Air warriors return

First aircraft units come home, describe air strikes on Iraq

At approximately 3:15 a.m. March 14, six bus-loads of eager Marines touched Air Station soil for the first time in several months. Portions of Marine Fighter Attack Squadron-235

and Marine Aviation Logistics Squadron-24 were among the first of the Hawaii-based air-craft squadrons to return home from the Middle East.

Not even the cold, stiff breeze blowing through the giant doors of Hanger 105 or the early morning darkness could over-

shadow the bright smiles and welcome-home hanners for the 214 returning Marines.

One of the returning Marines, Maj. James Hunter, executive officer of VMFA-235, described some of his squadron's busy schedule during an interview with a Marine reporter while in

Saudi Arabia.

"The three Kaneohe-based F/A-18 squadrons that were deployed to Bahrain attacked deapinside Iraq early on," he said. One of VMFA-235's F-A-18 Hornet pilots, Capt. Rod K. von Lipsey engaged in his first combat mission while flying over Southeastern Iraq.

According to von Lipsey, he knew that he would be on the first wave of attack from previous planning. As a surface-to-air missile hunter, von Lapsey would be responsible for supporting a U.S. Navy A-6 Intruder and a Saudi Arabian Tornado aircraft during a strike. Being tasked with supporting a suppression of defenses, the Kaneohe hased pilot was bighly exposed to Iraqi air defenses. "We encountered very heavy Triple-A and SAM activity," he said. "It was quite an impressive show of lights. I'll have to admit, there were some tense moments."

Von Lipsey added that within

Von Lipsey added that within five minutes of crossing the border, he heard that someone's wingman had been shot down.
"A SAM went off fairly close to us; so close that my flight leader thought! had been lit;" he said. "It was an aventful first taste of flying into Triple A and SAMs.

Portions of the other three returning squadrons, Marine Heavy Helicopter Squadron-463, Marine Medium Helicopter-165 and Marine Air Control Squadron-2 arrived at Hanger 105 at about 1:30 p.m. Thursday.

Capt. Edward H. Minchin, Ili, MACS-2 Tactical Aircraft Op-eration Center's officer in charge said their manning of seven

said their manning of seven early warning systems and two main TAOCs was "pulled off without a hitch."

According to Minchin, before the war started, their TAOC was integrated with the Eastern Sector Coordination Canter of the Saudi Arabian Air Defense. "In other words, all combat air patrols and other flight missions in that sector had to be cleared through the Saudi Arabian Coordination Center," said Minchin. "But after the war started, we began working on our own."

war started, we began working on our own."

Minchin added that when the war started, the TAOC coordinated more than 14,000 combat missions without any problems.
"The squadron performed well above expected," he said.

The largest group of Marines returning that afternoon (about 122) were from HMM 165 with commanding officer, I Col. Sam Hall. According to Hall, the helicopter squadron stayed combat ready all through Operations Desert Shield and Desert Storm.

"Before the water of a joint Marine Aircraft Group-16 and MAG-26 operation. The task was supporting troops and transporting them and equipment to various locations in the desert," he said. "But when the war started, our primary mission was to act as a medivac unit for injured troops. Luckily,

due to so few casualties, our role quickly changed," he added. Hall said the 26 pilots in his squadron began transporting Iraqi prisoners of war from Kuwaii to western Saudi Arabia where enemy POW camps were set up.

of Sea Stallion helicopters had to overgome a few hardships during the earlier stages of their deployment to the Middle East. Buttling 135 degree heat and "horrendous" sund storms, the helicopters ability to lift heavier loads was affected, according to Hall.

oads was affected, according to Hall.

"The temperature inside the cockpit combined with the fine 'talcum powdery' sand got to be very uncomfortable at times," said Hall. "The sand storms would be so bad at times, it became nearly impossible to see. We called that 'brown outs."

