End of Season Report

Crew began this year of Monday, September 23. The student teachers were: Ann McDaniel, Candy Clarke, Faye Harned, and Debbie Hall. The turnout was generally good with from three to five shells going out each day. By the Qualification deadline, sixty-eight girls had met the requirement of having gone out three times. From these girls the following dorm crews were formed: Bates, Cazenove, Claflin, McAfee-Freeman-Munger, Shafer, and Severance-Pomeroy-Beebe. These crews then practiced in the morning and afternoon until the Time trials which although originally scheduled for Tuesday, October 15, were re-scheduled to Wednesday, October 16 to give the crews more time to practice before the deadline. The four best times turned in by 5:00P.M. Wednesday October 16 were turned in by: Cazenove, McAfee-Freeman-Munger, Severance-Pomeroy-Beebe, and Shafer. These four crews then chose lanes and shells for the race. The four finalists practiced not more than twice a day until the day of the race, Wednesday, October 23 at 4:30PM. The weather was excellent all season with the exception of some early morning fog.

The weather was good the day of the race except for some wind which though not serious did slow the shells. The race was one of the closest in Wellesley history (all shells coming in within two seconds of each other) with a tie for third and fourth places. The winner was Cazenove. Refreshments were served after the announcement of the winner of the race.

The season went well with good weather and fairly good participation. My only recommendation would be to find some

better means of publicizing crew as the turnout, especially among freshman was not as good as expected.

The only expenditure thus far was for refreshments after the race which amounted to \$8.00.

Revised spring 1967

A. A. Crew -- Fall 1967

The crew season began on Monday, September 18. Girls who helped with teaching and running the afternoon program were Libby Anderson, Jenny Cook, Judy Fromson, Wendy Judge, and Lonnie Laszlo. By the qualification deadline, Wednesday, October 4, 132 had rowed at least once, and 81 girls had qualified for the inter-dorm races by rowing at least 3 times. From these girls seven crews were formed: Bates, Caz-Shafer, Claflin-Severance, McAfee-Munger-Freeman, Pomeroy, Stone-Beebe, Tower Court. The time trial deadline was Tuesday, October 10 at 5:00 P.M. Bates, Caz-Shafer, McAfee-Munger-Freeman, and Tower Court turned in the four best times (although Claflin-Severance turned in a time that was better than three of the crews' that qualified, they didn't do it until after 5:00). The four finalists practiced once or twice a day until Wednesday, October 18, the day of the Inter-Dorm Crew Race. Weather throughout the season was beautiful -- no rain and very little wind. The only problem encountered was some early morning fog which prevented timing on Tuesday, Oct. 10.

The day of the race was cloudy, but the rain held off until after the race. Caz-Shafer came in first, McAfee-Munger-Freeman second, Tower Court third, and Bates fourth. After the race, the proposed campaign for a fifth crew shell was announced, and refreshments were served. One week later, a challenge race was held between Stone-Beebe and Claflin-Severance, which the latter won.

The season as a whole went very well. Weather was good and response was excellent. The only problem that I can see is the one caused by having to eliminate almost half of the crews that qualified because of a lack of facilities to accommodate them.

A.A.Crew began this year on October 2 and continued through November 6. The calendar was set up last Spring and 200 copies were run off at that time. Publicity for the season included an exhibit at the Freshman Open House, announcements and posters in the dorms and posters on the outside bulletin boards and at the El Table. The calendars were passed out at the Open House and at the A.A. Crew practices. Because of a conflict with Academic Council, the interdorm races were moved up to October 31, and the qualification date was moved to October 23. The number of times out to qualify was therefore changed to three. Crew was continued until November 6 when the crew party was held.

As the boat house was not completed in time for the fall season, only two shells were used for A.A.Crew and these were tied onto a gloat extended from the swimming dock. Beginning the week of October 14, A.A.Crew began at 4:00 in order that each shell would be able to go out twice. Because of the beautiful weather, from 18 to 26 girls normally came to row each day. The total number of girls who came out at least once was 91. Of these 17 were seniors, 14 were juniors, 20 were sophomores and 40 were freshmen.

The boat house was finished on October 25, when for the first time in two years all four shells could be stored under cover. Thus we were able to use all four shells in the races.

A total of six teams qualified for the races. The crews were from Cazenove, Claflin, and McAfee. Shafer combined with Tower Court, Bates with Freeman, and Stone with Munger to form the others. The captains for these teams were:

Because of inclemnet weather the teams found very little time to practice as crews. Someof the teams however managed to get down and practice on the machines. Bates-Freeman dropped out of the race at the last minute due to the fact that several members could not row for various reasons. The time trials were scheduled for October 30, but because of the werther had to be held the following morning. Stone-Munger was eliminated form the finals then. The races were held in the afternoon. The starter was Miss Vaughan; the judges were Miss Bullen, Miss Hulac, Mrs. Rowbathom, and Mrs. Marsh. The head timer and finish judge was Miss Lunt who had several students helping her time. This fall \$2.50 was spent for 200 calendars, \$ for the cup engraving, and \$3.00 for refreshments. More refreshments would have been ordered if the party had been held the same day as the dorm races which is the custom .

There are several suggestions for next season.

1. Someone besides the heads of crew should be appointed to help teach the new girls. This would leave the heads free to organize the crews and see that every one is checked out properly.
2. A girl should not go out the first time she comes down to row, if she has never rowed before. The first day should be spent in learning all the rowing techniques and the proper way to handle equipment.
3. Set procedures for rainy days should be set up and posted.

This has been a good season even without the boathouse and I think a great deal of credit goes to Ben Lombard, our boatman, and Miss Vaughan, our advisor. Also a thanks goes to my two assistants, Marjorie Williams and Judy Cooper.

A.A.Crew began this year on October 2 and continued through November 6. The calendar was set up last Spring and 200 copies were run off at that time. Publicity for this season included an exhibit at the Freshmen Open Houses, announcements and posters in the dorms and posters on the outside bulletin boards, in Mary Hemenway Gymnasium and at the El table. The calendars were passed out at the Open House and during A.A. Crew. Because of a conflict with Academic Council the inter dorm races were moved up to October 31 and the qualification date to October 23. The number of times out to qualify was therefore changed to three. Crew was continued until November 6 when the crew party was to be held.

