Russian and British Submarines And Slav Destroyers Sink Battleship, 3 Other Teuton Cruisers and 7 Destroyers

REMAINDER OF KAISER'S SQUADRON BADLY CRIPPLED

This Victory, Together With Severe Check Given To Germanic Armies, Serves To Raise Spirits Of Anxious Subjects Of Czar

GERMAN LOSSES ARE HEAVY

The German losses in the battle were heavy. The battleship Moltke, sister of the Goeben, of 23,000 tons, armed with ten 11-inch guns and carrying a crew of eleven hundred men, is sunk, with three other cruisers of the German Baltic fleet.

BRITISH COOPERATION HAILED

The fact that British submarines played a large part in the general engagement, sinking at least two of the German cruisers, has immediately removed much of the feeling of general dissatisfaction that had arisen over the apparent inactivity of the Allies along the west front, when a vigorous offensive would have, in the popular mind, relieved the tremendous pressure against Russia.

GERMANS HAVE WITHDRAWN

The greatest battle now raging is before Brest Litovsk, where the Austro-Germans have crossed the Bug River both south and north of the fortress, in the face of great resistance.

RUSSIAN RESISTANCE STIFFENS

All along the front the Russian resistance has stiffened, which fact, coupled with the naval victory, has been greeted by the people as evidence that the tide has turned and that a Russian offensive will now take the place of the continual retreats.
