End of Season Report

Crew began this year of Monday, September 23. The student teachers were: Ann McDaniel, Candy Clarke, Faye Harned, and Debbie Hall. The turnout was generally good with from three to five shells going out each day. By the qualification deadline, sixty-eight girls had met the requirement of having gone out three times. From these girls the follbwing dorm crews were formed: Bates, Cazenove, Claflin, McAfee-Freeman=Munger. Shafer, and Severance-Pomeryy-Beebee. These crews then practiced in the morning and afternoon until the Time trials which although originally scheduled for Tuesday, October 15. were re-scheduled to Wednesday, October 16 to give the crews more time to practice before the deadline. The four best times turned in by 5:00P. M. Wednesday October 16 were turned in by: Cazenove, McAfee-Freeman-Munger, SeverancerPomerpy-Beebee, and Shafer. These four crews then chose lanes and shells for the race. The four finalists practiced not more than twice a day until the day of the race, Wednesday, October 23 at 4:30PM. The weather was excellent all season with the exception of some early morning fog.

The weather was good the day of the race except for some wind which though not serious did slow the shells. The race was one of the closest in Wellesley history (all shells coming in ithin two seconds of each other) with a tie for third and fourth places. The winner was Cazenove. Refreshments were served after the announcement of the winner of the race.

The season went well with good weather and fairly good participation. My only recommendation would be to find some
better means of publicizing crew as the turnout. especially among freshman was not as good as exspected.

The only expenditure thus far was for refreshments after the race which amounted to $\$ 8.00$.

## A. A. Grew -- Fall 1967

The crew season began on Monday. Soptember 18. Girls who helped with teaching and running the aftemoon program ware Libby Anderson, Jenny Cook, Judy Fromson, Wendy Judge, and Lonnie Laszlo. By the qualification deadine. Wednesday, October 4. 132 had rowed at least once, and 81 girls had qualified for the inter-corm races by rowing at least 3 times. From these girls seven crews were formed: Pates, Caz-Shafer, Claflin-Severance, MoAfee-Munger-Freeman, Pomeroy, Stone-Beebe, Tower Court. The time trial deadline was Tuesday. October 10 at 5:00 P.M. Bates. Caz-Shafer, McAfee-Munger-Freeman, and Tower Court turned in the four best times (although Clarlin-Severance turned in a time that was better than three of the crews' that qualified, they didn't do it until after 5:00). The four finalists practiced once or twice a day until Wednesday. October 18, the day of the InterDomm Crew Race. Weather throughout the season was beautiful -no rain and very little wind. The only problem enountered was some early moming fog which prevented timing on Tuesday. Oct. 10. The day of the race vas cloudy, but the rain held off until after the race. Caz-Shafer came in first, Nafee-MungerFreeman second. Tower Court third, and Bates fourth. After the race, the proposed campaign for a fifth crew shell was announced. and fefreshments were served. One week later, a challenge race was held between Stone-Beebe and Claflin-Severance, which the latter won.

The season as a whole went very well. Weather was good and response was excellent. The only problem that I can see is the one caused by having to eliminate almost half of the crews that qualified because of a lack of facilities to accommodate them.

A.A.Crew began this year on October 2 and continued through November6. he calendar was set up last Spring and 200 copies were run off at that time. Publicity for the season included an exhibit at the Feeshman Open House, announcements and posters in the dorms and posters on the outside bulletin boards and at the El wable. The calendars were passed out at the Open House and at the A.A. Crew practices. Because of a conflict with Academic Council, the interdorm races were moved up to October 3l, and the qualification date was moved to October 23. The number of times out to qualify was therefore changed to three. Crew was continued until November 6 when the crew party was held.

The total number of girls who came out at least once was 91. Of these 17 were seniors, 14 were juniors, 20 were sophomores and 49 were freshmen.

The boat house was finished on October 25, when for the first time in two years all four shells could be stired under cover. Thus wé were able to use all four shells in the rsces.

## A.A. Crew -- Fall, 1962

With mixed emotions $i{ }^{W}=\mathrm{was}$ learned that Miss Frolich, the crev advisor had won a Fulbright scholarship for this year and so would not be with us. We wished her luck, but were dismayed to lose her help. However, as soon as wa got to know Miss Vaughan, we were reassured that the program would not fall through gn account of an advisor. Before we left school in the spring, we set up the cre calendar for the fall, and had 175 copies printed up, to be ready in the fall.

Unfortuantely, the fall season was plagued by minor dqpdt/ disasters; however, Ben Lombard, our boatman, came to out rescue each time and helped us to comtinue. For futmre reference, if the lake should be drained, it is possible to build ramps out into the lake so that the shells can be kept out in the water, and not run ageound. ${ }^{1}$ so, if, after a violent storm, thd lake submerges the landing area, remind the cress to wear boots!
$=$ According to plans laid in the fẋz, we made arrangements fof the open house for freshmen and for a demonstration of the new shells, at a meeting of the heads the first week we got back. Since out major problem was publicity, we ga alllgot together and made all the posters for the season that first week, so that they could go up on time. Exhibits were made in each dorm, the Fl Table, the Rec Building, and the Gym, for the demonstration and christeniig, and the regular season.

