# Rape victim lauds sentence

A convicted rapist, Anthony Walker, has been given life in prison for raping his next-door neighbor, who said she still is fearful of the dark and has difficulty trusting people.

Being raped by a next-door neighbor who also threatened to hurt her 2-year-old daughter has forever changed a Westland woman's life, even though her attacker has been sentenced to life in prison.

"I have constant fears for my daughter," said the victim, Tracey, who didn't want her last name used.

"I'm afraid of the dark. I don't like being alone. I don't trust anyone."

Her remarks came Wednesday outside of a 16th-floor Wayne County Circuit Court room where rapist Anthony Guy Walker, 38, was sentenced to life in prison for one count of first-degree criminal sexual conduct.

Judge Michael Callahan also sen-

tenced Walker to prison for 15 to 30 years on a second count of first-degree CSC.

Callahan's decision came 16 days after a jury convicted Walker of raping his 26-year-old neighbor at knife-point on Dec. 20, 1994.

Tracey also testified during Walker's trial that he robbed her of \$80, but jurors acquitted him on an armed robbery charge.

Tracey was raped after Walker came to her former Westland Meadows mobile home on the pretext of borrowing medication for a stepson who was supposedly ill.

Walker also is a leading suspect in

the murder of his other next-door neighbor, Jane Fray, who was killed four months before Tracey was raped. Fray was stabbed 22 times and struck on her head.

Tracey and Fray's ex-boyfriend Ricky Amolsch, who spent 10 months in jail after being falsely suspected of murder, voiced hope Wednesday that Walker will be charged with Fray's death.

Regardless, Tracey said she is "very pleased" with the sentence handed down by Callahan in the rape case.

# Special students thrive in world of work

Each week, a group of special education students at the Westland's Northwest Wayne Skill Center heads off to work. Their work clothes are laid out on the shelves and they are ready to go. The students are working at Cintas, a commercial laundry in the old Ford Junior High.

all mastered enough work skills at the center to take on a job in the real world.

"If you want to teach them good work skills, you have to give them work to do," said Holly Dugas, special education teacher who accompanies the students daily and watches over them while they work.

The students, ages 15-20, have

got it our number one priority; the laundry work they do is secondary. They could get a job at a dry cleaners, but they also learn work skills they can use anywhere."

While this group of students heads off for Cintas, other groups at the skill center on Ann Arbor Trail west of Merriman start for jobs throughout the Livonia school district, including Bentley Center,

Wonderland and Digitron Packaging.

At all work locations, the goal is the same: to give the students a chance to develop skills that will lead one day to a decent-paying job.

All have entry-level jobs, but the experience they get in learning how to do a job and get along with

# Trio recognized as top public safety staffers

Jim Ridener, Larry Futrell and Mark Wilhide have been named Westland's top public safety employees because of their efforts to save lives and make the city a safer place.

Chosen as tops in their field by their colleagues and superiors, they received awards during a recent ceremony sponsored by the Veterans of Foreign Wars Harris-Kehrer Post

3323, Westland. Ridener, a city employee for nine years, was honored as Westland Police Officer of the Year for 1995.

Futrell, a Westland Fire Department employee since 1969, was named Westland Fire Officer of the Year.

Wilhide, hired by the city in August 1986, was recognized as Westland Firefighter of the Year.

Ridener, a Westland police officer who works the night shift, saved two

lives last year by pulling someone from a burning car and rescuing a man who had hanged himself from a tree.

"He's just a very dynamic individual," Westland police Lt. Dan Pfannes said. "He needs very little supervision, and he always gives you 110 percent."

Pfannes also described Ridener as "tireless" and "self-initiated" on the job.

Ridener and partner Kitty Miller

last year rescued an unconscious person from a car that had erupted in flames. Ridener also saved the life of a despondent man who had hanged himself with a rope from a backyard tree.

"The guy was hanging several feet off the ground," Pfannes said.

Futrell, a fire department battalion chief, "stands out as a firefighter who continually works to improve the fire service," Assistant Fire

## Student suspended for gun at school

A Westland fifth-grade girl has been suspended indefinitely from Nankin Mills School after she brought an unloaded 9mm semiautomatic handgun to school.

The 10-year-old will have a hearing before the Livonia Board of Education although a date hasn't been set.

A hearing was initially scheduled for tonight (Monday) but was postponed at the request of the girl's parents, said Dr. Kent Gage, Livonia school district elementary education director.

The school board has a range of penalties under state law

dealing with students who bring weapons to school, he said.

The Westland Police Department said the girl brought the gun, which was unloaded, to school as a bet.

Youth Officer Candy Vinnay said the girl snuck the gun in a case out of her parents' locked gun cabinet, put it in a canvas bag and brought it to school Thursday, April 18.

Vinnay said the girl brought the gun to school on a bet with a classmate.

Before school opened that morning, the girl, in the school's

rear playground, showed the gun to the other student involved in the bet, Vinnay said. The other student was suspended for two days, she said.

Another student observed the gun and called a teacher who directed the girl to go to the principal's office.

At the office, a Westland police officer who checks local schools on a daily basis happened to walk into the building when the girl was about to be questioned by principal Linda Gantos.

The girl said she didn't know how to tell if a gun was loaded

or unloaded.

Gage told the Observer Friday afternoon that he wouldn't comment on the case until the school board hearing is held.

He did say that there are rare incidents involving weapons brought to secondary schools and this is the first incident involving an elementary school pupil.

The school is on Hubbard, just north of Ann Arbor Trail.

The girl has been petitioned to juvenile court by Westland police.

## Man sentenced in abuse case

A 20-year-old father has been sentenced to a one-year jail term for abusing his 2-month-old daughter while caring for her in Westland.

Butch Matthews II also was placed on probation for five years when he was sentenced Thursday by Detroit Recorder's Court Judge Robert Evans.

"I'm really happy that he got time," said Marcy Anderson, the little girl's step grandmother. "I felt that he should get some jail time, even if it had been only a month."

The injured child, Felicia, now 9 months old, has been living with her step grandmother and her grandfather, Danny Anderson, in Belleville pending a custody battle.

The grandparents want to keep Felicia, but the girl's parents want custody.

Despite Matthews' conviction for first-degree child abuse, Felicia's mother, Michelle Anderson, has been supportive of him.

Evans convicted Matthews during a March trial in Recorder's Court.

Matthews has admitted kicking the baby's walker while he was caring for her last Sept. 5, though he changed his story on

several occasions, Westland police have said.

Matthews originally contended that Felicia was propped in her walker and that she fell out.

He later said he accidentally bumped the walker and that the child's head "whiplashed back and forth," said Sgt. Terry Donohue during a court hearing last September.

Finally, Matthews told police that he kicked Felicia's walker because he was angry and frustrated with the baby's mother, Donohue has said.

Felicia suffered head injuries during the incident, and she had bleeding around her brain, experts have testified. But Marcy Anderson said doctors won't know for a couple of years whether the baby suffered permanent brain damage.

The girl spent a week at the University of Michigan Medical Center.

Matthews could have received a maximum 15-year prison term for first-degree child abuse.

In serving his one-year term, he will receive credit for 40 days already served.

Marcy Anderson commended police and assistant Wayne County prosecutor Jerry Dorsey IV for their handling of the case.

"They did a really good job for Felicia," she said.

## Entertainment planned for youngsters

It's showtime!

The Stage IV Youth theatre program in the city of Wayne is heating up for the summer as Tracy Spada, arts and entertainment director, expands the theater workshops this season to include youths 5-18 years old from the Wayne-Westland School District. This is Spada's third year directing and producing stage plays, but this will be the first time she will share her theatrical wisdom with children 5 to 8 years old.

"I never directed little kids before," said Spada. "I think it will be a lot of fun to get this fresh group of kids on stage, and I think they will be easier to direct. It's kind of hard to get a 14- or 15-year-old to act like a dog, but little kids know exactly what to do."

There will be three sessions divided by the following ages: June 17-29, 5-to-8-year-olds; July 8-20, 9-to-12-year-olds;

and July 22-Aug. 10, 13-to-18-year-olds. Each class will be limited to 15 students. Participants must pre-register for the theater classes.

The Wayne Memorial High School graduate said she can't wait to work with the area youths.

"I believe it's so important for them to have a creative outlet. Some kids don't fit in with sports, so this theater program offers literally something for everyone from acting to behind-the-scenes production work."

All students will learn the basics of theater, and at the end of the session, they will perform before an audience.

As a result of a state grant received by the Wayne-Westland School District, Spada will also be directing the "Franklin Players," made up of Franklin Middle School students, for two stage productions — A Modern Cinderella and A Ghost for Rosanda.

Both performances will take place 7 p.m. next Thursday and Friday, May 2-3, at Stage IV of the State Wayne Theatre, on westbound Michigan Ave. west of Wayne Road.

The Franklin Players program is sponsored by the Wayne-Westland Community Schools in cooperation with the City of Wayne Department of Parks and Recreation for the Safe and Drug Free Schools Grant.

Other events slated to take place include:

- The Tytodic Band — Area residents Tyrone Hamilton, Jason Lipford and Diane Oliver will take center stage at the Stage IV of the State Wayne Theatre for a benefit performance for the Stage IV Youth Theatre 2 p.m. and 7 p.m. April 28. Cost for tickets is \$5 for adults and \$3.50 for students and seniors.

