#### Abstract

This document reports on an assessment of the Jacksonville State University's Houston Cole Library collection that employed a variety of methodologies and tools, including list-checking, direct collection examination, shelflist measurement and analysis, WLN (Washington Library Network) conspectus sheets, analysis of OCLC/AMIGOS Coilection Analysis Service statistics, and compilation of percentage of growth statistics. It is a base for planning acquisitions activity and collection treatment, measuring whether the library conforms to its collection development policy, and determining whether program or accreditation requirements are being addressed. Reviews are presented of holdings in 34 subject areas: agriculture, Alabama Gallery, American literature, art, audiovisual, auxiliary sciences of history, biology, chemistry, commerce and busine.s administration, communication, criminal justice, drama, education, English literature, family and consumer science, general works, geography ard anthropology, geology, government documents, history, languages and related literatures, law, library science and bibliography, mathematical and information sciences, military science, music, nursing, philosophy and religion, physics and engineering, political science and public administration, psychology, sociology and social work, technology, and Western European literatures. Each review contains statistics on monographic, serial, and nonprint media holdings; a description of support from collections in related subjects areas; and summaries of strengths, weaknesses, and recommendations. ## INTRODUCTION

The Houston Cole Library Collection Assessment document is the companion volume to the Houston Cole Library Collection Management and Development Policy. As such it is intended as a document that is under continuous scrutiny and revision. It is considered an essential element of Jacksonville State University's library management. The document serves diverse purposes, in addition to providing informational and statistical data about the library's holdings and collections.

The primary purpose of the collection assessment document is to reveal and report the strengths and weaknesses of the library's holdings and collections based on recognized collection evaluation techniques and standards. From these findings specific recommendations about future acquisitions activity and collection treatment are developed. As noted this is a continuous process. Recommendations, plans, and acquisitions are monitored and refined or altered as additional information from future assessments is reviewed. Furthermore, assessments reveal whether the library conforms to the criteria outlined in its collection management and development policy, whether the collection meets the needs of its patrons, and whether program or accreditation requirements and recommendations are being addressed. Finally, an assessment can serve as a communication tool between the University's administration and faculty and the library, between other libraries, consortia, and institutions, and for accreditation agencies.

Informational data from assessments provides the librarian with the necessary base to formulate and implement new plans and programs. Among these "decision-making concepts" that can be determined are: areas of future space requirements; staffing needs; budget projections or reallocation judgements; program funding; preservation and weeding decisions; and cooperative collection development arrangements. Extracted statistical data provides the library with a gauge to determine quantitative and qualitative or subjective information. Among the data that can be extrapolated are: growth rate; collection usage; percentage of budget expenditures, and interlibrary library comparisons.

In order to evaluate the Houston Cole Library's holdings we decided that each assessment would follow the pattern and hierarchy established in the Houston Cole Library Collection Management and Development Pclicy. Thus, collections are assessed first by floor location and secondly by University departmental affiliation or by subject matter. The use of this arrangement resulted in different levels of evaluation and allowed the individual Subject Specialists to determine
exactly to what depth they would evaluate the subject holdings on their respective floors. It also has permitted the reviewer to adapt the individual assessments to overall departmental areas of responsibility or to a particular faculty area of subject expertise.

The librarians evaluating the collections in the Houston Cole Library used the Conspectus Approach utilizing a variety of methodologies to incorporate both qualitative and quantitative analyses in their assessments. The methodologies employed were: list-checking, direct collection examination, shelflist measurement and analysis, WLN Conspectus sheets, comparative analysis of statistics extracted from the OCLC'AMIGOS Collection Analysis Service, and compilation of statistics (percentage of growth).

List-checking is both a quantitative and a qualitative exercise. To insure some consistency, it was required that a number of authoritative and comprehensive bibliographies, covering all the academic disciplines and appropriate for Comprehensive Universities such as Jackso:ville State University, were utilized. These included: Books for College Libraries, Guide to Reference Books, and American Reference Books Annual. Also, the reviewers checked the standard indexes and abstracts embracing their subject areas. In addition, they were strongly encouraged to employ other checklists and subject bibliographies germane to their disciplines.

Direct collection examination is a qualitative measurement. It presumed that the reviewer was knowledgeable about the subject and discipline. In this procedure the subject specialists physically perused the holdings, noting both strengths and areas of weakness or gaps in holdings, and the physical condition of the collection. Another facet of this technique was the reviewers' experience with reference assistance to patrons. The ability or inability to adequately supply informational needs was an important aspect of the assessment narrative.

Shelfiist measurement and analysis is a quantitative assessment technique. Each Subject Specialist or other library staff member measured the respective call number ranges in the Library of Congress Classification and the Dewey Decimal Classification (Houston Cole Library average: 85 titles per inch) for the holdings in the main and reference shelflists. Total holdings were indicated for each range on the appropriate WLN Conspectus sheets.

The WLN Conspectus sheets are both a quantitative and a qualitative report of the library's holdings. Incorporating the Houston Cole Library Collection Management and Develcpment Policy to determine and note the Goal Level of the collection, the assessor reviewed data from the other
methodologies employed to determine and note Current Level and Current Acquisition Levels of the collection. In addition, comments noting holding's weaknesses and strengths, other related collections, and recommended acquisition, preservation, and weeding plans were indicated. Completed conspectus worksheets at the Houston Cole Library are kept in loose-leaf binders as they are reviewed and updated frequently and their number and bulk preclude inclusion in this volume.

The OCLC/AMIGOS Collection Analysis Service provides a quantitative comparison of collection holdings within a variety of diverse or similar library groupings. For assessment purposes, the Houston Cole Library elected to compare its holdings with its' national peer group of Academic Libraries with holdings of 300,000 to 699,999 volumes, and with the other academic libraries within the state of Alabama (NAAL). Extracted data is generated from the ocLC tapes and reveals holdings comparisons within specific Library of Congress Classification ranges. In addition, other comparative data that can be extrapolated include: holdings percent, publication year, language, holdings proportions, overlaps, gaps, asd holdings distributions. During this evaluation the assessment concentrated on subccilection proportions of holdings percentages and holdings comparisons.

Within the methodology of compilation of statistics only the percentage of growth was utilized. This technique involved comparing our yearly acquisition rate with Baker \& Taylor's Books List: All Programs and the Bowker Annual to ascertain what percentage of the yearly publication of English Language and selected language publications the library acquires.

As this was the first comprehensive library-wide assessment undertaken a number of methodologies and other criteria were not incorporated into this document. Inasmuch as library assessments are a continuous process, it is expected that future collection evaluations will include other techniques and methodologies. Some future evaluations could focus on usage studies, user satisfaction surveys, citation analysis, or outside expert evaluations.

## AGRICULTURE COLLECTION ASSESSMENT

Following guidelines established by the Pacific Northwest Collection Development Program (which provides an overview of a library's current holdings and the level of activity at which the collection is being developed) the Agriculture collection is an overall 2bE (Basic Information Level, Advanced, predominantly English). Refer to the Agriculture conspectus sheets, the AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions sheets, and the checklist analysis sheets for a more detailed examination of the library's holdings.

## MONOGRAPHIC ASSESSMENT:

The Agriculture Collection contains 4,419 monographic titles in the classifications $S$ and 630. Additional holdings in this area are two microfilm sets, the George Washington Carver Papers at Tuskegee Institute and the John Horry Dent Farm Journals and Account Books, 1840-1892. The following bibliographies were checked against the library's holdings revealing the corresponding percentages:

## SUPPLEMENTAL SUPPORT:

Holdings in the related subject collections of Biology, Chemistry, Commerce and Business Administration, Family and Consumer Sciences, History, General Works, Geology, and Technology provide supplemental support to the Agriculture Collection.

## SUMMARY:

## Strengths:

Total holdings, PNW conspectus evaluations, AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions Reports, and checklist comparisons indicate that the Agriculture monographic holdings are
strong, particularly as there is not a degree program in this field. The collection's format strengths are guides, dictionaries, and encyclopedias. Its subject strengths are Agricultural History, Horticulture, Gardening, Economic Entomology, Plant Pests and Diseases, Floriculture, Aquaculture, and Wildiife Conservation. AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions s-iz Agriculture peer Group: Academics report reveals that within our national peer group we added 500 more titles than the average member. The $\mathrm{s}-\mathrm{Sz}$ collection size is 223\% larger than the average national member. AMIGOS Subcollection proportions S-SZ Agriculture Peer Group: AJB User Defined Peer Group report shows that in comparison to other NAAL libraries, JSU added 437 more titles than the average NAAL member insti ution. The S-SZ collection size is $91 \%$ larger than the average NAAL nember collection.

## Weaknesses:

Total holdings, conspectus evaluation, and checklist comparisons indicate that the Agriculture Collection is weak in the areas of Agricultural Education, Statistics, and Animal culture. The low holdings rates from the ARBA's checked indicate that the reference collection is aging. The AV collection is minuscule and dated. In addition, the Baker-raylor's Books List for All Programs indicates that they shipped 944 titles in the Agricultural Sciences to their customers between July 1990 and June 1991. AMIGOS data reveals that the library currently collects an average of 82 titles in this area per year. The journal collection is small, but adequate for the curriculum.

## Recommendations:

It should be noted that the holdings in this areas serves as a supplemental support collection. Monographs should be selectively purchased in areas that overlap and support other disciplines (i.e. botany, marine biology, etc.). Serial acquisitions should remain at the present level. Further, cooinnnation with the Director of Nonprint Media should be established to ensure that acquisitions of appropriate AV materials is undertaken.

## ALABAMA GALLERY COLLECTION ASSESSMENT

The Alabama Gallery consists of two divisions: the Alabama collection and the Old and Rare Book Collection. The materials in these collections are both eclectic and catholic in their nature. It was therefore impossible to evaluate them using the various traditional methodologies employed in assessing the other subject collections for the Houston Cole Library Collection Assessment Project.

## Supplemental Support:

Holdings throughout the library's other subject coilections supplement material in the Alabama Gallery. When possible, Alabamiana materials are duplicated in the general stacks.

## Summary:

The Alabama collection contains approximately 5,461 titles; numerous vertical files; copies of JSU theses; University publications, records, and archival records; and the manuscript collection containing correspondence of Clarence W. Daugette. The Old and Rare Book Collection contains approximately 680 titles.

## Strengths:

The Alabama Gallery Collection is adequate for the University's instructional needs. In addition to supplementing the curriculum, it serves the interests of local researchers, genealogists, and historians. Every
effort is made to collect one copy of newly published Alabamiana. While collecting retrospective materials for the Alabama Collection is limited to their availability and the Acquisition departmental budget, earlier published works in the collection represent a solid cross-section of Alabamiana.

## Weaknesses:

The Alabama Collection is weakest in archival state documents. This id due largely to the lack of a statewide depository system and the irregularity of these publications. The Old and Rare Book Collection is small as it serves as a storehouse for items found in the collection that are determined to be unique or old. In addition, many Alabama Gallery materials remain unprocessed through the library's automated catalog and the collection's retrospective holdings have not been converted.

## Recommendations:

continue to collect all identifiable in-print Alabamiana. Retrospective holdings should be converted and unprocessed items should be added to the library's automated catalog for accessibility. Outside support should be solicited to acquire older or out-of-print Alabamiana not currently owned by the library.

## AMERICAN LITERATURE COLLECTION ASSESSMENT

Following guidelines established by the Pacific Northwest Collection Development Program (which provides an overview of a library's current holdings and the level of activity at which the collection is being developed), the American Literature Collection is rated an overall 3cE (Advanced Study Level, predominantly English language materials). Refer to the Linguistics, Languages, and Literatures conspectus sheets, checklists, and AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions sheets for a more detailed examination of the library's holdings. MONOGRAPHIC ASSESSMENT:

The American Literature collection contains 13,863 monographic titles in the classification PS, with an additional 786 titles in PS reference. This is supplemented by 3,556 titles in Dewey classification 810-819 and 15,842 titles in classification PZ1-10, bringing the sum to 34,047 titles. There are additional titles in microform -- including the 15,571 titles in the Wright's American Fiction series -- for a grand total in excess of 49,618 titles. The percentage for the Selective Bibliography is somewhat misleading due to the narrow scope of the entries. Most of the citations are from creditable scholarly journals. NONPRINT MEDIA ASSESSMENT:
The American Literature Collection contains 63 nonprint titles. of these 63 titles, 29 were listed in the Educational Film \& Video Locator.

This low percentage can be attributed to the Locator's comprehensive filmography, a work intended for large media centers.

