There will be no break in service in transitioning to the new relocated site. The anticipated first treatment date at the new site is anticipated in Summer 2021, well in advance of the assumed completion of CN review (January 2022).

FKC Aberdeen serves patients with end-stage renal disease. FKC Aberdeen offers in-center hemodialysis, home hemodialysis and peritoneal dialysis training and support for dialysis patients, a dedicated isolation area, and a dedicated bed station. FKC Aberdeen also offers an evening shift, beginning after 5 pm, for dialysis patients.

As demonstrated in Table 2, FKC Aberdeen is above the 4.5 occupancy standard.

In-center dialysis station need was determined by applying the five-step methodology set forth in WAC 246-310-812. The specific methodology applied to the Grays Harbor County Dialysis Planning Area is detailed below:

Step (a)
Determine the Type of Regression Analysis to be Used

Determine the type of regression analysis to be used to project resident in-center station need by calculating the annual growth rate in the planning area using the end-of-year number of resident in-center patients for each of the previous six consecutive years, concluding with the base year.

(i) If the planning area has experienced less than six percent growth in any of the previous five annual changes calculations, use linear regression to project station need; or

(ii) If the planning area has experienced six percent or greater growth in each of the previous five annual changes, use nonlinear (exponential) regression to project station need.

Table 3 details the year-end number of in-center hemodialysis patients in the Grays Harbor County Dialysis Planning Area. As Table 3 demonstrates, growth in years 2017, 2018, and 2020 were less than 6%. As such, a linear regression is to be used to project station need.

Step (b)
Project the Number of Resident In-Center Patients

Project the number of resident in-center patients in the projection year using the regression type determined in (a) of this subsection. When performing the regression analysis use the previous five consecutive years of end-of-year data concluding with the base year.

Per WAC, the projection year for dialysis station need is defined as the fifth year after the base year. The base year is defined as the most recent calendar year for which December 31 data is

available as of the first day of the application submission period from the *Northwest Renal Network's Modality Report*. In this case, the base year is 2020 and the projection year is 2025. Accordingly, Table 4 details the number of projected in-center patients in the Grays Harbor County Dialysis Planning Area in the years 2021 – 2025 using a linear regression.

Step (c)

Determine the Number of Dialysis Stations Needed

Determine the number of dialysis stations needed to serve resident in-center patients in the planning area in the projection year by dividing the result of (b) of this subsection by the appropriate resident in-center patient per station number from subsection (3) of this section. In order to assure access, fractional numbers are rounded up to the nearest whole number.

As noted above, the projection year is 2025. For the Grays Harbor County Dialysis Planning Area, the appropriate resident in-center patient per station number is 4.8. Assuming 88 patients in 2025 (step b), dividing by 4.8 and rounding up yields nineteen (19) total stations needed in 2025.

Step (d)

Determine Net Station Need

To determine the net station need for a planning area, subtract the number calculated in (c) of this subsection from the total number of certificate of need approved stations located in the planning area. This number does not include the one department recognized exempt isolation station defined in WAC 246-310-800(9). For example, a kidney dialysis facility that is certificate of need approved and certified for eleven stations would subtract the one exempt isolation station and use ten stations for the methodology calculations.

Subtracting existing stations from 2025 need identifies a net station need of three (3) stations.

Table 7 presents the projected utilization at FKC Aberdeen. Given the three additional station is anticipated to become operational by May 2022, the first full year of operation will be 2023.

Utilization Forecast Methodology

Please see below for a description of the methodology used to construct the in-center and home patient projections.

In-Center Patients

The intervening in-center utilization is based on CY2020 utilization. Incremental growth for in-center patient is assumed when the new stations become operational (May 2022) and is based on the cumulative incremental growth featured in step (b) of the need methodology which is added to the 2020 FKC Aberdeen in-center patient census (see Table 6). It is assumed the number of treatments per patient is 148.8 treatments per year based on CY2020 utilization.

Home Patients

Home projections are forecasted at 11.1% of in-center patients, rounded to the nearest whole number (based on CY2020 utilization). It is assumed the number of home treatments per patient is 184.4 treatments per year based on CY2020 utilization.

Patient access is critical to improving the health and quality of life of our patients. But patient access is multi-faceted and not simply represented by the aggregate number of stations available. Patients require access to the specific treatment modality and convenient hours of operation that meet their individual clinical and personal needs. Further, continuity of care with the same physician and dialysis care team is often integral to addressing patients' care need.

Patients with limited financial means also face additional barriers to care due to the financial burden of out-of-pocket expenses. However, RCG strives to address this issue for our patients when needed by providing charity in our Washington facilities. A copy of our charity care policy is contained in Exhibit 6.

This project has no impact on either charges or payment, as reimbursement for kidney dialysis services is based on a prospective composite per diem rate. In the case of government payers, reimbursement is based on CMS (Center for Medicaid and Medicare) fee schedules which have nothing to do with capital expenditures by providers such as FMCNA. In the case of private sector payers, FMCNA negotiates national, state, and regional contracts with payers. These negotiated agreements include consideration/negotiation over a number of variables, including number of covered lives being negotiated; the provider's accessibility, including hours of operation; quality of care; the provider's patient education and outreach; its performance measures such as morbidity and/or mortality rates; and increasingly, consideration of more broad performance/quality measures, such as the CMS Quality Incentive Program ("QIP") Total Performance Score ("TPS").⁴

FMCNA does not negotiate any of its contracts at the facility-level, thus, the capital costs associated with the proposed FKC Aberdeen project would have no impact on payer negotiations or levels of reimbursement. In this regard, facility-level activities, such as number of FTEs, operating expenses or capital expenditures have no effect on negotiated rates, since such negotiations do not consider facility-level operations. As such, the proposed FKC Aberdeen project will have no effect on rates FMCNA would receive in the Grays Harbor County Dialysis Planning Area.

As described above, FMCNA does not negotiate any of its contracts at the facility-level, thus, the capital costs associated with the proposed FKC Aberdeen project will have no impact on payer negotiations or levels of reimbursement.

- Non-productive hours are estimated at 10% of productive hours, based on FMCNA experience.
- Benefits are calculated at 35.6% of wages and salaries based on FKC Aberdeen’s 2020 actuals.
- FTEs for the intervening periods between historical actuals and project completion projections are based on 2020 actuals.
- The staff to patient ratio matrix below was used to construct minimum FTE counts for the projection years based on future patient counts presented in Table 7.

FKC Aberdeen is an operational dialysis facility, which is staffed with qualified clinical and support personnel. Table 11 provides the number of current and proposed FTEs, by type. By virtue of our geographic location, any additional staff would be expected to principally come from Grays Harbor County as well as from neighboring counties in the region. To be effective in staff recruitment and retention, RCG offers competitive wage and benefit packages. Further, to ensure that we have adequate staff across all our facilities in Washington, we have built a local float pool of WA Licensed Patient Care Techs and RN's to ensure we have coverage for patient care. FMCNA also has an internal staffing agency, Fresenius Travel, in which we can request assistance. We also have the capability of using outside staffing agencies to fill critical needs.

As for matters responsive to the application questions, FMCNA has no history of criminal convictions relating to the ownership or operation of a health care facility within the United States within the last three (3) calendar years.⁶ FMCNA also has no history of license revocations or decertifications for facilities in Washington State. In the past three (3) years, a dialysis facility located in Coeur D Alene, Idaho (Fresenius Kidney Care North Idaho) was decertified on November 22, 2019.

current and new employees, potential new employees, Medical Directors, attending physicians, physician extenders (e.g., NP's, PA's), independent contractors, and vendors against the Office of Inspector General's List of Excluded Individuals/Entities and the General Services Administration's List of Parties Excluded from Federal Programs, as well as state specific exclusion lists, OFAC, etc. FMCNA will not engage a person or company that is excluded from participating in federally funded health care programs such as Medicare.

FKC Aberdeen Organizational Chart

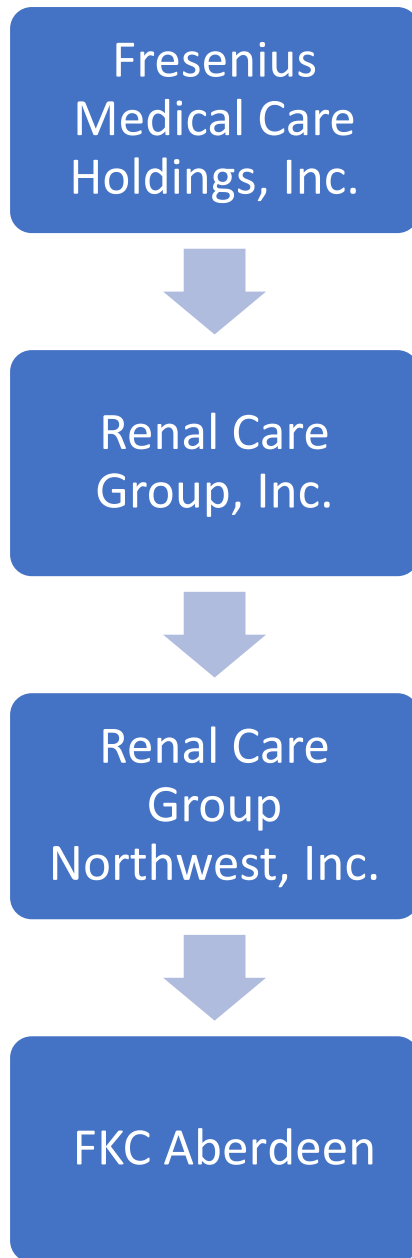

Patient Admission

Purpose To guide facility management on the admission process for all patients being admitted to an FKC dialysis facility.

Responsibility Medical Director, Clinical Manager or Registered Nurse, Master’s Social Worker, Registered Dietitian and Facility Secretary as defined in this policy, Patient Admission Services and Central Verification

General Policy This policy applies to In-Center, Home, Permanent Transfer, Transient and Seasonal Patients.

When medically appropriate and consistent with this policy, facilities shall admit and treat patients needing dialysis.

Each patient admitted will be followed by an attending physician on the facility's medical staff or physician who has been granted temporary privileges at the facility.

All services offered by FKC facilities are available to all patients provided:

- They are medically suitable based on the clinical assessment of the physician,
 - and the willingness of the responsible party to pay for such services.
-

Consent The patient must sign the consent for dialysis (hemodialysis or peritoneal dialysis) prior to the first treatment at the facility.

If the patient is incompetent or incapable of making healthcare decisions, refer to the block titled “Patient Appears Unable to Consent for treatment” For additional information refer to the [Informed Consent Policy](#).

The patient (or if patient has been deemed incompetent by a physician, the patient's representative) shall designate a person to be notified in case of emergency.

Types of Admissions: Definitions

New Patient: Permanent admission of a patient who is new to dialysis who are primarily referred by physician or hospital.

Transfer: A patient who is scheduled to receive ongoing and continued treatment at a dialysis facility (permanent or seasonal). A patient may be referred by his/her physician, a hospital, another dialysis facility, or as a self-referral.

Transient: A patient who is scheduled for only 1 to 13 treatments.

Transient or Seasonal Admission Requirements

The accepting physician will medically clear the patient prior to admission. (See block on medical clearance). The attending physician or physician extenders will make all the medical, laboratory and pharmaceutical decisions for the patient while under the physician's care in accordance with the standard rules and procedures of the facility.

Dialyzers and/or supplies brought by a transient or seasonal patient will only be used in the rarest of circumstances. Use of a patient-provided item, such as a specialized dialyzer or medication, must be approved by the Medical Director and the P and T Committee **PRIOR** to the patient arriving for treatment at the facility.

- If approved for a specific dialyzer or medication, a seasonal/transient patient's home facility must ship the item to the transient facility following proper storage and shipment procedures.

Admission Process All admissions must be processed through Patient Admission Services (PAS). Patient Admission Services (PAS) will receive patient information and medical records from referral sources. The PAS will disseminate this information to the appropriate departments responsible for medically and financially clearing the patients. Upon receipt of the referral for admission, the facility will be notified of the pending admission by PAS to confirm placement.

Patient Admission Services will obtain medical records and collaborate with the verification office to financially clear the patient.

Patient Transfer to another FKC Facility The Clinical Manager or his/her designee must contact Patient Admission Services when the patient transfers to a different FKC facility. Patient Admission Services will initiate the transfer.

Medical Clearance A patient shall be medically cleared for treatment when dialysis treatment is deemed indicated and appropriate according to the clinical judgment of the patient's attending physician. In the case where the Medical Director determines the patient is too acutely ill or not appropriate for outpatient dialysis care, then the decision for admission to the facility shall be made by the Governing Body.

Special Circumstances Admission Requests Requests to admit a patient with an external device such as left ventricular assist device (LVAD), continuous medication infusion, or LifeVest Defibrillator or other non-routine request requires approval from the corporate Medical Office.

Staff must review the [Admission, Handling and Safe Movement of the Morbidly Obese Patient Policy](#) before admission to the facility to ensure the

facility can safely care for a morbidly obese patient. The Governing Body will make the determination to accept or deny the patient based on special considerations outlined in the policy.

Emergency Admission - Transfer

Patients may need to be transferred emergently in situations related to unplanned emergencies caused by severe weather, fire or other serious facility operating problems such as water treatment failure or other unexpected problems leading to facility closure. An emergency transfer is not expected to extend beyond 30 days and patients are expected to return to their “home” facility to continue their treatments when operations are able to resume. The emergency data entry process may be used for emergency transfers.

Non-emergent situations such as a planned closure or an individual treatment at another facility after a missed a treatment, or unplanned after-hours admissions must be handled according to the current process of admitting a patient.

Medical Record Requirements

Patient Admission Services will collect the required information needed to admit a patient

At a minimum, the required documents to admit a patient include:

- History and Physical or nephrology consult note or discharge summary or the most recent physician progress note
- Hepatitis B panel (HBsAg, anti-HBs, anti-HBc)
 - If unable to obtain full panel:

- For patients new to dialysis: at a minimum a Hepatitis B surface antigen (HBsAg) result obtained within 30 days prior to the admission date
- For transient or transfer patients: All patients must have a documented hepatitis B antigen (HBsAg) **or** antibody (HBsAb) result prior to admission to the facility. HBsAg results must have been reported within 30 days of admission. If the patient has hepatitis antibodies (HBsAb), the results must have been reported within the past 12 months. Any discrepancies or questions related to admitting a patient and/or a patient's hepatitis results should be reported by the Clinical Manager to their Corporate Clinical Quality Manager.
 - Current medication list and allergies
 - Dialysis orders or the last treatment sheet
 - For transients/travelers only: A PPD Test or Chest X-ray within **one** year.

NOTE: On occasion, admitting facilities request additional medical information over the minimum required documents listed above. Patient Admission Services will attempt to get this information. However, inability to provide this information by the referring facility will not affect the admission of the patient.

Issues**

A referred patient who has exhibited behavioral issues in the hospital, at another FKC or non-FKC facility or during the admission process and could be a threat to the health and safety of patients or staff may be denied admission to the dialysis facility.

The decision to admit a patient who has exhibited behavioral issues shall be made by the facility management in collaboration with the patient’s attending physician and the Medical Director.

**Who is
Authorized to
Sign
Admission
Documents?**

Patients must have the mental capacity/competency to consent to treatment and sign admission forms for treatment to be given in the facility, except as described below. The facility staff cannot make determinations regarding mental capacity and competency and must presume competence unless a physician has declared the patient incompetent.

If a patient has been deemed by a physician to lack the mental capacity/competency to consent to treatment, a Legally Authorized Person may consent to the patient’s treatment and may sign the admission forms. In the rare instance that the legally authorized person is unavailable to sign the consent in person, the documents may be mailed, emailed, or faxed to the Legally Authorized Person for signature. The patient cannot be admitted and treated until the clinic receives the signed documents. The original signed documents must be faxed or mailed back to the facility to maintain in the patient’s medical record.

In the unusual instance when in person or fax options cannot be accomplished, the facility should reach out to their Division Legal Counsel or Compliance for additional guidance.

NOTE: State laws vary on who may consent to treatment on the patient’s behalf if the patient lacks capacity or competency to consent. In some states, family members or persons permitted by state law may consent to the patient’s treatment and sign the admission forms even if such persons do not hold a power of attorney for healthcare or healthcare proxy as the Law Department will determine.

For purposes of this Policy, a ‘Legally Authorized Person’ is as follows:

- a) The patient’s legal guardian or someone who holds a valid power of attorney for healthcare/healthcare proxy or who may sign on behalf of the patient under state law as determined by the Law Department.
- b) A parent or legal guardian if the patient is a minor.

NOTE: If there is any doubt the person is authorized to sign admission forms, contact the Law Department.

If a patient comes for his or her first treatment and does not appear to have the mental capacity/competency to sign the admitting documents, the nurse:

- must notify the patient’s attending physician of the patient’s perceived incapacity to understand and his/her inability to consent, and
- should seek confirmation whether a medical determination of incompetency or lack of capacity has been made in the medical record consistent with state law.
- If the patient is deemed incompetent by the physician, the staff should attempt to contact any emergency contacts listed on the patient’s admission paperwork in an attempt to find a family member who can
 - Provide proof of guardianship/power of attorney for healthcare or healthcare proxy (which must be provided at the time of admission, prior to treatment being provided), or
 - Assist in providing valid consent to treatment, if permitted under state law, or who can obtain legal authority/guardianship to represent the patient.
- The patient cannot be dialyzed if:
 - The patient has been deemed by a physician to be incompetent or to lack mental capacity consistent with state law, and
 - The patient does not have an appropriate legal guardian or an agent with a valid healthcare power of attorney or healthcare proxy, and

The law department determines that state law does not permit family members to give consent.

Required Documents That Must Be Signed Prior to First Dialysis Treatment

The Clinical Manager or designee will conduct an admission interview with all new patients.

The following documents must be reviewed with and signed by the patient and/or the patient's Legally Authorized Person before or at the patient's first scheduled dialysis treatment:

- Admission Agreement
- Assignment of Benefits
- Consent for Dialysis
- Medicare Secondary Payor Questionnaire (MSPQ)
- Fresenius Rx Agent Designation form
- Consent to Receive, Use and Disclose Health Information for Treatment, Payment and Health Care Operations form
- Spectra form
- Notice of Privacy Practices/Acknowledgment of Notice of Privacy Practices

Note: Patients or their Legally Authorized Persons will not be asked to sign consent forms for services that are not being provided (ex. blood transfusion consent) until the actual service is needed. Blank consent forms should never be signed or used.

Approved Forms of Identification

Patient Admission Services will request the referring facility to provide 1 photo ID for the referral. Upon placement at the facility, staff will request 2 forms of identification. The two forms of ID must be provided within 6 treatments.

The two forms of identification can be:

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Patient Admission

- A driver’s license, a state issued identification card, a passport, insurance cards or a birth certificate. (These documents will be copied and maintained in a separate folder for each patient. When the patient is discharged, they will be placed in the closed medical record.)
- If the patient does not bring in the required documents within 6 treatments, the Clinical Manager or Director of Operations must escalate to the Lead Social Worker who can review the situation and assist with obtaining the identification documents.

Failure to produce 2 forms of identification alone is not cause for discharge. Refer to the [Routine and Involuntary Patient Discharge Policy](#), [Routine and Involuntary Patient Discharge Policy Addendum](#) and the [Routine and Involuntary Patient Discharge Procedure](#) for guidance on discharging a patient.

FKC Notice of Privacy Practice

A copy of the “FKC Notice of Privacy Practices (NPP)” must be given to each patient that is receiving direct care from an FKC provider prior to the patient’s first treatment (see Privacy Notice Procedure COR-COMP-PS-0-001-001C1).

Patients have the right to review this Notice of Privacy Practices prior to signing the “Acknowledgement of Receipt of the NPP” form (See COR-COMP-PS-0-001-001D3). The “Acknowledgement of Receipt of the NPP” form should be signed by the patient or Legally Authorized Person, prior to the patient’s first treatment from an FKC direct provider of care. This form serves as an acknowledgement of receipt of the FKC Notice of Privacy Practices.

NOTE: This form is **not** a condition for treatment. If the patient refuses to sign the acknowledgement form, the FKC staff should document the efforts that were made to obtain the patient’s or Legally Authorized Person’s

signature and document that the FKC Notice of Privacy Practices was provided. This documentation should be made on the acknowledgement form and should be witnessed by another staff member. The acknowledgement form should be kept as part of the permanent active medical record.

A copy of this notice must also be posted in a clear and prominent location readily visible to patients in each FKC physical service delivery site. This notice will also be posted on the FKC web site. In addition, whenever the notice is revised, the FKC direct provider must make the notice available upon request.

All new admissions will also receive additional information if applicable per policy that includes:

 - Catheter Access Plan
 - Consent Form
 - DNR Instruction and Form

Advance Directive/DNR Status

All new admissions to the facility will be asked if they have an Advance Directive and/or a valid state specific Do Not Resuscitate Order prior to or at their first treatment and during their comprehensive interdisciplinary assessment.

Patient Rights and Responsibilities Policy

Patient Rights and Responsibilities

Purpose To comply with Federal Regulations that require dialysis facilities to:
 Educate staff regarding the rights of dialysis patients.
 Inform and educate all dialysis patients about their rights and responsibilities as a patient at the dialysis facility.
 Ensure that patients’ rights are respected and protected by the facility.

Responsibility The FMCNA Patient Rights and Responsibilities patient brochures may be distributed to patients by any FMS staff. Additional information or discussion must be provided by the Nurse or Social Worker.

All facility staff are responsible for ensuring that patients’ rights are respected and protected by the facility.

Conditions for Coverage: Patients’ Rights The Conditions for Coverage, §494.70 Condition: Patients’ Rights require dialysis facilities to inform patients or their representatives of their rights (including their privacy rights) and responsibilities when they begin their treatment and must protect and provide for the exercise of those rights. Patients’ rights as stated in the Conditions for Coverage:

- The patient has the right to –
1. Respect, dignity, and recognition of his or her individuality and personal needs, and sensitivity to his or her psychological needs and ability to cope with ESRD;
 2. Receive all information in a way that he or she can understand;
 3. Privacy and confidentiality in all aspects of treatment;
 4. Privacy and confidentiality in personal medical records;
 5. Be informed about and participate if desired, in all aspects of his or her care, and be informed of the right to refuse treatment, to discontinue treatment, and to refuse to participate in experimental research;
 6. Be informed about his or her right to execute advance directives, and the facility’s policies regarding advance directives;
 7. Be informed about all treatment modalities and settings, including but not limited to transplantation, home dialysis modalities (home

Conditions for Coverage: Patients' Rights, cont'd

- hemodialysis, intermittent peritoneal dialysis, continuous ambulatory peritoneal dialysis, continuous cycling peritoneal dialysis), and in-facility hemodialysis. The patient has the right to receive resource information for dialysis modalities not offered by the facility, including information about alternative scheduling options for working patients;
8. Be informed of facility policies regarding patient care, including, but not limited to isolation patients;
 9. Be informed of facility policies regarding the reuse of dialysis supplies, including hemodialyzers;
 10. Be informed by the physician, nurse practitioner, clinical nurse specialist, or physician's assistant treating the patient for ESRD of his or her own medical status as documented in the patient's medical record, unless the medical record contains a documented contraindication;
 11. Be informed of services available in the facility and charges for services not covered under Medicare;
 12. Receive the necessary services outlined in the patient plan of care;
 13. Be informed of the rules and expectations of the facility regarding patient conduct and responsibilities;
 14. Be informed of the facility's internal grievance process;
 15. Be informed of external grievance mechanisms and processes, including how to contact the ESRD Network and the State survey agency;
 16. Be informed of his or her right to file internal grievances or external grievances, without reprisal or denial of services; and
 17. Be informed that he or she may file internal grievances or external grievances personally, anonymously or through a representative of the patient's choosing.
 18. Be informed of the facility's policies for transfer, routine or involuntary discharge, and discontinuation of services to patients;
 19. Receive written notice 30 days in advance of an involuntary discharge, if discharge is justified and not due to an immediate threat to the health and safety of others.

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Patient Rights and Responsibilities

Policy All patients and/or their representatives will be informed of their rights (including privacy rights) and responsibilities.

Patient rights and the ability to exercise these rights must be protected by the facility.

The FMCNA Patient Rights and Responsibilities brochure explains the rights patients can expect to have while receiving treatment at this facility. The brochure also provides guidance as to certain responsibilities that are expected of the patient.

Each patient will be informed of their rights and given a copy of the FMCNA Patient Rights and Responsibilities within the first six (6) treatments in the facility. More in-depth discussions with patients about their rights and responsibilities are expected. These discussions may occur over a longer period of time.

Facilities should ensure that this information is provided to patients in a manner they can understand. For example, providing the FMCNA Patient Rights and Responsibilities brochure in the patient’s primary language or having it interpreted based on assessment of the patient’s language and reading preferences, or enlisting the aid of communication aids or interpreters for patients who are blind or have low vision, or are deaf or hard of hearing.

Dialysis facilities must prominently display a copy of the patient’s rights in a visible and accessible area in the facility and must include contact information for the State survey agency and ESRD Network.

The FMCNA Patient Rights and Responsibilities brochures are available in English and Spanish. They may be purchased from the FMS Marketing Online Ordering Center. Audio versions in English and Spanish may also be ordered through the FMS Marketing Online Ordering Center.

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Patient Rights and Responsibilities

Policy: Patients have the right to privately discuss their condition and treatment.
Privacy Rights There should be ready access to a room in the facility where patient and/or family meetings may be held in private.

Patients have the right to privacy during activities that may require the exposure of private body parts while in the dialysis facility. Privacy screens or curtains may be used to provide privacy. Blankets may also be used as long as staff are able to observe the patient’s vascular access, bloodline connections, and face at all times.

Patients or their representatives must be provided unbiased education about transplantation and all dialysis treatment options regardless of whether these options are available in the current facility.

Failure to Protect Patients’ Rights Evidence of failure to treat patients with respect and dignity, provide an opportunity for private communication, or prevent exposure of private body areas resulting in emotional discomfort for the patient, and evidence that cognizant patients/designees are not aware of their options for treatment or available grievance mechanisms could result in the facility receiving a Condition level citation.

FMCNA Patient Rights

YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO:

- **Information that is Easy to Understand**
- **Care that is Respectful**
- **Help Make Decisions about Your Care**
- **Privacy and Confidentiality**
- **Clear Information about Facility Policies**
- **Make a Complaint, and Receive a Response**

What rights do you have?

The Fresenius Medical Care staff is committed to working with you and your family to meet your health care needs. Our goal is for you to have the same care and attention we would want for ourselves.

This list of rights explains some of the basics about how you can expect to be treated in our facility.

You have the right to:

Information that is easy to understand

- Receive information about dialysis in a way that is easy to understand.
- Assistance in helping you choose healthy behaviors that will improve your health and well-being.
- Receive clear answers to your questions.
- Have an interpreter if you can't hear or understand your care team.

Care that is respectful

- Be protected from discrimination and or harassment based on race, color, national origin, sexual orientation, gender identity, disability, age, sex and religion.
- Be treated with dignity, consideration, respect and full recognition of your individuality and personal needs. This includes sensitivity to your psychological needs and ability to cope with ESRD.
- Say “no” and report staff that ask you to engage in personal or financial relationships, without fear of retaliation.

Help make decisions about your care

- Be informed about your care and have the opportunity to participate in all aspects of your care, if you wish.
- Involve family members in making decisions about your care, if you desire.
- Be informed about the treatment options available to you and the right to change your treatment option after discussion with your physician.
- Be informed about dialysis treatment options or schedules not provided by this facility. Ask your Clinic Manager or Social Worker about scheduling options for working patients.
- Decide if you want to be part of any available research studies.
- Accept, refuse or stop any treatment that is prescribed for you.
- Be informed about your medical status by the physician, nurse practitioner, clinical nurse specialist or physician’s assistant treating you, unless there is a documented reason for not giving this information.
- Receive all services as decided by you and the healthcare team in your plan of care.

- Know that Fresenius Medical Care does not reuse dialysis supplies, including hemodialyzers.
- Be told about and receive information about advance directives, and how the facility will carry out your wishes regarding your advance directives.

Privacy and confidentiality

- Privacy and confidentiality in all aspects of treatment. This includes
 - the right to privately discuss your condition
 - the right to privacy during activities that may require the exposure of body parts while in the dialysis facility. Privacy screens, curtains, or blankets that do not cover your face or access, may be used to provide privacy.
- Privacy and confidentiality in your personal medical records. These rights and FMCNA's privacy practices are more fully explained in our Notice of Privacy practices. A copy of the Notice of Privacy Practices is given to patients upon admission, is posted in this facility, and is available upon request at any time.

Clear information about facility policies

- Be told what services are available in the facility.
- Be given information about charges that may be billed to you if they are not covered by insurance or Medicare.
- Be informed of facility policies regarding patient care, including policies about visitors, eating and restroom use during treatment, isolation of patients with infectious disease, and conditions for transfer or discharge from the facility.
- Be informed that a two week notice is expected when requesting discharge from the facility to give staff an opportunity to:
 - Ensure continuity of care for transfer.

- Resolve any issues before a final decision to transfer from the facility is made
- If you do not agree to a two week notice, the staff will assist you to transfer at your requested time frame.
- You may not be discharged from the facility unless:
 - you or your insurer no longer reimburses the facility for the ordered services, your insurer materially reduces the amount of reimbursement originally agreed upon with the facility, or if the facility is unable to confirm with your insurer, before you are admitted, what the actual payment for services provided to you will be and, your insurer then reimburses facility at an insufficient rate relative to historical commercial insurer payment rates for the ordered services.
 - the facility ceases to operate.
 - transfer is necessary for your welfare or because the facility can no longer meet your medical needs, or
 - your behavior is disruptive and abusive such that it affects the safety and welfare of others.
- Be given a 30-day notice of discharge, unless there is an immediate threat to the health and safety of others and discharge must be made sooner.

Make a complaint, and receive a response

- Be informed about how to make a complaint through the facility, the ESRD Network or State Survey Agency.
- Make a complaint, verbally or in writing.
- Make a complaint yourself, anonymously or through a representative of your choice, through the Grievance Procedure without fear or concern that services will be affected.

What Responsibilities Do You Have?

You are the most important person on your health care team. This is because a lot of what determines how well you feel and the quality of your life depends on the daily decisions that you make.

You have the responsibility to:

Speak Up to Help Us Protect Your Health & Safety

- Tell the staff if you don't understand your treatment plan or any instructions.
- Tell the staff if something doesn't feel or look safe, or right.
- Involve your family or significant others in your care, when needed.
- Inform the staff if you have had health problems since your last treatment.
- Actively participate in your plan of care.

Choose Healthy Behaviors

- Take charge of your healthcare, to the best of your ability.
- Learn as much as you can about your healthcare needs.
- Cooperate, to the best of your ability, with your diet, medication, and dialysis treatment plans.
- Take care of, protect, and learn about your dialysis access - it's your lifeline!
- For your safety, make sure your face and dialysis access are uncovered and visible to staff at all times during your treatment.
- **Call the Fresenius Medical Care Disaster Line (1-800-626-1297)** if a disaster occurs and you cannot reach your facility.

Get Your Full Dialysis Treatment

- Tell the staff if your treatments are so uncomfortable that you will be unable to complete or attend your treatments. They will try to help.
- Arrive on time for your treatments or clinic visits.
- Let the staff know as early as possible if you are going to be late or miss a treatment or appointment and reschedule.
- Arrange transportation to and from treatment. Inform staff right away if your transportation needs change.
- Make sure you have a backup transportation plan in case you need it.
- For your safety, arrange to have someone with you when you come to dialysis, if you need help getting into or out of your vehicle or in and out of the facility. Staff are strongly discouraged from leaving the facility to assist an arriving or departing patient. Leaving the facility to assist a patient outside could result in a health or safety risk to the employee, the patient being assisted and/or other patients in the treatment area.

Be Considerate of Other Patients and Staff

- Respect the personal rights and property of other patients & staff.
- Maintain the confidentiality of any information you witness or hear while in the facility. This includes:
 - Not recording, writing down or discussing the personal health information or other confidential information of other patients.
 - Not using any form of photography, video or audio recordings of any kind anywhere within the facility.
 - Follow the rules of the facility that have been developed to provide protection, safety, and quality care to all patients.
 - Behave appropriately. This means not acting in a way that makes other people in the clinic uncomfortable or afraid for their safety, such as threatening, cursing, yelling, using sexually suggestive words, or inappropriate touching.
 - Understand that patients and/or visitors may not solicit or distribute for any purpose on FKC premises (including FKC clinics and the waiting area of such clinics), unless approved, in advance, by the FKC Compliance Officer and/or FMCNA human resources.
 - Understand that weapons of any kind are not allowed in the facility. This means not bringing any items that can be used as a weapon. Bringing weapons to the facility or making threats against others or the facility may be grounds for immediate dismissal from the facility.
 - Understand that alcoholic beverages or illicit (street) drugs are not allowed in the facility. Patients who come to dialysis under the influence of these substances put themselves at a health risk and may require hospitalization or police involvement.
 - Make sure your visitors follow the same rules as patients.

Provide Updated Information to Staff

- Notify the facility if you have a new address or contact information.
- Inform the facility right away if you obtain new insurance coverage or there are any changes in insurance.
- Inform the facility if you decide to receive dialysis at another facility or stop dialysis.

Remember: By taking advantage of your rights and fulfilling your responsibilities, you may be able to improve your health and the quality of your life.

Patient Volumes

Utilization projections, including the assumptions used to derive the forecasts, are presented in the application text.

It is assumed the number of treatments per patient is 148.8/year for in-center and 184.4/year for home based on full year 2020 Aberdeen actuals. There is an adjustment in 2022 to reflect only partial year utilization

Revenues

In-center revenues are based on CY2020 FKC Aberdeen data ("actuals"), given it is an existing facility. Payer mix statistics have also been obtained from FKC Aberdeen actuals for the most recent calendar year. Revenues are calculated by payer and treatment. Bad debt and charity care are subtracted from revenues to yield net revenue figures.

Charity Care

Calculated at 0.88% of revenue based on the experience of Fresenius' facilities in Washington State.

Bad Debt

Calculated on a per treatment basis from FKC Aberdeen actuals.

Expenses

Unless otherwise noted, expenses have been calculated on a per treatment basis from FKC Aberdeen actuals.

Personnel expenses are based on identified patient to staff ratios and incorporates a 10% non-productive factor. Wage figures have been compiled from current rates at the FKC Aberdeen facility.

Rent Expense is based on the revised rates provided in the 1st amendment to the lease. Commencement of lease expenses began on May 15, 2021.

Existing depreciation/amortization, other property expenses (property taxes, CAM), and interest expense are based on full year 2020 Aberdeen actuals, including accounting adjustments applicable under International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS).

Project-related Depreciation is straight-line; assumes 10 years on leaseholds and 8 years on equipment.

Physician Compensation: Section 5.01.1 of the Medical Director Agreement (MDA) presented the starting lump sum fee for multiple Fresenius facilities encompassing the MDA. Further, it states that the fee will increase by 2% each year thereafter. Fresenius allocates the MDA fee based on a treatment basis. The projected physician compensation fee is calculated based on 2020 actuals per-treatment expenses, with an annual 2% escalator, that is then multiplied by the projected number of treatments.

Medical Director Agreement

Joinder Agreement

This Joinder Agreement (the “**Joinder Agreement**”) is entered into as of the last date of signature by the parties hereto, by and among Renal Care Group Northwest, Inc. (“**Company**”), an affiliate of Fresenius Medical Care Holdings, Inc., a New York corporation d/b/a Fresenius Medical Care North America (“**FMCNA**”), RVS, LLC (“**Consultant**”), and Niranjan Sivakumar, M.D., in his/her individual capacity (“**Physician**”).

WHEREAS, Company and Consultant are parties to that Medical Director Agreement, as amended, a copy of which is attached hereto as **Exhibit A** and incorporated herein by this reference (the “**Medical Director Agreement**”), pursuant to which Consultant provides medical director services to the Dialysis Operations as identified in the Medical Director Agreement (Capitalized terms used herein and not otherwise defined shall have the meanings set forth in the Medical Director Agreement); and

WHEREAS, Physician is hereby deemed a “Member Physician” as defined in the Medical Director Agreement; and

WHEREAS, Physician will become privy to and/or have access to certain proprietary and confidential information concerning Company, including, but not limited to, various trade secrets and competitive information; and

WHEREAS, Consultant and Physician understand, acknowledge and agree that any specific Medical Director Services under the Medical Director Agreement to be performed by Physician on Consultant’s behalf shall be agreed by Physician and Consultant; and

WHEREAS, the parties acknowledge that, in accordance with the Medical Director Agreement, Company is compensating Consultant and Member Physicians for the provision of Medical Director Services through payments made to Consultant, although the specific compensation arrangement for the provision of any Medical Director Services by Physician on Consultant’s behalf are solely between Consultant and Physician, which Consultant and Physician represent and warrant shall be in full compliance with law;

NOW, THEREFORE, for good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged and intending to be bound hereby, the parties agree as follows:

1. Acknowledging Medical Director Obligations in the Medical Director Agreement.
 - a. Physician hereby acknowledges the nature of the Medical Director Services to be provided to the Dialysis Operations in the Medical Director Agreement. Physician agrees that any medical director duties to be performed by Physician, as Physician and Consultant may agree, shall be performed in compliance with this Joinder Agreement and the Medical Director Agreement.

