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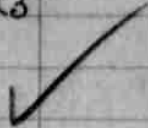

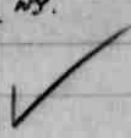

Sir,—

I have the honor to enclose herewith Voucher No. 570, in favor of Rev. Henri Boissin, for freight of materials supplied for the addition to St. Joseph's Indian Boarding School, Cross Lake. This Voucher is supported by the Copies of Bills of Lading, Statements and receipts of The Northern Fish Co. Selkirk, for the freight from Selkirk to Whiskey Jack. The item for boxes, was to protect the lime where the bags were broken on receipt at Selkirk. I also enclose the Statements of Rev. Boissin of the freight from Whiskey Jack to Cross Lake. The weights are the same as the Fish Co's, and the charge of 50¢ is fair.

I may say that The Fish Co. claim an additional \$74.50 on the freight for the boiler, as they state their charge for this was \$250. for the trip, while it was figured and paid for by the Principal as 27,000 lbs. @ 65¢. I will be in Cross Lake shortly, and will take this matter up, and if correct, will later issue a further voucher.

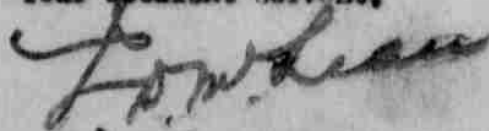



As we were delayed by the roofing papers , the mason work finished much later than we all expected ; but nevertheless , favoured by a nice weather ; all the outside of the whole addition was finished ; the cornices all around the roof were painted ; and the eaves pipes , all connected to the main sewer . About the Boiler , we want to tell you that we have had very hard time . We took six days to cross the five miles portage , and one day to load on our barge . Everythings were all set to leave on the next morning ; but during the night , a big storm with snow came ; and the waves pushed by a strong south wind , filled our barge up to the top . A good chance , we had her in a shallow place ; there we took a day and half before we could have our barge to float , and the big boiler well balanced inside , because the least difference we was enough to upset our barge , as she was not much bigger than the boiler itself . You can imagine the hard time we have had there

In the last twelve miles in the lake , it went good ; but we took 8 hours . The expenses amount to \$ 220.00 and the North Fish Co bill is \$ 250. ;or \$ 472.00 for the freight , from Selkirk to Cross Lake.

At the present time , it is set up to its place , and operates since three weeks . She will heat very well ; but a big trouble arose about the chimney , which is too small . According to the size of the boiler the chimney should be about 432 square inches of surface , and ours has only 144 square inches . There is no draft , and to prevent it from smoking , we have to keep the draft doors closed . To remedy to that ,

I was thinking to keep the present chimney for ventilation , and to build
an another one of the right size , near the other one , but inside ;
because it must disfigure the outside wall , and we will be able to build
it in winter . We have already put in the basement , the heating plant
electric fittings , cold and ~~water~~ warm water , and sewer pipes .

We were thinking to have a plumber and a steamfitter , but as the expenses amount to a great deal already, we will do the work , and we are only glad, because you have been so good to me . At the present time , we are making the concrete and cement flooring in the basement , and we expect to start plastering in a couple of weeks .

About our Storage batteries , to keep it in a good condition , we would need to clean it , but before touching it, we would need repairs . Just now it is ~~was~~ working not too bad . To clean it good , we have to charge all the wood insulators , and even a few plates which are worn out . We will be very thankful if You will be good enough to send us the following order :

In connection with Your letter, we are thanking You for having given us the statement, showing the Expenditure incurred by our school. WE also recognize the errors that You have mentioned. With regard to the account of \$ 963.75, which covers the lumber supplied by R C Mission Mills, we are sending You the bill, through the Indian Agent of Norway House, as You mention in Your same letter.

We are getting along fine with our work. The Junior Boys dormitory is almost finished; the big Boys playing room, small boys playing room; the visitors room, principal room and office; and a few bed rooms, are in the same condition. At this present time, we have over the half of the plaster work done, by Mr A Pieronie. We must state that the job is first class. As it is his trade, we had to give him wages according to his work which we thought that \$ 11.25 a day will be fair.

We also hired another carpenter named Mr J N Menard, as Mr Bron is living us on account of his health.

When the addition to the Cross Lake Indian Residential School was commenced, in 1923-24, \$10,000 was available. During the year there was expended for materials and freight \$1,821.64 and for labour \$6,240.20 - a total of \$8,061.84.

In 1924-25, \$20,000 was voted to complete the addition. There was expended during the year for materials and freight \$23,529.84 and for labour \$8,116.40 - a total of \$31,646.24.

Nothing has been voted for this addition this year, with the exception of the furnishings, which are not yet ordered. During the past two years, \$30,000.00 has been voted and \$39,708.08 expended. Hereunder are time sheets for labour, amounting to \$2,666.00, and later, I understand, there will be an account for lumber amounting to over \$900.

