## **BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS**

---

The City Charter requires an annual Public Hearing and adoption of the City's budget for the upcoming year. The following Proposed Fiscal Year 2019-20 Annual Budget and Citywide Fee Schedule are presented to City Council for adoption.

The General Fund provides the majority of ongoing governmental services that are not funded through restricted special revenue funds. These services include Fire, Police, Library, Arts & Culture, Community Services and Parks, Community Development, Public Works and general staff support services that include Administrative Services/Finance, City Clerk, City Treasurer, City Attorney, Management Services, Human Resources, and Innovation, Performance and Audit. The General Fund is supported by general taxes including property, sales, utility users, and other taxes, in addition to various fees and transfers from other funds.

Based on the FY 2019-20 proposed revenues and appropriations, we anticipate balancing the budget with an estimated use of fund balance of approximately \$319 thousand. Looking into the horizon, the City faces several ongoing funding challenges, the most significant challenge being the ongoing increase in PERS rates. Other challenges include shoring up the internal service rates, such as compensation insurance, liability and medical insurance. Total General Fund revenues are expected to grow by an average of 1.9% for the next five years, and without any significant new revenue sources, the City will have to be creative to meet the funding challenges presented.

As Glendale continues to streamline its costs and strategic goals, quality of service and continuity to be important - our customers must sense *value*. The organization must maintain structural balance by consistently applying the lens of long-term sustainability, closely monitoring cost-drivers and adapting to changes. Our goal is to restore, build, and maintain our programs, infrastructure and services and to not revert to traditional patterns and work flows. The City will continue to aggressively pursue exceptional customer service, balance value propositions, and invest in the future. With the City Council's vision and a team of high-quality ethical professionals, our value proposition to the community is renewed and has once again shaped this year's budget process.

## FY 2019-20 PROPOSED CITYWIDE BUDGET

The total appropriation proposed for FY 2019-20 citywide budget is \$938.3 million. A summary of revenue estimates and appropriations for all funds can be found in Attachments 1 and 2, respectively. The table below is a summary of citywide appropriations by fund-type as adopted for FY 2018-19 and as proposed for FY 2019-20.

### GENERAL FUND

The discussion below summarizes the proposed FY 2019-20 General Fund budget and the adopted FY 2018-19 General Fund budget for the City of Glendale.

#### Resources

The table below shows the estimates of the major revenue sources for the General Fund by major category along with the use of fund balance that equates to total resources.

Some of the significant revenue changes for the proposed FY 2019-20 budget include the following:

- Property Tax: This category is projected to increase by \$2.5 million, or 4.1%, for a total of \$64.0 million in FY 2019-20. The increase is attributable to a variety of factors, including continued low mortgage rates and an increase in the assessed property valuation. Due to recent mortgage rate increases, however, the California housing market has slowed somewhat; once the market adjusts to these new rates, housing sales should begin to rise again.
- Sales Tax: This category is forecasted to increase by \$718 thousand, or 1.6%, for a total of \$45.4 million in FY 2019-20. This figure does not include the revenue estimate for the recently approved Glendale Quality of Life and Essential Services Protection Measure (Measure S). While California's retail sales continue to rise on an annual basis, the growth in certain industries are projected to be smaller going into FY 2019-20 than in FY 2018-19, including autos/transportation, building/construction, and fuel/service stations. The proposed sales tax to be transferred into the Capital Improvement Fund for FY 2019-20 is 2.00%.
- Utility Users Tax (UUT): UUT revenues are estimated to decrease by \$1.7 million, or 5.7%, for a total estimate of \$28.2 million in FY 2019-20. This category continues to decline due to the shift in consumer behavior as more customers are switching from traditional phones and cable services to pre-paid and over the top (OTT) service providers, such as Sling TV, Netflix and Hulu, which are not taxed at this time.
- Occupancy & Other Taxes: This category is expected to increase by \$412 thousand, or 2.5%, for a total estimate of \$16.7 million. This is largely attributable to a \$200 thousand, or 5.0%, increase in the estimate for Landfill Host Assessment revenues.
- Interfund Revenue: The City uses a Cost Allocation Plan for the General Fund in order to allocate certain General Fund costs from central service departments, such as Finance, Human Resources, City Attorney, City Clerk, and City Treasurer, to a variety of "receiving" departments, such as Glendale Water and Power and Public Works, which are funded outside of the General Fund. For FY 2019-20, this category is expected to decrease by \$272 thousand, or 1.4%.
- Recreation and Filming Funds Shift to the General Fund: This category includes several revenue line items affected by the collapsing of the Recreation Fund and Filming Funds into the General Fund (from Special Revenue Funds category) in FY 2019-20. The net revenue impact of the shift of these funds' resources is \$5.3 million, which includes the following:
  - *Charges for Services*: \$3.2 million from the Recreation Fund, \$860 thousand from the Filming Fund and \$607 thousand from the Special Events Fund;
  - *Interest/Use of Money Property*: \$532 thousand from the Recreation Fund and \$20 thousand from the Filming Fund;
  - *Revenue from Other Agencies*: \$4 thousand from the Recreation Fund; and
  - *Miscellaneous and Non-Operating*: \$48 thousand from the Recreation Fund.

