Renee Christine Shirek, DOB 01/25/1984, 8160 West Fremont Avenue, Littleton, Colorado, telephone (303)973-6605, and Amanda Marie Henningsen, DOB 07/04/1984, 8150 West Fremont Avenue, Littleton, Colorado, telephone (303)972-0238, were interviewed at 8160 West Fremont Avenue, Littleton, Colorado, in the presence of Henningsen's mother, Tracee Henningsen, by Special Agent (SA) Ricky V. Wright regarding the incident that took place on 04/20/1999 at Columbine High School. After being advised as to the identity of the interviewing agent and the nature of the interview, Shirek and Henningsen provided the following information:

At approximately 11:10 am, Shirek got out of Math class and proceeded from the math department down the main hall and directly to the cafeteria. Henningsen had Jewelry class before lunch and got out at approximately 11:08 am. Upon leaving Jewelry class, Henningsen left the art department, went through the middle hall by the tech lab and went to her locker, locker #201. After leaving her locker, Henningsen went down the main hall to the cafeteria. Both Shirek and Henningsen sat down at the same lunchroom table (marked II on diagram sketch). Also sitting at the same table were Brittney Gillette, Bae Gattoni, Natalie Baker, Marni Maclennan, Julie Naslund, Jennifer Pollack, Meghan Piro, and Nicole Ray. Henningsen got her lunch and sat back down. Shirek had not gotten her lunch yet. Henningsen was sitting to the left of Shirek, facing northwest. Brittney Gillette was sitting to the left of Henningsen: Shirek was sitting to the right of Henningsen facing west.

Henningsen, Shirek, and Sarah Filipiak brought cameras to the cafeteria and were snapping pictures of friends around the table during lunch. Henningsen took 15-20 pictures with a Fugi Quicksnap disposable camera. Shirek took four or five pictures with her camera, but left the camera in the cafeteria. Filipiak is also believed to have left her camera behind. During the interview, Henningsen provided her Fugi Quicksnap disposable camera to SA Wright. Henningsen advised that the camera also contained some pictures from Disneyland. Later that same day, SA Wright logged the camera into evidence at the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office, evidence control #10062.

While Henningsen and Shirek were at the table, three or four boys ran into the cafeteria from the entrance by the teachers lounge and were yelling that someone had a gun. Chris Markham and Steve Dreaden were two of the boys. Everyone got down under the tables and Henningsen saw William Sanders walking around making sure everyone was under the tables. After two or three minutes, everyone got up and started running in all directions. Henningsen and Shirek ran up the stairs. While running up the stairs, they heard a loud bang behind them. Both Henningsen and Shirek ran east down the main hall and out the exit at the end of the hall. Once outside the school both ran across Pierce Street to Leawood Park.

Neither Shirek or Henningsen remember seeing any large duffle bags sitting in the cafeteria during lunch. Henningsen advised that she was also in the cafeteria first hour and fourth hour. When Henningsen was there fourth hour, Bae Gattoni, Natalie Baker, Kelcy Fowler, Jenny Allen, Jenny Pollack, and Brittney Gillette were also there. Henningsen does not recall seeing any large duffle bags in the cafeteria first hour or fourth hour. During both first hour and fourth hour, there were approximately 50 students sitting around in the cafeteria. Henningsen recalls that Scott Parker, Brock Rembold, and Lindsey Last Name Unknown(LNU) were also in the cafeteria during fourth hour.

Henningsen and Shirek did not know Eric Harris, Dylan Klebold, or any of the other members of the Trenchcoat Mafia very well. Henningsen heard a rumor that Patrice Doyle knows Eric Harris and saw him in school the morning of 04/20/1999. Doyle noticed that Harris had a strange expression on his face, which concerned her enough that she and a friend left school before the shooting. Henningsen also heard that Ashley Egeland and Lacy Hohn were chased by two gunmen.

That day, Shirek was wearing a light blue shirt, blue jeans, and white shoes. Henningsen was wearing a white shirt, green skirt, and tan sandals.



Supplemental Report

On April 21, 1999, I was asked to assist members of the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office with the collection of evidence at Columbine Highschool, 6201 S. Pierce Street, in unincorporated Jefferson County, State of Colorado. Upon arrival, I was first asked by Sergeant Booras to record the license plates of all the vehicles parked in the lot on south side of the highschool. After completing this task I gave the record of the license plates to Sgt. Booras.

Following this, I was asked to responded to the southwest corner of the building and assist Sgt. Dunnebecke with the collection of evidence. At this scene I observed several broken windows, fragments from explosives, clothing and other personal items, bullet casings, bloodstains, and other items which I did not recognize. I assisted the JCSO and the FBI with the collection of items of evidence. All items recovered by me, at this scene, were turned over to the JCSO as evidence.

My final assignment was to assist investigators with canvassing the south and south west parking lots for any further items of evidence. During this search I located two bullet fragments. I also observed what appeared to be bomb fragments and damage to several vehicles in the parking lot. My final task was to pick-up any nails which were located, and marked, by investigators earlier in the investigation. All items were given over to Investigator Reker as evidence.

The item was initially described as a power source made by Cardinal, model #14400V32BTS, Serial #740013, and has a identification tag attached to Berger & Co. 00063.

The item was cleared via CCIC and no record was located indicating the item has not been report stolen.

Item #438 was viewed at the Jefferson County Property area, to obtain better description. It was learned the item is not a power source, rather a 14400 bps external modem.

Berger & Co. was contacted via telephone. Mr. Bud Wilkerson conducted some research on the item. The tag on the item is a old control numbering system. He added the company often donates various computer components. He believes the modem being a 14.4 bps is an old item and was most likely donated to Jefferson County Schools. Mr. Wilkerson will continue to research the item for a more exact explanation.

On 04-29-99 I received a call from Mr. Greg Martin who is the MIS director for Berger & Co. He was able to give detail as to the disposition of the 14.4 bps external modem. His records show it was donated to the Dutch Creek Elementary School. He shows the donation took place in August of 1998. His contact for Dutch Creek Elementary School as Janet Vanzant at 303-978-9802.

On 04-30-99 I was able to contact Janet Vanzant who explained she had received the donation. She has a memo stipulating the donation from Berger & Co. I was faxed a copy of the memo. Contained in the Memo is 5 external modems, however none are listed with serial numbers.

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Janet Vanzant recalls the items and is aware of them being sent to the tech. central office. She states the items donated were all IBM compatible and at Dutch Creek Elementary they only have Mackintosh Computers. She made me aware of the contact person Michael Kent at 303-982-2200.

On 04-30-99 I did contact Michael Kent, he explained the modem was not cormally tracked within any ID system at Jeffco Schools. The item being donated would not have any value to the school and would have been stored at Columbine High School in what he called the "JUNK" room. It would not uncommon for a student to take the items from the room for personal use due to the outdated technology of the item.

Michael Kent provided his voice mail number for any additional followup of 303-982-5679.

Jefferson County Public School records were found to have only two students registered by the name of "DAN MAY," or "DAN MAES." One of the students was in third grade and eliminated as a possible lead. The second also failed to develop as Daniel Austin MAES (091285) attended Summit Ridge and was only 13YOA. Daniel Maes mother, Theresa Kisling (303) 972-6996 said her son "Danny" was not at Columbine High School the day of the shooting.

On May 6, 1999 I spoke with KASTLE and LAUGHLIN independently. Both said they had provided several interviews with other investigators from the Columbine Task Force. LAUGHLIN said the only person he was with at the time of the shooting was Jeffrey Marquardt, who had been interviewed by Investigator Terry Demmel, which Demmel confirmed, lead CN#2500.

KASTLE and LAUGHLIN could only provide two persons the associate with being; Dan Holsey and Dan Palmeter, neither of which were in the area with them at the time of the shooting. PALMETER was interviewed by Investigator Russ Atanasio, CN#2831.

No leads were found to identify "Dan" as present with KASTLE and LAUGHLIN at the time of the incident.

BARBOSA provided very vague/minimal information. She described knowing a person named "Eric" (unknown last) that claimed to have been the founder of the group that subsequently became known as the "Trench Coat Mafia." She described this person as being 5'-3 with long dark hair who frequently wore black and white make-up. BARBOSA said the only information she knew was that "Eric" claimed to have started the group a few years ago, but was "kicked-out" a couple of years ago by the others in the group. She added that "Eric" had told her the others in the group had kicked him out quite some time ago because they didn't like his passive attitude, and that he did not "get into the wild, crazy stuff."

BARBOSA said she did not have any further information or leads for identifying "Eric." She added that she did not have any information directly related to the incident at Columbine High School.

BARBOSA later provided a telephone number for a person named "Ashley," (ROSS), whom she said would know "Eric's" last name.

She also was said that Melissa had told Abbigail that two of the six were HARRIS and KLEBOLD. She had further told her that they had shown her a map/plan of where they were going to place the bombs in the school. CHAMBERS further advised she was told by Abbigail that "Melissa" had been fired from the Pretzelmaker since having made these statements. FLETCHER said on April 29, 1999 while at work CHAVEZ had told another employee, Christine BELL, that she knew six of the persons involved in the "bombing." FLETCHER said BELL is a student at Columbine High School and had become upset over what CHAVEZ had been told her. She had also learned that CHAVEZ had told BELL that the persons involved in the "bombing" had shown her a plan or drawing of the school showing where they were going to place the bombs. BELL said CHAVEZ had also mentioned that two of the six persons were KLEBOLD and HARRIS.

FLETCHER said she personally spoke with CHAVEZ about her comments. She said CHAVEZ confirmed this to her saying she knew KLEBOLD and HARRIS, as well as four other "guys" that were involved. CHAVEZ also told her that she had been shown a plan or diagram by the persons involved in the bombing of where they were going to place the bombs within the school. FLETCHER said CHAVEZ told her she did not know the names of the other four "guys" involved but that she could identify them from photographs. FLETCHER said she did not have any information that BELL had mentioned anything about the incident prior to April 29th. FLETCHER also mentioned that since leaving their employment she has been hired by "Tilt," which is also in the Southwest Plaza.

MELISSA said she had first met HARRIS and KLEBOLD at the Funplex arcade, on Coalmine and Kipling, in 1997, possibly during the "warm," summer months. She said she had become an acquaintance of theirs, seeing them only at Funplex about 15 to 25 separate times over the years following. She described them as always wearing black clothing, but that they did not wear the black trenchcoats for the first few months she knew them.

MELISSA added that HARRIS and KLEBOLD were a few other boys about their age when she met him, some of which were also wearing black clothing. MELISSA said HARRIS and KLEBOLD were almost always together when she saw them at Funplex. She added that HARRIS was "really cool," and that she knew him better as he spoke with her more than KLEBOLD. She also added that KLEBOLD appeared to want to keep her out of their group. MELISSA said that HARRIS spoke frequently of suicide and told her how his life "sucked," because people picked on him. She could not provide who was picking on HARRIS, or where this was occurring. She added that she felt she had talked HARRIS out of killing himself several times.

On approximately July of 1998, which was about the fifth time she saw HARRIS and KLEBOLD at Funplex, they were again with four other boys that they were with often. MELISSA described them group of six boys as sitting next to the area where she was, inside Funplex. She said she overheard some of their conversation as they were talking about where they were going to place the "bombs" in the "school," and were pointing to a "map." She described this map as being a standard sized piece of paper (8.5"x11") and thought it looked handdrawn. Her perception was that this map was of the school as they were talking about where they were going to place the bombs in the school. After hearing this she said she left Funplex. MELISSA said at no time did they discuss anything with her about their plans. MELISSA could not provide any names for the four other boys, as she did not know them as well as HARRIS and KLEBOLD. She again added that most of the boys were wearing black when she saw them.

MELISSA said she last saw HARRIS about five months ago at Funplex. She said she didn't stay long due to curfew as it was about 10:45pm. She said on this occasion HARRIS was again with KLEBOLD and two other boys she did not know.

MELISSA volunteered that she has "felt bad" about having heard them planning the "bombing," and didn't do anything about it. She said she did not have any contact with anyone over the Internet and that they do not have a computer in their home. She also denied being at Columbine High School the day of the shooting, nor did she know anyone talking about having been there.

Agent LICHTENBERG was on vacation when the lead was assigned on 05/24/99.

I spoke with Agent LICHTENBERG on June 1, 1999 by telephone. She told me that she did not actually speak with Brooks BROWN.

She said she spoke to a teacher, whose name she did not obtain, on April 20, 1999 about 11:50 to 12:00 following the shooting. LICHTENBERG believes he was a Psychology teacher. The teacher told her that he and another teacher were away from the school at lunch when the shooting occurred, but that on their way back to the school, they spoke with BROWN, who told them he had seen Eric HARRIS carrying an "odd looking duffel bag". She escorted the teacher to speak with an investigator.

LICHTENBERG is relatively certain of the time, because she recalls arriving at the scene about 11:39, and directing traffic for a short time prior to conducting the teacher to the investigators.

She was in the cafeteria eating her lunch and was sitting at table E on the diagram which is attached. She was sitting with:

Joey had just finished her sandwich and was finishing her lunch. She got to the cafeteria a little early. Her last class ended at 11:10, and she thinks she got to the cafeteria at about 11:15. She heard shots outside. At first, she didn't know what they were. She thought it was a senior prank. A janitor ran up to her table and said to get down and said that "they" had a gun. That's when she saw a "guy" run by with a gun in his hand. She got down and crawled towards the stairs. She saw other people running up the stairs and heard more shots. She said that she got under a table by the stairs by the school store, on the far end of the cafeteria. She was under the table and she said that shot gun shells were by her legs and she heard a bunch of explosions. She said that she heard a lot of gun shots, but could not tell me how many.

Joey said that one gun she saw was like a rifle. She said that the blasts from the gun were making her hair move. They were close. She said that bullets were "spraying". She said, "I just crouched down there. I remember the very last blast because it blew out the window. They were laughing as they threw the bombs and shot people. They said today the world's going to come to an end. Today's the day we die."

Joey said that there was fire near her back. She said, "I looked around and I looked back. They were standing there smiling and looking at what they had done." She left the cafeteria and ran to the senior parking lot. She said that she ducked behind a car

and saw a policeman and felt safer. She was then taken to a police car and frisked.

Joey said that she saw only one guy at first. He was wearing a black trench coat. When asked if she recognized him, she said that he looked like someone from school. She said that now she knows it was Eric Harris. She said, "Now that I think about it, it may have been the trench coat, and not the fuzzy hair that I saw."

Joey said that when she saw the second person with Eric, it was Dylan Klebold. She had recognized him from school. She first recognized his blonde hair.

Joey said that neither one of them had pack packs or duffle bags when she saw them.

Joey's back pack is black. She left it in the cafeteria.

When she hid under the table, the people around her were gone.

She knows of no internet correspondence of Eric's and Dylan's.

When asked who else Eric and Dylan hung out with, she said, "They hung out together."

She said that <u>Pauline Colby and Patrick McDuffy</u> used to be part of the group that hung with Eric and Dylan. She said that she had heard from Pauline and Patrick that Dylan and Eric were starting to get into some scary ideas and they stopped hanging around them. The scary ideas that Joey knew about were playing paint ball and games like that, and acting like they were ambushing people and play violent video games. Joey is still friends with Pauline. Joey said that she didn't see Pauline the day of the shooting, and hasn't seen or talked to her since then. Joey said that although she is friends with Pauline, she doesn't hang out with her after school. Joey said that a friend of Pauline's hung out with "that group", but Joey didn't know Pauline's friend's name. Joey said that Patrick

doesn't go to CHS anymore. He goes to a different school now. He picks up people from CHS every now and then. The people he picks up are: Lydia Shofner, someone named Jesse (a girl) and a guy named Evan. Lydia is a good friend of Joey's. Joey said that she didn't see Patrick at school the day of the shooting. She said that she didn't know Dylan and Eric, but had just seen them around the school.

Joey said that she remembered seeing the following people at school that day:

Jessica Paddilla, Mrs. Black, Joe Dreaden, Steve Dreaden, Jill Schneider, Brook Allison, Mrs. Mosier, Mr. Mosier, Mr. Tank, Steven Curnow, Kelly Fleming, Laruen Townsend, Daniel Rohrbough, Daniel Mauser, and Rachael Scott.

Joey said that she saw Eric and Dylan at school in the halls, that morning. She said that Eric didn't have a trench coat on. Eric was wearing a bright orange t-shirt and jeans.


Joey said that a few weeks before the shooting, someone super-glued the key locks at the school.

On April 22, 1999 Detective Jack McFadden of the Jefferson County Sheriff's Department Intelligence Division to ask me to conduct an interview with Kathy Paavilainen, and Linda Reffel. Both of these women worked the After Prom party that was held at Columbine High School on April 17, 1999.

On this same date Detective Vonderohe and myself conducted an interview with Linda Reffel at her residence. Ms. Reffel made the following statements.

Ms. Reffel stated she was on the food committee for the After Prom Party at Columbine High School on April 17, 1999. Judy Durkin another person also was on the food committee. The food for the most part was being stored in the school refrigerator and freezer.

Ms. Reffel stated that on Saturday night before the kids arrived for the After Prom Party sometime between 9 P.M. to 11 P.M. she went to take the food off some ice in the freezer. Upon opening the freezer she saw a white propane gas tank approximately eighteen inches to two feet high in the freezer. It was setting on the floor with a bunch of empty Pepsi cups stacked on the cart. She first thought that the propane tank was going to be used to blow up the balloons they were going to have for the party. However, she said the propane tank did not look like the oxygen tank she saw upstairs.

Ms. Reffel stated she remembered seeing the janitor up near the freezer when she went to get the food. The alarm was going off.

Ms. Reffel remembers seeing Dylan Klebold talking to a male person with green hair wearing black leather. He was described as being 6 foot skinny with messy hair sticking straight up.

Ms. Reffel was asked if the kids, who attended the After the Prom party had access to the rest of the school. Ms. Reffel stated the party was from 12 midnight to 5 A.M. The school was open all night. Anybody could have went anywhere in the school and let anybody in. There was no security at the school. However, there were other parents who were helping out with the party.

The school was also open on Sunday for the clean up.

In addition we interviewed Linda Harris and her husband Phil Harris. They were at Ms. Reffel's residence and they also attended the After Prom Party. Ms. Harris made the following statements.

Ms. Harris stated she was sitting in her car behind the school by the gym somewhere between 11:30 P.M. to 12 Midnight, when she saw two boys come from the front of the school and tried to get in the school by the doors in back.

Mr. Harris remembers seeing the kid with green hair come through the front door.

Mr. Harris said another parent identified as John Van Nuys was working the doors oat the back of the school and he might have information. He can be reached at 303-985-3569.

We asked Ms. Reffel and Mr. & Mrs. Harris if any of them saw anybody carrying anything into the school. They replied no.

On 04/20/99, at about 12:30 hours, I became aware of a situation at Columbine High School involving gunfire and explosions. The location of Columbine High School is 6201 South Pierce Street in Littleton. At about 1300 hours, Detective Stan Connally and I left the Lakewood police station enroute to assist the Jefferson County Sheriff's Department.

Upon our arrival, at about 1315 hours, we met Sergeant Girson, who was near the intersection of Leawood Avenue and Pierce Street. Sergeant Girson obtained suspect information via the radio. Sergeant Girson assigned Detective Inskeep to accompany other law enforcement officers to the address of the home of the suspect named Dylan Klebold. Sergeant Girson instructed Detective Stan Connally, with other law enforcement officers, to drive to the address of home of the second suspect, Eric Harris. At about 1340 hours, Detectives Inskeep and Connally departed the scene and went to their respective locations.