The expenditure has exceeded the amount provided and there was no provision this year for the last few accounts, as I understood that the building would be completed. However, the addition will have to be finished and furnished and I wish to recommend that the account for labour now on file and the one for lumber that will be presented in due course be paid.

Sir;-

I have to report that I inspected Cross Lake Boarding School on the 26th and 27th of May.

The general health of the pupils appears to be good.

In the class rooms the work was excellent, as usual, and good progress is being made.

The grounds are kept tidy and in good condition. There are quite a number of trees on these grounds which were not cut out, and these make the surroundings much more pleasant than the bare open so often found. The outbuildings are also in good condition. There is an excellent garden here which provides sufficient potatoes and vegetables for the school. The unusually severe winter caused a loss by frost of some of the potatoes in the winter storage root house, so that while the school had enough for themselves, they had no surplus as expected. Hens and cows are doing well, and furnish their quota for table use.

The school building is in excellent condition and well kept. It is a good example of the permanency of the stone building, especially when placed on a solid rock foundation. Some of the rooms were not so spotless as usual, as openings have been made into the addition, where work is going on, and dust is continually passing in.

Work on the new addition is making good progress, and the building should be ready for occupation in the fall.

The end frames are solid iron castings bolted together carrying the whole load of the tumbler. The main bearings, which are Beaver Roller type, are supported on these frames but separated from the heat of the machine by an air space and a stuffing box.

The shell is of galvanized steel plates with lift-up door. The cylinder is of galvanized wire mesh. The cylinder heads are strongly bolted to steel T beams, making an exceptionally rigid wheel.

The reversing header is our Beaver ball bearing reverse movement, firmly bolted to the end frame. All gears are machine cut from solid blanks and are properly guarded. A simple and efficient hand turning device and gear lock is provided.

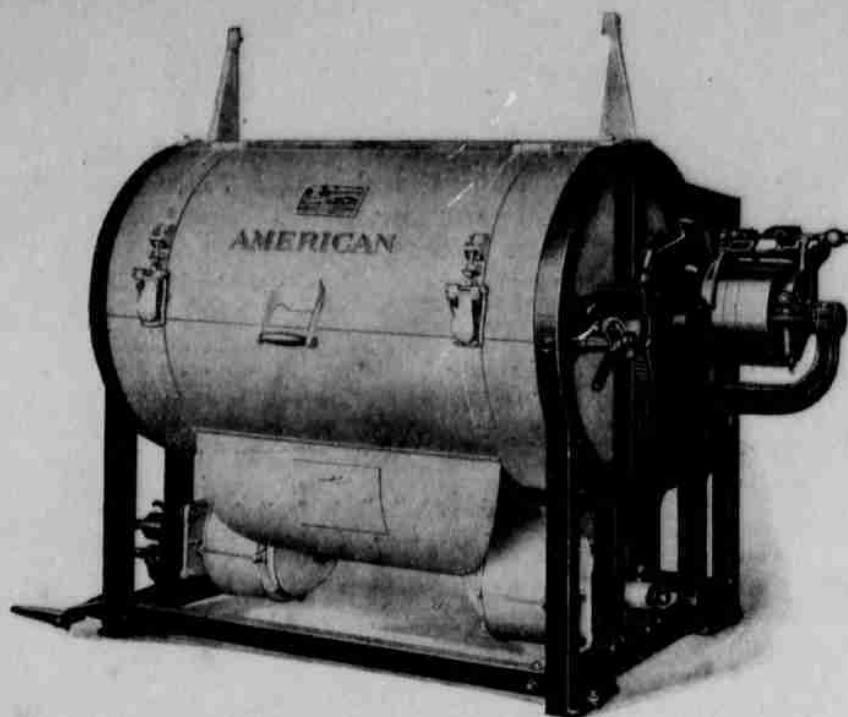

The inside cylinder shall measure 30 inches in diameter by 42 inches in length, constructed of galvanized woven wire, and shall be of type.

(Reversing or Non-Reversing)

Frames

Shall be of heavy cast iron, bolted together and connected by heavy stiffening angles, and shall support housing cylinder, fans, coils and driving mechanism.

Housing

Shall be of No. 16-gauge galvanized sheet iron. Shall be riveted to iron frames and made tight to prevent the escape of heat and air. The door shall be constructed of No. 16 galvanized sheet iron, hung on heavy wrought-iron strap hinges and securely latched by malleable-iron clamps, making it close fitting and preventing the leakage of air and heat.

Shall be equipped with clean-out door at bottom between fans.

Two upright castings shall be bolted to top of frames for tub door to rest against when open.

Cylinder

Shall be constructed of No. 2½-mesh, .110-inch diameter, galvanized woven wire, rolled after being woven, so that the intersections shall be interlocked. Shall be riveted to inwardly projecting cast-iron trunnions and re-enforced by wide hoops. Shall be further strengthened by four channels, riveted to trunnions. Shall be constructed with 3 galvanized cast-iron ribs projecting 4 inches into cylinder, securely riveted to the woven wire and bolted to the trunnions. Door shall be of No. 16 galvanized sheet iron, perforated, hung on heavy hinges, and fitted with heavy door latches.