- Concerts at Goudy Park — A series of talented area musicians

perform 7:30-9 p.m. every Thursday evening including: June 6 — Hot Walker (country) Band; June 13 — Street Corner (1950s and '60s music); June 20 — Emil Moro (Big Band music); July 11 — The AYU Quartet (acappella); July 18 — Tommy Dorsey Orchestra (Big Band music); July 25 — The Little Fiddlers & Tracey Lynne (country); Aug. 1 — The Tytodic Band (top 40); Aug. 8 — The Chisel Brothers (blues); Aug. 15 — The Ellis Brothers (country); and Aug 29 — Trinidad Tripoli (steel drums).

Chief Mark Neal said in Futrell's nomination.

Futrell could've retired already, but he has stayed on "to make a difference," Neal said.

The honoree revamped the fire department's hydrant maintenance system and computerized it "to ensure that our citizens are protected by working fire hydrants," Neal said.

Firefighters now have much more extensive information about the nearly 3,000 fire hydrants throughout the city.

Futrell said he is a low-key person who is "a little uncomfortable" being in the spotlight. He said his colleagues deserve as much credit as he does for improving the fire department.

"We have a lot of very hard-working guys, and I share this with them," Futrell said of his award. "But it is a great honor to receive the award."

Wilhide, a sergeant with the

fire department, followed in the footsteps of his father, retired Romulus Fire Chief John Wilhide.

"He is very proud to carry on the tradition of firefighting within his family," Westland battalion chief William Green said in nominating Wilhide for the award.

Wilhide transformed an old rescue vehicle into a mobile command post that has telephones, fax machines and other communications equipment that comes in handy during emergencies.

For example, firefighters responding to a hazardous spill can have information faxed immediately about the chemicals they find on the scene.

Wilhide also led efforts to upgrade a pickup truck to fight grass fires, and he was directly responsible for landscaping improvements at the main fire station on Ford Road.

"Never complacent, he always looks for a better way to accomplish tasks," Green said, adding later, "If working directly in the fire fight, Mark can be depended on by officers and peers alike."

Wilhide said he is "really proud" to be honored as Westland's top firefighter, and he commended the quality of the department as a whole.

"It's a weight off my shoulders," she said. "It's time to move on, now. I was real happy with the sentence. It's been a long time coming, but now it's over."

Westland police Sgt. Terry Donohue also commended Callahan's sentence.

"I'm very pleased," he said. "The sentence is pretty much what we expected."

Tracey had been confident all along that Walker would be convicted and sent to prison, even though he tried to convince jurors that he and Tracey had consensual sex with third partners including his wife.

"For him to lie like that and to keep claiming his innocence is ridiculous," Tracey said Wednesday.

Only months before Tracey

was raped, Walker had been released from prison after serving 14 years for kidnapping and sexually assaulting a minor.

Tracey has said she still shudders when she recalls the time that she left her young daughter with Walker and his wife. Tracey had considered Walker a friend at one point.

When Tracey was raped, her daughter was in another room of the mobile home. Tracey has testified that Walker warned her against reporting the rape, saying he knew child molesters who would hurt her daughter.

Walker fled Michigan after raping Tracey, and he was captured 20 days later in Colorado. When asked at his trial why he left the state, he replied, "I was scared."

fellow workers is invaluable to their future, when one day they must leave the protected world of the skills center and make it on their own.

"It's one thing to get a job; it's another to keep it over a period of time," Dodge said.

At Cintas, patience among company employees is the norm as the students often make mistakes as they learn.

"It's wonderful to have a company that is so accommodating," Dodge said. "The students do make mistakes; that's how they learn. But at Cintas, they get a second, third, fourth chance."

The Cintas job dovetails with a laundry/clothing class students take at the skills center, operated by the Livonia school district, which serves the northern section of Westland.

Other students take classes in metals/workshop, greenhouse, custodial and food service which also dovetail with the community jobs in which they work.

Special education students at the skills center come from 12 area districts.

At Cintas, the students get paid a piece rate for the level of job on which they work. Students stay in the class and work at their community job for as long as it takes them to learn appropriate job and behavioral skills, Dodge said.

"What they learn is to have a good attitude, to take the initiative, to be motivated, to get along, follow directions and have a positive attitude," Dodge said. "In the process they learn transferable skills."

All the practice the center's handicapped students get in the

classroom pales beside the excitement they feel when they go out in the real world and do a task that is both meaningful and financially rewarding.

"They have tremendous optimism when they get the chance to be in a real work environment," Dodge said. "Things hit home a lot faster. It's not just talk about being punctual; it's actually doing it and being on time."

As they work, Dodge stands beside them, pointing out the good things — and not-so-good things — that they do.

The combination of a helping hand and personal effort "jump starts" each student to ever higher motivational levels, Dodge said.

As the work day ends, the students feel good about themselves for a job well done — and the chance to do it.

"Our students definitely are capable of showing responsibility for themselves and for others," Dodge said. "They're not complete shining stars, but they try hard and the result is very reasonable."

# YMCA honors top volunteers

It was the "Jack and Mack" show Thursday night as two community activists were honored at the Wayne-Westland Family YMCA's 20th annual recognition dinner and program.

Highlighting the evening were presentations of numerous awards and swapping of anecdotes about Mack Mayfield, former city of Westland public services superintendent, and Jack Demmer, owner of a Ford dealership.

Also cited during the program were four Wayne-Westland school district teachers for their excellence and enthusiasm in their classrooms.

Mayfield, a long-time Westland resident, was honored for his varied activities, such as being the top Westland Goodfellow's paper salesman for more than five consecutive years, being property manager for his church and serving as president of his homeowners' association, an Inkster board of education trustee and booster of golf bene-

fits for several organizations.

In making the presentation to Mayfield, former mayor Thomas Taylor praised the recipient for being quiet about his activities as well as his golfing talents.

Mayfield started working for the city's water and sewer department 30 years ago and was later promoted to superintendent, the first African-American supervisor in the municipal government's history.

At Thursday's program, he was also given a certificate designating him as an honorary Westland firefighter by Fire Chief Michael Reddy.

Demmer was praised for his numerous community service activities, including the 100 Club which provides quick help to persons in need and the Wayne Chamber of Commerce.

His son, Jim, told of his father selling cars at 16 and later owning his own dealership, including a successful Nankin Township Edgel dealership in 1957.

The elder Demmer commented that he became active with the Y organization as early as 12 when

he joined an Indian Guide program.

Both men were also presented certificates for their long-time volunteerism by state, county and city officials.

The four teachers honored were Karen Paling of Wayne Memorial High School, Sharon Mayernik of Wildwood Elementary, Joanne Saam of Vanderberg Elementary and Carolyn Becher of Adams Middle School.

They received plaques from Zech and Duane Moore, Wayne-Westland school superintendent.

The Y program concluded the annual Invest in Youth campaign which met its goals of \$22,000 to help low-income families take part in Y programs and services, such as day care, fitness, latchkey, Indian Guides and swimming.

Perlowski said that the night's program "is a celebration of community" and that it takes many public and private organizations to help raise children.

**Clerk injured in cigarette scuffle**

A Westland woman who apparently had a strong nicotine craving has been charged in a knife-point robbery that netted a pack of cigarettes from a local convenience store.

Police just didn't consider her actions "kool."

The 37-year-old woman had no money with her April 15 when she asked for cigarettes on credit at the S&M market on Palmer Road east of Wildwood, Westland police Sgt. Scott Fetner said.

The woman became upset when the store attendant refused her smoke-now-and-pay-later request, and she pulled a knife and swung it at him.

The man, who suffered a cut on his left wrist, phoned police after the woman grabbed the cigarettes from the counter and fled the store, Fetner said.

Westland police spotted the suspect a few blocks away, and an investigation led them to recover the cigarettes and the knife, Fetner said.

The suspect has been arraigned in Westland 18th District Court on charges of armed robbery and felonious assault for the S&M incident.

She is jailed in lieu of a \$10,000 cash bond.

A preliminary hearing that had been scheduled for Thursday was postponed after a defense attorney asked Judge Gail McKnight to adjourn it.

The attorney asked that the suspect be evaluated to determine whether she is competent for the court proceedings. Another hearing has been scheduled for June 20, Fetner said.

After her initial arrest, the woman had been released on a personal bond because she was supposedly aiding police in a separate investigation involving a fire on Dryden Court.

But police discovered that the woman was providing inaccurate information.

The woman could face a maximum sentence of life in prison if convicted of armed robbery. Felonious assault is punishable by up to four years in prison.

Four Westland robberies occurred in less than five hours early Tuesday, but police have nabbed two suspects.

Two suspects were arraigned Thursday in Westland 18th District Court, although they have only been charged in the Palmer-Merriman 7-Eleven robbery at this point, Fetner said.

Arraigned on armed robbery charges were Dwayne Haag, 25, of Westland and Dennis Miller, 40, of Inkster.

A not-guilty plea was placed on record for the men, who remain jailed in lieu of \$100,000 cash bonds.

Haag and Miller have been scheduled for a May 2 preliminary hearing that will determine whether they should stand trial on the charges.

