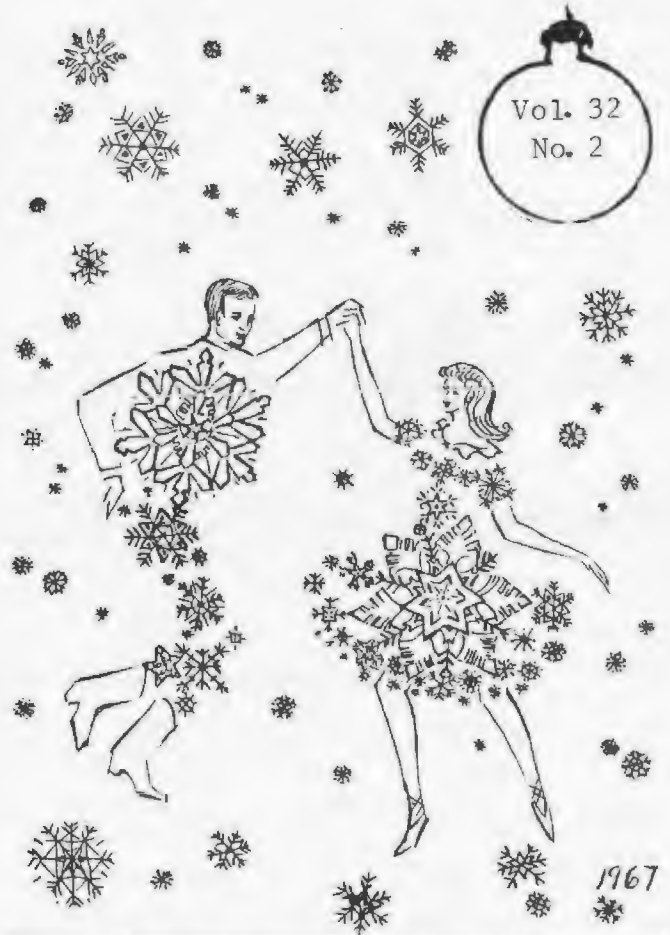

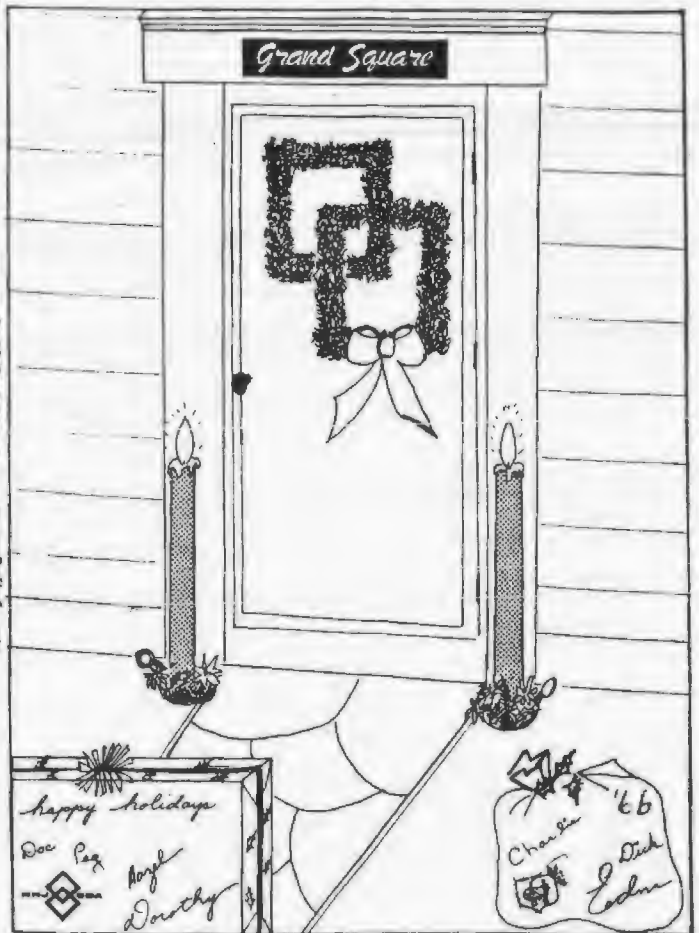

by having the most dancers in attendance at the Summer Dances. This Award will be presented to Valley at one of their Club dances.

