School leader Howard dies

A memorial service for Harry Howard, longtime Wayne-Westland school superintendent, was held Saturday in Nixa, Mo.

Mr. Howard, who was a local teacher, principal and administrator before serving as superintendent from 1968 to 1973, died at 71 Monday, Oct. 23, in Springfield, Mo.

After leaving the Wayne-Westland district, he was Ann Arbor school superintendent for nearly 10 years before resigning to become president of Cleary College, a private school in Ypsilanti and Livingston County, specializing in business and management education.

He retired in 1988 to become an educational consultant.

Mr. Howard received a distinguished service award from the American Association of School Administrators and has gained a reputation over the years as an authority on school finance as well as being an educational leader.

A native of Kentucky, he earned his doctorate in education at Wayne State University. Memorial donations in his name may be made to Young Life of America, 210 Nichols Arcade, Ann Arbor 48104.

Lobbying effort upsets judge

A Detroit judge has lashed out at supporters of slain Westland jogger Caryn Casas for bombarding her courtroom with letters and faxes against Garden City murder defendant Paul Raymond Sadler.

Detroit Recorder's Court Judge

Helen C. Brown also warned that some Casas supporters, accused of threatening and intimidating the court, could face possible criminal charges.

In another dramatic development, Brown said she will ask the U.S. Attorney General's office to investigate the role of Casas's former employer,

Food Motor Co., where the judge said "threats were sent" over telephone and fax lines.

During an Oct. 20 court proceeding, Brown said she had received "a mountain" of faxes from Casas supporters, with the overall theme being "to threaten and intimidate the court into submitting to your will."

Brown also noted that some supporters "threatened to mount a campaign against this court in the next election if the court does not do your bidding."

Christine Byndas, Casas's sister,

has said that her sister's supporters intended to lobby against any reduction in bond or charges in Sadler's case.

Casas, 24, was killed about 7 p.m. Sept. 13 while jogging in Hines Park in Westland. Sadler, 42, is charged with second-degree murder, driving drunk/causing a death, and leaving the scene.

Witnesses have testified that Sadler's car veered off of Hines Drive near Merriman and struck Casas.

LeBlanc target of criticism

The relatively quiet Westland city council campaign is heating up with a dispute between challenger Richard LeBlanc and a committee which has questioned several of his votes as a Wayne-Westland school board member.

LeBlanc, in the field of eight candidates seeking four council seats in the Nov. 7 election, feels the criticisms are "ludicrous."

Since three of the issues raised by the Wayne-Westland Citizens' Information Committee have racial overtones, LeBlanc cited the public support he has in the council race of several minority community leaders.

The committee, which questioned LeBlanc's votes at a press conference last week, denied any intention of injecting race in questioning his votes and a proposal to have the school district moved into the Schoolcraft College district.

The committee, which consists mostly of school district employees,

Ex-coach is given probation

Patrick Bennett, former John Glenn High School girls basketball coach, has been placed on probation for two years for a case in which he was accused of having sex with a 16-year-old player.

Bennett, 33, was sentenced Thursday by Detroit Recorder's Court Judge Dalton Robinson after pleading guilty Sept. 14 to a reduced charge of attempted fourth-degree criminal sexual conduct.

The charge carries a maximum sentence of one year in jail, but Bennett was placed on probation under terms of a plea agreement, Westland police Sgt. Michael Terry said.

Bennett's decision to plead to a lesser charge avoided his trial on two counts of third-degree criminal sexual conduct and two counts of obstruction of justice. Bennett could have faced a maximum sentence of 16 years in prison, had he been tried and convicted as originally charged.

He was charged in both Westland

was formed earlier this year to fight a planned recall of several school board members.

Committee Chairwoman Elizabeth Potter said that the group, which is made up of a little more than a dozen members, is only raising questions on votes which it feels LeBlanc didn't explain his position.

Of the school board actions in the past year cited by the committee in a three-page statement, three have a racial connection.

But Potter, in a telephone interview, disagreed with that conclusion.

"We're not expressing opinions," Potter said, "only presenting factual information."

Among the issues the committee raised:

- During ongoing school board discussion of school redistricting of attendance boundaries, LeBlanc offered a plan what would have some of the community's low-income and minority students to Wayne Memorial High (instead of John Glenn High).
- He was the only board member to vote against the promotion of a minority woman to Franklin Middle School principal.
- At a recent Westland Chamber of Commerce candidates' forum, LeBlanc proposed that the school district be in the adjoining Schoolcraft College district and pull out of the Wayne County Community College, which the committee said is predominantly black.

The only issue not race-related in the committee statement was that LeBlanc voted in favor of cutting secondary school busing more than a year ago but later said that he didn't know his action would affect so many students.

"A responsible board member would have known that information prior to voting," the committee statement said.

In the same release, the committee devoted one sentence to say it reviewed the records and other information about the eight council candidates and felt that the most qualified were Council members Thomas Brown, David Cox and Charles Pickering and Justine Barns, a former council member and state legislator.

Responding to the committee's criticism of his votes, LeBlanc disagreed with the chairwoman's view that the committee isn't injecting a racial element into the campaign.

In a statement, LeBlanc said:

"I can't expect all people to agree with all the decisions I participate in as one of seven policymakers for the school district. However, I believe that informed people will be able to distinguish between the nonsense this group is promoting and the decisions I have supported for the betterment of the school district on an at-large basis."

LeBlanc cited the support he has of several minority persons in the council campaign, namely

school board colleague Debra Fowlkes, William Anderson, former Nankin Township trustee and Westland city councilman, John Franklin, Westland Housing Commission chairman and Westland Democratic Club chairman, Clarence Cox and Bea Morgan.

Franklin told the Observer that he investigated the issues raised by the committee and found that its "statements are in variance with the facts."

LeBlanc concluded that the committee's "untrue statements are typical of the political falsehoods Westland residents have become accustomed to seeing in the final days before elections.

"It is blatantly obvious the malcontent leaders (of the committee) will go to any lengths to deceive voters in their attempt to discredit my candidacy. These ridiculous claims should be rejected for the vicious lies they are."

Abandoned houses razed

Seven abandoned houses have been torn down in Westland's far southeast corner, and the state has picked up the tab.

The city received a \$67,000 grant from the Michigan Department of Commerce for the purpose of demolishing the abandoned houses, said Robert Fritz, Westland building director.

The city had already paid Capital Wrecking Co. to do the work, but the state has reimbursed the money. The council recently approved a budget amendment reflecting the grant.

The houses were torn down in the Middlebelt-Van Born Road area at the addresses of 28912 McDonald; 28999 McDonald;

29118 McDonald; 28011 Eaton; 28934 Powers; 29014 Powers; 29041 Powers; and 28999 Richard.

The land has been graded and seeded, Fritz said, and the city owns the land.

The property hasn't yet been auctioned or sold.

Westland Police Chief Emery Price said there had been some trespassing around the abandoned houses, some of which had been stripped of aluminum siding and other materials.

Price also said the houses "were certainly an eyesore."

The money for the demolition came from a child violence prevention state grant program.

"haunted hallways" project from 6:30-8:30 p.m. Tuesday in the school on Marquette west of Wayne Road.

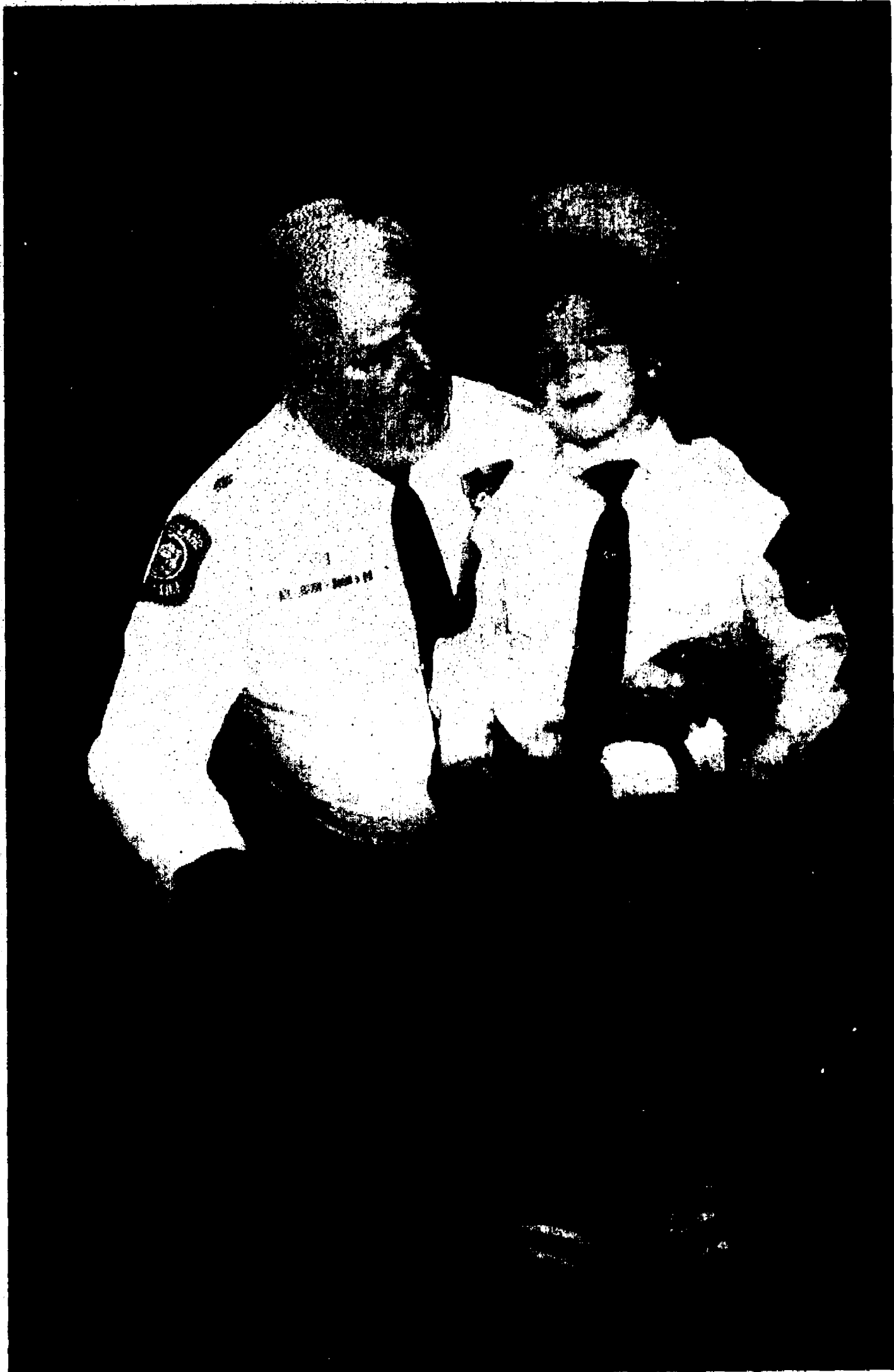
Admission will help pay for the school's upcoming theater productions. Students will also paint children's faces with Halloween designs.

