463 hits Twentynine Palms for two CAXs

The last few Marines and gear of Marine Heavy Helicopter Squadron 463, "Pegasus," are preparing to depart from K-Bay to Twentynine Palms, Calif., to participate in Combined Arms Exercises.

The Pegasus Marines spent all last week moving most of the squadron via C-5 Galaxy aircraft from K-Bay to Twentynine Palms, according to Lt. Col. Chris O'Connor, the commanding officer of HMH-463. While in California, HMH-463 will provide troop and cargo transport

support for two CAXs.

"This is an excellent opportunity to train in an environment not available to us in Hawaii," said O'Connor. "It's also a good opportunity to interface with other air elements we usually don't get to train with."

In addition to training with ground units during the two months in California, HMH-463 will work with CH-46 and AH-1 helicopter squadrons, O'Connor said.

"It will be a great change of pace," said Sgt. Kenneth Alexander, a maintenance control specialist with 463. "It's the first

time any of the young guys in the squadron have been anywhere and it's a good time for us to get the training we need."

After completion of the two CAX the main body of the squadron will return to K-Bay in early March, O'Connor added. In addition to the CAX, however, a detachment of servicemembers and helicopters will be sent to Weapons Tactics Instructors Course at Marine Corps Air Station Yuma, Ariz., to support spring courses there. These Marines will return in mid-April.

Local Boy Scouts fix up booby hatchery

The red-footed booby bird colony is a little safer now thanks to 11 Boy Scouts with Troop 223, who raked wood chips over highly flammable weeds and helped repair man-made nesting trees Saturday.

Dave Forand, a 15-year-old Kaneohe Bay Boy Scout, organized the effort in conjunction with the MCB Hawaii Environmental Department to help the birds. He picked the chore out of a list of things the department needed done.

"The other things were just things like painting recycling bins and cleaning beaches," said Forand. "I wanted to do this because it's helping the birds and they're protected."

The colony of an estimated 3,000 boobies is nestled in the back wall of Ulupa'u Crater behind the weapons range. It's one of two colonies in Hawaii. It has grown from 500 to 1,000 birds a few years ago because of people like the Boy Scouts, according to Dr. Diane Drigot, senior natural resources management specialist with the Environmental Department.

"We appreciate this kind of help," said Drigot. "There is a lot of work that needs to be done to maintain the area."

The Boy Scouts, along with five parents, raked and shoveled wood chips over weeds surrounding the trees to prevent an out of control fire. If a bullet ricocheted, as they have in the past,

fire can easily spread through the dry range weeds and cause substantial damage.

In 1991, the base developed a Fire Management Plan.

The Fire Management Plan brought fire breaks, Marine firefighting training and man-made trees to lure the birds out of the most susceptible area

for fire. The Boy Scouts helped Carroll Cox, the president of EnviroWatch Inc., Honolulu, add branches to these trees.

"These have become the trees the birds prefer to nest on," said Cox. "Their flexible, so they're not rigid like some of the other trees. They're great protection. And, they're built with flat

tops so it's easier for the birds to land."

The Boy Scouts finished up their task in approximately six hours after attracting several television stations and newspapers.

"With projects like this," said Drigot, "we hope to be able to sustain bullets and boobies into the 21st Century."

K-Bay resident receives special delivery

A MCB Hawaii K-Bay resident received an unexpected delivery at her home Dec. 22, in the form of a six-pound, 11-ounce baby girl in her bedroom.

Trisha Fields, the 25-year-old wife of Sgt. Dudley Fields, a radio operator with Liaison/Naval Gun Fire, Headquarters Battery, 1st Battalion, 12th Marines, gave birth to Tatyama around 2:40 p.m.

"It happened very quick," said Fields, recalling the impromptu birth of her first child. "I kept having to push and my husband and friend didn't believe me. I thought it would take longer, but it happened so fast."

Fields and her husband had traveled to Tripler Army Medical Center earlier because of contractions. Upon examination, doctors found she had the flu and was only dilated to two centimeters. Since 10 centimeters is full dilation, Fields was sent home.

