Preface

Because of the breadth of the federal government's bureaucracy, it is easy to understand why it has been the largest publisher in the world for decades. Approximately 9,000 titles are available for sale at any given time, including books, CD-ROMs, and other electronic formats, through the U.S. Government Printing Office (GPO) bookstores. Nearly every individual department, agency, bureau, commission, and office of the federal government's massive executive, legislative, and judicial branches publishes annual reports, directories, statistical compilations, guides, bibliographies, research reports, public relations materials, and daily, weekly, monthly, or other regularly or irregularly issued serial publications.

In 1994, the GPO received a Congressional mandate to move its operations from a print to an electronic environment. This change in emphasis has had a profound affect upon this vital agency. In FY 2000, the GPO distributed approximately 29,000 tangible products in print, microfiche, CD-ROM, and DVD formats to depository libraries. By FY 2002, that number had dropped to a little over 14,000 products. In contrast, *GPO Access* links the public to more than 224,000 individual titles, located on the GPO's servers or on other Federal web sites, today. *GPO Access* remains one of the few government web sites established by law and one of the longest running, having begun operation in 1994. Today, *GPO Access* provides free online access to over 2,200 databases of Federal information, containing Federal agency files, through more than 80 applications.

This reference work, like the Federal Depository Library Program (FDLP) itself, for years has been offering title specific information for librarians, educators, teachers, students, business owners, consumers, exporters, importers, pilots, agricultural workers, dieters, engineers, health workers, and the general public. Following in the tradition of our predecessors who compiled the *Guide to Popular U.S. Government Publications* (1st – 5th editions for Libraries Unlimited), we are excited to provide users with a location tool for the most recently produced popular federal documents. Like the GPO itself, this latest edition moves into the realm of e-commerce by providing hot links to many titles that are only available in an electronic format. Because the U.S. government remains the world's most prolific publisher, a finding tool for the most popular federal documents should continue to be helpful to teachers, students, librarians, and the general public. Furthermore, the Introduction not only explains how to locate and acquire/access such documents, but also discusses some recent developments surrounding the publication of and access to government documents.

The major portion of the book provides information about specific popular government documents by topics, beginning with “Accidents and Accident Prevention” and ending with “Women's Issues”. In between are topics of a diverse nature: aeronautics, aging, agriculture, alcohol and substance abuse, the arts, business, careers, copyrights, crime, education, energy, environmental

protection, food, geology, health and medical care, housing, labor, libraries, military affairs, museums, physical fitness, recreation, travel, and wildlife.

Most of the documents cited in this volume were published or created during the 2000 and 2002 calendar years. A few significant titles produced in 1999 have been included and are identified by an *. Also, some serial titles, which appeared in earlier editions, have been included in this edition in order to add their Internet addresses (URLs). The previous edition of the Infosential Press series is still available and contains bibliographic references and abstracts for documents published or printed mostly between 1997 and 1999. Readers who have not acquired this volume, and the previous Libraries Unlimited volumes, may wish to purchase them in order to locate relevant titles published before 1999.

While the present version of *Guide to Popular U.S. Government Documents* begins where the previous edition left off, the reader should note several differences. The authors were selective both with regards to topics covered and titles of documents included. Quality (generally a given with respect to federal government publications) and timeliness were certainly important criteria during the evaluation process. The extent to which these materials were "popular" was the most important factor in determining their inclusion into this bibliography.

What is meant by "popular" U.S. government publications is quite different from the concept of popular nonfiction sold in bookstores. Comparing the two types reveals that the titles in this book are far more technical or specialized because they are written from the perspective and mission of a particular federal department, bureau, or agency who published or commissioned it. Few commercial publishers would publish a title similar to best-selling U.S. documents such as the *Digest of Education Statistics*, *Dictionary of Occupational Titles*, or the *United States Government Manual*. Yet, many commercial publications contain data found in such federal documents. Government documents included here are simply considered popular because they are likely to be of general interest to teachers, students, health care professionals, law enforcement personnel, farmers, or airplane pilots. They may expect to find federal documents because they know that a particular federal agency or bureau regulates activities, enforces laws, collects statistics, or conducts research on a certain topic. What is considered popular, therefore, is in the eyes of the reader, editors, or the publisher.

Directories listing employees of government agencies, grant application booklets, and other dated works that are of value for a limited time are not included because a high percentage of the names and addresses would have changed by the time this volume is available for sale. It is further assumed that our readers would know that they could locate routinely issued directories, federal statutes or regulations, federal agency budgets, and Congressional hearings at depository libraries or through the online GPO bookstore.

We anticipate that this second CD-ROM edition (and future online versions) will enable us to cover more material with more frequent updates and at less overall expense to the information user. This CD-ROM may be read by any PC with a CD-ROM drive and Adobe Acrobat

Reader (which may be downloaded free through the Internet at <http://www.adobe.com/products/acrobat/readermain.html>). To view the work, users may access the CD from the program manager or My Computer and double click on the book icon. Users may navigate the entire text by using the right scroll bar or, by using the Table of Contents links in the side frame. Adobe's FIND and FIND AGAIN options (binoculars icon) is another navigational tool allowing readers to locate the first and subsequent instances of a keyword anywhere in the text.



Introduction

The primary use of this *Guide to Popular U.S. Government Documents* is the identification of recent popular federal documents, including periodicals. This *Guide* identifies popular titles that were published, for the most part, during the 2000-2002 period. A few significant titles published in 1999, that were not included in the previous edition (identified by an *), have also been included. Understanding the current political, social, and technical environment provides a deeper insight into understanding several specific issues, problems, and challenges relative to federal publications and the dissemination of federal government information. In particular, the events of September 11, 2001 have had a profound and devastating affect on the ability of the general public to access government information in an electronic format, both online and CD-ROM.

RECENT AND ONGOING DEVELOPMENTS

The chief forces that influence and impact federal publications are political, social, and technological in nature. The components of these broad environmental forces are so intertwined that an attempt to separate of them might seem artificial. However, we hope that doing so may help the reader to understand the virtual revolution that began in the 1980s and continues today.

Political Environment

Any discussion of recent events or trends affecting federal publications and the Federal Depository Library Program (FDLP) would be incomplete without first talking about the political environment at the end of the 20th century. A number of developments have helped to destabilize the federal government publications environment as follows:

- Presidents Reagan and Clinton both attempted to reduce government publication programs and to privatize federal agency printing operations where possible throughout the late 1980s and the entire 1990s.
- The Clinton/Gore Administration was committed to the use of technological and telecommunication advances to make an increasing number of federal documents electronically accessible and, through legislation and directives, ordered all federal agencies to develop and expand their use of the Internet and other electronic services.
- Two major events occurred in 2001 that dramatically, and possibly drastically, changed the way the federal government views “the public’s right to know in a free and open society”:
 - The son of a former President assumed his duties as the 43rd U.S. President;

- The terrorist attacks on September 11, 2001.

These events led to the following:

- A June 10, 2001 Washington Post story revealed that the Bush Administration was delaying the release of 68,000 pages of presidential records that offer an insider's view of the Reagan White House. The Bush White House stated that the delays were required, “to review the many constitutional and legal questions raised by potential release of sensitive and confidential Presidential records and to decide upon the proper legal framework and process to employ in reviewing such records on an ongoing basis.” The article went to state that some historians feel that President Bush might be worried about what some of the top aides in Bush’s administration, and his own father (as Reagan’s Vice-President), might have written when they worked for Reagan in the 1980s. Then, Executive Order 13233 “Further Implementation of the Presidential Records Act” was issued on November 1, 2001. The order amends - and some argue, reverses - the Presidential Records Act of 1978 (PRA) that allowed journalists, historians and other interested parties, through a Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request, to read presidential papers twelve years after the term of office finished. It also replaces Reagan’s 1989 decree (Executive Order 12667) with a requirement that a FOIA request must be justified by some “demonstrable, specific need.” In effect, it allows U.S. Presidents an indefinite amount of time to withhold their records from public view after they leave office. This will severely limit the study of contemporary American political history is this goes unchallenged.
- The anti-terrorism bill (H.R. 3162), the Uniting and Strengthening America by Providing Appropriate Tools Required to Intercept and Obstruct Terrorism (USA Patriot Act) Act of 2001, was signed into law by President Bush on October 26, 2001. It was designed to broaden the surveillance capabilities of law enforcement and, since its passage, many libraries have seen an increase in law enforcement inquiries based upon this Act. Because the Act affects state and local privacy laws, members of the library community and some civil liberty advocates are very concerned.
- Finally, the GPO sent out the following letter to all depository library directors and coordinators:

March 14, 2002

Dear Depository Library Director:

One of the changes in the wake of the September 11 attacks has been a heightened awareness of information security issues, and increased tension between the goal of free public access to Government information and the need to safeguard sensitive information. Since this issue has received so much attention of late, I would like to inform you of the U.S. Government Printing Office's (GPO) policies and procedures regarding the FDLP publications in depository library collections and the FDLP Electronic Collection. As one of 1,309 depository libraries in the Nation, your library plays an important role in informing the American public about our Government.