# S'craft studies tuition hike

Schoolcraft College trustees are reviewing a proposed \$2 per credit hour tuition increase for in-state students in the 1996-1997 fiscal year.

For in-district students the tuition would increase from \$48 to \$50 per credit hour. For out-district students the tuition would increase from \$71 to \$73 per credit hour. Out-of-state tuition would increase from \$105 to \$109 per credit hour.

Trustees discussed the proposed tuition increase at a board meeting Wednesday. It is part of the proposed \$36.8 million budget for the 1996-97 school year. Trustees are expected to vote on the budget at the regular meeting May 22.

The proposal is a 3.61 percent increase over the 1995-96 budget.

Schoolcraft College students have faced several tuition increases in recent years. Tuition increased \$2 to \$47 per credit hour in May 1995 and increased to \$48 per credit hour in the winter 1996 term for resident students.

Tuition increased to \$70 per credit hour in May 1995 and to \$71 per credit hour in the winter 1996 term for non-resident students.

Trustee Steve Ragan said the proposed tuition increase concerns him. A tuition increase can mean students having to spread course work over a longer period of time and can also mean students getting frustrated and quitting, he said.

"I don't think there's any way we can not approve a tuition increase, but we need to look at what's driving this," Ragan said.

"The college is moving in a lot of directions that I think are necessary to stay competitive," Schoolcraft College President Richard McDowell said.

A "fairly rich" contract for faculty members and the increasing cost of updating technology are among the budget pressures, according to Adélaré H. Raby III, vice president for business services.

Raby presented a tuition comparison with other local community colleges: Oakland Community College, which recently won a millage increase, is at \$46 a credit hour; Wayne County Community College is proposing \$54; Washtenaw Community College is proposing \$52; Henry Ford Community College is proposing \$49; and Macomb is at \$51. That cost is still lower than at an area four-year university. Eastern Michigan University charges \$91 a credit hour for 100 and 200 level courses for Michigan residents and \$98.50 a credit hour for 300 level. Non-residents pay \$237 a credit hour for 100 and 200 level and \$253 a credit hour for 300 level and higher.

Tuition and fees play a larger part in the college's budget than they did 15 years ago, Raby said. He showed the board a chart of tuition and fees as part of the budget compared to state appropriations as part of the budget. In 1980-81, state appropriations were \$4.8 million or 35.92 percent of the

budget and in the 1996-97 budget they are projected to be \$9.9 million or 26.89 percent of the budget. Tuition and fees, meanwhile, have gone from \$3.48 million or 26.06 percent of the budget in 1980-81 to \$11.9 million or 32.42 percent of the budget in 1996-97, Raby said.

Although enrollment increased 1.7 during the current school year, Raby said he expects enrollment to increase only 0.5 percent during the coming school year.

Property taxes made up 35.41 percent of the budget at \$4.7 million in 1980-81 and are expected to make up 39.32 percent of the budget at \$14.48 million in 1996-97. Raby said he expects the millage rate to stay at 1.8521, with 4179 of Schoolcraft's 2.27 millage not being levied because of the Headlee tax limit and Proposition A.

Several trustees wanted to see figures comparing how Schoolcraft is spending its money compared to other area community colleges.

But McDowell pointed out the college has invested in technology and other areas, when other colleges may not have. "People come here and drool at our equipment and our labs," he said. Visits to other local colleges may show that the buildings aren't in as good of repair as at Schoolcraft, he said.

#### WHERE THERE'S SMOKELESS

If young people think that they can avoid the carcinogenic effect of cigarettes by switching to smokeless tobacco products, they are mistaken. While the habit of smoking cigarettes has declined in recent years, the use of "dip" (tobacco products that are inserted between the cheek and gum) has climbed 40 percent since 1980, mostly among men and boys. 

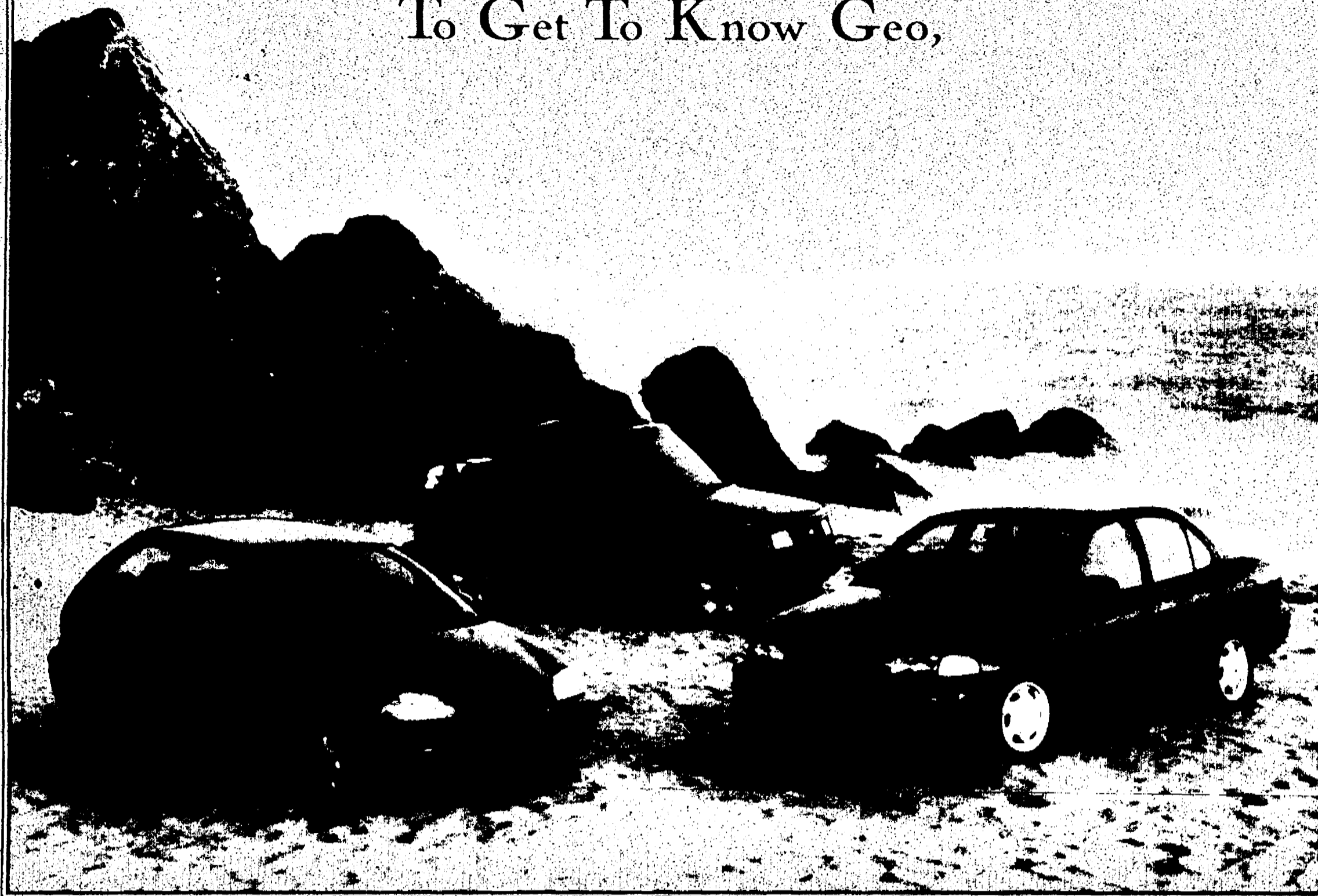

# Judge: Go regional on Rouge

A federal judge wants Wayne, Oakland and Washtenaw counties to consider a regional approach to stopping non-point pollution of the Rouge River.

Judge John Feikens says they should look at Chapter 21 of the state Drain Code in setting up a watershed authority.

The approval of federal funds "favors the development of a regional approach to the remedial efforts in southeastern Michigan," Feikens said in a letter to area officials and lawyers.

So far Feikens has met once with top officials in his Detroit courtroom and has another hearing set for May 7.

"A lot of people feared a Chapter 21 (consortium) would be imposed, but the court can't impose it," James Murray, Wayne County public works director, told the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments April 26.

(County Executive Ed) McNamara and

(Detroit Mayor Dennis) Archer say the communities must support it," Murray said. He added that communities favor the watershed approach only for planning and monitoring water management. Communities would have to petition for a Chapter 21 consortium, he added.

Murray said the consensus is that management practices — "how you keep pollutants out of the system" — is a better approach than trying to clean up pollutants. Guilty forces are such non-point runoff as herbicides and pesticides.

Feikens advocates a regional approach because: "The Rouge River Basin alone consists of 427 miles of watershed and 125 miles of river channel. It is the home of more than 1.5 million people located in 47 different municipal corporations.

"The price tag for CSO (combined sewer overflow) and storm water control in the Rouge Basin alone is estimated at up to \$2.5 billion," he wrote.

Feikens also quoted federal law to show the U.S. Congress favors a regional

approach to correcting CSO problems. Combined sewers mix sanitary sewage with storm water. In heavy rains, they become flooded and discharge their overflows into the Rouge.