By early Saturday afternoon, however, the unexpected began to transpire.

"The contractions got stronger," Fields said. "I knew we didn't have time to get to the hospital, so I told my hus-

band to call the ambulance."

When the emergency medical technicians from Branch Medical Clinic here arrived on the scene, they were surprised to see Fields fully-clothed and lying on her side, rather than supine and prepared for labor, according to Petty Officer 2nd Class Christopher McLaughlin, a hospital corpsman and EMT with Branch Medical.

"When we got there, we tried to calm the mother while the military police went to pick up her doctor," McLaughlin said. "Her water hadn't broken yet, and because this was her first pregnancy, I didn't think (the situation) was serious."

The severity of the situation became clear only a few minutes after the doctor arrived when Fields' water broke and gave birth.

"It was the first time I had ever seen a live birth," said McLaughlin. "I was shocked. There was a lot of screaming and it was crazy. It was very exciting."

After the child was born, "'Little House on the Prairie' style" as Sgt. Fields put it, Mrs. Fields and her new daughter were taken to Castle Medical Center in Kailua and released the next day.

Draft registration mandatory under 26

WASHINGTON — Men on active duty or attending a service academy may not realize it, but they have to register for the draft if they leave active duty before turning age 26, according to Selective Service officials.

The nudge comes with the recent announcement of the Selective Service's Web site, <http://www.sss.gov>.

Registering for the draft, officials said, is now just a computer mouse click away on the Internet.

Draft registration is coupled to many federal and state benefits. For instance, men must register to qualify for federal student loans or Pell grants and federal job training programs. Unregistered veterans under 26 applying for these benefits will end up waiting for verification checks and paperwork processing.

"We tell [servicemembers] to just sign up," said Barbi Richardson, a Selective Service spokesperson. It's simpler and faster for everyone, she said.

By federal law, all men living in the United States or who are U.S. citizens living overseas — including those in the reserve components — must register with the Selective Service System within 30 days following their 18th birthday. They also must register if they become subject to the draft at any time before age 26 — for instance, if they leave active duty or immigrate.

About 1.9 million men register for the draft each year. Women are not required to register for the draft. Failure to register is a felony punishable by a fine of up to \$250,000, five years in jail or both.

Post offices have registration forms for those without Internet access. Service members overseas can obtain materials from their personnel centers or American embassies. If you have questions, call toll-free 1 (888) 655-1825 or visit the Web page.

Sergeant Major's Corner

Attire reflects on Corps

When I was the sergeant major for the 11th Marine Expeditionary Unit in the late 80's, prior to each deployment I made a point of visiting all the Marines that made up the MEU subordinate elements and talking to them about the upcoming deployment.

Among the things I discussed was acceptable attire for liberty while on deployment and the standard of behavior that was expected of them.

I explained to them that while on deployment we were "ambassadors in green" of our Corps and country and needed to present the very best impression both by our behavior and appearance to the host nation and its citizens.

I also told them in no uncertain terms that once liberty call was sounded, those Marines not meeting the standard in their liberty attire would not be allowed to leave the ship til they did so. Also, those Marines who did not live up to an appropriate standard of behavior while on liberty would not see the outside of the ship til we returned back to home port.

With liberty being the precious commodity that it is on deployment, and our Marines understanding the importance of our port visits, most Marines left the more "faddish" type of clothing at home and opted for a more conservative look. Because of their understanding of the necessity of setting the very best example in both their dress and behavior, and their leaders holding them accountable if they did not meet those expectations, we had very few liberty incidents and Marines still had a great time ashore.

I have often wondered why we don't give that same type of lecture to our Marines at the end of each day before liberty call is sounded here at home.

While most Marines do dress appropriately while in civilian clothes, there are a few that push the envelope on the words "appropriate civilian attire."

Marine Corps Order P10120.28, paragraph 7, is pretty clear when it states, "Marines are associated and identified with the Marine Corps in and out of uniform, and when on or off duty. Therefore, when civilian clothing is worn, Marines will ensure that their dress and personal appearance are conservative and commensurate with the high standards traditionally associated with the Marine Corps. No eccentricities of dress will be permitted."