The U.S. Government Printing Office is entrusted by Congress with the stewardship of depository materials for free distribution and public access. GPO acts as an agent of Federal publishing agencies, which make decisions to produce Government publications of public interest and educational value and thus appropriate for distribution to depository libraries. Agency publications that are classified, for official use or administrative use only are not in scope for the FDLP.

Over the last two decades there has been an average of two tangible publications a year that GPO has been asked to remove from depository collections. Only the Public Printer and the Superintendent of Documents can legitimately order a library to withdraw a document from its depository collection.

When an agency requests that a title be withdrawn, we follow established policies and procedures for the withdrawal of documents from the FDLP. Under the FDLP, the Government may request the removal of materials from depository libraries since the law (chapter 19 of Title 44) indicates that all FDLP materials remain government property. Requests to withdraw happen rarely, however. Since FY 1995, the GPO has distributed 230,019 tangible product (print, microfiche, and CD-ROM) titles to depository libraries, and recalled just 20 (16 to be destroyed, 3 returned to the agency, 1 removed from shelves). Such actions are taken only on the request of the issuing agency, most commonly because the titles contain information that is erroneous or has been superseded.

The Office of the Superintendent of Documents has no statutory ability to deny agency document withdrawal requests. Instead, my office works through a process with the issuing agency. We first verify that the title was distributed through the FDLP. Then we discuss the reasons for the recall, and inform the agency of recall options. Finally we inform the agency that GPO must receive an official requesting in writing. Only after GPO receives an agency request in writing do we request the item be withdrawn from depository library collections.

*Many of the questions raised in recent months have concerned the U.S. Geological Survey CD-ROM entitled *Source Area Characteristics of Large Public Surface-Water Supplies in the Conterminous United States: An Information Resource for Source-Water Assessment, 1999*, which, by my letter dated October 12, 2001, I requested depository libraries to withdraw from their collections and destroy. My letter was issued pursuant to a letter from the USGS, dated October 5, 2001, which asked the GPO to "request that depository libraries receiving the [Source-Water CD-ROM] be instructed to destroy their copies." When a member of the library community questioned the USGS on the need for this action, a USGS e-mail reply dated October 31, 2001, said:*

“Subsequent contact with the Government Printing Office and the USGS Committee that sets official policy on restriction of sensitive information has reconfirmed the validity of the original written instruction from USGS and GPO to destroy the report.”

The October 12 letter went to the 335 Federal depository libraries that had selected this document for their collections. The letter was subsequently published in our publication “Administrative Notes,” which is made available to the entire depository library community and is posted online on the GPO’s Web site, at http://www.access.gpo.gov/su_docs/fdlp/pubs/adnotes/ad101501.html#7.

My request applied only to copies of the Source Water CD-ROM distributed under the FDLP. GPO has no authority over copies of publications acquired through channels other than the FDLP.

You may be aware that agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation visited some depository libraries in Arkansas, to verify that the USGS CD-ROM had been destroyed. These visits were apparently initiated by the FBI, and took place without USGS’ or GPO’s knowledge or participation.

Additional concerns have been raised regarding the sensitivity of some of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission microfiche in selected libraries. For several months we have been in communication with the Commission staff regarding the need to remove any of this material or impose access restrictions. Until NRC, as the responsible agency, completes their review process and asks that any titles be withdrawn from depository collections, GPO requires that depository libraries provide normal levels of public access to the NRC material. There is no statutory basis, nor is it consistent with the public purpose of the FDLP, for GPO or depository libraries to impose ad hoc access controls or restrictions on particular public documents.

GPO has not been asked to withdraw any online titles on our Web site. A few agencies have removed electronic information products that we have cataloged and pointed to as part of the FDLP/Electronic Collection. We are redirecting the PURLs to agency notices or our own notice to explain the situation. A partner agency, the Department of Energy Office of Scientific and Technical Information, has pulled over 5,800 research reports from three national laboratories that were included in the Information Bridge. We have requested that these be reviewed and returned, as appropriate, for public access. Other agency withdrawals have been information beyond the purview of the FDLP.

In partnership with Federal depository libraries, the GPO has been the Government’s agent for providing public access to Government information for nearly two centuries. The GPO takes very seriously any Federal agency’s request to restrict access to Government information that has been made public. However, the GPO also has a duty under the law to cooperate with Federal agencies in the appropriate distribution of the information they publish. As with all previous requests, any future agency withdrawal requests will be handled in accordance with law and established policy.

Despite President Bush's vision of using the Internet to create a "citizen-centric government", the Bush Administration has made a concerted effort to thwart public access to selected government information, historical and current, and has continued a long-standing effort to reduce, if not terminate, the ability of the GPO to meet its statutory obligation—through the FDLP—to preserve, and provide free access to, federal government information that is official and complete.

The vision of a government-wide, single catalog of federal government information resources goes back at least two decades. The Paperwork Reduction Act of 1980 established the Federal Information Locator Systems (FILS) that was designed to locate and reduce duplicate government information requests. The Paperwork Reduction Act of 1995 established the Government Information Locator Service (GILS) as an agency-based, electronic network for locating and accessing federal publications. The passage of the GPO Electronic Information Access Enhancement Act of 1993 authorized the Superintendent of Documents to provide online access to key information, such as the *Federal Register*, the *Code of Federal Regulations*, and the *Congressional Record*, to the general public. This led to the development of *GPO Access* which is both an online system offering free electronic access to official information from all three branches of the federal government and an electronic storage facility. The *GPO Access* home page (<http://www.gpoaccess.gov/>) offers the public a variety of search tools for locating government information products by topic, title, agency, or keyword within one database or across multiple databases.

One of the databases in *GPO Access* is the online version of the *Catalog of U.S. Government Publications* (<http://www.gpoaccess.gov/cgp/index.html>). This is an index to print and electronic publications created by Federal agencies since 1996 and, when available, links are provided to the full-text of these publications. Each bibliographic record includes a link to another feature, "Locate Federal Depository Libraries" (<http://www.gpoaccess.gov/libraries.html>). It enables users to find the names, addresses, and telephone numbers of depository libraries by state or area code that can make print publications available for their use.

Technological Environment

Technological advances have changed the way federal agencies create, disseminate, store, and retrieve their own information. Since the 1950's, government publications have been produced in the following formats: print, microcard, microfilm, microfiche, magnetic tape, floppy disks, CD-ROM, DVD, and online

media. In 1999, the distribution of new FDLP titles to depository libraries was 45% online and 55% tangible. By 2002, it was 60% online and 40% tangible. However, lacking specific guidelines or working models, each federal agency has had to learn on their own how to deal with the complexities of electronic publishing, computer networking, and society's demand for Internet-based electronic resources. Some were more successful than others in making the transition to e-government yet, by 2000, they were all eager to show their rapid progress in bringing electronic government services to the public. What was lacking was a highly visible, uniform, relatively inexpensive, and quick means of accessing this wealth of information.

Enter *FirstGov* (<http://www.firstgov.gov>) in September 2000, a collaborative creation of the Clinton White House and Eric Brewer, chief scientist of the Inktomi Company, to be managed by the General Services Administration (GSA). Ignoring *GPO Access*, which had been in existence since 1994, *FirstGov* was designed to be a one-stop index to all government information and services located on federal, state, and local government web sites and links to it are required to appear on all federal agency webpages. As soon as *FirstGov* was launched, the GPO began working with its developers to have links to *GPO Access* materials included. This collaboration was so successful that the GPO's 2000-2001 Biennial Report to Congress states that,

“The *FirstGov* search interface has been added to the *GPO Access* suite of “Finding Aids” to provide greater accessibility to Federal Government information... users may now search the Federal Government using the *FirstGov* search index. Users have the choice to search either the entire Federal Government or just *GPO Access* pages.”

