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Stitch in time

The best needlework samplers continue to bring prices far above more routine examples.

This 17 x 17in (43 x 43cm) embroidery by Janet Baird was one of a group of Victorian and earlier 19th century samplers guided between £50-200 each at the Costume & Accessories sale at Anderson & Garland on May 4.

Working chiefly in gros-and-petit-point with trees sewn in raised work, Baird's composition included bands of family initials and two quotes from scripture above a scene depicting a country house, figures and animals including a shepherdess and her flock.

Estimated at £100-200 in Newcastle upon Tyne, it sold for £7000 (plus 25% buyer's premium) to an online buyer using thesaleroom.com.

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If a bid is placed in the final few minutes before the auction closes for that lot, the time period will be extended by a number of minutes. The auction house can set the number of minutes, usually 10.

This is to stop 'sniping' – a practice used by bidders on some other websites whereby they rush to place bids in the last few seconds to prevent other bidders being able to respond before the auction closes.

Online art buying continues to grow but record rise eases after lockdown boom

The online art market continues to grow year on year with sales up 6% in 2022 according to the latest Hiscox Online Art Trade

It found that online sales reached \$10.8m in 2022 which accounts for 15.9% of all art sales.

The boom during the lockdown accelerated growth in online-only sales, with Hiscox estimating it increased the market's value by around

However, the current economic headwinds could impact the art market.

A survey of buyers found that 30% planned to cut back on art purchases over the coming year.


Robert Read, head of art and private clients at Hiscox, said: "The Covid-19 pandemic was a online market, boosting its value and size in a relatively short space of time. Although this level of growth was unsustainable, it has proven extremely beneficial, instilling higher levels of trust and confidence among buyers.

"Some of the key barriers to entry have been broken down, converting previous onlinesceptics to regular online buyers.

"The online art sector, like so many others, is facing into a potentially difficult period, but it does so in a more resilient state than it would have otherwise been. The challenge of a sluggish economy is already apparent in our findings, but the extent of the impact remains

The 2023 report also tracks 10-year trends and found the

market for buying art digitally has swelled over that period with sales now five times the size they were in 2012 (from \$1.6bn in 2012 to \$10.8bn in

The volumes of collectors buying online has also increased, from 38% to 78% of those surveyed over the 10-year timeframe (see graph above).

The Hiscox Online Art Trade Report, now in its 10th year, uses research from art market analysis firm ArtTactic which held interviews in January and February 2023 with senior management and CEOs from

46 online art trade platforms and 569 art buyers.

The estimated online sales figure of \$10.8bn is taken from the Art Basel UBS - Art Market Report 2023.

Rousseau's record flamingoes get Christie's off to a flyer

Christie's first major auction series since raising its buyer's premium last month kicked off in New York offering Impressionist and Modern art, writes Alex Capon.

With a large number of lots guaranteed, some high sums were recorded even if bidding felt a bit muted at times.

Among the lots that did manage to bring notable action at Christie's 20th century evening sale on May 11 was a large jungle scene titled Les Flamants that set a major record for Henri Rousseau (1844-1910).

The top lot of the night, the 3ft 9in 5ft 3in (1.14 x 1.62m) oil on canvas dated from the last vear of the artist's life and was one of the most ambitious of the 30 or so stylised compositions of lush, tropical landscapes he produced from 1891 onwards.

Coming fresh to market, it had been purchased in 1949 by American collectors Charles S and Joan Whitney Payson who assembled a vast collection of

knocked down at \$29.7m (£23.6m) to a phone buyer. Christie's sales of 21st century art will take place this week, while rivals Sotheby's is also holding both its Modern and Contemporary sales this week which will include a Gustav Klimt view of the Austria's Lake Attersee

Impressionist and Post-Impressionist works including pictures by artists such as Manet, Monet, Renoir, van Gogh and Cézanne.

It was consigned to Christie's from the estate of their daughter and given a \$20m-30m estimate, as well as a guarantee. Attracting multiple bidders, it came down to a battle between a bidder in the room and another on the

phone with the latter eventually winning at \$37.5m (£29.8m).

The price (\$43.5m with premium) was over 10 times the previous record for Rousseau which, remarkably, had stood for three decades: the £2.7m for a portrait de Joseph Brummer that sold at Christie's in London back in 1993.

Just over half of the lots in 54-lot sale were guaranteed and, overall, 44 lots sold (81%)

for a \$328.8m (£260.9m) total. A further \$177.8m (£141.1m) was posted by the 16 lots from the collection of media mogul and SI Newhouse (1927-2017) which were sold by Christie's in a dedicated auction on the same evening.

The Newhouse collection, which had previously provided the auction house with an \$80m (£62.02m) rabbit sculpture by Jeff Koons and a

It's a Cotman family extravaganza

A collection of works by the Cotman family of artists is coming for sale at Maidenhead auction house Dawsons this month, writes Laura Chesters.

Led by works by Norwich School landscape painter John Sell Cotman (1782-1842), the group, collected over many generations by the family itself and now consigned by a descendant, includes 200 oil paintings, watercolours and etchings as well as works by a number of other British artists.

Fellow Norwich School artist Miles Edmund Cotman (1810-58) and John Joseph Cotman (1814-78) - John Sell's eldest and second son) - are represented, as well as cousin Frederick George Cotman (1850-1920) and his son Henry

William Cotman (1876-1938).

Examples by more recent artists including Kenneth Cotman (1904-94) and Susan Cotman (1948-2022) also feature.

Dawsons will offer the works at its Fine Art & Antiques Auction on May 25.

John Sell Cotman worked in Norfolk and London as painter, archaeological draughtsman and later, on the recommendation of JMW Turner, as a professor at King's College School.

His best landscape watercolours can breach the six-figure mark, with the record set in 2016 for a watercolour of Walsingham Abbey, Norfolk, that made a hammer price of £280,000 at Bonhams, while his drawings and etchings tend to sell in the hundreds of pounds.

Among the highlights coming up at Dawsons is John Sell Cotman's portrait of his father Edmund (1759-1844). A Norwich hairdresser who became a

wealthy silk and lace merchant, Edmund wanted John to join the family business instead of becoming an artist.

The portrait is estimated at £500-800.

CITES application system goes digital

Permits and licences for CITES will soon be moving to an online service.

The Animal and Plant Health Agency (APHA) has announced it will begin using a new digital internal service to process applications this month and expects to launch the full digital service to applicants on gov.uk during the summer.

The APHA team said it will be able to process CITES applications "more quickly"

with the new system. However, a change to payments will affect applicants who settle bills via BACS.

Payments will soon be taken at submission. The system will no longer support BACS payments and all payments must be made by debit/credit

Payment up front

Specialist Kim McDonald, of The Taxidermy Law Company, said: "The new system seems to be straightforward, even if there might be some teething

"We will have to see how it goes. The paying up front is the only difference. I usually pay by BACS so this will now change."

In some instances applicants will be sent a payment link following submission.

APHA said: "We have redesigned our guidance pages and made a phoneline available to help with completing CITES forms online."

However, it will still accept postal applications from users who do not have digital skills or access.

The trade in endangered

species is governed by the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Flora and Fauna, better known as CITES. Certain items can be sold if a certificate (permits and licences) are issued.

Systems update

APHA said the change is part of the government introducing digital services across all its departments and that the current APHA set-up is "a 25-year-old legacy system".

Applicants will have to set up a government gateway account and APHA hopes to issue most permits within 10 working days.

The new system is limited to applications for import, export, re-export and Article 10 certificates. All others will need to be applied for by post or email.

CITES restrictions are separate to the UK's Ivory Act which came into force last June, bringing in a near-total ban on the sale of antique ivory.

Watch expert's exceptional collection catches the eye

Some exceptional pocket watches were offered for sale at Bonhams in Knightsbridge on May 11.

Many had a provenance to the collection of TP Camerer Cuss, the author of several books on the subject including The Country Life Book of Watches (1967) and The Camerer Cuss Book of Antique Watches (1976) in which some of the watches were pictured.

Leading the Watches and Wristwatches sale was a fine and rare gold and ruby set key wind triple-case pocket watch

with a shagreen outer case by Joseph Martineau. The height of luxury when it was made c.1760, it is set with 441 rubies forming a radiating circle to the back and bezel of the middle case and further decoration to the white enamel dial.