The demonstration on the 26 September was preceeded by the christening of the shells by the class presidents. Unfortunately, the sophomorg shell did not come when scheduled so that that shell has not been christened yet; this may want to be done thdis spring. Instead of risking damage to the shells by using ginger ale bottle, we used
red and yellow painted light bulbs encased in plastic bags, with the appropriate coll er of ribbon tied around it. The class crews were used in the demonstration, having been out for practice atleast once before that day. Although there was much publicity, the turn out was rather disappointing.

The regular A.A. crew season started on Oct. 1 and ran through Nov. 8 the day of the racex. Qualification was supposed to be 4 times out by Oct. 31 (Wed.) Hardy However, due to the fact that we could not take the shells out when it was raining, and therefore, may girls unexpectedly could not qualify, and also, we needed more time between qualification and the races to allow for bad weather, we changed the qualification date back to Tuesday, October 30, but with only three times out.

Except for a few important dates, we were blessed with excellent weather, with the result that unfortunately some people often had to wait 29 minutes or so for a chance to go out; it also discouraged some, I am aftaid.

The attendance procedure was simplified by having Miss Vaughan check each girl as she signed for the first time to see that she was qualified for strenuous activity, with a list from the phys ed. dept. This also meant that we did not have to use the xign-up sheets. This fact explains why we did not have figures of those who had signed up, as opposed to those who came out. I do not feel that the fact that we did not use the sign up sheets affected the attend dene one way or the other, since all the dorms had calendars posted anyway, with announcements being read.

Expenses for the season included $\$ 350$ for publicity, the colt of approximately 175 calendars (this was a good amount) \$列 $\$ 3.10$ for 5 doz. doughnuts, and \$__ for 2 jars of cider, as well as the crew cup engraving and the freshmen banner.

On Tuesday, October 9, the crew heads and advisors got together at the Well to decide on dorm captains. Unfortunately, Severence, Davis, and Munger did not have anyone to take on this position. Those chosen were:

It should be mentionsed in bold print, that my assistanst were Jaanne Coombs, junior, and Janet Woldman, sophomore. There help at practices and baling me out of hot water was utterly amazing.

Six teams finally qualified for the races, so that each crew was required to participate in a time trial, with the best three times provideng the participants for the races on Thursday. The results in order were: Claflin, McAffe, Bates, Quad, Confusion(Stone, Munger, Severence, and Tower) and Freeman.

The season's winners were: Claflin (1:54.3), Bates ( $1: 55,3$ ) and McAfee (1:58.2). Judges for the event were: Miss Beverly Bullen, Mrs. Jean Marsh, Mrs. Rotrbotham, and Miss C $\alpha x / 2 /$ Hulac. Three student timers were also used. After the races, the crew party was held in the canoe house and the results of the races were announced as well as the new officers: Janet Woldman, Head; Judy Cooper, Assistant, '65; Marjorie Williams, Assistant: '66.

Suggedtions for next year:
a. Plan season with three times out as the qualification requirement, but move the date earlier to allow more time to practice. Also, look into the possibility of ending the season before dad the time
change, since it gets dark too early afterwards.
b. Appoint someone other than the officers to help permanently with beginners on the machines, who would be able to be there most of the time.
c. Perhaps try a little-sister campaing in each dorm to drum up enthusiasm -- have each person who comes out reponsible for getting someone else out.
d. Emphasize for the experienced rowers the safety rules... eg. getting in and out correctly etc.
e/ thank your lucky stars that all// the bad luck must have happened last year!

## A. A. Crew

Fall 1961
On September 20 a meeting of heads and advisor was held to discuss plans for the fall season and for freshman open house, September 22. New posters were made and placed in the El Table, Rec Building, and at the Index Board. Sign-up lists were posted in the dorms September 25 and were taken down noon September 28. Sign-ups both in the dorms and at the open house were very good and indicated great enthusiasm.

The season opened October 2. To inaugurate the new crew shell, the senior crew was invited to give a rowing exhibition. With all the excitement over the new shell plus the good weather attendance was very good. Record attendance was set on October 18 when 52 girls came out for crew. Previously crew had been held on 7 v at $4: 40$. It was decided to have both $3: 30$ and $4: 40$ crew thereafter in orden to accommodate large groups. By the qualifying deadline, October 25, three doms had full crews--Bates, McAfee, and Pomeroy. The remainder were paired up as follows: Munger-Stone, Claflin-Tower-Severance, and Beebe-Shafer. In the preliminary races, held the week of October 30, the Claflin-Tower-Severance and Bates crews were eliminated, the four best times being chosen as finalists. The finals were held on November 2. Two races were held, because the new shell was not raced. MoAfee and MungerStone competed in the first race and Pomeroy and Beebe-Shafer raced in the second. Finishing times were used to determine which crew placed first, second, third, and fourth. McAfee won the race with a time of 1:51.5, just one-tenth of a second ahead of second place Beebe-Shafer, whose time was 1:51.6. Pomeroy and Munger-Stone finished third and fourth with times of 1:53, and 1:56.5 respectively. Total points were as follows:

The results of the race were announced at a party following the races. Also at the party were announced the names of honor list winners and of the new crew heads. They are: Anne Murray, '64, head, Joanne Coombs,'64, and Lois Boulware, '65, assistant heads. Expenses for the season included multigraphing ( 300 calendars), crew party, and crew cup engraving.