Schools stress AIDS education

Tattoos, hickies and pierced ears. Can any of these three cause AIDS?

Students and parents in the Livonia Public Schools, which includes the northern section of Westland, came to an HIV/AIDS seminar Tuesday and peppered educators and Dr. Don Lawrenchuk, medical director of Wayne County's Health Department, with questions on the disease.

Separating fact from fiction on the issue were Lawrenchuk and district educators Elaine Koons, Fred Price and Joanne Morningstar.

"We're here because we care about our kids; our job is to make sure you're safe," Koons said.

For students in Livonia Public Schools, being safe begins in the first grade, when teachers first take up communicable diseases. In health classes in subsequent

years, teachers build on this initial information. To alleviate fears, third-graders find out all the ways they can't get AIDS.

"So students will feel safe, we tell them they can't get AIDS from doorknobs, handshakes and the water fountain, that they're safe doing normal activities," Koons said.

Fourth-graders learn about the body's immune system and how disease and viruses can break it down.

To create compassion for victims, sixth-graders watch a video that tells the story of Ryan White, a well-known boy who died of AIDS.

Middle school delves deeper into the medical and personal aspects of AIDS. Students learn that AIDS is not hereditary, that it is acquired by a person's personal habits. And they learn the "risky behavior" that can lead to

a person getting it. "There's a lot of peer pressure on doing and saying things," said Price. "We teach them to be strong enough to make the right choice."

In the three public high schools in Livonia, students learn that the "right choice" in preventing AIDS is abstaining from sex, not just practicing "safe sex."

The overall theme of Livonia's education on AIDS is abstinence, Price said. "Abstinence is the only sure way of beating the problem. 'Safe' sex is not all that safe."

Parents and educators today, Koons said, must talk earnestly, sincerely and openly about a disease their own parents never had to worry about. "Now you have to make wise choices, or you may get a disease that will kill you."

Thirteen years ago, when he joined Wayne County's Health

Department, Lawrenchuk said he had never even heard of AIDS. Today, he said, it's the major public health problem in America.

"For every AIDS case, there are 100 HIV cases," he said. "The only way you can be certain not to get this sexually transmitted disease is to be sexually active."

During the question session, tattoos, hickies and pierced ears were all brought up.

According to Lawrenchuk, tattoos are dangerous because needles may have been used on an AIDS-infected person.

It is unlikely someone will get AIDS after giving a hickey unless there is the drawing of blood.

And there are no public health regulations regarding the piercing of ears or other areas of the body.

"Politicians aren't willing to regulate anything these days," Lawrenchuk said. "It's 'buyer beware.'"

Toxic waste drop-off set for Saturday

A household waste collection will be held from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m., Saturday, Nov. 4, for persons to get rid of potentially hazardous materials.

The event will be sponsored for Garden City and Westland residents by the newly-formed Central Wayne Energy Recovery Limited Partnership and will be held at the Central Wayne County Sanitation Authority incinerator on Inkster Road between Annapolis and Van Born in Dearborn Heights.

The event is being held to encourage residents to drop off hazardous wastes, which can then be recycled or disposed of free, said spokeswoman Jennifer Joseph.

During Saturday's drop-off, residents won't have to get out of their cars, as incinerator employees will handle the materials to be disposed.

Joseph said the group had such a good turnout at its first collection last spring, that it scheduled the Nov. 4 event. Some 350 persons dropped off thousands of gallons of pesticides; oil-based paints, solvents and cleaning products in a five-hour period.

Items that will be accepted include: oil-based paint and varnishes, wood preservatives, cleaning solvents, pesticides and weed killers, household batteries, oven cleaners, mothballs, transmission fluid, anti-freeze, pressurized cans, lead and metallic mercury.

The agency said used motor oil will not be accepted because there are other drop-off sites available.

Other items that will not be accepted are explosives, latex paint, tires, smoke detectors, any materials from commercial or industrial businesses, and recyclables which are usually dropped off at local recycling centers.

Joseph said there are numerous locations for persons to drop off used motor oil. Those are: Cherry Hill-Newburgh Sunoco, Westland; Valvoline Instant Oil Change, 32465 Ford, Garden City, between Merriman and Venoy (for persons who change their own oil); Wayne-Palmer Standard Service, Westland, which charges 50 cents per gallon; and Ray's Ultra Service Center, on Wayne Road and Cowan, which charges \$1 for drop-off of up to four gal-

lons with anti-freeze accepted at no charge.

Joseph said advantages of the disposal of hazardous wastes include creating a better environment through proper disposal or recycling of special wastes; improved household safety by removing toxic materials from storage; and safer conditions for local rubbish collection contractors.

The energy recovery partnership was formed last year by the

member cities of the incinerator authority — Garden City, Westland, Inkster, Wayne and Dearborn Heights — so that the burning of rubbish can be converted to energy.

Construction on the incinerator is expected to start next summer, Joseph said. In the past few months, partnership representatives have been working with state and county officials to obtain necessary permits.

Sadler is jailed in lieu of a \$500,000 cash bond.

Addressing the victim's supporters, Brown said, "The collective impression you have given the court by your fares is one of mob rule. You have called for impaling and crucifying the defendant. You have threatened the court with severe consequences if it reduces the bond or the charges."

Brown added later, "You sound like a lynch mob, out to get the defendant and out to get the judge

if the court gets in the way. And you should be ashamed of yourselves."

"The very fabric of our system of government is undermined by your threats to threaten and intimidate this court. Let me put you on notice that this court will not be threatened or intimidated."

The Observer contacted Byndas for comment on the judge's statements, but she declined to discuss the matter.

Brown warned those "who have sent threats" that they will be served with orders to appear before her to argue why they shouldn't be held in contempt of court.

Further, she said she will ask the Wayne County Prosecutor's Office "to investigate for possible criminal charges."

Moreover, Brown said she will ask the U.S. Attorney General's Office to investigate Ford Motor Co.'s role.

"These threats were sent by the Ford Motor Co. employees, using the Ford computer system, and (were) sent out over telephone and fax lines," she said. "This may bring this matter under federal jurisdiction."

A Ford spokesman said the persons using company equipment "were clearly acting on their own behalf and were not authorized or encouraged by Ford to take this action."

Jon Harmon, Ford corporate news manager, told the Observer in a telephone interview that the firm's equipment is intended only for company use.

Harmon went on to comment that "we are saddened by this senseless death of one of our employees."

Sadler's next court date is scheduled for Nov. 17, when the judge will hear motions.

and Wayne amid allegations that he had sex with the girl in both cities. He was originally charged with obstructing justice for allegedly telling the girl not to cooperate with authorities.

The girl testified in court that she didn't want Bennett prosecuted for having sex with her. Police said the relationship began in October, 1994, and lasted several months. The girl, now 16, is attending another area high school.

The girl testified in April that she was pressured to testify during a preliminary hearing. She said a prosecutor told her the Bennett "didn't love me and was taking advantage of me and using me for his own pleasure."

She also said she was tricked when she made a phone call to Bennett from the Wayne Police Department. She said she didn't know she was being taped during the conversation that was used to build a case against Bennett.

WAYNE-WESTLAND COMMUNITY SCHOOLS PUBLIC NOTICE

The Wayne-Westland Community School District's financial status for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1995, identifies the district as having a deficit fund balance. The deficit is a result of a combination of items, (1) operating millage deficit prior to the passage of Proposal A, (2) Wayne County Special Education Center Program charges, (3) decreased state and categorical funds, specifically special education and (4) decreasing enrollment. The deficit implemented many cost saving items, such as the termination of secondary transportation and reduction in administrative positions. The budget decreases were not sufficient to compensate for the lost revenues, and expenditures beyond the district's control, thereby resulting in a deficit situation for 1994-95 fiscal year. The taxpayers supported an enhancement millage in June of 1995. This enhancement millage, effective for the 1995-96 fiscal year will allow the district to relocate transportation, eliminate some pay-for-participation fees and reduce the deficit, as required by law. This millage is effective for the 1995-96 and 1996-97 fiscal years only.

The Board of Education has struggled to maintain the fine opportunities that have been available to the students of the Wayne-Westland Community Schools. This has been very difficult due to reductions in State Support and projected future reductions. We must never lose sight of the fact that these dollars ultimately translate into educational opportunities for students.

SMART board offers Kaufman general manager job

Despite some concerns about his commitment to regional transit, the SMART board voted Thursday to offer the job of general manager to Wayne County Circuit Judge Richard Kaufman.

SMART (Suburban Mobility Authority for Regional Transportation) Board members voted 5-1 to offer the position which pays \$96,000 to Kaufman, a Plymouth Township resident.