SUPPLEMENTAL SUPPORT:
Holdings in the related subject collections of English Literature; Western European Literatures; Languages and Related

Literatures; History; Art; Auxiliary Sciences of History; Philosophy, Ethics, and Religion; and General Works provide supplemental support to the American Literature Collection. SUMMARY:

## Strengtins:

Total holdings, conspectus evaluation, and checklist comparisons indicate that the American Literature. Collection overall is very strong. The collection is particularly strong in English language materials encompassing the areas of History and Criticism by form and period and Literatures of the 19 th and 20 th centuries, in :luding the post-1961 contemporary period. This is supported by the AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions profiles. The AMIGOS profiles also indicate that we compare impressively with our peer groups on both the AJB User Defined Peer Group and Academics Peer Group profiles, showing a larger collection size of $116 \%$ and $61 \%$ respectively. Our smallest comparative figure from either profile is 150\%, covering PS700-893, which is American literature of the colonial period and 18th century. The curriculum puts the least demand on this period of American literature. And because many of the "literary" figures of this period -- unlike the 19 th and 20 th centuries -- are really more central to history or religion, this portion of the collection receives strong supplementary support from materials in classes $B, E$, and $F$.

Further, the Language, Linguistics, and Literature Conspectus sheets indicate exceptional strength in the library's holdings in the 19 th century, 20 th century, and contemporary American

Literature, especially the fiction of these periods. These areas receive the heaviest demands of the curriculum. Although American literature does not have the microform strength of English literature, its research capabilities are enhanced by the 15,000 titles in Wright's American Fiction. Reference and periodical holdings are both more than adequate to support the monographic collection.

## Weaknesses:

The analysis of the library's holdings using the Guide to Reference Books does not reveal any pronounced weaknesses, but the Guide's listing is so brief that it really is not an accurate indicator. Of far more use is an analysis of the ARBA volumes covering 1985-1990. The ARBA analysis indicates that collecting activity for reference materials in this area, while adequate, is nowhere near the level necessary to maintain a 3cE collection level. A possible explanation for this decreased rate is that many of the titles cited in ARBA are republished, condensed, concise, or specialized editions of "complete sets" that the lihrary already owns. Nonetheless, collection activity in reference -- as well as periodicals -- still needs to be increased.

The Baker-Taylor Books List for All Programs 1990-1991 indicates that 3,227 titles were published in American Literature. The AMIGOS data reveals that the library averaged 656 American Literature titles per year for 1979-89. This low number can be attributed to the numerous popular out of scope titles published in this area each year.

In addition, the library's $A V$ holdings are small and inadequate.

## Recommendations:

The collecting activity should be maintained at the current 3 cE level. Areas within the American Literature curriculum which are receiving increased emphasis, such as Afro-American Literature and Women Writers, should be monitored to maintain pace with demand. Priority should be given to materials covering Contemporary Poets and Poetry, as these are also areas of increased usage. Additional funds should be allocated to purchase replacement copies of the many materials that have been withdrawn from this collection due to theft, loss, or mutilation. It is further recommenced that efforts between the library and the teaching faculty be coordinated to acquire duplicate reserve copies of heavily used materials.

SUPPLEMENTAL SUPPORT:
Holdings in the related subject collections of Education; Family and Consumer Science; History; Communications, Languages and Related Literatures; Western European Literatures; English Literature; American Literature; Philosophy, Ethics and Religion; Psychology; Sociology; and Technology provide supplemental support to the Art monograph and serial collections. In addition, the Art Department's slide collection of 23,500 items and additional AV materials lends supplemental support to the library's Art Collection.

## SUMMARY:

## Strengths:

Total holdings, conspectus evaluation, and checklist comparisons indicate that the Art collection is strong, particularly in the areas of (ND) Painting, (N) General Works, (NA) Architecture, (NK) Applied and Decorative Arts, and (NC) Drawing/Commercial Art. Of note are the high percentages of titles held in the smaller areas, such as sculpture, when checked against the listings in Books for College Libraries. In addition, the library maintains large holdings in areas such as architecture and the decorative arts which are not emphasized by the art
department. These materials support course work in regional planning, costume design, stage crafts, stage costume history, display, and creative expression in home furnishings. The library's holdings are more than adequate to support the emphasis in the curriculum. The AMIGOS Subcollection proportions $N-N Z$ Fine Arts: AJB User Defined Peer Group report shows that in comparison to other NAAL libraries JSU added 533 more titles than the average NAAL member institution. The $N-N Z$ collection is $38 \%$ larger than the average NAAL institution.

## Weaknesses:

Total holdings, conspectus evaluation, and checklist comparisons indicate that the Art Collection is weak in the areas of the art of Latin America, Eastern Europe, Asia, and Africa. Coverage is also uneven with regard to some major artists, such as Rubens, Mondrian, and Poussin, as well as minor European artists considered important to the study of the history of art. "How-to" holdings appear weak, but are supplemented by the Technology Collection. The AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions N-NZ Fine Arts: Academic User Defined Peer Group report reveals that within our national peer group JSU added 210 less titles than the average member in our peer group. JSU's N-NZ collection is $10 \%$ smaller than the national average member institution. The Baker-Taylor Books List for All Programs shows that 2100 titles were published in 1990/91. JSU has added an average of 178 titles per year since 1978. Because the study of art is by its nature visual, the minuscule and dated $A V$ collection is a glaring weakness.

## Recommendations:

Because the current collecting activity in this area has been limited, a conscious effort should be made to increase the library's art monographs, particularly in those areas determined as deficient. It is also recommended that in coordination with the Director of Nonprint Media, more recent and pertinent AV materials be purchased.

## AUDIO-VISUAL COLLECTION ASSESSMENT

The materials in this collection cover all disciplines. It was impossible to evaluate them using the standard methodologies as were employed in assessing other subject collections for the Houston Cole Library collection Assessment project. It should be noted that each subject collection assessment includes a non-print component describing the audio-visual holdings for that particular collection.

## Supplemental Support:

There are separate discreet non-print media collections in the departments of Art, Biology, Commerce and Business, Communications, Criminal Justice, Drama, Education, English, Family and Consumer Sciences, Foreign Languages, Music, Nursing, and Sociology.

## Summary:

The AudioVisual collection contains 3,694 titles in non-print media covering all Library of Congress classifications $\mathrm{A}-\mathrm{Z}$. In addition, the collection includes 850 pieces of hardware in its circulating collection. These range from overhead and slide projectors to screens, extension cords, and projection carts which are circulated throughout the campus on a daily and weekly basis.

## Strengths:

In terms of percentage of holdings, the areas of literature, education, general sciences, history and the social sciences represent the majority of the titles in the collection.

## Weaknesses:

In terms of percentage of holdings, the areas of Library Science \& Bibliography, Geography \& Anthropology, Physical Education, Political Science, Fine Arts, Linguistics, Foreign Languages, Military Sciences, Law, and Agriculture each represent less than $.03 \%$ of the total non-print collection. The software collection is very small. Although a large percentage of holdings support areas with the most students, the works are old and hold only historical interest. The few items in the newer technology formats cannot be used as the library does not own the necessary hardware. The newer digital technologies of compact disk and video projection devices are not represented in this collection. In fact, some of the library's equipment is over 30 years old and, although still in service, is increasingly difficult to maintain. An additional weakness is that most of the supplemental campus non-print collections are not catalogued in the library's database and are therefore not accessible to the general University community.

## Recommendations:

The software collection is shifting slowly to newer media formats of video tapes, computer software, and compact disk technologies and this effort must be continued. outdated materials must be replaced with more up-to-date titles and formats as soon as possible. Additionally, presentation hardware such as the newer digital technologies of compact disc, interactive video, and computer presentation must be acquired in order to expose the University community to the latest technology. Further, determined efforts should be made to develop a quality Audio-Visual collection to supplement and enhance the contemporary and future curriculum endeavors at Jacksonville State University.

## SUPPLEMENTAL SUPPORT:

Holdings in the related subject collections of History, General Works, Geography and Anthropology, Library Science and Bibliography, political Science, and Art, provide supplemental support to the Auxiliary Science of History Collection.

## SUMMARY:

## Strengths:

Total holdings, conspectus evaluation, and checklist comparisons indicate that the Auxiliary Sciences of History Collection is strong, particularly in the areas of History of Civilization, Western Civilization, Medieval Civilization, Chivalry, Genealogy, Biography, and National Biography. The AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions Cl-CT9999 Auxiliary Sciences of History Peer Group: Academic Report revels that within our national peer group we added 231 more titles than the average member. The C1-CT9999
collection is $84 \%$ larger than the average national member collection. The AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions C1-C9999 Auxiliary Sciences of History Peer Group: AJB User Defined Report shows that in comparison to other NAAL libraries, JSU added 300 more titles than the average NAAL member institution. The cl-C9999 collection size is $147 \%$ larger than the average NAAL member collection.

## Weaknesses:

Total holdings, conspectus evaluation, and checklist comparisons indicate that the Auxiliary Sciences of History Collection is weakest in the areas of Numismatics and Inscriptions. An observed weakness is the holdings for personal and family name research. A review of Baker-Taylor's Books List For All Programs reveals 264 titles _ $\cap$ this area were shipped between July 1990 and June 1991. AMIGOS data reveals that the library currently receives approximately 46 Auxiliary Sciences of History titles per year; this is not a concern as most of these publications are out of scope of the collection.

## Recommendations:

As the purpose of the Auxiliary Sciences of History Collection is to provide secondary support to other areas in the curriculum the collecting activity is more than adequate. Because a popular freshmen assignment is to locate the origin and meaning of one's surname, it is recommended that holdings in the area of personal names be enhanced. This is particularly important because this assignment is sometimes these students first encounter with library research.

## SUMMARY:

## Strengths:

Total. holdings, PNW conspectus evaluations, AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions Reports, and checklist comparisons indicate that the
collection's monographic holdings are more than adequate to support the course offerings in Biology. Of particular note in General Biology and Natural History axe the holdings in Reference, Biogeography, Origins of Life, Quantitative Genetics, Evolution, and Cytology. In Botany, areas of note encompass Reference, Plant Geography, Plant Ecology, Plant Evolution, and Plant Physiology. In zoology the collection is strong in the study of Invertebrates, Animal Behavior, and Embryology. Within the study of Vertebrates, areas of strength include Amphibia \& Reptilia and Ornithology. In Physiology, areas of strength include Comparative Physiology, Blood \& Circulation, Reproduction \& Physiology of Sex, and Reflexes \& Conditional Response. In Bacteriology and Microbiology, the areas of Immunology and Virology should be noted. A review of Books for College Libraries reveals a holdings percentage rate of $72.7 \%$; a holdings percentage rate of $66.6 \%$ being considered satisfactory for Comprehensive Colleges and Universities. Four bibliographies reviewed: Science \& Engineering Literature, Information Sources in Science \& Technology, Core List of Books \& Journals in Science \& Technology, and AAAS Science Book List 1978-1986 show holding percentages of $66.1 \%, 56.8 \%, 47.9 \%$, and $44.7 \%$ respectively. As these bibliographies are more specialized the holdings rates are good. AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions QH1-QR9999 Science Peer Group: Academics Report reveals that within our national peer group we added 959 more titles than the average member. The QH1QR9999 collection size is $48.9 \%$ larger than the average national member. AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions QH1-QR9999 Science Peer Group: AJB User Defined Peer Group Report shows that in
comparison to other NAAL Libraries JSU added 1,273 more titles than the average NAAL member institution. The QHI-QR9999 collection size is $77.3 \%$ larger than the average NAAL member collection. The Baker \& Taylor's Books List for All Proqrams indicate that they shipped 878 titles in the Biological Sciences to their customers between July 1990 and June 1991. AMIGOS data reveals that the library currently averages 265.2 Biology titles per year. As this represents over $30 \%$ of Biology titles for all types of libraries, it indicates a strong collection commitment. One Additional source of particular strength is the Price Parasitology Collection. Numbering over 5,355 items in journal, reprint, and monographic format, the collection, once cataloged, will be a great enhancement to biological researchers in that subject area.

## Weaknesses:

A review of the checklists and conspectus sheets reveals monographic weaknesses in several different areas. In General Biology and Natural History, areas of concern include Microscopy, History, and Study \& Teaching. Also, within the area of Cytology the study of Chromosomes \& Cell Division and Physiological, Physical, \& Chemical Properties need attention. In Botany the areas of Botanical Gardens \& Herbaria, Morphology, Anatomy, and Embryology are noted areas of weakness. In Zoology, History \& Biography need development, as do numerous classifications within Mammalogy, Entomology, Ichthyology, and Herpetology. The Human Anatomy collection is small and dated. Within Physiology, areas of concern include Environmental Influences, Endocrinology, Movement (Flight \& Muscle), and Enzymes. Technique \&

Classification is an area of weakness in Bacteriology and Microbiology. Overall the journal collection is adequate to support the curriculum, however, with the exception of Ornithology, there are no specialized journals that deal specifically with individual classes of plants or animals. Like the rest of the sciences, the Biology holdings in AV format are minuscle and dated.