- **All Other Revenues (Net):** This category holds the remainder of the revenue line items in the FY 2019-20 Proposed General Fund Budget, including:
  - *Licenses and Permits:* This category is expected to increase by \$960,000, or 9.9%, for a total estimate of \$10.7 million. The majority of the increases is attributable to new fees or recommended fee increases for FY 2019-20 (including Consumer Price Index (CPI) adjustments of 3.15% for many fee categories).
  - *GSA Loan Repayment:* This category is estimated to be \$3.7 million in FY 2019-20, which is a decrease of \$6.3 million, or 62.8%, from FY 2018-19. This is estimated to increase for FY 2020-21, with a final payment in FY 2021-22.
  - *Charges for Services:* Excluding the shifted resources from the collapse of the Recreation and Filming Funds, this category is projected to increase by \$2.4 million, or 26.4%, for a total estimate of \$11.6 million. This increase is due primarily to the receipt of \$2.0 million of the total estimated \$6.6 million in Scholl Canyon Tipping Fees in the General Fund in FY 2019-20 (in prior years, these revenues were fully deposited into the Capital Improvement Fund). It is worth noting that this category also includes increases to various line items due to fee increases resulting from applying a Consumer Price Index (CPI) adjustment of 3.15% for FY 2019-20.
  - *Transfers from Other Funds:* This category is projected to decrease by \$759,000, or 3.4%, for a total estimate of \$21.4 million for FY 2019-20. The majority of this variance is due to a lower transfer from the Electric Works Revenue Fund, which is set at 10% of certain revenues in that fund – and those revenues are estimated to be lower for FY 2019-20.

## Appropriations

The appropriations for the FY 2019-20 proposed General Fund budget and FY 2018-19 adopted General Fund budget, are as follows:

As indicated above, the General Fund budget is forecasted to increase by approximately \$9.2 million or 4.0%. This increase is mainly attributable to the following:

- **Salaries and Benefits:** The total net increase in the Salaries and Benefits category is \$11.9 million. Of this amount, \$6.2 million is an increase in PERS costs (net of employee cost sharing); \$3.0 million due to the Recreation Fund collapsing into the General Fund; \$1.1 million due to the Filming Funds collapsing into the General Fund; as well as Cost of Living Adjustments for GFFA (1.5%), GCEA (1.5%), GMA (1.5%) and Hourly Employees (1.5%), and normal step progression and reallocation of employees. Total Benefits are net of salary charges out to other Funds.
- **Maintenance & Operation (M&O):** There is a total net decrease of \$2.1 million in the M&O budget proposed for FY 2019-20. This is due to a decrease of approximately \$3.0 million in Fleet/Equipment Rental Charge; \$1.0 million in all other M&O due to various departmental budget reductions and \$390 thousand for ISD Service Charge. These decreases in appropriation are offset by increases of \$1.1 million due to the Recreation Fund collapsing into the General Fund; \$1.0 million for Liability Insurance and \$174 thousand due to the Filming Funds collapsing into the General Fund.
- **Transfers Out:** There is a total net decrease of \$687 thousand in the transfer budget proposed for FY 2019-20. This is due to a decrease of approximately \$1.3 million in transfers to the Low and Moderate Housing Fund resulting from less GSA Loan Repayment budgeted than last fiscal year. This decrease is offset by increases of \$500 thousand in transfer to the Debt Service Fund and \$74 thousand in Sales Tax transfer to the Capital Fund.

Based on the FY 2019-20 proposed revenues and appropriations, we anticipate balancing the budget with an estimated use of fund balance of approximately \$319 thousand. Although we are proposing a budget with a slight budget gap for FY 2019-20, it is an improvement from our initial budget gap of \$11.0 million. With cooperation from various departments, we were able to efficiently reduce departmental budgets as well as internal service costs for FY 2019-20 by eliminating some vacant positions and reducing various M&O projections to achieve a proposed budget with a slight budget gap. The proposed General Fund budget represents our continued commitment to deliver quality services while maintaining fiscal responsibility.