At about 1440 hours, Sergeant Girson received a description of a suspect vehicle from Detective Connally via the phone. Detective Connally learned that Eric Harris drove a Honda Prelude, gray or brown in color and usually parked the vehicle in front of the school in the lower lot.

I paged Detective Inskeep a couple of times so that he could provide information to Jefferson County Investigator Kate Battan regarding pending search warrants on the suspect's homes. At about 1500 hours, Detective Inskeep answered my page and called. The phone was handed to Investigator Battan who obtained the needed information.

At 1620 hours, Commander Debbie Granger, from the Jefferson Caunty Critical Incident Team, assigned me to conduct officer interviews at Leawood Elementary School located at 6155 West Leawood Drive, Littleton. I was assigned to interview DPD Officer George Gray, Badge #86-008.

On 04/20/99, at about 1708 hours, I interviewed Technician George Allan Gray. Technician Gray stated he has worked for DPD for the last 13 years. The first 4 years were spent in District #4. Following that, he spent 5 years in the gang unit. For the last 3 years, he has been a full-time SWAT team member. Technician Gray stated his regular duties include support and cover for patrol units, warrant service and to handle barricaded gunman situations. He stated he works Detail 2, which is the day watch from 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. His normal days off are Sunday and Monday. Technician Gray confirmed he had Monday, 04/19/99 off. He returned to work this morning at 10:00 a.m. and attended roll call. He said, about an hour later, he heard radio traffic from Canine Officer Tom O'Neill, who explained there had been shots fired at Columbine High School.

Technician Gray stated he took an unmarked car from SWAT headquarters and drove to Columbine High School. He parked near the intersection of Leawood Avenue and Pierce Street where he met other SWAT team members Henry Bloodworth, Tom O'Neill and Jamie Smith. As Technician Gray changed into his SWAT gear, he heard radio traffic of gunshots being fired inside the school. Denver SWAT Lieutenant Pat Phelan and Captain Vince DiManna instructed the team they would be performing an evacuation of the students.

Technician Gray recalled he and 10 to 12 other SWAT team members used a fire truck as cover to approach the front doors of the school, which faced east. The fire truck was parked about 25 yards from the front door and Technician Gray recalled seeing bullet holes in the windows and an open door, just south of the front door. Technician Gray recalled seeing what he believed was a student with his hands up against the glass, north of the front door. Technician Gray said Captain DiManna and Lieutenant Phelan decided to move to the cafeteria side of the school, as that was where the last known gunfire occurred.

Technician Gray stated they moved around to the north side of the building and eventually ended up at the west side entrance. Technician Gray recalled seeing two students, one of whom was a male, and moving. The second student appeared to be a female and was not moving. Techician Gray saw an object near the door which appeared to be a propone bottle with objects affixed to the outside with black tape. He said this device was nearest the moving victim.

Technician Gray stated Captain DiManna and Lieutenant Phelan ordered a four to five man rescue team. Technician Gray said he was ordered by Captain DiManna and Lieutenant Phelan to provide cover fire into the windows of the doors as other team members pulled the victim to safety. Technician Gray stated he fired approximately 16 to 18 rounds in controlled bursts at the windows with the intention of pinning down the gunman whose location was unknown. Technician Gray stated Captain DiManna held the shield in front and Lieutenant Phelan was behind the Captain. Technician Gray recalled a Littleton officer or Sergeant Dan O'Shea being to the right of the shield. Technician Gray recalled being to the left of the shield.

The team advanced to the male victim. The victim was grabbed and pulled back to the fire truck. Technician Gray stated he fired about 4 rounds from his .9mm H & K MP5 Long Gun on the team's retreat. Technician Gray said Captain DiManna and Lieutenant Phelan made the decision to pull the second victim, the female who did not have signs of life, back to the fire truck. The team advanced a second time. Technician Gray stated he fired 10 to 11 rounds from his MP5 at the same area as suppression fire. The second victim was pulled to the fire truck.

Technician Gray said he saw a third victim, who appeared to be dead, near the bottom of some stairs on that side of the building. Technician Gray said he scanned the second floor windows but did not fire. He recalled Sergeant Dan O'Shea firing suppression rounds into a window below the library. The victim was not alive, according to Technician Gray.

Technician Gray stated Lieutenant Phelan and Captain DiManna agreed they should withdraw and reorganize at the Command Post. Technician Gray stated the rescue took approximately 15 minutes.

Technician Gray said he did not fire at any other time with the MP5 or with his Glock .45mm sidearm. Technician Gray went on to say he assisted in vacating and searching the school.

Technician Gray stated he obtained at least 8 hours of sleep the night previous. He stated he had not consumed alcohol in the previous 24 hours. He stated he had taken one pill of Flexeril and three pills of 200 mg Ibuprofen for his left wrist tendon which was tender. He explained he wore a splint on his left wrist at the time of the shooting. He

said his left hand was the support hand for the rifle and was not involved in manipulating the trigger. Technician Gray stated he ate a full dinner of 04/19/99 at about 1700 hours. He recalled eating four Girl Scout cookies at about 10:00 p.m., when he took the pain pills mentioned previously. He added he was married, with four children and there were no unusual problems at home. He stated work was going well.

He denied wearing contact lenses or glasses.

Technician Gray stated he is not only certified to carry the MP5 but he is an MP5 instructor. He has trained and carried the weapon for the last three years. He stated he qualifies with the weapon 4 times a year. Technician Gray stated he has never been in a police shooting himself but stated he had been in an incident in which his partner fired his weapon on December 7, 1990. Following the shooting, Technician Gray stated he spoke to team member Don Gilworth briefly. He stated no one else has handled his

MP5 since the incident.

Technician Gray stated he and the SWAT team practice "officer down" drills where officers lay down suppression rounds to pin down the suspect whose location is unknown. Technician Gray stated this maneuver provides rescue team members a

margin of safety.

At approximately 1430 hours, I assisted several Denver Police officers with the evacuation of students from the west side of the school near the library. The students were lead away from the school to nearby police vehicles which transported them to the command post area. Toward the end of the evacuation, an unknown S.W.A.T team member requested paramedics to respond to the library area.

to check for survivors. South Metro Fire Department paramedics Ken Ruben and David Zude requested that I accompany them to the library.

We entered the library through a broken glass door on the north side of the library. I observed several bodies laying on the floor near a large table in the middle of the room. Each of the bodies appeared to have gunshot wounds to the head and were face down in a pool of blood. Ruben and Zude checked for vital signs, but was unsuccessful for each of the bodies they checked. We checked on a total of eight or nine bodies in the library area. After checking the bodies, we exited the library through the same door we entered. There were numerous S.W.A.T. officers remaining in the library after we left.



On Tuesday, 04-20-99, myself, Detective M. Harper, Sgt. D. McCasky, Detective S. Connally, and Detective D.

Mowery, all with LPD, assisted Jefferson County S.O. investigators with the search of the Harris residence at

I assisted with the search of the interior of the residence. Prior to going into the residence, myself

and Detective Harper walked the perimeter of the residence to ensure our safety and to visually inspect the

security of the residence. We found nothing to indicate anyone was present except police personnel and the

residence appeared to be secure on the backside.

While walking around the residence, I noticed on the east side of the residence, there was a large flat concrete

pad, surrounded by wood fence. This concrete area had scuffs and scratches on the concrete with numerous

pieces of glass. The concrete appeared to have been struck by glass objects, causing the scratches and scuff

marks.

Once inside the residence, I was assigned to a search team with Detective Harper, an Agent from the CBI, and

a Jefferson County S.O. Investigator. We searched the family room area (interior room - north of garage). In this

room, I observed an 8mm Sony video camera and case laying on the family room floor. In a "secretary/bookcase"

wall unit, I found several paper documents which had information regarding Eric Harris. Some of these papers

were seized.

After the family room, we went upstairs to the bedroom area and searched the open loft area. No items were

seized from this area and it appeared to be used mostly by Eric Harris' mother.

Next, we went to the bedroom directly north and west of the upstairs area. This room appeared to belong to Eric's

older brother. There were no items of evidentiary value removed from this room either

After these areas were searched, I assisted in the processing of Eric Harris' bedroom. I assisted mostly by

bagging items found by other investigators. I did locate a note on a table near Eric's bed which appeared to have

indicated a time line and the number of people he intended to kill at Columbine High School. This was left on the

table to be photographed and was later seized and booked.

On Thursday, 04-29-99, at approx. 1015 hrs., myself and Detective Dietel went to Bear Creek High School, 3490 So. Kipling St., to follow-up reports reference students who had information regarding a possible recurrence of the Columbine High School incident at Bear Creek High School. The first person I spoke with was Samantha

KRESGE, a student at the school.

Samantha told me on Monday or Tuesday, of this week (04-26-99 or 04-27-99), she was communicating with a male subject, Cameron Oothoudt, over e-mail and the telephone. Samantha said she was told by Cameron, that on Friday (04-30-99), Bear Creek High School was going to be attacked by the Trench Coat Mafia (TCM). Samantha said she asked Cameron how he knew, and he told her he had friends who are in the TCM and they told him they were going to attack BCHS. Samantha added, Cameron told her later, that the TCM members he

new, did not actually tell him what was going to happen, he only overheard them saying what was going to happen. I asked Samantha how she received this information. Samantha said she talked with Cameron on the

phone and over "instant messaging", on America On Line (computers). Samantha did not recall what Cameron

told her when.

I asked Samantha if she knew any of the TCM members and she said only one - Robert Donohue. Samantha said she has not seen or heard from Robert for approx, two years, and used to know him by the street name of "Bug".

Samantha said Robert is now known in the TCM as "Smerf". Samantha did not have any information on Robert,

and did not know if he was involved in the Columbine H.S. incident or not.

Lasked Samantha what she thought about Cameron's statements. Samantha said she thinks Cameron was more interested in "sounding big" than he was in being violent. Samantha said when she was dating Cameron, in January, 1999, he once told her how much he knows about explosives and he talked frequently about what kind of bombs would make what kind of mess. Samantha said Cameron told her he hated her father and talked about what kind of bomb he would use to kill her father and what a mess he would make with his bombs. I asked "amantha if she knew of any violence Cameron was involved in and she said she didn't think he was involved in any. Samantha said he always acted "tough" and hit her one time on the buttocks, very hard. Samantha said she turned around and laughed at Cameron and this made him angry, but he did not respond to her at all. I asked Samantha if she thought Cameron could carry out any of these things he told her about. Samantha again said,

Cameron "...tries hard to impress people, but even his close friends call him a 'dumb ass', for the way he acts!" I asked Samantha if she knew if Cameron was on any medications. Samantha said Cameron told her once, he saw a psychologist and the psychologist told him he was crazy, but he has never said anything about being on any medications. I asked Samantha what she thought of Cameron's statements. Samantha said Cameron is "...really messed up and he doesn't care for people. Cameron is always talking about how he breaks people's necks on his computer games! Cameron is a 'dumb ass' and he is really weird!" I asked Samantha what she meant by "...really weird!" Samantha said she is a part of the "Gothics" at BCHS and they know they are social outcasts. Samantha said Cameron is even considered "...way out there - even further than the people I hand with!" I asked Samantha what type of music and computer games Cameron likes to play with. Samantha said Cameron mostly listens to Marilyn Manson, Tool, Rommstein, Ministry, Mega Death, and Metallica. The only computer games (both PC and Playstation games) were some type of spy game where you sneak up on people and break their necks, and Star Craft. I asked Samantha if she knew of anyone Cameron was close friends with, .amantha said Cameron's best friends are Shawn Hennigan and Joe Dingledine. Samantha added, Joe is currently a student at BCHS, but Shawn is out of school for medical reasons. I asked Samantha if she knew if Cameron had a girifriend at the school or not. Samantha said Cameron's ex-girifriend is a girl named "Crystal", but did not know her last name. Samantha was released to return class, after I requested she not discuss this information with anyone else.

Detective Dietel interviewed Joe Dingledine at BCHS. See his supplemental report for information on this interview. The other student with information, Sarah Flint, was interviewed by Agent Hunt at BCHS. No follow-up interview was conducted with Sarah.

After BCHS, Detective Dietel, a JCSD Deputy Sheriff, and I went to 4613 So. Devinney St., and contacted Cameron Oothoudt. Cameron was home with his father, Timothy Oothoudt. I requested to speak with both Cameron and his father and they agreed. Cameron told us he was expecting us. When I asked how he knew we were coming, he said his friend Joe had called twenty minutes prior and told him we had been at BCHS and were asking questions about Cameron. Also at the residence, was Sean Hennigan. Detective Dietel went upstairs and serviewed Sean, while I talked with Cameron and his father.

Cameron said he did not know anything about BCHS being a target and denied telling anyone the statements! told him I was told. Cameron said he had never talked with Sarah, as they do not like each other. Cameron said he had not talked with Samantha for approx. three weeks. When confronted with information about what I was told, Cameron continued to deny he made any such statements. When I told Cameron this was done over "instant messaging", he immediately replied, "I have never told Sarah or Sam anything about blowing up Bear Creek!" ! confronted Cameron with his statement and asked how he knew it was Sarah and Samantha. Cameron denied he said that, and then said he never made the statements about Bear Creek being a target. Cameron did admit he is friends with Sarah, but stated she is always making things up about him and trying to get him into trouble. I continued to confront Cameron with the statement he made and he tried to change his words around and I again confronted him with his exact statement. Cameron never offered an answer to the question and said he did not "remember" ever saying anything about Bear Creek being a target. I talked with Cameron more about how he found out Bear Creek was a target and who he knew in the TCM. Cameron said he did not know anyone in the CM, and only heard the things about several schools being targets from people he associates with at Southwest Plaza Mali. Cameron did not know any of their names, but believes they are part of the TCM group. I asked Cameron to tell me exactly what he heard. Cameron said he heard SCHS was to be a target on Monday, but nothing happened, so the day was changed to Friday (04-30-99), as this is the day Hitler died. Cameron said he also heard Chatfield and Lakewood High were targets and could not tell me who he heard this from. I asked Cameron when he heard this and he said about two days after the Columbine incident. I again asked Cameron who he knew was involved in the discussions at SW Plaza and he said he did not know any of their names, but ...just heard people talking!" I again asked Cameron why he made the statements to people about SCHS being targeted. Cameron again said he just heard people he doesn't know talking about it.

I began to question Cameron about two subjects, who's names came up in other conversations. I asked Cameron who Bobby Hillbourne was. Cameron said Bobby is a friend of his and he is a part of the TCM. I asked Cameron where Bobby lives. Cameron said he heard, about one week ago, Bobby left, just after the incident at Columbine HS, and went on a seven day camping trip to Utah. I asked Cameron how long it had been since he talked or saw Bobby. Cameron said two to three months, that he only hears how Bobby is doing from Greg Philips. I asked Cameron if he knew Bobby's phone number and he was able to provide it to me without much thought (932-9744 or 933-4551).

I WAS APPROACHED BY AN UNKNOWN FEMALE ADULT WHO SAID THAT TWO FEMALE STUDENTS HAD WITNESSED THE INITIAL ASSAULT ON THE SECOND FLOOR. I SPOKE WITH BROOKE SKINNER AND PAGE ALLISON WHO SAID THAT THEY WERE IN A MR CRAM'S (SP?) SCIENCE CLASS ON THE SECOND FLOOR WHEN THEY HEARD THE SOUND OF GUNFIRE. BROOKE SKINNER SAID THAT MR CRAM STEPPED OUT TO LOOK AND THE LAST SHE SAW, MR CRAM HAD FALLEN TO THE FLOOR. BROOKE SKINNER AND PAGE ALLISON SAID THAT THEY THEN RAN FROM THE ROOM AND AS THEY DID, THEY SAW ONE SUSPECT ARMED WITH A RIFLE. THE SUSPECT WAS SHOOTING AT THE STUDENTS AND BROOKE SKINNER SAID HE WAS A WHITE MALE, WEARING DARK CLOTHING WITH SOME TYPE OF LARGE BELT AROUND HIS WAIST. I SELECTED AGT'S RUYBAL, MCNITT, GARCIA AND MYSELF AND WALKED W/B THROUGH THE PARK. AGT MCNITT HAD STARTED W/B WHILE I WAS COLLECTING THE OTHER AGENTS AND ENCOUNTERED A SUBJECT APPROACHING THE SCHOOL FROM THE PUBLIC LIBRARY PARKING LOT CARRYING A RIFLE. SEE REPORT BY AGT MCNITT.

THE ABOVE LISTED AGENTS THEN ESTABLISHED A PERIMETER FROM THE CENTER OF THE CLEMENT PARK BASEBALL FIELDS WEST TO THE S/W AREA OF THE PARK UNTIL RELIEVED AT APPROXIMATELY 1900 HRS, 04-20-99.

McNitt said that he was on duty and responded to the scene of the Columbine shooting to assist and was establishing a perimeter near the Jefferson County Library,

nbine Branch when he observed Petty running toward the high school with a rifle in his hands. Petty was contacted and taken into custody by Agent McNitt. McNitt said that he took custody of the rifle and a knife which Petty had strapped to his leg. Agent McNitt turned Petty over to the custody of Jefferson County Deputy Brovsky who took custody of the rifle and knife. Perry was later booked at the Sheriff's Office and the items booked in to Evidence. Dep Brovsky said that Perry was initially interviewed by two unidentified detectives on scene.

On May 21, 1999, Investigator Bob Vette and Det Hayes contacted Petty at his home at 4801 S. Wadsworth Blvd., #3-108. Telephone 303-948-3715. Petty is a white male, 5'10", 165 lbs. with brown hair and hazel eyes. Petty is further identified by NCIC/CCIC arrest record, Colorado SID 460842, Georgia SID 1975667P and FBI #920126RA7. Petty's criminal history involves petty larceny, criminal trespass and false reporting. Petty is employed as an installer of alarm systems for ADT Security at W. 44th Ave. and Kipling St., Wheat Ridge, Co. His supervisors are Ron and Frank. Shaffer at 303-423-6778.

Petty told Det. Hayes and Inv. Vette that he was just getting out of the shower preparing to go to work on 04-20-99 when he saw a news bulletin concerning Columbine High School on television between 11 20 and 11 30 A.M.

Petty said that he wanted to help at the school so he quickly took his air rifle and knife and drove his white Toyota

To pickup truck to the pavilion at the Jefferson County library parking lot where he parked and attempted to approach the school. Petty said that he only got approximately 50 yards away from his vehicle when he was contacted by

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

a police officer who took him into custody. Petty said he was then turned over to a Jefferson County Deputy and interviewed at the scene. He said that while on scene he was tested for gunshot residue by agent from the FBI.

Petty said that he does not currently know any students or faculty at Columbine High School however did have some friends that attended the school during the early 1990's. Petty explained that the rifle was an air pump .22 caliber BB/pellet gun and that he did not have any ammunition with him at the high school. Petty said that his only purpose for going to the school was to attempt to help the responding police agencies and the students inside the school.

At approximately 1015 hours, 4/21/99, Supervisor Monsoor requested that Criminalist Bohan and I respond to the Jefferson County Sheriff's Dept. in the execution of a search warrant, in conjunction with the JeffCo Critical Incident Team. Criminalist Bohan and I responded and arrived at approximately 1100 hours, 4/21/99.

