## A world of improvement: New international shipping products bring your doorstep to the world

When the new prices go into effect May 12, USPS will once again take center stage in the international marketplace. Customers told us they wanted easier, more convenient options to ship internationally, and in 2007, we gave it
 to them. We streamlined a sometimes-confusing and overlapping array of eight major products to just four: Global Express Guaranteed, Express Mail International, Priority Mail International and First-Class Mail International.

Global Express Guaranteed (GXG), our premier global shipping product, takes 1-3 business days. We partner with FedEx to leverage the strength of their global network and our accessibility - customers get the best of both! Not only that, but there's a money-back delivery guarantee and \$100 insurance included.

GXG volume has virtually doubled over the last year, and our competitive pricing is even more attractive online with a 10-percent discount.

Express Mail International is our fast, reliable, date-certain international product that arrives in 3-5 business days. Once again, \$100 insurance is included, and there's a flatrate envelope available.

And how about Priority Mail International? It's reliable and economical. It usually takes $6-10$ business days; there's a flat-rate envelope available, and three sizes of flatrate boxes from which to choose. The new Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box is available for international use for only $\$ 29.95$ to Canada/Mexico, $\$ 49.95$ to other countries - and it's 50 percent larger than other flat-rate boxes!

And all international products use the same envirofriendly packaging as domestic Express Mail and Priority Mail.

But customers aren't the only ones benefiting from the redesign of international products. We've made it easier for employees to complete international transactions, too. POS terminals walk you right through, step by step, including help with navigating the Customs forms.

The new USPS international products - a world of improvement at your fingertips.

## Coffee, tea or APC?

The New York Metro Area recently came up with a stimulating idea designed to drive business to some of its Automated Postal Centers (APC).

More than 100,000 coffee sleeves touting the ease and convenience of APCs were delivered to 54 local

The campaign was an innovative way to promote APCs - and it worked. APC revenues at the three locations increased an average of 12 percent over the same period last year, and by 50 percent at Whitehall Station.

There's no word yet on whether USPS will try the promotion in other areas. But it's clear that in downtown New York City, the promotion was a real eye opener.

## Most trusted agency

The premier privacy trust study in America has named the Postal Service the "Most Trusted Government Agency" for the fourth year in a row.

More than 86 percent of the 9,000 Americans surveyed by the Ponemon Institute ranked the Postal Service first among 74 agencies as the one best
 able to keep their information safe and secure.
"We have a 230-year tradition of trust," said Delores Killette, vice president and consumer advocate. "Americans depend on the security of the mail, and they trust the Postal Service to protect their privacy."

Killette attributed the No. 1 ranking in part to the relationship Americans have with their letter carriers. Carriers are a welcome and trusted member of the local community, she said.
"Because of this, the Postal Service truly is not a faceless agency," Killette said. "Consumer confidence in the mail is a top priority for the Postal Service and the Postal Inspection Service."

## New online exhibit puts a stamp on "Black Experience"

In 1940, Booker T. Washington became the first African American featured on a postage stamp. Since then, notable African Americans - from colonial days to the present - have been honored on more than 100 stamps.

## Large Flat-Rate Boxes are a nationwide hit

Through the end of March, the Western Area had sold the most Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Boxes, accounting for a fifth of all large flat-rate box revenue, followed by the Pacific, Southeast, Great Lakes and Southwest.

The San Diego District was the single highest-selling district, selling more than 4,500 boxes, followed by Seattle, Santa Ana, Colorado/Wyoming, Rio Grande, Van Nuys, Lakeland, Northland, Bay-Valley and Honolulu. Half of the top 10 sellers were in the Pacific Area.

An interesting trend: In nearly every area, sales of the APO/FPO-branded large flat-rate boxes have outpaced sales of "regular" large Priority Mail boxes. The military boxes outsold the regular box by a nearly three-to-one margin in the Southwest Area, and by a two-to-one margin in three other areas.

That held true nationally as well. Sales of the APO/FPObranded large box accounted for 44 percent of all Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box sales through the end of March, compared to 33 percent for the regular domestic box and 23 percent for international sales.

