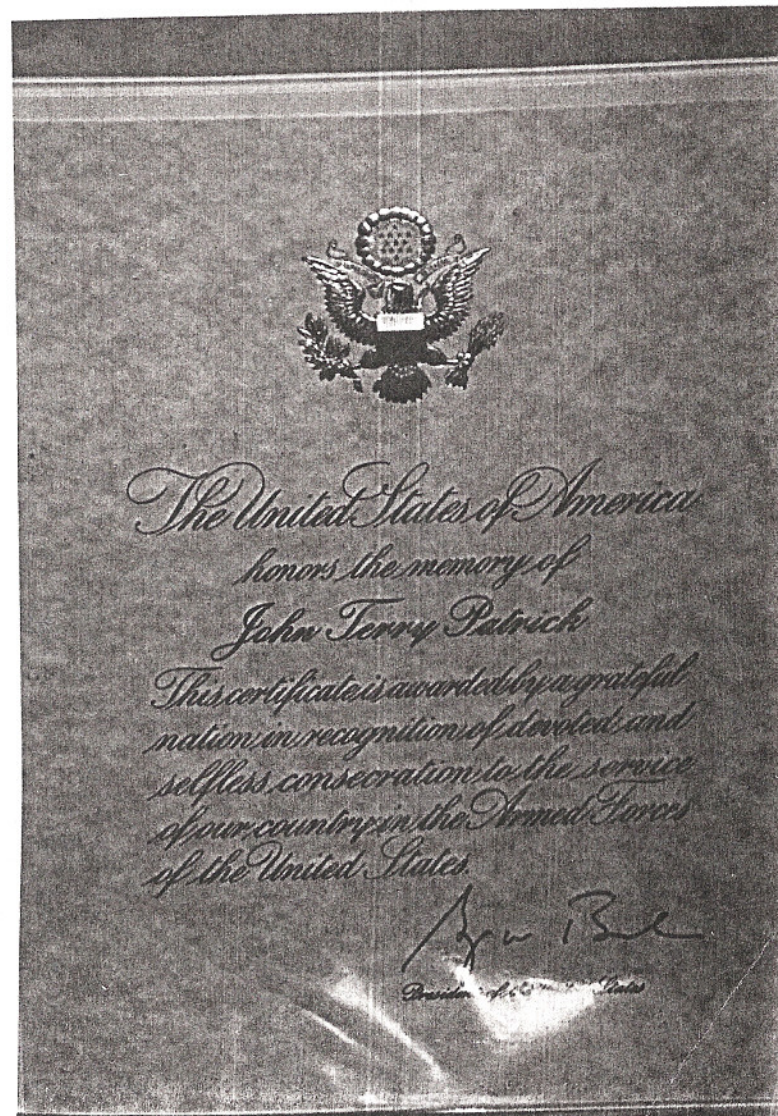
Dear Ms. Cady:


Dear Ms. Cady,


I returned to the cemetery to figure out why we couldn't make a connection with Jane A. Hughey. <sup>DEE WHITLOCK</sup> Nick was not there, but I revisited the stone to check the data. I returned to the library data base and decided to do a search by burial date since no Whitlock or Hughey showed up for 1910. I found the following:

<sup>JANE A. DIXON</sup>  
Jane A Dixon, born Hebron, parents William and Mannl (or Martha?) Dugan (hard to read mother's name), residence Easton, widow, d. Cambridge, July 6, 1910, age 74. No cause of death was given. She was interred on July 8, 1910. <sup>WHITLOCK</sup> <sup>NANCY DOUGAN</sup>

It appears that Jane married a second time--to a Mr. Dixon. His first name was not listed. The practice of the day was to bury the wife with the first husband, Hughey. I suggest that you write Sally Beelen, Town Clerk, 159 State Rt. 372, Cambridge, NY 12816 and Linda Record, Village Clerk, Municipal Bldg., Cambridge, NY 12816. A death certificate should be in one of these offices.

I searched for a 1910 *Salem Press* obituary but this year's paper was missing from the collection. The Cambridge Library has copies of the *Washington County Post* for these years, I believe. That would be a good possibility. Any of these sources might tell you how she died.