The motion to offer the job to Kaufman resulted in a round of discussion after Macomb board member William Sowerby first asked for a five minute recess before the vote on the motion presented by board member Cassandra Smith-Gray. When he returned to the board room he insisted the motion be changed so that board members could name who they wanted as general manager rather than voting yes or no to Kaufman.

Sowerby then named SMART

employee Paul Majka as his choice, but was in the minority as the rest of the board members named Kaufman as their choice to lead SMART, which is making a financial turnaround and expanding service in communities that in the spring voted in favor of a tax hike to support the service.

Kaufman will have to resign his judgeship and any future outside employment by him will be subject to board approval, under the offer approved by the board. He's expected to start the job in January.

"Outside employment is an issue with me," said James DeSana, mayor of Wyandotte and a board member. He said a majority of the Wayne Transit Authority board, which he's a member of, had voted for Kaufman and he was obligated to vote for him.

"I hope Judge Kaufman is making a total commitment," he said, adding he hoped Kaufman was not coming to try it out, and

then go back to his old line of employment.

Kaufman was elected to the bench in 1980. He graduated in 1976 from Wayne State University Law School.

He had been elected by his peers three times as chief judge of the circuit court. He was the youngest jurist ever to serve as chief circuit court judge. He was the first executive chief judge of both the circuit and Recorder's Court. He helped draft the Civil Justice Reform Act and his court was cited as an example of efficiency.

He's credited with consolidating the circuit court into one facility, the City-County Building.

Kaufman was among 10 finalists considered in June 1993 for three federal judgeships in the Eastern Michigan District of Michigan.

Sowerby questioned hiring a new general manager at the salary ceiling of \$96,000.

In light of his position as a judge, Kaufman would expect the salary ceiling, interim general manager Michael Duggan said.

After the vote Sowerby made a statement in which he expressed concern about how will Kaufman will work out in the position. He

said he's also not certain how Macomb County commissioners will react to the decision.

"I hope this does work. It's vital that this thing does work," Sowerby said, adding that he's not happy with the decision because he felt the general manager should have a transit background.

After the meeting, board chairman Matthew Wirgau, the Oakland County representative, said transit experience was not an issue for most of the board. Public transportation has not met the needs of communities across the country, he said.

"We want to look at new ways to provide service," he said. "To bring in someone who has failed in another part of the country didn't make sense, 'we're unique here,'" Wirgau said, adding he hopes SMART can continue the momentum it's had since voters approved a tax hike.

"Besides Duggan has been a great success, and he doesn't have a transit background," Wirgau said.

Duggan, who has served as interim general manager for four years in addition to his job as deputy chief executive officer for Wayne County, said he's relieved to give up his work with SMART.

DON'T PASS ON THE MOUTHGUARD

Youngsters who play basketball have as much reason to protect their teeth as they do to defend against their opponents. According to a recent study by the Illinois Department of Public Health in Springfield, blows to the mouth, teeth, and jaws comprise 33% of the injuries sustained by the basketball players studied who played without mouthguards. By comparison, fewer than 1% of their football-playing counterparts suffered these types of injuries because they wore mouthguards and faceguards. On the basis of these numbers, young sports players are encouraged to wear mouthguards when participating in high-contact sports such as basketball, soccer, wrestling, or field hockey. Those who find commercial mouthguards to be uncomfortable should ask their dentists about fabricating custom-fitted mouthguards. Winning and losing at team sports should not involve tooth loss.

Action group says Bennett bill protects polluters

Capitol capsules:
As soon as Sen. Loren Bennett, R-Canton, introduced his "strong environmental bill — good for business," Clean Water Action denounced it as a "Polluter Protection Act."

Bennett, chair of the Senate Natural Resources Committee, introduced Senate Bill 728 to "encourage Michigan industry and businesses to conduct their own environmental audits and cleanups... by providing them with privilege over the information they collect." It also provides "carefully structured immunity" for companies voluntarily doing their own cleanups.

Arguing the state "never had and never will have the ability to police these practices everywhere at once," Bennett said government should seek cooperation of business.

Clean Water Action, a Lansing-based group, issued a same-day response. Patrick Diehl, its program coordinator, said Bennett's bill would allow businesses to create secret files protected from disclosure even if the state or private parties sue for the information.

"It is a clone of pollution secrecy legislation promoted by big business nationwide," said Diehl. "We support a compromise which would protect businesses who voluntarily audit their practices from enforcement if they fully close the information and correct the problem."

Pesky write-ins

When voting, have you ever written in a fictitious name as a protest against all the candidates? Or your own name as a way

to get into the record books?

The state House of Representatives has passed a bill to prohibit the counting of write-in votes unless the candidate had previously filed a notarized declaration of intent. House Bill 4449 now goes to the Senate.

"After a long, exhausting day at the polls, the last thing workers want to do is tabulate votes for Mickey Mouse or some other fictional character," said the sponsor, Rep. Beverly Hammerstrom, R-Temperance. Would-be write-in candidates would have to file declarations of intent before 4 p.m. on the Friday preceding the election.

'Prince of potholes'

Gov. John Engler is taking a lot

of heat for "redirecting" \$192 million in federal transportation money from local to state projects.

"Not only is this highway robbery," said Jim Little, director of the County Road Association of Michigan, "but local officials won't be able to assess the damage to their road operations" until the Michigan Department of Transportation issues allocation figures. "This is a classic case of robbing Peter to pay Paul. In this instance, Peter was just about broke to begin with."

Three House Democratic leaders dubbed Engler "the prince of potholes." Reps. Curtis Hertel, Carolyn Kilpatrick and Greg Pitonik of Taylor objected that Engler had never consulted — or even notified — the Legislature and his own State Transportation Commission.

FOC bills move

Sen. Robert Geake, R-Northville, said 25 of 40 bills dealing with Friend of the Court operations are ready for full Senate action.

Geake, chair of the Senate Judiciary Subcommittee on Friend of the Court, said less controversial bills will be moved first. These include measures to facilitate interstate collection of child support from deadbeat parents, extend the statute of limitations for collection, and force parents to pay court costs when they refuse to comply with court orders.

Two bills make it a felony to falsely to accuse a parent of child abuse, a common problem in bitter custody disputes, Geake said. His panel has been working on the project for two years.

No party time

Some 250 student leaders and advisors from three dozen college campuses will descend on Lansing Nov. 10-11 for the third annual Peer Power College Student Leadership Conference. Topics: binge drinking and alcohol misuse on campuses.

Students from Eastern Michigan University, Madonna University, Oakland University, Schoolcraft College, Washtenaw Community College and the University of Michigan are among those who will attend.

Sponsor is the state Liquor Control Commission, chaired by former Sen. Phil Arthurs. School teams will turn ideas into action programs, he said. The conference at the Lansing Holiday Inn will conclude with a mock trial of a date-rape case by Cooley Law School students.

Workers sought to help seniors

The Senior Alliance, a non-profit agency serving seniors in western Wayne County, acts as a liaison between seniors and work-

ers. Workers, who are asked to charge the seniors no more than \$6 an hour, must provide three references, including two work references.

Workers who meet the requirements will be placed on the Senior Alliance referral list. Once a senior chooses and hires a worker, it is the responsibility of the senior to set up a work schedule and pay the worker.

Children's center doubles as lab for SC students

Schoolcraft College continues to expand with the opening last week of a new children's center.

The center, located off the south parking lot at the Livonia campus on Haggerty between Six and Seven Mile roads, will house day-care and kindergarten pro-

grams that had previously been housed in houses along Haggerty Road, as well as in the Liberal Arts building at the Livonia campus and at the Radcliff Center in Garden City.

"The vision, diligence and determination of many at School-

craft" resulted in the center, according to Pat Watson, Schoolcraft board chairman. Not only does the center provide child care, but it also serves the purpose of providing practical experience for students of child development, she said.

At a large gathering Oct. 24 to open the center, Richard McDowell, Schoolcraft president, said the center's opening date was picked because it was the college's 34th birthday. The celebration included refreshments prepared by Schoolcraft College's Culinary Arts students and performances by the children from the center.

The 9,000-square-foot facility cost \$576,000 for the building and equipment, according to Saundra Florek, dean of marketing and development at Schoolcraft. A lot of equipment was moved from the other buildings, she said.

Work began the first week of April on the center, which has capacity for 84 students, but enrollment will be limited to 70 because of the way the program is set up, Florek said. In fact there's already a waiting list.

Each room at the center has a different theme and kids are separated by age group, including six in the infant room (ages 6 weeks to a year), six in the transitional toddler room (ages 1-2 years), nine in the toddler room (ages 2-3), 34 in the preschool program

and 15 in the kindergarten program. The age groupings are approximate as maturity level also is a factor, Florek said.

The cost is \$145 a week or \$32 a day for infants, \$135 a week or \$30 a day for toddlers, \$105 a week or \$23 a day for preschoolers and \$117 a week for kindergartners

This is the first year for the kindergarten program and no part-time kindergartners are being accepted.

Other features of the center include: one-way viewing windows for training students without disrupting children's activities; sensor faucets in the diaper changing

areas and in the children's bathrooms, which are miniaturized for children; see-through and "non-pinchin'" doors to protect children; playground access from each classroom; an indoor playground for bad weather; a tornado shelter and staffing ratios of 1 adult to 3 infants and toddlers and 1 adult to 7 preschoolers.

The meeting will be preceded by a welcoming reception from 5-6 p.m. The Town Hall meeting is open to the public.