To get accustomed to the harsh and unpredictable conditions, Hall said a building-block type of training was implemented. Using this method, the pilots and crew hegun operating at a higher level of altitude until they were more accustomed to the terrain and conditions. Gradually, the pilots worked their way closer to the desert floor.

"By the time the war started, we were working 50-100 feet from the ground," he pointed out. "To sum up our entire war efforts, our pilots and their crew performed every mission they were tasked with efficiently and quickly."

According to officials here, terrorist activity is still a possibility as a result of tensions in the Middle East. The American Porces Information Service reports that the threat of global terrorism by supporters of Iraq is on the rise, and experts say the best defense is vizilance.

William Sessions. FBI director, recently said that Americans should go about their normal business, but he vigilant normal business, but he vigilant as to what is going on around them. They should report any activity out of the ordinary immediately to the FB1, the police or appropriate military authority. Three general rules should be followed: be alert, keep a low profile, and be unpredictable.

For example, if you see someone watching you, your home or your place of work, report it immediately to the

authorities. The same rule applies to suspicious-looking vehicles, especially those that appear to be following you. Teach your children not to talk to, or leave school with strangers, nor should they or adults open their residence doors without knowing whom to expect.

Be especially suspicious of bulky mail from people you don't know. Also, look for these flaws on mailed packages:

Rundown: Who is back, and who isn't

Editor's note: The following story is a compilation of information about Marines and sailors who returned from Operations Desert Shield/Storm through Tuesday.

Roughly 1,950 Kancohe-based Marines and sailors liave returned to the 1st Marine Expeditionary Brigade here, during the first 10 days of redeployment from Operation Desert Shield/Storm. About 5,500 more servicemen and women are scheduled to return.

Arrivals began March 9 with two flights of returning warri-ors from 3d Battalion, 3d Marine Regiment. While most of 3rd Battalion has returned, the regiment still has personnel from 1st and 2nd Battalions deployed as well as several Marines from its Headquarters element.

Servicemen from Battery A, tst Battalion, 12th Marines, the "artillery arm" of the 3d Marine Regiment, began to return at a later date.

Also still deployed are Marines and sailors in Brigade Service Support Group-I, the combat support element of the combat support element of the lat Marine Regiment are still in South West Asla.

Many Marines and sailors from 1st Radio Battslion, Fleet Marine Force, Pacific have returned.

Aircraft units have also begun to return. Marine Aircraft Group-24 has seen the return of: Marine Fighter Attack Squad-ron-235; Marine Medium Heli-copter Squadron-165; and Ma-rine Heavy Helicopter Squad-ron-463.

While Marine Air Control Squadron-2 and Marine Avia-tion Logistics Squadron-24 still have deployed personnel, sev-eral members of those units have returned.

MAG-24 units still to return are Marine Wing Support Squadron-174; Marine Fighter Attack Squadron-212; Marine Fighter Attack Squadron-232; and Marine Medium Helicopter Squadron-265. All F/A-18 (Hornet) aircraft are scheduled to return at a later date.

Cheney discusses future structure for military

The new Defense Department budget request continues the about-face in defense planning reflected by world events.

The military's force structure won't be geared for global conflict with the Soviet Union on short notice, said Secretary of Defense Dick Cheney. The strategy will focus more on being prepared for a quick, mobile response to any place in the world.

Atlantic forces will be configured to meet the requirements of the Conventional Forces in Europe Treaty. Pacific forces will provide regional access and a base for power projections, Cheney explained.
A U.S. based contingency force will be able to deploy quickly to trouble spots around the world for crises limited in scope and time, Cheney added. "We can

now focus more upon regional contingencies as being the driving factor in force size rather than the need to be prepared for a global conflict with the Soviet Union on short notice," he said.

The fiscal 1992-93 Department of Defense budget addresses this strategy, said Cheney. Rapid response to global crises requires superior U.S. force capabilities.

superior U.S. force capabilities. This requires high-quality personnel, vigorous defense research and development, advanced military systems, an ability to deploy military power rapidly to areas of U.S. strategic interest and preservation of nindustrial and technological base. To ensure nuclear deterence, Doll will maintain strong offensive nuclear forces, said the secretary.

