Irene (Granny) Ryan, of the Beverly Hillbillies, dies at 70 years.

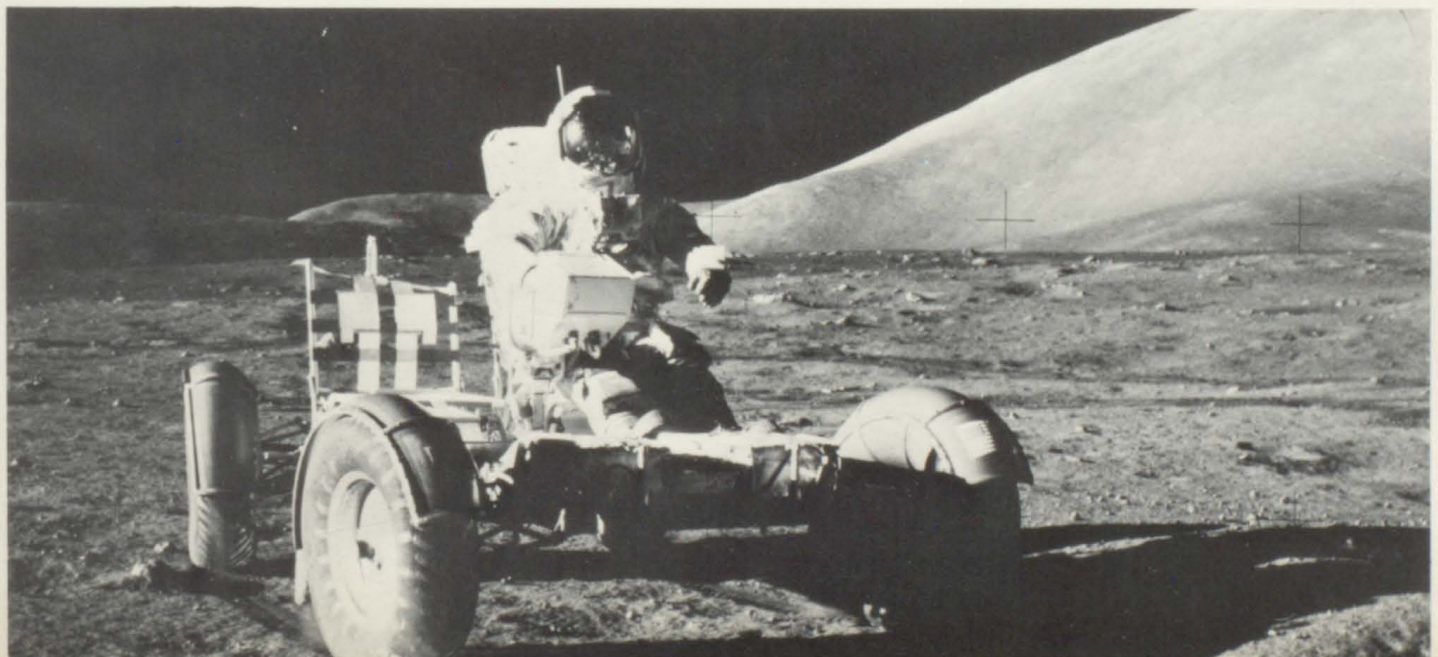
## MAY:

Skylab takes off for outer space to study the solar atmosphere and the length a human can stay up there. It develops problems and the astronauts join the lab later than scheduled.

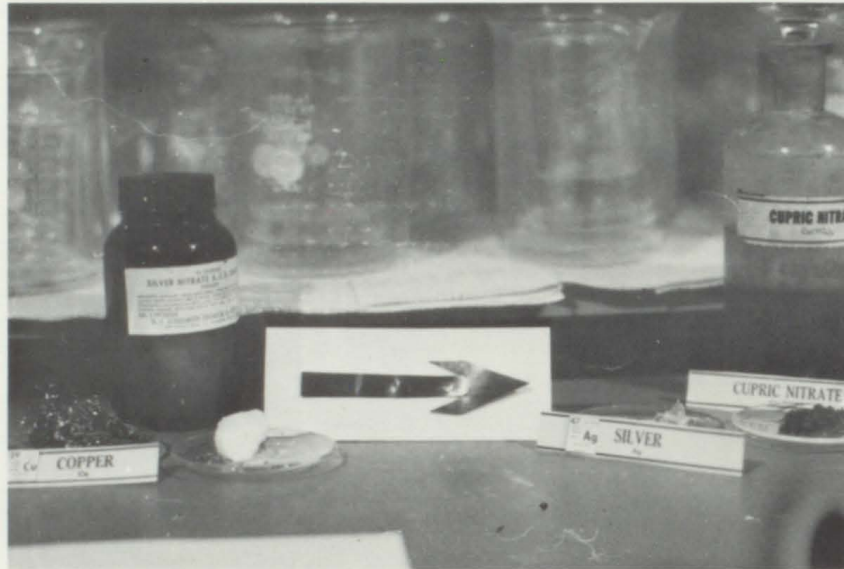
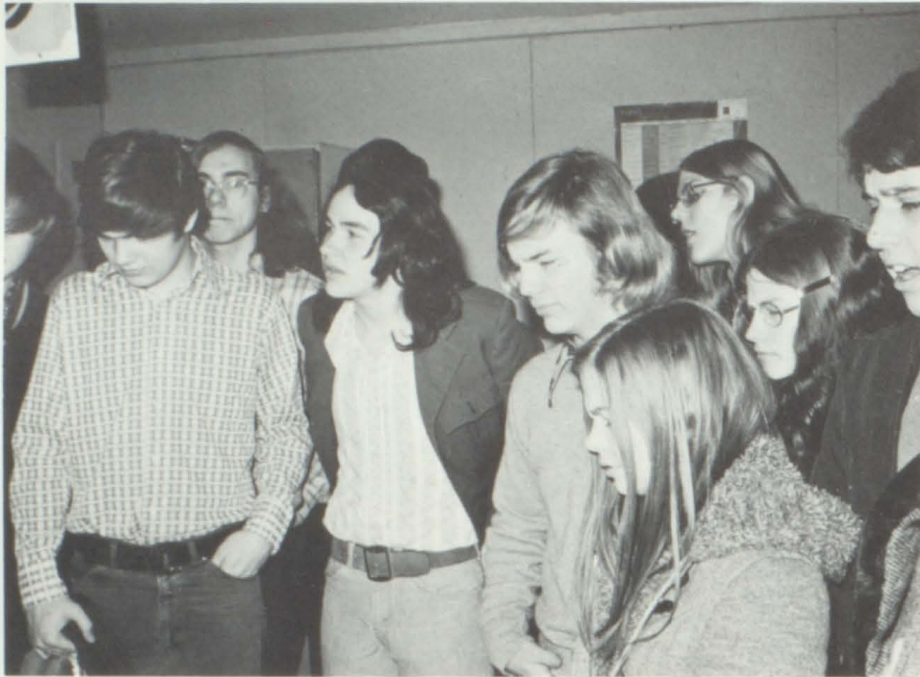
Gas leaks sprout in Williamsburg, Michigan, causing the town to be evacuated.