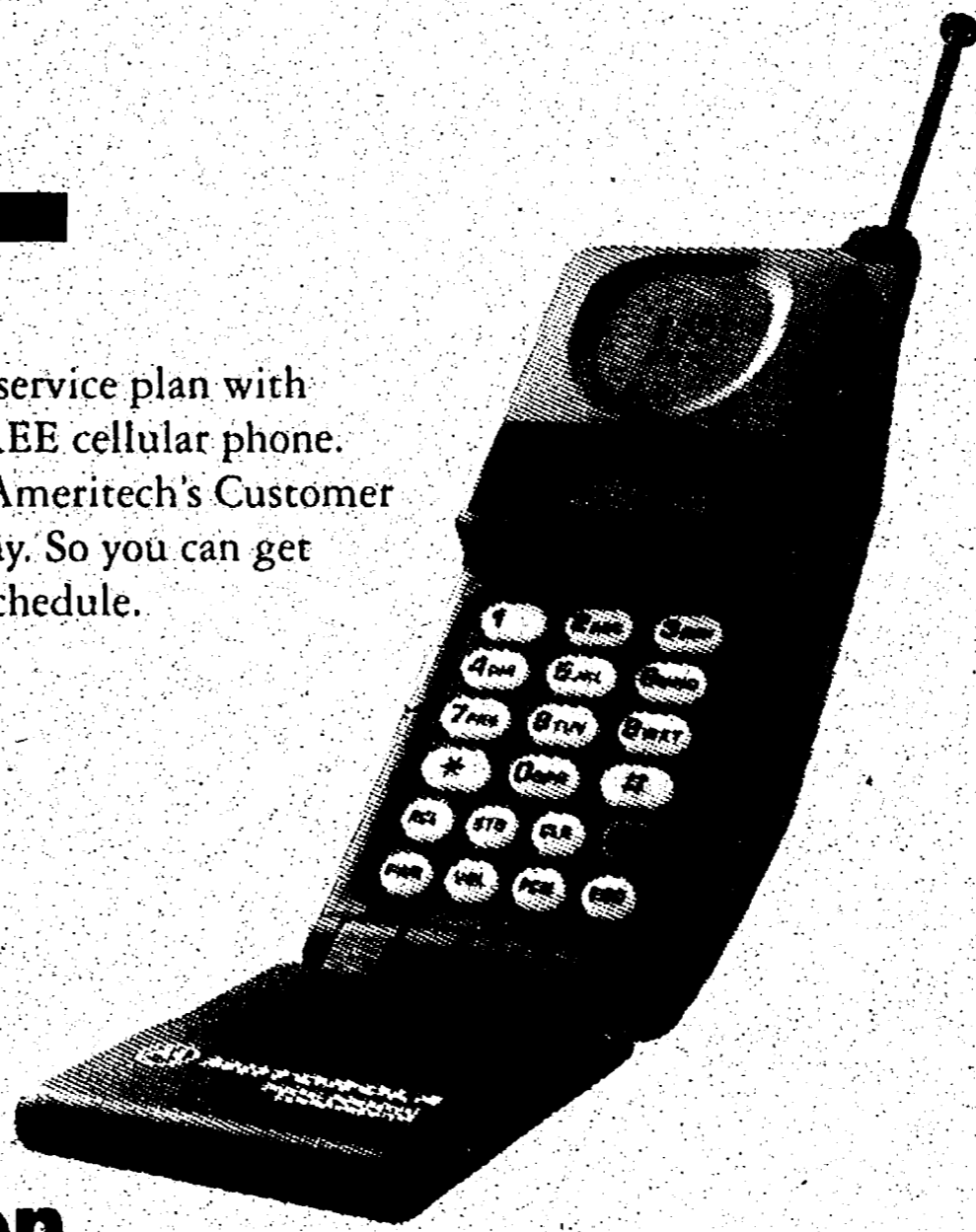

Fall brings requests for heartier recipes

Fall is upon us. Gone are the days of chilled soups, cold salads, grilled chicken and pickle recipes. They are being replaced with heartier recipe requests. Your wish is my command.

Brian Gariepy, a fifth grader at Gill Elementary School in Farmington Hills called because he needed to interview a chef for a writing assignment. After our interview, Brian asked for my favorite lasagna recipe.

Well Brian, with four boys at home younger than you, I think your mother will appreciate this recipe even more than you and I combined!

SPEEDY LASAGNA

- 2 medium onions, peeled
- 1/4 cup olive oil
- 1/4 teaspoon dried red pepper flakes
- 2 teaspoons dried Italian seasoning
- 1 (28 ounce) can crushed or diced tomatoes
- 1 pound egg noodles such as pappardelle or fettuccine
- 10 ounces ricotta cheese, drained
- 3 tablespoons fresh parsley, chopped

Slice onions into very thin slices. In a skillet large enough to hold the pasta, combine the onions, oil, red pepper, a pinch of salt and the dried Italian seasoning, stirring to coat with the oil.

Cook, uncovered, over very low heat, stirring from time to time, until the onions are tender and glazed, about 10 minutes. Add the canned tomatoes, simmer uncovered, until sauce begins to thicken.

Meanwhile, cook dried pasta in a pot of boiling water following package directions. Drain thoroughly. Add the drained pasta to the sauce. Add the ricotta, in small spoonfuls, toss again and cover. Allow to rest off the heat for 5 minutes. Serve garnished with parsley. Serves 4-6.

Chef's secret: I would brown some ground beef or turkey with some garlic and stir into the sauce for a meatier version, then it would easily serve 6!

Shirley Clark of Plymouth wanted a fall recipe that could carry itself right into Thanksgiving. The thought had never crossed my mind to combine apples with cranberries, but the result was absolutely delicious.

CRANBERRY APPLE PIE

- One pastry for a two crust pie
- 4 cups sliced and peeled tart apples (i.e. Granny Smith)
- 2 cups fresh or frozen cranberries
- 1 cup sugar
- 2 tablespoons cornstarch
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg
- 1 teaspoon fresh grated lemon zest
- 2 tablespoons butter or margarine

Preheat oven to 425 degrees F. In a large bowl, combine apples and cranberries. In a small bowl, combine remaining ingredients except butter. Sprinkle the sugar mixture over the apple mixture and toss to coat. Spoon into a pastry lined pie pan. Dot with butter or margarine and top with remaining pastry. Seal top crust and cut slits in top. Bake at 425 degrees F. for 35-45 minutes or until pie is golden. Serves 8.

The student loves chocolate chip peanut butter cookies, and after I faxed her a standard recipe, I found this one. It's so easy, even a kid could make them! I can't imagine anything better with a glass of cold milk.

EASY CHOCOLATE PEANUT BUTTER COOKIES

- 1 package chocolate cake mix (preferably without the pudding)
- 3/4 cup crunchy peanut butter
- 2 eggs
- 2 tablespoons milk
- 1 cup peanut butter chips
- 1/2 cup chopped nuts, optional

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F. Grease baking sheets or line them with parchment paper. Combine cake mix, peanut butter, eggs and milk in a large bowl. Mix at low speed with a mixer until blended. Do not overmix. Stir in peanut butter pieces and nuts. Drop by spoonfuls onto prepared baking sheet. Bake at 350 degrees F. for 7-9 minutes. Makes 3 1/2 dozen cookies.

BREAD machines

With the chill of autumn comes a yearning for hearty soups and stews and what better accompaniment than a freshly baked loaf of bread.

Bread machines have found a place in the American kitchen, and nowadays it is not uncommon for a family to waken to the smell of freshly baking bread. Even those who hate to cook, can in a matter of a few minutes, put together a dough that will produce a wholesome, tasty and fragrant loaf.

Barbara Norman knows this well having recently written, "What Can I Do With My Bread Machine?" This short informational volume covers a lot of territory with advice on how to buy and best maintain a bread machine; how to create original breads; suggestions about using perishable ingredients such as eggs and milk; alternate uses for breadmakers as well as recipe basics.

This 49-year-old West Bloomfield resident has worked as a lawyer, teacher and guidance counselor. She is an avid antiques collector as well as art glass expert and lecturer. In her spare time she experiments with kitchen gadgets and foods and enjoys creating recipes that

are delicious as well as easy to prepare.

Her first book, "What Can I Do With My Juicer?" was written after combing stores to find a book on juicing that wasn't written purely from a nutritional perspective. "There was so much I thought you could do with a juicer and ways of using the pulp in interesting ways. For me it was more than just a way to get vitamins. It was a way of making new and interesting foods, and making old favorites taste even better," she said. After the success of her first book Dell, her publisher, asked if she was interested in producing a volume on bread machines. She accepted the project, went out and bought four breadmakers, rolled up her sleeves and got to work.

"I'm an intense worker," she said. "For three months my machines were going around the clock." Her co-workers at Mott High School in Waterford where she works as a guidance counselor, sampled her creations and gave her honest and valuable feedback.

"They were my recipe testers," she said. Norman did several practice runs with each of her

recipes and adapted many of them to suit diets. Unlike many cookbook authors who prefer to create recipes from scratch, Norman encourages her readers to use prepackaged mixes that, with a little ingenuity, can be creative as well as tasty. A couple of additions "personalizes" a prepackaged mix according to Norman, "The goal," Norman says, "is to make good bread without it having to be an ordeal."

Her personal favorites are Lemon Poppy Seed Bread, Spinach Feta Cheese Bread as well as focaccia and bagels.

Would she ever consider marketing the breads she has developed and written about? "Never," she says. "I enjoyed writing the book and love bringing breads to family and friends, but it ends there."

The ever ambitious Norman is considering writing a play or TV series. At the same time she is thinking about writing another appliance based cookbook. "It will be my trilogy," she said.

Have a happy, healthy Halloween

Trick or treating at Halloween can be downright scary. But with some advance planning, the Halloween season can be a little less spooky for parents, according to Dr. Jose Cara, a pediatric endocrinologist at Henry Ford Health System.

Getting control of Halloween treats is a good place to start. If you allow your children to go trick or treating, look over the candy for safety and dietary concerns before allowing them to eat it.