## GXG Online Field Information Kit

This information kit is designed to inform Postal Service ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ employees and customers about the new availability of Global Express Guaranteed ${ }^{\circledR}\left(\mathrm{GXG}^{\circledR}\right)$ service on Click-N-Ship ${ }^{\circledR}$ service, as well as serving to raise awareness among Postal Service employees and the public about the features of GXG service. The kit contains the following materials:

- General information.
- Images of GXG mailing labels and commercial invoices.
- Information for customers and postal employees on correctly filling out GXG forms.
- Standup talk for retail associates.
- Standup talk for mail distribution clerks.


## Background

GXG service is the Postal Service's premier international service for mailing extremely urgent documents and packages to over 190 countries for date-certain, money-back guarantee delivery. And Click-N-Ship service is one of the Postal Service's most popular Internet services, with millions of customers using the system each month to calculate postage rates, print mailing labels with postage, and prepare Customs forms - all from the convenience of their own homes and offices. On April 16, 2008, GXG service was added to the suite of international mailing options on Click-N-Ship service, making it easier and more convenient for customers to access GXG service online. Customers who pay for GXG service online receive the extra incentive of a commercial base price that is 10 percent below the price at retail.

## GXG Service Online for Speed and Convenience

GXG service is an especially attractive product for consumers and businesses that need to send valuable and time-sensitive documents and packages quickly and securely overseas. Potential users for documents by GXG service include applicants for visas and passports, professors and physicians submitting grants and applications with deadlines, and mailers of legal documents. Potential users for packages by GXG service include travelers
abroad who have left something important at home like their house keys that they need sent to them as quickly as possible, people who realize that they are almost late in getting birthday or other gifts to loved ones overseas, and small businesses sending valuable items to international clients.

Preparing GXG mailings online enables customers to see exactly when a commercial invoice is required and what the prohibitions and restrictions are for mailings to any particular country.

## GXG Shipping Kit

As part of the GXG online launch, the Postal Service is producing a shipping kit for customers that will include the following:

- Five GXG cardboard envelopes.
- Five GXG Tyvek envelopes.
- A roll of GXG stickers.
- Ten GXG mailing labels (also known as GXG international air waybills).
- Five GXG commercial invoices (PS Form 6182, Commercial Invoice), also known as Cls, used as Customs forms.
- Five plastic pouches to hold the online mailing labels and Customs forms.

Everything that a customer might need to complete a GXG transaction is all gathered together in one convenient place. Beginning in May, these shipping kits will be made available free to customers who respond to an advertising campaign - customers will receive messages through an e-mail blast, a banner ad on USPS.com ${ }^{\circledR}$, a direct mail postcard, and print ads in business journals. They will respond by filling out their contact information at a Web site or by sending back a business reply mail postcard.

After the promotional period, customers can get additional free GXG mailing supplies online at www.usps.com/ shippingsupplies, by fax at 800-270-6233, by phone at 800-610-8734, or at a GXG participating Post Office ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ facility.

## GXG Supplies for Post Offices

An advertising campaign featuring GXG service will begin at the end of May 2008. Prepare in advance for an increase in GXG volume by familiarizing yourself with what the product looks like and how to handle it. Also, ensure that you have sufficient GXG mailing supplies in your Post Office.

If you have Internet access, order your office's GXG supplies through eBuy, following the procedures outlined in Postal Bulletin 22174 (2-16-06, pages 74-75). Otherwise, you can place your order by calling the Material Distribution Center (MDC) at 800-273-1509 and follow the prompts. Those without eBuy can fax 800-270-6233 or call 800-6108764. ## Mailing Label and Completion Instructions



Note: The Mailing Label (International Air Waybill, Item 11FGG1) must be completed in English. If not filled out entirely in English, the shipment will be refused and returned to the origin office.
Section 1 - From mailer's address information. Make sure all of the following information is entered completely and accurately:

- Date.
- Sender's Full Name.
- Sender's Telephone Number.
- Company Name - if applicable.
- Sender's complete address, including City, State, Country, and ZIP Code.

Section 2 - To destination address information. Make sure all the following information is entered completely and accurately:

- Recipient's Full Name.
- Recipient's Telephone Number - required if shipment is addressed to a P.O. box.
- Recipient's Fax Number - if applicable; helpful in case of an inaccurate destination address or difficulty with delivery.
- Recipient's Complete Address - including Postal Code. Do NOT abbreviate City, State/Province, or Country. Make sure to use English (for instance, "Moscow" instead of "Moskva"). POS ONE and Click-N-Ship service provide the Postal Code when required, if the correct city name is entered.
- Recipient's Tax ID Number for Customs Purposes (if applicable).