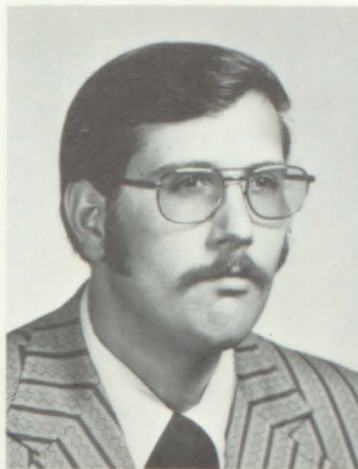

Mrs. Brown earned her B.A. from Adrian College. She teaches physical education and is advisor for the varsity cheerleaders.

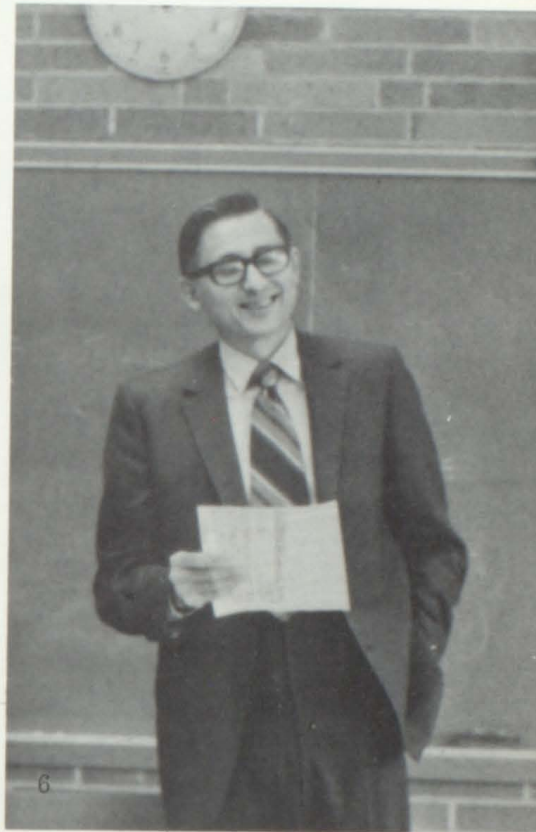
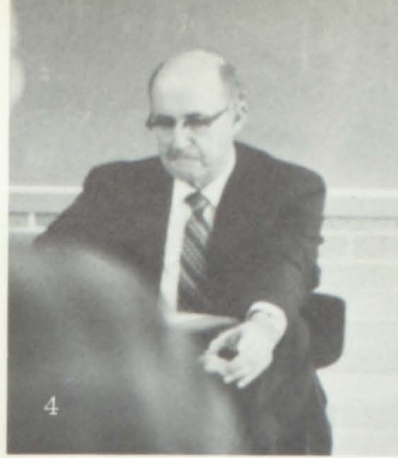


**DON H. BRUCE**

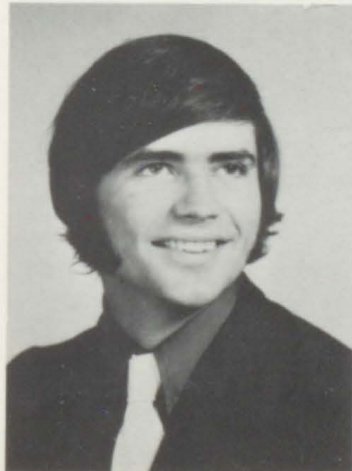


**HARRIET DeVANTIER**

WALTER SHREFFLER

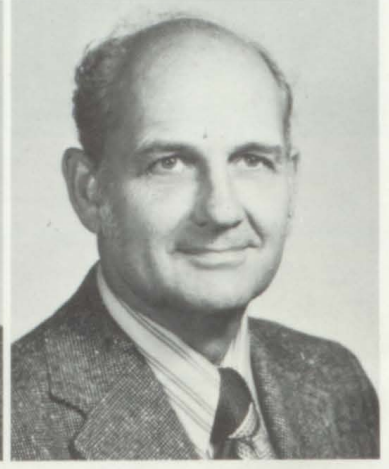
Mr. Shreffler earned his B.A. at Adrian College. He teaches United States history and China history, and is head coach of the football and track teams.

Mr. Smith earned his B.A. at Adrian College. He teaches Algebra I, geometry, and general math, and is the reserve basketball coach.