Several suggestions were made this seasnn for future reference. First, preliminary races, if necessary, should be run on a time basis, the three best times (assuming that there are six shells) being placed in one heat, and the three worst times being placed in the second heat. Shells in each heat race each other and the finishing is based on the best time. Second, it was suggested that the day of the final race be moved up a week partly because of Acadernic Council which meets on the same day as the races, and in order to give more time for practice between the preliminary races and the final races. Third, it was decided that if calendars are to be distributed at freshmen open house, 750 should be printed; otherwise 100 should be printed.

Fourth, it was decided to have a sophomore elected crew head because she would be more likely to be able to continue as head the fall of her junior year than would a senior. One assistant was to be elected from the freshmen and the other assistant was to be elected from either the sophomores or the juniors.

Special thanks go to Ben for keeping the shells so trim, for adjusting our slides, and for his words of encouragement before the races; to Miss Frohlich for all her helpful suggestions, and to Sue and Kathy for their fine cooperation in making this season the success that it was.

This Fall we were grated asch by a cleaned up crew house which Ben Lombard had worked so hard on all summer; all the oars were revarnished and painted and the rudedens etc were painted to match their shells. Benches wore put in and on the whole it was an hundred per cent improvement from the way the crew house was left in the Spring 。

As Susie had too many labs it was decided that Lan Virden would relieve her as head of crew and Susie would take Lyn's place as assistant head. Judy Francisco continned in the capacity cf assistant. Prelimenary meetings were held with the assistanks and Miss Frolich to plan a schedule for the new class system. We decided that we would hate to play it by ear and thus did not make out a calendar on Freshman open house we recieved many sign ups and then latowmany more with dorm signups. The total of 175 origional sign ups is larger than in years past, however only 39 of those coming out at least once (62) were origional signups.

The season had a slow start which I credidt to two reasons the switch to a class system mather than the usual dorm system, and the fact that for the first time boating permits were required. This seemed to affect the upperclassmen more than the sophomores and freshmen. After two weeks of struggling with a very few people, A.A. voted to let us return to the dorm system. By then the season was half over but by getting rests in every dorm we managed to get 36 girls qualified and thus have Pour shells for the races on 3 November; Pomeroy, Beebe-Shafer, Navy-Dower-Iower, and Munger-Stonembaviso Cazenove. As the day for the races was also the day for blood donations on campus we ran into a few problems and had to find some substitutes at the last minute. There was one subsititute each in the Beebe-Shafer and the Hunger conglomerate. It was a very windy day and difficult for lining up but we finally managed. BeebemShafer won the race in 2.09 seconds and 79.6 points, Pom was second with 77.9 ; Manger conglomerate third with 55.3 ; and the Navy etc fourth with 40.6 .

At a party after the races the head announced the new officers for next yearsMartha Leich'63 as heads Alice Barney '63 and Susan Goodpaster'64 as assistant. We spent $\$ 7.36$ on cider and donuts for refreshments, figuring on one gallon of cider for twenty people. These were our only expenses all season.

Although there were more origional sign ups than usual, less girls came out for crew. However the percentage was higher for those coming out more than once of those that did come out.

My thanks to Hiss Frolich for her very able assistance and moral support, Susie and Judy for doing most of the dirty work, and Ben for his ever present smile to greet us otis quick repairs and for keeping the crew house looking splendid all Fall.

On September 25 th , the newly appointed crew head and the new faculty advisor discussed the Freshman Open House and the coming ${ }^{\text {T}} 59$ Fall crew season. The need of appointing two assistants and getting sign-up sheets ready was seen and planned for.

September 25 th was Freshman Open House, at which crew had a display. The number of sign-ups was good, considering the number of freshmen present. By the 28th of September, signmup sheets were up in every dorm and posters were at the E1 Table, Index Board, and aramid campus. The dorm sign-ups were sparse, due, I think, to the lack of publicity by the dorm reps at sign up time. I suggest stronger dorm campaigns for crew at this time and at the beginning of the season, to insure participation from the start. The suggestion (made by list year's crew head) of appointing rather than electing dorm captains was taken. This resulted in having captains that could be better relied on for enthusiasm and leadership.