In these few words, the commandant is reminding all of us of our responsibilities to meet a standard of dress that brings credit to our nation and Corps.

Wearing trousers that five people could fit in back home in East Cupcake, New York, might have been fashionable when you were 15 years old. But as a United States Marine on liberty representing your Corps in the public eye, it is not.

Putting stuff in your hair that makes it stick straight up might look cool back on the block, but for a Marine on liberty in Waikiki, it looks ridiculous.

Marines, Sailors aid hurricane relief effort

SOTO CANO AIR BASE, Honduras — Commerce, trade and much-needed supplies are once again flowing throughout the hurricane-ravaged countryside here thanks to the long, hard efforts of U.S. Navy and Marine Corps bridge builders.

Marine Corps engineers and Seabees of Naval Construction Battalion 7 assigned to Joint Task Force-Bravo completed a culvert bridge between the towns of Talanga and San Juan de Flores Jan. 3.

"This bridge is a main thoroughfare," said Francisco Reyes, a principal landowner and former mayor of San Juan de Flores, during the Jan. 3 ribbon-cutting ceremony. "It allows the people of this area to conduct business and to be able to sell the crops that are grown here. Without this bridge, these people have no way to get their produce to market. You (the engineers) have provided us with a way to sustain our livelihoods, and we thank you."

The engineers worked nonstop in 12-hour shifts over eight days to complete the 70-meter culvert bridge across the Rio del Hombre. The bridge was built by packing a

15-foot-wide path of dirt and rocks between and atop a row of large concrete tubes (culverts) set in the river.

The Seabees had used the same techniques and a round-the-clock six-day work schedule to complete a 75-meter temporary culvert span across the Rio Hondo, north of the capital, Tegucigalpa, just before Christmas.

At the same time, 53 Marines from 8th Engineer Support Battalion and supporting units from Camp Lejeune, N.C., finished a 50-meter bridge at Ojo de Agua and then immediately moved on to bridges in downtown Tegucigalpa, the Rio Congrejal and others.

The American engineers' calendars have been similarly crowded since they arrived in Honduras after Hurricane Mitch hit in early November. The completion of every bridge has been followed by public fanfare.

"What you have done is made an extremely important connection between the people of the north and those in Tegucigalpa," said Tomas Lozano Reyes, Honduran public transportation minister, at the Rio Hondo ceremony. "The northern areas supply the basic food, the basic grain, to the capital so that its nearly 1 million peo-

ple can eat. That is what you have provided. The United States, through you, is showing the friendship that it has demonstrated before in tough times and is demonstrating so much now."

The Talanga-San Juan de Flores bridge is the Seabee unit's last. Among the first Americans deployed, the Navy builders are scheduled to return to the United States later in January. They'll be replaced by new units taking part in an operation called New Horizons '99.

"We have had a really good time down here and are glad that we've been able to help the people of this country piece their lives back together," said Seabee equipment operator Edgard Santiago. "It makes you feel good to know that you have helped these people out of the devastation that was left in the wake of Hurricane Mitch."

Sailor serves three ways

CAMP H.M. SMITH, Hawaii — He was all he could be in the Army and one of the few, the proud, in the Marine Corps. But for the past 13 years, it's been full speed ahead for one petty officer here.

Petty Officer 1st Class Thomas E. Webb began in the Army, did a stint in the Marine Corps and is finishing up his military career in the Navy. He now serves as the senior medical representative for Headquarters and Service Battalion, Marine Forces Pacific.

"I grew up as an Air Force brat," said Webb. "I was born on Albany Air Force Base, Ga., but my father retired in Ohio and that's where I was living before I entered the military. My father wanted me to join the Air Force, but when I went to talk with recruiters, the Army seemed to have more opportunities," said the 40-year-old avid golfer.

It was 1977 when Webb headed for Ft. Knox, Ky. He went on to serve three years in the Army as an eye technician and eventually made it to the rank of specialist.

