## PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

#### A. Purpose of Grant

This Grant represents a major attempt by the Grantee, the Government of Niger and other donors to design, implement and evaluate a comprehensive basic rural health services delivery system of preventive, educative as well as curative health programs which incorporate local community participation in Niger, in particular, the Diffa Department. Niger's existing national health delivery system provides health services, mainly curative to a small minority of the population, primarily in urban areas.

The purpose of this Grant is to:

1. Increase the level of adequate and accessible basic health services in Diffa Department;

2. Institutionalize public health training, in-service education and field supervision within the teaching/training institutions in Niger;

3. Create within the Ministry of Health the capability to assess and plan health programs based on epidemiological and demographic data; and

4. Increase the capability within the Ministry of Health to deliver health services to the rural population, especially in the Diffa Department.

The following preliminary steps are necessary to accomplish the purpose of this Grant:

1. Manpower Training

(a) Clearer definition of existing manpower resources in the target area, including numbers, types, level of training, and/or need for additional training;

(b) Analyses and/or refinement of analyses of existing health manpower training capability, in terms of institutions and trainers, as well as manpower available as potential trainers;

(c) Development of curriculum for health manpower training, including in-service training, re-training/upgrading, and training of newly recruited health manpower;

(d) Development of an overall plan for training programs, including schedules, sites for training, number of trainees of each type, and responsible

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faculty for each training type, and cycle;

(e) Outlining a plan for recruitment of trainees of both new health personnel and existing personnel;

(f) Outlining a plan for the involvement and/or utilization of individuals outside modern health delivery systems, i.e., traditional practitioners, rural populations, etc.

2. Provision of Health Services.

It must be realized that all aspects of the project are interdependent, i.e., the manpower training program, health facilities, and the health service programs; however, the following are precurser actions necessary in this component:

(a) Develop and outline an operational plan for the health delivery system in the target area;

(b) Identify and/or select sites for the provision of stationary health services, including the level and types of services to be provided at each site;

(c) Outline a plan of operation for the network of health services, including inter-relationships of stationary and mobile health units, and stationary units within each other;

(d) Outline a phased plan of operation and/or opening other facilities based upon availability of staff, equipment, commodities, renova-tion and/or construction of facilities;

(e) Develop and implement a plan for regularizing the operation of health facilities and/or service programs, including correcting deficiencies which impede the provision of health services, as practicable, i.e., staffing, in-service training, plan of supervision, logistic support, etc.;

(f) Develop and implement a plan for logistict support of the target area, including such as the following:

(1) Establishment of a standard formulary of basic pharmaceuticals to be used and at what points in the system to be used;

(2) Outline and implement a system for procurement, storage and distribution of pharmaceuticals and medical supplies.

- 3. Health Information Data System
  - (a) Establish a plan for data collection, analysis, utilization,

storage and retrieval;

(b) Design a plan for gathering and analysis of baseline data and for continuation of collection of similar data, including planning and implementing appropriate surveys, design of data collection and survey forms, etc.;

(c) Outlining and implementing a plan for training and supervision of personnel in the delivery system responsible for collecting and processing health information data;

(d) Formulate and implement a plan for relating the activities of the health information data activities in the project with similar activities in other Departments and Ministry of Health of the Government of Niger.

#### 4. Construction/Renovations.

(a) Outline a phased plan for rehabilitation/renovation and/or construction of training centers and health stations, i.e., clinics, village health units, MCH/FP facilities. Prepare schedules for work to be done to renovate/construct and identify in detail engineer's plans for all proposed buildings and equipment/supplies with site studies and cost factors.

(b) Construction/renovations development plans are to include exact contributions from each funding source including participation of the community in such activities.

(c) Necessary to show relationship of any construction/renovation to program purpose, i.e., the garage which is considered essential to the total effort; health education centers basic to community activities.

(d) Provide equipment needs and cost and timetable for procurement.

(e) Provide proof of availability of non-A.I.D. funds to cover any cost overrun for construction/renovation.

The identification of the specific public health program activities that will be implemented under this grant and a description of the preliminary planning for each such specific activity including how, where, when, by whom, what goods and services are required and estimated cost of such activity. This identification and planning and the planning for construction/renovation are required to satisfy Sec. 611 (a) prior to the time funds are obligated for these purposes and will be reviewed and approved by RDO/Niamey before funds are obligated by A.I.D. for this purpose.