As the boat house was not completed in time for the fall season, only two shells were used for A.A.Crew and these were tied onto a float extended from the swimming dock. Beginning the week of October 14, A.A.Crew began at 4:00 in order that each shell would be able to go out twice. Because of beautiful weather, normally from 18 to 26 girls came to row each day. The total number of girls who came out at least once was 91. Of these 17 were seniors, 14 were juniors, 20 were sophomores, and 40 were freshmen.

The boat house was finished on October 25, when for the first time in two years all four shells could be stored under cover. Thus we were able to use four shells in the races.

A total of six teams qualified for the races. The crews were from Cazenove, McAfee, and Claflin. Shafer combined with Tower Court, Bates with Freeman, and Stone with Munger to form the others. The captains for these teams were:

Because of inclement weather the teams found very little time to practice as crews. Some of the teams managed however to get down and practice on the machines. Bates-Freeman dropped out of the race at the last minute to to the fact that several members could not row for various reasons. The time trials were scheduled for October 30, but because of the weather had to be held the following morning. Stone-Munger was eliminated from the finals then. The races were held in the afternoon. The starter was Miss Vaughan; the judges were Miss Bullen, Miss Hulac, Mrs. Rowbathom, and Mrs. Marsh. The head timer and finish judge was Miss Lunt who had several students helping her time. The results of the race were as follows;

This fall \$2.50 was spent for 200 calendars, \$ for the cup engraving, and \$3.00 for refreshments. More refreshments would have been ordered if the party had been held the same day as the dorm races which is the custom.

There are several suggestions for the next season.

1. Someone besides the heads of crew should be appointed to help teach the new girls. This would leave the heads free to organize the crews and see that everyone is properly checked out.
2. A girl should not go out the first time she comes down to row, if she has never rowed before. The first day should be spent learning all the rowing techniques and how the equipment is handled.
3. Set procedure for rainy days should be set up and posted.

This has been a good season even though we did not have a boat house and I think a great deal of the credit goes to Ben Lombard, our boatman and Miss Vaughan, our advisor. Thanks. Also a thanks goes to my two assistants, Marjorie Williams and Judy Cooper.

A.A. Crew -- Fall, 1962

With mixed emotions ~~it was~~^{we} learned that Miss Frolich, the crew advisor had won a Fulbright scholarship for this year and so would not be with us. We wished her luck, but were dismayed to lose her help. However, as soon as we got to know Miss Vaughan, we were reassured that the program would not fall through on account of an advisor. Before we left school in the spring, we set up the crew calendar for the fall, and had 175 copies printed up, to be ready in the fall.

Unfortunately, the fall season was plagued by minor ~~disast~~/ disasters; however, Ben Lombard, our boatman, came to our rescue each time and helped us to continue. For future reference, if the lake should be drained, it is possible to build ramps out into the lake so that the shells can be kept out in the water, and not run aground. Also, if, after a violent storm, the lake submerges the landing area, remind the crews to wear boots!

= According to plans laid in the ~~fall~~^{spring}, we made arrangements for the open house for freshmen and for a demonstration of the new shells, at a meeting of the heads the first week we got back. Since our major problem was publicity, we ~~ga~~ all got together and made all the posters for the season that first week, so that they could go up on time. Exhibits were made in each dorm, the El Table, the Rec Building, and the Gym, for the demonstration and christening, and the regular season.

The demonstration on the 26 September was preceded by the christening of the shells by the class presidents. Unfortunately, the sophomore shell did not come when scheduled so that that shell has not been christened yet; this may want to be done this spring. Instead of risking damage to the shells by using ginger ale bottle, we used

red and yellow painted light bulbs encased in plastic bags, with the appropriate color of ribbon tied around it. The class crews were used in the demonstration, having been out for practice at least once before that day. Although there was much publicity, the turn out was rather disappointing.

The regular A.A. crew season started on Oct. 1 and ran through Nov. 8 the day of the race. Qualification was supposed to be 4 times out by Oct. 31 (Wed.) ~~Monday~~ However, due to the fact that we could not take the shells out when it was raining, and therefore, many girls unexpectedly could not qualify, and also, we needed more time between qualification and the races to allow for bad weather, we changed the qualification date back to Tuesday, October 30, but with only three times out.

Except for a few important dates, we were blessed with excellent weather, with the result that unfortunately some people often had to wait 20 minutes or so for a chance to go out; it also discouraged some, I am afraid.

The attendance procedure was simplified by having Miss Vaughan check each girl as she signed for the first time to see that she was qualified for strenuous activity, with a list from the phys ed. dept. This also meant that we did not have to use the sign-up sheets. This fact explains why we did not have figures of those who had signed up, as opposed to those who came out. I do not feel that the fact that we did not use the sign up sheets affected the attendance one way or the other, since all the dorms had calendars posted anyway, with announcements being read.

Expenses for the season included ³⁶⁵~~\$3.50~~ for publicity, the cost of approximately 175 calendars (this was a good amount) ~~\$3.10~~ \$3.10 for 5 doz. doughnuts, and \$_____ for 2 jars of cider, as well as the crew cup engraving and the freshmen banner.

On Tuesday, October 9, the crew heads and advisors got together at the Well to decide on dorm captains. Unfortunately, Severence, Davis, and Munger did not have anyone to take on this position.

It should be mentioned in bold print, that my assistants were Jaanne Coombs, junior, and Janet Woldman, sophomore. Their help at practices and baling me out of hot water was utterly amazing.

Six teams finally qualified for the races, so that each crew was required to participate in a time trial, with the best three times providing the participants for the races on Thursday. The results in order were: Claflin, McAfee, Bates, Quad, Confusion (Stone, Munger, Severence, and Tower) and Freeman.

The season's winners were: Claflin (1:54.3), Bates (1:55.3) and McAfee (1:58.2). Judges for the event were: Miss Beverly Bullen, Mrs. Jean Marsh, Mrs. Rowbotham, and Miss Cary/ Hulac. Three student timers were also used. After the races, the crew party was held in the canoe house and the results of the races were announced as well as the new officers: Janet Woldman, Head; Judy Cooper, Assistant, '65; Marjorie Williams, Assistant: '66.