Dear Mr. Wilson:

In response to your October 28 appeal, I did more checking for you by reviewing the county and Federal Census records for the town of Hebron. The town of Hebron historian may have more information in her files than I have in mine. I am sending her address along with this letter. Some Fitzpatricks still live in Hebron.

At any rate here is what I have been able to find. In checking my names file again, I ran across the Fitzpatrick (Fitz Patrick) name in the 1830 county and Federal census and discovered that Fitzpatrick turned into Patrick between 1860 and 1870. The given names for Terrance and Bridget Patrick were the same for the surname Fitz Patrick listed in earlier years. It became obvious that the last name had been shortened. Going back to my own genealogy files, I found a Fitzpatrick folder containing many Fitz Patricks, Fitzpatricks and Patricks listed in both forms of the census. The county census was taken every five years; the Federal census was taken every ten years. The county information was more informative, citing occupation and place of birth. In addition, someone, probably the late village historian, had penciled in birth and death dates and some other information. Here is what I found for the parents of Mary A. Fitzpatrick (Patrick):

The Patricks first show up in the County Census, 1855 and are last found in the Federal Census of 1880. Here is a composite of the information found on both lists:

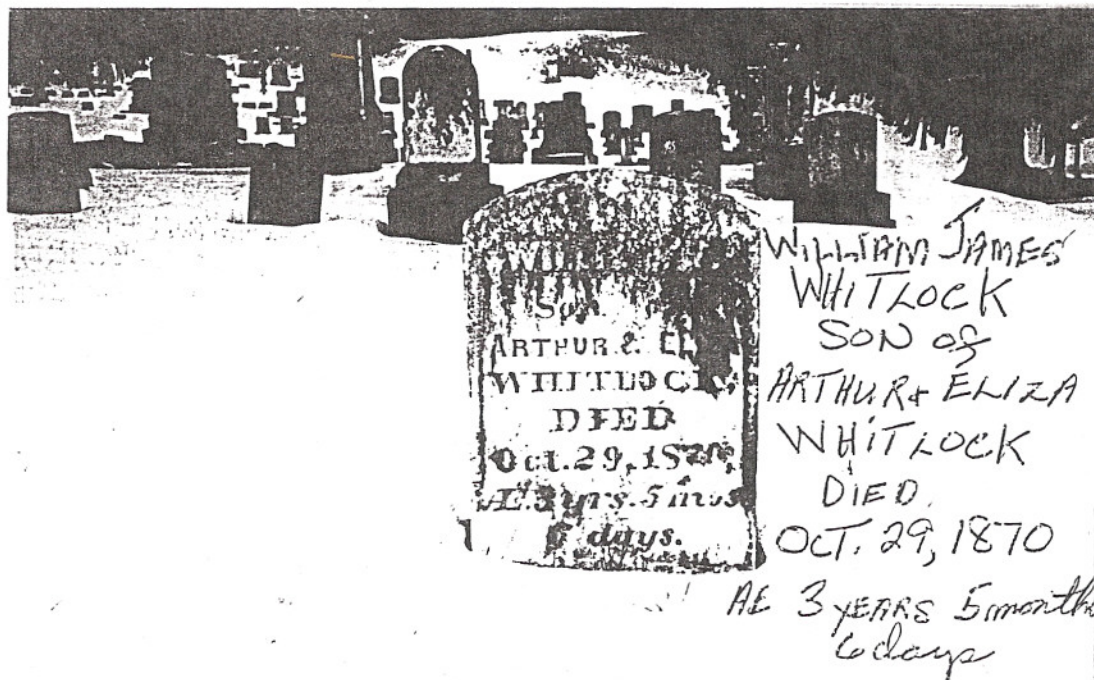
Terrance Patrick, b. 1814, d. July 31, 1890, m. 2nd, about 1851, Bridget Jones Burke, a widow, b. Jan. 6, 1826, d. Feb. 6, 1884. Terrance was a laborer. Their children were listed as Mary Ann, b. 1852; Elizabeth, b. 1853; Alice, b. 1854; Juliaette, b. 1855; Thomas W., b. Nov. 5, 1857; Andrew, b. 1859; Carey [Terrance?], b. 1862; Richard Burke, b. 1846 in Ireland, son of Bridget by 1st marriage. Mary A. is noted as having married William J. Whitlock. Half brother John Patrick is noted as being born in 1845 and dying on June. 21, 1865 in Georgia.