The initial planning of Item 4, Constructions/Renovations, (a) through (d) above will be completed within 90 days from effective date of this Grant

and recruitment of field team and deployment of the team to Niger within 30 days from the effective date.

B. Reports

1. Grantee's field staff will submit quarterly progress reports.

2. The Grantee will submit quarterly fiscal reports.

3. The project will be evaluated 18 months after the Grant's effective date and at the end of the project. A.I.D. will participate in the evaluations.

4. All reports will be submitted to AFR/RA with 20 copies.

#### C. Logistic Support

A.1.D. will furnish the Grantee with no logistic support.

#### STANDARD PROVISIONS

## a. Allowable Costs and Payment (Oct. 1974)

Ine Grantee shall be reimbursed for costs incurred in carrying out the purposes of this Grant which are determined by the Grant Officer to be allowable in accordance with the terms of this Grant and Subpart 15.2 of the Federal Procurement Regulations (FPR) (Principles and Procedures for use in Cost Reimbursement Type Supply and Research Contracts with Commercial Organizations)\* in effect on the date of this Grant. Payment of a lowable costs shall be in accordance with Attachment C of this Grant.

[\*If this Grant is made to a university, the applicable cost principles are "Federal Management Circular, 73-8 (Cost Principles for Educational Institutions)" instead of Subpart 15.2 of the FPR as cited above]

## b. Accounting, Records, and Audit (Oct. 1974)

The Grantee shall maintain books, records, documents, and other evidence in accordance with the Grantee's usual accounting procedures to sufficiently substantiate charges to the grant. The Grantee shall preserve and make available such records for examination and audit by AID and the Comptroller General of the United States, or their authorized representatives (1) until the expiration of three years from the date of termination of the program and (2) for such longer period, if any, as is required to complete an audit and to resolve all questions concerning expenditures unless written approval has been obtained from the AID Grant Officer to dispose of the records. AID follows generally accepted auditing practices in determining that there is proper accounting and use of grant funds. The Grantee agrees to include the requirements of this clause in any subordinate agreement hereunder.

c. <u>Refunds</u> (Oct. 1974)

(1) If use of the Grant funds results in accrual of interest to the Grantee or to any other person to whom Grantee makes such funds available in carrying out the purposes of this Grant, Grantee shall refund to AID an amount equivalent to the amount of interest accrued.

(2) Funds obligated hereunder but not disbursed to the Grantee at the time the grant expires or is terminated, shall revert to AID, except for funds encumbered by the Grantee by a legally binding transaction applicable to this Grant. Any funds disbursed to but not expended by the Grantee at the time of expiration or termination of the Grant shall be refunded to AID.

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(3) If, at any time during the life of the Grant, it is' determined by AID that funds provided under the Grant have been expended for purposes not in accordance with the terms of the Grant, the Grantee shall refund such amounts to AID.

#### d. Equal Opportunity Employment (Oct. 1974)

With regard to the employment of persons in the U.S. under this Grant, Grantee agrees to take all reasonable steps to ensure equality of opportunity in its employment practices without regard to race, religion, sex, color or national origin of such persons and that, in accordance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, when work funded by this Grant is performed in the U.S. no person shall, on the grounds of race, religion, sex, color or national origin, be excluded from participation, be denied benefits, or be subjected to discrimination. In addition, the Grantee agrees to comply in accordance with its written assurance of compliance, with the provisions of Part 209 of Chapter II, Title 22 of the Code of Federal Regulations, entitled "Non-Discrimination in Federally Assisted Programs of the Agency for International Development - Effectuation of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964."

