough to draw older couples. "I'm going to have to start paying rent," confesses Kerri Ayoub of Canton, a regular who enjoys her cappuccino in front of the corner fireplace. Her friend, Sean Adair of Taylor, often joins her for a game of chess. Sean assures it's worth the drive. "This is just a really cool place," says Ayoub. "And the homemade brownies and desserts are great."

The chess set joins dozens of books and games on built-in bookshelves. Just another reason to linger over the beverage of your choice. The quality of those specialty drinks is just as important to Haase as the ambience of the surroundings. He imports beans from around the world, representing different growers. The beans are freshly roasted and ground. There is less emphasis on flavored coffee and more care taken to acquire high-grade top of the line beans, such as the Arabica.

In any given week, you might find Jamaican, Hawaiian, Sumatran or African beans. The selection changes periodically. In addition to quality coffees, Haase uses Ghiradelli chocolate in his mochas and Monin syrups from France in his Italian and French sodas.

Teas for two

Non-coffee drinkers choose from exclusive Royal Garden teas. The premium whole leaf teas are served in linen bags for proper diffusion. Tea connoisseur Jim Dinser of Plymouth recommends Goddess herb tea, a Chinese green tea made with sun-dried leaves. "It is subtle and delicate," he says. The package describes the flavor as earth-mint.

Haase hopes to expand the space in the spring to include a front veranda where he can offer live entertainment. But for now, folks are glad to have a quiet gathering place. A local book club met here recently for coffee before a cross-country ski outing. Once ensconced on the cushy sofas, they never made it to the trails. "This is a great place to settle in," said one bibliophile as the group reluctantly left the warmth of the Plymouth Coffee Bean Company.

If you've been reluctant to visit one of the trendy new java cafes, let this be your wake-up call. The popular hangout of the '90s is a great place to start your day and an alluring alternative to the neighborhood bar on the weekend.

Mall greenery is good for your psyche

■ Planterra's interiorscapes are giving buildings a beautiful look and a healthier environment as greenery cleans out stale and potentially toxic air.

About 15 years ago, scientists from the National Aeronautics and Space Administration proved that plant leaves and roots removed trace levels

of toxic vapors from inside tightly sealed chambers. Greenery merchants have been busy ever since.

In response to NASA's findings, office and retail centers battling the "Sick Building Syndrome" placed huge orders for philodendrons, spider plants, golden pothos, gerbera daisies and chrysanthemums — the most effective plants for removing formaldehyde and benzene from the air. These chemicals are given off from building materials and products with oil bases. Architects began adding atriums and lobbies with lots of natural light so plant-filtering systems would be a part of their buildings.

When James Ryan and Associates of Farmington Hills redesigned The Somerset Collection in Troy in 1992, it created beautiful spaces for greenery. Planterra Tropical Greenhouses of West Bloomfield was hired to fill them. Planterra has won an Associated Landscape Contractors of America Grand Award for its landscaping work at The Somerset Collection.

A month later, Planterra was honored with the Gold Award from the Metropolitan Detroit Landscape Association, also for its work at The Somerset Collection.

Clean air council

Planterra president Larry Pliska is proud of the interiorscape awards that hang in the greenhouse lobby. They represent more than 20 years in the plantscape business. He's eager to discuss the benefits of plants in

the workplace, home, restaurant and shopping center as an active supporter of the Plants For Clean Air Council.

"This whole business started as a hobby with me in 1972," Pliska said. "I left my work as a draftsman to pursue my interest in plants. I watched as the government deregulated the standards for air quality in exchange for tighter, more energy-efficient buildings because of the oil embargo and the energy crisis.

"Then I read with interest about the new sick building syndromes where office workers suffer unexplainable eye irritations, headaches and other problems while at work. Their symptoms were linked to fumes released from carpeting, plywood and other things like solvents and petroleum-based products. These fumes contained benzene and formaldehyde, which can surely cause health problems."

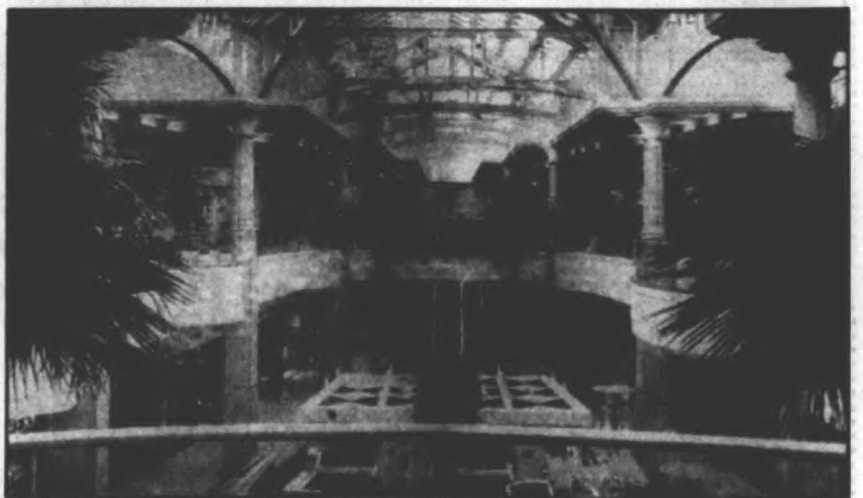

Chris Burke of Creative Framing was singing "Joy to the World." She sold 1,200 Ice Sculpture Festival posters made from an original oil painting by artist Kathy Jakobsen.

"We had a sure-fire item to sell but the numbers we sold astounded us," she said. "At times during the ice festival, we had customers three-deep in the store in a line that went out the door. It was great."

Mike McCarty, manager of Georgia's Gift Gallery, agreed. "Each year, we try and find merchandise that complements the ice sculptures and we always do well with this," he said. "Business was good during the festival. It absolutely energizes the area."

At Sideways, owner Sharon Puge said the ice-art patrons enjoyed the sculptures and then stopped by to see the demonstrations her store scheduled.

"They bought a lot of coffees,

non-alcoholic beverages, Valentines and cake decorating supplies," she said. "We plan special things in the store for this weekend and extend our hours. It was a fun weekend. The demonstrations brought shoppers in whether they were browsing or just getting out of the cold."

Donna, a cashier at The Cozy Cafe, said business was up during ice spectacular weekend but it was not as busy as last year.

Lots of goals

A sales boost for local business, Toney said, was just one goal of the Plymouth International Ice Sculpture Spectacular, now in its 12th year.

"The show brings in people from all over Michigan, Ohio and Canada who come to see the ice sculptures in Kellogg Park," she said. "But they also discover new shops when they are here. They may decide to buy a home here or

move a business here. And everyone knows every dollar spent turns over four to seven times, whether it's for gasoline or lunch or a pair of boots. The ice show benefits the whole community in one way or another."

This year's ice spectacular chairman, Mike Watts, said the event cost about \$125,000 to stage. It has its own board of directors.

"I estimate we had about 300,000 visitors to the ice show," he said, thawing out the day after. "Other years, we've had 500,000. You can't set a record every year. Considering the cold temperatures. We did just fine."

Just how fine, Toney said, will be apparent months from now when the chamber's phone rings with inquiries from ice festival visitors who want the name of a shop they saw in January or the

phone number of a service agency that caught their eye.

Downtown Plymouth is looking forward to its next community events: May's Memorial Day parade, the June-July Music in the

Park series, the Fourth of July parade, July's Art in the Park and Sidewalk Sales, September's Fall Festival and November's Santa Arrival. Then it's time for another ice spectacular.

One NASA report that Pliska distributes states that "it takes about 15 to 20 spider plants to clean and refresh the air in the average 1,800-square-foot home." That translates into a lot of spider plants in a 100,000-square-foot mall.

"At Somerset, we aimed to enhance the close relationship between architecture and landscape in our design," he said. "The display features an elegant ambience of architectural details as well as showing off the form, texture, and color of individual plants."

Jody Stevenson of Troy, a Somerset shopper, took a break from the clearance sales and bought a cup of coffee at Gloria Jean's. As

she sipped the brew, she commented on the mall's award-winning horticulture: "The plants at Somerset are so elegant. Most of them are planted in cream-colored marble containers throughout the center. Purple chrysanthemums are everywhere. My favorite spot is here, above the rotunda, where those huge palm trees rise up to the skydome."

The 35-foot-tall palm trees are actually preserved palms from southern California, according to Pliska. "They look so real, I hate to give away the secret. However, all the other species of plant around the mall are very real and thriving."

"Ours is a labor of love," he

said of his 45-member staff. "Part of our job is maintaining and changing the plants that we put into offices, homes and shopping centers. Plants are a lot of work. They take a long time to get the lush look we love. Some of my older figs and ficuses are valued between \$1,500 and \$2,500."

In addition to interiorscaping The Somerset Collection in Troy, Planterra has greened-up The Galleria in Southfield, the Renaissance Center in Detroit, the First Center Office Plaza in Southfield and the Embassy Suites and Marriott hotels.

Pliska is passionate about what he calls "getting the word out."

CITY OF PLYMOUTH ORDINANCE NO. 94-1

AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH STANDARDS FOR THE MAINTENANCE OF PROPERTY WITH THE CITY OF PLYMOUTH, TO PROVIDE FOR THE ENFORCEMENT THEREOF, AND PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

The City of Plymouth ordains:

Section 1. PURPOSE. The purpose of this ordinance is to promote the public health, safety and welfare by prohibiting the deterioration and inadequate maintenance of buildings and premises, which contribute to fire, safety and health hazards, and adversely affect the property rights of adjacent owners and occupants, in the City of Plymouth.

The intent of this ordinance is to provide minimum standards for the construction and maintenance of buildings and premises. Nothing in this ordinance shall be deemed to supersede, modify or reduce the requirements of other City ordinances, codes and regulations. All other ordinances which are inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance shall be controlling to the extent of such inconsistencies.

