NOTE: Sites for which the local government reorganization of 1974 specified a different name for the county-like administrative authority include both names, with the historic county name shown in parentheses. The reason for this is that the administrative names have frequently been used as if they were replacements for the historic names, though they are not. Presenting both names here insures that the reader will be able to make the proper connection with place references of all kinds. The historic county names are used for the two-letter abbreviations in the country field. Further changes in administrative names, resulting from the reorganization of 1995, are not yet included.

NOTE: Ordnance Survey (OS) map references are included under Location where known.

NOTE: In this region, chime semitones may be given either in chime scale (numbering from the bottom, as in "sharp 4th" or "flat 7th") or in ringing scale (numbering from the top, as in "#5" or "b2").