Suggestions for next year:

a. Plan season with three times out as the qualification requirement, but move the date earlier to allow more time to practice. Also, look into the possibility of ending the season before ~~at~~ the time

change, since it gets dark too early afterwards.

b. Appoint someone other than the officers to help permanently with beginners on the machines, who would be able to be there most of the time.

c. Perhaps try a little-sister campaigning in each dorm to drum up enthusiasm -- have each person who comes out responsible for getting someone else out.

d. Emphasize for the experienced rowers the safety rules... eg. getting in and out correctly etc.

e/ thank your lucky stars that all/ the bad luck must have happened last year!

A. A. Crew

Fall 1961

On September 20 a meeting of heads and advisor was held to discuss plans for the fall season and for freshman open house, September 22. New posters were made and placed in the El Table, Rec Building, and at the Index Board. Sign-up lists were posted in the dorms September 25 and were taken down noon September 28. Sign-ups both in the dorms and at the open house were very good and indicated great enthusiasm.

The season opened October 2. To inaugurate the new crew shell, the senior crew was invited to give a rowing exhibition. With all the excitement over the new shell plus the good weather attendance was very good. Record attendance was set on October 18 when 52 girls came out for crew. Previously crew had been held only at 4:40. It was decided to have both 3:30 and 4:40 crew thereafter in order to accommodate large groups. By the qualifying deadline, October 25, three dorms had full crews--Bates, McAfee, and Pomeroy. The remainder were paired up as follows: Munger-Stone, Claflin-Tower-Severance, and Beebe-Shafer. In the preliminary races, held the week of October 30, the Claflin-Tower-Severance and Bates crews were eliminated, the four best times being chosen as finalists. The finals were held on November 2. Two races were held, because the new shell was not raced. McAfee and Munger-Stone competed in the first race and Pomeroy and Beebe-Shafer raced in the second. Finishing times were used to determine which crew placed first, second, third, and fourth. McAfee won the race with a time of 1:51.5, just one-tenth of a second ahead of second place Beebe-Shafer, whose time was 1:51.6. Pomeroy and Munger-Stone finished third and fourth with times of 1:53, and 1:56.5 respectively. Total points were as follows:

McAfee	89.0
Beebe-Shafer	73.75
Pomeroy	63.5
Munger	49.2

The results of the race were announced at a party following the races. Also at the party were announced the names of honor list winners and of the new crew heads. They are: Anne Murray, '64, head, Joanne Coombs, '64, and Lois Boulware, '65, assistant heads. Expenses for the season included multigraphing (300 calendars), crew party, and crew cup engraving.

Several suggestions were made this season for future reference. First, preliminary races, if necessary, should be run on a time basis, the three best times (assuming that there are six shells) being placed in one heat, and the three worst times being placed in the second heat. Shells in each heat race each other and the finishing is based on the best time. Second, it was suggested that the day of the final race be moved up a week partly because of Academic Council which meets on the same day as the races, and in order to give more time for practice between the preliminary races and the final races. Third, it was decided that if calendars are to be distributed at freshman open house, 150 should be printed; otherwise 100 should be printed.

Fourth, it was decided to have a sophomore elected crew head because she would be more likely to be able to continue as head the fall of her junior year than would a senior. One assistant was to be elected from the freshmen and the other assistant was to be elected from either the sophomores or the juniors.

Special thanks go to Ben for keeping the shells so trim, for adjusting our slides, and for his words of encouragement before the races; to Miss Frohlich for all her helpful suggestions, and to Sue and Kathy for their fine co-operation in making this season the success that it was.

A.A. Crew Fall 1960 Report

This Fall we were greeted by a cleaned up crew house which Ben Lombard had worked so hard on all summer; all the oars were revarnished and painted and the rudders etc were painted to match their shells. Benches were put in and on the whole it was an hundred per cent improvement from the way the crew house was left in the Spring.

As Susie had too many labs it was decided that Lyn Virden would relieve her as head of crew and Susie would take Lyn's place as assistant head. Judy Francisco continued in the capacity of assistant. Preliminary meetings were held with the assistants and Miss Frolich to plan a schedule for the new class system. We decided that we would have to play it by ear and thus did not make out a calendar. On Freshman open house we recieved many sign ups and then later many more with dorm signups. The total of 175 original sign ups is larger than in years past, however only 39 of those coming out at least once (62) were original signups.

The season had a slow start which I credit to two reasons; the switch to a class system rather than the usual dorm system, and the fact that for the first time boating permits were required. This seemed to affect the upperclassmen more than the sophomores and freshmen. After two weeks of struggling with a very few people, A.A. voted to let us return to the dorm system. By then the season was half over but by getting rep's in every dorm we managed to get 36 girls qualified and thus have four shells for the races on 3 November; Pomeroy, Beebe-Shafer, Navy-Dower-Tower, and Munger-Stone-Davis-Cazenove. As the day for the races was also the day for blood donations on campus we ran into a few problems and had to find some substitutes at the last minute. There was one substitute each in the Beebe-Shafer and the Munger conglomerate. It was a very windy day and difficult for lining up but we finally managed. Beebe-Shafer won the race in 2.09 seconds and 79.6 points. Pom was second with 77.9; Munger conglomerate third with 55.3; and the Navy etc fourth with 40.6.

At a party after the races the head announced the new officers for next year:- Martha Leich '63 as head, Alice Barney '63 and Susan Goodpaster '64 as assistants. We spent \$7.36 on cider and donuts for refreshments, figuring on one gallon of cider for twenty people. These were our only expenses all season.

Although there were more original sign ups than usual, less girls came out for crew. However the percentage was higher for those coming out more than once of those that did come out.

My thanks to Miss Frolich for her very able assistance and moral support, Susie and Judy for doing most of the dirty work, and Ben for his ever present smile to greet us & his quick repairs and for keeping the crew house looking splendid all Fall.

A.A. Crew Report for Fall, 1959

On September 25th, the newly appointed crew head and the new faculty advisor discussed the Freshman Open House and the coming '59 Fall crew season. The need of appointing two assistants and getting sign-up sheets ready was seen and planned for.

September 25th was Freshman Open House, at which crew had a display. The number of sign-ups was good, considering the number of freshmen present. By the 28th of September, sign-up sheets were up in every dorm and posters were at the El Table, Index Board, and around campus. The dorm sign-ups were sparse, due, I think, to the lack of publicity by the dorm reps at sign-up time. I suggest stronger dorm campaigns for crew at this time and at the beginning of the season, to insure participation from the start. The suggestion (made by last year's crew head) of appointing rather than electing dorm captains was taken. This resulted in having captains that could be better relied on for enthusiasm and leadership.