Section 2. DEFINITIONS. The following words and phrases, as used in this ordinance, shall have the following meaning:

- (a) **BUILDING** shall mean any structure occupied or intended for the purpose of supporting or sheltering any occupancy.
- (b) **CITY** shall mean the City of Plymouth, Michigan.
- (c) **CITY COMMISSION** shall mean the Plymouth City Commission.
- (d) **PREMISES** shall mean a lot or parcel of land including the buildings and structures.
- (e) **STRUCTURE** shall mean that which is built or constructed, or any portion thereof.
- (f) **WORKMANLIKE MANNER** shall mean the manner of carrying out such activities as construction, maintenance and repair such as to secure the adequate maintenance of buildings and premises, to sustain the property rights of adjacent owners, and to eliminate conditions which contribute to fire, safety, and health hazards.
- (g) **YARD** shall be an open space on the same lot with a building, which space is unoccupied and unobstructed from the ground upward, except as otherwise provided herein. The measurement of the yard is the minimum horizontal distance between the lot line and the building or structure. Front yard shall be a yard extending the full width of lot, the depth of which is the minimum horizontal distance between the front lot line and the nearest line to the principal building on the lot. Rear yard shall be a yard extending the full width of the lot, the depth of which is the horizontal distance between the rear lot line and the rear line or lines of the principal building on the lot.

Section 3. COMPLIANCE WITH STANDARDS REQUIRED. All premises, buildings and structures within the City of Plymouth shall be maintained in a workmanlike manner in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance. The enforcement officer shall apply the provisions of this ordinance so that minor variations which do not create any fire, safety or health hazard, and do not adversely affect the property rights of adjacent property owners and occupants, shall not be considered a violation of this ordinance.

Section 4. STANDARDS FOR MAINTENANCE OF PREMISES. All premises in the City of Plymouth shall be maintained in accordance with the following provisions:

- (a) All premises shall be maintained in a clean, safe and sanitary condition free from any accumulation of rubbish or garbage, except on a temporary basis in accordance with City regulations.
- (b) Trees and shrubberies shall be kept trimmed so as not to adversely affect structures or impede pedestrian or vehicular traffic. Grass shall not be permitted to grow higher than six (6) inches, except in cases where such grass is normal to a natural landscape.
- (c) No machinery, equipment, vehicles, lumber piles, crates, boxes, building blocks, furniture, recreation equipment or other materials either discarded, unsightly or showing evidence of a need for repairs, with or without a current license, shall be stored, parked, abandoned or junked in any yard; and should such use of land occur, it shall be deemed a nuisance. This section shall not apply to construction material while such material is being actively used in the maintenance or construction of the premises.
- (d) Firewood shall be stored behind the front building line and in such a manner as to not cause rodent or other pest infestations.
- (e) Dog pens and dog runs shall not be placed in front of the front building line nor in the required side yards. They shall be located at least ten (10) feet from adjacent property lines unless an obscuring fence is provided. This restriction shall not apply to those premises containing a dog pen or dog run prior to the effective date of this ordinance until those premises either change ownership or no longer conform to the use in existence on the effective date of this act. All dog pens and runs shall be kept free of feces, garbage and other odor-causing conditions.

Section 5. STANDARDS FOR MAINTENANCE OF BUILDINGS AND STRUCTURES. All buildings and structures shall be maintained in accordance with the following provisions:

- (a) The exterior of every building and structure shall be maintained in a workmanlike manner, and all surfaces thereof shall be kept painted or protected with other approved coatings or materials.
- (b) Permanent repairs to a building or structure shall be made with the same or similar materials used in the original construction, and in such a manner as to permanently repair the damaged area.

(c) Exterior surfaces of every building and structure shall be maintained free of broken, loose, rotting, crumbling, missing or inadequately finished materials; and shall also be maintained free of any materials which are not intended to be on such surfaces, regardless of whether such conditions have been caused by normal wear and tear, neglect, vandalism or accidental causes.

Section 6. RESPONSIBILITY OF OCCUPANT. The occupant and the owner or his designated agent shall be responsible for the maintenance of his premises at all times. No person shall maintain or permit to be maintained any conditions prohibited by this ordinance upon any premises owned, leased, rented or occupied by such person.

Section 7. ADMINISTRATION AND ENFORCEMENT. Whenever an enforcement officer of the City determines that there exists a violation of this ordinance, or has reasonable grounds to believe that such violation exists, he shall give notice by personal service, and/or by certified mail with return receipt requested, to the person responsible for the property, based on the tax roll records of the City, and to the premises at which the condition exists if such delivery is possible. The notice shall contain the following information:

- (a) a description of the property sufficient for identification;
- (b) a description of the violations which are to be corrected;
- (c) a correction order indicating a specific deadline for completion of the repairs, actions, or other improvements required to bring the structure and premises into compliance with the provisions of this ordinance and other City ordinances, codes and regulations. The deadline for compliance shall allow a reasonable amount of time to accomplish the corrections in the order, taking into account the nature and extent of the work required, and the normal weather for the time of year involved.
- (d) a statement about the right of appeal as provided in Section 8 of this ordinance, or appropriate building code appeal board if applicable, in the event that the owner feels that the correction order is unreasonable.

Section 8. APPEAL. A person who has received a compliance order pursuant to Section 7 of this ordinance may appeal such notice as follows:

- (1) A person receiving a compliance order pursuant to this ordinance may request an administrative appeal, on the form provided by the City, for a hearing before the Building Official and the City Manager. The person filing such appeal shall agree to a hearing date and time, not more than fourteen (14) days after the date of filing, and shall specify the manner in which he requests to have the order revised. Upon the filing of such an appeal, the deadline provided in the compliance order shall be extended by the number of days from the filing date to the date of the administrative decision. At the administrative hearing, the appellant shall be allowed to present pertinent information related to his request for modification of the order, and may be represented by an agent. The Building Official and the City Manager shall issue a decision within fourteen (14) days of the hearing, and shall deliver a copy in writing to the appellant. The decision shall indicate whether the order is sustained or modified, the manner in which it is modified, and the revised compliance deadline date.
- (2) A person receiving an administrative appeal decision may request an appeal before the City Commission, on the form provided by the City, within fourteen (14) days of receiving such decision. The person filing such appeal shall agree to a hearing date at a regular City Commission meeting scheduled not more than twenty-one (21) days after the date of filing, and shall specify the manner in which he requests to have the order revised. Upon the filing of such an appeal, the deadline provided in the decision shall be extended by the number of days from the filing date to the date of the City Commission's decision. At the City Commission hearing, the Administration and the appellant shall each be allowed to present pertinent information related to the case, and the appellant may be represented by an agent. The City Commission shall make a decision not later than the next regular meeting after the hearing. The decision shall indicate whether the administrative decision is sustained or modified, the manner in which it is modified, and the revised compliance deadline date.

Section 9. Rights and duties which have matured, penalties which have incurred, proceedings which have begun and prosecution for violations of law occurring before the effective date of this ordinance are not affected or abated by this ordinance.

Section 10. Should any section, clause or paragraph of this ordinance be declared by a Court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, the same will not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or part thereof other than the part declared invalid.

Section 11. Violations of this ordinance shall be subject to the penalties as provided in Section 1.12 of the Plymouth City Code.

Section 12. This ordinance shall become effective ten (10) days after enactment hereof and after publication hereof.

Grumpy old men move out to change the world

I haven't seen the film "Grumpy Old Men" but I've met them. And they're so nicely grumpy. They belong to a non-dues-paying, open-to-anyone fraternity they label A.D.C. — short for "Another Disgusted Citizen." Their raison d'être is their concern for future generations. And their motto: "The pen is mightier than the sword."

At least that's how Tony Brehler, of Livonia, describes it.

Brehler, a retired office manager and World War II veteran, over the past year has gathered a small band of dissidents who are willing to do more than just talk about their concerns.

They take advantage of what Brehler calls "the powerful pen" and write letters to the editors of newspapers and to radio and TV stations and networks — as local as the Birmingham Eccentric and as national as The Wall Street Journal — when they have something to say on a pressing issue.

They come from Southfield, Franklin, Bloomfield Township, Farmington Hills, Livonia, gathering once a month at Bob Evans restaurant on Telegraph in Southfield to exchange information and ideas.

But they don't form a consensus: Their opinions are their own.

One way they add to their group is by writing to other letter writers whose opinions they respect and inviting them to join them.

That's how Ray Dubin happened to come to his first meeting.

Dubin, from Farmington Hills, wrote recent letters goading the MEA and warning taxpayers about the Clinton health care plan.

Brehler saw them and, as they say, the rest is history.

But Dubin breaks the "grumpy old men" mold as he is probably 30-something, the father of a 6-year-old and proprietor of a day care center.

The others are retired (except for R. Thomas Hunter, a financial advisor from Bloomfield Township) and readily acknowledge they have the time to spend trying to change the world. But still they are frustrated that more people don't seem to care or are afraid to speak up.

"How do we get the citizens off their cans?" asks Bill Carruth from Clawson at the group's January session.

"I don't know," Dubin responds. "Apathy is alive and well. Things that are important to me I make time to do. I might get up an hour earlier or stay up an hour later."

"This is a start," says Brehler. "If we can consolidate a group like this — and expand."

"I have friends in Bloomfield Hills who are worried the IRS will come after them (if they publish letters questioning the system)," says Carruth.

"I can't believe we're talking about this kind of thing," Hunter says. "It's about expressing your opinion."

"What we need," says Paul Harding, a Livonian, is "for this group to multi-

ply a thousand fold."

"I don't know if the world can stand that," Hunter jokes.

I think it could. Here are people who, after a life time of work, could be indulging more selfish interests or turning inward.

Instead, they talk — and write — about educational reform, children's self-esteem, their hopes for Detroit un-

By the way, they are not all-male by choice. They have tendered invitations to female letter writers (as well as to their wives where appropriate), but so far have not had any takers.

But these days Ford is putting some spunk back in its Mustangs, giving them a leaner and meaner look and putting the 1960s back under the hood. The market is the aging baby boomer who may be feeling he isn't running on all eight cylinders any more.

I don't know about other former Mustang owners, but I'm certainly in the market.

Car ordinance gets 30-day reprieve

The Wayne County Board of Commissioners has agreed not to sue the McNamara administration over a new county car ordinance, pending 30 days of negotiation.

