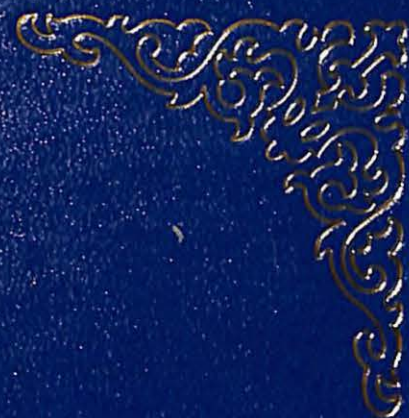

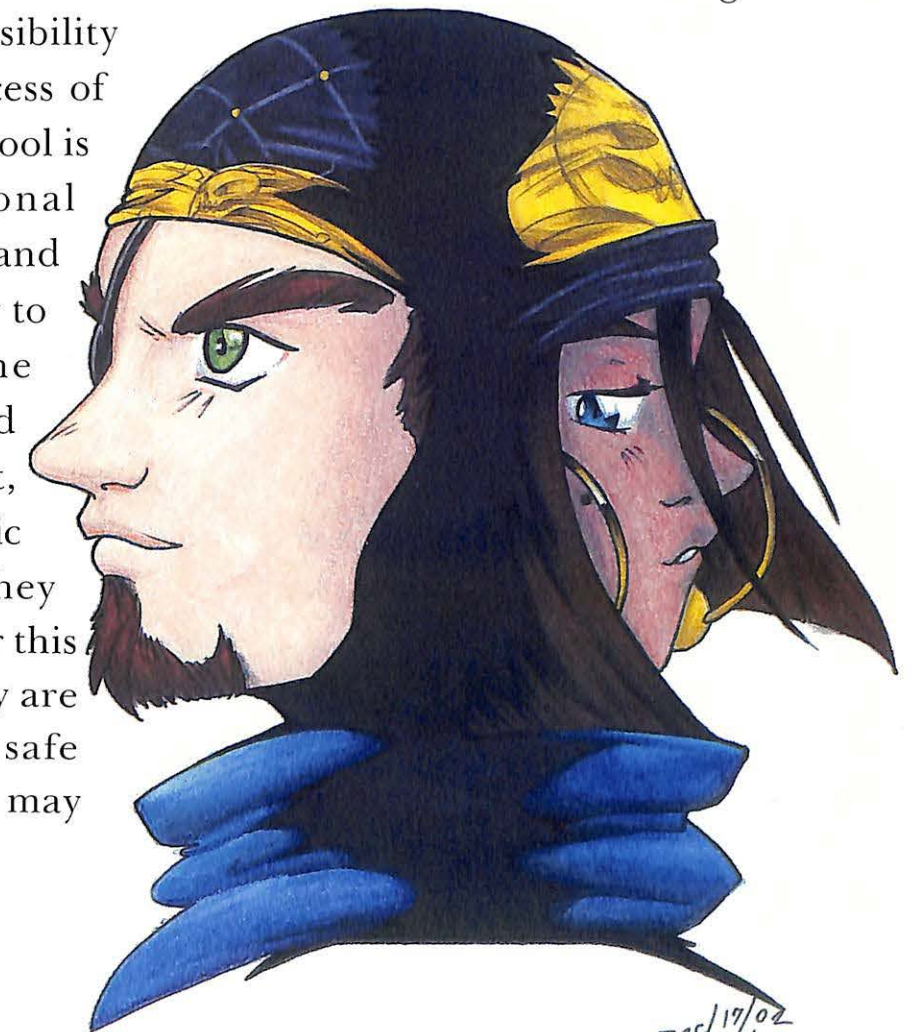

The Antilles High School community provides a world-class educational program that prepares all students in the eligible military and federal communities in Puerto Rico for success in a dynamic global environment.

