

ORDINANCE 2018 - 01; AN ORDINANCE AMMENDING 2018 SALARY ORDINANCE 2017-24

FILED

An Ordinance fixing the salaries and wages for the officials and employees for various departments of the County of Franklin, Indiana for the calendar year 2018.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF FRANKLIN COUNTY, INDIANA:

Section 1

The salaries and wages of the officials and employees for the various departments of the County of Franklin, Indiana, for the year 2018, shall be as follows:

The paragraph pertaining to 90% was removed from the Salary Ordinance. This change is retroactive back to 01/01/2018.

FRANKLIN COUNTY AUDITOR

Regular part-time employees shall not work more than twenty-eight(28) hours per work week, with the exception of mandatory certification training required of the position.

Seasonal employees are allowed to work up to 40 hours per week for up to 32 weeks per year. The position included in this designation are park part-time guards, extension part-time, highway positions for seasonal mowing, and Treasurer seasonal help. This does not include any other part-time help unless approved by Council. An employee working two or more seasonal or part-time jobs shall not work more than 1280 hours per year. All elected officials and department heads with part-time help will at the time of filing payroll vouchers with the Auditor; 1, verify the number of hours each part-time and seasonal employee has worked and the total hours worked for the year beginning September 1 to August 31.

Department Heads and Elected Officials may pay individuals at rates less than the stated wage, but may not exceed the amounts stated without a Salary Ordinance Amendment.

Call Back Pay

Employees called back to work after the regular work shift shall be compensated a minimum of two (2) hours and for all hours worked beyond two (2) hours.

Overtime Pay Calculation

That salary rate plus Longevity must be added together while figuring the overtime rate after actual 40 hours worked. This does not apply to Comp time. Sheriff, Jail and Communications will need to add holiday pay along with longevity due to the fact that the holiday pay is not included in the salary. ILEA Certification stipened to overtime calculation.

Section 2

Full time employees shall receive a longevity pay (based upon last hire date) of \$60.00 per calendar year. Employee must be employed as of December 31,2017 to receive that year benefit. Starting the 16th year of service the employee will receive \$75.00 per calendar year.

ILEA Certification stipend shall be paid bi-weekly to Sheriff department employees upon completion of the Indiana Law Enforcement Academy.

Holiday Pay is paid out at 8 hours of regular pay per holiday.

**AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE TRACKING OR DEPOSIT OF MUD
OR OTHER DEBRIS ON FRANKLIN COUNTY HIGHWAYS/ROADWAYS**

WHEREAS, it is determined that, Franklin County, IN, is in need of a policy governing debris tracked onto county roadways and highways;

WHEREAS, the Franklin County Board of Commissioners (the "Commissioners") is authorized, under I.C. § 36-1-3, et seq., to adopt home rule ordinances in matters that do not abrogate state law

BE IT NOW ORDAINED by the Commissioners, that:

1. No person shall drive or move any vehicle on Franklin County Highways, including all roadways, alleys, or other public rights of way, the wheels, tires, frame, or chassis of which carry onto or deposit in any mud, dirt, sticky substances, litter or foreign matter of any kind ("Debris") onto such Franklin County Highways.
2. The Franklin County Sheriff shall provide a written warning to (1) the operator of any Vehicle depositing such Debris, (2) the owner of any Vehicle depositing such Debris, and/or (3) the landowner that is the source of such Debris, requiring cleanup and removal of such Debris within twenty-four (24) hours. The failure to completely cleanup and remove such Debris within twenty-four (24) hours shall constitute a violation of this ordinance.
3. (1) The operator of any Vehicle depositing such Debris, (2) the owner of any Vehicle depositing such Debris, and/or (3) the landowner that is the source of such Debris may each be held liable for any Violation hereunder.
4. Fines and penalties for violations of this ordinance:
 1. First violation - \$100.00;
 2. Second violation - \$250.00;
 3. Third and Subsequent Violations - \$500.00;
 4. Fines up to \$250.00 may be paid through the Franklin County Ordinance Violations Bureau, if such bureau exists, or may be contested in court.
 5. Court costs, as set by the state schedule, shall apply to all cases contested in court.
6. All fines shall be deposited into the Franklin County General Fund.



WHEREAS, it is determined that, Franklin County, IN, is in need of updates to its policy regarding the take home on-call use of vehicles;

BE IT NOW ORDAINED by the Commissioners, that:

1. County Handbook Section **5.11 Take Home Vehicles** is hereby amended to read as follows:

Personal use of County owned vehicles without consent is prohibited. On call employees may be authorized to commute to and from home in government owned vehicles for the convenience of the County. Per IRS regulation, this is a taxable fringe benefit, the value of which will be included in taxable wages at the rates set by the federal government under its commuting value rule (\$1.50 per one way commute at the time of the adoption of this provision) with the following exceptions:

- Clearly marked police, fire, and public safety officer vehicles. The employee must be on-call, required to commute in the vehicle, and be prohibited from personal travel outside the jurisdiction.
- Unmarked vehicles used by law enforcement officers. The officer must be authorized to carry a firearm, execute search warrants and make arrests.
- Qualified specialized utility repair trucks.
- Any vehicle designed to carry cargo with a loaded gross vehicle weight over 14,000 pounds.
- Tractors.

