

I am a homeowner in ANC 6E, have lived in Shaw for 42 years and have operated my consulting business in Shaw (Mumin and Associates) for 23 years. I've been fortunate to be involved with most of the re-development of Shaw and N.W. #1 (what some now call NOMA) for more than three decades. I have also been involved and served as a leader in the civic and cultural life of the neighborhood since I moved to Shaw in the 70's.

Recently, the Mayor and other leaders have shared demographic data that shows the D.C. population is now 700,000. This is a long way from the 500,000 population we had for many years. Additionally, the trending data shows that we are gaining nearly a thousand residents each month.







Regarding Potomac Electric Power Company, Case # 1984:

The Board of Directors of Shaw Main Streets, the nonprofit commercial revitalization and historic preservation organization charged with managing the renaissance of central Shaw's 7<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> Streets commercial corridors, supports the application for zoning relief filed by the Potomac Electric Power Company to allow construction of a new substation in the Mount Vernon Triangle. The construction and successful operation of this new substation is critical to the success of hundreds of businesses in our service area, as well as the comfort and well-being of residents of this area.

Every summer, electrical power outages in central Shaw cost businesses in this area, predominantly restaurants, bars, and nightclubs, tens of thousands of dollars per incident in lost revenue and food waste. Each outage, regardless of time of day, results in the inability of these businesses to prepare for and serve customers during the peak evening hours of operation. Employees lose wages and tips, refrigerated product must be discarded, and customers are inconvenienced. On occasions when the outages occur during service hours, sales cannot be processed because the equipment needed in order to complete the electronic transactions cannot function.

Restaurants are especially susceptible to these losses, as they operate on very thin margins. A single electrical outage that causes one day or night's closure can result in financial damage that can prove insurmountable. Several during the course of a summer are not currently uncommon. As part of the electrical distribution system upgrades proposed as part of the Capital Grid project, PEPCO's Mount Vernon Substation could eliminate these service outages and their associated negative impacts on both businesses and residents. While some have suggested that voluntary conservation could prevent electrical service interruptions, increasing demand in our area alone, both from the growing number of businesses and new residents attracted by commercial and residential development, make the modest impact of such voluntary measures meaningless.

While some residents have expressed concerns about potential health impacts from the operation of a substation, the reality is that exposures from sources in homes, such as microwave ovens, far exceed what passersby will encounter outside of the station.

In conclusion, the future success of businesses and peaceful enjoyment of their homes by residents in Shaw depends on the construction and operation of the Mount Vernon Substation and the Capital Grid project. The Board of Directors of Shaw Main Streets urges the Board of Zoning Adjustment to approve this application.



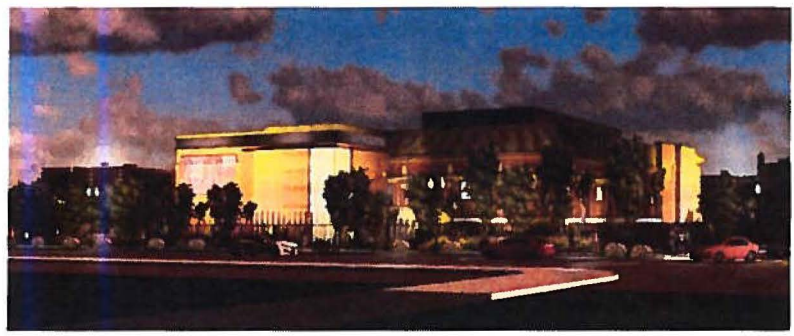