### **Glendale Quality of Life and Essential Services Protection Measure (Measure S)**

On November 6, 2018, Glendale voters approved the Quality of Life and Essential Services Protection Measure (otherwise known as "Measure S"), which increased the sales tax rate in the City by 0.75%, to a new total of 10.25%, effective April 1, 2019. The entire 0.75% increase goes directly to the City of Glendale, increasing its portion of the 10.25% rate from 1.00% to 1.75%. It is estimated that the City will receive \$30 million in sales tax revenue from Measure S in FY 2019-20 (with approximately \$7.5 million also estimated for the last three months of FY 2018-19).

All revenues resulting from the passage of Measure S will be received and accounted for separately in the General Fund and in the newly created Measure S Capital Improvement Fund (Fund 4011) to account for all CIP related activity. The State remits sales taxes to the City in the form of two monthly "advances", followed by a third month "clean-up" to true up the City's quarterly revenues to the actual sales taxes received by the State. The first advance for Measure S revenues for the April 1 – June 30, 2019 quarter will be received in June 2019; the second advance will be received in July 2019; and the final clean-up will be received in August 2019. This three-month cycle will repeat for every subsequent quarter. As a result, by August 2019, the City will have received its first full-quarter Measure S revenues.

During the Budget Study Session #3 meeting on May 14, 2019, staff presented a menu of options to City Council for the possible funding using Measure S revenue, including housing, infrastructure, recreation, holiday programming and other essential needs. City Council's decision was to allocate the estimated Measure S revenues towards housing (\$25.3 million), infrastructure (\$3.5 million), recreation (\$560 thousand), and holiday programming (\$458 thousand). For the allocation towards Affordable Housing Development in the amount of \$20.0 million and Infrastructure, Seismic Upgrades in the amount of \$3.5 million, both the Measure S revenue and appropriation will be directly deposited and expensed under the newly created Measure S Capital Improvement Fund (Fund 4011). As for the remainder of the programs that will be funded with Measure S, similar to the revenues received, all expenses incurred will be budgeted and accounted for separately within the General Fund. All unspent appropriation or unallocated funds will be returned to an assigned Measure S General Fund, fund balance category. The table below represents the approved Measure S funding towards various priorities for FY 2019-20.

### OTHER FUNDS

#### Special Revenue Funds

The \$1.8 million decrease (approximate) in the *Special Revenue Funds* is primarily due to the following:

- CDBG Fund 2010 – The increase of approximately \$27 thousand is due to an increase in projected revenue applied towards capital projects.
- Housing Assistance Fund 2020 – The increase of approximately \$1.3 million is primarily due to an increase in anticipated revenue applied towards personnel costs, direct assistance and Portable Voucher HAP.



- Home Grant Fund 2030 – The increase of approximately \$601 thousand is due to an increase in anticipated revenue applied towards direct assistance.
- Continuum of Care Grant Fund 2040 – The increase of approximately \$33 thousand is due to an increase in anticipated revenue applied towards contractual services
- Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act Fund 2060 – The increase of approximately \$624 thousand is due to an increase in anticipated revenue applied towards direct assistance.
- Affordable housing Trust Fund 2090 – The increase of approximately \$182 thousand is due to an increase in personnel costs.
- Urban Art Fund 2100 – The increase of approximately \$180 thousand is due to an increase in contractual services that is primarily driven by anticipated revenue received.
- Glendale Youth Alliance Fund 2110 – The increase of approximately \$393 thousand is due to an increase in anticipated revenue applied towards personnel costs.
- Low & Mod Income Housing Asset Fund 2130 – The decrease of approximately \$672 thousand is due to a decrease in contractual services.
- Miscellaneous Grant Fund 2160 – The increase of approximately \$722 thousand is due to an increase in anticipated revenue applied towards direct assistance.
- Filming Fund 2170 – The decrease of approximately \$609 thousand is due to the fund collapsing into the General Fund in FY 2019-20.
- Recreation Fund 2180 – The decrease of approximately \$4.2 million is due to the fund collapsing into the General Fund in FY 2019-20.
- Hazardous Disposal Fund 2190 – The increase of approximately \$46 thousand is due to an increase in personnel costs.
- Parking Fund 2210 – The increase of approximately \$4.2 million is due to an increase in contractual services and capital projects.
- Measure M Local Return Fund 2220 – The decrease of approximately \$119 thousand is due to a decrease in contractual services.
- Measure H Fund 2240 – The increase of approximately \$38 thousand is due to personnel costs.
- Measure W Fund 2260 – This fund was newly established to account for a storm water maintenance and management program. This fund has a proposed appropriation of approximately \$1.2 million in personnel costs, contractual services and CIP projects.
- Air Quality Improvement Fund 2510 – The increase of approximately \$15 thousand is due to an increase in contractual services.
- Measure R Local Return Fund 2540 – The decrease of approximately \$340 thousand is due to less appropriation in capital outlay.

