RESOLUTION TO ADOPT A BUDGET FOR THE CITY OF POLSON FOR THE FISCAL

YEAR 2020 (18:06)-City Finance Officer Cindy Dooley presented this agenda item. The City has reached a point that it can pass the Budget. At the Public Hearing on August 26th there were no changes suggested. Since that date, there have been a few corrections; the City Janitor was added for an amount of \$4,892.00 increase, and the Stutzman project amount will be \$53,200.00. Commissioner Turner asked about using Tax Increment Funding monies for the project. It would be a benefit to the public. Finance Officer Dooley explained that this project was chosen a year ago to be a project that would use the new Gas Tax monies. That can't be changed now. Interim City Manager Nash commented that the Stutzman project target finish date is November 6th. The project is only supposed to take 4-5 days. During that time the road will be closed. Finance Officer Dooley stated that the City will mill 175.98. Remember that the budget is passed at the fund level. The funds may be moved around within the fund by the City Manager and/or the Finance Officer. There were a few changes to the Budget Message. Commissioner Martin asked if the Commission would receive a hard copy of the budget once it is completed. Finance Officer Dooley commented yes, the Commission will receive a copy. Commissioner Moll commented that the personnel wages needs to be looked at especially the Water/Sewer employees. Commissioner Turner motion to approve Resolution 2019-TBD adopting a budget for the City of Polson for the Fiscal Year 2020. Commissioner Moll second. Commission discussion: none Public Comment: Bonnie Manicke-Ward II commented the following. Polson City Treasurer, retired. The comment refers to the August 26, 2019 FY '20 Preliminary budget public hearing to clarify Fund #3500 Special Assessment Debt Revolving Fund balance for Commissioner Martin and Commission. SID \$24 bond issue was in default January, 1988 with outstanding bonds \$560,000. A city wide mill levy for fund #3500 was levied for five years to service debt on SID #24. The 78 lots were marketed by the city with no fees during a seven year period. The SID bond issue was paid in full 1997. The funds in the revolving fund were established by a city wide mill levy with the funds belonging to ALL taxpayers NOT a specified district. Investment interest earnings over the years added significant revenue to the fund. A sample review of investment interest earning 2004-2008 totaled \$27,056.00. During the era, several cities challenged SID bond default. Missoula had 3 districts and Columbia Falls defaulted on two bond issues. In 1988, Mayor DeVries commented it is not a pretty picture. I am very grateful for the teamwork of the council and staff at the time to met the challenge to maintain the city's bond rating. Lake County was also very cooperative to charge off the real property taxes due at the time of deed recording. And not to forget the property taxpayer for the unselfish support of the added tax levy. Lee Manicke-Ward II commented that the Stutzman project should all be taken out of the Tax Increment Funding. There is \$860,000.00 in that fund. Mr. Manicke asked Commissioner Moll to bring the subject up at the next Polson Redevelopment Agency meeting. VOTE: Unanimous Motion carried

RESOLUTION 2019-TBD TO LEVY AND ASSESS SPECIAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICTS AND SPECIAL MAINTENANCE DISTRICTS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2020 (38:36)-City Finance Officer Cindy Dooley presented this agenda item. This Resolution is in conjunction with the Budget. The assessments for this year are SID #42-Street Scape, Light District #19, and Light District #20. There is a negative balance in Light District #19, so the City General Fund will advance that fund \$2,500.00 to cover the short fall. Mission Valley Power will be taking on the project of installing LED lights in the district. This should have a substantial savings. Commissioner Turner suggested speaking with Gerad Bell at Platt Electric. He assisted in filling out the forms for Brothers Construction and he submitted the

(11) <u>Attorneys' Fees</u>. In the event of any litigation to enforce or interpret the provisions of this Agreement, or to remedy a breach thereof, the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover its reasonable attorneys' fees as fixed by the court.

(12) <u>Release of Agreement</u>: After annexation of OWNER'S REAL PROPERTY has been completed, the CITY shall, upon request from OWNER, release this Agreement as an encumbrance against OWNER'S REAL PROPERTY.





