# Poultney football team wins Vermont Division III title


Last year the Poultney football team advanced to the Vermont Division III championship game and came up a bit short, falling to Woodstock. Now the Blue Devils wear the crown after defeating BFA-Fairfax/Lamoille, 17-8, at Rutland High School's Alumni Field.

The win marks the first football state championship for Poultney since 2007 and avenges a 6-0 loss to the two-seed Bullets by the top-seed Blue Devils in Poultney earlier in the year.

This victory could not be more filled with storylines for a program steeped in tradition for more than 80 years: A head coach in Dave Capman who has a son as an assistant coach and a grandson as

his starting quarterback, a standout player who could only watch a year ago while his brother tried to lead the team to a win.

Poultney football with its Friday night parades and pep rallies, singing

of the school fight song by the players before every game and after every win, team breakfasts, team dinners and skit night antics is unique. It a local version of the epic "Friday Night Lights" saga.

For Poultney junior running back Levi Allen, the victory was especially sweet. Last year Allen tore his ACL during the Fair Haven rivalry game. Allen missed the Blue Devils' run to last season's state title game as his brother Jacob tried to will the Blue Devils to the championship. After months of grueling rehabilitation on his knee, Allen rel-

ished the opportunity to get back to the championship contest to help his team win.

"Not much to say. I am at a loss of words," Allen said after the game. "I wouldn't want to be out here with anyone else. We're blessed. I'm blessed. That's all I can say. Everyone out here was blessed. It was an awesome opportunity."

Being more physical than the Bullets was the key to the win, Allen said.

"We knew it was all about physicality and today it was all or nothing," he said. "Leave nothing in the tank today."

Often big games between teams that are evenly matched come down to three things: turnovers, penalties and special teams play. Poultney took advantage

of all three to put their 17 points on the board. Poultney was handed a few early Christmas gifts from BFA-Farfax/ Lamoille that contributed heavily to the win

#### Stuff an ambulance with food Saturday

Thanksgiving is coming, and what better way to give thanks for your blessings than helping someone less fortunate than yourself.

In Poultney this weekend, fifth-grader Faith Winter is partnering with the Poultney Rescue Squad on a mission to stuff a rescue squad ambulance full of food.

Winter's community service project will benefit the Poultney Food Shelf.

Beth Winter, Faith's mom, said, "We were sitting at the dinner table one evening, and Faith said, 'Did you know that there are some kids in my school who don't always have food in their homes?' I told her, you know, it's not just kids who don't have food, it's also adults, including the elderly."

The family discussed the idea of a food drive.

Beth said, "I told her she could do one at any time because the need always exists, but Faith was adamant about doing it this time of year. She wanted to make sure that the food banks had food coming in for the holidays."

"Did you know that the Poultney Food Shelf serves the towns of Poultney, Middletown Springs and Hampton?" Winter wrote in a letter announcing the food drive. "They provide food for about 150 people each month. This amazing organization also does home deliveries for about 25 folks who have a hard time getting about each

Winter and her partners from the Poultney Rescue Squad will be at Shaw's Supermarket at 55 Depot St. in Poultney on Saturday, Nov. 16, from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.

They will be accepting nonperishable food items such as canned fruits and vegetables. soup, proteins like tuna and chicken and peanut butter. The Food Shelf also recommends donations of packaged mixes such as macaroni and cheese, pastas, potatoes, canned pastas, stews, coffee and even pet food.

"All of these items would be welcomed and enjoyed by many people in our community," wrote Winter, who plans on

reporting back on the success of the food drive.

There's another food drive going on this weekend, too, this one sponsored by the Fair Haven Police Department on Friday, Nov. 15, from 3 to 7 p.m., and Saturday, Nov. 16, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., at the Shaw's at 195 Old Route 22A in Fair Haven.

"My wife's parents went on one of their first dates to the Pawlet game supper," laughed Weiss. "It's a really popular event.'

Attendees come from Pawlet and the surrounding area, but also from as far away as Connecticut, Massachusetts, New Jersey and elsewhere. "We have some career firefighters who make the trip each year from Rhode Island," said Weiss.

The supper draws an annual crowd of around 300, said

Diane Mach, who is coordinating the dinner this year.

Said Weiss: "People get so excited about the food, and we have to seat patrons in shifts. There's usually a big old line, and people will spend a chunk of time catching up with those they haven't seen in a while."

Poultney fumbled on their next drive and gave the ball right back to BFA. The Bullets again drove into the red zone. It appeared BFA had gotten a TD pass from Cameron Meunier to Quinn Meunier to draw closer, but the touchdown was negated by a penalty when Quinn Meunier was flagged for illegal touching after stepping out of the back of the end zone before making the diving catch.

On fourth and goal from inside the five with 26 second to play, Alt came blitzing through from his linebacker spot to stop the last-gasp effort from the Bullets on a Noah

Brock run and preserve the title for Poultney. The Blue Devils went to the victory formation and ran out the clock from there.

Allen, who had just 32 rushing yards in the regular season loss to BFA-Fairfax/Lamoille. finished with 138 yards on the ground in this one.

Alt, Allen, Capman, Heith Mason and Colby Hutchins played strong games on defense for the Blue Devils. Capman ended the day of Schaarschmidt in the fourth quarter after laying a hard but clean hit after a pass reception by the BFA-Fairfax/Lamoille top offensive weapon.

#### Mystery missive alienates Poultney residents

To the editor:

Numerous Poultney households have recently been sent a certified letter from a party identified on the envelope only by a nine-digit zip code that corresponds to the address of record for Poultney Properties, whose principal, Leonard Knappmiller, seeks to install a Dollar General on his property on Beaman Street. Apparently all the certified letters contain the same thing: a notice not to set foot on the property, under pain of possible fine and/or imprisonment.

The volley of certified letters has generated discussion and mystification in Poultney. The recipients of whom we're aware – some of them have signed below - seem not to have a lot in common. Some have opposed the DG plan vocally, but other opponents were not on Mr. Knappmiller's list. Some recipients have had little

or no involvement in the issue.

Beyond the scattershot approach, we also wonder about the motive. Every person addressed is prohibited from being on the property, which would prohibit patronizing any business, DG included, located thereon. Is this how Mr. Knappmiller builds good will among people whom he addressed as neighbors a year ago, when seeking support for a zoning change that would have benefited his project?

The ill will embodied by his no-trespass notices seems to serve no purpose other than to alienate Poultney citizens further

What is art? Wow - that's a big question. And the person to help us think about it will be Champlain College professor David Mills presenting a highly visual program (with the same title) at Castleton Free Library on Thursday, Nov. 21, at 7 p.m.

This free program, funded through the Vermont Humanities Council and a National Endowment for the Humanities grant, promises to provide new ways of interacting with art.

The Vermont Humanities Council asks, "Have you ever thought to yourself, 'I could do that!' when looking at a work of abstract art in a museum or gallery? Or maybe you've wondered why collectors would pay millions for artworks that seem simplistic, bizarre or just plain ugly? It is sometimes tempting to think that art is just 'in the eye of the beholder.' But, by imagining art history as an ongoing conversation," Mills will explore "ways of encountering art as more than just

subjective preference."

Mills has been teaching interdisciplinary courses in philosophy and aesthetics for more than 20 years, and he earned his Ph.D. in philosophy from Pennsylvania State University specializing in the philosophy of art. His published work focuses on European philosophy and art after the world wars.