## Section 3 - Shipment Information

Documents: Check this box if the shipment contains only correspondence and/or printed matter.
Non-Documents: Check this box for all other items. The recipient may be required to pay import duties and taxes. This shipment may be subject to Customs inspection.

Description: REQUIRED. A proper description must be provided on the mailing label for EACH item in the shipment in order for the shipment to clear Customs. A proper description consists of four parts: item, detailed description, country of manufacture (where known), and value (the selling price or fair market value of the contents, in U.S. dollars.) Document value is $\$ 1.00$ or the cost of document reconstruction, whichever is higher. EXCEPTION: Document shipments to Mexico CANNOT have a value listed. Each document item should be fully described (for example, diploma, birth certificate, marriage license).

Total Value for Customs - If a commercial invoice is required, enter the sum of the total postage, fees, and packaging costs to the value of the items.

## Section 4 - Required Signature

The mailing label must be signed by the sender or company representative. Online labels do not need signatures - the name printed online serves as the signature.

## Section 5 - Postal Use Only

Each block of the "Postal Use Only" section must be completed by the retail associate. Please note that some of these fields, such as Postage and Insurance Fee, will be pre-populated in the online labels.

- Acceptance Date In.
- Acceptance Time In (check AM or PM).
- Scheduled Delivery Date.
- Acceptance Post Office ZIP+4 Code.
- Employee Initials.
- Dimensions in Inches (for non-document shipments).
- Weight (in pounds and ounces).
- Postage in U.S. Dollars.
- Insurance Fee in U.S. Dollars.
- Total Postage and Fees in U.S. Dollars - On shipments where a Commercial Invoice is required, the Total Postage and Fees amount should be added to the value of items in Section 4 above plus any packing costs to give the amount that is filled in the Total Value for Customs field.
- Packaging Type - check GXG packaging or type of customer-provided packaging.

Please note the GXG Air Waybill (Mailing Label) Item is currently being updated to include a privacy statement. Post Offices are encouraged to use up their existing stock before reordering.

## How to Transfer Information from Mailing Label to Commercial Invoice

Mailing Label, GXG International Waybill, Item 11FGG1


## PS Form 6182, Commercial Invoice


a) Fill in mailing label (GXG International Waybill, Item 11FGG1) first. If a Commercial Invoice (CI, PS Form 6182) is required, leave the mail label field marked A, Total Value for Customs, blank until after filling out the commercial invoice.
b) When a Cl is required, carefully transfer information from the appropriate fields on the mailing label to the Cl . The diagram shows that the information from the area marked 1 on the mailing label goes to the area marked 1 on the Cl ; the information from the area marked 2 on the mailing label goes to the area marked 2 on the Cl , etc.
c) On the Cl , add together the total value of the shipment, the packing cost, postage/shipping charges, and insurance cost to get the Total Invoice Value. Enter this amount in the field marked $\mathbf{A}$ (item 21) and also the field marked A (Total Value for Customs) on the mailing label.

## Commercial Invoice and Completion Instructions



Note: Refer to the Documentation Requirement section of Alphabetical Listing of Countries and Cities Served in Publication 141, Global Express Guaranteed Service Guide, or in POS ONE to determine if a commercial invoice is required for a shipment. A commercial invoice may be required for personal shipments as well as for commercial shipments. If a commodity is not listed or if there is any doubt, complete a commercial invoice for the shipment.

The Commercial Invoice must be completed in English. Three copies must accompany the shipment. Make sure all of the following information is filled out completely and accurately.