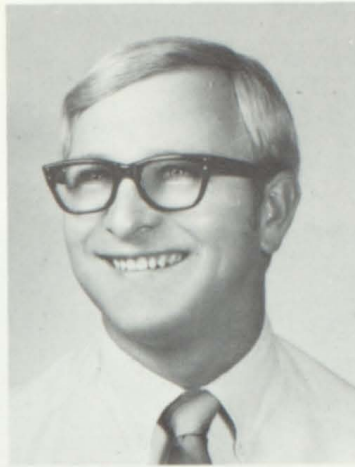
RALPH W. STAUP

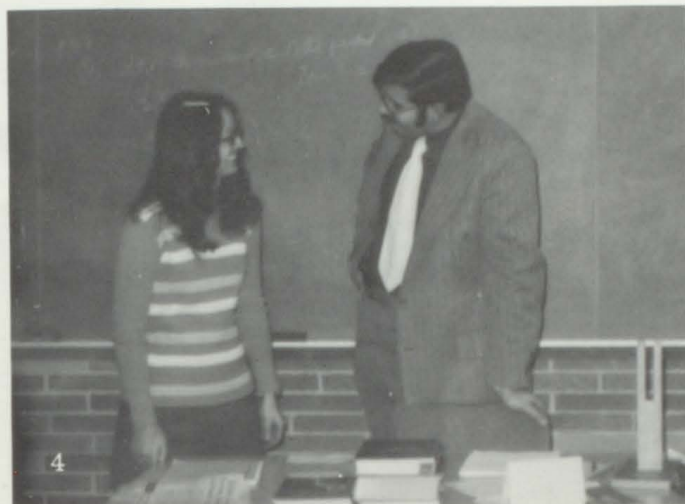




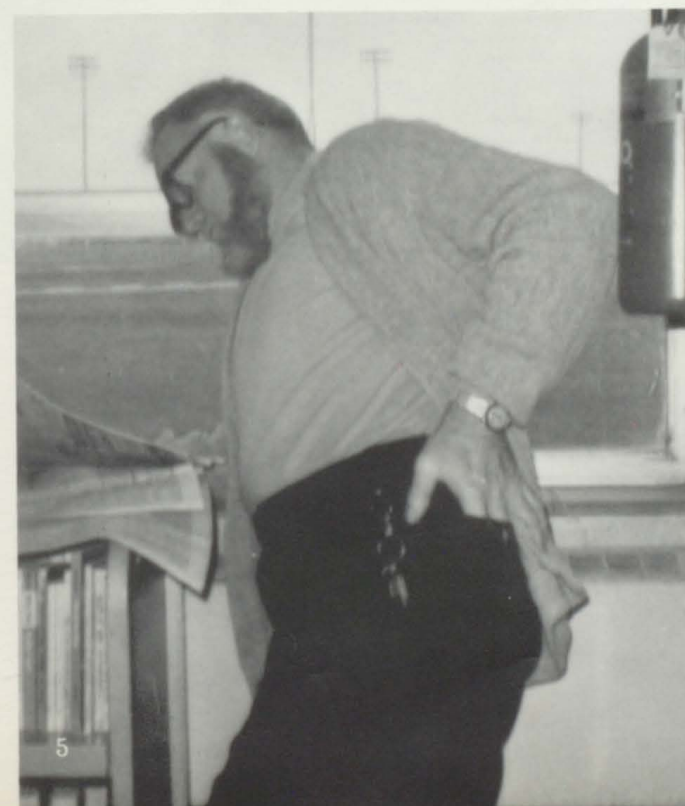
**LARRY S. TUTTLE**

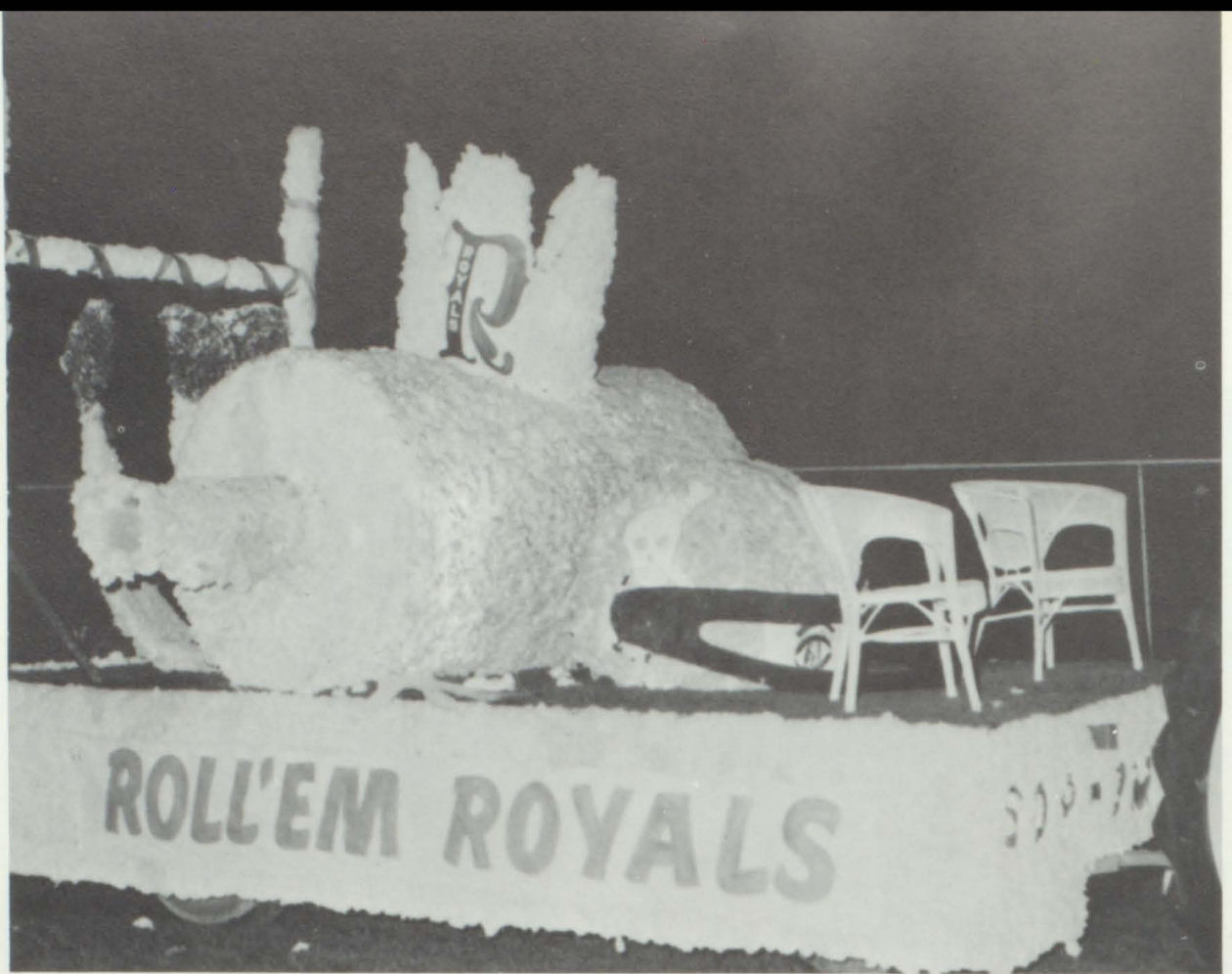






# Activities

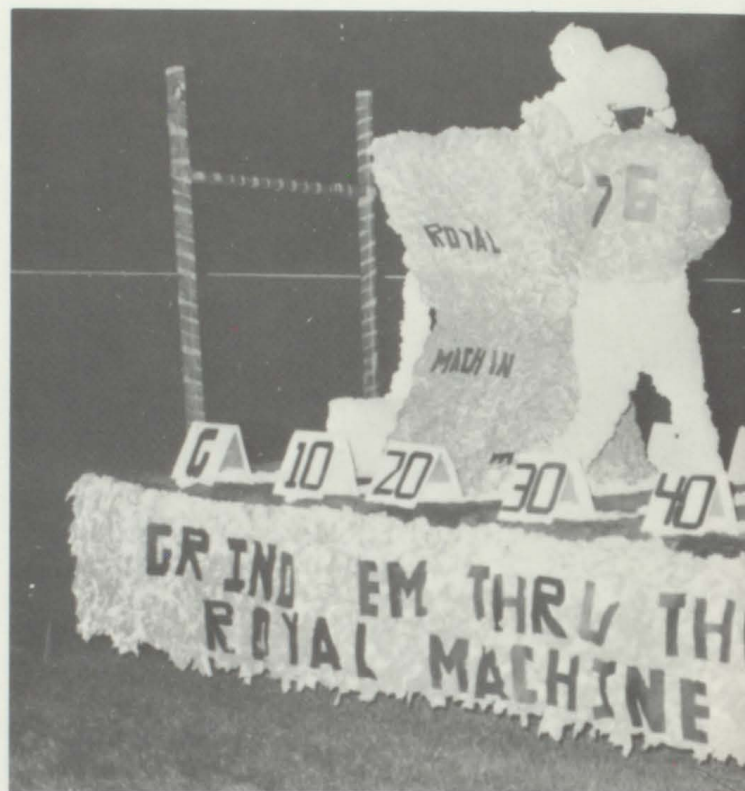
# Homecoming: Glory Of Victory — Agony Of Defeat

