

## **Pastor Eddie Cooper's 40 Days in the** Wilderness – A Cancer Survivor's Story

"I spent forty days straight taking radiation treatments," exclaimed Pastor Eddie Cooper with New Life in Christ Ministry when describing his bout with cancer. "That was my wilderness. Jesus was in the wilderness for 40 days also. That was my forty days experience in the wilderness."

Cooper was diagnosed with prostate cancer in September of 2013. He said he wasn't sick or anything but during his routine checkups with his doctor, his Prostate-Specific Antigen (PSA) levels continued to rise which prompted his doctor to order a biopsy. Cooper said while waiting on the results of the biopsy, he suddenly started losing a noticeable amount of weight.

"It's the fear of the unknown, that's the hardest," said Cooper. "You know, you can worry yourself to death, and that's exactly where I was going."

He said he began to realize that he had to do something to change his thinking. One day when his grandchildren were visiting, he looked at them and said to himself, "I'm not going anywhere." And, from that day for-

ward he thought differently about the cancer. "I began to think, yes I have cancer, but cancer doesn't have me."

He chose not to tell anyone in his family or church about the cancer except for his

wife. He said he didn't want to burden others with the news because he knew he was going to fight it with God's strength and guidance.

"I'm a pastor, and at one point I was wandering how I was going to do this without telling the church. I thought maybe there would be times that I wouldn't be able to minister. But, I would have a treatment, get up off the table, and go preach. God was in it all the way, I could see his hand moving throughout the whole experience."

He said he looked at the forty days of going through treatment as if he were going to work each day. He would get up early, get dressed and be at the treatment center early in the morning. By doing it early, he was better able to proceed with the rest of day as usual. Cooper said throughout the entire forty days, he never got sick from the radiation nor did he receive any burns.

"My last treatment was December 31, 2013. I never will forget that day. And, I've been cancer free since then," exclaimed Cooper with a huge smile. "I just thank God for what he did, and the way he did it. There was a time when you heard that 'C' word it was like a death sentence. But, I'm here to tell you, today, it is not a death sentence because with God all things are possible."

Cooper spoke of how comforting and supportive Dr. Primprell and his staff at Oncologics Inc in Laurel were to him during those forty days. "You know, when you see someone for forty days you get attached to them," said Cooper. "I take my hat off to them. They service you and treat you well. They were so good. Even today, from time to time I'll go by and take them some goodies."

When asked what advice he would give to someone battling cancer today, he said, "Don't look at having cancer as a sickness or a disease; it might play in your mind to where it will take you out. Before I found out I had cancer I was fine. I wasn't sick or anything like that. So, ask yourself what were you like before you knew you had cancer and operate in that same way. It's okay to have cancer, but don't let the cancer have vou."

He added, "And, don't put your faith in man; put your faith in God."





# **Open House held at Home Town's Barnes House**

The episode aired in January, but the homeowner, Marian Barnes, was unable to have the open house until now and for good reason. Her daughter, Morissa, which was seen on the episode with her, had her baby in January and momma had to be with her to help out. Not only did her daughter have a baby, but her son-in-law, Malcolm Jenkins, who plays with the Philadelphia Eagles, won the championship and then the Super Bowl, so she was unable to return home until recently.

Barnes is a native of Laurel/Jones County and retired from the Laurel educational system after serving 30 years. She said she wanted to move closer into the city after living 20 plus years in the county in the Currie community of Jones County. She wanted to

community of Jones County. She wanted to find a spacious home that would comfortably handle her large family when they visited.

Barnes had settled on the Jones House with three bedrooms, three baths, and approximately 3,000 square feet that was built in 1962. The house was formerly owned by Peggy and Tek Jones, a prominent radio personality in Laurel years ago. She chose it because it was well built and she wanted a large kitchen and large living room area, and, that's exactly what she got after Ben and Erin completed the renovations.

The renovations to the outside of the home included replacing the rod iron front door with double stained wood doors, replacing the white siding with a navy blue-gray color siding, removing the planter brick wall and replacing it with nice landscaping, and adding wood flower boxes under the windows. The back patio needed no renovations. Patio furniture was added and a tropical oasis created with plants.