Two assistants were appointed and the hours that the head and assistants would supervise at crew were decided upon. Participation was slow at the beginning (October 5th), but many more seemed to come out regularly and enthusiastically at the middle of the season. By the end of the qualifying period, five crews were formed; Stone, Munger-Caz, Pom-BB, Tower-Sev and Navy (plus others). Dorm crew practice was held a week before the final race. Following last year's procedure, two crews drew "byes" for the preliminaries and three crews raced on November 4th. The Stone crew was eliminated. The finals were held on November 5th, the results being Pom-BB first with 86.3 points at a time of 1:55. Second was Munger Caz with 73.3, Third, Navy, with 51.6, and fourth, Tower-Sev, with 39.7. The crew party was held after the final race, at which time the head announced that the new crew head was Susan Balch, '61, and her assistants, Chartis Bell, '62, and Judy Francisco, '63.

Crew's budget for Fall of '59 went for mimeographing the crew calendar, and \$4.00 for refreshments after the race. The budget, as given the head by the treasurer of A.A., was;

A. A. CREW REPORT

FALL, 1958

Preparations for the Fall Crew Season began on September 25, when the officers and advisor held a meeting at the Well. At that time, the head presented her lab situation, and it was decided that the problem could be handled, with the assistants sharing the 3:40 hours between themselves, and the head taking over many of the duties usually assigned to the assistants. It was decided that the crew season should begin October 1, a Wednesday.

Though posters were put up on every available signboard on campus, sign-ups were not good; the crew season began with average attendance, but slowly began to drop off after the first week. Rather than appoint dorm crew captains, thus having both crew reps and A.A. Reps in the same dorm, the officers decided they would return to the old system of letting dorms elect their own reps after the season had started, thus utilizing the A.A. reps as our contacts at the beginning of the season. The head experienced less than no cooperation in many dorms, and although the A.A. reps were to run the elections of dorm crew captains, many of them never turned in the results. In view of this, I would suggest that this election system be abandoned, and the head recourse to appointments of crew captains in each dorm.

As participation fell off, the head phoned A.A. reps and existing dorm reps, but this seemed to have no overall effect. Even a second round of phoning and a poster showing numbers qualified posted at the Index Board had little effect on general participation. Thus qualification for dorm crews was very sparse; only Freeman and Munger could muster up full crews, and after combining on the basis of numbers of people qualified, three more crews were formed; Beebe-Stone, Severance-Pom, and Claflin-Caz. Practice was held for the week before the preliminaries. Since there were five crews, and only four could race in the finals, a drawing was held to determine which three crews would race in the preliminaries. The three combination crews drew preliminaries, and the race was held the day before the finals. The Stone-Beebe crew was eliminated. The finals were held on Thursday, November 6; Miss Bullen, Miss Brown, and Miss Barrett judged. The results were: first, Severance-Pom; second, Freeman; third, Claflin combination; and fourth, Munger.

Many thanks go to Memer and Sally for putting up with my lab schedule, and to Miss McEmore for coming day after day in spite of such poor participation. Larry was our lifesaver, and without him crew couldn't function.

CREW REPORT 1957 FALL SEASON

September 28-Oct. 1, Crew season was begun by advertising the sport through posters put at the index board, Elftable, outside Green and Founders; notes on the index board, and sign up sheets in each dormitory. After they were appointed, a great increase in the number of participants was experienced.

Oct 23- A coxswains symposium at which new coxes were encouraged and instructed was held with aid from experienced coxes. This was publicized by indexing and a poster and proved fairly successful.

Oct 28- This was the last day that members could qualify for their house crews by having four times out by this date. The total number of crews was ten, distributed in the following manner: Bates 2, Munger 2, Pomeroy 1, Severance 1, Claflin 1, Homestead 1, Nany 1, and One crew consisting of people from Beebe, Caz and Stone called the "Flu" Crew.

Oct 29-Nov 1, This time was left up to the crews to practice whenever each crew wished. On wednesday lanes and boats were drawn; this was arranged according to when each crew could come. The schedule had two crews at 4:40 and 3:40 on Monday, and three at those times on Tuesday. * While this arrangement is convenient for members, the 4:40 time could prove dangerous as it gets dark so early at this time of year. In spite of flashlights on each shell and buoy, The lanes cannot be seen. A suggestion is to run all races at 3:40, and if it is impossible

Oct 29-Nov 1, to do this in two days, then take a third day also.

Nov 4, 5, The preliminary races were held and the winners of each of the four races are the ones which race in the finals held on Nov 7. November 6, left for a rain date, was used for the crews to practice.

Nov 7, Finals were held at 3:40 with Munger Severance, Claflin and the Flu crew competing. The results were Munger, first, Flu crew second, Severance, third and Claflin, fourth. After the race a picnic was held with the two assistants, Vicki Garriques and Alix Ritchie organizing and running it. *While it was very pleasant there is too much of a problem of money to make it worthwhile. Cider and donuts would probably workout better for everyone. New Heads of Crew were announced at this time, after an election held during practice week.

Nov. 11, A meeting was held with Miss Bullen to discuss honor lists. This list along with the names of New heads of crew is included in the statistics.

In concluding this part of the report, my thanks to Miss Bullen for being so helpful throughout the season. Without her guidance of the crews and her cheerfulness in spite of unfortunate or unforeseen incidents the season would not have been at all successful. Thanks to Larry for being so patient with the late crews and keeping the shells in such good shape for the races. To Miss Jaques and Mrs. Daly for being so patient when the names trickled in throughout the season, thanks also. Vicki and Alie with whom the season was suffered and enjoyed know how grateful I am to them both for their dependability and enthusiasm.

I have tried to include some suggestions for future heads of crew from the mistakes that I have made, and hope they will have as pleasant a season as the 1957 fall crew season.

FALL CREW SEASON 1955

I. Preparations:

Preparations for the fall crew season began late in the summer with the formulation of a schedule for the season. After this schedule was checked by Miss Bullen and then with the college calendar, it was printed.

The fall crew season began on Monday October 3rd at 3:40. Crew practices were held every weekday afternoon except Thursdays from 3:40 until 5:00. This late closing time allowed those who had labs to come down after 4:40.