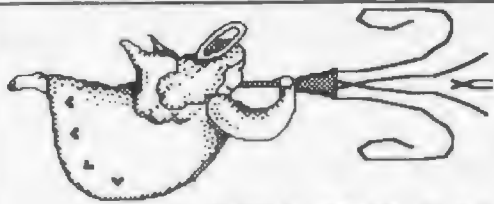

Beginner classes started in September with 33 Clubs hosting 25 classes. We encourage all to angel and welcome the new dancers into your clubs.

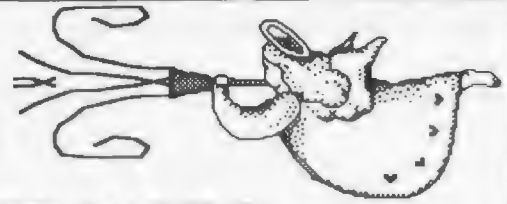

DELEGATES MEETING - September 17, 1989

Listings of the various classes in the NNJ area were distributed, as well as other pertinent info. This was followed by an informative session on the NNJSDA, conducted by Doc/Peg Tirrell.

All member clubs were represented. Also present - representatives from Garden State S/D Campers, Silver Stars, CCNJ, NNJRDLG, & SDCNJ. President Jim/Joyce Kelly presented a donation to the scholarship funds for \$100 to each representative from CCNJ & NNJRDLG.

1 VP - Thanked all clubs for their support and help at the summer dances which averaged 23 sets with 11 clubs having one square or more. Valley Squares had most dancers with Y Squares a close second, followed by Richmond Dancers. Next year's summer dances will begin in Caldwell and wind up in Iselin. Asked for help in locating new halls for dances.

3 VP - Thanked dancers, caller Steve Forman & Cuer Herb Rivkin for participating in Bergen County 4-H Day. Governors of NJ, NY & PA all issued proclamations declaring September S/D Month. Copies were distributed to respective clubs.

Cor Sec - Reminded all clubs that membership rosters are due Dec. 1st.

Rec Sec - Reminded all clubs clearance is necessary when planning a special dance on a night other than their regularly scheduled night.

GRAND SQUARE - Kathryn Hill is replacing retiring western Area Reporter Al/Dot Pushart & Dot Loewenstein is the new Advertising Editor since Helen/Art Rellinger have retired. The Tirrells will be retiring as Editors upon completion of this, their 25th year as Editors. Associate Editors, Charlie & Kathy Porter, will then become Editors.

SDCNJ - All systems are go for the NJ Convention on March 24th. There will be a flyer, announcing a special hall for class members, early next year. Volunteers are needed to help with various committees. If you can help, contact General Chr. Ken/Helena Robinson. 2nd SDCNJ Chairmen Donna/Bill Anderson were presented with a plaque of thanks for their service to the SDCNJ.

NNJRDLG Liaison - Announced Fall Festival of Rounds- Nov. 19.

BLOOD DRIVE - Next one - Delegates Meeting - Jan. 21, 1990. Clubs were asked to get the name of their Blood Coordinator to Donna Anderson.

LEGACY - The Gotta's were elected to the Board of Directors. Frank/Helen Cavanaugh are chairman of having the S/D declared the official folk dance of the US.

LUST - Save Sunday afternoon - September 9, 1990 for this Leadership Seminar. John Aquino asked for suggestions of topics for discussion.