## Recommendations:

The Biology Department has begun to place greater emphasis on research than in previous years. This new development has a number of implications for the library's Biology Collection. At present, with the exception of the few noted areas of weakness, the monographic holdings are more than adequate to support the curriculum. Thus, excluding the need for acquisitions to keep abreast of inflation, it seems that by intelligent acquisition practices it should be possible to enhance noted areas of weaknesses by carefully planned and balanced de-emphasis of areas of superior strength for a limited time period. Journal acquisition, however, will need an influx of new monies in order to meet the expected increased demand in research materials. A coordinated effort between the department and the library will be needed to insure that the appropriate current and retrospective serials are purchased. With the exception of a number of monographic and serial titles the uncataloged Price Parasitology Collection in its current state is useless for researchers. It is important that the pamphlet and reprint collection be cataloged
as soon as it is feasible. In addition, coordination with the Director of Nonprint Media and the teaching faculty should be established to insure that acquisition of new materials in AV format reflect the new emphasis and will update and increase the Biology holdings in that area.

SUMMARY:

## Strengths:

Total holdings, PNW conspectus evaluations, AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions reviews, and checklist comparisons indicate that the collections monographic holdings are adequate in the areas of History and Biography, General Chemistry, Inorganic Chemistry, Laboratory Handbooks, Safety, and Chromatography.

## Weaknesses:

A review of Books for college Libraries reveals a holdings percentage rate of $59.8 \%$, only $6.8 \%$ points off the recommended percentage for Comprehensive Colleges and Universities as noted by John M. Budd. This is, however, tempered by the fact that $25.4 \%$ of the 201 titles held are older or outdated editions. The Core List of Books shows a dismal $35.8 \%$ holdings rate, Guide to Basic Information Sources only 36.2\%, and AAAS Science Books List a weak 40.7\%. The AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions QD1-QD999 Science Peer Group: AJB User Defined Peer Group report shows that in comparison to other NAAL libraries JSU added 172 less titles than the average NAAL member institution. Noted areas of weakness in the monographic collection include: Bibliography, Chromatography, Kinetics, Nuclear Data, Mass Spectra, Organometallic Chemistry, Photochemistry, Theoretical Chemistry, and Thermophysical Properties. Baker \& Taylor's Book List For All Programs reveals that they shipped 421 Chemistry titles between July 1990 and June 1991, currently JSU is receiving only 27.3 Chemistry titles per year. of the 22 journal titles held only 15 titles are still on standing order. Chemistry holdings in the AV Collection are extremely small and dated.

## Recommendations:

The current rate of monographic acquisitions needs to be increased with particular emphasis on the noted areas of weaknesses and dated editions. Current budgetary constraints (proration) has forced the library to cancel some Chemistry journals, thus additional revenues must be sought in future budgets to reestablish standing orders for the more heavily utilized titles. Coordination with the Director of Nonprint Media in acquiring more recent and pertinent titles should enhance the current collection.

## SUMMARY:

## Strengths:

Total holdings, conspectus evaluation, and checklist comparisons indicate the overall Commerce arid Business Collection is strong.

The collection is particularly strong in the areas of ready reference, accounting, management, U. S. statistical sources, real estate, human resources/personnel management, and American business and economic trends. The library received NAAL grants to supplement acquisitions in this area in 1989/90 and 1990/91. During the grant process Books for College Libraries and Business Information Sources were used as evaluation/collection development tools. Retrospective purchases were selected from these sources as well as current publications from other sources. NAAL funds have been used to purchase an additional 905 volumes, resulting in a holdings percentage rate of $75 \%$ of $B C L$ citations. An AMIGOS analysis of the 1978-88 imprints added to the collection demonstrates that we have a strong collection in relation to our peer groups. The "Subcollection Proportions H-HZ Social Sciences: Peer Group: Academics" report shows that in comparison to our national peer group, we added 3,846 more titles than the average member within our group. The $H-H J$ collection size is $57 \%$ larger than the average member in our group. The "Subcollection Proportions H-HZ Social Sciences Peer Group: AJB User Defined Peer Group" report shows that in comparison to other NAAL libraries, JSU collected 4,436 more titles than the average NAAL member, making the collection $72 \%$ larger. In addition, the AMIGOS analysis indicates that in the period between 1978-1988 the collection has been growing at an average of 1,059 titles per year. The Bowker Annual shows 1,579 monographs published in this area during these same years. Thus, the monograph collection is current and supports the mission of the college of commerce and Business Administration.

## Weaknesses:

Total holdings, conspectus evaluation, and checklist comparisons indicate that the Commerce and Business Collection is weak in the areas of industry statistics (automotive, appliances, plastics, packaging, utilities, transportation, etc.) and international business and economic trends. Statistics are used for business optimal decision making, design and analysis of business research projects, assessing economic trends, and developing marketing strategies. This data is an integral part of the curriculum (Marketing Forecasting Methods MKT 488, Advanced Quantitative Business Analysis MGT490, Business Statistics ST490, Business Cycles and Forecasting ST480, Business Statistics ST501, Quantitative Methods in Business ST518, and Independent Research ST598). The results of the check against the biblios raphy, Business Information Sources, indjcate holdings of only $37 \%$ in this area. Further, a perusal of the sections covering international aspects in the bibliography reflect inadequate holdings. Current world events such as the evolution of the European Common Market, the possible North American Free Trade Zone, and the economic changes in the former Soviet Bloc countries are studied in the College of Commerce and Business Administration (International Eccnomics EC450, International Finance FIN434, International Management MGT496, International Marketing MKT493, International Trade EC570, International Finance FTN590, Interrational Management MGT590, and International Marketing MKT590). These areas need to be enhanced as the College of Commerce and Business Administration is seeking
accreditation from the American Assembly of Collegiate Schools of Business.

## Recommendations:

While the monographic collection is strong and the serials holdings reflect a percentage sufficient to support the college of Commerce and Business Administration programs at the Intermediate Study level, more serials within the specialties of international marketing, international management, international finance and banking, and industry statistics should be acquired. serial publications such as update services form the majority of materials for which the collection shows inadequacies and require long range funding commitments. These should receive priority consideration for collection development. These endeavors in combination with continued NAAL grant assistance will support the College of Commerce and Business Administration's accreditation goals.

## SUPPLEMENTAL SUPPORT:

The broader view of Communications as a discipline includes materials are located in LC classifications other than $P$ and $P N$. See especially holdings in advertising and business communication under HF, bibliography and publishing under $Z$, broadcasting under $H E$ and TK, public relations under $H M$ and photography under TR. Holdings in the related subject collections of Art; Commerce and Business Administration; Drama; Geography and Anthropology; Language and Related Literatures; Mathematics and Computer Science; Philosophy, Ethics, and Religion; Psycholngy; Sociology and Social Work; and Technology provide additional support to the Communication Collection.

## SUMMARY:

Eleanor Block in Communication and the Mass Media states:
"Coverage includes sources relevant to the various areas that constitute the curricula offered by departments of communication in colleges and universities throughout the United States. These most commonly include courses in communication theory, impersonal and small group communication, organizational communication, mass communication (radio, television, and film), rhetoric, speech, applied linguistics, international and intercultural communication, telecommunications, and new communication technologies. Public relations, advertising, technical
writing and business communication, and journalism are also naturally or, at least, in many programs, closely affiliated with the communication curricula."

## Strengths

Total holdings, conspectus evaluation, and checklist comparisons indicate that the Communication Collection is strong enough to support the present curriculum. Six relevant bibliographies checkea reveal a holdings rate of $49 \%$ or higher. Of note are our holdings in filmography; mass media; morphology and syntax; lexicography; motion pictures, communication law; communication ethics; biography; newspapers; journalism; and broadcasting industry. Extracted data from the AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions Peer Group: Academics report reveals that within our national peer group we added 321 more titles than the average member. Thus, the collection size is $42 \%$ larger than the average national member.

## Weaknesses:

Total holdings, conspectus evaluation, and checklist comparisons indicate that the Communications Collection is weak in the areas of television production, media editing, film and sound technology, and telecommunications technology. Findings also reveal a weakness in specialized research tools and materials on the American mass media professions. This weakness, however, can be justified as the focus of this program is on undergraduate education. In addition, the Baker-Taylor's Books List for all Programs indicates that they shipped 384 titles in the journalism and communication fields to their customers between July 1990 and June 1991.

AMIGOS data reveals that the library currently collects an average of 109 titles in these areas per year. The low holdings of audio-visual materials can be justified in part, as the University does not offer film courses, and many of the films were purchased to support other programs (e.g.adaptations of literary classics which are intended to augment literature reading assignments).

Recr" nendations:
Three bibliographies rated our serial holdings at below 30 per cent; therefore, periodical holdings in mass media and journalism should be examined with an eye to securing more of the standard professional journals. The monographic acquisitions should be increaser with a goal toward enhancing the noted weak areas. Also, acquisitions in the area of filmography should be deemphasized as it is out of scope of the curriculum.

## Strengths:

Total holdings, PNW conspectus evaluation, AMIGOS subcollection and checklist comparisons indicate the overall Criminal Justice Collection is more than adequate to support the curricula. of particular note are the holdings in Criminal Justice, Criminal Anthropology, Victimology, Crimes \& Criminal Classes, Police: Administration and Organization, Police Duty, Prisons, and Juvenile offenders. A comparison of the collection's titles against listings in Books for College Libraries shows a healthy 83.9\% holding rate. Analysis of a more germane bibliography, Crime in America: Historical Patterns and Contemporary Realities reveals a respectable $48.9 \%$ holding rate. Extracted data from the AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions $\mathrm{H}-\mathrm{HZ}$, Social Sciences Peer Group: Academic Report reveals that within our national peer group we have 2,028 more Criminal Justice titles than the average member in our peer group. The collection size is $164 \%$ larger than the average members collection. The Subcollection Proportions H-HZ, Social Sciences: AJB User Defined Peer Group report shows that in comparison to other NAAL libraries JSU collected 2,191 more titles than the average NAAL member. The collection size is $203 \%$ larger than the average NAAL member
collection. An indicator of collecting activity is the Baker \& Taylor Books List for All Programs 1990-91 which states that they shipped 280 Criminal Justice titles during the July 1990 to June 1991 period. Extracted data from the AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions report shows that the library added an average of 326 titles in Criminal Justice between 1978-1988. Further, a review of the journal holdings reveals that the criminal Justice collection is adequate to support the curricula in the subject areas of Criminology and Police Science.

## Weaknesses:

Total holdings, PNW conspectus evaluations, AMIGOS Subcollection proportions reviews, and checklist comparisons indicate that the Criminal Justice Collection's monographic holdings are weakest in the areas of Social Work with Delinquents and Criminals, Gun Control, and Victimless Crimes.

## Recommendations:

While the serials holdings reflect a percentage sufficient to support the College of Criminal Justice programs at the Intermediate Study level, more serials wit:' $n$ the specialties of police Science and Criminology should be acquired. Monographic acquisitions should focus in the area of Social Work with Delinquents and Criminals.

Total holdings for this area do not reflect the numerous titles classified within more specific areas of the Language and Literature (P-PZ) Library of Congress classification scheme. Additionally, there are many titles classified within the Dewey 800's. These materials include drama criticisms, play texts, and dramatic reference works that are organized by country of origin and/or authorship. A review of the holdings, PNW conspectus evaluation, AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions sheets, and checklist comparisons indicate the overall Drama Collection is more than adequate to support the curricuia. of particular note are the holdings in Genres and Special Types of Drama, Broadcasting, Motion Pictures, General Theater, Stage Crafts, Stage History, Theater in the United States, Amateur and College Theatricals, and Theater in Europe. It should be noted that the library holds \(66 \%\) or more of the items listed in the following bibliographies: Books for College Libraries, Guide to Reference Books, Humanities: A Selective Guide to Information Sources, Literary Advisor, and Reference Guide for English Studies. Extracted data from the AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions Literature General (PN1010-PN3300): Academic Report reveals that within our national peer group we own 229 more titles than the average member in our peer group. The PN1010-PN3300 collection size is \(26 \%\) larger than the average member collection. Extracted data from the Subcollection Proportions General Literature
(PNi010-PN3300): General Peer Group: AJB User Defined Peer Group report shows that in comparison to other NAAL libraries JSU collected 515 more titles than the average NAAL member. The collection size is \(90.6 \%\) ? arger than \(t\) e average NAAL member collection.