"I had a good time in the Army. We had plenty of money and people were making rank pretty fast. It was a good experience," Webb recalled.

"When my contract was up, I went to college at Wright State University in Dayton, Ohio, to pursue a degree in optometry. During that time I served in the Army National Guard and was attending Army ROTC classes," Webb said. But in 1983 the hardship of supporting himself and paying his way through college got the best of Webb, so he decided to get back in the Army.

However, this time there was a six month waiting list. "I can remember back in 1983 when I was heading to the Military Entrance Processing Station to enlist, there were actual-

ly people standing on the bus," Webb said. "So I get to MEPS and the Marine recruiter told me I could go to boot camp that day, so I signed up to be a Marine," Webb explained.

And it was off to Marine Recruit Depot, Parris Island, S.C., in February 1983 for Webb. "Back then I thought I knew the ropes, having prior service," he said. But Webb soon found out it wasn't as easy as he hoped. "I can remember arriving at night on the bus at Parris Island and when the door opened, all I could see were those famous yellow footprints," he said. "And it was three months of rough and tough training after that," he added with a begrudging grin. Following recruit training, Webb graduated as a private first class, for the second time in his military career.

Webb then went to School of Infantry at Camp Lejeune, N.C., and became an infantry Marine. He was assigned the military occupational specialty of 0351, Dragon gunner, and learned how to operate the ground-fired missile launcher.

"After school, I got stationed at Camp Pendleton with 2nd Battalion, 7th Marine Regiment in San Mateo. It was tough. As with most grunts we humped, weathering the cold of Korea and the heat of Twentynine Palms, but it was all good training," Webb said.

Webb spent almost three years in the Corps and earned a meritorious promotion to corporal. But he wanted to get back to his medical career. He found out about an interservice transfer and put in an application to become a Navy corpsman. "My commanding officer told me I could go to Officer Candidate School or become a corpsman," said Webb, who chose to get back to his roots.

From Camp Pendleton, Webb attended a two-week Navy orientation program at Great Lakes, Ill. "I can remember asking a guy there when we were going to have PT (physical

training). He looked at me all confused and asked, 'what's PT?'" Webb said. "I knew I was in for a change," he said.

For the third time in his military career, Webb started out as an 'E-2. "I went to Corpsman School in Great Lakes for two months. It was a pretty intense and tough experience," he said. "It was unique because the instructor knew I was a Marine, and he made me class leader. He also wanted me to treat and train the class like Marines. By the end of school you could see the pride in them."

"Being a Marine definitely follows you through your life and career. You do things —

be it marching, drills, or inspections — that people notice and attribute to the Corps. I got rewarded for that in school," he said.

At his new duty station, China Lake, Calif., Webb served again as an eye specialist. He spent three years as an eye technician there, and made petty officer second class.

He then went to Yorktown, Va., to an optician school. "When I was in Virginia, we were making glasses for the troops in Desert Storm. We were churning out about 4,000 pairs a day," Webb said.

Next, Webb headed for ship duty aboard the USS Ft. McHenry, where he was the leading petty officer of all preventive medicine. There he traveled to various places including Jordan, Korea, Bahrain, and Okinawa. His hard work earned him Sailor of the Year honors in 1994 and a meritorious promotion to petty officer 1st

class. Finally, in 1996, almost 20 years after he first entered the Army, Webb arrived here and quickly became an integral and well-respected member within the battalion.

"I've worked with a lot of corpsmen through the years, and Doc Webb is one of the most knowledgeable and finest I've ever met," said Sgt. Maj. Lemuel E. Drawhorn, H&S Bn. sergeant major. "When things happen, he's the man you want with you."

Reflecting on his experiences, Webb said there's a lot of curiosity from others about his career path. "They want me to tell stories about the way things were in the Corps, especially when they know I was a grunt. But it's not only the Marines who respect me for that. The Navy folks really get a charge when they hear I was a Marine," Webb explained.

King influenced change in nation

On Monday, the nation will pause to honor Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., perhaps the most noted civil-rights leader in United States history.