Despite all efforts to eliminate it, the GPO continues to expand its operations, through *GPO Access*, the FDLP, the U.S. Government Online Bookstore Sales Program (<http://bookstore.gpo.gov/>), and other services, utilizing all available and evolving technologies in order to meet the public's needs and to store information indefinitely. This clearly demonstrates the GPO's commitment to provide permanent public access to tangible and electronic federal information products.

Societal Environment

The American Library Association (ALA), as well as many librarians and concerned citizens continue to keep a close eye on developments that may either threaten to bring an end to this system of free (or nearly free) access to federal information or potentially might increase the public's access to it. Even prior to the latest attempt to circumvent the GPO in order to privatize government publications, many commercial companies have repackaged federal information and sold print or electronic versions of legal, judicial, and executive branch publications for profit for decades. But it is not just private publishers that sell

federal government information that has been collected and compiled at the expense of taxpayers.

The National Technical Information Service (NTIS) has served since 1950 as the nation's largest central resource for the sale of government-funded scientific, technical, engineering, and business related information. Federal statute (15 USC §1151-1157) directs the NTIS to recover its costs, including salaries, cataloging and indexing, permanent storage and retrieval, and postage, from the sale of its products and services. Congressional Information Services, Inc. (CIS) sold high-quality index and abstracts reference titles and their accompanying microfiche collections. This company is now part of Lexis/Nexis and its prices are out of the range of all but the largest and best-funded libraries. Small academic, school, and public libraries, particularly rural and inner city institutions, cannot afford to acquire federal serial publications from commercial entities, such as the NTIS or the CIS, because they are available on a standing order or subscription basis. The purchase of federal monographic publications compete with those offered through vendors and acquired as a result of book reviews, teacher recommendations, and the like.

Even government indexing services and databases are under attack from the private sector. In response to corporate complaints from the Software and Information Industry Association that it competed with similar commercial services, the Department of Energy shut down *PubScience* in November 2002. Since the late 1940s, *PubScience* cross-indexed and searched roughly two million government reports and academic articles. For the general public and researchers at small institutions such as public libraries, it was an invaluable tool for surveying what information existed on a given energy or science topic.

In December 2003, the Education Department will shut down its sixteen subject-specific ERIC Clearinghouses that form the backbone of the Educational Resources Information Center (ERIC). The *AskERIC* free online reference service will also be discontinued at that time, as well as, the discontinuation of all reference services and publications such as ERIC Digests. ERIC has provided users with access to a huge database of education-related documents and journal articles since 1966. ERIC journal articles can be found in library periodical collections and most ERIC documents are available in the ERIC microfiche collection. The corporate databases that offer similar access come at a price tag of \$100,000 per year or more. How the demise of these two free government services alone will impact the future of research by students, educators, scientists, and the general public remains to be seen.

Based upon the U.S. Census Bureau's Current Population Survey, "A *Nation Online: How Americans Are Expanding Their Use of the Internet* shows the rapidly growing use of new information technologies across all demographic groups and geographic regions. Not only are many more Americans using the Internet and computers at home, they are also using them at work, school, and

other locations for an expanding variety of purposes.” This survey found that, by September 2001, more than half the nation used computers. Approximately 54% of the U.S. population uses the Internet for e-mail (45%), searching for product and service information (33%), making online purchases (39%), and searching for health information (39%). The United States is truly a nation online and its citizens want/expect/demand access all day/everyday. To meet this demand, thousands of individuals, businesses, professional associations, schools, colleges, and government agencies at all levels (local, state, and national) create and update webpages every day. This has placed tremendous pressure on federal agencies to offer their publications and information through the Internet.

Bibliographic control of print and electronic government publications has become more difficult. For instance, we have been examining an increasing number of documents, available online or through depository libraries that have no corresponding bibliographic entries in the latest *Subject Bibliographies* (<http://bookstore.gpo.gov/sb/sale180.html>) or the *Monthly Catalog*. The publications themselves, of course, do not contain the stock number or price; bibliographic tools are needed in order to obtain such information. Faced with this dilemma, we have sometimes opted to include titles with incomplete entries, providing abstracts and whatever bibliographic information was available as of Summer 2003. By including these incomplete entries, especially the Internet-only titles, we are attempting to facilitate the process of locating the titles in depository libraries nationwide. Users should read the *How to Use This Guide* section below to learn how to most effectively locate documents on a particular subject, or by title. The abstracts for each entry will help users know if the titles may be worth purchasing or obtained through a library. Greater understanding of government documents may be gained by reading about the GPO Online Bookstore and Federal Depository Library Program in the following sections of this introduction.

The GPO has taken great strides in transforming itself from a printing press operation to a provider of digital government information. In FY 2002, over 10,000 online titles and another 10,000 links to agency titles were added to *GPO Access*, for a total of over 20,000 new online titles that year alone. As of September 2002, the *GPO Access* website provided access to more than 140,000 titles on GPO servers and over 91,000 additional titles through links to other Federal agency Web sites. *GPO Access* averaged close to 31 million document retrievals per month in 2001, for a total of approximately 372 million document retrievals in FY 2002. This is also an extremely cost effective service as the GPO estimates the cost of delivering these electronic resources in FY 2002 averaged less than 1¢ per retrieval. Despite its success, elements within and outside of the federal government continue to seek to diminish the vital role of the GPO.

In 2000, the Department of Commerce proposed shutting down the NTIS. Congress asked the National Commission on Libraries and Information Science (NCLIS) to study the Commerce Department’s decision. The report, issued to Congress and the White House in January 2001, hardly mentions the NTIS.

Instead, it presented a comprehensive assessment of how federal government information is disseminated and suggested the creation of an entirely new agency, the Public Information Resources Administration (PIRA), “to plan for and implement the treatment of public information resources as a strategic national asset.” PIRA would serve as the federal government’s focal point for providing timely dissemination and permanent public availability of its public information resources. Unlike the GPO, which comes under the legislative branch of the government, PIRA would be in the executive branch and would bring together the NTIS, the programs under the Superintendent of Documents at the GPO (including the FDLP), and other information sales and dissemination programs from all three branches of government. In an ironic twist of fate, PIRA did not succeed in replacing the GPO. Instead, President Bush zeroed out the NCLIS in his 2002 budget and, in December of that year, Judy C. Russell, who has been the Deputy Director of NCLIS since 1998, was named the new Superintendent of Documents at the GPO by the new Public Printer of the United States, Bruce R. James.

In September 2001, the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) rewrote the Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) and, as a result, the Commerce Department’s *Commerce Business Daily* (CBD) and its online version, *CBDNet*, was replaced by the General Services Administration’s *Federal Business Opportunities* (<http://www.fedbizopps.gov/>). Prior to January 2002, *CBDNet* listed current and archived notices of proposed government procurement actions, contract awards, sales of government property, and other procurement information. All Federal procurement offices were required to announce proposed procurement actions over \$25,000 and contract awards over \$25,000, that were likely to result in the award of any subcontracts, in the CBD which was one of the databases available through *GPO Access*.

The next challenge to the GPO came in May 2001 when Senator Joseph Lieberman introduced S.803, the “E-Government Act of 2001”. This bill would “enhance the management and promotion of electronic Government services and processes by establishing a Federal Chief Information Officer (CIO) within the OMB, and by establishing a broad framework of measures that require using Internet-based information technology to enhance citizen access to Government information and services, and for other purposes.” In July 2001, H.R. 2458 was introduced in the House as a companion bill to S.803. The House bill was more comprehensive and would give the federal CIO review authority of federal agency information technology (IT) budgets and also establish a \$200 million interagency e-government fund.

The President’s Management Agenda (PMA), announced in August 2001, presented an aggressive strategy for improving the management and performance of the Federal government. Of the 14 areas identified for improvement, #4 dealt with expanding electronic government (e-government). The PMA states that “The

Administration . . . will manage E-government projects more effectively by using the budget process to insist on more effective planning of IT investments by government agencies.” It called for the formation of an interagency task force under the OMB to coordinate President Bush’s agenda and proposed a \$20 million E-government fund for 2002 (\$100 million over three years, 2002 through 2004) to pay for collaborative E-government activities across agency lines. This Agenda went along nicely with the two bills already being considered in Congress.

In June 2001, the OMB went ahead and hired Mark Forman as Associate Director for IT and E-Government and asked the heads of all executive departments and agencies to choose “a senior e-government leader” to represent their units on the e-government task force to be headed by Forman. During his tenure as the federal government’s top IT official, 25 cross-agency e-gov projects were launched, many of which have made tangible progress. Then, after only two years in this position, he announced his decision to leave the OMB in August 2003 to return to the private sector in Silicon Valley.