The renovations inside were much more drastic. In 1962, when the home was built, Masonite Corporation in Laurel was flourishing. Many homes in the Laurel area used the Masonite paneling that was produced at the plant as part of the décor. The Jones house was no exception and Ms. Barnes agreed with Ben and Erin that it was time to for the paneling to go. In addition the flooring throughout the house was replaced with engineering hardwood flooring.

To give Ms. Barnes an open floor plan in the kitchen and living room area, several walls in the kitchen were removed and the opening to the formal dining room area was enlarged.


"I love the little breakfast nook; I wasn't expecting that," said Ms. Barnes. The breakfast nook is right in front of a window which overlooks the beautiful patio and back yard. During the open house, the Azalea's in the backyard were in full bloom.

The effort to address autism continues as doctors, therapists, and educators help persons with autism overcome or adjust to its challenges by providing early and accurate diagnoses and appropriate education, intervention, and therapy – all of which are vital to future growth and development. It is important to ensure that persons living with autism have access to the lifelong care and services needed to pursue their full measure of personal happiness and achieve their greatest potential."

By signing the proclamation the Mayor encourages everyone to join the City of Laurel in participating in the annual observance of Autism Awareness Month and support efforts that will heighten awareness and lead to a better understanding of this potentially debilitating disorder.



## Sideline View: Laurel's Cooley named winner of Eli Manning Award at Ole Miss

Patrick Reed won the 2018 Masters this past Sunday. Reed held off Rickie Fowler and Jordan Speith to win his first major championship. Reed shot a 15-under 273 to win by one stroke over Fowler. Tiger Woods playing in his first Masters since 2015 shot a 3-under 69 on Sunday and finished 1 over

for the tournament.

Mississippi State (17-16, 4-8) won two of three from Ole Miss (27-6, 7-5) over the weekend in SEC play. It was the Bulldogs' third straight year to claim



the regular season series from the Rebels. Ole Miss fell to second place in the SEC West as they trail Arkansas by a half game in the standings. State is still in last place in the SEC West. MSU travels to Auburn this weekend while Ole Miss heads to Vanderbilt. USM (22-9, 8-3) won two of three from Western Kentucky over the weekend but fell to second place in CUSA play. The Golden Eagles head to Miami this weekend to play Florida International.

The Ole Miss football team played their spring game this past Saturday. Bassfield native C.J. Moore was honored as he was named the Chucky Mullins Courage Award winner and will wear number 38 this fall. Moore led the Rebels with 51 tackles and three interceptions last year from this free safety position. Laurel native Octavious Cooley was named the winner of the Eli Manning Award as the Most Improved Player during the spring. Mississippi State and Southern Mississippi will play their spring games on April 21.

The Ole Miss Lady Rebels has hired

Wolett McPhee-McCuin to take over the basketball coaching reigns. She comes to Ole Miss from Jacksonville where she was 69-29 in the previous three seasons. The Lady Rebels have not been to the NCAA tournament since 2007.

Former Laurel resident Nell Fortner was inducted into the Texas Sports Hall of Fame this past weekend. Fortner is a former two-sport, four year letter winner at the University of Texas in both basketball and volleyball. She is still the fourth leading basketball scorer in school history. She was head coach of the 2000 U.S. Olympic team and an assistant on the 1996 team. Today, she is a basketball and volleyball broadcaster on the SEC and ESPN networks.

Kyle Busch won for the third time at Texas Motor Speedway. Busch stayed in front of Kevin Harvick over the last 24 laps to take his first victory of the season and 44th in his career.

The Atlanta Braves are off to a fast start as they entered the week at 6-3. Freddie Freeman has to be one of the top players in all of major league baseball. The Braves have young talent in Dansby Swanson, Ozzie Albies and Ronald Acuna to go with Freeman, Julio Teheran and Nick Markakis. Should be a great summer of baseball for Braves fans.

Former Japanese baseball player Shohei Ohtani is becoming an overnight sensation with the L.A. Angels. As a pitcher Sunday, he won his second game of the year as he retired the first 19 Oakland Athletics. He had 11 strikeouts in the first six innings using his 99 mile per hour fastball. 
