With the instillation of the new radio system we need to upgrade our current Equature logging recorder to be able to record digital radio traffic. The cost of this upgrade is \$40,414.99 per recorder.

Just to provide some history, by Florida Statute we are required to record all 911 telephone calls. Our 911 equipment runs on a 5-year replacement cycle which is the grant period for the purchase of hardware with the State E-911 Board. Both our primary and backup Exacom logging recorders were replaced in 2017 and 2018 respectively with new Equature recorders utilizing grant funds due to their being 5-years old. The primary recorder was replaced using a State E-911 Board special disbursement to the County of \$50,000 supplemented by \$4,521 in County funds at a total cost of \$54,521. The backup recorder was purchased using a State E-911 grant for \$13,413 supplemented by \$2,367 County funds of a total cost of \$15,780. The use of the County funds was necessary as the E-911 Board funds can only be spent on the portion of the recorder that is utilized to record 911 calls.

Both of these recorders were purchased with the software to record analog radio and telephone calls. The difference in price between the 2 recorders is that the primary recorder has analytic capabilities and other feature such as screen capture that we did not purchase for the backup recorder which records voice only.

With the County's new 700mhz radio system, to have the capability to record digital radio traffic the software must be upgraded. The cost of this software upgrade is \$40,414.99 per recorder. We cannot utilize E-911 grant funds for this software upgrade. In July, the Board approved a budget amendment that included \$38,865 to upgrade the primary recorder in the 911 Center. A budget amendment that includes the remaining \$1,552 is addressed elsewhere in tonight's agenda.

Additionally, Lawrence Wilson, in negotiations with Motorola, has gotten Motorola to waive the customary charge of \$100,000 per recorder for the API interface between the 700Mhz radio system and the logging recorders saving the County \$200,000.

Upgrading the primary recorder is necessary as it is our primary records retention system of all telephone, 911 calls, and radio recordings, and is an iatrical part of our daily operations. Based on our current needs, I am requesting that the Board of County Commissioners approve the purchase of the Equature Proxy upgrade to the primary 911 recorder.

RE: Amendment to D.A.V.I.D access agreement for 911 Communications Center

On November 1, 2011 the Social Security Administration made changes to the Death Master File (DMF) data. The deceased information provided by The Florida Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles through the D.A.V.I.D. system is based upon data obtained from the Limited Access Death Master File (LADMF). DHSMV has been advised that in order to continue access to LADMF the State must insure that anyone with information is shared has the authority to access this information and is aware of the associated penalties for misuse.

(1) Pursuant to 15 CFR §1110.102, the Requesting Party certifies that its access to DMF information is appropriate because the Requesting Party (a) has (i) a legitimate fraud prevention interest, or (ii) a legitimate business purpose pursuant to a law, governmental rule, regulation, or fiduciary duty, (b) has systems facilities, and procedures in place to safeguard such information, and experience in maintaining the confidentiality, security, and appropriate use of such information, pursuant to requirements reasonably similar to the requirements of section 6103(p)(4) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, and (c) agrees to satisfy such similar requirements.

(2) Pursuant to 15 CFR §1110.102, the Requesting Party certifies that it shall not: (i) disclose DMF information to any person other than a person who meets the requirements of Section 1 above; (ii) disclose DMF information to any person who uses the information for any purpose other than a legitimate fraud prevention interest or a legitimate business purpose pursuant to a law, governmental rule, regulation, or fiduciary duty; (iii) disclose the DMF information to any person who further discloses it to any person other than a person who meets the requirements of Section (1) above; or (iv) use the DMF information for any purpose other than a legitimate fraud prevention interest or a legitimate business purpose other than a legitimate fraud prevention interest or a legitimate suppose other than a person who meets the requirements of Section (1) above; or (iv) use the DMF information for any purpose other than a legitimate fraud prevention interest or a legitimate business purpose pursuant to a law, governmental rule, regulation or fiduciary duty.