An unprecedented assault against the GPO’s statutory responsibilities came in May 2002 when the OMB issued its Memorandum M-02-07. Ignoring the fact that the position of the Public Printer had been established by Public Law (P.L. 32-91) in 1852, followed by the establishment of the GPO in 1861 under the statutes of Title 44 of the *United States Code* for the express purpose of handling Federal printing needs, the OMB ordered Executive departments and agencies to bypass the GPO when seeking bids for the printing of their documents. Citing a 1996 Justice Department opinion that said Congress cannot force the Executive Branch to go through the GPO, which is a Legislative Branch agency, the OMB would put an end to the GPO’s “government printing monopoly” and, in so doing, save the American taxpayers \$50 million to \$70 million a year. From organizations such as the American Library Association and the Printing Industries of America, to the depository library community and concerned citizens, the reaction was swift and overwhelmingly negative.

Then, in August, President Bush announced the nomination of Bruce R. James as the next Public Printer. A former CEO of Barclays Law Publishers and the current Chairman of the Congressional Roundtable of Printing Industries of America, James had almost 40 years of experience in the private sector as a printer and publisher. In September, Congress ordered Executive Branch agencies to continue to use the GPO for most printing services. The next day, the White House said the agencies could ignore the order. Finally, in December 2002, President Bush signed the “E-Government Act of 2002” which formally established the Office of E-Government, within the OMB, with an operating budget of \$345 million spread over 4 years. This new office will oversee IT training, development, policy, and interagency implementation throughout the federal government. It will also support a GSA project to maintain and improve

the federal Internet portal, *FirstGov*, so that government resources are catalogued online “according to citizen needs, not agency jurisdiction.” [NOTE: Government documents are assigned a Superintendent of Documents (SuDocs) classification number when they are cataloged by the GPO and added to the FDLP. This means that materials in depository collections are arranged by agency rather than by subject.]

Upon assuming his position as Public Printer of the United States, James began negotiations with the OMB regarding government printing and, in June 2003, a compact was announced between the GPO and the OMB. It states:

...GPO will develop a demonstration print procurement contract . . . for a Federal department or agency of OMB’s choosing. The contract will feature a front-end electronic system utilizing the World Wide Web that will allow federal customers a one-stop, integrated, print ordering and invoicing system for all print jobs. Any registered printer in the country would be free to submit a price quote on any job placed in the system. The federal customer would then select a printer, using either lowest price or best value techniques . . . The Superintendent of Documents, at its expense, will continue to have access to publications produced under this contract for public distribution. As a condition of payment, vendors would be required to provide the GPO with one electronic version of every document ordered under the contract in a format acceptable to the GPO and two paper copies, in order to meet the requirements of Chapter 19 of Title 44, U.S. Code.

This new contract will allow the GPO to continue its vital mission to provide permanent public access to government information. The contract will also enhance the FDLP by preventing fugitive documents (agency publications that are produced but do not go through the GPO for cataloging and inclusion in the depository library system).

It is very important to realize that, while citizens still have access to federal documents in whatever form acquired by depository libraries, they will also be able to access thousands of them from any Internet accessible computer. Although critics point out that such electronic access is not affordable for all citizens from their homes, the public generally has benefited significantly from electronic access to federal documents. Federal governmental agencies make their information available through *FedWorld* (NTIS), THOMAS and MARVEL (Library of Congress), and *GPO Access*. This means that all libraries having public Internet accessible workstations are able to provide their users with access to electronic federal documents and information that is a great benefit to students, researchers, and library users.

Each depository library, however, is faced with some perplexing questions. Do depository libraries need to acquire, catalog, shelve, and maintain their collections of federal publications as the public is increasingly able to access federal information sources from any Internet accessible workstation, including those in libraries of all types and sizes? Why should the responsibility belong only to the depository libraries when mass computer storage is so inexpensive? Continued participation in the FDLP, however, is not a new question being considered by library directors. At the 2002 Spring Depository Library Council Meeting, Claire Hoffman, Head Librarian at Pennsylvania State University - Abington, gave a presentation on her research into the many reasons libraries are leaving the Depository Program. Her data covered October 1992 through October 2000 during which time 104 libraries had dropped their depository status. For the 2003 Spring Depository Library Council Meeting, Luke Griffin, Jacksonville [AL] State University, and Aric Ahrens, Illinois Institute of Technology, gave a presentation entitled “Deposits and Withdrawals: A Survey of Depository Libraries that have Recently Changed Status” (<http://www.jsu.edu/depart/library/government/depositories/>). From their study of the libraries that had dropped out of the program between 2000 and 2003, the authors gleaned the following reasons given in order of significance:

1. Staffing and funding – professional assistance costs
2. Internet – access to e-government documents and information is universal
3. Proximity to Selective or Regional – other depository libraries are in the area
4. Space – tangible document materials require storage space
5. Lack of use – this has more to do with promotion than interest
6. Diminished Value of Program – it was once a “status symbol”
7. Inability to meet GPO Standards – meeting minimum technical requirements means acquiring new hardware and software in order to accommodate new formats

As more and more government information goes online, library directors are asking themselves, “If most of the things that our patrons are using are available freely on the Internet, why should we keep the expense of staff, space, preservation, maintenance?” They also found that most of those libraries that had dropped depository status had the following factors in common:

1. Selection Rate – Low, 20% or less
2. Collection Size – Small, less than 1 million volumes
3. Designation Date – Post 1961, no longer a “status symbol” as joining is easier than prior to 1961
4. Library Type – more Public possibly due to having a broad mission, few Law since they have a focused and normally smaller collection

To substantiate the benefits of being in the FDLP, the Library Programs Service (LPS) launched a new “Stay With The Program” campaign at the following website: (www.access.gpo.gov/su_docs/fdlp/staywiththeprogram.html). Of particular note is *Benefits of Being a Federal Depository Library* (http://www.access.gpo.gov/su_docs/fdlp/council/fdlp-benefits.html). It was prepared by the Depository Library Council’s Subcommittee on Attrition and Retention (SOAR) that details the perks of belonging and a potential loss from dropping out of the program. At the time of the previous edition of *The Guide* there were 1,371 depository libraries in the program. By the time LPS released its *2002 Annual Report*, there were only 1,248 selective and 52 regional libraries. What is clear is that those depository libraries that choose to remain active participants in the FDLP are committed to acquiring or providing free public access to past, present, and future federal government publications in all available formats.

The advent of e-government and the (nearly) all-electronic GPO has brought with it new problems and challenges for depository librarians. Prior to 1996, one of their significant concerns was how and where to shelve/store their ever expanding print and microfiche depository collections. Next, their attention was focused on acquiring necessary computer equipment, telecommunications, networking, supplies, training, and technical assistance necessary to provide access to information on floppy disks and CD-ROMs. As electronic government information became available online, the cost to libraries for upgrading workstations, and providing printers, paper, ink cartridges, and maintenance became issues that might deter many small- to medium-sized libraries from providing free paper copies once access is gained.

Where adult literacy was once a principle concern for rural and inner city public libraries, computer literacy is a new issue and challenge not only for users but also for the library staff attempting to serve them. In this brave new electronic world, depository librarians must become computer savvy about how Internet search engines work and which ones are more user friendly or provide more pertinent search results. As more and more federal documents are available in electronic format only through the Internet, locating these treasures become more challenging and librarians can once again regain their former status as front line providers of access to needed information. While all state, federal, and international government information and publications may one day be available to anyone/anywhere with a computer and Internet access, unless users know where and how to find it, it might as well not exist.

This leads to another new concern unique to e-government information—providing permanent public access to government publications that can vanish at the keystroke of an agency webmaster. In an article published in the December 2001 issue of *American Libraries*, Gil Baldwin, director, and George Barnum, electronic collection manager of GPO’s Library Programs Service, stated, “GPO is legally mandated to retain FDLP publications in the program permanently,

whether in regional depository collections or in the FDLP Electronic Collection.” They explained that the GPO has, through agreements with publishing agencies and partnerships with universities and other institutions, developed a comprehensive strategy for providing permanent public access to online agency publications, through bibliographic control, arrangements with federal publishing agencies, and digital file preservation. “A multi-year project with OCLC and cooperating libraries, the Web Document Digital Archive Pilot Project, will support the preservation of electronic publications with Persistent Uniform Resource Locators (PURLs), bibliographic description, a metadata schema specifically for preservation, and distributed file archiving.” [NOTE: The PURL in a bibliographic record is a “hot link” that will take a patron from any library’s online catalog to the actual online document no matter where the document is located. This is necessary because agencies are constantly rearranging their websites and/or upgrading to new equipment with new Internet addresses.]