King was born in Atlanta to the Reverend and Mrs. Martin Luther King Jan. 15, 1929. By the time of his death, in 1968, King profoundly impacted the course of American history.

King studied divinity at Crozer Theological Seminary in Chester, Pa. It was there King attended a lecture on the life and work of India's first Prime Minister, Mohandas Gandhi, and became very intrigued by Gandhi's ideas on non-violent civil disobedience.

King later employed those tactics in his struggle to end segregation and discrimination against African-Americans. One of the most noted examples was the year-long Montgomery, Ala. bus strike, which he organized and catapulted him into national prominence as a leader of the civil rights movement.

King also drew much influence from his speeches and writings, including the poignant "I Have a Dream" speech, delivered to a crowd of

approximately 250,000, at the culmination of a march on Washington, D.C. Aug. 28, 1963.

In January 1964, King became the first black American to be selected as Time magazine's Man of the Year. Later that year, he was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in Oslo, Norway, Dec. 10, 1964. At age 35, he was the youngest person ever to garner the coveted prize.

"If it wasn't for Martin Luther King, (African Americans) wouldn't be where they are today," said Chief Warrant Officer Patrick B. Johnson, aviation supply officer at Marine Aviation Logistics Support Element, Kaneohe and chairman of the Black Heritage Committee here. "His main goal was to ensure equality — he wanted to make sure no one was treated better than anyone else."

Johnson said he believes King's endeavors also served to tighten the bonds of brotherhood in the Marine Corps.

"There are plenty of black people in the Marine Corps who have achieved their goals by being given the opportunities that (King) fought for," Johnson said.

King was assassinated in Memphis, Tenn. in 1968. Today, more than 30 years after the violent death of this peaceful man, the nation takes pause each year to remember his contributions and strives to ensure his ambitions and ideals live on.

Towards the end of the game, ASE began forcing plays and making turnovers of their own, leading to a number of late baskets for the CSSG-3 squad.

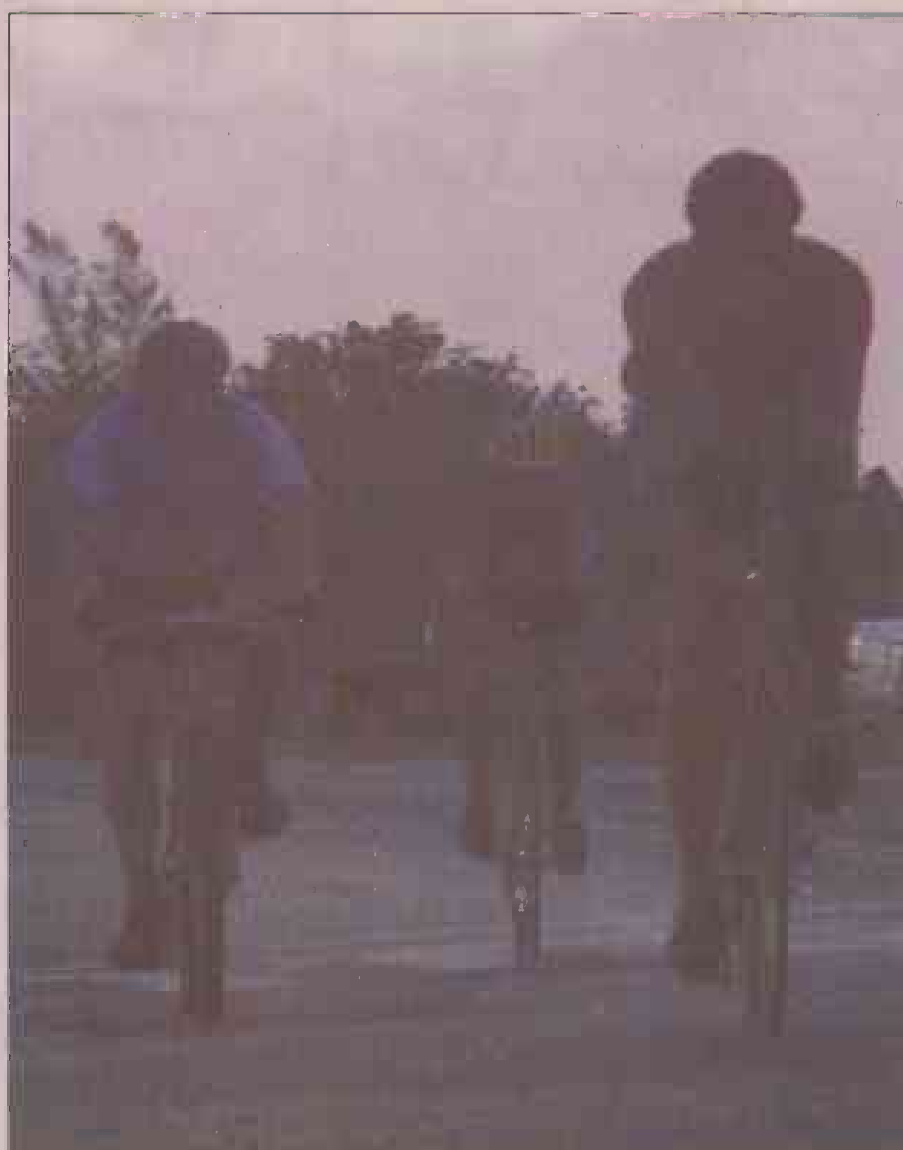
"I know we were trying too hard," Thompson said. "Our game was to run it at them but we tried too hard and gave up some turnovers we shouldn't have."