(3) Failure to comply with 15 C.F.R. §1110.102 pertaining to the deceased date of an individual may result in penalties of \$1,000 for each disclosure or use, up to a maximum of \$250,000 in penalties per calendar year, pursuant to 15 CFR §1110.200.

As such our agency must have safeguards in place as outlined in the amendment in order to continue to have access to the D.A.V.I.D system. Being we only disclose D.A.V.I.D. information for law enforcement purposes we meet the criteria as outlined in the amendment.

Therefore, it is my recommendation that the Board of Commissioners approve the attached D.A.V.I.D. amended agreement for signature by the Board Chairman.

Dear Ronald Williams,

This letter is to advise that the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for access to the Driver and Vehicle Information Database (DAVID) is being amended pursuant to Section VIII., of the MOU to include additional requirements regarding the deceased date of individuals provided in the DAVID application (see attached amendment).

The deceased date provided by the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles (Department) via the DAVID application is obtained from the National Technical Information Service (NTIS) through the NTIS Limited Access Death Master File (DMF), as defined in 15 CFR §1110.2. We have been advised by NTIS, that in order to continue our access to the Limited Access Death Master File, we must ensure that anyone we share the data with has authority to access the information, has controls in place to protect the data, and is aware of the penalties associated with misuse of the data. In summary, access to data from the NTIS Limited Access Death Master File is subject to the following requirements:

(1) Pursuant to 15 CFR §1110.102, the Requesting Party certifies that its access to DMF information is appropriate because the Requesting Party (a) has (i) a legitimate fraud prevention interest, or (ii) a legitimate business purpose pursuant to a law, governmental rule, regulation, or fiduciary duty, (b) has systems facilities, and procedures in place to safeguard such information, and experience in maintaining the confidentiality, security, and appropriate use of such information, pursuant to requirements reasonably similar to the requirements of section 6103(p)(4) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, and (c) agrees to satisfy such similar requirements.

(2) Pursuant to 15 CFR §1110.102, the Requesting Party certifies that it shall not: (i) disclose DMF information to any person other than a person who meets the requirements of Section 1 above; (ii) disclose DMF information to any person who uses the information for any purpose other than a legitimate fraud prevention interest or a legitimate business purpose pursuant to a law, governmental rule, regulation, or fiduciary duty; (iii) disclose the DMF information to any person who further discloses it to any person other than a person who meets the requirements of Section (1) above; or (iv) use the DMF information for any purpose other than a legitimate fraud prevention interest or a legitimate business purpose pursuant to a law, governmental rule, not purpose other than a legitimate fraud prevention interest or a legitimate business purpose pursuant to a law, governmental rule, any person who meets the requirements of Section (1) above; or (iv) use the DMF information for any purpose other than a legitimate fraud prevention interest or a legitimate business purpose pursuant to a law, governmental rule, regulation or fiduciary duty.

(3) Failure to comply with 15 C.F.R. §1110.102 pertaining to the deceased date of an individual may result in penalties of \$1,000 for each disclosure or use, up to a maximum of \$250,000 in penalties per calendar year, pursuant to 15 CFR §1110.200.

Your agency must meet the above requirements and have the proper safeguards in place as outlined in the amendment to continue having access to DAVID. In order to ensure compliance with these express requirements of federal law, we are requiring that agencies with access to DAVID enter into an amendment certifying compliance with the above requirements, and providing specific information as to how your agency qualifies to receive access to information from the NTIS Limited Access Death Master File.

Pursuant to Section IX., (c), of your current MOU, this is notice that we intend to cancel your MOU if the signed amendment, including sufficient information as noted above, is not received within thirty (30) days from the date of this letter. Please return the amendment in a timely manner to avoid termination of the MOU and access to DAVID.

On November 1, 2011, the Social Security Administration (SSA) implemented an important change in the Death Master File (DMF) data. IMPORTANT NOTICE: Change in Public Death Master File Records

NTIS receives Death Master File (DMF) data from the Social Security Administration (SSA). SSA receives death reports from various sources, including family members, funeral homes, hospitals, and financial institutions.