NSDC - The Trainors, Millers, Pattersons were thanked for helping transport the materials needed for the Showcase of Ideas at the National in OK last June. Also the Andersons who set up the display. 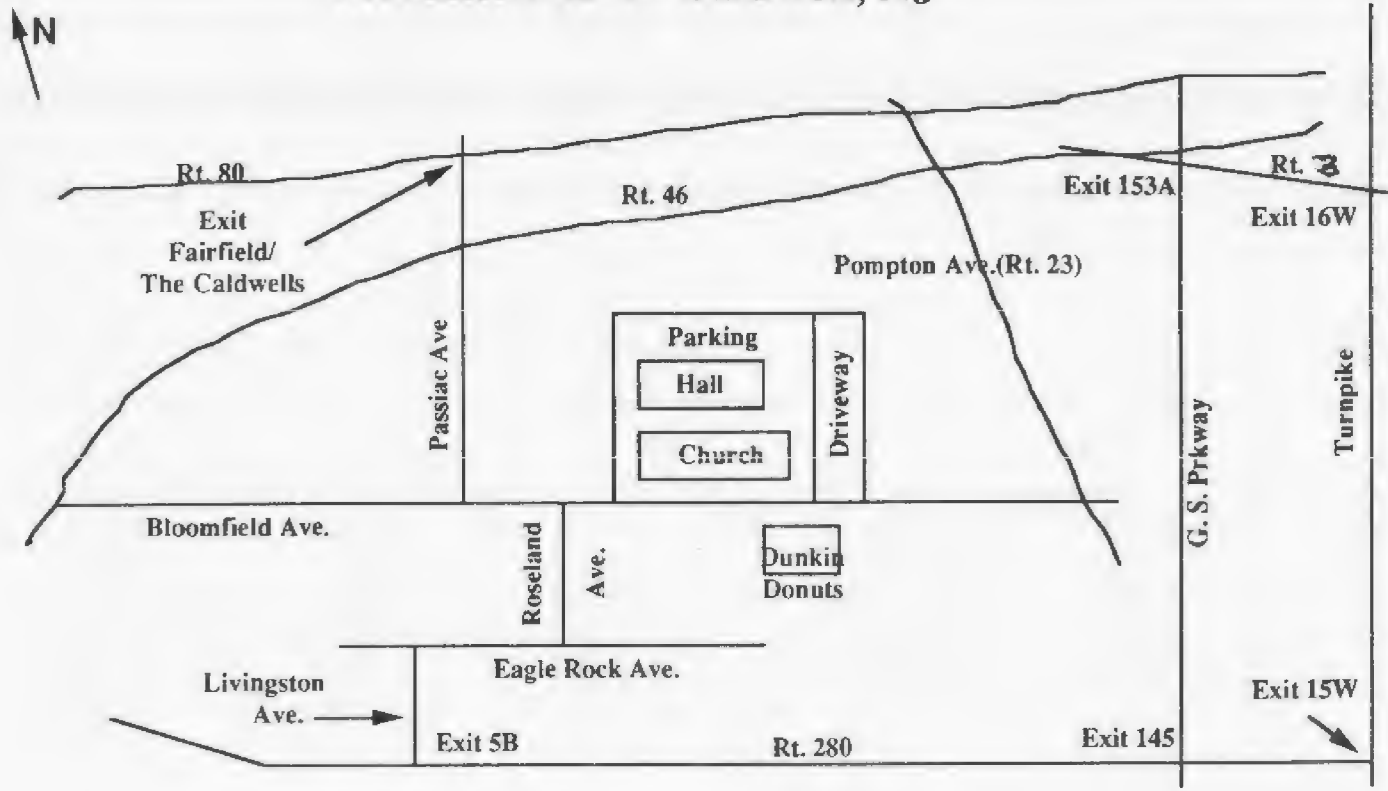

