Primary Narrative By Joseph Donofrio, 09/10/20 23:32

Male staff reports Disorderly Conduct and Offenses Involving Underage Persons by known suspects.

Supplemental Narrative By Joseph Donofrio, 09/10/20 23:34

On 9/10/2020, OSUPD was contacted regarding a male, [REDACTED] who was creating a public disturbance by yelling at passersby and appearing to be intoxicated or extremely agitated near Busch House (2115 N. High St.).

Dispatch was able to locate [REDACTED] on camera and tracked him walking up north on N. High St. and then westbound on W. Lane Ave to the front of Taylor Tower.

As I drove toward [REDACTED] I noticed he as sitting in the roadway of the Service Area #3 Entrance, on the east side of Taylor Tower. As I exited my vehicle to make contact with [REDACTED] he stood up and approached me and was visibly unsteady on his feet and did have a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from his person. Due to [REDACTED] intoxicated state, I instructed him to sit on the ground while I spoke with him, however he refused to follow by instruction and stood. [REDACTED] continued to be unsteady on his feet and refused to sit back on the ground. [REDACTED] stated he had been following around the "Nook Boys" around this evenings, because they are in Columbus tonight.

When asked how much alcohol [REDACTED] had consumed this evenings he stated "I had three white claws."

During our interaction, [REDACTED] remained very agitated and stated it was due to him trying to meet up with so many people tonight, and that he got beat up by three people tonight. [REDACTED] did not appear to have any signs of being involved any physical altercation. At this time Officer Chambers #309 arrived on scene to assist.

[REDACTED] finally followed my instruction to sit on the ground, but first attempted to sit on a chain that was suspended between to poles. When told again he needed to sit on the ground he finally complied. Again I attempted to ask [REDACTED] questions regarding where he was coming from and why he was yelling. I then asked how old he was to which he responded with "I m 20". At this time I asked for [REDACTED] identification and again he became confrontational and refused to comply with my order. At this time with [REDACTED] still seated on the ground, I instructed him to stay seated and moved behind him to place him into handcuffs. [REDACTED] then attempted to stand and become resistive to officers who were able to place him into handcuffs without further incident.

[REDACTED] was placed in the rear of patrol car 37, seat belted, donned a N95 mask, and transported to Blankenship Hall. After arriving at the station, I noticed [REDACTED] had a laceration to his right eyebrow due to him striking his face on the divider inside of vehicles holding area. Grandview Heights Medic 51 arrived at Blankenship Hall to assess [REDACTED] laceration. [REDACTED] denied medical treatment, but did allow medics to clean the laceration and the blood from around it. When medics asked [REDACTED] as to how he got the laceration on his eyebrow, he advised it had occurred when he fell off of an electric scooter earlier in the evening.

While completing paperwork, [REDACTED] purposefully urinated on the holding room s floor which had to be cleaned up by officers.

He was later transported to the Franklin County Jail.

[REDACTED] stated he had been at OSU fraternity house Phi Kappa Tau (141 E. 15th Ave Columbus, Ohio 43201) during the evening.

Supplemental Narrative By Chris Chambers, 09/11/20 00:31

Supplement

Student suspect, [REDACTED] was injured during transport to Blankenship.

Officers J. Donofrio and I responded to the area of Taylor Tower in regards to a male that was yelling in the area. We located student [REDACTED] who appeared intoxicated. [REDACTED] was intoxicated to the point where he could not care from himself as well as he was voluntarily intoxicated while being under age. [REDACTED] is only 20 years old. While [REDACTED] was being placed under arrest, he struggled to resist arrest and was verbally combative by yelling at both of us. [REDACTED] was placed into cruiser #37 where he was placed on the passenger side rear seat and the seatbelt was fastened by Officer Donofrio. I then obtained two N95 masks, from the rear of cruiser #37, and installed one onto my face. Then Officer Donofrio removed [REDACTED] cloth mask and replaced it with the second N95 mask.

As Officer Donofrio, who was driving the JP cruiser, were facing east bound on Lane Ave. To return to Blankenship Hall, we both turned in the street to travel west bound. After traveling approximately 10 feet, at approximately 10 miles per hour, I pushed on the vehicle brakes to slow the forward motion of the cruiser. I slowed so that Officer Donofrio could proceed in front of me. When I did so, [REDACTED] who was leaning forward and yelling at me, struck his forehead on the plexiglas partition. I do not know if he struck his head on purpose or by accident. [REDACTED] then stated that he had hit his head and I observed that there was some blood from a laceration above his right eyebrow. I asked [REDACTED] if he had removed his seatbelt, and he yelled at me some more. I observed that the injury was minor and due to [REDACTED] agitated behavior, I determined it was safest to continue with the transport to Blankenship Hall.

Upon arrival, requested for Supervisor K. Howe to meet me in the Blankenship loading dock. When I opened the rear passenger door, I immediately observed that [REDACTED] seatbelt was no longer secured in the latch and I again asked [REDACTED] if he had unsecured the seatbelt. I requested that a Medic be dispatched, and Grandview Heights Medic responded. While waiting for the Medics to arrive, I administered a gauze pad to his forehead as to provide basic first aid. [REDACTED] refused to be treated by the Medics with the exception of their attempts to clean the wound area. During this time, I observed that [REDACTED] was no longer the bleeding.

BWC video from both Donofrio and me show that [REDACTED] was secured in a seatbelt before transport.