The County and employee must timely report personal use as a wage. Such reports are processed by the Auditor's Office. Personal use of County vehicles, other than commuting, for travel outside of Franklin County is prohibited (e.g. vacation use).

2. If any provision of this ordinance is found to conflict with Indiana state law or with federal law, all other portions shall remain in full force and effect.
3. This ordinance shall become effective on passing.

WHEREAS, the Franklin County Board of Commissioners (the "Board") desire to adopt a comprehensive credit card usage for Franklin County, Indiana.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of Franklin County, Indiana that:

Section I. ISSUANCE AND USE OF COUNTY CREDIT CARDS

A) Business Credit Card for Travel Expenses

- 1) The Franklin County Auditor ("Auditor") (with the support of the Commissioners as needed) is hereby authorized to make application for and maintain business credit cards for the use by County department heads and employees designated by the department head for travel and permitted expenses related thereto as defined below. The credit card for travel expenses shall have a credit limit of \$5,000.00 per card. Department heads shall make a written request to the Auditor for any cards necessary for use within their respective departments.
- 2) The department head shall provide a written accounting of all charges and receipts for each purchase made. The department head shall be responsible for the card and its use.
- 3) County officials and employees shall use the credit card exclusively for the purpose of county travel expenses limited to the following:
 - a) Hotel or motel room reservations;
 - b) Hotel or motel room charges for telephone calls pertaining to county business;
 - c) Meals, including a maximum 15% gratuity before tax;
 - d) Fees associated with attending schools, conferences, seminars and the like;
 - e) Gasoline, if using a county-owned vehicle.
- 4) County credit cards shall not be used for alcoholic beverages, room service other than for ordering meals of less than \$15 per meal including all fees and gratuities, non-County business telephone calls, in-room movies, cash advances, or any personal expenses.
- 5) Accounts payable vouchers (claims) filed in connection with the use of credit

Ala

cards shall be submitted to the Auditor for processing within two (2) business days of the official or employee's return from their travel. All credit card usage shall be properly itemized and documented with a summary of items purchased with said credit card. The credit card will be paid in full every billing cycle. Improperly itemized and documented items as well as interest, carrying charges or penalties caused by improperly submitting items shall be the responsibility of the individual user who causes the expense to the County.

- 6) Payment for any personal or disallowed charges shall be the responsibility of the official or employee making the charge. An official or employee who abuses the credit card will be restricted from future credit card use and subject to disciplinary action up to, and including termination.
- 7) Before being issued a credit card, all individuals, officials, department heads, and/or employees who are expected to use said card, must sign a form provided by the Auditor's Office that indicates the individual has read and understands the policy regarding permitted uses of the County Credit Card.

B) Commercial credit card(s) for Public Purchases of Supplies, Materials, and Small Equipment

- 1) The policy of the Franklin County is to use purchase orders and claim forms for transactions by each department. However, the Auditor shall also make available the County credit card for commercial charging. Use of the credit card requires the submission of a purchase order (p.o.). The Commercial credit card shall have a credit limit of \$10,000.00 per card.
- 2) Commercial credit card receipts shall be properly itemized and documented as provided in I.C. 5-11-10 et seq. The credit card will be paid in full every billing cycle. Improperly itemized and documented items, as well as interest, carrying charges, sales tax, or penalties caused by improperly submitting items shall be the responsibility of the individual user who causes the expense to the county.
- 3) Any department head who abuses the commercial credit card will be restricted from future credit card use and subject to disciplinary action up to, and including termination.
- 4) Store credit or charge cards that are necessary for a particular vendor must be approved by the Franklin County Commissioners and obtained by the Franklin County Auditor following such approval. Once obtained, store credit and/or charge cards shall be governed by the procedure for Commercial credit cards set forth herein.

- C) Any County Credit Card may only be used to make purchases that have been previously specifically budgeted or appropriated.

Section II. MISCELLANEOUS EFFECTIVE DATE

- A) This ordinance shall become effective on September 1, 2018, following its execution by the Commissioners as attested by the Franklin County Auditor.
- B) If any provision of this ordinance is found to conflict with Indiana state law or with federal law, all other portions shall remain in full force and effect.





Residences are permitted, however all types of agricultural uses or uses akin to agricultural operations are permitted, either outright or by conditional uses, depending upon their impact to neighboring uses.

Section 80.03.02 A-2 Secondary Agriculture - This district is located generally in areas of less suitable farmlands where residential subdivisions either have taken place or are anticipated to do so. Residences are permitted however, all types of agriculture uses or uses akin to agricultural operations may be permitted, either outright or by conditional use, depending upon the impact upon neighboring uses.

Section 80.03.03 RE Recreational - The recreational district includes areas used primarily for recreation and residences. The topography is often steep and tree covered, with creeks and streams feeding the lake. This district includes Brookville Lake, parcels owned by the United States government and privately owned parcels, many of them small. The RE District is primarily suited for tourism related development, recreational activities, residences and traditional agriculture. Permitted and conditional uses should conform to this definition either outright or by conditional use depending upon the impact or neighboring uses.