To study the Chapter 21 watershed idea, Feikens has called in McNamara, Murray and counsel Thomas Neenan from Wayne County; Oakland Executive L. Brooks Patterson and Drain Commissioner George Kuhn; Washtenaw Drain Commissioner Janis Bobrin; Dr. Jonathan Bulkley, the court-appointed master in the Detroit sewage treatment plant case; and representatives of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and Michigan Department of Environmental Quality.

The Rouge case has been tacked onto an old case — the EPA's 1977 suit against Detroit's sewerage department. Feikens appointed then-Mayor Coleman Young as a virtual czar over the system. Result was billions of federal aid to improve the Detroit treatment plant, which serves more than 100 suburban communities.

# Driver ed bill changed

Michigan's effort to toughen teen driver training courses hit an ideological snag when Senate Republicans tacked a private school voucher system on.

"It provides further erosion of public school education in Michigan," said Democrat Henry Stallings of Detroit.

The Senate passed its version 19-17.

Voting yes were all area Republicans, including Loren Bennett of Canton and Robert Geake of Northville.

Voting no were 15 Democrats, including George Z. Hart of Dearborn and Alma Smith of Salem.

The bill goes back to the House, where sponsor Dan Gustafson, R-Williamston, hasn't decided whether he will agree to the Senate amendments.

The Senate 1) removed driver training as a public school man-

date and 2) set up a \$100 voucher system that students could use to attend a private driving school under certain conditions. One condition is that their public school failed to provide driver training; the other, that scheduling conflicts prevented their taking public school driver courses.

Sen. Loren Bennett, R-Canton, praised the voucher option. "I believe this is another issue whereby school districts deserve more local control. The residents of each school district may appeal to their local school boards for how they wish the matter to be handled," Bennett said.

"This recognizes the fact that nearly 30 percent of students today get their driver training outside of their public school," said Senate majority leader Dick Poshumus, R-Alto.

"I think we took a U-turn for families," said Sen. Art Miller, D-Warren.

"Saturday in the Park" begins Saturday in Hines Park.

Starting Saturday, May 4, and continuing every Saturday to Sept. 28, six miles of Hines Drive will be closed to vehicular traffic so that the public can run, walk, cycle or skate safely.

"This is a great opportunity to bring the family out to enjoy the park," County Executive Edward H. McNamara said.

Hines Drive will be closed from Ann Arbor Trail to Outer Drive for the program.

Parking is available at Warendale (Warren Avenue east of Telegraph); Merriman Hollow (Merriman Road and Hines) and Nankin Mills picnic areas (Hines Drive and Ann Arbor Trail).

"It's great to see people coming out to enjoy the park," said Hurley Coleman, director of Wayne County Parks.

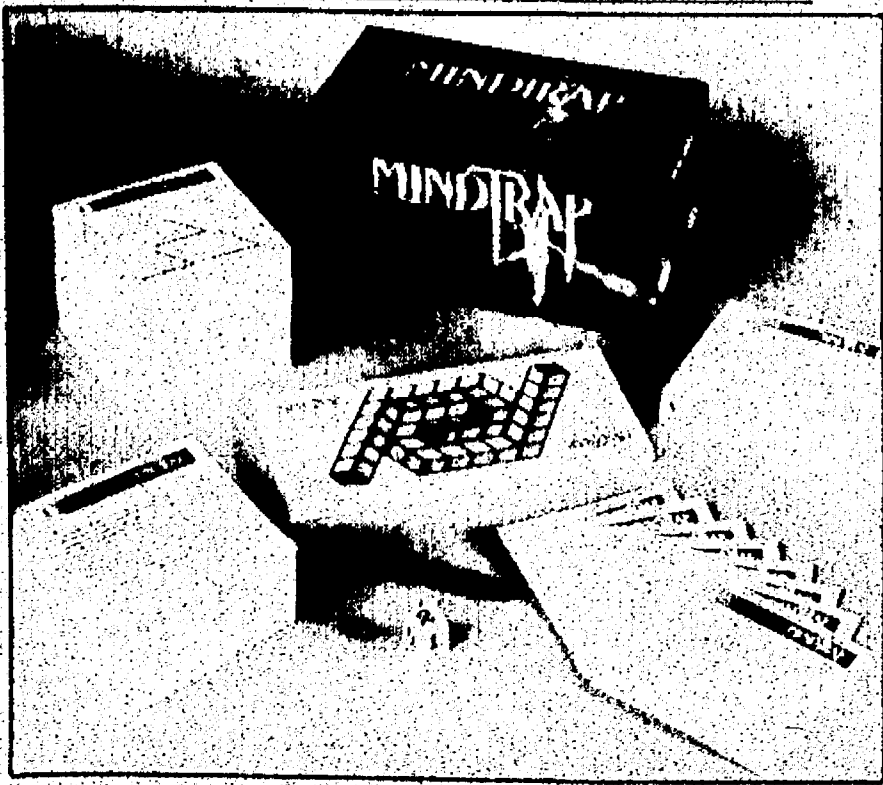

time jobs to pay for his custom-made clothes, Flusser decided to enter the clothing business.

His first job was designing boys' shirts for Van Heusen. The next designing sportswear for Pierre Cardin in the 1970s.

In 1979, Flusser penned his first book at the urging of his younger brother, a writer. "Clothes and The Man" was all about where to shop for the best menswear in cities around the world," he said.

"However, I found on the book tour that people were more interested in how to select a tie, when to wear the different shirt collars and how to put looks together. In 1985, I wrote "Making The Man" a guide to menswear. I hoped to de-mystify the industry with this book. It immediately sold 90,000 copies. It was sold through GQ magazine which oversold 1,500 copies."

The books made Flusser an author and historian, a much-quoted spokesman in the menswear field. He was awarded fashion's COTY AWARD as the top menswear designer in America, and presented with Cutty Sark awards for his contributions to menswear literature.

**Hollywood Calls**

"In 1985, I opened a custom men's shop in New York City," Flusser said. "We outfitted Wall Street — the guys from Solomon

Brothers and Goldman Sachs. I guess that's how Hollywood came to find me for the film Wall Street with Michael Douglas."

Flusser gained enduring notoriety for the "ensembles" he designed for Douglas' character Gordon Gekko, in the film.

"They spent \$40,000 on that wardrobe," Flusser recalled. "They wanted a power wardrobe that went beyond Wall Street. The costume director eventually stepped aside and I went to work. I tried to capture the 1980's in a quintessential image of what that decade has come to mean."

In the summer of 1992, (and again this summer) Flusser's designs will be worn by sports announcer Bob Costas during his on-camera work for the Olympics. In September, Flusser will publish his third book, "Style and The Man: How and Where to Buy Quality Menswear."

Flusser explained that the menswear revolution began in the 1960s. In the 1970s, Armani changed the "sensitivity of menswear forever" by bringing a casual air to suits best exemplified in the Armani wardrobe worn by Richard Gere in the movie "American Gigolo."

Flusser, is married and the father of two daughters. He occasionally creates women's clothing, but it's very tailored, "in the tradition of what Katherine Hepburn used to wear," he said.

## No beans about it, legumes are nutritious

**P**ick up any health-oriented magazine these days, and between stories about getting legendary "abs," and the importance of exercise, you'll probably read something about the benefits of beans.

European countries have long relied on the fabled legume. In the Middle East, people eat more beans than meat, fish and poultry combined. Even our government is implying the health benefits of more legumes via their updated food pyramid.

But for most of us, cooking beans at home probably evolves around opening a can of kidney beans and stirring them into a beef-laden chili. Let's face it, if we need to increase the amount of beans in our diet repertoire, we should know the basics.

### Selecting beans

Let's begin at the market. In order to select good beans, you need to know they come in two versions: dried and canned. There are some types of frozen beans, but for the most part, they are inferior for use after defrosting.

When purchasing dried beans, inspect the package and look for firm, clean, whole beans of uniform size and color. My only criteria for purchasing dried beans is to know the store I'm buying from and expect a fairly good turnover. Canned beans are always acceptable, and their best attribute is their time-saving characteristics.

Some of the better tasting beans (like black beans) are a little more elusive and you'll only find them at upscale grocers. If you have a problem finding your favorite bean in dry or canned form, it might be because of the lack of demand for it in that store. Check out the bean selection at Papa Joe's, Vic's, Westborn and Strawberry Hills. Bulk purchases can be made in sizes ranging from a few ounces to a few pounds.

As a general rule of thumb, especially when some recipes call for dry, some cooked, some canned and some soaked, you can roughly bet that a one-pound package of dried beans equals about 2 cups dry and 5 cups soaked. Dry beans expand to about 2 1/2 times their original size when soaked. One 16-ounce can (drained) will equal about 1 2/3 cups cooked beans.

Dried beans can be stored for fairly long periods of time, especially when kept dry in a sealed container or canister. You can immediately tell if dried beans are old when you go to clean and soak them. Any beans that "float" after washing are probably old. Although beans go through a series of threshing, sifting and cleaning processes prior to packaging, none of these ordinarily include washing because the moisture could cause the beans to start sprouting. Hence, the need to wash prior to soaking and cooking.