Enacted in October by unanimous vote of the commission, the ordinance forbids future county elected officials and most senior staffers from using county cars. It also eliminates the monthly stipends of as much as \$350 that 84 county employees collect in lieu of being paid by the mile.

Because Executive Edward McNamara didn't veto the ordinance or challenge it in court, it has the force of law, and McNamara is supposed to obey it.

However, a county legal opinion declaring the car ordinance "void and unenforceable" — and a subsequent executive order regarding county cars — gave commission-

ers the idea that McNamara didn't intend to obey the ordinance.

Commissioner Thaddeus McCotter, R-Livonia, who wrote the ordinance with the input and help of McNamara staffers Dave Katz and Bob Biga, is confident a compromise can be reached within the 30-day time period the commission set Thursday.

"I think we'll get it done," he said Friday. "They don't want to go to court either. That's just a waste of time and money."

However, the commission is prepared to sue if necessary, asking that McNamara be ordered to obey the ordinance, McCotter said.

Although McNamara's people haven't said specifically what parts of the ordinance they object to, the legal opinion, signed by county attorney Patricia Irving-Cwiek, says the ordinance "represents an unlawful usurpation of

executive authority by the legislative body of Wayne County."

Katz said the objections are "relatively minor stuff (and) I'm sure we can work the problem out. I don't see this as a major point of conflict at all. We've got an outstanding rapport with commissioner McCotter."

The ordinance also mandates meticulous record-keeping in regard to county cars and makes it more difficult to buy luxury cars when economy cars will do.

The commission decided that an ordinance regarding county cars was needed after an audit of county cars was completed in May.

Auditor General Ramona Henderson's report concluded that record-keeping in regard to county cars was sloppy and that sometimes departments bought fancy vehicles when more austere models would have done the same job.

U-M keeps E mail messages from graduate

(AP) — Electronic mail messages are not subject to the state Freedom of Information Act, the University of Michigan has claimed in refusing to release copies of computer messages from its president.

The university's attorneys used the argument to deny the FOI request by a 1993 Michigan graduate. Chetley Zarko had asked for the E-mail of President James Duderstadt, Vice President Walter Harrison, Vice Provost Douglas Van Houweling, and his assistant Virginia Rezmierski.

"I just wanted to see if I could get it," said Zarko, an Ypsilanti resident, a computer buff and free-lance writer.

But it remains to be seen whether E-mail isn't a record,

said state Sen. David Honigman, R-West Bloomfield, who has been talking about revising the state's FOI Act. He said he thinks the intent of the original FOIA would encompass government E-mail.

"How is (E-mail) different from a memo?" Honigman asked. "It is a permanent record. Like any record, it can be erased, but so can a piece of paper or a computer tape."

Lawyers for the university say the E-mail is protected by the federal Electronic Communications Privacy Act and several exemptions to the Michigan FOIA law. They outlined their stance in a letter to Zarko.

E-mail is exempt because: It isn't "prepared, owned, used, in the possession of or retained by a

public body in the performance of an official function," and it isn't a "means of recording or retaining meaningful content, University General Counsel Elsa Cole and attorneys for a Detroit law firm said.

The university also said that it would be impractical to recover certain messages from among the more than one million sent.

Kirk Tabbe, a Jackson County assistant prosecutor who serves on the state's computer crime task force, said how E-mail is used should determine whether it is subject to disclosure.

"I think U-M has a good argument that it's replacing telephone calls," which aren't subject to FOIA disclosure, he said.

On the other hand, if E-mail is

being used to pass around draft documents that otherwise would have been put on paper, "I would say that's something that the public has a right to view," Tabbe said.

The university has no policy against using E-mail for official business or against storing important messages on paper or magnetic media, but E-mail wouldn't fulfill the university's requirement that certain kinds of business be conducted in writing, said Harrison, vice president for university relations.

E-mail didn't exist when Michigan's Freedom of Information Act was written in 1976 and it's still very much a gray area in the law.

Here are answers to your questions

My voice mail box, and postman are taking a much needed breather now that the holidays are past. Your calls and requests were appreciated, and I hope your holidays were filled with delicious treats coupled with a bountiful helping of peace and love.

When you call the voice mail box, please remember to leave your name, phone number and city in which you live for a speedy response.

My daughter Jessie, resplendent in her Girl Scout sash, called the voice mail box twice requesting that you be reminded that this is Girl Scout cookie time. All of your favorites are back. This year marks the introduction of a cookie dubbed "Juliettes" which are a crunchy combination of caramel and pecans covered with a fudge coating.

Cookie proceeds help pay for local troop programs, council facilities and training. Everyone loves Girl Scout cookies, and yours truly has been known to polish off an entire box with a quart of milk while watching the Frugal Gourmet on Channel 50.

Girl Scout cookies freeze well, ship well through the mail and can be used in many recipes. A Janes Gang family favorite is a cheesecake crust made with Girl Scout Tagalong cookies crushed in the blender of a food processor. If you don't know a Girl Scout, call your local elementary school for the name and number of a troop cookie mom.

Diane Morrison of Westland called about the nut cake recipes that ran a few weeks back. Morrison questioned the amounts of nuts and wanted to know the equivalents of whole nuts to ground.

My sources indicate that different nuts give different equivalences, but as a general rule of thumb, 1 pound of ground nuts equals about 3 cups ground nuts; while 1 pound of whole nuts equate to about 6 cups ground nuts, depending on the nut.

Morrison also questioned the cooking time of the recipes. She said her nut cakes were dry around the edges. I re-tested the recipes and both cakes turned out moist and chewy as per the recipe directions.

Sometimes oven temperatures are off, and a few problems might arise in the type and quality of your bakeware. As a general rule of thumb, we suggest you always check cakes not by the exact time, but when a cake tester of toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean.

The Turciano family of Livonia called with a recipe request for French Crullers. This sounds too good to be true, but the Janes Gang took in "The Wizard of Oz" down at the Fox Theatre, and in the beginning of the movie when Dorothy falls into the pig sty and is helped out by Huck and the other two farm hands, Aunt Em comes on the scene with a plate of crullers proclaiming "here, have a cruller, you can't work on an empty stomach." My thoughts exactly.

Crullers are richer than doughnuts, so says "The Joy of Cooking." For best results, they should be made with all the ingredients at room temperature so that the dough can be mixed quickly, which in turn prevents the development of gluten in the flour which in turn makes for a heavy and tough dough.

FRENCH CRULLERS

- 4 eggs
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon grated lemon rind
- 1/2 cup milk
- 1/2 melted shortening
- 3 1/2 cups all purpose flour
- 1 1/2 teaspoons cream of tartar
- 1/2 teaspoon soda
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg or cardamom, optional

Beat eggs until light. Gradually stir in sugar, blend until creamy. Stir in lemon rind, shortening and milk. Mix well. Set aside. In a separate bowl, sift together the dry ingredients. Gently fold the dry ingredients into the egg mixture.

Gently stir until just incorporated. Cover and chill in freezer for 45 minutes. Roll or pat dough to a thickness of 1/4-inch. Cut into strips about 1/2 inch wide and fry in a deep fat fryer heated to 365 degrees until lightly golden. Drain on paper towels and sprinkle with powdered sugar.

Family works toward improving their diet

Marnie Britcher of Canton and her husband, Bill, are trying to fulfill their New Year's resolution to eat healthier meals. They have decided to reduce the amount of fat in their diets. To achieve this goal, they have started substituting low-fat and fat-free products in their cooking, and are reducing their intake of red meat.

Britcher has two sons - James, 21 and Matthew, a junior at Plymouth Salem High School, are typical young men. Marnie says they have no interest in eating healthy or low-fat foods. We all know this will change once they hit 30!

Britcher sent in a recipe for Beef Stroganoff that is very popular with her family.

"The recipe has been a longtime favorite of our family, but an extremely unhealthy one," wrote Marnie when she submitted the recipe for a make over. "The dish gets served frequently because of the tremendous flavor. The challenge would be to convert it to a heart healthy recipe without losing the flavor."

Because there are so many high fat products in this recipe there are a number of ways to reduce the fat. When I made the recipe I made changes on every high fat item. The ingredients can be replaced a few at a time to adjust for personal preferences.

I also spoke with Debra DePriest, a meat clerk at the Food Emporium grocery store on Six Mile Road in Livonia. She told me that cube steak is one of the leanest red meats. It is cut from the sirloin tip roast and placed through a tenderizing machine. DePriest said eye of round roast can also be used. There are only 6.7 grams of fat per 4 ounces of meat. This is very lean.

The original recipe calls for Chinese chow mein noodles. At 13.4 grams of fat per 4 ounce serving, these had to be replaced. No Yolk brand wide egg

- 9 cube steaks (8 ounces each), cut into bite-size pieces

- 3 medium onions, sliced

- Garlic powder (to taste)

SHRIMP ETOUFFE

- 1 medium onion, finely chopped
- 2 green onions, finely chopped
- 2 cloves garlic, finely chopped
- 1/2 cup celery, finely chopped
- 1 green pepper, finely chopped
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 3 tablespoons flour
- 1 1/4 cups water
- 1 (10 1/2 ounces) can tomato puree
- 2 bay leaves

- 1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce
- 4 to 5 drops tabasco sauce
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 tablespoon sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon black pepper
- 1/2 teaspoon crushed dried thyme
- 3 cups cleaned raw medium shrimp (or approximately 1 (12 ounce bag) frozen medium shrimp, thaw and drain)
- Sauteed, sliced fresh mushrooms (optional)
- 3 to 4 cups hot cooked rice or angel hair pasta

In a large non-stick skillet or sautepan, saute onions, garlic, cel-

ery and green pepper in olive oil until tender. Do not brown. Add flour, stir to make a smooth paste; cook 1 or 2 minutes. Add water, tomato puree, bay leaves, Worcestershire, tabasco sauce and other seasonings. Simmer uncovered over low heat, stirring until sauce thickens to desired consistency. May be made ahead to this point. Reheat before proceeding.

Add raw shrimp and cook 15 minutes over low heat, stirring occasionally.