Coils

Shall be located within the housing at rear and consists of 202 lineal feet of one-inch iron pipe connected at each end with right and left return bends.

Fans

Shall be equipped with 2 single fans of the multi-blade type 7½ inches in diameter, mounted on fan shaft beneath cylinder, for circulating air through the coils, and thence through the cylinder and out through an 8-inch duct leading to rear of machine. Shall be fitted with screened air intake. Fan shaft shall be equipped with renewable bearings.

Gearing

Gears shall be machine cut from solid blanks of sufficient width and diameter, and provided with suitable cast-iron gear guards. Shall be equipped with hand-worm gear lock for bringing cylinder door into position and locking same.

Driving Mechanism

Reversing type shall consist of one tight and two loose pulleys, each 10 inches in diameter, requiring 1-inch and 1½-inch belts, operating in connection with a worm and cam movement, producing a fixed number of reverse revolutions of the cylinder.

Non-reversing type shall consist of one tight and one loose pulley, each 10 inches in diameter, taking a 1-inch belt to operate cylinder. Cylinder shall revolve in one direction only.

Driving mechanism shall be mounted on cast-iron adjustable swivelling arm, bolted to machine, and embody strength, simplicity and reliability. Shall be 3-inch diameter tight and loose pulleys on fan shaft, taking 2-inch belt to operate fans. Fan belt shall be equipped with foot treadle shifter.

There has been difficulties regarding the payment of a freight bill to the Northern Fish Company of Selkirk, Man., account of Cross Lake School. There has been noticed by the Department a difference between the accounts of the Northern Fish Company and that of the Principal of the School for the transportation of a boiler. This boiler weighed 27300 pounds, which, at the ordinary rate of freight, viz: 65¢ per hundred would have amounted to \$177.45 as the Principal had mentioned in this account, but the Northern Fish charged a special price of \$250.00, making a difference of \$72.55 which has been paid by the Principal, though only \$177.45 have been reimbursed to him.

Would you kindly loop up this matter and advise me in order that I may communicate with the Principal.

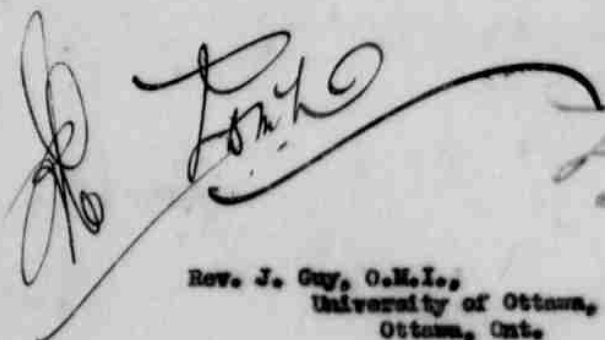

Rev. Father H. Boissin O.M.I., Principal of Cross Lake Indian Residential School has referred to me a copy of your letter dated February 4th, re the refusal of a water tank for his institution.

The Reverend Principal has requested me to reopen that question on account of its importance and urgency of action and I take the liberty of submitting the following considerations to your judgment. On account of the enlargement of the school the water supply is altogether insufficient with the two water tanks already used. In spite of pumping 3 or 4 times each day the upper stories are deprived of water during the night. You readily perceive the inconvenience and danger resulting from such a situation. In view of those facts and other reasons set forth in Rev. Fr Boissin's previous correspondence I would ask you to reconsider the negative decision above referred to.

A few weeks ago, the Rev. Principal of the Cross Lake Indian Residential School urged that an additional water storage tank be installed. The present tanks are inadequate, now that the building is enlarged, and there is insufficient water, particularly at night, for plumbing fixtures. The situation would be serious, of course, in the event of fire.

Mr. Orr estimates the cost at \$700, and, as no funds are specifically provided, the request was refused. His Lordship Bishop Charlebois and Father Guy have left the letter hereunder and His Lordship informs me that there is really an urgent need and asked to have the matter re-opened.

I wish to recommend that a pressure tank be supplied, as I am hopeful that funds can be found from the coming year's appropriation.



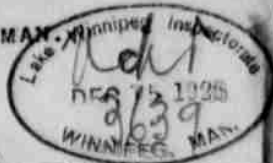

The broken fly-wheel was patched up and the engine ran in a way, but not to capacity, and there was a great element of danger if the damaged wheel burst. 1925

In the month of October, the Rev'd. Brother Cordeau was in Winnipeg, there was only one more steamer going, and he asked me if the broken fly-wheel could be replaced, he intimated that the engine would be useless practically if this was not done, under the circumstances I complied with his request. I beg now to submit my action for approval. The time was so limited that I had catch the steamer which went out on the 13th Oct, 1925.