Two assistants were appointed and the hours that the head and assistants would supervise at crew were decided upon. Participation was slow at the beginning ( October fth), but many more seemed to come out regularly and enthusiastically at the middle of the season. By the end of the qualifying period, five crews were formed; Stone, Munger-Caz, Pom-BB, Tower-Sev and Navy (plus others). Dorm crew practice was held a week before the final race. Following last year's procedure, two crews drew "byes" for the preliminaries and three crews raced on November 4 th, The Stone crew was eliminated. The finals were held on November fth, the results being Pom-BB first wi th 86.3 points at a time of 1:55. Second was Mugger Cai with 73.3, Third, Navy, with 51.6, and fourth, Tower-Sev, with 39.7. The crew party was held after the final race, at which time the head announced that the new crew head was Susan Baich, 61 , and her assistants, Chartis Be11, '62, and Judy Francisco, '63.

Crew's budget for Fall of '59 went for mimeographing the crew calendar, and $\$ 4.00$ for refreshments after the race. The budget, as given the head by the treasurer of A.A., was;

Preparations for theFall Crew Season began on September 25, when the officers and advisor helda meeting at the well. at that fime, the head presented her lab situation, and it was decided thet the problon cowld be handled, with the assistabts sharing the $3: 40$ hours between themselves, and $h$ ha the head takinc over many of the duties usually assigned to the essembaris. It was decided that inte orem season should begin October I, a Wednesday.

Though posters were put up on every available signboard on csmpas, sign-ups were not good; the orew season began with average attendence, but slowly began to drop off efter the first week. Rather than appoint dorn orew captains, thus hevingboth orew reps end A.A. Reps in the seme dorm, the officers decided they would return to the ad system of letting dorms eleot their bwn reps after the season had started, thus utilizingthe A.A. rejs as our contacts at the beginning of the season. The head experienced less then no cooperation in many dorras, and although the A.A. reps were to run the elections of dorm crew captains, many oftnera never turned in the resuists.. In view of this, I would suggest that this election system be abandoned, and the head recourse to appointments of ores captains in each dorm.

As participation fell off, the hasd phoned hot. reps and existing dorm reps, but this seened to have no overall effect. Iven a second round pf phoning ahd a poster showing pumbers cualified posted s.t the Index Board had little effect on general participation. Thus qualification for dorm crews wes very sparse; only Freeman and Nanger could muster up full oreve, and after combining on the basis of numbers of people qualified, three mo e orows were formed; Beebe-Stone, Severance-Pom, and Claflin-Caz. Practice wes held for the week before the preliminaries. Since there were five orews, and only four could race in the finals, a draming was held to determine which three orews vould race in the preliminaries. The three combination orews drew preliminaries, und the race was held the day before the finals. The Stone-Beobe crew was elininated. The finals were held on Thursday, llowember 6; Wiss Eullon, Miss Brown, and Miss Barrett judgod. The results wero: first, Sev-erance-Fbn; second, Freenan; third, Claflin combination; and fourth, Hunger.

Oct 28 - This was the last day that members could qualify for their house crews by having four times out by this date. The total number of crews was ten, distributed in the following manner: Bates 2, Nionger 2, Pomeroy 1, Severance 1, Claflin 1, Homesteadl, Nayy 1, and One crew consisting of people from Beebe, Caz and Stone called the "Flu" Crew.

Oct 22-Novl, to do this in two days, th en take a third day also. Nov 4,5 , The preliminary races were held and the winners of each of the four races are the ones which race in the finals held on Nov 7. Noveme ber 6, left for a rain date, was used for the crews to practice.

Nov. 11, A meeting was held with $M^{\perp}$ ss Bullen to discúss honor lists. This list along with the names of New heads of crew is included in the statistice.

In concluding thispart of thelreport, my thanks to Miss Bullen for being so helpful throughout the season. Without her guidance of the crews and her cheerfulness in spite of unfortunate or unforseen incidents the season would not have been at all sucessful. Thanks to Lary for being so patient with the late crews and keeping the shells in such good shape for the races. To Miss Jaques and Mrs. Daly for being so patient when the names trickled in through out the season, thanks also. Vicki and Alie with whom the season was suffered and enjoyed know how grateful I am to them both for theif depenability and enthusiasm.

I have tried to include some suggestions for future heads of crew from the mistakes that I have made, and hope they will have as pleasant a season as the 1957 fall crew season.

## FALL CRIEI SEASORI- 1956

## I Preparations:

The fall schedule was formulated in June 1956 and early in the fall five hundred copies were printed by the Viltigraph office for A. A. Grew. There were enough for everyone participating to have her own schodule. Signup sheets were posted in every dorm and at the FI Table, and posters were placed in strategic spots on campus. Aatensive use of the inder boand and personal pontact wore the means of publicizing the many events during the season.

II Plan of the seasons
The fall exer season began on Wednesday Ootober 3rd at 3 sh, O. Cren practices were held every weokday aftermoon excent Thursday from $384,0=$ 5 PM.

The flrst four and onemalf veeks of crew were spent in general practice when people were taught and vere given the opportunity to inpwave their skily in connection with qualifying for the dorm crevs by November 2ond.