1. Enter the mailing label (GXG International Air Waybill, Form 11FGG1) number. It is the 10-digit USPS tracking number located on the bottom right corner of the mailing label.
2. [a-f] Enter the shipper's full name, complete address, and country.
3. [a-g] Enter the recipient's full name, complete address, and country. This information must be provided. Provide the tax ID number (that is, GST, VAT, RFC) or EIN (if applicable or known by the shipper).
4. Enter country of ultimate destination. Enter the name of the country even if the goods are destined to the same country as the recipient or to a country other than the country of the recipient.
5. Exporting carrier is pre-filled - FedEx.
6. Total number of packages is pre-filled - 1. (GXG shipments are limited to one package per shipment.)
7. Enter the total gross shipment weight in pounds and ounces.
The Commercial Shipments Only section, which includes numbers 8,9 , and 10 , is completed by business customers.
8. [a-c] For commercial shipments, enter invoice date, invoice number, and customer order number (if applicable).
9. [a-g] Enter the buyer's full name, complete address, country, and tax ID number (that is, GST, VAT, RFC) or EIN, if applicable.
10. For commercial shipments, enter the terms and conditions of delivery and payment.
11. Enter a FULL description of EACH item in the shipment (for example, 100\% wool sweater).
12. Enter the country of manufacture of EACH item in the shipment (for example, Ireland).
13. Enter the quantity and unit of measurement for EACH item in the shipment (for example, 2 dozen).
14. Enter EACH item's unit per piece value (for example, \$336/dozen).
15. Enter the currency type and amount (for example, US $\$ 672$ ). This should equal the number of units indicated in the unit of measure field, multiplied by the unit value amount (that is, field $13 \times$ field 14).
16. [a-d] Name, date, location, and written signature of the person completing this commercial invoice.
17. Enter the currency type and total amount from column 15.
18. Enter any packing costs, including packaging.
19. Enter the GXG postage/shipping charges.
20. Enter any insurance premium paid to insure the shipment.
21. Enter the sum of the total amount, packing cost, and insurance cost. This should be the same as the declared value for Customs in section 3 of the mailing label (GXG International Air Waybill).

## Standup Talk for Retail Associates - GXG Online

[Please read this standup talk to all retail associates and then post copies of this standup talk on employee bulletin boards.]
On April 16, 2008, Global Express Guaranteed (GXG) service will officially become an option on Click-N-Ship service, completing the suite of international mailing and shipping options available through that channel. We are expecting volume to increase as GXG service is now more convenient for customers to use.

You can help increase GXG sales at retail as well. Ask if your customer is interested in getting speedy and reliable international delivery - and inform customers about GXG service, the fastest USPS international service.

Here are some of GXG's most important features:

- GXG is reliable - it is sold by the Postal Service and transported and delivered by FedEx Express.
- GXG offers date-certain delivery in 1 to 3 business days to major foreign cities.
- There is a money-back guarantee.
- GXG has the lowest retail price compared to our competitors.
- There is a 10 percent commercial base price incentive when purchased online.
- Free Package Pickup is available.
- Tracking is available from the time the item is scanned by the Postal Service until it is delivered abroad.
- Insurance is available - the first $\$ 100$ of insurance is included free, and insurance for up to $\$ 2,499$ is available for a fee.

As the result of increased awareness and an advertising campaign, more customers will be handing you GXG shipments that they have prepared themselves by paying for postage and printing out mailing labels and Customs forms online. You must scan the piece in POS ONE. Make sure that the mailing label is filled out correctly, and if a Customs form (called a Commercial Invoice) was required (POS ONE will tell you), make sure it is filled out completely and correctly, matching the information that is on the mailing label.

If customers present a package or document on which they have paid postage with Click-N-Ship service or another PC postage vendor, do not collect any additional postage at the counter. If the postage is short paid, don't return the package or document to the customer. Tell the customer that they will receive an e-mail informing them that their item is short paid, at which time they will need to pay the balance with their credit card of record before they can mail any other Click-N-Ship items.

After you complete the GXG acceptance transaction, please make sure you complete the following steps:

- Place GXG pieces in an Express Mail ${ }^{\circledR}$ sack designated for GXG service.
- Prior to dispatch, secure GXG sacks for appropriate transportation (same as Express Mail transportation).
- Attach GXG sack tags (PS141) to Express Mail sacks that contain only GXG pieces.
- Insert sack slide labels for each sack for routing to your designated processing AMC or P\&DC.

GXG pieces and sacks must be kept separate from other mail and dispatched with Express Mail only. If you dispatch directly to FedEx, you should segregate GXG items from Express Mail items for the handoff to FedEx.

## DMM Revision: Preparing Origin Mixed Area Distribution Center Sacks on Pallets

Effective May 12, 2008, the Postal Service ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ is revising the Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, Domestic Mail Manual ( $\mathrm{DMM}^{\circledR}$ ) 705.8.10.1 to allow Periodicals mailers to place origin mixed area distribution center (OMX) sacks on origin sectional center facility (SCF) pallets. We are also providing a new option for mailers to create OMX pallets.