#### e. <u>Termination</u> (Oct. 1974)

This Grant may be terminated at any time, in whole or in part, by the Grant Officer upon written notice to the Grantee, whenever for any reason he shall determine that such termination is in the best interest of the Government. Upon receipt of and in accordance with such notice, the Grantee shall forthwith take immediate action to minimize all expenditures and obligations financed by this Grant, and shall cancel such unliquidated obligations whenever possible. Except as provided below, no further reimbursement shall be made after the effective date of termination, and the Grantee shall within thrity (30) calendar days after the effective date of such termination repay to the Grantor all unexpended portions of funds theretofore paid by the Grantor to the Grantee which are not otherwise obligated by a legally binding transaction applicable to this Grant. Should the funds paid by the Grantor to the Grantee prior to the effective date of this termination of this Grant, be insufficient to cover the Grantee's obligations pursuant to the aforementioned legally binding transaction, the Grantee may submit to the Grantor within (90) calendar days after the effective date of such termination a written claim covering such obligations, and, subject to the limitations contained in the Grant, the Grant Officer shall determine the amount or amounts to be paid by the Grantor to the Grantee under such claim.

#### f. Officials Not to Benefit (Oct. 1974)

No member of or delegate to Congress or resident commissioner shall be admitted to any share or part of this Grant or to any benefit that may arise therefrom; but this provision shall not be construed to extend to this Grant 1f made with a corporation for its general benefit.

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## g. Covenant Against Contingent Fee (Oct. 1974)

The Grantee warrants that no person or selling agency his been employed or retained to solicit or secure this Grant upon an agreement or understanding for a commission, percentage, brokerage, or contingent fee except bona fide employees or bona fide established commercial or selling agencies maintained by the Grantee for the purpose of securing business. For breach or violation of this warranty, AID shall have the right to cancel this Grant without liability or, in its discretion, to deduct from the Grant amount, or otherwise recover, the full amount of each commission, percentage, brokerage, or contingent fee.

h. Nonliability (Oct. 1974)

AID does not assume liability with respect to any claims for damages arising out of work supported by its grants.

i. <u>Amenament</u> (Oct. 1974)

The Grant Agreement may be amended by formal modifications to the basic grant document or by means of an exchange of letters between the AID Grant Officer and an appropriate official of the Grantee.

j. Grant Agreement (Oct. 1974)

The letter to the Grantee signed by the Grant Officer, the Program Description and the Standard Provisions which have been reviewed and agreed to by the Grantee, constitute the Grant Agreement.

k. <u>Notices</u> (Oct. 1974)

Any notice given by any of the parties hereunder, shall be sufficient only if in writing and delivered in person or sent by telegraph, cable, registered or regular mail as follows:

To the cognizant AID Grant Officer

To Grantee - At Grantee's address shown in this Grant, or to such other address as either party shall designate by notice given as herein required. Notices hereunder, shall be effective when delivered in accordance with this clause or on the effective date of the notice, whichever is later.

### 1. Travel and Transportation (Oct. 1974)

(1) The Grant Officer hereby approves international travel hereunder provided that the Grantee shall optain written concurrence from the cognizant technical office in AID prior to sending any individual outside the United States to perform work under the Grant. For this purpose the Grantee shall advise the Project Manager at least thirty (30) days in advance of any travel to be uncertaken outside the United States. After concurrence is received the Grantee shall provide the cognizant USAID Mission or U.S. Embassy advance notification with a copy to the project officer of the arrival date and flight identification of Grant financed travellers.

(2) Travel to certain countries shall, at AID's option, be funded from U.S.-owned local currency. When AID intends to exercise this option, it will so notify the Grantee after receipt of advice of intent to travel required above. AID will issue a Government Transportation Request (GTR) which the Grantee may exchange for tickets, or AID will issue the tickets directly. Use of such U.S.-owned currencies will constitute a dollar cnarge to this grant.

(3) The Grantee agrees to travel by the most direct and expeditious route, and to use less than first class transportation unless such use will result in unreasonable delay or increased costs.

(a) All international air travel under this Grant shall be made on United States flag carriers. Exceptions to this rule will be allowed in the following situations provided that the Grantee certifies to the facts in the voucher or other documents retained as part of his Grant records to support his claim for reimbursement and for post audit:

<u>1</u>. Where a flight by a United States carrier is scheduled but does not have accomodations available when reservations are sought;

<u>2.</u> Where the departure time, routing, or other features of a United States carrier would interfere with or prevent the satisfactory performance of official business;

<u>3.</u> Where a scheduled flight by a United States carrier is delayed because of weather, mechanical, or other conditions to such an extent that use of a non-United States carrier is in the Government's interest;

(b) All international air shipments under this grant shall be made on United States flag carriers unless shipment would, in the judgement of the Grantee, be delayed an unreasonable time awaiting a United States carrier either at point of origin or transhipment, provided that the Grantee certifies to the facts in the vouchers or other documents retained as parc of the Grant records to support his claim for reimbursement and for post audit.