- Measure R Regional Fund 2550 – The decrease of approximately \$4.5 million is due to a decrease in project appropriation relative to last year.
- Transit Prop A Local Return Fund 2560 – The increase of \$617 thousand is due to an increase in contractual services.
- Transit Prop C Local Return Fund 2570 – The decrease of approximately \$53 thousand is due to contractual services.
- Transit Utility Fund 2580 – The increase of approximately \$463 thousand is due to an increase in contractual services, personnel costs and utility charges.
- Asset Forfeiture Fund 2600 – The decrease of approximately \$191 thousand is due to the shifting of a position into the General Fund.
- Police Special Grants Fund 2610 – The increase of \$144 thousand is due to an increase in personnel costs.
- Supplemental Law Enforcement Fund 2620 – The decrease of approximately \$64 thousand is due to a decrease in personnel costs based on activity projected.
- Fire Mutual Aid Fund 2660 – The increase of approximately \$150 thousand is due to an increase in anticipated revenues applied towards personnel costs.
- Special Events Fund 2670 – The decrease of approximately \$1.2 million is due to the fund collapsing into the General Fund in FY 2019-20.
- Library Fund 2750 – The increase of approximately \$96 thousand is due to an increase in hourly wages, books and general supplies.
- Cable Access Fund 2800 – The decrease of approximately \$675 thousand is due to a decrease in project appropriation relative to last fiscal year.
- Electric Public Benefit Fund 2910 – The decrease of approximately \$227 thousand is due a decrease in personnel costs, and rate decreases in the ISD and Building Maintenance charges.

### **Debt Service Funds**

There is only one Debt Service Fund with an appropriation for FY 2019-20: the Police Building Project (Fund 3030). The increase in this fund of approximately \$461 thousand is mainly due to an increase in interest costs on bonds.

## Capital Improvement Program

The \$11.4 million net increase (approximate) in the *Capital Improvement Program* is primarily due to the following:

- General Fund Capital Improvement Fund 4010 - The decrease of approximately \$11.7 million is a result of a decrease in appropriation for projects relative to last year. Some of the major project appropriations for FY 2019-20 within this fund include: \$650 thousand for Fire Station 28 Reconstruction; \$625 thousand for Montrose Parking Lot and Electrical Upgrade; \$500 thousand for Dunsmore Parking Lot Resurfacing; \$250 thousand for Sports Complex Field 3 Artificial Turf; \$200 thousand for Fire Station 26 Reconstruction; \$200 thousand for MSB Tenant Improvements; \$125 thousand for ADA Facility Modification; and \$100 thousand for Branch Libraries.
- Measure S Capital Improvement Fund 4011 – This is a newly established fund with a proposed appropriation of \$23.5 million in new Housing development as well as infrastructure needs for seismic upgrades approved by City Council as part of the Measure S allocation for FY 2019-20.
- State Gas Tax Fund 4020 – The increase of approximately \$310 thousand is a result of an increase in appropriation for projects relative to last year. Some of the major project appropriations for FY 2019-20 within this fund include: \$2.4 million for the La Crescenta Avenue Rehabilitation Project; \$1.0 million for the Maintenance District 9 Pavement Rehabilitation; \$865 thousand for Street Resurfacing Program; \$650 thousand for Pavement Management System and \$660 thousand for Street Tree Maintenance Program.
- Parks Mitigation Fee Fund 4050 – The decrease of \$750 thousand is due to a decrease in project appropriation relative to last year. The only project appropriation for FY 2019-20 is for Pacific Park Artificial Turf in the amount of \$750 thousand.