Serve over hot cooked rice or pasta. Sprinkle with sauteed mushrooms if desired. Serves 6 to 8.

BLUEBERRY-GINGER VINAIGRETTE

- 1 cup blueberry preserves or

- non-sugar fruit spread
- 1/4 cup ginger marmalade
- 1/2 cup crushed pineapple in its own juice
- 2 tablespoons balsamic vinegar
- 1/4 teaspoon cayenne pepper
- 1 to 2 tablespoons canola oil

Whisk ingredients together. Add oil, a teaspoon at a time, last. Whisk together.

LENTIL RICE SALAD

- 1 large carrot, shredded
- 3 scallions, chopped
- 1/2 cup parsley, chopped
- 1/4 cup dried cherries
- 1 cup lentils

- 1/2 cup long grain rice
- 1/2 cup wild rice
- Dressing
- 1/4 cup balsamic vinegar
- 1/4 cup red wine vinegar
- 1/2 cup dry sherry
- 1/4 cup olive oil

Cook lentils, long grain rice and wild rice according to package directions. Drain well. Add carrots, scallions, parsley and dried cherries. Whisk together dressing ingredients to make dressing. Mix rice, vegetable, and cherry mixture with dressing. Chill. Serves 6 to 8.

PINEAPPLE TROPICALE

- 1 fresh pineapple peeled,

cored and cut into bite-size chunks

- 1 ripe banana, sliced
- 2 tablespoons brown sugar
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon ground ginger
- Frozen vanilla yogurt
- Fresh raspberries (optional)

Mix fruit with brown sugar and spices in a bowl. Spread in a casserole dish. Bake at 350 degrees for about 20 minutes or until fruit is caramelized. Refrigerate until fruit is cool. To make parfaits, layer fruit with frozen vanilla yogurt in parfait glass. Freeze 1 to 2 hours before serving. Remove from freezer 15 minutes before serving, and sprinkle with fresh raspberries if desired. Serves 4 to 6.

For dessert, she served an out of this world parfait of baked fresh pineapple and bananas layered with frozen vanilla yogurt, and sprinkled fresh raspberries of top.

Halpern decorated her table with fresh flowers and curls of pink and yellow ribbon. It's hard to believe something as simple as ribbon could add so much to a table, but it did.

"I've always loved to entertain and set the table," said Halpern who has worn many hats including English teacher, insurance agent, and stock broker before going into the catering business four years ago. She's been at her

Birmingham location since June, and caters parties for 10 to over 400 with the help of her "fabulous staff."

"Do what reflects the season," she said. When you're entertaining in the winter make hot spiced wine, cider or soup. The fragrance will say welcome in a way words can't. Serve guests soup in mugs as a first course in the living room. Be sure to pass around a basket filled with slices of good bread.

Everyone still loves desserts. Turn your brownies into precious morsels by cutting out little hearts with a small cookie cutters.

"It's like a reward for being good," said Halpern. "It's OK if you do it in small bites."

Guests who don't want dessert will appreciate specialty coffees and interesting teas. "Put a little whipped cream in a bowl and dust it with cocoa and cinnamon. It's beautiful, and low in calories because you don't use very much," said Halpern.

Other dessert ideas she shared were to sautee apple slices in a little hot fudge or caramel sauce and layer apples with frozen vanilla yogurt. Baked fresh pineapple and poached pears served with raspberries are also elegant.

Simmer oranges with an orange flavored liqueur and serve in a crystal bowl, sprinkle pomegranate seeds on top for color.

"Whatever you do, try to do the best you can. Buy the best ingredients, fresh colorful produce — crisp, green lettuce, red onion. Serve foods that are beautiful to look at. Use fruits and vegetables of the season, each has its own bounty.

"Don't abandon your favorite recipes, but look for ways to reduce the fat," said Halpern. "The original recipe for Shrimp Etouffe had 1/4 cup of butter, we reduced it to one tablespoon."

Gale Cox, Wellness Coordinator for Botsford Hospital in Farmington, shares these low-fat entertaining tips:

- Offer alcohol free drinks, which are also lower in calories.
- Use diet pop in punch, and frozen fruit for decoration.
- Try to serve fruit and vegetables for appetizers. Make fruit kebabs with grilled pineapple.
- For main courses stick to lean beef, boneless, skinless chicken breast, fish and pasta. Use fresh spices, it will add a lot of flavor. Now you can get fresh basil year-round at most grocery stores.

Martin, a registered dietitian at St. Mary's Hospital in Livonia: ■ Lighten up dairy-rich dishes with low-fat options. Look for part-skim cheeses and lower-fat versions of cheddar, Swiss and other cheeses.

■ Use vegetable cooking sprays instead of frying in fats.

Chef Larry Janes answers reader recipe requests

Charlotte Michaels of Birmingham requested a recipe for a hearty soup the entire family would enjoy.

Well Charlotte, this is definitely soup weather, and when it comes to making soup, I usually turn to those group and church type cookbooks for tried and true recipes.

This recipe comes from "Ann Arbor's Cookin' II," which benefits the Ronald McDonald House and was submitted by Debbie Lohn.

POTATO CHEESE SOUP

- 4 tablespoons unsalted butter
- 2 cups chopped onions
- 2 cups chopped carrots
- 6 parsley sprigs, chopped
- 1 cup chopped fresh dill
- 1 1/2 pounds (about 4-5 cups) potatoes, peeled and cubed
- 5-6 cups chicken broth or stock (canned is OK)
- 1/2 to 1 cup heavy cream
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 2-3 cups shredded cheddar cheese

Melt butter in a large pot; add onions and carrots. Cook over medium heat for 3-5 minutes, stirring

frequently. Add parsley, 1/2 cup of the dill, potatoes and chicken stock. Bring to a boil.

Reduce heat and simmer for 10-15 minutes or until potatoes are soft and tender. Place in a food processor or blender and blend in small batches.

Return to pan, simmer gradually and stir in cream, salt, pepper, cheese and remaining dill. Serve warm. Yield: 6-8 servings.

Pauly Smorch of Redford, whose doctor just advised her to go on a fat-free, gluten-free diet, wanted help locating recipes and menu ideas.

First off Pauly, get that doctor on the phone and get the names and numbers of dietitians affiliated with a hospital in your area who can offer you a multitude of ideas and recipes. Also, visit your local library

and check out the cookbooks in the health section. Many are devoted to folks with similar problems. While you're there, look for copies of old Weight Watchers cookbooks.

The old program cookbooks never used fat, and some of the recipes were very tasty. I pulled this one from "The Best of Weight Watchers Magazine," 1980.

PINEAPPLE COOKIES

- 1/2 cup non-fat dry milk powder
- 1/4 cup canned crushed pineapple, no sugar added
- 1 teaspoon granulated sugar

- replacement or to taste
- 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract

Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

Combine all the ingredients in a medium bowl. Drop mixture, 2 teaspoons at a time for each "cookie" onto a non-stick baking sheet that has been sprayed with a non-stick cooking spray.

Leave room for "cookies" to spread. Bake about 20 minutes or until "cookies" are firm and lightly colored.

They will be soft at first and be-

come crisp as they cool. Makes 1 serving.

Chef's Secret: You shouldn't really cook with artificial sweetener as it has a tendency to break down and become bitter during the cooking process. I recommend increasing the vanilla extract to 1/2 teaspoon, not incorporating the sweetener into the cookie batter and baking it without the sweetener. When the cookies are removed from the oven, lightly sprinkle with sweetener for best taste.

noodles are a good substitute. There is no cholesterol and the fat is reduced to 2 grams per 4 ounces.

The sour cream can be substituted in a variety of ways. I used Land O'Lakes fat-free sour cream. You could also use 2 cups of "lite" sour cream and one cup of non-fat. This can be adjusted to your personal preference.

To reduce the sodium, use garlic powder instead of garlic salt and reduced sodium Worcestershire sauce. I suggest starting with 3 tablespoons of Worcestershire sauce and adding the extra if you wish. I found 6 tablespoons to be a little strong myself, but Britcher says that's what gives it a nice "kick." As always, a good

non-stick pan will greatly reduce the amount of fat because you can brown and saute without butter.

Keep in mind that when you substitute ingredients in any recipe the flavor will always change. This applies to "high fat" or "low fat" products. Be sure to keep an open mind when trying new low-fat products or recipes. Your tastebuds might need time to adjust, but your heart will love it the start!

Try white chili for change of pace

AP — Fans of Southwestern cuisine will enjoy white chili, flavored with chopped green chilies and onion, and simmered in a broth blended with garlic, oregano, cilantro and ground red pepper. The recipe, from McCormick & Co., also calls for cubed chicken breast, chopped onion and white cannellini beans.

For those who can't get enough chili: "Chilimania! The Chili-head's Handbook" by Herb and Chris Geltner (G.S.C. Books, Merritt Island, Fla.) contains over 900 recipes on chili, chili dips, pies, pizzas, soups, salsas, picantes, sauces, casseroles and appetizers.

SOUTHWEST WHITE CHILI

- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 1 pound boneless, skinless chicken breast, cut into cubes
- 1/4 cup chopped onion
- 1 cup chicken broth
- 4-ounce can chopped green chilies
- 1 teaspoon garlic powder

- 1 teaspoon ground cumin
- 1/2 teaspoon oregano leaves
- 1/2 teaspoon cilantro
- 1/2 to 1/4 teaspoon ground red pepper
- 19-ounce can white kidney beans (cannellini), undrained
- Shredded Monterey Jack cheese (for garnish)
- Sliced green onions (for garnish)

Heat olive oil in a 3-quart sautepan over medium-high heat. Add chicken; cook 4 to 5 minutes, stirring often. Remove chicken with slotted spoon, cover and keep warm.

Add chopped onion to sautepan; cook 2 minutes.

Stir in chicken broth, green chilies, garlic powder, ground cumin, oregano leaves, cilantro and ground red pepper; simmer for 30 minutes.

Stir in cooked chicken and kidney beans; simmer for 10 minutes. Garnish with cheese and sliced green onions. Makes 4 servings.