The first four weeks of crew were spent in general practice, at which time it was emphasized that a dorm had to have at least eleven people qualified (four times out) by the 28th of October in order to have a shell in the finals. The preliminary races were held from Oct. 31-Nov. 2. The final race was held on November 3rd.

III. Procedure of Season and Statistics:

367 persons signed up for crew, with over 100 freshmen signing at the AA Open House. The class distribution was as follows:

To facilitate work for Miss Jacques each name, with class and dorm was put on an index card. These were then arranged alphabetically by class. In turn, the regular crew attendance cards were made for use at the Crew House.

Crew attendance sheets which had the names of all those in the dorm who had signed for crew were sent to each captain, or representative from that dorm. A week later a letter was sent telling these captains the names of those who had already been out and how many times. Just before the preliminaries another letter was sent confirming the names of those who had qualified.

A chart was made and placed in the Crew House which kept all informed as to how many people from each dorm were qualified.

IV. Races:

For the first time in the history of crew three dorms had enough people qualified to have two crews per dorm. These were Munger, Severance, and Tower. Other dorms who had shells racing in the preliminaries were: Beebe, Cazenove, Claflin, Freeman, Freeman-Munger, Homestead, and Navy.

Three days of preliminary races were necessary. The shells who placed 1st and 2nd in each preliminary were able to compete in the finals. Due to heavy rains on Tuesday that race was held at 4:40 on Wednesday.

The following crews were in the finals: Claflin, Freeman, Munger A,

Munger B, Severance A, and Tower A.

The crews were judged for slow form, racing form, and placing in the race. Munger B was the winner, with Freeman 2nd, and Tower A 3rd.

V. Crew Party:

The first crew party was held in the Rec Building on Wednesday after the races. To the few who came at 5:15 there was hot cider and doughnuts. The second crew party, consisting of cold cider and day-old doughnuts, was held in the Crew House right after the finals on Thursday.

VI. Suggestions:

When it is necessary to have a six lane final it would seem better to eliminate the judging of racing form for the following reason: it is next to impossible to see the shells in the first two lanes.

In the way of thank-you's....

First my sincere thanks to Miss Bullen who was always down at the Crew House giving advice, offering suggestions and giving so much of her time. She made crew fun for all of us.

To BJ Bloomer, my thanks for doing all sorts of odd jobs, coxing and rowing when needed, and for her moral support.

To Barbie Pahl, my 2nd assistant, goes special thanks for joining BJ and me later in the season. She certainly did a swell job both in the routine work and in preparing the crew parties.

Many thanks go to Mrs. Marsh, Miss McFee, and Nancy Van Ness for judging in the finals.

And of course, thanks to Mr. Marshall for his patience and ever-ready help, especially during "flood week" when crews embarked from shore rather than the crew house.

FALL CREW REPORT - 1954

General preparations and plans:

A.A. Fall Crew opened officially on Oct. 4, 1954 at 3:40 after much turmoil. Due to many unfortunate occurrences during the summer, I was "given" the position as Head of Crew and Mary Lord was appointed assistant. Under these circumstances, we were unable to begin any preparations for crew during the summer, and this made things rather hectic in the first few weeks of school. However, sign-up sheets were finally made — one for each dorm, El Tablae, and the A.A. Open House. These had to be taken down after two days so that Miss Jacques could "okay" each prospective rower. As a result only 365 people signed up. But gradually the number increased to 417, thanks to Miss Bullen's daily announcements in gym classes, the work of A.A. Reps, and especially the urging (?) of avid "crewists" in their respective dorms. Also eight or so large posters were made by Anne Ransdell, the "de facto" and consulting Ex-Head of Crew. They were beautiful and we really appreciated her work and the results they brought. Again, in the way of publicity, the Index Board was invaluable for reminding people of the qualifying dates and races, etc..

So that people would know qualifying dates and plans of the season in general, sheets with this information were posted in each dorm and Crew House. However, it was still necessary to keep reminding people to come and get seasons.

Schedule:

There was a general practice period with 15 possible times to participate. In order to be eligible to row on a dorm crew, each person had to be out four times by Oct. 29. As usual, there were problems, and so Thurs. (the day before the deadline) was used as a "catch up" practice. Also since it was hard for people with labs to come at the 3:40 hour everyday, it was voted to lengthen the time for A.A. Crew from 3:40 - 4:30 to 3:40 - 5:10. This brought great results.

In order to get a season, each person had to be out 6 times by Nov. 4. We tried to encourage people to finish up their seasons, even though they weren't rowing on a crew, and we were very pleased at the number of people who took advantage of this — even if they had to row on the machines.

Crew captains were elected during the second week and we certainly couldn't have gotten along without them. They made sure their dorm had enough people qualified and they were the main link between the dorms and the Heads of Crew. Each one was sent a letter with instructions, etc., plus a list of people who had signed up for crew and the number of times each had been out as of that date. Later on, we advised each dorm to make a large chart with places for each girl to put a check after her name whenever she went out. This served as another reminder for the more "lackadaisical" crewers. In general I think these captains did more good than all-college notices and helped their dorms to realize the fun of the sport, which is what we tried to emphasize, rather than winning the races. In order for a dorm to enter one crew in the races, they had to have 11 people out 4 times by Oct. 29 th. Munger's "forceful" attendance last year stirred up much enthusiasm in other dorms this year and Freeman and Navy both had two crews, while Munger again had 32 people qualified - enough for 3 crews. However, other dorms weren't quite as successful. Stone-Davis combined forces as did Beebe-Severance, Bates with Freeman (leftovers) and Shafer with Caz's remnants. Fortunately all of the other dorms had enough qualified for one crew.

The Races:

In all, there were 16 boats racing, so it was necessary to have three preliminaries, Mon., Tues., and Wed. afternoon at 3:40. The first and second place winners of each preliminary then raced in the Finals on Thursday. In order for each cox to prepare for the race, there was a drawing for boats and lanes immediately after each preliminary. We were unable to have a final practice for the 6 crews racing on Thurs. If possible it would be much better if this could be worked into the schedule next year, although I don't think anyone suffered a very drastic setback for lack of such a practice. Results of the races are as follows:

However, those who did come seemed to enjoy themselves and the hot cider and cookies which Mary prepared so deliciously.