- b. Each reference to Member Physician, as utilized in Medical Director Agreement shall, for purposes of this Joinder Agreement, include Physician and shall bind Physician to the extent applicable.
- c. The parties understand and agree that Consultant is ultimately responsible for ensuring that all Medical Director Services are performed in compliance with the Medical Director Agreement.

2. Covenants Protecting Business Interests of Company.

- a. Physician hereby acknowledges and agrees to be bound by the Covenants Protecting Business Interests of Company set forth in Section 6 of the Medical Director Agreement, which includes, but is not limited to, a covenant not to disclose confidential information, covenant not to solicit employees and covenant not to compete.
- b. This Section 2 and the covenants of Section 6 of the Medical Director Agreement shall survive termination or expiration of this Joinder Agreement.
- c. If Physician ceases to qualify as a Member Physician, then the Physician shall be subject to the covenants not to compete and not to solicit employees for the period set forth in the Medical Director Agreement as applicable to a Former Member Physician.
- d. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the foregoing, the covenant not to disclose confidential information as set forth in Section 6 of the Medical Director Agreement survives expiration or termination of this Joinder Agreement and the Medical Director Agreement.

3. Compliance Training.

- a. Pursuant to Company's Compliance Program and this Joinder Agreement, Physician, if providing Medical Director Services, agrees to complete initial compliance and privacy training (if not already completed prior to the execution of this Agreement) within the timeframe established in the Company's compliance program and complete supplemental compliance training during each year of the term of this Agreement.
- b. Physician acknowledges having received a copy of Company's Code of Conduct and understands that the Code of Conduct, and any revisions to it, is applicable to the position of Medical Director of the Dialysis Operations and the provision of services hereunder. Physician hereby agrees to complete promptly any reasonable certification regarding the Code of Conduct as reasonably requested by Company or FMCNA.

4. Exclusive Use of Facility Resources. Physician acknowledges that the Facilities and the supplies, equipment and employees of the Dialysis Operations shall be utilized exclusively (a) for the provision of dialysis services to patients of the Facilities, and (b) for the provision of services under this Joinder Agreement and the Medical Director Agreement. No portion of any physical clinic space, assets, supplies, equipment, employees or other resources of the

Dialysis Operations shall at any time be utilized by Physician for his/her private medical practice or for any other purpose not expressly set forth in this Joinder Agreement or the Medical Director Agreement except pursuant to a written agreement with Company on fair market value terms.

5. Term. The term of this Joinder Agreement shall be the term as set forth in the Medical Director Agreement. The parties acknowledge and agree that the terms and conditions of the Medical Director Agreement intended to survive termination or expiration of the Medical Director Agreement shall so apply to this Joinder Agreement, except as set forth in Section 2 hereof.
6. Miscellaneous.
 - a. *Assignability*. Physician shall not assign this Joinder Agreement or assign any of his or her rights hereunder without Company's prior written consent, which may be withheld in Company's sole discretion.
 - b. *Entire Agreement*. Except with respect to the Medical Director Agreement and the Third Party Beneficiary provision herein, this Joinder Agreement contains the entire agreement of the parties with respect to its subject matter and as of the date this Joinder Agreement is fully executed, supersedes all previous and contemporaneous agreements and understandings, inducements or conditions, expressed or implied, oral or written, between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof.
 - c. *Waiver of Breach*. The failure of the parties to insist on strict performance of the provisions of this Joinder Agreement shall not be construed as a waiver of such provision or of any other default of the same or similar nature. No waiver, modification or change of any of the provisions hereof shall be valid unless in writing and signed by the parties against whom such claimed waiver, modification or change is sought to be enforced. One party's waiver of any default by the other party of any provision of this Joinder Agreement is not a waiver of any other default and shall not affect the right of that party to require performance of the defaulted provision at any future time.
 - d. *Severability; Headings*. If any term or provision of this Joinder Agreement or its application to any person or circumstance shall to any extent be declared invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of this Joinder Agreement or the application of such term or provision to persons or circumstances other than those as to which it is held invalid or unenforceable shall not be affected and each term and provision of this Joinder Agreement shall be valid and enforceable to the fullest extent permitted by law. The headings of sections in this Joinder Agreement are for convenience only and shall not affect or limit the interpretation of its provisions.
 - e. *Applicable Law*. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed and enforced in accordance with the laws applicable to the Medical Director Agreement.
 - f. *Third Party Beneficiary*. Company's present and future parent corporations, including but not limited to National Medical Care, Inc. and Fresenius Medical Care Holdings,

Inc., are intended third party beneficiaries of this Joinder Agreement and shall independently have the right to enforce each of the provisions of this Joinder Agreement, including, but not limited to, the restrictive covenants contained in Section 2 of this Joinder Agreement and in the Medical Director Agreement.

- g. *Authorized Signature.* This Joinder Agreement shall not be deemed accepted by Company unless and until an authorized officer of Company has signed this Joinder Agreement. No other act or writing by an agent, officer or manager of Company shall cause this Joinder Agreement to be a valid, effective or binding contract on Company. This Joinder Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which together shall constitute but one and the same instrument. Such execution may be transmitted by facsimile, e-signature, email or other electronic transmission and are to be deemed for all purposes to have been executed and delivered by that party to the other party.
- h. *Notices.* All notices pursuant to this Joinder Agreement shall be in writing and shall be deemed duly given and properly served when: (a) delivered personally (with written confirmation of receipt), (b) received by the addressee if sent by registered or certified mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested, or (c) received by the addressee if sent by a recognized express delivery service, in each case, to the parties at the addresses as set forth below or at such other addresses as may be furnished to the other parties in writing:

MEDICAL DIRECTOR AGREEMENT

This MEDICAL DIRECTOR AGREEMENT (“Agreement”) is made by and between Renal Care Group Northwest, Inc. (“Company”), a Delaware corporation and an affiliate of Fresenius Medical Care Holdings, Inc., a New York corporation d/b/a Fresenius Medical Care North America (“FMCNA”), and RVS, PLLC (“Consultant”), a Washington professional services corporation comprised of the following physicians: Julia Anuras, M.D., Chris Burtner, M.D., Lana Bur, M.D., Vo Nguyen, M.D. and Seth Thaler, M.D. (“Member Physicians”).

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, Company has established dialysis treatment centers at 1872 N 13th Loop Rd., Shelton, WA 98584 (“Shelton”), 719 Sleater Kinney Rd SE, Lacey, WA 98503 (“Lacey”), 2012 Industrial Parkway, Aberdeen, WA 98520 (“Gray’s Harbor”), 1684 Bishop Rd., Chehalis, WA 98532 (“Chehalis”) (each a “Facility” and, collectively, the “Facilities”), or at such address as a Facility may be relocated to from time to time; and

WHEREAS, Company has established a home dialysis treatment program located at 719 Sleater Kinney Rd SE, Lacey, WA 98503 and at the Gray’s Harbor Facility through which Company provides peritoneal dialysis and/or home hemodialysis treatments (“Home Program”); and

WHEREAS, Company has established a program for the provision of dialysis and/or apheresis services, and other contracted-for services, at Providence St. Peters Hospital located at 413 Lilly Rd NE, Olympia, WA 98506 (each an “Inpatient Services Program” and, collectively, the “Inpatient Services Programs”); and

WHEREAS, Consultant, through Member Physicians, specializes in the treatment of kidney disease and is experienced in the medical administration of dialysis facilities, home dialysis programs and inpatient services programs; and

WHEREAS, Company desires to retain Consultant to provide, through Member Physicians, certain administrative services with respect to the Facilities, the Home Programs and the Inpatient Services Programs and Consultant desires to provide such services in such capacity to Company; and

WHEREAS, the parties acknowledge that Company has established a master list of contracts that is maintained and updated centrally which cross references contracts between the parties and which shall be made available to the Secretary of the Department of Health and Human Services upon request.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants herein contained and further good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, and intending to be bound hereby, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. ENGAGEMENT AND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

Company hereby engages Consultant to provide certain administrative services to the Facilities, the Home Programs and the Inpatient Services Programs and Consultant agrees to provide such services upon the terms and conditions set forth herein. Consultant acknowledges that each nephrologist designated to serve as Medical Director of a Facility, a Home Program or and/or an Inpatient Services Program has specific duties and responsibilities (a) as set forth in this Agreement; (b) with respect to the Facilities and the Home Programs, as required by the Conditions for Coverage for End-Stage Renal Disease Facilities, 42 C.F.R. § 494.1 *et seq.*, or such amended or successor regulations, and the Interpretive Guidelines thereto promulgated by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (“CMS”) (collectively, the “Conditions for Coverage”); (c) as required under state licensing or other applicable laws; (d) as set forth in applicable FMCNA policies and procedures, including but not limited to, those policies and procedures related to quality outcomes for patients; and (e) as assigned to him/her in the Governing Body and Medical Staff Bylaws of the Facilities, the Home Programs and the Inpatient Services Programs. Consultant further acknowledges that (a) the Medicare Improvements for Patients and Providers Act and the implementing regulations of the Medicare End-Stage Renal Disease Bundled Payment System, 75 Fed. Reg. 49029 *et seq.*, or such amended or successor regulations (collectively, the “Bundle”) set forth certain rules effective as of January 1, 2011 for the reimbursement of claims by the Medicare program for renal dialysis services provided at dialysis facilities and home dialysis programs; and (b) the third party payors for individual patients may also set forth certain rules governing the reimbursement of claims for care provided to such payors’ patients.

2. TERM

The term of this Agreement shall begin on September 1, 2015 (the “Commencement Date”) and shall continue for a period of seven (7) years (“Initial Term”), unless sooner terminated as provided herein. This Agreement shall automatically renew for additional successive terms of three (3) years (the “Renewal Term”), unless either party gives written notice of non-renewal to the other party not less than nine (9) months prior to the expiration of the Initial Term or then current Renewal Term, as applicable. For purposes of this Agreement, “Term” means the Initial Term and any Renewal Term.

3. OBLIGATIONS OF CONSULTANT

3.01 Designation of Medical Directors; Requirements for Nephrologists Providing Services Hereunder

3.01.1 Consultant shall designate a nephrologist at each Facility, Home Program and Inpatient Services Program who shall be responsible for performing the services hereunder at such Facility, Home Program and/or Inpatient Services Program and who shall be deemed the Medical Director for such Facility, Home Program and/or Inpatient Services Program. Consultant acknowledges and agrees that the Medical Director of a Home Program shall report to the Medical Director of the Facility from which the Home Program is administered and that the Medical Director of the Facility shall be accountable for the Medical Director services rendered with respect to the both the Facility and such Home Program. Each nephrologist

designated as Medical Director shall at all times meet the requirements of Section 3.01.4, below, when providing services hereunder. Consultant acknowledges and agrees that the aforementioned designations, whether now or in the future, shall be made in writing and are subject to Company's prior written approval. Company hereby approves the initial designations of the Medical Directors of the Facilities, the Home Programs and the Inpatient Services Programs as set forth on Schedule A, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

3.01.2 Consultant agrees that it shall not designate a nephrologist as Medical Director at more than two (2) Facilities at any given time unless an exception is approved in advance, in writing, by the Chief Executive Officer of FMCNA, in consultation with FMCNA's Chief Medical Officer and the respective FMCNA Business Division President. Consultant further agrees that, barring any unforeseen circumstances, each nephrologist designated as Medical Director of a Facility, a Home Program or an Inpatient Services Program shall serve in such capacity for at least one (1) year before another nephrologist may be designated as the new Medical Director for such Facility, Home Program or Inpatient Services Program. Consultant acknowledges that Company strongly favors Medical Directors serving for tenures longer than one (1) year.

3.01.3 Any nephrologist who at any time is designated a Medical Director shall also be deemed a Member Physician for purposes of this Agreement. The term Member Physician is defined in Section 6.01.5, below. If a nephrologist designated as Medical Director has not already signed this Agreement as a Member Physician, then, prior to rendering services hereunder, such nephrologist shall be required to execute an amendment to this Agreement, or a separate agreement in a form acceptable to Company, pursuant to which such physician agrees to abide by the terms and conditions of this Agreement including, but not limited to, the provisions of Section 6 (collectively, a "Joinder Agreement"). The parties agree that while the designated Medical Director shall remain responsible for performing the duties hereunder with respect to the applicable Facility, Home Program or Inpatient Services Program, other Member Physicians may assist such Medical Director in the performance of the duties hereunder from time to time, including but not limited to any time the designated Medical Director is on vacation; provided, however, that such Member Physician, at all times when providing such assistance to the Medical Director, meets the requirements in Section 3.01.4, below.

3.01.4 Each Member Physician, whether as the designated Medical Director of a Facility, a Home Program or an Inpatient Services Program or when providing assistance to the designated Medical Director, shall at all times meet each of the following requirements:

a. Remain licensed as a physician in the state in which the Facilities, the Home Programs and the Inpatient Services Programs are located and at which such physician is providing Medical Director services hereunder.

b. Remain board certified in nephrology, internal medicine, pediatrics or pediatric nephrology, have completed a board-approved training program in nephrology and have at least twelve (12) months of experience providing care to patients receiving dialysis. Company may waive this qualification for a specific Member Physician, but such Member Physician may not

serve as Medical Director of a Facility or a Home Program unless the Secretary of the Department of Health and Human Services has indicated otherwise.

c. Remain a member in good standing of the Medical Staff of the Facilities and the Home Programs at which physician is providing Medical Director services hereunder, unless FMCNA's Chief Medical Officer or his designee specifically agrees otherwise in writing.

d. Remain a member in good standing of the Medical Staff of the Facilities from which the Inpatient Services Programs are administered and at which physician is providing Inpatient Services Program Medical Director services hereunder, and maintain privileges (at a minimum, courtesy/guest privileges) at the hospital at which Company operates the Inpatient Services Programs, unless FMCNA's Chief Medical Officer or his designee specifically agrees otherwise in writing.

e. Maintain a current registration with the Drug Enforcement Administration.

f. Maintain a current state controlled substances registration (or equivalent), as applicable.

g. Maintain malpractice liability insurance coverage of not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$3,000,000 annual aggregate and further maintain, for a period of not less than three (3) years following the termination of this Agreement, any such malpractice liability insurance if underwritten on a claims-made basis.

h. Not be excluded, suspended, sanctioned or otherwise restricted from participating in federal health care programs, including but not limited to, Medicare or Medicaid.

i. Remain otherwise qualified to act as a medical director of a dialysis treatment facility that is certified to participate in the Medicare.

j. Maintain any additional requirements as a physician as may be required in order for the Facilities to be licensed as dialysis facilities, or the equivalent, in the state in which the Facilities are located.

k. Maintain any additional requirements as a physician as may be required in order for the Inpatient Services Programs to be operated consistent with the requirements of The Joint Commission.

3.01.5 In the event that a Medical Director (i) is indicted for (x) any felony, or (y) any violation of a federal or state health care law; or (ii) fails to meet any of the requirements set forth in Section 3.01.4; or (iii) is terminated by Consultant, Company shall terminate such physician's designation as Medical Director upon same day notice to Consultant, and Consultant, within that same day period, shall designate a new Medical Director who meets the requirements set forth in this Agreement.

3.01.6 In the event that a Medical Director is unavailable to serve as Medical Director for a period greater than two (2) months, or such shorter time as Company in its reasonable discretion determines may affect the quality of care provided at a Facility, a Home Program or an Inpatient Services Program, then, unless Company agrees otherwise in writing, Company shall terminate such physician's designation as Medical Director upon five (5) business day's prior notice to Consultant and Consultant, within that same five (5) business day period, shall designate a new Medical Director who meets the requirements set forth in this Agreement.

3.01.7 In the event that a Medical Director sells or otherwise disposes of his ownership in, resigns from or leaves the employ of Consultant, Consultant shall promptly notify Company of the effective date of such circumstance and shall, within five (5) business days of such notice (and, in any event, no later than one (1) day prior to the effective date of such circumstance), designate a new Medical Director who meets the requirements set forth in this Agreement.

3.01.8 If Consultant is unable to designate an alternative nephrologist to serve as the Medical Director of a Facility, a Home Program and/or an Inpatient Services Program pursuant to the provisions of Sections 3.01.5, 3.01.6 and 3.01.7, as applicable, Company shall have the right to terminate this Agreement.

3.01.9 With Company's prior written approval, Consultant may designate a temporary Medical Director ("Temporary Medical Director") for a Facility, a Home Program or an Inpatient Services Program who shall serve in the role for such period of time as agreed upon by Company in its prior written approval. A Temporary Medical Director shall be considered a Medical Director and a Member Physician for all purposes under this Agreement, except as otherwise explicitly set forth herein. Each Temporary Medical Director shall at all times meet the requirements set forth in Section 3.01.4, above, when providing services hereunder and shall have executed this Agreement as a Member Physician or shall have executed a Joinder Agreement. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the foregoing sentence, for a period of up to thirty (30) days, Consultant may designate as Temporary Medical Director a nephrologist who was not previously a Member Physician (prior to designation as Temporary Medical Director) and who has not specifically agreed to be bound by the provisions of Section 6; provided, however, that such nephrologist will no longer be able to continue to provide services hereunder or receive compensation for such services after such thirty (30) day period if he or she has not executed a Joinder Agreement by such date. Consultant shall ensure that the services provided by a Temporary Medical Director are in accordance with all terms and conditions contained in this Agreement.

3.01.10 If a state or federal regulatory or licensing authority ("Authority") finds deficiencies at a Facility, a Home Program and/or an Inpatient Services Program related to or caused by a Medical Director's failure to satisfy the requirements of a Medical Director pursuant to the Conditions for Coverage or to any other applicable federal or state laws and/or regulations, and such Authority requires the appointment of a physician monitor to assist the Facility, the Home Program and/or the Inpatient Services Program in achieving compliance with applicable licensing rules and regulations and to supervise the implementation of a corrective action plan, Consultant agrees to pay for the cost of such monitor until the Authority has determined that all such deficiencies are cured.

3.02 Medical Director Services

During the term of this Agreement, Consultant shall ensure that Medical Directors providing services hereunder perform all the services described in Schedule B, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, and as otherwise set forth in this Agreement, which shall include, but not be limited to the following:

a. Medical Directors shall provide all services at the Facilities and the Home Programs required to be performed by a Medical Director pursuant to (i) the Conditions for Coverage, and (ii) any other applicable federal, state or local requirements, and, in coordination with Company, Medical Directors shall actively supervise the compliance of the Facilities and the Home Programs with the requirements of (i) the Conditions for Coverage, and (ii) any other applicable federal, state or local requirements.

b. Medical Directors shall make recommendations to ensure that the operations of the Inpatient Services Programs are in accordance with (i) the requirements for the hospital's accreditation by The Joint Commission, as such requirements are communicated to Company by the hospital, and (ii) any other applicable requirements of the hospital.

c. Medical Directors shall abide by all of the bylaws, policies, procedures, rules and regulations of Company, the Facilities, the Home Programs and the Inpatient Services Programs, as applicable.

d. Medical Directors shall coordinate the provision of medical director services with FMCNA's Medical Office and shall communicate regularly with FMCNA's Chief Medical Officer and/or the members of FMCNA's Medical Advisory Boards, as appropriate. The coordination of services and communication may include, but is not limited to, (i) participation in conference calls scheduled by FMCNA's Medical Advisory Board members in their region; and (ii) attendance at any medical director meetings or conferences held by FMCNA.

e. Medical Directors shall serve as the chairpersons of the Medical Staff of the Facilities and the Home Programs, as applicable, and, as chairperson, shall supervise the attending physicians and other members of the Medical Staff and, in coordination with Company, shall monitor on an on-going basis the compliance of the attending physicians and other members of the Medical Staff with (i) the requirements of the Conditions for Coverage governing the provision of care to dialysis patients; (ii) any other applicable federal, state or local requirements governing the provision of care to dialysis patients; and (iii) all of the bylaws, policies, procedures, rules and regulations of Company, the Facilities and the Home Programs, as applicable. Such supervision shall include, but not be limited to, ensuring that the attending physicians and other members of the Medical Staff (i) order items and/or services for patients only when documented with accurate and reasonably detailed medical justifications for such items and/or services; (ii) participate in a timely manner in patient care plan meetings at the Facilities and the Home Programs, as applicable; (iii) complete in a timely manner patients' medical records, including patient care plans, at the Facilities and the Home Programs, as applicable; (iv) provide to Company staff in a timely manner copies of (x) patients' hospital

medical records, including hospital discharge summaries, and/or other records documenting patients' co-morbid conditions, and (y) patients' medical records from attending physicians' office visits, for inclusion in patients' medical records at the Facilities and the Home Programs, as applicable; (v) comply with the Comorbid Review and Reconciliation Policy and Procedure; and (vi) limit the use of local laboratories for specimen testing. In instances of non-compliance by the attending physicians or other members of the Medical Staff with these requirements, Medical Directors shall, in coordination with Company, take appropriate corrective action where necessary consistent with the Medical Staff Bylaws.

f. Medical Directors of the Inpatient Services Programs shall, in coordination with Company, monitor on an on-going basis the compliance of physicians who order inpatient services with (i) the requirements of The Joint Commission governing the provision of care to inpatient dialysis and/or apheresis patients; (ii) any other applicable federal, state or local requirements governing the provision of care to inpatient dialysis and/or apheresis patients; and (iii) all of the bylaws, policies, procedures, rules and regulations of the Inpatient Services Programs and the applicable hospitals.

g. Medical Directors shall cooperate and work collaboratively with Company, Company staff and each attending physician at the Facilities and the Home Programs to achieve the goals of the Facilities' and the Home Programs' Quality Program, as such program is described in Schedule C, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, and as such program may be updated from time to time; provided that such updated program, including but not limited to periodic updates to the individual goals that comprise the UltraScore, the calculation of the UltraScore and its components and any other FMCNA quality metrics or guidelines on quality outcomes, are provided to Medical Directors in writing.

h. Medical Directors shall cooperate and work collaboratively with Company, Company staff and each attending physician at the Facilities and the Home Programs in pursuing Company's goal to control health care costs while continuing to provide quality care to its patients consistent with the requirements of the Facilities' and the Home Programs' third party payors, including those requirements under the Bundle. Such cooperation shall include, but not be limited to, ensuring that each attending physician at the Facilities and the Home Programs, consistent with the Medical Staff Bylaws, abides by the formularies approved by the FMCNA Medical Department, FMCNA's Pharmaceutical and Therapeutics Committee (the "P&T Committee"), FMCNA's Medical Advisory Boards and/or any other authorized FMCNA committee or, alternatively, utilizes the exceptions process set forth in such formularies. Additionally, Medical Directors shall, in cooperation with Company, monitor on an on-going basis each attending physician's compliance with such formularies, or the exceptions processes set forth therein, and, with Company, take appropriate corrective action where necessary consistent with the Medical Staff Bylaws.

i. Such cooperation shall further include, but not be limited to, ensuring that each attending physician at the Facilities and the Home Programs, using his or her professional judgment, implements the algorithms developed and approved by the FMCNA Medical Department, FMCNA's P&T Committee, FMCNA's Medical Advisory Boards and/or any other authorized FMCNA committee (the "FMCNA Algorithms"), whenever he or she determines it to

be appropriate for the treatment of his or her patients. FMCNA Algorithms are a set of defined steps or processes that, once adopted by the attending physician, comprise that physician's order for an item or service. FMCNA Algorithms may include, but are not limited to, documents and processes referred to as guidelines, clinical pathways, standing orders, protocols and algorithms. Medical Directors shall, in cooperation with Company, ensure that if an attending physician chooses not to implement FMCNA Algorithms for a particular patient, such attending physician, consistent with the Medical Staff Bylaws, clearly and thoroughly documents in such patient's record the clinical justification for such decision. Medical Directors shall, in cooperation with Company, ensure that if an attending physician chooses not to implement such algorithms for the majority of his or her patients, such attending physician, consistent with the Medical Staff Bylaws, provides a written explanation to FMCNA's P&T Committee for such decision and cooperates with FMCNA's P&T Committee in the continuous improvement of the FMCNA Algorithms. Additionally, Medical Directors shall, in cooperation with Company, monitor on an on-going basis each attending physician's compliance with these requirements and, with Company, take appropriate corrective action where necessary consistent with the Medical Staff Bylaws.

j. Such cooperation shall further include, but not be limited to, ensuring that each attending physician at the Facilities and the Home Programs orders items and services required by the third party payor to be provided, directly or under arrangements, by the Facility or the Home Program (such as laboratory tests for ESRD-related conditions or medications included in the Facility's or the Home Program's Bundle payment) only through the Facility or the Home Program (e.g., using FMCNA or its subsidiaries or an entity contracted with FMCNA or its subsidiaries) in conformance with Company's policies and procedures. Additionally, Medical Directors shall, in cooperation with Company, monitor on an on-going basis each attending physician's compliance with such policies and procedures, or the exceptions processes set forth therein, and, with Company, take appropriate corrective action where necessary consistent with the Medical Staff Bylaws.

k. Medical Directors shall cooperate and work collaboratively with Company and Company staff in overseeing the receipt and storage of oral, non-narcotic medications for patients of the Facilities and the Home Programs from the applicable pharmacy and the delivery of such oral medications to such patients for self-administration outside the Facilities and the Home Programs. Such cooperation shall include, but not be limited to, reviewing and approving policies and procedures relating to the receipt, storage and delivery of such oral medications; reviewing on a periodic basis the Facilities' and the Home Programs' records and/or logs related to the receipt, storage and delivery of such oral medications; and taking such other actions, as members of the Governing Bodies of the Facilities and the Home Programs, to ensure the safety and security of the delivery of such oral medications to patients at the Facilities and the Home Programs. The parties agree that nothing in this Section 3.02.k shall require Medical Directors to be involved in issues related to reimbursement for such oral medications, including but not limited to, patients' payment of co-pays or deductibles for such oral medications.

l. Medical Directors shall use best efforts to assist Company and shall actively participate in the development, implementation and monitoring of all plans of correction (or the equivalent) developed in response to any one or more deficiencies, citations, or other instances of

non-compliance identified through any survey, inspection or review conducted by a local, state or federal governmental agency or accreditation body including, but not limited to, Medicare, Medicaid or state licensing agencies. Additionally, Medical Directors shall respond promptly to communications and requests for information from the FMCNA Medical Office regarding federal and/or state survey deficiencies.

m. Medical Directors shall devote best efforts, skill and sufficient time to carry out the requirements of this Agreement, including but not limited to being available all hours of operation of the Facilities, the Home Programs and the Inpatient Services Programs for visits to and consultation regarding the Facilities, the Home Programs and the Inpatient Services Programs, as applicable, and by being on-call and working such additional time at or away from the Facilities, the Home Programs or the Inpatient Services Programs, as applicable, as is necessary to fulfill Medical Directors' responsibilities under this Agreement.

n. It is understood and agreed, however, that Consultant is an independent contractor and that Medical Directors are not employees of Company and that Medical Directors shall not be required to devote the entire working day to duties hereunder (with the exception of on-call responsibilities), but will continue the practice of medicine independently of Company which practice is a wholly separate professional activity of Consultant and Medical Directors.

o. Consultant shall ensure that Medical Directors complete activity reports using the form attached hereto in Schedule D-1, and incorporated herein by reference, to document the provision of services hereunder at the Facilities and the Home Programs. Consultant shall ensure that Medical Directors submit such activity reports on a quarterly basis to Company. Additionally, Consultant shall ensure that Medical Directors complete activity reports using the form attached hereto in Schedule D-2, and incorporated herein by reference, to document the provision of services hereunder at the Inpatient Services Programs and, if applicable, the provision of other agreed-upon services. Consultant shall ensure that Medical Directors submit such activity reports on a quarterly basis to Company. Consultant shall ensure that Medical Directors represent and warrant that the information provided on the activity reports is truthful, accurate and complete to the best of their knowledge.

The term "ensure" as used in this Section 3 and in Schedule B of this Agreement and the requirement that a Medical Director perform the duties hereunder shall be construed to mean that the Medical Director shall perform the specified tasks directly himself or herself or, to the extent such tasks are delegable, that he or she may delegate such tasks to the appropriate qualified individuals of the Facility/Home Program(s), but that the ultimate responsibility for the performance of the tasks and all follow up remains with the Medical Director. If the Consultant reasonably believes that a Medical Director cannot fulfill his or her obligations under this Agreement because a Company employee is not performing a task properly delegated by the Medical Director to the Company employee in accordance with this Agreement, then Consultant shall have the right and obligation to bring the matter, in writing, to the attention of the Area Manager, Director of Operations or Regional Vice President and, if Consultant is not reasonably satisfied with resolution of the same, he or she shall further have the right and obligation to raise such concern in writing with the Governing Body, Group Vice President, Division President or Chief Medical Officer. By bringing the matter to the attention of any of the the persons specified

above and in the tiered approach outlined above, then Company shall recognize that Consultant and applicable Medical Director(s), while remaining responsible under the Conditions for Coverage for the performance of all services at the Facilities and the Home Programs that are required to be performed by a Medical Director, shall have fulfilled his or her contractual responsibilities under this Agreement with respect to that matter and that Consultant shall not be in breach of the Agreement; provided, however, that Consultant and the Medical Director continue to actively cooperate with the Company through to the equitable resolution of the issue.

3.03 Additional Obligations of Consultant

3.03.1 Neither Consultant, nor any Medical Director nor any Member Physician shall participate in, directly or indirectly, or permit others to conduct, any clinical research study ("Study") at a Facility, a Home Program or an Inpatient Services Program without first obtaining the prior express written approval of Company. If Company approves such Study, which approval shall be at Company's sole and absolute discretion, Consultant, Medical Directors and/or Member Physicians shall conduct such approved Study in accordance with all applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations, the Study protocol (which shall also be subject to Company's prior review and approval), applicable Company policies, and Good Clinical Practice (in accordance with the Guidance for Industry E6 Good Clinical Practice: Consolidated Guidance by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Food and Drug Administration, April 1996 (ICH), as it may be amended or revised from time to time). Consultant, Medical Directors and Member Physicians acknowledge and agree that they shall comply with all Company policies and procedures in seeking Company approval of the Study and, if approval is granted, in conducting such Study. Consultant, Medical Directors and Member Physicians further acknowledge and agree that any Study conducted with respect to an Inpatient Services Program must also be approved by the applicable hospital and conducted consistent with such hospital's policies.

3.03.2 Consultant and Medical Directors shall cooperate and, in a timely manner, provide any and all information and make such disclosures with respect to the Facilities, the Home Programs and/or the Inpatient Services Programs and the services provided by Consultant and Medical Directors pursuant to this Agreement as Company may request: (a) in connection with administration of the Facilities, the Home Programs, and the Inpatient Services Programs, as applicable, and/or (b) in connection with implementation of this Agreement, and/or (c) for Company's use in submissions or disclosures to governmental agencies, specifically including but not limited to the completion of all necessary information to allow Company's submission of cost reports to CMS. Consultant and Medical Directors represent and warrant that all such information and/or disclosures shall be truthful and accurate to the best of their knowledge. In the event that Consultant or any Medical Director fails to provide in a timely manner all information and disclosures required under this Section 3.03.2, including but not limited to, completion of all necessary information to allow Company's submission of cost reports to CMS, Consultant hereby acknowledges and agrees that Company may retain the Fee due Consultant for services rendered hereunder until such time as Consultant and Medical Directors provide the necessary information or disclosures as required herein. Once Consultant and Medical Directors have provided such information or disclosures, Company shall pay Consultant the Fee under this Agreement retained pursuant to this paragraph, such payment to be made the month following

the month in which such information or disclosures were provided in conjunction with payment of Consultant's regular monthly installment of the Fee.

3.03.3 Consultant shall provide Company with an e-mail address, phone number and other relevant information for being able to contact each nephrologist designated as Medical Director of the Facilities, the Home Programs and the Inpatient Services Programs and shall ensure that each such nephrologist checks such e-mail on a regular and reasonably frequent basis. Consultant may provide this information to the applicable Regional Vice President. Such e-mail addresses and other contact information shall be updated by Consultant as necessary to ensure Company has a valid e-mail address at all times for each Medical Director.

3.04 Consultant's Representation Regarding Referral Source Relationships

Consultant hereby represents and warrants to Company that Schedule E hereto sets forth a complete and accurate list of the full names and, as applicable, the National Provider Identifiers ("NPI"), of all of (i) Consultant's physician owners, partners, members, shareholders or the equivalent, and the immediate family members thereof (i.e., husband or wife; birth or adoptive parent, child, or sibling; stepparent, stepchild, stepbrother, or stepsister; father-in-law, mother-in-law, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, brother-in-law, or sister-in-law; grandparent or grandchild; and spouse of a grandparent or grandchild) who are a source of patient referrals to Company or FMCNA, a purchaser of items or services from FMCNA that are reimbursable by a federal or state healthcare program, or a seller or lessor to Company or FMCNA of items, including real property, or services for which Company or FMCNA makes claims for reimbursement under any federal or state healthcare program; and (ii) physicians assigned by Consultant to provide Medical Director services pursuant to this Agreement, and the immediate family members thereof who are a source of patient referrals to Company or FMCNA, a purchaser of items or services from FMCNA that are reimbursable by a federal or state healthcare program, or a seller or lessor to Company or FMCNA of items, including real property, or services for which Company or FMCNA makes claims for reimbursement under any federal or state healthcare program. Consultant agrees to notify Company, in writing, of additions or deletions from Schedule E within thirty (30) days of such addition or deletion thereto.

4. OBLIGATIONS OF COMPANY

4.01 Except as specifically delegated by this Agreement to Consultant, Company shall retain all management and administrative prerogatives and responsibilities as owner of the Facilities, the Home Programs and the Inpatient Services Programs, as applicable. Without limiting the foregoing, Company agrees as follows:

4.01.1 For the time period that the Facilities and the Home Programs are in operation, to operate the Facilities and the Home Programs in compliance with the Conditions for Coverage and, to the extent applicable, with state laws regulating licensed medical facilities. Additionally, for the time period that the Inpatient Services Programs are in operation, to operate such Inpatient Services Programs in compliance with applicable laws.

4.01.2 To provide all necessary equipment, personnel, supplies and services (other than medical services) required for the operation of the Facilities, the Home Programs and the Inpatient Services Programs, as applicable, including a business manager or administrator.

4.01.3 To establish, modify and implement, policies and procedures concerning the administration of the Facilities, the Home Programs and the Inpatient Services Programs, as applicable, including purchasing, personnel staffing, inventory control, equipment maintenance, accounting, legal, data processing, medical record keeping, laboratory, billing, collection, public relations, insurance, cash management, scheduling and hours of operation.

4.01.4 To provide Consultant, Medical Directors and Member Physicians with the use of one office at each Facility provided solely for the purpose of assisting in the performance of the services described herein. Consultant, Medical Directors and Member Physicians agree they shall not use such office space for any other purpose including use by Consultant, Medical Directors, and Member Physicians for their private medical practice. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Consultant, a Medical Director or a Member Physician may enter into a sublease with Company, at Company's sole discretion, to use such space for purposes related to Consultant's, a Medical Director's or a Member Physician's private medical practice or for other lawful purposes; provided that such sublease is at fair market value, in compliance with applicable law and Company policies.

4.01.5 To provide Consultant, Medical Directors and Member Physicians with professional liability insurance or self-insurance purchased or maintained by Company in an amount not less than \$1 million combined single limit per occurrence for bodily injury and property damage and \$3 million in the aggregate, covering bodily injury and property damage claims (including the cost of defense) arising out of errors and omissions caused or alleged to be caused by Consultant, Medical Directors or Member Physicians within the scope of this Agreement, but not for errors or omissions caused or alleged to be caused by Consultant, Medical Directors or Member Physicians providing services as a treating physician. The insurance or self-insurance required to be maintained by Company hereunder shall be subject to and limited by the terms and conditions of insurance policies, primary, excess or otherwise, maintained by Company.

4.02 All of the foregoing responsibilities of Company shall be fulfilled with a view towards adopting policies and procedures designed to provide high quality, cost-efficient care to the patients at the Facilities, the Home Programs and the Inpatient Services Programs. Company may consult with Consultant when fulfilling such responsibilities.