FLUNKING SCHOOL LUNCHES

The Agriculture Department has issued a flunking grade to the lunches served in our nation's public schools. According to its report, our schools serve lunches that exceed the government's own dietary guidelines for fat by 25 percent (by 50 percent for saturated fat). The school lunches also exceed recommendations for sodium intake by nearly 100 percent. According to Dietary Guidelines for Americans, from the Departments of Agriculture and Health and Human Services, no more than 30 percent of daily calories should come from fat (no more than ten percent from saturated fat). Daily sodium intake should not exceed 2,400 mg. A survey of 545 schools shows lunch lunches derive 38 percent of their calories from fat (15 percent from saturated fat). Just one school lunch provides nearly two-thirds the daily limit for salt.

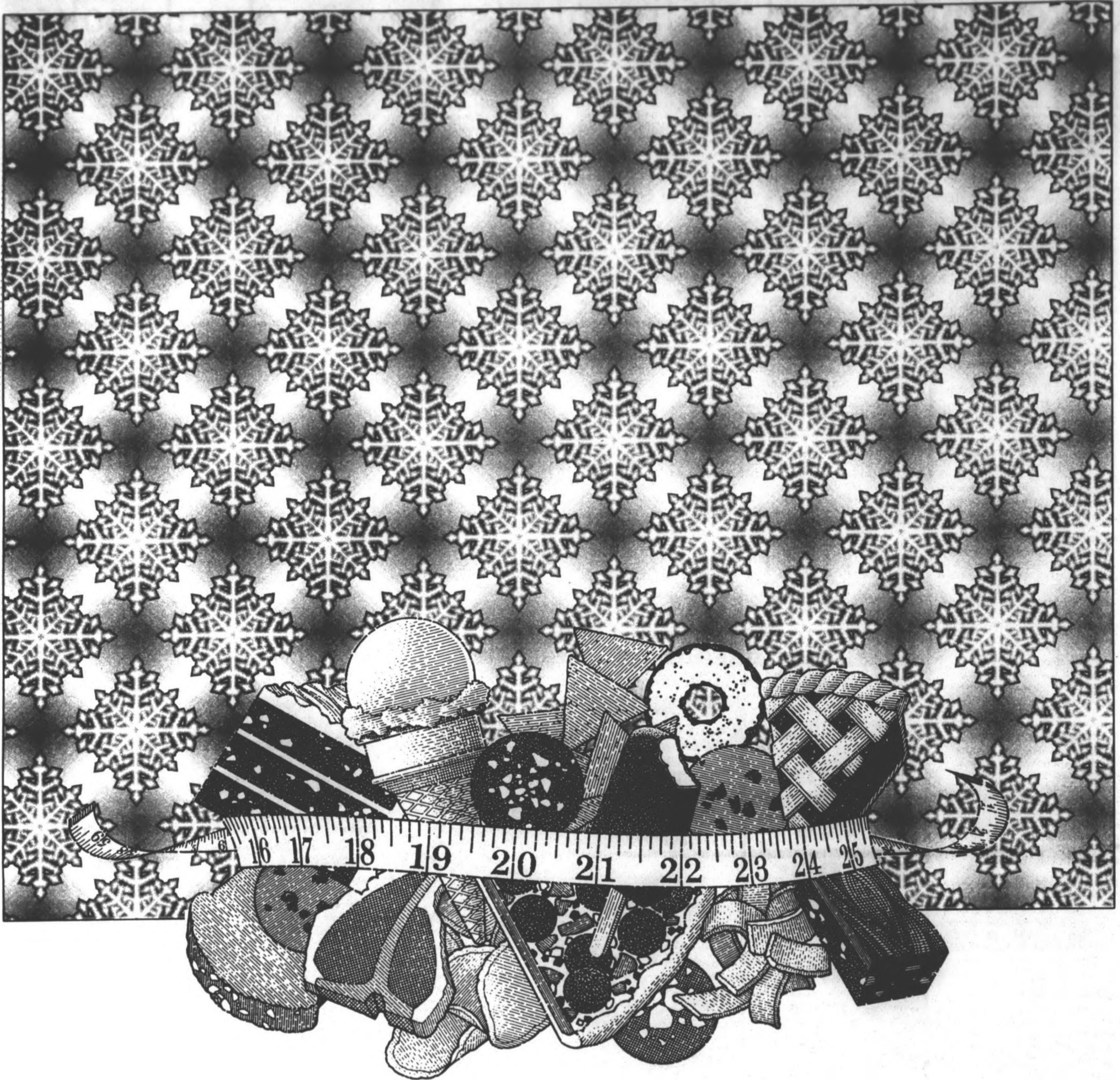

Detroit 1999: The Big Ugly — various artists



Whoever said Detroit musical talent is not worth listening to lied. The compilation disc "Detroit 1999: The Big Ugly" proves that Detroit musicians are not only worth the time, but that talent has, does and will exist in the Motor City.

The 17-track release contains one cut each from local acts, some old, some new, some strong and some blue. All arranged on plastic from a local recording company which has been releasing material since 1977 and has six other compilations under its belt.

Each track is unique in its own right giving only a taste of each act's potential. Nevertheless, it's a good way to get exposed and possibly contaminated. Majority of the cuts have a rock feel to it, but what could you expect from a city of middle class, beef and potatoes, Bud Light drinkers.

The first thing that hits you are the hearty vocals on an interesting broken heart story entitled "Papa's Arms" from the now-defunct Strange Bedfellows. The release continues along with a bouncy-abstract Cinecyclyde's "Slave Wages" to a soulful country-feeling "When You're There" from the Volebeats.

The big release travels to a fun-filled look at hating school with the Happy Accidents' "All My Teachers," the outgoing sounds of The Opaque's "Political Machine," the trials and tribulations of loathing working with See Dick Run's "I Hate My Job," and to the abstract, orchestrated sounds of Jim Olenski's "High Noon at Mojave."

Each piece has its own feel, like all compilations, but considering this is Detroit based, it acts as a voice for the groups and performers which they might not otherwise get. If nothing else, "Detroit 1999: The Big Ugly" is the perfect way to taste a variety of home-based sounds.

The fictional idea behind this release is mass destruction after the Eight Mile Road War of 1995, one large auto company and the lack of music in the city except for one droning note leaving Tremor compilations the only music listened to by renegades. Luckily, it's only a dream.

Crossing Borders — Kukuza



This may or may not be the finest bluegrass disc of the year (I think it's one of the five best, at least), but it is the most unusual.

The U.S. label debut for this brilliant Moscow-based octet, while steeped in a stock bluegrass framework, reminds me more of Fairport Convention than Alison Krauss most of the time.

Certainly, lead vocalist Irina Surina has absorbed every nuance of the Sandy Denny songbook and emerges as the best new vocalist of the year, hands down. That she is surrounded by madolinist/clarinetist Georgi Palmov, dobro/banjo player Andrei Shepelev and fiddler supreme Sergei Mosolov enhances the magic, and makes the fact that 13 of the 14 tunes here are sung in their native Russian that much less of a problem. It isn't that hard to imagine the lyric content of the songs. The delivery is a notch this side of heaven, and the song titles are given English translations, so how much more can you expect.

"Go With God My Lovely" sounds like Denny backed by David Grisman; "The Wanderer" sounds like it wanted to be the "Wings of a Snow White Dove." "The Secret" has the best fiddle break this side of "White Bird"; "Love Takes Work," the only English language piece, reminds me of "Tennessee Stud"; and "Enough" could have been a Peggy Lee song.

This is just about as amazing as acoustic music gets! Highly recommended.

"In The Name of the Father" (soundtrack) various artists

Daniel Day-Lewis has been called an early Oscar contender for his portrayal of Gerry Conlon, a petty thief wrongly convicted along with his family for an IRA bombing, in the film "In the Name of the Father." But what has been lost in the shadow of the movie's hype is the quiet return of Sinead O'Connor, who contributed the song "Thief of Your Heart" to the film.

The song is trademark O'Connor, who has vowed a few times never to record again. Her angelic voice is accompanied in most of the song by only drum beats, keyboards and strings — a sound as chilling as some of the lyrics of the song: "Winter's cold, but you're colder still." The song increases in tempo as it progresses and frantically fades.

'Tommy': Rock as an art form

Twenty-five years after the debut of "Tommy," fans of The Who are once again seeing, feeling and hearing the story of the "deaf, dumb and blind kid."

Actor Roger Bart spent endless months being sickeningly nice to children as "Dickon" in the play "The Secret Garden."

Now he gets to torture them in his role as the conniving abusive "Cousin Kevin" in the rock opera "Tommy," which plays the Masonic Temple in Detroit through Sunday, Feb. 6.

"After 'The Secret Garden' and being so nice to the little girl, it's divine justice now that I'm able to torture a child," the boisterous Bart said with a laugh.

In "The Secret Garden," "Dickon" teaches the young Mary Lennox to make her garden flourish. His tenure in the role included a three-week stint at the Fisher Theatre in Detroit.

In "Tommy," "torture" aptly describes Cousin Kevin's treatment of Tommy, played by 1992 Detroit Music Awards host and ex-MTV veejay Steve Isaacs. One line in a song Cousin Kevin sings hints at his plans for his "deaf, dumb and blind" cousin: "There's a lot I can do with a freak."

"I get to stick him in a garbage can. . . I was a little scared about what my parents would think when they saw me up there," he said.

But as Kevin and some local children are harassing the young boy, Tommy discovers his penchant for playing pinball.

Cousin Kevin's role in the play is much more pronounced in the stage production than the cameos he had in the 1975 movie, which starred Ann-Margret, Tina Turner, Roger Daltrey and Eric Clapton. Once Tommy's talent is discovered, Cousin Kevin takes advantage of his young relative's newfound fame.

That's one of the many differences between the film and the play. Without divulging too many secrets, Bart offers a blunt comparison of the two productions.

"It's extremely different from the movie," Bart said from Boston where "Tommy" was playing prior

to the Detroit shows. "In the play version, the people actually sing well," he said. (The most surprising talent in the show is Isaacs who proves to be a phenomenal singer with exceptional range.)

"If you want to refresh your memory (about the play), the last thing I'd want you to do is rent the movie.

