GIANT JET-POWERED BOMBER OUTSPEEDS JET FIGHTERS

Pushed by eight mighty Pratt & Whitney Aircraft J-57 jet engines, an Air Force Boeing B-52 heavy bomber provided a spectacular speed record to open the National Aircraft Show at Dayton. 