The budget request includes a downsizing of the Marine Corps

from three to roughly two and a half expeditionary brigades. The Navy will face a 20 percent reduction of its fleet. For example, the number of aircraft carriers will be reduced from 13 to 12. This includes retirement of the USS Midway, USS Forrestral, USS Saratoga and USS Ranger. Carrier wings will be cut from 15 to 13 hy 1995, and all battleships will be taken out of service. The fleet of 545 ships will be slashed to 451.

of 545 ships will be stasned to 451.
The budget request includes a downsizing of the Army from 28 divisions in 1990 to 18 by

1995.
The Air Force will reduce its tactical fighter wings from 36 to 26. It will cut its strategic bombers from 268 in 1990 to 181 in 1995, reflecting retirement of B-52H strategic aircraft over he next few years. The FB-111 will

convert from a strategic to a conventional role. DoD anticipates that 13 B-2 advanced technology bombers will be online by 1995.

To preserve the technological superiority of U.S. forces, the fiscal 1992 research, development, test and evaluation budget authority will be 10 percent above fiscal 1991 levels. DoD technology base funding - \$3.9 billion for fiscal 1992 and \$4 billion for fiscal 1993 includes high-performance computing and improved materials for electronics, gas turbine engines and

improved materials for electronics, gas turbine engines and airframe components, continued Cheney.

The force structure will include high airlift and sealift capacities, substantial and effective maritime and amphibious forces, a full array of combat aircraft and both heavy and light Army infantry divisions,

he added.

The budget calls for six C-17 strategic transports in fiscal 1992 at a cost of 2.8 billion, with an additional 12 planes in 1993 for \$4.2 billion. Airlift capacity will remain at current levels through fiscal 1995, then modestly increase, as the fielding of C-17s exceeds the retirement of C-141 airlift alreraft.

Dol) also plans to improve response time to problem areas with its sealift program in 1993, using funds already appropriated by Congress, said the secretary. The Ready Reserve Force will increase from 96 tanker and cargo ships to 142 by 1994.

Dol) is reorienting the Strategic Defense Initiative to provideglobal protection against limited ballistic missile strikes. This defensive concept, known as Global Protection Against

Limited Strikes, includes thea-ter missile defenses to protect U.S. and allied troops deployed abroad.

Consistent with streamlining its force structure, U.S. military manpower levels will decline because fewer people are needed for a smaller force, continued Cheney. By the end of fiscal 1995, active military will decrease to 1.653 million, about 24 percent below the post-Vietnam peuk of 2.174 million in fiscal 1987.

Force structure changes will reduce the reserve strength at the same time the active military is being cut. For every Army division deactivated, a roundout component from the reserves will be deactivated. In general, however, the reduction for reserves is slightly less than on the active side.



American POWs speak about capture, captivity

With their heads held high with
pride and confidence, the seven
returning prisoners-of-war
walked into their press conference at the Bathesda Naval
Hospital to finally give America
the answers to their burning
questions about being held
captive by Iraqi troops.

The five Marines and two

The five Marines and two Navy POWs were introduced to the anxiously awaiting press. They were: LtCol. Clifford M. Acree, Maj. Joseph Small III, Capt. Michael C. Berryman, Capt. Russell A.C. Sanborn, CWO-4 Guy L. Hunler and Navy Ids. Lawrence Slate and Jeffrey Zaun.

Acree, who is from Seattle,

and stationed with the Marine Air Support Squadron out of Cherry Point, N.C. described his time in captivity.

"My experience was just about like everyone else's," he said. "In my mind, I knew I had to take it one day at a time.

"My thoughts were primarily centered around my family, whom I love, and about the welfare and snfety of the other prisoners. America should be proud about how the POWs did," said Acree.

He also went on to describe the details of his capture and subsequent injury to his neck when his OV-10 Bronco was shot down over Kuwnit Jan. 18.