"Ann-Margret rolling in baked beans. . . Maybe the guy who directed it was turned on by that or something. This is much more sort of along the lines of what Pete (Townshend) was trying to do. The ending reflects a little more maturity. . . I think he imagined it to be like this."

The most obvious change takes place in the beginning of the play when Tommy's father kills his mother's lover. In the film, it's the father who dies. Although it may irk those who respect the original movie, director Des McAnuff said it's the right of The Who's Pete Townshend to change his creation.

"There are people who really feel like they own this, that this has been part of them, and they don't want anything to change. They want nothing other than the original album and a concert version by The Who," said director Des McAnuff in the book "Tommy."

"But Pete certainly has the right to return to his own work and do what he pleases. It's a sacred right that a writer has. And what I think happens to those folks who are open to 'Tommy' is that they get completely caught up in the theater and the music — they're experiencing a true development and extension of the original album."

Part of the development of the 1990s version of "Tommy" is the result of the creative minds of the cast as well. Bart recalled one of his first meetings with Townshend: "He said, 'Have a great time, kids, and make it your own.'"

Tracey Langran, a dancer who has toured with the English pop band Pet Shop Boys, also didn't feel intimidated by performing material by Townshend in front of the rock legend.

"Pete Townshend is what made this very similar to doing a concert tour; he knew everyone's name," said Langran, who is the cast's dance captain and understudy for most of the women's parts. "He has this energy that's unbelievable."

Fans of the play must possess similar energy. Tickets are scarce for the Broadway performance, and the shows at the Masonic Temple are selling briskly. Bart said he believes

this was the right time for "Tommy" because fans of the original album are now financially stable and able to spend \$50-\$100 on tickets for the show.

"I think you look at the target audience of Broadway: People who can afford it are over 50. The people who grew up on the album can come and enjoy it on Broadway."

He said it's also appealing for the "twenty-something crowd," many of whom were too young to remember the album.

Although he admits to not being a big Who fan prior to auditioning for "Tommy," the music is what makes Bart excited to sing "the hardest music I've ever sang" including the song "Pinball Wizard."

"Every night I hear the overture and I can't wait to jump in," he said. "It's really a terrific piece. Thanks to bands like Nirvana, rock 'n' roll is still around. They've saved it. They've proved that 'it's a valid American art form as opposed to something that's just a fad.'"

"Tommy" is at the Masonic Temple, 500 Temple, Detroit, through Sunday, Feb. 6. Tickets are priced at \$25-\$47.50. For more information, call (810) 645-6666 or (313) 832-5900.

Artists show off new-found success at Ark

Starting over: Dan Navarro and Eric Lowen have found the support they need to revive their musical career with Parachute Records.

Dan Navarro and Eric Lowen have written successful tunes for a host of performers including Pat Benatar, the Bangles, David Lee Roth, Dave Edmunds, the Temptations and the Four Tops.

Yet two years ago the duo found that they couldn't revive their own career after releasing "Walking on a Wire" on Chameleon Records in 1990. Despite unsuccessful attempts at getting another record deal, they kept plugging along, touring as "Lowen & Navarro."

"We continued to tour without any tour support," Navarro said from a tour stop in Ardmore, Pa.

They wanted to make sure that their fans "knew we didn't just go away," he added.

One of their supporters who didn't stray was Tom Vickers, director of artist and repertoire for Mercury Records. He had the perfect home for Lowen & Navarro's music — Parachute records, which he recently re-

vived. A former rock label, Parachute is geared toward adults who grew up listening to rock music but aren't interested in modern rock, Vickers said.

"The adult progressive market is an up-and-coming format that encompasses a mixed bag of compatible musical styles, including singer/songwriter, acoustic and electric folk, country and some aspects of jazz and blues," Vickers said. "These consumers grew up with rock and still love many of the artists that have shifted into the acoustic arena, like Eric Clapton and Rod Stewart."

"In their search for new artists and good songwriting, a lot of people have gravitated toward country music, which is now more popular than ever. Parachute's goal is to have that kind of quality songwriting but geared more toward people who grew up with rock music."

Lowen & Navarro's album "Broken Moon," which includes guest appearances by Navarro's cousin Dave Na-

Help is called for to handle distress about weight loss

Voice mail message:
Barb,
I saw the "Company" show when you talked to some women, and a man, who lost huge amounts of weight. I have a problem . . . a

big problem. I continue to feel fat despite having lost 150 pounds.

When I buy clothes I take things off the rack that are far too big for me. I am always surprised when the big sizes don't fit. Also, I am worried about gaining the weight back.

I am preoccupied with this thought. I just don't know what to do about this.

Dear Caller,

You are distressed and need psychological counseling. If you do not know how to contact an experienced counselor on your own, please send me your address. I will send you information that will help you to do so.

The following is some information that I hope will give you greater perspective on your problem.

Often, men and women who lose large amounts of weight report "still feeling fat." It is possible that there may be both psychological and neurological reasons for those feelings.

Nearly all amputees report

feeling the presence of their absent limb or limbs. Despite the absence of physical flesh, they describe a full range of sensations, such as heat, cold, pain, movement and touch. Although I did not find similar reports with people who lost a lot of weight, it is logical that the two phenomena are related.

Scientists trying to find the origin of these seemingly crazy sensations discovered complicated brain interactions leading to them. The cliché, "It is all in your mind" is true, not because the person is crazy but because the brain is organized to generate a bodily experience even when parts of the body are not present.

So far, scientists do not know how to help amputees retrain their brains so that they are not tortured by their phantom limbs. The answer to that question could help psychologists help people like you.

Right now you need counseling to help you with your insecurities. Most new behavior brings with it a feeling of instability, fears of backsliding. Not knowing "what to do" is an undesirable position, one that furthers your confusion.

12 or so reasons to see Six Degrees

A clean-cut young black man stumbles unannounced into a Fifth Avenue apartment clutching at his side. He tells Flan and Ouisa Kitteridge, a middle-aged art dealer and his wife, that he was mugged in Central Park. He came here because he's a friend of the couple's children at Harvard.

When he introduces himself as Paul Poitier, son of the famous actor, he really gets the couple's attention. He spends the evening and makes them dinner, helping Flan seal a \$2 million art sale to an impressed foreign dealer.

That Paul is really a con-man should come as no surprise. If you didn't hear about John Guare's award-winning play "Six Degrees of Separation," you probably heard something about the much-publicized case on which it was based.

Part of the movie's fascination

MOVIES

comes through the thought that anyone can be duped, especially when a famous person's name is dropped. But this just scrapes the surface of a story full of clever insights from Guare (who also wrote the screenplay) and director Fred Schepisi.

The director, who began his career in Australia with uncompromising films like "The Chant of Jimmy Blacksmith," understands the subtleties needed in a story like "Six Degrees." He gets big laughs at the foibles of his upper-crust characters, who at their most extreme, appear genuine and human.

Donald Sutherland and Stockard Channing have their best roles in years as the Kitteridges, both outraged and moved by the young con man. Despite his deception, Paul compares favorably to their own son and daughter,

freshmen at Harvard, gagging on the silver spoon.

You can also make a connection between Paul and Flan, who are both cons in their own way. On more than one occasion, the art dealer manipulates customers by giving them the latest details in the continuing saga, which by now has hit "The New York Times."

The story is told by the couple at dinner parties, at art openings and auctions, and each time it goes a little bit further. Intentionally complex, it draws you into each new chapter and keeps you guessing at the outcome.

Those who think that rapper and TV star Will Smith can't handle a role this complex need only look at him play directly to the camera, reviewing the highlights of his false father's career. We can see that he's performing for someone, but for now this little twist stays secret.

Among the more interesting no-

tions in "Six Degrees of Separation" comes through the title, which says that we can connect to anyone else in the world through only six people. You can link the President of the United States to a gondolier in Venice through a chain of friends and relatives.

In between intellectual revelations, there's some amazing use of the Manhattan landscape, which you may think has been filmed from every angle imaginable until you see Schepisi take a crack at it.

From the script and direction to the smallest speaking parts, "Six Degrees of Separation" joins "The Snapper" as the year's first must-see films.

The two others are original songs, collaborations between Bono of U2 and labelmate Gavin Friday. Like the O'Connor song, "In the Name of the Father" begins heavily and swings upward into an almost industrial-sounding danceable song and collapses into Friday and Bono's moody mumbling.

Friday and Bono re-appear on

the soundtrack with the disco song "Billy Boola," an upbeat departure from the other original songs.

The soundtrack, on Island Records, also includes classic rock songs, including "Voodoo Child (Slight Return)" by Jimi Hendrix, "Dedicated Follower of Fashion" by the Kinks, "Is This Love" by Bob Marley and The

Wailers and "Whiskey in the Jar" by Thin Lizzy.

The song which accompanies the intense trailers, "Pride (in the Name of Love)" isn't on the soundtrack album.

With the exception of "Billy Boola," the album is equally as painful as the 2½-hour film — but in this case it's good.

varro of the Red Hot Chili Peppers and ex-Bangles singer Susanna Hoffs, is the label's first. The acoustic act jump in the Water and New York-based singer/songwriter Jane Williams will release albums on the label this year.

Lowen & Navarro are now touring to support "Broken Moon." The tour, which brings them to The Ark in Ann Arbor on Wednesday, Jan. 26, will include a Spanish version of "We Belong," a song they wrote for Pat Benatar.

Opening the show is Billy Fal-

con, another adult progressive musician who will play material from his upcoming album "Letters from a Paper Ship." Like Lowen & Navarro, Falcon was rediscovered by a long-time fan, Jon Bon Jovi. After a few meetings with Falcon, Bon Jovi signed him to his now-defunct, Mercury-affiliated label Jambo.

The record deal along with recording his first album for Jambo, "Pretty Blue World," helped Falcon get back on his feet after the death of his wife.

"Most of my time (prior to the recording of "Pretty Blue World")

was spent in a family situation. . . . My wife was ill and passed away," said Falcon, who is now signed with Mercury Records.

