

## WHAT IS **OPT**?

### OPT MEANS...

#### **OPTIONAL**

Not a required part of your course of study in the USA

#### **PRACTICAL**

Out of the classroom work

#### **TRAINING**

A continuation of your learning experience in the USA



## WHAT IS **OPT**?

### FAST FACTS...

- An extension of your F-1 visa status
- Max of 12 months of employment authorization
- Must only find work related to your MICA major
- You are allowed to apply for OPT before you have a job



**ARE YOU ELIGIBLE  
TO APPLY FOR OPT?**

**IF ALL OF THESE ARE TRUE...**

Been in F-1 status for two consecutive semesters?

Will have graduated by the time OPT starts?

Never had OPT before at this degree level?

**THEN YOU ARE ELIGIBLE FOR OPT!**

## WHEN SHOULD YOU APPLY?

### SPRING GRADUATES

You should submit your application no more than 90 days before your **PROGRAM END DATE: MAY 15, 2023**

Earliest you can send in your application: **FEBRUARY 15, 2023**

You may **not** submit your application more than 60 days after your **PROGRAM END DATE.**


Latest you can send in your application: **JULY 15, 2023**

**REMEMBER:** USCIS could take 3-5 months to process applications – mail it far in advance of your start date!



If you don't graduate during the semester you specify, your application may be made invalid.

### PICK YOUR OPT START DATE

The date you list cannot be changed after you submit this form.

#### A. Student Responsibilities

I meet all of the below requirements for applying to OPT:

- I've been in F-1 Status for two consecutive semesters
- I've graduated or will graduate by the time of my chosen OPT start date
- I've never done OPT before at this degree level
- Have attended one of the Office of International Education's OPT Workshops

I will fulfill and follow all of the below requirements to maintain my status on OPT:

- I understand that OPT restricts me to employment or volunteer activity in my field of study.
- I understand I must update my address, employment information, and other relevant information in the SEVP Portal within 10 days of any changes. Failure to do so will threaten my F-1 status during OPT.
- I understand that if I do not fulfill the degree requirements by the date specified in this form, my OPT application may be invalidated or otherwise affected.
- I understand that my OPT application must be received by USCIS within the 30 days after the Office of International Education signs my OPT I-20.
- I understand that my OPT application may be denied by USCIS and my fee will not be reimbursed.
- I understand that if I am unemployed for at least 90 days, my F-1 status will be auto-terminated by USCIS and I will be required to leave the United States immediately.
- I understand that compliance with U.S. laws is the responsibility of the F-1 visa holder

# OPT START DATE

Remember...

**USCIS can take 3-5 months to approve your OPT application**

You are not allowed to work until you receive USCIS approval and you've physically received your card

If your start date is reached and you have not received approval from USCIS, your end-date will not change

CONSIDER:

International travel plans?

Would you like some time off after graduation?

Do you want to start working immediately?

Have you spoken with any potential employers?

# COMPLETING THE I-765

## EVIDENCE

### 2x2 PHOTO

**Upload a recent color photograph** of yourself that measures 2 inches by 2 inches.

### I-94

**Form I-94**, Arrival and Departure record or passport.

### EMPLOYMENT

**Upload a copy of your last Employment Authorization documents** ( EAD, Passport, Visa).

### CPT/OPT

**Upload evidence** or any previously authorized CPT or OPT (I-20 with the CPT authorization)

### I-20

**Upload your I-20** with OPT authorization. (You will receive this I-20 during your Final OPT Meeting)



## 5. Passport-Style Photos

- Taken within last 30 days
- White to off-white background
- Printed on traditional photo paper
- Not mounted & not retouched
- 2 inches x 2 inches



- Full face, frontal view
- Head must be bare unless you are wearing headwear as required by your practicing religion

### **RECOMMENDED:**

Visit a professional to get your photos

#### How To Fill Out Form G-1450

1. Type or print legibly in black ink.
2. Complete the "Applicant's/Petitioner's/Requester's Information," "Credit Card Billing Information," and "Credit Card Information" sections and sign the authorization.
3. Place your Form G-1450 ON TOP of your application, petition, or request package.

**NOTE:** Failure to provide the requested information may result in USCIS and your financial institution not accepting the payment. USCIS cannot process credit card payments without an authorized signature.

**NOTE:** Form G-1450 may only be used with a form being submitted to a USCIS Lockbox. **Do not submit this form to a USCIS Field Office. They will not accept it.**

**SUBMIT YOUR COMPLETE APPLICATION PACKET. USCIS MUST RECEIVE YOUR APPLICATION WITHIN 30 DAYS!**

# SUBMIT APPLICATION PACKET TO USCIS

Sign the front of your new I-20

Submit or Mail your application so it is received **within 30 days!**

You will receive a **NOTICE OF ACTION** in about 3 weeks. This paper will have your “receipt number.” Use that number in case you need to call USCIS with any OPT questions.

**You CANNOT work until you have received your EAD card!** *Talk to potential employers and let them know your situation.*

Be prepared to wait about 3-5 months for your OPT application to be approved

# IF YOU GET A REQUEST FOR EVIDENCE (RFE)

If there is a problem with your application, USCIS will send you a notice by mail called a “Request for Evidence (RFE)”

An RFE means that you need to send additional documents before your EAD can be issued. Requested documents must be sent **ASAP!**

An RFE will delay the processing of your application.