Scanning of pallet labels enables mailers and the Postal Service to track mail received in our processing facilities. Mail not presented on pallets may prove more difficult to track because there is no label to scan. ## Handbook F-21 Revision: Rural Replacement Carrier Training Pay Procedures

Effective immediately, Handbook F-21, Time and Attendance, Chapter 5, Rural Carrier Procedures, is revised to include updates to section 587.3 that provide proper timekeeping information for leave replacement training pay as outlined in this article. These changes are necessary to ensure compliance with the 2006-2010 USPS/NRLCA National Agreement.

These revisions will be incorporated into the next printed version of Handbook F-21.

Beginning December 3, 2007, pay period 25, a newly appointed rural carrier associate (RCA) will be paid the greater of the actual hours worked or the evaluation of the route(s) served (up to 40 hours) for the first five (5) pay periods of employment. There will be no special timekeeping procedures required by local offices to provide the appropriate compensation.

Also effective pay period (PP) 25 substitute rural carriers, rural carrier relief employees and rural carrier associates are eligible to receive training pay when completing service on a rural route which he/she has not served in the past twelve (12) months. The leave replacement (Designation 73,75 , or 78 ) will be paid the greater of the actual hours worked or the daily evaluation of the route (up to 40 hours) for the day.

Offices may complete PS Form 2240-R, Rural Pay or Leave Adjustment Request for PS Form 1314, to provide compensation to leave replacements who should have received training pay after December 3, 2007, and prior to this article, for serving a route which had not been served by the carrier in the past twelve (12) months.

Timekeeping procedures for electronic badge reader (EBR) offices will be included in the Rural Time and Attendance Collection System (RTACS) Training Guide.

### 587.31 Newly Appointed Rural Carrier Associate

A newly appointed rural carrier associate (RCA) will be paid the higher of the two rates (evaluated hours versus actual hours) for each week for the first five pay periods of employment. The payroll system will automatically determine the greater of the two payments for each week. This change is effective PP25-2007.

### 587.32 Route Not Served in Past Twelve Months

When it has been determined that a substitute, rural carrier relief (RCR), or rural carrier associate (RCA) has not served a particular rural route in the past twelve (12) months, the carrier will be paid the greater of the actual hours worked or the daily evaluated hours of the route for 1 day.
The local office must determine if the actual hours worked is greater than the daily evaluated hours of the route. To determine the daily evaluation of the route, complete the appropriate calculation as follows:

A and H routes - divide the weekly evaluated hours by 6 .
$J$ route - divide the weekly evaluated hours by 5.5.
K route - divide the weekly evaluated hours by 5.
If the actual hours worked is greater than the daily evaluated hours of the route, the evaluated hours are entered on PS Form 1314 for the route served. Enter the number of hours over the evaluated hours on PS Form 1314-A, and route number A995 will be used to capture the additional time. (See Exhibit 587.32)
If the actual hours worked are less than the daily evaluated hours of the route, enter the work hours on PS Form 1314 only. No additional entries are necessary on PS Form 1314-A.
For auxiliary routes, if the actual work hours are greater than the daily evaluated hours, enter the evaluation on PS Form 1314-A for the auxiliary route and complete a second PS Form 1314-A, using route number A995 to capture the additional time.

## Exhibit 587.32Route Not Served in Past Twelve Months

The rural carrier associate (RCA) worked on route J003, Monday and Tuesday, in week 1. The RCA has not served the route in the past twelve (12) months. The route is a 46-hour route.
Calculate the daily evaluation of the route. $46 \div 5.5=$ 8.36 hours per day.

The RCA's actual work hours for route J003 are 9.18 hours on Monday and 9.25 hours on Tuesday. The RCA is entitled to the greater of the actual hours for Monday only. On

PS Form 1314 for route J003, add 8.36 hours for Monday and 9.25 hours for Tuesday, and enter the total hours for the week. 17.61 hours will be entered for week 1.

Prepare PS Form 1314-A with route number A995 and enter the difference between the actual work hours and the daily evaluated hours of the route for Monday ( $9.18-8.36=.82$ ). Enter 0082 on PS Form 1314-A for week 1. No entries are to be made for Equipment Maintenance Allowance (EMA).