5. COMPENSATION

The amount of compensation due Consultant during the term of this Agreement shall be determined as follows:

5.01 Medical Director Fee

5.01.1 For services hereunder during the term of the Agreement, Company shall pay Consultant, and Consultant shall accept as full and sufficient compensation therefor, an annual Medical Director Fee ("Fee") of Three Hundred Fifty Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$350,000.00), prorated for partial years. Company shall pay the Fee in equal monthly installments, in arrears, on or before the last day of each month during the term of this Agreement. The Fee payable hereunder shall increase by two percent (2%) on each Anniversary of the Commencement Date. Consultant represents and warrants to Company that it does not and shall not compensate Medical Directors, Member Physicians based on the volume or value of referrals to the Facilities, the Home Programs and/or the Inpatient Services Programs.

5.01.2 If this Agreement applies to more than one Facility and is terminated with respect to one or more Facilities (each a "Terminated Facility" and, collectively, the "Terminated Facilities") or termination of a Home Program or an Inpatient Services Program but remains in full force and effect with respect to the remaining Facilities or Home Programs or Inpatient Services Programs, then the parties shall promptly and in good faith negotiate a new, adjusted Fee ("Adjusted Fee"), to be effective as of the date of termination of this Agreement with respect to the Terminated Facilities ("Facility Termination Date") or the termination date of the Home Program or the Inpatient Services Program. The Adjusted Fee is to reflect fair market value for the services rendered hereunder with respect to the remaining Facilities Home Programs/Inpatient Services Programs in light of the expected decrease in work load due to removal of the Terminated Facilities Home Programs/Inpatient Services Programs from the Agreement and/or an increase in workload, if any, at the remaining Facilities Home Programs/Inpatient Services Programs. The Adjusted Fee shall be considered the Fee for purposes of this Agreement as of the Facility Termination Date and thereafter or the termination date of the Home Program or the Inpatient Services Program.

5.01.3 If the parties are unable to reach agreement as to the Adjusted Fee as described in Section 5.01.2 above on or before (a) the Facility Termination Date or the termination date of the Home Program or the Inpatient Services Program or (b) sixty (60) days after commencement of negotiations between the parties regarding the Adjusted Fee, whichever is later, then Company may either: (i) terminate this Agreement upon written notice to Consultant, which notice shall specify the effective date of termination of this Agreement or (ii) unilaterally reset the Adjusted Fee in Company's sole reasonable judgment consistent with fair market value.

5.01.4 The parties acknowledge and agree that the Fee payable hereunder shall be in consideration for all services to be provided hereunder and all covenants herein including, but not limited to, the restrictive covenants set forth in Section 6.

5.01.5 Consultant agrees that Company may set-off from the Fee payable hereunder any overdue amounts owed to Company by Consultant, Medical Directors or Member Physicians under any sublease or other agreement, arrangement or understanding ("Subleasing Arrangement"), related to the use by Consultant, Medical Directors or Member Physicians of any space at a Facility or the supplies, equipment and/or time/services of any personnel of the Facilities, the Home Programs or the Inpatient Services Programs, or any other item or service furnished by the Facilities, the Home Programs or the Inpatient Services Programs (collectively, "Facility Resources") for Consultant's, a Medical Director's or a Member Physician's private

medical practice or any other purpose not expressly set forth herein. If no Subleasing Arrangement exists, then Consultant agrees that Company may set-off from the Fee payable hereunder the fair market value of Facility Resources used by Consultant, a Medical Director or a Member Physician for its/his/her medical practice or any other purpose not expressly set forth herein. Company shall only set-off the aforesaid amounts if: (a) Consultant receives at least fifteen (15) days prior written notice of the amount due and the basis thereof, and (b) Company has not received payment of such amount due during the above specified fifteen (15) day period.

5.02 Tax Treatment

The parties agree that the payments under this Agreement are payments for services rendered to Company by Consultant. Consultant is an independent contractor and will be responsible for the payment of all local, state and federal income, self-employment and so-called payroll taxes on the fees paid to Consultant by Company.

5.03 Method of Payment

Consultant agrees that it shall not be entitled to payment hereunder until such time as it completes and submits to Company the W-9 form attached hereto as Schedule F and incorporated herein by reference. Upon receipt of the W-9 form, and in accordance with the terms set forth in this Section 5, Company shall pay the Fee by wire transfer pursuant to the instructions of Schedule G, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

6. COVENANTS PROTECTING BUSINESS INTERESTS OF COMPANY

6.01 Definitions

6.01.1 Affiliate -- shall mean FMCNA or a person or entity that directly or indirectly through one or more intermediaries, controls or is controlled by, or is under common control with, Company or FMCNA.

6.01.2 Business -- shall mean the provision of, and/or the purchase, sale, establishment, development, management or operation of any facility, program, entity or business which engages in the provision of, any of the following:

- a. outpatient dialysis treatments or services utilized in connection with any outpatient dialysis treatments (including, but not limited to, in-center, home, nocturnal, staff assisted, and self-care dialysis treatments, training and support and related services);
- b. in-hospital dialysis treatments and services utilized in connection with any dialysis treatments provided in a hospital;
- c. renal-related equipment and supplies;
- d. renal-related laboratory services;

e. renal-related pharmacy services, including without limitation the provision of erythropoiesis stimulating agents, iron derivatives, Vitamin D analogues and other pharmaceuticals routinely provided by Company to ESRD patients;

f. apheresis services;

g. vascular access and peritoneal catheter related services;

h. any other items, services or treatments for persons diagnosed as having end stage renal disease or chronic kidney disease and/or chronic renal insufficiency (e.g., pre-ESRD patients) or for persons receiving dialysis services in a hospital or receiving services through any renal disease management programs; or

i. any other items, services or treatments developed or provided by Company or its Affiliates.

6.01.3 Confidential Information – shall mean (i) this Agreement and its terms and conditions, and (ii) any information and/or trade secret of Company or its Affiliates related to the Business, or of any entity with which Company or its Affiliates contracts to provide or receive items or services related to the Business, including, but not limited to, any formula, pattern, compilation, program, product, device, method, system, technique, process, financial information, business strategy, or costing data, patient list, payor list, manual, policy or procedure, form, contractual arrangement, idea, creation, development, improvement or design; provided, however, that Confidential Information shall not include: (a) any information which is known to the public (i.e., persons with no past or present affiliation to Company) or (b) any information disclosed to Consultant or Member Physicians by a third party who is not bound by any confidentiality obligations with respect to such information. Examples of such Confidential Information include, but are not limited to: patient statistical profiles generated by Company or its Affiliates; pricing techniques, programs and strategies; staffing patterns; planning and construction techniques for start-up dialysis centers; manuals, policies, and procedures developed for use by patients and/or staff of a Facility, a Home Program and/or an Inpatient Services Program; and inventory control systems including the reordering of supplies and analysis of their use.

6.01.4 Financial Benefit – shall, subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement, include, but not be limited to, medical directorship fees, referral fees, consulting fees, dividends, lease payments, management fees or any other remuneration from any dialysis facility, home dialysis program or inpatient dialysis program or entity or operation engaged in the Business.

6.01.5 Member Physician – each physician who, as of the date of this Agreement or at any time during the Restricted Period,

a. is employed by or affiliated with Consultant, or

b. is a partner or shareholder of Consultant or holds a similar position, or

c. provides services on behalf of Consultant, including but not limited to, any physician designated "Medical Director" pursuant to Section 3.01.

6.01.6 Restricted Period – shall mean the term of this Agreement (which shall include any extension of such term through course of conduct or otherwise). The parties agree that in the event of a violation by Consultant or a Member Physician of the covenants contained in this Section 6, the Restricted Period shall be extended automatically for an additional period equal to the period from the date on which such violation commenced (a) until the date on which Consultant or Member Physician ceases such violation; or (b) through and including the date of the final determination of a court that Consultant or Member Physician did violate such restrictions. Such extension of the term of the Restricted Period shall be in addition to, and not in lieu of, any other remedies available to Company.

6.01.7 Restricted Territory – shall mean the geographic area as depicted on the maps attached hereto as Schedule H.

6.02 Permitted Activities

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this Section 6, the parties acknowledge and agree that this Section 6: (a) shall not limit Consultant, Medical Directors or Member Physicians from engaging in the practice of medicine and charging fees for administering such professional medical services to patients, (b) shall not require Consultant, Medical Directors or Member Physicians to admit individuals to, or refer any other business to, any Facility, Home Program, Inpatient Services Program, Company or its Affiliates, (c) shall not require Consultant, Medical Directors or Member Physicians to prescribe, utilize or purchase any items or services from any Facility, Home Program, Inpatient Services Program, Company or its Affiliates, and (d) shall not restrict Consultant, Medical Directors or Member Physicians from admitting individuals to any other dialysis facility, home dialysis program, hospital or entity.

6.03 Covenant Not to Compete

6.03.1 Subject to 6.02 above, in consideration of the compensation payable hereunder and in recognition of Company's proprietary interest in its Business, Consultant and Member Physicians covenant and agree that they shall not, during the Restricted Period, directly or indirectly, alone or in association with any firm, person, or entity:

- a. engage as a principal, agent, independent contractor, consultant, manager, partner, joint venturer, proprietor, landlord, shareholder, director, officer or employee of; or
- b. participate in the ownership, management, medical directorship, operation or control of; or
- c. act as a consultant or advisor to; or
- d. hold any direct or indirect ownership or other interest in; or

- e. render services other than as a treating physician for; or
- f. otherwise assist or obtain any Financial Benefit from

any operation, person, firm, entity or enterprise, other than with Company or any of its Affiliates, that engages or proposes to engage, in the Business anywhere in the Restricted Territory. For the avoidance of doubt, nothing in this Agreement between the parties and/or their Affiliates, nor in the medical director agreement between Company and Consultant dated October 12, 2012 pursuant to which Consultant provides medical director services to Company's dialysis facility located at Olympia, Washington 98516, shall be deemed to prohibit the participation in the foregoing manners by Consultant and Member Physicians in the dialysis facility located at 335 Cooper Point Road, Olympia WA 98502.

6.03.2 Consultant and Member Physicians hereby represent, covenant and agree that they do not, and following the Commencement Date of this Agreement shall not, employ, contract, retain, engage, partner or joint venture with any person or entity which receives a Financial Benefit from any person or entity which engages in the Business anywhere in the Restricted Territory, and that no such person or entity holds, or during the Restricted Period shall hold, a direct or indirect ownership interest in Consultant.

6.04 Covenant Not to Disclose Confidential Information

Consultant and Member Physicians acknowledge that in the course of performing the duties contemplated by this Agreement, Consultant and Member Physicians will become privy to and/or have access to current and future Confidential Information of Company and its Affiliates. Throughout the term of this Agreement and at any time thereafter, Consultant and each Member Physician shall not, nor shall their respective employees and agents, use or disclose to any person, firm, corporation or entity any Confidential Information of Company or its Affiliates without the prior written consent of Company, except as may be required by law, lawful subpoena, court order or legal process. If Consultant or Member Physicians are so required to disclose any Confidential Information of Company or its Affiliates, Consultant and/or Member Physicians, as applicable, shall provide sufficient notice thereof to Company to enable Company to seek a protective order or other appropriate legal or equitable remedy to prevent such disclosure.

6.05 Improvements to Company's Services and Products

Consultant and Member Physicians represent, covenant and agree that they hereby assign to Company or its designated Affiliate all rights, title and interest to any improvements or inventions related to Company's procedures, documents, products or services that it/he/she authors, discovers, designs, or perfects in the course of their work under this Agreement and hereby agree to execute such other documentation as Company or its designated Affiliate may reasonably require to confirm such assignment.

6.06 Covenant Not to Solicit Employees

Consultant and Member Physicians agree that Company and its Affiliates have invested and will continue to invest substantial time and effort in assembling and training its personnel. In addition, as a result of employment by Company and its Affiliates, Company's personnel gain knowledge of the Business (e.g., business affairs, marketing, patients and methods of operation) of Company and its Affiliates which Consultant and Member Physicians agree represents Confidential Information of Company and its Affiliates. Accordingly, throughout the Restricted Period, Consultant and Member Physicians agree not to induce or solicit, directly or indirectly, by or for themselves, as agent of another, or through others as their agent, any individual who is at such time an employee or consultant of Company or its Affiliates to leave employment or any contractual relationship with Company or its Affiliates, as applicable.

6.07 Joinder Requirement for New Member Physicians

Except as explicitly set forth with respect to a Temporary Medical Director as described in Section 3.01.9, Consultant agrees that it shall cause each Member Physician upon the execution of this Agreement or on the date that such physician becomes employed or affiliated with Consultant, whichever is later, to promptly execute this Agreement as a Member Physician or to promptly execute a Joinder Agreement. Notwithstanding the foregoing restriction, Consultant shall not be precluded from engaging the services of a locum tenens physician or other similar physician on a periodic and infrequent basis so long as such physician does not provide services for or on behalf of Consultant under this Agreement. The parties hereby acknowledge Company does not in any way encourage or support Consultant placing limitations or restrictions (in employment agreements or otherwise) on where Consultant's employed or affiliated physicians may refer patients or other business.

6.08 Former Member Physicians

Any Member Physician who ceases to be a Member Physician as defined hereunder (e.g., by leaving the employ of, or no longer being affiliated with, Consultant) during the Restricted Period shall be deemed a "Former Member Physician." Each Member Physician agrees that, in the event that he or she becomes a Former Member Physician, the provisions of Section 6 shall still apply to such physician as if he or she was still a Member Physician. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the parties agree that, in the event that a Member Physician becomes a Former Member Physician, Sections 6.03 and 6.06 of the Agreement shall only apply to such physician until the earlier of (a) expiration of the Restricted Period under the Agreement, or (b) two (2) years after the date on which such physician becomes a Former Member Physician. Company and each Member Physician agree that if such physician violates the covenants contained in this Section 6 while he or she is a Former Member Physician, the Restricted Period shall be extended automatically for an additional period equal to the period from the date on which such violation commenced (a) until the date on which the Former Member Physician ceases such violation, or (b) through and including the date of the final determination of a court that Former Member Physician did violate such restrictions. Such extension of the term of the Restricted Period shall be in addition to, and not in lieu of, any other remedies available to Company.

6.09 Remedies; Survival

6.09.1 Consultant and Member Physicians have carefully considered the nature and extent of the restrictions placed upon them and the rights and remedies conferred upon Company and its Affiliates under this Agreement, and Consultant and Member Physicians hereby acknowledge and agree that such restrictions, rights and remedies are reasonable with respect to time, scope and territory, are designed to eliminate competition which otherwise would be unfair to Company and its Affiliates, would not prevent Consultant or Member Physicians from practicing medicine or nephrology in the community where they currently practice, are fully required to protect the legitimate interests of Company, and do not confer a benefit upon Company and its Affiliates disproportionate to the detriment to Consultant or Member Physicians.

6.09.2 Consultant and Member Physicians acknowledge and agree that the restrictive covenants as described in this Section 6 (collectively, "Restrictive Covenants") are reasonable and necessary for the protection of the business interests of Company and its Affiliates, that irreparable injury will result to Company and its Affiliates if Consultant or Member Physicians breach any of the terms of said Restrictive Covenants, and that in the event of Consultant's or Member Physicians' actual or threatened breach of any such Restrictive Covenant, Company and its Affiliates will have no adequate remedy at law. Consultant and Member Physicians accordingly agree that in the event of any actual or threatened breach by them of any of the Restrictive Covenants, Company and its Affiliates, as appropriate, shall be entitled to injunctive and other equitable relief, without bond and without the necessity of showing actual monetary damages, including without limitation, immediate temporary injunctive relief. Nothing contained herein shall be construed as prohibiting Company and its Affiliates from pursuing other remedies available to it for such breach or threatened breach, including, but not limited to, the recovery of any damages which it is able to prove.

6.09.3 In the event a court of competent jurisdiction determines that any portion of the foregoing Restrictive Covenants are unreasonable, then restrictions contained in the Restrictive Covenants shall be reduced and any other modifications shall be made by the court to the extent necessary for this Section 6 to be enforced by the court.

6.09.4 The provisions of this Section 6 shall survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement.

7. TERMINATION

7.01 The Agreement shall terminate: (1) at the expiration of the period provided in Section 2; (2) upon Company's becoming insolvent, upon a petition in bankruptcy being filed designating Company as bankrupt or upon Company's being adjudged a bankrupt; or (3) upon mutual agreement between Consultant and Company.

7.02 Company, at its option, may terminate this Agreement for any of the reasons set forth below (an "Event of Default"), such termination to be effective upon written notice to Consultant or such later date as Company may specify in such notice:

7.02.1 A material breach of this Agreement by Consultant or any Member Physician which shall not be cured by Consultant within thirty (30) days of receipt of notice from Company describing such breach.

7.02.2 Indictment for any felony or any violation of a federal or state health care law by Consultant, any Medical Director or any Member Physician.

7.02.3 Exclusion or suspension of Consultant, any Medical Director or any Member Physician from participating in federal health care programs, including but not limited to Medicare or Medicaid.

7.02.4 If Consultant fails to immediately remove a Medical Director providing services hereunder in the event:

- a. the Medical Director fails to meet any of the requirements in Section 3; or
- b. of misconduct of either a personal or professional nature of the Medical Director which, in Company's reasonable opinion: (a) interferes with the Medical Director's ability to fulfill the obligations hereunder; (b) interferes with the normal conduct of the operations of a Facility, a Home Program and/or an Inpatient Services Program, as applicable, in accordance with the policies and procedures of such Facility, Home Program or Inpatient Services Program; or (c) endangers patient care; or
- c. a material physical disability of a permanent nature of Medical Director occurs and renders the Medical Director, in the reasonable opinion of Company, unable to satisfactorily perform duties as contemplated herein. Consultant shall notify Company at the onset of any material physical disability of the Medical Director; or
- d. Consultant fails to cause Medical Director to cease performing duties required under this Agreement upon ten (10) days' written notice by Company to Consultant that Company is not satisfied with Medical Director's performance.

7.02.5 In the event that a nephrologist ceases to serve as Medical Director of a Facility, a Home Program or an Inpatient Services Program, as applicable, on whatever basis, and Consultant fails within a reasonable time (as determined in Company's sole discretion) to find a nephrologist reasonably satisfactory to Company to serve as the new Medical Director for such Facility, Home Program or Inpatient Services Program. Payment of the Fee (prorated for partial months) shall be discontinued as of the date the Medical Director last provided services.

7.03 Upon the occurrence of an Event of Default, Company shall be entitled to pursue such legal or equitable remedies as may be available to it to collect, inter alia, its actual and consequential damages suffered as a result thereof.

7.04 Company may terminate this Agreement upon thirty (30) days prior written notice to Consultant in the event it decides to sell a Facility, Home Program and/or an Inpatient Services Program. If this Agreement applies to more than one Facility or Home Program, then

termination under this Section 7.04 shall operate only to terminate this Agreement with respect to the Facility, Home Program and/or Inpatient Services Program that is sold and the Agreement shall continue in full force and effect with respect to the remaining Facilities, Home Programs and/or Inpatient Services Programs. In such an instance, the Fee shall be adjusted as described in the pertinent provisions of Section 5.01.

7.05 Closure of a Facility

7.05.1 Company may terminate this Agreement upon thirty (30) days prior written notice to Consultant in the event that Company in its sole discretion decides it will close a Facility. The parties acknowledge and agree that Company shall use its independent business judgment when determining whether to close a Facility. Such independent judgment may be based upon various factors including, but not be limited to, the following operational considerations:

- a. Ability of the Facility to cover reasonable expenses and maintain a reasonable profit; or
- b. Concentration of other dialysis facilities in the area and prevalence of viable substitutes for in-center dialysis services in the area; or
- c. Total population of patients with ESRD in the geographic area and anticipated growth in the demographics of such population.

7.05.2 Notwithstanding any provision herein to the contrary, a decision by Company to terminate this Agreement pursuant to this Section 7.05 will not be determined in a manner that will take into account the volume or value of any referrals or other business generated between the parties.

7.05.3 If this Agreement applies to more than one Facility, then termination under this Section 7.05 shall operate only to terminate this Agreement with respect to the Facility that has closed, and the Agreement shall continue in full force and effect with respect to the remaining Facilities. In such an instance, the Fee shall be adjusted as described in the pertinent provisions of Section 5.01.

7.06 Closure of a Home Program and/or an Inpatient Services Program

7.06.1 Company may terminate this Agreement with respect to a Home Program and/or an Inpatient Services Program, as applicable, upon thirty (30) days prior written notice to Consultant in the event that Company in its sole discretion decides it will close a Home Program and/or an Inpatient Services Program, as applicable. The parties acknowledge and agree that Company shall use its independent business judgment when determining whether to close a Home Program and/or an Inpatient Services Program. Such independent judgment may be based upon various factors including, but not be limited to, the following operational considerations:

- a. Ability of the Home Program and/or the Inpatient Services Program, as applicable, to cover reasonable expenses and maintain a reasonable profit; or

b. Concentration of other home dialysis programs or inpatient dialysis services programs, as applicable, in the area; or

c. With respect to an Inpatient Services Program, Company's no longer holding the contract to provide inpatient services at a hospital or other medical facility; or

d. Total population of patients with ESRD in the geographic area and anticipated growth in the demographics of such population.

7.06.2 Notwithstanding any provision herein to the contrary, a decision by Company to terminate this Agreement with respect to a Home Program and/or an Inpatient Services Program pursuant to this Section 7.06 will not be determined in a manner that will take into account the volume or value of any referrals or other business generated between the parties.

7.06.3 If this Agreement applies to more than one Home Program or Inpatient Services Program, as applicable, then termination under this Section 7.06 shall operate only to terminate this Agreement with respect to the Home Program or Inpatient Services Program that has closed, and the Agreement shall continue in full force and effect with respect to the remaining Home Programs or Inpatient Services Programs. In such an instance, the Fee shall be adjusted as described in the pertinent provisions of Section 5.01.

7.07 Termination by Consultant

7.07.1 Consultant may terminate this Agreement: (1) in the event of a material breach of this Agreement by Company which is not cured by Company within thirty (30) days of receipt of notice from Consultant describing such breach, (2) upon conviction of a felony by Company, or (3) upon exclusion or suspension of Company from participating in federal health care programs, including but not limited to Medicare or Medicaid.

7.07.2 Company shall only compensate Consultant for services rendered through the date of termination.

8. EXCLUSIVE USE OF FACILITY RESOURCES

Consultant and Member Physicians acknowledge that the space at the Facilities and the Home Programs, and the supplies, equipment and time/services of the employees of the Facilities, the Home Programs and/or the Inpatient Services Programs shall be utilized by Consultant, Medical Directors and Member Physicians exclusively (a) for the provision of dialysis services to patients of such Facility, Home Program or Inpatient Services Program, as applicable, and (b) for the provision of services hereunder. No portion of any space at any Facility or Home Program, nor the supplies, the equipment or the time/services of any employee of a Facility, a Home Program or an Inpatient Services Program, shall at any time be utilized by Consultant, Medical Directors or Member Physicians for their private medical practice or for any other purpose not expressly set forth in this Agreement. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Consultant, Medical Directors or Member Physicians may enter into an agreement with

Company (at fair market value and in accordance with all applicable law) to use Company space, equipment or personnel for purposes related to Consultant's, Medical Directors' or Member Physicians' private medical practice or for other lawful purposes.

9. ASSIGNABILITY

Consultant and Member Physicians shall not assign or subcontract this Agreement or assign or subcontract any of their rights hereunder without Company's prior written consent, which may be withheld in Company's sole discretion. Company may assign this Agreement to any of Company's Affiliates without the consent of any of the other parties hereto. Company shall not assign this Agreement or assign any of its rights hereunder to any person or entity, other than an Affiliate, without Consultant's prior written consent, which shall not be unreasonably withheld. This Agreement shall be enforceable by or against any permitted assigns hereunder. Any attempted assignment of this Agreement in violation of the provisions of this section is void.

10. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Agreement contains the entire agreement of the parties with respect to its subject matter and as of the date this Agreement is fully executed, supersedes all previous and contemporaneous agreements and understandings, inducements or conditions, expressed or implied, oral or written, between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof.

11. WAIVER OF BREACH

The failure of the parties to insist on strict performance of the provisions of this Agreement shall not be construed as a waiver of such provision or of any other default of the same or similar nature. No waiver, modification or change of any of its provisions shall be valid unless in writing and signed by the parties against whom such claimed waiver, modification or change is sought to be enforced. One party's waiver of any default by the other party of any provision of this Agreement is not a waiver of any other default and shall not affect the right of that party to require performance of the defaulted provision at any future time.

12. SEVERABILITY; HEADINGS

If any term or provision of this Agreement or application to any person or circumstance shall to any extent be invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of this Agreement or the application of such term or provision to persons or circumstances other than those as to which it is held invalid or unenforceable shall not be affected and each term and provision of this Agreement shall be valid and enforceable to the fullest extent permitted by law. The headings of sections in this Agreement are for convenience only and shall not affect or limit the interpretation of its provisions.

13. LEGAL COMPLIANCE

13.01 This Agreement shall be construed in a manner consistent with any and all applicable federal and state laws, including, without limitation, Medicare, Medicaid, the Health

Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 and other Federal and State statutes and regulations and the principles and interpretations related thereto. The parties intend to comply with the provisions of 42 U.S.C. 1395nn(a)(1) and 42 U.S.C. 1320a-7b(b), as such provisions may be amended from time to time. The parties intend that this Agreement meet the requirements of (i) the Personal Services and Management contract Safe Harbor to the Medicare and Medicaid Anti-Kickback statute as set forth in 42 C.F.R. Part 1001.952(d); and (ii) the Personal Services Arrangement exception to the Physician Ownership and Referral legislation as set forth in 42 U.S.C. 1395nn(e)(3) and the corresponding regulations, if any.

13.02 The parties represent that as of the date this Agreement is executed the Fee negotiated and agreed upon is fair market value for services rendered based upon arm's length bargaining and is consistent with the value of similar services. Furthermore, the parties represent that the Fee is not and has not been determined in a manner that takes into account the volume or value of any referrals or business otherwise generated for or with respect to a Facility, a Home Program or an Inpatient Services Program or between the parties for which payment may be made in whole or in part under Medicare or any other federal health care program.

14. LIMITED RENEGOTIATION

14.01 Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this Agreement, (a) in the event that the performance of either party of any term, covenant, condition or provision of this Agreement should jeopardize the licensure or certification of either party or (b) if there is a future change in Medicare, Medicaid, or other Federal or State statutes or regulations or written governmental interpretations thereof ("New Law") which renders any of the material terms of this Agreement unlawful or unenforceable, then (i) the unaffected provisions of this Agreement shall continue in full force and effect and (ii) either party, upon written notice to the other party ("Renegotiation Notice"), shall have the right to immediately initiate good faith renegotiation of the affected terms of this Agreement in order to restore, if possible, the intent and purpose of the affected provisions in the Agreement and to modify the Agreement as necessary so that such Agreement does not jeopardize the licensure or certification of either party, is in compliance with such New Law and continues to be in compliance with other applicable laws and regulations.

14.02 If the parties are unable in good faith to come to a mutually satisfactory resolution regarding the affected terms of the Agreement and have failed to amend the Agreement (or enter into a new Agreement) within 90 days from date the Renegotiation Notice was received, then, unless the parties mutually agree otherwise in writing, the parties shall utilize binding arbitration in accordance with this Section to modify the Agreement as necessary so that such Agreement does not jeopardize the licensure or certification of either party, is in compliance with such New Law and continues to be in compliance with other applicable laws and regulations.

14.03 The above referenced arbitration shall be triggered by one party providing the other party written notice of the arbitration required under this Section. Upon the other party's receipt of such written notice, both parties shall promptly appoint an arbitrator of choice from a list of arbitrators recognized by the American Health Lawyers Association (AHLA) Alternative Dispute Resolution Services. In accordance with the rules of the AHLA Alternative Dispute Resolution Service then in effect, such appointed arbitrators will appoint a third arbitrator from

the list and they shall hear the parties and make the determination as to necessary modifications to the Agreement so that the Agreement does not jeopardize the licensure or certification of either party and is in compliance with such New Law and continues to be in compliance with other applicable laws and regulations. If AHLA or the AHLA Alternative Dispute Resolution Service is no longer in effect, then such arbitrators shall be chosen from a list provided by the American Arbitration Association in the same manner as set forth above and such arbitration shall be conducted in accordance with the Commercial Rules of the American Arbitration Association then in effect. The parties shall irrevocably grant the arbitrators the authority to determine the modifications necessary to the Agreement so that such Agreement does not jeopardize the licensure or certification of either party and is in compliance with such New Law and continues to be in compliance with other applicable laws and regulations. Arbitration shall be binding for settlement of the modifications necessary to the Agreement as stated in the foregoing sentence. The parties agree to immediately execute any amendment, addendum or new agreement as is necessary to memorialize such modifications to the Agreement. The parties shall share the costs of such arbitrators equally between them. Each party shall bear its own expenses of preparation for arbitration.

15. APPLICABLE LAW

This Agreement shall be governed by and construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Washington.

16. BOOKS AND RECORDS OF CONSULTANT

If required by regulations now or hereafter issued by CMS pursuant to Section 952 of the Omnibus Reconciliation Act of 1980 (Section 1861(v)(1)(I) of the Social Security Act), as amended, and the regulations promulgated thereunder, the books and records of Consultant necessary to certify the nature and extent of costs associated with Consultant's performance of services under this contract shall be maintained and preserved by Consultant for such period of time as provided by law so as to be available for and subject to inspection and review by appropriate agencies of the United States. In addition, if and to the extent that Consultant uses the services of a related organization to provide services hereunder, Consultant will require such related organization to maintain, preserve and make available its books and records to the same extent that Consultant is so required. In the event that this Agreement is not subject to the provisions of Section 952 or regulations promulgated hereunder, this section of the Agreement shall be null and void. The provisions of this Section shall survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement.

17. NOTICES

All notices pursuant to this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be deemed duly given and properly served: (a) delivered personally (with written confirmation of receipt), (b) when received by the addressee if sent by registered or certified mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested, or (c) received by the addressee if sent by a recognized express delivery service, in each case, to the parties at the addresses as set forth below or at such other addresses as may be furnished to the other parties in writing:

18. COMPLIANCE TRAINING AND CODE OF CONDUCT

18.01 Pursuant to Company's compliance program and this Agreement, each Medical Director providing services hereunder shall be required to devote at least (i) two (2) hours to initial compliance and privacy training (if not already completed prior to the execution of this Agreement), which initial training shall occur no later than thirty (30) days after the Effective Date of this Agreement and (ii) one (1) hour to supplemental compliance training during each year of the term of this Agreement. The initial and annual supplemental compliance training shall, as required by Company, include, but not be limited to, one or more of the following: a review of written compliance materials, a viewing of a compliance video recording and participation in a conference call to discuss compliance issues.

18.02 In the event any Medical Director providing services hereunder fails to complete the compliance training as required in this Section, Consultant hereby acknowledges and agrees that Company may retain the Fee due Consultant for services rendered hereunder until such time as every Medical Director providing services hereunder completes the required training. Once every Medical Director has completed the required training, Company shall pay Consultant the Fee due under this Agreement retained pursuant to this paragraph, such payment to be made the month following the month in which the last training was completed in conjunction with payment of Consultant's regular monthly installment of the Fee.

18.03 Consultant and each Member Physician acknowledge having received a copy of the Code of Conduct and understand that the Code of Conduct, and any revisions to it, is applicable to the position of Medical Director of the Facilities, the Home Programs and the Inpatient Services Programs and the provision of services hereunder. Consultant and each Member Physician hereby agree to complete promptly any reasonable certification regarding the Code of Conduct as reasonably requested by Company or FMCNA.

19. THIRD PARTY BENEFICIARY

Company's present and future parent corporations, including but not limited to National Medical Care, Inc. and Fresenius Medical Care Holdings, Inc., are intended third party beneficiaries of this Agreement and shall independently have the right to enforce each of the provisions of this Agreement, including, but not limited to, the restrictive covenants contained in Section 6.

20. INDEMNIFICATION

20.01 Company shall be free from all liability and claims for damages by reason of any injury to any persons, including without limitation, Member Physicians and their agents and employees, and any property of any kind whatsoever, and to whomsoever belonging, from any causes whatsoever arising out of or through the gross negligence or other misconduct of Consultant or Member Physicians, or their agents or employees. Consultant hereby covenants and agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless Company and its Affiliates from any and all liability, claims, damages, losses, costs, obligations and expenses (including but not limited to reasonable attorneys' fees) which it may incur as a result of either the negligence or willful misconduct of Consultant and/or Member Physicians, or the agents or employees of either, or the breach by Consultant or Member Physicians of the provisions of this Agreement. The provisions of this Section shall survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement.

20.02 Consultant shall be free from all liability and claims for damages by reason of any injury to any persons, including without limitation, Company and its Affiliates and employees, and any property of any kind whatsoever, and to whomsoever belonging, from any causes whatsoever arising out of or through the gross negligence or other misconduct of Company, or its Affiliates or employees. Company hereby covenants and agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless Consultant and Member Physicians from any and all liability, claims, damages, losses, costs, obligations and expenses (including but not limited to reasonable attorneys' fees) which it may incur as a result of either the negligence or willful misconduct of Company, or its Affiliates or employees, or the breach by Company of the provisions of this Agreement. The provisions of this Section shall survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement.

21. NO CONFLICTS

Consultant hereby represents and warrants to Company that (a) Consultant and Member Physicians are under no obligation or commitment, contractual or otherwise, that would prohibit or prevent them from entering into this Agreement, and (b) each is free to enter into and perform under this Agreement.

22. JOINT EFFORT

The preparation of this Agreement has been the joint effort of the parties, and the resulting document shall not be construed more severely against one of the parties than the other.

23. ATTACHMENTS; PRIORITY OF DOCUMENTS

All attachments (including but not limited to Schedules) to this Agreement are incorporated herein by reference and made a part of this Agreement. Notwithstanding the foregoing, to the extent that any provision of any attachment hereto conflicts or is contrary to this Agreement, then the provisions in this Agreement shall govern.

24. AUTHORIZED SIGNATURE

This Agreement shall not be deemed accepted by Company unless and until an authorized officer of Company has signed this Agreement. No other act or writing by an agent, officer or manager of Company shall cause this Agreement to be a valid, effective or binding contract on Company.

25. FORCE MAJEURE

Neither party shall be liable nor deemed in default for any delay or failure to perform any of its duties or obligations under this Agreement resulting directly or indirectly from any acts of God, civil or military authority, acts of a public enemy, terrorism, war, civil disobedience, riots, accidents, fires, explosions, earthquakes, floods, failure of transportation, machinery or supplies, vandalism, strikes or other work interruptions by its employees or independent contractors or any similar cause beyond its reasonable control. Notwithstanding the foregoing, each party shall, at all times, use commercially reasonable efforts to perform its duties and obligations under this Agreement.

26. COUNTERPARTS; FACSIMILE EXECUTION

This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts with the same effect as if all the parties had signed the same document. Such executions may be transmitted to the parties by facsimile, or in graphical-image form by email or other electronic transmission (collectively, "facsimile evidenced signature") and are to be deemed for all purposes to have been executed and delivered by that party to the other party. All such facsimile evidenced signatures shall have the full force and effect of an original signature. All fully executed counterparts, whether original or facsimile evidenced signatures or a combination of both, shall be construed together and shall constitute one and the same agreement.

27. EFFECTIVE DATE


Unless otherwise indicated herein, this Agreement is effective as of the later of the dates indicated by the parties below (the "Effective Date").



SCHEDULE B

FRESENIUS MEDICAL SERVICES MEDICAL DIRECTOR DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

The Medical Director is directly responsible for the creation, preservation and continuous improvement of high quality professional care of patients at a Facility. A Facility refers to all of the outpatient dialysis services provided by or administered out of an outpatient dialysis facility (including, for example, any and all nocturnal in-center programs, and any and all home dialysis programs)¹ which is owned or operated by a subsidiary or affiliate of Fresenius Medical Care North America ("FMCNA" or "Company"). The Medical Director is responsible for planning, organizing, conducting and directing the professional services of a Facility, and to that end, has specific duties and authorities as set forth (a) in this Medical Director Agreement ("Agreement"), (b) as required under the Conditions for Coverage for End-Stage Renal Disease Facilities, 42 C.F.R. § 494.1 *et seq.*, and the Interpretive Guidelines thereto promulgated by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services ("CMS") (collectively, the "Conditions for Coverage"), (c) as required under state licensing or other applicable laws, and (d) as assigned to him/her in the Governing Body and Medical Staff Bylaws.

While the Governing Body is responsible for overall management of such Facility and the Area Manager (or other appointed Facility Chief Executive Officer) exercises responsibility for the management of a Facility, the Medical Director shall be responsible for the delivery of patient care and outcomes in the Facility and is accountable to the Governing Body for the quality of medical care provided to patients at the Facility.² As such, it is often stated in this document that the Medical Director shall "ensure" that a particular task is completed. Where the Medical Director is to "ensure" a task is completed, it is expected that the Medical Director will perform such task personally or, through appropriate and reasonable delegation, oversee that such task is properly completed.

