## After Katrina, USPS employees deliver the promise of a brighter day

It was one year ago last month that Hurricane Katrina made landfall in Plaquemines Parish, pummeling the community with 125 mile-per-hour winds and signaling the start of the most destructive hurricane ever to hit the Gulf Coast.

Buras, LA, Rural Carrier Associate Elise Gipson delivers the mail to Plaquemines Parish. Like the bright strobe light on the roof of her jeep, Gipson is a beacon of hope to her community. "We started delivering in May, and once they saw the blinking light, they started replacing their mailboxes from one end of the parish to the other like crazy," she says. "They knew it meant things were going to get better. One man was so excited he put up flowers at the mailbox."

As a lifetime resident of the small community, Gipson had plenty of experience with storms and she evacuated in time. Since returning, Gipson - like her neighbors and coworkers - copes each day with the challenge of trying to return to a normal life after experiencing firsthand such wide-spread devastation. Wind, tidal surge and mud caused the roof and walls of Gipson's home to partially collapse.
"We're glad she's delivering mail for us," says customer Nicole Bourgeos. "We look forward to her little white jeep coming down the road."

## Carrier Pickup is off the charts

Carrier Pickup recently made its 40 millionth pickup at LensWorld.com's main office in Hoboken, NJ.

LensWorld.com has been in business for five years now. It fulfills contact lens prescriptions through its Web site and ships them using the Postal Service's domestic and international expedited services. And each day, for five years, LensWorld.com owner Kevin Walsh was going into the local Post Office with satchels full of outgoing packages.

Customer Service Supervisor Dennis Haggerty was the first to speak to Walsh about Carrier Pickup. "I told him that we could pick up his packages at no extra charge and his eyes bugged out," said Dennis. "I walked him through the Web site and he started requesting pickups the next day."

Walsh is seeing clearly how Carrier Pickup saves both time and money. "Now, I just give my packages to my carrier and he takes care of the rest."

## Richard Potter dies at 79: PMG's father was career USPS employee

Richard "Dick" Potter, a 40-year postal veteran and father of Postmaster General John E. Potter, died recently at 79. Dick began his Postal Service career as a letter carrier and worked in several stations in Manhattan, retiring in 1985 as Director of Station Operations for the New York Post Office, with responsibility for some of the most complicated delivery zones in the nation. Other survivors include his wife Maureen; sons Richard, Christopher, Brian, and Brendan; daughter Mary Anne Gassert; and 14 grandchildren. He is also survived by his sister, Anna Nestor, and his brother, James.

According to the most recent U.S. Census Bureau report, the estimated Hispanic population of the United States (excluding the 3.9 million residents of Puerto Rico) as of July 1, 2005, was 42.7 million, constituting 14 percent of the nation's total population. It is projected that by the year 2050, the Hispanic population in the United States will represent 24 percent of the nation's total population. On another front, the number of Hispanicowned businesses grew 31 percent between 1997 and 2002 - three times the national average for all businesses - according to a report released on March 21, 2006, by the U.S. Census Bureau. The nearly 1.6 million Hispanic-owned businesses generated approximately $\$ 222$ billion in revenue, up 19 percent from 1997. Reaching this valuable market segment with products and services continues to be an ongoing challenge to corporate America.

In light of this challenge, the Postal Service continues to identify emerging market strategies that will build awareness within the Hispanic community of our products and services, and continues to make our products accessible to
consumers when, where, and how they prefer. In many instances, the "how" can be in how we communicate. And in many cases, that message may have to be in another language.

## In-Language Communication Makes Good Business Sense

Rapid growth in the multicultural consumer market has made it even more apparent that businesses need to look at developing in-language communication tools that can effectively target America's culturally diverse customer base.

To meet this need, the Postal Service has developed and made available a menu of in-language communication tools that are designed to inform customers about the services we provide, and assist them in doing business with us. The Multicultural Outreach page on the Postal Blue intranet (http://blue.usps.gov/diversitynet/multicultural/welcome.htm) contains news and information about the multicultural mar-
ket. One of its most helpful offerings is its menu of inlanguage translation tools.

The Multicultural Outreach page also offers translation aides for Special Services and product fact sheets for selected Postal Service-products in a variety of languages, including Spanish, Chinese, Vietnamese, French, and Russian. In-language tools provide our non-English speaking customers with a brief description of the products and services offered by the Postal Service, along with step-by-step instructions on how to use Special Service forms.

These translation aides and fact sheets are easy to use and can be printed locally by postmasters and station managers.

## Change to the Nominal Rate for Periodicals Mail

Effective September 13, 2006, the definition of "nominal rate" for Periodicals eligibility is 30 percent of the basic annual subscription rate.