“Depositories create individual selection profiles tailored to local needs and select from a collection of materials that GPO discovered and acquired for FDLP. The FDLP/EC is a distributed set of collections maintained by participating agencies, by depository libraries, or in GPO’s own archive servers.” Libraries provide links to these collections through bibliographic records in their local catalogs and finding aids rather than maintaining physical custody of the tangible items. The distribution of files to be housed locally has not been seen as a satisfactory solution by many of the libraries in the FDLP. In the GPO’s administration of the FDLP, it continues to strive for solutions that will benefit all FDLP libraries, their users, and the public. Changes in technology also pose threats for easy access to government information. Smaller CD-ROMs, as well as other storage media (e.g., zip disks, DVDs) that can hold many times the information of a 3.5" disk, are being used for distributing government information. As new computer software and hardware are being acquired to accommodate these new formats, the ability to access information on older storage devices, such as 5.25" floppies, becomes more difficult, if not impossible. This is one emerging issue that will have to be addressed soon if the GPO and its FDLP wish to fulfill their responsibility for permanent public access to all federal government information.

Supporters of the free and easy access to all federal sources of information for U.S. citizens might believe what James Madison said in his letter to W. T. Barry, August 4, 1822: "A popular government without popular information, or the means of acquiring it, is but a Prologue to a Farce or a Tragedy." Depository libraries and librarians, OCLC, and others have helped to ensure that federal documents are usable, freely available, and within easy access to citizens across the United States.

Print publications are made available by the General Services Administration through the Federal Citizen Information Center. It publishes a free, quarterly (summer, fall, winter, spring) *Consumer Information Catalog* which lists free and low-cost federal publications of general interest to consumers. The catalog is also available online at: <http://www.pueblo.gsa.gov/catalog.pdf>.

The *Consumer Information Catalog* lists government publications by title under such topics as Cars, Computers, Education, Employment, Family, Federal Programs, Food, Health, Housing, Money, Small Business, Travel, and miscellaneous section. Publications are free when the participating agencies are able to cover the costs of publication and mailing. Booklets with a price are a part of the Government Printing Office sales program. The GPO sets the price to cover the associated costs of publication and distribution. Some agencies, however, do share in the cost of inexpensive publications otherwise paid by the GPO. These publications have a classification number of 300 and most cost \$1.00. Free

documents have a classification number of 500 or 600. Those with a number of 100 cost over \$1.00. Subscriptions are numbered in the 200s. Because numbers may be duplicated, it is important to include the letter immediately after the number; it changes every year to help distinguish between titles.

ENVISIONING THE FUTURE OF FEDERAL GOVERNMENT INFORMATION

During the Spring 2003 meeting of the Depository Library Council the newly appointed Public Printer of the United States, Bruce R. James, and the new Superintendent of Documents, Judy Russell, asked the Council to devote one and a half days of that meeting to developing a vision of what the GPO and the Federal Depository Library Program (FDLP) should become, not just in the next few years, but over the next century. The transition to an electronic FDLP is nearly complete. The electronic dissemination of federal government information has become the rule rather than the exception. For the public to continue to enjoy the benefits of centralized, no-fee access to federal government information, the GPO and the depository libraries must develop new models that are appropriate for and sustainable in this century.

The Council developed a series of broad statements of their vision of the future of federal government information to be used as a starting point for discussion with the Public Printer. Throughout the remainder of the meeting, and through subsequent discussions with the GPO staff and focus groups, a coherent vision of how the library community believes the new the GPO and the FDLP should develop in the 21st century began to emerge. The following is the statement of the Council (edited for formatting purposes only).

“Statements on the Shared Goals of GPO and Libraries

- ✓ *The Government Printing Office, in partnership with federal depository libraries, meets the needs of the public for no-fee access to official government information.*

Government information is a strategic national resource owned by the people and held in trust jointly, for the public good, by GPO and by federal depository libraries. Together, these institutions provide stewardship for government information throughout its life cycle, ensuring timely access as new information is produced and permanent public access in the future.

- ✓ *The new era of partnership between GPO and federal depository libraries should retain the best aspects of the existing system while*

incorporating new technologies and services to provide a higher degree of dispersion of government information to the public.

During the print era, the process of printing and distributing government information placed GPO in the position of a centralized government information agency with the authority to distribute information to libraries. As we move into a future where the primacy of the printing process is diminished, it is vital that GPO maintain its centralized role in dissemination of federal government information. Other federal agencies have come to rely on GPO to fulfill the role of central disseminator of government information, and the public has come to rely on depository libraries to serve as local distributors of that information. The library community sees a continuing role for GPO as the centralized agency ultimately responsible for provision of no-fee permanent public access and the creation of metadata and bibliographic records. Partner libraries should continue to fulfill their mission of providing services to the public.

- ✓ *A new more flexible FDLP must be developed to meet institutional missions of partner libraries.*

Because some libraries consider ownership of digital content vital while others only want to manage it, a flexible system of GPO partnership with libraries should provide for the needs of both types of institutions. A variety of partner libraries could provide a multitude of entry points, ensuring the public's ability to access no-fee federal information.

- ✓ *GPO should become an aggregator for federal information.*

GPO's role in information dissemination should include use of state-of-the-art technology to harvest and manage federal information, an active role in working with agencies to develop widely usable information products, and cooperation with both partner libraries and private information providers in the creation of databases and other products. This aggregator role is essential to ensuring that federal information is widely accessible to the public. GPO should serve as a driver of new information technologies for its partner libraries, whose role is to use their knowledge of public, academic, and research users of government information to assist with the development and use of government aggregators.

- ✓ *Partner libraries should become facilitators in the federal information dissemination process rather than repositories of printed government publications.*

Through the FDLP, libraries should participate in decisions that affect the federal information life cycle, from development of valued-added products to provision of permanent public access. Key aspects of this joint venture entail collection, description, and no-fee permanent public access to federal information in all formats.

Libraries can assist GPO in its mission by helping to meet the information needs of underserved and disadvantaged members of the public, including those facing technological, economic, cultural, and physical challenges. Libraries also can help to meet the needs of specialized user communities, such as scholars, scientists, and public advocates.

- ✓ *The traditional library role of facilitator to no-fee public access to federal information remains key.*

No-fee library services improve the public's utilization of federal information resources and provide agencies with local responders to information requests. The GPO-library partnership should be broadened to include other agencies, thereby improving the products and service that the FDLP has to offer. Because the costs of providing access to this strategic national resource cannot be borne by nonprofit libraries alone, government agencies should assist them by providing no-fee access to information products for GPO's partner libraries.

Changes Needed to Bridge the Gap between Present and Future

From GPO:

- ✓ *GPO should expand its partnerships with the Library of Congress, the National Archives and Records Administration, and other federal agencies that can help it achieve its goals in the centralized management of federal government information.*

GPO is uniquely positioned to provide public access to federal information, but many other agencies with related missions play key roles in the life cycle of government information and should partner with GPO to the benefit of both government efficiency and public access.

Introduction – Changes Needed cont.

- ✓ *GPO should explore information product development that is focused on value-added services.*

Federal information is notoriously complex and difficult to use, and technological advances have given government agencies the ability to make vast amounts of information available that can require knowledge of not just government processes, but statistical analysis, geographic information systems and other advanced methods of information manipulation. GPO should be encouraged to develop value-added information products in order to address these issues. In addition, GPO should make its information resources available to commercial aggregators to provide greater value-added access to government information to all libraries, depository and non-depository, that wish to pay for those services.

- ✓ *GPO should provide services for varied communities of users.*

GPO should recognize that there are different types of partner libraries whose needs vary according to their user communities. In order to help librarians provide appropriate services for diverse groups, GPO must be aware of varying levels of user needs.

- ✓ *GPO should focus on marketing and training in the use of government information services.*

GPO increasingly provides training in online government information services, particularly in its role as a driver of new technologies for libraries. This is a role that GPO should continue and expand.

From partner libraries:

- ✓ *Libraries must act as service providers rather than warehouseers.*

The old depository model, which sought to distribute copies of most government printing to libraries around the nation, does not necessarily work in the electronic age. The emphasis in many libraries has shifted from building collections, which may or may not be used, to providing information to users in a timely fashion. With an increasing number of government information titles being disseminated in electronic-only formats, superior service rather than volume counts will become the distinguishing hallmark of GPO's partner libraries.