I have been away so much in December, 1925 and January 1926, from my office attending to official duties at Fort Alexander, that this and other matters have been held up.

The New fly-wheel made the engine a complete new engine almost, and possible to run with safety.

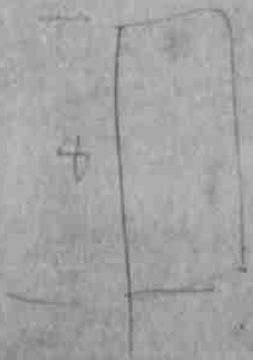

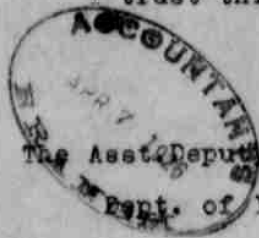
The freight rate of the Northern Fish Co. who handled this material, is .65 per cwt. from Selkirk to Whiskey Jack. This is a special rate. The regular rate from Whiskey Jack landing ~~is~~ across the portage, and along the lake to Cross Lake settlement is .50 per cwt. The school handled the material here with its own outfit.

It will be noted that on page 1 of the Voucher there are two errors, amounting to \$1.90. These are undercharges and underpayments. As the School did not pay these amounts, obviously a refund of these amounts is uncalled for. I cannot alter the Voucher, as it would not then agree with the receipts for money paid.

Your letter as marginally noted above is acknowledged. This is with reference an additional pressure tank for water supply system at Cross Lake Indian Residential School. I have a reply from the Rev'd Principal, and in addition I have been able to have a personal interview with Brother Cordeau, this is the man who actively supervised the work connected with the new additions and other activities incident to these operations.

I am informed by Brother Cordeau that it would be best to get two tanks of the following dimensions:-

2 Pressure tanks 4' x 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ ', the capacity of these two tanks together would equal the capacity of a large one of 6' x 13', the two smaller tanks would not cost any more, would handle better in transport, and can be admitted to the building through the opening as it now is, if larger a special entrance would be required. Brother Cordeau says that two such tanks as indicated could be placed upright.

Brother Cordeau's judgement in this matter, in my opinion, should be accepted, he is familiar with the whole lay-out.

Re fittings he states that all necessary fittings that would be wanted, are on hand at the School.

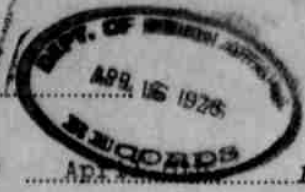

When I was speaking to Brother Cordeau about the pressure tanks for Cross Lake Indian Residential School, he opened up the matter of replacing the pipe of the main sewer of this institution, with a larger pipe, 8" at least.

The old sewer pipe was 6", this appears to be too small to properly carry away all the material for discharge through this source from the school building with the increased accommodation since the new addition was completed. This was the cause of overflow or backing up in the basement.

The Reverend Principal makes mention of this, in his letter of the 6th instant, and asks for attention.

The length of this main sewer is about 500 feet.

Brother Cordeau is in the east at present, and he may be calling at the Department in Ottawa.

This is an important matter in providing for the disposal of the sewerage in a proper manner.

I beg to submit this matter for consideration, which is what I told the Rev. Principal and Brother Cordeau I would do.

Brother Cordeau who is in charge of the Cross Lake Indian Residential School recently visited this office and gave me a detailed description of the damaged condition of the concrete septic tank. After making an approximate estimate of the work required to put this tank in working condition, I would recommend that a new tank be built, *instead* similar to that provided for the new Guy Indian Residential School, with a few alterations to the drainage system. The cost will probably amount to \$2,200.00 in this locality.

It was suggested by Brother Cordeau that the sewage could discharge direct into the lake without endangering in any way the water supply intake, which is about a mile above the proposed sewage outlet. I cannot recommend this change unless a very accurate inspection of the local conditions is made. As I understand Inspector Bunn is familiar with this Institution, I beg to request that he be asked to submit a report as to which arrangement should be decided upon.

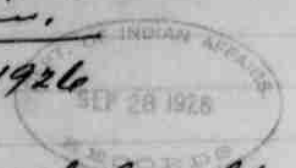

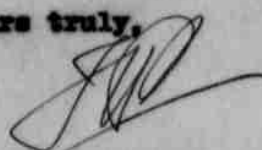

Referring to your letter No. 123-1-5, dated Sept. 29th and just received, with reference to the purchase of some 225 ft. of 8" cast iron pipe, and two elbows for the Cross Lake Indian School, for the sewer discharge line, I beg to say that there must be some misunderstanding in this matter. I have not received any authority from the Department re this pipe, nor have I ordered it.

June 8th last I wrote Mr. Inspector Bunn, of Winnipeg, recommending the purchase of 8" glazed tile for ~~the~~ this line. Mr. Bunn had already been in communication with the Department re the matter. Since that date I have had no information, except that I found, on my visit to the said school July 28th last, that the material had not yet been delivered.