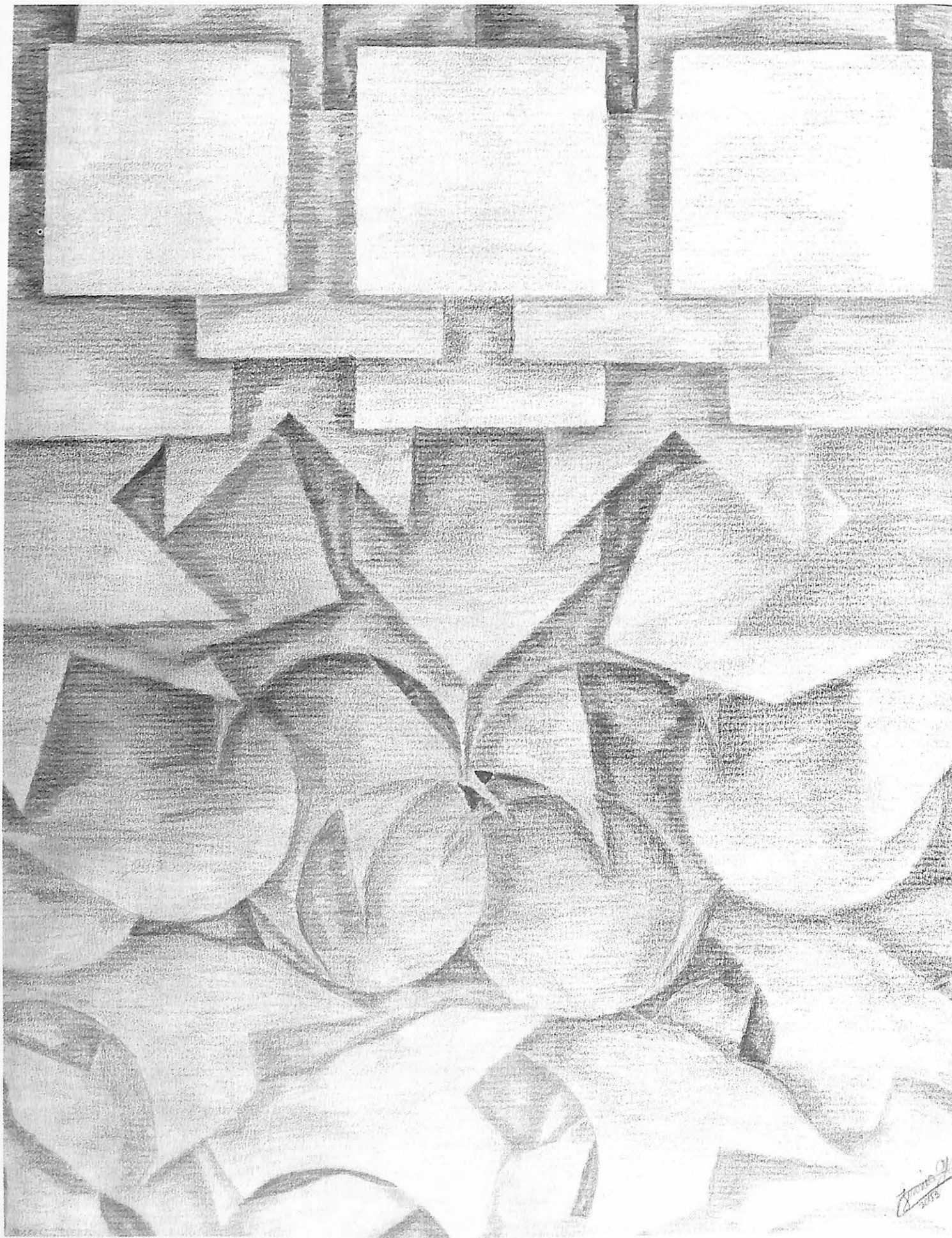
## VISION

# EVOLUTION

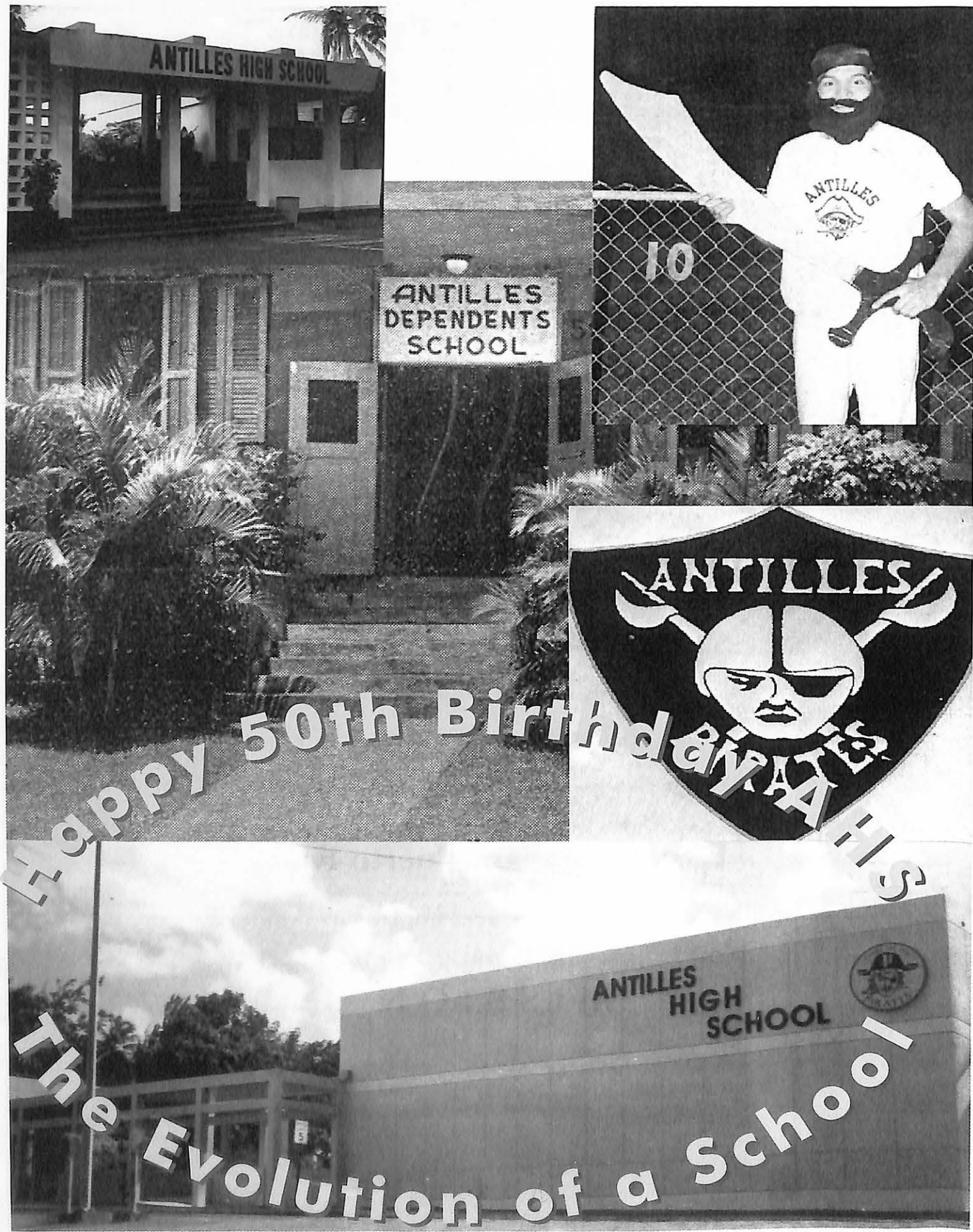

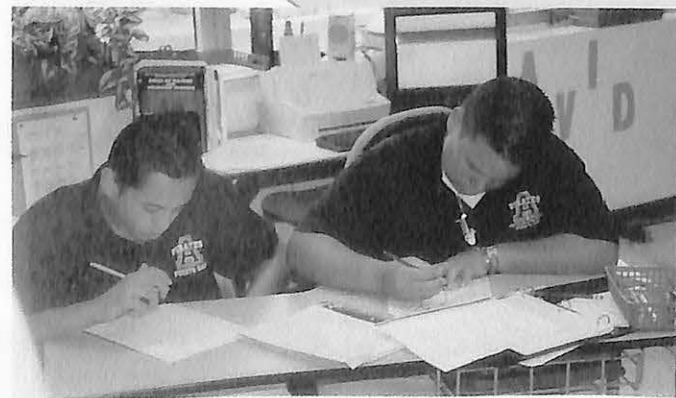
# AVID

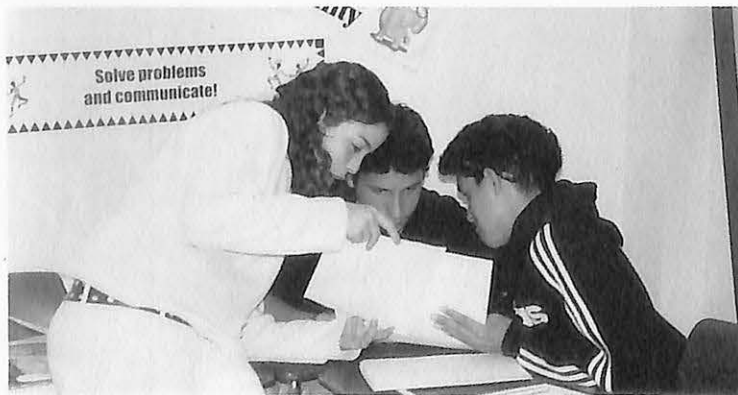