- ✓ *The role of regional federal depository libraries should be reexamined.*

Not all states have regional libraries within their boundaries, and the economic realities of state funding mean that some areas are better served by regional libraries than others. New ways of supporting FDLP libraries should be explored that are tailored to meet local needs and economic realities.

Introduction – Changes Needed cont.

- ✓ *Libraries, in their role as facilitators between government agencies and the public, should share their knowledge about providing information services with GPO and other agencies.*

As institutions, libraries make it a priority to understand their user communities and to provide effective information services for those communities. Libraries should share their expertise by working with government agencies in order to improve the usefulness and accessibility of information products and services.”

It is impossible to tell, at this point in time, exactly what the future of the GPO, the FDLP, and even the distribution of government information, will be like in the months, years and decades ahead. But it will certainly be interesting to watch.

ACQUIRING, ACCESSING, AND USING U.S. GOVERNMENT PUBLICATIONS

This section and the *How to Use This Guide* section below are primarily concerned with assisting the reader in effectively locating documents on a particular subject or by title. Searching for, retrieving, storing, and printing federal publications through the Internet is a more dynamic process than it is for printed publications. Not only are the skills and knowledge required to use the Internet or other electronic tools more rigorous, but so are the computer hardware and software requirements. However, these problems and requirements must be dealt with as more and more government publications become electronic only.

The Federal Bulletin Board (FBB) is a free electronic bulletin board service (BBS) that enables Federal agencies to provide the public with immediate, self-service access to Federal information in various electronic file formats. Users are able to identify, select, and transfer electronic files to their own personal computers quickly and easily through the File Library System. The FBB may be accessed in four ways:

A user account, consisting of a user ID and password only (no personal information is requested), is required in order to use the search feature. Just click the “Create account” button. You only need to create an account once and can use it to search the FBB on subsequent visits to the site. A fully searchable *GPO Access User’s Guide* can be downloaded from the FBB, as well as “Helpful Hints for Using *GPO Access*”, and other information at: <http://fedbbs.access.gpo.gov/access.htm>.

The general public can use these official government databases and many others free of charge for access to the *Federal Register*, congressional bills, *Congressional Record*, *GAO Reports*, *GILS Records*, *Privacy Act Notices*, *Monthly Catalog of Government Publications*, *Public Laws*, and the *U.S. Code*.

Complete full-text and graphics for these databases are available, with many of the documents also available as ASCII text files. Most databases also provide Adobe Acrobat Portable Document Format (PDF) files, which can display and print typeset pages, including embedded graphics. Graphics are provided as individual files in TIFF format for many databases. Because the *Congressional Record* and other databases are updated daily, users interested in locating specific information contained in these databases should use these sources whenever the most current bills, reports, and other information are needed.

The GPO's catalog librarians have been cataloging Internet only titles, using standard (MARC) formatting and the *Anglo-American Cataloging*, 2nd edition (AACR2) cataloging rules, since 1996. These electronic titles have then been uploaded into OCLC's Online Union Catalog and the linked PURLs and URLs lead to publications stored on the GPO's servers (archival copies) or directly to federal agencies database servers.

Federal Depository Libraries

The federal publication system was established in 1813 by legislation during the Thirteenth Congress as the means by which U.S. citizens could access government information, regardless of format and price. Congress also authorized free distribution, no-fee access to the public for selected congressional publications.

Nearly 1,300 libraries in the 50 states, the District of Columbia, and the six U.S. territories, participate in the Federal Depository Library Program (FDLP) under the administration of the GPO. The Government Printing Reform Act of 1996 (HR 4280) placed a limit on the number of depository libraries. As stated previously, there were 1296 libraries in the FDLP in 2002. The GPO administers the FDLP dissemination programs associated with the acquiring, cataloging, and distributing of federal documents.

The distribution of government publications was ordered by legislative action in 1857 and 1858. This allowed Senators and Representatives to designate libraries in their home states to receive federal documents. Major revisions of the

Introduction – Federal Depositories cont.

depository system occurred with passage of the General Printing Act of 1895 and the Depository Library Act of 1962. Under the latter, two libraries in each congressional district were authorized as depository collections. The state library and two regional libraries in each state may also house full depository collections. The regional libraries must accept all of the federal publications and agree to retain and make them available to the public permanently.

As the population of the United States grew during the twentieth century, the need for additional depository libraries became apparent. Documents were meant to be primarily an educational tool (although sometimes serving a political function as well) of the federal bureaucracy; therefore, federal bureaucrats and politicians generally believed that depository collections should be close to the citizens geographically. Accordingly, other libraries across the states were named selective federal document depository libraries to complement existing regional federal depository libraries, geographically speaking. Established regional depositories would, in turn, help the selective depository libraries collect, organize, and dispose of the documents. For example, the regional libraries assist the selective depository libraries in tasks such as weeding documents that are five years or older due to the premium placed on shelf space. All 50 states have at least one depository collection. However, six states lack a regional depository and are served by regionals in adjoining states. Most other depository collections are located in the federal libraries of executive departments and independent agencies or bureaus, land-grant college or university libraries, accredited law schools, and U.S. military academy libraries.

With widespread access to and use of the Internet, the future of selective depository libraries is uncertain given the political and budgetary pressures already discussed. This makes the retention of the regional depository libraries even more significant. The librarians and staff at these libraries have the expertise and experience needed now and in the future to provide assistance to citizens in their regions. The public will continue to have information related needs with respect to federal government whether or not all, or the vast majority, of the information is Internet accessible. The regional depository libraries, in such an environment, should have a much greater role in helping their constituents, including other local libraries, gain access to government information on the Internet.

While there continues to be a variety of ways to access printed material, some concerns have arisen. At the onset of the Reagan administration, privatization was seen as the way to reduce government expenses and to generate income. So was microfiche, and later, the CD-ROM format, both of which were cheaper to reproduce and distribute. Format changes have been constant, varying between print, microfiche, and digital on disks and online. Depository libraries may not receive the format they requested, resulting in some volumes being paper, others microfiche, and other disks. When depositories fail to receive a requested item, they often have had to do without because the title is “claims exhausted” (no

Introduction – Federal Depositories cont.

longer available from the GPO) or they have to buy it from a commercial vendor. The government document distribution environment has constantly been changing since 1980 and now we have more to worry about than the little light bulb burning out over our individual depository bins at the GPO.

Depository and other libraries for decades have been making tremendous investments in library shelving, micro format and disk storage cabinets, map cases, stack maintenance, and staffing to provide reference and technical support services for government documents in whatever format. Most of these institutions continue to invest in computer workstations, “hot” tables for cable connection to the Internet or wireless networking systems for use by laptops belonging to patrons or loaned by the library itself, computer paper, ink cartridges, and training programs for staff. These investments continue to strain library budgets; meanwhile very few of these institutions have eliminated any traditional library services.

The telecommunications infrastructure and technologies necessary to achieve the largely electronic system described are already established and becoming increasingly affordable by depository and other libraries. Many depository libraries, however, still lack the necessary funds to acquire and maintain public Internet access at reasonable or justified prices. Technology grants at the federal and state levels are beginning to make progress in meeting this basic requirement for a successful transition to the emerging electronic federal document system. These monies are essential to the effort to have at least one public Internet workstation in every Congressional District across the United States, particularly those that presently don't possess a regional depository library with its statutory full collection of all historic and current publications. At the same time, training librarians and support staff in those libraries that have established public Internet access represents another pressing need. Simply put, free access to free government information and free publications comes only at a price for those libraries dedicated to providing this very necessary, but rarely appreciated, service.

The GPO and Bookstore Sales

For those unable—or disinclined—to utilize the depository system, many federal documents remain available directly from the one remaining federal bookstore or from commercial bookstores, like Books-A-Million or Barnes & Noble. Some choose to contact the agencies themselves or the Federal Citizen Information Center (formerly known as the Consumer Information Center), FDIC-03D, P.O. Box 100, Pueblo, CO 81002. The Center is operated by the General Services Administration (GSA) and has been in operation since 1970 by executive order to help federal agencies promote consumer information. Its *Consumer Information Catalog* (issued quarterly) lists free and inexpensive U. S. publications likely to be of general interest.

New Titles By Topic E-mail Alert Service, which is available at this site: (<http://bookstore.gpo.gov/alertservice.html>), is a free service that allows you to receive e-mail updates of selected new publications available for sale from the Superintendent of Documents. You can sign up for any or all of the notification lists covering selected subject areas and receive updates on new titles as soon as they are available for purchase. The subject areas are: Business; Defense and Security; Elementary and Secondary Education; Employment and Occupations; Federal Statistics; Health Care; Military History; and Travel and Tourism.