The crew preliminaries were held on November 5 th and 6 th and the final race and the crov party were held despite rain on Thursday, Nov. 8员 at 3alio.

III Procedure of season and statistics.
366 persons signed for crev either on the signup sheets or later vith Wiss Jaques. The class distrit bution vas as follows:

Upon Miss Jaque's suggestion, to save time, we transfermed names directiy from the signup sheets to the regular crew cards and alphabetized them by
class. From these cards the list of those who had signed was made and at the same tine it was noted on the cards if a girl was disqualified because of health or swiming ability. We found this systom a most efficient one and it is recomended for use in the future.

During the second weekof crew house crew captains were elected. Those who served in this capacity weres


The captains were constantly informed of their dorm's progress in the qualification of a crev and they wore used as a means of getting events publicized in the dornitories. Posters were put ug by the Index Board every day of the last week in which people could qualify to show the standing of each dorm.
T. This season we were able to break the existing record for the highest muber of cxew seasons ever earned in one season. The previous record was established in the fall of 1953 when 176 seasons were earmed-u-a season being Pive times out. This fall with six times out counting as a season We have 163.5 seasons. The difference added by counting those who have five times out this year goes over the 176 of the former record.

## IV Races:

This fall we were fortunate to have every house except Homestead ree presented in the creews that qualified for the preltminary races. The following shells qualified for the preliminary racess

Betes, Beebe-Shafer, Cazenove, Claflin, Davis, Preeman-Stone, Hunger, Navys Pomeroy, Severance, and Tower. Wavy and Tower and Munger atch quatified two crews. The preliminary races were held Nonday Nov. 5th at 4840 and Tuesday, Nov. Gth at 3840 and at 4840 . Difficulities caused by early dark ness made it necessary to place lights on the bows of the shells and on the finish buoys Thedday aftermoon. The shells that placed first and second In the prelinnnery races were able to compete in the finals. These crews were: Davis, Mreman-Stone, Munger $A_{9} N_{\text {avy }} A_{2}$ Soverance, and Tower A. Despite the rain Thurday afternoon we decided to go ahead with the race since it was not a cold dxy and since there seomed to be no other feasible time for the race. ## FALL CREN SEASON 1955

## I. Preparations:

Preparations for the fall crew season began late in the summer with the formulation of a schedule for the season. After this schedule was checked by Miss Bullen and then with the college calendar, it was printed.

Sign-up sheets and several posters were made soon after return to school. The sign-up sheets went to each dorm, the El Table, and to the AA Open House. Posters were put up at the EI Table, the Crew House, and the AA Open House.

Notices were posted periodically at the Index Board in Founders, for both regular and special practices.

## II. Plan of the Season:

The fall crew season began on Monday October 3rd at 3:40. Crew practices were held every weekday afternoon except Thursdays from 3:40 until 5:00. This late closing time allowed those who had labs to come down after 4:40.

The first four weeks of crew were spent in general practice, at which time it was emphasized that a dorm had to have at least eleven people qualified (four times out) by the 28 th of October in order to have a shell in the finals. The preliminary races were held from Oct. $31-N o v$. 2. The final race was held On November 3 rd.
III. Procedure of Season and Statistics:

367 persons signed up for crew, with over 100 freshmen signing at the AA Open House. The class distribution was as follows:

To facilitate work for Miss Jacques each name, with class and dorm was put on an index card. These were then arranged alphabetically by class. In turn, the regular crew attendance cards were made for use at the Crew House.

Crew attendance sheets which had the names of all those in the dorm who had signed for crew were sent to each captain, or representative from that dorme A week later a letter was sent telling these captains the names of those who had already been out and how many times. Just before the preitiminaries another letter was sent confirming the names of those who had qualified.

A chart was made and placed in the Crew House which kept all informed as to how many people from each dorm were qualified.

## IV. Races:

For the first time in the history of crew three dorms had enough people qualified to have two crews per dorm. These were Munger, Severance, and Tower. Other dorms who had shells racing in the preliminaries were: Beebe, Cazenove, Claflin, Freeman, Freeman-Munger, Homestead, and Navy.

Three days of preliminary races were necessary. The shells who placed Ist and 2nd in each preliminary were able to compete in the finals. Due to heavy rains on Tuesday that race was held at 4:40 on Wednesday. The following crews were in the finals: Claflin, Freeman, Munger A,

Munger B, Severance A, and Tower A.
The crews were judged for slow form, racing form, and placing in the race. Munger B was the winner, with Freeman 2nd, and Tower A 3rd.

## V. Crew Party:

The first crew party was held in the Rec Building on Wednesday after the races. To the few who came at 5:15 there was hot cider and doughnuts. The second crew party, consisting of cold cider and day-old doughnuts, was held in the Crew House right after the finals on Thursday.

## VI. Suggestions:

When it is necessary to have a six lane final it would seem better to eliminate the judging of racing form for the following reason: it is next to impossible to see the shells in the first two lanes.