"When my plane was hit, I went to pull the ejection handle and did not eject at first, so I looked back and saw that CWO-

4 Hunter was still in the plane.

"Everything happened so slowly. So I bent down to pull the ejection handle again, which is the worst possible position to have your neck in and then that's when I hit it and injured the neck," he added.

Small, who is from Racine, Wis. and is stationed at the Marine Aerial Observation Squadron-1 at MCAS New River, N.C., also described his time in captivity.

"I was captured on the second day of the ground war, so I had

a pretty good idea what the Iraql troops were doing to the prisoners," he said, "I had landed in the middle of an Iraqi infantry unit with no real chance to escape. I went through several interrogation sessions and was eventually put in a cell in Baghdad."

"During that time I prayed and thought of my family at home," he added. "I would like to thank the American people for the support they have shown."

Berryman, originally from Broken Arrow, Okla., is

stationed with the Marine Attack Squadron-311, Marine Aircraft Group-13.

"You don't even begin to realize what you have in this world until you lose it," he told the press. "I just kept thinking about my family and how they were holding up during all of this."

Sanborn, who was born in Arcadia, Fla., and is assigned to Marine Alreack Squadron-231, Marine Aircraft Group-13, fielded questions about the bleak conditions they were held under.

"To be brief, it was a terrifying experience. I was put into a solitary cell and suffered mistreatment and abuse.

"I underwent several interro-gation sessions. The food, as well as the medical care, was


very inadequate," he said.


Sanborn was listed as missing in action Feb. 9, when his AV-8B Harrier failed to return from a combat mission.


Hunter was with Acree when he was captured. He was born in Moultrie, Ga. and was stationed with the Marine Aerial Observation Squadron-2, Marine Aircraft Group-39 before his capture. He told the press about how he felt when he was forced to make statements on Iraqi television.

"I felt really bad about what we were forced to do," he said.
"Afterwards, when all the prisoners were put together, I had found out that they were forced to make statements, also. When we were together, we had lengthy talks about what had happened."











Iraqi troops 'eagerly waited' to surrender

Kuwait-One of the primary contributing elements to a
quick and decisive victory for
allied forces here was the rapid,
massive surrender of thousands
of Iraqi troops only hours after
the ground offensive began.

As front line Marine units
pressed forward, destroying
virtually every enemy tank,
vehicle or bunker in front of it,
Iraqi soldiers began appearing
out in the middle of the battlefield with their hands up and
waving white flags or holding
on to some kind of white
material.

Dressed in threadbare olive drab uniforms, the enemy troops appeared tired and seemed to be conteat with their capture.

"The majority of Iraqi soldiers were sent to Kuwait under pressure from Saddam Hussein," said 1stLt. Abdullah Nahr Alanzi, a Kuwaiti Air Force officer, who served as an interpreter with the 3rd Tank Battalion. "If they would have gone back (to Iraq) they would have been killed. And if they would have surrendered, their families would have been killed. They know themselves that they were fighting (or nothing. They

weren't fighting for their country, their people or their families. They were down here in Kuwait for one reason Saddam Hussein."

The 37-year-old civil engineer also learned from the EPWs that most of the enemy troops were eagerly waiting for allied forces to launch their attack so they could surrender. "It was their chance to get to Saudi Arabia

or any other place to get out of Saddam's control. A lot of Iraqis were killed in the Iran-Iraqi War for nothing. The same thing would have happened with Kuwait."

During 3rd Tank Battalion's advance, Iraqi soldiers began surrendering in small groups. As the assault continued, hordes of enemy troops began forming up and walking south toward

EPW collection points.
"I saw one Iraqi jump in the air, land, kiss the ground and come up smiling because he was so happy that we finally arrived," said LOpl. Robert Bolling, an amphibious assault vehicle crewman.