It may be that the letter has been wrongly addressed, since Inspector Bunn does practically all of the buying for this Agency, being in closer touch than I with the dealers. It may also well be that the goods are now at Whiskey Jack. If they are not, the last opportunity of forwarding the pipe by boat is past for this season.

The pipe for the sewer, which was asked for, and I understand some arrangements made for, last summer, should be forwarded at the first opportunity, on as early a boat as possible.

I found also, that the steam boiler, which has been used for some years for compression for the small steam engine which has done much of the work, and which will now be used for running the laundry machinery, as well as furnishing steam for thawing pipes, providing hot water for laundry, or heat to make water hot, and used on some occasions as an auxiliary to the heating plant, especially so in mild weather, is getting badly rusted, and is likely to be condemned at any time, in fact, should not be used much longer, as it will not be safe. I would ask that this be replaced, as it is a very necessary part of the plant.

The type of boiler required is 15 H.P. Nagle, of the type "Bug", diameter, 36", height, 7 ft. Upright submerged tubes. The minimum ~~power~~ should be 15 H.P. and the maximum height, 7 ft. as this will leave only sufficient head space in the basement. Engine should be complete with injector and other necessary fittings.

I would especially ask that the engine and sewer pipe receive early and favorable consideration, as both are very much needed.

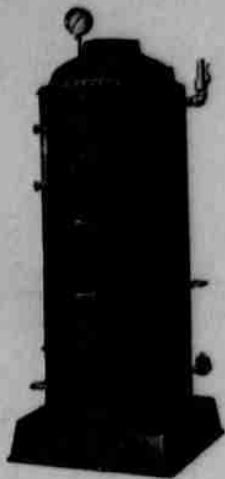

Referring to my letter No.777-3A,dated January 23rd last especially to my recommendation that a new high pressure steam boiler be supplied for St.Joseph's Indian School, Cross Lake, I enclose herewith the circular and letter forwarded to me by the Principal, in which the kind of boiler is particularly specified as their choice.

The type, Geneva, has the advantage of being only 6 ft. in height, which will leave more headroom.

Ten feet of smoke stack will be required. As the pipe must run horizontally, an elbow is required, as short an elbow as possible. It may be that a collar could be made that would fit on the hood of the boiler.

I trust the Department will furnish this boiler, as it is urgently needed, the old one being unsafe, or will be unsafe very soon. It is being carefully watched, and not too much pressure being allowed.



Sir:- Your letter, number and date as marginally noted above, is hereby acknowledged. This reply is belated, but the letter came between seasons and I expected to have an interview with some one from the Cross Lake School, so that I could get at the facts and write intelligently. I am now pleased to say that I had a visit from the Rev'd Brother Menard who is the man who looks after this side of the work for the Cross Lake Indian Residential School. He called on me on the 4th instant and we had a long talk that day and continued this on the 7th and 8th. These adjournments were necessary as he had to bring in certain information that became necessary as our talk progressed.

Sewage System)

This was the first matter that we talked over. I find that the system is practically out of business. The Septic Tank will have to be rebuilt, the old construction was too light. Brother Menard will send correct dimensions so that the quantity of Cement required can be worked out.

The piping, cast iron, should be 8", and the quantity named by Brother Menard is 225 lineal feet, from building to mouth of discharge in running water. The old pipe was 6" and was too small.

A "Y" reducer is required, cast iron, the branches to 4" each and the stem of the "Y" 8" this connects the two feeders from various parts of the building with main sewer pipe, the 2 feeders are sewage conveyors, the main goes to the Septic Tank after receiving the discharges from the conveyors, the junction is in the building I understand. The enlargement of the main pipe is necessary to take proper care of the sewage, there are about 110 people, pupils and staff, all told. The new Laundry also adds to the quantity of discharge.

I asked the Reverend Brother about the possibility of discharging the raw sewage direct into the water, but he says that this is not a workable plan, and that it entails a lot of labor, and he also suggested that there might be some complaint about doing this. It is my opinion that Provincial regulations would soon step in, and that some severe criticism might be the outcome. I was getting a line on this matter as it was intimated in your letter 123-1-5 date the 23rd April 1926, I wrote about this but did not get satisfaction and a definite conclusion, so I preferred to hold it over and during the past season of 1926 I did not meet any one from Cross Lake, so that I was not clear about the details as I have able to place them with you now, after a talk with Brother Menard.

I have your letter of the 15th instant, relative to the sewage disposal system, the supplying of a new steam boiler, repairs and other supplies required as mentioned therein for the use of the Cross Lake Indian Residential School.