A physician who meets all of the requirements of this Agreement, including but not limited to the requirements set forth in Section 3.01.4 of the Agreement, may also serve as Medical Director of Company's Inpatient Services program if Company is contracted to provide certain inpatient services at medical facilities. The responsibilities of such Medical Director are more fully described in Section II below.

Medical Director responsibilities include, but are not limited to, those set forth below.

¹If a home dialysis program has a Medicare provider number different from the Medicare provider number of an outpatient dialysis facility, then such home dialysis program is a separate "Facility" for purposes of this document.

²A Facility must have a single Medical Director who meets all of the requirements under this Agreement and under the Conditions for Coverage. The Governing Body and such Medical Director may designate other physician(s) who meet all of the requirements under this Agreement, including but not limited to the requirements in Section 3.01.4 of the Agreement, and under the Conditions for Coverage to direct the home hemodialysis or peritoneal dialysis programs, provided that it is understood that any such home dialysis Medical Director reports to the Medical Director of the Facility who remains ultimately accountable for such programs, and that all home dialysis programs are under the same Governing Body and quality assessment and performance improvement program oversight as the in-center dialysis services.

I. FACILITY-BASED MEDICAL DIRECTOR DUTIES

A. On-Call Availability

1. Assist in ensuring that each attending physician (including the Medical Director if he/she is an attending physician) provides the Facility with instructions that clearly explain how he/she is to be contacted, including a valid e-mail address, office and other telephone numbers, pager or mobile phone numbers, and updates to any such information. Such requirement is due to the fact (a) that the health care of every patient must be under the continuing supervision of a physician who is available for situations involving the Facility, patients or staff and (b) the Facility must have a written plan for physician coverage during illness, vacation and holidays. The Medical Director shall ensure that Facility staff and patients are provided written instructions for obtaining emergency medical care.

2. If an attending physician cannot be located or contacted and no coverage is available or responding, provide guidance, as Medical Director, to Facility staff on how to address patient issues (e.g., refer patient to hospital, etc.) until the attending or covering physician can be contacted. The Medical Director is to follow-up with unresponsive attending physicians and take appropriate action, in conjunction with the Governing Body as necessary, to prevent future occurrences.

3. Be on-call to fulfill Medical Director functions including, but not limited to, responding to any emergency involving the Facility, patients or staff that might impact patient care, whether during operating hours or when the Facility is not open. If not available (e.g., on vacation or otherwise not available), arrange for Medical Director coverage by a physician who meets all of the requirements under this Agreement, including but not limited to the requirements in Section 3.01.4 of the Agreement, and under the Conditions for Coverage and provide the Director of Operations/Area Manager with prior notice as to the physician providing such coverage and the duration of such coverage.

B. Clinical Management

Policies and Procedures

1. Participate, as a member of the Governing Body, in the development, by means of periodic review and approval, of Company's patient care policies and procedures manual(s) for the Facility. The Medical Director may suggest changes to such policies and procedures consistent with FMCNA Clinical Policy 138-010-005 – FMCNA Policy and Procedure Guidelines (as amended) ("Procedure to Modify Policies"). This policy requires the Medical Director to correspond in writing with the Chief Medical Officer and Vice President of Clinical Quality Management to establish agreement on any changes in the policy and procedure that might be relevant to local issues.

2. Ensure that all policies and procedures relative to patient admissions, patient care, infection control, and safety, are made available to Facility staff, attending physicians and non-physician providers granted privileges to care for patients in the Facility ("non-physician

providers”). The Medical Director shall further ensure that such policies and procedures are adhered to by all such individuals who treat patients in the Facility. Such efforts may include, but not be limited to, working cooperatively with the Area Manager and the Clinical Manager who shall assist the Medical Director in the oversight and review, monitoring and implementation of policies and procedures relating to:

- Patient care and the delivery of high-quality, safe and effective dialysis.
- Facility’s quality assessment and performance improvement program (“QAI program”).
- Interdisciplinary team participation in comprehensive patient assessments and reassessments, patient plans of care, and the QAI program.
 - REMINDER: The Medical Director is not a member of the interdisciplinary team (except in the capacity as attending physician for his/her own patients). The Medical Director’s involvement is to oversee that each attending physician and other interdisciplinary team member participate per Facility policies. The Medical Director is expected to get involved if the interdisciplinary team members fail to appropriately participate, complete documentation, respond to QAI activities, etc.
- Patient rights, admission, grievances and discharge.
- Prevention, treatment, and safe contact with patients with hepatitis and other contagious diseases.
- Compliance with standards and regulations issued by CMS, AAMI, OSHA, CDC, regarding infection control and water and dialysate quality as specified in the Conditions for Coverage and prevalent in the industry.
- Timely and appropriate referral of patients for transplant evaluation.
- Disaster preparedness plan.
- FMCNA compliance programs, policies and procedures.

Patient Education on Treatment Options

3. Ensure that patients are informed about all treatment modalities and settings, including but not limited to, transplantation, home dialysis modalities (home hemodialysis, intermittent peritoneal dialysis, continuous ambulatory peritoneal dialysis (CAPD) and continuous cycling peritoneal dialysis (CCPD)), in-center hemodialysis and nocturnal hemodialysis, including, when possible, providing such information, together with Facility or Company staff, to patients prior to the initiation of dialysis at treatment options education sessions that may be held at the Facility or in the community that the Facility serves.

4. Ensure that patients receive information regarding other facilities which provide any modality not offered by the Facility.

Tracking Interdisciplinary Team Participation – Patient Comprehensive Assessments and Patient Plans of Care

5. Ensure, with the assistance of Facility management, that appropriate qualified Facility staff are participating on each patient’s interdisciplinary team. The interdisciplinary team members include, at a minimum, a patient’s treating physician (who serves as the leader), the

patient or the patient's designee (if the patient chooses), a registered nurse, a social worker, and a dietitian ("interdisciplinary team"). Medical Director shall ensure that the patient or the patient's designee is invited to the interdisciplinary team meetings. Each patient's interdisciplinary team is responsible for developing for such patient an individualized and comprehensive assessment of his/her needs which is used to develop the patient's treatment plan and expectations for care (i.e., patient plan of care). A physician extender who serves in lieu of the attending physician to the extent that state practice laws, Facility policies and the Conditions for Coverage so allow, may participate in the assessment and development of the plan of care.

The Medical Director shall:

- Ensure that an interdisciplinary team provides each patient an individualized and comprehensive assessment (and reassessment) of his/her needs with the components and frequency as set forth in the Conditions for Coverage.
- Ensure that an interdisciplinary team completes the patient's plan of care with the components and frequency as set forth in the Conditions for Coverage.
- Ensure that an interdisciplinary team appropriately tracks each patient's transplantation referrals consistent with the Conditions for Coverage.
- Assist in resolving any conflict among interdisciplinary team members regarding patient care issues and, as necessary and consistent with Facility policies, elevate such conflicts to the Medical Advisory Board and/or the Chief Medical Officer.
- Ensure that all patients have a current, properly signed, patient comprehensive assessment and patient plan of care for stable and unstable patients, as applicable, and that all standing orders are current.
- Support efforts of Facility staff to ensure patient adherence to the dialysis schedule and other treatments.

Quality Assessment and Performance Improvement

6. Have operational responsibility for the QAI Program. The Medical Director shall provide leadership of the Facility's QAI Program by serving as the chair of the QAI Committee, which is appointed by and accountable to the Governing Body. The QAI Program is designed and implemented to objectively, systematically, and comprehensively monitor, evaluate and improve the quality and appropriateness of patient care and services by identifying opportunities and resolving identified problems through the use of continuous quality improvement (CQI) methodology to achieve measurable improvement of health outcomes and reduce medical errors. The goal of the QAI Program is to maximize the number of patients who achieve each patient target as outlined in the Measures Assessment Tool (MAT) which CMS indicates is the current professionally accepted clinical standards (based on current CMS Clinical Performance Measures (CPMs), the National Kidney Foundation Kidney Disease Outcomes Quality Initiative ("KDOQI") guidelines, etc.), and on the Fresenius Medical Services ("FMS") Quality Status Reports (QSRs). The Medical Director shall:

- Prepare for, attend and, as Chair, lead the monthly QAI Committee meetings consistent with the requirements in the Conditions for Coverage and the guidelines

promulgated by the FMCNA Medical Office, as such guidelines may be amended from time to time.

- Periodically review and approve the Facility's QAI Program (and the Medical Director may suggest changes consistent with the Procedure to Modify Policies).
- Review overall quality indicators related to improved patient health outcomes in the categories set forth in the Conditions for Coverage, inclusive of the target levels in the MAT. If the quality indicators do not meet such target levels, assist in developing and oversee the corrective action plan (including, but not limited to, communications from the Medical Director to attending physician individually, through Medical Staff meetings, etc. on the relevant issues) to bring such quality indicators in conformity with the MAT target levels. If an attending physician does not agree with the target levels set forth in the MAT, then ensure that such attending physician documents his/her disagreement with such target levels in the applicable patient's medical record and provide rationale and new targets that the QAI Committee is informed.
- Educate Facility staff, attending physicians and non-physician providers in the QAI Program objectives.
- Review the method of prioritizing the importance of improvement projects.
- Include and encourage all staff to participate towards achieving QAI Program goals.
- Communicate with the Governing Body regarding the status of QAI Program activities and regarding needs identified by the QAI team, particularly when resources are required to address QAI Program improvements.
- Provide clinical guidance regarding the development of performance improvement plans/activities.
- Participate in the evaluation of the effectiveness of performance improvement plans/activities.
- Oversee infection control and water and dialysate quality which duties are set forth in more detail below.

7. Review Clinical Variance Reports (CVRs) (adverse events) with Clinical Manager and QAI Committee to ensure appropriate intervention.

8. Monitor, with the Clinical Manager and QAI Committee, CVRs and assist in submission of MDRs when appropriate to do so.

9. For better focus on continuous improvement in the quality of care provided to patients and continuous compliance with the Conditions for Coverage, it is Company's and FMCNA's strong recommendation that the QAI Committee of each Facility and/or Home Program convene separately to discuss solely that Facility's and/or that Home Program's quality-related matters. The QAI Committees of multiple Facilities and/or Home Programs may consolidate their meetings if (a) such QAI Committees determine that consolidation may better identify trends, improve consistency of care and improve the overall quality of care provided to patients within a geographic area, and (b) the applicable FMCNA Regional Vice President, Group Vice President, Division President or Chief Medical Officer (or designee) has provided written approval permitting such consolidated QAI meetings, which written approval shall be renewed on an annual basis.

Infection Control

10. Assume accountability, as the leader of the QAI Committee, for oversight of infection control issues. The Medical Director shall:

- Ensure compliance by Facility staff with the standards and regulations regarding infection control issued by CMS, AAMI, OSHA, CDC as set forth in the Conditions for Coverage.
- Ensure adherence by Facility staff to Facility policies and procedures regarding infection control.
- Ensure that clinical staff report infection control issues to the Medical Director and QAI Committee and that infection control and patient safety issues are continuously reported and discussed in QAI meetings.
- Ensure that he/she is familiar with and able to describe the Facility's infection control program and reporting mechanisms.
- Ensure Facility reports all communicable diseases to the state and CDC as required pursuant to applicable federal and state laws and regulations.
- Ensure all Facility staff wear appropriate personal protective equipment when at risk for blood splatter and practice hand hygiene as appropriate and in accordance with Facility policies and procedures and the Conditions for Coverage.
- Participate in CQI activities that may decrease rates of infection and catheters.

Water and Dialysate Quality

11. Oversee the safety and quality of the water used for patient treatments. The Medical Director shall:

- Participate in Company-sponsored educational efforts regarding water and dialysate quality.
- Ensure that he/she is knowledgeable of the water treatment system installed and assure that the system, as installed, will produce water meeting AAMI quality standards.
- Oversee the performance of biomedical staff and the proper functioning of water treatment equipment by visual observation of the equipment on a quarterly basis.
- Ensure, as leader of the QAI Committee, that water and dialysate monitoring is continuously reported to the QAI Committee and documented within the QAI materials.
- Participate in analyzing and addressing water or dialysate quality test results outside of expected parameters.
- Review and sign each month the following reports: AAMI water quality reports, chlorine and chloramine log, and endotoxin/colony count reports.
- Ensure compliance by Facility staff with standards and regulations regarding water and dialysate quality issued by CMS and AAMI as set forth in the Conditions for Coverage.
- Ensure adherence by Facility staff with Facility policies and procedures regarding water and dialysate quality.
- Ensure Facility Staff shall immediately notify the Medical Director in the event of a chlorine or chloramine breakthrough.

- Consistent with Facility policies and procedures, develop standard protocols in conjunction with Company and/or Facility management which require blood and dialysate cultures and endotoxin levels be collected routinely. In the event of patient adverse reaction(s) potentially related to the water treatment or dialysate systems, then such tests shall be repeated with appropriate patient evaluation (including blood cultures).
- Ensure that he/she and other appropriate Facility staff are able recognize the need to evaluate the water system in the event of patient adverse reaction(s) potentially related to the water treatment or dialysate systems and to take indicated corrective action.
- Collaborate with Medical Advisory Board-initiated quality improvement programs regarding water and dialysate quality.

Patient Involuntary Discharge Policies

12. Ensure that all Facility staff and the interdisciplinary team members follow the Facility's patient discharge and transfer policies and procedures. If transfer or discharge is due to a patient's abusive or disruptive behavior which seriously impairs the delivery of care to the patient or the ability of the Facility to operate effectively, ensure that interdisciplinary team, before any such discharge or transfer:

- Is aware of ESRD Network rules regarding patient discharges.
- Reassesses the patient consistent with the comprehensive patient assessment process.
- Documents the problem and ongoing efforts to resolve the problem.
- Obtains a written discharge or transfer order signed by the attending physician and Medical Director.
- Documents efforts to place the patient in another facility.
- Notifies the state survey agency (e.g., state department of health) and the ESRD Network.

In the case of immediate severe threats to the health and safety of others, ensure that the Facility utilizes the abbreviated involuntary discharge procedure approved by the Governing Body.)

13. If a Medical Director objects to the discharge or transfer of a patient, the Medical Director shall confer with the Chief Medical Officer or his designee.

Delivery of Oral Medications to Facility Patients

14. Assist the Clinical Manager and other authorized Facility staff in overseeing the receipt and storage of oral non-narcotic medications from the patients' applicable pharmacy and the delivery of such oral medications to patients for their self-administration outside the Facility. The Medical Director shall:

- Review and approve policies and procedures relating to the receipt, storage and delivery of oral medications at the Facility and monitor compliance with such policies and procedures.
- Review on a periodic basis the records and/or logs of the Facility related to the receipt, storage and delivery of oral medications.

- Take such other actions, as a member of the Governing Body of the Facility, to ensure the safety and security of the delivery of oral medications to Facility patients.

Nothing herein shall require the Medical Director to be involved in issues related to reimbursement for such oral medications, including but not limited to, patients' payment of co-pays or deductibles for such oral medications.

Miscellaneous

15. Assist in the determination, development, implementation and monitoring of any plans of correction and corrective actions resulting from federal and/or state surveys.
16. Respond to communications and requests for information from the FMCNA Medical Office regarding federal and/or state survey deficiencies.

C. Physician and Non-Physician Provider Management

Medical Staff Bylaws – Attending Physicians and Non-Physician Providers

1. Serve as Chair of the Medical Staff, and prepare for and attend Medical Staff meetings to be held on a regular basis (at least semi-annually).
2. Ensure that attending physicians and other Medical Staff members are appropriately oriented to the Facility and to their responsibilities.
3. Review the Medical Staff Bylaws and assist in making any necessary changes, consistent with the procedures set forth in such Bylaws.
4. Ensure that the Facility has open enrollment for membership on the Medical Staff and for non-physician providers seeking privileges and assist and encourage eligible nephrologists to join the Medical Staff.
5. Participate in determining physician and non-physician provider privileges and support the credentialing process including review of applications, credentialing, verification reports, interviews, recommendations, and follow-up, if necessary.
6. Ensure that all Facility attending physicians and non-physician providers are provided a copy of (or access to) the Medical Staff Bylaws and Governing Body Bylaws and comply with such Medical Staff and Governing Body Bylaws and state and federal regulations.
7. Participate in taking disciplinary action with respect to Medical Staff members when necessary and consistent with the Medical Staff bylaws. The Medical Director acknowledges that the Governing Body may, after consultation with the FMCNA Law Department, report to, or seek involvement of the Network Medical Review Board, National Practitioner Data Bank, state department of health, state licensing organizations, state or national professional organizations,

and any other suitable agencies or organizations regarding a physician's inadequate provision of care based on the local standard of practice or inappropriate, unprofessional or illegal conduct.

Policies and Procedures

7. Ensure, in conjunction with the Governing Body: (a) that all physicians and non-physician providers (b) are oriented to the Facility and their responsibilities, (c) are informed of all Facility policies and procedures including, but not limited to, policies and procedures relative to patient admissions, patient care, infection control, safety, medical records and the QAI Program and (d) are given access to such policies and procedures. Oversee that evidence is maintained in the physicians' and non-physician providers' credentialing file that they understood and agreed to the Medical Staff Bylaws, policies and procedures and responsibilities related to the QAI Program.

8. Ensure adherence by physicians and non-physician providers to Facility policies and procedures relative to patient admissions and discharge, patient care, medical records, infection control, and safety.

9. Ensure physician and non-physician provider compliance with Facility medical records policies and rules such as proper completion of medical records, patient comprehensive assessments, and plans of care, prompt signing of orders and timely completion of other pertinent documentation.

10. Ensure all Medical Staff, and non-physician providers wear appropriate personal protective equipment when at risk for blood splatter and practice hand hygiene as appropriate and in accordance with Facility policies and procedures and the Conditions for Coverage.

Patient Care

11. Communicate, in conjunction with the Governing Body, to the physicians and non-physician providers the expectations regarding their participation in improving the quality of medical care provided to Facility patients.

12. Ensure that each attending physician participates, as leader of each of his/her patient's interdisciplinary team, in the patient comprehensive assessment, plan of care, and, as appropriate, QAI Program activities (including, but not limited to, evaluating QAI results and other outcome data). A physician extender who serves in lieu of the attending physician to the extent that state practice laws, Facility policies and the Conditions for Coverage so allow, may participate in the assessment and development of the plan of care.

13. Ensure (with the assistance of Facility management as part of the QAI Program) that an attending physician or non-physician provider, on a monthly basis, sees his/her patients (including home dialysis patients), whether in the Facility or at his/her office or other site, documents such visit in a progress note and provides such progress note or other proper documentation of the visit to Facility staff for placement in the Facility's medical record.

14. Ensure (with the assistance of Facility management as part of the QAI Program) that an attending physician or non-physician provider, on at least a quarterly basis, visits his/her in-center hemodialysis patients at the Facility while such patients are receiving in-center dialysis, and documents the same in the medical record.

15. Ensure that physicians or non-physician providers assess on an ongoing basis the estimated “dry” or “target” weight for each patient and the adequacy of each patient’s dialysis prescription (a) at least monthly for hemodialysis patients by ordering and evaluating delivered Kt/V or an equivalent measure, and (b) at least every four (4) months for peritoneal dialysis patients by ordering and evaluating delivered weekly Kt/V or an equivalent measure.

16. With the assistance of Facility management, develop and publish a common Physician Call schedule if the Medical Staff desires to cross cover patients. Otherwise, ensure each attending physician provides an individual call schedule and all required contact information.

D. Facility Staff Management

1. Assist in management of staffing issues including:

- Oversee, in conjunction with the Clinical Manager, appropriate patient/staff ratios consistent with Facility and FMS staffing policies.
- Assist in Facility staff recruitment and retention activities as requested (e.g., interviews, outreach, and education).
- Participate in selection of candidates for key staff positions in the Facility.
- Participate in mediation of grievances, when requested.
- Oversee, in conjunction with the Clinical Manager, planning short-term coverage for staff shortages.
- Participate in disciplinary action of staff members when requested by the Area Manager or Clinical Manager.

2. Oversee staff education, training and performance, including:

- With the assistance of Facility management, ensure that Facility staff members receive the appropriate orientation, education and training to competently perform their job responsibilities; such orientation to be documented in their employee file.
- With the assistance of Facility management, oversee and monitor the performance of Facility Staff to ensure that Facility Staff are competent to carry out the their assigned duties (e.g., to adequately monitor the patient and dialysis process, to provide needed social services, etc.) and Facility staff follow Facility policies regarding expected performance.
- Serve as an educational resource for Facility staff.
- Lead educational sessions for the staff on a regular basis (at least 4 times a year);
- Support efforts of patient education.
- Periodically review and make recommendations on training materials.
- Assist in the development and delivery of in-services, other educational programs, and staff training;

- Review and assess vendor, laboratory, pharmaceutical and product formulary appropriateness.
 - Review and approve the training program for the technicians who perform monitoring and testing of the water treatment system.
 - Review and approve the training program for patient care dialysis technicians.
3. Coordinate emergency medical care to patients or staff members suffering an urgent, life-threatening illness, potentially contagious disease, or needlestick or sharps accidents.
 4. Actively participate in arranging for proper care of patients when disasters occur such as hurricanes, flooding, earthquakes, blizzards, terrorist threats, fires and power loss.

E. Governing Body Responsibilities

1. Prepare for, attend and actively participate on Governing Body meetings (at least four times a year and as otherwise scheduled).
2. Facilitate communication between Medical Staff and Governing Body.
3. Be accountable to the Governing Body with respect to the delivery of patient care, the outcomes, and quality of medical care provided to Facility patients.
4. Facilitate communication between the QAI Committee and Governing Body.
5. Communicate with the Chief Medical Officer as necessary on issues brought before the Governing Body which entail a change of policy and procedure.
6. For better focus on continuous improvement in the quality of care provided to patients and continuous compliance with the Conditions for Coverage, it is Company's and FMCNA's strong recommendation that the Governing Bodies of each Facility and/or Home Program convene separately to conduct solely that Facility's and/or that Home Program's business matters. The Governing Bodies of multiple Facilities and/or Home Programs may consolidate their meetings if (a) such Governing Bodies determine that consolidation may better identify trends, improve consistency of care and improve the overall quality of care provided to patients within a geographic area, and (b) the applicable FMCNA Regional Vice President, Group Vice President, Division President or Chief Medical Officer (or designee) has provided written approval permitting such consolidated Governing Body meetings, which written approval shall be renewed on an annual basis.

F. Communications with Outside Resources

1. Participate in discussions with administrators of Skilled Nursing Facilities, Nursing Homes and Extended Care Facilities to coordinate continued quality care for dialysis patients cared for jointly in such institutions.

2. Participate in the administrative duties associated with the transfer of patients to or from other dialysis facilities (for example, as a result of a change in patient insurance coverage, change in address or change to another facility).
3. Ensure that attending physicians complete administrative duties associated with transient, temporary, or visiting patients. When requested by the Area Manager or the Clinical Manager, review medical records for the purpose of acceptance or rejection of transient patients seeking temporary dialysis services.
4. Communicate and participate in establishing a formal relationship with transplant programs regarding transplant criteria and referral of potential transplant candidates, and ensure that attending physicians refer all eligible and willing patients for transplantation evaluation.
5. Communicate and participate in establishing a relationship with associated Surgical/Radiological Departments regarding availability and quality of vascular access services for all patients.
6. Assist in ensuring that proper medical records and monthly progress notes are forwarded from referring hospitals and physician offices, and oversee the proper sharing of patient comorbidities and other medical information between hospitals and facilities upon admission or discharge, as applicable.
7. Ensure proper completion of the End Stage Renal Disease Medical Evidence Report, Form 2728, and all other CMS forms or other required documentation.

G. Facility Management

1. Assist Facility Management, on at least a quarterly basis, in overseeing Facility operations, including participation with the Area Manager and Clinical Manager in budget development, cost containment efforts, financial performance and reimbursement problems.
2. Oversee that dialysis equipment and other technical component services meet clinical care standards.
3. Ensure that Facility staff are prepared to respond appropriately and safely to emergency situations, i.e., fire or patient/visitor violence.

H. Knowledge of Current Legal Requirements and Role of Medical Director

1. Be familiar with the Conditions for Coverage.
2. When presented by the Area Manager, Clinical Manager, Medical Advisory Board representative for the region or Chief Medical Officer, review changes in regulatory requirements issued by AAMI, CMS, OSHA, CDC, FDA etc.

3. With the Area Manager and Clinical Manager, as requested, or when there have been major changes, review Medicare Fiscal Intermediary's local medical review policies.
4. When requested, participate in ESRD Network activities, representing the Facility.
5. Be aware of and monitor the effects on patients and staff of all approved clinical research projects that are to be carried out in the Facility.
6. Attain adequate CMEs each year to ensure updated knowledge on regulatory issues as well as general nephrology issues and keep specialty current.
7. Keep up-to-date regarding the functions and role of the medical director of an outpatient dialysis facility (e.g., take courses, review literature, attending conferences, attend the FMCNA medical director meeting, etc.).
8. Be familiar with Company's Governing Body and Medical Staff Bylaws.

I. Home Hemodialysis and CAPD/CCPD Programs

1. In conjunction with the Governing Body, ensure that the home dialysis services provided by the Facility are at least equivalent to the services provided to in-center patients and meet all the applicable Conditions for Coverage including, but not limited to, interdisciplinary team participation in patient comprehensive assessments and plans of care
2. Assist in identification of appropriate patients for home dialysis and patients' support for the home hemodialysis program or CAPD/CCPD, as applicable.
3. Ensure that the interdisciplinary team oversees the adequate training (home hemodialysis or peritoneal dialysis, as applicable) of the home dialysis patient.
4. Ensure that the patient has the proper equipment for home hemodialysis or CAPD/CCPD, as applicable.
5. Oversee that Facility management is providing proper staffing and backup support, including adequate in-center backup and on-call service.
6. Review the results of all water and dialysate cultures and endotoxin levels, and analysis of source and product water for chemical contaminants of each home hemodialysis patient, such review to be documented and incorporated into the QAI Program.
7. Ensure that home dialysis patients' self-monitoring data (e.g., patient treatment sheets) and other information from home dialysis patients or their caregivers are gathered and promptly reviewed at least every two (2) months and placed in the Facility medical record, and ensure that the attending physician or home training nurse immediately reviews upon receipt time sensitive information such as hospitalization data and radiology, pathology, and laboratory results.

8. Ensure that all quality care objectives have been met for home hemodialysis or CAPD/CCPD patients, as applicable.

9. Ensure that any nocturnal home dialysis program conforms to the requirements for home dialysis programs generally as set forth above. With the assistance of Facility management, ensure compliance with any additional policies, procedures, training and equipment requirements which may apply to a nocturnal home dialysis program (e.g., as may be required with the use of nocturnal hemodialysis remote monitoring).

10. Ensure that any home staff assist dialysis program conforms to the requirements for home dialysis programs generally as set forth above. With the assistance of Facility management, ensure compliance with any additional policies, procedures, training and equipment requirements, and applicable CMS guidelines, protocols or regulations which may apply to a home staff assist dialysis program. For residents of Nursing Homes or Skilled Nursing Facilities participating in a home staff assist dialysis program, ensure that there is sufficient communication, information sharing and collaboration between the health care facilities regarding the medical needs and care being provided to such patients.

J. Enforcement

If a Medical Director fails to fulfill his/her responsibilities as a Medical Director after Facility management or Company management have taken reasonable steps to counsel such Medical Director as to the nature of his/her deficiencies in providing Medical Director services and resolve the issues accordingly, the Governing Body may, after consultation with the FMCNA Law Department and Chief Medical Officer or his/her designee, report to, or seek involvement of, the Network Medical Review Board, state department of health, state licensing organizations, state professional organizations, and any other suitable agencies or organizations.

II. NON-FACILITY BASED MEDICAL DIRECTOR DUTIES

“Inpatient services” refers to hemodialysis, peritoneal dialysis, continuous renal replacement therapy, apheresis and/or other contracted-for services which Company provides to patients of a hospital or other applicable medical facility (hereinafter “Hospital”) pursuant to a written contract.

1. Oversee the Inpatient Services Programs at the Hospitals where Company is contracted to provide such inpatient services, assuring the proper coordination and functioning of all services within each Inpatient Services Program consistent with the contract and the goals, objectives, policies, bylaws and rules and regulations of Company and the associated Hospital.

2. Assist in the development, implementation and periodic review of policies and procedures specific to the Inpatient Services Programs, which will be provided by Company and/or FMNCA. Any suggested change to such policies and procedures can be made in accordance with the Procedure to Modify Policies.

3. Working with the Hospital, ensure adequate physician coverage for all inpatient services to be provided under the contract with the Hospital.
4. Working with the Hospital, oversee efficient scheduling of treatments at the Hospital and, together with Company and/or FMCNA personnel who have operational responsibility for the Inpatient Services Programs, monitor the behavior of prescribing physicians that is disruptive to this goal.
5. Working with the Hospital, ensure that the medical staff and other patient care staff of the Hospital provide inpatient services in compliance with the applicable rules, requirements, policies and procedures of the Inpatient Services Programs.
6. Ensure adequate supervision of Company's and/or FMCNA's direct patient care staff during their performance of inpatient services at the Hospital.
7. Oversee the scheduling of Company's and/or FMCNA's direct patient care staff and supervisory personnel, including the scheduling of emergency coverage.
8. Collaborate with Company and/or FMCNA personnel who have operational responsibility for the Inpatient Services Programs to oversee adequate nursing services, backup support, and in-service training for direct patient care staff.
9. Identify any activities by any physician, any patient care personnel of the Hospital or any Company or FMCNA staff which do not conform to established policies and procedures of the Inpatient Services Programs. With the assistance of Company and/or FMCNA personnel who have operational responsibility for the Inpatient Services Programs and the Hospital, as applicable, take appropriate action to remedy such situation and to maintain overall quality of services and conformity to both the policies and procedures of the Inpatient Services Programs and the Hospital's policies, procedures, and applicable medical staff bylaws.
10. Assist Company and/or FMCNA personnel in maintaining all records relating to the care and treatment of patients in the Inpatient Services Programs in accordance with Company's and Hospital's policies and applicable regulations of public health agencies.
11. Through a routine Quality Assessment and Process Improvement ("QAI") review, supervise the operation and maintenance of equipment and assist in selection of equipment and supplies for the Inpatient Services Programs.
12. Through a routine QAI review, oversee the technical operations of the Inpatient Services Programs, including quantity and quality of water, water treatment, dialysate and treatment supplies and ensure compliance with applicable state, regulatory and Hospital requirements.
13. Collaborate with Company and/or FMCNA personnel who have operational responsibility for the Inpatient Services Programs to ensure compliance with all aspects of the QAI program, including the development and implementation of new QAI programs.

14. Support Company and/or FMCNA personnel who participate on Hospital committees related to the Inpatient Services Programs and/or the provision of inpatient services.
15. As requested by the Hospital, participate on Hospital committees related to the Inpatient Services Programs and/or the provision of inpatient services.
16. Ensure that all quality care objectives have been met for the Inpatient Services Programs.
17. Work with Company and FMCNA personnel and Hospital to ensure that the Inpatient Services Programs are operating in compliance with the standards of The Joint Commission and other external regulatory agencies, as such standards are communicated by Hospital to Company and/or FMCNA in writing.
18. Review federal, state and local survey reports of Hospital related to the provision of inpatient services and, as required by Hospital, participate in the development and implementation of plans of correction related to the provision of inpatient services.
19. Be responsive to communications and requests for information from the FMCNA Medical Office regarding survey deficiencies.
20. Assist in the establishment of new Inpatient Services Programs as needed.

SCHEDULE C

QUALITY PROGRAM

The Company's Quality Program emphasizes a limited number of quality outcomes that have the highest impact on patient survival and uses an UltraScore to identify facilities with the strongest quality outcomes and, equally importantly, to identify facilities whose quality outcomes are improving. The UltraScore is made up of two components:

The first component, the sub-score, represents the sum of five actionable outcomes that have been shown in published literature and the Company's own data to have a strong correlation with patient hospitalization and mortality. For hemodialysis programs, these five outcomes are the percentage of patients in a Facility with:

- a. eKt/V of 1.2 or greater
- b. Hemoglobin between 10-12 g/dl (Patients with a hemoglobin greater than 12 and not administered an ESA for the prior 30 days are considered to have met this target)
- c. Albumin of 4 g/dl or greater
- d. Phosphates between 3.0 to 5.5 mg/dl
- e. No catheters

For peritoneal dialysis programs, the sub-score is calculated from the same five outcomes except for the following modifications:

- a. The dose of dialysis is measured weekly as wKt/V and the outcome is the percentage of patients with wKt/V of 2.0 or greater.
- b. Peritonitis rates replace no catheters, with the calculation being the percentage of patients with one or fewer episodes of peritonitis in 24 months.

The second component of the UltraScore is the standardized mortality ratio (SMR) for the Facility. The use of the SMR automatically adjusts for differences in patients' age, sex, race and presence or absence of a diabetic diagnosis. The average SMR is 1.0.

The SMR will be calculated and used only for hemodialysis programs with 25 or more patients and for peritoneal dialysis programs with 10 or more patients. For Facilities with fewer than 25 hemodialysis patients or 10 peritoneal dialysis patients, the UltraScore will consist of only the five outcomes that make up the sub-score. When hemodialysis or peritoneal dialysis programs increase their census above these thresholds, the SMR component will be added to calculate the UltraScore.

In all other Facilities, the UltraScore is calculated using SMR and the formula $\text{UltraScore} = \text{Sub-score} + 100(1 - \text{SMR})$. For Facilities with $\text{SMR} \geq 2.0$ (twice the average mortality), the maximum impact will be a subtraction of 100 points. For facilities with $\text{SMR} = 0$, the maximum impact will be an addition of 100 points.