2018- 24 SALARY ORDINANCE FOR 2019

An Ordinance fixing the salaries and wages for the officials and employees for various departments of the County of Franklin, Indiana for the calendar year 2019.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF FRANKLIN COUNTY, INDIANA:

Section 1

The salaries and wages of the officials and employees for the various departments of the County of Franklin, Indiana, for the year 2019, shall be as follows:

Regular part-time employees shall not work more than twenty-eight(28) hours per work week, with the exception of mandatory certification training required of the position.

Seasonal employees are allowed to work up to 40 hours per week for up to 32 weeks per year. The position included in this designation are park part-time guards, extension part-time, highway positions for seasonal mowing, and Treasurer seasonal help. This does not include any other part-time help unless approved by Council. An employee working two or more seasonal or part-time jobs shall not work more than 1280 hours per year. All elected officials and department heads with part-time help will at the time of filling payroll vouchers with the Auditor, 1, verify the number of hours each part-time and seasonal employee has worked and the total hours worked for the year beginning September 1 to August 31.

Department Heads and Elected Officials may pay individuals at rates less than the stated wage, but may not exceed the amounts stated without a Salary Ordinance Amendment.

Overtime Pay Calculation

That salary rate plus Longevity must be added together while figuring the overtime rate after actual 40 hours worked. This does not apply to Comp time. Sheriff, Jail and Communications will need to add holiday pay along with longevity due to the fact that the holiday pay is not included in the salary. ILEA Certification stipened to overtime calculation.

Section 2

Full time employees shall receive a longevity pay (based upon last hire date) of \$60.00 per calendar year for the first 15 years and \$75 for every year after that. Employee must be employed as of December 31,2018 to receive that year benefit.

ILEA Certification stipend shall be paid bi-weekly to Sheriff department employees upon completion of the Indiana Law Enforcement Academy. This is not added to the regular hourly rates for Sheriff Deputies and Matron.

Holiday Pay is paid out at 8 hours of regular pay per holiday.

WHEREAS, IC 6-1.1-37-15 provides that a policy may be implemented allowing the County Treasurer and the County Auditor to waive, negotiate, or settle penalties that have accrued on delinquent property taxes imposed in the County, if the policy is approved by the fiscal body of the County; and

WHEREAS, the Franklin County Council believes that it would be fair and reasonable to implement a policy allowing the County Treasurer and the County Auditor to waive, negotiate, or settle penalties when the Treasurer or the Auditor determines that the penalties are wholly or partly due to a clerical error made in the office of the Treasurer or the Auditor and when any such error involves issues with the mailing of tax billing statements (as per IC 6-1.1-22-8.1) or with the entry of payment information (including, but not limited to, date and time of payment and identification of the parcel for which payment was made) or when any such error involves a similar clerical mistake or oversight.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Franklin County Council that the policy attached hereto as *Exhibit a* (which policy allows the County Treasurer and the County Auditor authority to waive, negotiate, or settle penalties when the Treasurer or the Auditor determines that the penalties are wholly or partly due to a clerical error made in the office of the Treasurer or the Auditor and when any such error involves issues with the mailing of tax billing statements (as per IC 6-1.1-22-8.1) or with the entry of payment information (including, but not limited to, date and time of payment and identification of the parcel for which payment was made) or when any such error involves a similar clerical mistake or oversight is **HEREBY APPROVED** and that the County Treasurer and the County Auditor are hereby authorized to implement the same immediately.

**FRANKLIN COUNTY POLICY REGARDING WAIVER, NEGOTIATION, OR
SETTLEMENT OF CERTAIN DELINQUENT PROPERTY TAX PENALTIES**

Section 1. The County Treasurer or the County Auditor may waive, negotiate, or settle a delinquent property tax penalty if the Treasurer or the Auditor makes a determination (a) that the tax penalty accrued wholly or partly due to a clerical error made in the office of the Treasurer or the Auditor and (b) that the error involved issues with the mailing of tax billing statements (as per IC 6-1.1-22-8.1) or with the entry of payment information (including, but not limited to, date and time of payment and identification of the parcel for which payment was made) or that the error involved a similar clerical mistake or oversight.

Section 2. Any negotiated agreement or settlement agreement made pursuant to this policy and IC 6-1.1-37-15 shall be shown by a written agreement entered into by and between the county auditor, the county treasurer, and the taxpayer or the taxpayer's authorized representative. After concluding the agreement, the Auditor shall provide a copy of the agreement to the taxpayer or the taxpayer's authorized representative.

Section 3. Any waiver, negotiation agreement, or settlement agreement made pursuant to this policy and IC 6-1.1-37-15 shall be documented by the Auditor in the manner prescribed by Indiana Department of Local Government Finance.

Section 4. The Auditor shall provide all documentation related to a waiver, negotiation, or settlement of penalties pursuant to this policy and IC 6-1.1-37-15 to the Indiana State Board of Accounts upon request.