"High-sugar candies like candy bars and candy corn can be substituted by parents with low-sugar treats like raisins, fruit roll-ups, dried fruits, pretzels and low-fat granola bars," said Dr. Cara. Halloween treats can be worked into the child's meal plan or saved and given out for special occasions.

Michigan children need to develop better eating habits. Statistics show that Michigan has more overweight children with higher cholesterol levels than the national average. Both problems are the result of diets too high in fat and calories and too little exercise.

Sweets are high in fat and/or sugar and therefore calories. For example, one ounce of plain milk chocolate contains 150 calories, 2 teaspoons of fat and 3 teaspoons of

sugar. Sugar-type candies such as gum drops do not contain fat. However, one ounce does contain nearly 5 teaspoons of sugar.

Getting control of Halloween treats is a good place to start," said Faye Fitzgerald, a dietitian with the Henry Ford Heart and Vascular Institute.

For parents of a child with diabetes, trick or treating is very scary. In general, it is better for diabetic children to have treats included as

part of one of the main meals rather than as free-standing snack, said Dr. Cara.

Both Cara and Fitzgerald suggest that parents start a "spooktacular" tradition for Halloween that reinforces good eating habits by handing out nutritious snacks such as packaged nuts, raisins, pretzels, dried fruit, popcorn or sugarless gum. You can even hand out non-food items such as fun colored pencils, stickers or erasers. Getting neighborhood friends to join in this new tradition also may help children cut down on excess sweets.

"It's a good idea for parents to follow similar Halloween guidelines for non-diabetic siblings and other family members," said Dr. Cara. "This can reduce potential conflicts between siblings or relatives."

Fun treats that meet diabetic guidelines include cupcakes made with low-fat cake mix and sugar-free frosting, low-fat, sugar-free frozen yogurt, angel food cake and popcorn balls. Individual pizzas or a healthy submarine sandwich make a great meal that kids of all ages will enjoy. Fresh cut up veggies, and fruit juice round out the meal and will please parents and kids.

Safety tips

- Always accompany small children. Stop only at well-lit houses in your own neighborhood or go only to homes of people you know.
- Advise older children to travel in groups, never alone. Set a time for returning home and tell them never to accept an invitation to enter a home or apartment.
- Always buy flame-resistant costumes and make sure they're short enough so the kids don't trip on them.
- Apply reflector tape to costumes and treat bags.
- Affix your name, address and phone number to the inside of small children's costumes in case they get lost or separated.
- Avoid buying masks as they can impede a child's vision and breathing. Use makeup instead.
- Falls are the number one cause of Give kids flashlights so they can see and be seen.
- Make sure kids stay on the sidewalk and don't cut across yards. Stress the importance of looking both ways before they dart across the street.
- Warn kids to only accept wrapped or packaged treats and not to eat any treats until they get home and an adult inspects them.

Well Dorie, where there's smoke, there's flavor. This dish, compliments of the Catfish Institute, gives plenty of both.

BLACKENED CATFISH

2 tablespoons sweet Hungarian paprika
2½ teaspoons salt
2 teaspoons lemon pepper seasoning
1½ teaspoons garlic powder
1½ teaspoon cayenne pepper
1½ teaspoons dried basil, crushed
1 teaspoon onion powder
1 teaspoon dried thyme
Farm raised catfish fillets
1 cup unsalted butter or margarine, melted
Lemon wedges

Heat a large cast iron skillet or heavy aluminum skillet over very high heat for 10 minutes. In a small bowl, combine spices and seasonings. Mix well. Dip catfish fillets into melted butter and roll in seasoning mixture. Place on waxed paper. Place three fillets at a time in the hot skillet. Cook, uncovered for 2 minutes. Drizzle each fillet with 1 teaspoon melted butter. Flip and continue cooking for 2 minutes.

Remove from pan and continue with remaining fish. Serve with lemon wedges. Serves 6.

Chef's secret: Don't try this at home in an unvented kitchen! You can get the same results outside over hot coals.

Broil or panbroil lean beef patties to medium doneness (no pink should remain). Cut cheese into Halloween shapes like pumpkins and ghosts with a cookie cutter; use these to top the burger. Sliced olives and bell pepper pieces accent the cheese cut-outs.

Fresh fruits and vegetables with a dip are an easy accompaniment. Serve the dip in hollowed-out miniature pumpkins.

HALLOWEEN BURGERS FOR KIDS

Dorie Davenport of Birmingham called to compliment me on the catfish story that ran a few weeks back. Dorie claims she never would have tried catfish thinking, like me, that it was a bottom feeder and real "fishy tasting." Now she's a catfish convert, and would like to prepare blackened catfish. Well Dorie, where there's smoke, there's flavor. This dish, compliments of the Catfish Institute, gives plenty of both.

BLACKENED CATFISH

2 tablespoons sweet Hungarian paprika
2½ teaspoons salt
2 teaspoons lemon pepper seasoning
1½ teaspoons garlic powder
1½ teaspoon cayenne pepper
1½ teaspoons dried basil, crushed
1 teaspoon onion powder
1 teaspoon dried thyme
Farm raised catfish fillets
1 cup unsalted butter or margarine, melted
Lemon wedges

Heat a large cast iron skillet or heavy aluminum skillet over very high heat for 10 minutes. In a small bowl, combine spices and seasonings. Mix well. Dip catfish fillets into melted butter and roll in seasoning mixture. Place on waxed paper. Place three fillets at a time in the hot skillet. Cook, uncovered for 2 minutes. Drizzle each fillet with 1 teaspoon melted butter. Flip and continue cooking for 2 minutes.

Remove from pan and continue with remaining fish. Serve with lemon wedges. Serves 6.

Wellnesswear debuts at Saks

Needing money for the work of the Wellness House on West Warren in Detroit, development director Ken Malecke turned to local graphic designer Dominic Pangborn with a modest plan.

Would the award-winning artist create a line of high-end merchandise that could be sold through department stores to raise funds for Wellness House programs helping those inflicted with AIDS and HIV?

Malecke wanted the merchandise design to symbolize hope for those with the disease, and also be a warning and education for the rest of society.

Not only would Pangborn design the symbol, he agreed to develop a line of sophisticated merchandise suitable for fine stores.

"I have a hard time saying no to requests for charities that help people," Pangborn said. "I can pass on saving buildings, but not on people. I liked the idea of products that raise funds. This way, a second collection can be introduced after a few years, and money for the charities can continue."

Malecke contacted Saks Fifth Avenue next, and with the intercession of Saks' fashion director Cheryl Hall, the retailer agreed to be the first department store to sell the merchandise at 100-percent Wellness profit.

The Wellnesswear Collection will be available in mid November at the stores in the Somerset Collection, Troy, and the Fairlane Town Center, Dearborn.

"The apparel is intensely fashion-

oriented," Pangborn explained. "The public can wear it to voice their support in the fight. We think the design is sharp and intelligent — something people will be proud to own and wear."

Saks' Hall said a Wellnesswear Boutique is being created on the store's main floor to showcase the line's apparel, stationery and china items. The store is donating floor space and sales associate time to promote and sell the Wellnesswear Collection.

"The Wellness House deserves our efforts," she said. "Saks feels blessed to be a part of this program. The best part is that the dollars stay in De-

troit. It's local. It benefits our community."

The Wellnesswear Collection consists of fine china place settings, a scarf, cummerbund and bow-tie or tie set, stationery and notecards, golf shirts, T-shirts, tank tops, baseball caps, and tote bags emblazoned with Pangborn's vivid, primary colored design — the new symbol of the fight against AIDS.

The merchandise is priced between \$20 and \$200. It can be ordered directly by calling 1-513-667-5035. The Wellness House is a shelter for people with AIDS and also a food delivery service. It feeds some 800 families daily.

Marshall Field's was founded in 1852 when merchant Potter Palmer opened a dry goods store in downtown Chicago. Marshall Field became a partner in the business in 1865, and 16 years later, became chief proprietor, renaming the firm after himself.

At the turn of the century, Marshall Field's was the largest wholesale and retail dry-goods establishment in the world.

In June 1990, the Dayton Hudson Corp. purchased Marshall Field's and together the three store groups became the Department Store Division of Dayton Hudson Corp., with annual sales nearly \$3 billion.

Make your Halloween party ghoulishly delightful

AP — Make your Halloween party ghoulishly delightful and entertaining. Serve "snake" sandwiches, scary-face pizzas, "spider" pretzels and frozen "witches."

The sandwiches can sit on a table for an exciting centerpiece. The pizza faces can be made in advance, or served plain, with vegetable add-ons. The frozen witches need to be frozen at least two hours before the party. The recipes are from "Family Fun" magazine.

Snake Sandwich

- Sliced salami or other lunch-meat
- Provolone or American cheese slices
- 8 hot-dog buns
- Mayonnaise
- Carrot strips
- Red pepper
- Broccoli florets
- Radish

Make 5 salami and cheese sandwiches on 5 hot-dog buns with the

mayonnaise, reserving 1 bun for later use.

Slice 1/4-inch off either end of each sandwich, then cut the sandwiches into thirds. Arrange the miniature sandwiches in a snake curve on a platter or cutting board.

For the snake's head, halve the remaining hot-dog bun and open it to make the snake's mouth. Wedge two carrot strips "fangs" into the mouth to hold it open. Cut a piece of red pepper into a tongue shape and set it between the fangs. Add broccoli florets for the eyes, radish slits for eyebrows and more red pepper for nostrils. Use the remaining half bun at the tip for a tail. Serve with carrot and celery sticks and chips. Makes 8 servings.