Relative to the 225 lineal feet of cast iron piping, 8", I have to refer you to official letter of March 11th, last, in which you were requested to take this matter up with Mr. Agent Gordon, and if he had not purchased same, you were to arrange to do so, and have the above quantity forwarded to the school. You may also supply a "Y" reducer of the dimensions mentioned in your letter, and a sufficient quantity of lead, etc., for making joints. As soon as you have received the correct dimensions of the new septic tank, you should forward same for the consideration of the Department.

Relative to the new steam boiler required, we would refer you to official letter of the 27th ultimo, in which you were requested to arrange for the purchase of same.

You may purchase and have forwarded 200' steam rubber hose, 5 ply, of the dimensions required.

We have no funds available at the present time to supply the plow, breaker with coulter and stump puller and wire cable.

You may also arrange for the purchase of castors for 100 beds. I may say that the beds supplied this school were purchased from the T. Eaton Co., Winnipeg, and you may obtain the castors from this firm at the lowest possible cost.

You may also purchase and forward 3 inexpensive wall clocks.

Relative to the building of a new stable to accommodate the

horses and cattle at this school, I beg to say that this requirement will be noted for our Estimates for the fiscal year 1928-29. We have no funds available in our appropriation for the present fiscal year for this purpose. In the meantime, however, full particulars should be forwarded as to the lumber and materials that would be required, the approximate cost of same and for any labour required.

Relative to the extra desks required, I would refer you to official letter of April 21st, 1926. It is presumed that you have arranged for the purchase of the number of extra desks mentioned in said letter. If not, you should make the purchase after obtaining competitive prices from the firms mentioned, and have these desks forwarded. You should also purchase 2 teachers' desks of the type described as No. 25 in the catalogue of the Christie School Supply Co., Brandon, also 2 teachers' chairs, No. 10, and 4 visitors' chairs, No. 14, in said catalogue.

Competitive prices should, as far as possible, be obtained in all the above authorized purchases, and certified accounts, in duplicate, should be forwarded covering the expenditure incurred. Receipts for any freight charges should be attached. I shall be pleased if you will give the matter of these purchases your early attention.

A copy of the last annual report has been sent to the Principal.

I have word from Cross Lake Indian Residential School as to the dimensions of the Septic Tank, this is as follows:-
7' Wide. 18' Length. 5' High. divided in two compartments of equal size, to permit best action of the Bacteria in the disposal of solids and thus permit only purified sewage to leave the tank. In providing Cement for the construction of this tank, the Reverend Brother asks that a few extra sacks be sent, as in transit there is some Cement spoiled, even with the greatest care in handling. The end and side walls will be 8" thick and the bottom and top 6". These figures are exactly as given by Brother Menard.

Gentlemen:

We have your favor of the 10th in reply to which would say that our quotation covers exactly what is specified in your Order #399 were it not for the fact that the boiler is to be installed in the Province of Manitoba, and presumably comes under the Manitoba Boiler Inspection Law.

It is not a question of safety; the boiler we have quoted is a good boiler and perfectly safe if properly operated; but as we understand it the Province of Manitoba requires that all boilers except those used on railway locomotives and in steamship service, or boilers used in private residences smaller than 30 square feet of heating surface, must be built in accordance with the Canadian Interprovincial Regulations, and the boiler we have offered you would not comply with those regulations; but is our regular catalog construction boiler. It may be possible that boilers used in an Indian school are not subject to this inspection, but that is a point on which we have no information, and we would not ship this boiler for installation in Manitoba unless you relieve us of all responsibility of its passing inspection, and agree to pay for it whether or no.

We would like very much to sell you the boiler, but we cannot take any chances of shipping the boiler to this distant point and then have it rejected, as we believe the inspector would have a perfect right to do if it is subject to the regular inspection; nor would we care to furnish a boiler built to comply with the Canadian Interprovincial Regulations. Our reason for this is that the Canadian Provinces have adopted a special boiler inspection law which is different from anything else in existence and which operates very much to the disfavor of manufacturers outside of Canada. It entails a large amount of expense to get the specifications approved, and on account of not having a Canadian inspector in the shop there is a severe penalty in the shape of a higher factor of safety; and when the Canadian inspectors do come here to inspect throughout construction they make it just as hard as possible for the American manufacturers. We know of a case where an inspector was brought here to inspect boilers being built throughout construction, and in explanation of the amount of unnecessary work and changes that he insisted on he told the manufacturer outright that the Canadian

manufacturers of boilers wanted to furnish as many of the boilers used in Canada as possible, and for that reason have made it hard for outsiders to compete. We are only giving you this information to show you how the matter stands.

If the boiler you have ordered is acceptable we will be very glad indeed to fill your order; but it must be with the understanding that we take absolutely no responsibility in regard to it.

With reference to this High Pressure Boiler, I received your letter, Number and date as marginally noted above. On the 15th Mar. 1927, I addressed you with referenc to this boiler, and I enclosed a cut showing the style of same, this I had received from the Rev-Bro Menard of the Cross Lake Indian Residential School staff, this cut is an exact duplicate of the high pressure boiler that is in service now at this school. It has given good service and for that reason the Rev-Bro desired to ~~purchase~~ a new one of the same design in every detail.