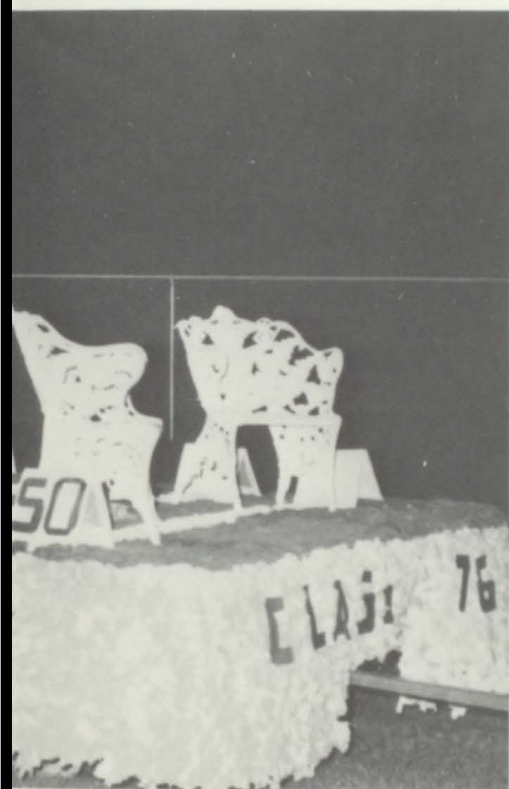

After casting was completed the 29 select BHS students began work and six weeks later they put on a semi-professional performance.



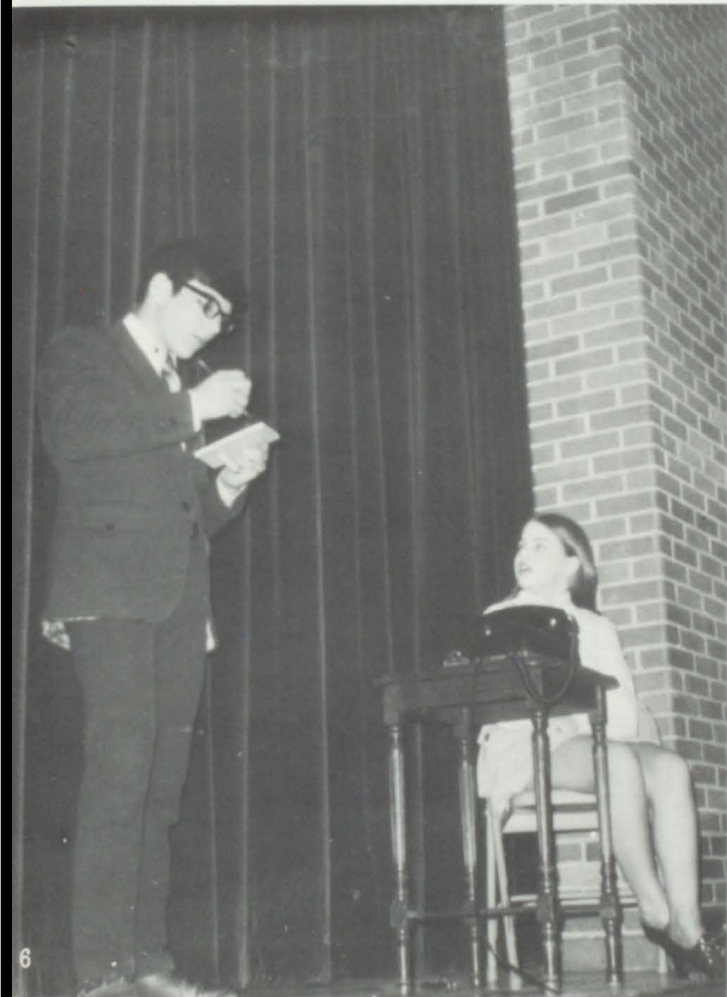

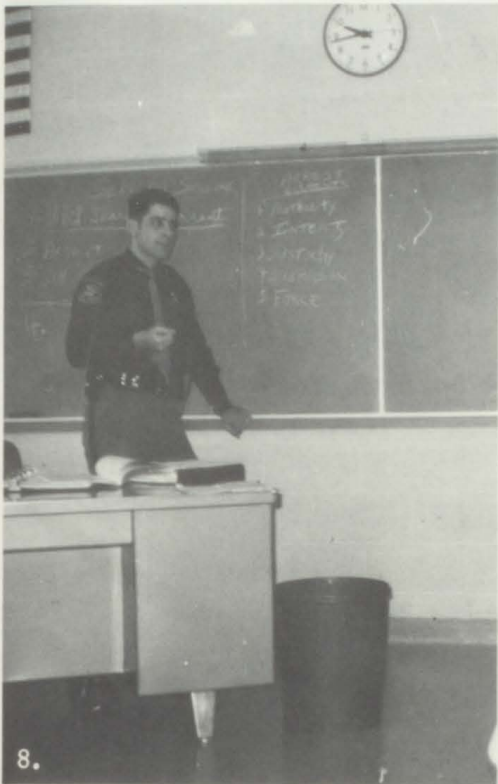
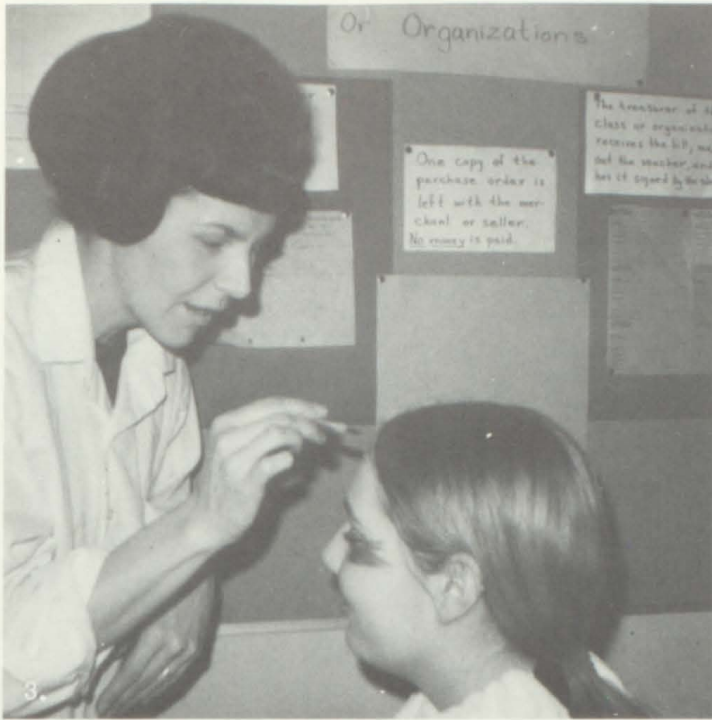
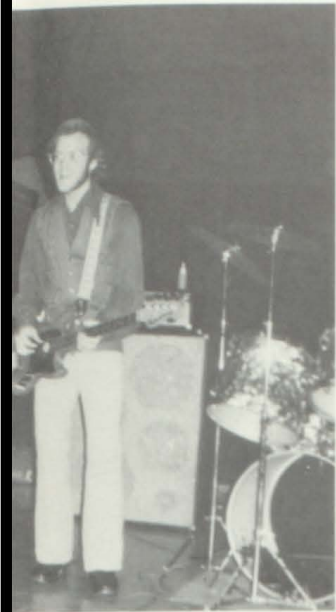