Scary-Face Pizza

- 1 pita pocket round
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 1/2 cup shredded mozzarella
- 1 teaspoon grated Parmesan cheese

Preheat oven to 375 degrees F. Position the pita, bowl-side facing

up, and prick it with a fork. Spread the olive oil evenly across the top and sprinkle with both cheeses. Choose from the following ingredients to make the pizza yourself or present your guests with bowls of the toppings as options so they can make their own:

- Zucchini, cut in small rounds
- Onion, green or white, chopped or cut crosswise
- Mushrooms, sliced
- Green and black olives
- Red and green peppers, sliced in curves
- Fresh or sun-dried tomatoes, chopped or sliced
- Pepperoni slices

Bake the pita in a 375-degree F oven for 10 minutes or until the cheese has melted and the bread begins to get crispy. Makes 1 serving.

Note: For a party, multiply this single-serving recipe by the number of guests you are expecting.

Spider Pretzels

- 2 teaspoons smooth peanut butter
- 2 round crackers

8 small pretzel sticks
2 raisins

With the peanut butter and the crackers, make a cracker sandwich. Insert eight pretzel "legs" into the filling. With a dab of peanut butter, set two raisin eyes on top of the cracker. Makes 1 serving.

Frozen Witches

- Tube of chocolate decorating gel
- 8 chocolate sugar cones
- 8 thin, round chocolate wafers
- 1 pint pistachio ice cream
- Black shoestring licorice
- Chocolate chips
- Candy corn

For each dessert, squeeze a ring of decorating gel around the edge of the cone and attach the cone to a chocolate wafer "rim," then set it aside.

Using an ice-cream scoop, drop individual "heads" of ice cream onto a cookie sheet lined with waxed paper.

Cut pieces of licorice to make hair and a mouth and arrange them in place on the ice-cream face. Add

chocolate-chip eyes and a candy-corn nose. Top each scoop with a cone hat (flatten the ice cream slightly so the hat doesn't fall off.) Freeze for at least two hours or until

the hats are set in place. Makes 8 servings.

Note: To avoid meltdown, make these desserts in batches of four.

AP — "Spider web" brownies, chocolate marshmallow "spiders" and decorated popcorn balls are sweet treats for a Halloween party. Each recipe is quick and easy to make. The popcorn balls make festive party favors.

Spider Web Brownies

- 4 squares unsweetened baking chocolate
- 1/4 cup (1/2 stick) margarine or butter
- 2 cups sugar
- 3 eggs
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1 cup flour
- 1 cup coarsely chopped nuts (optional)
- 7-ounce jar marshmallow creme
- 1 square semisweet baking chocolate, melted

Heat oven to 350 degrees F (325 degrees F for glass dish). Line a 13-by-9-inch baking pan with foil extending over edges to form handles. Grease foil.

Melt chocolate and margarine in

large microwave-safe bowl on high (100 percent power) for 2 minutes or until margarine is melted. Stir until chocolate is completely melted.

Stir sugar into chocolate until well blended. Mix in eggs and vanilla. Stir in flour and nuts until well blended. Spread in prepared pan.

Bake in a 350-degree F oven for 30 to 35 minutes or until toothpick inserted in center comes out with fudgy crumbs. Do not overbake. Immediately drop marshmallow creme by spoonfuls over hot brownies. Spread evenly over top of brownies. Cool in pan. Lift out of pan onto cutting board. Remove foil. Place on serving tray. Drizzle melted chocolate over marshmallow creme to create spider web design. Cut into squares. Makes 24 brownies.

Tip: To melt the semisweet baking chocolate: Place 1 square semisweet chocolate in zipper-style plastic sandwich-size bag. Close bag tightly. In a microwave oven, cook on high (100 percent power) about 1 minute or until chocolate is melted. Fold down top of bag tightly and snip a tiny piece off one corner,

about 1/4 inch. Holding top of bag tightly, drizzle chocolate through opening over marshmallow creme.

Chocolate Marshmallow Spiders

- 8 squares semisweet baking chocolate
- 2 cups miniature marshmallows
- Black or red string licorice
- Assorted candies

In microwave oven, melt chocolate in large microwave-safe bowl on high (100 percent power) for 2 minutes, stirring halfway through heating time. Stir until completely melted.

Add marshmallows; mix lightly until completely coated. Drop by spoonfuls onto wax paper-lined tray. Decorate with pieces of string licorice to create spiders. Use additional miniature marshmallows and candies to make eyes. Refrigerate until chocolate is firm. Makes 2 dozen cookies.

Popcorn Jack-o-Lanterns

- 1/4 cup (1/2 stick) margarine or butter
- 10 1/2-ounce bag miniature marshmallows
- One 4-serving size package orange flavor gelatin
- 3 quarts (12 cups) popped popcorn
- Green gumdrop spearmint leaves, cut in half
- 1 square semisweet baking chocolate, melted

In microwave oven, cook margarine and marshmallows in a large microwave-safe bowl on high (100 percent power) 1 1/2 to 2 minutes, or until marshmallows are puffed. Stir in gelatin until well mixed.

Pour marshmallow mixture over popcorn in large bowl. Mix lightly until well coated. Shape into 12 balls with lightly greased or wet hands. Top with spearmint leaf halves to create stems. Decorate with melted chocolate to make jack-o'-lantern faces, if desired. Makes 12 popcorn balls.

Area hoop teams hit rock bottom

Just thought you'd like to know. Was it merely coincidental that all three Livonia Public Schools, along with Westland John Glenn, were not among the top eight seeds in the Western Lakes Activities Association girls basketball playoffs?

(Also, when was the last time Farmington Hills Mercy or Livonia Ladywood missed the Catholic League playoffs? I do remember one of the two, but not both during the same season failing to qualify.)

As far as the WIAA's four non-qualifiers, some may say a non-competitive middle school program may be the culprit. As much as I'm asked: What's wrong with Livonia Churchill's football program? I'm now hearing similar complaints from various coaches and people in the community about the middle school program, which stresses participation over competition.

Livonia's program, which gives students a taste of various sports over six-week increments during the course of the school year, is comparable to Farmington's.

Students in Livonia practice or play games three times per week, 1 1/2 hours per session. It's a six-game season in basketball with all the games scheduled within the district.

Farmington students have a similar program, but meet Monday through Thursday.

But are we satisfying our student's competitive needs?

Harrison girls basketball coach Pete Mantyla brings up one interesting point. He doesn't feel Farmington's program measures up with the middle school programs in Plymouth-Canton and Walled Lake.

"I'm sure we'd be at the bottom in our league if it wasn't for the AAU program we have going here in the off-season," said Mantyla, whose team finished fifth in the WIAA regular season behind Walled Lake Central, Plymouth Canton, Plymouth Salem and Northville.

Some may argue that Livonia Schools are competitive enough, particularly when it comes to soccer, swimming, golf, tennis and cross country.

But a lot of the success comes from community club teams, especially at Livonia Stevenson where the Spartans are state contenders this fall in soccer, girls cross country and girls swimming. By the time many of these athletes reach high school, they've already been exposed to state and national competition. Stevenson's football team won its division and the girls tennis team qualified for state.

Churchill's boys golf team was a state qualifier, while Stevenson and Franklin have already won district boys soccer titles.

"This is merely food for thought, something superintendents, school board members, coaches, parents and administrators may want to hash over sometime soon, and see if we need to re-evaluate things."

Personally, I campaigned vigorously to reinstate middle school sports in Livonia, and I'm starting to wonder whether they're competing on a level playing field with other WIAA members.

■ It's quite an accomplishment just to finish, particularly when the weather conditions are not favorable.

Patriots complete district work

Upstart Livonia Franklin put an exclamation point on an incredible week of soccer Saturday by winning the Class A district title with a 3-0 win over Redford Union at Livonia Churchill.

The Patriots, capturing their first boys' district in school history, will take their 15-6 record into Wednesday's regional semifinal against the state's No. 2-ranked Livonia Stevenson Spartans (17-0-2). Game time is 5 p.m. at Plymouth Canton.

"For my first year this is more than I ever hoped for; I can't say enough about the guys," Franklin rookie coach Dave Hebestreit said. "We have guys who are willing to fulfill roles. I respect them as much as they respect me. It's been a great working atmosphere."

Franklin, which played city rival Churchill to a 2-2 draw through 80 minutes of regulation time, followed by a 15-minute sudden death period (before darkness halted play), came back to finish the job on Friday.

Not wind, lightning, rain or even hail could stop the Patriots, who won it with a minute remaining in the second OT, 3-2, on Eric Bowman's goal.

The ever relentless Bowman, Franklin's version of Pete Rose in soccer shorts, faked a free kick from 25 yards out. Roberto Vega, instead, chipped the ball over three Churchill defenders to teammate Eric Kracht, who in return, played a perfect header onto the foot of streaking Bowman.

"We did not want to go to a shootout; they did their job," Hebestreit said. "Bowman and Vega had no de-

fensive responsibilities. We went totally offensive with our key scoring threats up top."

The stunned Chargers bowed out at 8-5-4 overall.

"Franklin ran a nice play," Churchill first-year coach Chad Campau said. "Our goalie (Bryan Strameck) and Bowman got there at the same time. There was nothing you can do."

"I was just frustrated the way the whole thing turned out. I thought we had them on the ropes (Wednesday). They had guys injured and tired, but with two days rest, I'm sure that rejuvenated them."

RU, making its second district final appearance, kept Franklin scoreless until 11:57 left in the half when Kracht banged home a rebound after Vega took the initial shot. Vega then scored four minutes later on an assist from Steve Finneran. The Patriots added another goal in the second half, Bill Wojtas capitalizing after Finneran's shot ran off the crossbar.

RU, meanwhile, could muster little offense as Franklin goalkeeper Shawn MacGillis notched his eighth shutout of the year.

"When you beat teams like Catholic Central (1-0 on Monday) and Churchill, that says something," said RU coach Don Koontz, whose team bowed out a 4-13-1 overall. "I used to coach at Franklin and their coach (Hebestreit) has done a great job. They're a team. They knock the ball around nicely. They're playing a style that's rare in high school soccer. They'll cause trouble for anyone who plays them."