Upon arrival, we met Deputy Tim Walsh of the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office. Also present were members of the Arapahoe County Bomb Squad and the FBI. The residence is in a very secluded location, with a long driveway from Cougar Rd. The primary house is a multi level, gray siding structure with a three car garage. The tennis and basketball courts are on the north side and the main entrance is along the east side of the residence, at the south end of the home. There is an additional structure to the south of the primary residence that also has gray siding and numerous windows. At approximately 1140 hours, a detective from the JeffCo Sheriff's Dept. arrived with a signed search warrant. At that time, the Arapahoe County Bomb Squad and the FBI ntered the residence to secure it and declare the area safe to enter and earch.

Parked on the exterior of the residence, on the north side, is a black BMW 320i. This vehicle has no registration plates and the interior is partially gutted. There are numerous stickers on the car. These stickers are: 1) the Chemical Brothers, 2) Rammstein, 3) Marilyn Manson, 4) KMFDM NAIVE, 5) NIN (the second 'N' is backwards). It does not appear that this vehicle was used for any transportation.

At approximately 1200 hours, I was requested to assist the bomb squad unit by obtaining photographs. Some devices were found in the bedroom where it is believed that the suspect resided. Overall photographs were obtained of a gray box and some other incendiary devices. The box, a small cash box, contained two pipe bombs. We then exited the residence, pending the completion of the sweep by the bomb squad.

I was advised that the pool house was cleared. We proceeded to the pool area and obtained overall photographs of the pool and the pool house. I was further advised that the guest house was also clear. The guest house is the structure immediately to the south of the main residence. I entered the building and obtained overall photographs of its interior. The building consists of a living area, a small kitchen, a small bath and a loft with a bed and a small closet. The interior was extremely neat and organized.

Criminalist Bohan and I were then directed to an area northeast of the sidence, which is in a small wooded area. The bomb technicians had located

an area where an apparent device had been detonated earlier. I obtained overall and detailed color photographs of the remnants of this device. Items were seized. These items consisted of shotgun wads and a small electronic device.

Once the bomb squad had declared the interior of the residence safe, we entered the home to conduct the search. I first obtained overall photographs of the entire residence.

The home is a three story structure with the main entrance entering into the middle level. The middle level consisted of a family room, living room, two offices, an art studio, the master bedroom and the kitchen/dining area. The upper level consisted of two bedrooms and a bath. The lower level consisted of a laundry room, a gymnasium and the garage.

The focus of the search was in one of the bedrooms on the upper level. Evidence inside this bedroom indicated that this is where Dylan, one of the uspects, resided. Numerous articles were seized during the search. I obtained photographs during the search. All articles seized were maintained by the Jefferson County Sheriff's Dept. Other detectives searched the remainder of the residence. Several articles were also saized from the remainder of the home. At the conclusion of the search, I obtained additional overall photographs depicting the condition of the residence. I also obtained a photograph showing the presence of the search warrant and copies of the inventory. We exited the residence at 1645 hours, at which time the Jefferson County Sheriff's Dept. detectives secured the residence.

At the conclusion of the search, I turned over to the Sheriff's Dept., six rolls of film and one VHS tape. Criminalist Bohan had obtained videographic coverage of the search. A receipt, which is attached, was obtained for the evidence turned over to the Sheriff's Dept.

- On April 24, 1999 JCSO Inv. Gary Muse had written a report regarding information he had received from Agent Laurel Lichtenberg at the CHS crime scene. According to the report, Agent Lichtenberg had related that she had spoken to CHS student Brooks Brown, who said that during lunch, he had run into Eric Harris coming toward the school carrying a "weird looking duffel bag" as he approached. Harris allegedly told Brown, "I like you. Get out of bere".
- 2. A review of an early version of a JCSO search warrant affidavit relates that Inv. Muse had interviewed Brooks Brown, who had said he had seen Eric Harris in the corridor of CHS, carrying a duffel bag, which had an odd shape to it. This statement was inconsistent with that referred to above, as well as to two subsequent statements given by Brown to Agents Holstlaw and Estep, and again to Holstlaw and Clyman. During those statements, Brown said that he had seen and spoken to Harris in the junior parking lot immediately prior to the shooting, and saw Harris remove a large duffel bag from his car and place it on the ground. Depending upon which version is given by Brown, he said he walked away, and heard the shooting begin either 30 seconds or two minutes later. He then ran into the nearby neighborhood, where he eventually encountered the two teachers.
- 3. On May 12, 1999 I spoke to Agent Lichtenberg to clarify the information she had obtained and reported. She said that on April 20, 1999 she did not interview Brooks Brown. However, she did interview two CHS teachers (males, names unknown) who told her that they had been driving in the neighborhood immediately south of the school, when they ran into Brooks Brown. He was agitated about the shooting which had just begun, and described to them that he had seen Harris walking toward the school with the duffel bag as described in paragraph 1 above.

On 04/20/99, at approximately 1600 hours, I responded to 6201 South Pierce Street to assist in reference to the shooting at Columbine High School. I arrived on scene with several other Lakewood police agents who had also responded. I was then requested by Sergeant Randy West of the Jefferson County Sheriff's Department to assist with the execution of a search warrant at the residence of Eric Harris,

I responded to the address with Deputies Craig Schoske and Cheryl Zimmerman, arriving at 1920 hours. We were first met by Jefferson County Deputy Scott who had secured the perimeter. Deputy Scott advised that no one had been inside the residence since it had been secured. Also present were Lakewood Detectives Stan Connally, Dave Mowery, Mike Greenwell, and Mitch Harper, and Littleton Crime Lab personnel Jessica Barrett and Bruce Adams. Chuck Davis from the Colorado Bureau of Investigations later responded to assist with the search.

After the residence was photographed by Littleton Crime Lab personnel, we entered the residence to execute the search warrant. The residence is a two story house with a basement located on a cul-de-sac. I then assisted with the search of the kitchen, family room, and formal dining area. Items seized from these areas included a Columbine High School class schedule for Eric Harris which was attached to the refrigerator by a magnet. Also seized were high school photographs of Eric Harris along with his graduation announcements which were located on the dining room table. An address list of people the announcements were being sent was also seized. On the table in the living room was a drawer containing several documents regarding Eric Harris' high school data were also seized.

There was a shed detached from the main home in the back yard that was also searched. This shed was searched with the assistance of an ATF agent identified by a first name of Matt. 1 did not

obtain Matt's last name during the search. In the shed was located two PVC white pipes which were

seized. According to the ATF agent, these could have possibly been used in the making of the pipe

bombs.

I next responded to the basement area to assist with the search of the suspect's bedroom. Due

to the size of the area and the close quarters, I did not actively participate in this search. FBI Agent

Mark Holslaw arrived on scene with Jefferson County Sheriff's Deputy Don Estep and Attorney

General Investigator Gary Klineman. These three assisted with the search of Harris' bedroom. At

one point, the ATF agent located what he believed to be a bomb in the bedroom. Members of the

bomb squad responded and defused this particular device. During my participation in the search,

I did not view the device that was located.

Chuck Davis from the Colorado Bureau of Investigation dismantled a computer located in a

second level bedroom/office of the residence. All items seized from the residence were placed in the

vehicle belonging to Deputy Craig Schoske. Also during the search, Lakewood Detective Gregg Slater

responded to assist with the search of the residence.

The garage was searched as well as a Toyota Camry located in the garage. During the search

of the garage, it was noted that there was a very heavy smell of gasoline. Lakewood Detective Mike

Greenwell noted that on the side of the residence on a concrete slap there were particles of glass.

It was reported that neighbors had heard Eric Harris breaking glass in the previous days. It was

unknown what this glass was used for, but speculation was it was used in the pipe bombs.

We cleared the residence at 0010 hours on 04/21/99, while the Jefferson County sheriff's

deputies continued the search of the Eric Harris' bedroom. The remainder of the house had been

searched, and no further action was required. We then responded to the command post at

Columbine High School and contacted Sergeant West who advised us to return in the morning to

assist with the investigation.

On 04/21/99, we responded to Columbine High School where we stood by for instructions.

It was then requested that Lakewood detectives contact some of the victims who were in area

hospitals. At this time, I responded to Swedish Medical Center with Detectives Slater, Wilson, and

Inskeep. Due to the condition of the victims, we were unable to speak with them. Detective Slater

and I did speak with the parents of Valeen Schnur. See Detective Slater's report for further

information regarding this interview.

Detective Inskeep and I next responded to Lutheran Medical Center to contact victims who

were being treated there. Upon arrival, we were advised that all the victims had been released. We

then left a serious bodily injury statement to be completed by the physicians. This statement was to

be faxed to us as soon as it was completed.

Detective Inskeep and I then responded to St. Anthony Central Hospital where we met with

Detectives Slater and Wilson. Detectives Slater and Wilson had spoken with some parents and had

On 5/15/99, I was assigned information control number DN3554 for follow up investigation. The information control narrative stated that Shawn Nossaman indicated that a lunch employee, Ms. Caruthers, was in the cafeteria when this occurred. The information control sheet was prepared by Sergeant Calvin Hemphill, Denver Police Department.

On 5/18/99, I contacted Jefferson County Schools Area Administrator, Barb Monseu, and requested any information she might have on cafeteria employee by the name of Ms. Caruthers. She said that she had no 'ormation on such an employee but would provide me with information on the manager and other employees of the kitchen. The program is mainly run by the students, who write, direct, and act as camera operators and on camera announcers. The only staff involvement is by Gary Talocco who states that since the program is done every morning the students are running it by themselves, and he just overseas it for content. Gary Talocco stated I would need to speak with the students to determine what the "thought" or "phrase of the day" was on the day of the incident. Gary Talocco was defensive and stated he had been interviewed twice before but not on this subject.

The rebel News Network broadcasts are not recorded, so no record of what actually was broadcast is available.

Rissmiller stated they had been joking around with the fact that April 20th is the marijuana smoking day. The show had made reference to the "international day to smoke marijuana" as he put it and the jokes were about marijuana. Rissmiller was not sure what the phrase of the day had been but he had wanted to use "You don't want to be here today 4/20 4/20 4/20" Making reference to the 20th being a marijusna smokeing day. He is unsure of what phrase was actually used. Rissmiller stated the show made no reference to Hitler, and he was unaware it was Hitler's birthday until after the incident. He stated the broadcasts are done without scripts and much of the broadcast is similar day to day so only minimal notes are used and are not saved. Rissmiller stated when the incident took place he was supposed to be in marketing class but had gone to Taco Bell with Dave Macone for an early lunch.

John Flemming is responsible for the audio for the RNN. Flemming stated he remembered the phrase of the day to be "How can they expect us to be in school today." During the incident Flemming was in the Tech lab. He heard what he thought were fireworks and possibly a senior prank. The fire alarms also went off about the same time. Flemming and other students started to exit the room at the direction of Mr. Tucker, a teacher, and ran out a north door of the school, by Clement park. They then climbed the fence by the smokers pit and continued to the parking lot at Clement park. After Flemming climbed the fence, he thought he heard bombs going off. Flemming stated he had been in video class first semester with Eric Harris, but they were not friends. According to Flemming, Harris would occasionally show up in video class this semester. Sometimes Dylan Kliebold would be with him but Flemming did not feel either was actually enrolled in the class. Flemming stated he did remember seeing a music video that Eric Harris had done as a project the first semester. The video was very violent and had clips form Terminator and Starship Troopers and other very bloody gun battles. Flemming stated he thought it was a little violent but did not think much of it at the time. Flemming is unaware where a copy of this music video is.

Veik could not remember who came up with the original phrase. Veik stated he changed the prhase of the day because he did not feel the original phrase was appropriate. Veik made the phrase "How can you expect us to stay in school on a day like today?" Veik actually typed in the phrase to the graphics generator and stated that he often "cleaned up" the phrases. Veik stated the phrases are not approved by anyone and the whole broadcast is left up to the students to keep within limits. Veik stated he had come up with the phrase because the weather had been bad for some time and was expected to be very nice.

Gary Talocco provided a list of his video students, but did not have an actual list of those present for the Rebel News Network broadcast on April 20, 1999. Talocco stated that the students are not assigned to specific jobs for the broadcast and that it is voluntary and they "...pretty much run it themselves."

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Narrative: On 04/20/99 at approximately 1500 hours I was dispatched to Columbine High School to deliver fresh radio batteries that I had retrieved from various sergeants' radios at the station. I arrived at 1506 hours and distributed the batteries to various perimeter units. At that time I relieved Sergeant Nate Miller who was on scene from the original Watch I response to the call. Sergeant Heffner was also on scene. Our responsibilities included maintaining a perimeter north and west of the school in Clement Park.

Shortly after 1900 hours, I was contacted by Agent Toby Maez who had been given a letter by a citizen named Robert Wallace. Mr. Wallace said he found a sealed letter near 7605 W. Colfax Ave and after reading its contents called LPD. Agent Maez felt it might be relevant to the investigation at the school. I instructed him to book the original (preserved for prints) into our property unit and to have someone transport a copy to me at Clement Park. A second copy was provided by me to John Kickbush at Clement Park

Upon examining the letter is was found to be addressed to:

The first page of the letter is dated "Monday 4/19". The letter seems to be a travelog at the beginning but on the bottom of page three the writer mentions "Liberal Girl" saying she is from Mount Vernon, N.Y. and is a 10th grader. The letter says that "She's leading a meeting here about school shootings, and leading the Peace Activation Group going to Columbine High School." The letter goes on to mention that "We might get some national broadcasting out of this, which is great". Later, the write says that "Liberal girl was quite impressive. I told her she'll definitely get on national TV. Then she started talking repeatedly about people being made aware." "Made aware of what exactly?' "Of school shootings". The writer had knowledge that "these kids had bullet-proof body armor and uzi semi-automatic weapons and it was their parents!" The letter is signed "I love you, Alex".

At approximately 2200 hours on 4/20/99 I responded to Leawood Elementary School at the request of the J o S.O. I contacted Lt. John Dunow and Dep. Warren (J.L. Warren?). Information was related to me that had been obtained from an interview with an associate of the two deceased suspects. According to the individual being interviewed, several other subjects were involved with the planning and execution of the shootings at Columbine High School. He further related that the group had planned on committing similar shootings on 4/21 at Bear Creek High School and Chatfield High School. During my conversations with Dunow and Warren I mentioned the letter that had been found and I asked them to question their

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informant about its contents. Deputy Warren returned a short while later and stated that the subject had seen it before. I am not certain at this point if he meant the subject had seen the actual letter or just the various phrases within the letter. The informant had pointed out poems, a quote from WW II, and terminology used in a movie entitled "6 Things To Do in Denver When You're Dead". According to Deputy Warren, the informant indicated to him that Alex was a student and that Eric Harris or one other subject in the group, whose name I do not recall, had "helped" her write the letter.

Warren went on to say that "Liberal Girl" referred to in the letter was Alex according to the informant. As mentioned earlier, the letter referred to liberal girl being on national TV. In the press coverage of the shootings by the Rocky Mountain News, they interviewed a female student named Alejandra "Alex" Marsh who is 16 years of age, which would be consistent with "liberal girl" being referred to in the letter as a 10th grader. The article is on pages 16A-18A of the 4/21/99 issue. Marsh is quoted as saying she saw someone she knew with a shotgun and that he was more than capable of doing this. She is further quoted as saying "He had spoken of doing something like this, but in an almost jesting kind of way". I have also seen this Alex Marsh on television segments aired by the media. All of this may be consistent with the "national broadcasting" referred to in the letter and the mentioning of liberal girl being on TV.

O₁. -/22/99 I checked with directory assistance and found that the return address on the letter is a valid address listed to Alexis Bhagat with a telephone number of 1-518-427-7249. On checking for a Bree Edwards, to whom the letter was addressed, directory assistance found only one B. Edwards listed in Albany. That person was listed at 243 Elm St. with a telephone number of 1-518-434-4808. I have made no attempt to call these numbers or otherwise contact the residents.

(There is the possibility that this letter may have been written over a two day period, as there is a line across page 3 about 3/4 of the way down. That may account for some of the knowledge of body armor and uzi's mentioned in the narrative.)

UPON OUR ARRIVAL WE WERE DIRECTED TO RESPOND TO SWEDISH HOSPITAL TO INTERVIEW VICTIMS WHO WERE BEING TRANSPORTED TO THE HOSPITAL FOR TREATMENT OF THEIR INJURIES. WHILE ENROUTE TO SWEDISH HOSPITAL WE WERE ADVISED THAT WE WERE TO RESPOND, INSTEAD, TO LITTLETON HOSPITAL. WE ARRIVED AT LITTLETON HOSPITAL AT APPROX 1300 HRS AND MET DETECTIVE GREENWELL THERE.

DETECTIVE MCGLYNN AND I FIRST SPOKE TO V-DANIEL STEEPLETON. STEEPLETON HAD AN APPARENT GUNSHOT WOUND TO HIS LEFT KNEE. SEE REPORT BY DETECTIVE MCGLYNN FOR DETAILS OF THE INTERVIEW. STEEPLETON'S CLOTHES WERE COLLECTED BY ME AND DETECTIVE MCGLYNN, AND WERE LATER BOOKED AT LPD.

I NEXT SPOKE TO V-MAKAI HALL. MY CONVERSATION WITH HALL WAS VERY LIMITED DUE TO HIS INJURIES AND THE FACT THAT HE WAS BEING READIED TO BE AIRLIFTED TO ST.ANTHONY'S HOSPITAL. V-HALL SUFFERED APPARENT GUNSHOT WOUNDS TO HIS NECK AND RIGHT KNEE.

V-HALL TOLD ME THAT HE OBSERVED TWO SUSPECTS. ONE SUSPECT WAS IDENTIFIED AS DILLON (LAST UNK). THE SECOND MALE WAS UNKNOWN TO V-HALL. V-HALL INDICATED THAT THE SUSPECTS WERE ARMED WITH SHOTGUNS, AN "UZI", POSSIBLE PISTOLS, AND "BOMBS". V-HALL WAS UNABLE TO TELL ME ANYMORE, AND WILL NEED TO BE RE-INTERVIEWED.

I COLLECTED V-HALL'S CLOTHING AND BOOKED IT AS EVIDENCE AT LPD.

AT APPROX 1430 HRS I COLLECTED THE CLOTHING FROM VICTIM JENNIFER DOYLE. DOYLE WAS BEING TREATED FOR AN APPARENT GUNSHOT WOUND TO HER RIGHT HAND. V-DOYLE WAS INTERVIEWED BY DETECTIVE GREENWELL. I LATER BOOKED V-DOYLE'S CLOTHING INTO THE LPD PROPERT UNIT AS EVIDENCE.

AT APPROX 1440 HRS VICTIM JOYCE JANKOWSKI ARRIVED AT THE HOSPITAL. V-JANKOWSKI IS A TEACHER AT COLUMBINE HIGH SCHOOL. JANKOWSKI HAD AN INJURY TO HER LEFT KNEE AND ABRASIONS TO HER BACK AFTER SHE FELL FROM THE CEILING IN THE TEACHER'S LOUNGE.

V-JANKOWSKI PROVIDED THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION. JANKOWSKI INDICATED THAT SHE FIRST BECAME AWARE OF A PROBLEM WHEN SHE WAS NOTIFIED OF SOME TYPE OF COMMOTION AND LOOKED OUT THE ONLY WINDOW IN THE LOUNGE. THE WINDOW FACES THE WEST. JANKOWSKI INDICATED THAT SHE OBSERVED TWO DOWNED STUDENTS. SHE THEN HEARD SEVERAL POPS, LATER DETERMINED TO BE GUNSHOTS, AND SCREAMS FROM THE AREA OF THE WEST DOORS. JANKOWSKI STATED THAT SHE HEARD SEVERAL GUNSHOTS AND SCREAMS FROM THE CAFETERIA. SHE STATED THAT SHE HID IN THE FACULTY ROOM BATHROOM WITH THREE OTHER ADULTS AND THREE STUDENTS. THEY LOCKED THE DOOR AND TURNED OUT THE LIGHTS.