An *Electronic Products* list (<http://bookstore.gpo.gov/eproducts/index.html>) is available to purchasers who need the original coded version of a document or set of documents, as well as those who are interested in reproducing and reselling the information. Diskettes include printing instructions or codes as well as text. However, they **do not** include illustrations, graphic designs, and documents that were photographed to be printed. Nor are stocks of these products available on hand at the GPO for filling customer orders. Each product is created on demand, after an order has been placed by the customer.

The *U.S. Government Online Bookstore* accepts major credit cards (Visa, MasterCard, Discover, and American Express) and will ship selected documents to the requester's home or office. Checks and money orders should be made payable to the Superintendent of Documents. All credit card orders must include the account number and expiration date of the card. You will need to write your name, complete shipping address, product information (quantity, stock number, title, and price), and method of payment in the designated fields on the order form which is available online at: <http://bookstore.gpo.gov/order001.pdf>. Orders may be submitted to the GPO via the Internet, telephone, fax, postal mail, or teletype. Payment must accompany your order.

A detailed transaction receipt is provided with each online order that you will want to print out for your records. The option to have the transaction receipt sent to your e-mail address is available on the order form. In order to help the GPO answer any questions they may have about your order, please include your daytime telephone number, fax number, and/or e-mail address. Your contact information will not be used for any other purpose.

Government documents are sometimes acquired through special agents and dealers; however, this aspect of acquiring documents is not discussed in detail here because, first, a comprehensive list of these agents or dealers is not available, nor is such information easy to research. Secondly, these agents quickly come and go; the higher profile entities offer varying degrees of service. Thirdly, the authors would not want to either exclude any worthwhile dealers, or help foster an awareness of those actually providing poor service. The GPO bookstore, however, is a known entity whose services are fairly consistent. Those who do not wish to use the federal bookstore may be able to locate dealers through the yellow pages in larger cities across the United States.

Citizens who want to buy copies of federal documents can obtain many of them from the GPO bookstore. Buyers should keep the following points in mind:

- To check on the availability of documents, the buyer should consult the GPO's *Sales Product Catalog* (SPC) which is available online at <http://bookstore.gpo.gov/index.html>.
- Because many titles have not been included in our book, we want to make readers aware of the *List of Classes of United States Government Publications Available for Selection by Depository Libraries*. It is a quarterly publication that lists over 5,000 government publication series available under the depository program. Publications are arranged alphabetically by department, beginning with the Agriculture Department. Document series are listed by their Superintendent of Documents (SuDocs) classification system number: A1.1.; A1.1/3.; A1.1/4-2.; . . . AA1.1.; AC1.2.; AE1.101.; C1.1.; etc.
- The preprinted, mail-order forms are also found in GPO catalogs (including the *Monthly Catalog*), *U.S. Government Books*, sales flyers, and subject bibliographies. The order forms are simple to use because they contain spaces for all essential order information and include a space for the address of the buyer.
- If a stock number does not appear in this *Guide*, a *Monthly Catalog*, or the source of information does not say “For sale by the Superintendent of Documents”, the publication may not be available through the GPO.
- Full payment must be made when placing an order. Checks and money orders should be made payable to the Superintendent of Documents. All credit card orders must include the account number and expiration date of the card.

- Calls should be made between 7:30 a.m. - 9:00 p.m. Eastern Standard Time. (New, expanded hours as of September 2003).
- Volume purchasers should consider establishing a GPO deposit account. A written request to open a Superintendent of Documents deposit account, accompanied by a minimum deposit of \$50, may be submitted by mail or fax. Allow three weeks for a new deposit account to be activated.

- International customers will incur additional cost for special handling. Foreign checks and currencies are not acceptable, but UNESCO coupons and international postal orders are acceptable. International customers are advised to contact the GPO bookstore directly for the most accurate and recent information about ordering U.S. documents.
- Orders must be submitted in English and need to be sent by surface mail, unless otherwise requested. Regular shipping and handling costs are included in the price.
- Priority shipping does cost extra but will be accommodated by calling 866-512-1800 or 202-512-1800 before placing an order.

As of September 1, 2003, the GPO closed all of its bookstores nationwide, except for the main bookstore in Washington, DC, which will undergo reconfiguration. Its address, telephone, fax, and hours are as follows:

The retail sales outlet in Laurel will remain in operation to service bookdealers picking up from the co-located warehouse facility only. The closures resulted from an overall decline in sales due to the dramatic increase in access to government information on the Internet and the shift from walk-in traffic at bookstores to purchases made online through the *U.S. Government Online Bookstore*.

How to Use This Guide

Most users will locate desired entries initially by consulting the Table of Contents which provides a broad-based topic breakdown organized by chapters (e.g., Agriculture and Horticulture, Recreation Activities); the user can go directly to any chapter of interest simply by clicking on the hyperlink located to the right. By clicking on the “search” button (binoculars) within Adobe Acrobat, you can type in the name of a federal agency and locate each of their publications included in *The Guide*. In some cases, narrow topics may be cited as subheadings under different broad topics listed in the Table of Contents. Documents relating to the health of children, for instance, might be located under the subheading “Health Care, Child Abuse, and Protection” within the chapter “Children, Infants, and Youth” before going on to other chapters such as “Health and Medical Care” and “Food and Nutrition”. The use of computer function keys such as “PgUp”/“PgDn” and the up and down arrows will assist in browsing for useful entries.

Once potentially useful entries have been located, users need to know how the citations are structured. For most documents, the citations include these elements:

- **Title:** The entry begins with the full title as it is found on the title page or cover of a print document or at the top of the screen or in the title bar for an online publication. This title should be found in library or commercial catalogs and indexes because this practice is standard cataloging procedure. A subtitle is included if it appears on the cover or title page of the document.
- **Issuing Agency:** This is usually the governmental agency, department, bureau, commission that conducted the research, or other entity that prepared the publication. The issuing agency is the corporate author. While individuals may be named in the actual publications as authors or editors, only the name of the first person listed has been included in *The Guide*. We found it prudent to specify the issuing agency followed by the broader department, executive office, or legislative body within which it resides.
- **Imprint Statement:** While most books include both the place and year of publication, only the year of publication has been included for brochures, books, and non-serial titles in this guide. The reason for not including the place of publication is that, in most cases, the place is Washington DC, Virginia, or Maryland. Although the publisher of most documents is usually thought to be the GPO, here the publisher should be regarded as the issuing agency as the GPO is usually the printer or print jobber. The compilers have noted if the publication is a revised edition (rev. ed.). In the case of periodical publications, which are normally obtained through subscription, the first year of publication has been included. The frequency of publication (monthly, quarterly, semi-annual, etc.) is noted after the

Introduction –How to Use cont.

name of the issuing agency. However, for annual publications, the current years available in print and/or online, are given.

- **Collation Statement:** The collation includes the number of pages and notes if the work is illustrated (ill.) or has maps, charts, tables, etc. The abbreviation “ill.” is used to indicate that photographs, portraits, sketches, or similar graphic materials appear in the publication. We felt “p.” should refer only to the number of pages, a standard bibliographic designation. In the case of some looseleaf publications that are supplemented or updated periodically, the number of pages may not be noted (1v.) because of the difficulty in projecting the number of final pages in the publication. If the publication is part of a series, the title of the series is provided in brackets.
- **Stock Number (S/N):** The S/N is the principle information required for ordering the publication from the *U.S. Government Online Bookstore*. The format is as follows: S/N 003-001-00065-4.
- **Price:** The price is the domestic (U.S.) price. No attempt was made to provide foreign cost information. When the publication can only be ordered in quantity packages, a note has been made of the total package price. When single issues of a serial or subscription may be purchased, a note has been made whenever possible. Readers should note that price information does not necessarily mean that the publication cannot be obtained free from the issuing agency. Some agencies will mail copies to requestors until their copies are all distributed. If readers wish to write the agency and wait for a response, they should realize there may be considerable delay in a response as most agencies are now understaffed.
- **Superintendent of Documents Classification Number (SuDocs number):** By providing the call number, which is standard and recognized in all depository libraries across the United States, users can find government documents cited in a number of reference publications. The purpose of this combination of letters, numbers, and punctuation marks that comprise the SuDocs number is to create a unique number for each government publication. For frequent users, or anyone understanding this classification system, the SuDocs number provides some insight into the issuing agency, publication series, issue number for serials, and type of publication. *The Monthly Catalog*, individual library catalogs, publisher guides, and bibliographies will refer to the SuDocs number assigned to each publication. Readers should be aware that all the SuDocs numbers were not always known by the time this work went through its final editing stage. Also, some free or online publications are not given a SuDocs number. Although some libraries do classify government publications by Library of Congress (LC) or Dewey Decimal Classification (DDC) numbers and interfile them on the same shelves with books, the authors made no attempt to include other classification