In what Bonhams called 'remarkable' condition, it was last sold at auction in 1958 when it took £380 at Sotheby's. Estimated at £20,000-30,000, it brought £38,000 (plus 27.5/26% buyer's premium).

Martineau is recorded as working in London from 1744-94, first at Orange Street and then later at St Martin's Court.

Sold towards the top end of

expectations at £17,000 was a rare silver and leather key wind pair case pocket watch with a pinwork case, c.1670. Signed for William Snow in Marlebrough [sic] he is thought to be the son of Nicholas Snow of nearby Salisbury who in his will stated "my working tooles belonging to my trade shall be kept and preserved for the use and benefit of my said sonne William Snowe".

The accuracy performance of watches greatly improved when the movements were made with four- rather than three-wheel trains, and this is an early example. Purchased from Dennis Brown c.1947, it was illustrated in FJ Britten's Old Clocks and Watches and Their Makers (1956).

Pick of the week

Keen as mustard on a Lambeth rarity

In January this year three photos of a salt glaze stoneware jar appeared on the Facebook feed of the Oxfordshire Antique Bottle Collecting Club.

'Goodday from South Africa. Any information about this item marked Lambeth?' read the post.

Multiple replies from members quickly arrived. 'Awesome', 'Amazing', 'Wow that's a bit nice', 'The only whole example I've ever seen', 'Very rare item', 'Prepare yourself for a lot of interest'.

The object of such admiration later arrived by post from South Africa at the office of Alan Blakeman of Yorkshire bottle advertising specialist BBR Auctions.

He had been driving back from the Stanley Bottle Show in County Durham in February when it arrived and his wife opened it.

"I was blown away - an absolutely fantastic and highly significant find," Blakeman said.

The distinctive cuboid form with conical neck was associated with selling mustard, but this hand potted vessel was unusually large at 61/4 in (16cm) tall and unusually decorative.

It was impressed to one of the faces with the façade of a classical building and the words John Hunt Colour Works Lambeth.

Members of the Oxfordshire club had done some useful research. Hunt is recorded working as a mustard maker and bone and guano merchant at a number of Lambeth addresses in the second quarter of the 19th century. In Robson's Commercial Directory for London for 1837 he is listed as 'Soap, mustard & colour manufacturer & bone merchant, High Street I amheth'

Plainer and smaller versions of this jar are known impressed with just two or three lines of lettering although this 'building' variant was deemed a much rarer beast. According to one club member, it was

previously known only from a broken jar labelled John Hunt Mustard Works Lambeth that was unearthed in a river in Australia.

When back in the office, Blakeman contacted the sender to learn that this South African jar had been in a display case in the home of a grandparent for many years and had only been rediscovered during a spot of

He happily agreed to add it to BBR's April 23 auction at the Elsecar Spring Extravaganza and predicted it would be the talk of the show.

He was not wrong. It set a new auction record for a Victorian mustard pot when it was hammered down at £4500 (£5300 including premium).

Early glimpses of treasures to come

The Treasure House Fair is promoting its commitment to overseas exhibitors with a series of early highlights from European and US galleries.

Long-Sharp Gallery from Indianapolis, US, is bringing a number of drawings fresh from the estate of Andy Warhol. Focusing on flower compositions, the display is titled Andy's Secret Garden. Fellow US dealership Geoffrey Diner Gallery from Washington, DC, brings design-focused items including a bench by George Nakashima (1905-90).

From Europe comes Univers du Bronze of Paris, which offers works by Les Lalanne, while Galeries Gmurzynska of Zurich will bring Fire Painting by Yves Klein, along with various works of Surrealism, Pop Art and more.

The fair runs from June 22-26 on London's Chelsea Embankment, filling the void left by Masterpiece, which earlier this year announced it would no longer take place.

Anyone for tennis memorabilia?

An antiques and vintage tennis racket collection put together over a decade by an IT entrepreneur and tennis enthusiast will be offered at an online auction coinciding with the dates of the Roland-Garros tournament.

Dubai-based Slava Babienko, CEO of Koronapay Europe, will offer 91 of his rackets and tennis accessories dating from the late 19th to early 20th centuries. The oldest in the collection is an AG Spalding & Bros racket dated 1876 (pictured right).

Babienko said:

tennis, I have
assembled a large
collection of original antique
rackets, tennis balls,
tournament cups, and even
tennis-themed postage

The online auction will run from May 22 to June 11 via the US NFT marketplace called OpenSea. (NFTs are nonfungible tokens: units of data stored on a digital ledger, called a blockchain, which can be sold and traded).

Each lot will include a physical object that can be shipped internationally and a digitalised NFT version.

Mitten was worn on 1953 Everest expedition

A left-hand cotton mitten owned by John Hunt (1910-98), leader of the successful British Expedition to the summit of Mount Everest, sold for £3200 (plus 25% buyer's premium) at Hansons in Bishton Hall, Staffordshire, on May 10.

Hunt himself wore this glove as he climbed to 27,400ft on May 26, 1953, before he was overcome with extreme fatigue and altitude sickness. Instead, Edmund Hillary and Tensing Norgay reached the summit three days later, the news reaching London in time to be reported on the morning of Queen Elizabeth II's coronation.

The mitten is discoloured from age but otherwise remarkably well-preserved – and clearly matches the right-hand mitten that was offered (but went unsold) at Bonhams, Knightsbridge, in a Marine Works of Art sale in 2003.

It was offered at Bishton Hall together with an autograph letter signed by Hunt on personal stationery explaining that the glove was donated by him in the mid-1970s to a village auction being held to raise funds for a new scout hut for the 1st Newtown Scout Group in Powys. The vendor's late father purchased the mitten from the sale.

Serendipity had it that more John Hunt memorabilia was offered on the same day at Dominic Winter in South Cerney, Gloucestershire. This included a first edition dust-jacketed copy of Hunt's book *The Ascent of Everest* signed to the title and half title by 14 expedition members. Estimated at £700-2500, it sold at £4600.

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
















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Sandon lots pass to new owners

Much-loved expert decided time was right to disperse his impressive collection

If the name of Sandon is synonymous with Worcester, it perhaps came as no surprise that it was a 1921 Royal Worcester vase that achieved the highest price in Chorley's (22.5% buyer's premium) on April 18.

Decorated with a red deer stag in the snow in 1921 by Harry Davis (1885-1970), a painter Sandon befriended in his later years, it sold for £3000 to a private buyer in the room for the Henry Sandon Study Collection sale, against an estimate of £800-1200.

The private collection of the muchloved BBC Antiques Roadshow expert, author, lecturer and Worcester aficionado proved a great draw to the Gloucestershire saleroom.

In these days of remote bidding, the 1000-plus pieces offered in 279 lots attracted a packed saleroom including a generous helping of members of the Ceramics Circle.

The sale exceeded the auction house's modest expectations, fetching over double its pre-sale estimate with only 23 of the 279 lots left unsold.

Seen as a whole

Sandon, now 94, was keen that buyers might peruse his collection as a whole.

"Now that I'm older than most of the ceramics in my collection I am no longer able to pick up and hold and cherish every one of the hundreds of pieces I have lived with," he quipped.

Sandon began his career as an enthusiastic archaeologist. Digging up Roman and medieval pots in his garden next to Worcester Cathedral led him to local auctions and "antiques shops filled with Worcester porcelain".

The first 30 lots reflected that interest in archaeology and antiquity.

A large quantity of 17th century delftware shards and various fragments including Roman pottery and glass was the favourite lot of auctioneer Simon Chorley, "with every piece telling a story".

Many of the delftware shards came from the pottery at Southwark's Pickleherring Quay – swapped with friends and fellow collectors – and the remaining fragments excavated by Sandon himself. The market likes a story, and the lot sold for £600 against an estimated £100-150.

Study collections are amassed more for the pursuit of knowledge, as opposed to investment or show.

It was under the guidance of Jim Kiddell from Sotheby's, Dr Bernard Watney and Geoffrey Godden that Sandon began to create his own private study collection.

"It didn't matter that I could only afford damaged examples of the early pottery I coveted.

"I knew it was important to buy as much as I could and to hold and live with it."

Viewed against Chorley's occasionally 'come-and-get-it' estimates, there were a few surprises.

An attractive English delft plate (probably Bristol c.1750-60), decorated in yellow, manganese and blue with a Chinese figure offering a teapot to a friend was one of Sandon's

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favourite pieces. The room shared his view on its charm, and the plate sold for £750 against an estimate of £100-150.