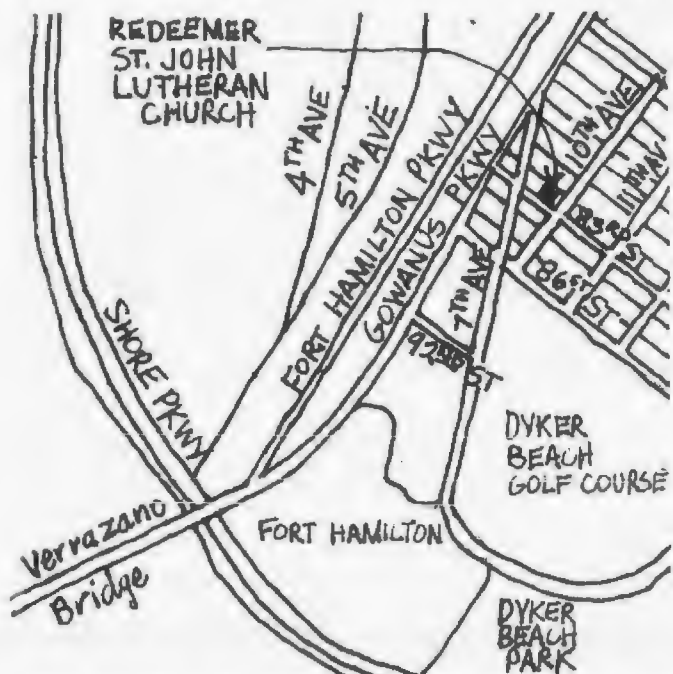

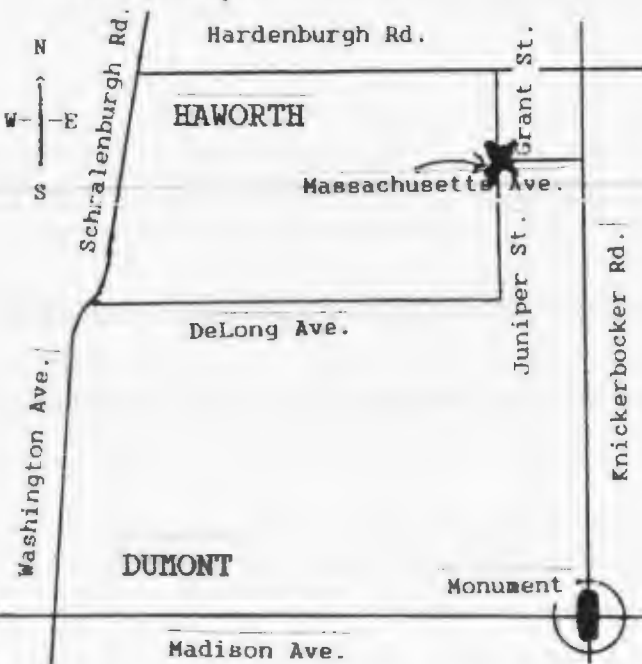

We will be dancing the night AFTER Thanksgiving - so come dance off a few of those extra pounds with us.

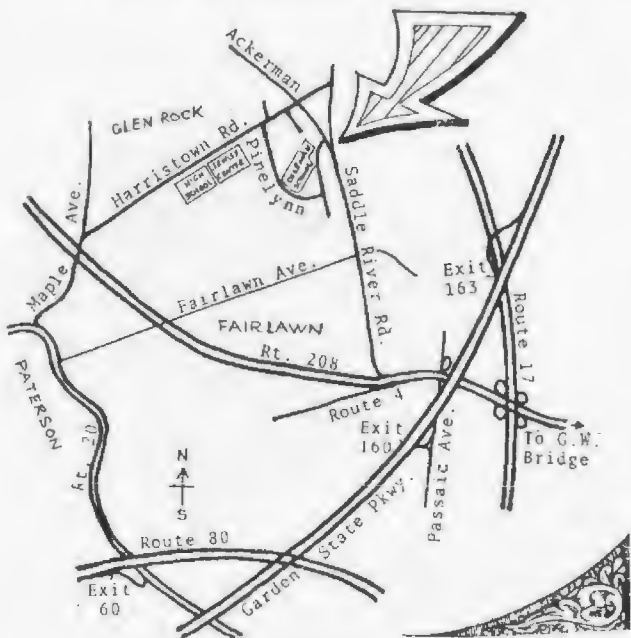

Our PLUS square dance class is underway on Tuesday nights in Edison High School, with Dan Koft teaching. Come and enjoy.