I have so many thank yous that I hardly know where to begin. Everyone was so wonderful to us in our " unusual" predicament, and I know we wouldn't have gotten along without them. First of all, crew couldn't have survived without Miss Bullen. She was so patient, was always down at the Crew House, was willing to come at last minute practices, gave much-needed advice, and most important made crew so much fun, not only for Mary and me, but also for all the A.A. Crewists. To her goes our sincerest and most special thanks.

I also would like to congratulate Mary Lord on her "bang up" job. She did all the bits of paper work and calling which take up so much time, and was always willing to lend a hand. Even though she insists she didn't know what was happening, I certainly couldn't have managed without her.

Another big help was Anne Ransdell, the ex-head of crew, who even though she was practically in the hospital, took time

to make the whole exhibition for the A.A. Open House and supplied me through out my term with posters, reminders, and advice.

And, I couldn't forget Mr. Marshall who kept the boats in such excellent condition(as always) and was willing to stay down at the crew house until 5:10 every night.

My last thank yous go to all the crew captains for their enthusiasm and support.

Fall Crew Report -1953

I. Preparations:

Preparations for the fall crew season were begun in the late summer to ease the general rush during the actual season. A tentative outline of plans for the season was drawn up and sent to Miss Bullen, crew faculty advisor, for approval and further suggestions.

Sign up sheets were made in advance with what we hoped was an eye-catching design. (At least it was colorful!) There was one for every dorm, one for the El Table, and one for the Freshman A. A. Open House.

Five large crew posters were made. (I will not commit myself to judge the esthetic qualities of these posters except that the word CREW stood out above all else, which was the purpose. Also emphasized was -----
ANY DAY EXCEPT THURSDAY AT 3:40 RAIN OR SHINE!!!!!!!

At the beginning of the season sheets with the crew schedule and deadlines were drawn up. Again there was one for every dorm and the crew house. It is also wise to make an extra large one for the El Table. (Lethargic people have a tendency towards myopia.)

The Index board as another publicity method was used extensively. Again a word of warning _____ make sure that the notice begins "ALL". If it starts with CREW people are likely to skip right over it.

So much for publicity _____

II. Plan of Season:

At the outset of the season, the plans for crew included a playday with Clark and Lasell Junior College. Unfortunately

this plan did not materialize, but I should like to recommend it strongly for next year _____ either in the spring or in the fall.

The rest of the season was to go much the same as in previous years. First came a certain period of qualification for dormitory crews, practice, preliminaries, and at last the Finals. ^{Also we planned a crew party for immediately after the finals.} Instead of inviting just members of Voluntary Crew, we asked anyone who wanted to come. This was in keeping with our attempt to emphasize the importance of supporting the crews and to stress the fun of the sport. Thanks to the efforts of the crew captains, there was a great deal of interest, ~~in the season.~~

III. Procedure of Season and Statistics:

The sign up sheets were posted on the date designated. In order for Miss Jaques to have time to check all the people, the sheets had to be taken down after three days. Due to this and the fact that as yet there were no A.A. Reps, the initial sign up was small, numbering only 230. When the season started ^{the} announcements were made every day in the crew house urging those who were already out to persuade others to come out. The voluntary members were also asked to ^{think} about whom to elect for a dorm crew captain. By the 10th of October ~~the number~~ the number in voluntary crew had risen to 283. By the 14th it numbered 401 - the largest sign up for crew!

Every dorm, with the exception of Stone had a sufficient number of people signed up to qualify at least one crew. The election of crew captains took place after the first week of crew. This enabled people to get acquainted with enthusiastic crewers in their dorms. The following people were elected;

In order to assure one crew from every dorm letters were sent to all the captains asking them to keep track of how many were qualifying. An alphabetical list of all who had signed up for crew in their dorm was enclosed. Later another letter was sent asking them to get up enthusiasm for crew, to make a poster advertising the Preliminaries and Finals, and to advertise the "Crew Brew," the crew party. Again alphabetical lists were included in the letter. This time the lists stated the dates each person had been out for crew and the captains were asked to make sure that those who hadn't yet been out knew the way to the Crew House and Lake Waban.

I cannot stress enough the important part these dorm captains play in Fall Crew. They enable the Heads of Crew to keep ~~the~~ ^{the} unified. In fact they were so indispensable that it was decided to elect the captains for next fall at the end of this season. There were elected from the Freshman, Sophomore, or Junior class. The reasons for electing them now were;

1. The captain would be someone truly interested in crew.
2. it would enable the Head of Crew to get started faster in the season
3. it would assure the Head of Crew that she would have at least one crew from every dorm, and possibly two.
4. it would give the captains more time to work up enthusiasm.

As the season continued it was discovered that some people were having a great deal of trouble meeting the qualifying dates. This was

due to the 3:40 time conflicting with labs. We agreed, therefore, to abide by the last qualification date only. In other words to qualify for a dorm crew you must have been out four times by the 28th of October. Those who could only manage to get to the Voluntary Hour once a week were allowed to make up the time either in a class or on the machines.

As the qualification deadline neared, a chart, changed daily was put up in the Crew House. This showed how many people had been out once, twice, threese, and how many had qualified in each dorm. For a dorm to enter one crew in the races they had to have eleven people out four times by the 28th, Pomeroy and Claflin just missed qualifying two crews. MUNGER, FOR THE FIRST TIME IN THE HISTORY OF CREW, HAD THIRTY FIVE PEOPLE QUALIFIED, ENOUGH FOR THREE CREWS. DUE TO THIS THEY HAD ONE BOAT IN EACH PRELIMINARY.

IV Races:

As there were 15 crews, it was necessary to have three preliminaries - five barges in each one. On Monday, Nov. 2nd, two preliminaries were held....one at 3:40 and the other at 4:10. Due to the pressure of time and darkness the boats were judged for form two at a time. First and second place boats from each preliminary raced in the Finals on Thursday. Tuesday, Nov. 3rd one preliminary was held. Immediately after the preliminary on Tuesday there was a drawing for boat and lane for the Finals. Wednesday the 4th there was a practice day for those racing in the Finals. Mrs Marsh, who very nicely substituted for Miss Bullen, who unfortunately was in the infirmary, gave suggestions about improving form etc.

There were six boats racing in the Finals on Thursday. A six lane race does present some problems, however:

1. the 1st lane was very close to shore and the boats had to be careful not to hit bottom
2. it is difficult to hear instructions from the committee boat and

also to hear the start.