Starting June 16, 2008, Post Offices ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ and Postal Retail Units must use the revised Postal Service ${ }^{T M}$ PS Form 3849, Delivery Notice/Reminder/Receipt. It is being revised as a result of changes to Postal Service redelivery procedures for Express Mail ${ }^{\circledR}$ service. Offices may begin ordering the new PS Form 3849 from the Label Printing Center (LPC) in Topeka on or after April 28, 2008. All offices must begin using the revised PS Form 3849 on June 16, 2008.

The item number 7530-05-000-4581 for the overprinted label will not change. All previous versions of PS Form 3849 become obsolete on June 16, 2008, and offices should recycle the old forms.

The following changes were made to PS Form 3849:

- Removed text after Express Mail that stated "We will attempt to deliver on the next delivery day unless you instruct the post office to hold it." This change reflects the elimination of next day redelivery for Express Mail service. There will no longer be automatic redelivery of Express Mail items on the second
day. A policy letter will be issued from the vice presidents of Delivery and Retail Operations.
- Removed Recorded Delivery service. This service is no longer available for international shipments.

## Verifying U.S. Postal Service Money Orders

Follow these steps to cash a Postal Service ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ money order:

1. Check that the amount does not exceed the legal limit: \$1,000 for domestic, and \$700 for international postal money orders.
2. Check that the proper security features are present:

- When held to the light, a watermark of Benjamin Franklin is repeated from top to bottom on the left side.
- When held to the light, a dark line (security thread) runs from top to bottom with the word "USPS" repeated.
- There should be no discoloration around the dollar amounts, which might indicate the amounts were changes.
These appear in Postal Service Notice 299, U.S. Postal Money Order Reference Card, or online at http://www.usps.com/missingmoneyorders/ security.htm.

3. If the money order seems suspicious, call the U.S. Postal Service Money Order Verification System at 866-459-7822.
Please provide this information to local banks and retailers, as they also receive Postal Service money orders for cashing.

Mail addressed to military post offices overseas is subject to certain conditions or restrictions of mailing regarding content, preparation, and handling. The APO/FPO table below outlines these conditions by APO/FPO ZIP ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ Codes through the use of footnoted mailing restrictions codes (see the Restrictions page following the table).

Acceptance clerks should use the table with the integrated retail terminal (IRT) or POS ONE terminal to determine which APO/FPO ZIP Codes are active and which
conditions of mailing apply. Acceptance clerks may contact the Military Postal Service Agency with any questions regarding APO/FPO ZIP Codes, toll free, at 800-810-6098, Monday-Friday, 0730-1600 ET.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

A1. Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Commander," "Commanding Officer," etc.
B. PS Form 2976-A is required for all mail weighing 16 ounces or more, with exceptions noted below. In addition, mailers must properly complete required customs documentation when mailing any potentially dutiable mail addressed to an APO or FPO regardless of weight. The following are exceptions to the requirement for customs documentation on nondutiable mail that weighs 16 ounces or more:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters, and printed matter weighing 16 ounces or more. (A known mailer is anyone who legally applies a permit imprint to a mailpiece. Mail with meter postage is not considered to be from a known mailer.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies are exempt from providing customs documentation on mail addressed to an APO or FPO, except for those APOs/FPOs to which restriction B2 applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use - Exempt from Customs Requirements."
B1. PS Form 2976 or 2976-A is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents. Exceptions: All other exceptions listed in restriction B above are applicable to this restriction.

B2. All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending mail addressed to or from this APO or FPO weighing 16 ounces or more.
C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

C1. Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.
D. Coffee is prohibited.

E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.
E2. Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited. Although religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.

E3. Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.
F. Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM 601.11.1.2c. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/ FPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in DMM 601.11.2 and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.

F1. Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

F2. Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot. 22 caliber rifle per individual.
G. Only letters, flats, and Periodicals are authorized. Parcels of any class are prohibited.
H. Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.
I. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

- Maximum length 20 inches.
- Maximum width 12 inches.
- Maximum height 12 inches.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 68 inches.
This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

I1. This restriction does not apply to registered mail.
12. This restriction does not apply to official government mail marked MOM.
J. Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.
K. Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."
L. All official mail is prohibited.
M. Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.
N. Registered mail is prohibited.
O. Delivery status information for Extra Services is not available on USPS.com.
P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.
Q. Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.
R. All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM 601.8.0, are prohibited.

R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.
T. Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.
U. Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

U1. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

U2. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail letters only when addressed to Box R.