## Enterprise Funds

The \$31.4 million net increase (approximate) in the *Enterprise Funds* is primarily due to the following:

- Sewer Fund 5250 – The decrease of approximately \$3.1 million is due to a decrease in project appropriation relative to last year.
- Refuse Disposal Fund 5300 – The decrease of approximately \$1.3 million is due to less appropriation for capital outlay, depreciation and utilities. These decreases are offset by increases in contractual services.
- Fiber Optic Fund 5400 – This fund was newly established to provide improved commercial network infrastructure to expand the City's operation as a provider. This fund has a proposed appropriation of approximately \$220 thousand in personnel costs and contractual services.
- Verdugo Fire Communication Fund 5800 – The decrease of approximately \$1.8 million is due to a decrease in capital outlay. Part of this decrease is offset by an increase in contractual services, cost allocation and the ISD service charge.

- Electric Utility Funds 5820, 5830, 5850 & 5880 – The increase of approximately \$32.7 million is mainly attributable to an increase in purchased power, fuel-natural gas, regulatory expenses and an increase in project appropriation relative to last year.
- Water Utility Funds 5920, 5930 & 5950 & 5980 – The increase of approximately \$4.6 million is mainly attributable to an increase in project appropriation relative to last year, personnel costs, cost allocation charges and depreciation.

### Internal Service Funds

The \$5.9 million decrease (approximate) in the *Internal Service Funds* is primarily due to the following:

- Fleet Management Fund 6010 – The decrease of approximately \$1.7 million is primarily due to a decrease in capital outlay.
- Joint Air Support Fund 6020 – The increase of approximately \$1.7 million is due to an increase in capital outlay for a purchase of a helicopter. Cost reflects 50% of helicopter purchase. The remaining 50% is paid for by City of Burbank.
- ISD Infrastructure Fund 6030 – The decrease of approximately \$2.3 million is primarily due to a decrease in capital outlay. Part of this decrease is offset by an increase in contractual services.
- ISD Applications Fund 6040 – The decrease of approximately \$2.4 million is primarily due to decreases in capital outlay, computer software, contractual services and hourly wages.
- Building Maintenance Fund 6070 – The increase of approximately \$483 thousand is primarily due to an increase in repairs and grounds maintenance.
- Unemployment Insurance Fund 6100 – The decrease of approximately \$674 thousand is primarily due to a one-time transfer that was made in FY 2018-19 to the Compensation Insurance Fund (Fund 6140) to help improve its negative fund balance.
- Liability Insurance Fund 6120 – The decrease of approximately \$414 thousand is primarily due to a decrease in cost allocation charges and personnel costs. Part of this decrease is offset by an increase in general supplies and excess insurance premium.
- Workers Comp Insurance Fund 6140 – The increase of approximately \$634 thousand is due to increases in excess insurance premium and cost allocation charges.
- Dental Insurance Fund 6150 – The decrease of approximately \$561 thousand is primarily due to a one-time transfer that was made in FY 2018-19 to the Medical Insurance Fund (Fund 6160) due to funding needs.
- Medical Insurance Fund 6160 – The decrease of approximately \$35 thousand is due to a decrease in administrative fees for active and retired employees. Part of this decrease is offset by an increase in medical premiums and claims.
- Vision Insurance Fund 6170 – The decrease of approximately \$241 thousand is primarily due to a one-time transfer that was made in FY 2018-19 to the Medical Insurance Fund (Fund 6160) due to funding needs.

- Employee Benefits Fund 6400 – The increase of approximately \$448 thousand is due to an increase in anticipated separation and compensated time payouts.
- RHSP Benefits Fund 6410 – The decrease of approximately \$258 thousand is due to a decrease in compensated absences accrual.
- ISD Wireless Fund 6600 – The decrease of approximately \$693 thousand is primarily due to a decrease in capital outlay. Part of this decrease is offset by an increase in contractual services.

### AUTHORIZED FULL-TIME SALARIED POSITIONS

The FY 2018-19 authorized full time position count is 1,591. As part of the departmental budget reductions for the achievement of a balanced budget in FY 2019-20, it is proposed to eliminate a net total of 12 full time positions of which 11 are from the General Fund. As part of the Measure S approved funding staff is proposing the addition of five unclassified full time positions for the Monthly Housing Rental Subsidy Program and one classified full time position for the Aquatics Program Expansion, making the proposed FY 2019-20 full time position count 1,585. The table below provides a summary of the authorized FY 2018-19 and proposed FY 2019-20, full-time salaried position count.

### PROPOSED NEW FEES & CHANGES

The Citywide Fee Schedule lists 2,347 fees administered by the City. Overall, staff has identified and is proposing the following: 12 new fees, 39 fee increases, 759 Consumer Price Index (CPI) Increases, 30 decreases to existing fees, 35 fee deletions, and a modification to one existing fee. These proposed changes, if approved by City Council, will be effective in FY 2019-20. It is important to note that most non-development-related increases and changes will take effect 30 days after Council adoption, with all development project related fee increases and changes becoming effective no sooner than 60 days following City Council adoption of the proposed fees.