To qualify for certain Periodicals rates, publications must show that at least half of their circulation is sent to persons who have paid above a nominal rate for a subscription. The "nominal rate" is a token subscription price that is so low that it cannot be considered a material consideration, or a payment amount that is the result of a reduction of more than 50 percent of the basic annual subscription rate, either under a premium offer or another arrangement. We are changing the definition of nominal rate from more than 50 percent to more than 70 percent of the basic annual subscription rate.

Changing this definition required a filing with the Postal Rate Commission. We filed the case on July 6, and the Commission issued a Recommended Decision on August 30 approving the change. The U.S. Postal Service Board of Governors authorized the change and set September 13 as the implementation date.

### 617.34 Perishable Parcel

Service employee must call the telephone number printed by the mailer in the endorsement. The Postal Service employee gives the mailer the customer's name, address, and, if necessary, keyline information. A second attempt to deliver is made only if requested by the addressee. A second notice is sent if the parcel is not called for after 5 days. If the parcel remains unclaimed 10 days after the first delivery attempt or the retention period specified by the mailer, the parcel is handled according to POM 68, Undeliverable Mail. Mailers of perishable items who want to use this endorsement must place the endorsement along the left or bottom edge of the address label. The lettering of the endorsement must be in boldface type and as large as, or larger than, the lettering of the addressee's name and address but never smaller than 8-point type.

## Standardized Procedures for "Notice Left" Mail

To provide better customer service and operational efficiency, the Postal Service ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ has standardized the "Notice Left" operations for PS Form 3849, Delivery Notice/Reminder/ Receipt, which applies to all ordinary parcels, accountable mail, and other Extra Services mailpieces. This standardization establishes a uniform process nationwide for when Postal Service employees must prepare and use PS Form 3849 for unsuccessful delivery attempts.

PS Form 3849, commonly referred to as a "Notice Left," is used when a mailpiece cannot be delivered when attempted by a Postal Service employee because no one is available to accept delivery. Adopting a standardized process nationwide affords mailers the ability to accurately inform their customers of when the Postal Service will make second notice attempts or will return an article to the sender.

The standardized procedures also are detailed in a new Work Instruction document (provided separately to field offices) and in Postal Operations Manual (POM) sections 617.3, 619.25 , and 812.42 (see pages 1315 of this issue).

This information kit is designed to inform Postal Service employees about the new procedures for preparing and using PS Form 3849 for Notice Left mail. The kit contains the following materials:

- Standup Talk for Retail Employees - Notice Left.
- Standup Talk for Delivery Employees - Notice Left and Return Guidelines.
- Standup Talk for Back Office Employees - Notice Left.
- Workroom poster entitled "Notice Left and Return Guidelines."


## Standup Talk for Retail Employees - Notice Left

[Please read this stand-up talk to all retail employees (or designated employees) and then post copies on employee bulletin boards.]

The Postal Service has standardized Notice Left operations for PS Form 3849, Delivery Notice/Reminder/Receipt, which affects all ordinary parcels, accountable mail, and other Extra Services mailpieces. The Postal Service uses PS Form 3849 when a delivery cannot be made because no one is available to accept the item. This nationwide standardization of the Notice Left process provides better customer service and operational efficiency for the Postal Service.

## What do you need to do?

- Review the dates on articles daily to determine when a second attempt or notice is required, or if the article needs to be returned to sender.
- Watch for redelivery requests that may be received through My Post Office, by customer request, or by telephone. Retrieve the items and process as requested.
- Ensure that items are stored in the designated Notice Left area.
- When a customer arrives to pick up an item:

1. Ask for and review the PS Form 3849 and, if applicable, appropriate identification from the customer. If the customer does not have the PS Form 3849, ask for and review appropriate identification from the customer and then fill out another PS Form 3849 for the item.
2. Obtain the customer's signature, if applicable.
3. Scan the delivered item, if applicable.
4. Store PS Form 3849 in the designated area.

## What to avoid?

- Items not labeled with an employee's initials and date of attempted delivery. Ensure that all items are labeled correctly before they are stored for pickup.
- Items held longer than the type of service allows and guidelines require. Review articles daily to ensure that required second attempts are made and notices are issued or that items are returned as required.
Defining the processes to be followed after the initial attempt to deliver an article is just another way we are transforming our products and services to better meet the needs of our customers.

Please refer to the Work Instruction (provided separately to field offices) or your POM for specific retail acceptance details and general information about the Notice Left operation.

## Standup Talk for Delivery Employees - Notice Left and Return Guidelines

[Please read this stand-up talk to all delivery employees and then post copies on employee bulletin boards.]