In your letter, number and date as marginally given, I am instructed to purchase this H.P. Boiler, and before doing so I wrote on the 6th May 1927 asking for the cut of the boiler that I had enclosed with my letter of the 15th March, 1927, I received the cut on the 14th May, and I then asked for competitive prices, on the 17th May, due at noon on the 20th, I received three tenders as listed as follows:-

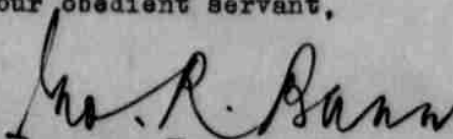

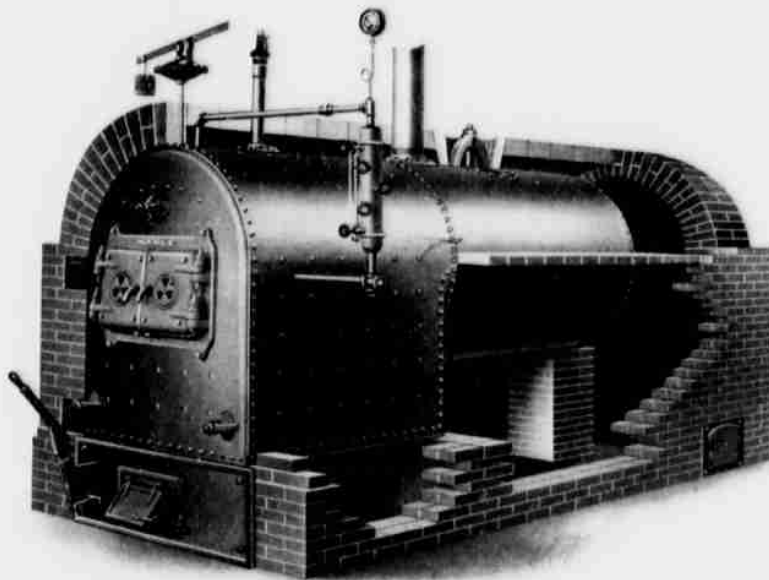

Dear Sir,

Your Circular #87 of September the 29th reached us in October by the last mail of the season last fall, so I didn't have the opportunity to answer to it before as we had no other mail before the end of this present month.

I am letting you know that we have adequate fire escapes and that the access to them is easy even for the small children. We follow your instructions and the doors of fire escapes can be open by any small child. Fire drill exercises were given to the children, so they would know what to do in case of fire.

However, we are short of a few things in our fire equipment.

- 1st. We have no special alarm bell in our school.
- 2nd. We need two hose of 50 feet each, size $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches.
- 3rd. We need two hose of 100 feet each, size $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches, for the out-buildings like the warehouse, barn, carpenter shop, etc.
- 4th. We need $\frac{1}{2}$ doz. Couplings to fit these hose $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches.
- 5th. $\frac{1}{2}$ doz. valves $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches.
- 6th. 1 case of Pyrene Cans to refill our extinguishers.

With these few things our fire equipment would be complete and we will be more safe in case of fire.

For some time, representations have been made that a proper barn should be erected at the Cross Lake Indian Residential School. The item was crowded out of the Estimates for the coming fiscal year; but, following the last interview with Father Guy, I marked the request as fairly urgent.

Brother Menard, of the staff, has been sent out by the Rev. Principal and he is now in Ottawa in connection with the improvements that are necessary at the school. He proposes to get out the lumber and put up at least the frame of the barn this coming summer. The building could be finished in 1930, and, if you approve of the scheme, an item will have to be placed in our Estimates of a year from now.

A plan and a bill of material have been prepared by Beatty Brothers, of Winnipeg. It has been estimated that the barn, without silo (which is unnecessary at Cross Lake) would cost approximately \$7,000. Mr. Orr and I feel that \$5,000 is all the Department should be asked to put into a barn at any northern school, and I wish to recommend that an item for this amount be placed in the 1929-30 Estimates. The school management has a small lumber mill at Cross Lake and can erect the barn at a cost of very little more than \$5,000, if they provide some labour by members of the staff and the older boys.

I believe the Department should let them proceed with the work and undertake to reimburse them to the extent of the Vote in 1930.

Pursuant to conversation with Rev. Brother Menard, I wish to suggest that you indicate what type of binder, fanning mill and small thresher would be most suitable for the Cross Lake Indian Residential School. You should state the Winnipeg representatives of the manufacturers and let me know something of the cost, f. o. b. Winnipeg. If the Department decides to allow the expenditure, instructions could be given to Mr. Inspector Bunn to purchase and ship to Cross Lake as soon as navigation opens. You may also let me have the receipt, in duplicate if possible, which shows your expenditure for a seed drill, which, I understand, you have purchased so as to be ready for the spring sowing. Favourable consideration will be given to reimbursing you in this connection.