The FY 2019-20 Proposed Citywide Fee Schedule (Attachment 3) shows existing fees and whether they are new, changed, unchanged or need to be removed from the proposed schedule. User fees included in the Citywide Fee Schedule are charged as a fixed fee per unit, a valuation based fee, or as an hourly fee, which is shown for each fee listed.

The attachment also shows the recommended CPI adjustment of 3.15% for fees charged by the following departments: Public Works, Library, Arts and Culture, Community Development, Police, Fire and Glendale Water and Power. The CPI adjustment of 3.15% is based on data from the Bureau of Labor Statistics for a 12-month period ending January 2019 for all items in the Los Angeles-Long Beach-Anaheim geographic region.

## AMENDMENT OF CLASSIFICATION AND COMPENSATION RESOLUTIONS

### Introduction

As City departments periodically review their respective organizational structures, recommendations are made relative to the need for changes in job classifications and titles. Additionally, adjustments to compensation are recommended due to inequity studies, market factors and recruitment/retention challenges. Such changes require amendment to the various Classification and Compensation resolutions. The Human Resources Department and City Manager's office review and approve said proposals prior to Council consideration.

For the 2019/2020 Fiscal Year, staff is seeking to establish several classification titles and continue the process of bringing other classifications throughout the City into alignment with their respective labor market counterparts, with a concern for appropriate internal equity.

The most significant of these changes involve a reorganization and modernization of the classifications within the Information Services Department, as addressed in Budget Study Session #2 on May 7, 2019. Additionally, there are ten other transactions that involve either new job classification titles or adjustments to existing compensation levels for other City departments.

### Information Services Department

In an effort to modernize the City's information technology environment and develop a more contemporary and flexible infrastructure and take advantage of new applications, technologies and software, the Information Services Department is seeking to upgrade and improve existing job classifications to ensure that the right personnel with appropriate skill sets are retained. Recruitment and retention of talented information technology personnel has been a significant challenge. A comprehensive review of classification titles, job descriptions and compensation levels has not been undertaken for many years. Thus, many classification titles and associated job duties and minimum requirements are outdated. In a field that is continually evolving, a full review of the organization's structure, classifications and compensation is in order.

Thus, staff is proposing that a series of new titles be established that would better serve a contemporary information technology organization and best meet the needs of the City. The new classification titles would include **Systems Engineer I, II and III** to eventually replace the Systems Analyst series. The classifications of **Departmental Applications Manager, GIS Manager, IT Projects Manager** and **Network Manager** are being added to better address the needs of those respective functions. Additionally, with the newly proposed managerial titles being added to the organization, the existing classifications of **Senior PC Specialist Supervisor, IT Infrastructure Manager, IT Applications Manager, Wireless Systems Manager** and **Assistant Chief Information Officer** are proposed for compensation adjustments to ensure appropriate internal compensation alignment and avoid any salary compaction.

As addressed in the budget study session, the cost of the proposed Information Services Department restructuring is \$390,000, which will be phased in over the course of the fiscal year and funded within the Department's internal service fund. Within this restructuring, no new positions are being added and the existing budgeted headcount will remain the same.

## Public Works

In the Public Works Department, one of the existing Assistant Director of Public Works incumbents has been assigned to serve as City Engineer. Thus, staff has proposed a new classification of **Assistant Director of Public Works/City Engineer**, which will be a lateral move at no additional cost. Additionally, staff is recommending an adjustment to the compensation of the classification of **Assistant Transit Manager** in order to achieve better internal alignment with the Transit Manager classification. Both of these transactions involve existing budgeted positions, thus no increase in overall headcount will occur.

## Community Development

In the Community Development Department, staff is proposing an adjustment to the compensation of the **Principal Neighborhood Services Supervisor** classification to address additional duties associated with the Rental Rights program. Similarly, staff is also requesting an upgrade to an existing Housing Systems Analyst position to a new classification of **Housing Applications Manager** to address the additional responsibilities. Additionally, the classification of **Senior Inspector** is recommended for an adjustment due to a salary compaction problem between this supervisory position and its subordinate staff. Each of these transactions involve existing budgeted positions, thus no increase in overall headcount will occur.