The Postal Service has standardized Notice Left operations for PS Form 3849, Delivery Notice/Reminder/Receipt, and has provided return guidelines that affect all ordinary parcels, accountable mail, and other Extra Services mailpieces. The Postal Service uses PS Form 3849 when a delivery cannot be made because no one is available to accept the item. It is very important that PS Form 3849 be filled out completely and accurately. This nationwide standardization of the Notice Left process provides better customer service and operational efficiency for the Postal Service.

## What do you need to do?

- When the customer is not available to receive an item at the first attempted delivery, fill out and leave PS Form 3849 to notify the customer of the attempted delivery. Someone normally available to receive parcel: If an ordinary parcel or unnumbered insured parcel cannot be delivered on the first attempt, make a second delivery attempt the next working day. If the item is not delivered after the second attempt, leave a PS Form 3849 at the address showing that the parcel is being held awaiting call.
- Ensure that each item attempted is endorsed near the address with the date and the delivery employee's initials.
- Perform any required scans, if applicable.
- Return any attempted articles to the designated employee or designated storage area.
Note: Insure articles are filed as outlined in POM 619.251.


## What to avoid?

- Poorly marked packages. It is important that the attempted date be noted clearly near the address of the article to ensure that a follow-up attempt can be made in a timely manner.
- Incomplete PS Form 3849. When filling out PS Form 3849, it is important to fill in all required blanks and date the form.


## Remember:

- Back office personnel must review each attempted article to ensure that second attempts or notices are made and that items are returned when required. This can be done only when the attempted notices are filled out correctly.
- When unable to complete delivery, place PS Form 3849 in the customer's mail receptacle.
Please refer to the Work Instruction (provided separately to field offices) or your POM for specific details and general information about the Notice Left operation.

- Items not filed correctly. Check items to ensure that they are stored in the proper area for efficient handling as outlined in POM 619.251.

## ELM Revision

## Occupational Safety and Health Programs

Effective September 14, 2006, Employee and Labor Relations Manual (ELM), 821.133, Notifying the Safety Office of Controverted Claims, and 822.12, Reporting Requirements for Installation Heads, are revised. The text and title of 821.133 are deleted, and the section is marked "reserved" to remove references to obsolete record-keeping-requirements. Section 822.12 is revised to align with Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) regulations.

### 822.12 Reporting Requirements for Installation Heads

In the event of a fatality, amputation, mutilation, or OSHA reportable accident (see 822.11b) performance cluster manger must, within 8 hours, report the accident by telecommunications (FAX/e-mail) to the area Human Resources manager
and Headquarters Safety Performance Management. The report must use the following format:
a. The installation head must report all serious accidents to the performance cluster district manager by COB the day of the accident.
b. The installation head, after consultation with the servicing safety office, must report orally (by telephone or in person) to the nearest OSHA area office within 8 hours the following:
(1) Any accident that is fatal to one or more employees.
Note: Employers must report all fatal heart attacks occurring in the work environment, whether OSHA recordable or not (OSHA § 1904.39(b)(5)).
(2) Any accident that results in in-patient hospitalization of three or more employees.
(3) Any fatality or hospitalization of three or more employees that occurs within 30 days of an accident.
c. The report to OSHA should relate the following information:
(1) Name of the establishment.
(2) Location of the incident.
(3) Time of the incident.
(4) Number of fatalities or hospitalized employees.
(5) Names of any injured employees.
(6) Postal Service contact person and his or her telephone number.
(7) Brief description of the incident.
d. The installation head is not required to report:
(1) Motor vehicle accidents that occur in public streets, except those in construction work zones (OSHA § 1904.39(b)(3)).
(2) Commercial airplane, train, subway, or bus accidents (OSHA § 1904.39(b)(4)).
e. The installation head must provide records within 4 business hours to an OSHA compliance officer who requests them (OSHA § 1904.40(a)).
f. The installation head must promptly report to the appropriate union:
(1) Any employee fatality.
(2) Any serious industrial, noncriminal accident or injury.

## Election Campaigns - Hatch Act and Other Requirements

## Hatch Act Requirements for Postal Service Employees

The Hatch Act affects some political activities, including off-duty activities, for Postal Service ${ }^{T M}$ employees. The Office of Special Counsel, which investigates possible Hatch Act violations, has prepared examples of permitted and prohibited activities for federal, including Postal Service, employees:

Postal Service employees may:

- Be candidates for public office in nonpartisan elections.
- Register and vote as they choose.
- Assist in voter registration drives.
- Express opinions about candidates and issues.
- Contribute money to political organizations.
- Attend political fundraising functions.
- Attend and be active at political rallies and meetings.
- Join and be an active member of a political party or club.
- Sign nominating petitions.
- Campaign for or against referendum questions, constitutional amendments, and municipal ordinances.
- Campaign for or against candidates in partisan elections.
- Make campaign speeches for candidates in partisan elections.
- Distribute campaign literature in partisan elections.
- Hold office in political clubs or parties.