After his wife died, Falcon found himself the single father of their daughter Rosie and drifted away from writing songs. Bon Jovi's interest in his music, however, sparked his creativity.

"For the first time in five years I felt that I was breathing," he added.

"Pretty Blue World" included the hit "Power Windows," a song that convinced Bon Jovi to sign him. In the album "Letters from a

Paper Ship," many of the songs point to Falcon's positive outlook even at the worst of times. For example, in "Cold Hard World" he sings: "It's a cold hard world. That's a cold hard fact. You break your heart while you break your back. Like a reckless train on a wild track it's a cold hard world. . . ."

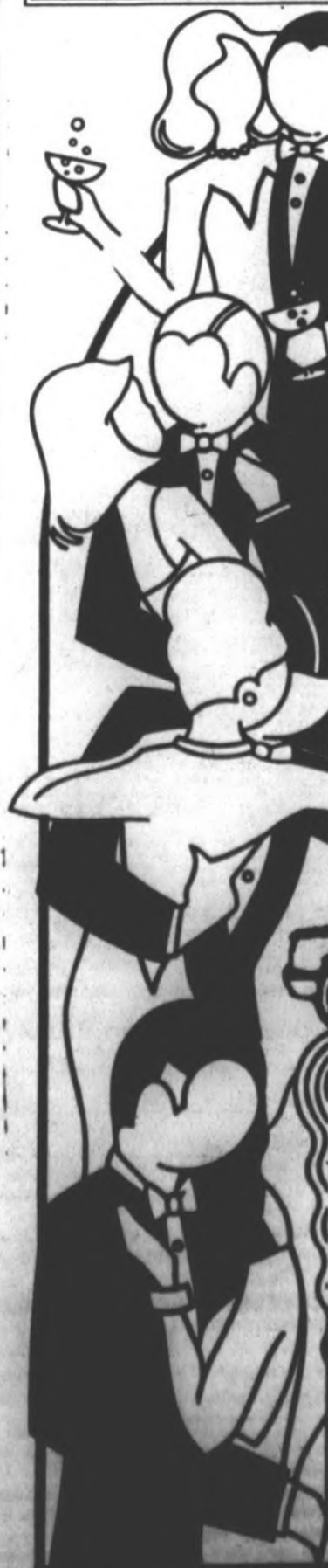

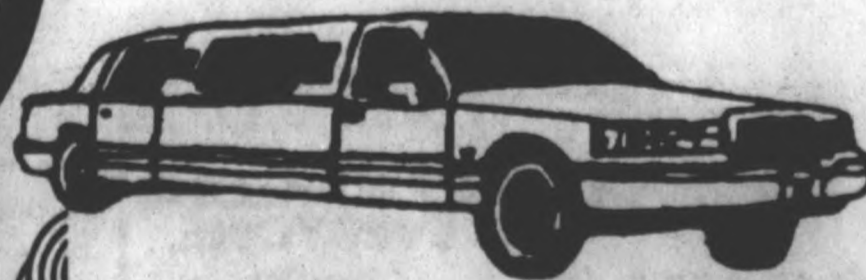

For two quarters at least, this game was a joke — and all the laughs belonged to Plymouth Canton.

But the tone turned serious in the stretch run. And as the clock ticked, ever so slowly for the Chiefs, the humor melted. Suddenly, it wasn't funny anymore.

It was a ball game. Fortunately for Canton, time ran out on a furious Farmington Harrison rally that fell a point short. The Chiefs' 61-60 victory Friday at Harrison lifted them over .500 for the first time this season — they are 5-4 overall, 2-1 in the Western Lakes Activities Association.

The Hawks slipped to 4-5 overall, 0-3 in the WLA.

"That was quite a finish, eh?" said a relieved Canton coach Dave VanWagoner. "Well, we'll take the win on the road."

And run with it — which is exactly what put the Chiefs in command in the first half. After a lackluster first quarter by both teams (Harrison led 12-8), Canton came alive in the second. VanWagoner put his troops into a full-court press, and the Hawks came unglued.

"We're a slow team," admitted Harrison coach Mike Teachman. "Quickness bothers us."

It showed in that quarter. Canton scored 13-straight points and, after a Harrison basket by Kevin Bambenek, the Chiefs ran off nine more. By the time halftime mercifully arrived for the Hawks, they had been outscored 29-6.

And it might have been worse. They committed seven turnovers in the quarter, and Canton was horrible at the free throw line, making just 5-of-14.

Harrison started the second half with a 7-2 run, but the Chiefs still

had a comfortable 49-30 lead when the fourth quarter rolled around. They increased their advantage to 20 with a Matt Paupore free throw in the first minute of the final period.

That's when the fun began. In a 3 1/4 minute span, Harrison put together a 17-2 run that trimmed Canton's lead to 52-47. Calvin Pruitt and both Bambenek brothers, Kevin and Charles, each had five points in the comeback, with Charles' three-pointer with 3:32 left making it a five-point game.

It remained agonizingly tight the rest of the way, but Harrison never did catch up. Rick Smith's free throw with 45 seconds left pulled the Hawks to within 58-55; he missed the second, but Aaron Weiss rebounded and Kevin Bambenek pumped up a potential game-tying three. It missed, and Harrison was forced to foul.

Ted Docks went to the line with 30 seconds left and made 1-of-2. Smith answered with a layup seven seconds later, and the Hawks again fouled Docks. This time he hit both with nine seconds to go, making it a four-point game.

Ball game, right? Well, not quite. A long-range Kevin Bambenek triple pulled the Hawks to within a point with a second left. But they never regained possession.

Paupore was the only Chief to reach double figures in scoring with 18. Docks had nine and Ron Hunter netted eight. Docks also had five assists.

Harrison got 15 points and 18 rebounds from Pruitt. Kevin Bambenek scored 14 and Charles Bambenek finished with 12.

"Yeah, it was a great comeback," Harrison's Teachman said. "There's a real positive feeling in our locker room right now. We proved we can play against quickness."

It was a night of firsts Wednesday for Madonna University's men's basketball team:

■ The Fighting Crusaders held two consecutive opponents to under 100 points;

■ They found an inside game to complement their defense;

■ They actually had a lead at halftime.

All were first-time-this-season accomplishments for Madonna. Oh yes — there was something else.

The Crusaders won a home game, beating Concordia College 102-97. Attitude, according to coach Bill Sharpe, was as big a factor as anything in Madonna's win. "They came out and made it known they were going to win," he said.

"They really tried to work the game play. A lot of them just decided their man wasn't going to score on them."

It showed, in the first half in particular when the Crusaders powered in front 61-52. Unlike earlier efforts this season, when they seemed to live or die (the latter ruled by a wide margin) by the three-point shot, they've

cut back on perimeter shots and tried to work for better one in closer.

Against Concordia, Madonna attempted just 21 threes (making seven). The Cardinals were 9-of-21 on treys.

What turned the tide was the play of the Crusaders' big men, 6-foot-7 Brandon Slone and 6-8 Sam Kuehn. Both freshmen recorded career-highs in scoring. Slone pouring in 28 points and Kuehn 13. Kuehn also nabbed a collegiate-best 11 rebounds; Slone had nine.

Dan Dombrow netted 12 points and Doug Soper had 11. Soper, the sophomore-point guard, also had 11 assists and five boards. Concordia got 26 points from Brent Pontillo and 23 from Joe Pechota.

There was another first for the Crusaders: They got a lead and held it. The previous Saturday, they had rallied to tie the University of Michigan-Dearborn midway through the second half, only to let up and lose by 17.

This time, they withstood the pressure. With four minutes to play, Con-

cordia was down by 12. With less than a minute left, the game was tied. But Slone knocked down a pair of free throws and Madonna's defense held. Soper iced the victory with 13 seconds to go, making 3-of-4 free throws after a foul and technical foul were called against the Cards.

"Two weeks ago, Concordia would have beat us," said Sharpe, whose team ended a 10-game losing streak with the win. Madonna is now 2-19. "They just made up their mind Concordia wasn't going to beat them. I think the freshmen are coming together now."

Concordia was hardly top-notch competition. The Cards are now 1-15. Their errant free throw shooting was their undoing: 12-of-27 (44 percent) to Madonna's 29-of-43 (67 percent).

MADONNA 73, CONCORDIA 58: It's been an uphill struggle for the Lady Crusaders, but they finally reached the break-even point with Thursday's win at Concordia.

That was the good news. Here's the bad: Starting point guard Shawn Bannon injured her right knee with two minutes left in the first half.

The extent of the injury was unknown. "We'll have to wait for the swelling to go down," said Madonna coach Bill Potter.

The injury occurred when Bannon came to a jump stop as she went in for a layup.

"I feel it will hurt us without her leadership," said Potter. "But I also feel we have quality people that can take her spot — if she gets back."

"It's always bad when you lose your No. 1 guard."

Make that No. 1 player. Bannon, a junior, is a transfer from Central Michigan University, where she was a starter. She leads the Crusaders in scoring, assists and steals. She had scored six points before being hurt.

They hardly needed her against Concordia (5-13 overall). Jill Burt (21 points) and Stephanie Creley (20 points, nine rebounds) picked up the scoring slack quite well; Megan Marshall (seven assists) and Tracy Prybylski (six assists), who took over for Bannon, distributed the ball.

Vikki Koenig contributed as well, with 13 points and eight boards. The win evened Madonna's record at 5-5.

CC's Holowicki gets his 600th

They threw a victory party Friday night at Redford Catholic Central, complete with a cake for legendary coach Bernie Holowicki.

All would agree there's nothing stale about the cake or the coach.

Holowicki, who works as hard today as he did in 1953, when his coaching career started at Detroit St. Hedwig, earned career win 600 with a 78-43 victory over visiting Harper Woods Notre Dame.

Holowicki, 600-213 overall, is the third high school basketball coach in Michigan to reach 600, joining a club that includes retired coaches Lofton Greene of River Rouge (739 wins) and Paul Cook of Lansing Eastern (635).

CC is 5-3 overall, 3-1 in the Catholic League Central Division.