RE: Impact Fee Review Board Recommendation: Boys & Girls Club Impact Fee Review/Modification Request

Mayor and City Commissioners,

On August 6th, the City received an Impact Fee Review/Modification Request application from the Boys & Girls Club. The request is to waive all assessed impact fees required for the construction of the new Boys & Girls Club facility in Polson. The grand total of assessed impact fees is \$30,892, of which, \$17,563 is for sewer, \$8,129 is for water, and \$5,200 is for fire. As no impact fees have been paid at this time, the City is not permitted to issue the Boys & Girls Club a building permit until a determination of the request is made.

Per Section 2.06.883 of the Polson Municipal Code, a final determination by the City Commission must be made within 60 days of receipt of the petition request. Additionally, the sole authority to decide on impact fee petitions shall reside with the City Commission, which shall receive and consider advice from an ad hoc review board that is formed by the City Manager.

In mid-August, the Interim City Manager assembled an impact fee review board that consisted of two City Commissioners, the City Finance Officer, City Planner, and Building Official. The board, absent the Building Official, met on August 28th to discuss the petition request. The general consensus of the board was that the City Commission should waive all assessed impact fees for the Boys & Girls Club project. The board agreed that the non-profit organization is a great asset to the community and provides valuable services to the community's youth that ultimately have a positive impact on the community. The primary basis for the decision, however, was the fact that on October 3, 2011, the City Commission waived all assessed impact fees for the construction of the non-profit Mission Valley Aquatics and Fitness's aquatic center.

Although the applicant is technically seeking an impact fee re-determination, the nature of their request does not meet any of the criteria set forth in Sec. 2.06.883(B) of the Polson Municipal Code. But, in referencing Sec. 2.06.883(A)(3)(b), the board's advice must also consider the facts and circumstances in law as well as *equity*. Therefore, acknowledging that a precedent had been set by the City Commission for a near identical request eight years ago, the board felt that granting the Boys & Girls Club's request to waive all assessed impact fees, would be justified.

BACKGROUND: The Polson School District has submitted plans to rebuild the Linderman School gym. Time is declared to be the essence as to all of the terms, covenants and conditions herein contained.





AGENDA ITEM SUMMARY: Requesting council to approve a resolution to adopt 2020 schedule of fees for the Parks and Recreation Department. This year's resolution will also include the 2020 golf fees.

BACKGROUND: The City passed Ordinance # 2015-011. Within this ordinance it states:

A nonrefundable fee shall be paid to cover administrative costs of processing permits. All fees under this article shall be set by commission resolution and included in the Schedule of Fees. The director may require a deposit for the rental of any park or recreational facility. If the director requires a deposit for the rental of any park, the director shall establish standards for return and forfeit.

ANALYSIS: See the resolution for a summary of the fees and charges.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS: The fees will cover the administration costs, cost of inspections for return of deposits, other cost incurred in the implementation of this fee schedule and improvement and repair of amenities within the parks.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION: City Staff has recommended passage of this resolution, along with the approval of the Parks Board and Golf Board. The Parks Board and the City Staff also recommend that a portion of these fees go to capital expenditures within the parks which relate to the generation of these fees. The Parks Board and the Director of Parks and Recreation are recommending an increase to the shelter reservations, parks special event fees, and vehicle access fees.

The Director of Golf Operations, the Director of Parks and Recreation and the Golf Board are recommending the following increases to the golf fee structure for the 2020 season: +\$30 Adult season pass

+\$30 Adult season pass +\$25 couples pass +\$20 millennial passes (age 20-29) +\$10 Junior 14 & under +\$5 Junior 15-18 +\$25 19-22 years old/ student ID +\$25 out of county Junior +\$15 season trail fee +\$30 cart season pass +\$1 green fees **SUGGESTED MOTION:** Motion to approve the resolution to adopt the 2020 Parks and Recreation Schedule of Fees as recommended

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF POLSON, MONTANA:

1. The City shall impose and collect the fees as shown on Exhibit "A" and Exhibit "B" attached hereto for the services rendered by the City and the Parks and Recreation Department to include Polson Bay Golf Course.

2. This Resolution shall be effective September 17, 2019. All applications for services made prior to this date shall be charged the fees then in existence.