Unpredictable market

The market for jasperware can be unpredictable, but three late 18th century vases (one by Wedgwood, two by Adams, took £1200 despite cracks, chipping, glued repairs and a missing cover to one vase.

In a similar vein, a Qing porcelain meiping with a sang-de-boeuf glaze streaked with turquoise and red sold to an internet buyer for £1700.

And hair cracks, chips and a troubled Russian art market notwithstanding, a Soviet revolutionary plate decorated with a townscape by Alexandra Balt sold to a British buyer for £1100. All had estimates of £100-200.

In 1966, Sandon was appointed curator of the Dyson Perrins Museum at the Royal Worcester Factory, a position he held until 1982.

A Royal Worcester plate by Harry Stinton (1883-1968) from a service commissioned for William Keith Kellogg – of breakfast cereal fame – featured a costly red field deliberately chosen to match the famous Kellogg logo. Kellogg ordered two sets of 25, painted by one of Worcester's best artists.

The plate, painted with a rural winter landscape, was a spare given to Sandon in reward for advice given when the service was sold in 1985. It achieved £2200 against an estimate of £1000-1400.

Among the earlier pieces, a private collector secured the Worcester or Caughley triple salt or sweetmeat stand, c.1780, for £1600 (Estimate: £250-350). It has a hairline crack and scattered chipping.


Reference works

The 31 lots of studio pottery proved softer with 12 lots failing to sell, although a stoneware vase by Geoffrey Whiting made £500.

Still, a collection of studio pottery reference books fetched a generous £220 (estimate £50-100) as part of Sandon's library sold as the auction came to a close.

A collection of antiquarian books on the city of Worcester and its porcelain sold for £600 - an invaluable reference source for future generations.

As Sandon says: "It's time for all of my pots to join new study collections."

This mahogany 12-drawer cabinet of minerals, rocks and fossils carries the printed trade label reading Arranged and Sold by J Tennant, Mineralogist by Appointment to Her Majesty, 149 Strand London.

Complete with a catalogue dated December 1835 detailing more than 400 numbered specimens, at Ewbank's (25% buyer's premium) in Surrey on March 24 it had an estimate of £800-1200 but sold at £4600 to an online bidder.

James Tennant, elected a fellow of the Geological Society in 1838, ran a mineral shop at The Strand until 1881. As mineralogist to Queen Victoria, he is best known for supervising the cutting of the Koh-i-Noor diamond for the crown jewels.

Exceptional slice of dessert on offer with tasty Ewenny

The Welsh Sale held by Rogers Jones (24/15% buyer's premium) in Cardiff on April 1 included an exceptional Swansea porcelain dessert plate.

The decoration, taken from Thomas Daniell's famous Views of Calcutta published in 1788, is painted by Thomas Baxter (1782-1821), the celebrated 'Worcester' porcelain painter who worked for Swansea from 1816-19. The scene shows the ghat (steps) descending from the old Fort William to the River Hooghly.

The inscription to the base references the tragedy of the Black Hole of Calcutta that had cost the lives of so many captured British troops half a century earlier. It reads Within the walls of this fort is the black hole, whose name is eternized by the sufferings of Mr [John Zephaniah] Holwell and his illfated companions in 1756.

This plate is well known, having been pictured in the book *Thomas* Baxter, The Swansea Years 1816-1819 by John Wilstead and Bernard Morris

It came for sale as part of a consignment from the family



by Sotheby's in 1992 but some fine pieces, each bearing his collecting label, had remained in the family.

Prices for these pieces have come down a lot in recent years as the buying pool becomes smaller but this prize (in fine condition) did sell at

Horace Elliot wing-form jug sold for £6500 in November and a wassail bowl and cover by the Claypits potter William Williams inscribed and dated 1832 that took £15,000 in July 2021.

The April sale at Rogers Jones included a large sgraffito decorated model of a seated cat in a royal blue glaze c.1900.

Measuring 15in (38cm) high, it carries several inscriptions: to the chest the words Morris Gwae llygod lle bo cath fawr, (woe to mice, where there is a big cat) and to the base Jones Bridgend for Evan Jones.

Estimated at £700-1000, it took £2800.

Blanchard spread his wings This rare pair of late 19th century terracotta eagles, each standing 2ft 2in (64cm) high have indistinct marks for Blanchard Terracotta London. At garden statuary specialist **Summers Place Auctions (25/20% buyer's premium)** in West Sussex on March 28 they had a guide of £3000-5000 and took £5500.

Mark Henry Blanchard served his apprenticeship with the Coade Company and c.1839 established his own factory in London. By the middle of the century, he had emerged as the leading manufacturer of terracotta in Britain and was awarded prizes for his exhibit at the Great Exhibition of 1851.

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Gratitude for 'zeal and intredipity' in attacking women and children

A hero to the establishment in 1819 but a villain to the common man then and to everyone today, William Scholes Withington was back in favour at Cambridge.

Or rather an elaborate l6in (4lcm) tall 1818 silver gilt presentation cup that was sold at Cheffins' (24.5% buyer's premium) best sale to date of silver, jewellery and watches, on April 6.

Made by London smith William Burwash in 1818, it was engraved to one side with the arms of De Grelley, the medieval lords of Manchester, which were used by the local authorities at the time.

To the other side it was inscribed: To Thomas Scholes Withington Esq., One Of The Constables Of Manchester In The Year MDCCCXVII, The Principal Inhabitants Present This Cup, In Testimony Of The Grateful Sense They Entertain Of The Indefatigable Zeal And Intrepidity With Which He Discharged The Duties Of That Arduous And Responsible Situation In A Season Of Extraordinary Difficulty And Danger.

known, The Peterloo Massacre. Withington was a captain of the rag-tag Manchester & Salford Yeomanry mounted militia -the 1817 date on the cup refers to his appointment.

On August 16, 1819, his troop was ordered by magistrates to break up

the tens of thousands of people at St Peter's Fields in Manchester listening to Henry 'Orator' Hunt calling for franchise reform.

The militia's charge killed a child and injured a woman. The 15th Hussars were then ordered in, sabres-drawn, killing between nine and 17 people and injuring between 400-700. One of the injured, a weaver, unsuccessfully sued Withington in the civil court.

The 144oz cup was a magnificent reminder of a terrible day and it doubled top expectations, selling to a Midlands collector at £12,000.

The cup was among a consignment from senior lawyer and prolific collector Barry Lock (1934-2021).

Top bid of the day was a string of 71 natural saltwater pearls with an old-cut diamond clasp. Pitched at £10,000-5000, they sold to a London dealer at £58,000.

Brown has a golden moment

Led by the multi-estimate £90,000 bid for an intaglio carved with the portrait of a Roman Caesar (see *ATG* No 2590), the strong market in the glyphic arts was evident among other lots offered at Fellows 25% buyer's premium) in Birmingham on April 13

The second outstanding item at the Birmingham sale was the 11in (3cm) long gold carnelian intaglio shown above, signed W[illiam] Brown Inv't.

London maker William Brown (1748-1825) and his brother Charles (1749-95) were Europe's outstanding carvers of intaglios and cameos in the neoclassical era. Catherine the Great ordered about 400 – so many that for 10 years she became almost their sole client. Two hundred examples of their work are still in the Hermitage.

The Birmingham intaglio depicts Hebe feeding Zeus in the form of an eagle. Mounted as a gold fob, it was discovered among an assortment of jewellery brought in for sale.

The £1000-1500 estimate was a tempting one. Against bidders in the room and on the phone, it sold to a collector online at £9900.

Living longer, William Brown produced more material than brother Charles, whose works are snapped up when they do come to auction.

Last December, a cornelian oval seal made by the latter for Catherine the Great with an intaglio carved after Stubbs' 1770 painting *Horse Frightened by a Lion* was sold by Ilkley auction house Hartleys at £19,000 (ATG No 2572).

Send in the clowns: cigarette card rarity

Among the most popular cigarette cards to collect are those produced by the Taddy company.

And particularly in demand is a set of 20 titled *Clowns and Circus Artistes* which has the key appeal of being prototype versions that were never issued.

When they do come up at auction high four-figure prices will result.

The latest was offered by specialist saleroom **Loddon Auctions (22.8% buyer's premium inc tax)** on May 3. It sold via a phone bid at the low estimate of £8000.

The set came from the private collection of a 'renowned deceased collector', and several other Taddy cards featured in the Berkshire sale were from the same source.