\section*{Weaknesses:}

Total holdings, PNW conspectus evaluations, AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions sheets, and checklist comparisons indicate that the weakest areas of the Drama Collection are Theater in Canada, Latin America, Eastern Europe, Asia, Africa, and Oceania; Jewish Theater; Minstrel Shows, Spectacles, and Ta'oleaux; Directories to Foreign Language Plays; Catalogs and Playbills; and Rhetoric. The serial assessment reveals a low number of current subscriptions in this area.

\section*{Recommendatirns:}

While the monographic collection is strong and the serials holdings reflect a percentage sufficient to support the Drama Program at the 3 bE Intermediate Instructional Support Level, it is recommended that an increase in the rumber of journal subscriptions and monographs encompassing theater design and public performance be considered when funds permit. Other noted areas of weakness are out of scope of the curriculum.

(Advanced Study Level, predominantly English). Refer to the Education and Physical Education and Recreation conspectus sheets for a more detailed examination of the library's holdings.

The Education Collection contains 30,506 monographic titles in the classifications 370 and \(L\). The physical education holdings are comprised of 6,443 titles in the classification GV, 613, and 790. The juvenile literature collection contains approximately 10,620 titles. The public school textbook collection is comprised of 2,570 series titles representing approximately 12,000 volumes. \section*{SUMMARY:}

\section*{Strengths:}

Total holdings, conspectus evaluation, and checklist comparisons indicate that the Education Collection is strong, particularly in the areas of pedagogy, juvenile literature, school administration and organization, public school education, and special education. A NAAL sponsored AMIGOS analysis performed in 1986 indicated JSU's Education Collection was the 4 th largest in the network. It should be noted that this analysis did not include the 2,641 titles cataloged in the 370's. The 1978-1988 AMIGOS L Subcollection Proportions report shows that in comparison to our national peer group we added 2,116 more titles in education than the average member and we added 2,068 more titles than the average NAAL member. The comparative size of this collection is rated \(86 \%\) larger than the average member of our national peer group and 82\% larger than the average NAAL member. The 1978-1988 AMIGOS GV Subcollection Proportions report shows that in comparison to our national peer group we added 1,804 more physical education titles than the average member in our peer group and 2,303 more titles than the average NAAL member. The comparative size of this collection is rated \(106 \%\) larger than the average member of our national peer group and \(192 \%\) larger than the average NAAL member.

\section*{Weaknesses:}

Total holdings, conspectus evaluation, and checklist comparisons
indicate that the Education Collection is weak in the areas of history of education, educational endowments, bilingual education, multicultural education, incernational education, rural education, and comparative education. The AMIGOS subcollection proportions indicate that between 1978-1988 the education and the physical education collections grev at an average of 451 titles and 198 titles per year respectively. The Bowker Annual shows an average of 1,183 education monographs and 1,306 physical education monographs published during this period. This is indicative that a concerted effort be made to aggressively build this collection to maintain the current 3 CE level. The physical education serials collection is weak in the areas of womens sports, outdoor recreation management, sports law, and physical fitness. It should be noted that a significant part of the physical education collection is missing and in the withdrawal process. The nonfictional juvenile collection is inadequate. Informational books, how to books, biographies, travel books, sex education books, etc. are in demand.

\section*{Recommendations:}

Although the Education Collection is relatively strong, and is sufficient to support the college of Education's programs at the Advanced study level, the majority of material was collected in the mid-60's. Recent acquisition activity in this area has been less than desirable. As this collection supports one of the largest programs on campus, it warrants more attention. It is recommended that the noted areas of weakness be upgraded as budget permits. Funds should be allocated to enhance the serial
collection, particularly in the area of physical education, after an inventory of those holdings is completed.

MONOGRAPHIC ASSESSMENT:
The English Literature Collection contains 16,363 monographic titles in the classification PR, supplemented by an additional 4420 titles in Dewey classification 820-829 with a further 15,842 titles in classification PZ1-10, for a sum of 36,625 titles. There are also 10,844 titles in microform, supplemented by the Early English Books microfilm series in class PN. This low percentage can be attributed to the Locator's comprehensive filmography, a work intended for large media centers.

SUPPLEMENTAL SUPPORT:
Holdings in the related subject collections of American Literature; Western European Literatures; Languages and Related Literatures; History; Art; Auxiliary Sciences of History; Philosophy, Ethics, and Religion; and General Works provide supplemental support to the English Literature Collection.

\section*{SUMMARY:}

\section*{Strengths:}

Total holdings, conspectus evaluation, and checklist comparisons indicate that the overall English Literature collection is very strong. The collection is particularly strong in English language materials encompassing the areas of History and criticism by form and period; shakespeare; and Literatures of the 17th, 18th, and 19 th centuries. This is supported by the AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions profiles. The AMIGOS profiles also indicate that we compare impressively with our peer groups on both the AJB User Defined Peer Group and Academics Peer Group profiles, showing a larger collection size of \(115 \%\) and \(52 \%\) respectively. Our smallest comparative figure from either profile is \(100 \%\) covering PR2411-PR2416 which is Renaissance Drama -Anonymous Plays.

Further, the Language, Linguistics, and Literature Conspectus sheets indicate that the library's holdings in Chaucer, Renaissance Prose and Poetry, Renaissance Playwrights, and Provincial and Colonial Literatures are more than adequate. A check of the library's holdings against the various bibliographies confirm these areas of strength. It should also be noted that the library owns complete microform sets of the Early English Books (STC 1), Early Enqlish Text Society Publications, and the English Literary Periodicals. In addition, the library has a substantial holdings of the Early English Books (STC II) and 3 units of the Eighteenth century (STC III). The reference collection is more than adequate, and we own

most of the major periodicals in this subject field.

\section*{Weaknesses:}

Total holdings, AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions, conspectus evaluation, and checklist comparisons indicate that the English Literature Collection is weak in the areas of authors and literature not from England; however, much of the Scottish and Irish literatures are subsumed under the English Literature rubric. Therefore, these literatures are stronger than the conspectus sheets and AMIGOS comparisons indicate. Austraiian and Canadian literatures are fairly well representeá, but other Commonwealth literatures, particularly those from third world countries are not actively acquired. Because the collection is strongly influenced by the curriculum and Commonwealth writers are rarely assigned or studied at this university this collection is adequate. However, a representative sampling from these areas should continued to be purchased to maintain an overall 3cE level. The analysis of the library's holdings using the Guide to Reference Books shows that we are weak in Welsh, African, Australian, Indian and New Zealand reference materials. This conclusion is further supported by analysis of the ARBA voiumes covering 1985-1990. In fact, the ARBA analysis indicates that the collecting activity for reference materials in this area has fallen dramatically over the period of 1985-1990. A possible explanation for this decreased rate is that many cited titles are republished, condensed, concise, or specialized editions of "complete sets" that the Iibrary owns.

The Baker-Taylor Books List for All Programs 1990-1991 indicates 1,695 titles were published in English Literature. The AMIGOS data reveals that the library currently receives approximately 320 English Literature titles per year. In addition, the library's AV holdings are small and inadequate.

\section*{Recommendations:}

The collecting level should be increased to maintain the current 3cE level. The teaching faculty should be notified of this situation and their input on selections should be solicited. Coordination with the Director of Nonprint Media in acquiring more recent and pertinent AV materials would enhance the overall collection.

\section*{Strengths:}

Total holdings, PNW conspectus evaluations, AMIGOS Subcollection Proportion analysis, and checklist comparisons indicate that the Family and Consumer Science monographic holdings are strong, particularly in Home Management, American Hotels
and Restaurants, Nutrition, Cookery, Clothing Manufacturing, and Sewing. These findings are supported by the library's high holdings rates reflected against the listings in Bibliography on Home Management, International Bibliography of Nutrition, and Books for College Libraries. ARBA 85-87 shows acquisitions of reference materials for that time perioid to be above average. Extracted data from the AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions T-TZ Technology Peer Group: Academics report reveals that compared to our national peer group we added 737 more titles. The TT-TX collection size is \(247 \%\) larger than the average national member collection. Extracted data from the AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions T-TZ Technology Peer Group: AJB User Defined Peer Group report show that in comparison with the average NAAL library, JSU collected 736 more titles. The TT-TX collection size is \(246 \%\) larger than the average NAAL member institution. A review of the journal holdings reveals that the Family and Consumer Science Collection is adequate to support the curricula relative to this area.

\section*{Weaknesses:}

Total holdings, conspectus evaluation, and checklist comparisons indicate that the Family and Consumer Science Collection is weak in the areas of Laundry, Soft Home Furrishings, Mobile Home Living, Taverns and Barrooms, Hotels and Taverns Legislation, and Hotel Management. All but the area of Soft Home Furnishings are out of scope. ARBA 88-90 shows an average acquisitions rate of less than \(30 \%\). Guide to Reference Books shows a holdings rate of \(48 \%\), while Walford's Guide to Reference Materials shows an
extremely low holdings rate of only 14.9\%. Walford's low percentage can be attributed to it's European bias; however, the low rating from Sheey's is of concern because all but three of the citations are American imprints. The Baker and Taylor's Books List for All Programs indicates that 386 titles were shipped to their patrons during the July 1990 - June, 1991 period. The AV Collection is small and dated.

\section*{Recommendations:}

Monographic acquisitions need to be maintained at the current level. Monographic holdings in Soft Home Furnishings should be enhanced. Serial acquisitions should remain at the present level.

\section*{Strengths:}

Total holdings, AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions reviews, PNW conspectus evaluation, and checklist comparsions indicate that the General Works Collection is strong, particularly in the areas of General Reference Dictionaries, Indexes, newspapers, Academies and Learned Societies, and Yearbooks, Almanacs, Directories. Of significant note is the Rand Corporations reports. The AMIGOS Subcollection

Proportions \(A-A Z:\) Academic Report reveals that in comparsion with our national peer group, we added 980 more titles in this area between 1978-1988 than the average member within our group. The \(A-A Z\) collection size is \(676 \%\) larger than the
average collection in our group. The AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions A-AZ: AJB user Defined Pecr Group report shows that in comparsion to the average NAAL library, JSU collected 955 more titles in this area, making the collection \(562 \%\) larger. The General Encyclopedias are aged and are being updated. The Subject Encyclopedias and General Dictionaries are current. The Newspaper Collection reflects the regional scope of the Houston Cole Library, which collects the major newspapers of the Southeast as well as selected indexed national newspapers. Books for College Libraries shows a strong holding rate of \(76 \%\). Reader's Guide shows a high holding rate of \(71 \%\) and the InfoTrac shows a holding rate of \(80 \%\).

\section*{Weaknesses:}

Total holdings, conspectus evaluation, and checklist comparsions indicate that the General Works Collection is weak in the areas of general encyclopedias some of which are aging and/or outdated. ARBA 90 shows a relatively low holding rate of \(45 \%\) and Guide to Reference Books which shows a low holding rate of \(26 \%\). These low holding rates for ARBA and Guide to Reference Books can be attributed to fact that ARBA and Guide to Reference Books include many titles for foreign publications and other types of materials that are out of scope of the collection.

\section*{Recommendations:}

The General Works Collection adequately meets the general reference needs and provides informational support for the
teaching and research activities of the University community. It is recommended that the current collecting activity level for this area be maintained. Emphasis should be on updating the old and outdated general encyclopedias. Selected foreign language general encyclopedias should be acquired.

The Geography and Anthropology collection contains 27 titles in Geography ( \(1 \%\) of the \(A V\) Collection) and 17 titles in Anthropology (.07\% of the AV Collection). The following indexes and bibliography was checked against the library's holdings revealing the corresponding percentages:

\section*{SUPPLEMENTAL SUPPORT:}

Holdings in the related subject collections of Commerce and Business Administration; Geology; History; Political Science and Public Administration; Sociology and Social Work; Auxiliary Sciences of History; General Works; and Philosophy, Ethics, and Religion provide supplemental support to the Geography and Anthropology Collection. An additional resource for support is the library's selected government depository map collection housed in the Geography Department in Martin Hall.
checklist comparisons indicate that the Geography and Anthropology Collection has the following weaknesses: the Geography holdings are weak in the areas of mathematical geography, hydrology, oceanography, and world atlases. Though curricula offerings are limited in the areas of oceanography and hydrology, additional support for these areas can be found in the Geology and Agriculture Collections. In addition, the library's map holdings are not cataloged and therefore are difficult to access. Further, the Geography \(A V\) collection is very small and \(60 \%\) of these holdings are pre-1980. The Anthropology holdings are weak in the areas of general anthropology and anthropology of women. However, course offerings tend to concentrate on cultural anthropology. As with the Geography holdings, the Anthropology AV holdings are small and dated. The Bowker Annual shows that an average of 594 titles were published in the area of travel between the years 1978-1988. The AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions report indicates JSU collected an average of 152 titles in the areas G-GT.