# Array Of Activities Make School Life Interesting

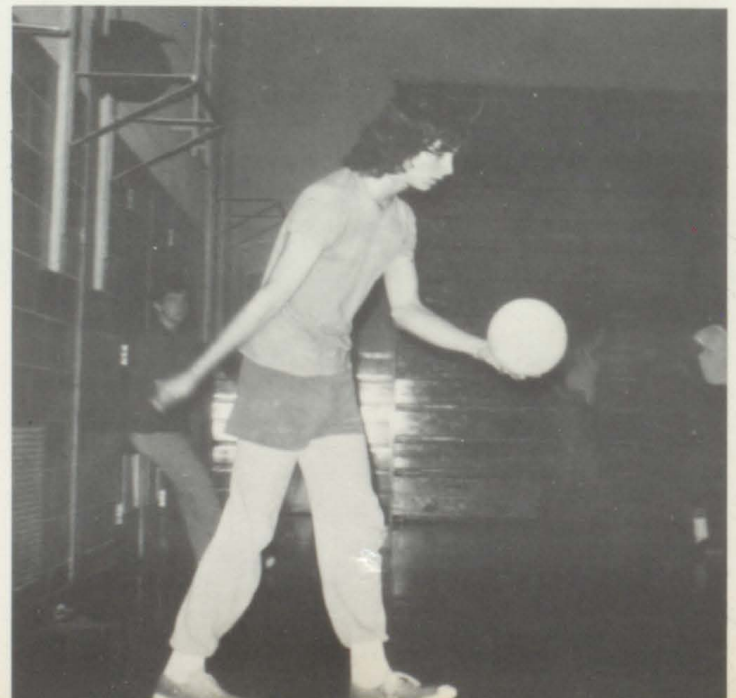
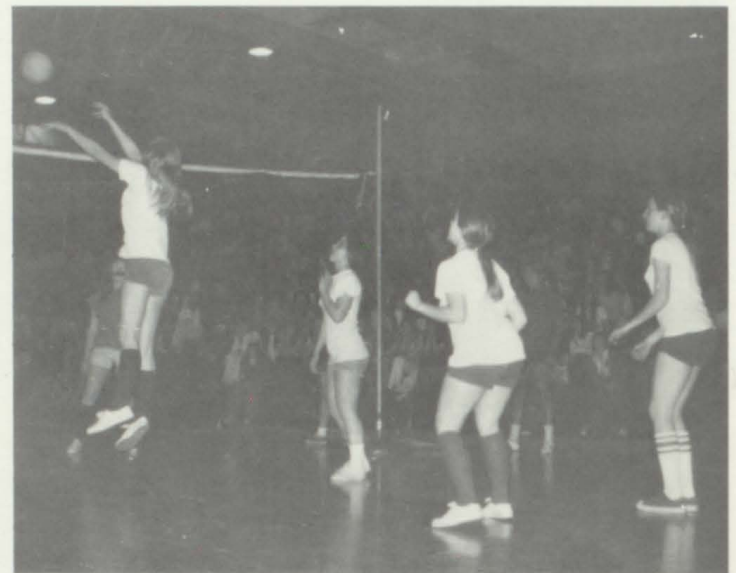
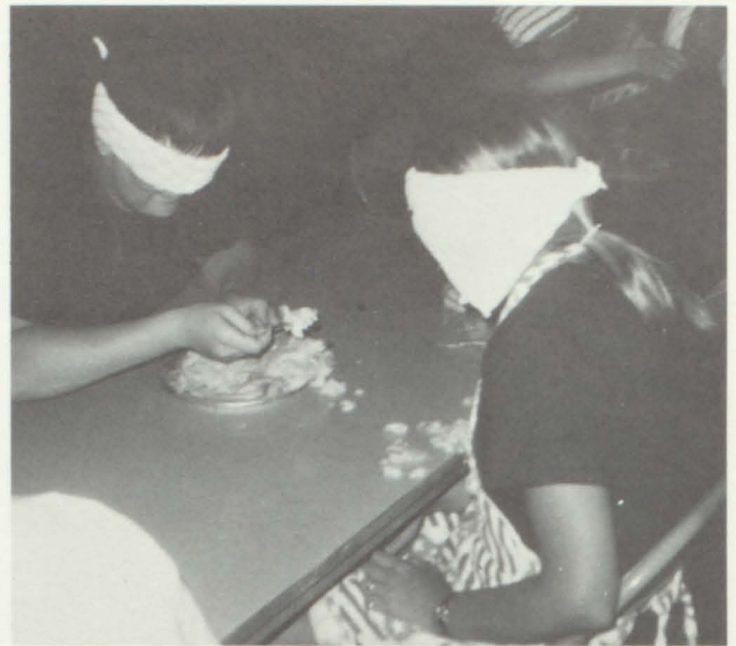
# Happenings Of Activities Week



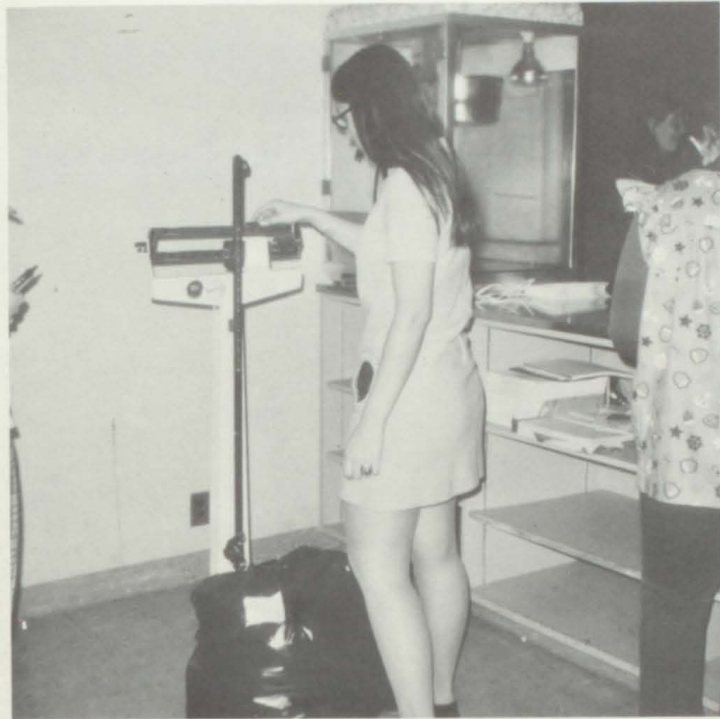
This year's Activities Week featured many variety of happenings. They included lunch outside, a treasure hunt, peculiar clothes, purple and gold, and student teacher day.