### Soaking

Perhaps no other factor in bean cookery is more controversial than whether beans should be soaked, and if so, for how long. Before beans can really cook and tenderize, they need to rehydrate. Dried beans contain only about 15 percent moisture in the dry form and rehydrate to 60 percent moisture when fully cooked. Another important factor about the soaking of dried beans suggests that by changing the soaking water before cooking, many of the indigestible soluble sugars in beans dissolve in the soak water and go down the drain. If you have a problem with gas, discarding the soaking water should alleviate it. If you are afraid of throwing away some valuable nutrients, don't be because scientists tell me that no significant amount of essential nutrients are lost.

The basic rule of thumb for soaking is 1 pound of dried beans to 10 cups of water. Hot water will do a "quick soak" that can be accomplished in 4 hours. Bringing the water to a boil, boiling water and beans for 3 minutes, then removing from heat can be done in one hour. Yours truly usually places the beans in a big pot with cold water and allows them to soak overnight for optimum results. Just a word of caution: use a big enough pot.

For plain boiled beans to serve as a hot vegetable or for use in a casserole, you can cover one pound of soaked beans with 6 cups of water and boil gently for 1 hour and 15 minutes. Of course, canned beans are always acceptable, but pound for pound and dollar for dollar, expect to pay about double for the convenience of using canned bean products compared to dry.

There's only one real trick that I learned about cooking beans... you should never add salt to the cooking beans until just before they are cooked. Salt added to the water during soaking and early cooking will toughen beans. See recipes inside.

This year's Le Gala de Cuisine is also marking the 100th year of the automobile. ## Easy entrees add fiesta flavor to Cinco de Mayo celebrations

Cinco de Mayo, the fifth of May, is a great time to gather friends for a fiesta. One of Mexico's most enthusiastically celebrated holidays, it commemorates a day-long battle in 1862 in which a poorly equipped Mexican army, outnumbered three to one, triumphed over Napoleon's toughest troops as they tried to take over the country. The day is celebrated much like our Fourth of July, with parades and parties, fun and feasting.

Cinco de Mayo falls on Sunday this year. Why not join in the spirit of the holiday with a weekend fiesta? These two recipes from San Antonio's pace Picante Sauce Test Kitchens will make party preparations fuss-free. Each recipe can be prepared pronto, without exotic ingredients or hard-to-handle chiles.

**Camarones al Mojo de Ajo** (Spicy Shrimp in Garlic Sauce) is a boldly seasoned mix of shrimp and tomatoes with garlic and a splash of lime juice. Serve it over rice.

In a single-skillet **Arroz con Pollo Pronto** (Quick Chicken and Rice), golden brown, boneless chicken breasts heat atop a savory mix of rice, black beans and corn seasoned with picante sauce and ground cumin, one of Mexico's favorite seasonings. A sprinkling of Cheddar cheese completes the dish.

Trim either entree with a salad of tossed greens, avocados, ripe olives and red onions, add a favorite dessert and your dinner is ready in no time.

### CAMARONES AL MOJO DE AJO (SPICY SHRIMP IN GARLIC SAUCE)

- 1 pound medium shrimp, peeled and deveined
  - 2 tablespoons lime juice
  - 1 tablespoon vegetable oil
  - 5 cloves garlic, minced
  - 1 can (14 1/2 ounces) whole peeled tomatoes, cut up
  - 1/2 cup picante sauce
  - 2 teaspoons chili powder
  - 4 cups hot cooked rice
- Place shrimp in shallow nonmetallic dish. Pour lime juice over shrimp. Toss to coat. Set aside.
- In medium skillet over medium heat, heat oil. Add garlic and cook until tender. Add tomatoes, picante sauce and chili powder. Heat to a boil. Reduce heat to low. Cover and cook 10 minutes.
- Add shrimp mixture. Cook 5 minutes or until shrimp turn pink. Serve over rice. Serves 4.

# Delicious soup, salad, and dip full of beans

Soup and beans are made for each other, and many times, leftover beans can be just the ticket for adding protein to a soup stock or extending the meat called for in some recipes.

This soup recipe is a Janes Gang family favorite — you won't believe how easy it is to make — and it tastes better after a day or two in the refrigerator!

## SIX BEAN SOUP

1 1/4 cup each of baby limas,

whites, blackeyes, garbanzos, pinks and kidney beans

1 teaspoon salt  
1 cup chopped onion  
1 cup chopped celery  
1 cup chopped carrot  
1/2 cup chopped green pepper  
1/2 cup minced parsley  
1 clove garlic, minced  
2 tablespoons butter or margarine  
2 envelopes (2 ounces each) chicken noodle soup mix  
1 bay leaf  
1 cup fresh or canned tomatoes, chopped  
Grated Parmesan cheese for topping.

Soak beans by preferred method.

(To maintain color of beans, soak beans separately) Drain. Cook onion, celery, carrot, pepper, parsley and garlic in butter or margarine until tender, about 5-7 minutes.

Combine cooked vegetables with soup mix, 2 quarts water, bay leaf and soaked beans. Simmer, barely covered, about 1 1/2 hours. Stir in diced tomato. Serve generously sprinkled with Parmesan cheese. Makes about 1 gallon, about 16-18 cup servings.

*Chef's secret:* You make this soup vegetarian by using a dry vegetable broth mix in place of the chicken soup.

## CURRIED BEAN AND RICE SALAD

1 teaspoon curry powder  
1 tablespoon margarine  
3/4 cup chicken broth or bouillon  
1/3 cup uncooked brown rice  
1/4 cup celery, chopped  
1 bunch green onions, chopped  
1/2 green pepper, seeded and chopped  
1 tablespoon lime juice  
1 1/2 cups drained canned beans (one 16 ounce can)  
1/4 cup plain yogurt  
2 tablespoons toasted sliced almonds (optional)

Salt and fresh ground pepper to taste

1 tomato, cut into wedges  
1 hard cooked egg, pressed through a sieve  
Saute curry powder in margarine for several seconds to heighten its flavor. Stir in chicken broth; bring to a boil. Add rice; cover and simmer 20-30 minutes or until all liquid is absorbed.

Stir in celery, green onion, green pepper and lime juice. Toss to mix well and chill thoroughly. Stir in beans, yogurt, almonds and seasonings into rice mixture. Garnish with tomato and sieved hard-cooked eggs. Serves 4.

*Chef's secret:* This is delicious served with roast pork or chicken!

## HUMMUS ( GARBANZO BEAN DIP )

1/3 cup tahini (sesame seed paste)  
1 - 16 ounce can garbanzo beans, drained  
1/4 cup fresh squeezed lemon or lime juice  
1 clove garlic, finely chopped  
Pinch salt and a crackling of fresh ground pepper  
2-3 tablespoons olive oil  
In a blender or food processor, process tahini with beans until pureed. Add remaining ingredients and process until smooth. Serve with vegetable sticks or pita bread. Makes 1 1/2 cups.

## GRILLED SHRIMP

24-26 shrimp, peeled and deveined  
6-8 wooden skewers, 4-inch  
Marinade:  
1 teaspoon ginger, freshly grated  
1 tablespoon garlic  
3 green onions, thinly sliced  
1 jalapeno pepper, seeded and minced  
1 cup vegetable oil  
1 cup tomato juice  
1 tablespoon cumin  
Prairie Salsa:  
1 cup black beans, dried  
1 tablespoon olive oil  
1 teaspoon garlic, minced  
1 small onion, diced  
1 celery stalk, diced (includ-

ing leaves)  
1 Serrano chili, seeded and minced  
3 cups chicken broth  
1 medium tomato, peeled, seeded and diced  
1/2 teaspoon cumin powder  
1 cup corn, fresh and cut off of the cob  
1 teaspoon basil, fresh  
2 teaspoons cilantro, chopped  
1/2 red pepper, sweet, diced  
1 teaspoon salt  
1 teaspoon lime juice

Put shrimp on wooden skewers. Mix all ingredients for marinade. Cover shrimp with marinade for 2 hours. Grill on medium heat until done.

Rinse and pick stones and dirt from black beans. Cover with cold

water. Bring to a boil. Cover pot and steep for 10 minutes. Bring back to a simmer, cook gently until tender (about 1 hour).

Cook onions, celery and chilies in olive oil on medium heat in a large skillet until clear. Add corn and garlic, cook for 5 minutes. Add broth. Reduce by half.

Add cooked black beans to the corn mixture. Add basil, cumin, and cilantro. Season with salt.

Puree 1/2 of the mixture in food processor. Return to the pan. Add red peppers, lime juice and tomatoes. Keep warm; serve under grilled shrimp. Serves 6-8.

## ORZO PASTA WITH WILD MUSHROOMS, ROASTED SWEET ONIONS AND FRESH HERBS

2 cups orzo pasta, cooked and drained  
4 tablespoons olive oil  
2 cups wild mushrooms, coarsely chopped  
4 garlic cloves, minced  
1 sweet onion, sliced  
2 teaspoons olive oil  
2 tablespoons Balsamic vinegar

1 cup parsley, coarsely chopped  
1 tablespoon fresh thyme, chopped  
4 tablespoons Parmesan cheese, grated  
Salt and pepper to taste

Place 4 tablespoons oil in a large skillet. Sauté mushrooms on high heat until softened. Add garlic and cook until juices dry up and mushrooms begin to brown.