\section*{Recommendations:}

Concentration should be placed on developing the recognized areas of weakness. In particular, the map collection should be cataloged and the AV holdings enlarged and updated. The recommended collection level should be a 3cE (Advanced Study Level, predominantly English).

\section*{GEOLOGY COLLECTION ASSESSMENT}

Following guidelines established by the Pacific Northwest Collection Development Program (which provides an overview of a library's current holdings and the level of activity at which the collection is being developed) the Geology Collection is rated an overall 3 E (Instructional Support Level, predominantly English). Refer to the Geology conspectus sheets, AMIGOS subcollection Proportion sheets, and checklist analysis for a more detailed examination of the library's holdings.

\section*{SUPPLEMENTAL SUPPORT:}

Holdings in the related subject collections of Biology, Chemistry, General Works, Geography, and Technology provide supplemental support to the Geology Collection. Significant supplemental support is also provided by JSU's Map Collection which is housed in the Geography Department in Martin Hall.

\section*{SUMMARY:}

\section*{Strengths:}

Total holdings, PNW conspectus evaluations, AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions reviews, and checklist comparisons indicate that the collection's monographic holdings are more than adequate to support the minor in Geology cffered by the Geography Department. Of particular note are the holdings in Meteorology, Geomorphology, Climatology, Paleontology, and Geology (General, Reference, and Historical). A review of Books for College Libraries reveals a holdings percentage rate of 67.7\%; according to John M. Budd's article on the utility of BCL3 in the Journal of Academic Librarianship, a percentage rate of \(66.66 \%\) is satisfactory for Comprehensive Colleges and Universities. Two standard bibliographies reviewed, Geologic Reference Sources and

The Earth Sciences: An Annotated Bibliography, also confirm the adequacy of the library's holdings. The former bibliography is intended for research collections, and thus a holdings percentage rate of \(39.1 \%\) is quite impressive. The latter bibliography lists historical geological works, and thus, again, reflects a strong collection with a \(26.5 \%\) holdings rate. Additional sources that enhance the collection include: the U.S. Geological and Geographical Survey of the Territories (Hayden Survey); the U.S. Geological Survey, Monograph Series; U.S. Geological Survey, Professional Papers Series; and the Geological Society of America, Geology of North America Series. JSU's Map Collection houses selected Alabama Geological Survey Maps, U.S. Geological Survey Maps, and U.S. Defense Mapping Agency Maps. The AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions QC801-QC999 and QE1-QE9999 Science Peer Group: Academic Report reveals that within our national peer group we added 172 more titles than the average member in our peer group. The QC801-QC999 collection size is \(138 \%\) larger and the QE1-QE9999 collection size is \(14 \%\) larger than the average national member collection. The AMIGOS Subcollection proportions QC801-QC999 and QE1-QE9999 Science Peer Group: AJB User Defined Peer Group report shows that in comparison to other NAAL libraries JSU added 367 more titles than the average NAAL member institution. The QC801-Qc999 collection size is \(213 \%\) larger and the QE1-QE9999 collection size is 99\% larger than the average NAAL member collection.

\section*{Weaknesses:}

A review of the checklists reveals monographic weaknesses in the
areas of Mineralogy, Stratigraphy, Economic Geology, Map and Cartographic Literature, Sedimentology, and Geological Education. While the Bowker Annual does not reflect annual publishing data for Geology, a review of Baker \& Taylor's Books List for All Programs reveals that they shipped 465 Geologic books between July 1990 and June 1991. AMIGOS data reveals that the library currently receives approximately 60.4 Geology titles per year. The most serious present concern, however, is the parsimony of currently received journals. of the 17 titles held, only 7 are currently on standing order. Like the rest of the Sciences, the Geology holdings in \(A V\) are minuscule and dated.

\section*{Recommendations:}

The current rate of monographic acquisitions needs to be maintained, if not increased slightly, with particular emphasis placed on the areas of noted weaknesses. Additional serials subscriptions should be instituted when funding permits. Their selection should be coordinated with the Geography Department. In addition, a review of the JSU's Map Collection holdings within the next year would certainly aid in getting a better picture of the overall condition and strength of the collection. Finally, coordination with the Director of Nonprint Media in acquiring more recent and pertinent AV materials should enhance the overall collection.

\section*{GOVERNMENT DOCUMENTS COLLECTION ASSESSMENT}

The Houston Cole Library's Government Document acquisitions are cataloged in the Library of congress Classification System. It is therefore impossible to evaluate them as a unique or distinct collection as they are treated, counted, and integrated as holdings into their appropriate classification within the various subject collections of the Library. As a selective depository, the Library is required by the Government Printing office to maintain a core collection of specific documents. The Library adheres to this policy. General, as well as specific, selections include a variety of publications, including monographs, serials, directories, biographies, handbooks, yearbooks, maps, annual reports, statistical publications, proceedings, indices, and bibliographies. In addition, materials are received in such diverse formats as printed, microfilmed, \(C D-R O M\), and video mediums. These publications encompass the subjects of population, housing, agriculture, education, criminal justice, drug abuse, child abuse, maternal and child health, military history, U.S. history, U.S. laws and legislation, developing countries, national parks, library science, and mental health, public health, environmental issues, and space and technology. At the moment the perception is that Jacksonville state University's Selective Government Documents Depository Program currently receives the appropriate titles to adequately support the teaching and research activities of the University.

Following guidelines established by the Pacific Northwest Collection Development Program (which provides an overview of a library's current holdings and the level of activity at which the collection is being developed) the History collection is rated an overall 3 bE (Intermediate study level, predominately English). Refer to the History Collection conspectus sheets, the AMIGOS Sub-Collection Proportion reports, and the checklist analysis for a more detailed examination of the holdings in this area.

The History Collection contains 54,487 monographic titles in the classifications D, E, F, and 900. In addition, GN700-GN885 contains 234 titles. Auxiliary Sciences of History; Education; Military Science; General Works and the Alabama Collection provide supplemental support to the History Collection.

\section*{SUMMARY:}

\section*{STRENGTHS:}

Total holdings, conspectus evaluation, AMIGOS subcollection proportions, and checklist comparisons indicate that the History Collection is adequate to support the curricula. It should be noted that the library holds \(76 \%\) of the items checked in BOOKS FOR COLLEGE LIBRARIES. Significant areas include Ancient History; Medieval History; Great Britain; France; Eastern Europe; Central \& Sub-Saharan Africa; China; United States Historiography; United States History to 1860; and United States Southern History. Ov all the monographic holdings are strong, particularly in the areas of European and United States history. The sections of British and French history are noteworthy. British and United States history are supplemented with major microform collections. Holdings in South Asian, Southeast Asian, East Asian, Middle Eastern, and African histories constitute basic core collections for the curricula. Data from the AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions History: General and Old World (D-DZ): Academics Report reveals that within our national peer group we own 1224 more titles than the average member in our peer group. The \(D-D Z\) collection size is \(39 \%\) larger than the average national member collection. The data from the AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions History: America (E-FZ) : Academics Report reveals that within our national peer group we own 1164 more titles than
the average member in our peer group. The E-FZ collection size is \(47 \%\) larger than the average member collection. Data from the Subcollection Proportions History: General and Old World (D-DZ): AJB User Defined Peer Group report shows that in comparison to other NAAL libraries JSU collected 2434 more books than the average NAAL member. The collection size is \(124 \%\) larger than the average NAAL member collection. Data from the AMIGOS Suiocollection Proportions History: America (E-FZ): AJB User Defined Peer Group report shows that in comparison to other NAAL libraries JSU collected 1900 more books than the average NAAL member. The collection size is \(108 \%\) larger than the average NAAL member collection. Baker \& Taylor's Book List for All programs indicates that they shipped 2181 titles in the categories D and E to their customers between July 1990 and July 1991. AMIGOS data reveals that the library currently adds an average of 366 titles per year. As this represents \(17 \%\) of the history titles for all types of libraries, it represents an acceptable collection commitment.

\section*{WEAKNESSES:}

Findings indicate that the areas covering Latin America, specifically Mexico, and Canada need to be strengthened. As these subject areas were little utilized in the past this was not a concern, however, new emphasizes in the Political Science and Foreign Language programs require upgrading these collections. Although African and Asian histories are generally adequate, specific areas remain under represented. In general, the Reference holdings are somewhat dated and small. The \(32 \%\) holding
rate from the Guide to Reference Books appears inadequate; however, the large number of out-of-scope foreign title listings skew the findings. The 307 periodical titles in this collection constitute a level of 3 aE ; as the collection goal level is 3 CE this area needs enhancement.

\section*{RECOMMENDATIONS:}

While the overall History Collection is strong, it is recommended that the history journal subscriptions be increased. It is further recommended that when funds permit, available backfiled indexed state newspapers be acquired. In addition, selective monograph purchases covering Latin America, Mexico, Canada, Africa, and the Far East should be added. Analysis of the ARBA volumes reviewed indicates a steady decline in the acquisitions of reference materials. This downward trend should be addressed.

\section*{LANGUAGE AND RELATED LITERATURES COLLECTION ASSESSMENT}

Following guidelines established by the Pacific Northwest Collection Development Program (which provides an cverview of a library's current holdings and the level of activity at which the collection is being developed) the Language and Related Literatures Collection is rated an overall 3aF (Instructional support level, selected foreign language materials). Refer to the Language and Related Literatures conspectus sheets, AMIGOS Subcollections Proportions reports, and checklist analysis for a more detailed examination of the holdings in this area.

\section*{MONOGRAPHIC ASSESSMENT:}

The Language and Related Literatures Collection contains 20,124 monographic titles in the classifications \(P-P N\) and 400. In addition, the library owns 59 units of Early English Books, 1475-1640 (STC I) collection consisting of 1700 reels and 27,911 titles; 62 units of Early Endish Books, 1641-1700 (STC II) consisting of 43,420 titles, and 3 units of the Eighteenth Century collection. \section*{SUPPLEMENTAL SUPPORT:}

Holdings in the related subject collections of English Literature, American Literature, Western European Literatures, Communications, Psychology, Education, History, Auxiliary Sciences of History, Geography and Anthropology, and General Works provide supplemental support to the Language and Related Literatures Collection.

\section*{SUMMARY:}

\section*{Strengths:}

Total holdings, conspectus evaluation, and checklist cumparisons indicate that the Language and Related Literatures Collection is strongest in English language materials. Most numerous are holdings dealing with the history of the English language or the writing and teaching of English. Of note is the strong coverage of classical and Russian literatures. In addition, the library's holdings of the Loeb, dual-language editions of the Latin and Greek classics are fairly complete. The library also owns the 9 volume set of Robert's Dictionnaire Alphabetique et Analogique as well as the oxford English Dictionary. The AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions P-PN Academics report for 1979-1989 reveals that we added 929 more titles thai: the average member institution in our peer group. The collection size is \(30 \%\) larger than the average member. Baker \& Taylor's Books List for All Programs indicates that they shipped 2,256 titles in the categories P-PN to their customers between July 1990 and July 1991. AMIGOS data reveals that the library currently adds an average 404 titles per year. As this represents \(18 \%\) of the \(\mathrm{P}-\mathrm{PN}\)
classification titles for all types of libraries, it represents an acceptable collection commitment. Major areas of strength are: Communication \& Mass Media; Philosophy \& Psychology of Language; Linguistics; Morphology \& Syntax; Lexicography; Classical Literary History; Individual Classical Authors; History of English Languages; English Versification; Native American Languages \& Literatures; Russian Translations; English Bibliographies; and Dictionaries and Encyclopedias of International Literature.

\section*{Weaknesses:}

Total holdings, conspectus evaluation, and checklist comparisons indicate that the Language and Related Literatures Collection is particularly weak in foreign language study materials - i.e. dictionaries, textbooks, and grammars. The library does not own either the Deutsches Worterbuch or the Diccionario Historico de la Lengua Espanola. In addition, most foreign language materials are translations rather than works in the language of origin. These shortcomings can be attributed to an absence of any foreign language degree programs for several years at JSU. These programs have subsequently been reinstated.

\section*{Recommendations:}

As the University has reinstated degree programs in
French, German, and Spanish it is anticipated that demand for teaching materials in these areas will increase. In addition, the faculty has indicated a desire for the library to increase
holdings of foreign literary writers in their native language. It is further recommended that the definitive dictionaries for these languages be purchased.

Holdings in the related subject collections of Political Science and Public Administration, History, Criminal Justice, Philosophy Ethics and Religion, Nursing, Education, Sociology and Social Work, Psychology, and Commerce and Business Administration provide supplemental support to the Law Collection.