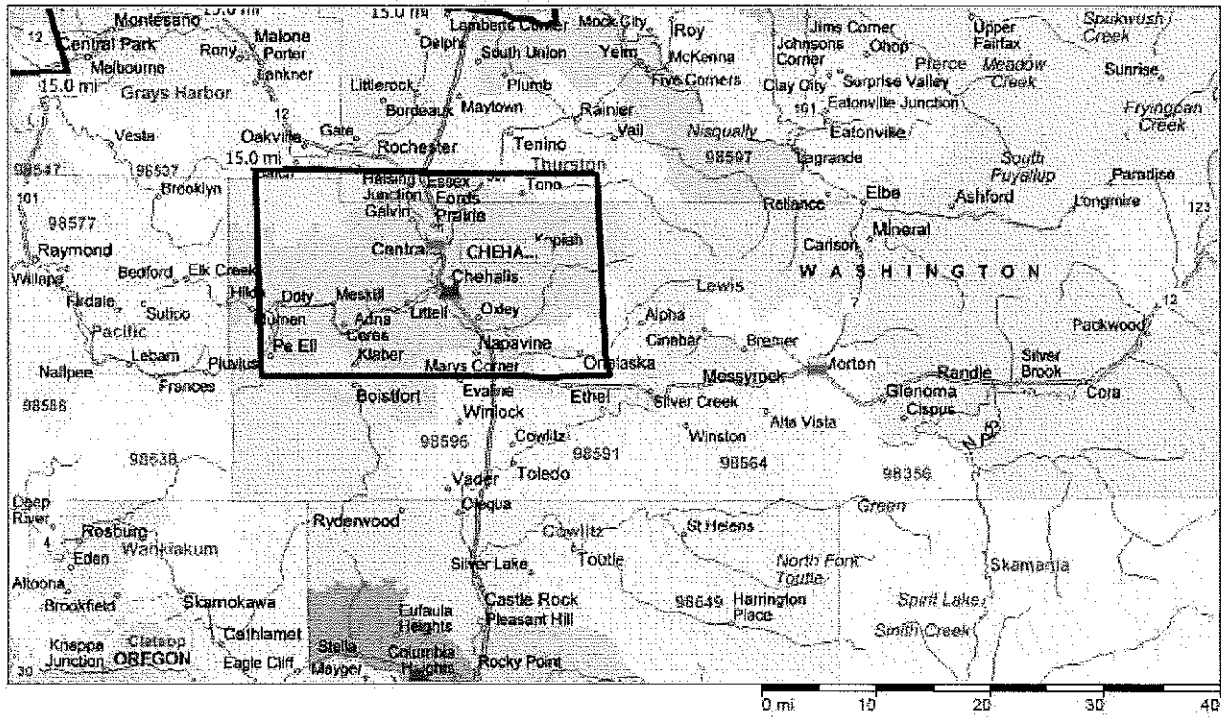

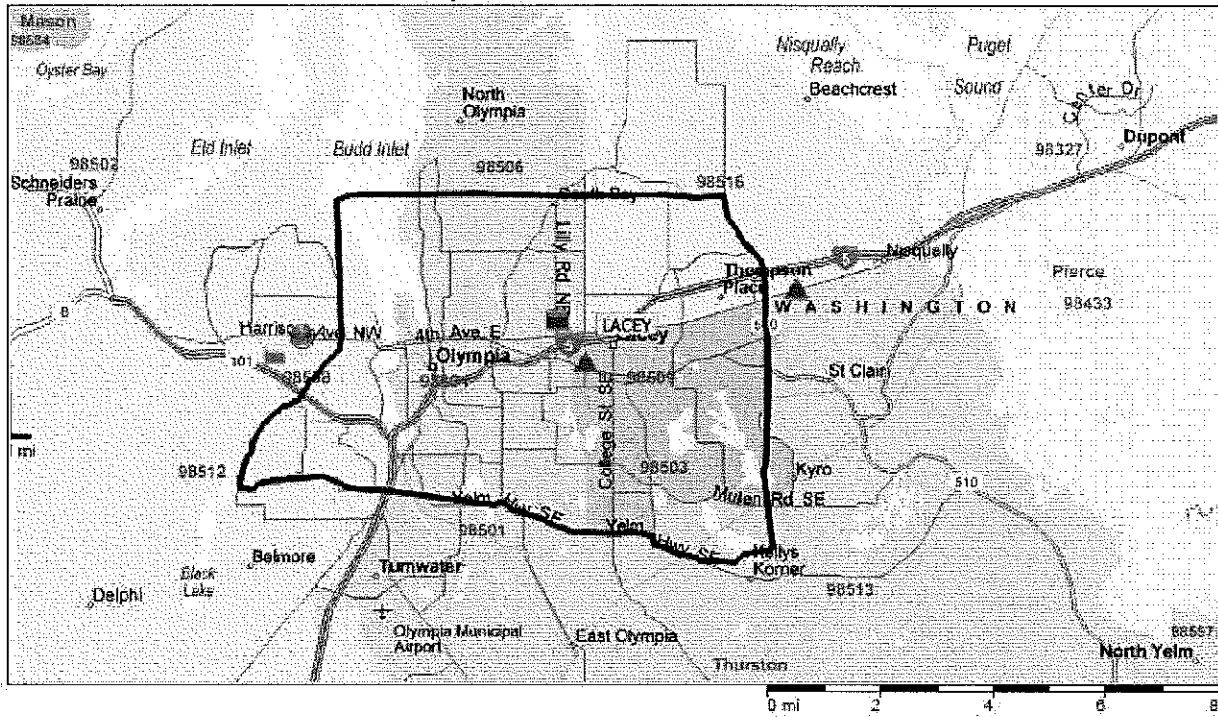

Shelton, WA

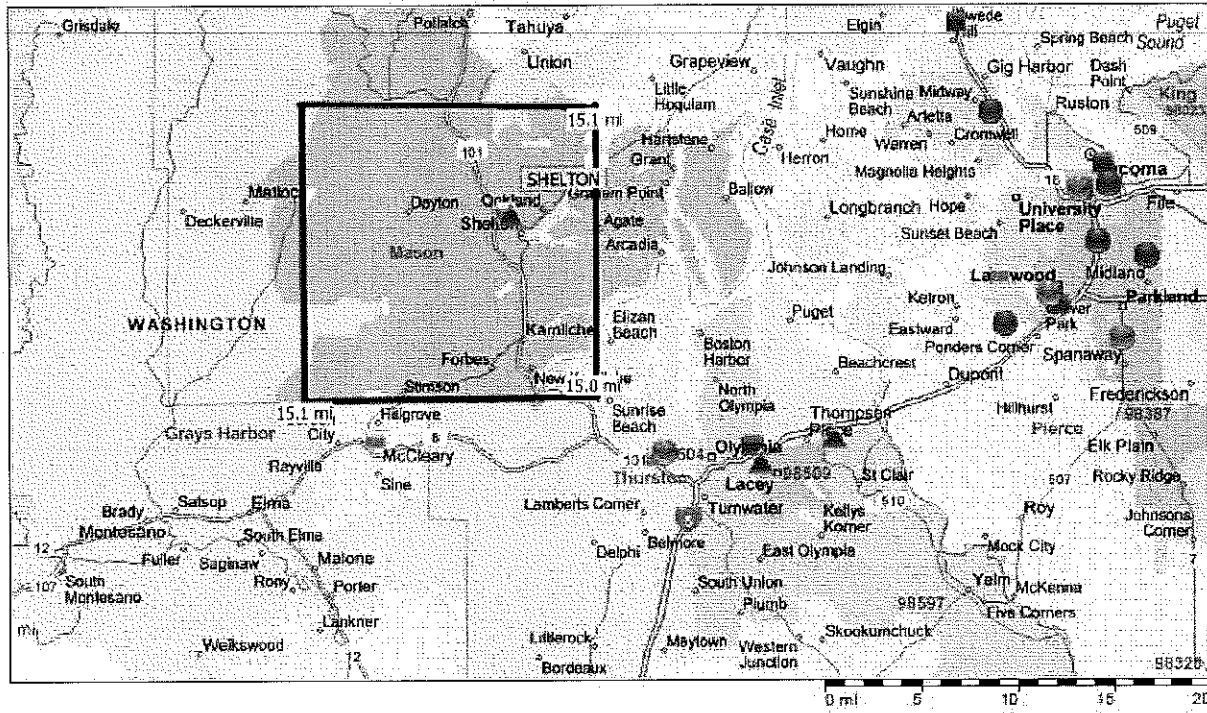

LEASE AGREEMENT

THIS LEASE AGREEMENT (this "Lease") is made as of this 27th day of November 2019 by and between Aberdeen Renal Construction LLC, a Colorado limited liability company ("**Landlord**"), and Renal Care Group Northwest, Inc., a Delaware corporation, d/b/a Fresenius Kidney Care Grays Harbor ("**Tenant**").

ARTICLE 1 - CONSTRUCTION OF SHELL BUILDING

1.1. *Construction of Shell Building.* Using Pagone + Associates (the "Architect"), Landlord shall, at Landlord's sole cost and expense construct a building and certain improvements in substantial accordance with the specifications shown and detailed in Exhibit B and the Construction Drawings (as defined in Section 1.3), with such minor variations as Landlord may deem advisable and with such construction sometimes collectively hereinafter referred to as "Landlord's Work". In the event of a conflict between the Construction Drawings and Exhibit B, the Construction Drawings shall govern.

The building to be constructed by Landlord shall contain approximately 11,000 square feet to be leased hereunder to Tenant (the "Premises" or "Building") on the property located on the southwest corner of Sumner Avenue and N. Thornton Street, known as Lots 1-11, inclusive, and Lots 15-22, inclusive, Block 12, Rices Addition to Aberdeen, City of Aberdeen, Grays Harbor County, Washington (the "Property"). The Premises and Property are more particularly described and shown on Exhibit A attached hereto and made a part hereof.

1.2. *Commercially Reasonable Efforts Required; Substantial Completion.* Attached hereto as Exhibit B-1 is the estimated development construction forecast schedule related to Landlord's Work ("EDCFS"). In the event any date or dates change in the EDCFS, Landlord shall provide Tenant within three (3) days of such change an updated and revised EDCFS. Landlord shall use its best efforts and take all commercially reasonable steps to Substantially Complete (as hereinafter defined) Landlord's Work per the Work Schedule set forth below. For purposes of this Lease, "Substantially Complete" or "Substantial Completion" of Landlord's Work shall occur when (i) Landlord's work is complete in accordance with Tenant's specifications attached hereto as Exhibit B, and (ii) the applicable local governmental authority issues a temporary certificate of occupancy or shell certificate of occupancy, if applicable.

Landlord shall provide Tenant thirty (30) days prior written notice of the Delivery Date along with a request for a completed Commencement Date Certificate ("CDC") in the form set forth in Exhibit C attached to this Lease in order to memorialize the Commencement Date, defined in Section 2.2 below. Within fourteen (14) days of the Delivery Date, ("Inspection Date") Tenant shall (i) inspect all Landlord Work completed at the Premises with Landlord; (ii) document all Landlord Work has been Substantially Completed and the actual Delivery Date in writing as outlined in Exhibit B of this Lease, and (iii) provide a copy of said confirmation to Landlord along with a completed CDC. Landlord shall execute the CDC within seven (7) days from receipt of the CDC from Tenant and deliver same to Tenant. If Landlord's Work is not substantially completed upon Tenant's inspection of the Premises; Tenant will promptly so inform Landlord of the Landlord Work remaining and the Delivery Date will be determined by the same process until Substantial Completion of all Landlord Work, except that Landlord will give Tenant five (5) business days prior written notice of the Delivery Date not thirty (30) days.

If on the Inspection Date Tenant determines that the Landlord Work is Substantially Completed; but there remain certain unfinished items of Landlord's Work to be completed, and said items do not (i) affect Landlord and Tenant's ability to confirm the Delivery Date, or (ii) interfere with Tenant's ability to obtain a final Certificate of Occupancy, or its equivalent, Landlord and Tenant shall within ten (10) days from the Inspection Date prepare a written list of such uncompleted

items (the “Punch List”). Landlord agrees to complete the item(s) on the Punch List with all due diligence and in no event later than thirty (30) days from receipt of said Punch List. In the event Landlord does not complete said Punch List items within said thirty (30) day period, Tenant shall have the right, but not the obligation, to cure such failure and offset any reasonable costs incurred in doing so from payment(s) of Base Rent, upon three (3) days advance written notice to Landlord of Tenant’s intention to complete said Punch List item(s). Completion of the Punch List items shall not be required in order to document Substantial Completion of the Landlord Work or the Delivery Date pursuant to Exhibit B as outlined in the prior paragraph.

Subject to the delivery of the Punch List, Landlord’s Work shall be deemed to have been completed in accordance with the terms of this Lease, unless Tenant notifies Landlord in writing within ten (10) business days after the Inspection Date of any unfinished Landlord’s Work that is not considered a Punch List item.

1.3. Construction Drawings.

Landlord shall, in accordance with the Site Plan attached hereto as Exhibit B-2, and the Approved Floor Plan attached hereto as Exhibit B-3, prepare and furnish to Tenant, at Landlord’s sole cost and expense, in compliance with applicable laws, statutes, ordinances and codes, and construction drawings (which plans shall be consistent with the specifications shown on Exhibit B) (“Construction Drawings”) for the construction of Landlord’s Work. A schedule identifying each approved drawing or document constituting a part of the Construction Drawings is attached hereto as Exhibit B-4.

1.4. Cooperation. Landlord and Tenant shall in good faith review and approve (or disapprove), process and perform any obligation pursuant to this Lease concerning approval of plans, or concerning the construction of Landlord’s Work with all due diligence and reasonable speed including, without limitation, approvals, reviews, shop drawings, change orders, subcontractor bids, value engineering, and inspections, with the objective of facilitating the construction of Landlord’s Work as quickly as reasonably possible.

1.5. Changes to the Construction Drawings.

(a) The Construction Drawings may be changed from time to time by mutual agreement of the parties, in the manner provided in Section 1.3 for the approval of the Construction Drawings. If any material error or omission is discovered in the Construction Drawings, then the party discovering the same shall immediately notify the other party in writing and the Construction Drawings shall be subsequently modified or changed where reasonably necessary.

(b) If changes to the scope of the Landlord’s Work result from a request for a change from the Tenant then, the Landlord will obtain from its contractor and furnish to Tenant’s project manager assigned to this project (“Tenant’s Project Manager”) within ten (10) business days from the date of issuance of such request or the date of such discovery, an itemized analysis of the increased cost, including a detailed budget setting out (with unit costs) the amount of additional time, materials, and labor which will be required to complete the requested changes.

(c) If Tenant's Project Manager approves the change and the increased cost, which approval will not be unreasonably withheld, such increased cost of this and all such changes shall be reimbursed by Tenant within thirty (30) days from receipt of paid invoices for said increased costs.

(d) If a change in the Construction Drawings causes a delay in the completion of Landlord's Work, and if within ten (10) days after such delay occurs (provided such delay is caused by a change in the Construction Drawings requested by Tenant or local governmental authority), Landlord notifies Tenant in writing of the extent of and reasons for such delay, then the date provided for in Section 1.2 for Landlord to complete Landlord's Work shall be extended by one (1) day for each day of delay caused by the changes.

1.6. Tenant's Right to Inspect and Access. At any time prior to the Delivery Date, Tenant shall be allowed entry into the Premises in order to inspect the progress and quality of Landlord's Work, review and test all mechanical, electrical and utility systems servicing the Premises in order to ensure proper installation and use thereof. Landlord, upon request from Tenant, shall provide any information related to the means and methods of construction for any and all portions of Landlord's Work. If Tenant's inspection and/or testing reveals faults with any mechanical, electrical, or utility system, Landlord shall, at its sole cost and expense, have thirty (30) days to repair such deficiencies. In the event that such faults are not properly fixed within such thirty (30) day time period, Tenant shall have the right to exercise its rights under Section 17.4 of this Lease upon written notice to Landlord.

1.7. Material Inducement. Landlord hereby recognizes and acknowledges that its obligation hereunder to Substantially Complete construction of Landlord's Work on or before the Delivery Date constitutes a material inducement to Tenant to enter into this Lease. As such, and subject to delays contemplated in Sections 1.5(b) and 1.5(d), in the event that (i) Landlord fails to timely complete any of Landlord's Work as required under this Article 1 by the timeframe indicated, and (ii) if such failure is not caused by the acts contemplated under Article 22 of this Lease, nor caused by (iii) a Tenant Delay as defined below, Tenant shall have the option to exercise any and all of the following remedies:

- (i) Collect liquidated damages from Landlord in the amount of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) per day beginning on the Delivery Date and continuing until Landlord's Work is Substantially Complete, which amount at Tenant's option shall be paid by Landlord to Tenant on a monthly basis or deducted from Tenant's payment of Base Rent (as defined in Section 3.1 of this Lease);
- (ii) If such event is not remedied by Landlord within thirty (30) days from the Delivery Date as outlined in Section 1.2.8 above, exercise its rights under Section 17.4 of this Lease; and/or
- (iii) terminate this lease upon ten (10) days written notice to Landlord if Landlord has not:
(A) received its Building Permit within 180 days from the date of application for the

Building Permit; or (B) break ground on construction of the Building within 30 days of issuance of the Building Permit; or (C) does not Substantially Complete Landlord's Work within 390 days from the issuance of the Building Permit.

As used herein a "Tenant Delay" is any delay in providing information or documents by Tenant to Landlord as required in the Work Schedule above and necessary for Landlord to timely complete Landlord's Work, or Tenant's failure to timely schedule inspections required in this Article 1. In the event of a Tenant Delay, the date provided for in Section 1.2 for Landlord to complete Landlord's Work shall be extended by one (1) day for each day of delay caused by Tenant.

1.8. Re-measurement. Within fifteen (15) days of Landlord's request for a CDC pursuant to Section 1.2 above, the Tenant may request the rentable and useable square footage of the Premises be measured and certified by the Architect or by a registered architect or engineer selected by Landlord and reasonably acceptable to Tenant, at Landlord's sole cost and expense, pursuant to Building Owners and Managers Association ("BOMA") Standards and the rentable square footage of the Premises as determined therewith shall be documented in the CDC, in the form attached hereto as Exhibit C. Notwithstanding the foregoing, remeasurement shall not increase or decrease the amount of Base Rent under this Lease.

1.9. Tenant Improvements. Tenant shall submit plans and specifications for its initial improvements ("Tenant Improvements") to Landlord for approval, which shall not be unreasonably withheld, conditioned or delayed, and which shall be deemed granted if Landlord does not respond within ten (10) business days of Tenant's submission. Landlord hereby grants Tenant and its contractors, agents, equipment and materials suppliers, and subcontractors a license to access the Property, the Building and the Premises for purposes of delivering supplies and constructing the Tenant Improvements. During the construction of the Tenant Improvements, Tenant shall submit all changes to its plans and specifications to Landlord for approval, which shall not be unreasonably withheld, conditioned or delayed, and which shall be deemed granted if Landlord does not respond within five (5) business days of Tenant's request.

1.9.1. Construction Requirements. Tenant shall obtain all building and other permits or licenses required for the work. The Tenant Improvements shall be constructed in a good and workmanlike manner using quality materials and using licensed and insured contractors. Promptly after completion of the Tenant Improvements, Tenant shall procure a certificate of occupancy for the Premises from the applicable authorities. Copies of each such permit, license and certificate obtained by Tenant pursuant to this Section 1.6.1 shall be delivered to Landlord. Subject to the terms of Article 7 of this Lease, Tenant covenants not to suffer any mechanic's liens to be filed against the Property, Building or Premises by reason of any work, labor, services or materials performed at or furnished to the Premises by Tenant, or by anyone acting through or on behalf of Tenant related to the construction of the Tenant Improvements.

ARTICLE 2 – LEASE OF PREMISES; TERM

2.1. *Lease of Premises.* Upon the Substantial Completion of Landlord’s Work, Landlord shall deliver the Premises to Tenant and Landlord thereafter shall lease to Tenant, and Tenant shall lease from Landlord the Premises.

2.2. *Lease Term.* The term of this Lease shall be for fifteen (15) years (“Initial Term”) commencing on the date that is one hundred (100) days after the Delivery Date (the “Commencement Date”).

2.3. *Options to Extend Term.* Landlord hereby grants to Tenant three (3) consecutive options to extend the term of this Lease (each a “Renewal Option”) each for a period of five (5) years (each an “Option Term”). The lease of the Premises for each Option Term shall be on the same terms and conditions contained in this Lease except that the Base Rent for each Option Term shall be determined pursuant to the terms and conditions of Section 3.2 of this Lease. Each Renewal Option may be exercised only by written notice delivered by Tenant to Landlord no later than sixty (60) days prior to the expiration of the then current term. Tenant may only exercise its Renewal Options if, on the date of delivery of the notice to Landlord, Tenant is not in default of this Lease beyond the expiration of any applicable cure periods. The Initial Term and all Option Terms are hereby referred to collectively as the “Lease Term”.

ARTICLE 3 – BASE RENT

3.1. *Base Rent; Pro-ration for Partial Months.*

Commencing on the Commencement Date and during the Initial Term, Tenant shall pay to Landlord annual rent (“Base Rent”) as follows:

Tenant shall pay Base Rent in advance on or before the first day of every calendar month, without any setoff or deduction except as provided elsewhere in this Lease. Payment of Base Rent shall be made to Landlord at the address specified in Section 26.15 of this Lease, or at such other place that Landlord may from time to time designate in writing; or, at Tenant’s election, electronic fund transfer (“EFT”) payment to Landlord’s chosen financial institution. Landlord shall provide Tenant all reasonably requested documentation to effectuate said EFT payments within thirty (30) days from Tenant’s written request. The Base Rent for the first full calendar month of the Initial Term shall be paid no later than fifteen (15) days after the Commencement Date. If any payment of Base Rent is for a period shorter than one full calendar month, Base Rent for that fractional calendar month shall accrue on a daily basis at a rate equal to 1/365 of the annual Base Rent.

3.1.1. *Calculation and Adjustment of Base Rent.* The parties agree that the Base Rent set forth in Section 3.1 above is based on an Estimated Total Project Cost of \$5,033,969 times a rent constant of 8.15%, which includes estimated hard construction costs of \$2,995,000, as set forth on Exhibit F attached hereto. Once bids are received by general contractors, Landlord and Tenant agree to re-visit the estimated costs set forth above in this Lease and the rent constant set forth in this section below. In the event that there is an increase in costs and/or increase in market capitalization rates (which would increase the rent constant), any increase in Base Rent and/or the rent constant will be capped such that the adjusted Base Rent and/or adjusted rent constant will not increase the initial Base Rent set forth above by more than twelve percent (12%); provided, however, that in the event that increases in costs and/or increases in market capitalization rates will cause an over 12% increase in the initial Base Rent set forth above, then Landlord and Tenant shall act reasonably and in good faith to reach agreement on an adjusted, initial Base Rent and/or an adjusted rent constant; and, further provided, if Landlord and Tenant are unable to reach such agreement within a reasonable period of time, then Tenant agrees that Landlord shall not be obligated to close on the purchase of the Property. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained herein, in no event shall Base Rent exceed Fair Market Value (as defined in Section 3.2.1. below).

3.2. *Base Rent for Option Terms.* Base Rent for each Option Term shall be equal to an amount that is the lesser of (i) Fair Market Value of the Premises (as defined in Section 3.2.1 of this Lease) or (ii) the annual Base Rent paid during the previous year prior to the commencement of the applicable Option Term increased by 1.7% annually during each year of the Option Term.

3.2.1. *Fair Market Value.* Fair Market Value shall be defined as the then fair market rental value of an improved space and served by the utilities detailed in Exhibit B of this Lease, that is comparable in size to the Premises, leased for a term comparable to the Option Term, and located in buildings equivalent in quality and location to the Building. Fair Market Value shall be based on an improved space that is not (i) subleased, (ii) subject to another tenant's expansion or right of first refusal rights, or (iii) leased to a tenant that holds an ownership interest in or is otherwise affiliated with the Landlord.

3.2.2. *Determination of Fair Market Value.* Fair Market Value shall be determined as follows: Within thirty (30) days of Tenant's exercise of a Renewal Option pursuant to Section 2.2 of this Lease, each party, at its own cost and by giving notice to the other party, shall appoint a real estate appraiser with at least five (5) years full-time commercial appraisal experience in the area in which the Premises are located to appraise the Fair Market Value. The appraisers shall have fifteen (15) days to agree upon the Fair Market Value of the Premises. Any agreement reached by the two appraisers shall be binding upon Landlord and Tenant. In the event that the two appraisers are unable to agree on the Fair Market Value, they shall immediately and mutually select an independent third appraiser meeting the qualifications stated in this Section 3.2.2. The third appraiser's determination of the Fair Market Value of the Premises shall be made within ten (10) days, and Landlord and Tenant shall share the cost of retaining the third appraiser equally. The two appraisers or the third appraiser, as the case may be, shall immediately notify the parties of their determination of Fair Market Value of the Premises, which shall be binding on both Landlord and Tenant and which shall serve as the Base Rent for the Option Term.

3.3. *Late Payment of Base Rent.* If Landlord does not receive any payment of Base Rent within five (5) days after that Rent is due, interest shall accrue on such unpaid Base Rent at the rate of ten percent (10%) per annum until fully paid by Tenant.

ARTICLE 4 - USE AND COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS

4.1. *Permitted Use.* Tenant shall use and occupy the Premises for the purpose of an outpatient dialysis facility and related office and administrative uses (the "Permitted Use"). Tenant shall not use or occupy the Premises for any other purpose without prior written notification to the Landlord. Tenant shall not conduct any activity in the Premises that are offensive, or in a manner that violates federal, state, county, city, or government agency laws, statutes, ordinances, standards, rules, requirements, or orders now in force or hereafter enacted, promulgated, or issued (collectively, "Laws"). Tenant may operate on the Premises, at Tenant's option, on a three hundred sixty-five (365) days a year, seven (7) days a week, twenty-four (24) hours-a-day basis, subject, however, to zoning and other regulatory requirements.

4.2. *Condition of Premises; Repairs and Replacements.* Tenant shall keep the Premises in a neat and orderly fashion during the Lease Term. Tenant, at Tenant's sole expense, shall promptly make all repairs, replacements, alterations, or improvements to the Premises including any Alterations (as defined in Article 5), fixtures, and furnishings, in order to comply with all Laws to the extent that such Laws relate to or are triggered by Tenant's particular use of the Premises. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Tenant shall not be obligated to make any structural changes to the Building. Landlord, at Landlord's sole expense, shall promptly make all repairs, replacements, alterations, or improvements, retrofitting, or remediation needed to comply with all Laws to the

extent that such Laws apply to the Building as a whole, or any of its structural components or mechanical or electrical systems.

ARTICLE 5 – ALTERATIONS; TENANT’S RIGHT TO EXPAND

5.1. *General.* Tenant may remodel the Premises during the Lease Term in accordance with the terms and conditions of Section 5.2 of this Lease. In addition, without the necessity of obtaining Landlord’s consent, Tenant may install such counters, partitions, walls, shelving, fixtures, fittings, machinery and equipment in the Premises as Tenant deems necessary to conduct its business (hereinafter defined as “Alterations”). Tenant may also install a television or satellite antenna on the roof of the Premises, flues and wall or roof penetrations and an emergency generator in a location close in proximity to the Premises. Tenant shall cooperate with Landlord with respect to the location and method of installation of such equipment, as to not void or violate any construction material and labor warranties.

5.2. *Alterations; Notification to Landlord Required.* Notwithstanding anything contained in Section 5.1, Tenant shall not be permitted to make any alteration or modification to the Premises after the Commencement Date without prior written notification to Landlord. Any alteration or modification which either (a) costs more than Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000) in each instance or (b) affects the structural, electrical, mechanical or life safety systems of the Building shall require Landlord’s prior written consent, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld, conditioned or delayed. Tenant shall be responsible for all associated with an Alteration that:

- (a) adversely impacts the structural integrity of the Building or any of its mechanical and electrical systems; or
- (b) results in Landlord being required to perform any work pursuant to any Law that Landlord could otherwise avoid or defer had the Alterations not been made.

5.3. *Compliance with Laws and Insurance Requirements.* Tenant shall ensure that its construction of all Alterations complies with all Laws and any applicable requirements. Tenant shall obtain all permits that may be required by any governmental entity having jurisdiction over the Premises.

5.4. *Manner of Construction and Payment.* Tenant shall have the right to use contractors and subcontractors of its choosing. All work relating to any Alterations shall be done in a good and workmanlike manner, using materials equivalent in quality to those used in the construction of the Premises. The construction of Alterations by Tenant shall be diligently prosecuted to completion, and Tenant shall ensure that all work is performed in a manner that does not obstruct access to the Property. In addition, Tenant shall take reasonable steps to ensure that its construction does not interfere either with other tenants' use of their premises or with any other work being undertaken by Landlord in the Building.

5.5. *Payment for Alterations.* Tenant shall promptly pay all charges and costs incurred in connection with its construction of all Alterations. Subject to the terms of Article 7 of this Lease, Tenant covenants not to suffer any mechanic’s liens to be filed against the Property, Building, or Premises by reason of any work, labor, services or materials performed at or furnished to the Premises by Tenant, or by anyone acting through or on behalf of Tenant related to the construction of any Alteration.

5.6. Expansion Right. During the Lease Term, Tenant shall have the right to expand the square footage of the Building, parking areas, and/or the Premises (the “Expansion Space”), as the case may be, up to the maximum extent allowed by local zoning, building, and other requirements. Tenant shall send Landlord written notice of its intent to expand. Within five (5) days after Landlord’s receipt of said notice, the parties shall appoint a mutually acceptable independent real estate appraiser/ broker (the “Expansion Appraiser/ Broker”) with at least five (5) years full-time experience in the area in which the Premises are located to provide an opinion of the fair market rental value of the proposed Expansion Space. The cost of the Expansion Appraiser/ Broker shall be shared equally by Landlord and Tenant. The Expansion Appraiser/ Broker shall have thirty (30) days to provide an opinion of the fair market rental value of the proposed Expansion Space. Any opinion given by the Appraiser/ Broker shall be binding upon Landlord and Tenant. Landlord shall have ten (10) days from the date the Expansion Appraiser/ Broker renders its opinion to notify Tenant as to whether Landlord shall construct the Expansion Space at Landlord’s sole cost and expense. In the event Landlord elects to build the Expansion Space, the Expansion Appraiser’s/ Broker’s opinion shall serve as the Base Rent for the Expansion Space, which shall commence upon the date Landlord delivers the completed Expansion Space to Tenant. Landlord shall immediately commence to construct the Expansion Space using its best efforts and taking commercially reasonable steps to complete the Expansion Space. In the event Landlord elects not to build the Expansion Space, Tenant shall have the right to construct the Expansion Space at its sole cost and expense, and Tenant shall not be obligated to pay Base Rent for the Expansion Space during the remainder of the term of the Lease or any future option periods. In such event, Tenant shall be responsible for obtaining all permits and approvals required by governmental authorities having jurisdiction, including but not limited to any zoning, building and/or other requirements. Further, Tenant shall expand the Building, parking areas in a first class, good and workmanlike manner consistent with the construction standards utilized in constructing the Building, which shall include but not be limited to comparable precautions for dealing with mine subsidence. Prior to commencement of construction, Tenant shall furnish to Landlord the plans and specifications of the work to be undertaken and shall obtain Landlord’s written approval of the plans and specifications, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld. Failure of Landlord to respond to Tenant’s written request for approval on or before the 30th following Landlord’s receipt of Tenant’s written request for approval shall result in Landlord being deemed to have consented to Tenant’s written request for approval.

ARTICLE 6 - REPAIRS AND MAINTENANCE

6.1. Tenant’s Repair and Maintenance Obligations. During the Lease Term, Tenant shall at its sole cost and expense keep and maintain the non-structural portions of the interior of the Premises, including all Tenant Alterations, in good order and repair and free of refuse and rubbish. Tenant shall be responsible for its own janitorial services for the Premises as well as cleaning of windows of the Premises.

6.2. Landlord’s Repair and Maintenance Obligations. During the Lease Term, Landlord shall:

(a) without expense to Tenant, unless damage is caused by Tenant, maintain and make all necessary repairs and/or replacements to the exterior and structural portions of the Property, Building and Premises, including, without limitation: foundations, structure, load bearing walls, exterior walls, the roof and roof supports, columns, retaining walls, gutters, downspouts, flashings, and footings.

(b) maintain and make all necessary repairs and/or replacements to the following, unless Tenant elects to maintain any of the following by providing written notice to Landlord electing to do the same at its sole cost and expense: parking areas (including surfacing, striping, paving and sealing), curbing, sidewalks and directional markers, water mains, gas and sewer lines, private roadways, landscape, and loading docks. Landlord shall also perform exterior pest control, and snow and ice removal.

Within thirty (30) days of Tenant's receipt from Landlord of paid invoices and written documentation evidencing the same, Tenant shall reimburse Landlord for the actual costs and expenses of the maintenance and repair contemplated in this Section 6.2(b) (the "Maintenance Expenses"), except for the replacement of the parking lot or any other capital expenditure, as defined in Section 6.2(b)(vii) below, as additional rent for the same periods and in the same manner, time, and place as the Base Rent.

(i) Payment of Estimated Maintenance Expenses. On or before December 31st of each year during the Lease Term, Landlord shall provide Tenant with a statement detailing Landlord's reasonable estimate of the Maintenance Expenses for the upcoming calendar year (the "Estimated Statement"). Tenant shall pay to Landlord, Landlord's estimate of Maintenance Expenses each month together with Tenant's payment of Base Rent.

(ii) Annual Reconciliation of Maintenance Expenses. On or before April 15th of each year, Landlord shall provide Tenant with a statement showing the actual Maintenance Expenses for the previous calendar year (the "Actual Expenses Statement"). Landlord shall indicate on Actual Expenses Statement whether there is a shortfall or overpayment by Tenant in its payment of Maintenance Expenses for the prior calendar year. If a shortfall exists, Tenant shall pay, within thirty (30) days of receipt of the Actual Expenses Statement, the full amount of that shortfall. If an excess exists, Landlord shall refund the full amount of such excess to Tenant within thirty (30) days. No interest shall accrue on any shortfall or overpayment by Tenant of the estimated Maintenance Expenses. Should Landlord fail to reimburse Tenant hereunder, Tenant shall have the right to offset Base Rent.

(iii) Landlord's Books and Records; Tenant's Audit Rights. Upon written notice to Landlord, Tenant and/or its authorized representatives may examine, inspect, audit, and copy the records of Landlord concerning Maintenance Expenses for the two (2) prior calendar years of the Lease Term at Landlord's office during normal business hours. If Tenant's audit reveals that Landlord overstated the actual Maintenance Expenses any calendar year, Tenant shall submit a written claim to Landlord ("Tenant's Audit Claim") that shall describe in detail how the Maintenance Expenses have been overstated. If Tenant's audit reveals that the Maintenance Expenses taken as a whole were overstated by at least three percent (3%), Landlord shall pay for Tenant's reasonable costs of conducting the audit. Otherwise, Tenant shall pay its own costs.

(iv) Resolution of Tenant's Audit. If Landlord agrees with Tenant's Audit Claim, Landlord shall reimburse Tenant for Tenant's overpayment or Tenant shall pay Landlord for any shortfall, within thirty (30) days. If Landlord disputes the results of

Tenant's audit, the parties shall agree on a third-party arbitrator to conduct its own independent audit of the Maintenance Expenses for the calendar year or years in question. The parties shall cooperate with such third-party arbitrator so that it can make a determination as to the validity of Tenant's Audit Claim. The determination of the third-party arbitrator shall be given to the parties with sixty (60) days and shall be final and binding upon the parties. Upon the conclusion of the third-party arbitrator's audit, all amounts owed by Landlord to Tenant or by Tenant to Landlord, as the case may be, shall be made within ten (10) days. The parties shall share the costs of retaining the third party arbitrator equally. Should Landlord fail to reimburse Tenant hereunder, Tenant shall have the right to offset Base Rent.

(v) Confidentiality. Tenant shall keep any information gained from the inspection of Landlord's records, books, and general ledger confidential and shall not disclose any information contained therein to any other party, except as required by law. If requested by Landlord, Tenant shall require those employees or agents inspecting Landlord's records, books, and general ledger to sign a confidentiality agreement prior to their inspection and review of the same.

(vi) Time Limitation to Bill Tenant for Maintenance Expenses. In no event shall Tenant be required to pay any Maintenance Expenses that Landlord failed to bill Tenant for and that accrued more than two (2) years prior to the date that Tenant is notified by Landlord of such expenses. In addition, Landlord may not seek reimbursement from Tenant due to an adjustment in Maintenance Expenses more than two (2) years after furnishing an Actual Expenses Statement to Tenant.

(vii) Capital Expenditures. Expenses incurred by Landlord that are considered to be capital improvements or capital replacements but that are not intended as a labor-saving device pursuant to this Section 6.2 (b) or under generally accepted accounting and management practices shall not be included in Maintenance Expenses. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Landlord may charge as an Maintenance Expense any capital expenditures intended to reduce Maintenance Expenses or affect economies in the operation, maintenance, or repair of the Building provided that Landlord shall provide Tenant with (i) an estimate of the amount of reduction in Maintenance Expenses anticipated as a result of that capital improvement or replacement, (ii) an estimate of the cost of the capital improvement and the annual amortization charge of that capital expenditure, and (iii) reasonably sufficient information to support those estimates. All capital improvements or capital replacement expenditures included in Maintenance Expenses shall be amortized over Landlord's commercially reasonable determination of the useful life of that capital improvement or replacement in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles.

6.3. Limitations on Repair and Maintenance Obligations and Defaults. All of the foregoing in this Article 6 notwithstanding, neither Landlord nor Tenant shall be obligated to perform any maintenance, repair or replacement necessitated by the negligence or willful misconduct of the other party, or of the other's employees, contractors, or agents. The party whose negligence or willful misconduct caused the need for such maintenance, repair or replacement shall be responsible for same, at its sole cost. Neither party shall be in default of its repair and maintenance

obligations under this Article 6 if Landlord or Tenant, as the case may be, begins performing repairs and maintenance and, due to the nature of the particular repair or maintenance obligation, more than thirty (30) days are reasonably required to complete such work and the responsible party is diligently prosecuting such work to completion.

ARTICLE 7 - COVENANT AGAINST LIENS

7.1. *Covenant Against Liens.* Tenant shall not permit mechanics' or other liens to be placed upon the Property, Building, or Premises or Tenant's leasehold interest therein. Landlord shall have the right to post and record notices of non-responsibility in the Premises during Tenant's construction of any Alteration or Expansion. Within sixty (60) days of written notice from Landlord, Tenant shall fully discharge any lien by settlement, bonding, or insuring over the lien in the manner prescribed by the applicable lien Law. Nothing contained in this Section 7.1 shall restrict or prohibit Tenant from initiating a legal action or defending itself in an existing legal proceeding to determine the validity of any lien or attachment. In all such cases, Tenant shall indemnify, protect, defend, and hold Landlord harmless from and against all claims, demands, causes of action loss, damage, liability, costs, and expenses (including attorneys' fees and court costs) relating to such liens and attachments. In no event shall Tenant be in default under the terms of this Lease so long as Tenant is diligently pursuing the full discharge of any lien placed upon the Property, Building, or Premises, as the case may be. Tenant shall, upon demand, reimburse Landlord for all amounts paid and costs incurred by Landlord, including reasonable attorneys' fees, in having any such lien discharged of record.

ARTICLE 8 - ENTRY BY LANDLORD

8.1. *Landlord's Access to Premises.* Tenant shall permit Landlord or its agent to enter the Premises upon reasonable prior notice to (a) inspect the Premises, (b) make such alterations, maintenance, or repairs therein as may be required under this Lease or pursuant to any Law, (c) show the Premises to prospective purchasers or mortgagees or to ground or underlying landlords, or (d) serve or post all notices required by law or permitted by this Lease. In addition to the foregoing, during the last ninety (90) days of the Lease Term, Tenant shall permit Landlord to show the Premises to prospective tenants at reasonable times, and to place notices on the front of the Premises or on any part thereof offering the Premises for lease. Landlord shall exercise its rights under this Article 8 at such times and in such a manner as to minimize the impact of any interference with Tenant's business in and occupancy of the Premises.