# TYPES OF WORK ON OPT



# TYPES OF WORK ON OPT

Make sure none of the work you are doing violates U.S. labor laws.

All work must be done in the U.S. for it to count towards OPT

**Remember: All work MUST be related to your major field of study at MICA.**

**Freelance Work** - does not require a license

Employed by someone to create something or provide a service.

Get an offer of work in writing. Include:

- employer name
- start and end dates of projects, etc.

Save this information for your records. All necessary information should be entered into the SEVP Portal.

**Self Employment** - requires a business license (takes time)

If you are create something, and then decide to sell it later to someone who wants to buy the work or service.

We have not seen many students do self-employment for OPT.

Commission/Freelance Work

Self-Employment (With proper business license)

# BASIC RULES

## **REPORT CHANGES TO THE SEVP OPT PORTAL**

You will receive an emailed link from USCIS to access the portal once your OPT has been approved

<https://sevp.ice.gov/opt/#/login>

## **FULL-TIME OPT**

Make sure you are working at least 20 hours per week to count towards Full-Time OPT

## **DO YOU PLAN TO TAKE ANY CLASSES?**

Studies during OPT should be purely recreational and not towards another degree



## UNEMPLOYMENT DURING OPT

USCIS specifies that students on OPT should only be unemployed for a **TOTAL OF 90** days during their entire OPT session.

This means that the days you are unemployed throughout your OPT term all add up.

The Department of Homeland Security tracks your employment and unemployment. They will terminate your F-1 status if you are unemployed for more than 90 days during the 12 months of OPT.

**THIS MEANS YOU WILL NEED TO LEAVE THE UNITED STATES AT 90 DAYS OF UNEMPLOYMENT.**

Working under 20 hours each week? Those days count as unemployment.



## PERSONAL RESPONSIBILITY DURING OPT

### Around your OPT Start Date, you will receive an email to access the SEVP Portal

You are responsible for keeping track of your unemployment days.

If you exceed 90 days of unemployment, you are responsible for leaving the United States or changing your status accordingly.

You are responsible for reporting any employment or personal changes to the SEVP Portal.

International Education is **not** responsible with keeping track of your unemployment days or making sure that you are reporting your employment and personal information.

# REPORT YOUR INFORMATION

To avoid termination of your F-1 status, you are required to report your employment information. Employer information must be updated on the SEVP OPT Portal within 10 days of any changes


To avoid termination of your F-1 status, you are required to report your personal information. Personal information must be updated on the SEVP OPT Portal within 10 days of any changes

# INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL



## F-1 visa

If you plan to travel: F-1 visa must be valid when you re-enter USA

It is difficult to renew your F-1 visa during OPT / after graduation- It is not recommended

# INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL



Before OPT is approved

Before MICA classes end

## **YOU SHOULD BE OKAY!**

Standard: bring I-20 with travel signature, **valid** visa, passport, etc.

(Permission to re-enter is never guaranteed)

After Graduation

Your OPT application will be considered invalid and you will be denied.

# INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL



After OPT is approved

Have a job/ job offer

International travel should be fine!


Bring with you...

- Passport valid 6 months into the future
- A **valid** F-1 visa
- Your OPT I-20 with a valid travel signature
- EAD
- **Job offer letter (REQUIRED)**

No job/ job offer

International travel is very risky

Re-entry may be denied at the US border if you are not able to present proof of OPT employment

## PRACTICAL INFORMATION WHILE ON OPT

### DRIVER'S LICENSE

Your driver's license may only be valid until your I-20 end date. You may need to visit the MVA with your EAD card.

### SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER

If you don't have a SSN and did not apply for one with your OPT application, you may apply for one *before* you get a job, *after* you receive your EAD card.

### TAXES

Don't forget that you must file taxes even if you have not earned money. Tax forms are due April 15<sup>th</sup> each year.

### HEALTH INSURANCE

After you graduate, you will no longer be eligible for MICA Health Insurance. You should sign up for an insurance plan on your own. The Affordable Care Act requires "Resident Alien" F-1 visa-holders to have ACA insurance or pay a fee. Check with the IRS to determine if you are a "Residential Alien."



IF YOU WORK THROUGHOUT OPT AND DO NOT REACH 90 DAYS OF UNEMPLOYMENT...

**Plan to leave the USA After OPT?**

Must leave within 60 days of OPT end date  
Not allowed to work or study during these 60 days  
May travel around the US during those 60 days  
Once you leave, you may not reenter on your F-1 visa

**Plan to study in the USA after OPT?**

Arrange to transfer your SEVIS record before the end of your 60 days after the end of OPT  
After those 60 days, you will need to get a new SEVIS ID

**Animation or Graphic Design Major?**

Apply for STEM OPT for the additional 24 months of OPT.


**Been sponsored for a H1-B work visa?**

Work with your employer and immigration lawyers to change your immigration status

**Applying for another visa type? (K-, O-, TN-)**

Make sure you start the process early and work with an immigration lawyer

**AFTER OPT**





IF YOU WORK THROUGHOUT OPT AND REACH 90 DAYS OF UNEMPLOYMENT...

**Must prepare to leave the U.S.!**

Once you leave, you may not reenter on your F-1 visa

**If you apply to a new program in the U.S....**

Arrange to receive a new I-20 from the new program. You will get a new SEVIS ID and will need to pay a new SEVIS fee.

**BE CAREFUL!**