U3. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.
V. Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) not available from any origin.

V1. Delivery Confirmation service is not available.
W. Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.
X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.
Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail items only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail items, and Package Services items (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.
Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).

Z1. The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O817E or O818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

On May 12, 2008, in Washington, DC, the Postal Service ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ will re-issue the nondenominated First-Class Mail definitive Forever Stamp ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ (Liberty Bell) in one design in a pressure-sensitive adhesive (PSA) double-sided booklet of 20 stamps (Item 677700). The stamp, designed by Carl T. Herrman of Carlsbad, California, goes on sale nationwide May 12, 2008.

The stamp was first issued in 2007 as a double-sided convertible booklet of 20 (Item 676600), vending booklet of 20 (Item 676500), and ATM booklet of 18 (Item 569900).

As a community service, the Postal Service ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided are illustrations of those postmarks.

People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office ${ }^{T M}$ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event but who wish to obtain the postmark may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.

## How to Order the First Day of Issue Digital Color or Traditional Postmarks

Customers have 60 days to obtain the first day of issue postmarks by mail. They may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office ${ }^{\text {TM }}$, by telephone at 800-STAMP-24, or at The Postal Store ${ }^{\circledR}$ Web site at www.usps.com/shop.

## Traditional Postmarks

Customers should affix the stamps to envelopes of their choice, address them to themselves or others, or provide a self-addressed return envelope with sufficient postage large enough to accommodate the canceled item. Mail the request to the corresponding city of issuance. There is no charge for the first 50 postmarks. There is a 5 -cent charge for each additional postmark over 50. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment. After applying the first day of issue postmark, the Postal Service ${ }^{\mathrm{TM}}$ will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.

All postmark requests should go to the first day of issue city. The first day of issue city Post Office will then forward in bulk all postmark requests to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, P.O. Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992 by respective Post Offices.

## Digital Color Postmarks

Only select stamp issues offer a digital color postmark. Customers may submit \#6 or \#10 envelopes constructed of paper rated as "laser safe." The Postal Service recommends envelopes of 80-pound Accent Opaque, acid-free, $9 / 16 "$ side seams with no glue on the flap. The maximum size of all digital color postmarks is 2 " high x 4 " long. Allow
sufficient space on the envelope to accommodate the postmark and do not use self-adhesive labels for addresses on the envelope. Two test envelopes must be included. There is a minimum of 10 envelopes at 50 cents per postmark required at the time of servicing. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment.

The Postal Service reserves the right to not accept hand-painted and other cachet envelopes that are not compatible with our digital color postmark equipment. The Postal Service also reserves the right to substitute traditional black rubber postmarks if use of non-specified envelopes results in poor image quality or damage to equipment.

Customers should affix the stamps to the envelopes and address them to themselves or others for return through the mail. Or, they may include an additional self-addressed return envelope, large enough to accommodate their canceled items, with sufficient postage affixed for return of their postmarked items. Mail the request for a first day of issue digital color postmark to the corresponding city of issuance. Post Offices will then forward all customer requests for digital color postmarks to: Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, P.O. Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992.

After applying the first day of issue postmark, the Postal Service will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.

## Stamp Out Hunger! 16th Annual Letter Carriers Food Drive Coming Soon

The 16th annual Stamp Out Hunger Food Drive, sponsored by the National Association of Letter Carriers, is scheduled for Saturday, May 10. Letter carriers in more than 10,000 cities and towns across America, aided by rural carriers and other volunteers, will collect nonperishable food items donated by customers. The event is the largest annual 1-day food drive in the world.

The Campbell Soup Company and the U.S. Postal Service ${ }^{\circledR}$ are major supporters of the drive. The success is in its simplicity. All citizens need to do is place their donated items next to their mailbox before their letter carrier delivers the mail Saturday, May 10. The carriers do the rest, taking the items back to their stations, where they will be sorted and delivered to area food banks or pantries. In some areas of New York City and Chicago without mailbox collections, donors are asked to take their contributions to
their local participating Post Office ${ }^{\text {TM }}$, but will have an option of virtual food drives on the Internet to assist with collections for local food banks.

An estimated 35 million people face hunger every day in America including more than 9 million children. In 2007, the drive collected more than 70 million pounds of food - and more than three quarters of a billion pounds since its inception 16 years ago. The drive is one way to help stamp out hunger.