## FALL CREW REPORT - 1954

General preparations and plans:
A.A. Fall Crew opened officially on Oct. 4, 1954 at 3:40 after much turmoil. Due to many unfortunate occurences during the summer, I was "given" the position as Head of Crew and Mary Lord was appointed assistant. Under these circumstances, we were unable to begin any preparations for crew during the summer, and this make things rather hectic in the first few weeks of school.However, sign-up sheets were finally made one for each dorm, El Tabie, and the A.A. Open House. These had to be taken down after two days so that Miss Jacques could "okay" each prospective rower. As a result only 365 people signed up. But gradually the number increwased to 417, thanks to Miss Bullen's daily announcements in gym classes, the work of A.A. Reps, and especially the urging (?) of avid "crewists" in their respective dorms. Also eight or so large posters were made by Anne Ransdell, the "de facto " and consulting Ex-Head of Crew. They were beautiful and we really appreciated her work and the results they brought. Again, in the way of publicity, the Index Board was invaluable for reminding people of the qualifying dates and races, etc..

So that people would know qualifying dates and plans of the season in general, sheets with this information were posted in each dorm and Crew House. However, it was still necessary to keep reminding people to come and get seasons.

There was a general practice period with 15 possible times to participate. In order to be elegible to row on a dorm crew, each person had to be out four times by 0ct. 29. As usual, therewere problems, and so Thurs. ( the day before the deadine) was used as a "catch up" practice. Also since it was hard for people with labs to come at the $3: 40$ hour everyday,it was voted to lengthen the time for A.A. Crew from 3:40-4:30 to $3: 40-5: 10$. This bought great results.

In order to get a season, each person had to be out 6 times by Nov. 4. We tried to encourage people to finish up their seasons, even though they weren't rowing on a crew, and we were very pleased at the number of people who took advantage of this even if they had to row on the machines. - Crew captains were elected during the second week and we certainly couldn't have gotten along without them. They made sure their dorm had enough people qualified and they were the main link between the dorms and the Heads of Crew. Each one was sent a letter with instructions, etc., plus a list of people who had signed up for crew and the number of times each had been out as of that date. Later on, we adwised each dorm to make a farge chart with places for each girl to put a check after her name whenever she went out. This served as another reminder for the more "lackadaisical" crewers. In general I think these captains did more good than all-college notices and helped their dorms to realized the fun of the sport, whichis what we tried to emphasize, rather than winning the races. ## The Rades:

In all, there were 16 boats racing, so it was necessary to have three preliminaries, Mon., Tues., and Wed. afternoon at $3: 40$. The first and second place winners of each preliminary then raced in the Finals on Thumsday. In order for each coz to prepare for the race, there was a drawing for boats and lanes immediately after each preliminary. We were unable to have a final practice for the 6 crews racing on Thurs. If possibe it would be much better if this could be worked into the schedule next year, although I don't think anyone suffered a bery drastic setback for lack of such a practice. Another big help was Anne Ransdell, the ex-head of crew, who even though ahe was pracitically in the hospital, took time
to make the whole exhibition for the A.A. Open House and supplied me through out my term with posters, reminders, and advice.

And, I couldn't forget Mr. Marshall who kept the boats in such excellent condition( as always) and was willing to stay down at the crew house until 5:10 every night.

My last thank you's go to all the crew captains for their enthusiasm and support.

## Fall Grew Report -1953

## I. Preparations:

Prepartions for the fall crev season were begun in the late summer to ease the general rush curing the actual season. A tentative outline of plens for the eeason vas drewn up and sent to Miss Bullen, crew feculty advisor, for approvel and further sugcestione.

Sign up sheets were mare in advance with what we hoped WEs an eye-catching deaign. (At least it was colorful!) There was one for every dorm, one for the 41 Table, and one for the Froshman A. A. Opon House.

Five Iarge crew posters were made. (I will not commit myself to juege the esthetio qualities of these posters excopt that the word CREs stood out above all else, which was the purpose. A1so emphestred ves --mANY DAY EXCEDP MHURSDAY AR 3:40 RATM OR SHTNTE:!:!:!!

At the beginning of thepeason sheets with the crew schedule and deadilnes were drawn up. Again there was one for every dorm and the crew house. It $1 s$ also wise to make an extra large one for the In Table. (Lethergic poople heve a tendency torards myopia.)

The Index board as another publicity method wos used extensively. Again a word of waming .... make sure that the notice begins. "ALL". If it starts with CREW people are 11kely to skip right over it.

II. Plan of Peasón:

Aff the outset of the season, the plans for crow included a playday with Clark and Lasell Junior College. Unfortunately
this plan dic not materialize, but I should like to recommend it strongly for next year $\qquad$ oither in the apring or in the fell.