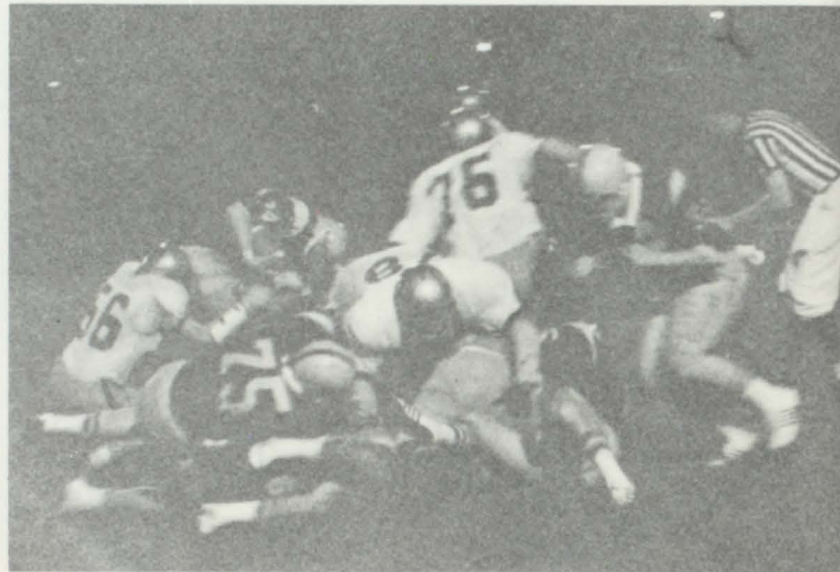
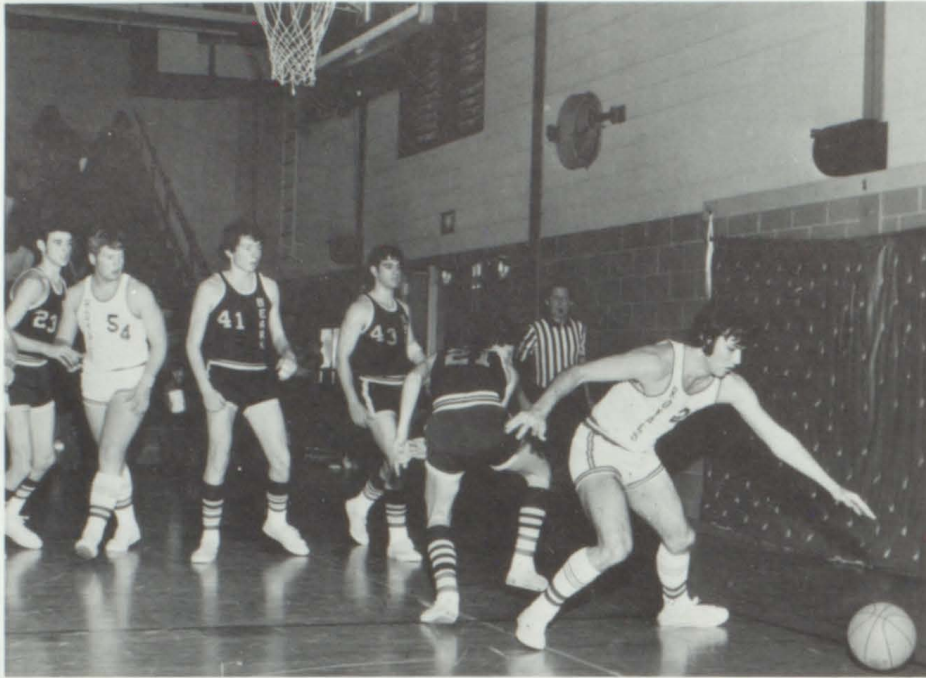
The Seniors totaled the most points and as the results received \$25. Runners-up were Juniors, Sophomores, and Freshmen.