Reeman Dansie of Colchester sold another *Clowns* set for £8400 in May 2021, while last year Lewes saleroom Toovey's took £4200 for one c.1915 catalogued as 'by family repute these cards were gifted to the vendor's grandfather, an avid cigarette card collector, by an employee at the Taddy factory'.

Long burner

The Taddy company dates back to the 18th century and by the end of the 19th

century it was one of the most important tobacco companies in Britain.

A 2021 article by a Mrs K Hart on the website of the Cartophilic Society of Great Britain noted that by 1897 cigarette cards were being put into the Taddy packets.

It said: "That year the company produced Actresses collotype and a five-card set called English Royalty. Then the next year came a set called Royalty, Actresses and Soldiers, while 1899 brought us Natives of the World."

In 1900 the set of 20 cards called Clown and Circus Artistes were produced but "didn't go out on general release. Only a few sets got out of the factory. It was on the July 29, 1987, at Phillips Auctioneers, that they sold a set for £15,500 – plus 10% premium making a total of £17,050. This was a breathtaking price as Murray's [card specialist firm] catalogue price at the time was only £6500."

Hart added: "I have never seen the packet, only an illustration of one with a date of December 21, 1900, in a copy of *Tobacco Journal*."

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





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Alma-Tadema's friends put on a panel show

Six of the 45 distinctive designs from the artist's spectacular London villa emerge at auction

The north London home of Sir Lawrence Alma-Tadema (1836-1912) must have been a real eye-opener to visit.

In 1885, he and his second wife Laura moved to 44 Grove End Road*, St John's Wood, the former residence of the artist James Tissot who had returned home to France not long before.

Over the next decade the couple spent an extraordinary £70,000 renovating and expanding the property, a huge sum at the time, creating a spectacular villa with a series of open-plan spaces articulated by arches. Its numerous rooms were all individually decorated, many in an opulent classical aesthetic.

With rooms dedicated to Greco-Roman, Egyptian, Byzantine and Arabic styles, not to mention the Japanese and Chinese rooms and the three-storey artist's studio with vast windows, 'Casa Tadema' as it became known was described by The Pall Mall Gazette as 'The Palace of the Beautiful'.

Striking feature

One of the most striking features was the Hall of Panels: a large space featuring white walls and alcoves inset with painted panels by artists such as Frederic, Lord Leighton, John Singer Sargent, Sir Frank Dicksee, Alfred East and Sir Edward John Poynter,

Some had been brought from Alma-Tadema's previous house but many were painted specifically for the setting.

The artists were seemingly given something of a free rein to choose what they wished to paint - they were described as 'substantial visiting cards' by one critic but they can also be regarded as personal messages to the Alma-Tademas from friends, family and colleagues.

Subjects ranged from scenes of ancient Rome to marines, landscapes

and painted interiors. Among the latter were views of the Alma-Tadema residence itself as well as pictures of his former home at Townshend House, near Regent's Park.

The size of the panels was 2ft 8in (81cm) high but there was some variation in width. By 1902, all 45 niches were filled and the scheme was described by the writer and actor Rudolph de Cordova as 'unique in London, unique in the world'.

Following Alma-Tadema's death in 1912, the contents of 44 Grove End Road were sold at auction by Hampton's in London and the panels were dispersed. Over the years, a number have passed through the trade, being sold by dealers such as Agnews and the Fine Art Society, while a group also emerged at Sotheby's Belgravia in 1974.

They have since been spread far and wide with examples such as Sargent's Javanese dancer now in the Museu Calouste Gulbenkian in Lisbon and another by Leighton ending up in the collection of Ann and Gordon Getty.

An effort to regroup them for a 2016-17 exhibition at the Fries Museum in Netherlands (which travelled to the Belvedere in Vienna and Leighton House in London) admirably located 17 of the original 45 panels.



It was, therefore, a significant moment when a group of six were consigned to Bonhams' (27.5/26/20/14.5% buyer's premium) 19th Century and British Impressionist Art sale on March 29. They had been acquired by Jim Fitzpatrick, owner of The Irish News,

and had hung in the newspaper's offices since he acquired them in the early 2000s from London dealer The Fine Art Society. Fitzpatrick died aged 92 last year but the main reason for the sale was The Irish News moving offices in Belfast.

Two of the panels, both dating from the 1880s, were by Tadema's sister-in-law Emily Epps Williams





(fl.1869-90) and the others were by Valentine Prinsep (1838-1904), John O'Connor (1830-89), Edith Hipkins (1854-1945) and Charles Green (1840-98). All six sold at the auction for a combined £92,200, going to six different buyers - two to UK private collectors, a couple to US-based private collectors, another to an Italian private buyer and one to

The top-seller by some distance was a view of Alma-Tadema's studio in Townshend House. It was painted by Williams, an artist who exhibited several times at The Royal Academy and The Grosvenor Gallery but who has largely fallen off the radar.

a US dealer.

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Leighton and Millais portrait sitters bring family values

While the Bonhams sale also offered plenty of European works (see *ATG* No 2590), other Victorian highlights included portraits of young women by two of the big names in the sector.

'Beautiful and sensuous'

Sea Echoes by Frederic, Lord Leighton (1830-96) depicts a young woman holding a sea-shell to her ear and was described in the catalogue as a 'beautiful and sensuous painting'. It was a Royal Academy exhibit from 1862.

The model features in a number of Leighton's paintings of the early 1860s and there was a tentative suggestion that she was one of his two sisters, Alexandra and Augusta.

It dates from a period when the artist was exploring figurative compositions with a story-telling element and could be regarded as a significant work from the earlier part of his career.

The 20¼ x 17½in (52 x 45cm) oil on canvas had been acquired by a member of the vendor's family from Sotheby's in January 1960 – indeed, it had been

previously untraced since then.

Estimated at £250,000-350,000, it drew interest from a number of parties but came down to a battle between a UK private buyer and an overseas collector before it was knocked down to the latter at £320,000.

While higher prices have been recorded for larger works, this was the highest price at auction for a work by the artist in this smaller format.

Not forgotten at £240,000

Also making a significant sum and a useful contribution to the bottom line at Bonhams was Forget-Me-Not by Sir John Everett Millais (1829-96). Another Royal Academy exhibit from 1883, the sitter in the picture is unknown but it is thought to have a likeness to the artist's daughter Effie.

The 2ft 9in x 2ft 1in (84 x 64cm) signed oil on canvas showed the young Victorian woman with a touch of an aristocratic lady of a bygone age, recalling portraits of the Georgian era. It was, therefore, somewhat removed

from his works as a radical young Pre-Raphaelite.

After his death, it remained in the collection of the artist's wife, Lady Millais, and stayed in the family until a Christie's sale in 1900. The private vendor here had inherited it, their family

having acquired it in the early 1960s.
Estimated at £200,000-300,000,
it drew competition from a UK-based
private collector who was eventually
seen off by a British art agent bidding
on behalf of a private collector.

It sold at £240,000.

The 2ft 8in x 7½in (81 x 19cm) oil on panel was signed with the artist's initials and showed the brightly lit studio from the side entrance up a flight of steps.

The studio, which was double-height and adorned with a shining aluminium-clad semi dome, was filled with numerous artefacts including a Japanese basket stool and a replica of the Hercules bowl by the window, as shown here. The painting also depicted a known Alma-Tadema work on the easel, the watercolour *An Old Story*.

The estimate for the panel was £5000-7000 which was not too far removed from the prices

fetched by all the others in the sale. However, this one gave a glimpse of Alma-Tadema's working practices and therefore had extra appeal to collectors and scholars of the artist's work.

After a prolonged bidding battle, it was knocked down at £50,000, by far the highest price among the few works by Williams ever sold at auction.

The other panel by the artist at the Bonhams sale was a view of the drawing room at Townshend House. Painted in 1885, it showed the striking black and white floor

created by Alma-Tadema and dated from the same year as another well-known painting of the same setting by his daughter Anna Alma-Tadema (1867-1943), a work she painted as a teenager which is now part of the Royal Academy's collection. The two works show the same lantern hanging from the highly decorated ceiling and the heavy brocade curtain hanging as a room divider.

This panel was slightly wider at 7½ in (19cm). Estimated at £5000-7000, it sold at £12,000.

Another panel of a window seat in Townshend House by Hipkins took £8500 against a £5000-7000 estimate. Alma-Tadema had been close to the artist's father, the eminent musicologist Alfred James Hipkins (1826-1903).