3. it is imperative that all the boats keep in their own lanes. If they don't it can be very dangerous and involve a crash.

V. Crew Party:

The crew party was held immediately after the Finals in the Rec. Building. This was kind of an experiment this year. Before there used to be a crew dinner in the Well. Not many people were ever able to attend this because of academic and social commitments. Since the "Crew Brew" was the same afternoon, most people felt that since they had already spent the major portion of the afternoon in relaxing they might as well do a good job of it. Plus there was the added temptation of being able to congratulate the winning crew, get warm and eat. In all there were about 150 people at the party and everyone seemed to enjoy themselves.

A special vote of thanks should be given to Nancy Mueller '55 and Sandy Berkley '56 who forewent watching the Finals to prepare the hot cider doughnuts, and cookies which were so welcome to cold crew members and spectators alike.

So many thanks are due to so many people that I hardly know where to begin. First and foremost my most sincere thanks to Miss Bullen without whom the entire season would have been a failure. She never failed to give the right advice, she gave unstintingly of her time, she was fun to work for, and above all she made crew FUN!!!! I am sure everyone in voluntary crew feels the same way and joins Anita and me in thanking her.

To mention all the things I have to thank Anita for would take several more pages. To be brief I have her to thank for one of the best seasons of crew. She did more than her share while I lounged (unwillingly) in the Infirmary. If Crew ever has as good an assistant head it will be because they followed Nita's model.

A very special thank you to Mrs. Marsh for taking over crew while Miss Bullen was in the Infirmary. Without her help, chances were that the races would have been done in ice-boats.

And of course many, many thanks to Mr. Marshall for his patience with crash landings, a very low lake and for keeping the boats in the best condition possible.

One last thanks to all the dorm crew captains for doing such a wonderful job.

Voluntary Crew Report
Fall 1952

Crew has been rather amusing and exciting this fall in that it has broken several rules that usually hold for crew. We started out by having four deadlines for people to meet instead of the usual one. At first there were protests and it looked like it might be disastrous in that few people would meet the first deadline, but it soon caught hold, and we now believe that it was a help in that it got people started earlier than they did before, and we feel that the plan should be continued. Voluntary Crew - Fall Season, 1951

Crew this year was extremely popular, 322 people signing up, of which 262 came out at least once, 93 had seasons, and 91 had half seasons.

The weather was wonderful all along, with only about one rainy day all season. This didn't stop Crew, though, for we had practice in the skiff house on rainy days, which proved avry valuable. Also, before any one could go out in a shell for the first time, she had to put in a period on the machines.

The races between the dorms were even more exciting than usual. The victors in the upperclass preliminaries were Bee, Davis, Pom and Shafer, while the freshman qualifying Navy were Bower, Little, Manger and Norumbega. Both of the finals ended in dead ties, an unprecedented event in the history of the sport, which emphasized the importance of form in the races, as this was the deciding point. Little and Pom were finally declared winners.

The only unfortunate incident during the whole season was that Martha Abbott, head of crew, became overpointed and had to resign, the assistant head taking over. However, she had much assistance from Martha and Ginny Stulken, past head of crew.

The crew dinner was delicious, being held right after the final races in ZA. About 166 attended, and enjoyed immensely the main course, "Sloppy Joe." We're sure Wellesley will be adding this to the regular menu soon. For a tasty and well organized dinner, many thanks to Beth Hackett.

At this time, the new head of crew has not been elected. However, the nominations are: Harriet Baldwin, Ginny Emery, Joyce Gevirtz and Fran Lawrence, all class of '54.

~~The~~ This year there will be co-managers of the freshman crew in the spring: Blair MacElroy and Sylvie Wallace. "W" Es have been awarded to Martha Abbott, Lorine Anderson, Ray MacLean and Liz Kauschkolb, ^{Helen Putnam} all '53, and a chevron to Jean Summers, '52.

The following suggestions concerning the management of crew in the future are submitted:

1) The head of the freshman crew for the spring be called "manager," not "captian," as she is an appointed official. The freshman crew may elect their own "captain" later

in the spring.

2) The AA reps be elected earlier in the season. When they finally got to work, the results of their efforts were astonishing: from five boats out in an afternoon, we had fifteen. But this enthusiastic attendance came too late in the season, and we felt the girls did not get the proper experience in rowing for the races, as many of them barely qualified for their crews.

3) That the practice of having Miss Dillon give a short talk about a week before the races for captains, coxes and all other interested oarsmen, be continued. The tips on racing procedure and rowing in general were felt to be invaluable.

4) The last and most important suggestion concerns the method of checking attendance. It had been felt that the present system of checking in in a book is too slow and inefficient, and that a card catalogue system should be used instead. A card for each girl would be signed by the hygiene registrar, instead of her attaching her name to a list, which is later transcribed into the book. The cards would be alphabetized in a filing box which could be left in the crew house, on the vol. crew desk. Each card would have a space for name, class, house, preferences for position, and boxes to check the date. Each girl could get her own card as she came in, and the cox or captain of each shell could arrange them by position, thus having the names ready to copy off onto the shell slips. Then she could give them to the head of crew who could fill in the date at her own convenience, instead of being so swamped by girls that she sometimes doesn't even have time to go out herself during the period. This would prevent any girl from rowing who hadn't a card ok'd by Miss Jacques, would keep from cramming the book with lately added names, and would save the head of crew an enormous amount of unnecessarily expended time. When over 100 people have to individually checked in, there is no opportunity for announcements, say nothing of her rowing herself, or some of the girls being held up. I sincerely hope these four suggestions will be adopted and put into practice.

My deepest thanks go to Miss Dillon, without whose encouragement, instruction and assistance crew could not have had its present success. It's a wonderful job that I am passing on to the new head of crew, with every wish for her good luck.

VOLUNTARY CREW --- FALL, 1950

Voluntary crew was quite successful this fall--of the three-hundred and thirty-five persons who originally signed up, two-hundred and seventy-one came out for practice at least once, and one-hundred and thirty whole seasons and seventy-three half seasons were awarded. During the first week of classes, sign-up lists were posted in the freshmen dorms, including Munger and Tower Court, and also on the A.A. and class boards. The names were given to Miss Jacques twice during the end of the week to keep from putting too much extra work on her at one time. To keep things running smoothly until the season really got under way, temporary captains were appointed in every dorm.