\section*{Strengths:}

Total holdings, PNW conspectus evaluations, AMIGOS Subcollection Proportion analysis, and checklist comparisons indicate that the law monographic holdings are strongest in the areas of Labor Law, Education Law, Election Law, Constitutional History of the United States, Family Lar, History of American Law, Jurisprudence, Criminal Procedure, Supreme Court History, and Biography. Books for College Libraries shows a strong holding rate of \(79 \%\). The AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions: K-KFZ Law Peer Group: Academics report reveals that within our national peer group we have 1,314 more law titles than the average member in our peer group. The collection size is \(105 \%\) larger than the average member collection. The subcollection proportions: K-KFZ Law: AJB User Defined Peer Group report shows that in comparison to other NAAL libraries, JSU collected 1,489 more titles than the average NAAL member. The collection size is 138\% larger than the average NAAL member collection. These holdings, supplemented by related collections, are more than adequate to support the University's Pre-Legal program.

\section*{Weaknesses:}

Total holdings, conspectus evaluation, and checklist comparisons indicate that the Law Collection is weakest in the areas of Legal Bibliography, Laws of Foreign Countries, Religious Freedom, and Contract Law. While low percentages are indicated in the serial assessment, the collection is ample for instructional purposes. An analysis of the ARBA's shows that with the exception of the 1988 edition, the reference holdings are declining each year.

\section*{Recommendations:}

Monographic acquisitions need to be maintained at the current rate. Assessed areas with weak holdings, including serial titles, should be evaluated for future acquisitions based upon curriculum demands and library funding.

\section*{Strengths:}

Total holdings, AMIGOS subcollection proportions reviews, PNW conspectus evaluation, and checklist comparisons indicate that the Library Science and Bibliography Collection is strong, particularly in the areas of school libraries and media centers, college and university libraries, library management, technical
services, and library automation. Of significant note is the juvenile literature collection located in the Education Collection. The AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions Z-ZZ : Academic report reveals that in comparison with our national peer group, we added 1,155 more titles in this area between 1978-1988 than the average member within our group. The \(Z-Z Z\) collection size is 63\% larger than the average collection in our group. The AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions Z-ZZ: AJB User Defined Peer Group report shows that in comparison to the average NAAL library, JSU collected 1,515 more titles in this area, making the collection size 103\% larger.

\section*{Weaknesses:}

Total holdings, conspectus evaluation, and checklist comparisons indicate that the Library Science and Bibliography Collection is weak in the areas of book arts, circulation systems, audio-visual library services, book collecting, library history, public libraries, and specialized libraries. Other than circulation systems and audio-visual library services, these areas are not a major concern for collection development because they are out of scope. The collection supports the instructional media programs offered by the College of Education and serves the professional needs of the library staff. The low holding rate of \(32 \%\) from Library Literature can be attributed to the large number of journals that are dedicated to public, special, or regional libraries and librarianship. ARBA and Guide to Reference Books include many titles for foreign publications and other types of materials that are out of scope of the collection. In addition,
the \(Z\) classification shelflist measurement does not include those subject bibliographies that are cataloged with their respective disciplines.

\section*{Recommendations:}

The collection adequately meets the needs of the library staff and supports the Instructional Media Program. It is recommended that the current collecting activity level for this area be maintained. Emphasis should continue to be placed on publications encompassing library media centers, library management, and school library automation. In addition, the holdings in audio-visual library services and circulation systems should be enhanced.

\section*{MATHEMATICAL, COMPUTING, \& INFORMATION SCIENCES COLTECIION ASSESSMENT}

Following guidelines established by the Pacific Northwest Collection Development Program (which provides an overview of a library's current holdings and the level of activity at which the collection is being developed) the Mathematical, Computing, and Information Sciences Collection is rated an overall 3 aE (Basic Instructional Support Level: predominantly English). Refer to the Mathematical, Computing, and Information Sciences conspectus sheets, AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions sheets, and the checklists analysis sheets for a more detailed examination of the library's holdings.

\section*{MONOGRAPHTC ASSESSMENT:}

The Mathenatical, Computing, and Information Sciences collection contains 935 titles in the Dewey Classification 510-519.9 (Mathematics), 1445 titles in the LC Classification QA74QA76.95 (Computer Science), and 4780 titles in the LC Classifications QAI-QA73 and QA77-QA939 (Mathematics). Holdings in the related subject collections of Education, Physics and Engineering, and Technology provide additional support to the Mathematical, Computing , and Information Sciences Collection.

\section*{SUMMARY:}

\section*{Strengths:}

Total holdings, PNW conspectus evaluations, AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions Reports, and checklist comparisons indicate that the collection's monographic holdings are adequate to support the course offerings in Mathematics and Computing and Information Sciences. Of particular note in Mathematics are the holdings in Arithmetic, Theory of Groups, Linear Algebra, Probabilities, Mathematical Statistics, Operator Theory, Elementary Geometry, Differential Geometry, and Non-Euclidean Geometry. In Computer Science areas of note include Reference Works, Artificial Intelligence, and Computer Systems. AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions QA1-QA939 Science Peer Group: Academics Report reveals that we added 36 more titles than the average member. This number implies that the collection is \(.0185 \%\) larger than average national member. It should be noted that only three subdivisions within the QA classification are in fact larger than our national peer group's subdivisions.. These are QA1-QA99 (General Mathematical Works and Computer Science), RA101-QA145 (Elementary Mathematics and Arithmetic), and QA801-QA939 (Analytic Mechanics). AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions QAl-QA939 Science Peer Group: AJB User Defined Peer Group Report shows that in comparison to other NAAL Libraries JSU added 112 more titles
than the average NAAL member institution. The QA1-QA939 collection is . \(06 \%\) larger than the average NAAL member collection. However, it should be noted that only two subdivisions within the QA classification are in fact larger than other NAAL libraries' subdivisions. These are QA1-QA99 (General Mathematics and Computer Science) and QA101-QA145 (Elementary Mathematics and Arithmetic). The Baker \& Taylor's Books List for All Programs indicate that they shipped 773 titles in Mathematics \& Computer Sciences to their customers between July 1990 and June 1991. AMIGOS data reveals that the library currently averages 179.5 titles per year. As this represents \(23.2 \%\) of Mathematics and Computer Science titles for all types of libraries, it represents an acceptable collection commitment.

\section*{Weaknesses:}

A review of the checklists and conspectus sheets reveals monographic weaknesses in several areas. Of note in Mathematics are Graph Theory, Homological Algebra, Combinational Analysis, Multivariate Analysis, Riemannian Surfaces, Elliptic Functions, Algebraic Topology, and Differential Topology. In Computer Science areas of weakness include Study and Teaching, Programming, and Programming Languages. AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions reveal that in relation to our national peer group we are weaker in the areas of QA150-QA299 (Algebra), QA300-QA433 (Calculus, Functional Analysis, Functions, and Differential Equations), and QA440-QA799 (Geometry, Manifolds, Trigonometry, and Topology). In relationship to other NAAL Libraries we are weaker in the former areas, as well as the area of Analytic

Mechanics. Journal holdings are adequate to support the undergraduate curriculum, but extremely limited in scope and it is questionable whether they can support the diversity of curriculum needs at the maste='s levels ( N S. in Mathematics, M.S. in Education, Educational Specialist Degree, and the M.B.A.). Like the rest of the Sciences, the Mathematical, Computing, and Information Sciences holdings in AV format are minuscule and dated.

\section*{Recommendations:}

At present, with the exception of the noted areas of weakness, the monographic and serial collections are adequate to support the undergraduate program in Mathematics. The collection, however, needs immediate attention in both monograph and serial acquisitions to effectively support the graduate courses offered. The limited number of monographic and serial titles in the Computer Science Collection, coupled with the rapidly changing informational requirements in the discipline and the tremendous increase in publishing in the field, make it difficult to properly gauge the effectiveness or timeliness of the collection. Clear guidelines must be established to distinguish between the popular (personal) computer science treatises and journals and works needed for the baccalaureate curriculum. It is recommended that increased monies be allocated to purchase additional Computer Science Journals. In addition, coordination with the Director of Nonprint Media and the teaching faculty should be established to insure that acquisition of new materials in \(A V\) format will reflect changes in emphasis within the Mathematical,

Computing, and Informational Sciences curriculum.

Holdings in the related subject collections of History; Auxiliary Sciences of History; Law, General Works; and Political Science and Public Administration provide supplemental support to the Military Science Collection.

SUMMARY:
Strengths:
Total holdings, conspectus evaluations, AMIGOS Subcollection Proportion analysis, and checklist comparisons indicate that the Military Science Collection is strong, particularly in naval and military history, areas that are heavily complimented by the holdings of the History and the Political Science and Public Administration Collections. An additional strength is the library's holdings on foreign defense organizations and policies. The AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions U: Academic report reveals that in comparison with our national peer group, we added 905 more titles in this area between 1978-1988 than the average member within our group. Thus, the \(U\) collection size is \(173 \%\) larger than the average member in our group. The AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions U: AJB User Defined Peer Group report
shows that in comparison to other NAAL libraries, JSU collected 1,012 more titles in this area than the average NAAL member, making the collection \(243 \%\) larger. The AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions V: Academic report reveals that in comparison with our national peer group, we added 72 more titles between 1978-1988 in this area than the average member within our group. Thus, the \(V\) collection size is \(118 \%\) larger than the average member in our group. The AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions V: AJB User Defined Peer Group report shows that in comparison to other NAAL libraries, JSU collected 65 more titles in this area than the average NAAL member, making the collection \(94 \%\) larger.

\section*{Weaknesses:}

Total holdings, conspectus evaluation, and checklist comparisons indicate that the Military Science Collection is weak in the areas of space warfare, navigation, naval architecture, naval ordnance, naval seamen, tide and current tables, naval life and manners, pilots and pilotage, and military maintenance and transportation. However, naval science is not part of the Military Science curriculum and acquisitions in this area are for secondary support of the History and the Political 'science curricula. Space warfare is covered in the Rand Publication series and within the subcollection of air warfare. A noted deficiency is the lack of a periodical index for this discipline. In addition, the \(A V\) holdings in this area are extremely poor. Further, manuals such as those published in the Brassey and the Jane's weapons series are dated.

Recommendations:
Funds should be appropriated to enlarge and update the AV holdings of the Military Science Collection. Careful reviews of the weapons series publications should be undertaken. It is further recommended that the Air University Library Index to Military Periodicals be purchased.

Holdings in the Audio-Visual Services Department and the Music Department provide supplemental support to the Music Collection. Related subject collections include History; Art; American Literature; English Literature; Drama; Education; General Works; Philosophy, Ethics, \& Religion; Psychology; Western European Literature; and Languages and Related Literatures. SUMMARI:

\section*{Strenqths:}

The overall condition of the Music collection is good. Total holdings, AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions, conspectus evaluation, and checklist comparisons indicate that the Music Collection is very strong in monographic holdings. This is evidenced by holdings of \(50 \%\) or higher in five of six bibliographies checked. The AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions M-MZ : Academic report reveals that in comparison with our national peer group, we added 198 more titles in this area between 1978-1988 than the average member within our group. The M-MZ
collection size is \(18 \%\) larger than the average collection in our group. The AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions M-MZ: AJB User Defined Peer Group report shows that in comparison to the average NAAL library, JSU collected 608 more titles in this area, making the collection size \(85 \%\) larger than the average NAAL collection. of note are holdings in the areas of biography, philosophy, physics of music, music education, music appreciation, music interpretation, and conducting.

\section*{Weaknesses:}

Total holdings, AMIGOS Subcollection Proportion, conspectus evaluation, and checklist comparisons indicate that the Music periodical holdings are inadequate. A check of the titles listed in Music Index show only 13\% held. This lowers the overall collection level rating. Extracted data from the AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions report shows that an average of 120 monograph titles were added between the years 1978-1988. The Bowker Annual shows an average of 373 titles published in this area for the same period. This is a respectable acquisitions rate as most of the items published in this category are out of scope. In addition, the monograph collection has weaknesses in the areas of music history, computer and electronic music, composition (history), instruments and instrumental music, vocal music, national musics, composition, improvisation, accompaniment, percussion music, instrumentation, and orchestration. It should be noted that with the exception of vocal music, which has only \(30 \%\) of the holdings cited by checked bibliographies, the other "weak" areas of the collection show a
respectable holdings rate of \(40 \%\) or better. The score collection is small and inadequate. In addition, interests in southern culture and ethnic music have increased the demand for national musics material.

\section*{Recommendations:}

Funds be appropriated to enhance the areas of periodicals, scores, vocal music materials, percussion materials, computer and electronic music materials, and national musics. There are many developing forms of music and these new interests should be supported by the collection. It is further recommended that the collection be upgraded to a 1 vel of \(3 c F\) (Advanced Study Level, selected foreign language materials).