Q: What change has SSA made to the Public DMF?

A: Effective November 1, 2011, the DMF data that NTIS receives from SSA no longer contains protected state death records. Section 205(r) of the [Social Security] Act prohibits SSA from disclosing the state death records SSA receives through its contracts with the states, except in limited circumstances. (Section 205r link - http://www.ssa.gov/OP_Home/ssact/title02/0205.htm)

Q: How did this change affect the size of the Public DMF?

A: The historical Public DMF contained 89 million records. SSA removed approximately 4.2 million records from this file and adds about 1 million fewer records annually.

REMINDER: DMF users should always investigate and verify the death listed before taking any adverse action against any individual."

AMENDMENT NO. 1 TO THE MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF HIGHWAY SAFETY AND MOTOR VEHICLES AND COLUMBIA COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

THIS AMENDMENT NO. 1, is made to the MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU) between the FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF HIGHWAY SAFETY AND MOTOR VEHICLES, hereinafter referred to as "Providing Agency" or "Department," and COLUMBIA COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, hereinafter referred to as "Requesting Party," collectively referred to as "the Parties," executed on or about 6/29/2017.

WHEREAS, the MOU was executed for the purpose of establishing the conditions and limitations under which the Providing Agency agrees to provide electronic access to DAVID information to the Requesting Party; and

WHEREAS, as required in the MOU, access to and use of DAVID information shall be in accordance with Chapter 119, Florida Statutes, and the Driver's Privacy Protection Act (DPPA), and may only be disclosed to persons to whom disclosure is authorized under Florida law and federal law; and

WHEREAS, in order to ensure that this MOU complies with the requirements of Federal law, the Parties wish to add additional language addressing access to and disclosure of data that may include the deceased date of an individual; and

WHEREAS, changes to the MOU are required to be made in writing, in accordance with section VIII. <u>Amendments</u>; and

WHEREAS, this Amendment is required to add the additional compliance requirements to the MOU.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual benefits to be derived here from, the Parties hereto do hereby amend the MOU as follows:

I. Added language is shown herein as underlined. Existing language that was already underlined is shown herein with a double-underline.

II. The third paragraph of section III. <u>Legal Authority</u>, is hereby amended as follows:

Under this MOU, the Requesting Party will be provided, via remote electronic means, information pertaining to driver licenses and vehicles, including personal information authorized to be released pursuant to Section 119.0712(2), Florida Statutes and DPPA. By executing this MOU, Requesting Party agrees to maintain the confidential and exempt status of any, and all information provided by the Providing Agency pursuant to this agreement and to ensure that any person or entity accessing or utilizing

said information shall do so in compliance with Section 119.0712(2), Florida Statutes and DPPA. In addition, the Requesting Party agrees that insurance policy information shall be utilized pursuant to Section 324.242(2), Florida Statutes. <u>Furthermore, the deceased date of an individual shall only be provided to a Requesting Party that meets the qualifications of 15 CFR §1110.102</u>. Disclosure of the deceased date of an individual, which is not in compliance with 15 CFR §1110.102, is punishable under 15 CFR §1110.200. Additionally, because the Social Security Administration does not guarantee the accuracy of the Death Master File, the Requesting Party is reminded that adverse action should not be taken against any individual without further investigation to verify the death information listed (A notice from the Social Security Administration addressing the foregoing is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference).

III. Section IV. <u>Statement of Work</u>, subsection B., is hereby amended by adding item 14.

14. <u>Access and utilize the deceased date of an individual, or other information from the NTIS Limited</u> Access Death Master File, as defined in 15 CFR §1110.2, in conformity with the following requirements:

(a) Pursuant to 15 CFR §1110.102, the Requesting Party certifies that its access to DMF information is appropriate because the Requesting Party: (i) has a legitimate fraud prevention interest, or a legitimate business purpose pursuant to a law, governmental rule, regulation, or fiduciary duty; (ii) has systems, facilities, and procedures in place to safeguard such information, and experience in maintaining the confidentiality, security, and appropriate use of such information, pursuant to requirements reasonably similar to the requirements of section 6103(p)(4) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986; and (iii) agrees to satisfy such similar requirements.