Thinner example

Also selling above estimate was one of the thinnest panels in the collection, a depiction of an Indian water carrier by Prinsep.

Measuring just 5¾in (15cm) wide, it was painted by the artist in his trademark style which, like Alma Tadema's, was much influenced by the Pre-Raphaelites.

Showing an Indian girl going down the sacred steps to the Ganges to fill her pitchers, the subject was also familiar for the Calcutta-born artist who returned to India in 1877 and later published his journals inspired by his experiences on the sub-continent.

The panel had previously been part of the Forbes collection of Victorian pictures but was unsold at the Christie's sale of the collection in 2003 against a £7000-10,000 estimate. Here it was given a lower pitch of £5000-7000 and it duly attracted interest, taking £9000.

An equally slim panel by O'Connor depicting a view in Vicenza sold above estimate at £8500, while, completing the set here, a panel titled *A bit of old Hampstead* by Green went below estimate at £4200.

* Alma-Tadema's home at 44 Grove End Road (now number 17) is a Grade II listed building and last went on the market in 2006 for £17m. The Alma-Tademas moved there after Townshend House was damaged when a barge transporting five tons of gunpowder exploded nearby on Regent's Canal.

Symons supporters make a bugle call

William Christian Symons (1845-1911) had a varied career, working as a designer for Royal Doulton and an illustrator for *The Graphic* and *The Strand Magazine* as well as receiving commissions to create mosaics for Westminster Cathedral and stained-glass windows for the firm Lavers, Barraud and Westlake.

As an artist he exhibited works at numerous galleries including the Royal Academy, Manchester City Art Gallery and the Royal Society of British Artists. He was friends with artists such as James Whistler (1834-1903) and John Singer Sargent (1856-1935) and, like the latter, he was an early supporter of the New English Art Club. Indeed, he would often borrow Sargent's studio in Fulham Road.

While Symons now has considerably less commercial standing than such contemporaries, his supporters would say his works represent excellent value on the current market, although not too many examples have come up for sale recently.

Doing something to address this, a group of 17 pictures was consigned directly from the artist's family to **Bellmans' (25% buyer's premium)** auction of Old Master, British and European Paintings in West Sussex on March 28.

While one lot was withdrawn, all the others sold for a £11,210 hammer total with the prices ranging from £5000 down to just £180 for a small pencil and wash sketch. Bellmans reported a mix of trade and private buying.

On a good note

The top-seller was *Blow Bugle, Answer Echo*, a 3ft 4in x 4ft 2in (1.02 x 1.27m) signed oil on canvas which had been one of the pictures shown at the posthumous exhibition of Symons' paintings and watercolours at the Goupil Gallery held the year after he died. It had also appeared in an exhibition at Victoria Art Gallery in Bath in 1994 titled *Life, Light and Colour: the rediscovery of William Christian Symons*.

The work was painted in the back garden of The Pilgrim's Rest, a medieval inn opposite the gatehouse of Battle Abbey which appears to the background. While it appeared to show a family scene, the



composition and style was somewhat removed from his more overtly figurative subjects, such as the picture that holds the artist's current auction record: *The Anchor's weighed, remember me* that fetched £20,000 at Sotheby's in 2006.

Here the estimate was set at £5000-7000, and it sold at the lower end of predictions.

Making a lesser sum but bringing more bidding against a £600-800 pitch was a painting of the artist's own family titled *The Recital*. Depicting his wife Cecilia, known as Sissy – who was a Royal Academytrained musician – playing the violin, together with the couple's sons, the 3ft x 2ft 4in (92 x 7lcm) oil on canvas was offered unframed and had a few condition issues such as some minor paint loss and shrinkage.

Even still, selling at £800, it was one of the works that followers would probably point to as representing good value.

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Funny felines stand up and deliver Louis Wain record

Has the film *The Electrical Life of Louis Wain* raised demand for the artist?

The 2021 movie starring Benedict Cumberbatch as Louis Wain (1860-1939) and Claire Foy as his wife Emily has certainly raised attention about the life and work of the mercurial painter and prolific illustrator of anthropomorphic cats.

As poignantly portrayed in the film, his humorous feline depictions, of which he typically produced several hundred sketches a year, had their roots in an emotionally intense period when his wife was dying of cancer.

To comfort her he brought home a stray kitten which they named Peter – the subject of his earliest cat drawings.

While his work became hugely popular in Victorian and early 20th century Britain, he was increasingly troubled by his mental health. He ended up in hospital on a pauper's ward but, after a public campaign to help him, he was transferred to London's Bethlem Hospital and later to Napsbury Hospital in Hertfordshire where he was able to continue to paint in pleasant surroundings with a garden and colony of cats.

In terms of the current Louis Wain market, while his work has many fans, the plentiful supply of material means collectors tend to be selective and prices at auction therefore range across a wide spectrum. Many sell for hundreds of pounds but only a small number of the larger and more colourful paintings make five-figure sums.

Notable prices

While such works are significantly rarer in the saleroom, a few notable prices came at **Bonhams**

(27.5/26/20/14.5% buyer's premium) last year when two pictures broke the £10,000 barrier – *The Tabby Toboggan Club* that made £11,000 in April 2022 and then *Pensive Puss* that made £12,000 in July.

Incidentally, Wain's striking Cubist-style ceramic cats have also recorded some strong sums of late, such as the record £8500 for an example at Kinghams in May 2022 (see *ATG* No 2548), although there is not much evidence of significant crossover interest between the two categories.

The latest picture at Bonhams


- A Highway Robbery - offered in a
Knightsbridge auction of Modern
British and Irish Art on March 22
was the best of the bunch so far.

A 20½ x 2ft 5in (52 x 73cm) signed gouache and pencil on paper, it was a comparatively large work on paper with an attractively large number of feline figures with lots of activity and plenty of humour.

Bonhams head of sale Catherine White told *ATG*: "Although works by the artist do appear on the auction market relatively frequently, this was a particularly fun example and quintessentially 'Wain'. The composition was a little more complex than other examples and had a more detailed narrative to the work. Wain is a master at capturing numerous characters and personalities in the facial expressions and mannerisms of his cats and this painting was a great example of this.

"We have certainly seen an increased interest in the market for his work over the last year or two."

While the extent to which this recent demand was down to the film remains a moot point, this picture

clearly had strong appeal for Wain collectors and, flying past a £3000-5000 estimate, it was knocked down at £30,000 and broke an 18-year old record.

The sum surpassed the previous high for Wain at auction: £25,000 for an oil painting of cats dancing around a maypole that sold at Bonhams in 2005.

Another work by the artist at the latest sale was a pen and ink drawing titled *On the River*. The 21 x 2ft 6in (53 x 76cm) signed sketch again had a good size, a lot of cats on show and a complex composition. Estimated at £2000-3000, it drew decent interest and sold at £4000, an above-average price for a drawing by Wain.

Classic Cuneo

Another popular name with a strong following is the railway enthusiasts' favourite Terence Cuneo (1907-96).

Cuneo is a reliable performer at

auction and here Bonhams offered a good-sized signed oil canvas of a famous train at full steam – all important factors in the market – which drew demand against a £30,000-50,000 estimate.

The depiction of the 1930s steam locomotive Duchess of Hamilton measured 2ft 6in x 3ft 3in (75cm x lm) and dated from 1978, 14 years after it officially stopped operating and two years before it first ran as the National Railway Museum's flagship locomotive. It remained operational until 1989, before becoming a static exhibit at the York museum.

A signed oil on canvas with provenance to locomotive specialist collector Allen Levy, it drew a number of interested parties at Bonhams and was knocked down at £45,000, the highest sum at auction for Cuneo since Sworders sold Evening star at full steam for £65,000 in March 2020 (ATG No 2436).

Colourful jacket of distinctive type

Four-figure first edition du Maurier book comes in the trademark Gollancz design without pictures


Offered in a recent Scottish sale was a 1938 first edition of *Rebecca* by Daphne du Maurier, one that sports the familiar red, black and yellow colours of the trademark, typographic-only jackets once favoured by the publisher, Gollancz.

Described as a copy without any major flaws, it was said to show some edge wear, mostly along the top, and to have the spine of the unclipped jacket sunned and bearing some minor marks. A small knock at the bottom of the front cover was also noted but the binding was said to be otherwise tight and the contents essentially clean and clear.