\section*{SUMMARY:}

\section*{Strengths:}

Total holdings, PNW conspectus evaluations, AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions reviews, and checklist comparisons indicate that the Collection's monographic holdings are extremely strong. Of particular note are the holdings in anatomy and physiology, cancer nursing, pediatric nursing, geriatric nursing, community and public health nursing, gynecology and obstetric nursing, psychiatric nursing, pharmacology, and terminal care nursing. Brandon-Hill's Selected List of Nursing Books (the recognized standard list for nursing collections) reveals a \(93.6 \%\) holding rate, while Books for College Libraries owned shows a respectakie \(69.6 \%\) rate. The rating of \(39.6 \%\) in Cr a Collection in Nursing reflects its concerted effort to av: d duplication of the Brandon-Hill lists. ARBA and Guide to Reference Books reflect the entire discipline of Medicine. A breakdown of their monographic nursing items reveal holdings of \(93.7 \%\) and \(100 \%\) respectively. The AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions R-RZ Medicine Peer Group : Academic report reveals that within our national peer group we added 3,606 more titles than the average member in our peer group. The R-RZ collection size is 124\%
larger than the average member collection. The Subcollection Proportions R-RZ Medicine Peer Group: AJB User Defined Peer Group report shows that in comparison to other NAAL libraries JSU collected 3,473 more titles than the average NAAL member. The collection size is \(114 \%\) larger than the average NAAL member collection. A review of the journal holdings reveals that the Nursing Collection is adequate to support the curricula of the College of Nursing. Of particular note are the journals covering the subjects of midwifery, nursing education, administration, nursing research, gynecology and obstetrics, pediatric nursing, and critical care nursing. A comparison of the library's serials to tue Brandon-Hill's Selected List of Nursing Journals reveals a 55.4\% holdings rate for recommended journals. However, the library holds \(81.4 \%\) of their recommended "core" journals. In addition serial holdings reflect a respectable \(63.9 \%\) of the journals recommended by the core collection in Nursing.

\section*{Weaknesses:}

Total holdings, PNW conspectus evaluations, AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions reviews, and checklist comparisons indicate that the Nursing Collection's monographic holdings are weak in the areas of dentistry, hospitals and nursing homes, histology, ophthalmic nursing, orthopedic nursing, and perioperative nursing. Dentistry is out of scope of the collection. Extracted data from the AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions report shows that an average of 592 titles in medicine were added between the years 1978-1988. The Bowker Annual shows an average of 3,530 titles published in
this area for the same period. This small percentage can be attributed to the Bowker Annual's inclusion of highly specialized medical publications and the numerous popular works on medicine, health, and diet, which are out of scope of the collection. A better indicator of collecting activity is utilizing Baker \& Taylor's Books List for All Programs which states that they shipped 233 Nursing titles during the July 1990 to June 1991 period. A review of the journals held reveals a pattern similar to the monographs; the more specialized nursing journals are not well represented. While we own \(81.4 \%\) of Brandon-Hill's recommended "core" journals, the vast majority are "general" nursing journals covering all topics, but failing to provide in-depth research material. Reviews of the most important nursing indices (AJN International Nursing Index and Cumulative Index to Nursing) reflect holdings of only \(14.3 \%\) and \(24.2 \%\) respectively. While the AJN International Nursing Index does cover many foreign language publications and therefore many titles are out of scope of the collection, the percentage ratings of our holdings for the two indices represents a collecting level well below the desired 3 bE . The AV collection is small and dated. over \(57 \%\) of the holdings are more than ten years old.

\section*{Recommendations:}

The current rate of monographic acquisitions needs to be maintained, with particular note to the Brandon-Hill list. Recognized areas of weakness within the monographic collections should be addressed. Serial subscriptions for the most sought-after specialized journals should be acquired as budget

permits. A balance must be struck between monographic and serial acquisitions (dropping monograph acquisitions in areas out-of-scope of collection, in favor of more journal titles). A comprehensive review of the AV holdings should be undertaken with the Director of Nonprint Media, the College of Nursing's Media Center Director, and other interested nursing faculty and students. The review should include current acquisition policies and procedures, evaluation of current holdings, and an evaluation of selection methodology.

\section*{SUMMARY:}

\section*{Strengths:}

Total holdings, conspectus evaluation, and checklist comparisons indicate that the Philosophy, Ethics, and Religion Collection is strong, particularly in the areas of Ontology, Medieval Philosophy, Renaissance Philosophy, Alexandrian Philosophy, Conduct of Life, Individual Ethics, Religion and Science, Mythology, Christianity, Catholicism, and Protestantism. Extracted data from the AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions B-BJ Philosophy/Psychology Peer Group : AJB User Defined Report shows
that in comparison to other NAAL libraries, JSU added 178 more Philosophy titles than the average NAAL member institution. The \(B-B J\) collection size is \(27 \%\) larger than the average NAAL member collection. The AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions BL-BX Religion Peer Group: Academic Report reveals that within our national peer group we added 61 more Religion titles than the average member. The BL-BX collection is \(.03 \%\) larger than the average national member collection. The AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions BL-BX Religion Peer Group: AJB User Defined Report shows that in comparison to other NAAL libraries, JSU added 623 more titles than the average NAAL member institution. The BL-BX collection size is \(44 \%\) larger than the average NAAL member collection.

\section*{Weaknesses:}

Total holdings, conspectus evaluation, and checklist comparisons indicate that the Philosophy, Ethics, and Religion Collection is weakest in the areas of Eastern Philosophy, Informal Logic, Eastern Religions, and Biblical Studies. A review of Baker-Taylor's Books List for all Programs reveals 3,064 titles (of which 2,284 were Religious) covering this area were shipped between July 1990 and June 1991. AMIGOS data reveals that the library currently receives approximately 436 titles in this area per year. Extracted data from the AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions B-BJ Philosophy/Psychology Peer Group: Academic Report reveals that within our national peer group we added 210 less Philosophy/Psychology titles than the average member. The \(B-B J\) collection is \(20 \%\) smaller than the average national member collection. \(2 \underset{1}{\text { A }}\)

Recommendations:
As the purpose of the Philosophy, Ethics, and Religion Collection is to provide secondary support to other disciplines in the curriculum, the current collecting activity is more than adequate. It is recommended that collecting activity in this area target Philosophy publications rather than Religious publications as this is a more appropriate reflection of the curriculum.

\section*{PHYSICS \& ENGINEERING COLTECTION ASSESSMENT}

Following guidelines established by the Pacific Northwest Collection Development Program (which provides an overview of a library's current holdings and the level of activity at which the collection is being developed) the Physics and Engineering Collection is rated an overall 3aE (Instructional Support Level, predominantly English). Refer to the Physical Sciences conspectus sheets, AMIGOS Subcollection Proportion sheets, and checklists analysis for a more detailed examination of the library's holdings. Holdings in Engineering are housed on the Tenth Floor in the Technology area. For a detailed examination of the collection see the Technology Collection Assessment. The Astronomy collection is reviewed separately within this assessment because of the large number of holdings in that area. MONOGRAPHIC ASSESSMENT:
The Physics and Engineering Collection contains a total of 2,522 monographic titles. A classification breakdown reveals 1,411 titles in the \(Q B\) and 520's (Astronomy) and 1,111 titles in the QC1-QC849 and 530's (Physics). The following bibliographies were checked against the library's holdings revealing the corresponding percentages:

Holdings in the related subject collections of Biology, Chemistry, Education, Geology, Mathematics, Computing and Information sciences, and Technology provide additional support to the Physics and Astronomy collection.

\section*{Astronomy:}

Total holdings, PNW conspectus evaluations, AMIGOS subcollection Proportions reviews, and checklist comparisons indicate that the collection's monographic holdings are more than adequate to support the course offerings in Astronomy. Of particular note are the holdings in History, Practical \& Spherical Astronomy, Stars, Clusters \& Nebulae, and Cosmogony \& Cosmology. A review of Books for college Libraries reveals a holdings percentage rate of 67.9\%; a holdings percentage of \(66.6 \%\) being considered as satisfactory for Comprehensive Colleges and Universities. Four bibliographies reviewed: Information Sources in Science \& Technology, Core List of Books \& Journals in Science \&

Technology, AAAS Science Book List 1978-1986, and Science \& Engineering Literature show holding percentages of \(44.3 \%, 52.7 \%\), \(39.4 \%\), and \(48.7 \%\) respectively. AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions QB1-QB9999 Science Peer Group: Academic Report reveals that within our national peer group we added 94 more titles than the average member. The QBI-QB9999 collection size is \(40.0 \%\) larger that the average national member. AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions QB1-QB9999 Science Peer Group: AJB User Defined Peer Group Report shows that in comparison to other NAAL Libraries JSU added 169 more titles than the average NAAL member institution. The QBI-QB9999 collection size is \(106.0 \%\) larger than the average NAAL member collection.

\section*{Physics:}

Total holdings, PNW conspectus evaluations, AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions reviews, and checklist comparisons indicate that the Physics collection's monographic holdings are adequate to support the degree programs offered by the Physics and Engineering Department and the College of Education. A review of Books for College Libraries reveals a holdings percentage rate of 70.3\%; a holdings percentage of \(66.6 \%\) being considered satisfactory for Comprehensive Colleges and Universities. Four bibliographies reviewed: Information Sources in Science \& Technology, Core List of Books \& Journals in Science \& Technoloqy, AAAS Science Book List 1978-1986, and Science \& Endineering Literature show holding percentage rates of \(40.0 \%, 64.0 \%, 60.5 \%\), and \(50.0 \%\) respectively. AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions QC1-QC999 Science Peer Group: Academic Report reveals that within our national peer group we った
added 165 more titles than the average member in our peer group. The QCl-QC999 sollection size is \(43.4 \%\) larger than the average national member collection. The AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions QC1-QC999 Science Peer Group: AJB User Defined Peer Group Report indicates that in comparison to other NAAL Librarıes JSU added 133 more titles than the average NAAL member institution. The QCl-QC999 collection size is \(102 \%\) larger than the average NAAL member collection.

\section*{Weaknesses:}

\section*{Astronomy:}

A review of the checklists reveals monographic weaknesses in the areas of Astronomical Observatories \& Instruments, Radio Astronomy, Astrophysics, Cosmoschemistry, Atlases. The Baker \& Taylor's Books List for All Programs indicate that they shipped 190 Astronomy books between July 1990 and June 1991 to their patrons. AMIGOS data reveals that the library currently receives approximately 29.9 Astronomy titles per year. As there are only three courses currently taught, this is not a major concern. The fact that there is only one Astronomy journal on standing order is of greater concern, but is balanced somewhat by the excellent coverage of Astronomy in general science journals that the library receives. Like the rest of the Sciences, the holdings in Astronomy in Audio-Visual Services are minuscule and dated.

\section*{Physics:}

A review of the checklists reveal monographic weaknesses in the areas of Bibliography, Motion, Sound, Light, Color, \& Gravity. The glaring weakness of the overall reference holdings can be
attributed to the high number of publications in foreign languages, particularly German and Russian. The Baker \& Taylor's Books List for All Programs indicate that they shipped 655 Physics books between July 1990 and June 1991 to their patrons. AMIGOS data reveals that the library currently receives approximately 72.7 Physics titles per year. Like the rest of the Sciences, the holdings in Audio-Visual Services for Physics are small and dated.

\section*{Recommendations:}

\section*{Astronomy:}

The Astronomy Collection is extremely strong for the limited number of courses offered. Current acquisition levels should be maintained with more emphasis placed on those areas of noted weaknesses. Coordination with the Director of Nonprint Media and the teaching faculty should be established to insure that acquisition of new materials in \(A V\) format strictly adhere to curriculum needs.

\section*{Physics:}

The Physics Collection is adequate to support the current course offerings. Additional attention should be given to the noted areas of weaknesses. Coordination with the Director of Nonprínt Media in acquiring more recent and pertinent titles should enhance the collection.

Holdings in the related subject collections of Law, History, Communications, Commerce and Business Administration, Sociology and Social Work, Education, Criminal Justice, Military Science, and Geography provide supplemental support to the Political Science and Public Administration Collection.