1 cup picante sauce

# Keep bugs out of pantry

Have you ever found tiny bugs in your pancake mix or little black spots in the rice?  
"If you are, you aren't alone," said Sylvia Treitman, home economist for the Michigan State University Extension, Oakland County Food and Nutrition Hotline.  
"We received numerous calls from concerned people each month on various kitchen pests."  
"It is generally not poor house-keeping that causes the problem, so don't feel guilty," said Treitman. "Some insects may even come packaged inside the food, so you can't assume an unopened package is pest free."  
If you find pests in your pantry, here's what to do:

- Clear off all shelves, drawers and food storage areas.
- Look the food items over carefully and throw away all infested food.
- If you are in doubt about a food, you may freeze it to kill any larvae.
- Clean empty cupboards with a household detergent. Pay careful attention to crevices, scrape out corners and edges carefully.
- Insecticides need careful handling around food - use caution and follow manufacturers' directions. Keep food out of cupboards several days or longer after spraying, if recommended.
- Prevent pantry pests by:
  - Buying quantities of food that can be eaten in a relatively short time
  - Storing foods, especially grains, in glass jars or containers with tight fitting lids.

# Heavenly cakes worth the extra effort

Angel food, angel cake, yellow angel, sunshine, sponge or chiffon, whatever you call these heavenly cakes, they are all worth the effort.

C. They all loved for their sponge-like, delicate texture and versatility. Simple garnishes for these cakes are the best by using frozen or fresh fruit or better yet just a light dusting of powdered sugar will make a perfect ending to a meal.

Angel food, sunshine, yellow angel are sponge-like cakes that are leavened chiefly by the expansion of air incorporated in an egg foam. A large proportion of egg white with a corresponding quantity of cream tartar contribute to optimum volume, texture, tenderness and color in angel cake. Cream of tartar stabilizes the egg foam, tenderizes

the structure and whitens flour pigments.

### Tips for success

Success making an angel cake depends on the degree to which the egg whites are beaten, the leavening with which the sugar and flour mixture are incorporated, and the temperature the cake is baked. It's easier to separate whites from yolks if eggs are cold, but egg whites will yield a large volume if allowed to stand at room temperature before separating and beating. Use eggs that are at least three days old for best results. Since eggs vary in size, some recipes state cup measurements, for instance, angel food cake calls for cups of egg whites. Cake flour will make a high rising angel flour cake, while unbleached all purpose flour makes a cake with more body, but it doesn't rise as high, so the choice is yours.

Reasons for angel and sponge cake coarse texture are under

beaten egg whites, insufficient blending of ingredients or too slow of an oven. A tough cake is a result of too hot of an oven, not enough sugar or over mixing. Cracks in the crust come from over beaten egg white, too much sugar or too hot an oven. An undersized cake can be from under beaten or over beaten egg whites, over mixing, too large a pan or removal from the pan too quickly.

Use fine granulated sugar which dissolves more readily and makes a cake with a finer texture. One of the most important steps in making a sponge cake is to beat egg yolks until they're as thick as whipped cream and lemon colored. Always cool angel and sponge cakes in an inverted pan. If the cake falls from the inverted pan, it is probably because the pan had been greased at one time. Be very careful not to grease this pan, as the batter clings to the side and

the tube as it rises so the cake stays high and light.

Careful measurement and careful grease-free preparation are essential to good results. To make an angel food cake in a jelly roll pan, use half a recipe. The only time it's recommended is to grease a pan for sponge-type cake is when using a jelly roll pan or making angel food or sponge cupcakes. There is no fat in the angel food cake, but there are calories, so you'll have to watch how much you eat.

Work quickly so that the air that has been incorporated will not be lost. Sponge cake depends on egg yolks and egg white for leavening, each beaten separately and added at different times during the mixing. Sponge cakes can be made with or without baking powder. The added baking powder does add volume.

### Chiffon cake

Chiffon cake is a cross between a foam cake and a shortened

cake. It uses oil instead of butter so it's moist and stores well. Fresh orange juice or lemon juice adds to its delicious light texture. Do not use olive oil in a chiffon cake, the flavor is too strong. There is a difference in mixing procedure so do not substitute oil for solid fat. Find a recipe that is proportioned correctly for oil. The egg whites in a chiffon cake must be beaten so stiff that they begin to lose their gloss.

Always use a serrated or bread knife or an electric knife to slice these cakes. Cut with a sawing motion and don't press down or you'll compress the cake. The only other bit of advice is as my grandmother always said, make these types of cakes on a sunny day with low humidity, the cake will be lighter and fluffier.

These cakes are difficult to make and certainly are a wonderful ending to a meal.

# Poach fruits in a simmering bath of flavor

If you thought poaching was just for eggs, you're in for a real treat. This simple, low-fat cooking method brings out the natural, rich flavor and sweetness of fruit to make delicious desserts.

Poaching basically involves placing the fruit in a pan of simmering liquid and covering it with a tight-fitting lid. The steam that accumulates bastes the food, lending it the delicate flavor of the poaching liquid. Fruits are poached in sweetened water or fruit juices or in sweet white wine.

Use a two-to-one sugar to liquid ratio for poaching. The high sugar concentration causes the fruit to retain its shape while softening.

Additional flavorings can be added to the poaching liquid, including vanilla extract, grenadine syrup, cloves, ginger, anise seed or cinnamon.

Firm fruits, such as apples, pears, plums, peaches and nectarines, are best for poaching and it's important that the fruit be ripe but not overripe. Unripe fruit lacks flavor and overripe fruit won't keep its shape and texture.

While cooking times vary depending on the size of the fruit, the following list will give some guidance. Do not overcook — fruit is done when easily pierced with a fork.

- Apples (4), peeled and cored — 10 to 12 minutes
- Peaches (4), peeled, halved and pitted — 5 to 7 minutes
- Nectarines (4) peeled, halved and pitted — 5 to 7 minutes

- Pears (4 large), peeled, halved and cored — 10 to 12 minutes
- Plums (8 to 10), whole fruit, prick each with a fork — 7 to 10 minutes

Brush all fruits, except plums, with lemon juice to prevent browning.

Fruit can also be poached in a microwave oven. Use fruit or fruit pieces of approximately equal size and the same degree of ripeness. Poach fruit in a round dish, arranging it with the broadest ends toward the outside of the dish, and cover with a lid or vented plastic wrap. Cooking time will be slightly shorter than on the stovetop (be sure to test for doneness). The dish should be rotated and the fruit basted with liquid and turned over every few minutes. If you allow the fruit to stand after cooking, more of the flavorful liquid will be absorbed.

Sprinkle poached fruit with a little ground cinnamon, garnish with other fresh fruit such as raspberries or strawberries, or top with chocolate sauce.

**Poached Pears with Chocolate Sauce**

- 2 1/2 cups water
  - 7 tablespoons granulated sugar
  - Grated rind and juice of 1 lemon
  - 1 cinnamon stick
  - 4 pears
  - 4 tablespoons chocolate sauce
- In a large saucepan, combine the water, sugar, lemon rind, lemon juice and cinnamon stick. Bring to a boil, stirring until the

sugar is dissolved.

Peel, halve and core the pears. Add the pears to the boiling syrup. (Pears should be covered in liquid; if not, double the amount of poaching liquid or poach in batches). Reduce the heat to medium-low and simmer gently for 15 to 20 minutes or until pears are almost tender (pears will continue to cook while cooling). Remove from the heat and let pears cool in the liquid.

Drain the pears thoroughly and pat dry on paper towels. Arrange the pear halves on individual plates. Drizzle with chocolate sauce and serve at room temperature.

Poaching is also a favorite way to cook chicken in many cuisines throughout the world, yet it is not common with American cooks. Poaching is a fat-free cooking method that's ideal for lean and healthful meals. Whether you poach in chicken stock, wine or water flavored with herbs and aromatic vegetables, poaching is an easy way to deliciously flavor the tender, moist meat.

The subtle flavor of poached chicken pairs well with zesty condiments. Swiss Chicken uses chicken broth and evaporated skim milk to achieve a rich, smooth sauce without excessive fat.

- 6 boneless, skinless chicken breasts
- 3/4 cup chopped onion
- 3 cloves garlic, minced

In a skillet, poach the chicken, onion, and garlic in chicken broth until the chicken is almost done, about 10 minutes. Drain the broth from the pan, and add the evapo-

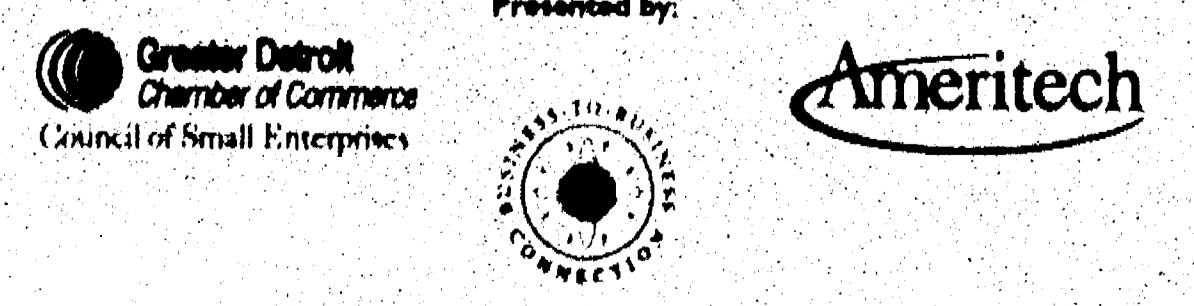

# Bake great breakfast breads with less fat

Home bakers can leave the high tech fat substitutes to the scientists who created them and still turn out leaner muffins, coffee cakes and other breakfast treats that taste terrific. How? By following a few, simple lower-fat baking how-tos.