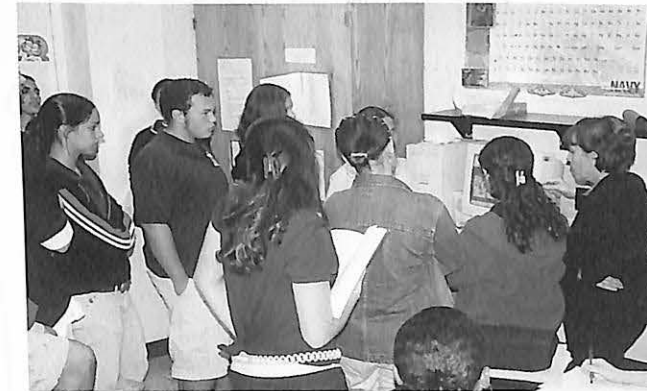

# BUSINESS EDUCATION

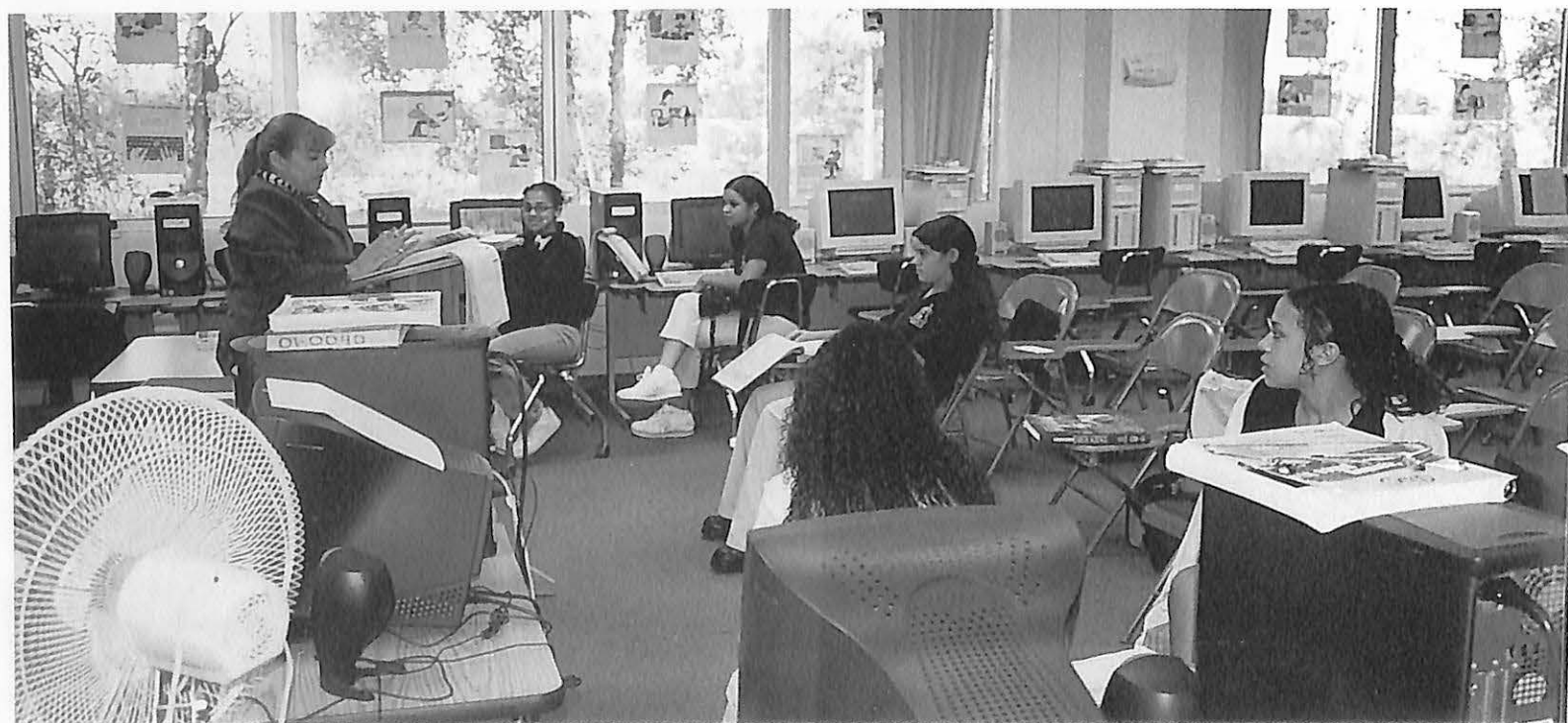

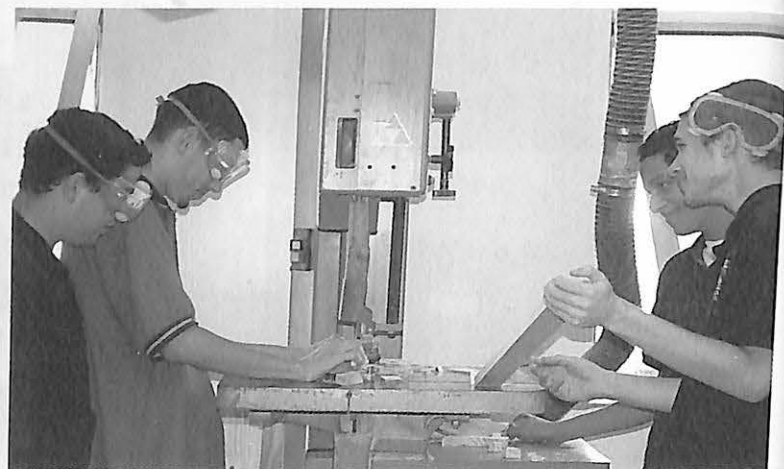

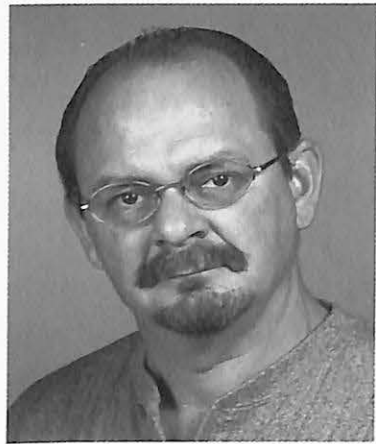

most tragic moments. It is the beating of our heart. Music here at AHS demonstrates that our students have a passion for singing and playing these beautifully expressive sounds.