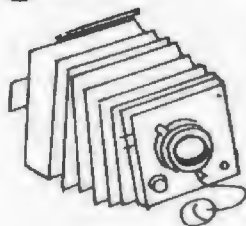

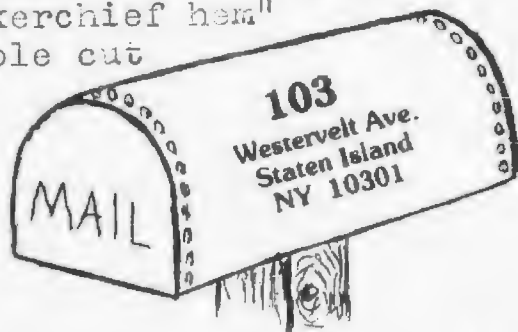
You could have just a couple of mix & match skirts & blouses and simply add little accents & touches of ornamentation and have a special outfit.

Say you're building your wardrobe with a black skirt & blouse and a white skirt & blouse. That's the easiest background for felt cut-outs; colored sashes & ties appropriate for the holiday theme; fancy bows made from fabric, ribbon, lace, etc.; cut-outs from remnants of specialty fabrics; and anything else you can think of — there are no rules to creativity.

One of my favorite touches is an overskirt made from a Christmas Tree Skirt. I cut out the center waist opening by laying a tape measure looped to my approximate waist size in the center, measuring up from the border edge (sometimes these tree skirts are not exact circles), marking with chalk, determining a zipper opening that will not interfere with the border picture (by the way you don't have to cut this opening all the way to the bottom. You can use a "dart" type seam and just leave the top open for the zipper.), double checking everything, then cutting. I use a matching or, if I can't find a close enough match, a contrasting strip of fabric for a waistband. I like a fancy trim at the border hem. This little overskirt can be worn over different skirts & blouses or dresses for a "different" outfit & almost acts like an apron (even for non-square-dancing holiday occasions). Tree skirts can be made into capelets and sleeves on blouses too.

Fancy holiday tablecloths have potential too, either circular or square made into a "handkerchief hem" skirt. (That's a big square with a hole cut in the middle.) Need I continue? Have I released your mind from rules and patterns? Have I let you give yourself permission to explore new possibilities? Then this column is doing its' job!

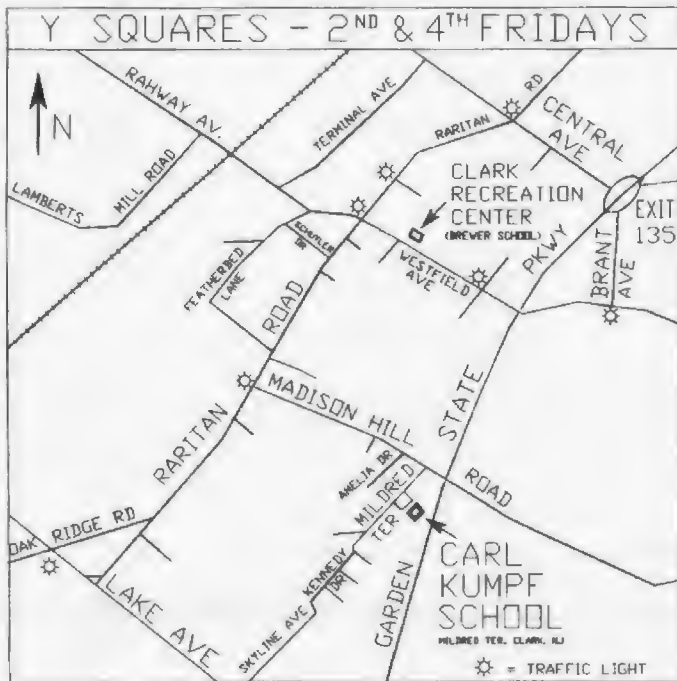

Nearly 9,000 replies were received for the 1989 Legacy Survey, the best response ever even though some personal questions were asked. The wealth of information derived from the replies was overwhelming

and deserved more than a single comprehensive report, so a series of reports highlighting one aspect of the Survey will be made. The series will include age trends, demographic profiles, family trends, singles, club and dancing trends along with the comments many of you made.