But, Postal Service employees may not:

- Be candidates for public office in partisan elections.
- Use their official authority or influence to interfere with an election.
- Collect political contributions unless both individuals are members of the same federal labor organization or employee organization and the one solicited is not a subordinate employee.
- Knowingly solicit or discourage the political activity of any person who has business before the agency.
- Engage in political activity while on duty.
- Engage in political activity in any government office.
- Engage in political activity while wearing an official uniform.
- Engage in political activity while using a government vehicle.
- Solicit political contributions from the general public.
- Wear political buttons on duty.

## Campaigning on Postal Service Premises

Postal Service regulations (see Postal Operations Manual 124.54; 39 CFR 232.1; and Poster 7, Rules and Regulations Governing Conduct on Postal Property) prohibit campaigning for election to public office on leased or owned Postal Service property. Tell individuals who ask about the availability of Postal Service property for such purposes about the prohibition, and give them a copy of the
regulations. The following points will help you interpret and apply the regulations:

- The focus of the regulations is to identify activities that are "prohibited." Activities that are not prohibited by any of the regulations are permitted. For example, in the context of political campaigning, informational leafleting would be permitted, so long as the information in the leaflet itself is not political campaigning and the leafleting was carried out in a way that does not disrupt Postal Service business.
- Campaigning for election to public office is prohibited on Postal Service property, even if the candidate is independent of any political party.
- The regulations do not prohibit all activities related to political issues. For example, distributing literature pertaining to a referendum or ballot measure is
permitted. The regulations do prohibit, however, the solicitation of signatures on petitions, polls, and surveys.
- The regulations prohibit depositing posters or literature on Postal Service property, obstructing entrances, any activity that tends to impede or disturb the public in transacting Postal Service business, the sale of goods, and the solicitation of contributions on Postal Service property.
- The regulations cover activity only on Postal Service premises. Activity outside Postal Service property, even if it affects our premises, is not governed by our regulations.

## Revised Form

## PS Form 17, Stamp Requisition/Stamp Return

Effective October 1, 2006, postal retail units must use revised PS Form 17, Stamp Requisition/Stamp Return, dated September 2006. The September 2006 edition of this form replaces the June 2002 edition. All previous editions of PS Form 17 are obsolete and must be discarded/ recycled.

The form was revised to add the following blocks:

- Location ID (10-digit Unit Finance \#) of Shipping Unit.
- Shipment \# (10-digit).
- Location ID (10-digit Unit Finance \#) of Receiving Unit.
- Ship to Other Location.

Upon the arrival of the new version PS Form 17, the Material Distribution Center (MDC) will discard/recycle the previous editions of PS Form 17 and use the September 2006 edition. A copy of PS Form 17 appears on page 40 ff this Postal Bulletin. Offices may reproduce this copy locally until they order and receive the form from the MDC.

Offices may order PS Form 17 from the MDC by using touch tone order entry (TTOE): Call 800-332-0317, option 2.
Note: You must be registered to use TTOE. To register, call 800-332-0317, option 1, extension 2925, and follow the prompts to leave a message. (Wait 48 hours after registering before placing your first order.)

## Procedures for Receiving and Returning Stamp Stock

Effective October 1, 2006, Automated Postal Center (APC), Electronic Money Order Voucher Entry System (eMOVES), integrated retail terminal (IRT), POS ONE, and Small Post Office Reporting Tool (SPORT) offices will be required to record a shipment number and location ID when receiving or returning stamp stock at the unit level.

## Manual PS Form 17, Stamp Requisition/Stamp Return

PS Form 17, Stamp Requisition/Stamp Return, was revised to include the following blocks:

## Postal Retail Unit Receives Stamp Stock From the SDO, SSC, or Another Location

If the APC, eMOVES, IRT, POS ONE, or SPORT office receives stamp stock from the SDO, SSC, or another location, then the office must pick up the stock and ensure the amount is reflected into AIC 841, Stamp Stock Received, on the unit PS Form 1412, Daily Financial Report.

APC, eMOVES, IRT, or POS ONE offices must also:

1. Enter the 10 -digit numeric shipment number that is shown on the system-generated PS Form 17 received from the SDO or SSC or the manual PS Form 17 received from another location.
2. When stock is received from the SDO or SSC, enter the 10-digit unit finance number of the SDO or SSC.