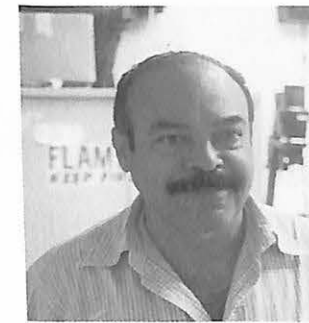

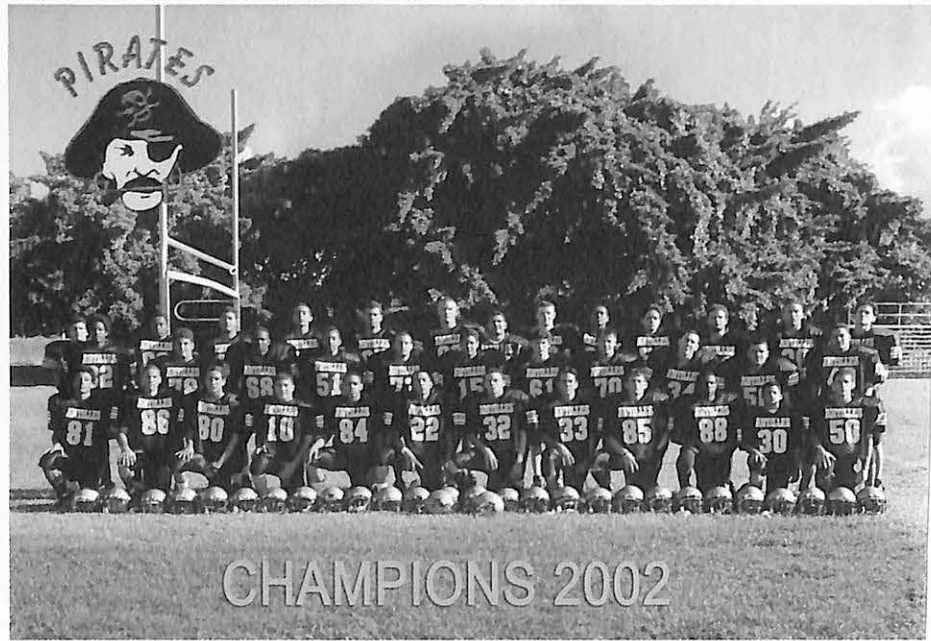