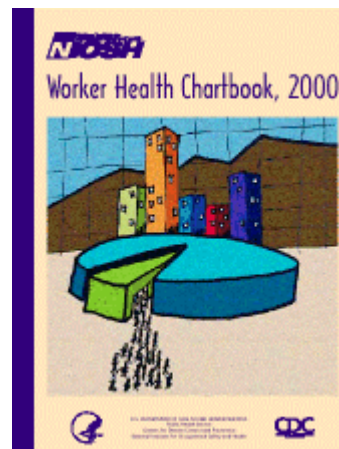
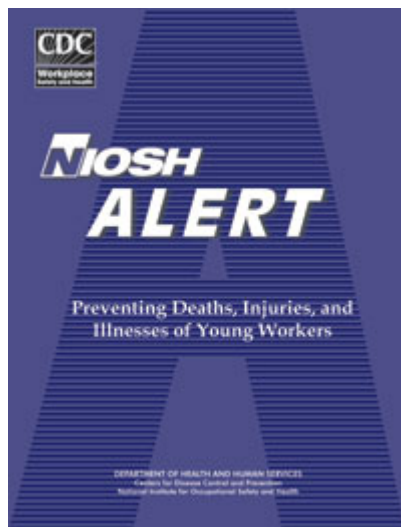
numbers. LC or DDC numbers are readily available for those federal publications cataloged through bibliographic utilities such as OCLC and library networks accessible on the Internet.

- The example ED1.328/7:P94 will serve to illustrate exactly how SuDocs numbers work. The letters “ED” tells the reader that this is a publication of the Department of Education. Checking the *List of Classes of United States Government Publications Available for Selection by Depository Libraries*, the number “328” indicates that the specific agency that issued the title is the Office of Educational Research and Improvement. The /7 indicates that the publication is part of a Technical Report series. Together the “ED1.328/7” is referred to as the class stem and appears in front of the first colon. The combination of letters and numbers that appears after the first colon can indicate a variety of things depending upon whether the publication is a book, a serial, or a series publication. The “P94” refers to the first word of the title: *Proxy Reporting of Dropout Status*. Catalog librarians establish “Cutter” numbers for authors, subjects, or titles; P12 might be used for Pacific, P31 for peace, P75 for pocket, etc. For many books or brochures, the final number after the colon might indicate the year, for example, 995 means 1995. For some serial publications, the SuDocs number reveals the series symbol, volume number, and book number; for example, “:103” might mean bulletin number 103; “/995/3/4” means volume 3, issue number 4 in 1995.
- **URLs/PURLs:** If a government publication is available online, we have included the Uniform Resource Locators (URLs) and/or Persistent Uniform Resource Locators (PURLs) associated with it. When this book was submitted to the publisher, all of the URLs “worked,” i. e., they were “hot links” you click on in order to go directly to the electronic publication. Given the instability of URLs and federal government servers, should you be unable to “click and go”, you should be able to “cut and paste” the link into your web browser. Should any of the URL links fail to locate the desired document, try going to the *Internet Archive* at <http://www.archive.org/>, then “cut and paste” the URL into the *WayBackMachine* window. Be sure to delete the extra “http://” before you click the “Take Me There” button. This should lead you to a collection of screen captures of the document. Another possible way of locating a missing online publication would be to go to *Google: Uncle Sam* at <http://www.google.com/unclesam> and type the title of the document between quotation marks (“ ”) in the search window.
- **Abstract:** By including one to five sentence abstracts for each document, readers can decide whether to purchase the item or go to a depository library to examine it. Examination is advisable before making a purchase,

of course, because an abstract may not precisely describe the publication. Readers are advised that the titles of many government documents, particularly if they are lengthy, often reveal quite a lot about the contents of the publication. The reader should read the title and abstract as one, because the abstracts may not repeat information contained in the title, imprint, or collation statements. For some documents, an abstract was not included if the document could not be obtained, but the compilers felt the title should be included due to its obvious importance. For series, one abstract is written for the series when the individual titles contain essentially the same information. In such cases, enough information is provided by the series title, general abstract, and volume title to understand the contents of the work and how to obtain it.

Abbreviations have been used sparingly because the CD-ROM format rendered the need to save space relatively unimportant. As a result, the only abbreviations used (noted above) related to concerns about the use of distracting verbiage in the bibliographic entries; for example, “col.” rather than “color”.

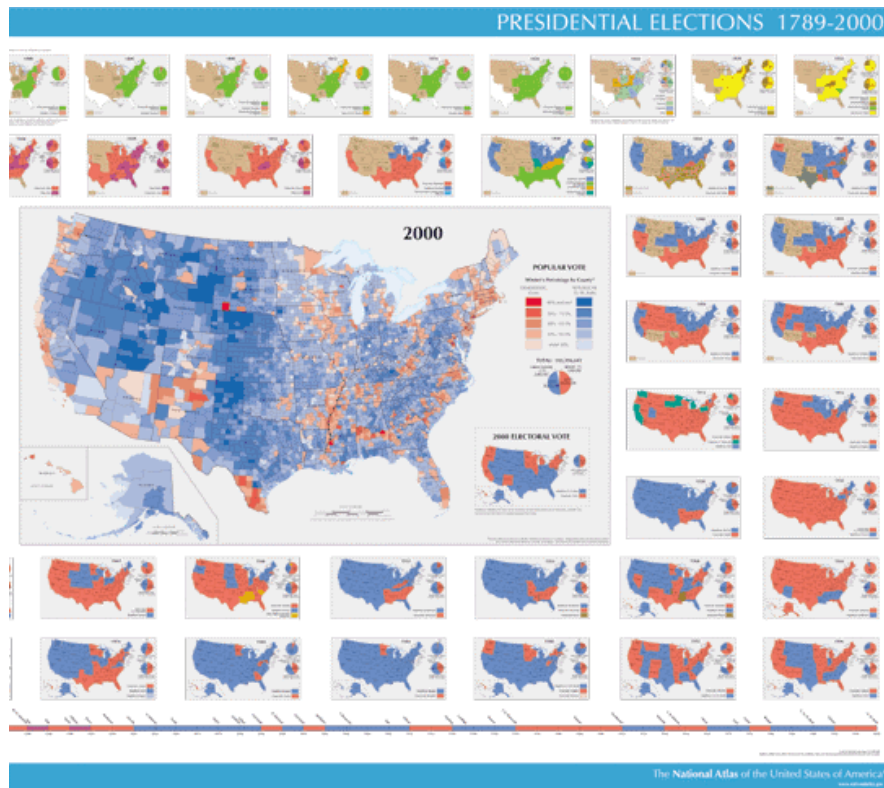

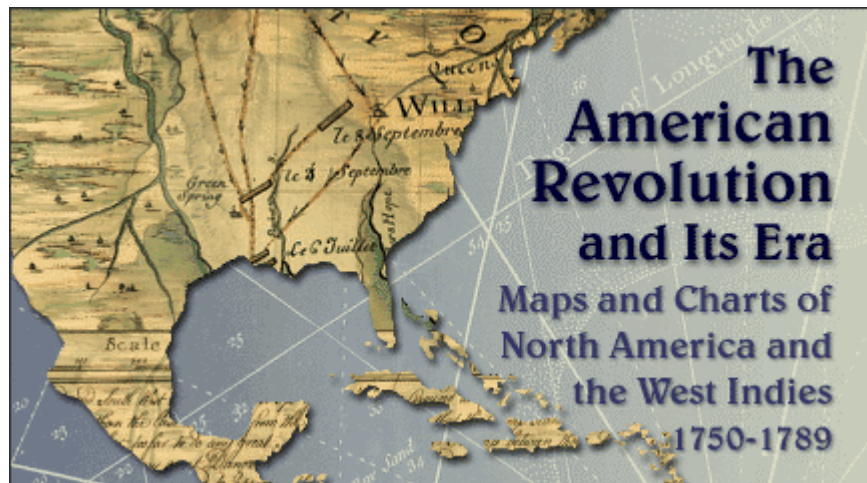