8.1.1. *Emergency Entries.* Landlord and Landlord's agents may enter the Premises without any advance notice when necessary to address emergency situations. For purposes of this Section 8.1.1, an emergency situation is one that poses a threat of imminent bodily harm or property damage. If Landlord makes an emergency entry into the Premises when no authorized representative of Tenant is present, Landlord shall provide notice to Tenant as soon as reasonably possible after that entry and shall take reasonable steps to secure the Premises until a representative of Tenant arrives at the Premises.

8.2. HIPAA Compliance Provision. Landlord acknowledges that Tenant is subject to the provisions of the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 and related regulations (“HIPAA”), and that HIPAA requires Tenant to ensure the safety and confidentiality of patient medical records. Landlord further acknowledges that, in order for Tenant to comply with HIPAA, Tenant must restrict access to the portions of the Premises where patient medical records are kept or stored. Landlord hereby agrees that, notwithstanding the rights granted to Landlord pursuant to this Article 8, except for an emergency entry into the Premises taken pursuant to Section 8.1.1 of this Lease or when accompanied by an authorized representative of Tenant, neither Landlord nor its employees, agents, representatives or contractors shall be permitted to enter those areas of the Premises designated by Tenant as locations where patient medical records are kept and/or stored.

8.3. Method of Entry. Landlord shall at all times have a key or, if applicable, a card key with which to unlock all the doors in the Premises except for the locations in the Premises designated by Tenant as areas where patient records are kept or stored. In an emergency situation, Landlord shall have the right to use any means that Landlord considers proper to open the doors in and to the Premises. Any such entry into the Premises by Landlord shall not be considered a forcible or unlawful entry into the Premises or an actual or constructive eviction of Tenant from any portion of the Premises.

ARTICLE 9 – HVAC, UTILITIES AND SERVICES

9.1. HVAC. During the Lease Term, Landlord shall be responsible for the regular maintenance and repair of the heating and air conditioning equipment (“HVAC”) servicing the Premises. Tenant shall reimburse Landlord for its costs related to the maintenance and repair of the HVAC as part of the Maintenance Expenses. Landlord also shall be responsible for the replacement of the HVAC units or any Major Component of the HVAC (a “Major Component” will be defined as any replacement cost over \$2,500.00) during the Lease Term. The cost of any such replacement of the HVAC units or any of the Major Components shall be paid by the Landlord and treated as a capital expenditure in accordance with Section 6.2(b)(vii). Upon the written request from Tenant, Landlord shall provide annual maintenance and repair records within thirty (30) days of said written request.

9.2. Utilities and Services. Landlord, at its own expense, shall ensure that all utility services outlined in Exhibit B are provided to the Premises on all days during the Lease Term on a 24-hour-a-day, 7-day-a-week basis.

9.3. Payment of Utility Charges. Tenant shall pay or cause the payment of all charges for gas, water, sewer, electrical, telephone and other utility services supplied to the Premises during the Lease Term and beginning on the Delivery Date. Tenant shall receive all savings, credits, allowances, rebates or other incentives granted or awarded by any third party as a result of any of Tenant’s utility specifications in the Premises. Should Landlord elect to supply any or all of such utilities, Tenant agrees to purchase and pay for the same, provided that: (a) the rate charged by Landlord to Tenant shall not exceed the rate charged Landlord by any supplying utility plus any expenses incurred by Landlord in connection with billing and supplying such utility service to Tenant and (b) Tenant shall not be required to pay for any utility charges that Landlord fails to

notify or bill Tenant of after two (2) years. In addition, Landlord may not seek reimbursement from Tenant due to an adjustment in utility costs or charges that are more than two (2) years old.

9.4. Interruption of Utility Services. In no event shall Landlord be liable for any interruption or failure in the supply of any utility to the Premises unless such interruption was caused by the negligence or willful misconduct of Landlord or any person or entity acting on behalf of Landlord. In such event, Tenant shall be entitled to an abatement of Base Rent for the period of such interruption if Landlord does not make repairs and restore all interrupted services to the Premises within two (2) business days.

ARTICLE 10 - TAXES

10.1. Tax Expenses. "Tax Expenses" means all federal, state, county, or local government or municipal taxes, fees, charges, or other impositions of every kind (whether general, special, ordinary, or extraordinary) during any calendar year (without regard to any different fiscal year used by any government or municipal authority) because of or in connection with the ownership, leasing, and/or operation of the Property or the Building. Tax Expenses shall include taxes, fees, and charges such as real property taxes, general and special assessments (including any and all fees or charges of any property owner association(s) or master association(s)), transit taxes, leasehold taxes, and taxes based on the receipt of rent (including gross receipts or sales taxes applicable to the receipt of rent, unless required to be paid by Tenant). Tenant and Landlord acknowledge that assessments, taxes, fees, levies, and charges may be imposed by government agencies for services such as fire protection, street, sidewalk, and road maintenance, conservation, refuse removal, and other governmental services formerly provided without charge to property owners or occupants. Tax Expenses shall also include any government or private assessments (or the Building's contribution toward a government or private cost-sharing agreement) for the purpose of augmenting or improving the quality of services and amenities normally provided by government agencies and private associations. Tenant and Landlord intend that all new and increased assessments, taxes, fees, levies, and charges and all similar assessments, taxes, fees, levies, and charges be included within the definition of "Tax Expenses" for purposes of this Lease. All excess profits taxes, franchise taxes, gift taxes, capital stock taxes, inheritance and succession taxes, estate taxes, federal and state income taxes, and other taxes applied or measured by Landlord's gross or net income shall not be included in Tax Expenses.

10.2. Payment of Tax Expenses. Landlord shall pay before due all Tax Expenses assessed against the Property. Tenant shall reimburse Landlord for Tax Expenses within thirty (30) days of Tenant's receipt of an applicable invoice and written documentation supporting the same, together with Landlord's calculation.

10.3. Payment of Personal Property Taxes. Tenant shall pay before due all taxes levied or assessed against its personal property, furniture, or fixtures placed within the Premises.

ARTICLE 11 – INSURANCE

11.1. *Tenant's Insurance.* Tenant covenants and agrees that throughout the Lease Term it will keep in full force and effect the following insurance policies:

(a) “All risk” property insurance, including fire and extended coverage, vandalism, malicious mischief, sprinkler leakage and water damage, demolition and debris removal and flood insurance (if the Building is located in a flood hazard area) insuring, on a replacement cost basis, Alterations that Tenant is responsible for.

(b) Commercial general liability or public liability insurance with limits not less than \$2,000,000 combined single limit, including coverage for bodily injury and property damage to third parties. Landlord and its lender shall be named as an additional insured, but only with respect to claims arising out of the Tenant's use and occupancy of the Premises.

Insurance agreed to in this Section 11.1 may be provided in a combination of self-insured retention, primary insurance and /or excess / umbrella insurance. Policies shall be placed with companies holding an A.M. Best's rating of B+ or better. Tenant shall, upon written request, provide the Landlord with a certificate of insurance evidencing the existence and amounts of such insurance required herein.

11.2. *Landlord's Insurance.* Landlord covenants and agrees that throughout the Lease Term, it will keep in full force and effect the following insurance policies:

(a) “All risk” property insurance, including fire and extended coverage, vandalism, malicious mischief, sprinkler leakage and water damage, demolition and debris removal and flood insurance (if the Building is located in a flood hazard area) insuring, on a replacement cost basis, the Property and the Premises, including but not limited to the parking lot, common areas, foundation, and roof.

(b) Commercial general liability or public liability insurance with limits not less than \$2,000,000 combined single limit, including coverage for bodily injury and property damage to third parties.

Insurance agreed to herein may be provided in a combination of self-insured retention, primary insurance and /or excess / umbrella insurance. Policies shall be placed with companies holding an A.M. Best's rating of B+ or better. The Landlord shall, upon written request, provide the Tenant with a certificate of insurance evidencing the existence and amounts of such insurance required herein.

Tenant shall reimburse Landlord for Landlord's costs associated with the insurance premiums (but not deductibles) for the insurance contained in Section 11.2(a).

11.3. *Waivers.* Landlord and Tenant hereby mutually waive their respective rights of recovery against each other for any loss insured by the “all risk” property insurance policies existing for the benefit of the respective parties. Each party shall obtain any special endorsements, if required by their insurer to evidence compliance with the aforementioned waiver.

ARTICLE 12 - HAZARDOUS MATERIALS; MEDICAL WASTE

12.1. Definition of Hazardous Materials. Hazardous Materials shall mean any hazardous or toxic substance, material, or waste in any concentration that is or becomes regulated by the United States of America, the state in which the Property is located, or any local governmental authority having jurisdiction over the Building, and shall include:

- (a) Any "hazardous substance," as that term is defined in the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act of 1980 (42 United States Code sections 9601-9675);
- (b) "Hazardous waste," as that term is defined in the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act of 1976 (42 United States Code sections 6901-6992k);
- (c) Any pollutant, contaminant, or hazardous, dangerous, or toxic chemical, material, or substance, within the meaning of any other applicable federal, state, or local law, regulation, ordinance, or requirement;
- (d) Petroleum products, asbestos containing materials ("ACM's") in any form or condition, and polychlorinated biphenyls ("PCB's") and substances or compounds containing ACM's or PCB's; and
- (e) Radioactive material, including any source, special nuclear, or byproduct material as defined in 42 United States Code sections 2011-2297g-4.

12.2. Representations and Warranties of Landlord. Landlord hereby represents and warrants that (a) as of the date of this Lease it has no knowledge of any Hazardous Materials located in, on, or under the Property, the Building or the Premises, (b) Landlord has provided Tenant with a copy of all tests and reports that Landlord has conducted prior to the date of this Lease which relate to the existence of Hazardous Materials, including, without limitation, a Phase 1 Study, and (c) Landlord has not received any notices or other notifications from any governmental entity that the Property, the Building or the Premises is in violation of any environmental law. In the event that a Hazardous Material of whatever kind or nature and wherever located, including, but not limited to, soil, water, building components, above ground or below ground storage containers is found to be present at the Premises, the Building, or the Property, then so long as the presence of such Hazardous Material is not the fault of Tenant, or Tenant's employees, agents, contractors or invitees, Landlord will assume full responsibility and liability for treatment of same in accordance with all applicable Laws.

12.3. Tenant's Use of Hazardous Materials. Except as may be required in Tenant's ordinary course of business and as provided by law, Tenant shall not cause any Hazardous Materials to be generated, brought onto, used, stored, or disposed of in or about the Property, the Building, or the Premises. Tenant shall comply at all times during the Lease Term with all Laws governing the use, storage, and disposal of Hazardous Materials, including those Laws cited in Section 12.1 of this Lease.

12.4. Notification to Other Party. During the Lease Term, if either Landlord or Tenant becomes aware of (a) any release of any Hazardous Material on, under, or about the Premises, the Building, or the Property or (b) any investigation, proceeding, or claim by any governmental agency regarding the presence of Hazardous Material on, under, or about the Premises or the Building, that party shall give the other party written notice of the release or investigation within three (3)

days after learning of it and shall simultaneously furnish to the other party copies of any claims, notices of violation, reports, or other writings received by the party providing notice that concern the release or investigation.

12.5. Remediation Obligations. If the presence of any Hazardous Material brought onto the Property, the Building, or the Premises by either Landlord or Tenant or by Landlord's or Tenant's employees, agents, contractors, or invitees results in contamination of the Property, the Building or the Premises, that party shall promptly take all necessary actions, at its sole cost and expense, to return the Property, the Building, or the Premises, as the case may be, to the condition that existed before the introduction of such Hazardous Material. If Landlord undertakes any cleanup, remediation, detoxification, or similar action pursuant to this Section 12.5 as a result of the presence, release, or disposal in or about the Property, the Building, or the Premises of any Hazardous Material, and that action requires that Tenant be denied access or use of the Premises to conduct its business on the Premises for a period of greater than seven (7) business days, Base Rent payable under this Lease shall be abated for the period that Tenant is unable to conduct its business in the Premises, unless such cleanup, remediation, detoxification, or similar action pursuant to this Section 12.5 is due to Tenant, Tenant's employees, agents, contractors, or invitees.

12.6. Indemnifications. Landlord and Tenant shall, at that party's sole expense and with counsel reasonably acceptable to the other party, indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the other party and the other party's shareholders, directors, officers, employees, partners, affiliates, agents, and successors with respect to all losses arising out of or resulting from the release of any Hazardous Material in, on, under or about the Property, the Premises or the Building, or the violation of any environmental law, by that party or that party's agents, assignees, subtenants, contractors, or invitees. This indemnification includes all losses, costs of characterization, costs of removal, remedial actions, repairs, liabilities, obligations, penalties, fines, claims, actions (including remedial or enforcement actions of any kind and administrative or judicial proceedings, orders, or judgments), damages (including consequential and punitive damages), and costs (including attorney, consultant, and expert fees and expenses) resulting from the release or violation. This indemnification shall survive the expiration or earlier termination of this Lease.

12.7. Medical Waste. For purposes of this Lease, "Medical Waste" shall include (i) medical devices, instruments, or paraphernalia such as syringes, sutures, swabs or wraps of any sort that are intended to come into contact with any part of the body, and (ii) biological wastes and other waste materials that results from the administration of medical care to a patient by Tenant. During the Lease Term, Tenant shall not dispose of medical waste in the trash receptacles provided by Landlord at the Property, Building, or Premises. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in this Lease or any exhibit to this Lease, Tenant shall at all times during the Term have the right, in a manner consistent with applicable law, to (a) determine the kind of container in which to store medical waste in the Premises prior to its disposal, (b) dispose of medical waste generated in the Premises, and/or (c) retain the services of a licensed independent contractor to dispose of the medical waste generated in the Premises.

ARTICLE 13 - INDEMNIFICATIONS

13.1. Indemnification by Tenant. Tenant agrees to indemnify and hold Landlord harmless against all claims, demands, costs and expenses, including reasonable attorney's fees for the defense thereof, arising from Tenant's conduct, management of Tenant's business, use and occupancy of

the Premises, construction of Alterations, breach of any of the terms and conditions of this Lease, or the negligence or willful misconduct of Tenant, its agents, servants, contractors or employees. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained herein, the foregoing provision shall not be construed to hold Tenant responsible for any loss, damage, liability or expense resulting from injuries caused by any negligence or intentional misconduct of Landlord, its guests, invitees, agents, servants, contractors or employees. In case of any action or proceeding brought against Landlord by reason of such claim as is described in the initial sentence of this paragraph, Tenant, upon written notice from Landlord, covenants to defend such action or proceeding by counsel reasonably acceptable to Landlord.

13.2. *Indemnification by Landlord.* Landlord agrees to indemnify and hold Tenant harmless against all claims, demands, costs and expenses, including reasonable attorney's fees for the defense thereof, arising from Landlord's conduct, management of Landlord's business, construction of improvements by Landlord including Landlord's Work, breach of any of the terms and conditions of this Lease, or the negligence or willful misconduct of Landlord, its guests, invitees, agents, servants, contractors or employees. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained herein, the foregoing provision shall not be construed to hold Landlord responsible for any loss, damage, liability or expense resulting from injuries caused by any negligence or intentional misconduct of Tenant, its agents, servants, contractors or employees. In case of any action or proceeding brought against Tenant by reason of such claim as is described in the initial sentence of this paragraph, Landlord, upon written notice from Tenant, covenants to defend such action or proceeding by counsel reasonably acceptable to Tenant.

ARTICLE 14 - DAMAGE AND DESTRUCTION

14.1. *Partial Damage or Destruction.* If no more than forty percent (40%) of the Property, Building, Premises or parking areas are partially destroyed from any cause and such damage or destruction renders the Premises partially inaccessible or unusable, Landlord shall promptly restore the Property, Building, Premises or parking areas to substantially the same condition as they were in immediately before the destruction within one hundred eighty (180) days after the date of such partial destruction. Base Rent shall be abated for the portion of the Premises not occupied by Tenant during the time of such restoration and for any portion of the Premises which may be occupied by Tenant, but which are unfit for the purposes permitted under this Lease. In the event that Landlord fails to restore the Property, Building, Premises or parking areas, as the case may be, within the one hundred eighty (180) day timeframe provided herein, Tenant shall have right to terminate this Lease upon ten (10) days notice to Landlord or exercise its rights under Section 17.4 of this Lease. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Landlord shall not be required to make any repairs or restorations that are prohibited by law, and Landlord shall not be liable for any inconvenience or annoyance to Tenant or its visitors, or injury to Tenant's business resulting in any way from such damage or the repair thereof.

14.2. *Complete Damage or Destruction.* If forty percent (40%) or more of the Property, Building, Premises or parking areas are destroyed from any cause, such damage shall be deemed a complete destruction for purposes of this Lease. In such event, Landlord shall, within sixty (60) days after the date of the casualty, commence its reconstruction. The following provisions shall apply in the event of a complete destruction:

- (a) Landlord and Tenant shall each have the right to terminate this Lease upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other party if Landlord's commercially reasonable determination of period for reconstruction will exceed two-hundred and seventy (270) days from the date of the casualty;
- (b) Base Rent shall be fully abated during the period beginning on the date of the casualty and ending on the date of completion of Landlord's restoration obligations as provided in this Article 14. If Tenant occupies a portion of the Premises during Landlord's restoration of the Premises, Base Rent shall be abated only for the portion of the Premises not occupied by Tenant.

14.3. *Damage Near End of Term.* Notwithstanding any other provision of this Article 14 to the contrary, if any portion of the Property, Building, Premises or parking areas are destroyed or damaged by a casualty during the last twelve (12) months of the Lease Term, Landlord and Tenant shall each have the option to terminate this Lease by giving ten (10) days written notice to the other party within thirty (30) days of the date of the casualty.

14.4. *Effective Date of Termination; Rent Apportionment.* If Landlord or Tenant elects to terminate this under this Article 14 in connection with a casualty, Tenant shall pay Base Rent properly apportioned up to the date of the casualty. After the effective date of the termination, Landlord and Tenant shall be discharged of all future obligations under this Lease, except for those provisions that, by their terms, survive the expiration or earlier termination of the Lease.

ARTICLE 15 - CONDEMNATION

15.1. *Condemnation.* If forty percent (40%) or more of the Premises or the parking serving the Premises is taken or condemned by any competent authority for any public or quasi-public use or purpose or is sold to the condemning authority in lieu of condemnation, and such condemnation renders the Premises inaccessible or unusable for Tenant's use, Landlord and Tenant shall each have the right to terminate this Lease upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other party. Tenant shall have the right to make such claims as may be available to Tenant under applicable law, provided such claims do not reduce the amount of condemnation proceeds available to Landlord.

15.2. *Apportionment of Base Rent.* If this Lease is terminated under this Article 15, Tenant shall only be obligated to pay Base Rent for the period up to, but not including, the termination date of this Lease. Landlord shall return to Tenant any prepaid Base Rent allocable to any period on or after the Termination Date.

ARTICLE 16 - ASSIGNMENT AND SUBLEASING

16.1. *Restriction on Landlord's Right to Alienate Property.* Prior to the Delivery Date, Landlord shall not be permitted to sell or otherwise transfer any portion of its interest in the Property or under this Lease without first obtaining the written consent of Tenant, which Tenant may grant or withhold in its sole discretion.

16.2. *Restricted Transfers by Tenant.* Except as provided in Section 16.3 of this Lease, Tenant shall not voluntarily assign, sublease or otherwise encumber any part of its interest in this Lease or in the Premises without Landlord's prior written consent, which shall not be unreasonably withheld, conditioned or delayed (a "Restricted Transfer"). Concurrent with Tenant's written

request for Landlord's consent to a transfer, Tenant shall provide Landlord with (a) information regarding the proposed transferee, including their name, address, and ownership profile, (b) the nature of the proposed transferee's business and anticipated use of the Premises; (c) current audited financial statements of the proposed transferee, and (d) all material terms of the proposed transfer, including the base rent to be paid by the proposed transferee for the term of the proposed assignment or sublease, the portion of the Premises to be transferred, a general description of any planned alterations or improvements to be made by the proposed transferee to the Premises, the effective date of the transfer, and copies of other relevant documentation concerning the proposed transfer to the extent then available.

16.2.1. *Standard of Landlord's Reasonableness.* It shall not be deemed unreasonable for Landlord to withhold consent to subletting or assignment by Tenant under this Lease if Landlord in its sole judgment determines that the proposed transferee (a) is of a character or is engaged in a business which is not in keeping with Landlord's standards for the Property, as determined solely by Landlord; (b) has a use which conflicts with the general character of the Property; (c) does not meet the then current commercially reasonable financial standards required by Landlord; or (d) is unacceptable because Tenant is in default beyond any applicable cure period under this Lease at the time of the request for Landlord's consent. Consent given by Landlord to any such assignment or subletting shall not operate as a waiver of the necessity for a consent to any subsequent assignment or subletting.

16.2.2. *Release of Tenant.* If Landlord consents to any Restricted Transfer, Tenant and any guarantor of this Lease shall thereafter be released from all liability under this Lease accruing after the date of the Restricted Transfer.

16.3. *Permitted Transfers by Tenant.* Notwithstanding Section 16.1, Tenant may assign this Lease or sublease the Premises in whole or in part, upon written notice to Landlord, but without the consent of Landlord, provided, however, that Tenant and any guarantor of this Lease shall not be released from any and all obligations and liabilities under the Lease to:

- (a) any entity into which or with which Tenant has merged or consolidated;
- (b) any parent, subsidiary, successor, or wholly-owned affiliated entity of Tenant;
- (c) any entity which acquires all or substantially all of the assets or issued and outstanding shares of capital stock of Tenant;
- (d) any partnership, the majority interest of which shall be owned by Tenant or a parent, subsidiary, successor or wholly-owned affiliate entity of Tenant;
- (e) any purchaser of substantially all of Tenant's assets located at the Premises, provided that any such assignee or successor shall agree in writing to assume and perform all of the terms and conditions of this Lease on Tenant's part to be performed from and after the effective date of such assignment or subletting; or
- (f) any medical director or any member of a medical director's practice associated with Tenant, provided that no more than ten percent (10%) of the Premises are transferred pursuant to this Section 16.2(f).
- (g) any other party, provided that Tenant and any guarantor of this Lease agree in writing to remain liable under this Lease.

16.4. Right to Collect Base Rent. If this Lease is assigned, Landlord shall collect Base Rent directly from the assignee. If all or part of the Premises is subleased and Tenant defaults, Landlord shall have the right to collect the base rent payable by the sublessee to Tenant directly from the sublessee provided that Landlord shall apply all amounts collected to Tenant's monetary obligations under this Lease.

ARTICLE 17 - DEFAULTS AND REMEDIES

17.1. Default by Tenant. The occurrence of any of the following shall constitute a default by Tenant under this Lease:

- (a) Tenant's first failure in any calendar year to pay when due any Base Rent or any other monetary obligation required to be paid under this Lease if the failure continues for ten (10) days after Tenant's receipt of written notice of its failure from Landlord to Tenant;
- (b) Tenant's second failure in any calendar year to pay when due any Base Rent or any other monetary obligation required to be paid under this Lease;
- (c) Tenant's failure to perform any other obligation under this Lease if the failure continues for thirty (30) days after Tenant's receipt of written notice of its failure from Landlord to Tenant. If the required cure of the noticed default cannot be completed within thirty (30) days, Tenant's failure to perform shall not constitute a default under this Lease if Tenant has taken steps to cure the failure and is diligently and continuously attempting to complete the cure as soon as reasonably possible;
- (d) The entry of an order for relief with respect to Tenant or any guarantor of this Lease under any chapter of the Federal Bankruptcy Code, the dissolution or liquidation of Tenant or any guarantor of this Lease, the appointment of a trustee or receiver to take possession of all or substantially all of Tenant's or any guarantor's assets or Tenant's interest under this Lease that is not discharged within thirty (30) days; or
- (e) The execution by Tenant or any guarantor of this Lease of an assignment for the benefit of creditors.

17.2. Landlord's Remedies on Tenant's Default. Upon the occurrence of any event of default by Tenant, Landlord shall have the following rights and remedies, each of which shall be cumulative and nonexclusive:

- (a) Terminate this Lease, in which event Tenant shall immediately surrender the Premises to Landlord and, if Tenant fails to do so, Landlord may without prejudice to any other remedy which it may have for possession or arrearages under this Lease enter upon and take possession of the Premises and expel or remove Tenant from the Premises or any part thereof, without being liable for prosecution for any claim for damages therefore;
- (b) Recover the following sums from Tenant:

- (i) any unpaid rent which has been earned at the time of such termination plus accrued interest thereon at the rate ten percent (10%) per annum; plus
 - (ii) the net present value, using a discount rate equal to ten percent (10%) per annum, of the unpaid rent for the balance of the Lease Term less any rental loss that Tenant proves could have been reasonably avoided; plus
 - (iii) any amounts reasonably expended by Landlord to restore the Premises to the condition the Premises were in as of the Commencement Date of this Lease;
- (c) Cure any default by Tenant by making any payment required to be made by Tenant (other than payments of Rent) or performing any of Tenant's other obligations under this Lease. Tenant shall repay any sums expended by Landlord pursuant to this Section within ten (10) days of Landlord's submission to Tenant of invoices and proof of payment. In the event that Tenant fails to reimburse Landlord hereunder, interest shall accrue on such sums at the rate of eighteen percent (18%) per annum unless such interest rate violates applicable usury laws, in which case interest shall accrue at the maximum allowable legal rate. No such payment or expenditure by Landlord shall be deemed a waiver of Tenant's default nor shall it affect any other remedy of Landlord by reason of such default; and
- (d) Accept any payments made by Tenant without waiving any rights under this Lease, including any rights that Landlord has to fully address and seek remedy for Tenant's default.

17.3. *Default by Landlord.* Landlord's failure to perform any its obligations under this Lease shall constitute a default by Landlord under the Lease if the failure continues for thirty (30) days after written notice of the failure from Tenant to Landlord. If the required cure of the noticed default cannot be completed within thirty (30) days, Landlord's failure to perform shall not constitute a default under this Lease if Landlord has taken steps to cure the failure within thirty (30) days and is diligently and continuously attempting to complete the cure as soon as reasonably possible.

Landlord hereby acknowledges that the infiltration of water into the Premises represents a health and safety hazard to Tenant, its employees, and its patients. Therefore, notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in this Section 17.3, Tenant shall have the right to exercise its rights pursuant to Section 17.4 of this Lease in the event that Tenant provides Landlord with written notice of a roof leak or other water infiltration into the Premises and Landlord fails to commence to repair the same within five (5) business days, and is diligently and continuously attempting to complete the cure as soon as reasonably possible.

17.4. *Tenant's Right of Self Help.* In the event of a default of this Lease by Landlord pursuant to Section 17.3, Tenant shall have the right, without waiving any claim of damages for breach of this Lease, at any time thereafter to cure such default for the account of Landlord. In exercising its self-help rights pursuant to this Section 17.4, Tenant shall have the right to use contractors of its choosing. Landlord hereby grants to Tenant and Tenant's contractors a license, effective during the Lease Term, to enter those portions of the Property, Building, and Premises that are reasonably necessary for Tenant to take such action. Any reasonable amount paid or any liability reasonably incurred by Tenant in exercising its self-help rights pursuant to this Section 17.4 shall be deemed paid or incurred for the account of Landlord and Landlord shall reimburse Tenant therefore within ten (10) days of Tenant's submission of invoices and proof of Tenant's payment of such invoices. In the event that Landlord fails to reimburse Tenant as provided herein, such failure shall be considered a material breach of this Lease and the following provisions shall apply:

- (i) Interest shall accrue on such unpaid amounts at the rate of eighteen percent (18%) per annum unless such interest rate violates applicable usury laws, in which case interest shall accrue at the maximum allowable legal rate; and
- (ii) Tenant may deduct the full cost incurred in curing Landlord's default and any accrued interest thereon pursuant to Section 17.4(i) of this Lease from future payments of Base Rent.

ARTICLE 18 - HOLDING OVER

18.1. Holdover Rent. If Tenant remains in possession of the Premises after the expiration or earlier termination of this Lease, Tenant's occupancy shall be deemed a month-to-month tenancy upon the same terms and conditions of this Lease except that (a) Base Rent shall be equal to One hundred twenty-five (125%) of the Base Rent paid by Tenant to Landlord for the month in which this Lease expired or was otherwise terminated and (b) Tenant shall not have any right to extend the Lease Term.

18.2. Limitation on Tenant's Liability for Holdover. Tenant shall not be liable for any damages sustained by Landlord on account of Tenant's holdover unless Landlord provides Tenant with thirty (30) days written notice to vacate the Premises and Tenant thereafter fails to do so.

ARTICLE 19 - SURRENDER OF PREMISES

19.1. Surrender of Premises. Upon the expiration or earlier termination of this Lease, Tenant, at its sole cost and expense, shall remove all debris and rubbish from the Premises. Tenant shall quit the Premises and surrender possession thereof to Landlord in broom clean condition except for reasonable wear and tear and damage caused by acts of God, Landlord, casualties, and/or condemnation.

19.2. Removal of Tenant's Trade Fixture and Personal Property. Tenant shall remove from the Premises all movable trade fixtures and personal property of Tenant including furniture, equipment, freestanding cabinetwork, and other articles of personal property owned by Tenant. Tenant's water treatment equipment and process piping shall be considered one of Tenant's trade fixtures for purposes of this Lease. Tenant shall repair all damage to the Premises and the Building resulting from such removal. If Tenant fails to remove any of its trade fixtures or personal property on or before the expiration or earlier termination of this Lease, said trade fixtures and personal property shall become the property of Landlord.

19.3. Removal of Tenant Alterations. Tenant shall have the right, but not the obligation, to remove Alterations installed on or in the Premises by Tenant during the Lease Term pursuant to Article 5 of this Lease. In the event that Tenant removes any Alterations pursuant to this Section 19.3, Tenant shall, at Tenant's expense, repair all damage to the Building and the Premises resulting from such removal. In the event Tenant does not remove any Alterations prior to the expiration or earlier termination of this Lease, such Tenant Alterations not so removed shall be conclusively deemed abandoned by Tenant and title thereto shall pass to Landlord without any payment or credit to Tenant.

ARTICLE 20 - ESTOPPEL CERTIFICATES

20.1. *Obligation to Provide Estoppel Certificates.* Within twenty-one (21) days after receipt of a written request by Landlord, Tenant shall execute and deliver a commercially reasonable estoppel certificate or other form required by any existing or prospective lender, mortgagee, or purchaser of all or part of the Property or the Building. Tenant shall be permitted to indicate in the estoppel certificate any exceptions to the statements contained therein that may exist at the time Tenant executes the certificate. Tenant shall also execute and deliver such other documents or instruments may be reasonably required for the purpose of supporting Landlord's underlying transaction.

ARTICLE 21 - SUBORDINATION, NONDISTURBANCE, AND ATTORNMENT

21.1. *Automatic Subordination of this Lease.* This Lease shall at all times be subject and subordinate to the lien of any mortgages, deeds of trust, ground leases, or other encumbrances recorded now or subsequently against the Premises or the Property and all renewals, modifications, re-financings and extensions thereof (collectively, "Encumbrances"). This clause shall be self-operative, but within twenty-one (21) days after the receipt of a written request from Landlord or any Encumbrance holder, Tenant shall execute a commercially reasonable subordination agreement together with any customary additional documents evidencing the priority of the Encumbrance and the subordination of this Lease with respect to such Encumbrance. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Tenant shall not be required to execute any agreement or other documentation that materially increases Tenant's obligations during the remainder of the Lease Term or adversely alters or negates any of Tenant's rights and remedies granted under this Lease or applicable law.

21.2. *Non-Disturbance and Attornment.* Provided that Tenant's occupancy of the Premises is not disturbed and that the terms and conditions of this Lease are honored by the transferee of Landlord's interest in the Property, Tenant covenants and agrees to attorn to the transferee of Landlord's interest in the Property by foreclosure, deed in lieu of foreclosure, exercise of any remedy provided in any Encumbrance or underlying lease, or operation of law, and to recognize such transferee as the new landlord under this Lease. In the event any Encumbrance holder notifies Tenant of such a transfer of Landlord's interest in the Property, Landlord agrees that Tenant shall not be liable for making payments of Base Rent or any other sums due pursuant the terms of this Lease directly to the transferee.

21.3. *Modifications of Lease Required by Landlord's Lender.* If any institutional lender of Landlord requests a modification of this Lease, Tenant shall endeavor in good faith to agree to that modification and to prepare and execute an amendment to this Lease so long as (a) Base Rent and any other amounts required to be paid under this Lease are not changed, (b) the time for and manner of payments under this Lease are not changed, (c) the Lease Term (including any Option Terms and the times governing Tenant's exercise of any options) is not changed, (d) Tenant's possession of the Premises and rights to possession and use of other parts of the Building and Property are not changed, (e) Landlord's obligations to Tenant under this Lease are not reduced, (f) Tenant's obligations to Landlord under this Lease are not increased, and (g) the proposed modification does not materially or adversely change the other rights and obligations of Tenant under this Lease or applicable law. As a condition of Tenant's obligation to execute an amendment, Landlord shall reimburse Tenant for its costs, including reasonable attorney fees, that are incurred in connection with the review, negotiation, and preparation of the amendment.

ARTICLE 22 - FORCE MAJEURE

22.1. *Force Majeure.* Except for the payment of any monies due by one party to the other under the terms and conditions of this Lease, whenever a period of time is prescribed herein for the taking of an action by Landlord or Tenant, such party shall not be liable or responsible for, and there shall be excluded from the computation of any such period of time, any delays due to strikes, acts of God, governmental approval delays, shortages of labor or materials, war, terrorist acts, civil disturbances and other causes beyond the reasonable control of the performing party.

ARTICLE 23 - SIGNS

23.1. *Building Name; Landlord's Signage Rights and Obligations.* Subject to Tenant's signage rights under this Article 23, Landlord may at any time change the name of the Building and install, affix, and maintain all signs on the exterior of the Building as Landlord may, in Landlord's sole discretion, desire. Tenant may use the name of the Building or pictures or illustrations of the Building in its advertising or other publicity during the Lease Term. Landlord shall, at its sole cost and expense, install Tenant's name and suite number on all signage located on the Property.

23.2. *Tenant's Signage Rights.* Tenant shall have the right, at its sole cost and expense, to erect, affix or display such signs or sign advertising its business as Tenant may consider necessary or desirable on the exterior or interior walls, doors, or windows of the Premises, and in locations on the Building, the Property and/or exterior monuments where other tenant's signs are located. If permitted by the applicable association(s), Tenant shall have the right to install directional signs in the parking areas of the Property that indicate the location of the Premises. The location of all signs installed by Tenant pursuant to this Section 23.2 shall be subject to Landlord's consent, which shall not be unreasonably withheld, conditioned or delayed. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Landlord hereby consents to Tenant's approved signage criteria provided by Tenant and as outlined in Exhibit H attached hereto, if any. All such signs and the location thereof shall be subject to local ordinances governing the same and it shall be Tenant's responsibility to comply fully with local ordinances.

23.3 *Compliance with Laws.* Notwithstanding anything contained in this Article 23 to the contrary, Tenant's signage shall be subject to all governmental and quasi-governmental consents, approvals and permits as may be necessary in order for Tenant to erect its signage. Landlord agrees to cooperate with Tenant, at no cost to Landlord, in the filing any required applications for governmental approvals for signage.

23.4. *Removal of Tenant's Signs Upon Lease Termination.* Tenant shall promptly and permanently remove all of its signs installed pursuant to Section 23.2 of this Lease upon the termination or earlier expiration of this Lease.

ARTICLE 24 - PARKING

24.1. *Grant of Parking Rights.* Landlord, at no cost to Tenant, shall provide Tenant with sufficient parking for Tenant's employees and patients in a location adjacent to the Premises as outlined in Exhibit B. Such parking shall be provided in accordance with all applicable federal, state and local laws, ordinances and regulations. Except as may be required under the covenants, conditions and restrictions referenced in Exhibit D hereafter and except for repaving and/or re-striping, Landlord

shall not be permitted to make changes to any parking spaces located within seventy-five feet (75') of the Premises during the Lease Term.

ARTICLE 25 - BROKERS

25.1. *Brokers.* Landlord and Tenant hereby represent to each other that they know of no real estate broker or agent who is entitled to a commission or finder's fee in connection with this Lease, other than Layton Lane Partners, Inc. ("Broker"). Each party shall indemnify, protect, defend, and hold harmless the other party against all claims, demands, losses, liabilities, lawsuits, judgments, and costs and expenses (including reasonable attorney fees) for any leasing commission, finder's fee, or equivalent compensation alleged to be owing on account of the indemnifying party's dealings with any real estate broker or agent, other than Broker. The terms of this Article 25 shall survive the expiration or earlier termination of this Lease.