SUMMARY:

\section*{Strengths:}

Total holdings, PNW conspectus evaluation, AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions reviews, and checklist comparisons indicate the overall Political Science and Public Administration Collection is more than adequate to support the curricula. of particular note are the holdings in History of Political Thought, Nationalism, Constitutional Organs and Functions of Government, Administration, Political Parties, United States Presidency, Congress, State and Local Government, Public Policy and Public Administration. Books for College Libraries reveals a holdings percentage rate of 65.2\%. Political Science: A Guide to Reference and Information Sources shows a healthy 66.7 g holdings rate. The collection is extremely strong in the field of Public Administration as revealed by a review of the library's holdings from the following bibliographies: Guide to the Foundations of Public Administration (98.0\%) and Public Administration: A Bibliographic Guide to the Literature (88.4\%). The AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions J-JX Political Science Peer Group: Academic Report reveals that within our national peer group we own 854 more titles than the average member in our peer
group. The J-JX collection size ir: \(49 \%\) larger than the average member collection. The Subcollection Proportions J-JX Political Science Peer Group: AJB User Defined Peer Group report shows that in comparison to other NAAL libraries JSU collected 1435 more titles than the average NAAL member. The collection size is \(124 \%\) larger than the average NAAL member collection. A review of the journal holdings reveals that the Political Science and Public Administration Collection is adequate to support the curricula in the subject areas of the Federal, State and Local Governments.

\section*{Weaknesses:}

Total holdings, PNW conspectus evaluations, AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions reviews, and checklist comparisons indicate that the weakest areas of the Political Science and Public Administration Collection are International and Foreign Politics.

\section*{Recommendations:}

While the monographic collection is strong and the serials holdings reflect a percentage sufficient to support the College of Political Science and Public Administration programs at the Intermediate Study level, more serials within the specialties of International and Foreign Politics would complement the curriculum.

\section*{Strengths:}

Total holdings, AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions reviews, PNW conspectus evaluation, and checklist comparisons indicate that the Psychology Collection is strong, particularly in the areas Psychological Testing, Experimental Psychology, Behaviorism, Gestalt Psychology, Creative Processes, Work, Applied Psychology, Comparative Psychology, and Psychology of Nations. Extracted data from the AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions B-BJ: Academic Report reveals that in comparison with our national peer group, we added 687 more titles in this area between 1978-1988 than the average member within our group. The BF collection size is \(55 \%\) larger than the average collection in our group. The AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions B-BJ: AJB User Defined Peer Group report shows that in comparison to the average NAAL library, JSU collected 958 more titles in this area, making the collection \(97 \%\) larger than the average NAAL member institution. ARBA for 1985-1990 indicates an average holdings rate of \(45 \%\) and Guide to Reference Books shows a holdings rate of \(43 \%\), which are both respectable percentages because these sources include many foreign language materials or titles that are otherwise out of scope of the collection. Books for Colleqe Libraries shows a strong holdings rate of \(70 \%\). Reader's Guide shows a high holding rate of \(71 \%\) and the Inforrac shows a high holding rate of \(80 \%\). How to find out in Psychology shows a holding rate of \(52 \%\).

\section*{Weaknesses:}

Total holdings, AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions reviews, PNW conspectus evaluation, and checklist comparisons indicate that the Psychology Collection is weak in the areas of Congresses Humanistic Psychology, Psychotropic Drugs, Attention, and Motivation. The Baker \& Taylor's Books List for All Programs 1990/91 shows that 800 titles were published in the BF's. The AMIGOS data indicates that JSU adds an average of 177 titles in this area. This low number can be attributed to the large number of popular titles publshed in Psychology. The Psychology Collection is particularly weak in AV materials.

\section*{Recommendations:}

The Psychology Collection meets adequately the needs of the Psychology faculty and students. In spite of the large number of popular titles published in this field the current collecting activity is low and should be increased. Emphasis should continue to be placed on publications encompassing the noted strengths. Collections covering Humanistic Psychology, Attention, and Motivation should be enhanced. In addition, more current and pertinent AV holdings should be acquired.

\section*{Strengths:}

Total holdings, PNW conspectus evaluation, AMIGOS Subcollection and checklist comparisons indicate the overall Sociology and Social Work Collection is more than adequate to support the curricula. Of particular note are the holdings in Sociology (General \& Theoretical), Social History, Social Problems, Social Reform, Family, Marriage, Women, Sexual Life, Social Pathology and Social and Public Welfare. Books for College Libraries shows a healthy \(83.1 \%\) holdings rate and Sociology: A Guide to Reference and Information Sources shows a respectable \(61.9 \%\) holdings rate. In the field of Social Work the library shows a satisfactory collection as evidenced by the \(52.1 \%\) holdings rata in The Reference Sources in Social Work. Extracted data from the AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions H-HZ Social Sciences Peer Group: Academic Report reveals that within our national peer group we have 4307 more titles than the average member in our peer group. The collection size is \(49.7 \%\) larger than the average member collection. Extracted data from the Subcollection Proportions H-HZ Social Sciences Peer Group: AJB User Defined Peer Group report shows that in comparision to other NAAL libraries JSU

collected 5352 more titles than the average NAAL member. The collection size is \(262.6 \%\) larger than the average NAAL member collection. A review of the journal holdings reveals that the Sociology and Social Work collection is cierfuate to support the curricula in the subject areas of Sociology and Social Work.

\section*{Weaknesses:}

Total holdings, PNW conspectus evaluations, AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions reviews, and checklist comparisons indicate that the Sociology and Social Work Collection's monographic holdings are weak in the areas of Gerontology, Aging and the Aged, Disaster Relief (Resugees), and Health Care. Materials encompassing health care, disaster reflief, and gerontology can be found in the supporting collections of Nursing and Education. Extracted data from the AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions report shows that an average of 763 titles in Sociology and Social Work were added between the years 1978-1988. An indicator of collecting activity is the Baker \& Taylor's Books List for All Programs which states that they shipped 1408 Sociology and Social Work titles to all customers during the July 1990 to June 1991 period. A comparison of the AMIGOS analysis and the Baker-Taylor Books List shows a nealthy \(54.2 \%\) purchase rate.

\section*{Recommendations:}

While the serials holdings reflect a percentage sufficient to support the College of Sociology and Social Work programs at the Intermediate Study level, more serials within the specialties of Gerontology and Aging, and Child Development should be acquired. The monographic collection is adequate overall. However, acquisitions of materials covering noted subject weakness should be made in conjunction with the acquisitions activities in Nursing and Education.

Total holdings, PNW conspectus evaluations, AMIGOS Subcollection Proportion analysis, and checklist comparisons indicate that the Technology and Engineering monographic holdings are strong,

particularly in Cookery, Electronics, Sewing, Hotel Restaurant Management, Food Service, Photography, Chemical Technology, Mechanial Engineering, Construction, and Mineral Industries. Of note, the Commerce and Business Administration Collection holds an additional 6,037 monographic titles related to Technology and Engineering. Also, of significance are the library's microform holdirgs in the Food and Nutrition Collection. A check of ARBA 85-90 and Guide to Reference Books indicates that reference holdings are strong in this area. The AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions T-TZ Technology Peer Group: Academic report reveals that within our national peer group we added 1,764 more titles than the average member in our peer group. The T-TZ collection size is \(69 \%\) larger than the average national member collection. The AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions \(T-T Z\) : AJB User Defined Peer Group report shows that in comparison to the average NAAL library JSU collected 1,082 more titles. The \(T-T Z\) collection size is \(33 \%\) larger than the average NAAL member institution.

A review of the journal holdings reveals that the Technology and Engineering Collection is adequate to support the curricula. The collection is comprised of a variety of monographs, journals and bibliographic references for both undergraduate and graduate instruction. In addition, this collection is enhanced by related subject collections on the Science and Social Sciences Floors.

\section*{Weaknesses:}

Total holdings, conspectus evaluation, and checklist comparisons indicate that the Technology and Engineering Collection is weak in the areas of General Engineering, Industrial Electrochemistry, Metallurgy, Highway Engineering, Pneumatic Machinery, and Latin American Technology. In particular, Engineering titles are small. A review of Books for College Libraries reveals a holdings percentage rate of \(54 \%\) holdings. Recommendations are that comprehensive colleges and universities hold \(66 \%\) of those titles listed in BCL. AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions reports indicate that between 1978 and 1988 the Technology collection grew at an average of 392 titles per year. The Bowker Annual shows and average of 2,504 titles published in Technology during this period. In addition, Baker \& Taylor 's Lists for All Programs shows that they shipped 2,004 titles during the July 1990 - June 1991 period. This small number can be attributed to the inclusion of highly specialized technical manuals and numerous popular works on technology, which are out of scope of the collection. However, this is indicative of a low level of collecting activity over this period. A review of the journals indexed in Applied Science and Technology Index, which are of a specialized nature, indicate only an \(11.7 \%\) holdings rate. This is offset somewhat by the \(69.3 \%\) holdings rate in General Science Index. Also, the AV Collection is small, dated, and inadequate.

\section*{Recommendations:}

Although the collecting activity has been adequate, it is recommended the monographic acquisitions be increased as funding
permits. Serials acquisitions should be increased, with careful attention focused on current, as well as, future programs. At present, Engineering is not a growing area relative to curricula; however, several efforts have been made by faculty to determine whether the University should implement a degree program in Engineering. If Engineering should become a major program, immediate attention should be given to this area since this particular area shows a great degree of weakness. It is further recommended that the minuscule Photography Collection classed in the 700 's on the 6th floor be reclassed for relocation on the loth floor. Coordination with the Director of Nonprint Media in acquiring more recent and pertinent titles should enhance the current AV collection.

\section*{WESTERN EUROPEAN LITEERATURES COLLECTION ASSESSMENT}

Following guidelines established by the Pacific Northwest Collection Development Program (which provides an overview of a library's current holdings and the level of activity at which the collection is being developed), the Western European Literatures Ccllection is rated an overall \(2 b \mathrm{~F}\) (Basic Information Level Advanced, selected foreign language materials). Refer to the Linguistics, Languages, and Literatures conspectus sheets and AMIGOS Subcollections Proportions reports for more detailed examination of the library's holdings.

\section*{MONOGRAPHIC ASSESSMENT:}

The Western European Literatures Collection contains 10,929 monographic titles in the classifications \(\mathrm{PQ}, \mathrm{PT}\), and PZ11-78. There are also 1,671 titles in Dewey classification, making the total 12,600, with an additional four series titles in microform. The percentage for the Selective Bibliography is somewhat misleading due to the narrow scope of the entries. Most of the citations are from creditable scholarly journals.

NONPRINT MEDIA ASSESSMENT:
The Western European Literatures Collection contains four nonprint titles. The following biblingraphy was checked against the library's holdings, revealing the corresponding percentages: TITLE HELD LISTED 巻 Educational Film \& Video Locator \(1 \quad 51,900 \quad 0.0 \%\) This low percentage can be attributed to the Locator's comprehensive filmography, a work intended for large media centers.

SUPPLEMENTAL SUPPORT:
Holdings in the related subject collections of American Literature; English Literature; Languages and Related Literatures History; Art; Auxiliary Sciences of History; Philosophy, Ethics and Religion; and General Reference provide supplemental support to the Western European Literatures.

\section*{SUMMARX:}

\section*{Strengths:}

Total holdings, conspectus evaluation, and checklist comparisons indicate that the overall Western European Literatures collection is strong. The collection is particularly strong in English language materials in the areas of 16 th-20th century French Literature; Spanish Literature; German Literature; and Norwegian Literature, of which the collection reflects over \(60 \%\) of BCL listings.

\section*{Weaknesses:}

Total holdings, AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions, conspectus evaluation, and checklist comparisons indicate that the western European Literatires Collection is weak in the areas of Italian Literature; Latin American Literature; and Portuguese Literature. Periodical and reference holdings are small. As this is the first year following the University's reinstatement of Baccalaureate programs in French, Spanish, and German, inadequacies in this area are expected. Italian and Portuguese are not degree programs, and thus collection activity is light and in English translation cnly. The AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions: Academic Reports reveal that in comparison with our national peer group, we added 491 fewer titles in the \(P Q^{\prime} s\) and 185 fewer titles in the PT's between 1978-1988 than the average collection in our group. The PQ collection size is \(44 \%\) smaller and the PT collection size is \(38 \%\) smaller than the average collection in our group. The AMIGOS Subcollection Proportions: AJB User Defined Peer Group report shows that in comparison to
the average NAAL library, JSU collected 147 fewer titles in the \(P Q ' s\) and 55 more titles in the \(P T\) 's, making the \(P Q\) collection size \(19 \%\) smaller and the PT collection \(22 \%\) larger than the average NAAL collections. The higher PT NAAL average can be attributed to JSU holdings in Scandinavian Literature, which is an area out of scope for most NAAL collections.

\section*{Recommendations:}

The reference and periodical collections should be upgraded.
A primary focus should be on the collection of foreign language imprints and serials in French, Spanish, and German to develop the collection to a level of 3 bF (Intermediate Instructional Support Level, selected foreign language materials). Input from teaching faculty must be solicited in the selection process to ensure appropriate support of the curricula.