I found nothing on the Coon connection. The town historian of Cambridge might be of some help. I have highlighted his name on the sheet. I had no luck finding the parents of William Whitlock. The answer may be in Palatine Bridge, New York. Write Mrs. Sandra Cronkhite, Town Historian, P.O. Box 278, 15 Berthoud Street, Nelliston, NY 13410.

I hope this is of some help to you. Thanks for the check.

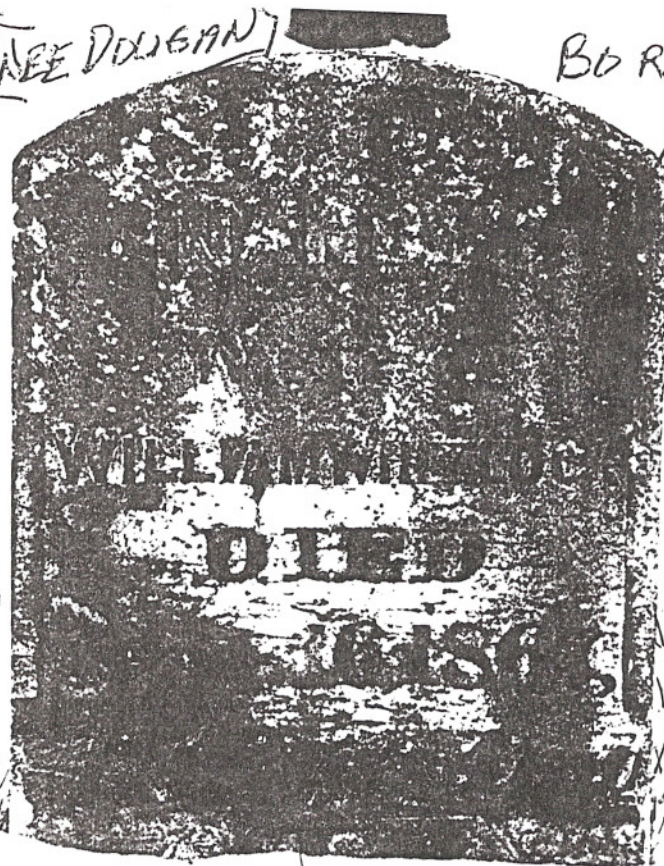

Dear Mr. Wilson:

I'm sorry I took so long to reply. The Christmas holidays slowed me down considerably.

I did manage to find a row of grave stones in Evergreen Cemetery but no major monuments. The following inscriptions were difficult to read and did not come out well in the photographs, but at least you have this record. The stones are found in Section C, Plot #28, the north end of the section as you enter the cemetery.

son of Henry Dixon

Stone 1, (related family) Father, James H. Dixon, 1858-1934.

NANCY ELIZABETH

Stone 2, (related family) Mother, Libbie Hughey, wife of James Dixon, 1860-1896.

Stone 3, (related family) John Hughey, died July 23, 1879, age 56.

→ Stone 4, Jane A. Whitlock, wife of John Hughey, June 5, 1840-July 6, 1910.

Stone 5, Nancy wife of William Whitlock, Sept. 16, 1867.

→ sister of William James  
Stone 6, William Whitlock, d. April 26, 1883. B; SARATOGA Co. + Arthur Whitlock

Stone 7, Janet wife of William Whitlock, April 30, 1880.

JANE A. HUGHEY NÉE WHITLOCK married HENRY DIXON in late 1880

I found no stones for Martha M. Whitlock, Bertie Oliver Whitlock, Jennie N.

Witlock or Arthur Whitlock. However, the cemetery map showed a neighboring plot for an Arthur Whitlock, Section C, # 26. On that plot was a single stone (#8) with this inscription: William J. son of Arthur and Eliza Whitlock, Died Oct. 29, 1870 AE 3 y, 5 mos, 6 days. I also checked the Civil War Monument for Arthur's stone and found no stone there either. I think you are right. Arthur is not buried here.
