WESTCOTT FIELD

One of the most popular soccer venues in the country, Westcott Field is the home turf for both the SMU men's and women's soccer teams. Both teams began competing at Westcott Field in 1994.

The grass facility was used as a training site for the Dallas venue of World Cup USA '94. Teams from Germany, Bulgaria, Sweden and Holland practiced there before their games at the Cotton Bowl.



Within more recent years, Westcott Field has climbed the charts as one of the nation's exciting soccer stadiums. In 2001, Westcott Field ranked among the highest attended facilities during the SMU men's team No. 1 reign for 14 weeks, as well as the women's team march to the Western Athletic Conference Title.

In 2004, the Mustangs added a press box to the stadium featuring attractive lettering and the Mustangs' past champions. Before the 2006 season, SMU installed a new turf and a state-of-the-art drainage system.

WESTCOTT FIELD: BY THE NUMBERS

Since Westcott Field opened in 1994, SMU has experienced a lot of success in Dallas:

- SMU has gone undefeated at home three times > 1995 (11-0-1), 2001 (8-0-0) and 2012 (5-0-2).
- **The Mustangs hold an all-time winning percentage of 71.26%.**
- Three times the Mustangs have tallied double-digit win totals at home > 1995 (11-0-1), 1999 (10-2-0) and 2003 (11-1-0).
- In 25 seasons, SMU has finished .500 or better in 23 seasons

Two-time National Coach of the Year and 1995 NCAA Championship Coach Chris Petrucelli enters his seventh season (2018) as SMU Head Women's Soccer Coach. A veteran of 20-plus years as a head coach, Petrucelli was named the NSCAA National Coach of the Year in both 1994 and 1995 and was lauded as the NSCAA Central Region Coach of the Year in both 2002 and 2006. In 29 years as a head coach, Petrucelli has compiled a 403-171-51 (.686) record.

In 2018, Petrucelli guided the Mustangs to a third-consecutive 10-win campaign with a 10-6-2 overall mark and a 5-4 record in the American Conference. The Mustangs earned three All-Conference honors including first team recognition for Allie Thornton and Rookie of the Year for Courtney Sebazco. On September 23, SMU defeated UConn for Petrucelli's 400th career victory, one of eight division one coaches to reach that mark.

In 2017, SMU recorded eight shutouts, the most since 2006. The 2017 season also brought the 400th program win for SMU women's soccer and was ranked as high as No. 22 in the United Soccer Coaches Poll. Seven players on the 2017 team received post season, All-American/Region/Conference/Academic accolades.

In his fifth season at the helm (2016), the veteran coach guided the Mustangs to a 13-7-2 overall record en route to the first NCAA Tournament appearance since 2006. After finishing third overall in the regular-season (19 pts, 6-2-1), SMU finished as runner-ups at the American Athletic Conference Tournament. The Mustangs were ranked top-25 nationally in total goals (17th NCAA, 1st AAC), total assists (17th NCAA, 1st AAC), total points (18th NCAA, 1st AAC), points per game (18th NCAA, 2nd AAC), scoring offense (19th NCAA, 2nd AAC) and assists per game (24th NCAA, 1st AAC). Petrucelli was named the AAC Co-Coach of the Year, and five student-athletes were named to AAC All-Conference teams, including Vanessa Valadez and freshman Allie Thornton who earned first team honors. Following the AAC Championship, four members were named to the AAC All-Tournament Team.

In 2014, Petrucelli guided a young team to seven wins and the quarterfinals of the American Athletic Conference Championship. Freshman Claire Oates was named the conference's Rookie of the Year and second-team all-conference.

In his second season on the Hilltop (2013), SMU won nine games and had two players earn All-American Athletic Conference recognition. He also won his 350th career game as a Division I head coach in SMU's 6-1 victory over ULM on Aug. 23, 2013. In his first season at SMU (2012), Petrucelli led the Mustangs to an undefeated record at home (5-0-2) and four Mustangs took all-conference honors.

The six-time conference coach of the year came to the Hilltop after spending the last 13 seasons as head coach of the Texas women's soccer program where he compiled a 165-88-26 mark and signed some of the nation's top recruiting classes. Under his tutelage, Texas captured back-to-back Big 12 postseason titles (2006-07) and the program's first Big 12 regular season title in 2001. He guided the Longhorns to 10 NCAA Tournament appearances (2001-08, 2010-11), including runs to the third round (round of 16) in 2004, 2006 and 2007.



Prior to heading to UT, Petrucelli constructed the Notre Dame women's soccer program into one of the nation's best. He guided the Fighting Irish for nine years (1990-98) and was honored by the NSCAA as the National Coach of the Year in both 1994 and 1995 en route to becoming the only collegiate coach to win the award in consecutive years. During his tenure with Notre Dame, he led the Irish to the 1995 NCAA National Championship, three National Championship title matches (1994-96) and six NCAA Tournament appearances. This included four consecutive national semifinal berths from 1994-97, and eight-straight conference championships. Prior to being honored as the 1996 Big East Coach of the Year and leading the Irish to Big East crowns during each of his four seasons in the conference, Petrucelli was named the Midwest Collegiate Conference (MCC) Coach of the Year in each of Notre Dame's four years within that league, as he guided the Irish to MCC titles every year and never lost a league match.