There's no question that the troops who surrendered, as many as there were would have put up a good fight had they stood their ground. But their surrender enabled them to escape the long arm of Saddam flussein; something most of them have been trying to do for months, perhaps years for those involved

the Iran-Iraq War

"As soon as Saddam heard that his army was giving up, he announced that his people should withdraw," Alanzi continued. "He just wanted to save himself and say, "Nobody pushed my people out of Kuwait. I told them to withdraw."

As more troops surrendered and allied forces continued the annihilation of the Iraqi Republican Guard, it became clear that Hussein's plan to cover up the defeat of his army, which used to be approximately 1 million strong, was headed for a full.

Softball player finds sport in giving to others

He loves softball. That's why
he turned to the sport when he
wanted to raise money for fellow
Marines deployed to the Persian
Gulf.

Sgt. George Hartman decided several months ago to hold a weekend softball match as a fund-raiser. Rainy weather conspired against him, though, delaying the event until a significant day in January that most people will remember as the beginning of the war.

They actually began playing Jan. 15, Saddam Hussein's deadline day to get out of Kuwait. As CNN reporters in Baghdad were telling the world about the start of the war, Hartman, along with six male and five female teams, were midway into the three-day event.

The \$485 raised was presented to the Enlisted Spouses' Center for "whatever they need to spend it on," as Plartman, a maintenance controller from the Power Plant put it. Judy Conlen, co-president of the Spouses' Center, said the money will be used to fund a big party they plan to have when all of the deployed troops get back.

Hartman said he gave the money to the Spouses' Center for two reasons. The first was that he knew they could use the donation and they'd put it to good use. Secondly, he and his wife Lorf are neighbors and good friends of the Conlens.

"I guess the reason I know about the Spouses' Center and what they do over there is because I know Judy so well," Hartman said, "I figured it was a good cause."

Hartman, while the originator of the idea, said he does not deserve full credit. He said that the staff at Athletics was key to pulling the tournament off. Scouts, MPs work together on pond

Military Policemen and local
Girl Scouts recently assisted the
"Hawaiian Stilts" to get a
fighting chance for survival by
remodeling their homes. The
Hawaiian Stilts are endangered
birds that nest in the Air
Station's Nu'upia Ponds.
On the morning of Feb. 23,

under the supervision of Station Environmental Protection Spe-cialist Dr. Diane Drigot, six Marines and approximately 30 Girl Scouts from Troops 88, 29 and 156 worked in knee-deep waters to repair pesting homes. waters to repair nesting homes. By filling old tires with pickle-weeds and mud, the birds' nesting and feeding habitats are enhanced, giving them a better

chance for survival.

According to Drigot, the success of the Hawaiian Stilt is attributed to three key factors: Assault Amphibian Vehicles plowing up thick pickleweed, the trapping of predators by the Military Policemen and auxiliary game wardens, and volunteer groups like the Marines and

Girl Scouts who are helping to keep the ponds cleared.

"This is the girls' fourth time out here," said Lori Foxworth, Jr. Troop leader for Troop 88. "Whenever they come, they have a great time. Among the fun, they realize the importance their part plays in the birds' future," she added.

According to Foxworth, the girls' volunteer work at Nu'upia Fonds will apply to environmental badges for their groups.

"Before the Marines and the "Before the Marines and the girls came today, there weren't any birds around the tire nests," said Drigot. "But on the way out from the ponds, they looked back and saw them (birds) flying to the tires. So, we are doing some good here and not just getting muddy."

According to Drigot, between 1984 and 1991, the Air Station's Stilt population has steadily grown from 60 to 130-160 birds.

The Hawaiian-native bird is found on the islands of Oahu, Maui, Kauai, Molokai, Niihau, and a few on the island of Hawaii.

"Nu'upia Ponds here is considered one of the top three breeding grounds for the Stilt." said Drigot. "The upkeep of the ponds is crucial to promote national goals, and to stay

within historic preservation and endangered species laws set by the federal government."