(b) Pursuant to 15 CFR §1110.102, the Requesting Party certifies that it will not: (i) disclose DMF information to any person other than a person who meets the requirements of subsection IV. B. 14 (a), above; (ii) disclose DMF information to any person who uses the information for any purpose other than a legitimate fraud prevention interest or a legitimate business purpose pursuant to a law, governmental rule, regulation, or fiduciary duty; (iii) disclose DMF information to any person other than a person who meets the requirements of subsection IV. B. 14 (a), above; or (iv) use DMF information for any purpose other than a legitimate fraud prevention interest or a legitimate than a person who meets the requirements of subsection IV. B. 14 (a), above; or (iv) use DMF information for any purpose other than a legitimate fraud prevention interest or a legitimate business purpose pursuant to a law, governmental rule, regulation or fiduciary duty.

IV. The second paragraph of section V. <u>Safeguarding Information</u>, is hereby amended as follows:

Any person who willfully and knowingly violates any of the provisions of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor of the first degree punishable as provided in Sections 119.10 and 775.083, Florida Statutes. In addition, any person who willfully and knowingly discloses any information in violation of DPPA may be subject to criminal sanctions and civil liability. <u>Furthermore, failure to comply with 15.CFR §1110.102</u> pertaining to the deceased date of an individual may result in penalties of \$1,000 for each disclosure or use, up to a maximum of \$250,000 in penalties per calendar year, pursuant to 15 CFR §1110.200.

V. Item D., under that part of section V. <u>Safeguarding Information</u>, that begins with "The Parties mutually agree to the following:", is hereby amended as follows:

D. The Requesting Party shall comply with Rule 74-2, Florida Administrative Code, and with Providing Agency's security policies, and employ adequate security measures to protect Providing Agency's information, applications, data, resources, and services. The applicable Providing Agency security policies shall be made available to Requesting Party. Additionally, with respect to the <u>deceased</u> <u>date of an individual</u>, the Requesting Party shall have systems, facilities, and procedures in place to <u>safeguard such information</u>, and experience in maintaining the confidentiality, security, and appropriate <u>use of such information</u>, pursuant to requirements reasonably similar to the requirements of section <u>6103(p)(4) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 and agrees to satisfy such similar requirements</u>.

VI. Section XIII. Certification Information, is hereby added to the MOU as follows:

<u>Pursuant to IV.B.14(a) above, the Requesting Party certifies that access to DMF information is</u> <u>appropriate based on the following specific purpose (please describe the legitimate purpose):</u>

<u>Please indicate whether the Requesting Party desires to re-disclose the deceased date of any</u> <u>individual to any other person or entity.</u> Yes___No__

If the Requesting Party desires to re-disclose the deceased date of any individual to any other person or entity, the Requesting Party agrees that it will not re-disclose the data received from the Providing Agency, but rather, will contact NTIS at https://classic.ntis.gov/products/ssa-dmf/# to become a Certified Person, as defined by 15 CFR §1110.2. A Requesting Party who is a Certified Person may only disclose the deceased date of an individual pursuant to the Requesting Party's obligations under 15 CFR §1110.102."

VII. All other terms and conditions of the original MOU not herein revised shall be and remain the same in full force and effect.

Re: Public Private Partnership Agreement – Carl and Joan Allison Cypress Lake Road

Date: December 12, 2018

At the October 4 meeting of the Board of County Commissioners the board considered a proposal from Carl and Joan Allison to pave a portion of Cypress Lake Road, a public road, at Mr. and Mrs. Allison's cost. I informed the board at that time that a public private partnership agreement, or P3 agreement, would be necessary to implement that proposal.