- APC, eMOVES, and POS ONE offices must select "Receive from SDO/SSC." The system will display the unit's primary SDO/SSC unit finance number.
- IRT offices must select "Receive from SDO/SSC," then enter their primary SDO/SSC unit finance number. Thereafter, the system will display the unit's primary SDO/SSC unit finance number.

3. When stock is received from another location, enter the 10-digit unit finance number of the other location.

- APC, eMOVES, IRT, and POS ONE offices must select "Receive from Post Office," and enter the 10-digit unit finance number of the other location.
Note: To verify your primary SDO or SSC unit finance number, look at the PS Form 17 you received from your SDO or SSC. You will find their 6-digit unit finance number on the form. Add "0000" to this number.


## Postal Retail Unit Overstates Stamp Stock Received Shipment in AIC 841

eMOVES or IRT office must:

1. Select "Ship to Own Unit."
2. Enter the overstated amount into AIC 848.
3. Enter the original 10-digit numeric shipment number that was used with overstated AIC 841.

The system will display the unit's own 10-digit unit finance number.
Note: Currently this option is not available for APC, POS, or SPORT offices.

## Postal Retail Unit Ships Stamp Stock to the SDO, SSC, or Another Location

APC, eMOVES, or IRT offices must:

1. Enter the displayed system-generated 10-digit numeric shipment number on the manual PS Form 17.
2. Attach the system-generated shipment number receipt to the manual PS Form 17.
POS ONE offices must:
3. Enter the system-generated shipment number on the manual PS Form 17.
4. Attach the system-generated shipment number receipt to the manual PS Form 17.

## Verifying U.S. Postal Service Money Orders

Follow these steps to cash a Postal Service ${ }^{T M}$ money order:

1. Check that the amount does not exceed the legal limit: $\$ 1,000$ for domestic, and $\$ 700$ for international postal money orders.
2. Check that the proper security features are present:

- When held to the light, a watermark of Benjamin Franklin is repeated from top to bottom on the left side.
- When held to the light, a dark line (security thread) runs from top to bottom with the word "USPS" repeated.
- There should be no discoloration around the dollar amounts, which might indicate the amounts were changes.
These appear in Postal Service Notice 299, U.S. Postal Money Order Reference Card, or online at http://www.usps.com/missingmoneyorders/ security.htm.

3. If the money order seems suspicious, call the U.S. Postal Service Money Order Verification System at 866-459-7822.
Please provide this information to local banks and retailers, as they also receive Postal Service money orders for cashing.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

A1. Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Commander," "Commanding Officer," etc.
B. PS Form 2976-A is required for all mail weighing 16 ounces or more, with exceptions noted below. In addition, mailers must properly complete required customs documentation when mailing any potentially dutiable mail addressed to an APO or FPO regardless of weight. The following are exceptions to the requirement for customs documentation on nondutiable mail that weighs 16 ounces or more:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters, and printed matter weighing 16 ounces or more. (A known mailer is anyone who legally applies a permit imprint to a mailpiece. Mail with meter postage is not considered to be from a known mailer.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies are exempt from providing customs documentation on mail addressed to an APO or FPO, except for those APOs/FPOs to which restriction B2 applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use - Exempt from Customs Requirements."
B1. PS Form 2976 or 2976-A is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents. Exceptions: All other exceptions listed in restriction B above are applicable to this restriction.

B2. All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending mail addressed to or from this APO or FPO weighing 16 ounces or more.
C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited

C1. Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.
D. Coffee is prohibited.

E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

E2. Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited. Although religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.

E3. Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.
F. Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM 601.11.1.2c. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/FPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in DMM 601.11.2 and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.

F1. Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

F2. Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.
G. Only First-Class Mail letters, Periodicals, and Standard Mail items are authorized.
H. Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.
I. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

L. All official mail is prohibited.
M. Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.
N. Registered mail is prohibited.
O. Delivery status information for Extra Services is not available on USPS.com.
P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.
Q. Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.
R. All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM 601.8.0, are prohibited.

R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.
T. Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.
U. Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

U1. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

U2. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail letters only when addressed to Box R.

U3. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.
V. Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) not available from any origin.

V1. Delivery Confirmation service is not available.
W. Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.
X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.
Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail items only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail items, and Package Services items (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

## Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).

Z1. The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O817E or O818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

SPORT offices must:

1. Enter the word "SPORT" in the shipment number on the manual PS Form 17.
2. When stock is returned to the SDO or SSC, enter the 10-digit unit finance number of the SDO or SSC on the manual PS Form 17.