In a May 4 sale held by **Taylors** (25% buyer's premium) in Montrose, Angus, it realised £4200 against an estimate of £300-500.

Despicable behaviour

Also part of that auction was a copy of a much less familiar work, and one for which I have so far been unable to find anything more than what is revealed by the title-page.

It tells of the despicable behaviour of a so-called 'Young Gentleman' who seduced and ruined a young lady but then declined to marry her – which shameful behaviour "...was the utter Destruction of them both".

A copy of The Misfortunate Fair, or; Unhappy Lovely Maid, and the Deceiver Punished, it came with a condition report that read: "Leather rubbed, bookplate partially removed, original back paper cover lost, ex

ownership inscription to final page, light browning/foxing/staining, page corners and edges folded and sometimes a little fraved."

But it was still sold at £800 against an estimate of £20-30.

English 17th century works play their part in New York

Seventeenth century English plays provided the principal attraction in a New York sale.


One of the best sellers on May 4 at Swann Galleries (25/20/12% buyer's premium), with a winning bid of \$150,000 (£119,330) that doubled the high estimate, was one that presented the complete texts of *King Lear*, *Othello* and *Anthony & Cleopatra*.


Extracted from a First Folio of 1623, they were bound in dark blue morocco by Sangorski & Sutcliffe, along with a couple of facsimile leaves presenting a note 'To the Reader' and a catalogue of the plays.

Extensive collections

This was just one of a very large number of early quarto editions from the extensive collections of Ken Rappoport, led at \$65,000 (£51,710) by a copy of the 1634, first and only quarto edition of *The Two Noble Kinsmen*.

Although not included in the traditional canon of Shakespeare's plays because it did not appear among the folios, the play was a seemingly equal collaboration between Shakespeare and John Fletcher that had been completed in c.1613.

The only separate edition of the play printed in the 17th century, this copy, later bound in full brown morocco by Bedford, was formerly in the Rosenbach Collection.


Bid to \$26,000 (£20,685) was a first quarto edition of John Ford's play about a mutually infatuated brother and sister, *Tis Pitty Shee's a*

Whore, while one of the earliest lots was a 1617 edition of Thomas Heywood's A Woman Kilde with Kindnesse, which sold at \$19,000 (£15,115).

The title-page of the latter defines it as a third edition, but no second edition has been traced and the first edition of 1607 is known only from a copy now in the British Library.

Atlas admired for elegance

The County Durham-born cartographer John Arrowsmith (1790-1873) was responsible for one of the first 'modern' atlases of the 19th century: The London Atlas of Universal Geography Exhibiting the Physical and Political Divisions of the various countries of the World.

Admired for its understated elegance and clarity, it was first issued in 1834 but ran to many different versions until 1858

It is famously difficult to accurately designate 'editions' of this atlas. Although for the entire life of the atlas the contents page remained unchanged, from the 1838 issue Arrowsmith often customised production, replacing and adding in extra plates to the original 50.

Contrary to the norm, it is sometimes the later 'editions' of the atlas that are the most valuable as they contain a great variety and number of plates. In the case of Australia, the atlas began with three plates, with later copies offering as many as eight maps.

The copy of the Arrowsmith atlas offered by Anderson & Garland (25% buyer's premium) in Newcastle upon Tyne on March 22 came in a full-calf binding with gilt inscription The London Atlas 1861. Numbering 120 double-page maps in large folio format, it included some important later additions such as a map of Texas that includes the region of the upper Rio Grande within its borders.

This influential map was published with varying differences between 1841-58 (the date of this copy) and on its own is highly desirable. Here, as part of the atlas estimated to bring £2000-3000, it took £36,000.

A very long royal procession

Shown here are pages from an extremely long, hand-coloured aquatint record on one continuous folding strip just a little over 4in tall, but a work that would extend to around 19ft (5.8m) if fully opened.

Contained in the publisher's now re-backed, but gilt decorated cloth cover with its silver clasp, it presents an Authentic Representation of the Magnificent Marriage Procession and Ceremony... of Queen Victoria and Prince Albert... at the Chapel Royal, St James's, on February 10, 1840.

It was offered in a May 4 sale held by Chiswick Auctions (25/12% buyer's premium).

On its pages are displayed the uniforms, costumes, dresses and so on worn by those in attendance on that royal occasion, all of whose names and official appointments are given, along with details of the state apartments through which the long and distinguished procession passed.

When originally published by Fores the work cost one guinea fully coloured, or 12 shillings plain.

This example, re-backed and with the panorama held into the binding with tape at front and rear - though not affecting the image, said the cataloguer - sold for £1000 in the west London saleroom.

The c.1870s bangle, set with rubies, diamonds, emeralds, moonstone and enamel, has a makers mark *CG* for Carlo Giuliano (1831-95) and is numbered 50. Giuliano, who trained under the famous goldsmith Castellani, set up his own shop in London in 1874.

The bangle is estimated at £4000-6000 at Bellmans' fine jewellery and watches sale on May 18.

A timed online sale at Rogers Jones in Cardiff includes this trio of caricature figures – known as groggs – depicting the legendary front row of the Pontypool rugby team from the 1970s.

Comprising loose head prop Anthony 'Charlie' Faulkner, hooker Bobby Windsor and tight head prop Graham Price, the Pontypool threesome also represented Wales and the British Lions, becoming the first club front row to achieve both feats.

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
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Dealers' Diary

Female artists still at the forefront

Welcome focus on women in recent years shows no sign of slowing down amid great interest and demand

Following a now well-established and profitable theme in the market, female artists lead the way in a clutch of Modern British exhibitions taking place this spring.

Among the notable names is Evelyn Dunbar (1906-60), whose work is showcased by online dealership Modern British Art Gallery. The firm is a sister business to Liss Llewellyn, long a promoter of Britain's 20th century women artists.

The current programme comprises II weekly 'shows' on Dunbar, who was a painter, illustrator and official war artist. The shows are divided into themes such as Wartime Works, Studies for Major Paintings and Figure Studies & Nudes. The pictures are offered studio fresh with prices ranging from £100-5000.

'Twice in a lifetime'

Modern British Art Gallery dubs it a 'twice in a lifetime opportunity' since this is the second major discovery of Dunbar's works offered in the past 10 years.

In 2015 a group of previously unrecorded pictures by the artist found in an attic in a Kent house were exhibited in a show arranged by Liss Llewellyn at Pallant House, Chichester. Five years later, during a mid-lockdown shed clear-out, an extra 200 works on paper were uncovered in an outbuilding (at the same Kent property).

Some from this group have already sold, including a series of sketchbooks, which Oxford Brookes University bought, adding to its significant collection of Dunbar's work. The remaining ones are featured in the digital exhibitions.

Despite the artist being well known in her day, Anton Liss, who runs Modern British Art Gallery, says that Dunbar has returned to prominence only recently.


Interest from art historians and the possibility of a more formal programme of study on the artist planned by Oxford Brookes have bolstered her resurgence, he suggests.

Liss adds: "The market has evolved alongside this with demand for Dunbar's all too rare paintings which has become increasingly














Prices are likely to rise, he predicts, "especially with the phenomenal growth of interest in the work of woman artists, which in the case of Evelyn Dunbar you would consider to be entirely sustainable and justified".



Having a tranche of market-fresh works by a reclaimed female artist is an enviable position. Private collectors and major institutions alike are adding rapidly to their stores of these figures, as highlighted in a special report by *ATG* last winter (No 2573).

At the time, dealer Philip Mould told *ATG* that the key was to find "women artists of great talent who are going up in value," citing Jessica Dismorr (1885-1939) and Nina Hamnett as examples (1890-1956) in the Mod Brit arena.

This formula might apply also to Cicely Hey (1896-1980), who is in the spotlight at **The Court Gallery** in Somerset (show runs until June 15).

Hey is perhaps best known for her work as a model for Walter Sickert (1860-1942), and was married to Robert Tatlock, editor of *The Burlington Magazine* and art editor of *The Daily Telegraph*.

These relationships, especially with Sickert, have sometimes overshadowed the fact that she was






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- 1. Evelyn Dunbar, Woman on Sofa Reading Newspaper, watercolour on paper, £1500 at Modern British Art Gallery.

a highly trained and well-respected artist. Born in Oxfordshire, she studied at Brussels School of Art, Central School of Arts and Crafts and the Slade. Hey exhibited in London during the 1920s-30s, received positive reviews in the national press, and was a member of The London Group until her death.