<u>AGENDA ITEM SUMMARY</u>: This agenda item requests City Commission follow the process set forth in the Polson bay Golf Course Charitable Golf Pass Policy, identified as City Commission Policy Number Golf -2. This policy requires the City Commission to make the final determining decision in awarding 6 season passes to charitable organizations.

<u>BACKGROUND</u>: Polson Bay Golf Course gives away 6 season passes to non-profit organizations that have a Polson community benefit for them to raise additional funds. With increased demand for these passes, a new policy was created to take applications, evaluate the non-profit, and to require reports of funds derived from the passes and how those funds are to be spent in the benefit of the Polson community. The deadline for applying for the season passes was Sept 1, the applications were discussed at the September Golf Board meeting, and the Golf Advisory Board's recommendation for the granting of the season passes will be given to the council for approval on the second council meeting in September.

<u>ANALYSIS:</u> The Golf Advisory Board has received more applications for Charitable Golf Passes this year than the six available. It will be up to the City Commission to give these golf season passes to the charitable organizations it deems most deserving based upon the Golf Advisory Boards recommendations. The Golf Advisory Board recommends giving only 1 pass to the American Legion instead of the two requested in order to be able to award 1 to the Special Olympics.

<u>FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS</u>: The financial impacts are minimal to the overall golf fund, because the Charitable Golf Pass policy states that the number of passes awarded will be limited to 6 a year.

<u>STAFF RECOMMENDATION</u>: Staff recommends following the recommendation of the Golf Advisory Board for donating season passes for charitable organizations

<u>SUGGESTED MOTION</u>: I move to award the 2020 golf season passes to community nonprofits in the following manner: 2 passes to the Polson Elks, 2 passes to the Polson Rotary, 1 pass to the American Legion Post 112, and 1 pass to the Flathead Lake Buccaneers Special Olympic Team.

- 1. Rational or Background to Policy: This policy has been implemented to establish very clear procedures and timelines to be followed by charitable groups when requesting donations of golf season passes from Polson Bay Golf Course and to establish procedures for the Golf Advisory Board in reviewing these requests.
- 2. Policy Statement: The following policy guidelines apply:
 - **a.** All requests for donated season passes must be received by September 1st.
 - **b.** The Golf Advisory Board will review all requests and make recommendations for award to the city commission.
 - **c.** The Polson city commission will make the final award determinations.
 - d. Raffles must comply with Montana Rule 23.16.2602 (General Raffle Requirements).
 - **e.** Follow up report detailing charitable earnings is required post raffle/drawing for the golf course.
 - f. Maximum of 6 season passes (total) to be awarded annually.
 - **g.** Winners of donated season passes will be eligible for a full refund of pre-purchased season pass for the same year, or allowed to transfer won season pass to another person prior to use. Won season passes are excluded from the golf roll-over/refund policy.
 - **h.** Not all requests will be awarded.
 - i. Effective date of this policy is upon City Commission approval.
- **3. Procedures:** The following procedures will be followed when giving out golf charitable season pass(s):
 - **a.** Application forms are available at the Polson Bay Golf Course Pro-shop.
 - **b.** All requests for donated season passes must be received by September 1st.
 - c. All requests must be submitted to:
 - Polson Bay Golf Course 111 Bayview Dr. Polson Mt 59860
 - **d.** The Golf Advisory Board will review all requests and make recommendations for award to the city commission on the second Wednesday in September for the upcoming golf season.
 - **e.** The Polson city commission will make the final award determination on its second meeting in September.
 - **f.** Follow up report detailing charitable earnings is required post raffle/drawing. This report should include; method of fund raising, amount raised, contact information of

winners and how the funds will be spent to benefit the community. Information will be used to determine future eligibility for season passes.

g. The golf advisory board will make recommendations for award based on amount of money to be raised, the benefit to the community, reports from previous awards, and the relevance to the promotion of the game of golf, and the relationship of the charitable organization to the City of Polson, its citizens, and Polson Bay Golf Course.

ELIGIBILITY

Groups requesting golf passes must be a 501c(3) local organization that show funds raised will be used to benefit the Polson community.