• **Cut back on the amount of fat** (butter, margarine, shortening or oil) in a recipe, but don't eliminate it altogether. Baked goods made without any fat tend to be tough because fat is what makes baked goods tender. Depending on the recipe, applesauce and other fruit purees, canned pumpkin, and plain non-fat or low-fat yogurt can be substituted for part of the fat. While it's possible in many cases to reduce the amount of fat by as much as one-half, it's wise to eliminate a little less fat the first time to be sure you're happy with the flavor and texture.

• **Measure ingredients accurately**, especially the flour. To measure flour, stir first then lightly spoon into a dry nested measuring cup until overflowing. Level by sweeping a straight-edged spatula or knife across the rim of the cup. Use a glass measure with a pouring spout to measure liquid ingredients.

• **Mix batters as little as possible.** After adding the liquid ingredients to the dry ingredients, stir just until the dry ingredients are moistened. Overmixing develops the gluten in the flour, which can make muffins and other quick breads tough.

• **Be sure not to overbake.** Begin checking for doneness a minute or two before the time given in the recipe. When a wooden pick inserted in the center of muffins (and coffee cakes) comes out with a few moist crumbs clinging to it, the muffins are done.

**Honey Lime Oat Muffins**, developed in the Quaker Oatmeal Kitchens, weigh in at 200 calories and 3 grams of fat. For a flavor twist, substitute lemon or orange peel and juice for the lime.

## HONEY LIME OAT MUFFINS

- Muffins:**
- 1 cup oats (quick or old-fashioned, uncooked)
  - One 8-ounce container plain nonfat or low-fat yogurt
  - 1/2 cup honey
  - 1/2 cup skim milk
  - 3 tablespoons margarine or butter, melted
  - 2 teaspoons grated lime peel
  - 2 egg whites, slightly beaten
  - 1 1/2 cups all purpose flour
  - 2 teaspoons baking powder
  - 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
  - 1/2 teaspoon salt (optional)
- Glaze:**
- 1/2 cup powdered sugar
  - 4 teaspoons lime juice
  - 1 teaspoon grated lime peel

Heat oven to 375 degrees F. Line 12 medium muffin cups with paper baking cups or spray bottoms only with no-stick cooking spray. In large bowl, combine oats with

yogurt, honey, milk, margarine and lime peel. Let stand 10 minutes.

Stir in egg whites until blended. Add combined dry ingredients; mix just until dry ingredients are moistened. Fill muffin cups almost full. Bake 20 to 24 minutes or until light golden brown. Let muffins stand a few minutes; remove from pan. Cool slightly.

For glaze, combine powdered sugar, lime juice and peel; mix until smooth. Dip muffin tops in glaze.

## GINGER OAT CRUMB CAKE

- Topping:**
- 1/2 cup oats (quick or old-fashioned, uncooked)
  - 1/2 cup all-purpose flour
  - 1/2 cup firmly packed brown sugar
  - 2 to 3 tablespoons finely chopped crystallized ginger or 1 teaspoon ground ginger
  - 3 tablespoons butter or margarine chilled

- 1 1/2 cups boiling water

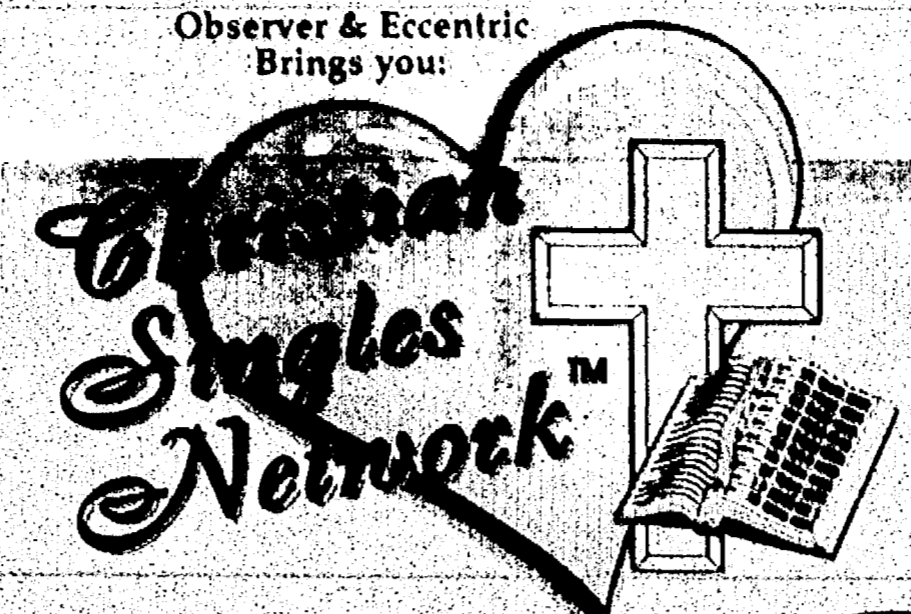

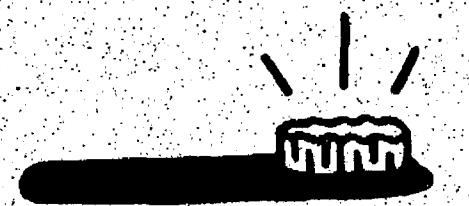

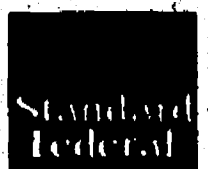

"On Wisconsin" will be the battle cry for 17-year-old Dustin Kuk of Livonia, who recently signed a NCAA letter-of-intent next fall to play hockey with the Badgers, who were ranked 16th in the country this season.

Kuk follows the footsteps of two other Livonians who made their marks while playing on the Madison campus - Ron Griffin and Chris Tancill.

Griffin played on Wisconsin's 1977 championship team and was a member of the U.S. National Team, while Tancill, a member of the Badgers' 1990 NCAA championship squad, just completed his pro season with the San Jose Sharks of the National Hockey League.

"The first thing I like about Wisconsin is their track record of putting guys into the NHL," Kuk

said. "They've produced some phenomenal players, guys like Chris Chelios (Chicago Blackhawks) and Tancill (now playing for the U.S. in the World championships).

"Hockey is number one there. They put 10,000 people in the building every night. It's just a great hockey town."

Kuk, who just completed a season with the Bramalea (Ontario) Blues of the Provincial Junior A League, agonized over his decision.

He narrowed it down to three schools - Wisconsin, Western Michigan and Michigan State. He also considered NCAA champion Michigan and runner-up Colorado College, along with Colgate.

"I was one of the hardest decisions I've had to make," said Kuk, a 6-foot-1, 188-pound left winger. "It

was tough telling the other coaches no thanks. I met a lot of great people while I was being recruited."

Kuk made his official visit to Madison in January. Wisconsin coach Jeff Sauer made a pair of visits over the winter to see Kuk play in Toronto.

"It's a big school and has a beautiful campus located between two lakes," said Kuk, who plans to study business education. "They showed a lot of interest in me and I feel comfortable in the role I'm going to play, even though I'll be the youngest on the team."

Kuk is on schedule to graduate (May 16) from high school a year early. He is finishing up classes at Redford Bishop Borgess High.

He attended Franklin High until last fall when he decided to opt for the top-ranked Tier II team in Canada.

While playing for the Blues, Kuk attended North Park Secondary School.

The Blues recently finished the year with a 38-9-3 record, falling to their arch-rival Brampton Capitols (in double overtime) in the seventh and deciding game of a playoff series.

Despite missing 10 games with a shoulder injury, Kuk was second among rookies in league scoring this season with 24 goals and 42 assists.

"It was a great year and I got everything I wanted out of it," Kuk said. "I'll miss a lot of things up there. They're just great people. I met a lot of good families."

Kuk will be eligible for the NHL draft in either 1997 or 1998.



