On items where payments are to be made from proceeds of the above listed bond issues, full regard is given to the provisions of each Act and its prospective amendments.

Except as otherwise provided in these Acts, before the State agency or institution responsible for an individual item may begin work with funds secured under the Act, the agency or institution shall provide satisfactory assurances to the Board of Public Works that the work described in the individual items can be completed with the funds specified for that item.

If federal funds are available to help accomplish any project identified in these Acts, the State agency or institution responsible for the project shall make efforts through proper administrative procedures to obtain these federal funds. Before spending any funds secured under these Acts, the agency or institution shall certify its efforts to the Board of Public Works and state the reason for any failure to obtain federal funds. If federal funds are obtained, they shall be used to defray the costs of the project described in these Acts, not to expand its scope, except in the case of projects for State parks and recreation areas of the Department of Natural Resources funded from the proceeds of the General Construction Loans of 1973 through 1980. These latter projects may be expanded in scope beyond that proposed in the specific appropriation in these Acts if the addition of Federal funds makes this possible, but not beyond the total park acreage or area to which it applies, as evident from the master plan for State parks and recreation areas adopted by the Department of Natural Resources.

9. <u>DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES:</u> (FLOOD MANAGEMENT GRANT PROGRAM)

Submission of a request by the Department of Natural Resources for approval from the Board of Public Works to commit to the Town of Chesapeake Beach an additional grant of \$66,705.00 from Chapter 569, Acts of 1983, in accordance with the Flood Management Grant Program of the Flood Hazard Management Act of 1976 (Subtitle 8-9A) of the Natural Resources Article). This represents the Department's maximum share of funds as provided under Natural Resources Article §8-9A-03 and is to be used for construction of an additional one hundred and twenty linear feet of stone revetment, engineering inspection of the flood gate installation, and vegetative restoration of the site.

The project is part of a comprehensive Flood Management Program developed by the Town of Chesapeake Beach and has been adopted by the Mayor and Council. The Town plans to install a total of 710 linear feet of stone revetment and the flood gate structure which will be operated upon a flood tide warning. The project will protect ten businesses and homes and will provide safe access along Route 261, the main thoroughfare. Each of the structures to be protected has been flooded and will have flooding above the first floor from the 100-year frequency flood. Route 261 floods regularly, creating concern for access of emergency vehicles and continuing maintenance problems.

This request is in addition to the \$107,630.00 grant previously requested and approved by the Board of Public Works (Item 23, August 15, 1984) for the purchase and installation of the flood gate structure, construction of stone revetment, and engineering design. The current request will fund increased costs of the project which have become necessary due to severe flood and erosion damage experienced in November 1985, and the recent receipt of actual construction bids which exceeded original estimates.

The estimated cost for the entire project is \$544,770.00, of which \$348,670.00 is eligible for funding with a Flood Management grant. This grant increase of \$66,705.00 will provide a total of \$174,335.00, which is 50% of the eligible costs. The Town's share of the project is composed of \$38,405.00 of its own monies and a portion of a loan from the Department of Natural Resources. Shore Erosion Control program. That loan totals \$257,025.00 and also covers revetment work not directly related to the flood management portion of the project. Because of the protection provided to Route 261, the State Highway Administration is providing \$75,000.00.

The Town of Chesapeake Beach, Calvert County, intends to protect 730 linear feet of eroding shoreline along the Chesapeake Bay through the construction of a stone revetment and also plans to control flooding of a major portion of the Town through the installation of a concrete and steel flood control structure. Competitive sealed bids for the construction of these two items were obtained by the Department of Natural Resources on March 24, 1987, with the low bid amounting to \$487,765.00.

The Town of Chesapeake Beach in order to accomplish this work is seeking to obtain a 25-year, interest-free loan from the Shore Erosion Control Construction Loan Fund for 534 linear feet of the stone revetment structure amounting to \$257,025.00. Repayments of the loan will be \$10,281.00 per year. The fund source will be the Shore Erosion Control Loan of 1985, 06.84.62.000.

Additional funds for the project will be obtained by the Town from the Department of Natural Resources' Flood Management Division in the amount of \$148,000.00, subject to the approval of the Board of Public Works by separate action.

The balance of funds required for the project will be provided to the Department through a property owner's cash contribution in the amount of \$82,740.00, to be deposited with the Department prior to the award of the construction contract.

The Town of Chesapeake Beach will pledge its full faith and credit for the repayment of the loan. The executed loan agreement will be duly recorded in the land records of Calvert County, Maryland.

The subject procurement is hereby determined to be sole source on the basis that no other entity is suitable and acceptable to provide the required services in a timely manner.

Senators Wagner, Cade, Jimeno and Yeager, whose districts are primarily affected by the proposed BWI expansion requested an independent, objective assessment of the BWI Master Plan by an outside institution capable of bringing together the necessary academic and technical resources to perform the assessment in a timely manner. As the Senators wished to be able to assure their constituents that the findings would not be affected by any proprietary interest in its outcome, it was deemed inappropriate to utilize a State institution for the study itself.

Accordingly, the services of a <u>private</u> institution of unquestionable competence and independence was sought for the assessment. The Johns Hopkins University (JHU) Institute for Policy Studies has assembled a uniquely well-qualified team of professionals -- economists, environmentalists and other technical specialists with expertise and experience to carry out the assessment of the BWI Master Plan. Furthermore, it was determined that the particular group of individuals who comprise the study team are available now, but are not likely to have the time to carry out the study at a later date. Since the timing for the study is constrained by SAA's planned expansion activities which

and the second

could be affected by the study findings, the immediate availability of this skilled team of professionals is a very important factor. The JHU team provides:

- o thorough knowledge of the Baltimore-Washington region and its economic base;
- o familiarity with local and national resources available for data research and analysis;
- o cost savings and efficiency due to the fact that the University is Maryland based; and
- o independence of approach: JHU is a private entity, not part of the State system. This is a factor of paramount importance to the Senators who have requested the assessment of the BWI Master Plan.