Cyclists enjoy competition at Bike the Base

Nearly 100 bicycle competitors were pumping pedals Jan. 9 as they attacked the hills and curves of MCB Hawaii Kaneohe Bay's streets in the Headquarters Battalion Fifth Annual Bike the Base Race.

Bikers tackled either a 20-mile road course or a 12-mile mountain bike route, each posing different difficulties. The road race consisted of two 10-mile circuits of the base perimeter while the mountain bike dirt trail was muddied by the overnight rains.

Boxing club cultivates champions

They might not be the next Rocky Balboa, Muhammed Ali or Oscar de la Hoya, but base residents have the opportunity to grow into champions with the base boxing club.

The club, which practices at the new Multi-Purpose Athletic Facility, trains youth and adults in basic boxing skills, to develop talents and help them to achieve personal goals.

"Boxing is an individual sport, with individual goals, so if a student just wants to stay physically fit and learn the sport, they can do that," said Steve Kalnasy, MWR varsity sports coordinator here. "But if they want to jump a step further and be competitive, that option is open too."

The club will also be home to the base varsity boxing team once Fred Mateo, base boxing head coach, and his assistants

identify Marines and Sailors who exhibit enough potential talent.

"The thing I'm excited about is that we will be able to pick from the cream of the crop to get a first-class boxing team for the base," Mateo said.

"The boxing and wrestling clubs will prepare Marines and Sailors to compete on a higher level, which may include the All-Marine teams," said Kalnasy.

Initially Mateo and his assistants will use circuit training, such as speed bags, jump ropes and abdominal training to build students' skills.

"Everybody learns on a different level, and some students will come into the class with more experience than others," Mateo said. "So there will definitely be one-on-one instruction available to get the most from each student's abilities."

Mateo brings more than 20 years of boxing experience to the ring. A boxer at the national and international levels in the 1970's, current chief of officials for the

United States Amateur Boxing Hawaii Association and coach of Junior Olympics top contenders, Mateo's resume speaks for itself.

"I want people to know that we have the best boxing coach on the island," Kalnasy said with confidence.

"This is the best gym on the island," Mateo said. "It's like a miniature version of an Olympic training facility."

Mateo, a believer in boxing's benefits and giving to the community, said there are many positive aspects with bringing the sport to the base.

"This is good outreach to the base community, especially with youth athletics," Mateo said. "When I was a kid training, Marines would come in and train at the same gyms. I looked up to them, and eventually we grew a mutual respect."

"Boxing, along with wrestling and martial arts, encourage discipline, endurance and fitness," Kalnasy said. "They embody the 'Semper Fit' ideals."