RU's all-division keeper, Mike Ferrarotti, graduates, but the Panthers return all-division sweeper Mike Lovatli.

"I don't know what the future holds," Koontz said. "Hopefully we'll have some new freshman who will come in and help."

Meanwhile, the future is now for the Cinderella Patriots, who earn a rematch against the highly regarded Spartans.

In a Sept. 18 meeting, Franklin had Stevenson down 2-1 with nine minutes to play, only to lose, 3-2.

NOTE: Dave Sterling should have been credited with Churchill's first goal Wednesday against Franklin with Brian Zawislak assisting.

Zebra surprise Rockets

Wayne Memorial atoned for a season full of sins with a 26-21 upset football victory Friday, over rival Westland John Glenn.

It was the Zebras' fourth city title in the 22-year running of the series. They also knocked the Rockets out of post-season playoff contention in Class AA-Region III for the third time since 1987.

Two junior standouts, quarterback Lorenzo Guess and wide receiver Richard Rashad, teamed up on a 10-yard scoring pass with only 1:31 remaining to give host Wayne the victory.

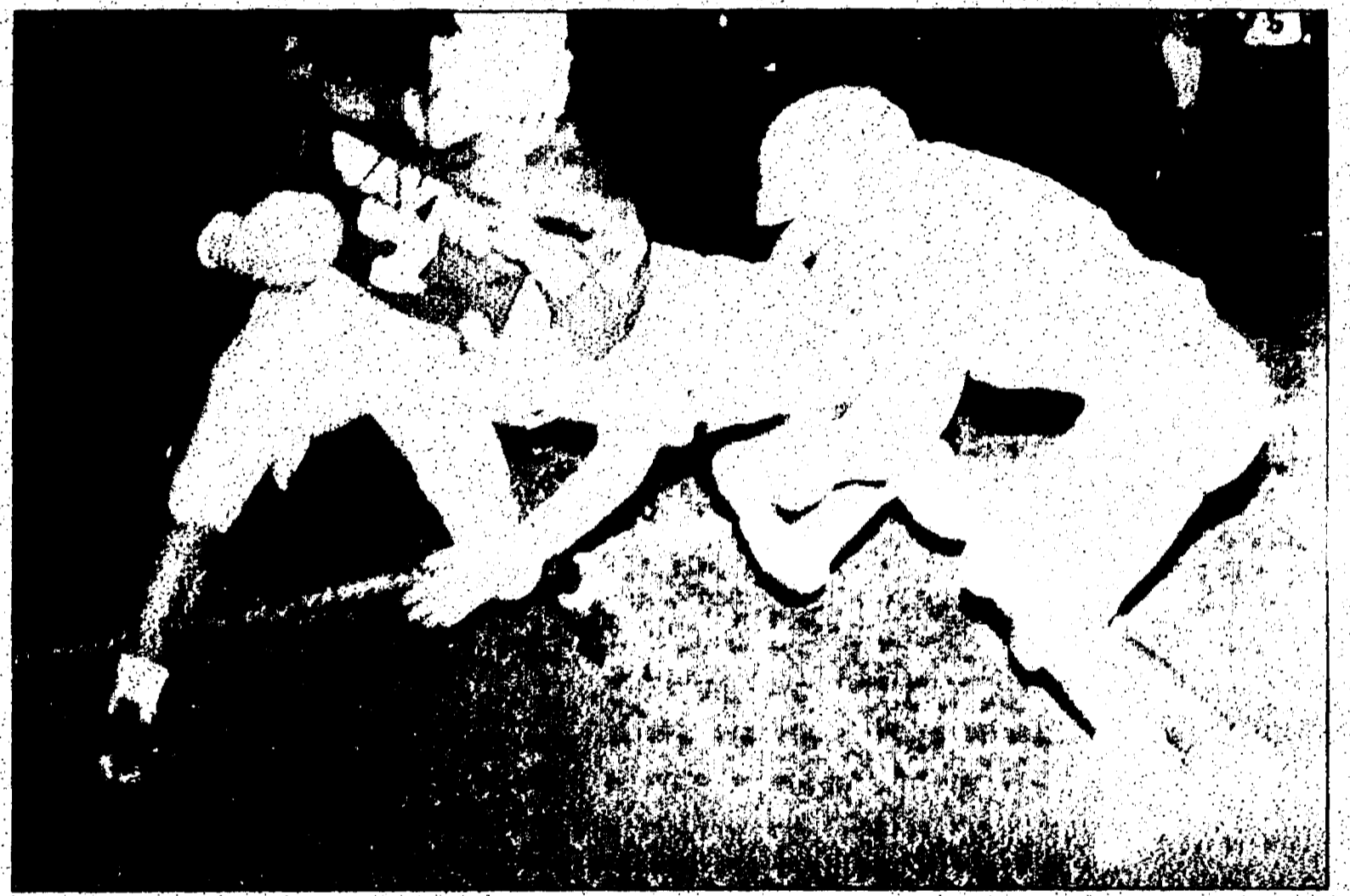
"It was a great way to end the season," said Wayne coach Chuck Howton, whose team finished 3-6 overall. "It's been a season of frustration. We've had lulls offensively and defensively. We've moved the ball all year, but we've seemed to have difficulty once we got inside the 20-yard line."

"Today things clicked better. I'd have to say it's the best game we've played all year."

Guess, the Zebras' 6-foot-3, 185-pound signal caller, was brilliant. He was 11 of 19 for 157 yards and directed the game-winning 74-yard, eight-play drive in the final six minutes.

The 6-4, 195-pound Rashad, who had six catches for 82 yards, came through in the clutch with a dramatic 37-yard catch (and run) to put Wayne in scoring position at the Glenn 31.

He then back-pedaled into the end zone to haul in a lofty toss from Guess.

"We throw a lot of alley-oops in basketball, I just had what I had to do to catch it," said Rashad, who along with Guess, was a starter on last year's basketball team, which reached the state Class A quarterfinals. "This is the only time I've had a chance to play against Glenn in football. I missed last year and I didn't play the year before."

"I think this victory with inspire us for next year."

With Glenn ahead 21-20 midway through the final quarter, Wayne came up with a key defensive stop on fourth-and-3 at the Zebras' 26.

Tackle Melvin Gray, a 6-3, 280-pound sophomore, aided by Guess coming up from his safety spot, kept Glenn ball carrier Jay Jackson (20

carries for 153 yards) short of the first down marker.

"That's the (off-tackle) play the players wanted to run and it was the play they had the most confidence in," said the Glenn coach, who polled his team during a timeout. "Everybody was comfortable with that call."

The Glenn defense, which had allowed only 58 points in eight games, was not its stingy self. The Rockets gave up four touchdowns, all on sustained, time-consuming drives.

"Guess is the most dangerous quarterback we've faced and their receivers made tremendous catches," Gordon said. "They have so many weapons and a ton of speed. And we knew going in that Wayne was a better team than their record indicated."

They've played a tough schedule (in the Mega Conference) and it was kind of game we thought it would be."

The Zebras took the opening kickoff and drove 79 yards in 12 plays, capped by junior Dwayne Jackson's 3-yard TD run with 4:54 left in the first quarter. (Jackson had 71 yards on 16 carries to lead Wayne.) Guess then hit Rashad on the two-point conversion pass for an 8-0 advantage.

Glenn answered, however, on its initial drive, marching 80 yards in 14 plays culminating in Jay Jackson's 3-yard TD run with 10:16 left in the second. Jackson, a 6-5, 150-pound senior, also ran in for the two-pointer to make it 8-8.

Stevenson gridders earn playoff spot

Livonia Stevenson didn't know whether city rival Churchill was a stepping stone or a gravestone.

Stevenson entered Friday night's showdown against Churchill unsure whether it was going to make this week's Michigan High School Athletic Association football playoffs.

"The Spartans didn't find out until well after they'd trimmed the Chargers, 26-7, that the right combination of circumstances had indeed put them into the playoffs for the second year in a row and the third time since the MHSAA began prep football's post season.

"We prepared well this week," Stevenson coach Tom Gabel said. "But there was a sense of finality. We were unsure about the playoffs."

"We had to prepare as if this were the last game of the season. Which is what we did."

The way things went in the first half gave host Churchill supporters reason to believe that, with a miracle or two, the Chargers just might make it the Spartans' last game of the season — and give their sacking program a shot in the arm at the game time.

"It was a sloppily played game," Churchill coach Steve Naumcheff said after his team lost its ninth in a row this year and 19th straight overall. "There was a lot of emotion on both sides. It was a case of playing hard plus the emotion."

"This is an old-time rivalry. And certainly Stevenson is worthy of its 7-2 record."

It was a bit bizarre all day long. First was the unseasonable warmth overnight, then there was the warmish rain, followed by partial afternoon of sunshine.

But nightfall found a brisk breeze that took the wind chill down to freezing. Then, at least on the Churchill field, it began raining yellow fog.

Churchill was whistled nine times for 70 yards in penalties in the first half while Stevenson was flagged six times for 67 yards.

CC wins rematch with Rice

This time, a reward goes along with the Catholic League football championship.

Redford Catholic Central defeated Birmingham Brother Rice, 17-7, in the Prep Bowl Saturday night at the Pontiac Silverdome, and there is still plenty of football to be played.

The mood was far different from two years ago, when the Shamrocks won the league championship at the same site but fell just shy of the state playoffs despite an 8-1 overall record.

Murphy's 'Vampire' is toothless

On a dark and foggy night, a freighter rolls over fishing boats and crashes into the docks at a New York City shipyard.

What's a nice opening like you doing in a movie like this? You'll want to ask after sitting through the rest of "Vampire in Brooklyn," a toothless Eddie Murphy horror comedy that makes "Blacula" look like "Schindler's List."