For these reasons, I have determined that the subject contract represents an entirely valid sole source procurement.

REMARKS: Since early 1963 the Maryland Port Administration has utilized the M/V NYMPH as a harbor-tour vessel to transport prospective customers, government officials and trade users for the purpose of selling the importance and benefits of the facilities and services of the Port of Baltimore.

During the operating year of 1986, the vessel was used <u>180</u> times for harbor tours. The MPA considers the use of harbor tours as a very effective "selling" tool of its sales and marketing programs and the vessel's use has proven to be an asset of incalculable value to the Port of Baltimore and the State of Maryland.

On or about September 4, 1986, MPA solicited bids for the repair and replacement of the teak decking and underlayment of the foredeck of the M/Y NYMPH. This

vessel is a 75 foot classic-style yacht that was built in 1913 and purchased by the Maryland Port Authority in 1963. Bids were opened on October 22, 1986 with only one bidder responding with a bid of \$81,000. The estimate for this work was \$45,000.

Considering the age of the vessel, the Port Administrator ordered a structural survey to determine whether the remainder of the vessel was sound before deciding to invest that much money in repairs. MPA contracted with Mr. Fred Hecklinger to conduct a structural survey of the NYMPH. Mr. Hecklinger's survey found that the vessel was not sound, due to extensive rotten horn and other structural timbers and hull planking. The Port Administrator then ordered a second survey to verify the condition found on the first. The second surveyor, Mr. John Sheller, affirmed the poor condition of the NYMPH. A total estimate of repairs of the rotten timbers and planking was then approximated to cost between \$200,000 to \$250,000, depending upon the condition of structural members which could not be seen by the surveyors. This estimate, plus repairs of the teak decking and underlayment, amounted to between \$281,000 to \$331.000 to make the NYMPH seaworthy.

MPA conducted an in-house operational review of the vessel. The review included such areas as present condition, age (the NYMPH will be 74 years old this year), limitations-(only twenty guests can be transported at one time, the open rear deck of the vessel confines its use to warm weather months, slow engine speed restricts the cruising range of the vessel from the Inner Harbor area to the Key Bridge). Based upon the results of this review, the Port Administrator elected to not repair the NYMPH, to propose the sale of the NYMPH in an "as is, where is" condition and purchase another vessel better equipped to service the harbor tour requirements of the MPA. The Secretary of Transportation concurred with the Port Administrator's decision.

Since the M/V NYMPH has been determined as "unseaworthy" by the two structural surveys; and harbor tours remain as a primary "selling" tool of the MPA; and the purchase of a new vessel could require a minimum of four to six months, or longer, the Port Administrator, with the concurrence of the Secretary of Transportation, elected to pursue the purchase of a previously-owned yacht that could be available for service by the latter part of April, or the first

part of May, 1987.

Accordingly, the MPA Executive Committee adapted several criteria to be used by the MPA to identify vessels which would provide the physical characteristics MPA deems necessary for the replacement vessel. MPA then contacted serveral boat brokers in Maryland, Virginia and Florida, to determine the availability on the open market of vessels meeting or exceeding MPA's requirements.

New vessels of the size and utility required by MPA are estimated to cost between \$1,300,000 and \$2,800,000. There are many previously-owned yachts on the market, but not many that meet our requirements and have reasonably low "asking" prices.

The previously-owned yacht market is brisk at this particular time. In fact, one of the few vessels which MPA recently found in Fort Lauderdale, Florida, which met its criteria, sold for \$450,000 before MPA could tender an offer. The previously-owned yacht market has an established process which includes the following;

- 1. Identification of the vessel and its owner by the Buyer;
- 2. Inspection of the vessel by the Buyer;
- 3. A conditional written price offer accompanied by a cash deposit of 10% of the price offer by the Buyer to the Seller, subject to the results of a condition, structural and mechanical survey of the vessel and seatrials;
- 4. Performance of the surveys by independant surveyors hired by the Buyer;
- 5. Performance of seatrials; and
- 6. Payment of the balance owed and take possession of the yacht.

It is therefore necessary that MPA request the Board to waive the normal State process, so as to allow us to promptly tender an offer for a vessel meeting our criteria and at the same time, bind that offer with a cash deposit of 10% of the offer. If the offer is accepted, MPA will complete the necessary vessel surveys and trials and finally, if satisfied on all counts, conclude the acquisition. MPA will then make a final report to the Board.

In 1978 Leblang & Associates was chosen to design the renovations for four buildings (Goodwin, Medairy, Preston and Jackson) at the Rosewood Center. The Fire Marshall's Office reviewed the construction documents submitted by Leblang and noted certain design deficiencies which Leblang failed to correct. DGS subsequently issued a change order for \$32,865.53 to the contractor, Structures, Inc., to have the situation corrected. In addition, Structures, Inc. filed a delay claim against DGS. That claim was settled for \$15,000, \$6,666.60 of which was attributable to delays caused by Leblang's omission. Thus, DGS's total out-of-pocket expenses as a result of Leblang's omission were \$39,532.13.

While clearly responsible for the problem, Leblang delayed reimbursing the State. Suit was filed and a settlement offer of \$40,000 has now been made. The Department of General Services and the Attorney General's Office recommend this settlement offer be accepted.