(4) Travel allowances shall be reimbursed in accordance with the Federal Regulations (FTR).

## **m**/ <u>Regulations Governing Employees Outside the United States</u> (Oct. 1974)

(1) The Grantee's employees, when employed in work overseas, shall maintain private status and may not rely on local U.S. Government Offices or facilities for support while so engaged.

(2) The sale of personal property or automobiles by Grantee employees and their dependents in the foreign country to which they are assigned shall be subject to the same limitations and prohibitions which apply to direct-hire AID personnel employed by the mission, except as this may conflict with host government regulations.

(3) Other than work to be performed under this Grant for which an employee or consultant is assigned by the Grantee, no regular or short. term employee or consultant of the Grantee shall engage, directly or indirectly, either in his own name or in the name or through an agency of another person, in any business, profession or occupation in the foreign countries to which he is assigned.

(4) The Granter's employees, while in a foreign country, are expected to show respect its conventions, customs, and institutions, to abide by its apping laws and regulations, and not to interfere in its internal politic airs.

(5) On the written request of the Grant Officer or of a cognizant Mission Director, the Grantee will terminate the assignment of any individual to any work under the Grant and, as requested, will use its best efforts to cause the return to the United States of the individual from overseas or his departure from a foreign country or a particular foreign locale.

(6) Allowances for employees assigned overseas shall be reimbursed in accordance with the Federal Travel Regulations (FTR).

**n.** <u>Conversion of United States Dollars to Local Currency</u> (Oct. 1974)

In countries designated "excess" or "near-excess" currency countries, Grantee agrees to convert all United States dollars to local currency through the United States Disbursing Officer, (USDO), American Embassy, unless the Disbursing Officer directs the Grantee otherwise or certifies that no local currency is available.

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## • Ineligible Countries (Oct. 1974)

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Unless otherwise approved by the Grant Officer, no grant funds will be expended in countries ineligible for assistance under the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, as amended, or under acts appropriating funds for foreign assistance.

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## p. Subordinate Agreements (Oct. 1974)

The placement of subordinate agreements (e.g., leases, options, etc.), grants, or contracts with other organizations, firms or institutions and the provisions of such subordinate agreements are subject to prior written consent of the Grant Officer if they will be funded nereunder. In no event shall any such subordinate agreement, grant, or contract be on a cost-plus-a-percentage-of-cost basis. Subordinate contractors (including suppliers) shall be selected on a competitive basis to the maximum practicable extent consistent with the obligations and requirements of this Grant. q. <u>Negotiated Overhead Rates</u> (Oct. 1974)

Pursuant to the provisions of this clause set forth below an overhead rate shall be established for each of the Grantee's accounting periods during the term of this Grant. Pending establishment of a final rate for the initial period beginning 5/1/76 and ending 4/30/77, provisional payments on account of allowable indirect costs shall be made at the rate or rates of 20%, applied to total direct cost

(1) The Grantee, as soon as possible but not later than ninety (90) days after the close of each of his accounting periods during the term of this Grant, shall submit to the Grant Officer with copies to the Overhead and Special Cost Branch, Support Division, Office of Contract Management, AID, Washington, D.C. and to the Office of the Auditor General, AID, Washington, D.C., a proposed final rate or rates for the period, together with supporting cost data. Negotiation of final overhead rates by the Grantee and the Grant Officer snall be undertaken as promptly as practicable after receipt of the Grantee's proposal.

(2) Allowability of costs and acceptability of cost allocation methods shall be determined in accordance with Subpart 1-15.2 (Principles and Procedures for Use in Cost-Reimburgement Type Supply and Research Contracts with Commercial Organizations) of the Federal Procurement Regulations\* as in effect on the date of this Grant.

(3) The results of each negotiation shall be set forth in a written overhead rate agreement executed by both parties. Such agreement shall specify (1) the agreed final rates, (2) the bases to which the rates apply, and (3) the periods for which the rates apply. The overnead rate agreement shall not change any monetary ceiling, Grant obligation, or specific cost allowance or disallowance provided for in this Grant.

