Guest Speaker: Mrs. Jayne Kelly

• 4th Grade teacher at Wass, Author of <u>Raising Great Kids from Tots to Teens, and In-</u> <u>Between</u>

- Started to notice parents seeking out parenting tips and strategies. While parenting is personal and private, there are many patterns seen in the classroom that highlight the need to partner between school and home
- Respect: Giving it and Getting It
 - Definition of Respect: showing care and giving attention
 - Tip #1: Ask fewer questions (can feel like an interrogation) and try nurturing statements instead ("It's so nice to see you!" "Welcome home!")
 - Tip #2: You must model respect in order to get respect in return: Get on their level, correct the behavior and not the personality, talk and don't yell
 - Handling disrespect respectfully:
 - Correct behavior privately, avoid public humiliation
 - Use "I" or "we" statements to provide alternative behaviors
 - Name and narrate your child's emotion
 - Stay calm