A number of her works are held in national museums and other institutions, but the show in question is based on a recently rediscovered collection of paintings, drawings, watercolours and prints.

Prices range from £250-3750.

St Ives influences

In Cornwall, Belgrave St Ives holds an exhibition of prints by Wilhelmina Barns-Graham (1912-2004) from May 26-June 26.

Barns-Graham has recently been the subject of Paths to Abstraction at Hatton Gallery, Newcastle, which closes this week, and is one of the best-known women of the St Ives movement.

The show additionally features the prints of Bob Crossley, her exact contemporary, also associated with St Ives and the Penwith Society of Arts. In its April report on the Modern

British art market, Portland Gallery of St James's, London, noted the strength in demand for female artists, listing several with recent strong results at auction such as Vanessa Bell, Jessica Dismorr and Edith Rimmington.

The report said: "Across all houses, Mary Fedden performed consistently with encouraging results illustrating wide interest and demand. Portland Gallery actively took part in bidding for a number of these works, although prices rose above expected top estimates."

The gallery was among those commenting on the strength of the market for Fedden (1915-2012) at last year's Modern British Art Fair (ATG No 2565) and held an exhibition on the perennial favourite last year.

There are more Feddens to be found at the Spring into Summer 2023 exhibition at Clark Art in Cheshire. The show runs until August 24 and, though it includes a range of artists, highlights the work of women including Helen Bradley (1900-79) and Tessa Newcomb (b.1955).

1 How did you get your

My wife, Gill, and I had spent many years visiting antiques shops and auctions and had built up a quite interesting collection of glass. In 1991, we first took a stand in an antiques centre at Coltishall in Norfolk. Two years later the glass dealer who had been there for years died and his widow offered us his stock

At that point I had been a teacher for 30 years. It was a job I loved and felt was important, but I could see my vision of education did not fit the new training model created by Margaret Thatcher's government. Buying that dealer's stock in 1993 led to my decision to resign my headship of a small primary school.

That April, I found myself on the road searching for stock and passing school playgrounds where children were playing and shouting to each other. That first day I wondered if I had done the right thing. I had no idea that 30 years later I would still be working with glass and finding interesting examples I had never seen before.

2 What is your area of focus?

It has always been 18th and 19th century drinking glasses. At the beginning it was English glass but as the years have passed I have realised the importance of and interest in Continental glass. At any show I will always have glass from France, Holland, Germany and Bohemia and, of course, Murano. In addition, I generally have a selection of Roman glass.

What events do you have this

The Decorative Fair at Battersea (last week) and the Petworth Antiques Fair this week.

4 What is one great discovery you have made?

I have collected books since I was six years old and about seven or eight years ago I was looking at collectors' books coming up at my local saleroom.

I asked if there were any books on glass in the sale and was presented with the catalogue of the Felix Slade Collection published in 1871. This



formed the basis of the British Museum collection and many of the pieces can still be seen when visiting the Victoria and Albert Museum.

I had never seen the book before and found it interesting because it pre-

dated all the great volumes produced at the end of the 19th century. It contained no photographs but a number of detailed coloured drawings of glasses from Roman times to the 19th century. Many of them filled the half-folio pages but there were other, smaller pictures, one of which held my attention: a small bottle with a metal top which was enamelled with a bird among flowers and foliage. I recognised this piece because I had sold it about 15 years

Needless to say I was determined to buy the book which I did at the sale a few days later. It sits today in my

5 What is something you couldn't do without?

It is not exactly an item but, for me, it is the most important thing I need. I am fortunate that I still have a good memory which is essential for the research I carry out to confirm my opinion about glass I am contemplating buying. People ask me questions all the time and I often have to rely on my memory to produce an answer.

I suppose as time passes this may become more difficult but at the moment I can usually produce an answer or know the route to follow to get it. Long may it continue!

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Six Joseph Knibb clocks star in a stellar collection

This 8-day walnut longcase clock is one of six by Joseph Knibb in a 16-piece collection on offer from dealer **Ben Wright**, writes Frances Allitt.

Made c.1685, the clock (6ft 7in high) features a 10-inch square signed dial and may be one of the maker's first longcase clocks made with a skirted base.

The dial is described as "quintessential top-quality Knibb" and the movement is original with all the pillars and latches complete, and the original pendulum is also in place.

It is offered for a price in the region of £100,000.

Knibb was part of a large family of clockmakers, though his remain the best known and most collectable.

The group on offer from Wright includes two longcase clocks, two miniature lantern clocks and two table clocks. There is also a brass small lantern timepiece with an alarm by Knibb's brother John in Oxford.

A total of seven Knibb clocks "is a remarkable statistic for a collection of any size," Wright, who is based in tetbury, Gloucestershire, says in the catalogue introduction.

The collection also includes an ebony striking table clock by Thomas Tompion numbered 155.

It is the earliest-known example to incorporate the maker's twin subsidiary rings on his dial for pendulum regulation and strike/ silent, and the earliest-known clock to display the hand of an elegant



backplate engraver who became known as 'engraver No 155'.

Also to be found are a walnut and marquetry hooded wall clock by Christopher Gould, a month duration marquetry longcase clock by Jarrett with one and a quarter seconds pendulum and an ebony table clock by Henry Massy with month duration movement.



Crotch covered in St James's

This view of Wadham College, Oxford, by William Crotch (1775-1847) is the first and earliest in a catalogue of his works on show at **Guy Peppiatt Fine Art**.

Crotch was primarily a musician. He became famous as a child prodigy and in 1797 he was appointed Heather Professor of Music at Wadham College. The same year he completed this watercolour and pencil of the college buildings from his garden, which is offered for £1100.

Throughout his life he pursued his interest in art alongside his genius for music and said once he could not decide "which I love best between these two sisters". At Oxford his drawing improved under the guidance of John Baptist Malchair, who became a close friend.

Peppiatt's exhibition is staged at his gallery in Mason's Yard, St James's. It comprises 30 works mainly produced between 1802-42. It runs until May 19.

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Donation to the Met on the cards

Dr Cyril Mazansky, a retired radiologist in the US, is a historian and author with a focus on UK history. He has created a number of collections including British swords which have been donated to Brown University (Rhode Island) and an ongoing collection of trading cards which has been accepted as a future donation to the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York.







Dr Cyril Mazansky

ATG: how and when did you get the collecting bug?

Dr Mazansky: It was in the early 1980s. I used to paint military miniatures of the British army. I came across these military cigarette cards and thought they would be a good aid in my painting.

However, it did not take long before I became enamoured of these cards in their own right, and with my wife's enthusiastic support, they soon took on a life of their own and became a major collecting hobby.

What elements do you look for when considering a purchase?

Since my collection is very much a disciplined thematic one, my purchases are driven by that aspect. For me it has always been about creating as complete a collection as possible.

I was fortunate in that the major portion of my collection was acquired between the 1980s and early 2000s when these sets and good quality ones were still available.

Therefore, the driving force was acquiring these sets, most of which were in very good to excellent condition.

Where do you find items to buy?

The vast majority of my collection has been acquired via card auctions.

A significant number have also

been purchased from card dealers.

Would you classify your habit as 'buying the best' whatever the cost or are you driven more by the 'thrill' of hunting something that others may have missed?

My collection is most definitely not based on any thrills. It is an organised, disciplined approach. As I said, I was fortunate to acquire most of my collection when very good quality sets were available.

However, I have bought less than optimum sets or type cards when at the time these were the only ones available. If a higher quality set or part set or type card later came onto the market, I would often purchase the better quality one. I have often bid well above asking price to ensure the best chance of acquiring an important set or card types.

Where do you display your collection?

My entire collection is organised in card albums with sleeves anywhere from one to 10 cards per sleeve. These are all stored in bookshelves.

I also have an extensive and complete data-based system of my entire collection. This allows me to easily identify the location of any card or set in the albums.


How large is your collection?

I have nearly 2300 sets or part sets. A set may consist of anywhere from one card to 50 cards per set. I think the most common number is around 25.

What are your plans for the collection?

I am still collecting now but only very selectively. It is now almost entirely type cards to fill in gaps in incomplete sets. My aim is to physically hand over my collection to the Met in the next few years. I will probably continue collecting the way I am so that when I hand it over, it will be the most complete collection that I can achieve.

It has been a truly rich, rewarding and highly educational hobby for me

What is the most you have spent on an item for your collection?