- APC, eMOVES, and POS ONE offices must select "Ship to SDO/SSC." The system will display the unit's primary SDO/SSC unit finance number.
- IRT offices must select "Ship to SDO/SSC." If already set up, the system will display the unit's primary SDO/SSC unit finance number.
- SPORT offices must enter the 10-digit unit finance number of the SDO or SSC on the manual PS Form 17.

3. When the office ships stock to another location, enter the 10-digit unit finance number of the other location on the manual PS Form 17.

- APC, eMOVES, IRT, and POS ONE offices must:
- Select "Ship to Post Office."
- Enter the 10 -digit unit finance number of the other location.
- SPORT offices must enter the 10-digit unit finance number of the other location on the manual PS Form 17.

4. Ensure amount shipped is reflected in AIC 848, Stamp Stock Returned, on the unit's PS Form 1412.
5. Ship the carton to the SDO/SSC or other location.

## SDO/SSC Receives Stamp Stock From APC, eMOVES, IRT, POS ONE, or SPORT Office

The SDO or SSC must report the amount in the Stamps Services System (SSS) using inventory modification (IMOD) 02 (Stock Received From Other USPS Sites).

1. Enter the 10-digit unit finance \# of the shipping office.
2. Enter the 10-digit numeric shipment number that was generated from the APC, eMOVES, IRT, or POS ONE and is reported on manual PS Form 17.
Note: SPORT sites will not have a 10 -digit numeric shipment number on manual PS Form 17.

## Postal Retail Unit Manual PS Form 17 is Missing the Shipment Number

Shipment is considered not properly prepared, and will be returned to the originating unit (except for SPORT offices).

SDO and SSC offices must:

1. Report the returned stamp stock in the SSS:

- Enter total amount on manual PS Form 17 in IMOD 02 (Stock Received From Other USPS Sites).
- Check the "No Shipment Number" box.
- Use item number 109100 (\$1.00 stock) and/or item number 106100 (\$. 01 stock).

2. Indicate on manual PS Form 17 "No Shipment Number" that has to be corrected.
3. Without opening the carton, prepare the carton to be returned back to the unit with a new registered number.
4. Enter the returned amount in IMOD 07 (Stock Shipped) using item number 109100 (\$1.00 stock) and/or item number 106100 ( $\$ .01$ stock).
5. Attach a new system-generated PS Form 17 with a new 10-digit numeric shipment number to the carton and ship it back to the originating office.

## Postal Retail Unit Receipt of Returned Stamp Stock Shipment From SDO or SSC

APC, eMOVES, IRT, or POS ONE offices must:

1. Pick up the returned stock and ensure that the amount is reported in AIC 841 on the unit's PS Form 1412.
2. Enter the new 10 -digit numeric shipment number that is shown on the system-generated PS Form 17 from the SDO or SSC. Do not use the original 10-digit numeric shipment number that was generated when the stock was originally shipped using AIC 848.
3. After a correction is made, apply a new registered number and a new 10-digit numeric shipment number and reship the stamp stock to the SDO/SSC.

## SDO and SSC Receiving Stamp Stock From Suppliers or Other Sources (Warehouses)

SDO and SSC offices must:

1. Report the amount received from suppliers in the SSS using IMOD 01 (Stock Received From Suppliers).

- Select the Vendor.
- Enter the numeric shipment number.

2. Report the amount received from another SDO or SSC using IMOD 03 (Stock Received From Other Warehouses).

- Enter the 10-digit unit finance number.
- Enter the 10 -digit numeric shipment number.


## SDO or SSC Overstates Stamp Stock Received

 Shipment in IMOD Codes 1, 2, or 3SDO and SSC offices must enter the overstated amount in the SSS using IMOD 60 (Stock Overage Correction).

## Revised Documents

## Hazardous Materials Items

The Postal Service ${ }^{T M}$ has developed three new job aids and revised two existing HAZMAT posters to help employees to comply with Postal Service requirements for mail handling and processing of hazardous materials. The new materials are the following:

- Label DECDDD-4, Prohibited Item Return Label.

■ Label DECDDD-5, International Nonmailable Item Label.

- Notice 128, The Safety of the Mail Is Everyone's Responsibility.
The revised posters are the following:
- Poster 138, Keep the Mail Safe.
- Poster 298, Department of Transportation Hazardous Materials Warning Labels.


## Label DECDDD-4, Prohibited Item Return Label

The Postal Service prohibits the mailing of alcoholic beverages per the Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM ${ }^{\oplus}$ ) 601.11.7. Postal Service employees must assume that all markings and labels on a mailpiece indicate the mailpiece's actual contents. Under new Postal Service procedures, alcoholic beverage boxes must be returned to the mailer. At this step, the revised Label DECDDD-4, Prohibited Item Return Label, is used.