The first report is on age trends. You may be surprised to learn that the average square dancer's age is 57. Since 1/3 of the US is over 40, that is a big market. More than 10 million baby boomers have already turned 40 and another 20 million will in 5 more years. There are a great many potential square dancers in those figures. The 55 and older segment of our population controls more than half of the discretionary income of this country. Most have neither children at home nor mortgages. Square dancing appeals to the middle age segment as a moderate form of recreation with lasting social values. So perhaps we should not be too concerned at the lack of young people in classes. Let them age a bit and get them later.

Legacy published a new Leadership Journal in Sept. featuring Recruitment of New Dancers and Club Ideas That Worked (which will be a regular column). The Oct. Issue will emphasize Club Organization That Works, New Dancer Briefings and the Need for Enthusiasm. 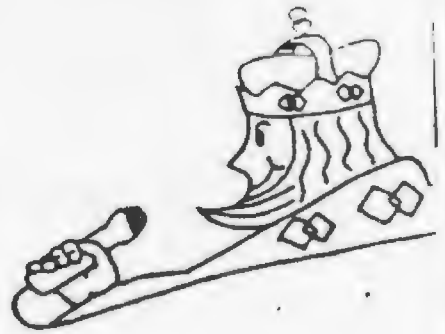
Starting formation: facing couples or facing tandems. Action: from facing couples, the left hand dancer steps forward and to the right to become the lead dancer in a tandem. Lead dancers join left hands and pull by. Moving to the other trailing dancer, each extends a right hand and touches to a right hand mini wave and turns $\frac{1}{2}$. New center dancers join left hands and form a right hand ocean wave. Ending formation: right hand ocean waves. Timing: 6 beats.

The other current MS Quarterly Selection is Grand Sweep. The purpose of the QS is to provide variety for the dancer. These calls are not a mandatory part of any program, but are to be used at the caller's discretion. Dancers are not to be held accountable for selections past or present. A QS should be workshopped prior to being called the first time at a dance.

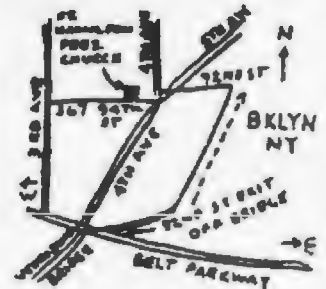

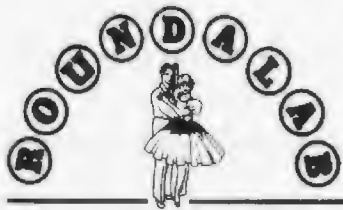

The annual meeting of the USDA was held in June in Oklahoma City. The new presidents are Frank/Nan Habersberger, past NNJSDA presidents, who retired to FL to rest! The Credit Card Committee reported great success with their service. Every dollar received is put back into the S/D activity. Also the Handicapable

Committee has been flooded with requests from all over the US requesting info on forming handicapable clubs. The USDA joins Legacy in the movement to have the "Square Dance" designated as each state's folk dance. Ten (10) states now have that designation. John Aquino represented NJ. at the meeting. The USDA serves to represent the dancers as a united voice to other national and international organizations associated with the square dance activity. They express and coordinate the views of the dancers on a national level. The SDCNJ and CNJSDA are members of the USDA.



Much of the work over the past 14 years during the existence of RAL has been devoted to standardizing the language of round dancing. RAL members have been very busy identifying, phasing and describing the figures that comprise the 6 Phases of r/ding. Realizing that while written descriptions are a big help, a picture is worth 10,000 words and a video committee was instituted to tape the numerous figures. The Standardization Planning Committee and the Video Committee responsible for producing the video instructional tapes of the 6 Phases of r/ding have had a really busy year. The committees met at the convention in June to plan the final steps in producing the tapes. Over 740 figures will appear on these tapes. Each figure will be described and then followed by the man's part and the woman's part. Then the figure will be demonstrated again with a lead in and exit figure. Each Phase can be purchased individually or a complete set will be available. For non-members, the tapes will be accompanied by the proper Phase Booklet. It has been a tremendous undertaking. Demonstrating the Phase I, II & III figures are Betty/Irv Easterday of MD. The figures in Phases VI, V & VI were done by Bill/Carol Goss of CA and Wayne/Barbara Blackford of FL.