ARTICLE 26 - MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

26.1. *Quiet Enjoyment.* Provided that Tenant performs all of its obligations under this Lease, Tenant shall peaceably and quietly hold and enjoy the Premises for the Lease Term, without hindrance from Landlord or any party claiming by, through, or under Landlord.

26.2. *Minimization of Interference.* Landlord shall exercise its rights and perform its obligations under this Lease in such a way as to minimize any resulting interference with Tenant's use of the Premises. Tenant shall exercise its rights and perform its obligations under this Lease in such a way as to reasonably minimize any resulting interference with the operation of the Property and the Building.

26.3. *Application of Payments; No Accord and Satisfaction.* All payments received by either party under the terms of this Lease shall be applied to the oldest payment obligation then owed by the payor. No designation contained in a separate writing or on a check or money order shall (a) modify this clause or have any force or effect without the written consent of the other party or (b) constitute an accord and satisfaction. Each party may accept checks or payments without prejudice to its right to recover all other amounts due under this Lease and to pursue all other remedies provided for in this Lease and applicable law. In no event shall the provisions of this Section 26.3 limit, hinder or otherwise prevent Tenant from exercising any of its offset rights pursuant to the terms of this Lease.

26.4. *No Waivers.* No waiver of any provision of this Lease shall be implied by any failure of either party to enforce any remedy for the violation of that provision, even if that violation continues or is repeated. Any waiver by a party of any provision of this Lease must be in writing, and such written waiver shall affect only the provision(s) specified and only for the time and in the manner stated in the writing.

26.5. *Captions.* The captions of articles and sections of this Lease are for convenience only and shall have no effect on the interpretation of the provisions of this Lease.

26.6. *Time of the Essence.* Time is of the essence of this Lease and each of its provisions.

26.7. *Recording—Memorandum of Lease.* This Lease shall not be recorded but, at the request of the other party, Landlord and Tenant shall execute, acknowledge before a notary public, and

deliver a memorandum of lease. The costs of recording any memorandum of lease shall be borne by the party requesting its execution.

26.8. Authority. Landlord and Tenant each warrant and represent to each other that the individuals executing this Lease are duly authorized to execute and deliver this Lease and, once fully executed and delivered, this Lease constitutes a valid, legal and binding obligation enforceable in accordance with the terms and conditions contained herein.

26.9. Binding Effect. This Lease shall bind and benefit the parties to this Lease and their legal representatives and successors in interest.

26.10. Governing Law; Venue. This Lease shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the state in which the Property is located without regard to the conflict of law principles thereof. Any action or proceeding in respect of any claim arising out of or related to this Lease, whether in tort or contract or at law or in equity, shall be filed in the state or federal court of competent jurisdiction located geographically closest to the Premises.

26.11. Attorney Fees and Costs. If either party undertakes litigation against the other party arising out of or in connection with this Lease, the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover from the other party reasonable attorney fees and all incurred court costs.

26.12. Interpretation of Lease Provisions. Landlord and Tenant hereby acknowledge that the terms and conditions of this Lease were reached after an arms-length negotiation, that both parties participated in the drafting and preparation of this Lease, and that both parties had the opportunity to seek the advice of counsel prior to the execution and delivery of this Lease. As such, Landlord and Tenant hereby agree that the rule of construction that a document be construed most strictly against the party that prepared the document shall not be applied.

26.13. Severability. If a court of competent jurisdiction holds any provision of this Lease invalid or unenforceable in whole or in part for any reason, the validity and enforceability of the remaining clauses shall not be affected.

26.14. Exhibits; Entire Agreement; Amendments. The Exhibits attached to this Lease are a part of this Lease and incorporated into this Lease by reference. This Lease and all exhibits thereto constitute the final, complete, and exclusive statement of the terms of the agreement between Landlord and Tenant pertaining to Tenant's lease of the Premises and supersedes all prior and contemporaneous understandings or agreements of the parties. Neither party has been induced to enter into this Lease by, and neither party is relying on, any representation or warranty outside those expressly set forth in this Lease. This Lease may be amended only by an agreement in writing signed by Landlord and Tenant.

26.15. Notices. All notices (including requests, demands, approvals, or other communications) under this Lease shall be made in writing and sent by prepaid certified mail with return receipt requested or by a nationally recognized overnight delivery service (e.g. Federal Express, DHL, United Parcel Service) with charges prepaid or charged to the sender's account and sent to the following addresses:

All notices shall be effective on delivery if delivery is confirmed by the delivery service. Any correctly addressed notice that is refused, unclaimed, or undeliverable because of an act or omission of the party to be notified shall be considered to be effective as of the first date that the notice was refused, unclaimed, or considered undeliverable by the postal authorities or overnight delivery service. Either party may change its address by giving the other party notice of the change in any manner permitted by this Section 26.15.

26.16. Consents. Unless a different standard is specifically stated in the applicable section of this Lease, whenever the consent of either party is required, such consent shall not be unreasonably withheld, conditioned, or delayed.

26.17. Zoning and Flood Plain. Landlord warrants and represents that the Premises is zoned for Tenant's use and is not located in a flood plain.

26.18. Conditions, Covenants and Restrictions Affecting Title. Landlord hereby represents and warrants to Tenant that, except as provided in Exhibit D, and to Landlord's knowledge, there are no conditions, covenants and/or restrictions affecting Landlord's title to the Property that (i) conflict with any of the terms or conditions contained in this Lease or (ii) prohibit Tenant's permitted use of the Premises pursuant to Section 4.1 of this Lease. Copies of all documents that may conflict with the terms of this Lease or affect Tenant's use of the Premises, the Building, the Property or the parking areas are attached hereto as Exhibit D.

26.19. Guaranty. This Lease shall be guaranteed by Fresenius Medical Care Holdings, Inc. in the form attached hereto as Exhibit E.

26.20. Landlord Partnership Structure. Landlord represents and warrants that each investor in Landlord, who is a Referral Source (as defined herein) to Tenant, has contributed capital to

Landlord in an amount that is at a minimum proportionate to said Referral Source's ownership interest in Landlord. A Referral Source is an individual or entity which (i) is a source of patient referrals to Tenant, or any of its affiliates, or subsidiaries; (ii) a purchaser of items or services from Tenant, or any of its affiliates, or subsidiaries that are reimbursable by any federal or state health care program; or (iii) a seller to Tenant, or any of its affiliates, or subsidiaries of items or services for which Tenant, or any of its affiliates, or subsidiaries makes claims for reimbursement under any federal or state health care program.

26.21. *Exclusivity*. Provided that Tenant is then open and operating within the Premises, and is not then in default under any of the provisions of this Lease, Landlord, its affiliates and subsidiaries shall not lease space or sell real property within a five (5) mile radius of the Property to any other tenant/ buyer for the purpose of the Permitted Use.

26.22. *W-9*. In connection with Tenant's payment of Base Rent, Landlord shall provide the applicable information and sign the W-9 Form attached hereto as Exhibit G.

26.23. *CON Contingency*. Landlord and Tenant understand and agree that the establishment of any outpatient dialysis facility in the State of Washington is subject to Tenant obtaining a Certificate of Need ("CON") from the Washington State Department of Health ("Department"). Tenant agrees to proceed using its commercially reasonable efforts to submit an application for a CON and to prosecute said application to obtain the CON from the Department. In light of the foregoing facts, the parties agree that the Lease is contingent upon Tenant's receipt of a CON for the Premises either after the Department's evaluation or on appeal, if applicable. In the event that the Department does not award Tenant a CON for the Premises, this Lease shall be deemed null and void, neither party shall have any further obligation to the other party with respect to the Lease.

26.24. *Shared Values*. As stated in the Fresenius Medical Care Code of Ethics and Business Conduct, Tenant upholds the values of quality, honesty and integrity, innovation and improvement, respect and dignity, as well as lawful conduct, especially with regard to anti-bribery and anti-corruption. Tenant upholds these values in its own operations, as well as in its relationships with business partners. Tenant's continued success and reputation depends on a common commitment to act accordingly. Together with Tenant, Landlord is committed to uphold these fundamental values by adherence to applicable laws and regulations.

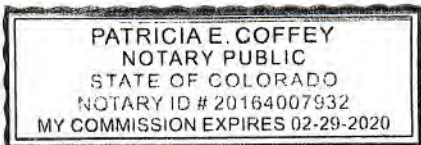

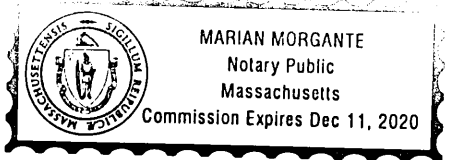

A Ground-Up Shell Building construction project is one in which Landlord constructs a shell building structure, utilities, parking, landscaping, and site improvements to Tenant’s specifications. Tenant’s specifications are intended to allow Landlord’s completed project to function as a “Build to Suit” structure accommodating interior build-out by Tenant into an outpatient dialysis facility.

Building shall consist of a conventionally built structure, with a low slope roof. Developer must ensure selected building type is allowed by authorities having jurisdiction and bring all variances to RECS-ATL for written approval.

The site and shell set of drawings shall include a site plan containing, but not limited to, the property boundaries, setbacks, curb cuts, topography, parking layout, exterior lighting, and depiction of the location of all incoming required utilities. Utilities shall include but not be limited to electrical service, gas service, domestic water supply, irrigation water supply, fire line water supply, waste line (sewer), Telephone service, cable TV service. Shell building shall be based on the approved preliminary plan of the interior build-out prepared by Tenant.

Landlord shall abide by Tenant’s Design and Construction Services Agreement (see separate agreement), be responsible for hiring Registered Architects, Engineers, and any other persons necessary to prepare and provide Tenant the necessary design documents as described below and in the Lease.

DEFINITIONS AND EXPLANATION OF ITEMS IN MATRIX ABOVE:

DIVISION 1-GENERAL REQUIREMENTS:

1. ALTA SURVEY: Landlord is to provide Tenant a site survey (ALTA) in PDF file format which shall include, but not be limited to, property boundaries, utility locations, roads curbing, sewers and topography.
2. ENVIRONMENTAL REPORTS: Landlord is to provide Tenant environmental reports (Phase I, and II if recommended in Phase I report) less than 6 months old conforming to engineering standards for tenant's review and approval.
3. GEOTECHNICAL TESTING: Provide soil borings of the site performed by a qualified Geotechnical Engineer to determine bearing capacity and stability of the soil (quantity and location to be approved by Tenant).
4. SOILS COMPACTION TESTING: Compact the soil to 95% compaction beneath the floor slab prior to the installation of under slab vapor barrier, piping, scale and electrical conduit. Compaction shall be verified by a testing agency hired by the developer.
5. SLAB MOISTURE TESTING: A slab vapor emission and relative humidity test report must be performed by independent third-party testing agency (Independent Floor Testing, Inc. preferred). Testing performed by flooring installer is not allowed. The agency must utilize ASTM standards (F2170, F1869) to test and verify if the slab meets vapor and relative humidity tolerances required

to install floor finishes without mitigation. See Attachment "A". Provide a copy of the report to Tenant's representative for verification that the slab meets these requirements. In the event that the Tenant's vapor emission and/or relative humidity requirements are not met, the Landlord will reimburse Tenant for costs to rectify issue to above noted parameters with Tenant's GC team.

6. PERMITS, IMPACT AND TAPPING FEES: Obtain, pay and pull permits including for impact and tapping fees. See utility matrix for general guidance.

7. CLOSEOUT AND RECORD DOCUMENTS:

A. Landlord to provide one set of record documents and drawings (completed Landlord's work) to Tenant in PDF and AutoCAD 2013 formats. Deliver electronically to Tenant with each record drawing as a separate file, properly titled and dated, indicating the preparer. These record drawings shall become the property of the Tenant.

B. Operating and Maintenance Manuals: Where available, manuals shall be submitted containing the following:

- 1) Description of the system provided with detailed description of the function of each principal component of the systems or equipment.
- 2) Operating procedures, including pre-startup, startup, normal operation, emergency shutdown, normal shutdown and troubleshooting.
- 3) Maintenance procedures including lubrication requirements, intervals between lubrication, preventative and repair procedures, and complete spare parts list with cross reference to original equipment manufacturer's part numbers.
- 4) Control and alarm features including schematic of control systems, control loop electric ladder diagrams, controller operating set points, settings for alarms and shutdown systems, pump and fan curves.
- 5) Safety and environmental considerations.

C. One copy of the manuals shall be provided within two weeks of completion of Landlord's work to allow for training of Tenant's personnel. The requirement for manuals applies to each packaged and field-fabricated operating system. The manuals shall be provided in three-ring side binders with durable plastic covers as well as electronic files via team Dropbox. The manuals shall contain a detailed table of contents and have tab dividers for major sections and special equipment.

8. LANDLORD DELIVERABLES:

Landlord to complete the following and provide checklist with Tenant signoff prior to turnover of building to Tenant:

- 1) Advise Tenant of insurance change over requirements.

- 2) Submit all warranties, maintenance contracts, final certificates and similar documents.
 - a. Complete warranty contact and information: items warranted, duration of warranty, landlord notification process, etc.
- 3) Deliver maintenance (attic) stock of materials where specified.
- 4) Make final changeover of lock cylinders or cores and advise Tenant of change of security responsibility in writing.
- 5) Complete startup of all systems and instruct Tenant's personnel in proper operation and routine maintenance of systems and equipment.
- 6) Provide factory representative's certification HVAC is working according to performance specifications.
- 7) Remove all temporary facilities and utilities no longer needed.
- 8) Submit final meter readings, record of stored fuel and similar information.
- 9) Provide listing of utility accounts, meter numbers, account numbers, etc. for the transition of services into Tenant's name and account.
- 10) Conduct Punchlist walk through with Tenant team for creation and resolve of all outstanding or noted deficient items within 10 working days.

DIVISION 2-SITework:

9. CIVIL (DESIGN, UTILITIES, TESTING): Provide all site engineering required for permitting and construction. Site plans must be prepared by a registered Civil Engineer and submitted to the Tenant for review and approval before any work is started. Responsibility for designing, constructing, complying with all codes and jurisdictional laws and bringing all utilities required by Tenant into Tenant's premises, at a mutually agreed upon location per approved plans, and depth (in case of sewer). Underground utility services to enter via rear of Tenant's space. This includes water (including fire loop, and irrigation), storm sewer, sanitary sewer (including condensate drain), electrical, natural gas, and fire protection (sprinklers) in the sizes and water pressures shown in the utility matrix below. All MEP rooms located outside of Tenant premises (in case of multi-tenant building) must be accessible to Tenant's staff at all times. All utilities (except fire protection) shall be exclusive for Tenant's use. Engage a qualified independent geotechnical engineering testing agency to perform field quality control testing.
10. INDIVIDUAL METERS/SUB-METERS (WATER, ELECTRIC, GAS): Individual meters shall be supplied and installed in locations coordinated with Tenant. Full line size water meter shall be supplied. Indicate meter identification numbers.
11. BACKFLOW PREVENTER FOR DOMESTIC WATER, FIRE SPRINKLER AND LANDSCAPE IRRIGATION IN HOT BOXES: Systems must have backflow preventers meeting code for domestic water, fire sprinkler and landscape irrigation (if applicable) in hot boxes.

- * Volume of water for Tenant's use only, not inclusive of capacity for other tenants and/or irrigation. Where services are shared with other tenants or uses, a fixture count for confirmation of available service is required. Dedicated water with dynamic pressure of 60 psi and 30 g.p.m. required post backflow preventers. Separate taps for domestic water, irrigation and fire are required to ensure line volume, pressure and size meet tenant's specifications.
- ** Volume of sanitary waste for Tenant's use only, not inclusive of capacity for other tenants. Where services are shared with other tenants, a water drainage volume analysis for confirmation of available service is required. Tenant's Team (PES, Architect, Engineer, TM, PM, Bio-med) to take into consideration current water drainage volume analysis, compare to estimated Tenant's requirements, and determine the minimum size of sewer required for Tenant's use.
- *** If natural gas is not available, then add an estimated 200-400 Amps to electric service guidance in the matrix. Electric service is an estimate and will always need to be sized by Tenant's electrical engineer.

15. **PARKING, ACCESS AND HARDSCAPING:** Site paved surfaces should allow for easy access to staff and visitors, parking, delivery trailer trucks, sanitary vehicles and unobstructed access to building by fire rescue.

Provide roadways consisting of minimum of 4", and parking consisting of minimum of 2½" bituminous asphalt on a 6" compacted base for general parking & roads. Actual depth of roadways and parking shall follow recommendations listed in project's Geo-technical report. Single lanes shall have 12'-0" min. width and curved lanes 14'-6" min., each additional lane 12'-0". Multiple straight lanes shall be 10'-6" min.

Parking spaces shall be at the minimum rate of 1 per 333 square feet of building area (preferred by Tenant) or per local codes, whichever is greater. Parking spaces shall be code compliant and designed so parked vehicles do not obstruct adjacent routes of travel. Provide HC parking at a rate of 10% of total parking spaces or per local code, whichever is greater. One HC parking stall must be designated as van parking. HC parking should be located along building where affected staff and visitors will not cross active drive aisles and along accessible pathway(s) to the building entrance. Provide parking lot striping for standard and handicap spaces, patient drop off area, accessible aisles adjacent to HC parking spaces, HC designation and signage.

Accessible aisles servicing handicapped cars shall be 60" wide min. and aisles servicing vans spaces shall be 96" min. per code and shall extend the full length of the parking spaces they serve. Aisles must be marked to discourage parking and must not overlap the vehicular way. Accessible aisles servicing vans can be located at either side of parking space except at angled van parking spaces which shall have access aisles located on the passenger's side of the parking spaces.

Layout shall provide 50' direct/ straight access for sanitary vehicles, with 14 feet of vertical clearance over the entire approach and 32 feet above the dumpster enclosure. Provide a 6" reinforced concrete loading area (12 ft long x width of enclosed area) in front of enclosure gates.

Provide delivery ramp or curb cut providing access from delivery area to delivery door(s). Must have 60+ inches clear (includes door swing area) if delivery door(s) is(are) approached from the side, or 48+ inches clear if approached from straight on.

Buildings must have extruded curbs or fully formed curb & gutters only as required to meet code. Tenant preference to have minimal curbs and utilize wheel stops in all parking spaces.

Hardscaping i.e. sidewalk or ramp added adjacent to building must be doweled into building structure and include frost slab foundation starting below frost line (depth required is region specific).

16. **REINFORCED CONCRETE DUMPSTER AND DELIVERY PADS WITH BOLLARDS:** Provide reinforced concrete dumpster pad with enclosure and gates per all local code requirements for Tenant's use at both delivery and dumpster areas (two dumpsters if recycling or waste volume requires it, 10 yards each) at location agreed upon by Tenant and Landlord. Reinforced concrete dumpster loading pad shall extend 12ft out in front of gates. Concrete pad at the dumpster and at delivery areas shall be constructed of 6" minimum 3000 PSI reinforced Portland cement concrete on an 8" compacted base. Concrete delivery ramps must meet max. 1:12 slope, min. 6' clear width and ADA compliant handrails and guardrails. Design to include pallet access from drive lane to delivery door for end user (Flush or ramp condition).

Dumpsters shall not be installed behind parking spaces, in front of fire hydrants, or within 5 feet of a combustible wall, opening or building eave. There shall be a 50'-0" unobstructed approach beyond the extent of the enclosure gate opening. Enclosure shall hold the dumpsters, provide a 2-foot clearance from interior walls to each side of the dumpsters (provide wheel stops or bumpers), and shall be 6 feet high or at least 6 inches above the top of the dumpster. When required, gates must be a minimum of 16 feet wide with no intermediate posts. When gates are opened, they shall not infringe on traffic aisles, gates shall clear 180 degrees when secured open. Extend concrete pad a minimum of 12' in front of gates flush with drive access and provide painted metal bollards to protect enclosure and gates.

17. **REINFORCED CONCRETE GENERATOR PAD WITH BOLLARDS AND CONDUITS TO ATS:** If Tenant elects to have an onsite generator at the property, provide reinforced concrete generator pad with imbedded anchor rods and fence enclosure per Tenant's details at location adjacent to Mechanical/Electrical area, away from air intakes, storm drains and where noise may not interfere with adjacent use. Landlord agrees to coordinate with Tenant and authorities having jurisdiction for mutually acceptable locations. Tenant to provide proposed generator size, pad dimensions and thickness. Landlord to provide and install switches and oversized conduits from generator to ATS per Tenant's specifications and electrical drawings. Work to include a) modification or replacement of hardscape and/or landscape as required throughout path of conduit, pad and devices; b) providing and installing required enclosures, fencing, bollards and protection per local and state code. Enclosure and gates to meet at minimum local building codes. Install conduit stub-up in pad and underground connections between pad and building. When provided, Generator unit is OFIC. See item 62.

18. **MECHANICAL PADS:** Where roof top may not be used for HVAC equipment, provide ground mounted pad(s). Pads to be located in an area of suitable size for pad installation. Size will vary based on unit selection and should be at least 6" greater than the unit's overall base dimensions. Landlord A-E to follow manufacturer's and code recommendations / requirements for location, spacing and free air movement. Pad shall be one-piece level concrete slab with a min. thickness of 6".

19. **BOLLARDS:** Provide 6" diameter x 48" height, concrete filled steel pipe bollards painted yellow at each corner of the enclosures (Dumpster and Generator) and as necessary to protect equipment or enclosure. Bollards shall be provided in front of natural gas mains outside of the facility to prevent accidental contact. Pre-cast cement bollards 12" diameter x 34" high shall be provided if parking spaces or drop-off areas are located immediately adjacent to glazed exterior walls or patient care areas. When there is a grass buffer area or a curb lower than 6" between parking spaces or drop-off area and glazed walls or patient care areas, wheel stops shall be provided. When required, pre-cast cement bollards 12" diameter x 34" high shall be provided at column supports for the patient drop-off area and to protect all emergency exit doors if located adjacent to parking or driveways. In locations where there

are no curbs or landscaping buffers between vehicular circulation and the building corners, provide bollards for protection.

20. **LANDSCAPING:** Landscaping design shall take safety, accessibility, screening, sound attenuation and overall aesthetics into consideration, and shall meet or exceed all local code requirements. Landlord shall submit design documents to Tenant for review and approval before providing and installing. Complete irrigation system shall have separate tap and meter. When possible, create islands large enough to accommodate a mixture of canopy trees, flowering trees, evergreen trees, shrubs and flowers. Avoid plants that drop fruit and/or sap. Treatment Room shall have priority for most favorable view of landscaped areas. To eliminate the need for supplemental irrigation, tenant recommends xeriscaping when possible. Xeriscaping is the use of appropriate regionally available water conserving plants.
21. **SITE FENCING:** Provide site fencing where required by local authority to meet or exceed minimum local standards. Fencing design to be submitted to Tenant for review and approval before any work is started.
22. **PATIENT DROP OFF AREA:** Provide a reinforced concrete vehicle pad for patient drop off area, flush with the patient building entrance. Drop off area (and main entrance to the building) should be partially covered with a cantilevered canopy and shall have additional width to accommodate ADA patient entrance door requirements.

Only when required and approved by Tenant, provide a covered patient drop-off area (porte-cochere) at patient entrance constructed of the same material as the building exterior. Drop off and queuing zone cannot overlap vehicular way or obstruct traffic, should be marked as a “no parking” area, and provide a minimum vehicle queuing area 20' long. Provide fire suppression system in to porte-cochere ceiling to meet NFPA 13 and all state and local codes. Provide painted metal bollards to protect the walkway, porte-cochere columns, patient entrance, and all emergency exit doors if located adjacent to parking or driveways. In area subject to snow and ice, heated concrete pad at patient drop off area may be considered for patient safety – it must be required and approved by Tenant.

Porte cochere should provide a 14'-0" high vehicle clearance with recessed down lighting, and a min. 20' clear width to accommodate a 14' wide drop-off vehicle lane and additional patient entrance door clearance requirements. Clearance height signage to be posted above the traffic entrance. If roof is sloped it shall be designed to minimize the risk of falling snow or ice. Snow cleats, guards, etc. shall be installed.

23. **SITE LIGHTING:** Provide site lighting for parking areas and sidewalks including parking lot pole lights at the rate of 1 per 10 parking spaces, side walk illumination, drop off & delivery area illumination, and building mounted lighting. Lighting at every point within a means of egress leading from the building exit to a public way shall be illuminated with a 2 bulbs battery backup fixture. All fixtures along the egress path shall have battery backup or other code compliant means of emergency power in case of power failure. Provide general yard lighting from fixtures mounted on building and/or 24'-0" high minimum lighting poles at fence line. All site lighting should meet minimum local standards or 2.0-foot candles on average measured at the walking surface, whichever is more restrictive.
24. **SIGNAGE-WAYFINDING AND IDENTIFICATION:** Provide site signage to identify the site entrance and exit, the building entry, as well as parking and delivery areas. All buildings shall have a street address number on or near the main entrance. Signage shall not be located in a manner that would

confuse or obstruct traffic. Signs shall be provided informing drivers of clearances and location of accessible and van accessible parking. Accessibility signage shall be provided per ADAAG and state/local regulations, accessibility signs shall be located at 5'-0" from finished grade or top of sidewalk to the sign's center line. Signs shall be anchored securely to building or on rust inhibitive metal sign posts.

25. MONUMENT SIGNAGE: Provide a concrete base for Tenant's monument sign. Provide underground electric power to the free-standing sign location near the driveway entrance with electric power for lighting. Use Tenant's signage specifications and details (to be provided approximately 6 weeks after site selection) and coordinate locations of sign base and building signage with Tenant.
26. CLEARING, GRADING, TESTING, ETC.: Provide clearing, grubbing, fill, blasting, grading, excavations, and other work necessary to prepare the site for development. Testing agency to provide reporting to confirm construction meeting application requirements of ASTM for soil, subgrade, trenches, asphalt and concrete construction. Site grading shall maintain ADA compliance, and 2% slope away from building.
27. TERMITE PROTECTION: Provide pest control service. Engage a national licensed professional pest control company for application of federal registered (EPA) termite soil treatment solution after excavation, filling and grading operations are complete. Termiticide shall be applied before placement of under slab, compacted gravel as recommended by the pest control company. Product and installation shall be warranted, by the national pest control company, for a period of 5 years from date of treatments.

DIVISION 3 - CONCRETE:

28. FOUNDATION AND FLOOR SLAB: Foundations and floor slabs must be designed by a registered Structural Engineer. Provide engineered foundations of poured in place concrete with appropriate reinforcing. All foundations and layout to confirm coordination with Tenant's under slab scope of work, building utilities design and requirements. Provide interior floor slab of 4" thick concrete with welded wire fabric over the vapor retarder after all under slab sanitary piping and electrical conduit work are complete per the Tenant's design. Concrete shall have a water/cement ratio of between .48 and .52 and shall be wet cured using burlap or plastic sheeting for added strength and shrink resistance. Concrete floor slab shall conform to ACI 117 to meet tolerances for flatness (measures bumps) and levelness (measures slope), and slab must slope to drains per TI design requirements. Provide 48" diameter area that slopes 1/4" per ft to drain at Tenant emergency shower drain. Water treatment area floors shall be rated at 10 PSF minimum. Furthermore, do not use, and reject any and all use of integral and/or topically-applied silicate based admixtures in all concrete mixes. The floor slab must be flat and leveled (parallel to horizon) to allow for tenant improvements without a new concrete pour. Floor flatness of 25 minimum and floor levelness of 20 minimum are required. Measurements must occur as soon as slab is cured enough to walk on, and no more than 72 hours after the slab is poured. Measure the slab with a floor profiling device, such as the Dipstick by FACE. Final slab surface finish should be smooth but not burnished. Plastic blades should be used on the burnisher in order to achieve the desired surface texture.

DIVISION 4 – MASONRY

29. DEMISING WALLS IF MULTI-TENANT BUILDING (DIVISION 4 IF MASONRY, DIVISION 9 IF FINISHES): Complete construction of all demising walls separating tenants and all shell

demising walls including, but not limited to fire riser room and backflow preventer closet. Walls shall comply with all applicable local codes and regulations (including OSHPD in California, and NFPA Life Safety Code and Center for Medicare Services Requirements) to meet requirements of Tenant's use. All demising walls to include fire taping, detailing of top and bottom of walls, penetrations (for shell work only) and painted. Landlord to coordinate with Tenant's team for any installation of Tenant provided items within wall for scheduling and avoidance of rework. Provide duct dampers, and fire sealing at any/all SHELL building penetrations through the tenant's demising walls.

DIVISION 5 – METALS

30. STEEL STRUCTURE: may be used in shell. Provide additional support above the main patient entrance and staff entrance doors to allow for a building mounted canopy. Provide structural systems in compliance with all applicable Building Codes. The roof structure must be designed to support the tenant's soffit and suspended television systems within the patient treatment room. Provide structural design of the roof system to support the HVAC equipment (when applicable) on a standard roof curb as coordinated with Tenant team for location and sizing to meet load and zone requirements.
31. CLEAR SPACE FROM FINISHED SLAB TO UNDERSIDE OF ROOF STRUCTURE (BEAMS, JOISTS, OR TRUSSES - DIVISION 3 IF CONCRETE, DIVISION 5 IF METALS): shall be a minimum of 13ft.
32. ROOF SLOPE: to be code compliant and no less than 0.5":12".
33. EXTERIOR DOOR AWNINGS: The staff entrance door and the main entrance must be provided with a permanent protective waterproof awning. Metal frame and fabric awnings are prohibited. Steel frame with metal deck is preferred. If awning roof is sloped, it shall be designed to minimize the risk of falling snow or ice. Snow cleats, guards, etc. shall be installed.
34. BOLLARD PROTECTION OF METERS, EXTERNAL DOORS: Provide 6" diameter x 48" height, concrete filled steel pipe bollards painted yellow for protection of the following items where approachable by or adjacent to vehicular traffic, and / or is required by code:
 - A. Electrical Service
 - B. Gas Meter and Piping
 - C. Entry and Egress Doors
 - D. Dumpster Gate / Enclosure
35. SEISMIC UPGRADES: entire building must comply with current seismic upgrade requirements from code compliance where applicable.

DIVISION 6 – WOOD, PLASTIC & COMPOSITES

36. MISCELLANEOUS CARPENTRY: Furnish and install all wood carpentry for blocking, roof framing, parapets, etc.

DIVISION 7 – THERMAL & MOISTURE PROTECTION

37. UNDER SLAB VAPOR BARRIER: Provide concrete slab-on-grade over a Class "A" vapor retarder with a water vapor transmission rate not greater than 0.1 perms (per ASTM E-96), beneath the slab to prevent transmission of moisture from sub-base and sub-grade soil. All vapor retarder laps and seams

must be overlapped by 6 inches and taped per manufacturer's installation instructions and ASTM E-1643. Proper site preparation, slab construction and use of the vapor retarder following the guidelines established by ASTM E-1745 are required. Vertical penetrations of vapor barrier material (pipe, conduit, etc.) shall be per manufacturer's installation instructions.

38. **SLAB MOISTURE MITIGATION:** If tenant's slab vapor emission and relative humidity requirements are not met, then slab must be mitigated per attachment "A". Further, in case of acquisition or renovation of existing building, if Landlord's work includes new sections of slab or filling of trenches, do not use and reject any use of silicate admixtures to concrete; namely Barrier One, SCP-327 or any similar silicate-based product. Ensure floor slab is flat and leveled. Certain States are at higher risk of slab moisture test failures (see Exhibit A1). It is recommended Landlord carries allowance to mitigate slab moisture in waiting room, treatment room and patient restrooms in these States, subject to test results.
39. **BUILDING INSULATION:** Provide vapor retarders on exterior walls and under the roof as required. Installation shall comply with IBC – 2015 sec. 1405. Provide Building Insulation as follows:
 - a. Ceiling/Roof - R-30 minimum. Where additional insulation must be added to the underside of the roof structure to attain the required R value and when applicable with flame spread rating in compliance with governing codes. Tape all seams for a continuous seal. When building type allows (i.e. flat roof with metal deck) must have above deck roof insulation vs batt insulation.
 - b. Exterior Walls - R-19 minimum.
 - c. Windows - All windows to be low E, double glazed insulated glass.
 - d. Doors - All exterior doors and frames to be insulated & weather stripped to prevent passage of air and day-lighting.
40. **NEW ROOF:** Provide and install a new roofing system that carries a 15 yr. non-prorated guarantee from a nationally recognized roofing manufacturer. Metal roofing systems may be fine, but not with exposed fasteners.
41. **DOWNSPOUTS, ROOF DRAINS:** Downspouts must not evacuate water onto sidewalks or within 5 feet of building structure. Discharge must be directed away from building or piped into a drain. Interior roof drain leaders are preferred in cold climates. Roofs shall be sloped to drain to perimeter gutters and down spouts, preferably on 1 side of the building only. Provide gutter and downspouts along the lowest side wall.

DIVISION 8 - DOORS AND WINDOWS:

42. **EXTERIOR WINDOWS:** to be low E, double glazed insulated glass of not less than 10 SF ea., in anodized aluminum self-weeping frames, and shall be provided at the rate of not less than 1 per 600 sq. ft. of building area.
 - a. All windows are to be a fixed non-operable type and to have sill tray flashings with end dams.
 - b. Provide an aluminum/glass storefront system of insulated, low E glass at the main patient entrance. System shall be installed and properly flashed in place per manufacturer's installation instructions. (Kawneer VG451T series or equal)
43. **EXTERIOR DOORS AND FRAMES:**

- a. Main entrance door shall be an exterior 8'-0" wide sliding door with an automatic operator. Operable leaf must provide a minimum of 42" (nominal) opening. (Record USA 5100 Series). Glass must be provided separately and installed on site. The main entrance may include a minimum 8'-0" x 7'-6" vestibule in cold weather climates with aluminum/glass storefront system (Kawneer VG450-2 or equal) and a hard ceiling with lighting and vestibule heating unit. In buildings with entry vestibule, provide matching interior vestibule door. Location, size, and electrical schematic wiring of vestibule lighting and a recessed heating unit shall be coordinated with Tenant's architect. Where required by code, glazing shall be tempered, safety glass. Window stools for all except the storefront system shall be no lower than 3'-6" from finished floor.
- b. All other exterior doors shall be out-swinging with non-ferrous non-removable hinges, weather stripping, insulation, drip caps and ADA accessible with 1/4" high threshold.
- c. Delivery Doors - pair 3'W x 7'H, Steelcraft or Curries, insulated 16-gauge metal door with 14-gauge galvanized steel frames. Delivery doors to have heavy duty thresholds and fully grouted frames.
- d. Staff Entrance door – 3'W x 7'H, Steelcraft or Curries, insulated 16-gauge metal door with 14 gauge galvanized steel frame, or 3'-0" x 7'-0" glass/aluminum store front style door.
- e. Dialysis Room – 4'-0" x 7'H, Steelcraft or Curries, insulated 16-gauge metal door with 14 gauge galvanized steel frame, or 3'-0" x 7'-0" glass/aluminum store front style door
- f. All exterior doors are to be prepped to Tenant's specifications to accept electric door strikes, closers and automatic door operators.
- g. Emergency Water Access Door: When installed in a wall, install (2) stainless steel 304 #4, 8" x 8" insulated access door, one on exterior, one on interior. Available from www.bestaccessdoors.com or 1-800-483-0823. To be located adjacent to the door in the backflow preventer closet.

44. EXTERIOR DOOR HARDWARE: to match interior locksets and cylinders and be part of the facility master keying system. Provide temporary construction cores on all exterior locksets. See Attachment "B" for hardware set information.

DIVISION 9 - FINISHES:

45. EXTERIOR FINISHES:

- A. EXTERIOR WALLS: shall be finished with acrylic based EIFS, architectural wall panels, or other materials as required by local ordinances, and waterproofed to prevent the infiltration of moisture into the building.
 - a. EIFS
 - i. manufacturer's installation instructions must be submitted to the Tenant's Project Manager for review.
 - ii. Acrylic based EIFS, shall have architectural details around windows and at the roof edges
 - iii. All exterior systems should have designed control joints, water management control (weeps and venting) and installation per manufacturers and associated trade standards.
 - b. Architectural Wall Panels Manufacturers:
 - i. Nichiha
 - ii. AL 13
 - iii. Stonewood

c. Any other material including brick/stone veneer designs to be approved by RECS ATL Design team.

B. INTERIOR SIDE gypsum board for all exterior walls to be installed by Tenant's TI contractor.

46. INTERIOR FINISHES:

- a. DEMISING WALLS IN MULTI-TENANT BUILDING: Provide and install complete demising wall system and assembly with fire rating to meet Tenant's use;
- b. COMMON AREA ROOMS: Provide and install all wall systems required for common area rooms i.e. electrical, utility rooms, etc...
- c. BACKFLOW PREVENTER CLOSET: Provide and install wall systems as needed.
- d. VESTIBULE AND TENANT ENTRIES: Provide and install complete wall and door systems per Division 8 above (interior and exterior doors).

