Both BAPSH Partbred Covering Certificates & Spanish PRE & HA Covering Certs. for the 2001 season should have been sent to the **REGISTRAR by 1st October.** If any have not yet been sent, you **URGENTLY need to do so!!**All PRE & HA stallions who have covered either PRE, HA, or **Registered ARAB** mares MUST have a SPANISH CRIA CABALLAR COVERING CERT for each mare, or the year 2001 foals CANNOT be registered in SPAIN& will NOT receive full papers. The Spanish Covering Certificate is, on the reverse side, the Foal's BIRTH CERT.

Please take note that the Blue copy of this triplicate form is forwarded to Spain by the Registrar so the Cria Caballar know what foals are expected next year - ie. it is not possible to 'slip one in' next year if the paperwork was not done on time this year!!

The Registrar would once again like to thank all the stallion owners who got their paperwork in on time, and 'well done' on your accuracy & lack of errors. It is much appreciated.

A British Bred "El Caballo Español"

It was really encouraging to see a British Bred Spanish horse on the cover of the latest "El CABALLO ESPANOL" ANCCE magazine. Unfortunately, no credits or acknowledgements are given for these cover photos, so most members of ANCCE, who receive the magazine world-wide, are probably unaware of the fact that the horse was bred in Britain.

The "Levitating horse", so brilliantly photographed by Rafael Lemos as part of a commission by Peter Maddison-Greenwell, is the bay stallion Maryss Brujo, bred by Mary McBryde. Many members will recognise the picture from the promotional leaflet produced by Peter's El Caballo de Espana, a number of years back..

Maryss Brujo, by the well known stallion Ghandi, out of Mary McBryde's foundation mare Anisada (Nemeo x Divina III) is one of the most well travelled Spanish horses to have been produced in this country. Bred by Mary McBryde in Wiltshire, he spent some months at both the Welshpool Stud in Wales and at Old Track in Bath, before following Mary out to Canada with his mother Anisada and his half sister Marvss Amalia (Trianero III) in 1991. He was taken to the United States for grading in 1993 and then back to Canada to begin his stud career. In 1994, leaving a number of progeny on the American continent, Brujo returned to the UK, where he began to produce an extremely successful group of offspring. A few years later, much to the loss of Spanish horse breeding in the UK, Maryss Brujo left these shores once again, this time with his current owner, Simone Howarth. He is presently with Association member Simone in South Africa were he is successfully competing inDressage.

Maryss Brujo is not only one of the most widely travelled British bred Spanish Horses. He also comes from one of the most successful showing families in this country. His

mother Anisada and sisters Maryss Amalia and Maryss Dilaila have all been National Champion mares, with Dilaila going on to become Supreme Champion in 1997. All his eligible offspring have passed their grading. His daughter Maryss Gloria (out of Maryss Amalia) also became Supreme Champion in 2000 with her full brother Maryss Encantado, owned by Liz Andrews, taking the title of Champion Ridden at this year's Show.

Maryss Brujo has also produce a number of outstanding partbred progeny who have gone on not only

to success in the showring, but to also to produce quality stock in their own right. Astrologica EDM, (out of the Forest mare Bracken) owned and bred by the Yeguada Estrella del Mar, is a prime example. This young mare was Reserve Champion Partbred in 1999 and has just produced the first Brujo grandchild; a stunning 3\4 bred filly by the classical stallion Argentino VII..

Even if he is not acknowledged on the cover of the magazine, the results of Maryss Brujo prove that he is more than worthy of his place thereon.

What's In A Name

Choosing a name for your foal can be a difficult decision, especially when you have several each year to find. You may wish to keep with tradition and select names starting with the same letter of the alphabet for each year beginning at the letter "A" and working to "Z" or you may wish to select randomly.

I once frequented a riding school where the horses were named after Shakespearean Characters; Falstaff, Banquo, Paris etc, which I thought was a very good idea. All my animals (apart from my Spanish horses) are named after flowers, plants and all things botanical so a theme seemed the best way of selecting names at our stud and we liked the traditional idea of working our way through the alphabet.

The Stud is named after myself "Estrella Del Mar", which means Star of the Sea (a lovely name in Spanish, especially as I was born in the late 60's and could have been called Moon Unit or something equally hippy). Bearing our Stud's name in mind we chose to use seafaring/nautical terms for our colts and astronomical terms for our fillies. In conjunction we used EDM as an affix to identify our horses wherever they may be shown or featured.

This process of choosing names does eliminate all the hours of indecision that occur when you have hundreds of names from which to make your selection. So far we have produced; and Astrologica (fortune teller/clairvoyant), Barquero (a sailor of small vessels), Camaron (a shrimp, ironically 16hh at just

under 2 years of age), Conchero (a shell collector/gatherer), Capella (a star in the Auriga Constellation), Dione (a satellite of Jupiter, Desdemona (a Satellite of Uranus) and Delfina (derived from the Dolphin Constellation). I am now busy compiling a list of E names for 2002, without selecting any final ones until the foals are safely on the ground and can be matched to suit their personalities.