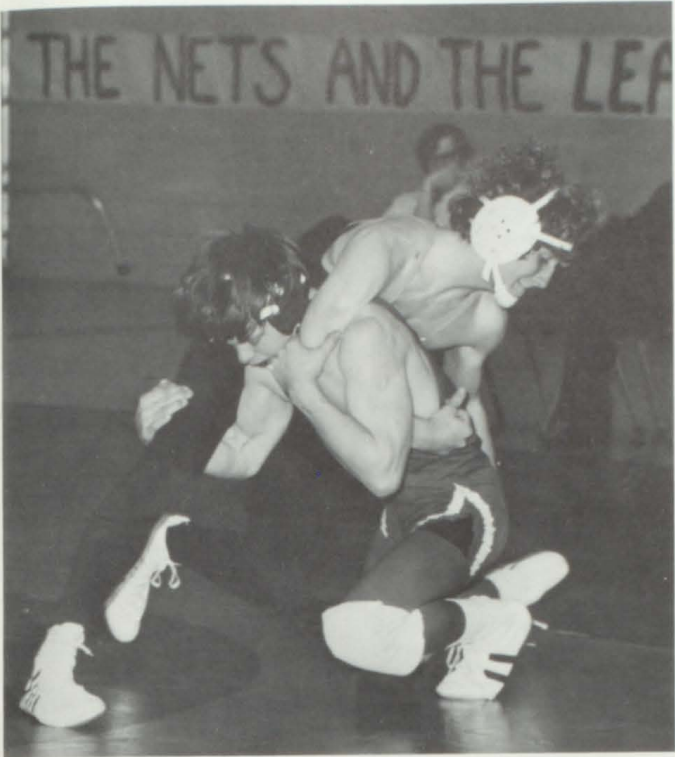

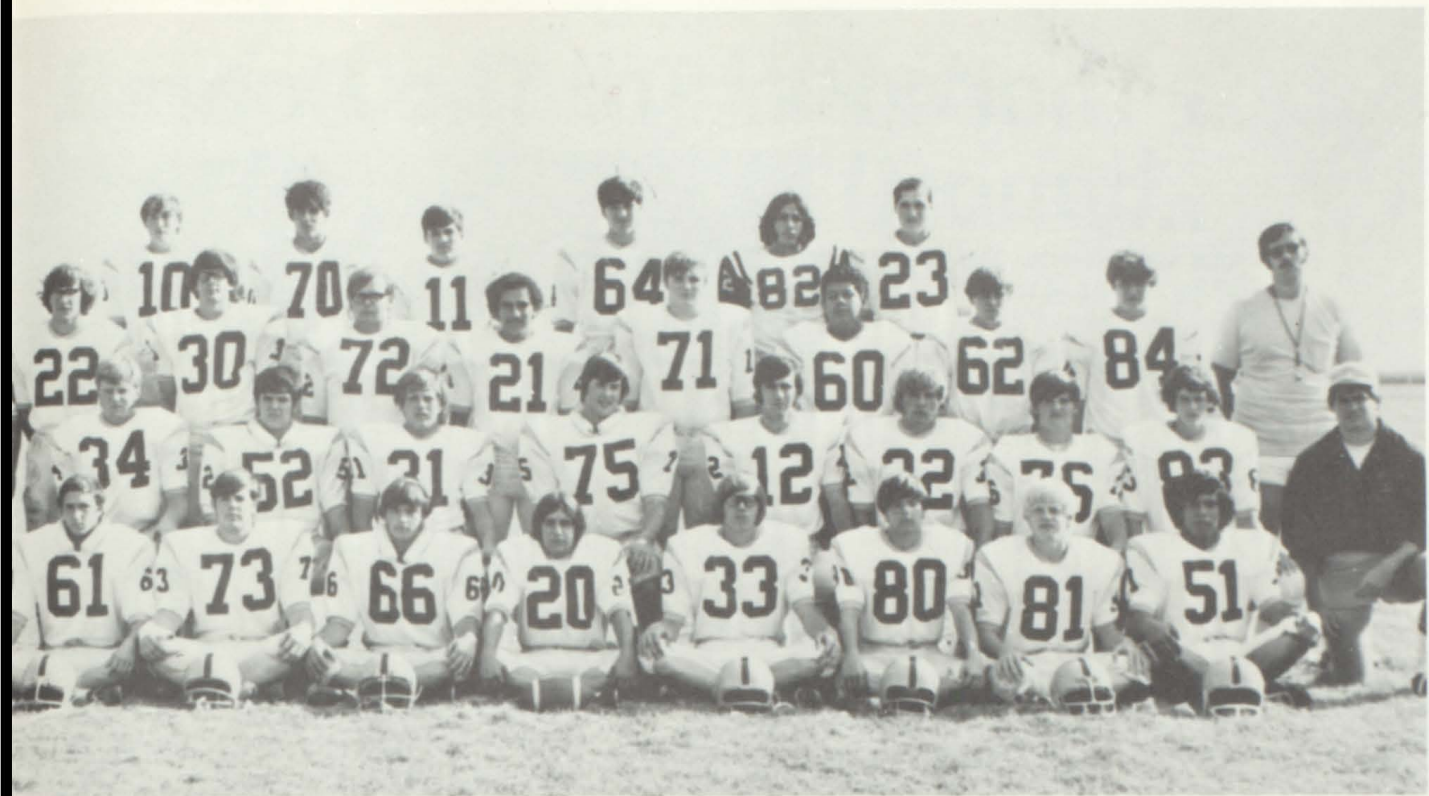
Defensively, Senior L. Sayler consistently turned in fine performances as did L. Goetz and J. Simon.

However, the fine play of the under classmen led by B. Fischer, M. Kilchenman, and G. Konieczny leave an excellent nucleus to build for next year.

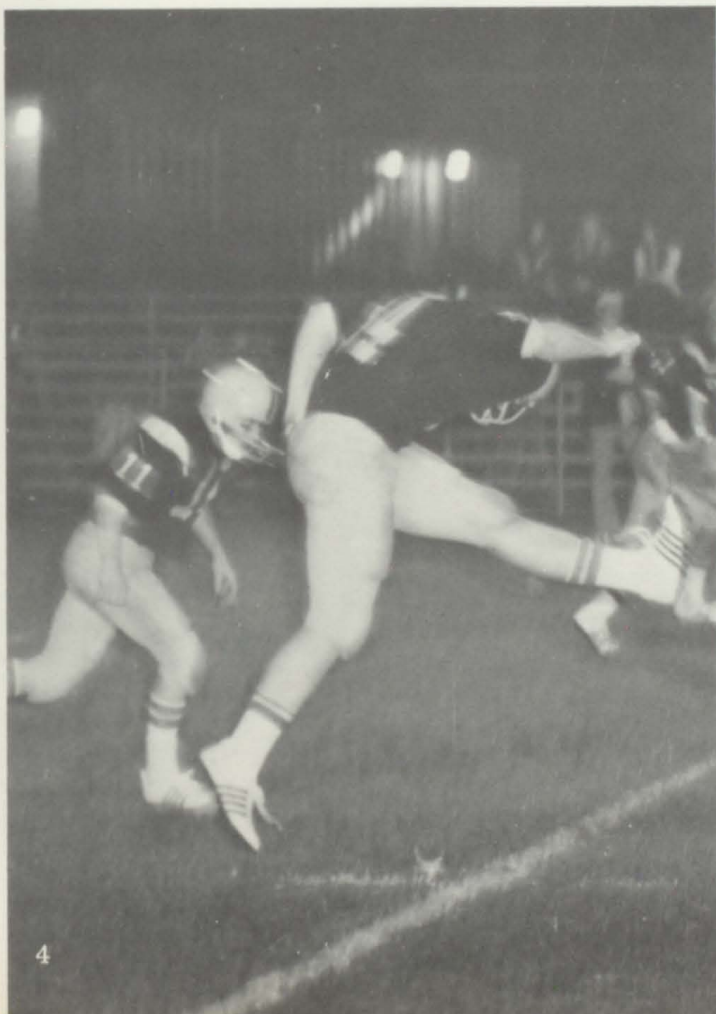
The JV's this year were together with the varsity. As for the Freshman team, they won two out of five games. All the teams of Blissfield have the reputation of never giving up.