"To have my sons and friends in here and CC to give me the party, that's real nice," Holowicki, 62, said. "I never expected this. I just thought the game's over; that's it. Life goes on, we have Warren DeLaSalle and that 6-foot-9 kid (Jim Miller) on Tuesday."

As for the cake, it was baked Monday night by the mother of CC senior guard Andy Kummer in anticipation of Holowicki winning No. 600 on Tuesday against New Boston Huron. That game was postponed due to the cold weather, but the cake stayed fresh sitting in the Kummer's garage the next three days.

All that was missing on Seniors Night was 600 candles.

"Coach Holowicki is a great guy and I love to be a part of this," Kummer said. "He's kind of like a dad to us. He'll cuss you out on the court and tell you what he thinks but then he's your best friend after the game."

The milestone came against ND coach Mike Maltese, who played for Holowicki at Warren DeLaSalle before graduating in 1971. Holowicki took over the

next season at CC.

Maltese said he gave Holowicki a congratulatory card before the game. With ND's leading scorer and rebounder, 6-7 sophomore Tim Mott, out with bronchitis, Maltese figured the card would be open after the game.

The Irish fell to 2-6 overall, 0-4 in the Central Division.

"Those guys (CC's players) were hungry to get him it," Maltese said. "I think of coach Holowicki as someone special. If somebody had to be it, I'm glad he got 600 against me."

CC ended the first quarter with nine straight points for a 13-4 lead. The Shamrocks started the second quarter with an 11-2 run to go ahead 24-6 en route to a 40-16 halftime lead.

Three CC players scored in double figures, led by 6-foot junior guard Mike Ridley with 17 points on six-of-10 shooting, including two three-point shots. Kummer made all five of his field-goal attempts and finished with 13 points and sophomore guard Justin Hoener added 11 points.

Joe Daly, a 6-7 senior center, scored all eight of his points in the first half, and he had a team-high six rebounds before Holowicki emptied his bench in the second half. The Shamrocks enjoyed a 34-27 rebounding advantage with Hoener and Ridley adding five each.

Seldom-used sophomore forward Richard Turk had six points off the bench and reserve junior forward Jon Kandes put the finishing touches on the win with a three-pointer at the buzzer.

"I like the way the second group played; they were very unselfish and played great defense," Holowicki said.

There was concern after the game, however, for senior guard Andy Slankster, who injured his hip and elbow in a fall to the floor.

ND shot only 33 percent from the field (15-46). The Irish, who trailed 58-22 after three quarters, were led by senior guard Anthony Vitale.

Schoolcraft records its 1st conference win

The end of another streak for Schoolcraft College's men's basketball team.

Last Monday, the Ocelots ended a seven-game losing streak by beating Adrian College's junior varsity. On Wednesday, they won their first Eastern Conference game of the season, toppling Alpena 85-69 at SC.

All seven losses in their slide had been against conference foes. SC is now 1-7 in the league, 7-11 overall.

Coach Dave Bogataj attributed the win to team play — which became imperative when Steve Whitlow, the team's only returning starter from last season and its second-leading scorer, was sidelined with an illness prior to the game.

To make matters worse, Todd McNeil, the conference's leading scorer (25.7 points per game) and fourth-leading rebounder (9.1), got into foul trouble quickly. McNeil was whistled for three fouls in the first five minutes of the game and played just 20 minutes altogether, totaling 11 points and eight rebounds.

At that point, Bogataj said, "It was up to them. They had to do it — and they did."

Indeed, Biggest among the contributors was Dan Pertulla, a 5-11 guard from Redford Thurston. Pertulla didn't join the team until December, when it became evident several players would be lost due to academic problems. He made his addition noteworthy, pouring in 33 points against Alpena.

Included in that total were seven three-pointers; 24 of his points and six of his threes came in the second half. "He just got open and buried it," said Bogataj. "He got in a real nice rhythm."

Mark Cady added 12 points and Lamonte Fondren had nine and seven rebounds. Alpena (6-12 overall, 2-6 in the conference) got 16 points from Herman Jenkins, 15 from both Craig Covington and Dan Smith, and 10 from Scott Nicholson.

That game ended the first half of the conference's round-robin season, and no front-runner has emerged. Highland Park, Delta and Macomb are all 6-2; Henry Ford is 5-3, Mott is 4-4, Oakland CC and St. Clair are 3-5, Alpena

is 2-6 and SC is 1-7.

I spy, you spy, we all spy for 'I Spy Returns'

When asked what it was like to work with Bill Cosby again in "I Spy Returns," Robert Culp lets out the laugh of a mischievous little boy covered in mud.

Cosby and Culp reprise their roles as Secret Service agents in "I Spy Returns," Thursday, Feb. 3, on CBS.

"Everybody asks the same question, and it's very hard to answer, except to say that when we first worked together he taught me how to have fun. I taught him, and he taught me, but the thing he taught me, mostly, was how to have the most wonderful time imaginable. And it was like that all over again. It was like putting on an old suit, the best suit of clothes you ever had. And we had pure fun!"

And fun between two old friends is the strongest and most enjoyable part of this reunion. Although there may be too many "you're fat" and "you're old" jokes, Cosby and Culp have a great relationship that's a joy to watch. Unfortunately the plot seems fat and old.

In the film, Alexander "Scotty" Scott (Cosby) has retired from the sleuth business to teach. But when he discovers that his daughter (Salli

Richardson) is recruited to follow in his footsteps by his old friend and ex-partner Kelly Robinson (Culp), Scott confronts him to get her out of the business.

Kelly tries to offer comfort by explaining that his son (George Newbern) is accompanying Scott's daughter on her first mission, but that just worries Scott even more. Soon the experienced agents follow their rookie offspring and the two pairs take turns rescuing each other from evil spies.

The original series, which aired from 1965-68, earned Cosby three Emmys for his performance while Culp was nominated for both writing and acting.

"Bill, I think, put it better than anybody," Culp says. "Someone asked him 'What was it like to work with Culp again?' and his response was 'When I hear his voice I know exactly where I am.' And the same thing goes for me. There isn't any other way to put it."

"I Spy Returns" almost didn't get made; Culp explains "It's a long and tortured story."

"When Bill hit it big with 'The Cosby Show,' he made a deal with Warner Brothers for features.

Warner Brothers thought that the most logical thing for him to do was 'I Spy'; this was going to be a big \$20 million picture!

"The deal was that I was to write and direct. Well, two years later, and four scripts later — two of theirs and two of ours — we couldn't agree on anything. They hated the scripts we came up with and we hated the ones they came up with because they didn't understand what 'I Spy' was all about. (Cosby and I) just sadly parted company, and (Warner Brothers) wasted a lot of money. This was '87."

"Well, then it fell into limbo, and Bill was busy and I was busy, and yet Jeff Sagansky, the guy who runs CBS, heard about (the project) and said, 'I want that one,' and he just kept after it and after it until it became a reality."

Culp explains that people often attribute Cosby and Culp with the reinvention of the so-called buddy film. But he thinks they may have actually created the genre.

"When anybody looks back on it," Culp says, "there never was a buddy movie before, outside of 'Gunga Din'; the father of the concept in film, the first time it was really successfully brought off. The only other example is Laurel and Hardy."

"And as a matter of fact, Bill and I both worshipped Laurel and Hardy, and there were some deliberate references to them in the stuff that we did (in the original series), as we made it up going along. ('I Spy Returns') was the same thing."

The smoothness and wittiness of Cosby and Culp's dialogue is one of the foundations of "I Spy Returns," probably because it's real.

"It's very hard to write dialogue for Bill and me" he says. "Nobody's ever been able to do it except me. The scripts I wrote for 'I Spy' — we never changed a word. We did it the way it was because I had honed it and honed it and honed it until it was fun and also pithy."

"But the rest of the time, when we found scenes that we couldn't make work for us, we just threw them out, and said 'What is this scene about' and then we'd turn the camera on and wing it. So that's what we did this time."

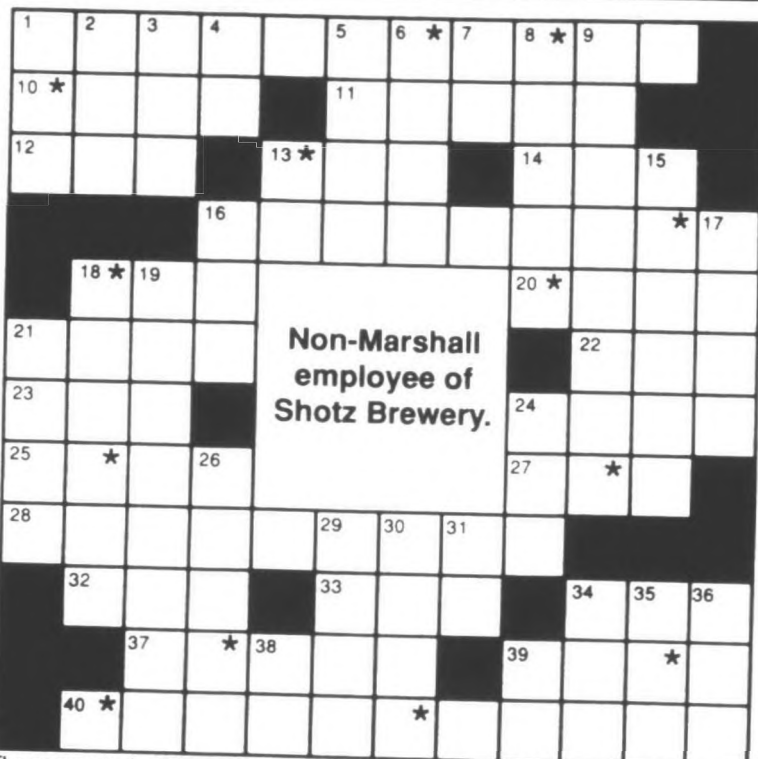

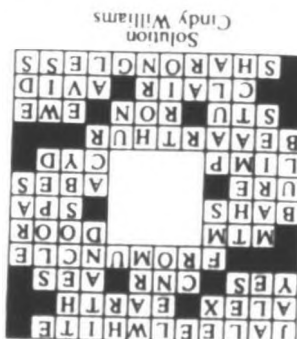