(4) Pending establishment of final overhead rates for any period, the Grantee shall be reimbursed either at negotiated provisional rates as provided above or at billing rates acceptable to the Grant Officer, subject to appropriate adjustment when the final rates for that period are established. To prevent substantial over or under payment, the provisional or billing rates may, at the request of either party, pe revised by mutual agreement, either retroactively or prospectively. Any such revision of negotiated provisional rates provided in this clause shall be set forth in a modification to this Grant.

# r. Publications (Oct. 1974)

(1) If it is the Grantee's intention to identify AID's contribution to any publication resulting from this Grant, the Grantee shall consult with AID on the nature of the acknowledgement prior to publication.

(2) The Grantee shall provide the Project Manager with one copy of all published works developed under the Grant. The Grantee shall provide the Project Manager with lists of other written work produced under the Grant.

(3) In the event grant funds are used to underwrite the cost of publishing, in lieu of the publisher assuming this cost as is the normal practice, any profits or royalties up to the amount of such cost shall be credited to the Grant.

(4) The Grantee is permitted to secure copyright to any publication produced or composed under the Grant. Provided, the Grantee agrees to and does hereby grant to the Government a royalty-free, non-exclusive and irrevocable license throughout the world to use, duplicate, disclose, or dispose of such publications in any manner and for any purpose and to permit others to do so. s. Patents (Oct. 1974)

(1) Grantee agrees to notify the Grant Officer, in writing, of any invention or discovery conceived or first actually reduced to practice in the course of or under this Grant. The Grant Officer will determine the patent rights to be afforded the Grantee in accordance with the Presidential Memorandum and Statement of Government Patent Policy 36 FR 16b87.

(2) Nothing contained in this clause shall imply a license to the Government under any patent or be construed as affecting the scope of any license or other right otherwise granted to the Government under any patent.

# t. Procurement of Equipment, Vehicles, Supplies, Materials, and Services (Oct. 1974)

(1) Except as may be specifically approved or directed in advance by the Grant Officer, or as provided in paragraphs (2), (3), and (4) below, all equipment, vehicles, materials, supplies and services the costs of which are to be attributed to this Grant and which will be financed with United States collars shall be purchased in and shipped from the United States. In addition, for any U.S. purchase transaction in excess of \$2,500 the Grantee shall notify the seller that the item(s) must be of U.S. source and production and comply with the componentry limitations and other requirements applicable to suppliers under AID Regulation 1, and that the supplier must execute and furnish Form AID-282 "Suppliers Certificate and Agreement with the Agency for International Development".

(2) Exceptions to the foregoing are as follows (for Title X Grants only):

Grantee may permit a subgrantee (or the Grantee on his behalf) to procure commodities already in its country (with the exception of contraceptives, drug products, pharmaceuticals, and motor vehicles) in an amount not exceeding a total cost of \$5,000 per subgrantee per annum without regard to limitations, rules and procedures applicable to commodity transactions financed by AID. Such commodities shall not be considered "Already in its country" within the meaning of the aforementioned exception if the commodities have been imported or otherwise brought into the country at the request of the Grantee or subgrantee. A subgrantee's own country for this purpose shall in no event include any of the following: Australia, Austria, Belgium, Canada, Denmark, France, Germany, Spain, Italy, Japan, Lukembourg, Monaco, Netherlands, New Zealand, Norway, South Africa, Sweden, Switzerland, and United Kingdom. The Grantee shall take all reasonable precautions to ensure that the subgrantee does not procure any commodity which has as its country of origin any of the following countries: Albania, Bulgaria, Chine (Mainland and other Communist-controlled areas), including Manchuria, Inner Mongolia, the provinces of Tsingnai and Sikang, Sinkiang, Tibet, and former Kwantung Leased Territory, the present Port Authur Naval Ease Areas, and Liaoning Province, Cuba, German Democratic Republic, Hungary, North Korea, North Vietnam, Outer Mongolia, Poland, Rumania, and the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics.

(3) Printed or audio visual teaching materials may, to the extent necessary, be purchased outside the United States when:

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Procurement of Equipment, Etc. - Page 2 of 3

(a) Effective use of the materials depend on their being in the local language, and

(b) Other funds including U.S. owned and controlled local currencies are not readily available for procurement of such material.