## Ground

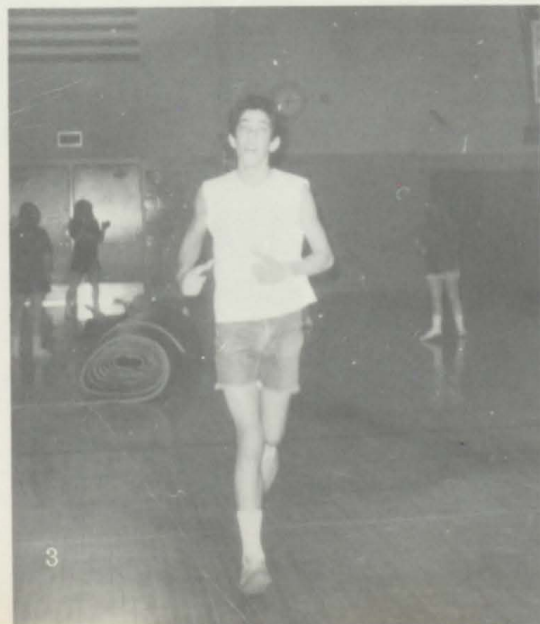

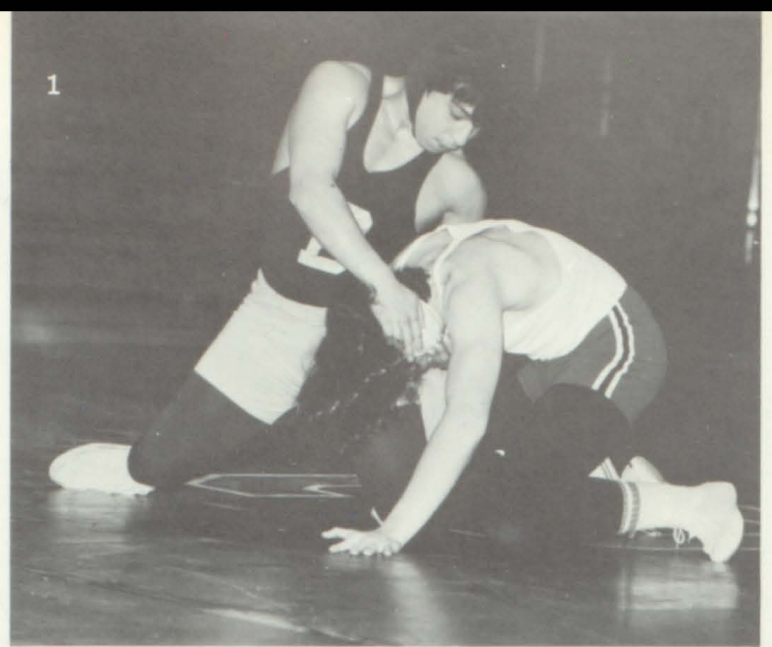

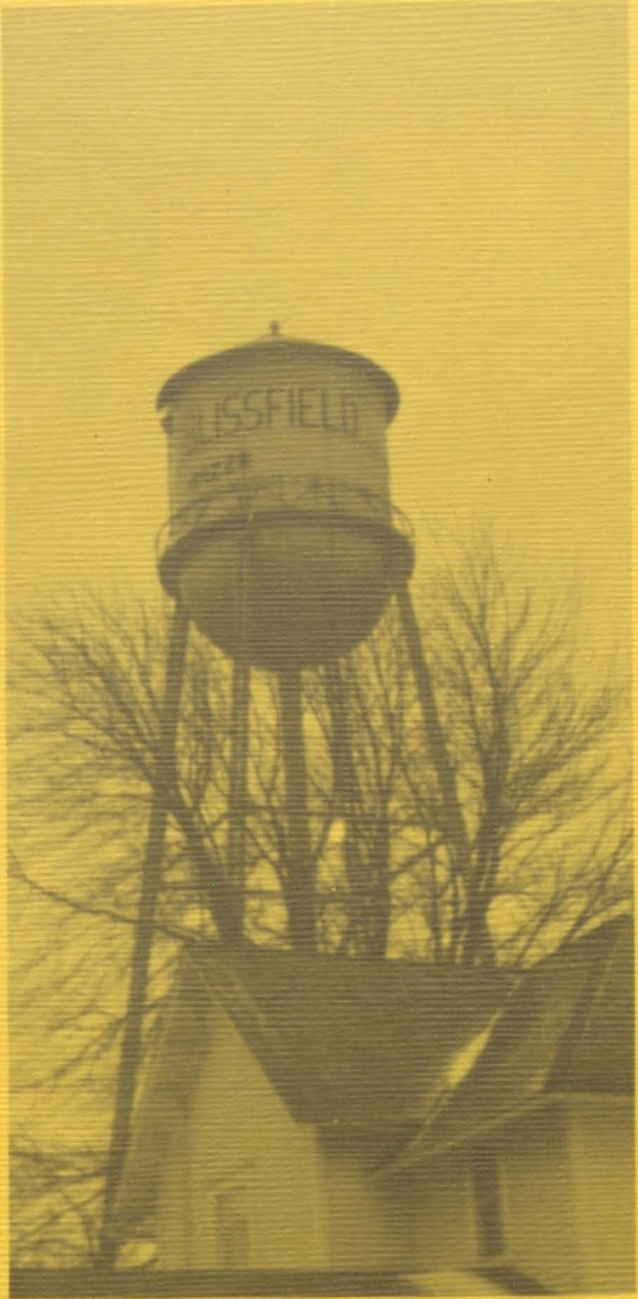
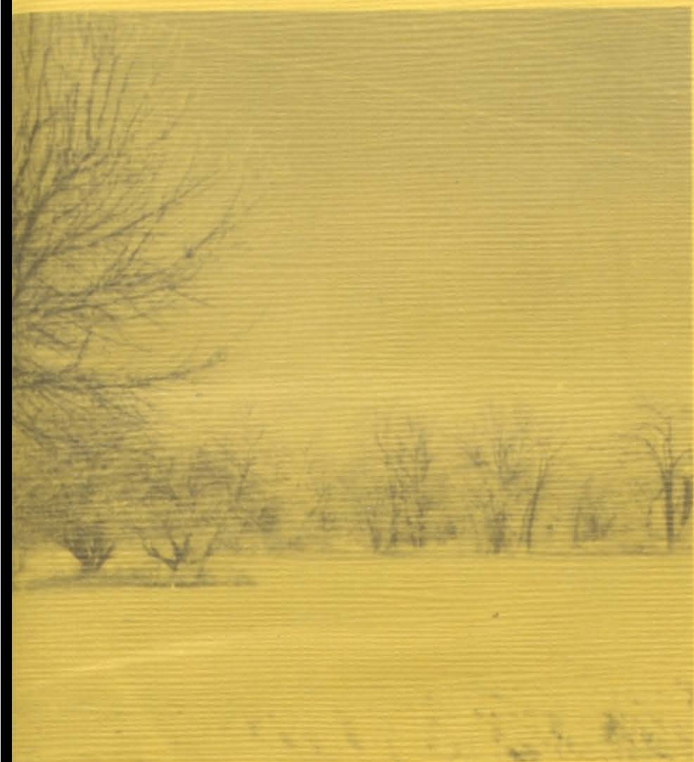
# Class Of '73 Enjoys New Place

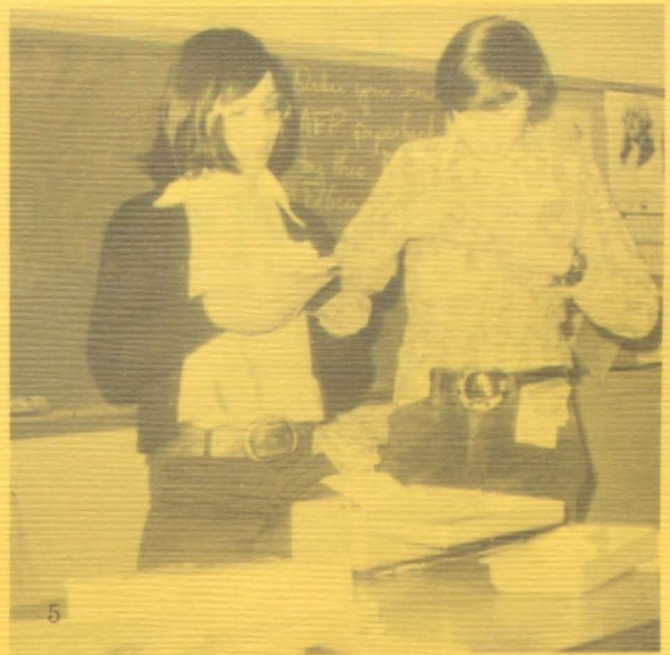