I am today authorizing Brother Menard to purchase 300 ft. of fire hose, one-half dozen couplings, one-half dozen valves, one case of Pyrene refills and one case of Guardene refills. It is understood that the Brother will purchase these in Winnipeg, to the best advantage, after consultation with Inspector Bunn. Brother Menard should certify to the accounts, in duplicate, and present them to Mr. Bunn, who will forward them to the Department for payment. The company that supplies these goods should prepay the express to Mile 137, H. B. Railway, and should attach the express receipt to the account.

I am also authorizing Brother Menard to purchase one 80 gallon jacket heater, to be attached to the kitchen range. It is understood that this will be shipped to Mile 137 by freight. The company from which he purchases this, also, should attach freight receipt and submit their account, in duplicate, to Mr. Inspector Bunn. Brother Menard should certify to this, also. He is also being authorized to select a few dollars' worth of heavy wire screen for approximately a dozen windows which are next the playgrounds. When navigation opens, the company should ship this to Cross Lake and present their account, in duplicate, to Mr. Inspector Bunn.

Ottawa, February 22, 1928.

Reverend Sir:

Rev. Brother Menard has explained that you are desirous of proceeding, this year, with the erection of the proposed new barn at the Cross Lake Indian Residential School. Funds for this purpose will not be available until 1929, but the Deputy Superintendent General has approved of certain activity this year. I have to advise you to proceed with the preparation of the lumber and with some of the building operations this year. If you erect a barn as shown on the plan which Beatty Brothers of Winnipeg have prepared and which has been approved by our Architect, the Department will allow a grant of \$5,000 in 1929, if you will forward receipts in duplicate showing expenditures of at least this amount. If the cost does not come to this amount, the Department will be glad to learn that a saving has been effected. It is understood that the lumber will be supplied at cost and that the members of the staff and the older boys of the school will provide labour without special payment.

Re Lighting Plant of Cross Lake Indian Residential School.

In the early part of January, 1928, I received a letter from Mr Agent Gordon of Norway House Agency, with reference to the Lighting Plant above mentioned.

In his letter Mr Agent Gordon made a recommendation that a New Switch-board should be installed, and he gave the firm name as placed on the generator of the above named plant. When I got this letter, I consulted with a firm of Electricians, the Schumacher-Mackenzie-Kummen Co., as I could not intelligently make out the facts that I got in this connection from Mr Agent Gordon's letter.

This Electrical firm asked a number of questions and these I submitted to Mr Agent Gordon for fuller detailed information, at the same time I wrote to Brother Menard who has charge of the lighting plant in question. Unfortunately Brother Menard had left Cross Lake by the time my letter reached there and it was sent to him in the east, he received it, he told me this when he called at my office on the 5th instant. I asked him if he had spoken of this matter when he was in the Department at Ottawa on or about the 22nd February, he answered in the negative, as the Brother is fully acquainted with all the facts, it was most unlucky that he omitted to speak about this important matter at the time he was there, he had my letter and knew what I required.

When Brother Menard was here we went to the Canadian-Fairbanks Morse, and I showed them the correspondence, and this firm told us that a New Switch-board was the safest solution of this problem, as this will insure safety.

Brother Menard told me that in the present condition of the old Switch-board that there was danger of fire, and that they have been very careful about using the plant. This feature of danger of fire is a serious one and I fear that the safest and best cure is a New Switch-board that will safe-guard the situation in an absolute manner.

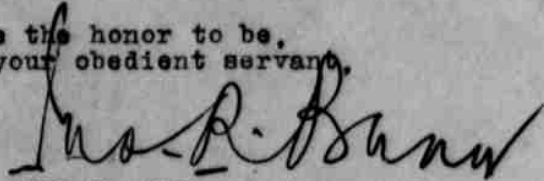

I think I have taken every care to determine what is the best steps to take, and I have come to the conclusion that the Old Switch-board should be removed and replaced with a New one and this should be done without any delay.

If a New Switchboard is decided upon, then this could be shipped to Cross Lake via the C.N.R'y and H.B.R'y via The Pas to Mile 137. I told Brother Menard that I thought this was the safest and best procedure and he agreed with me. It would have simplified matters very much if he had introduced the matter to you when he was in Ottawa on the 22nd Feb'y, the whole matter would have been closed by this time.

I enclose a memo of the cost of a New Switchboard which has been figured out by The Canadian Fair-banks Horse Co for your information.

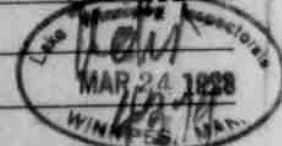

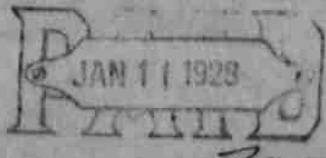