Attached for the Board's approval is an agreement prepared in conformity with the parameters discussed previously. The agreement:

- 1. Requires the Allisons to fund the project by depositing funds in advance with the Board, subject to additional advances if necessary or refund if the project is completed under budget;
- 2. Assigns full project authority to the County, subject to a limitation on destruction of standing trees;
- 3. Provides that the road is and will remain public notwithstanding private funding of improvements.

The P3 agreement allows the County to move forward and complete this portion of Cypress Lake Road now, removing this portion from the project scheduled to begin during the 2021 fiscal year. Completing this portion with private funds will realize a cost savings to the County.

At the time of signing the agreement Mr. and Mrs. Allison tendered a check to Columbia County for the initial deposit required by the agreement. That check is being held by my office subject to the Board's approval of the P3 agreement.

Recommended Motion: To approve the Public Private Partnership Agreement between the County and Carl and Joan Allison for paving of a portion of Cypress Lake Road.

PUBLIC PRIVATE PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENT

Fla. Stat. § 125.01(1)(m) and Fla. Stat. § 287.05712

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered this ______ day of December 2018 by and between COLUMBIA COUNTY, FLORIDA, a Political Subdivision of the State of Florida, 135 NE Hernando Avenue, Suite 203 Lake City, FL 32055 (the "County") and CARL L. ALLISON and JOAN M. ALLISON, whose address for purposes of this Agreement is 1704 SW Paloma Court, Lake City, Florida 32025 ("Allison");

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the County is authorized by Florida Statutes sections 125.01(1)(m) and 287.05712 to enter into public private partnerships for the construction of improvements to governmental facilities, including county roads, and is a "responsible public entity" as that term is defined in Chapter 287;

WHEREAS, Allison, a "private entity" as that term is defined in Chapter 287, contacted the County's public works department requesting the county pave an approximately 800 linear foot section of Cypress Lake Road, a county road, at Allison's expense;

WHEREAS, Cypress Lake Road is presently scheduled for paving and construction utilizing FDOT funds during the 2021 fiscal year;

WHEREAS, Allison does not wish to wait until 2021, and is willing to pay for the construction of and donate the necessary right-of-way to complete paving of the portion of Cypress Lake Road running north from Allison's property, and will do so if the County will proceed with this portion immediately;

WHEREAS, Allison's payment for the improvement of this portion of Cypress Lake Road will save the County public resources that would otherwise be committed in 2021 to paying the portion of Cypress Lake Road which Allison wishes to pave now;

WHEREAS, the paving of a portion of Cypress Lake Road is designated as a "qualifying project" as that term is defined in Chapter 287;

WHEREAS, Cypress Lake Road is and will continue to be a public road, dedicated to the public's use and for public benefit; and

WHEREAS, the County owns and will continue to own Cypress Lake Road after this Agreement is completed.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties enter into this Public Partnership Agreement as follows:

1. RECITALS INCORPORATED

The recitals above are true and correct and are incorporated herein by reference.

Allison P3 Agreement/JFF

2. PROJECT NOT SOLICITED

The County did not solicit this partnership agreement. The County does not have an application fee for submission of unsolicited proposals, and no such fee was charged or is owed in connection with this agreement.

3. LEGISLATIVE DETERMINATIONS

The County hereby determines that the project that is the subject of this Agreement:

- a. Is in the public's best interest;
- b. Is for a facility that is owned by the County;
- Has adequate safeguards in place to ensure that additional costs or service disruptions are not imposed on the public in the event of material default or cancellation of this agreement;
- d. Has adequate safeguards in place to ensure that the responsible public entity or private entity has the opportunity to add capacity to the proposed project or other facilities serving similar predominantly public purposes; and
- e. Will be owned by the responsible public entity upon completion or termination of the agreement and upon payment of the amounts financed.

4. FINANCING

Financing for the project contemplated by this agreement shall be paid by Allison. Allison shall deposit with County cash in the amount of ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND and 00/100 DOLLARS, for application to pay any and all costs associated with this project. There shall be no contingency for private or public financing. Said amounts paid by Allison shall be held by the County in lieu of any cash bond or performance bond so long as Allison ensures funds remain on deposit in advance of the County incurring expenses. In the event this amount is exhausted, Allison agrees to make additional reasonable deposits, which shall be made from time to time before completion of the work. If the work is completed and funds remain deposited with the County, said sums shall be refunded to Allison upon review and approval by the Board of County Commissioners for Columbia County, Florida.