> Important Customer Information We regret that your mail is being returned to you because it bears alcoholic beverage (e.g., beer, wine, liquor) markings or labels. The Postal Service prohibits the mailing of alcoholic beverages [Domestic Mail Manual (DMM) 601.11 .7 ]. Postal Service employees must assume that markings and labels on mail indicate the actual contents (DMM $601.5 .1 \mathrm{~b})$. As such, all mail pieces containing alcoholic beverages and/ or bearing alcoholic beverage markings are prohibited in the mail. To determine if you are eligible for a postage refund, take this mail piece with the notice attached to the retail counter at a Post Office ${ }^{\text {TMM }}$ DECDDD4, July 2005 PSN $7690-08-000-1490$

If a Postal Service employee encounters an alcoholic beverage box at any point in the mailstream (originating and destinating), then he or she must follow this protocol:

1. Affix a Label DECDDD-4 over the address information.
2. Place Label 127, Surface Transportation Only Label, on the mailpiece.
3. Return the mailpiece to the sender via the most efficient surface transportation network.

Note: Air transportation is prohibited.
You can order Label DECDDD-4 from the Material Distribution Center (MDC) and use touch tone order entry (TTOE): Call 800-332-0317, option 2.
Note: You must be registered to use TTOE. To register, call 800-332-0317, option 1, extension 2925, and follow the prompts to leave a message. (Wait 48 hours after registering before placing your first order.)

## Label DECDDD-5, International Nonmailable Item Label

The mailing of hazardous materials to and from international and APO/FPO destinations is extremely limited. Many items permitted in domestic mail are prohibited in international and APO/FPO mail.

Label DECDDD-5 is designed for use on nonmailable international and APO/FPO mailpieces; the items are returned to the sender via surface transportation as long as the items meet the mailability standards for domestic mail. Label DECDDD-5 notifies customers of their errors and lets Postal Service employees know that the parcel is being returned to the sender.

## Important Customer Information

We regret that your mail is being returned to you because it bears the markings of items not permitted in international mail (e.g., hazardous materials, ORM-D, ORM-D-Air, dry ice). The Postal Service has strict guidelines for the mailing of items to international destinations [International Mail Manual (IMM) 130]. Postal Service employees must assume that markings and labels on mail indicate the actual contents. As such, all mail pieces containing nonmailable items and mail pieces bearing nonmailable markings are not permitted in international mail (IMM 131.1).
To determine if you are eligible for a postage refund, take this mailpiece, with this notice attached, to the retail counter at a Post Office ${ }^{T M}$.

Postal Service employees discovering a nonmailable international mailpiece at any point in the mailstream are required to perform the following:

## Notice 128, The Safety of the Mail is Everyone's Responsibility

Notice 128, The Safety of the Mail is Everyone's Responsibility, is a recent addition to Postal Service HAZMAT reference material. Delivery and collection employees have been trained to recognize nonmailable and unacceptable packages and have been instructed not to accept them. However, many times, the mailer is not present when the carrier/collector arrives.

Notice 128 serves as a communication tool for delivery and collection employees to inform mailers about why their package was not accepted. Notice 128 is left with each mailpiece deemed nonmailable or unacceptable under Postal Service regulations. In addition, Notice 128 provides customers information about the Postal Service's requirements for the mailing of hazardous materials and provides reference and local contact information.

## Distribution: Item 556500, \$1.00 Official Mail, WAG Pane of 20 Stamps

Only the Chicago, Illinois, accountable paper depository (APD), which is the sole distribution unit designated to accept penalty mail requisitions from authorized government agencies, will receive an automatic distribution of Item 556500. Only the Chicago APD may distribute this $\$ 1.00$ official mail stamp to authorized government agencies that submit PS Form 17-G, Penalty Mail Stamp Requisition. This new official mail stamp must not be distributed to government agencies before September 27, 2006.

## Initial Supply to Post Offices

## Pictorial Postmarks Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service ${ }^{T M}$ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided, as space permits, are illustrations of those postmarks that were reproducible and available at press time.

People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office ${ }^{\text {mM }}$ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the postmark, may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail ${ }^{-}$ postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include
postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserviced.

Customers wishing to obtain a postmark should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: PICTORIAL POSTMARKS, followed by the NAME OF THE STATION, ADDRESS, CITY, STATE, ZIP $+4{ }^{\circledR}$ CODE, exactly as listed below (using all capitals and no punctuation, except the hyphen in the ZIP+4 code).

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for postmark, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial postmark, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.

## New System Requires Postmasters and Station and Branch Managers to Save Current Business Connect Information



On October 1, 2006, we will implement a new system for the Business Connect ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ Data Center.