The rest of the season was to go much the seae as in previous years. Flrst came a certain period of qualification for dormitory erews, practice, preliminarios, and at last the Finals, binatead of inviting just mombers of Voluntary Grev, we asked anyone who wanted to cone. Inls was in keeping with our attempt to emphasize the iraportance of supporting the crews and to stress the fun of the sport. Thanks to the efforts of the crew aaptains, there was a great deal of interest, int wirm.
III. Procodure of Sesson and Statistics:

The sign up sheets were posted on the date designated. In order for Miss Jaques to have time to check all the people, the sheets had to be takon down after three days. Due to this and the fact that as yet there wore no A.A. Reps, the initial sign up was small, numbering only 230 . When the senson started ennoncements were inse avery day in the erev house urging those who wore already out to persunde othors to come out. The voluntery members were also asked to habout whon to elect for a dome crew centain. By the loth of October the number in voluntery erev hed risen.to 283 . By the 14 th 1t numbered 401 - the largest 81 gn up for crev!

Evory dorm, with the exception of gtone had a suffioient number of people signed up to qualify at least one orev. She election of crom captains took plese after the firgt week of crew. This enabled people to get acquainted with enthusisstic crewors in thelr dorms. The following people were eleoted;

In order to sssure one orew from every doril lettors were sent to oll the captains asking then to keep track of how many were qualifying. An alphabetical 11 st of al2 who had al gnea up for orev in their dorm was enclosed. Later another letter was sent asking them to get up enthusiasn for crew, to make a postor adverising the proliminaries and Finals, and to advertise the "crew Brew," the crow party. Again alpkabetical 11 sts wore included in the lettor. Ihis tine the IIsts stated the antos aach pareon had boan out for crew end the captains were asked to make sure that those who hadn't yot been out knew the way to the Grow House and Iake Waban.

I cannot stoss enough the important pert these dorm captains play in Fall Crev. They enable the Heads of crow to keep the fortunified. In fact they were so. Indispensable that it was decided to elect the ceptains for next fell at the ond of this season. There were eleoted froin the Freshnan, Sophomore, or Junior class. The reasons for electing them now were;

1. The captain would be someone truly interested in crew.
c. It would enable the Head of Crsw to get steted faster in the ses.son
2. it weuld assure the Head of Grow that she would heve at loast one crow from every dorn, and poselbly two.
3. 1t would give the captains more time to wordup enthusiasm.

As the season continued it was alscovered that some people were having a great deal of trouble meeting the qualifiying dates. This was
due to the 3:40 time conflicting whth labs. We agreed, therefore, to abide by the last qualiflcation date only. In other words to qualify for a dorm erew you must have been out four times by the 28th of October. Those who could only manage to get to the Volunatary Hour once a week were sllowed to make up the time elther in a class or on the machines.

As the cualification deadline neared, a chart, changed dally was put up in the crew House. This showed how many yoople hed been out onee, twice, thelae, and how many had qualifted impach eorm. For a dorm to enter one orew in the races they had to have eleven people out four timea by the 28 th, Pomeroy sna claflin just missed qualifying two orews. ## IV Races:

As there were 15 orew\} it was necessary to have three preliminaries Ifve barges in each one. On Monday, Wrve. 2nes, two preliminaries were held.... one at $3: 40$ and the other at 4:10. Due to the pressure of time and dariness the boats were yudged for form two at a time. First and second place boats from each preliminary paced in the Finals on Thuraday. Tuescay, Nov. 3rd one preilminary was held. Imediately after the preliminary on Theadey there was a drawing for boat and lane for the Finals. Mednesday the 4th there was a patctse day for those raing in the Finala. Mrs Marsh, Who very nicely aubstituted for Nise Bullen, who unfontunstely was in tho infimary, gave suggestions about improving form etc.

There were six boaty racing in the Finals on Thureday. A six lane race đows present some problems, however:

1. the 1st lane was very elose to fore and the boats luad to be careful not to hil bottom
2. It is difficult to hear instruations from the committee boat and
also to hesr the start.
3. it is imperative that all the boats keep in their own lanes. If they aon't it onn be'very eangerous and involve a erash, if.
V. Orew Party :

The orew party was held immediately after the Minals in the Rec. Building. This was kive ac an experiment.this year. Before there used to be a crow dinmor in the Well. Not many poople were ever able to attend this because of acaderic end socisl comittments. Sinee the "Crew Brew" was the same afternoon, nost mople felt that sinoe they had already spent the major portion of the afternoon in relaxing they might as well ao a good job of it. Plus there wes the aceed temptation of being able to congratulate the winning orew, get warm and eat. In all there were sbout 150 people at the party and everyone seamed to enfoy themseives.

A srecial vote of thanks should be given to Nancy Mueller '55 and Sandy Perkloy '55 who forevont vatching the pithels to prepare the hot ofder doughnuts, and cookies which were so welcome to cold crew members and spectators allike.

So many thanks ere due to so many people that I hardly know where to begin. Firgt and foremost my most sinsere thanks to liss Bullon without whom the entire sesson would have been a fallure. She never failed to give the right advice, she gave unstintingly of her time, she was fun to work for, and above $2 l l$ she made crew Fun!!!! I am sure everyone in voluntsry srow fools the game way and joins Anita and me in thanixing her.