5. WAIVER OF PROJECT APPROVAL REQUIREMENTS

Due to the simplicity of the project and as provided by statute, the County waives those project approval requirements set forth in Fla. Stat. section 287.05712(5).

6. NOTICE TO AFFECTED LOCAL JURISDICTIONS There are no other affected local jurisdictions.

7. COMPREHENSIVE AGREEMENT

- No payment bond, letter of credit, or security other than the deposits under section 4 shall be required.
- b. The County shall design the qualifying project and approve all work performed thereon when same is constructed in conformity with the County's designs. The road shall be aligned in such a way that no presently standing trees are removed from Allison's lands.
- c. A policy of public liability insurance shall not be required as Allison shall not be permitted to perform work or control work performed on the qualifying project.
- d. All monitoring of the qualifying project shall be by the County only.

e. Allison's duties in connection with this agreement relate to payment of the deposit under section 4, donation of necessary right-of-way for the current improvements to Cypress Lake Road, and funding the completion of the qualifying project. Failure by Allison to timely perform these duties shall constitute a material breach of this Agreement and work shall be suspended until such time as any breach is cured.

8. POWERS AND DUTIES OF ALLISON

Allison shall:

- a. Donate such portions of right-of-way as are determined by the County Engineer or his designee to complete paving of Cypress Lake Road for the qualifying project hereunder. Donation shall include only such lands as are owned or controlled by Allison, or either one of them, or any trust or corporate entity controlled by or held for the benefit of Allison or either one of them.
- b. Comply with the comprehensive agreement.

9. EXPIRATION OR TERMINATION OF AGREEMENTS

Upon the expiration or termination of a comprehensive agreement, the County may use revenues from the qualifying project to pay current operation and maintenance costs of the qualifying project. If Allison materially defaults under the comprehensive agreement, the compensation that is otherwise due to the private entity is payable to satisfy all financial obligations on the qualifying project. Revenues in excess of the costs for operation and maintenance costs may be repaid to Allison. The County may terminate with cause and without prejudice a comprehensive agreement, and may exercise any other rights or remedies that may be available to it in accordance with the provisions of the comprehensive agreement. The full faith and credit of the County is not pledged to secure the financing of Allison in connection with this or any other Agreement.

10. SOVEREIGN IMMUNITY

No part of this Agreement shall be construed to waive the sovereign immunity of the County or an officer or employee thereof with respect to participation in, or approval of, any part of a qualifying project or its operation, including, but not limited to, interconnection of the qualifying project with any other infrastructure or project. The County possesses sovereign immunity with respect to the project, including, but not limited to, its design, construction, and operation.

11. CONSTRUCTION OF AGREEMENT

This agreement shall be liberally construed to effectuate the purposes hereof and in support of the legality of the relationship between the parties hereto. Although this agreement was prepared by counsel for the County, a court of competent jurisdiction called upon to construe this agreement shall not apply any rule of construction favoring either party by reason of the party responsible for the drafting of same.

12. CHOICE OF LAW, VENUE

This Agreement shall be and is governed by the laws of the State of Florida. Venue for any proceeding hereunder shall lie exclusively in the state court, in the Third Judicial Circuit of Florida, in and for Columbia County, Florida. In any action to enforce this agreement, the prevailing party to such suit shall be entitled to recover reasonably incurred attorneys' fees and costs in that action.

All expenses have been tracked in the 303 and 405 accounts since grant award. The grant has been assigned a project code, G322, to ensure the expenses are tracked appropriately. The finance department has verified with the Department of Economic Opportunity this manner of tracking and reporting is compliant with the grant guidelines.

Further the revisions will provide for a larger qualified applicant pool.