A standout teacher of the game, Petrucelli has not only produced championship-caliber teams, but has also developed some of the nation's top soccer talent as well. He has coached one NSCAA National Player of the Year as well as players who have earned 30 NSCAA All-America honors, 69 All-Region accolades, seven conference Player of the Year awards, eight Conference Rookies of the Year honors and over 100 All-Conference decorations.



Besides working with his programs, Petrucelli has served as chair of the NCAA Division I Soccer Rules Committee; been active in the NSCAA; served as a member of NSCAA Coaching Academy staff while sponsoring workshops for other coaches at the convention; and has been a member of the United States Soccer Federation Region I Olympic Development Program staff for boys as well as the Region II staff for girls. In addition, Petrucelli was also the head coach for the United States Olympic Festival in both 1994 and 1995, served as the head coach of the U.S. Under-21 Women's National Team during the summers of 2003 and 2004, and has worked as the Under-16 girls Region II ODP head coach. Of note, he led the Under-21 National Team to back-to-back Nordic Cup titles in 2003 and 2004.

During his playing career, Petrucelli helped UNC-Greensboro capture a pair of NCAA Division III titles in 1982 and 1983 and was named the team's captain as a senior. After earning his degree in business administration in 1984, he spent a year as a graduate assistant at Old Dominion where he then became one of ODU's full-time assistant coaches in 1986.

J., Petrucelli and his wife, Eve, are the parents of daughter Gabrielle and sons Nicholas and Andrew.

ALL-AMERICANS



LISA COLE
FIRST TEAM - 1990

Lisa Cole was a First Team All-America selection in 1990 and was also on the Freshman Team in 1987. Cole is SMU's all-time leader in points (246), goals (101) and assists (44). Cole also holds SMU's highest single-season scoring mark, tallying 37 goals (1.76 per game) on 184 shots in 1987. The 37 goals were an NCAA record from 1987-2005, and her 87 points that season still rank third all-time in NCAA history. Cole's 4.14 points per game in 1987 rank second in NCAA history, and her career mark of 3.15 points per game rank fourth. Cole was also an all-region honoree three times (1988-90). SMU won a total of 63 games during her four seasons on the Hilltop, and made its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 1990.



KARA LEE
FIRST TEAM - 1993

Kara Lee is SMU's fifth all-time leading goal scorer with 51 goals in her three seasons on the Hilltop. Lee totaled 37 points (15 goals, seven assists) in 1993 to earn First Team All-America status. Lee was named to the all-region team all three years from 1991-93, leading SMU in goals and points all three years. Lee also led the Mustangs in assists in 1991 and 1993. Lee is one of five different Mustangs to average over one goal per game over the course of a single season, a feat that she accomplished in 1991. SMU won 38 games over Lee's three seasons with the program, advancing to the NCAA Tournament in 1992 and 1993.



DANIELLE GARRETT
FIRST TEAM - 1995

In two seasons at SMU, Danielle Garrett amassed 52 goals and 128 points, which both rank fourth in program history. Garrett led the NCAA in scoring in 1995, leading SMU all the way to the College Cup and an undefeated regular season. Garrett tallied 32 goals and 83 points that year, marking the second-highest totals in Mustangs history. The 83 points are also the fourth most in Division I history. Garrett is also one of two Mustangs to have ever averaged at least one goal per game over two entire seasons. The Southwest Conference Player of the Year in 1995 partnered with Courtney Linex to form the nation's top goal-scoring tandem in 1995.



COURTNEY LINEX
THIRD TEAM - 1995

Courtney Linex helped lead an SMU attack that led the nation in scoring and advanced to the College Cup in 1995. Linex posted the third-most prolific season in SMU history that year, recording 77 points (31 goals, 15 assists). Her season included a 10-game stretch with at least one goal, the seventh longest streak in NCAA history. Her point total is eight highest in Division I history, and her 31 goals rank 13th all-time. Over her four seasons at SMU, Linex totaled 162 points, ranking second in program history. Linex's 64 career goals rank third at SMU.



MARCI MILLER
THIRD TEAM - 1997

Marci Miller started all 23 games for the Mustangs in 1997, helping lead SMU to the WAC regular season and tournament titles. Miller scored 11 goals on 47 shots and totaled 27 points. For her career, Miller posted 51 points (19th at SMU) and 1.16 points per game (16th). Between 1996 and 1997, Miller recorded nine game-winners, leading the team during that span. Miller was also named All-WAC First Team in both 1996 and 1997, and earned WAC Mountain Division Player of the Year both seasons. The two-time all-region honoree played 44 total games at SMU.



ASHLEY GUNTER
SECOND TEAM - 2006

Ashley Gunter led SMU to a regular season Conference USA championship and an NCAA Tournament appearance in 2006, recording 10 solo shutouts (third all-time at SMU), including one in the first round of the NCAA postseason over McNeese State. She was named C-USA Defensive Player of the Year after allowing just six total goals during conference games. Gunter was on the Hermann Trophy watch list in 2007 and finished her career with 38 wins (38-20-5), good for third all-time at SMU. Gunter is also third in shutouts in program history with 23 solo shutouts.