Because Nu'upia Ponds is a protected wetland, an endangered species habitat and protected national Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) has required all federal agencies to consider the impact of all actions on the environment. Additionally, the Secretary of the Navy has established a policy to prevent loss and to avoid impacts on wetlands wherever possible on Navy Department lands.

"It wasn't the first idea that papped in my mind on a Saturday morning" said Sgt. Jonas Sanjurjo, a military policemen here. "But it was worth it and it wasn't that had."

Drigot suid with everyone's continued support, she is optimistic that the Hawaiian Stilt will one day be taken off the endangered list.

"We have received a steady stream of support from the Marines and Girl Scouts, but we are always looking for more," said Drigot.

Ombudsmen's toils and troubles take their toll

You know those seemingly armor-plated monuments of strength we like to call ombudsmen? Well, startling new information has just come inthey're human too. Yes, it's really true. In fact, the toils of their jobs are starting to show. Look closely, you'll see what I mean.

There's one. She's smiling and wearing a patriotic T-shirt,

although you might not notice it beneath all those yellow ribbons. Look at her face though, better yet, look at her eyes. Stop staring at the sleepless bags beneath them for a second and look a little closer. See the dilation of the pupils at the center of those bloodshot squiggly lines? That's one of the early signs of what doctor's are calling ombudsodisorientidus. The symptoms get worse. You might wonder why she's

some of the ombudsmen wedged that phone in there just one time too many and it's stuck. You can bet they're thankful that receivers can be unplugged from the rest of the phone. It's sad, but what do you expect, they spend most of the day talking into their phones. It wouldn't be so bad if they had a free hand to hold it. But as fate would have it, one's busy writing while the other's busy keeping little ones from mischief.

got that crook in her neck. Surely you see it, her head's almost touching her shoulder. Not quite, though. There's just enough room to stick a phone receiver in between. She's lucky, some of the ombudsmen wedged that phone in there just one

Some of the visionaries anticipated this crooked-neck problem early on, and tried alternating the phone from ear to ear to beat it. It's too bad, it seemed like such a good idea at the time. Don't worry, though, doctors at the medical clinic here say they should be able to support the weight of their heads within a few months, a year at the most.

It's those tiny dots all around their ears and cheek that have doctors most buffled, though. Who would have imagined that the little holes in the phone receiver would actually make permanent marks? Maybe that's

something phone makers should look into.

If you think about it, it's a miracle they can still move their jaws enough to talk. The darn things are swollen up from talking so much that they make people who just had their wisdom teeth pulled look gaunt. The ombudsmen say ice packs help a little, but I don't believe 'em.

They'll also tell you their's is a tough Job, but that it's thera-peutic to help other people. Let's ask the one we were just staring at.

Whoops, sorry about that. I forgot about the swelling around her jaw. I'd better just tell you what she said. After a while, you learn to decipher what they

"It's made me stronger, and better equipped to handle my own stress. Sure it's a tough joh-long hours, phone calls in the middle of the night and the like. But the satisfaction I get from knowing I'm helping other families go through what I'm going through is immensely satisfying."

That's probably so, but she doesn't argue that her job brings

on another form of stress. The result of this stress is also apparent if you pay close atten-tion.

You notice how she keeps starting to walk off in different directions? Psychologists say that's caused by the peculiar position she and her fellow onbudsmen hold as middlemen between the military and the military family. It's a form of temporary schizophrenia (that is, they hope its only temporary). Apparently, this strange phenomenon is caused by not knowing just which of these two communities they are speaking on behalf of. The fact is, It's both.

Not that the two are on different sides, mind you. But there is a gap. That's one of the main reasons these ladies hold the position of ombudsmen that they do to bridge that

They have to take the informa-tion they learn from the military, which isn't always good news (i.e. we don't know when your husbands are coming home) and try to present it to the wives in a way that won't cause an all out visit. riot.

Meanwhile, they've also got to take the complaints they get from their families (i.e. How come Milly knows when her husband

is coming home and I don't? Grrrrrrrrl) and work their way skillfully through the military system, like a guide through the jungle, to get the best possible answer to explain the situation.