To mention all the thines I have to thank Anita for would take several more pages. To be brief I have her to thank for one of the best seasons of orev. She did more than her share while I lounged (unwililngly) in the Infirmary. If Crew ever has as good an asgistant head it will be because they followed Nite's model.

A very special thank you to Mrs. Harsh for taking over crew while Miss Mullen was in the Infirmary. Without her help, chances were that the races would have been done in ice-boats.

The following suggestiong concerming the managemont of erow in the fubture are submitted:

1) The head of the freshan crow for tho spring be callod"manager," not "caption," as she is an appointed official. The Ireshman crow may olect thoir own"captain"Iater
in the spring.
2) The AA rops be elected earlier in tieseaoon. When they finally got to work, the results of their efforts were astonishing: from five boats out in an aftemoong we had fipteen. But this onthriastic attondance cane too late in the season, and we felt the girls did not get the proper eup rience in rowihg for the races, as many of them barely quatified for their crevs.
3) That the practice of having Miss Dillon give a shoxt talk about a week before the races for captains, comes and all otior nterestod omsmen, be continued. The tips on racing procedure and rowing in generil ware felt to be inviluable.
4) The last and most important suggestion conewn the nethod of checking attondance, It had been felt that the present system of aleeling in in a book is too slow and inelficiont, and that a card eatalogue systen should be used instead. A card for each girl would be signed by the hygiene registrar, instead of her attaching her name to a list, which is leter transeribed into the book. The carcls would bo alphabetized in a. filing box which coyld be left in the crew house, on the vol. crew desk. Bach cord would have a space for name, class, house, preferences for position, and boxes to check the date. Bach girl could get hor own eard as she came ing and the cox or captain of each shell could arrange them by position, thas haveing the frames ready to copy off anto the shell slips. Then she could give them to the head of crew who could fill in the date at hor own convenionce, instead of being so sampod by girls that she sometimes doesn*t even have tino to go out herself during the period. this wowld prevent any girl from rowing who hadn't a card ok ${ }^{\text {td }}$ by Miss Jacques, would keep from craming the book with lately added names, and would save thopead of crew an enomous mount of umecessarily expended tine. When over 100 people have to indivudually checked ing, there is no opportuni for amouncements, say nothing of her roring hrsief, or some of the girls being held up. I sine rely hope those four suggestions will be adopted and put into practive.

My deepest thanks go to Mss Dillon, without whose encouragenent, instruction and assistance ererr could bot have had its present success. It's a wonderful job that I am passing on to the new head of crew, with overy wish for her good ruck.

## VOLUNTARY CREW --- FALL, 1950

Voluntary crew was quite succassful this fall-of the three-hundred and thirty-five persons who originally signed up, two-hundred and seventy-one cane out for practice at least once, and one-hundred and thiryy whole seasons and seventy-three half seasons were awarded. During the first week of classes, sign-up lists were posted in the freshmen dorms, including Munger and Tower Court, and also on the A.A. and class boards. The names were given to Miss Jecques twice during the end of the week to keep from putting too much extra work on her at one time. The day of the races was cold and cloudy, but not rainy. The upperclass races began right on schedule at 3:40 and the freshmen followed successfully before dark settled down on Lake Waban, to close the fall crew season once again.

This season has been a profitable one, both in the number of girls who turned out for crew and also in the lasting friendships that were made. It is with deep appreciation and warm memories that I bring this report to a close. wne The job that I longed for, worked for, and completely enthusiastically has been passed on to Ginny Stulken and Windy Patterson. I wich both of them the best and luck, and I'm sure that crew will continue to climb in popularity under their guidance.

Many thanks go to Miss Watt for her encouragement and hard work all season - that cheerful smile from the boat on cold cloudy days was more than welcome.

The freshman crew captcin was appointed. It is Barbara Flood, who was the captain of the victorious Noanett crew. Best of luck, Ginny, and I know you'll have a successful year - you've been a wonderful help to us this fall!

Fall Crew Report - 1947

The two people who were added to the Dower crew had both been out the required number of times by Nov. 2
At the time groups were combined there were 9 goups represented that dic not have the required 11 giris. It was necessary to combine this in ways which would give the greatest number of girls an opportunity to row.
I believe Dower made very little effort to inform the two new members about practices and races
B. Weld called Dower and said she could row in the Preliminaries. She was told she was not needed. Dower has not contacted her about practices or Finals
Dower is to be commended for their Dovm spirit. It is unfortunate that it was not stronger earlier in the season
In-as-much-as Dower as a crew was not eligible to rev, I feel strongly that the Dower-Joslin-Commuter crew should be representative of the combined group. This was not checked in the preliminary races because at that time I had no indication that my suggestions were not being followed.
I believe Dower has made it quite obvious that they do not want the others to row with them. They took it upon themselves to cross out the names of the others on the posted list without even an explanation. And finally, without these two additional peopee Dower would not have emen been scheduled to race.