## Pirate Athletes

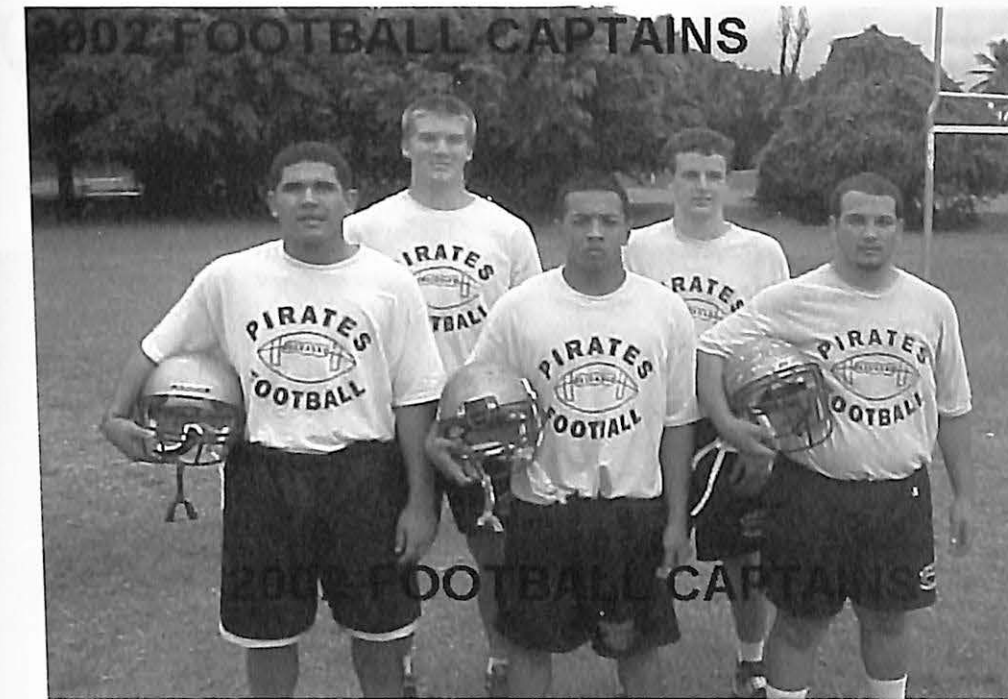
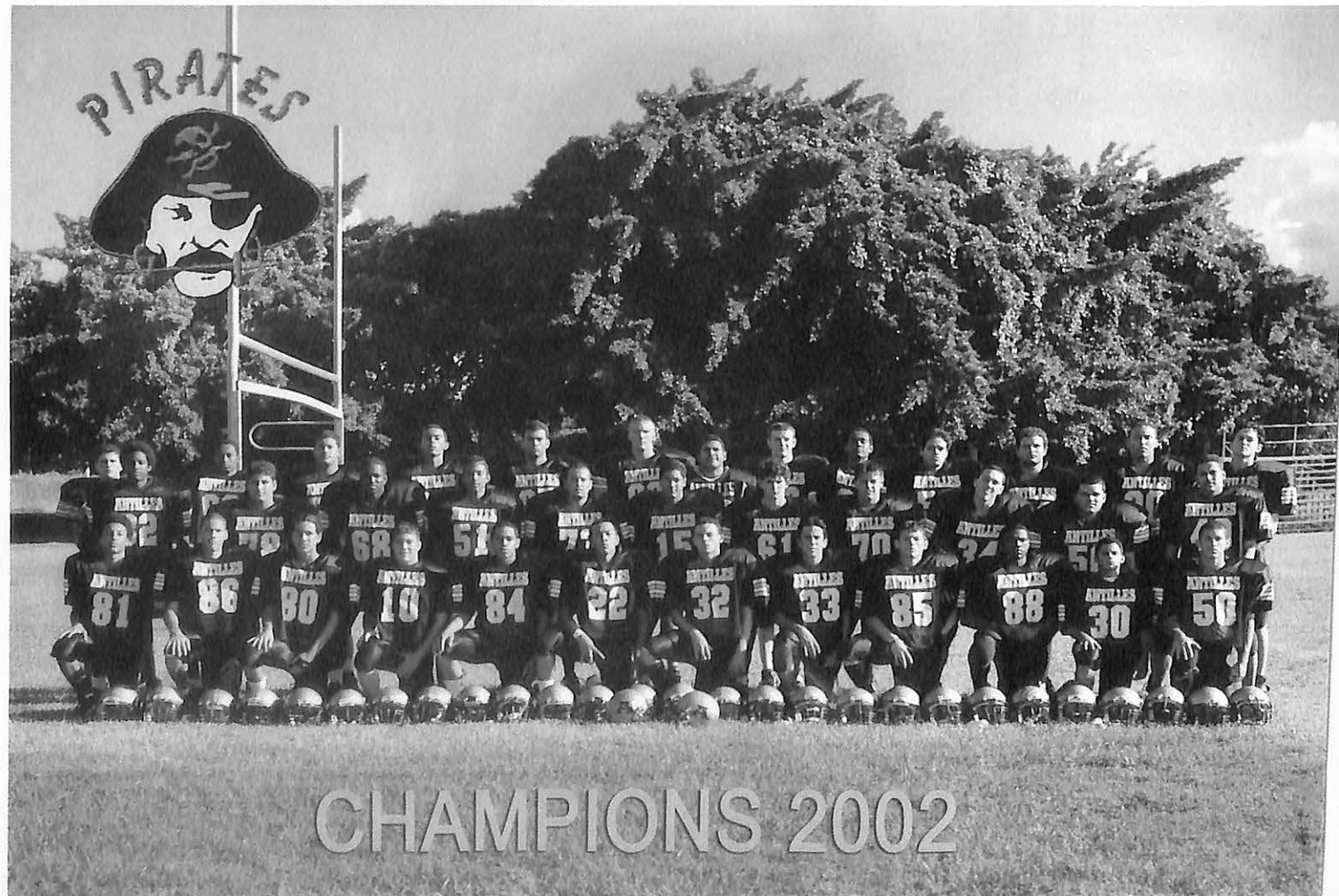