Another symptom you might notice in ombudsmen is their inability to distinguish between their own family and those within their units. The experts explain this as "a side-effect caused by their involvement with so many different families." They suggest name tags to help differentinte.

Take our study, for example. Just now, her 10 year-old came over and asked for soda-money. She told him he'd have to ask his mother first. When the confused hoy told her SHE was his mother, this ombudsman replied that of course she was, and told him to stop asking OTHER people for money.

With that, she turned and walked off in a zag-zag pattern, head crooked to one side, down the street and around the corner. Lets just hope she's on her way home, because there are several messages from the families of her unit waiting on her anwering machine. Ombudsodisorientidus or not, she still has a very important job to do, and she pushes on, along with the rest of the ombudsman crew here.



It takes planning, long hours to feed 6,000 hungry Marines

The cooks and staff at an eating establishment here say serving hungry Marines and sailors nutritious, well-helanced meals, is their sole purpose for existence. They boast that up to 6,000 discriminating palates can be satisfied in one day's business.

Capt. Dan Spino, Air Staffon food service officer, takes his job seriously and the food prepared at Pless Hall even more.

"The job of feeding our Marines and sallors three well-balanced, nutritious meals every day takes a lot of planning," Spino said. "That job will get even tougher when all of our Marines and sailors return from Saudi Arabia, but we're ready to feed them all," he added. "There will be no food service problem here."

to 49 cooks and a handful of civilian mess attendees, sometimes referred to as "the bread and butter of the chow hall." According to Spino, most of the cooks are on the mess deck by 2:30 a.m. and don't leave until after nine in the evening. To help reduce the time of figuring out what to prepare, the cooks and crew follow a pre-planned schedule of meals.

That schedule is more commonly known as the master menu which all Marine Corps dining facilities must abide by. The master menu rotates every 30 days and is based on guidelines and nutritional standards set by Marine Corps Order P10110.17C. However, some meals in the master menu can be changed locally to suit the needs of the Marines and sailors, according to Spino.

In order to satisfy requests from the people aboard the Air Station, the master menu is monitored and modified by Spino, medical representatives, the senior enlisted food technician, mess manager and a representative from every unit. They also solicit units to find out if any special food items are requested.

According to Spino, several

considerations go into a master menu to make Kaneohe's pa-trons diet unique to the Corps.

"We take into consideration the climate and the type of training and work environment our Marines and sailors are in," said Spino. That in turn, helps us decide the calorie intake needed and finally assists us in designing a master menu specifically for Hawaii-based personnel."

On special occasions, Pless Hall will sponsor special meals to honor a specific event. Ethnic observances, Marine Corps Birthday and Christmas meals are a few.

"When our guys return from the Middle East, we plan on having a steak dinner to honor them and to let them know we missed them," said Spino. "They are our customers and a welcome-home dinner is in order."

Spino said Marine Corps food teams routinely visit Pless Hall to ensure Marines and sailors who dine there are getting quality food and service. These teams inspect all Marine Corps dining facilities. According to

Spino, the teams let "no crumbs slip through the cracks" when it comes to food service.

Some argue that the Navy's chow is better than the Army's or the Air Force's is better than the Marine Corps, but according to Spino, there isn't any difference.

"All military services use the Armed Forces Recipe Service," he suid. "Lasugna in the Muriue Corps is made the same way as lasugna is in the Air Force."

The health-consciousness sweeping the nation's attitudes about food has also swept into the Marine Corps diet, according to Spino. Spino said the dining facility here uses only 100 percent beef and cholesterolfree oil. He also added that most foods such as meat, fish and poultry are broiled and baked instead of deep fried.

"We are starting to do most of our cooking with convection (warm air) ovens and the dry-heat method of cooking." Spino added. "The cooking techniques are getting better which will help reduce saturated fat and salt intake," he pointed out. "Most of all, if our customers are happy, we are happy."