The order of preference as to countries in which such purchases outside the United States are made shall be:

1. The AID receiving country

2. Countries falling within AID Geographic Code 901

3. Other Countries falling within AID Geographic Code 899

AID Geographic Codes are defined in AIDPR 7-6.5201.1,

(4) Procurements in the country in which an activity is being undertaken and which are less than S2,500 and are for materials (regularly available and normally sold on the local market) which are to be consumed or expended during the period of this Grant, are exempt from the conditions of Paragraph 1 above, provided that the origin of such materials and supplies and the component parts thereof is a free world country as described in AID Geographic Code 935.

(5) All international <u>air</u> shipments made by the Grantee, to be financed hereunder, shall be made on U.S. flag carriers unless shipment would, in the judgement of the Grantee, be delayed an unreasonable time awaiting a U.S. carrier, either at the point of origin or transnipment, provided that the Grantee certifies to the facts in the documents retained as part of his Grant records for post audit by AID. All international <u>ocean</u> shipment made by the Grantee, to be financed nereunder, shall be made on U.S. flag vessels. Where U.S. flag vessels are not available, or their use would result in a significant delay, the Grantee may obtain a release from this requirement from the Transportation Support Division, Office of Commodity Management, AID, Washington, D.C. 20523, as appropriate, giving the basis for the request.

(6) The Grantee shall obtain competition to the maximum extent possible for any procurement to be financed nereunder. Procurement by the Grantee without consideration of more than one source must be approved by the Grant Officer. In no event will any procurement be on a cost-plus-apercentage of cost basis. The Grantee shall take all reasonable steps necessary to insure that subgrantees procuring in accordance with Paragraph (2) obtain competition to the maximum extent possible. In addition to the foregoing, for purchases made in the United States the cost of which are to be attributed to this Grant, the Grantee shall comply with the following requirements:

To permit AID, in accordance with the Small Business Provisions of the Mutual Security Act, to give United States Small Business firms an opportunity to participate in supplying commodities and services procured under this Grant, the Grantee, shall, to the maximum extent possible, provide the following information to the Office of Small Business, AID, Washington, D.C. 20523 at least 45 day. prior to placing any orde. or contract in excess of Five Thousand (\$5,000) Dollars, except where a shorter time is requested of, and granted by the Office of Small Business:

(a) Brief general description and quantity of commodities or services;

(b) Closing date for receiving quotations or bids;

(c) Address where invitations or specifications may be

obtained.

(7) Funds provided under this Grant shall not be used to procure any commodity or commodity-related services furnished by any supplier whose name appears on the List of Ineligible Suppliers under AID Regulation 8, "Suppliers of Commodities and Commodity-Related Services Ineligible for AID Financing", Grantee agrees to review said list prior to uncertaking any procurement the cost of which is to be attributed to this Grant. AID will provide Grantee with this list. u. Title to and Use of Property (Grantee) (Oct. 1974)

Title to all property financed under this Grant shall vest in the Grantee, subject to the following conditions:

(1) The Grantee shall not, under any Government contract or subcontract thereunder, or any Government grant, charge for any depreciation, amortization, or use of any property title to which remains in the Grantee under this clause.

(2) The Grantee agrees to use and maintain the property for the purpose of the grant.

(3) With respect to items having an acquisition cost of \$1,000 or more, title to which vests in the Grantee, the Grantee agrees:

(a) to report such items to the Grant Officer from time to time as they are acquired and to maintain a control system which will permit their ready identification and location.

(b) to transfer title to any such items to the Government . in accordance with any written request therefor issued by the Grant Officer at any time prior to final payment under the Grant.

. Title to and Care of Property (U.S. Government) (Oct. 1974)

Property, title to which vests in the Government under this Grant, whether furnished by the Government or acquired by the Grantee, is subject to the provisions of this clause and is hereinafter collectively referred to as "Government property." Title to Government property shall not be affected by the incorporation or attachment thereof to any property not owned by the Government, nor shall such Government property, or any part thereof, be or become a fixture or lose its identity as personalty by reason of affixation to any realty.