## Glendale Water & Power

Glendale Water & Power is proposing a new classification of **Utility Business Systems Support Administrator** to run the information technology and business support systems for GWP. With the increasing complexity and vulnerability of GWP's IT systems, the utility recently underwent a cyber security audit, which recommends the implementation of key safeguards to limit exposure. The Administrator classification will be responsible for developing, implementing and ensuring compliance with comprehensive information security strategies and programs; identifying security risks; recommending mitigation measures; and consolidating all IT functions that are currently spread among various work units within GWP. This transaction will involve the reallocation of one budgeted position, thus, no increase in overall headcount will occur.

## Police

The Police Department is recommending the establishment of two new classifications within its non-sworn Public Safety Business Specialist Series. These classifications provide essential administrative and staff support functions within the organization, and must pass a background investigation. The newly-proposed classifications, **Public Safety Business Assistant III** and **Sr. Public Safety Business Specialist**, will provide career growth opportunities to existing personnel and assist in retaining quality staff. Any movement to these newly-established classifications will involve the reallocation of existing staff, thus no increase to the budgeted headcount will occur.

## Sustainability

Staff is in the early stages of discussion regarding the establishment of an office of sustainability to address Citywide strategies and efforts relating to environmental quality and sustainability on matters relating to energy use, resource conservation, recycling, pollution reduction, waste elimination, transportation, community outreach, and building design. While these discussions are very preliminary and decisions regarding which department the sustainability function will reside have yet to be fully vetted, staff is recommending that the classification of **Sustainability Officer** be established as a starting point to these discussions.

## City Attorney

The employment contract for the **City Attorney** calls for an adjustment effective July 1, 2019 based upon a labor market salary survey or 5%, whichever is less. Human Resources staff conducted the salary survey of the City's comparable labor market cities and found that Glendale's position is 11.34% below the labor market average. As per the terms of the City Attorney's contract, the adjustment will be 5%. With the adoption of the budget on June 4, 2019, the Executive Classification and Compensation Resolution will be amended to reflect this 5% adjustment for the City Attorney to be effective July 1, 2019.

## Summary

All of the above classification changes and compensation adjustments are included in the form of amended Classification and Compensation resolutions for the 2019/2020 budget adoption. The resolutions are set forth in this report individually by employee group, as follows:

- GCEA, Confidential and Hourly Classifications
- GMA and GMA Employee Relations Exempt Classifications
- Appointed Executives

The resolutions contain all of the new or amended job classifications, identified by highlighting. The classification titles and salary range numbers correspond to the attached "Exhibit A" following each resolution.

**Section 7.** It is hereby declared to be the intention of the Council that the sections, paragraphs, lines, sentences, clauses and phrases of this resolution are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, line, paragraph or section of this resolution shall be declared unconstitutional by the valid judgment or decree of a court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, lines, paragraphs and sections of this resolution.

**SECTION 8. EFFECTIVE DATE.** This Resolution shall take effect and be in force effective the pay period beginning June 23, 2019.

In addition to the compensation rates set forth herein, the classifications set forth alphabetically in Sections 4.1 through 4.2, inclusive, of this resolution shall be subject to

cost-of-living increases of one and one-half percent (1.5%) at the commencement of the first pay that includes July 1, 2019.

The hourly at-will classifications set forth alphabetically in Section 4.3 of this resolution may be eligible for cost-of-living increases of one and one-half percent (1.5%) at the commencement of the first pay period that includes July 1, 2019 at the discretion of the City Manager.

The City is authorized to adjust the salary ranges of classifications and related occupational series contained within Sections 4.1 through 4.3, inclusive, which are affected by legislative action by any governmental entity that increases the minimum wage of jurisdictions within the City of Glendale.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF GLENDALE PROVIDING FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF CLASSIFICATION TITLES AND COMPENSATION FOR EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY OF GLENDALE COVERED BY THE GLENDALE MANAGEMENT ASSOCIATION MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING, INCLUDING EMPLOYEE RELATIONS EXEMPT CLASSIFICATIONS

**Section 2.** As to the persons in the various classification titles herein mentioned subsequent to the effective date of this resolution, the increases or decreases in rates of compensation set forth herein shall be effective on the date of the adoption of this resolution.

**Section 3.** The following schedule of compensation rates, attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit "A" and labeled "Salary Range Amounts", shows standard salary range numbers, the salary steps designated by number, and unless otherwise specified, the full-time monthly rates and special rates (in dollars) for all classification titles.