Other British Studs, for example, Star Andalusians use a theme to name their foals, though not alphabetically e.g. Venus, Jupiter etc (by coincidence also an astronomical selection derived from the Stud name).

I find it fascinating to see the old Spanish names repeated throughout the Stud books, many of which are occupational names such as Jardinero (the gardener), Brujo (the Wizard) etc.

It would be interesting to hear from other breeders on their methods of choosing names, so please write in with your comments.

B.A.P.S.H. LIMITED ? By Tina Barnett-Tucker

Very important News from your Committee. Please read and consider.

The Background

For some time now it has been apparent that in order to comply with changing administrative directives relating to Breed Societies, the Association would have to address the issue of changing to a limited company. The Committee has examined the issues relating to this, most importantly the granting of "Legal Personality" by virtue of becoming limited. Without this status, no Breed Society shall be recognised by DEFRA as being able to issue passports

The Issues

The BAPSH in Britain acts as a regional office, answerable to the main office of the Jefatura de Cria Caballar in Spain. This, our controlling body, maintains the Stud Book of the Purebred Spanish Horse and the Hispano-Arab and issues all passports directly from Spain. Therefore the directive does not affect our Register 1 and 3 horses. However, if this Association is to go ahead and issue passports in Britain for our PARTBRED horses, as intended, we shall have to comply with the directive and change our status to that of a Limited Company.

The change of status will also protect ALL members against any financial liability that may be sued for in a court of law.

After consideration of the facts and of the changes which this moveshall entail, the committee decided to put forward a proposal to the membership, for acceptance at the 2002 AGM, that "The British Association For The Purebred Spanish Horse become a Limited Company with immediate effect."

The Changes

The change of status to a limited company would have little effect on members for the main part.

However, we will briefly address here the main concerns and questions which will undoubtedly arise.

i)Name-The Association shall retain its present title of The British Association For The Purebred Spanish Horse. Being unique in this country it can use the word BRITISH in its company name. It is not necessary to affix the word "Limited" to the title.

ii)Aims -The aims of the Association shall remain the same; being the welfare and promotion of the Spanish horse with all profits given over to this purpose. This shall be ensured by the fact of the Association shall become a Company Limited by Guarantee, which necessitates all profits being reinvested in the company. Therefore no members shall be in receipt of dividends as no shares shall be issued.

iii)Costs -These shall be limited with a fee to set up the company with registration at Companies House of between £300 and £400 complete.

iv)Membership - All present members will automatically become members of the limited Company, enjoying all the rights and privileges to which they are presently entitled.

v)Management-The Association shall be managed technically, as at present. All powers of management shall be vested in the Board of Directors which shall be identical in makeup to the present committee. Members of the board will be voted onto it by the full voting membership. All members of the board will be



known as Directors for purposes of the Companies Act only. At future elections members will be aware of which relating committee position each potential Board Member shall be standing for. The Board of Directors will have no more power or influence over the Members or the general management of the Association than they have at present. These nominal changes shall only come into effect after the 2002 AGM, should the proposal be passed. They shall not relate to the coming elections for the posts of five committee members and President (Chairman) to be announced at the AGM. These upcoming elections shall be run strictly under our present rules and terminology.

The Method

In order for members to be in possession of all the facts before they vote on the proposal at the 2002 AGM, the committee shall send out a draft copy of the "articles" of the new company with the AGM agenda. These articles shall be as identical to the present rules as can be accomplished. Some of our present rules may have to be altered slightly and a few may need to be changed. Where this occurs, the specific rule will be highlighted, and, should the members decide, these can be voted on individually

at the meeting.


The draft of the new memorandum shall be constructed from the standard articles of a limited company as set down under the Companies Act and our own present Rules of the Association. This document will be put together from the information supplied by the Committee, by a Company Formation Agent endorsed by the Association's accountants. Any legal preparations shall be dealt with by said agent and are inclusive in the costs as

previously stated. On completion the document shall then be circulated as previously stated for thorough consideration by the members.

Recommendations

Your committee has been aware of the looming necessities of this change of status for some time and has considered the upheaval it will cause at numerous meetings. However, it is no longer practicable or indeed sensible in our view to circumvent

the problem any longer. It is the committee's view that now is the time for the members to take the decision to transform BAPSH into the legally recognised entity of a limited company. You, the members, have empowered the committee to manage the Association and your committee now advises that you accept their proposal to make the BAPSH a Limited Company at the 2002 AGM.