## (1) <u>Use of Government Property</u>

The Government property shall, unless otherwise provided herein or approved by the Grant Officer, be used only for the performance of this Grant.

(2) <u>Maintenance and Repair of Government Property</u>

The Grantee shall maintain and administer in accordance with sound business practice a program for the maintenance, repair, protection, and preservation of Government property so as to issure its full availability and usefulness for the performance of this grant. The Grantee shall take all reasonable steps to comply with all appropriate girections or instructions which the Grant Officer may prescribe as reasonably necessary for the protection of the Government property.

The Grantee shall submit, for review and written approval of the Grant Officer, a records system for property control and a program for orderly maintenance of Government property.

## (3) Property Control

The property control system shall include but not be limited to the following:

(a) Identification of each item of Government property acquired or furnished under the Grant by a serially controlled identification number and by description of item. Each item must be clearly marked "Property of U.S. Government."

(b) The price of each item of property acquired or furnished under the Grant.

(c) The location of each item of property acquired or furnished under the Grant.

(d) A record of any usable components which are permanently removed from items of Government property as a result of modification or otherwise.

(e) A record of disposition of each item acquired or furnished under the Grant.

(f) Date of order and receipt of any item acquired or furnished under the Grant.

The official property control records shall be kept in such condition that at any stage of completion of the work under this Grant, the status of property acquired or furnished under this Grant may be readily ascertained. A report of current status of all items of property acquired or furnished under the Grant shall be submitted yearly concurrently with the annual report.

#### (4) <u>Maintenance Program</u>

The Grantee's maintenance program shall be such as to provide for, consistent with sound industrial practice and the terms of the Grant: (i) disclosure of need for and the performance of preventive maintenance, (ii) disclosure and reporting of need for capital type rehabilitation, and (iii) recording of work accomplianed under the program.

(a) Preventive maintenance - Preventive maintenance is maintenance generally performed on a regularly scheduled basis to prevent the occurrence of defects and to detect and correct minor defects before they result in serious consequences.

(b) Records of maintenance - The Grantee's maintenance program shall provide for records sufficient to disclose the maintenance actions performed and deficiencies discovered as a result of inspections.

A report of status of maintenance of Government property shall be submitted annually concurrently with the annual report.

#### (5) <u>Risk of Loss</u>

Unless otherwise provided in this Grant, the Grantee assumes the risk of, and shall be responsible for, any loss of or damage to Government property provided under this Grant upon its delivery to him or upon passage of title thereto to the U.S. Government, except for reasonable wear and tear and except to the extent that such property is consumed in the performance of this Grant. Title to and Care of Property (U.S. Government) Page 3 of 3

(6) <u>Access</u>

The Government, and any persons designated by it, shall at all reasonable times have access to the premises wherein any Government property is located, for the purpose of inspecting the Government property.

(7) Final Accounting and Disposition of Government Property

Upon completion of this Grant, or at such earlier dates as may be fixed by the Grant Officer, the Grantee shall submit, in a form acceptable to the Grant Officer, inventory schedules covering all items of Government property not consumed in the performance of this Grant or not theretofore delievered to the Government, and shall prepare, deliver, or make such other disposal of the Government property, as may be directed or authorized by the Grant Officer.

(8) <u>Communications</u>

All communications issued pursuant to this clause shall be in writing.

(9) Government Furnished Excess Personal Property

When Government furnished excess personal property is provided under a grant, the appropriate provisions of the Federal Property Management Regulations, Part 101-43, shall be included.

## w. Prohibition on Abortion Related Activities (Oct. 1974)

No funds made available under this Grant will be used to support the following activities: 1) procurement or distribution of equipment intended to be used for the purpose of inducing abortions as a method of family planning; 2) special fees or incentives to women to coerce or motivate them to have abortions; 3) payments to persons to perform abortions or to solicit persons to undergo abortions; 4) information, education, training, or education programs that seek to promote abortion as a method of family planning.

# **x**, <u>Salaries</u> (Oct. 1974)

All salaries, wages, fees, and stipends reimbursed under this Grant shall be in accordance with the Grantee's policy and practice as reviewed and approved by the Grant Officer. In the absence of an approved policy the Grantee shall follow the regulations contained in Section 7-15.205-6 of the Agency for International Development Procurement Regulations.