JANKOWSKI DESCRIBED HEARING SEVERAL LOUD BANGS, LATER DETERMINED TO BE EXPLOSIONS, AND SEVERAL MORE GUNSHOTS. THERE WAS ONE VERY LOUD EXPLOSION AND THE LIGHTS WENT OFF. SHE STATED THAT SHE COULD SMELL NATURAL GAS. V-JANKOWSKI STATED THAT THEY COULD HEAR "METAL" BEING MOVED AROUND IN THE CAFETERIA, BUT THAT THEY COULDN'T HEAR ANY SCREAMING ANYMORE. V-JANKOWSKI DESCRIBED HEARING VOICES OF MORE THAN ONE PERSON OUTSIDE THE LOUNGE. SHE STATED THAT THEY THOUGHT IT WAS THE POLICE, BECAUSE THE VOICES SPOKE IN A CONTROLLED TONE WITH LITTLE EMOTION. JANKOWSKI STATED THAT THEY REALIZED IT WASN'T THE POLICE WHEN THEY LOOKED OUT THE WINDOW AND SAW THE POLICE FAR AWAY ON THE PERIMETER.

JANKOWSKI STATED THAT THEY KEPT HEARING SPORADIC EXPLOSIONS FROM WITHIN THE SCHOOL. SHE STATED THEY TRIED TO USE A PHONE IN THE FACULTY LOUNGE, BUT THAT IT WASN'T WORKING. INVESTIGATION:

On 04-20-99, Detective Hal Shucard and I were responding to the area of Columbine High School, We were requested by Sgt. Miller to respond to Swedish Hospital and interview victims of the shooting that had occurred at the school. Prior to our arrival at Swedish Hospital, we were diverted to Littleton Hospital. We arrived there at 1300 hours and were advised that three victims were currently in the emergency room.

Detective Greenwell was already on scene and was interviewing one of the victims, Stephanie Munson. -Detective Shucard and I were directed to one of the emergency room care units where we met with Daniel-Steepleton, DOB: 01-30-82. We observed that Steepleton's clothing had already been cut off of him and that he suffered an injury on his left knee. Daniel Steepleton is a junior at Columbine High School.

Daniel Steepleton told us that he had been in the library at Columbine High School when he heard several loud bangs. He said that a teacher then came running into the library yelling, "they have guns". Steepleton said that he then heard more shots. He said that all of the students either tried to run or hid under tables. He said that suspects then came into the library. They demanded that kids with white ball caps stand up. He said that he was then shot in the knee and fell to the ground. After he fell to the ground, he heard the students throwing, "bombs at people". He said that he heard someone yell "get out" and he got up and ran out of the library.

Steepleton said that he knew the people involved, not by name, but by a gang they are associated with known as the "Trench coat Mafia". He said that one of the students that was shooting was Dylan. He described the two suspects as wearing long trench coats, with baseball caps on backwards. He said that he thought one had long hair. He said he believed he was shot from about a distance of 15 ft, and that he was shot with shotgun.

As Steepleton was taking cover in the library, he heard one of the suspects yell as they came in, "this is for the four years of bull shit we had to put up with". He said then one of them yelled, "everyone with a white hat stand up". He said that they were both shooting at people in the library and couldn't identify the person that shot at him, but he thought it was Dylan.

Steepleton said that after he was shot, he had gone down and was laying down with his head down and he heard one of the suspects yell, "stand up nigger boy". Steepleton again said that he didn't look up to see what was going on but then heard a gun shot. He then heard one of the suspects say, "I always wanted to do this" and then he heard them mention something about a knife. He didn't look up to see what was going on. He said that

throughout the course of the time in the library, he heard the suspects yelling, "die...get on the floor".

Steepleton said that the weapons that he saw included a shotgun, some type of automatic or semi-automatic machine pistol, hand-made bombs that had a fuse and duck tape that needed to be lit before they were thrown at people, and both suspects were carrying backpacks, which he believed they were getting the bombs from. Daniel Steepleton's clothing was seized by the Lakewood Police Department. The injury to his knee turned out to be a shotgun blast and three pellets were removed during surgery and turned over to the Arapahoe County Criminalistics unit. No photos were taken of Mr. Steepleton because he was transported to surgery prior to the arrival of Arapahoe County Criminalistics.

Other students and faculty that were on scene at the hospital were identified as Jennifer Doyle, Nick Foss, Steven Eubanks, Makai Hall, Stephanie Munson, and Joyce Jankowski. Jennifer Doyle and Stephanie Munson were interviewed by Detective Mike Greewell. Makai Hall and Joyce Jankowski were interviewed by Detective Hal Shucard. The other victims were interviewed by representatives of Arapahoe County Sheriff's Department.

I determined that I would go to St. Anthony's Hospital of see if I could be of any assistance. On scene at 1420 hours I contacted Detective Jim Nelson and Detective Susan Gaetano, from the Arvada Police Department. They informed me they had just arrived and that there were already three victims on scene and other victims were reported to be en route to St. Anthony's from the scene of the shooting. It was determined that the best course of action was for each of us to assume investigative duties for one of the victims on scene, I interviewed victim Kacey Ruegsegger.

I observed that Kacey had suffered a gunshot wound in the right shoulder above the collar bone which appeared to be an "in and out" injury. I also observed a second gunshot wound in her right hand at the base of the thumb, which was also an "in and out" injury. At the time of the interview Kacey was in a trauma room adjacent to the emergency room on a gurney, she was receiving oxygen and had received two separate injections of morphine for pain. She was crying and semi-hysterical during this time. I asked Kacey if she could tell me what had happened to her. She said that she was in the library when she heard gun shots. She did not know exactly what the noise was. Several moments later the librarian came running in and told them that someone had a gun

The gunman jerked the chair away and from about five feet velled at her "quit your bitching" and fired at her. She indicated that she felt the first shot hit her in the shoulder and she was not aware of the second shot to her hand. I asked Kacey how she got out of the library. She indicated that two people who she did not know picked her up and began trying to drag her out of the library, but at some point they began to get trampled and she was left. She did not recall how she got out of the library. She could only remember being in a police car at some point. The only person Kacey knew in the library by name was Dan Steepleton, the rest were unknown to her.

Several minutes after taking this statement I re-entered the trauma room with Detective Susan Gaetano, from the Arvada Police Department and we went over Kacey's statement with her again Kacey was beginning to show the effects of the morphine injections and her answers were becoming less clear. At that point the attempt to obtain a statement from her was discontinued. Shortly after

that she was wheeled out of the room en route to surgery.

OBSERVATION/INVESTIGATION:

ON TUESDAY 04/20/99 AT 1200 HOURS I WAS ON DUTY IN THE INVESTIGATIONS DIVISION OF THE LAKEWOOD POLICE DEPARTMENT. I WAS REQUESTED BY SERGEANT GEORGE HINKLE TO PREPARE FOR A MISSION AS A SWAT TEAM MEMBER.

I GATHERED MY GEAR, AND ACCOMPANIED DETECTIVE JOE WRAY IN A MARKED LAKEWOOD POLICE DEPARTMENT VEHICLE TO THE AREA JUST SOUTH OF COLUMBINE HIGH SCHOOL IN UNINCORPORATED JEFFERSON COUNTY.

MYSELF AND SEVERAL OTHERS FROM THE LAKEWOOD POLICE DEPARTMENT SWAT TEAM WERE THEN SENT TO THE NORTH WEST CORNER OF THE HIGH SCHOOL, WHERE WE MET UP WITH THE DENVER POLICE DEPARTMENT SWAT TEAM.

- I WAS FIRST ASSIGNED TO PROVIDE COVER ON AN OPEN DOOR ON THE WEST SIDE OF THE SCHOOL. THIS COVER WAS REQUIRED FOR STUDENTS WHO WERE BEING EVACUATED OUT OF THE CAFETERIA AREA.
- I WAS THEN ASSIGNED TO GO UP ONTO THE ROOF AND PROVIDE COVER WITH MY MP-5 SUB MACHINE GUN. AFTER ONLY A FEW MINUTES ON THE ROOF I WAS TOLD TO RETREAT.
- I THEN STAGED NEAR A COMMAND POST JUST BAST OF THE SCHOOL. I WAS THEN SENT WITH THREE OTHER LAKEWOOD SWAT MEMBERS TO MEET UP WITH OTHER LAKEWOOD SWAT MEMBERS ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF THE SCHOOL.

ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF THE SCHOOL, I MET UP WITH THESE OTHER TEAM MEMBERS WHO WERE STATIONED BEHIND AN ARMORED CAR.

- I WAS THEN ASSIGNED TO PROVIDE COVER WITH MY MP-5 SUB MACHINE GONE ON THE BACK OF THE ARMORED CAR AS WE RESCUED A MALE STUDENT FROM THE SECOND FLOOR SOUTH SIDE.

On 042099, at approximately 1130 hrs. Dispatch stated that Jefferson County was requesting help from all surrounding agencies for an shooting at Columbine High School.

INVESTIGATION By Officer D.A.BACA 8402:

Upon my arrival at the scene I contacted a Jefferson County Sgt. and asked him if they needed our SWAT Team to respond. He stated that he did, so I contacted Sgt. Parker and requested he make a call out. I also requested that we have the Negotiators respond to set a up a command post posting board.

Officer Wood arrived on scene and we set up the posting center on the side of Nike Wood's police vehicle. I contacted the principal of the Columbine High School, Frank DeAngelis and two School Administrators, Barbara Monseu and Ricky Kaufman. I interviewed the principal Frank DeAngelis who told me that he was confronted in the school by a armed gun wan who was carrying a rifle. He stated that he ushered several students into a room and locked the door. He also stated that he and the students were able to escape.

As we gathered names of possible suspects, I requested that the school administrators obtain their dob's, home addresses and other information. This information was posted. I requested that Beangelis draw a layout of the school so that we could identify where hostages were hiding, which he did.

As students and teachers, who were hiding in the school called their family members we were able to get telephone numbers and call these students and teachers back. We made lists of persons hiding and established where they were hiding. This information was also posted and passed on to the tactical team.

Because of the many telephone calls that were being made we moved the postings to the Arapahoe County SWAT van. The FBI placed three more hard telephone lines into the van so we were able to make calls on these abones rather than cell phones.

Two Lakewood officers and a f8I agent also helped with the posting due to the large amount of hostage information and names.

After the building had been cleared twice, we took down the postings and lists of student and teachers names marked them with our Littleton PD case number. We tried to give this information to Jeffco, but were unable to find a safe place to keep the evidence. I brought the inf tion back to the Littleton Police Department and placed it into evis...ce. I gave Jeffco my card and told them where the evidence would be. OABACA 8402 042199

I was advised at approximately 1135 that Jefferson County S.O. was responding to a *shots fired* call at Columbine High School. Myself and Cpl.Bohlen responded. At this time Ofc. Baca had arrived and advised that there were multiple suspects and multiple victims and that Jeffco was requesting our SWAT unit. I advised Dispatch to page out SWAT, which was done at 1141. I arrived shortly therafter. I was advised by Captain Armstrong of Arapahoe County S.O. that our SWAT unit was the closest and that "It's your problem." He offered to provide administrative assistance. Sqt. C.W.Black arrived and I was advised to take charge of the tactical units as they were deployed. I took a position on the east perimeter, where I was later joined by Lt. Williams of Arapahoe S.O., Lt. Brennan of Lakewood PD, and Capt. Dimanna of Denver PD. I remained at this post until around 1600, coordinating tactical responses by the various units, when I met with Cpl. Ratcliff inside the main entrance to be briefed by him, and to assist in coordinating further search efforts. We were relieved at approximately 1700, and after providing names and ranks to Jefferson County personnel, we cleared the scene and returned to Littleton PD approximately 1800.

SUPPLEMENTAL BY OFFICER WOOD:

Upon receiving information of a possible shooting incident at CC ine High School, I was assigned to pick-up, and transport all negociations equipment to the scene. Upon arriving at Leawood and S. Pierce St., I immediately began assisting Tactical Officer Heal in preparation for entering the school. Realizing that no Critical Incident Command Post had been set up, I began setting up a temporary Critical Incident Command Post using Littleton Police Unit \$293.

Upon setting up a command post, I with Ofc. Baca began to interview a subject who was identified as the school principal, Mr.

DeAngelis. Using a dry chalk board, Mr. DeAngelis completed a schematic diagram of the school for tactical team entry. I was then informed of call received via cellular phone of a teacher who was trapped inside the English office with six other teacher's, and two students. I then began to talk with the teacher, Eric Friesen who informed me of all building information and possible locations of victims. I talked with this teacher for approximately 2 hours as I was also assisting in the coordination of critical incident posting, and the set-up of the hostage negotiations telephone. I assisted Ofc. Baca in detailing lists of possible suspect(s), as well as possible witnesses.

After it was determined that Columbine High School was cleared of further suspect(s), I assisted in collection of all Command Post information, labeling same, and giving custody to Ofc. Baca.

SUPPLEMENT BY CPL. GREG BOHLEN:

OA2099 I was working patrol duty when LPD received the request for ass__ence from Jeffco. I responded to the area with Ofc. Baca and Sgt. Parker. I arrived on scene on S. Pierce St & Leawood, at about 1137 hours. I immediately began to prepare with my SWAT equipment, when I was contacted by a number of officers from Jeffco and Benver PD. A request was made of my assistance and if we had any ballistic shields, as LPD had

some of the first SWAT officers on scene. I offered both our shields. At that time Officer Neal arrived, and he also being on SWAT, we were requested to assist a group of other SWAT officers. We took the shields, and Sgt. Parker approved us assisting the other SWAT officers.

We met up with officers from BPD and Jeffco on Pierce St, just northeast of the school, where they had already prepared an LFD firetruck to provide us cover to move toward the school. I was advised that there were injured students down on the outside of the school, and we were to move to that area and attempt to rescue the students from the area. We moved up to the northeast entrance of the school. From there we could see what appeared to be a student in one of the windows. Officer Meal ended up moving to the doorway we had reached, and assisting those officers. This was at about 1215 hours.

My group then moved along the north side of the school, at which the student we saw inside was able to get to a door and run to our position. (He was later sent via other officers to one of the CP's). We worked our way to the very far southwest corner of the school. The firstruck was backed into a position by the doors on that side of the school, at that location I observed three students down on the ground. There were DPD and Jeffco supervisors at this location with us. They decided that officers would move forward to assist these students. This was about 2237 hours. time officers moved toward the school, and they announced that they would be providing cover/suppressive fire during the rescue. I stayed in a cover position behind the firetruck and covered open and unsecured doorways. I provided no suppressive fire. One student was removed. He had a gunshot wound and was still alive. A Jeffco patrol car was moved to us and I assisted in loading him into the vehicle and he was removed from the scene. A second student in this same position was removed in the same fashion. She was DOA. There was a male student at the bottom of the stairs at this location. Again officers moved to his position, found him also DOA, and left him at that location. I then stayed at that location, covering the school.

A Jeffco SWAT unit arrived, and they moved up to the school, at which time a large number of students were evacuated through our location. A large group of students were also able to escape on their own, running south through the parking lot to a fence line and then running west.

Officer were sent to that location to intercept and assist.

After an unknown period of time, we left our positions, at which time I moved back to Pierce St, and met with Sgt. Parker. I was then deployed to the inside of the school from the east side, to met up with Cpl. Ratcliff and the rest of LPD SWAT. I then worked with our team to continue in the clearance of the area of the school. We were able to clear a large area of the school. Working with DPD, Lakewood, and Jeffco, we located and evacuated a large number students and adults, all from the Scim, Nath, and Finance area. We marked all rooms that we cleared and secured. All students were searched and lead out of the building and turned over to other Officers. Once these areas were secured, our team was ordered to respond to the main entrance. We stayed at that area until we were instructed to clear the scene.

SUPPLEMENT BY OFC. NEAL:

On D42099 at 1930 hrs I was working an off duty job at Union Bank. At approx 1936 hrs I heard through Sgt. Parker that an All SWAT call out was being made and that all SWAT officers needed to report at S. Pierce and Bowles ave.

I immediately responded to LPD and retrieved my patrol car and directly proceeded to the scene with my SWAT equipment,

I arrived on Scene at approx 1952 hrs. I was advised to get immediately suited up as there were reported injured students outside of the school that needed rescuing.

Myself and Cpi. Bohlen formed a team consisting of SWAT officers from Denver P.D. and Jefferson County S.O. At approx 1956 we moved into the area around the south eastern entrance of the school using a fire truck for cover.

At this point the teams split up and I was separated from Cpl. Boblen. Myself and Officers from Denver and Jefferson County entered the school building. We entered the building at the south east entrence just south of the main entrance. This was at approx 1200 to 1215 hrs. Myself and the Denver and Jeffco officers began clearing the immediate area inside the building where we entered. We cleared this area for approx 45 minutes.

1250 hrs I was able to determine that the rest of my SWAT team had arrived and was outside. It was determined that I would go and find my team brief them and then re-enter the building to continue clearing the inside of the building. At this point no students or teachers had been found.

Finding my team and briefing them we then entered the building under the command of Team Leader Cpl. Ratcliff. The officers of the team consisted of Ofc. Wren, Ofc. Eyman, Ofc. Brauch, and Ofc. Sutherland.

We then supplemented the Denver team that had also had more team members arriving.

At this point we had approx 18 Officers in the building and we began a systematic clearing of the building. We moved from the South East hallways into the finance Office, and then moving into the math and science offices. We were then further supplemented by officers from the Lakewood SWAT team. As we entered the finance and math and science offices we encountered approx 80 persons consisting of mainly students locked in offices throughout the area. These students and teachers were then escorted out to safe areas. Upon clearing rooms in the building we would write on the door *cleared, LPD and time cleared.* Our search ended upon reaching the area near the front of the library. This was at approx 1630 hrs. It was reported that The library had already been checked by one of the Denver teams operating in the building. All of my activity occurred on the second level of the building.

on 042099 at approximately 1125 hours, I was in my office and heard dispatch advise Sgt. Parker of the shooting incident at Columbine High School. At approximately 1130 hours, dispatch stated that Jefferson County was requesting assistance from other agencies. Cmdr. Beckman advised me to be available in the detective car on the street. At

approximately 1135 hours, dispatch advised that Jefferson County was requesting LPD SWAT and I returned to headquarters and changed into my SWAT uniform. At approximately 1205 hours, I arrived at S. Pierce St., and W. Leawood where I continued to deploy my SWAT equipment. At that time, Sgt. 8lack asked that I remain by the CP and wait for the other team members to arrive. At approximately 1230 hours, I was advised to meet with Sgt. Parker on the east side of Columbine High School. I walked over to Sgt. Parker's location with Ofc. Wren and waited until the remainder of our team arrived.

Cpl. Ratcliff, Ofc. Eyman and Ofc. Sutherland arrived and Ofc. Neal met us on the east side of the high school. He advised us of the area that he and the OPO officers had searched. Cpl. Ratcliff instructed the team to go to that area and we entered the door southeast of the main entrance. We met with OPO SWAT and continued searching the building. There were several locked doors that were forced open. Approximately 150 students and teachers were found in several of the rooms that were searched. Myself and other LPO officers searched the students and teachers and escorted them out through the southeast door that we had entered through. We released them to other officers who escorted them to the CP.