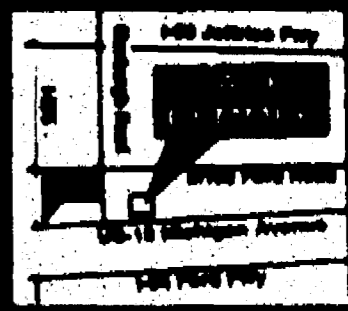

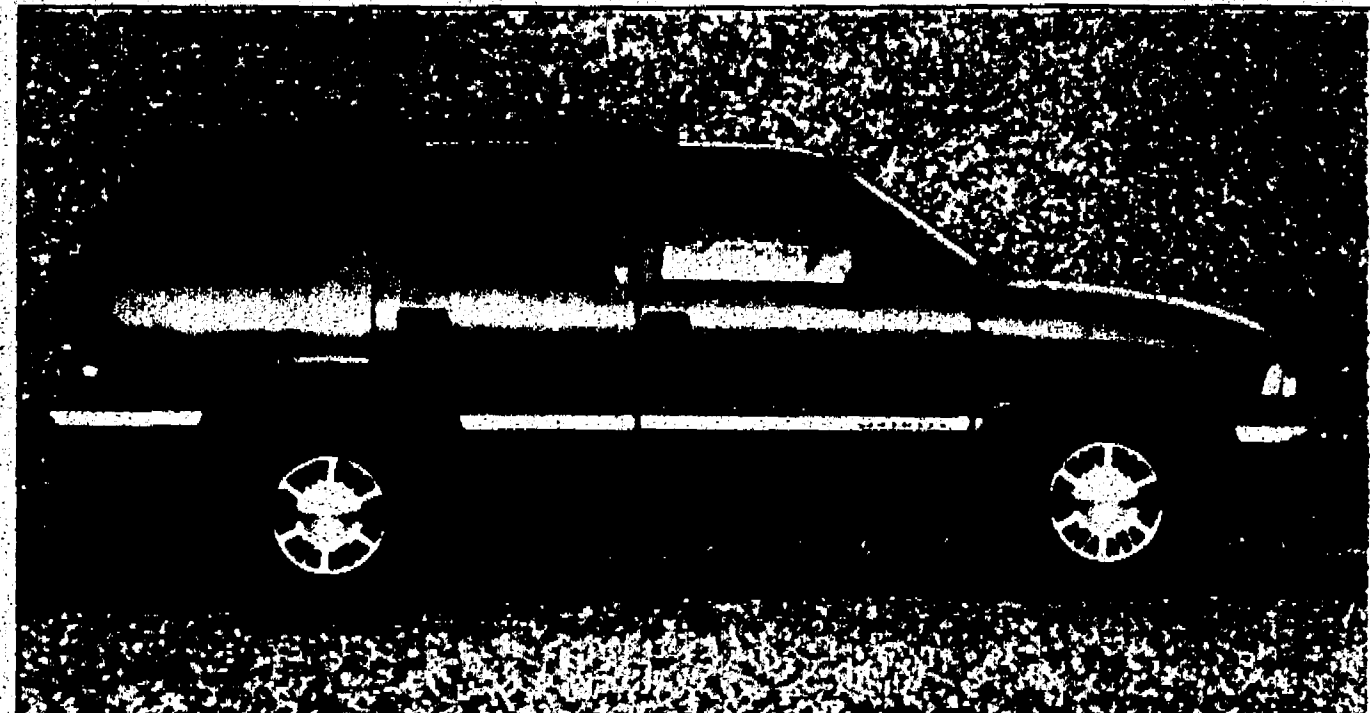
When you look at sport utility vehicles, you generally think big.

Here's a smaller sport ute that can easily fit the person who has an active lifestyle and needs a fun-to-drive multi-purpose vehicle.

The 1996 GMC Jimmy, kisser cousin to the Chevrolet Blazer, looks small on the outside, but is really a lot larger than you'd imagine. It's roomy even for the larger person. The best part is that it combines a high level of comfort and convenience features with a solid ride usually found in the larger luxury (read that high-priced) sport utilities.

The Jimmy tested was a 4-door all-wheel-drive model outfitted with the new Vortec 4300 engine. This 4.3-liter V6 has been around for awhile in the Jimmy and Blazer, but it's been heavily tinkered with this year.

The fuel injection system has been upgraded. The intake manifold is half cast aluminum and half composite material, which cut weight and improved insulation of the intake air. Other improve-



ments include a stiffer cylinder-

than eight years. Car manufacturers are taking steps to allow you to keep them even longer.

As with all 1996 vehicles, the Jimmy is in full compliance with federal law and has OBD II—second generation on-board diagnostics. OBD II, simply, is a newfangled (yet sophisticated) way for your car or truck to tell you if something just isn't right.

OBD II constantly monitors fuel delivery and the evaporative storage system, catalytic converter, oxygen sensors, exhaust gas recirculation valve, manifold air temperature sensor, crankshaft and camshaft position sensors, air pump and ignition system. If any of those systems malfunction in any way, a "SERVICE ENGINE SOON" warning light illuminates on your instrument panel.

For example, if your oxygen sensor loses function, the light will go on. Before, there was no way to tell it wasn't working right. Untreated, your car would suffer premature wear on the catalytic

converter. Ultimately, you would have to replace the converter, costing you a lot of money.

With all 1996 vehicles, all you do is take your vehicle to the dealer and a service technician, through computer diagnostics attached to your vehicle, will know exactly what's wrong without ever removing a part.

What that means for you and me is that the new 1996 vehicles have the lowest emissions ever, the car will last even longer than before and you'll have quicker first-time and lower cost on repairs of your engine-related problems. We all win.

Back to the Jimmy.

There are four models to choose from: The SL, SLS, SLE and SLT, in both 2-door and 4-door, ranging in price from \$19,573 to \$23,504. A 4-speed electronic automatic transmission with overdrive is standard on all Jimmys this year. Optional on the Jimmy 2-door is a 5-speed manual with overdrive.

The Jimmy is also available in

four suspension packages: The "smooth-ride" suspension is suited to paved and improved roads, has a good cargo capacity and gives a smooth ride. The "Euro-ride" suspension is for paved and improved roads, has good cargo capacity and provides a touring or sporty ride.

The "off-road" suspension has traction control, is for rough and unimproved off-roading and has a firm ride. And the "Highrider" suspension has all that and is used primarily for recreational purposes. All suspensions allow for heavy-duty trailering. All are available on the 2-door Jimmy.

On the 4-door Jimmy, you can choose from smooth-ride, Euro-ride or luxury-ride suspensions. The luxury ride is for paved roads, provides good cargo capacity, allows heavy trailering and has a premium ride.

The Jimmy is comfortable and easy to get into and out of. Instrumentation is smartly arranged and easy to operate. Daytime running lights and dual air-bags are standard on all Jimmys, as is brake/transmission shift interlock (you have to apply the brake to shift from park).

This is a solid vehicle for anyone interested in an upscale, sporty truck that's a pleasure to drive. It's versatile for anyone with an active lifestyle and it's functional for anyone from an at-home mom to a guy who likes a small, comfortable multi-purpose vehicle for work. For 20 grand, it's

a bargain as well.

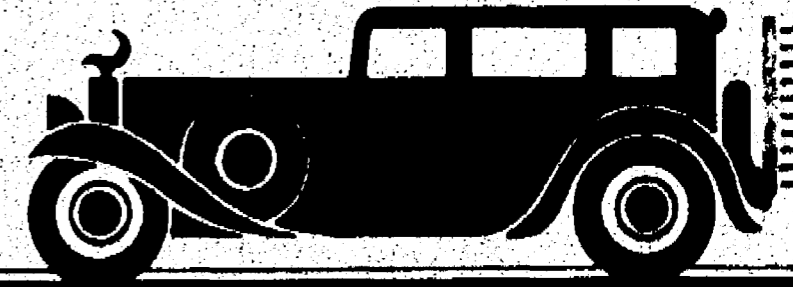

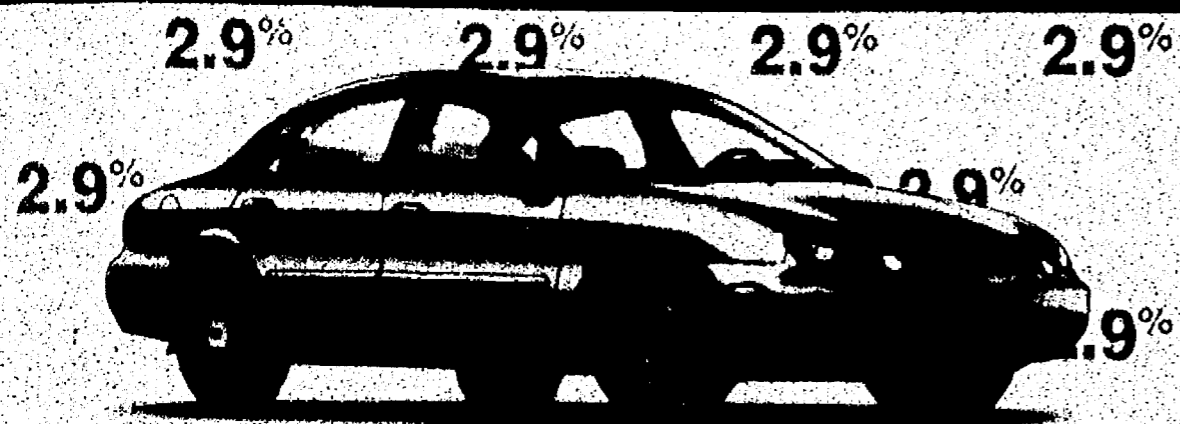

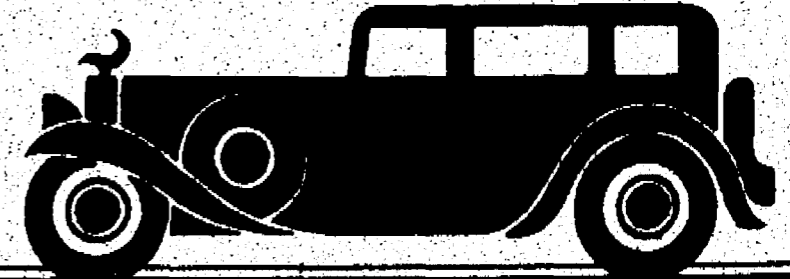