Section 5. The base salaries stated herein include the employees' portion of the contributions made to the PERS retirement system and a portion of the employer's portion of the contributions made to the PERS retirement system. These contributions are up to eight percent (8%) of the base salaries for non-Safety employees and nine percent (9%) of the base salaries for Fire and Police Safety employees. Additionally, employees pay a portion of the employer's contributions made to the PERS retirement system as provided for in the respective Memorandum of Understanding. The City does not reimburse

employees for their PERS contributions, therefore their effective salaries are reduced by this amount from the amounts stated in this resolution.

**Section 6.** The provisions of this resolution so far as they are substantially the same as the provisions of previous classification/compensation resolutions and/or ordinances, and any amendment thereto, must be construed as continuations thereof and not as original enactments.

**Section 7.** It is hereby declared to be the intention of the Council that the sections, paragraphs, lines, sentences, clauses and phrases of this resolution are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, line, paragraph or section of this resolution shall be declared unconstitutional by the valid judgment or decree of a court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, lines, paragraphs and sections of this resolution.

**SECTION 8. EFFECTIVE DATE.** This Resolution shall be effective the pay period beginning June 23, 2019.

(a) In addition to the compensation rates set forth herein, effective the commencement of the first pay



period that includes July 1, 2019, all General Manager non-Safety Sworn classifications listed in Section 4, shall receive a one and one-half percent (1.50%) wage increase to the wages previously in effect.

(b) In addition to the compensation rates set forth herein, effective the commencement of the first pay period that includes July 1, 2019, the Sworn Fire Manager classifications listed in Section 4 shall have an additional salary step (Step 6) added to the salary ranges, which shall be in the amount of five and one-half percent (5.5%) above the existing Step 5 of the same salary ranges.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF GLENDALE PROVIDING FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF CLASSIFICATION TITLES AND COMPENSATION FOR APPOINTED EXECUTIVE LEVEL EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY OF GLENDALE

WHEREAS, the City of Glendale (hereinafter referred to as "City") has established a system of classification for all positions within the City service with descriptive occupational titles used to identify and distinguish positions from one another based on job duties, essential functions, knowledge, skills, abilities and minimum requirements; and

WHEREAS, it is in the City's best interest to periodically add and delete classification titles to ensure that the City's classification plan and organizational structure is contemporary and best meets the needs of its operating departments; and

WHEREAS, the City has established a system of compensation for the classification titles listed herein, based on collective bargaining agreements, resolutions and agreements as approved and adopted by the City Council.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GLENDALE:

Section 1. The classification titles hereinafter designated in this resolution, except insofar as they are specifically provided for in The Charter of the City of Glendale, are hereby created.

Section 2. As to the persons in the various classification titles herein mentioned subsequent to the effective date of this resolution, the increases or decreases in rates of compensation set forth herein shall be effective on the date of the adoption of this resolution.

Section 3. The following schedule of compensation rates, attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit "A" and labeled "Salary Range Amounts", shows standard salary range numbers, the salary steps designated by number, and unless otherwise specified, the full-time monthly rates and special rates (in dollars) for all classification titles.

Section 4. The salary range number assigned to each classification are set forth alphabetically as follows:

**Section 5.** The base salaries stated herein include the employees' portion of the contributions made to the PERS retirement system. These contributions are up to eight percent (8%) of the base salaries for non-Safety employees and nine percent (9%) of the base salaries for Fire and Police Safety employees. Additionally, employees pay a portion of the employer's contributions made to the PERS retirement system in the amount of four percent (4%). The City does not reimburse employees for their PERS contributions, therefore their effective salaries are reduced by this amount from the amounts stated in this resolution.

**Section 6.** Except as otherwise restricted by Charter, the City Manager may set Executive Salaries in Section 4 anywhere within the range between and including Step 1 and Step 8.

**Section 7.**

(a) Effective the commencement of the first pay period that includes July 1, 2019, all appointed non-Safety Executive-level classifications listed in Section 4, with the exception of City Manager and City Attorney, shall receive a one and one-half percent (1.50%) wage increase to the wages previously in effect.

**Section 8.** The provisions of this resolution so far

as they are substantially the same as the provisions of previous classification/compensation resolutions and/or ordinances, and any amendment thereto, must be construed as continuations thereof and not as original enactments.

Section 9. It is hereby declared to be the intention of the Council that the sections, paragraphs, lines, sentences, clauses and phrases of this resolution are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, line, paragraph or section of this resolution shall be declared unconstitutional by the valid judgment or decree of a court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, lines, paragraphs and sections of this resolution.

SECTION 10. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Resolution shall take effect and be in force effective the pay period beginning June 23, 2019.