We continued our search and Ofc. Neal marked the doors that were so led in the building. At approximately 1700 hours, we were told that the entire building had been searched with the help of the other SWAT teams and were instructed to meet at the main entrance of the building to wait for further instruction. At approximately 1730 hours, we were relieved by other SWAT teams. There is nothing further from this officer. Angela Brauch 9301 042099

SUPPLEMENT BY OFC WREN:

On C42099 at approximately likthrs I received a page for all SWAT officers to respond to the area of Columbine Kigh School to assist Jefferson County Sheriff's Department with a critical incident. I arrived at that location at about 1225hrs and contacted Sgt Black. Sgt Black directed Ofc Brauch and myself to meet with Sqt Parker on the east side of school. We met with Sgt Parker and waited for the remainder of the team to arrive. After the arrival of Cpl Ratcliff, Ofc Eyman, Ofc Sutherland and Cpl Ougan, we were met by Ofc Neal, who had previously entered the school with members of other departments. At approximately 1315hrs, Ofc Neal led the team into the building through a door on the southeast side of the school. Once inside, we met with officers from Denver P.D. and Jefferson County. After several minutes, Ofc Sutherland and myself relieved two Denver P.D. officers covering a hallway in the southwest corner of the school on the second floor. Ofc Sutherland and myself stayed at that position for over an hour. We were then reunited with the rest of the team at location. At that time, I assisted with ig rooms on the second floor in the southeast corner. We found numerous students and teachers hiding or locked in the rooms. Once we found them, I assisted in leading the subjects to a door on the east side, where they were turned over to other officers.

I then went with Lakewood SWAT as they cleared the cafeteria and commons area on the lower floor. The rest of the Littleton team

continued to clear rooms on the second floor. I then met with the team and we were ordered to clear and return to the Police Department. No further action taken. J.Wren 3202 042199

Supplemental Report by Cpl Ratcliff:

On 042099 at about 1250 hours Ofc Sutherland and I arrived on scene at Columbine High School. We were directed to an area near the front of the school by Sgt Parker. We transported the majority of LPD's SWAT equipment.

Sgt Parker and Ofc Neal briefed us on the current situation. I was team leader for LPO's entry team. I took Ofcs. Wren, Brauch, Neal, Eyman and Sutherland and we made entry into the school by the door south of the main entrance at about 1315 hours.

We met with a Denver SWAT team and began a search of the main hallway, attendence office, classrooms to the north of the main hall, south of the main hall, and the math and science areas.

We located and evacuated 100 to 150 students and teachers. These persons were taken outside of waiting law enforcement personnel.

W ured from our assignment by about 1730 hours. No additional internation, Cpl Rateliff, 042199.

SUPPLEMENT BY OFFICER SUTHERLAND:

On 042099 at approximately 1150 hours I was paged to assist Jeffco on a critical incident. I arrived at LPD and assisted Cpl Ratcliff with the SWAT equipment. Cpl Ratcliff and I responded to Columbine High School at approximately 1250 hours. We responded to the east side of the school were Sgt Parker, Ofc Wren and Ofc Brauch were located. Ofc Neal then responded to our location from inside of the school and we were briefed by him and Sgt. Parker. Ofc Neal then lead us inside the school through an east side door just south of the main entrance. We then were in contact with Denver SWAT. Ofc Wren and I were staged on a hallway and two double doors on the second floor located on the south side of the building.

Cpl. Bohlen, Cpl Ratcliff, Ofc Neal, Ofc Brauch, and Ofc Eyman then cleared the hallway just to the north of our location. We then started to clear several locked rooms on the second floor. We found several students and teachers hiding in several rooms. They were all patted down and escorted out a east door were other police officers were ready to process them.

We cleared all of the rooms that were assigned to us. We were informed that the suspects were dead and that the rest of the school was clear. We then left the building.

I recieved a page to respond at approximately 1955 hours on 11-20-99 to respond to the area of W. Leawood Dr. and S. Pierce St. to assist our SWAT team in reference the Columbine High School shooting incident. Upon arrival, I contacted Negotiations members Baca, Daphne and Wood, Mike who

had set up a temporary posting center on the side of a police vehicle. I contacted Sgt Black also who advised that we needed to set up a command post to assist Jefferson County officials with the gathering and dissemenation of information. We duplicated all the information officers Baca and Wood had accumulated on suspects, weapons, and hostages and gave it to the

Jefferson County Deputies inside their command post. I was told by the Jefferson County Undersheriff, Dunaway, John, that we needed to set up for negotiations in the event of contact with the suspects. We moved all of our posting materials and equipment to the Arapahoe County Sheriffs van and set up perations there. We continued gathering information on suspects, weapons, hostages and their locations, parent lists, phone extentions for students inside the school building and maps etc. of the school. We passed on this information to Sgt Black and Jefferson County personnel in their command post next to ours. Officers Baca, Vocd, and myself talked to students hiding at different locations inside the high school and tried to assure them of our actions to find them and get them out safely. I talked to Natthew Cornwell in the Yocal Music Room along with over 50 other students three times during a two hour period until they were rescued by the SWAT Teams. After Natthews group release. I escorted them to the buses from the command post for transport to Leawood Elementary School. After our SWAT team was relieved. I assisted gathering all of our information up and instructed Officer Saca tr 22

it into an evidence locker at the Littleton Police Department at the request of the Jefferson County Sheriffs Department. SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT BY OFFICER N.P. EYNAN

On B&2099 at aproximately 115% hours, I received a Swat page that advised LPB Swat to respond to the area of Leawood and Pierce, to assist Jefferson County S.O. on a critical incident.

I arrived on scene at Columbine High School at approximately 1255 hours. On my arrival I met with members of LPO Swat, and were advised that we were needed in the southeast wing of the school to meet with Denver Swat officers. I was advised that several students had been shot and there were possibly four suspects in the school armed wth Shotguns, handguns and possibly a rifle.

Upon entry in to the southeast wing of the school, we entered on the second level just south of the the main entrance. At that time we meet with officers from DPO swat and assisted them in clearing the main office area and several adjacent rooms. After assisting DPO it was determined that LPD Swat would break off and clear the southeast wing and the Science rooms. During the search LPD Swat officers entered and cleared numerous rooms in the science hall and southeast wing. During the search we located possibly up to 100 hostages, which were all searched and escorted out of the School.

LPO Swat officers did assist a joint team of DPO Swat and Jefferson County Swat Officers in the rescue of 48 students and faculity from the area known to us as Science 3.

There was made into rooms wether locked or unlocked. Locked rooms we intered by breaking the glass windows and reaching through the window and opening the door. Each room that was cleared by LPB officers was marked advising the time that the room was cleared and the Letters L. P. B. written on the door. LPD officers were called out of the scene at approximately 1815 hours, and advised to clear.

On 042099/1140 I was advised through radio at my home of a possible hostage incident at Columbine HS. Sgt Parker and Commander Brandt were in route to the scene. I was advised that JCSO requested our SWAT team. in my position of SWAT Coordinator, I responded from my home.

On my arrival I contacted Commander Brandt and Sgt Parker. It was an extremely chaotic situation. I was unbable to immediately locate an incident commander and began assisting in the arrival and deployment of the various SWAT units; Littleton PD, JeffCOSD, ArapCOSO, Lakewood PD, Denver PD, and FBI . I then contacted Lt Walcher, JCSO and advised him of my action. He asked me to assist in the deployment and direction of the tactical units. I contacted Sgt Parker who had set-up a SWAT staging area east of the school on Pierce St. and advised him that Lt. Walcher requested we assist in the tactical deployment of the various responding teams and he needed to coordinate with a tactical supervisor from each un

I then directed Ofc Baca and Wood to set up a Tactical Operations Center for the collection and dissemination of information. I then assisted Lt Walcher in the command post.

At the conclusion of the initial tactical clearance, I responded to the school at the direction of the JCSO to advise the SWAT teams that paramedics would respond to check the condition of the deceased and that additional teams were requested to clear the school again, directing their attention to the numerous explosive devices and location of bodies. They were to remain in position until relieved. The time was approximately 1700. I entered the school to better debrief the responding units as to the situation.

At approximately 1730, at the request of Lt Walcher, I briefed the Commerce City PD, Boulder PO & SO, Thornton PO and Northglean PO, who then relieved the units on scene. I then contacted Lt Walcher and cleared the scene at approximately 1800.

SUPPLEMENTAL BY CPL. SEAN P. DUGAN:

I received a page at 1152 hrs. to respond to the area of ¥. Leawood and S. Pierce St. to assist J.C.S.O. on a critical incident. Sqt. Tardy and I responded to the scene Code 3 and met up with Sgt. C.W. Black at imately 1265 hrs. Sqt. Black directed us to meet up with Sqt. Boug Parker in front of the school, on S. Pierce St., in front of the main entrance. Once there, Cpl. Ratcliff directed me, one of LPD SWAT's two snipers, to assist the teams' approach to the school with rifle cover. I observed an unidentified SWAT officer covering the main entrance to the school from a corner located just south of the entrance. I took up an initial position at six o'clock and approximately 70 yards from the main entrance where I could cover the majority of the east side of the school. To better cover a number of ground level windows located on the northern east side of the school, I moved to a position of 7 o'clock and approximately 40 yards from the main entrance, and positioned myself beneath a parked vehicle. From this position, me and the other unidentified SWAT officer, were able to provide cover for LPD SWAT officers conducting evacuations of students from an eastern exit located due south of the main entrance. I held this position until such time I was instructed to clear the incident. Nothing further to report. S.P.Dugan/042299.

SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT BY DETECTIVE JACKSON:

On April 20, 1999 at approximately 11:49 hours to respond to Pierce Street and Leawood Street on an assist to Jefferson County 5.0, on a critical incident at Columbine High School.

On arrival I assisted with postings and other functions at the command po—As students and teachers were able to exit the building, I assisted with interviewing these subjects and collected written statements from these subjects. These statements were subsequently turned over to Jeffco.

I spoke to several school personnel who gave possible associate names of David Caravan, who was expelled from the school around October or Hovember of 1998, and Eric Dutro, who is not currently a student at Columbine High School.

One of the involved students, Adam Hancey, did also advise me that a John Savage had been involved with the Trenchcoat Mafia Gang in the past, and would know a lot about them, but didn't seem to be closely associated with them this year, and hadn't been seen by him wearing a trenchcoat this school year.

I was also advised that the following people were reportedly in the office area of the school at the time of the incident, I did not personally contact any of these victims: Xiki Leyba, Sidney Keating, Jan Fielder, Chris Mikeseil, Peter Horvath, Frank D'Angelo, Mona Madden, Darlene Mesch, and Judy Grecko.

I was advised that I would be assigned to a lab team for the school, and remained on standby until approximately 2230 hours, when I was released for the night.

On April 21, 1999 I responded back to the scene and was on standby for a lab team, but was subsequently assigned to conduct follow-up interviews.

I responded to 1833 S. Carr Street to attempt to contact a shooting victim who had subsequently been released from Littleton Porter Hospital, a Patricia Nielsen, phone was at home at the residence, and a card was left.

I later received a phone call from Mielsen, who indicated that there are two Patricia Mielsens working for the Jeffco school system, and that the victim was her daughter-in-law. She supplied the phone number for the victim, and this information was turned over to Lakewood P.O. Sargeant Dan McCaskey.

I then responded to Littleton Hospital to attempt to locate another victim, the name I had been given was Bob Warder. I was advised at the hospital that this was actually Robert Warnier, who is the step-father of a shooting victim by the name of Brian Anderson. I was advised that Warnier had responded to the school after the incident had begun, and when he discovered that his son had been a shooting victim, he apparently sufferered chest pains and was transported by paramedics. Warnier was not interviewed. I later confirmed that Anderson had been diverted to Lutheran Hospital, and was interviewed by another interview team.

On April 22, 1999 I responded to the school and assisted with forwarding e-mail information received by Littleton P.D. to the FBI for further analysis.

SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT BY DETECTIVE JACKSON:
Also contacted on 4/20/99 was Doug Johnson, a biology teacher. Johnson advised the following:

That he was in science room \$3, located at the southwest corner of the building on the upper level.

On April 20, 1999 at approximately 140hrs I responded to Columbine High School on a request for assistance by the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office on shots fired and students injured. I arrived at S. Pierce St. and W. Leawood at approximately 1150hrs and contacted Lt. Walcher who was the incident commander for the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office.

I requested that Off. Baca establish a negotiations operations center and met with Sqt. Black who had just arrived. Sqt. Black and I remained most of this incident with Lt. Walcher at the command post and provided assistance as needed with the command and activities of this incident. I cleared from the scene at approximately 1800hrs and responded to LPO for a debriefing.

We did obtain a medical records release signed by Kyler and his mother (attached to interview notes). Kyler reported that:

he went to lunch in the cafeteria about 1110 hrs.

he and Ryan Dethridge, Jill Sikowsky and another girl got under a table

he heard what sounded like a plane flying low and then gunshots

two subjects were running and firing shots

everyone scattered, and he got hit with a chair in the ribs during the commotion

told his friend, Dusty Hoffschneider, to stay with him, but Dusty pulled the fire alarm and ran out

Adam went into the kitchen

he saw one of the suspects, a W/M, 17-18 years old, 6', unknown

weight, long bboadkhhackwards cap, black trenchcoat, hands in coat pockets, covering face with hand, didn't see weapons; thought he had seen this kid before - around Xmas, this kid and his friends had threatened Adam

Ryan told Adam he saw more subjects with the suspect; Ryan took off

they heard shots outside the kitchen

they were behind a metal rolling gate, and they heard 1-2 shots hit it

around Xmas 1998, & kids in black leather trenchcoats threatened Adam, telling him they were going to kill him if he went to class, and if he told anyone about the threats, they would shoot him

Adam knew they were called the Trench Coat Mafia

the Trench Coat Mafia kids hung out near the post-grad center 6th-7th hour

Adam told his parents and the following school personnel about the threats: Sid Keating, Brad Butts, Rudy Martin, Mrs. Park, Peter Horvath, Kevin Land.

On 042399, I received a phone call from Det. Christian Contos of the Englewood Police Department, who relayed information about a suspicious incident that occurred at the King Soopers, 5050 S. Federal Blvd. Det. Contos told me that:

on 042299, 0900-1000 hrs., a subject in a black trenchcoat entered the store and purchased five 2-liter pop bottles

the subject was 18-25 years old, very tall and thin, with long brown wavy hair, wearing sunglasses

REPORT NARRATIVE:

the subject engaged in conversation with the checker about the Columbine HS incident

graffiti was later found in the store restroom that said, "I bombed that high school and Goddard (middle school in Littleton) is next"

On April 20, 1999, I heard the call come in from Jefferson Co. S.O. that there had been shots fired at Columbine High School. I responded to the school. I interviewed the following students as they came out of the school.

As he fell he found himself in front of the two. The one with the long black hair pointed the rifte at his head. He then ran out the door. Kastle wrote out a statement which was given to Jeffco Detective at the scene to help prepare a warrant.

She stated that she was in the cafeteria when the two boys entered. She gave the following description of the two suspects:

1) black coat, 6'2-6'3, dark skin, long brown hair, dark eyes, rough complexion, and was wearing a cap. She saw this suspect run to the stairs and shot people as they were going up the stairs. He was carrying a "big black gun".

When she saw and heard this she ran to the commons area.

5'9-5'10, he was giving orders to the other suspect, he was aiming at people with his long black rifle, he was shooting at things in the cafeteria, she noticed that he was wearing a belt that had other guns and ammunition.

A custodian was telling the kids to get down.

The two suspects were yelling as they shot the rifles. They were talking about how fun this was and they were laughing as they did all of this.

The two suspects started a fire in the commons and they ran out. The fire looked different because it was orange in color.

She left with two other students, Kenny Dooley and Brittany Wooden.

Campbell wrote out a statement which is attached.

He stated that he didn't observe anything. When they heard the gunfire they ran to the kitchen and stayed there until the police arrived and got them out.

Eric had called the Littleton Police Dept. after he heard what was going on at Columbine, A Commerce City officer responded to his address and brought him to the scene as we hoped he would provide intell for those at the scene. Aukt provided the following information;

That he was a member of the trenchcoat mafia when he was still a student at Columbine. In fact he help to start it by wearing a trenchcoat. This caught on and others followed. It was not a hateful group at this time. He was a ware that it has become this way.

That he suspected that the ones in the school were probably Eric, who also goes by the name "preacher" and two main people in the group.

That others he knew that were involved in the group were Joe Stairs, Tad Bayles, Maria (last name unknown) and Julie Daukis?.

That they didn't like school. They always talked about wanting to do things to the dean of students car.

That they were into satanic worship.

it Eric has the anarchist cookbook.

They talked about setting bombs around school and about blowing up the school.

That they talked about how it would be fun as a senior prank to ride through the school on a dirt bikes with guns and shoot it up.

That they hated Craig Place, the dean. They hated him because whenever they got into trouble he was the one that caught them.

That last year there was a fight between the stoners and the mafia against the jocks, The mafia group would chant satanic verses as they walked by the jocks.

That hacks computer systems. He hacked into the schools computer system once to change grades. The use to work at Burger King.

That they use to hang out with a Dustin Seebold?.

That they use to drive around a friends whit &ronco.

On 042199 Detective Steve Johnson and I responded to Littleton Hospital and interviewed the two remaining shooting victims who were still there. They stated the following:

That he was in the library with two friends, Micay Makia and Pat Ireland. They were sitting at a corner table by the window.

That he heard a loud "hammer" noise. Like the sounds were coming from the wall. He heard "pops" which he later figured out was the bombs going off. They then huddled under the table.

That there were two suspects. One was tall and was one short. They had on long trench coats. They were both wearing black caps, backwards.

That they were yelling things like . "This is for the four years of BS you have given us" and "All jocks die." and "white hats willdie" Dan said he was wearing a white hat so he took it off and put it between his legs.

That the two of them were laughing the whole time.

That they pointed the gun at a black student and said, *Stand up nigger boy and then shot him.

t they then shot the three of them.

That Pat was hit twice in the head.

That he kept hitting Pat to try and keep him awake.

REPORT NARRATIVE:

That the two suspects then threw a bomb at them. Micay caught it and threw it to the corner. They then acted dead.

That the cops were outside by this time and they shot at the officers,

That they then heard shots in the hallway so they ran out the back door.

That they hid behind a police car.

That he and Micay made it out together.

That the taller one is the one that shot him.

That Micay recognized one of them and said, "That's Dylan."

That both of them had guns The other one had an automatic. They both had backpacks that had bombs in them. The bombs had fuses coming out of duct tape.

That Jenny Doyle ran out with them when the two suspects were in the hallway.

We the spoke with ; Jennifer Doyle DOB 011382

who stated the following;

That she is a junior at Columbine High School.

That she was in the library when this happened and ended up under the table with three guys; Cory (unk last name), unk name, little with blonde hair, and Austin Obanks.

That Cory had been shot. She was afraid he was dead because she was laying on top of him and she noticed "blood leaking out."

That a kid came in the library who had been shot in the stomach. He told us to get under the table.

That she saw bullets bouncing off the wall.

That she heard gunshots and bombs and they kept getting louder.

.aet she saw one of the bombs thrown out the window.

That they told them to come out from under the table.