DIVISION 10 – SPECIALTIES

47. LANDLORD'S EXTERIOR SIGNAGE: Provide the building with street address number on or near the main entrance. Signs shall be anchored securely to building or on rust inhibitive metal sign posts. When required, traffic control signs shall be provided. Landlord shall allow Tenant prorated share of individual or multi-tenant signage.

48. ACCEPTANCE OF TENANT'S EXTERIOR SIGNAGE: Landlord shall allow Tenant prorated share of exterior building, existing pylon or monument signage. Tenant shall provide exterior signage specifications, details and location(s) approximately 6 weeks after site selection, including path for electrical rough in and blocking as described in attachment "C", pending any zoning and jurisdictional approvals.

DIVISION 14 – CONVEYING SYSTEMS

49. ELEVATOR: Thyssenkrupp Endura MRL 4500#, front entry, 1 stage, 110 fpm or equal. Must be able to accommodate gurney.

DIVISION 15 - MECHANICAL/PLUMBING:

50. HVAC AND HUMIDITY CONTROLS: must meet Tenant's requirements.

- a. Provide all labor, material, equipment and supervision to install HVAC units, curbs, drops, power, gas, drain, and roof repairs. Startup of equipment by factory authorized personnel.
- b. Provide system of rooftop package HVAC units and/or split system units. Utilize design from tenant's A&E firm, including extra load in treatment area, and meeting Tenant's Energy Code Climate Zone Map requirements (attachment "E"). The design and installation shall meet the following criteria:
 - 1) Equipment shall be provided to deliver a minimum of three (3) zones:
 - i. Public and Administrative Areas: 1 zone
 - ii. Patient Treatment Area: 1 zone
 - iii. Supporting Area: 1 zone

- 2) HVAC system shall have separation of air change per use space (typically 1 unit per zone; treatment floor preferred with more than one unit):
 - i. Public and Administrative Area;
 - ii. Treatment Area;
 - iii. Support Area.
 - 3) Heating: 72°, *Cooling* 74°, inside to be designed using ASHRAE Climatic Conditions for area and energy code 90.1.
 - 4) Humidity Control: system must always maintain humidity levels below 60% in all seasons, non-condensing. Equipment shall possess manufacturer's integral components to achieve Tenant's requirements for humidity control.
 - 5) Fresh Air: Provide based on ASHRAE 62.1 and 170 as well as International Mech. Code. Refer to Tenant's outdoor air requirements matrix – see attachment "E".
- c. Provide and install externally insulated full size supply and return vertical trunk ductwork, connected to unit, and terminating parallel to the underside of adjacent building structure for connection to distribution ductwork (provided by Tenant). Interior lined duct is not allowed.
- d. Exterior Fresh air intake section of HVAC units must be minimum 15 or 25 feet from any exhaust vent depending upon local codes. HVAC units must be minimum 10 feet from perimeter of building roof.
- 1) **Air Handler Units and Split System Units** must be installed level to permit proper condensate pan drainage and discharge into an associated drain. Also provide secondary pan, with independent drain line for split system with discharge meeting local code requirements. Locate units in mechanical spaces and storage areas to maintain minimum service and operational clearances and filter accessibility. Install flexible connectors, refrigerant piping, electrical connections, condensate drains and unit filters as instructed by the manufacturer. It must meet local codes for a fully operational system. Immediately before shell turnover to Tenant, Landlord along with mechanical contractor and engineer are required to demonstrate the equipment is in compliance with Tenant's requirements, and obtain Tenant's acceptance in writing. After completion of Tenant's build-out, Landlord is required to operate system and provide factory representative's certification HVAC is working according to performance specifications before turnover to Tenant.
 - 2) **Manufacturers:**
 - i. York International Corporation
 - ii. Carrier Corporation
 - iii. The Trane Company
 - 3) **Filters** shall be pleated, medium efficiency, (no less than MERV 8), disposable type, within a rigid frame sized to securely fit HVAC unit filter rack. Filter shall service both return air and fresh air intakes.

- e. Vestibule Wall Heater – if Tenant requires a vestibule, provide Q-Mark, LFK 204, 204V 1Ø, fan forced wall heater for cold weather locations (vestibule and riser room), with tamper resistant thermostat in a LFKS mounting frame.
- 51. HVAC NEW PENETRATIONS FOR EXHAUST FANS:** Provide exhaust vented to outside of the following areas (must coordinate roof penetration locations with Tenant):
- a. Toilets:
 - i. 25 CFM per unit;
 - ii. Controlled via 7-days 24-hour time clock.
 - b. Staff Lounge:
 - i. .30 CFM/ Sq.Ft.;
 - ii. Controlled via 7-days 24-hour time clock.
 - c. Soiled Utility, Janitor Closet, Medical Waste Room:
 - i. 10 air changes per hour;
 - ii. Controlled via 7-days 24-hour time clock.
 - d. Gas fire hot water heater:
 - i. Combustion air duct (separate high & low roof penetrations) with weather caps at roof (intake damper to be controlled with burner), or;
 - ii. Separate roof penetrations for direct enclosed combustion supply and exhaust venting to the exterior;
 - iii. Follow all manufacturer’s guidelines for combustion air and exhaust air ducting;
 - iv. Concentric venting is allowed subject to local code compliance.
- 52. PLUMBING SERVICE TO TENANT’S PREMISES:** For plumbing work required to bring service to Tenant’s premises, the following items are required to meet Tenant’s standards or local code, whichever is more restrictive.
- a. All services to be brought to locations within Tenant premises at mutually agreed upon location(s).
 - b. Follow Utility Matrix and coordinate with Tenant for line sizes for water, sewer, gas, sprinkler riser.
 - c. Water shall be PVC/CPVC piping where allowable by local code, otherwise use copper Type “L.”. Under slab water piping shall be copper Type “K,” sleeved.
 - d. Sewer/soil drainage piping shall be PVC (or Cast-Iron if required by code). Hollow/Foam core PVC piping is not acceptable.
 - e. Backflow preventer for incoming water must meet code.
 - f. Provide cleanouts at all changes of direction in sewer drain piping and main trunk at 50' length intervals including outside the building footprint.
 - g. A sewer invert no less than three (3) feet below top of slab on grade is required. Sewer invert is required to be at a depth (36" or greater) that will accommodate code compliant

“fall” from an assumed floor sink, with 20" invert depth, at a location furthest away from sewer entry into the Tenant’s Premises.

- h. Use black iron piping for gas service and label it accordingly. Exterior exposed gas piping (i.e. on roof) must be painted to protect it from rusting.
- i. Any roof drain leaders shall be located directly adjacent to an interior column with a maximum 1" clearance between outside face of the leader and the outside face of the column. All roof drain systems must include secondary overflow capacity.
- j. **Plumbing Fixture Schedule: All products to be sole source through Ferguson National Sales Center (855) 324-7899 or NSCservice@ferguson.com**

53. LIFE SAFETY SYSTEMS: For fire protection work required to bring service to Tenant’s premises, the following items are required to meet Tenant’s standards or local code, whichever is more restrictive.

a. FIRE PROTECTION:

- 1) Provide sprinkler system including service line from water main to interior of Tenant’s premises, sprinkler riser including flow and tamper valves, backflow preventer, horizontal main line, branches, and hangers such that with the addition of drops and sprinkler heads by the Tenant’s contractor, the Tenant’s heated interior structure will have full wet sprinkler coverage. Layout of shell system to be coordinated with Tenant interior wall layout to avoid conflict / rework of system to install Tenant walls to deck.
- 2) If applicable, provide a complete dry sprinkler system with manifold connection to the wet sprinkler system, air compressor, horizontal main line, and sprinkler heads at the porte-cochere (when applicable), along building overhangs, and in any unheated attic spaces.

- 3) Sprinkler Riser: Sprinkler riser must meet requirements from Utility Matrix, and its location is to be coordinated between Tenant and Landlord.
- 4) Sprinkler system is to comply with NFPA 13 and all applicable state and local codes. Sprinkler riser to be in the riser room with Tenant having access at all times.

b. FIRE PROTECTION - PIPING

- 1) Schedule 40 black steel pipe shall be labeled and joined by approved combination of couplings, gaskets and grooves.
- 2) Plastic piping, where allowed by the Authority Having Jurisdiction, shall be Orange CPVC conforming to NFPA 13.

DIVISION 16-ELECTRICAL:

54. ELECTRICAL POWER: Provide according to Utility Matrix - coordinate location with Tenant.
55. SERVICE TO TENANT'S PREMISES: For electrical work to bring service to Tenant's premises, the following items are required to meet Tenant's standards or local code, whichever is more restrictive:
 - a. Provide existing or new sub-panel, conduit and wiring for exterior lighting, site lighting, irrigation system (if one exists), signage, HVAC units and room exhaust units. NEMA galvanized sheet steel casing with molded case bolt on circuit breakers with toggle type mechanism and a 20% spare capacity. Panel buss and lugs shall be copper only. Label all circuit index cards.
 - b. Electrical power to terminate inside Tenant's premises at a location approved by Tenant within a single main distribution panel dedicated solely for Tenant's use. NEMA galvanized sheet steel casing with molded case bolt on circuit breakers with toggle type mechanism and a 20% spare capacity. Panel buss and lugs shall be copper only. Label all circuit index cards.
 - c. All wiring, receptacles, fixtures, and other electrical components shall comply with the N.E.C. and all other applicable local codes and regulations.
 - d. Conductors: Branch Circuits, #12-gauge min., control wiring #14-gauge min., all conductors shall be copper. Aluminum wiring is prohibited.
56. SITE LIGHTING (SIDEWALK, DROPOFF, EGRESS PATHWAYS, GENERAL YARD): Provide site lighting for parking areas, sidewalks and egress (reference electrical section for specifics) including parking lot pole lights at the rate of 1 per 10 parking spaces, side walk illumination, drop off & delivery area illumination, and building mounted lighting. Provide general yard lighting from fixtures mounted on building and/or 24'-0" high minimum lighting poles at fence line. All site lighting should meet minimum local standards or 2.0-foot candles on average measured at the walking surface, whichever is more restrictive.

57. EMERGENCY LIGHTING (EGRESS EXTERIOR): Fixtures shall be wall-mounted lighting and with emergency battery back-up. Fixtures to be located adjacent to each exit door and along walking route to the public way as defined by the authorities having jurisdiction. Finish, number of fixtures and locations to be reviewed and approved by Tenant. Fixtures to provide a min. of 1 fc along the entire route.
58. PORTE COCHERE LIGHTING: If a Porte Cochere is required by Tenant or by local code, provide a minimum of 10 foot-candles under entire Porte cochere at the driving and walking surface
59. OTHER EXTERIOR LIGHTING: Parking lot pole lighting, non-emergency sidewalk lighting, delivery area lighting, and building lighting - Lighting to meet minimum local standards or 2.0 foot candles on average measured at the walking surface, whichever is more restrictive. Fixtures to be fully shielded type. Light levels should not exceed 0.1 foot-candles at property lines and should not spill onto adjacent property.

60. CONDUIT FOR LOW VOLTAGE (PHONE, CABLE OR SATELITE TV, INTERNET): Provide conduits with pull string from common utility demarks to Tenant’s phone and data wiring closet with quantity and sizes per utility matrix above. Location to be coordinated and approved by Tenant during the design phase and shown on drawings. Terminate inside building within the wiring closet or at location designated by the Tenant.
61. TELEVISION SERVICE CONDUIT TO ROOF INCLUDING WATER TIGHT CAP AND ROOF PATCH: Must provide television service conduit to roof at location immediately adjacent to Tenant’s data closet, including water tight cap and roof patch.
62. ELECTRICAL ROUGH IN AND BLOCKING FOR TENANT’S EXTERIOR SIGNAGE: Coordinate with Tenant to provide and install access to i.e. soffit access panels, etc....and electrical rough in and blocking required for Tenant’s exterior signage.
63. POWER TRANSFORMER(S): If local utility company requires installation of a power transformer, coordinate installation location and pay for any charges.
64. GENERATOR (TENANT SUPPLIED, LANDLORD INSTALLED): If required by Tenant or by State regulations, Tenant will purchase from Tenant’s national vendor a generator to support entire

facility electrical system. Landlord to coordinate delivery, supply and pull wires, and install according to Tenant's electrical drawings. Landlord to coordinate start up with generator representative, and commission, including providing a full tank of fuel.

65. **INSTALLATION OF AUTOMATIC TRANSFER SWITCH ("ATS") INLINE WITH SERVICE POWER:** Landlord agrees to coordinate with Tenant for mutually acceptable wiring diagram, location of conduits and devices. Work includes installation of Tenant provided ATS inline and wiring service to main distribution panel ("MDP"). **Provide all service from the utility, with main disconnect, main distribution panel per building size matrix, ATS (per below), and sub panel A in a location as coordinated with the Tenant's approved Preliminary plan.**

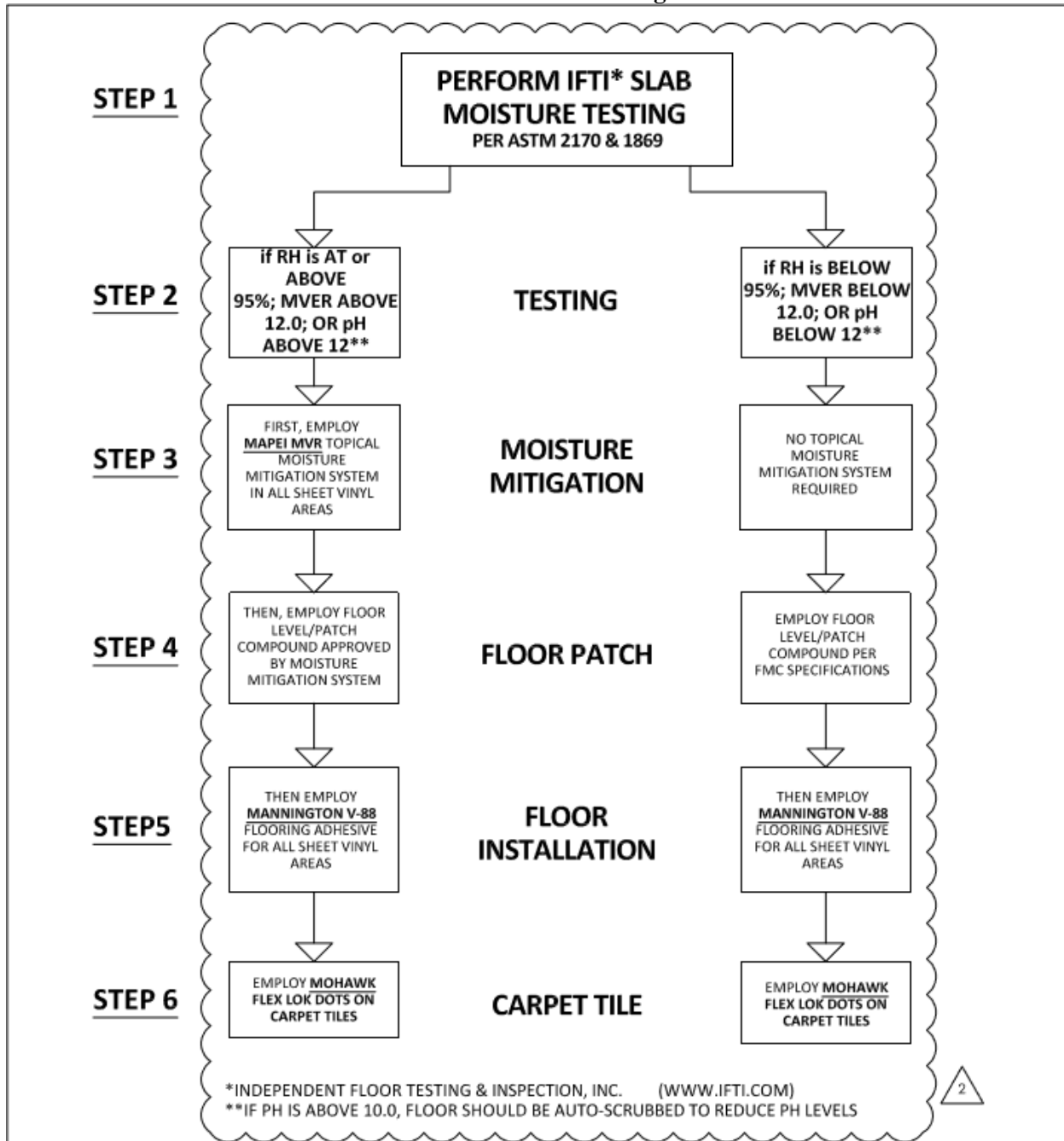
Sub Panel A: In addition to the Tenant specific distribution panel, provide sub-panel, breakers, conduit and wiring for exterior lighting, site lighting, irrigation system, signage, HVAC units and room exhaust units. NEMA galvanized sheet steel casing with molded case bolt on circuit breakers with toggle type mechanism and a 20% spare capacity. Panel buss and lugs shall be copper only. Label all circuit index cards.

ATS: Provide ATS on service line ahead of the Tenant's main distribution panel. Provide max size conduits to location of potential future generator to be agreed upon by Tenant.

66. **LIFE SAFETY SYSTEMS - FIRE ALARM SYSTEM IN MULTI-TENANT BUILDING, OUTSIDE TENANT'S PREMISES:** All Fire Alarm System work required outside Tenant's Premises must be performed by Landlord.
67. **LIFE SAFETY SYSTEMS - FIRE ALARM:** Furnish and install a complete, non-proprietary fire alarm system to accommodate all Tenant's devices during tenant build out. Life safety panel to be provided by Landlord. Provide system with addressable components, and meets all applicable code requirements, including but not limited to: NFPA 70 (National Electric Code), NFPA 72 (Fire Alarm Code), NFPA 99 (Health Care Facilities Code), and NFPA 101 (Life Safety Code).

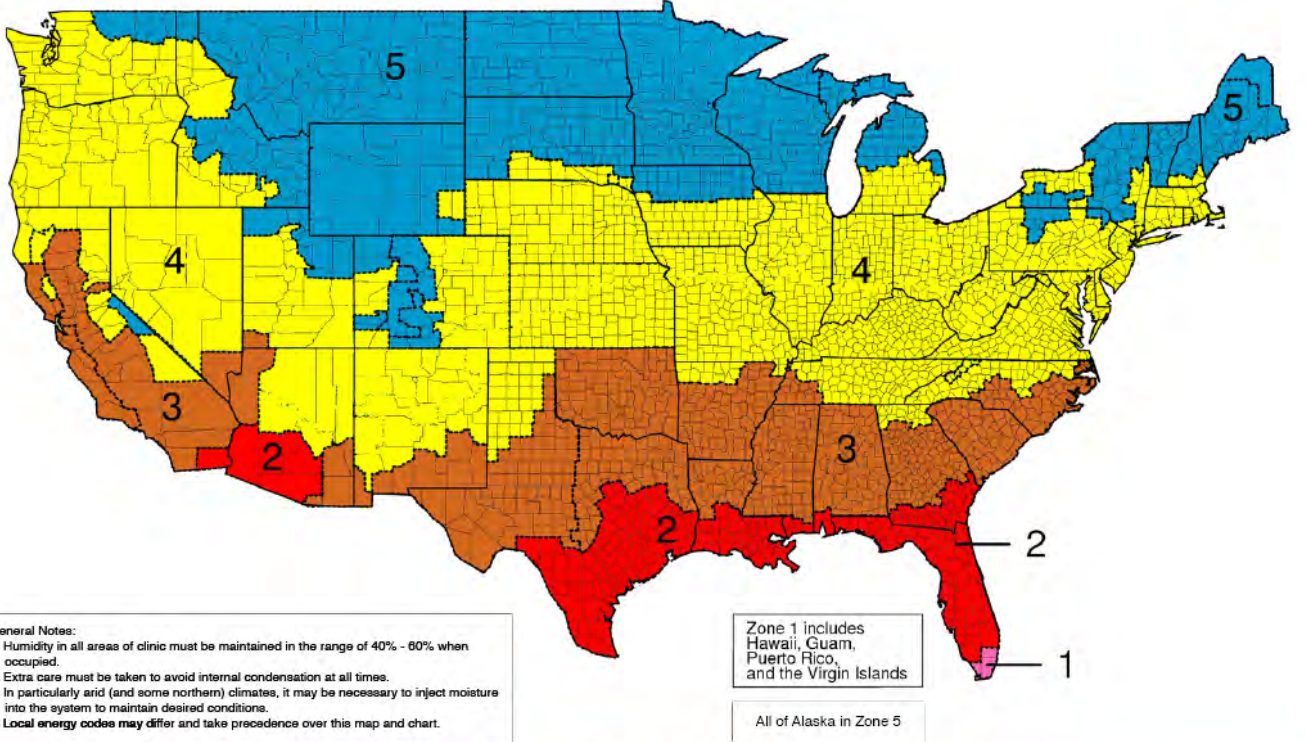

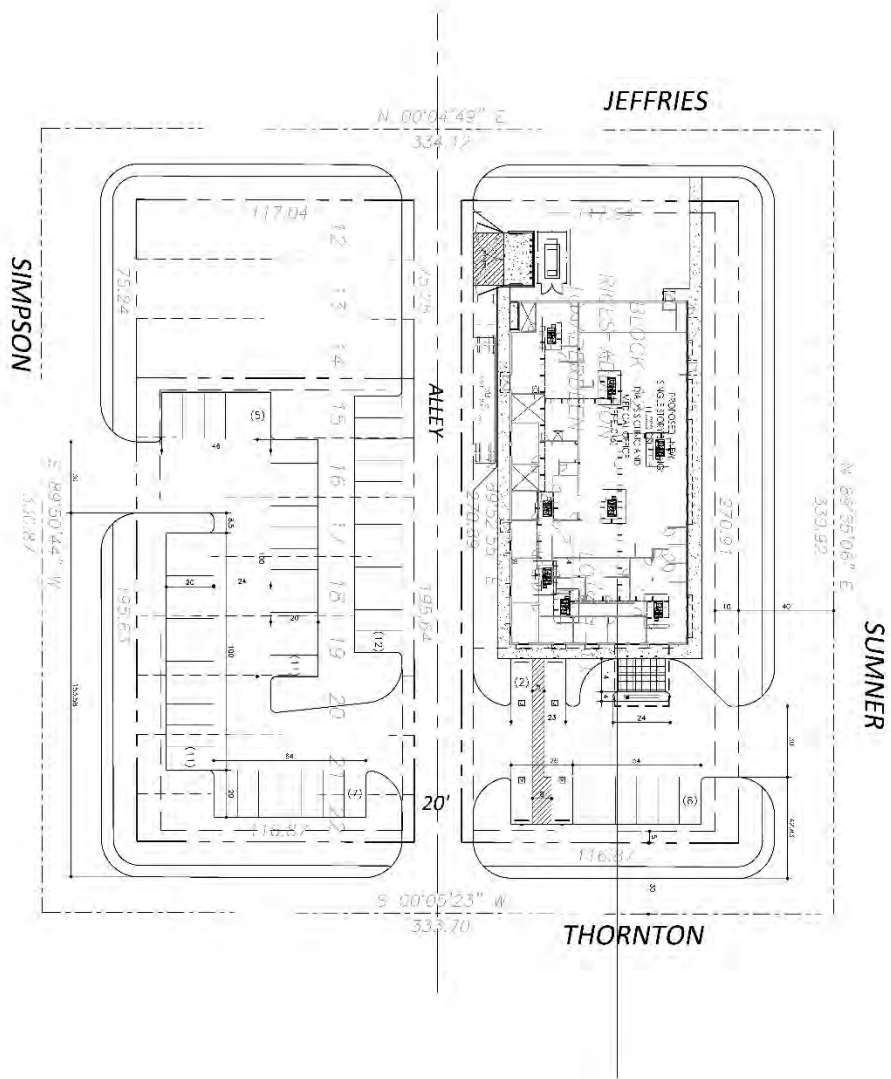

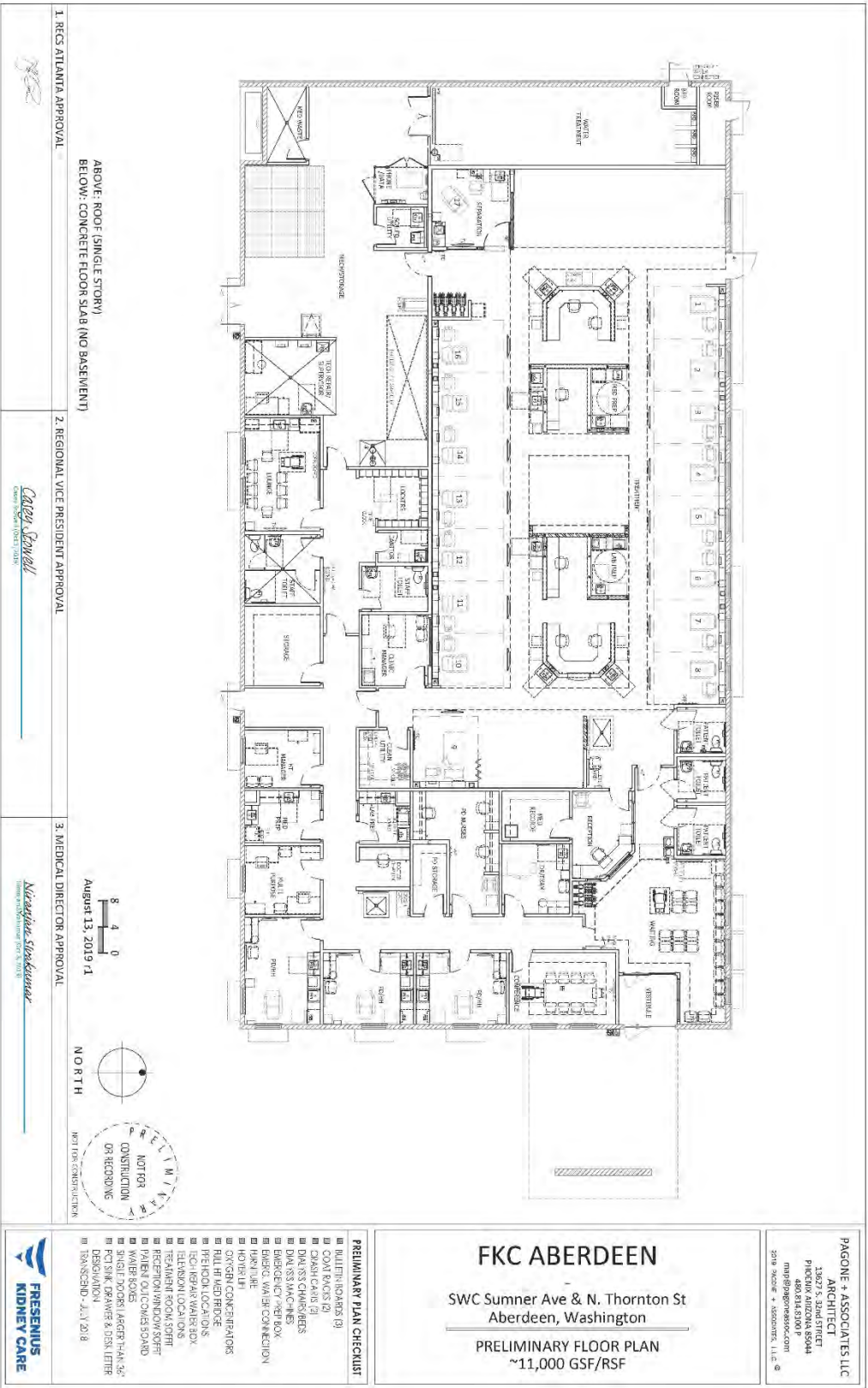

FLOOR PLAN



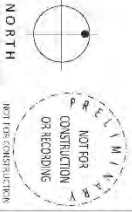

FIRST AMENDMENT TO LEASE

The above referenced properties lie within the General Commercial Zone (GC) and are classified as a personal and professional service per our city code (*AMC 17.04.070 – 68*) and is an outright permitted use in the MI zone (*AMC 17.36.020 B*).

The proposed use of the property for a kidney dialysis facility is:

Affiliation/Transfer Agreement

AFFILIATION AGREEMENT

This AGREEMENT made as of this 30th day of April, 2015 ("Effective Date"), between Providence Health & Services – Washington d/b/a Providence St. Peter Hospital (hereinafter referred to as "Hospital") and **Renal Care Group Northwest, Inc.** (hereinafter referred to as "RCG"), an affiliate of Fresenius Medical Care Holdings, Inc. d/b/a Fresenius Medical Care North America.

WHEREAS, RCG desires to assure the availability of the Hospital's facilities for its patients who are in need of inpatient treatment at a hospital, in compliance with 42 C.F.R. 405.2160, and the Hospital is equipped and qualified to provide hospital care on an inpatient basis for such patients; and

WHEREAS, the Hospital desires to assure the availability of hemodialysis treatment for its patients who are in need of outpatient treatment, and RCG is experienced and qualified to administer dialysis treatments and clinically manage patients with chronic renal failure on an outpatient basis;

1. The Hospital agrees to make the facilities and personnel of its routine emergency service available for the treatment of acute life-threatening emergencies, which may occur to any of RCG's patients. If, in the opinion of a member of RCG's medical staff, any patient requires emergency hospitalization, the Hospital agrees that it will provide a bed for such a patient (or in the event a bed is not available at the Hospital, to arrange for the transfer of the patient to an affiliated hospital) and furnish all necessary medical services at its facility for such patient at the patient's expense. In the event of an emergency at RCG, the responsible physician shall notify the patient's physician of record, as indicated in RCG's files, and shall promptly notify the Emergency Room physician of the particular emergency. RCG shall be responsible for arranging to have the patient transported to the Hospital and shall send appropriate interim medical records. There will be an interchange, within one working day, of the patient LongTerm Program and Patient Care Plan, and of medical and other information necessary or useful in the care and treatment of patients referred to the Hospital from RCG, or in determining whether such patients can be adequately cared for otherwise than in either of the facilities. Admission to Hospital, and the continued treatment by Hospital, shall be provided regardless of the patient's race, color, creed, sex, age, disability, or national origin.
2. In the event the patient must be transferred directly from RCG to the Hospital, RCG shall provide for the security of, and be accountable for, the patient's personal effects during the transfer.
3. RCG shall keep medical records of all treatments rendered to patients by RCG. These medical records shall conform to applicable standards of professional practice. If requested by the Hospital, RCG shall provide complete copies of all medical records of a patient treated by RCG who is, at the time of the request, an inpatient at the Hospital.

4. The Hospital shall accept any patient of RCG referred to the Hospital for elective reasons, subject to the availability of appropriate facilities, after the RCG attending physician has arranged for inpatient hospital physician coverage,
5. In addition to the services described above, the Hospital shall make the following services available to patients referred by RCG either at the Hospital or at an affiliated hospital:
 - a. Availability of a surgeon capable of vascular access insertion and long-term maintenance;
 - b. Inpatient care for any patient who develops complications or renal disease-related conditions that require hospital admission;
 - c. Kidney transplantation services, where appropriate, including tissue typing and cross-matching, surgical transplant capability, availability of surgeons qualified in the management of pre- and post-transplant patients; and
 - d. Blood Bank services to be performed by the Hospital.
6. RCG shall have no responsibility for any inpatient care rendered by the hospital. Once a patient has been referred by RCG to the Hospital, Hospital agrees to indemnify RCG against, and hold it harmless from any claims, expenses, or liability based upon or arising from anything done or omitted, or allegedly done or omitted, by the Hospital, its agents, or employees, in relation to the treatment or medical care rendered at the Hospital.
7. RCG agrees to develop, maintain and operate, in all aspects, the outpatient hemodialysis facilities listed on Exhibit A attached hereto, providing all physical facilities, equipment and personnel necessary to treat patients suffering from chronic renal diseases. RCG shall conform to standards not less than those required by the applicable laws and regulations of any local, state or federal regulatory body, as the same may be amended from time to time. In the absence of applicable laws and regulations, RCG shall conform to applicable standards of professional practice. RCG shall treat such commitment as its primary responsibility and shall devote such time and effort as may be necessary to attain these objectives. Admission to RCG, and the continued treatment by RCG, shall be provided regardless of the patient's race, color, creed, sex, age, disability, or national origin. The cost of such facilities, equipment and personnel shall be borne by RCG.
8. The cost of such facilities, equipment and personnel shall be borne by RCG. The location of such facilities shall be selected by RCG, but shall be sufficiently close to the proximity to the Hospital to facilitate the transfer of patients, and communication between the faculties.

9. RCG shall engage a medical director of RCG's outpatient hemodialysis RCG who shall have the qualifications specified in 42 C.F.R. 405.2102. This individual must be a physician properly licensed in the profession by the state in which such facility is located. In accordance with 42 C.F. R. 405.2162, RCG shall employ such duly qualified and licensed nurses, technicians, and other personnel as shall be necessary to administer treatment at its facility, in accordance with applicable local, state, and federal laws and regulations.
10. The Hospital, acting through its appropriate medical staff members, shall, from time to time, evaluate its patients with chronic renal failure in accordance with its standard operating procedures. With the approval of the patient, the patient's physician shall consult with the RCG Medical Director. If outpatient treatment is considered appropriate by the patient's physician and the RCG Medical Director, said patient may be referred to RCG for outpatient treatment at a facility operated by RCG which is most convenient for the patient (or, in the event space is not available, to an affiliated unit). There will be an interchange, within one working day, of the Patient Long-Term Program and Patient Care Plan, and of medical and other information necessary or useful in the care and treatment of patients referred to RCG from the Hospital, or in determining whether such patients can be adequately cared for otherwise than in either of the facilities.
11. With respect to all work, duties, and obligations hereunder, it is mutually understood and agreed that the parties shall own and operate their individual facilities wholly independent of each other. All patients treated at the facilities of Hospital or RCG shall be patients of that facility. Each party shall have the sole responsibility for the treatment and medical care administered to patients in their respective facilities.
12. RCG and Hospital shall each maintain in full force and effect throughout the term of this Agreement, at its own expense, a policy of comprehensive general liability insurance and professional liability insurance covering it and RCG's Staff and Hospital staff and physicians, respectively, each having a combined single limit of not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence, \$3,000,000 annual aggregate for bodily injury and property damage to insure against any loss, damage or claim arising out of the performance of each party's respective obligations under this Agreement. Each will provide the other with certificates evidencing said insurance, if and as requested. RCG and Hospital further agree to maintain, for a period of not less than three (3) years following the termination of this Agreement, any insurance required hereunder if underwritten on a claims-made basis. Either party may provide for the insurance coverage set forth in this Section through self-insurance.
13. Each party agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the other, their officers, directors, shareholders, agents and employees against all liability, claims, damages, suits, demands, expenses and costs (including but not limited to, court costs and reasonable attorneys' fees) of every kind arising out of or in consequence of the party's breach of this Agreement, and of the negligent errors and omissions or willful misconduct of the indemnifying party, its agents, servants, employees and independent contractors (excluding the other party) in the performance of or conduct related to this Agreement.

14. The Parties expressly agree to comply with all applicable patient information privacy and security regulations set for in the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act ("HIPAA") final regulations for Privacy of Individually Identifiable Health Information by the federal due date for compliance, as amended from time to time.
15. Whenever under the terms of this Agreement, written notice is required or permitted to be given by one party to the other, such notice shall be deemed to have been sufficiently given if delivered in hand or by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, to such party at the following address:

If any provisions of this agreement shall, at any time, conflict with any applicable state or federal law, or shall conflict with any regulation or regulatory agency having jurisdiction with respect thereto, this Agreement shall be modified in writing by the parties hereto to conform to such regulation, law, guideline, or standard established by such regulatory agency.
17. This Agreement including any exhibits, schedules or other attachments which are incorporated herein by reference and made a part hereof may not be amended, modified or shall be binding unless agreed to in a written instrument signed by both parties.
18. This Agreement contains the entire understanding of the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes all negotiations, prior discussions, agreements or understandings, whether written or oral, with respect to the subject matter hereof, as of the Effective Date. This Agreement shall bind and benefit the parties, their respective successors and assigns.

19. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Washington, without respect to its conflicts of law rules.
20. The term of this Agreement is for one (1) year, beginning on the Effective Date, and will automatically renew for successive one year periods unless either party gives the other notice prior to an expiration date. Either party may terminate this Agreement, at any time, with or without cause, upon thirty (30) days written notice to the non-terminating party.
21. The parties agree to cooperate with each other in the fulfillment of their respective obligations under the terms of this Agreement and to comply with the requirements of the law and with all applicable ordinances, statutes, regulations, directives, orders, or other lawful enactments or pronouncements of any federal, state, municipal, local or other lawful authority.