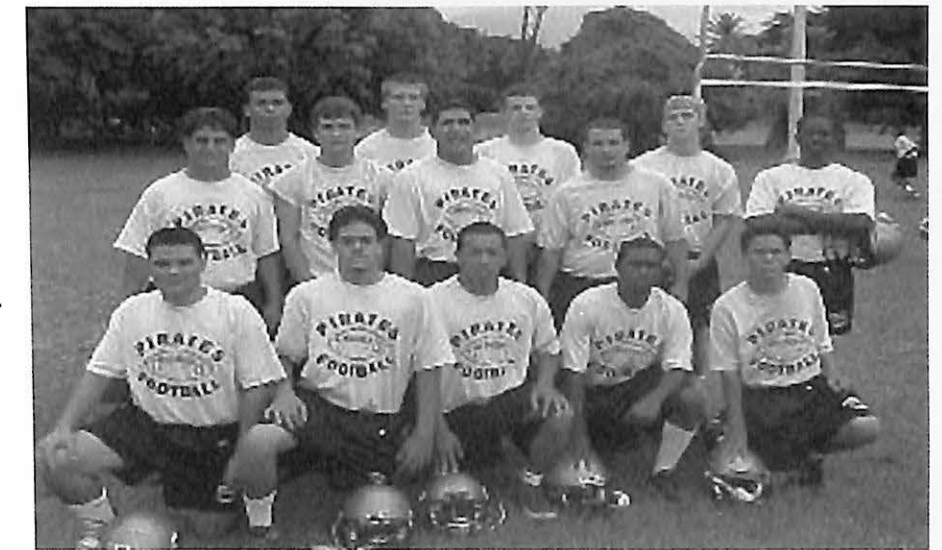


# FOOTBALL