They then left the library and came back.

They asked someone if his name was John but John was gone.

That when they came back they pulled the chair out from the table. She saw the black boots and thought of was the police. One of the suspects then pointed his gun at her and shot four times. She was struck in the right hand.

That she was sitting with her knees tucked up and her head was in her arms.

That she thought that the one who shot her was Eric Karris. She disn't know his name prior to this incident but saw his picture on T.V. She said she was watching Channel 4, and it was the picture on the right side of the screen. He was wearing black boots and black pants and he was a dirty blonde.

That she heard one of them say to the other one, "Do you know what else I've been wanting to do? Stab someone."

That Cory came up from the back of the library and got under the table.

The she had been sitting at the front table, She had a black backpack calculator in it.

That Austin said (after the shooting), "We got to get out of here." Ten to fifteen of them then ran to the back goor and out of the school. They then ducked behind a police car.

That shots continued the entire time. She said they heard bombs going off. The cops said they were coming from the kitchen area.

That both suspects were carrying "long guns".

That she saw only two people doing the shooting and throwing the bombs.

Later on 042199 I was asked to assist the forensic team #5 inside the school. I continued to work with this team through 042699. Allpaperwork for team #5 was turned over to Barbara with Pueblo Division of CBI.

SUPPLEMENT BY DETECTIVE STEVE JOHNSON:

On April 20, 1999, I was at the Littleton Police Department and at around in the many heard Littleton Police Dispatcher Kathi CHRIST air a report that there had been a shooting at Columbine High School and that there were "students down." I then started to respond to the area of W. Bowles Ave. and S. Pierce St. where I heard a command post was being established. When I arrived there, Jefferson County Sheriff's personnel requested that

interviews be conducted of students found in the school. I interviewed the three below students who offered following statements:

Kyle Micholas 8RAMLETT DOB 12-25-82 621% S. Eaton Ct., Littleton CO (303) 795-0895

That he was outside sitting by the door that led to the lunchroom with James STEWART, Mark (last name unknown), and Will BECK and he heard "all these pops." BRAMLETT offered that there were a lot of pops that he asumed were gun shots. He further said "maybe 20." That he then say a kid come up and start screaming, "get it off of me" which BRAMLETT said he did not know what the kid was referring to but thought it must of been the gunshot wounds. BRAMLETT said he did not know what happened to that student but went into the school after that and said that the shots continued. BRAMLETT also offered that he then saw a "guy wearing a black trench coat came out of the school shooting." BRAMLETT offered that the kid had long black hair. BRAMLETT offered that he does not know the student but he has long blond hair and "everyone calls him Oylan." BRAMLETT said that he saw a male student laying on the ground the this subject had shot. BRAMLETT said that he then went in a storage room and hid with 17 other students until SWAT got them out.

I interviewed:

Micole Renee REILLY DOB: D5-06-83 6570 W. David Dr., Littleton, CO (303) 972-2324

REILLY offered that she was in the Biology room with 60 to 70 othber kids and 10 other kids came in. REILLY said that she heard "noise" that she described as "guns, bombs and shots." That she knew a teacher had been shot and she saw two kids help him. That she waited for SWAT and then ran from the school.

I then interviewed:

Tyley CHENOWETH DOS: 11-13-82 8965 W. Prentice Ave., LIttleton, CO (303) Unkown

CHENOWETH offered that he was in his Biology class and was taking a test when he heard gunshots and then the door was shut. That he knew there was a teacher by the name of Mr. Saunders who was shot and injured in the next room. CHENOWETH offered that he heard "lot's of gunshots" and helped push desk's up against the door until they were rescued.

I then assisted with minor tasks amongst the other investigators. I le 'that numerous "bombs" were still in the school and it would be sometime before investigators were allowed in the school.

On April 21, 1999, I returned to the school to assist in the investigation. As part of this, I went with Littleton Police Detective Joan SCHROER to Littleton Hospital and interviewed Danny STEPLETON and

Jennifer DOYLE. I learned that both of these victims were in the library and had sustained gunshot wounds. The content of those interviews is contained within Detective SCHROER's supplement. I was able to secure a serious bodily injury form for STEPLETON that was signed by Dr. JOUY who offered that STEPLETON had treated him for 1 to 2 gunshot wounds to the left femur.

I was then assigned to the interior of the school to assist in crime scene documentation. I was assignmed to team #5 and assisted that team also on April 22, 1999.

I have been assigned numerous other intel reports that will be investigated, documented and forwarded to the Jefferson County Sheriff's Department.

SUPPLEMENT SOFTECTIVE R. HOFFMAN:

On 4-20-99 at approximately 11:25 A.M., Littleton Police Dispatch aired that there had been shots fired at Columbine High School and that Jeffarson County Sheriff was requesting assistance. I responded to the ar the high school where I met with Jeffarson County Authorities. They requested available investigators to interview students and teachers as they are brought from the school.

I interviewed the following people as they exited the building:

Tyler Rex Jackman 5/10/81---He was walking to parking lot with friends. That he saw a person known to him as Dylan carrying a sawed off shotgun. That it looked as if he had shot a male student near the back patio area. That he also observed Dylan light a pipe bomb, throw it and watched it explode. Jackman also saw another male wearing a dark tranch coat, unknown who. He heard several gunshots, and as he looked around saw a person shot in the leg.

 Joshua Eugene Wielsen 1/23/82--He did not observe anyone that was shooting. Oid see that the front door had been shot out.

Amanda Nicole Stair 1/19/83--She was in the library at the time. Girl came in and stated that a guy had a gun. She got underneath a desk to hide. Two males (unknown names) wearing trenchcoats came in, one called the other "Red". The males yelled to the students that were hiding "Get up now or we will blow your heads off." Amanda stayed under the table. The two males starting firing several shots inside the library. She heard 5 or 6 people had been shot.

'Nathan Hatfield 5/25/82--He was in the cafeteria when the shooting started. Then ran into the kitchen to get away. He saw one student shot in the leg outside the cafeteria near the "hill", which is near the South parking lot. The shooter was described as tall, wearing a trench coat, red hair, wearing a baseball style cap.

REPORT NARRATIVE:

Sarah Ashley Slater 6/27/82--She was setting in the cafeteria at approximately 11:15 a.m. when she heard gunshots. She hid under a table for a few minutes then ran to the kitchen to hide with others. Bescribe shooter as wearing a trench coat, shoulder length blonde wavy hair, black baseball type cap being worn backwards.

Jennifer Juanita Tindall 10/25/82--She was out in the student parking lot at approximately11:20 a.m. when she heard several gunshots. She saw two male subjects near a stairwell. She described subjects as the first one being tall/skinny, wearing a white shirt, brown hair, possibly tied back. He was carring what she believed to be an automatic rifle, the kind she has seen on television. The second subject had on a long black trench coat, black hair tied back, heavy set. Bid not see him carrying any guns. She left the area immediately.

- Suzanne Lee Meyer 7/18/83--She was in 5th hour science class. She stayed in the room the entire time. She heard several gunshots but did not see anything.

Tina lee Becerra 1/2/82--She was in the choir room. Heard several shots but never saw anything.

raig Dennis Place 6/16/47-He is a PE teacher. He was just coming by rom lunch and was on the Morthside of the building. He saw several kids running from the school. He heard several rapid gunshots but did not see who was shooting. He stated he does know of the trenchcoat gang, they dress in black and wear combat boots. They are described as being anti-establishment.

Carole Jean Weld 10/7/38--She is a library technician. A aid by the name of lois Kean was with her. They heard a "popping noise" so they went to check on it. They saw two males with rifles, long and black rifles. One of the males had a long tubular pipe, jamming stuff down. Both then hid in a sound proof room.

All of the above documents and statements will be forwarded to Jefferson County authorities.

I did also assist with their intell group at the school on Wednesday and Thursday, April 21st and 22nd, 1999.



REPORT: 99003121 INFORMATION:

On 042199 while working at Heritage High School I was contacted by Brett Elson who is a student at Heritage. He told me that he had information regarding the shooting that occurred at Columbine High School on 042199. Elson went on to tell me that he was friends with Horst Rossmueller, and Joshua Barnes who were students at Heritage last year.

Elson told me that he was with Rossmueller and Barnes when they went to visit the two suspects in the shooting at Columbine High School. He told me that he was with Rossmueller and Barnes one day when Rossmueller supplied them with information regarding military strategy, close quarters combat and information regarding weapons. He told me that he was in a car with Barnes when they would drive to the suspects house after to school.

I asked Elson what his involvement was with these subjects and he told me that he did not believe in what their beliefs were, and that the only reason he went to their house was because he was friends with Earnes. While speaking with Elson I saw that he was wearing black combat type boots, black jeans and admitted to owning and wearing a "black duster". When asked why he did not wear the duster anymore he replied, "because it's not cold".

Another student who was named as possibly being involved with this type of behavior was Charles Collier.He is currently a student at 'itage and up to a month ago dressed in a black trench coat, black , is or fatigues, and black combat boots. The last time I saw Collier was on 042099 and at that time he was wearing blue jeans and a t-shirt. I have not been able to speak with Collier yet, and both he and Elson still attend Heritage. Rossmueller and Barnes graduated last year.

INFORMATION REPORT BY OFFICER K.L. WINKLER:

On 042199, at approx. 1500 hours, Officer T. Cooper and I responded to 615 W. Fremont Ave. in order to attempt to contact Joshua Barnes due to his name being mentioned as an associate to the two suspects in the Columbine High School shooting on 042099.

Upon our arrival, we came into contact with Joshua's grandmother, Elizabeth (Betty) Roy. Betty advised that Joshua was over at a friend's house and had been there all day, and his mother, Cynthia Roy and stepfather, Robert Roy, were at work. Betty then stated that she would call Cynthia and Robert in order to have them respond to their residence in order for us to speak with them. While she was looking for the number, Joshua did call the residence. Betty spoke with him over the phone in our presence and asked him to respond to his residence in order to speak with Officer Cooper and me.

At approximately 1517 hours, Cynthia and her husband, Robert, responded to the residence. Joshua arrived shortly thereafter with Horst Rossmueller and his mother, Roberta Rossmueller. Joshua then stated that he had been at Horst's house and that was where he came from. Roberta

nadvised that the reason she had come to our location with Horst was because she felt if we needed to speak with her and her son, she would be there then for that. We then told her that we would not need to speak with her because Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office had already been at her

residence earlier and we did not need to duplicate the matter. They then left the residence.

Officer Cooper then advised Joshua that he was not a suspect in the incident at Columbine, but since his name was mentioned as an associate to the "Trench Coat Mafias," we needed to speak with him. Joshua agreed to speak with us and stated that he thought that we would be responding since his picture was in the paper. He stated that he did not attend Columbine, but knew some of the individuals that were also in the group photo that had appeared in the Denver Post. Joshua stated that he knew Chris Morris through Brian Sargent and also knew Nicole (unknown last name), Joe (unknown last name), Krista Hannley, Kristin (unknown last name), Pauline (unknown last name), Chuck (later identified as Charles Collier). He stated he knew Brian Sargent from middle school when he was living in Lakewood off of Hampden Ave. and he and Sargent attended the same school.

Joshua advised that he used to hang out with this group of individuals until the end of the summer of 1998 and knew them since July of 1997. He stated that they had referred to themselves as the "Trench Coat Mafia," but he believed that it was only as a means to "scare" the other students. He stated that they did not brag about being in this type of gang or utilize it to their advantage. Joshua stated that he had graduated from Heritage High School and felt like he was left out of the group because of that.

Joshua stated that he was good friends with Krista Hanniey, but had a toring out with her and had not talked to her since December of 1998. He stated that they had conflicting schedules and that was why they had not talked with one another often. He stated that he had just recently gotten on speaking terms with her. Joshua was then asked if he had talked with Krista since the shooting incident. He stated that he had and that it was on the evening of the shooting at approximately 2100 hours. I then asked him how she acted. He stated that he asked her how she was doing, and she stated, "Okay, fine." I asked him if she seemed depressed or distraught over the shooting incident or if she was crying, and he stated no. He also stated that Krista told him that she knew who committed the shooting; that it was Eric Harris and two other males that he could not remember the names of. She then told him that Eric had told her "that he was planning for tomorrow." Joshua advised that this statement was made on Monday, 041999.

Joshua then advised that he had not talked to any of the other individuals in the group; that he just recently began speaking with Krista again.

Joshua was then asked if he had used the internet on Horst's computer that is at his residence. He stated that he has not. He stated that there is a computer at work, Software, Etc., in Southglern Mall, but they are not allowed to touch it. He advised that he has been working there for six to seven months.

Joshua was asked who in particular is involved in the group that have referred to themselves as the "Trench Coat Mafia." He stated that it was " re Brian, Chris, Chuck and Corey." I asked him if he was also

plved in their group. He stated, "I didn't like to associate myself with them." I then asked them what type of apparel they wore. He stated that Joe wore a black, long duster and Chris would sometimes wear black BDU (military-type pants) and camouflage apparel. He stated that those were the only two individuals that he saw dressing in that capacity. It

should be noted that Chris is Chris Morris, Chuck is Charles Collier and Corey is possibly Corey Schaeffer.

Joshua advised that he has known Horst since middle school and hangs out with him on a regular basis. He was then asked who he hangs around nowadays since he does not associate with any of the other individuals he had previously mentioned. He advised that the group he hangs around with consists of Horst Rossmueller, Josh Coffman, Matt Borden, and Dan Clem.

Josh was asked if he knew Jim Bowers. He stated that he had only heard of him through word of mouth when Bowers got into trouble for pulling a knife on a girl in the Southglann Shopping Mall.

Josh was asked if he had ever been involved in making any bombs; he stated that he was not. He was then asked if Krista or anyone else made mention of the same, and he stated that he never heard anything mentioned regarding guns or bombs amongst any of the other individuals.

Joshua, as well as his parents, then gave Officer Cooper and me permission to search his room and the room attached to his bedroom which were both located downstairs in the basement. Josh did point out an area which he used to build model airplanes and similar models. There were no other items found that could be associated with the shooting. Nothing else was found in the residence that was cause for any alarm, or gave rise to any suspicions of illegal activity.

Before Officer Cooper and I left the residence, we spoke with "ua's parents, Cynthia and Robert, without Joshua being present. Upon sing with them, they both advised that they have been concerned with Joshua not coming home until the early morning hours of the day and sometimes they would not see him at home for five to six days. They both stated that they did not believe that he was doing any type of narcotics. Robert advised that they had told Joshua if he had not straightened up his act, they were going to have him move out in August of this year.

Robert did add that Josh also frequented his friend's house, Joshua Coffman, across the street from his residence at 686 W. Fremont Ave.

Officer Cooper asked both parents what Joshua's demeanor was on most occasions. Robert advised that Joshua is very good-natured and does not seem to get upset easily. Robert then added that they had been pleased with the fact that Joshua had kept a job for the past six to seven months due to the fact that he had been working at Home Depot prior to his current job and had not lasted long.

It should be noted that we also searched the garage with the permission of Cynthia and Robert; meeting with negative results.

Nothing further regarding Joshua Barnes.

Officer Cooper and I then responded to Daniel Kribs residence located at 2869 W. Davies Ave. We responded to that location due to the fact that Daniel had been involved in a Second Degree Arson and a Possession of an Incendiary Device on OSO498. After Officer Cooper and I make with Daniel in the presence of his parents, Roba and David Kribs.

as believed that he was not involved nor did he have any additional information regarding the case. Daniel denied any knowledge of any of the persons named by Barnes or any of the individuals named in the media as being involved at the incident at Columbine High School. We also

searched his room with his permission as well as his parents; leading to negative results.

Nothing further regarding Kribs. K.L. Winkler, 9801, 042199.

SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT BY OFFICER M.P.EYMAN

On 042198 at approximately 1830 hours, I met with Donelle Stitt at her father's residence, Richard Stitt, at 3600 S. Pearl St. #604. LPD had been notified by a Powell Middle School courselor, who advised that Stitt was discussing the Columbine High School incident at the school stating that she knew the parties involved.

On speaking with Stitt she advised me that she discussed the incident at school on this date, but that it was during her newspaper class. Stitt advised that she had a friend at Columbine High School and that in January of 1999 she met two of the alleged Trench Coat Mafia members in the smoking area behind Columbine High School.

During the conversation Stitt stated that her ex-boyfriend, Cory Schaffer, had shown her a copy of the anarchist cook book that he owned. Stitt advised that she did make reference to the availabilty on the internet of how to make bombs. Stitt advised that she has no personal knowledge or information on any of the subjects known as the Trench Coat Mafia.

SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT BY OFFICER COOPER:

After speaking with Barnes, Officer Winkler and I responded to Powell Middle School. Codr. Beckman had advised us that a counselor there had contacted him regarding a student that was heard making statements in class regarding knowledge of the incident at Columbine High School. After arrying at the school, we were unable to contact the courselor. However, we did contact the Assistant Principal, Linda Arnold. She stated they had a student by the name of Donelle Stitt. During one of her classes today, she reportedly made statements that she had knowledge of the shooting incident prior to it happening. I asked if they felt Donelle was being honest or just trying to get attention. Armold stated that she felt the Donelle could have some information, based on the fact that she seemed to be involved in a crowd that by appearances fit the profile of the "Trench Coat Mafia". She stated that she had seen older, high-school age kids dressed in camoflage type outfits come onto Powell School grounds and pick-up Donelle. Donelle's personal information was obtained and given to Officer Eyman to follow up on. See Eyman's supplemental report above.

Officer Winkler and I then responded to 666 W. Fremont Dr. in an effort to contact Josh Coffman, as his name was provided to us by Josh Barnes' parents. Josh was not home, but we contacted his mother, Debra Coffman. She stated she was not aware of Josh being involved in any

gal activity. She stated she did not think Josh had any interest in making bombs or weapons. She felt she monitored him closely and was aware of his circle of friends and his activities. She stated that he spent most of his time at home, when he was not at school. She stated that Josh was into role-playing games and computer games. She stated she

monitored the games, and sometimes played the games herself. She did not think Josh or any of his friends were involved in illegal activity, or had any involvement in, or knowledge of, the incident at Columbine High School. Ms. Coffman gave us verbal permission to search Josh's room. Officer Winkler and I did so. The room was located in the basement of the house. A search of the room did not reveal anything that would indicate Josh was involved in illegal activity. Nothing was found that was cause for concern, or further follow-up.

Officer Winkler and I attempted to contact Brett Elson at 255 W. Peakview. There was nobody home at that address.

Officer Eyman and I then responded to 2408 W. Euclid Ave., in an effort to contact Cory Schaeffer. We were unable to contact anybody at that residence.

We then went to 1511 E. Mineral PI, in an effort to contact Ganiel Clem. He was not home, but we did contact his parents, Patrick and Marilyn Clem. They gave verbal consent to search Daniels room, and Officer Eyman did so, in the presence of Mr. Clem. Nothing of interest was found in the residence. I advised the Clem's as to why we were there, and advised them their son was not a suspect in the shootings, but that his name came up during the investigation. Mr. Clem stated he was familiar with Horst Rossmueller, Josh Barnes, and Josh Coffman. He stated they have come to the residence in the past to play role-playing games with Daniel. Mr. Clem also stated that he had no knowledge of D isl or his friends being involved with the "Trench Coat Mafia". He is lad that he felt he was certain his son was not involved in any kind of para-military type activity, and had never expressed an interest in guns, bombs, or weapons. He could provide no further information on his son or his friends.