As about the 70th actor to don the red-lined cape and fangs, Murphy brings little fresh blood to Bram Stoker's creation. His Maximilian is an African-born bloodsucker in search of the only woman in America who has vampire blood flowing through her veins.

She is Rita (Angela Bassett), a police woman whose only hint at a dark side comes through her macabre paintings. Sharp-dressing Max's job is to woo her because, as we all know, a vampire can't do his dirty work unless he is invited.

Bassett, so robust in the current "Strange Days," looks surprisingly stinky in her part. Nothing looks good, thanks to cinematography that's overly murky and dark, even by vampire movie standards.

Chapman is a trademark of director Wes Craven, creator of the popular "Nightmare on Elm Street" movies, though usually he delivers a clever twist or two. You'd think a veteran like Craven would give us something new, especially in the wake of "Interview with the Vampire."

This is supposed to be Eddie Murphy's comeback, but only one sequence recalls his talent for mimicking, done so well in movies like "Trading Places" or "Coming to America." His impersonation of a Bible-thumping preacher has some funny moments, but it's directed clumsily and goes on far too long.

Murphy in fact spends much of his time as a straight man to Ka-deem Hardison as the slave ghoul Julius. As the movie drags on, he starts to decompose, losing an ear here, an arm there, replacing what he can with parts from department store mannequins.

As a horror comedy, "Vampire in Brooklyn" is equally inept in both categories. The jokes come across gross instead of funny and the delivery, especially Murphy's, is uninspired. Even his mummy-like coffin looks tacky and garish.

The only spine-chilling part came at the end, when sporadic audience applause at a preview screening proved my innermost fear: the makers of "Vampire in Brooklyn" might actually be rewarded for their efforts. Now that's scary.

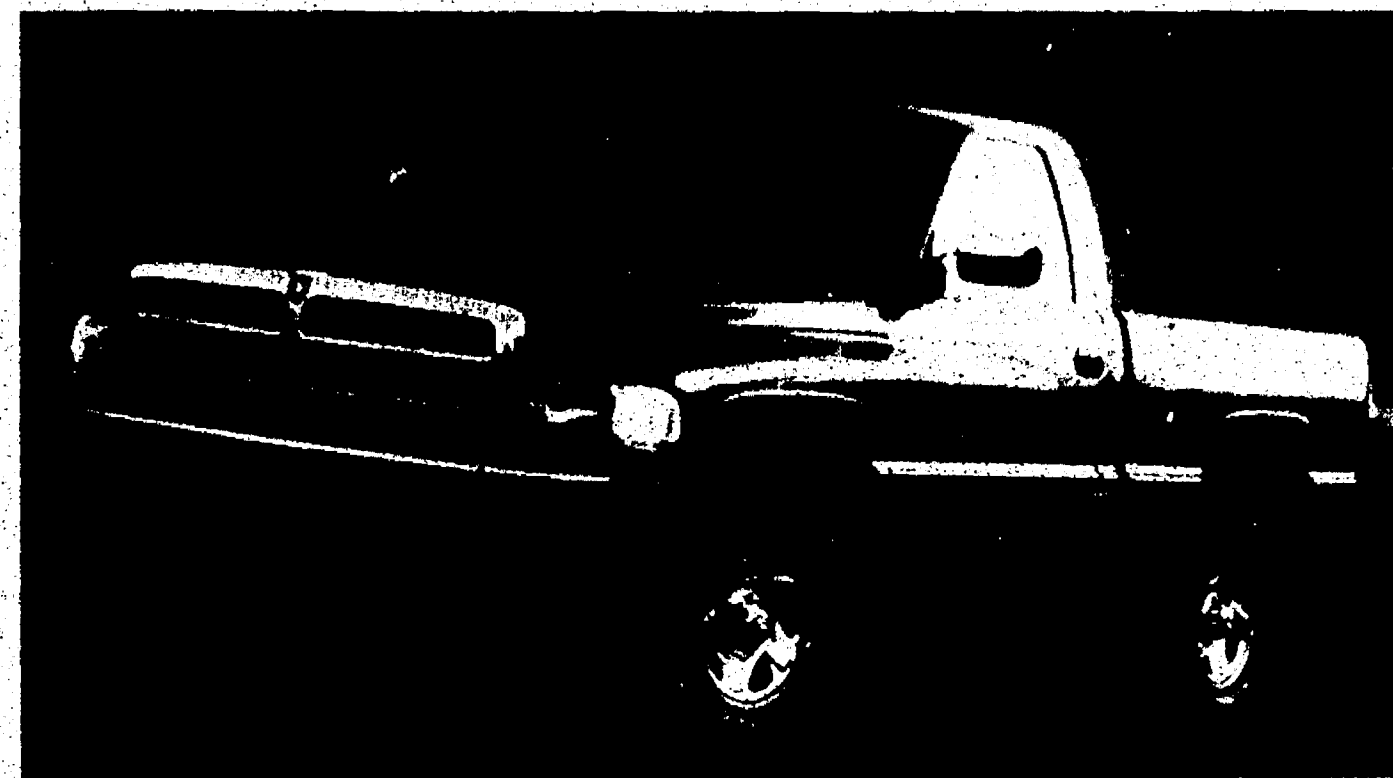
Never has a car company captured the true essence of a full-size truck, making it so in control, so commanding, so... masculine.

The Club Cab has a full bench people-sized back seat. We went up north to Birch Run, about an hour's drive north of Detroit, and came back with a truck-load (no pun) of stuff in the back seat and my 2- and 4-year-old girls never whimpered — that's how

much room there was back there. (If you don't have toddlers, you may forget how large and clunky those toddler car seats are.) Both the Regular Cab and Club Cab have the roomiest interiors of any other full-size pickup on the market, by the way.

The Dodge Ram is offered in Regular Cab, Club Cab and Cab/Chassis models, in 1500, 2500 and 3500 models, in 2- and 4-wheel-drive and in gas and diesel engine versions.

Safety has been well thought out here as well, with a standard driver's side airbag, side impact beams and available 4-wheel anti-lock brakes.

There are three trim levels available, including Work Special, LT, SR and Laramie SLT. There are a variety of engines in most models, like the 3.9-liter V6 (170 horsepower), 5.2-liter V8 (220 horsepower), 5.9-liter V8 (230 horsepower), 8.0-liter V10 (300 horsepower) and the 5.9-liter in-line

6-cylinder Cummins turbo diesel (215 horsepower). You can even choose between a 6.5-foot or 8-foot box, depending on the model you want.

We had the ST trim level, which provided a lot of standard equipment, like tinted glass, a carpeted rear cab, two coat hooks, sun visors that had map storage straps, an AM/FM stereo with cassette and clock, 6-way power driver's seat and two-speed intermittent windshield wipers.

The center console is really neat. It's got plenty of storage and can handle a laptop computer as well. Fold everything down and there's a good-sized work area. Fold it up and away and there's plenty of room for another passenger.

Much has changed on the 1996 models, including new sequential multi-port fuel injection for the 8.0-liter V10 engine, increased engine power and torque on the Cummins diesel, on-board diagnostics for all powertrains, new cast aluminum wheels standard on the 1500 SLT and Sport package, new exterior colors, and later in the model year, there will be the availability of a camper suspension package.

The Dodge Ram is a sweet-heart of a truck.

Now I'm just dying to get my hands on a Ram outfitted with a Cummins.

As Tim Allen would say if he had a Ram: "Hu-hu-hu..."

Our Aging Cars Deserve Attention

(CCC)—The "graying of America" is a phenomenon that applies to our nation's aging cars as well as their owners. Latest industry reports show our car population now is nearly nine years old, the oldest it's been since 1980.

Eighty percent of these vehicles are three years old or older, more than 30% are ten years old or older.

A car is not necessarily a clunker because it's old, emphasizes the Car Care Council, but it is more likely to be a candidate for repairs and it certainly deserves more frequent under-the-hood checks.

Survey results from National Car Care Month vehicle checks indicate a continuing condition of maintenance neglect on vehicles of all ages. This is due in part to the fact that 80% of all gas is pumped at self-service pumps, where people neglect under-hood checks.

But it's also due to tight money" preventive maintenance some times takes a back seat to other household items, with the ultimate result being costly emergency or catastrophic repairs.

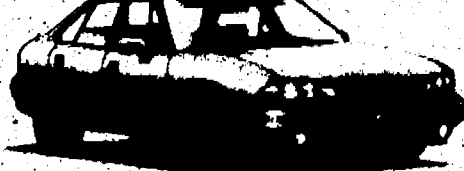

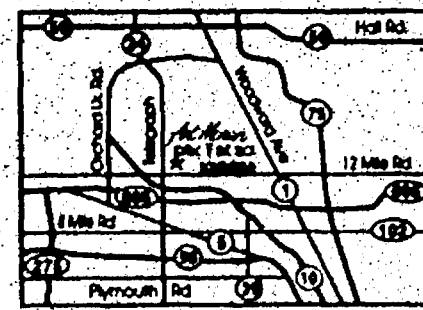

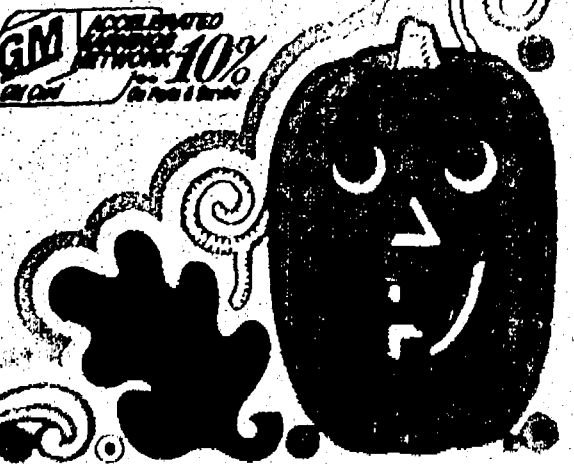