The crew supper this year was under the protection of Barbara Flood, '55, who did a bang-up job. We used ZA again--it was the only society not having an initiation dinner at home that evening--and had a menu similiar to last spring's crew supper. Ninty persons were present, but Barbara had consulted the kitchen at Shafer as to the amounts to cook, so everything worked out well. An innovation was the candied sweet potatoes, which set the ham off to perfection.

Twelve freshmen crews and six upperclass crews contested for the championship--Navy and Pomeroy coming out on top. The finals were held in perfect weather--not much wind and enough light in both races, although the second heat just beat the night.

sixty crewers with good appetitâs consumed approximately twenty pounds of stewed hamburger meat on mashed potatoes, jello salad with nuts, celery, and carrots, buttered rolls and jam, all topped off with ginger bread ala mode and steaming coffee.

The day of the races was cold and cloudy, but not rainy. The upperclass races began right on schedule at 3:40 and the freshmen followed successfully before dark settled down on Lake Waban, to close the fall crew season once again.

This season has been a profitable one, both in the number of girls who turned out for crew and also in the lasting friendships that were made. It is with deep appreciation and warm memories that I bring this report to a close. ~~was~~ The job that I longed for, worked for, and completely enthusiastically has been passed on to Ginny Stulken and Windy Patterson. I wish both of them the best and luck, and I'm sure that crew will continue to climb in popularity under their guidance.

Many thanks go to Miss Watt for her encouragement and hard work all season - that cheerful smile from the boat on cold cloudy days was more than welcome.

The freshman crew captain was appointed. It is Barbara Flood, who was the captain of the victorious Noanett crew.

Best of luck, Ginny, and I know you'll have a successful year - you've been a wonderful help to us this fall!

FACTS REGARDING DOWER CREW

Preliminary race was originally scheduled for Nov. 9 & 12

The last possible chance to attend voluntary was Nov. 7

On Nov. 5~~6~~ Dower had only 3 girls who had met the requirement

On. Nov. 6~~7~~ Dower had only 8 girls who had met the requirement

On. Nov. 7~~8~~ Dower had 11 girls who had met the requirement

Crews were required to have a total of 11 girls in order to take care of necessary substitutions

On either Nov. 5~~xxx~~ 6 two girls were added to the Dower group to assure them of having at least nine people plus one substitute

It was suggested to all groups that were ~~base~~ combined houses that they arrange to have each house represented and if necessary draw lots in selecting their crews. I especially urged that they be cordially and fair to the minority groups

The two people who were added to the Dower crew had both been out the required number of times by Nov. 2

At the time groups were combined there were 9 groups represented that did not have the required 11 girls. It was necessary to combine this in ways which would give the greatest number of girls an opportunity to row.

I believe Dower made very little effort to inform the two new members about practices and races

B. Weld called Dower and said she could row in the Preliminaries. She was told she was not needed. Dower has not contacted her about practices or Finals

Dower is to be commended for their ~~Dorm~~ spirit. It is unfortunate that it was not stronger earlier in the season

In-as-much-as Dower as a crew was not eligible to row, I feel strongly that the Dower-Joslin-Commuter crew should be representative of the combined group. This was not checked in the preliminary races because at that time I had no indication that my suggestions were not being followed.

I believe Dower has made it quite obvious that they do not want the others to row with them. They took it upon themselves to cross out the names of the others on the posted list without even an explanation.

And finally, without these two additional people Dower would not have ~~even~~ been scheduled to race.

CREW REPORT FOR FALL OF 1943

Crew this Fall was a double-header affair, combining Interdormitory crew with class crew because of the absence of a Spring sports season. Interdormitory crew was stressed for the major part of the season because of the fine large number of sign-ups, and the enthusiasm of the Freshman and Sophomores especially. It was thought that Dorm crews would give a greater number of people a chance to participate, and also not discourage the people who really liked to row, but who possibly would not make Class Crews. Dorm Crew was more successful than ever before--there were ten Freshman house boats and six upperclass boats. In order to be eligible for Class Crew, it was decided that a person must participate and show interest in Dorm Crew. It was decided at an A.A. Board meeting that in order for a class to enter a boat in the Class Races, it must have five substitutes--also people who had displayed interest. The purpose of this ruling was to prevent people from being dragged in at the last minute to row, a practice which had been very much in evidence last Spring. It was also hoped that an effort would be made to prevent any cliquy business in the choosing of the Class Crews.

House captains were appointed for Dorm crew, and they arranged for a certain day each week when their crew would practice. Two heats of races were run off both for the Fresh men and the upperclass houses. Then the crews which had come in first and second in these heats were raced against each other to determine the final winners. For the Freshmen Homestead was first, followed by Noanett, Webb, and Norumbega. In the upperclass races Shafer was the victorious crew, followed by Beebe, Stone-Davis, and Munger. These races were run off the week before the Class Crew Races which were held on the afternoon of November 4th.

class { Rainy weather prevented class crews from getting as much practice as they wished but the race was a good one. The Seniors failed to meet the requirement of the five subs, and would have been disqualified, but a petition signed by the other class captains was voted and accepted by the A.A. Board to the effect that the Seniors should be allowed to race. Giving tradition a jolt on Nov. 4th, the Soph Crew was victorious, with the Juniors 2nd, the Seniors 3rd, and the Freshman 4th.

This crew season could be called a very successful one--also proving the worth of Dorm Crew as shown by the enthusiastic turn-out of people. There were 172 sign-ups, and 133 people who came out at least once. Seven times out was considered a season, and 29 girls met this requirement.

The rule that a girl could not row two hours in one day was enforced, and in order to make it easier for the Freshmen and Sophomores who had required crew to row--with their house crews--a number of them were allowed to change the time of their class to the 4:40 hour, when the voluntaries from their house came down. Although this solved one problem, it sometimes meant that there were no places in the boats for some people. For the last half of the season there were seven boats out every day at 4:40. The great popularity of crew as a required sport was partly responsible for this, but voluntaries were very much in evidence--very gratifying.

After the Races on Nov. 4th, the Captain of the '47 Crew, Betty Jones duly christened the Freshman boat--"Suivez-moi!" (I neglected to mention earlier that the Freshmen and Sophomores entered boats in the Second Crew Races--the Sophs were the winners.)