I then responded back to 606 W. Fremont Dr. to contact Joshua Coffman. The results are as follows:

That he knew Kristin Thelbault, Chris Morris, Chris' girlfriend known only as Nicole, and Brian Sargent.

That he did not know the suspects involved in the Columbine shooting incident, and had never met them.

That he had heard Chris Morris speak of the Trench Coat Mafia about 3 months ago, and Nicole was present during that conversation.

That he saw Krista Hannley about 2 weeks ago.

That he had been friends with Brian Sargent, but had stopped talking with him about 4 months ago, around the same time Josh Barnes was involved in a dispute with Sargent over a computer disc.

That he had not heard anything regarding the incident at Columbine High School prior to hearing about it on the news.

he considered Josh Barnes his closest friend, and has known him since Barnes moved into the neighborhood about 6 years ago.

That he had known Daniel Clem since last summer, and considered him to be a close friend.

That he did not think Barnes or Clem had any knowledge of the incident at Columbine prior to it happening.

That if Barnes had prior knowledge of the incident, he was sure Barnes would have told him about it.

That none of the people in his cirle of friends, (Rossmueller, Clem, Barnes) had any involvement in the incident at Columbine.

That he did not have access to the internet, as he deleted the program from his computer after his mother found out he was in a chat room.

That he was not involved in making bombs, or other weapons, and was not in the possession of any bombs or weapons.

After speaking with Josh Coffman, I returned to 1511 E. Mineral Pl. and contacted Daniel Clem. The results of the interview are as follows:

That he dated Kristen Thelbault in the past and provided a phone number for her of 973-4124.

That he met Chris Morris once in the presence of other friends, but did not talk to him.

The has seen Nicole, Chris Morris' girlfriend, on several occasions. He did not know Nicole's last name.

That he did not know Brian Sargent.

That he did not know Donelle Stitt.

That he did not know Cory Schaeffer.

That he had known Horst Rossmueller for about 2-3 years, after meeting him at Arapahoe High School. They were both students there at that time.

That he has regular contact with Josh Barnes and Josh Coffman. He played role—playing games with them.

That he has heard Josh talk about gurs, but that it was in the context of their role-playing games.

That 1 or 2 months ago, Horst Rossmueller disappeared for 2 days, and nobody knew where he was.

That he was acquainted with James Bowers, but that Bowers moved to Minnesota almost a year ago.

That he did not know the suspects in the Columbine shooting, and had not met them. In fact, had never heard of them until the news regarding the incident.

That he knew nothing of the Trench Coat Mafia.

That he had no prior knowledge of the Columbine incident.

That he did not think that Barnes, Coffman, or Rossmueller, had any involvement in, or prior knowledge of, the Columbine incident.

Note:

After conducting the above interviews, I was a Littleton Hospital on a detail. While there, the television was on the break room. It was tuned to "Inside Edition" news program. Horst Rossmueller was appearing on the program, talking about the incident, and the trenchcoat mafia.

Nothing further to report.

SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT BY OFFICER EDSON:

On 042299 at about 1200 hours, I recieved a call from Ofc. Allen with Englewood Police about information on a graffitti report he was taking at 5050 S. Federal. Ofc. Allen told me that he recieved a call from the manager at King Scopers who was reporting graffitti in the bathroom. In the men's restroom in one of the stalls there was graffitti which stird "I bombed that High School, and Goddard is Next". At this time to are no suspects or leads. Ofc. Allen took an info report with pictures on EPD CR# 99-5647. I advised Ofc. Romero of the incident who made the staff at Goddard aware. Nothing further at this time. SUPPELMENTAL REPORT BY OFFICER COOPER:

On 042299, at about 1630 hours, I received a telephone voice mail from Lori Kinney, the assistant principal at Powell Middle School. She stated that she had another complaint regarding Donelle Stitt, from a "concerned parent." Kinney advised that she was told that Oonelle was heard speaking about the fact that she knew the suspects in the Columbine incident, and that she was planning to do the same at Powell. I attempted to contact Kinney by phone and was unsuccessful.

I then responded to 2408 W. Euclid Ave. in an attempt to contact Corey Shaffer, the person identified as Donelle Stitt's boyfriend. I did contact him, however, he identified himself as Corey Luman. His mother's married name is Linda Shaffer. Linda's husband is not Corey's father. Corey made the following statements in response to my questions:

That he moved into Littleton about 2 months ago from the Morrison area.

That he did not associate with anybody from Columbine High School.

To the did not know the suspects in the Columbine shooting incident.

That he had no knowledge of, and never heard of, the "Trench Coat Mafia" until hearing the term on the news.

That he had no prior knowledge, or knew of anybody with prior knowledge, of the Columbine incident.

That he used to date Donelle Stitt, but had not seen or spoken to her in about a month.

That Donelle Stitt had never spoken to him about the "Trench Coat Mafia" or any of the people involved in the incident as reported by the news.

That he used to have a copy of the "Anarchist's Cookbook" downloaded onto his computer from the internet, but no longer had it. In fact the family had gotten rid of the computer.

That he did not know, nor had he ever heard of, Josh Barnes, Caniel Kribs, Josh Coffman, Daniel Clem, Kristen Thelbault, Brian Sargent, Chris Morris, Matt Borden, James Bowers, or Krista Hannley.

Prior to contacting Luman, I spoke with Officer Kloppenberg. He gave me the name of Joe Valentine as a person who had information that was related to the Columbine shooting. After speaking with Luman, I contacted Valentine at his business. Valentine owns The Computer House, at 6229 S. Santa Fe Dr. He provided the following information:

That the father of Dylan Klebold, one of the suspects in the Columbine ing, was a regular customer at the Computer House.

That in March of 1998, Klebold's father asked Valentine if he was hiring employees and asked if he would be interested in hiring his son, Oylan. Valentine advised him to have Dylan contact him reference the job.

That in March of 1998, Dylan Klebold called Valentine on the phone regarding the job and faxed him a resume. Valentine provided me with the information faxed to me by Klebold. It was subsequently given to Commander Beckman of LPD.

That he, in fact, hired Klebold, but Klebold never showed up for work, as he had gotten another job at a different computer store (Computer Rennaisance near Southwest Plaza).

That Klebold was subsequently fired from that job, and called Valentine to see if the job at The Computer House was still open.

That Valentine advised Klebold that he had filled the position and was no longer interested in having Klebold work for him.

There was a phone number on the top of the faxed document, which is presumably the number that the document was faxed from. That number is Also hand-written on the front page of the faxed resume was the number 716 9591. Valentine stated he wrote that number on the p himself, but did not know who the number belonged to or what it was in, eference to.

Both numbers were checked through Cole's directory. The first number, and the Risted back to the Klebold address at The other number listed to a Nick Forsea, at 14034 W. Amhurst Ave. in

Lakewood. I called Valentine and asked him if that name or address meant anything to him. He stated it did not, but would research it and provide the LPO with any information that he might come up with.

After speaking with Valentine, I then returned to Josh Barnes! residence and spoke with him again. I recontacted him in order to reconfirm some statements he made the previous day. Brett Elson had contacted Officer Scott, and advised him that he personally had accompanied Barnes and Rossmueller to the Columbine shooting suspect's residence more than once, last year. I asked Barnes about this again. He stated that he had never met the suspects of the Columbine shooting. He stated that he and several other friends had tried to find the individuals house that lived in Deer Creek Canyon (Klabold) at one time. but they were unable to find it. He reiterated the fact that he had no knowledge of the Columbine incident, other than what he had heard on the news, and had never met the suspects. He also stated that Chris Morris was a student at Columbine High School, and was about Barnes' age or slightly younger. (Condr. Beckman had been advised of a Chris Morris that was a 6th grade student at Powell Middle School. It appears that the divis Morris that has been named as an associate of the subjects of this report is not the same Chris Morris that Ondr. Seckman had received information on.)

Upon arrival DPD Metro/SWAT Personnel responded with other Police and Sheriffs personnel to evacuate students from the building and to search the building for suspects. During this action some members of the Deaver Metro/sWAT Bureau fired their weapons either at suspects or in a suppressive fire mode. An unknown number of persons were located in and around the school and were evacuated. During the search of the building an unknown number of persons who had been injured or killed were also located in and around the building. In addition two suspected suspects were located in the building. These two susepcts were determined to be dead from apparent self inflicted wounds. After clearing the building Denver Metro/SWAT personnel turned the scene over to Jefferson County Sheriffs Deputies and responded to make statements of their actions.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT

On 04-20-1999 we were working in the Sex Crimes Unit. We were sent to assist with the shooting at Columbine High School at about 1345 hrs. We responded to Pierce and Leawood, where we were directed to Leawood Elementary School. We walked to Leawood Elementary and were contacted by Capt. Saltzman. A school bus arrived with students who needed to be interviewed and we directed the bus to the side entrance to the gym. We learned that the gym was full of parents and we directed the students to the music room so that they could be interviewed. A Jefferson County Deputy told us that those who had witnessed the shooting or seen the shooters would be interviewed in the library. We then began to contact the students and the ones who had witnessed anything were taken to the library. When the interviews were complete we were eventually relieved from the elementary school and we responded back to Leawood and Pierce where we contacted Deputy Chief Abrams and Division Chief Gordon to see if we were needed for anything else. After we were released from that location we returned to headquarters.

On the above date reporting officer was in the District Four station when a call was received from a student at Columbine High School at approximately 1137 hours. The student later identified as the son of officer Wayne Depew reported that shots were being fired inside the school and that students were wounded by the gunfire. Officer John Lietz kept this party on the phone and simultaneously contacted Jeffco Sheriff dispatch. He in turn continued to relay information relative to the shooting to the dispatcher and kept in touch with student Depew. At the same time I established a relay to DPD officers to keep them updated on the situation as Officer Lietz relayed the information to me. Subsequent to that reporting officer setup Channel 5A with the assistance of Technician Hays and Detective Loughlin. This took place at approximately 1300 hours. We coordinated communications in this manner until approximately 1400 hours when radio took over Channel 5A. Following that Technician Hays and myself responded to the scene to assist there.

Upon our arrival we were sent to Fair and Pierce to assist a multi-jurisdictional team in the removal of students from the school via school bus. Approximately 3 business of students were evacuated to a nearby elementary school for debriefing by investigative personnel.

At the conclusion of the situation Officer Hays and myself escorted a U.S. Army armored personnel carrier back to its transport vehicle and we were relieved at approximately 1730 hours.

Upon arrival at the school a Lakewood Officer that was directing traffic near the command post at Bowels and Pierce St. directed us to the West Side of the building. We drove west through the park ending up on top of a large hill overlooking the West Side of the school. Present at this location were Lt. Ryan, Sergeants Selander, and Jones. While attempting to we sure the west side of the building it was apparent that other Officer who were closer to the building were attempting to extract students from the building. After about two – three minutes a large amount of gunfire erupted and it appeared that the Officer were under fire from hostile that were shooting from with in the building. The gunfire lasted about ninety seconds.

Lieutenant Ryan and Sergeant Jones drove to the area of the shots and Ryan instructed us to remain at the observation point. Within a short time of Ryan's departure, Captain Sandoval requested additional assistance at the command post located at Pierce/Bowels. Sergeant Selander remained at this location and Detective Daniel E. Rojas and I responded to Sandoval's request.

We were requested to report to Captain Lighthouses and Lieutenant Wheeler, upon arrival Wheeler was in the process of assembling a group of Officer and after the Officer were assembled we responded to Weave and Kendell in order to check for additional suspects. This area was searched and no suspects were found. While searching Detective Daniel E. Rojas located evidence of a detonation involving a two-liter plastic bottle. We recovered the bottle and took photos of the damage. We then responded to a second location South of the school on Pierce, attempting to locate additional suspects. We were unable to locate any suspects and we responded back to the command post.

In responding back to the command post Captain Sandoval ordered us to respond to Lakewood Elementary School to assist with crowd control because the high school students were being transported there. On the date of 4-20-99 at approximately 1125 hours, Detective Brennan 82-87 was at the location 5125 W Florida Ave, Denver, Co conducting a photo line up at the King Soopers store when the call for help was aired by Jefferson County Sheriffs officers. It was related that these officers were under fire at Columbine High School.

The RD responded to the location of Pierce St & Lealand Ave, where the initial command post was set. The RD assisted initially at this location keeping the area clear while a triage area was set.

The RD contacted Captain Collier at the scene and assisted as the decision was made that Denver detectives would be assigned to an individual ambulance as injured students or faculty was evacuated from the school. That detectives would board each ambulance and respond with the victim to the hospital.

Upon the communication with the forward Tactical Teams, the RD, et al, moved South on Pierce St, to the East entrance of Columbine High School. It was found that only one male student was evacuated to the location and was transported by ambulance. The RD assisted at the location with the evacuation of students from Columbine High School.

During the time at the location the RD spoke to Jefferson County Sheriffs Officer Gardner, who related of being the school resource officer assigned to Columbine High School. Officer Gardner related that at the start of the incident he was fired upon and returned fire on one of the suspects.

Upon the conclusion of the assignment at the forward post, the RD returned to the Command Post at Pierce & Leawood. The RD was requested to respond to Leawood Elementary School and assist with statements from the witnesses. The RD found that the statements had been completed by detectives that were at the location. The RD then returned to Denver Police Headquarters.

The purpose of this letter is to inform you of the actions I took at Denver Health Medical Center, and else where about the city in relation to the multiple shooting at Columbine High School on 04/20/99.

At 1300 hours I was accompanying Detective Martin Martinez, 81018 to Denver Health Medical Center to interview a victim on one of his Domestic Violence cases. Upon learning of our destination, Sgt. Priest and Sgt. Meier asked us to stay at the hospital and get the names of any victims that arrived there from the multiple shooting at Columbine High School. We were to gather any evidence and obtain statements from the victims if possible.

1310

On our arrival at the hospital we were informed that Detective Martinez' victim had already been released. We were escorted into the waiting room by hospital security, who wanted us to wait and talk to an admissions supervisor to get the information from the shooting victims. The nursing supervisor instructed us to go into the emergency room so we could get the necessary information in a more timely fashion.

We contacted Dr. Cantrill, the E.R. supervisor, who informed us of two victims currently in the E.R. and one more enroute. He then completed serious bodily injury reports on Lance Kirkland, 02/16/83, and Jenna Park, 04/02/81. Kirkland was already in the Operating Room being treated for multiple gunshot wounds to the right thigh, chest, and face. Park was in the E.R. being treated for multiple gunshot wounds to the right knee, right shoulder, and right foot.

1400

We met Deputy John Healy from the Jefferson County Sheriff's Department, who was at the hospital to collect evidence and obtain statements. Healy stated he had arrived at the hospital on the first ambulance with Lance Kirkland. Healy had already obtained the clothing from Kirkland and Parks, and placed it in paper bags.

1415

The third gunshot victim was identified as Mark Kintgen, 05/30/81. Dr Cantrill completed a serious bodily injury on him, stating he a single gunshot to the head.

1430

I obtained a list of known victims and the hospital they were being treated at from the E.R. staff and sent a copy of the list to Sgt. Meier via fax.

I was contacted by Lt. Yount as to the identity and location of the victims. I referred him to Sqt. Meier, who had the list. A P.I.O. was requested to handle media concerns, and Detective M. Hall responded to the hospital with more evidence bags.

Mark Healy's condition was upgraded to stable, and we were informed a fourth victim was enroute to the hospital. The staff also informed us they were preparing for up to thirty more victims.

1530

Post 10- Sgt. Hoffman, Post 11, Technician Swedlund, and Post 19 Officer Denison responded to the hospital for crowd control and security. A report of a carload of armed suspects following an ambulance necessitated heightened security.

1555 Victim #4, Lisa Kreutz, arrived at the hospital. Dr. Cantril completed an S.B.I. form for her shortly thereafter. He indicated she was suffering from multiple extremity gunshot wounds.

1600

Detective Hall and I assisted Detective Martinez and Investigator Healy in obtaining family information on the victims, and contacting the family members at the hospital.

1630

We were informed there would be no more ambulances at D.H.M.C. We continued meeting with the families.

1823

After gathering all the evidence we secured from D.H.M.C. and informed Sqt. Meier of the final outcome. A final list of victims/locations was sent to him. Detective Martinez and myself transported investigator Healy to the Command Post near Pierce and Bowles, arriving at 1910 hours. All evidence obtained at D.H.M.C. by Investigator Healy was placed into a Jefferson County Sheriff's vehicle, as directed by supervisors at the scene. All of the original copies of the S.B.I. forms were turned over to Detective Healy, and copies kept for D.P.D. records.

Detective Martinez and myself returned to Police Headquarters and started to write the activity letter. Detective Penington informed us that there had been threats of further attacks 04/21/99. He told us to secure for the evening, and get rest.

A Jefferson County officer was assigned with us to identify the students as they were leaving the school. The students were identified and searched, then led to a

hole in a privacy fence then taken to awaiting buses and removed from the scene. We remained on the scene until about 5:55 p.m. We then returned to District Three.

On 4-20-99-Tuesday, at approximately 1430 hours, I received a call to respond to Columbine High School-6201 S. Pierce St. on a shooting/Homicide with multiple victims. My role was to coordinate the Denver Police Homicide Unit-Team 70 and assist Jefferson County with the crime scene. We stood by in Clement Park for directions. At 2300hrs I was dismissed and asked to return the following day-4-21-99-Wednesday.

On 4-21-99 Sgt. Fetrow along with a Homicide Team responded to Columbine High School again at 0600hrs. Our responsibility was to stand by and wait for assignments. At approximately 1400hrs we were escorted into the crime scene to appraise the situation. At approximately 1500hrs we received our assignments and entered the crime scene. Our job was to process the office area in the main hallway. Inside the office were multiple shell casings, live rounds, magazines (clips), broken glass, broken furniture, bullet holes and other collateral damage. We processed the scene with the crime scene detectives. My job was to oversee the coordination of the crime scene. We secured from the scene at 2200hrs.

On 4-21-99 at 2300hrs Sgt. Fetrow was contacted by Capt. Leary to assign Homicide Detectives to assist at the following morgues for autopsies: Denver Health Medical Center, Boulder County, Jefferson County, and Arapahoe County. The autopsies would be conducted the following day at 0800hrs on 4-22-99.

On 4-22-99 at 0800hrs Sgt. Fetrow responded to the scene to assist in processing the crime again. Sgt. Fetrow was contacted by the detectives standing by for the autopsies and he was informed by

Jefferson County Sheriff's Department that they also needed our crime lab to process the autopsies. The crime lab teams were assigned by Sgt. Reed and they left the school for the morgues. Due to a lack of crime scene personnel, the Homicide detectives withdrew from the scene and responded to Denver Police Headquarters.

Shortly after noon on April 20, 1999, I received a call over the police radio from Det. J Ruetz. Det. Ruetz stated he had received information from Lt. D Cribari and Sgt. E Martinez there was a hostage situation at the Columbine High School, at South Pierce and West Bowles, and to report to the Command Post that had been set up. The purpose was to provide whatever technical support might be needed.

While enroute to the Command Post (CP) I was again called on the radio by Det. J Ruetz and was told there was quite a traffic jam of emergency vehicles, and to park my car at Pierce and Bowles and walk the rest of the way to the CP.

Upon my arrival at the CP I checked with my partner Det. J Ruetz and was briefed by him. A short time latter I was contacted by a Littleton Police officer and was asked if I could assist in running four (4) "landline" phone lines into the Arapahoe County SO mobile command post. While Det. J Ruetz and another Denver PD Tech Detective K Rich located available "pairs" working numbers in the cross box I made the connections to the Arapahoe County SO (ACSO) mobile command post and verified the phones worked inside the van.