In 1915 the cigarette manufacture WD & HO Wills produced a set of 50 cards titled *Waterloo* to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the Battle of Waterloo. It is a magnificent set.

However, the government, under wartime censorship, requested them not to issue it because then France was their close ally in the First World War, and they did not want to antagonise them.

A few sets ultimately came onto the market. These were probably owned by employees of Wills. I purchased a set in 1989 in very good to excellent condition for £3000. A 2023 card catalogue lists the price per card at £180, equivalent to £12,000 per set, but I would be surprised if any cards ever come onto the market.

Has the market for collecting cards changed since you started?

From my perspective there has been a definitive change.

A number of the older sets, especially from the latter part of the 19th century to the early 20th century are either no longer available or rarely so.

Even cards in the prime period of production between the two world wars are much less frequently available. One can still get part sets or only type cards from sets of this period. Now no cigarette producer ever issues cards. They are only from other commercial companies.

The subject matter has become much more narrowly focused,

compared with the extremely rich and varied types of sets that were also highly educational in the past. These are no longer being issued.

Sports celebrities, although always popular as just one aspect of card subject matter, now seem to play a far more dominant role. Also entertainment types of sets dominate.

The quality of the illustrations, in my humble opinion, does not have the same depth and richness from earlier cards.

Prices of older sets and especially collector quality sets have gone up on an average 3-4 fold in the 40+ years that I have been collecting.

What advice would you give a young collector starting out now?

I just don't know for certain, but I think this younger, digitally fixated generation, does not seem to be fascinated by this hobby unless it is, as in the US, baseball cards, and I suppose in the UK football and cricket cards. I do know that the members of the Cartophilic Society of Great Britain, from my perspective, appear to be of my generation.

If there was a younger member who was interested, I would only tell them of my personal experience, in that it has been a truly rich, rewarding and highly educational hobby for me.

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

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French style chimes with buyers

Fine clocks from a single-owner selection sell well into six figures in New York saleroom

Cottone's (20% buyer's premium) spring auction in Geneseo, New York, featured an impressive horological focus.

It included 50 examples of French and European clocks from the collection of Dr William Thomas of Naples, Florida, most of them acquired from the horological consultant Jim Cipra of Long Beach, California.

Two of these, both fine examples of late 18th/French Empire period precision clockmaking, provided some of the top prices of the entire auction on March 31.

Selling for \$205,000 (£165,320) against a guide of \$100,000-150,000 was a 15in (38cm) Louis XVI month going regulator with equation of time and remontoire from c.1785, by a royal clockmaker, Robert Robin (1741-99), in a case attributed to Pierre-Philippe Thomire.

Robin, who received a number of royal appointments during the reign of Louis XVI, produced luxury timekeepers for wealthy clients and this particular model was his most successful.

Dr Thomas' version featured a jewelled and enamelled porcelain dial decorated with the signs of the zodiac by the highly regarded enameller Joseph Coteau and is signed both by Robin and Coteau.

A second major attraction was a two-train orrery clock of c.1820



by Zacherie-Nicholas-Amé-Joseph Raingo. It has a separately wound musical box in the base and is set on an amboyna pedestal.

The ormolu-mounted clock, which is signed *Raingo. A Paris* to the dial, is fashioned in the form of an ormolu mounted rotunda surmounted by the solar system display which also features three horizontal dials indicating the zodiac and month divisions, lunar divisions and the divisions of the four years including leap years.

It sold for \$170,000 (£137,095)

against a \$150,000-250,000 guide.

Another precision timekeeper, but this time of British manufacture, was a 19th century 6ft 4in (1.9m) astronomical regulator showing mean and sidereal time signed *T Cooke & Sons York and London* to the silvered 13in dial.

It features a rare seven-legged gravity escapement and a weightdriven movement, and is contained in a mahogany, brass and glass case.

The regulator had a provenance to The Norman Lockyer Observatory Corporation, The Hill Observatory, Salcombe Regis, Sidmouth, Devon before being acquired by Dr Thomas from Mr Cipra. It sold at Cottone for \$45,000 (£36,290).

Tiffany window

Among the other consignments in the 220-lot sale was a selection of Tiffany glassware ranging from lamps and vases to Tiffany studios windows.

One of a latter, a 5ft 9in x 1ft 11½in (1.75m x 59cm) Impressionist sunset landscape window from 1915 set in a gothic-style wood frame, provided another of the day's top prices when it took \$230,000 (£185,485).

Bid for the feeling of Bliss

Converse Auctions in Pennsylvania will be offering the clock collection of Willis R Michael (1894-1969) in its online auction on May 19.

Michael, who was one of the founders of the NAWCC (National Association of Watch & Clock Collectors), trained as a tooland-die maker and owned a successful specialised tool-and-die company.

His interest in clocks began in 1937 when he purchased his first grandfather clock and his collection expanded to 400 clocks and 225 watches.

Many of the clocks and timekeepers in the auction are of American make.

Among them is this mahogany-cased marine chronometer made by John Bliss & Co of New York and fitted with a Roman numeral silvered dial and a stem wind.

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Family collection flies away to a white-glove result

Two Generations Collection was the title of an auction of automobilia and collectors' cars amassed by a single family.

Held by **Bonhams*** at Middletown, Rhode Island, it was a white-glove affair realising a premium-inclusive total of just over \$4.3m on April 29.

The 35 collectors' cars which rounded off the auction provided the top prices of the day headed, at \$760,000 (£613,000) by a Thomas Flyer, a 50HP seven passenger touring car from 1906 pictured right.

The 345 lots of automobilia which preceded the collectors' cars covered a huge variety of material including car accessories, model cars, motoring themed ceramics, posters and petrol pumps, motoring trophies and motor themed vesta cases.

High-flying posters in the sale included a 3ft 11in x 5ft 2in (1.2 x 1.57m) example for the *Grand Prix de l'ACF* at Dieppe from 1908, a striking design by Bric showing a goggles-wearing driver speeding along a coastal road in a racing car. It was printed on paper by B Chapellierjeune, Paris, and mounted on linen and took \$27,000 (£21,775), over four times the \$5000-7000 guide.

Keen competition also came for a Paris-printed Michelin tyre poster from c.1905 designed by E Montaut measuring 5ft lin x 3ft 10in (1.54 x 1.16m) depicting another racing car with the legend *Le Pneu Michelin A Vaincu le Rail* (The Michelin Tyre has beaten the Rail). It went beyond a \$3000-4000 guide to take \$20,000 (£16,130).

A c.1901 poster measuring 4ft 10in x 3ft 7in (1.47 x 1.09m) advertising Automobiles Corre, a design by Philippe Chapellier prominently featuring a large unicorn logo, realised \$10,000 (£8065) against a guide of \$1000-1500.

Bing 'Gordon Bennett'

An early rarity among the selection of toy and model cars was a 11½in (28.5cm) long clockwork-powered 'Gordon Bennett' racing car made by the German firm of Bing, c.1904.

This was hand painted in yellow with gold details and numbered 71, had velvet upholstered pierced metal white seats, a red chassis and spoked wheels with white rubber tyres and was described as in 'playworn' condition. Estimated at \$6000-8000, it sold for \$26,000 (£20,970).

Much more modestly guided at \$300-400 was another early clockwork racing car: an 8in (20cm) French model of c.1905 lithographed in red and with a driver and mechanic and a maker's mark to the rear. This ended up making \$6000 (£4840).

Erwin Ross Thomas, whose factory produced The Flyer, started out in the bicycle-making business working for H A Lozier & Co. He left to take over the Buffalo Automobile and Auto-Bi company, producing bicycles and motorcycle engines, changing its name in 1900 to Thomas Auto-Bi.

The first Thomas automobiles, small runabouts, were produced in 1903. The firm progressed with a more substantial frame and a three cylinder engine. Because of its sprightly performance the new car was christened a Flyer by Thomas' Chicago agent CA Coey, a highly marketable name that stuck. The engine size progressed with the addition of extra cylinders so that by 1905 the firm offered a range of four Flyers: a four-cylinder 40hp, two four-cylinder 50hp and a six-cylinder 60hp.

Thomas Flyers soon gained fame among the faster and more flamboyant touring cars of their time and were often finished in bright colours with ornate accessories. The remarkably original Flyer offered at Bonhams – almost certainly the only unrestored example of this model, said the auction house – had been acquired from the well-known William Fisk Harrah collection in the 1980s. It sold at Bonhams to a bidder in the room.