## How will this impact you?

The new system will not include existing customer information and Business Connect activities. After September 29, 2006, information not retained as described below will no longer be available.

## What should you do?

By 11:59 P.M. CDT September 29, 2006, postmasters and station and branch managers must print and retain customer information and the list of past Business Connect activities for their records. Directions on printing this information from the Business Connect Data Center are noted in this article.

Remember, after September 29, 2006, all current customer data and Business Connect activities will no longer be available, so now is the time to retain this information for
your records. If you have any questions, please e-mail BusinessConnect@usps.gov.

## To print customer information:

1. Log into the Business Connect Data Center; under "Activities" (on the left side of the page), click on View/Edit My Activities.
2. Click on the magnifying glass next to an activity you wish to view - this will take you to the "Update Customer Information or Enter Revenue" screen.
3. Click on the magnifying glass in the middle of the screen to bring up the "Company Information" page.
4. Right-click the mouse, and then click on Print.
5. Go back to the "Update Customer Information or Enter Revenue" screen; click on the blue circle in the middle of the screen to go to the "Add/Edit/View Revenue" page.
6. Right-click the mouse, and then click on Print.
7. Keep these printouts for your records.

To print a list of your Business Connect activities:

1. After printing the customer information as described above, stay in the Business Connect Data Center; under "Activities" (on the left side of the page), click on View/Edit My Activities.
2. Click on the Print Activities button below the list of activities; scroll down to the bottom of the screen and click on Print.
3. Keep this printout for your records.

The cost per unit of 500 is $\$ 11.00$. This cost includes overprinting the address of the fulfillment office placing the order. You may pay for orders with local IMPAC credit cards, checks, or money orders. However, Cyril-Scott Company cannot process the order until it receives payment. Local eBuy procedures may also apply (refer to local procurement procedures).

Postal Service ${ }^{T M}$ Headquarters has funded a national procurement for this print run for 4 million brochures for the Stamps By Mail centralized computer processing sites. The distribution amount for each site is available by referencing
column $\mathrm{J}(4 \mathrm{MM})$ of the centralized site address spreadsheet. These quantities are based on revenue generated by site. No local order placement is required to receive brochures from this distribution. However, centralized sites may order additional quantities from the Cyril-Scott Company from local funds by following the ordering instructions contained within this article. If you order additional quantities from local funds, please inform Cyril Scott when ordering that the order is a centralized site supplemental order.

All other local Post Offices ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ should follow the ordering instructions contained within this article and utilize local funds.

Cyril-Scott Company will deliver orders within 35 calendar days after printing. Printing begins 1 week after the deadline date, and actual receipt of the order will depend on the ultimate destination and the corresponding delivery service standard. You should save copies of all orders placed at your local Post Office until the order has been received. Please ensure procedures are in effect locally for proper verification of receipt.

We will publish the print run schedule for Fiscal Year 2007 in a subsequent Postal Bulletin.

## Passport to Growing Revenue

Due to an increase in passport application volume, the Department of State has modified the estimated time frame to process a passport application. Processing times vary according to the Passport Agency's workload. With passport applications on the rise, it's a good idea to review both expedited and routine passport services:

EXPEDITED SERVICE: For customers who need passports in less than 6 weeks, the Department of State will process a passport within 2 weeks of application. Express Mail service to and from the Department of State must be used in order to receive the passport within 2 weeks.

ROUTINE SERVICE: Passport processing takes 6 to 8 weeks. Customers who need their passport in less than 6 weeks should be encouraged to expedite their application.

## USPS Awards Two New National Contracts for Corrugated Fiberboard Pallet Boxes

On August 30, 2006, the Mail Transport Equipment (MTE) Category Team awarded 3-year contracts to International Paper and Rand Whitney to supply corrugated fiberboard pallet boxes to all Postal Service ${ }^{T M}$ mail processing facilities. The International Paper contract is effective October 1, 2006, and the Rand Whitney contract is effective September 1, 2006. Based on estimated annual usage, the projected value of these contracts is $\$ 33,370,000$ per year.

Use the eBuy online catalog requisition to place orders. Orders placed via the catalog will be routed to either International Paper or Rand Whitney.

One goal of this supply chain management effort is to consolidate requirements in order to leverage USPS® demand. As a result, the overall cost of the corrugated fiberboard pallet boxes has been reduced by $8 \%$. Additionally,
time of delivery from manufacturing site to facility will be reduced because the manufacturing site is selected based on its proximity to the Postal Service mail processing facility placing the order. International Paper has 10 manufacturing facilities across the United States and Rand Whitney has a state-of-the-art manufacturing facility strategically located in the Northeast. The final advantage of these contracts is that all responsibility from receipt of order to delivery falls on the suppliers.