While making the connections to the ACSO mobile command post I was contacted by Det. D Metzler of the Denver PD and asked if we (Myself, Det. J Ruetz and Det. K Rich) could also connect four (4) "landline" phones lines to the Denver Police Department mobile command post. This was accomplished.

When the lines were no longer needed the landlines were disconnected and the customers whose lines were used were returned to their original condition and the customers notified what had been done.

While this was being done a US West technician arrived at the scene and assisted detectives in the installation and removal of the lines.

On this date, a call of help came out from Lakewood and Jefferson County on shots fired at Columbine High School. Detective Jude and Hess responded to the area of the Command Post at Lehigh and Pierce.

Detective Hess was assigned to stay with an ambulance and go with them to get any victims, and then to stay with them when they were taken to the hospital. Statements would be taken from the victims, clothing would be taken, and whatever else would be done that needed to be done, during the course of this investigation.

Det. Hess was assigned to Rescue #13, of Littleton Fire Department. The Littleton Fire Personnel were Captain Mark Gorman, Captain Jim Olsen, and EMT Jerry Losasso. Their phone number is 303-795-3800.

At about 1445 hours, the crew of ambulance #13 was told to go to the entry way of the high school, which was closest to the street intersection of Pierce and Fair, and to get ready to go in to get wounded parties. The Swat units would take the crew in. Later it was related that the Swat Units would be bringing wounded to the crew at that location. As the crew and Detective Hess stood by, there were numerous times when they were told to get ready to go in, however it was always stopped due to possible danger to the paramedics. The building had apparently not been cleared. Some of the victims were being taken out of other doors of the school. Several different groups of students were found and were being taken out of the entry way where ambulance #13 was located. The Swat Units took control of those students. All of the students and teachers were told to put their hands on their heads, until they could be checked. Word had been received that the suspects had changed clothes with some of the students, in an attempt to get away. Approximately 150 parties came out of the school at that location.

It was determined that there were no more wounded victims inside of the school, and that all of the parties that were left, were dead. Apparently two of the dead were suspects and they had possibly killed themselves.

It was determined that the ambulance crew would not be needed any longer, at which time Detective Hess returned to the Command Post. Detective Hess was advised that he could leave, and return to District #4.

Once the Detectives responded I assigned them at the direction of Denver Police Command Staff to debrief students as they were brought from the school. I took command of the non-uniform personnel and directed them to various locations around the scene. Det. Arellano kept a list of all Detectives and their assignments. Upon completion of their assignments the Detectives were dismissed with instructions to complete a statement and submit it with any and all other statements, and other related paperwork to me for routing to Capt. Sandoval.

I then received several District 4 radios and batteries to take back to District 4.

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

SUBJECT: Shooting at Columbine High School in Jefferson County

On this date, at about 1100 hours, while working as the District Clerk, I received a call from Matthew Depew, Officer Wayne Depew's son. He stated he was at Columbine High School and someone was shooting all the students. I knew this school was in Jefferson County so I told him to hang up and call 911 to get emergency help on the way. I ran to my desk phone to call our dispatch and received a call back from Matthew Depew stating that the phones in the school could not call 911 and he could not call for emergency help. I then kept Matthew on the phone in one ear and grabbed my other phone calling 911 myself. I directed Denver 911 to transfer me to Jefferson County 911. While doing this Matthew Depew stated he and several other students were in the cafeteria area and an unknown number of gunmen were shooting students in the cafeteria right at that moment. I could hear shots being fired in the back ground. I have a daughter that is a student at the school so I knew some of the layout of the school. I asked Depew where he was in the cafeteria, since there are pay phones only at the doorways to the cafeteria. I was told that Depew and the group he was with had run to the rear kitchen area.

I tried to pass information from Depew to Jefferson County over the phone as the suspects were continuing to shoot people. Matthew Depew remained remarkably calm and told me that he and about 20 others (later found to be eighteen total) had run into the office in the kitchen and were hiding there. He gave me a physical description of the one suspect he had seen. I gave this information to Jefferson County and heard it passed over their police radio for their officers in the field to use. Over the next two to two a half hours I spoke with Depew and kept him on the phone with me while I spoke with Jefferson County Communication Manger Randy Smith and Lieutenant Jeff Shrader. During the two hours Depew kept me appraised of the suspect's movements in the area and kept the other seventeen people with him calm. Several times the suspect(s) came to the door and tried to shoot these people and I could hear the suspect(s) pounding and shooting at the door, unsure if anyone was inside. I had Depew talk to everyone constantly in a soft voice to keep them quiet and calm. I had Depew describe the office he was in so I could direct some sort of barricade to be placed against the door. He described an office with one desk with a computer on it and three chairs. At first, about six people were holding the door closed with their feet, and said the office was filled with people so there was not a lot of room to move around. I asked Depew to try and have a chair placed against the door knob since it could not be locked. Depew told me that the group did find sacks of floor, etc. to put against the door. I was told that about two hundred pounds of items were put against the door. I coordinated with Jefferson County to make sure people gaining entry to the room where these victims were hiding were police. The suspects attempted entry numerous times and shots were fired in the area and possibly into this room. At one point I could hear the suspect(s) shooting in volleys of four with what Depew described as a shotgun. It sounded as though the suspect(s) were walking around the cafeteria "re-shooting" anyone down to ensure they were dead. The grouping of rapid shots were as though all four series of shots were directed at one target. The suspects were so close to Depew and his group that I could hear the suspect(s) loading and "racking" their weapon over the phone. Depew was very quietly describing to me that the suspects were shooting anything that moved or made noise. At that point Depew was certain he was going to die and asked me to tell his father he loved him. I constantly had Depew maintain control and told him that if the gunmen came into the room everyone should remain quiet and not talk. I told Depew to hold the phone up and ask the gunmen to speak to me if they came inside. I also directed Depew to plan an attack if necessary and to have several students try and hit the gunman with chairs if it was apparent he was going to shoot. Depew volunteered to be the person to try and get the shotgun if it came to that.

Depew helped me keep everyone in his group quiet and down for the entire time, even though when what was later learned to be guns and bombs were going off around them, two of Depew's group got so scared they tried to run out for help. At one point another person tried to get in the door but it was unknown whether this person was a suspect or not. He gave his name to Depew but even Depew realized that student might be a hostage of the gunmen and Depew maintained control of the group and did not move the barricades to allow this person inside.

During the time the SWAT teams were moving in, the mood in room became very difficult with two mentally challenged members of the group trying to yell out and get out of the room. Again, Depew helped direct his group to maintain order until they could be removed safely. Depew constantly followed my directions to have the group breathe easy and remain quiet, no matter what happened. At several points when it sounded like the suspect(s) were not in the area Depew made the group hush up when they felt the situation was over and started talking loud, laughing, etc. Due to the knowledge Depew learned from his father, a former Denver SWAT member, Depew was able to describe to the group what would be happening with the police and why it was taking so long to get the group to safety. I added information for Depew as needed but he maintained a professional manner at all times. At one point, early on in the situation, Depew spoke with two of the group that are friends of my daughter to answer my questions about whether my daughter had been shot. That allowed all of us to work together with a common bond to survive that continued throughout the incident.

Jefferson County Communications assisted me during the entire time and gave me the suggestion to get phone numbers of the eighteen people's family members so they could be told everyone was alright. That suggestion bought me some valuable time and helped keep the group busy and quiet while officers worked to clear the school. I had already had Depew pass a paper around with everyone writing down their names and had given this information to Jefferson County so I had him add phone numbers. (I later tried to call everyone's family on the list but only spoke with two or three. Everyone else had left for the school and could not be reached by phone.) The list I made of victims, phone numbers and family names is attached to this letter.

I feel that Matthew Depew is responsible for saving the lives of himself and the seventeen people with him, by his responsible actions and even knowing to call Denver Police when the phones would not connect him to 911. If Denver Police can give the lifesaving award to Matthew Depew there is no doubt in my mind, while listening to the suspect(s) shoot into the room, that he deserves that award, eighteen times over.

05/14/99, 0930 hrs. Officer John Lietz reported that his daughter, Heather Lietz, attended Columbine HS and was in math class when the shootings started. He was also on the telephone with another police officers child, who he identified as Mark Depew. (See attached typed written statement prepared by Officer Lietz on 04/20/99).

Officer Lietz stated that Mark Depew was sitting at a table in the cafeteria that was near the windows. He witnessed a student being shot outside and saw one of the suspects. He said that this suspect entered the cafeteria near the Rebel Corner. Some of the students went to the window to see what was happening and many thought that it was a staged shooting using paint balls. When he realized that the shootings were for real, he and several others ran to the door near the teacher's lounge to escape. Just before arriving at the door, another gunman entered the door blocking their exit. They had no other choice but to run into the kitchen area and barricade themselves in an office that had no windows. He said that there were about 18 students inside of the small room and they barricaded the door by using sacks of flower and using their feet, as there was no lock on the door.

Officer Lietz said that he was on the telephone with Mark Depew during the course of the shooting and kept him calm by giving advice. He said that while on the telephone, he could clearly hear shooting and the footsteps of the suspects as they ran by the office where the students were hiding. He said that he could hear keys jingling and he could hear what sounded like two-way radios as the suspects communicated with each other. He said that he could hear the suspects trying the door to gain entry and he told Mark not to open the door under any circumstances. Office Lietz said that he could hear gunfire from 11:20AM to 12:45PM. He said that all the shotgun blasts came in four round bursts and he could hear the pump action between shots and then hear the suspects reload. He said that it sounded like the gunfire was coming from the cafeteria then quite then more gunfire coming from another area in the school. 20 minutes later the gunfire could be heard in the cafeteria again. In between the gunfire, the suspects would walk back into the kitchen area and try the door where the students were hiding. At one point, one of the suspects pretended to be Jeremy and attempted to trick his way in. At one point while the suspects were in the either the cafeteria or kitchen area, Officer Lietz could hear loud noises like the suspects were hammering on something.

Officer Lietz said that he stayed on the phone with Mark Depew until the Denver Metro/SWAT team breached the barricaded door and freed the students.



On the date of April 20, 1999, I received a call to assist with my team to the Columbine High School incident. At that time I directed my technical detectives to gather needed equipment, and coordinate their efforts with our counterparts with the FBI. I also contacted my other three detectives to respond. At approximately 1220 hours I arrived at the mobile command post area and contacted Denver Police Department Captain Rudy Sandoval. I then learned that a coordinated effort needed to be established for processing triage, initial debriefings and interviews of anticipated evacuated students.

I helped coordinate these activities with Denver Police Department Sergeant Clyde Jones of the District Four Burglary detail. I coordinated our debriefing area with the triage area immediately south of the mobile command posts. Denver Police Department Sergeant Paul Selander was also there assisting. Once the evacuated students were gathered and searched, they were placed into a triage line. There they were given liquids and medically evaluated by medical and EMS personnel. They were then asked for their names where they were placed on a check-in list. Once this was accomplished, the group of Denver Police Department detectives then interviewed them. After this they were placed into a checkout line where their names were crossed checked against the check-in list, then escorted to a waiting bus with subsequent arrival to the nearby elementary school. The first group we escorted were escorted on foot, in order to relieve congestion of students in the area, and due to a bus not able to drive into the nearby area.

After we completed these tasks, I sent Detectives Joe Montoya, Marcus Fountain and Joel Bell to the elementary school to assist with further interviews. My technical Detectives Jeff Ruetz, Kerry Rich and Steve Barnhill coordinated telephone and other related aspects with the mobile command posts, and subsequently disconnected all implemented lines once their services were no longer needed. Some of the detectives in my interview group include the following, but not are limited to: Detectives Scott Goldberg, Charles Boyles, Theresa Garcia, Bryan Gordon, Joe Delmonico, John Schittgerand, Rick Polak, Barbara Archer, Paige Lyda, Ray Estrada and Mark Woodward.

At approximately 1730 hours, I then responded to the elementary school and offered additional assistance. The Law Enforcement coordinator there was Denver Police Department Sergeant Ed Tuffield, who released my detectives shortly upon our arrival.

This ended my involvement.

#### Synopsis:

On the above date, Denver Police Department Detective Jeff Ruetz and this reporting supervisor interviewed the president/owner of the Video City store where Charles "Chuck" PHILLIPS is employed. Heim stated that he employs PHILLIPS, and that Philips took several days off, due to the Columbine shootings incident. Heim also gave information on PHILLIPS, and declined to give investigators account information on

#### Details:

- On the date of May 10, 1999 at 1330 hours, Denver Police Department Detective Jeff Ruetz and this reporting supervisor responded to the Video City store located at 11068 West Jewell Avenue #C6, Lakewood, Colorado. The purpose of this visit was to investigate statements made to investigators by Cory Friesen and Chris Morris about renting a video game the night before the shootings at this video store. The friend of Friesen and Morris was identified by them as Charles "Chuck" PHILLIPS II, who works at the store, and had allegedly worked there on April 19, 1999, the night before the shootings at Columbine High School.
- 2. Investigators contacted the manager of the store, identified as Jeff Prangle. Once Prangle was informed of the identities of the investigators, and asked questions about PHILLIPS, Prangle stated that PHILLIPS took a week and a half off since the incident at Columbine High School. He had not seen him in "a while." When asked for home telephone information for PHILLIPS and information on what other Video City store he was temporarily moved to, Prangle called his boss, the president/owner, identified as John W. Heim. Heim exited his back office and was informed of the investigators identities. He stated that he had moved "Chuck" to his other store temporarily because "Chuck", as he referred to him by, had informed him that he had been receiving threats, in light of his picture being televised with Eric Harris, Dylan Klebold, et al. Heim also stated that "Chuck" is a "weird guy", and couldn't or did not want to explain why or in what way to investigators.
- 3. When asked if he or Prangle knew of any associates of PHILLIPS, the only name remembered was the name "Chris". "Chris" was remembered by Prangle, who stated that "I might have met him once." This reporting supervisor asked Prangle if Cory Friesen had an existing rental account at this store, to which he stated "He does." When asked what

items had been rented around the date of the Columbine High School incident, Heim directed Prangle to not divulge the information. Heim further related to investigators that "by law" he couldn't provide any further information from his data bases to investigators. This reporting supervisor then told Heim to not alter any stored information in his computer system, and that investigators will secure a search warrant to retrieve the information. SUBJECT: Activities at Denver Health Medical Center/Columbine High

School.

Sir,

This communication is to inform you of my activities on 04-20-1999 in relation to the criminal acts committed at Columbine High School. My activities will be submitted in chronological order as they occurred on that date.

12:40 p.m. Myself and Detective Gregory Campbell (#86067) were en route to Denver Health Medical Center to contact a female (Neva Marshall) in relation to an unrelated Denver Case when Sergeant Jon Priest and Lieutenant D. Yount requested that we obtain any victim names and conditions and render any assistance to Officers in whose jurisdiction the Columbine High School action occurred. In addition, Detective Campbell and I were asked to make sure that Serious Bodily Injury Reports were completed on each victim.

1:00 p.m. Detective Campbell and myself arrived at the Hospital and immediately contacted Jefferson County Detective John Healy who indicated that the first victim to arrive (Lance Kirkland DOB 02-16-1983) was unresponsive and had already been taken to surgery. Lance's condition was listed as critical. Lance's father (Mike Kirkland) was on the way to Denver Health Medical Center (heretofore designated as DHMC). Detective Healy indicated that Lance was suffering from gunshot wounds to his head, torso and legs and had been responsive on the ambulance ride to the hospital. Detective Healy was in possession of two large plastic bags which held the clothing and personal effects evidence that was obtained from the two victims who were currently in the Emergency Room.

Myself and Detectives Campbell and Healy then responded to an Emergency Room Suite and contacted a young female (later identified as Jenna Park DOB 04-02-1981) who was suffering from apparent

gunshot wounds to the shoulder and knees. This victim was listed in serious condition. Detective Healy obtained a verbal statement from Jenna Park that was satisfactory to his purposes.

Detective Campbell and I obtained Serious Bodily Injury Reports for victims Kirkland and Park from Doctor Cantrill who was the presiding Doctor of the Emergency room.

- 2:45 p.m. At this time, victim #3 (identified as Mark Kintgen) arrived via ambulance and was suffering from a gunshot wound to the head. Mark was stabilized in the Emergency Room and was then taken to the C.T. Scan.
- 2:45 p.m. Mark Kintgen was returned to an Emergency Room suite where his mother (Kay Kitgen) was present and was briefed by the Doctors.
- 2:55 p.m. I was contacted by Lieutenant D. Yount who was briefed as to the known conditions of the victims. Lieutenant Yount gave his desk telephone (#303.640.1269) with instructions to call if any help was needed. I requested a Public Information Officer as the media contingent was cordoned but largely numbered.
- 3:10 p.m. I contacted Doctor Witt who was the neuro surgeon who was to operate on the head wound on Mark Witt. I asked Doctor Witt of Mark's condition. Doctor Witt stated that Mark was stable and that the prognosis for his recovery was very good.
- 3:30 p.m. Sergeant W. Hoffman (#77-40) arrived with his "Post" Officers to assist in the security of the arriving victims to the hospital. The following Officers accompanied Sergeant Hoffman:
- 1) Technician Swedlund #77-40.
- 2) Officer Dennison #96-07.

Additionally, Denver Police Department Public Information Officer Virginia Lopez arrived and was briefed and provided an updated list of all known hospitalized victims and their locations.

3:55 p.m. Victim #4 (identified as Lisa Kreutz, age 17) arrived via ambulance at the hospital and was immediately taken to a an emergency room suite. Myself and Detective Campbell assisted Detective Healey in bagging and marking the jewelry and clothing that was removed from the victim. Detective Healey signed for the custody of the victim's clothing. Ms. Kreutz appeared to be suffering from multiple gun shot wounds to the left rear shoulder and right lower leg. The Emergency room received information from an anonymous source that two armed males in a red and black GEO Metro were following the ambulance and were requested to provide additional security if necessary. No such vehicle was observed.

3:58 p.m. I was contacted by Denver Police Department Victim's Advocate Sharon Aragon who requested an updated list of victims in all the hospital so that the victims could be placed in contact with their parents.

4:30 p.m. Detectives Campbell, Healy and myself were notified that all emergency ambulances were on stand down as no additional victims were being transported.

The evidence was placed into the Denver Sheriff Department Detention Facility for safe keeping as myself and Detective Healy responded to the Emergency Room conference rooms to contact the families of the victims. The following parents were contacted:

Myself and Detective Healy left business cards with the victim's families with the reassurance that if any questions needed to be answered, that we could be called any time.

6:23 p.m. Detectives Campbell, Healey and myself secured from DHMC and transported Detective Healy to the combined command centers at Bowles and Pierce (Clement Park).

7:10 p.m. Arrived at the Combined Command Center at Clement Park and stood by until relieved by Jefferson County Sheriffs. Detective Healey had control of and placed the collected evidence into a Jefferson County vehicle under the direction and with the assistance of Jefferson County Sheriff Department supervisory and command personnel. We stood by as directed by Denver Police command staff on the scene.

9:10 p.m. Detective Campbell and I arrived at Denver Police Headquarters and prepared to write up our activities. We were informed by night shift Detective Pennington that possible further criminal acts were possible on 04-21-1999 and were told to go home and get rest.

9:30 p.m. Detective Campbell and I secured from Headquarters.
